

Barely nine months after the release of his last full-length disc, John Mellencamp returned this week with the first single from Dance Naked, a new CD to be released in mid-June. With a hoop and a holler, and the kinda celebration that John deserves, his reading of this Van Morrison classic, "Wild Night," is easily the #1 Most Added cut at Rock Radio this week.

"Wild Night" nabs 118 adds at Rock Radio, with KDKB, KLOL, WLVQ, WDVE, WFBQ, KYYS, WMMR and WNEW among them. Also, with at least three spins a day reported by WZBH, WGCX, KOZE, WZZO and WYMG, this one screams out of the box and right onto the Power Cuts chart at #57* and slams a Homer! Moreover, "Wild Night" is also the #1 Most Added track at Adult Rock Radio, and will chart high next week, and it is the #4 Most Added single at Top 40 Radio.

With John giving "Wild Night" his own flavor, and with the awesome vocals from Me'Shell NdegeOcello, this song is destined for multi-format success. And, watch for Mellencamp's two-month long tour to kick off in August; it will start on the east coast and work its way westward, with the final shows tentatively scheduled for Indianapolis.




"Cleopatra's Cat" is a funky blend of rock/jazz that rests firmly in its own groove. Look for large volumes of out of the box adds, and watch for *Turning It Upside Down*, the band's first CD in more than two years, which hits June 14.

Bon Jovi

"Good Guys Don't Always Wear White" Sony 550 Music/Epic Soundtrax

The last time Jon did some music for a soundtrack, Kiefer Sutherland was one of the stars and the flick was a western. Well, it's deja vu all over again, because Jon, Richie, Alec, David and Tico have contributed this rocker to the soundtrack for the upcoming "Cowboy Way," which stars Woody Harrelson and, you guessed it, Kiefer.

"Good Guys Don't Always Wear White" is a guitar workout for Sambora, while Jon's vocal stance is all grit n' growl. Sony 550 is working this one for Epic Soundtrax, and you can count on a major blitz from the new label.



Stabbing Westward "Nothing"

It ain't grunge and it ain't heavy metal. It ain't industrial, either, but Stabbing Westward's "Nothing" certainly contains aspects of each of these three musical forces. Simply stated, "Nothing," from Ungod, the Chicago-based band's debut effort, is a very cool, stirring hard rock song. In listening to it, we

The early story on "Nothing" is heavy phones at WXTB, and Rock Radio should delight in the opportunity to start the ball rolling in earnest.

"Fade Away" features Sharleen Spiteri's attitude-soaked voice, which sounds like no other lady singer's out there. The guitars are heavy and the beat is insistent.

Find this one on both Rock CD TuneUps #112 and #114; KEZE, WEQX, WGLF and KMTN are among the stations already on "Fade Away."



3rd Matinee"I Don't Care"

You already know this band under the moniker of Toy Matinee. A slightly revamped lineup warranted the name alteration (songwriter/ producer/keyboardist Pat Leonard has now teamed up with ex-Mr. Mister leader Richard Page), but the sound is consistent with "Last Plane Out" and other tracks from the Toy Matinee CD that Rock Radio played extensively. This musically seductive comment on the nature of apathy kicks off Meanwhile at both Rock and Adult Rock Radio (where it was #4 Most Added in its first week out).

Music From The "Backbeat" Soundtrack "Money"

Virgin

The movie is not so much about The Beatles, as much as it is about the relationship between original bassist Stu Sutcliffe, John Lennon and photographer Astrid Kirchherr.

This Don Was production captures the raw energy of The Beatles in the late 50s and early 60s, as performed by a veritable supergroup of today's rock and alternative heavies: R.E.M.'s Mike Mills, Soul Asylum's Dave Pirner, Nirvana's Dave Grohl, Afghan Whigs' Greg Dulli, Sonic Youth's Thurston Moore and Gumball's Dave Fleming. These players and singers don't sound exactly like The Beatles, but the excitement, the thrill and the exhilaration is all there.

