ell, it will take some getting used to, but soon we'll all recognize a #37* debut on the new PPW-oriented Power Cuts chart for the stellar kick-off that it is. We bring this up because #37* is exactly where "No One To Run With" enters the mainstream Rock Radio airplay chart this week, based not on the 143 out of the box adds, but on the 761 plays it received in roughly half a week prior to reporting day. The new Allman Brothers single is also an easy Homer! in its first week.

WNEW, WZBH, WZZR, WTAO and KRKX each report at least 20 plays on "No One To Run With," while KLOS spikes its play from one to 16 this week. Also, with 147 stations now playing the song, retail is noticing a buzz already; Where It All Begins is the #13 Hot Future on the streets.

This is The Allman Brothers Band, so immediate phones come with the territory; as of now, WDHA, WONE and WQBZ are a third of the stations reporting Top 5 requests on "No One To Run With."

TrafficFar From Home

The hundreds and hundreds of thousands of Traffic fans who heard The Album Network's World Premiere radio special on Tuesday, April 26, know exactly how thrilling it is to be able to hear new Traffic music for the first time in almost 20 years. They also know how easily the music makes good on the promise.

The three elements that make Far From Home a Traffic project, as outlined by Steve Winwood and Jim Capaldi in this week's cover feature, are: 1) free-form jamming, 2) the fact that the pair worked on it together, from the ground up, and 3) more free-form jamming. Spontaneous exploration and musical experimentation have again served Traffic well.

Rock Radio programmers can feel comfortable giving their listeners large helpings of new Traffic music, as there is much from which to choose. "Riding High" is a good starting point, but you won't wanna stop there. If you're into the more R&B side of Winwood's solo material, then go for "Some Kinda Woman," "This Train Won't Stop" and "Every Night, Every Day." If the more progressive, rhythmic side of Traffic is your bag, don't miss "Far From Home," "Nowhere Is Their Freedom," "State Of Grace," "Holy Ground" or "Mozambique." Whatever the case, going deep on Far From Home will be the trend. And don't miss Traffic with The Grateful Dead, this summer.

Toad The Wet Sprocket "Fall Down"

"Thank God someone is making music like this!"
That is one of the many complimentary thoughts that screamed for our attention the first time we heard the final mix of "Fall Down." In this first single from Toad's forthcoming new album, Dulcinea, the band has again successfully bridged the chasm that separates College Radio from mainstream Rock Radio, and it spreads itself into the accessible realms of Alternative Radio and Adult Rock Radio, as well.

Toad The Wet Sprocket gives us mellifluous pop music that never loses its razor-like sharpness and character. "Fall Down" is great stuff, and each of the nearly two million Americans who purchased *Fear* are gonna go nuts when they hear it.



Boz Scaggs "Some Change" (rock remix)

This slow-cookin' Texas boogie was awarded more than 300 plays at Rock Radio a week ago. The 45-plus rock stations that went early on "Some

Change" did so by playing the more polished CD version, without any prompting from Virgin. Now comes this "guitars up/keys down" version for Rock Radio that adds balls and grit, and offers even more reason to play it.

Boz's first album in six years has already enthralled Adult Rock fans to the tune of a Top 10 placement at radio and at retail. Boz is back and rockin', and "Some Change" is takin' over Rock Radio next. Oh, and you can get this rock remix on our next Rock CD TuneUp, #115.



Great White "Sail Away"

If you thought Great White was gonna come back with a repeat of the records they'd already made, then wipe your mind clear and listen to "Sail Away." This song is like nothing you've heard from them before. In fact, the new Sail Away CD is a major step away from the bluesy, good time party rock that made multi-Platinum stars of Great White.

A strong conga/rhythm track, dead-on vocal harmonies, a Stills-like acoustic guitar bed and Jack Russell's smooth voice make "Sail Away" a real easy, adult listen. All it needs is for you to give it your unbiased attention.


The Allman Brothers Band Where It All Begins Epic

It takes no more than two downbeats of "All Night Train" to know who you're listening to. Just two notes into Where It All Begins, and it already feels like an old friend. You can chalk it up initially to Dickie Betts' lyrical guitar lines, but as soon as Gregg Allman's voice comes barrelling through, you know this is undeniably The Allman Brothers Band!

By the time you read this, "No One To Run With" will already be the most added track at Rock Radio in its first week. With The Allman Brothers Band, you would expect nothing less.

This new album is crammed full of the familiar Southern fried boogie/bluesbased rock we've always loved by these guys, beginning with "All Night Train," and continuing on through the soon-to-be-classics "Sailin' 'Cross The Devil's Sea,"

the Betts-sung "Back Where It All Begins," "Soulshine" (one of the finest Allman Brothers tunes we've ever heard), "Mean Woman Blues," "What's Done Is Done" and "Temptation Is A Gun."

It doesn't matter if you never connect with "Selling The Drama" on a lyrical level, because the power of the music

carries this tune on its own. "Selling The Drama" will make multi-format stars of Ed Kowalczyk, Chad Taylor, Chad Gracey and Patrick Dahlheimer.

Mick Ronson

Heaven And Hull

If Mick Ronson had not succumbed to cancer a year ago, he would have finished *Heaven And Hull* in the fashion he'd begun it and the CD would then have been his first solo record in nearly 20 years. But Ronson made many friends during his more than two decades in rock n' roll, including David Bowie, lan Hunter, Joe Elliott, John Mellencamp and Chrissie Hynde, each of whom has contributed to finish the album.



Heaven And Hull exhibits the style of guitar work that Mick showcased with Bowie's Spiders From Mars, with lan Hunter (both solo and in Mott The Hoople) and with Mellencamp (that's his standout lick on "Jack And Diane"); Ronson's was an accessible style, as evidenced on the new single, "Don't Look Down," "Take A Long Line" (both with Elliott), "When The World Falls Down" and "Life's A River" (you'll hear a bit of Cougar growl in this one), but he could also go into left field at times, which you can hear on "Trouble With Me" (which features Hynde).

Mick Ronson's CD also benefits from a 1992 live recording of "All The Young Dudes" and from his and Bowie's version of "Like A Rolling Stone" (Ronson was part of Dylan's Rolling Thunder Revue).

Stuttering John"I'll Talk My Way Out Of It"

Stuttering John did not weasel a record deal out of his internship with Howard Stern. Atlantic would never sign a guy just because he asks stupid questions of celebrities on Howard's show. John Melendez was a guitarist/singer/songwriter first, and, okay, being on the air with the self-described "King Of All Media" has helped to get his name known by a few million people. Some of those people are your listeners.

"I'll Talk My Way Out Of It" is rugged, hard rock that employs the kinda hooky guitar licks that made Alice Cooper famous in the 70s. Go ahead, discover just how good Stuttering John might sound when he's not stuttering.

You've recently been re-serviced with the CD, called, appropriately enough, *Stills Alone*.



In the first two installments of our exclusive interview with Pink Floyd (which first appeared, in part, during The Album Network's World Premiere radio broadcast of *The Division Bell*), we learned, from guitarist/singer David Gilmour, about division bells and the continuing division between the band and Roger Waters. We also learned from drummer Nick Mason about how the band nearly broke up around the time of *The Final Cut* and how they've managed to resurrect a democratic spirit that had been missing for some time.

