Beatles are back on top!




Whatever the rights and wrongs of the Beatles v. Monkees controversy (see Lloyd Alexander's "Forum", page 12), The beatles have stolen the show!

With only the Beatles' "All You Need Is Love" pipping Scott McKenzie's fast-rising hit "San Francisco", the quiet singer is one of the biggest favorites on the pop-scene today. "It is possible", he admitted recently, "that I may visit England in September with the Mamas and the Papas".

The song was written specially for him by Papa John Phillips. "I believe in the song", says Scott, "I had to sing something I believed in - it is a reflection of the West Coast of which I am a part". On the disc, John Phillips is playing guitar and Mama Michelle is on bells.

Scott has had a long association with the Mamas and the Papas. Some years ago he was singing with John Phillips in the Journeyman group, ranging from jazz to folk to blues. His voice is clear and pure as a beil, capable of much greater vocal range than the simple charm of "San Francisco".

Andrew Oldham (Rolling Stones' manager) has so much faith in Scott's ability that he took a full-page advertisement recently in a top English pop-newspaper, to boost him. "Scott has the depth and vocal ability to establish himself beyond just one or two



The Twilights are Australia's number one group.

They have been for the past year.

This may not seem much on paper but considering the ups and downs of the Australian pop scene, it is indeed an achievement.

What makes the Twilights so good and different from any other pop group in Australia?

They are the most dedicated and musically exacting group on the Australian scene. They are prepared to work hard, practice every day, and are always ready to experiment with something new, having written 70% of their recording material.

If they do copy they do it to perfection, since the Twilights hit the big time they have peen noted for copying the sound and records i the Beatles

But as Terry puts it: "It is the only form nt music that we as a group can become inolved in. Any material that is recorded by omeone else that we do, we try to learn be ore it is released so as it is in actual fact resh in peoples minds".

The Twilights, like the Beatles, are continually changing their sound and appearance, to help create a new scene. Terry for instance is known for his genuine interest in Indian music, and this influence amongst other things helps give the Twilights a different

Although each member is completely different from the other, they all contribute to the writing of their material, and will record only what they think may make the grade. Laurie, the newest member of the group took the credit for their last single "Young Girl".

The Twilights have been together as a group for nearly three and a half years, barring Laurie who joined them 15 months ago. On this count the Twilights can plead "Not

The twilights are always coming up with

stage act wise. No matter how many times they appear at the same dance you do not get sick of hearing or seeing them.

THE TWILIGHTS

"We purselves would, and do, get sick of the sameness in material that we play, so we venture for new ideas and material continually", said Glen.

'Our stage act", explained Paddy, "forms on the reaction of the audience. Every dance or show has a different audience who react in a different way. So it is really up to us to feel them out, and put on an act that will satisfy

During this time they admit that they have had disagreements and arguments but I dare anyone to try and get a bad word about one of them from another. This unity has also helped the Twilights stay at the top, because without it no pop group can hope to succeed.

Record wise the Twilights have always maintained a high level on the charts with good commercial discs. Their material is always fresh and original, but most important of all, it is commercial.



SOUNDS OF SILENCE

Sounds of Silence, the swinging group out of Adelaide, know enough about success to make the comments well worth listening to! Speaking on the ravy Battle of Popularity between the Beatles and the Monkees, Andy Clarke (their new drummer) said, "The Beatles are going stale! They're not a sensation any more".

Kevin Clancy, the Sound's rhythm guitarist, did not agree. "I think it's a matter of how old you are. If you were 15 or 16 when the Beatles first made it as a group, then you're more likely to din a now. Younger fans are turning to the Mc ...s because they have the fresh, switched-on look which the Beatles had when they were new".