The Hatters

"Dig The Ribbit"

This one feels like a time warp right outta the 70s, when Little Feat reigned supreme. And yet, "Dig The Ribbit" is also a kissin' cousin to the kind of organic rock being made by Big Head Todd And The Monsters, Blues Traveler and other "H.O.R.D.E." type bands.

The Madcap Adventures Of The Avocado Overlord is the freshman release from The Hatters, which is a New York-via-Philadelphia band. "Dig The Ribbit" is a hoppin' tune that will get under yer skin (as well as that of your adult demos) and refuse to come out.

Robin Trower

"20th Century Blues"

For his first album in four years, Robin has recorded on his own label, giving him the freedom to make the music he wanted to make. Thus, "20th Century Blues" (which is the title track of his forthcoming new CD) is in the hard rockin' blues vein of his early 70s output, and it is among his finest work in years.

Trower will be opening up for Peter Frampton on selected dates this summer, and "20th Century Blues" is on our Rock CD TuneUp #115; for more info, call Derek Sutton at V12: (213) 660-2553.

Huey Lewis & The News

Four Chords And Several Years Ago

The rock n' roll made by Huey Lewis & The News has always been steeped in the 50s, so if they made an album of their interpretations of classic R&B tunes, it wouldn't be that much of a stretch. For their first time out on new label Elektra, Huey and the boys are doing just that, a la Honeydrippers. And they haven't just gone in and updated these gems, either. No, Huey Lewis & The News have given them exactly the treatment they deserve, keeping the original feel (even to the point of covering the initial recordings of some of these cuts, even if somebody else had a bigger pop hit with them later).

The first single from Four Chords & Several Years Ago is "(She's) Some Kind Of Wonderful," and we also recommend "Your Cash Ain't Nothin' But Trash," which Stevie "Guitar" Miller had a hit with in the 70s, "Good Morning Little School Girl," "She Shot A Hole In My Soul" and "Going Down Slow."

Atomic Shelter

"Chinese Bike"

East Europe Records

"Chinese Bike" is a hook-filled, mid-tempo rocker, which combines deep lyrics with a Scorpions-style hard pop/rock sound. The first single from Atomic Shelter's 12th album, *East Europe Man*, has logged more than 100 PPWs for a couple of straight weeks, at stations like KEZE, KATP, WOZN and KQXR. On "Chinese Bike," Bruno Langer leads his band out of war-torn Croatia, bringing awareness and emotion with him.

Soundgarden

"Black Hole Sun"

With "Spoonman" still owning more than 2,775 PPWs at Rock Radio (and while Superunknown is still the #1 CD at RAWk Radio), A&M has designated this killer cut for Rock Radio emphasis. And why not? It is already logging better than 1,000 plays with no official push!

Chris Cornell, Kim Thayil, Ben Shepherd and Matt Cameron are hotter than hell these days, and this "Lucy In The Sky With Diamonds"-type tune comes from the #1-selling, multiformat smash Superunknown CD. Rock Radio cannot avoid "Black Hole Sun"!

U2"All I Want Is You"

"All I Want Is You" never got the attention it deserved when it came out five and a half years ago on U2's Rattle And Hum CD. Now this gem is getting added by tastemaker stations in cities like LA (KLOS and KROQ are both on it), Chicago and Minneapolis. Why? Because it is featured on the Platinum-selling, Top 10 Reality Bites soundtrack.

"All I Want Is You" was written and recorded by U2 in the 80s, so it has the style and sound that made the band international heroes. Add it, play it and live with the positive results.

George Thorogood & The Destroyers "Killer's Bluze"

Lonesome George and his band of bluesmen have already taken three hits from the *Haircut* CD to Rock Radio. Now comes "Killer's Bluze," just as Thorogood hits the road with ZZ Top; anyone who has ever seen George or the Topsters knows *that* will be one mutha of a good time boogie show.