In this, the third segment of our four-part series, Redbeard discusses, among other things, the Floydian renaissance of keyboardist Rick Wright with the man closest to the situation - Wright himself.

With all of the success of A Momentary Lapse Of Reason, 1 think your fans are going to find The Division Bell to be even more satisfying. "I think that is absolutely correct."

Why do you think that is?

"Well, partly because I was involved with it a lot more. With A Momentary Lapse Of Reason, I was involved with it actually near the last quarter of making the album and just put a couple of album tracks down, or whatever. This [time], Nick, myself and Dave were involved right from the beginning, and out of that, the tracks came and decisions [came], like, 'Nick will play all the drums, I will play all the keyboards'...Jon Carin came in as a programmer and played some of the keyboards, but it was to get the band feeling back. And for that reason, as you say, I think the fans will like it more. And, [it reminds me] of Wish You Were Here, which happens to be my favorite album."

What is it about the dynamic between you and David and Nick and Bob Ezrin? What is it that made The Division Bell start differently than the last five Pink Floyd studio albums?

"Well, the intention of this album was to try and recreate a band feeling, which hadn't happened on A Momentary Lapse Of Reason. I wasn't on The Final Cut, I was on The Wall, but again it wasn't a band feeling. And both Dave and Nick - I think I can speak for them and myself really liked the feeling we had on Dark Side Of The Moon and Wish You Were Here. After that, we lost that band feeling, and the original intention of this album was to learn all the material and then get the other musicians - Gary [Wallis, percussionist], Jon [Carin], Guy [Pratt, bass player] and the girl singers (as well as Tim Renwick, who once again added guitars) - and go and play it live, in the studio. It didn't turn out that way, but the original intention of Dave's was actually to do a live album, in the studio."

You have a unique perspective; no one has seen Pink Floyd the same way that you have. You were there at the beginning, you were there when the band actually defined the mega-stadium presentation, the state of the art for presenting music, you were at the forefront of film and video being used to augment the live presentation, you came through the period when Pink Floyd set the standard with Dark Side Of The Moon, you were with the band when the business success finally paid off and Pink Floyd became an incredibly successful endeavor; then you left, and now you're back.

Because of the unique perspective you have on this, is The Division Bell particularly sweet for you?

"It was fulfilling because I wrote on it, and I wrote with Dave on it. And I sang on it. For the first time since Dark Side, I [have a] lead vocal. So that was very fulfilling, because I've never had any confidence in my voice.

"But I wrote 'Wearing The Inside Out,' so I had to sing it. I'd rehearsed it with Anthony Moore, who wrote the lyrics, but I basically hadn't really sung for 20 years. I did one take and Bob said, 'Okay, that's it,' which I couldn't believe. But it's a song that really suits my voice. I don't have a versatile voice, but there are certain ways of singing I can do - like the chorus of 'Us And Them' or the chorus of 'Time.' So that was very fulfilling...particularly writing a song and singing it, and having it on the album."

Can I tell you that it was very fulfilling for me to listen to you do it? I think you're going to be wonderfully gratified at how many people react to that song and your singing it.

"You know, you're the only person who has said this."

Good. There is an element of Pink Floyd that I hadn't noticed had been missing, really, over time, and it's like you've underlined it by singing "Wearing The Inside Out."

"Yeah, and the element at the other end, for example, 'What Do You Want From Me,' which is kind of this combination of Dave and me writing. He wrote the lyrics, but that sounds, to me, so Pink Floyd. And that wasn't happening on A Momentary Lapse Of Reason or on The Final Cut - obviously, 'cause I wasn't there - and it wasn't happening on The Wall. So those things are wonderful, and I think, as you say, most people are going to love it for that."

> Overall, I counted up five songs that you've contributed to on The Division Bell. How does that change the way you look at Pink Floyd now, from as recently as the Momentary

"I'm very excited. I mean, because the last writing I did was on Wish You Were Here. And in the future it will be interesting to see how people react to the albums. I've already heard some people saying this album has the feeling of Wish You Were Here."

I agree. How would you sum up your feelings at the end of the Momentary Lapse... tour? I mean, it was so successful. What was said, and what was left unsaid about the future?

"Well, I don't think there was any clear idea of the future, except that everyone realized the band had started happening again. And it was a lot of sadness.

"It was the end of the tour and (it had) a wonderful feeling to it that we hadn't had for years. I've done every Pink Floyd tour, and certainly, for me, I had probably the best feeling of the band being together since the beginning, virtually. So I knew it was going to happen again. There was no way that, after that feeling, Dave or Nick would say, 'Not again."


So, does that give you great anticipation for...

"Ah hah! The future. Well, we're getting older...no. What the album - and now hopefully this tour - has done has inspired me to do a lot of things.


"I already have two projects going, which I won't talk about. I know the next Pink Floyd album will be a few years [in coming], or maybe it won't. Maybe we will go straight into the studio and do another one. But having done this, I have quite a lot of things to do musically."

ut then, Traffic always was a living example of ebb and flow, taken to a tangible extreme. Traffic's music, its personality, its essence seemed to breathe of its own accord. The band itself even had its own cycle of evaporating and reconvening, adding or subtracting players with each new musical experiment.

There had been nine of these experiments, these creative outbursts, from Traffic. Nine over a period of seven and a half years, featuring eleven different players. From the spring of 1967 until the fall of 1974, Traffic captured a never-before - or since - mimicked blend of progressive rock, folk-infested, R&B-laced, jazzrooted pop and turned it into a soundtrack for the counterculture. There were seven studio albums and two live offerings, and then, nothing.

Nothing, until now.

On Tuesday, May 3, after a near 20 year dormancy, Jim Capaldi and Sleve Winwood will deliver Traffic's 10th outing. Conceived, composed and created from January through August, 1993, in a provincial farm house known as Woodstock, in Kilcoole, Ireland, Far From Home is described by Winwood and Capaldi as "the Barleycorn of 94," in reference to their Top 5 recording, John Barleycorn Must Die. As with that 1970 landmark effort, Traffic recorded Far From Home relatively spontaneously, as a duo, with only a few instruments being added after the fact. Davy Spillane and Mick Dolan laid down bagpipes and rhythm guitar, respectively, but all other instruments and sounds were played and made by Winwood and Capaldi.

Far From Home reflects the musical evolution undertaken by Steve Winwood and Jim Capaldi these past two decades. Whereas Traffic's sound was never characterized by any one instrument, the new set is oriented a bit more toward Steve's keyboards than his guitar, and toward Jim's love of Latin rhythms. And whereas the late 60s' and early 70s' rock scene owes a debt of gratitude to songs like "Dear Mr. Fantasy," "Heaven Is In Your Mind" "The Low Spark Of High Heeled Boys," "Light Up Or Leave Me Alone" and "Empty Pages," it is easy to hear how far the recording process has been advanced in 20 years when you compare the sonic quality of tracks such as "Here Comes A Man," "Nowhere Is Their Freedom," "State Of Grace," "Far From Home" and "Holy Ground" to those early records. Otherwise, Far From Home is pure Traffic. It is exploratory musical jamming, organically grown and offered, as is.

