After six months overseas - exhaustion

Johnnie Young is in Perth in a state of exhaustion after six months' intensive work in Europe with his group, The Word.

'I am tired", Johnnie told "Go-Set" in an exclusive interview at a Perth home yesterday.

So tired that he has refused interviews to other Press, radio and television groups. (He is normally a chaser of publicity.)

Pale and wan, bitter and depressed, the former West Australian popsinger told of his experiences.

"Though I was making about \$600 a week with The Word in Germany (we worked mainly on the continent) it was a battle with long working hours. For example, my big break of working on the German television show "Beat Club" was much harder than any Australian TV work.

"Because the show had a viewing audience of eight

million, rehearsals had to be hard. "Rehearsal could take two eight-hour days." But there were compensations.

"Appearing on the show with the Bee Gees, the Small Faces organist. Mac. Scott McKenzie and Family Dog gave us a lift". Johnnic said.

"Fabulous experience", he said, a glimpse of a smile flashing on his sad face. "Beat Club pays \$150 a

week for one song and pro-vides accommodation in a fine hotel.

"Playing in Europe was not at all like in Australia, where I sometimes averaged earnings of \$2,000 a week, because The Word and I weren't known and we did not have a hit record", said a cooler, more mature

Johnnie. "The break of Beat Club from knowing compere Dave Lee Travis was my real start. TV work in Europe is so hard to get that when you get it, clubs phone to book you for about three months' work.

"A group can work for two years on one hit record alone. It's quite different from Australia.
"This was why Danny

Findiay (drums), Rod Alex-ander (guitar) and I flew back to Australia, secretly, tor a vacation. There are so many good groups over there. An out-of work band in England could be better than Aus-

tralia's best." Johnnie said "Craise Fin-ton Kirk" reached number 14 on a pirate radio station

country tour, for about a month. John said he had learnt from his European work although he had spent a lot of money improving himself.

He had succeeded in Australia because of lucky circumstances.
"I was not talented", he

said, "just fortunate."
"Johnny O'Keefe was the genius who helped me origin-ally", he said "Most people ally", he said "Most think I'm big-headed

"They just don't take the time to know me. The English-complexioned young man reflected in the searing 108 degree heat

"I haven't got many friends in show business but Johany O'Keefe was good to me", he said bitterly "I should like to one day produce a show like Johnny's