"Killer's Bluze" is an electric blues burner that takes a satirical look at marriage, done up in a way that only George and his sense of humor could do (sample line: "I'm going to jail/Prison don't scare me none/Because after living with you/Doing time would be fun").

Dig
"Unlucky Friend"

Last summer, Dig's self-titled debut was picked by our Retail types as a Best Buy. When our Alternative department premiered its Virtuallyalternative magazine a few months back, it chose Dig to grace the cover. Recently, "Believe" was a surprise Top 20 hit at Rock Radio, garnering consistent airplay for weeks and weeks and weeks, and ultimately finding its way onto more than 100 Rock Radio reporters.

Like "Believe," "Unlucky Friend" is raw, rough, rugged and crammed full of spunk and accessibility ("spunkability," if you will). In fact, the opening to this song goes way out of tune, giving it a very "alternative" and hip feel. You'll dig, er, love it.







It's Time To Kick The R&R Habit

Last week, Album Network voiced very determined opinions (on page 13 if you somehow missed the diatribe) concerning R&R's Plays Per Week chart, which gives unreasonable weighting to a handful of major market stations, and dismisses the value of songs receiving less than five spins weekly. This week, many of our radio reporters responded with their reactions.

"Duh! I've been in radio long enough to know Arbitron is arbitrary, and so now is the new R&R chart!" Pam Brooks, WHCN

"I thought the Plays Per Week editonal Tommy and Donna put together was not only eye-opening, but really needed! One thing you left out, however: Of the four trades taking Plays Per Week for reports, three of them count spins beginning on "add" day. One of them goes from Sunday to Sunday. This does not seem to really make a huge difference. But...with this example it could: Most programmers put new tunes in on add day, or at midnight the following day (Wednesday, 12:01am). This means there are two or three spins not recorded for Plays Per Week. If there were five spins not shown because of this, multiplied by 165 stations - you're off by up to 800 possible spins, compared to other charts. By the way, the only trade that doesn't go along with the other three is R&R!" Tim Travis, WDIZ

"I totally agree with you! I've had problems with R&R myself, and your editorial was right on." Becca Goodman, KEZO

"I think the R&R chart is an anti-music chart. I don't like seeing myself rated so low and Classic Rock stations rated so high. In general, the weighting system is bullshit! If you have to weight, shouldn't you be weighting the successful stations more heavily? This weighting system leaves itself open to too much manipulation. It was a useless chart before and it's even more useless now, because it makes no sense. I think R&R gave the big finger to any station outside of the Top 25 markets. When I called earlier in the year and spoke to Cyndee Maxwell, every answer I got indicated that R&R is only concerned about satisfying the record companies and not concerned with radio and the music we play. Maybe they should just be called 'R,' for 'Records.' I can play in the game, but I

don't really matter. Don't mind me, I'll just head to the back of the bus." Dave Rossi, WAVF

"Bear with me...I'm on the air, spinning new music and obviously making no impact on Central New York, as far as R&R is concerned (third from the bottom, third from last - reaching tivo markets - weighted 1.0). Sorry, my diatribe continues... important point: As ballsy as your editorial is - as fed up with the suits at R&R as I am - how can I, who relies on record company support, word-of-mouth product and promotions - deny the fact that when I'm coaxed into a last minute 'add,' the only 'trade' that I must call is R&R? This from the mouths of record label promo people, the very same people who say, out of one side of their mouths, 'You're

important to us, your add is important to us, even if you weren't an R&R reporter.' Push comes to shove, R&R status will matter until RECORD COMPANIES change - are they not at fault for R&R's 'lofty' status?! If I did indeed get equal treatment without R&R - don't you think I'd do without 'em? Don't you think we all would? I'm not convinced." Mimi Griswold, WKLL/WKRL


"Why the hell won't R&R accept a report for any record that receives less than five spins? This is ludicrous. We're rotating two Allman Brothers tunes, in addition to the single, that received four and three spins each. That's an extra seven spins to give the album a total of 33 plays last week. Why is this not significant in the eyes of R&R? Aren't we ALBUM Rock stations? The Motley Crue album got seven spins last week between two cuts, but you won't see that in R&R because it was four and three spins each.