For the very first time since 1974, Winwood and Capaldi have a Traffic album on which they can deliberate from a current perspective. And so it is that they have called me from Steve's Nashville home (he spends part of his time in Tennessee and part of it back home in England, while Capaldi resides fulltime in the UK). Here, then, is a glimpse into the hearts, minds and souls of Traffic.

Did this record start off as a Traffic album?

CAPALDI • "Mentally, it was already in the background." WINWOOD • "Yes. We'd already got in our minds that we wanted to make a Traffic album, but after Jim and I [had] written the first couple of things, it was so...unmistakably Traffic that this had to be the one.

"We said, What are we waiting for?! This is the time to do it.'
The [songs] already sounded like Traffic."

Jim, you've played with Steve on his solo recordings before,...is that the only thing that made this different that these songs "sounded like Traffic"?

CAPALDI • "No. We hadn't worked together from scratch on the last [of Steve's] solo albums, Refugees Of The Heart and Roll With It; [in those instances], it was a track that Steve and I did toward the end of the project. This was completely from scratch."

"So, there's no way it could be anything other than a Traffic album."

Steve, in many ways, your 1990 solo album, Refugees Of The Heart, was a precursor to the new Traffic album.

"There's no way it

could be

anything

other than WINWOOD • "Yes, I think it was. I had attempted Traffic to, like, re-inject my solo work with some of the album." Traffic elements, particularly in tracks such as 'In The Light Of Day' and 'You'll Keep On Searching,' which - Jim Capaldi were very Traffic-sounding. So that was, as you say, a precursor, inasmuch as I thought, 'It doesn't make sense, me trying to make solo albums sound like Traffic we should make a Traffic album, and we [should] work within the freedom that Traffic allows us,' which is a kind of total disregard for any market forces, or from any kind of direction in terms of commerciality. We wanted to get away completely from that, from A&R pressure, and to really do something that flew in the face of anything like that."

Being totally self-indulgent in your music can be a risky proposition, wouldn't you say, lim?

CAPALDI • "Well, I don't think there are any risks..."
WINWOOD • "Well, it's an opinion, isn't it!"

CAPALDI • "I'd think that kind of opinion is only raised when someone's done something in the wrong way, you know what I mean? I mean, if you know someone's work, and within the frame of that work, they do something kinda weird, I think it gets reaction, you know?

"I know what you're trying to say, but in our case, in the realms of Traffic, we certainly haven't overindulged ourselves. I don't know how Traffic could, really. No, I don't think we're taking risks, to be honest."

WINWOOD • "I think any art, by definition, is basically self-indulgent. You have to be self-indulgent to your own vision, perhaps, just to be able to honestly do what you feel you have to do. So, I think self-indulgence is only a word that comes up when it goes wrong, or when you don't like it."

Well, I was thinking more, like, if you were being driven by chart positions or sales figures - as somebody with the kind of solo success that Steve has had would have expected of him - you have to give it a different attention than if you're simply making it to satisfy your own musical tastes. That's what I meant by 'self-indulgence': You're allowed to satisfy your own taste.

WINWOOD • "Absolutely. And with Traffic, we never paid any mind to market forces or A&R..."

CAPALDI • "Or why we were doing what we were doing."
WINWOOD • "In fact, when I first started making records, I only did it because it was something I wanted to do. And that's really what we've attempted to get back to now; we're doing this because it's what we love to do."

When did you begin writing the songs for For From Home?

WINWOOD • "When we were in Ireland."

CAPALDI • "Early in January...we did a lot of jamming."
WINWOOD • "Yeah, what you hear on a lot of the record is
pure jamming as we were writing the song. That's what you've
actually got there on the record: The pure, unadulterated
thought and playing, as it were. So, in that way, the technology
very much worked with us."

So it is the actual recording of the germ of the idea that winds up on the album?

CAPALDI • "[Yes]: 'Mozambique,' 'Far From Home,' 'Every Night, Every Day,' 'Some Kinda Woman'...Steve overdid the vocal on 'Every Night, Every Day,' and put the horns on, but the guitar and organ stuff on 'Far From Home,' 'Mozambique' - that was all ran off as we jammed."

WINWOOD • "We used the actual, original jam vocal in lots of places, and just fixed a few bits where we needed to. Whereas 20 years ago, we'd base a lot of our writing on jamming, [but] we'd have to jam it, then go into the studio and reconstruct the jam, if you'd like. So, you'd kinda go a generation off the thought process. Now, it's possible to actually put that directly onto the [record]."

CAPALDI • "[On] 'Far From Home,' there's a lovely little piano phrase, and the groove - all that - is as we did it. We had to find a lyric, and we had to find a melody for the vocal, but what you're hearing played is what we did."

Besides the two of you, Chris Wood was always there for Traffic. At the time you recorded this, it had been roughly 10 years since he passed away. If Chris was still alive, do you think you could've done a Traffic album without him?

WINWOOD • "Chris would've been right there with us. I mean, in a way, he almost was. He was guiding us through the album, spiritually. And, we felt that we couldn't get anybody in to actually do his flute parts, because we thought we knew what he'd do better than anybody else. And so, we kind of did his parts as well."

Who is in the touring band?

WINWOOD • "We have Rosko Gee, who played bass on When The Eagle Flies; Randall Bramlett will be doing keyboard, sax and flute - filling Chris Wood's part; a young keyboard player [named Mike McEvoy], who actually worked with [ex-Traffic percussionist] Reebop Kwaku-Baah and Rosko; and Walfredo Reyes on percussion and drums."

Do you see the door open for more Traffic stuff in the future?

CAPALDI • "Of course the door's open for Traffic [chuckles]." WINWOOD • "The door is definitely open. But I mean, of course, every record you do, every song you write, there's an element of 'Let's do this and see what happens,' you know? But we feel [very] comfortable working in this Traffic mode." CAPALDI • "I got no plans for a solo album, no desire, really."

In closing, if you were to sum up what each of you thinks is the most important thing about this album, this period of Traffic, what would it be?

CAPALDI • "Just to have Traffic - the sound, the attitude, the no-frills, no-bullshit feel - to have the people, and young people, hear that again today."

WINWOOD • "I think there's an unfettered kind of looseness and freedom about Traffic, which I felt had been missing in my music for long enough, and I wanted to rekindle [it]. That part of Traffic was very inspiring - not only to me, but to other people - and I feel like I want to explore that even more."

Traffic's reunion tour gets under way in North America in mid-May, and carries on until early September. Here are some of the early dates:

"As an A&R guy, I'll strive for my soul brother and guiding force John Kalodner's ears and instinct, Michael Goldstone's quiet cool and boundless integrity, and Bob Pfeifer's subliminal networking genius. Clive and Roy Lott have made a number of moves recently that send a signal this place is ready to rock - bringing on Jim Urie, Madelyn Scarpulla and Steve Schnur reinforces that sentiment.

