

Armed with eight new numbers, Normie Rowe is preparing for another major assault on the charts. The tunes were recorded last week and will be packaged in two's for release as singles in '68.

On the new recordings Normie is backed by a 16-piece "mini orchestra". The material must rank among the best that Normie has ever had to work with. All of it has been given special arrangements by the leading arranger Rocky Thomas.

I heard Normie putting down one of the numbers at Festival. Titled "Break out and be Free". It starts off as a solid up-tempo ballad then "breaks out" into a really driving chorus. This tune will undoubtedly be an A-side on one of the forthcoming single releases.

Normie's next 45, which will be rush released in a few weeks, will probably feature either "I Was Born to be by Your Side" or "Open Up The Skies" as its A-side.

No sooner was the recording completed than Normie headed back to the army. For the next few weeks Normie will be at the Kanungra Jungle Training Camp in Queensland.

Both the Moody Blues and the Vanilla Fudge had first L.P.'s that were big sellers because of their original sounds. The Fudge's first is the biggest-selling record out of Festival at present.

Their new L.P.'s "The Beat Goes On" (Vanilla Fudge) and "Days of Future Passed" (Moody Blues) are in a way two attempts at the same thing - to make "serious" pop. For this reason they make an interesting comparison, and the result is one definite "miss" and one resounding hit.

In "The Beat Goes On", the Fudge have taken on far more than they can handle on one L.P. disc, perhaps even on a whole series of discs. The second is a sort of historical medley, ranging through Mozart, Beethoven, 15th Century Negro spirituals, 20th century ragtime, blues and swing, to the Beatles (a rather weak think the Beatles are the most important musical phenomenon of the last three centuries, since they rate four items to Mozart's one and Beethoven's two.

On the second side, we get war-On the second side, we get war-time speeches by Chamberlain, Churchill, etc., and more recent ones by Kennedy, interspersed with comment by members of the Fudge. The total effect is

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