Because of their 'five or more' policy, a total of 43 spins on current records are not reported this week. Wake up, R&R! Every spin counts!" T.J. Bryan, WDHA

"I never believed that I would feel this way...but today, I'm glad I'm not a reporter to R&R. After looking at their 'new' charts, I'm laughing at not only the 'total points' column but also their 'add factor.' Tell the fine folks at Zoo Entertainment about their newly signed band Great White. Here's a record that had 15 R&R adds, 45 total stations and 338 plays last week. It's not charted. Yet, Peter Frampton's monthsold 'Day In The Sun' is at #43 with 0 adds, 19 total stations and 292 spins...great chart? Not only is The Album Network the leader of presenting Plays Per Week in print, but they're doing it right. There is no other publication that provides as much information, detail and band support. All R&R does is give bogus charts. Why have they never supported the bands they chart? R&R seems to be in the Chart business. The Album Network is in the Music business. In the commentary printed last week by Tommy Nast and Donna Geisinger, they hit the nail on the head. By not setting up silly play requirements of three plays per day or whatever, the AN is letting radio do radio the way it has to - whether the heavies play 2x or 8x a day. Each market is different. By 'making' their reporters do things they wouldn't do normally, R&R is a big bad machine getting ready to blow a rod. 'Let them eat cake'?...I could think of worse endings. Keep up the good work. You're the best." Michael Cross, KJKJ

"In response to last week's R&R editorial in AN, I just have to say that I applaud my former employers for having the balls to tell it like it is! To state in today's Rock Radio environment that less than five plays in a week has no impact when you're generating cume in the hundreds of thousands, is just not correct. And it's nice to see the industry generating its focus toward the meat and potatoes of what it's all about: airplay. I will commend the first person who comes up with a system that weights the size of a market or the call letters as a conversion of radio airplay vs. retail sales. But in the meantime, I think the thing to do is to keep things as simple as possible, because comparing airplay against retail is the only thing that has any weight." Lex Staley, WFYV



World Radio History

Tou gotta love this story: LA girl moves to the northeast to pursue a career in music; girl moves back to LA and puts out nine albums which showcase an eclectic blend of blues, pop, R&B, soul and rock, flavored ever so slightly with a bit of folk roots; girl grows gracefully into a woman as she wins over a modest and faithful audience of folks enthralled by her slide guitar work and her soft, reassuring voice; woman endears herself to her fans and peers alike as a tireless humanitarian, championing such causes as ecological concerns, planned parenthood, the anti-nuclear movement and the Rhythm & Blues Foundation; woman wins a trio of Grammy statuettes and proceeds to watch her modest and faithful audience explode into the stratosphere; woman becomes an "overnight" sensation, after 18 years.





1989's Nick Of Time reached #1 and has now sold in excess of 4,000,000 copies in the US. In 1991, Luck Of The Draw was a #2-selling album, and it is owned by more than 5,000,000 Americans; it also earned its creator three Grammys.

"Making quality records was our only intent at the time," says VP/A&R Tim Devine, who brought Bonnie to Capitol in 1988. "When those albums took off the way they did, we were all blown away."

Perhaps less surprising at this point, Longing In Their Hearts was released to an overwhelmingly positive response, which came fast and furious in the form of multi-format radio play and sales. Bonnie had done it again.

Bonnie will be rehearsing for her upcoming world tour later this afternoon (she will play in North America from July to Thanksgiving, with Bruce Hornsby opening the shows), but at the moment, she has called me to discuss *Longing In Their Hearts*, the tour, and whatever else might come up.