"I've loved every minute of my past few years as a champion of heavy music. I hope I've helped to break a band or two by keeping new music alive at Rock Radio," continues Friend. "And I cannot say enough about my seven years at RIP. I could write a book about the road experiences alone! But now, I'm ready to find and break my own bands. Company officials said they will call the station "Alice" because "the 11,000 best sets of call letters have already been taken, and because the project has the adventurous feel of chasing a white rabbit down a hole. The station will be marketed as 'Alice...at 106 FM."

"With Alice targeting women 18-34, and Majic reaching women 28-44, we think we can offer our advertisers a broad spectrum of Denver's terrific female market," says a company spokesman. "With two stations, we can be twice as entertaining and four times as efficient, since these things are generally exponential in nature."



Julien Temple



ulien Temple, one of the industry's most recognized and prolific video makers, was already a pro when the video channel signed on, and he has remained at the forefront of his craft. A graduate of England's National Film School, he cut his teeth filming The Sex Pistols in concert, which eventually became the classic punk movie, "The Great Rock And Roll Swindle."

His success continued as he delved deeper into the field of video making, with a reputation and a videography to prove it: Neil Young's sarcastic, satire-laden "This Note's For You"; Tom Petty's award-winning video, "Into The Great Wide Open"; Duran Duran's moody "Come Undone," and a list of videos that goes on for pages, including artists like The Rolling Stones, David Bowie, Janet Jackson, Whitney Houston, Billy Idol, Judas Priest and The Kinks, among many others.

Temple has also managed to continue with his film career, directing "The Secret Policemen's Other Ball" in 1983, "Absolute Beginners" in 1985, 1987's "Earth Girls Are Easy" and the first IMAX entertainment feature, "At The Max," highlighting The Stones' Steel Wheels tour in 1991.

Now heading his own company, Nitrate Films, we caught up with Julien fresh from a video shoot in the jungles of Nepal for Enigma's "Eyes Of Truth." Here is an insider's look at the man behind the camera....

Album Network: How did you get into making videos?

Julien Temple: "I started making videos with The Sex Pistols. 'God Save The Queen' was the first one I did - and 'My Way,' with Sid Vicious. I've been doing it a long time, and I've done other kinds of filmmaking as well. But I keep coming back to [videos], because of the relative freedom you have. It's wonderful to be able to not market research and second guess the hell out of something...you're allowed to run with the creative idea that turns you on, as long as you can convince the artists and, to a lesser extent, the record company. If you really work with an artist, and you're in synch, then you're very free."

What was it like working with The Sex Pistols?

"It was a very exciting time, because The Sex Pistols were more than just music. In a way, the whole Seattle grunge thing was that idea, coming to America, 12 or 13 years later. The first time 'round, I think it was even more exciting, because it was new, and there was this sense that they were turning upside down and reinventing, certainly in England, the whole idea of pop culture, and starting it afresh. That was fantastic. Sid himself was a kid - you've got to remember he was only 20 when he died. I was working with him when he was 18, and I was only a couple of years older. There was a great energy of that being involved with people that young who were having such an impact on things."

Was it tough to make the jump from video to film? Did you experience any barriers due to the fact you were a music video director?

"I had done movies before I did videos - I did a movie with The Sex Pistols called 'The Great Rock And Roll Swindle.' I trained at a film school, and my whole background was movies. So, to me, that's what I had always been keen on doing. Actually, going between the two is not that difficult. A movie can take five years before it's financed and finished, and video is more instantaneous. You have to be really patient to get a movie off the ground. But if you know what the difference is creatively between a movie and a video, the act of directing is just trying to make the images you create work for the idea. Movies, videos, even commercials - they're all different, but the overall skill of a director remains the same, as long as you're aware of the difference between the

demands and the needs of the various formats, then you can go between them quite happily. I think there is a feeling that a music video director can't necessarily handle 90 minute stories. But if you've done movies, it's not as much of an issue."

How is making a video different from making a movie?

"It's different in a lot of ways. One thing is just the time it takes - music video is a very spontaneous form. You can be lying in bed and have an idea that you'd like to film, and three weeks later, it's on television around the world. That's an amazing kind of feeling of connecting with a global audience. I think in a kind of formal way, videos are more about firing out ideas and images at a viewer in a living room - a couch potato on a sofa, or whatever, whereas movies, in a dark room, should really pull the audience from their seats and into the screen, and create a world they enter and are immersed in. There's a different kind of creative impetus.

"It's hard to make people cry in a three minute video, or to touch them, because in a movie, the parameters of the world and the people that you're showing takes time to develop. Movies aren't about a blitz of information in a way a lot of videos are. Purely to capture the attention of people within the formatting of MTV, videos have to deliver visually powerful images, one after the other, although I'm not saying that's the best kind of video. But in a movie, if it was all incredibly powerful images, you'd walk out after 10 minutes! You have to have light and shade in a dramatic context.

"There are different schools of video making - obviously, it has a lot to do with still photography and album cover art. A lot of very successful videos are, basically, moving still images of artists performing. There was a period when still photographers got involved in videos - Herb Ritts did wonderful work with Madonna and Janet Jackson and some other major artists, but they're all very similar. They're basically beautiful stills of those people, which is one way of doing it. For me, it's more interesting if you have a conceptual idea for things and tell some kind of story."

Who comes up with the concept for a video?

"It very much depends on the artist involved. The reason I like doing

videos so much is because they are, oddly, one of the most personal forms of filmmaking that connects with a mass audience. By that I mean I've been able to come up with ideas which I can then interest the artist in, and that's what interests me. You can work in videos as a filmmaker who not only writes at, but really closely supervises it to the end.

"It's a hard industry to work in, because with each job, you're pitching an idea against five or six other ideas. It's different in commercials, where an agency has an account, and they trust those people to come up with something. Even if the first idea isn't right, they go back to the drawing board and come up with it again. Here, you live and die on your idea.

"However, there are artists I've worked with who've had wonderful dreative input and ideas going in. Neil Young springs to mind, and David Bowie. With those two in particular, it's very much a collaboration. One of you may have a germ of an idea, and you kick it around and work it up together. That's more possible when you've had a long-standing, creative relationship with the person involved."

How much does it cost to make a video, and why is it so expensive, considering a large percentage don't ever make it to MTV?

"It really varies. I think they should have an award for the biggest budget at the MTV Awards, because if you're talking about Madonna or Michael Jackson, or even MC Hammer, you're talking millions of dollars. The average video, I would say, is \$25,000, because there are so many small independent ones done. With major record labels, it's somewhere between \$50,000 and \$75,000. And for a real standout video, I think you've got to be talking between \$100,000 and \$200,000. There's a huge disparity between the few top end videos - which are not necessarily the best - where the budgets are in the millions of dollars, and the independent ones, which run in the thousands of dollars."

What happens when a video doesn't make it to MTV?

"MTV has its own programming instincts and rules, and it is, more and more, a channel that's trying to reach just a young kid audience. So, there are a lot of artists who sell in an older age group that don't ever make it to MTV. They're not particularly keen on ballads, and R&B, in general, doesn't get a real crack on MTV, unless it's Janet Jackson or Whitney Houston, for example.