One thing which the Sounds of Silence all acreed on was their admiration for the way the Beatles write their own material. This admiration is not surprising - the Sounds also prepare 90% of their own stage act! Their new self-penned record, "Running High" "Blame Myself" is doing reasonably well in Adalaide, but they are disappointed by the lack of airplay in Melbourne

ARMED FORCES CONCERTS

They are certainly appreciated when they play in GO-SET's special concerts for the Armed Forces, however! Their appearance at Point Cook last week brought a wild response, and the Sounds dug the reception. "It's a fantastic response", enthused Michael Barry (lead guitarist). "There's no tension, and you can feel free to enjoy yourself. And the food and, uh, soft-drink were tremendous! We took a box of prawns home from the last concert,

and it kept us going all week!" The Sounds have a feeling that the image at groups is becoming less important. "Look at the success of the Procul Harum's song. No-one has ever seen them out here, not even

many pictures. 'Yet 'Whiter Shade of Pale' had an incredible success. It is becoming the sound which is selling Pop-groups, not just their appearance". As Kevin pointed out, "What will happen when the Monkees have to come up with new sounds. That will be the real

test of popularity between the Monkees and

the Beatles!

Since his recent split with The Id, Sydney has been waiting to see what Jeff St. John

would come up with in a new backing group. Now, after several weeks of thought and planning, he is confident he has found the

The group, going under the unusual name of The Yama (Yama being the Hindu word roughly translated to mean "The first mortals") incorporates some of Australia's finest musicians.

Ross East plucks out on lead guitar; Virgil East, bass; Peter Figures, drums; Wayne "Groove" Myers, organ; Murray Hill, sax and flute, and Keith Jenkins, trumpet.

Several members of the group have played with successful bands previously. Virgil East will be remembered from his Python Lee Jackson days: Peter Figures was the drums behind the now defunct Throb, while Keith Jenkins has played behind such big names

as P. J. Proby. Ross East, who has never played in Sydney before, is a protege of the great guitarist

George Golla. Although the group have only been playing together for a couple of weeks, they are showing a style that promises to be a big, exciting

As Jeff pointed out, "It will take a little time for the guys to get used to working with each other and start groovin' together but I have great faith in them and the sound we will be putting across."

The type of material they are using contains the big ballads as well as today's standard R & B material, with more commercial negropop involvement. They also add a dash of humor in their repetoire with a song such as "Thou Shall Not Steal," an old Newbeats" number. Thus helping to stress the versatility of the group.

"The main thing," said Jeff, "is that we are also trying to generate a lot more excitement into the music than before. You know, a 'tearing' sort of sound that an audience can get involved in." As well as moving in and out of North Sydney's "Here" disco for seasons at a time, they will be doing a lot of interstate tours.

At the moment they are on a two weeks tour of Adelaide and Melbourne, playing in Adelaide from August 3 to 6, and Melbourne August 7 to 13 inclusive, arriving back in Sydney on August 16.

Already they have spent a week at the Spin recording studios, working on material due for release in the near future.

All in all the future looks good for Jeff and his new group, and Sydney watches with interest their development and impact on the Australian pop scene.

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Ray Charles to tour Australia

Ray Charles, who will tour Australia next month, was born in Georgia of negro parents in 1932. He was blinded at six, sent to a school for blind children, and orphaned at 15. He had to choose between a white cup and cane and a street corner, or forging ahead as a musician.

The latter course was facilitated by an incredible natural gift. The Ray Charles the world knows today began to emerge in a series of discs he made beginning in 1952.

His voice breaks the conventional laws of commercial singing: it hollers and croaks and comes vibrantly alive. It expresses tantalising anguish and, of course, it is this anguish which makes the record worth listening to by millions of fans the world over.

His piano playing, though embellished by certain harmonic devices from the modern school, is only another variation on the simple blues sequence. His composition . . and he writes 90% of the material he records . . is another variation on the same everlastin ever-lovin theme. He writes simple songs. Not necessarily songs that are easy to write, but songs that are every easy to hear,

and just as easy to remember.
On record he may not show the
technical flair and brilliance of a
Cole or a Peterson, but he does
have an elemental power that
recommends itself immediately.
His playing is blunt and stark, but
wonderfully so!

His style now embraces blues, jazz vocal, pure rhythm and blues . . . the Chicago, not the Mersey variety . . and something that can only be called the Ray Charles

But to Charles, it is music that is his life. And he takes life (as music) religiously. In his own words: "Too many artists, after reaching a point of success, just record anything, getting by otheir past performances. I want my current record, and the record after that, to be better than anything I've done before. You have to improve and keep improving to stay on top. You can't fool the public."



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

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