Who is in the touring band with you?

"A lot of the same people I've had for a while, and some of the rhythm section from the last three albums; my bass player, 'Hutch' Hutchinson, has been with me for 10 years now, and [drummer] Ricky Fataar, who played on my Green Light album in 82, and then came back to do Nick Of Time, actually joined my road band after Luck Of The Draw. Debra Dobkin is our percussionist and vocalist, and [I have] a guitar player, George Marinelli, who used to be in The Range - I'm a huge fan of his. And an old friend of mme, Mark T. Jordan - not Marc Jordan from Canada; he played on my second album, and I've known him over the years, playing with Jackson Browne, Van Morrison, Dave Mason and Taj Mahal - different bands. And Glen Clark, who has been in my band since Luck Of The Draw, is on harp and B3 and some other keyboards, and vocals, as well."

Don Was and Ed Cherney have been with you for three albums, producing and engineering. What do they bring to the process that makes you want to stick with them?

"Well, for starters, I pick the musicians and the songs, basically, and do the work to come up with the music. What I'm looking for in a producer - and the reason my records are really co-productions, and always have been - is another set of ears, a perspective, somebody to pick up the slack when I need a break, somebody to ask, 'What do you think? Should we let the guy play it one more time, or was that it?' So, what I'm looking for is just a compatible help-mate, and somebody with some perspective, which Don has. Not only is he one of the nicest people as a person, but [he's easy] to work with in the studio, because he's so unobtrusive and non-egotistical. He doesn't really try to foist any foreign ideas onto [me]...he knows that I know what I wanna do, and he's just trying to help me get there.

"And I would say the same for Ed Cherney. If you're not a fan of somebody's playing or engineering, you shouldn't even consider working with them.

"So, there would be no reason for me to change from the group of people I'm with, because I get everything I need."

After you won your first slew of Grammy awards in 1990, you said, 'Those of us who do rhythm & blues are gonna get a chance again.' What are your thoughts on that statement now? Artists like Delbert McClinton and John Hiatt have enjoyed more attention at Rock Radio in the last couple of years, perhaps as a result of your success.

"Yeah, it's opened up a little bit, but I still would love to see some of my favorite R&B artists get good songs, good producers and good deals with record companies, and get to be on the radio again.

"I think the crux of a great record is good material. We all know there are terrific singers out there that haven't had hits lately, because they're just not finding the songs that cut through."

And yet you find gobs of 'em.

"I don't find gobs - I work really hard and listen to

hundreds and hundreds of tapes of junk before I find something. The hardest thing I do is look for songs. It's very, very difficult. I'd say 90% of what I get is totally mediocre."

On Longing In Their Hearts, there are seven songs that you've found outside. Would you say those seven were, by and large, instantly obvious to you?

"When you find a good one, it stands out like a diamond, you know?

"Where the hard work comes in, and where the craft comes in, for me, is in picking songs that are all gonna fit together, that go with my style, that I can somehow bring a sensibility to that's different than the original."

What went on inside of you during the process of making Longing In Their Hearts? Did any of your newfound enormous popularity weigh on you?

"Not really. You would think I would feel pressure, but each time I go in to make a record I've got my hands fiall: I wanna find 10 or 12 great new songs to sing, so I can go out and play 'em. I've got fans that have been with me

since the early days, that can't wait to hear what I'm gonna come up with - [which] includes all my friends, my band and me. What [I] love to do most is play live, and [I] have to have new material to be more satisfied and fulfilled as a performer and as an artist.

"When I have the greatest songs I can find at any given point, there's not anything that anybody else can say that'll make it better or worse. I've got my own standard to live up to. I don't wanna disappoint myself or other people.

"Whether [or not] my records sold in the 70s to the same level that they sell now doesn't really affect anything about the process of making the record. At each juncture, you just do the best you can with the songs that are available. I would never be able to compromise my style. There wouldn't be any reason for me to continue in music if I ever did something I didn't believe in."