"It really depends on what bandwagon they're on at the time. Obviously, MTV really got behind the whole Seattle grunge thing, and had a lot to do, I think, with launching it. But there are a lot of other alternative outlets. VH-1 was set up to cater to a slightly older target, and there are a number of video jukebox networks, outlets in clubs, and local shows that will play a video as special programming. It's not all over if it doesn't get to MTV, although the biggest record buying audience is that young kid audience, who'll go out and buy something having seen it on MTV."

From where do you get the images? Do you listen to the song over and over, or do you have an idea going into a project?

"Certainly, one way is to just listen to the song and something comes from that. Often, there are things about the artist, the legend of artists like The Stones, for instance which conjure up ways of thinking about music that would obviously be very different from someone like Enigma.

"It's almost like a personal diary, in a way, for a filmmaker, because you can have an idea and realize it so quickly. As a filmmaker, you're constantly looking at the world and having ideas, and sometimes, you have an idea that you'd like to do, but it's just not the right song. Then suddenly, a song comes along that would really work. It doesn't have to be just shutting your eyes and listening to the pusic...you can approach it from the lyric of the song, you can approach it more abstractly from the music, or you can involve the legends of the people you're working with."

What music video director do you most admire?

"I've always admired Jean Baptiste Mondino. He directed Don Henley's 'Boys Of Summer,' Madonna's 'Justify My Love,' and recently, a great Neneh Cherry video. He has a great vision, and he's been copied a lot. I think Tarsem is interesting, and Kevin Kerslake is capable of doing really good work as well."

Of the videos you've directed, which is your favorite one?

"I love Neil Young's 'This Note's For You,' because of the impact it had. It was actually banned on MTV, but then won the Video of the Year! There were a lot of ironies in that, and I think it was a very honest, powerful statement from Neil. I've also enjoyed doing big, dance things with Janet Jackson, and I've loved working with The Stones. Recently, I've really enjoyed working with Enigma."


What about outside of your own work?

"I loved the Red Hot Chili Peppers' recent video. I think Tarsem's 'Losing My Religion' was a great video, as well. When videos are good, it's a great form, but, like any other form, 90% of them are not very good. There are a lot of talented people working in the field, and what I think is really great about music video is that it allows young, new filmmakers to start working."

If you could choose one song from all time to set to a video, what would it be?

"In another time, I would have loved to have done something with Frank Sinatra...something from the 50s, like 'Witchcraft.' I'd also loved to have done something with Miles Davis - again, from an earlier time."

Currently, Julien Temple is in Europe preparing to film the bittersweet love story of legendary French film director Jean Vigo, one of the early defining spirits of the cinema who, along with his wife, perished in his 20s from tuberculosis.



"Fall Down" is guitar pop reaching full potential, offering up not only catchy hooks, but creating and shuffling through varying moods within the song. "Fall Down" grabs the listener not only the first time through, but well before that initial listen is over. If "Fall Down" is any indication of the music to be found on the upcoming *Dulcinea* album, it's a safe bet that Toad The Wet Sprocket are about to establish themselves as one of the preeminent guitar-based pop bands of the day.

Johnny Cash American Recordings

This gem marks the meeting of two of the greatest minds in American music, country wizard Johnny Cash and renegade producer Rick Rubin. Rubin couldn't have been happier to add Cash to the American Recordings roster, knowing that the singer/musical outlaw would fit most appropriately with the label's rebellious spirit. The result is a stirring collection of dark, brooding songs that display Johnny's melancholy baritone and sensitive acoustic playing.

Songwriting credits feature several notable guests, including Nick Lowe, Tom Waits and Glen Danzig. The album's 13 tracks are the best of 70 that were recorded in Rubin's living room over a relaxed six-month session. Cash, himself, attests that this album is the best work he has ever done. A collaboration of this caliber should not be missed.


KCRW Live Performances

Mammoth

Those who live in the LA Basin are lucky enough to have access to one of the finest radio programs available, KCRW's "Morning Becomes Eclectic." Host Chris Douridas presents a musical smorgasbord that is guaranteed to live up to the show's title, and quite often features in-studio performances from some of the most talented artists around.

Rare On Air, Vol. One compiles a number of these rare performances onto CD, offering a glimpse of artists ranging from Los Lobos to Leonard Cohen to Natalie Merchant performing in a very intimate setting. All the tracks were recorded live as they happened, direct to two-track DAT, giving them a warm, honest feel. Of particular note here are Tori Amos' "Silent All These Years," Natalie Merchant's "How You've Grown," Peter Himmelman's "Always In Disguise," as well as great tracks from X, Los Lobos and Nick Cave And The Bad Seeds.



Indigo Girls

"Touch Me Fall"

Epic

For those who expect acoustic folk songs and ballads from the Indigo Girls, the duo's latest release should prove to be an ear opener. "Touch Me Fall" is perhaps the most fully realized single ever released by the Indigo Girls. The track starts gently with a simple base of ringing electric guitar and soothing vocals. Amy Ray and Emily Salier i gradually build the song throughout with a variety of sounds and textures, including strings and horns. As the song grows, the pace accelerates dramatically toward an energetic and driving conclusion that is certain to surprise and captivate fans, both old and new.

Marxman

45 RPM

The London-based Marxman caught much attention last year with the release of the single "All About Eve." Now they release 45 RPM, an EP prefacing a full release scheduled for next month. 45 RPM showcases Marxman's penchant for hot dance beats, ethereal keyboard textures and smooth rapping. Though the beats are definitely danceable, they don't carry the average non-message of pop nonsense and party spirit. Rather, Marxman mold a mature political stance through their lyrics, commenting boldly on such issues as domestic violence, racism, drugs and the continuing guerilla war in Northern Ireland. Marxman innovate brilliantly in their juxtaposition of infectious drum beats, jazzed instrumental samples and meaningful raps. Forward-thinking alternative programmers have already begun spinning 45 RPM, a good warm up for the attention that Marxman should get with the May release of their full album, 33 Revolutions Per Minute.

Denzil

Pub

Play/Giant

After taking part in a handful of bands, singer/guitarist Denzil has come into his own with a self-titled group. The band's initial release, *Pub*, features a collection of tracks that ride on the highs of bouncing strum rhythms and well-timed electric statements. The album is already climbing to the crest of the alternative airwaves, clearly indicating that Denzil's perky pop compositions have more than average staying power. *Pub* is ample proof that this musician from Bournemoth, UK, will be one of this decade's artists to watch.

Maggie Estep

"Hey Baby"

Maggie Estep steps into the recording world from New York City's poetry/spoken word scene. Estep has achieved notoriety recently with her appearances in 30-second promos for MTV and her participation in last year's MTV Spoken Word Tour.

Estep's debut single release, "Hey Baby," offers up a humorous female perspective on being harrassed by calls of "Hey baby!" and "Yo baby!" on the street. Estep fights back in the song by offering the offending man a chance to become involved in a bizarre scenario involving non-dairy creamer and "blue stuff for the toilet." After hearing this, he wants to know if she has a thing against men. "No," she replies, "just STUPID men."

Lisa Germano

"Puppet"

4AD/Warner Bros.