So, your success hasn't changed the personal standard to which you aspire?

"Next year I could do my best and 300,000 people could buy the record, and I'd still think it was incredible that 300,000 people liked it. It's not a real thing to me, these numbers they tell me that I sell, because I basically live the same lifestyle, I'm playing with a similar set of musicians that I've always played with, and doing a similar style of

music. I'm growing as a songwriter and trying to be better on every level of my performance and my music, but the marketplace's reaction to me does not faze me.

"Of course it's more fun to be successful and be able to pay people what they're worth, and take on projects like the Rhythm & Blues Foundation, and actually make a difference in political campaigns. [But], if the point is to get the joy that made you wanna get into music in the first place, you have to get that from what you're doing, or it's not worth it. So, whether I have a zillion-selling record or a modest-selling one, that doesn't really matter to me. And I mean that as sincerely as I could possibly say it. But I'm really grateful that people like Longing In Their Hearts. I was surprised that Luck Of The Draw did as well as it did, and I'm really, really grateful that I didn't get slagged on this one, because I know the laws of gravity are that eventually people start knocking you."

In late March, Longing In Their Hearts debuted on our Hottest Sales Nationwide chart at #2; the following week it went to #1 (Editor's Note: It has been in the Top 10 every week since).

"That's incredible. I did three months of promotion, but Capitol really organized a hell of a campaign. Between my management and Capitol, they did some stuff that just blew me away: TV ads during the Oscars; Tower Records ran a call-in thing, where you could call an 800 number and hear two cuts off my record - and 30,000 people called! I mean, I can't even believe this! I've been sittin' here in the morning, gettin' up, riding my bike around the lake and going off to rehearsal, so it doesn't really feel any different than it did when Sweet Forgiveness came out."

In your last two answers, you have talked about how it's nice to have money so you can

"pay people what they're worth," and, when I mentioned your early sales success on the new album, you didn't say, "Wow, I guess I made a good album," you gave all the credit to Capitol. I think those two statements paint a nice picture about you, and so I'm very happy for you having this success.

"I wish I could say it was me, but, God, you know what it's like - you could have a great record, and if you didn't have any support, nobody would know it. I've seen some very close friends of mine have really good records and their record companies kinda dropped the ball.

"I know how frustrating it is to go out on the road and not have the ads in the newspapers and not have the records in the stores. And, when you get the support that I've had, it's...like that expression on 'Saturday Night Live,' 'like buttah.' You

know what I mean? It's such a relief and a pleasure to be in the music business, being in my position right now. I can do whatever I want, and get nothing but support for it.



Is it a big ol' smokescreen, or shades of things to come? Official word should be out by the end of this week....

Retail Regi\$ter

BMG is running a national threemonth sales and marketing promotion called "Galaxy Of Stars," in which all nine of their branches are in competition with each other to create and execute the best/most effective "Galaxy Of Stars" promotion.

BMG's California branch purchased and decorated a beautiful 1961 Ford Galaxie 500 automobile (check out the accompanying photos!) with artist logos and vinyl laminates featuring such stars as Whitney Houston, Rollins Band, Toni Braxton, Shaquille O' Neal, Alan Jackson, Pam Tillis, Elvis Preslev and many more. Anywhere the car stops, cassette singles are given away and in-store ballot boxes have been set up at retail to allow consumers to enter a drawing to win the car as is (it includes a 10-CD changer, an assortment of BMG "Galaxy Of Stars" CD titles and a new engine!). The car appeared at retail outlets in such cities as Palm Springs, Phoenix, San Diego and Los Angeles, and it will be traveling up to Northern California to tour that market until Memorial Day weekend, then it will be given away to a lucky winner.

Each retail store that agreed to participate in the promotion is required to put up a "GOS" display, in addition to pricing and positioning key "GOS" titles in their store during the time each visit takes place, as well as for a few days after the car leaves, so that people can listen to their sampler cassettes and return to the store to buy the product on sale.

■ April Showers Gold And Platinum

During the first quarter of this year,

RIAA Gold and Platinum Album certifications were up by 214 over the same period in 1993. Among the albums and singles that can boast awards this April is Nirvana's In Utero, which became the second album for the band to go multi-Platinum, as it passed the two million mark. The queen of rap, Queen Latifah, solidified her power by becoming the first-ever, woman solo rap artist to receive a Gold award, which was earned for Black Reign. The unstoppable janet, was certified as it passed the six million mark in sales (her second release to achieve this rank), and it was joined at the multi-Platinum level by Ten Summoner's Tales at the three million mark, from Grammy Award-winning artist Sting. The powerful soundtrack Philadelphia continues to break ground, and it was awarded a much-deserved Platinum certification. Another soundtrack, Reality Bites, went Gold a little over two months after its release, as did The Downward Spiral from Nine Inch Nails. God Shuffled His Feet from the Crash Test Dummies walked away with a Platinum award.

Out for a little less than three months, the single "Gin And Juice," from Snoop Doggy Dogg, went Gold; Tim McGraw's "Indian Outlaw" also earned a Gold award; and Beck landed his own Gold single award for "Loser." Almost becoming an endangered species, the Platinum single award managed to find three new homes: Celine Dion's "Power Of Love," Ace Of Base's "The Sign" and Salt 'N Pepa's "Whatta Man."

Other News And Views

We hear Evergreen Communications is about to debut a new 100,000-watt signal in the Boulder/Denver market. SBR Consulting will be involved in the implementation of the station's format, which is rumored to be Adult Rock. In fact, Ray Skibitsky, a founding member of SBR, will take over the GM duties at the station, the call letters of which will be announced shortly. Several people have resigned from KBCO in the past few days, including Program Director Doug Clifton, and a number of people from KBCO's sales staff. With the resources Evergreen has, it should be an interesting battle, with their new station going head on with Noble's KBCO!



Dookie is proving to be a strong store favorite, as it climbs 15-10* on the In-Store Play chart. The album surges upward to nab the #24* spot on the Hottest Sales Nationwide. 





Radioactive's Brendan Bourke and Lisa Christiano will be buying drinks all week in celebration of their first #1. Congratulations also to MCA's Gary Spivack, Gina Iorillo and Stephanie Morris, on the hours of work and support they've given this act. Needless to say, this couldn't have come at a better time, given that Live's touring schedule puts them in LA this weekend. For those of you asking if it's selling, how does a five-point jump into the Top 10 of the Alternative Sales Chart sound? Sounds like a record on the road to Gold to us....

By the time you read this, Jay Taylor and/or Infinity will have announced his final destination and new station. But why wait for the "official word," when we can throw some rumors around of our own? Rumor #1 has Jay exiting the Edge for a west coast station that everyone assumes to be KOME/San Jose. While this makes sense on a lot of levels (after all, it's no secret that KOME could have better numbers, and San Jose is a major market), still, we're not totally sold. Consider this: KOME is posturing itself as a classic rock station (this week they dropped a mother load of records), not to mention Live 105 has a fairly impressive presence in SJ (they have higher ratings in San Jose than in San Francisco - and they're doing pretty damn good in SF). Makes sense until you get to Rumor #3. Houston. Prime market, reasonable real estate, and everyone knows that an alternative station would kick some major ass there. Hmmm. There's only one drawback: Infinity doesn't have an FM there (although they do have a Spanish AM). Maybe it's not an Infinity station. There is a classic rocker that could use a boost in its ratings. Rumor #4: Jay Taylor is heading to New York to host "120 Minutes" - all right, we're just kidding. C'mon, get a sense of humor. Rumor #5: Infinity is a pretty smart company; so smart, in fact, that all these rumors could be just that - rumors. Burroughs stories, duty free shopping stories and tracks from the new Nova Mob CD, we were leveled. Few artists possess the insight and personality of Grant Hart, and fewer still can write songs with his depth and passion. Call Restless immediately for a copy....