Finding a home on 4AD, Lisa Germano is finally able to display her rare sense of harmony and texture to its fullest potential. After gaining initial exposure as John Mellencamp's violinist, Germano went on to produce and release her own record, which gained her the attention of Capitol Records, who released her first major album, Happiness. That album is now being re-released on 4AD, with extra tracks, remixes by John Fryer and Ivo and new artwork. "Puppet," one of the standouts of Happiness, readily demonstrates Germano's aptitude for sonic construction; it's a chilling blend of Lisa's whispered vocals, haunting acoustic guitars and emotional violin lines. The dark, airy strains that characterize "Puppet" prove that Germano's 4AD signing was a good move, one that should help propel her into a deserved spotlight.

Beats The Hell Out Of Me

Beats The Hell Out Of Me

How do we cope with the everyday aggravations of life? The answer-Beats The Hell Out Of Me, an Arizona-based band with more than just a bad attitude. Their self-titled Metal Blade debut (and second record overall) is a tumultuous dissertation of skin-peeling rage and soul-sucking anomie capable of breaking bones with the band's sonic intensity alone. Not since Black Flag have we heard a band with such a psychotic, anger-driven hatred of everything, including themselves. Beats The Hell Out Of Me is a 10-song tirade against society, people, and the life-crushing ways of the world that refuses to be ignored.

From the opening teeth-grinding guitars of "Painfully," Beats The Hell Out Of Me maniacally lumber through the album with the feel of a rampaging, yet not careless, killer on the loose. The songs seem to strain to the breaking point, led by Mike Pistrui's strangled vocal expulsions, sounding as if he is choking on the bile the world inflicts upon him. "Behind My Back" (our personal fave), is the prize jewel of fiery display, and if radio isn't too chicken to play it, could be huge. Barely controlled yet excessively focussed, Beats The Hell Out Of Me let you know exactly what's been done unto them and how they feel about it. Rendered with the unnerving deliberateness of a serial killer playing out his/her fantasy on some faceless victim, Beats The Hell Out Of Me is an intimidating catharsis of darker emotions we all try to keep hidden lest we be judged harshly by "normal society." Get on Beats The Hell Out Of Me before your listeners beat the hell out of you.

VHVGLSH CHANNE

Young British rap star Matty from Credit To The Nation was joined by The Levellers last week to present a petition of over 50,000 signatures to Prime Minister John Major at 10 Downing Street. The petition called for the closure of the headquarters of extreme right wing organization The British National Party, and is part of a wider Don't Vote Nazi campaign set up response to the 30 BNP candidates standing in local council elections across the UK. Other celebrities supporting the campaign include Suede, who signed the petition, poet Benjamin Zepheniah and a host of young British comedy talent, including cross dresser Eddie Izzard, Nick Revell and Harry Hill. Elsewhere, anti-Nazi campaigners prevented a gig by the right wing band The League Of St. George from taking place at London's Dublin Castle venue.

That Petrol Emotion, the critically-acclaimed rockers who formed from the ashes of new wave favorites The Undertones, have decided to call it a day after a decade of fine songs, music paper praise and extensive tours - but little commercial success. The band recorded four albums for Polydor and,

later, Virgin Records, and had the occasional Top 40 hit, but never quite lived up to expectations of press and fans alike. They play farewell concerts in London and Dublin at the end of the month.

And it's goodbye to Brendan, the charismatic drummer with Creation favorites Teenage Fanclub, who has quit the band after months of speculation about the future of the band. A statement issued last week, however, made it clear that the witty soft rock fans intend to plow on with their schizophrenic love of Status Quo and Big Star without the man.

Old Rock Stars At Large *1: Self-styled Pulp fan and former spokesman of a generation. Joe Strummer made his first live appearance in ages in Prague recently when he joined Dirty Pictures at a charity gig for East European refugees. Strummer performed numerous Clash songs, including "London Calling" and "Garageland," and the Bobby Fuller Four number, "I Fought The Law."

Old Rock Stars At Large *2: As mentioned in English Channel a fortnight ago, the Led Zep revival gathers pace. Page and Plant appeared together for a spur of the moment set at a tribute to legendary British bluesman Alexis Corner. The gig took place in Buxton Opera House, Derby, and the set list included such standards as "Train Kept A Rollin'" and "Baby Please Don't Go."

Azalia Snail

Fumarole Rising Funky Mushroom

This is the second solo effort from Azalia Snail, a woman from New York. While, on her last album (and other projects with the band Hail), she just seemed like some crazed woman with a guitar and lots of noisy effects, on this album her artistic vision is more realized. There is no sense to the structure or themes of her songs - initially. But underneath all the noise are beautiful melodies and pop songs just waiting to happen.


The great thing about this album is that it refuses to be pigeonholed. You cannot place it in the "angry woman in a band" ghetto. Nor does it qualify as a noisy testament to the God of Keyboard Sequencing. Snail is attempting to show that a woman is not limited to the prescribed notions of what a woman in rock should be. She plays all the guitars and keyboards, some of the percussion, and sings every song. This, in itself, is not a reason to celebrate this record. The creativity and just plain uniqueness of each song are what make this a record that everyone needs to hear.

Each song has something extraneous going on, whether it is a spoken word sample ("Having An Experience" features John S. Hall of King Missile ranting about something) or a looped drumbeat. These are used as backbones for the song structures, which then take off into swirly drones or discordant, yet beautiful, meanderings. The first song on *Fumarole Rising*, "Into Yr. World," starts off as a simple, folky love song, until a trumpet interrupts with an odd cadence that seems to be the call of approaching royalty. "Cast Away (The Saga Of Jeannie Berlin)" is stopped halfway through for a version of "The Wedding March" played on an organ, before starting back up. Snail hides the vocals beneath lots of noise, but it doesn't detract from the songs, because there is so much to hear in each one. The style fits because of the wonderful production job that Snail did on the record, and the fact that overdone vocals can ruin a good song.

I don't know that what I've written has made much sense, because this record is truly the most unique thing I have heard. Its beauty and genuine artistry is something that needs to be heard. People this talented should not be buried beneath the hype of riot grrrls and poppy songs about sisters and trees.







My last gasp for the great John David, this tasty, four-song sampler from Zakk Wylde's Pride & Glory offers an introduction to Zakk's new world, with James LoMenzo on bass and Brian Tichy on drums. The emphasis here is on big performances, with a little polish to go along with the spit. There's a lot of breathing room between the players in this power trio, and you can tell their amps pushed a lot of air to make this record. Zakk's vocal style is reminiscent of Ricky Medlocke of Blackfoot, real ballsy and powerful. Pride & Glory take an "off the beaten" path approach before they get to choruses at times, but the trip is so interesting it's worth the ride, particularly on "Horse Called War." "Toe'n The Line" is so down and dirty you can feel the mud cover your boots as you turn up the volume. Downright nasty!

Collapsing Lungs

"What It Is To Bush," Elektra








Stompbox



Stephen Street, and mixed

by Bob Clearmountain, Last Of The Independents offers us a somewhat softer and more intimate collection of songs. There is more emphasis on melody and song structure, there is more of an acoustic feel to the production and there is a broader variety of musical styles. One constant remains, however: Chrissie's unique and moving voice. She wrote most of the tunes by herself, collaborating on five with Billy Steinberg and Tom Kelly (these include "Hollywood Perfume," "Night In My Veins," "977" and "Love Colors"). These songs, in addition to her self-penned "I'm A Mother" and "Tequila," and the Dylan classic "Forever Young" (which we first heard on the With Honors OST), are all perfect for Adult Rock Radio

It has been four years since their last effort, *Packed*, was released, but Chrissie has been busy raising her children (who are 9 and 11 now), doing a good number of benefit concerts and recording songs for special projects, such as the Hendrix tribute, the Dylan tribute, the recently released Otis Blackwell tribute, and the soon-to-be-released Mick Ronson project.

In an interview she recently did with our very own Jim Nelson, Chrissie mentions how her need for a complete band, a "Pretenders," is crucial to her right now. It was important in the creation of this project and will have even more meaning to her as the band embarks on an extensive tour in support of Last Of The Independents.

Whatever the driving forces, it is my opinion that this is the strongest album, from first song to last, the Pretenders have ever released!



Traffic Far From Frome Virgin

Everything about this project exudes the essence of what Traffic was all about! They had that certain "something" which made them

stand apart. Far From Home reassures us the magic still exists. When it comes to creating music as Traffic, Winwood's voice suddenly has more soul and anguish, the extended guitar solos and "controlled" jams give an improvisational air bordering on jazz, and Capaldi's driving poly-rhythms and percussive accents add that special flair. Throughout, there is always that big ol' Hammond organ and, finally, the flute and sax lines make Traffic's signature sound complete.

On the other side, the lyrical content of the songs is just as intelligent and thoughtful as Traffic's past work. "Here Comes The Man" reminds us there is nothing more powerful and stable than true love and an honest relationship. "Far From Home" explores the myriad of roads we may travel in our lives that can take us away from our roots. "Nowhere Is There Freedom" addresses the hardship and horror so many of the people of the world still face. "Holy Ground" is a spiritual reminder of how sacred the earth really is. "Some Kinda Woman" is about how some women fully realize the inherent power of their femininity. And "State Of Grace" touches on the realization that the sorrows in the world shouldn't override the basic blessedness of life.

In the tradition of high standards established with albums like Low Spark Of High Heeled Boys and Fantasy Factory, Steve Winwood and Jim Capaldi have created a musical experience that is moving, mature and very inspirational.

Marvin

Weapons Of The Spirit

Marvin goes beyond the boundaries of your typical singer/ songwriter. He has been a strong, behind-the-scenes influence for a while now, having produced Toad The Wet Sprocket and Peter Case. He also co-



wrote three of the songs on Maria McKee's last album, has a song on the upcoming album from Susanna Hoffs (of the Bangles) and contributed a lot of material to the Williams Brothers. He has now decided to come to the forefront with his solo release, Weapons Of The Spirit.

The first thing that will strike you about his music is its optimism and clean production. There is a spiritual quality to his songs that comes through loud and clear. The instrumentation features a basic rhythm section, keyboards, acoustic guitar (with some electric guitar spice), a little sax and violin, and his ever-present mandolin. His vocal style is raw and passionate. Most of the material is straightforward folk-rock, but you will detect some subtle Celtic and Middle Eastern influences. Structurally, he is definitely pushing the boundaries of

traditional song values.

Songs that I particularly like are "Temple And Shrine" and "Man On A Tightrope (Leap Of Faith)," both of which feature McKee on vocals along with Marvin. "Daughter Of The Rainbow" has Victoria Williams sharing vocals, and "Weapons Of The Spirit" and "Kingdom Within" showcase Marvin's own persuasive vocal style. All of these songs explore the dichotomy between that which is eternal (spiritual) and that which is temporal (material).

Marvin's music has the earthy quality of Arlo Guthrie with the easygoing sway of Lone Justice or Cowboy Junkies. Weapons Of The Spirit is a unique collection of songs that are well worth your attention.

The Neville Brothers

Live From Planet Earth

Can you spell the word E-V-E-N-T? The Neville Brothers have taken their interpre-tation of the New Orleans sound around the world several times over the past 15 years. They have performed over 200 dates a year, and the



energy and vibe of their live show is renowned. Now all that magic has been captured at various live dates throughout 1993. To cap off the celebration of this release, The Neville Brothers will be performing at this year's 25th Anniversary of Jazz Fest.

All the great classic tunes by "the bros" are included, as well as nine tracks that have never been on previous Neville releases. Included are "Shake Your Tambourine," "Voodoo," "Brother Jake," "Yellow Moon," "Her African Eyes," "Love The One You're With/You Can't Always Get What You Want," "One Love/People Get Ready/Sermon" and the emphasis track, "Congo Square." All these and six more fully represent The Neville Brothers' unique gumbo blend of pop, R&B, jazz, and the nistorical New Orleans sound championed by such artists as The Meters and Art Neville with the Hawkettes.

The band has come a long way since their initial gathering under the moniker of The Wild Tchoupitoulas in 1976. And, it's hard to believe that it wasn't until 1989 that their true talent was recognized with a Grammy Award for Yellow Moon (for Best Pop Instrumental). Now, the whole world shall know and experience what has been called, by many, the best live show on the planet.



Spirit Of The West

Faithlift

Spirit Of The West has been Canada's best kept secret for over 10 years, but that is about to change with their Elektra US debut release, Faithlift. Believe it or not. this is actually their sixth album. The past couple of



releases by SOTW have onne Gold in their native land. opening the door for them in Europe and, now, the States.

Spirit Of The West has an engaging sound. It could loosely be classified as heavy folk-rock, but this label falls short in conveying the group's strong sense of melody, dynamics and multi-level harmonies. Each song on Faithlift has its own special quality, be it the flowing melody and ominous message in "Bone Of Contention" or the bouncy sound of "And If Venice Is Sinking," with its quippy lyrics and instrument-specific arrangement. Other songs of note are "Mum's The Word," a serious song about a sad incident in the small mining town of Yellowknife. "6th Floor," which was inspired by the band's visit to the Old Texas Schoolbook Depository in Dallas, and "Death On The Beach," which features a pleasant groove juxtaposed with a sobering message

Spirit Of The West's members, John Mann (lead vocals and guitar), Vince Ditrich (drums), Hugh McMillian (bass and keyboards), Linda MacRae (bass and accordion) and Geoffery Kelly (guitar and flute), all seem to share the common vision that Mann and Kelly create with their songs. Their music is cohesive, catchy and well-

Leon Redbone's music is American music - the best of where America has come from and the place where American roots can still feed the imagination. He has always represented the ultimate example of "cool," and with Whistling In The Wind, his fourth release for Private Music, this has not changed.

Just about any track will satisfy your "Redbone jones," but some guest appearances are worth mentioning. "When I Kissed That Girl Goodbye" features the harmony talents of Roger McGuinn. "Settin' By The Fire" is a duet with Merle Haggard, and the zany "Little Grass Shack" has Ringo Starr adding his own unique vocal delivery

Leon Redbone stands alone in the style of music he performs. He has satisfied and entertained audiences for almost 30 years. His past radio success and his constant television exposure make him a great candidate for airplay at Adult Rock Radio

Steve Ellis

Pleasures Of The Past

Steve Ellis is a plumber and tiler from Northhampton, England. Music has always been his passion, and he will readily credit artists such as Elvis Costello, Paul Weller and Matt Johnson as giving him the impetus to give it a go as a singer/songwriter/performer. His Pleasures Of The Past, produced by Ed Roynesdale (Joe Jackson), who also contributes his talent on keyboards, is a solid debut

Ellis' cited influences are evident in most of the material on the album, as there is that urgent, quitardriven, uptempo feel that pervades throughout. His songs are about everyday life and how people deal with it. I would like to suggest you give a listen to "Where I'll Be," "You Make The Call," "Slave To It" and the title track.

There is already a buzz out there on Steve Ellis, and a handful of stations have added Pleasures Of The Past Now is a good time to give it a listen.

Johnny Cash

American Recordings

American Recordings

The title of Johnny Cash's latest album is American Recordings There is a double meaning here. It is his first group of recordings for his new record label, American Recordings, and it is Cash at his most basic, doing music that is purely American in origin.



What we have is Cash and his ol' gitter, givin' us songs about women, childhood, traveling, patriotism, faith and slices of America's past. No frills, no flash, just the man

The album was produced by Rick Rubin. The concept from the get-go was to make an album of just Johnny Cash. In his own words, "I have wanted to do this album all my life. I'm more proud of this album than anything else I have ever done. This is me!" It is hard to suggest tracks (they're all so good), but a few really touched me. They are "The Beast In Me," "Bird On A Wire," "Down There By The Train," "Redemption" and "The Man Who Couldn't Cry.

Lest you think Johnny Cash may not be right for your station, think again. He is an American institution. He has had 26 albums on the pop charts. He has won seven Grammys and 23 BMI Songwriting Awards. He has sold over 50 million records. He is the only living entertainer to be awarded the "Triple Crown" - entrance into the Songwriters Hall of Fame, the Country Music Hall of Fame and the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame.

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

TOAD THE WET SPROCKET Dulcines COLUMBIA

In a world where so many rock bands look alike and sound alike, it is refreshing when a group whose music and approach is a little different works its way up through the ranks to Platinum-Plus success. Such is the case with Toad The Wet Sprocket. This Santa Barbara-based band initially formed in high school when lead vocalists/guitarists Glen Phillips and Todd Nichols joined with bassist Dean Denning and drummer Randy Guss. They built a strong following in the local club scene and eventually put out their own album, *Bread And Circus* (which was recorded in their living room for a total cost of \$650). This made them enough money in local sales to record their second album, *Pale*. In 1988, the record companies came calling and the band settled on Columbia, but insisted on their autonomy concerning the creative direction of their music. Their next release, *Fear*, sold well over one million copies and led to an extensive, two and a half year global tour.

Now Toad The Wet Sprocket is back with *Dulcinea* (named after Don Quixote's imaginary lover). The album shows tremendous growth for the band in their songwriting and in the fine tuning of their sound.

From the opening bars of the first emphasis track, "Fall Down," you will know we are in for a wonderful musical journey. It is uptempo and hooky, and the harmonies are incredible! The lyrics describe someone who fails to step in and help a friend in desperate need. Elsewhere in *Dulcinea* are songs of reserved beauty, such as "Inside" and "Begin," which tells a true story of a four year old girl's feelings about her father's death and offers some thoughts about life after death. "Reincarnation" takes this theme a little further. Other strong tunes include the Country and Western tinged "Nanci" and the powerful "Fly From Heaven."

Overall, the big chord guitar jangle is still there, as are the strong vocals and straightforward delivery. Lyrically, however, Toad The Wet Sprocket has matured considerably. *Dulcinea* is a thoughtful step forward for the band.

Chris Herriges is a young artist based in the Twin Cities area. He has been developing a strong regional following for the past few years and, consequently, he put out this fine

EP in autumn of last year. The regional press has likened his guitar playing to that of Pete Townshend or Mark Knopfler, and his vocals have been compared to those of Phil Collins and Steve Winwood.

Bit by bit, Herriges has been building a story at mainstream Rock Radio, and now some Adult Rock stations are also beginning to show interest, thanks to the recent reservice of his debut EP, *Long, Cold Road*. It contains four tracks that aptly represent his vocal, guitar and, of course, songwriting skills.

Two tracks would work well at our format: The title track and "In Your Time.' Pay close attention to this bright new artist.


We have a feeling the House Of Blues will be *the* place to be in the City Of Angels for a long time to come!






It looks like Azoff's interest in SYN (a band we

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
Greta Lineup Wobbly

Mercury fuckers Greta ficed a career crushing blow when band frontman Paul Plagens dropped into a substance abuse rehabilitation center here in Los Angeles recently...but the band managed to embark on an East Coast tour anyway!

How did they manage a tour without their lead vocalist? Jeff Charroux, vocalist of Ultra Violet Eye, subbed for Plagens.

"We assumed the band wouldn't be able to do the tour," Mercury's Mike Sikkas told the "LA Times." "On a creative level, it didn't really fly...but after considerable discussion - and Paul was in the loop on all of this - rather than disrupt the momentum and have the whole band victimized, we chose to continue with the tour."

Plagens hopes to rejoin Greta for a string of dates with Motorhead, starting this weekend.



Q: What's the difference between cheating on your wife and cheating on your taxes?

"To be honest, we weren't going to put it out," Kaufman told the "Times." "But it seemed important to have people see another side of [Koresh]. It just didn't feel right leaving it in our closet."

The album was released with the permission of Koresh's mother, who asked that some of its profits go to a young girl fathered by Koresh. But Kaufman doesn't expect to make much money from the limited release (only 3,000 copies have been pressed). He's more interested in the publicity this release could bring his label and the independent bands he's produced.

When the Doris Tate Crime Victims Bureau learned of the CD, they expressed the same sentiment they held for the Guns N' Roses track - anger. "Mr. Koresh hurt a lot of people," stated Kelly Rudiger, executive director of the organization. "No one should be able to make money on things like that."

Waco Rock?

And you thought Guns N' Roses got slammed when they released an album that featured a cover of a Charles Manson tune...well, a tiny independent label in the heartland of America might even top that furor with their recent release - an EP featuring spoken word and music from deceased Branch Davidian leader David Koresh!

Just like Manson, Koresh had dreams of becoming a rock n' roll star, and lived in Hollywood while pursuing a recording career.

According to the "LA Times," the record, entitled *Voice Of Fire*, features a lengthy biblical oration by Koresh, in addition to his "shaky but passable singing" and competent guitar work on two acoustic tunes, "Book Of Daniel" and "Sheshonahim."

The EP's being released by the Iowa-based indie label Junior's Motel, whose owner, Kirk Kaufman, had a connection to the charismatic, yet ultimately deadly, leader: Kaufman's girlfriend, Sandy Berlin, knew Koresh in the early 80s.

According to Kaufman, Koresh had kept in touch with Berlin, occasionally attempting to convince her to join his compound in Waco, TX. Apparently, Berlin acquired some tapes of Koresh, which were compiled into the CD release.