Toad The Wet Sprocket debuts #6* on the Alternative Airplay chart this week with 765 spins, up from 229 last week. Only three records stand between them and the top chart position...Marc Kordelos, whose name was sadly and mistakenly maimed in last week's column, has agreed to perform (for radio) his infamous table dances in exchange for increased spins. We're not sure which is more scary, Marc cavorting on a table or Todd Bisson in a Barney costume - don't forget, similar behavior was behind John Wayne Gacy's woes (we can think of at least two programmers that Bisson would like to bury beneath his house). Velocity Girl

"Sorry Again"


For those who have narrow-mindedly viewed Sub Pop Records as a grunge label, the latest from Washington, DC's Velocity Girl is bound to surprise with its pristine pop sound. But "Sorry Again" is a perfect example of the band's evolution and an almost perfect three-minute pop song. KROQ has already recognized the potential of this track, adding it almost a month before its official release. Pleasing guitar melodies and a lilting beat pace "Sorry Again," but it's the vocal presence of singer Sarah Shannon, who turns a hook as well as any of her contemporaries, that really makes the track shimmer.

Velocity Girl's debut album, Copacetic, enjoyed healthy success at College Radio, is the second best selling album in Sub Pop history (lagging only behind Nirvana's Bleach) and won the band a steadfast following around the country. With the release of "Sorry Again" and the upcoming iSimpatico! album, Velocity Girl is ready to achieve a whole new level of success that should easily eclipse all previous milestones.

Beastie Boys

"Sabotage"
Grand Royal/Capitol

"Sabotage," the new single from the Beastie Boys' upcoming release, *III Communication*, features a stylistic continuation of the jaw-dropping punk/funk vibe that made *Check Your Head* such a smash. Indulging in the noise/rap crossover that they pioneered with their last record, MCA, King Ad Rock and Mike D. create a thrashing instrumental performance that is typically lyricized with the screaming whines





that have made the B-Boys such a nightmare to suburban parents. Once again, the Beastie Boys demonstrate how hip white folks can make a valuable contribution to a genre largely created by and for the African American community. This record will surely soon be found in the collections of punkers and hip-hoppers alike.

Eve's Plum

"Die Like Someone"

Sony 550 Music

The philosophy of taking things slow and letting a record develop is certainly paying off for Eve's Plum. Enthusiasm and reaction to the New York band has steadily grown over the past six months, with solid airplay and sales developing from the "I Want It All" single. Now, with the release of "Die Like Someone," the timing is right for Eve's Plum to stride confidently into the limelight. "Die Like Someone" offers more of Eve's Plum's ebullient brand of pop, combining pleasing guitar melodies with the charismatic vocal presence of singer Colleen to formulate another track that is loaded with radio appeal.

Overwhelming Colorfast

"Every Saturday"

Relativity

"Every Saturday" is the first single from Overwhelming Colorfast's new Two Words album, and it marks a new chapter in the evolution of this San Francisco Bay area band. "Every Saturday" features a healthy dose of melody, some Byrds-esque ringing guitar and a great hook in Bob Reed's songwriting, making this the best opportunity to date for commercial radio to get behind the band. Still present is the distortion-fueled guitar sound that characterizes Colorfast's live shows and has garnered the band an impressive following at College Radio.

Jah Wobble

"The Sun Does Rise" Island/PLG

Though his name has often floated between the lines, connoisseurs are well aware of the collaborative prowess of bassist Jah Wobble, whose delicate timing and thick sound have provided the backbone to PiL, The Orb's 40-minute "Blue Room" and many of visionary Bill Laswell's experiments in genre-bending. With his Invaders Of The Heart, Wobble incorporates a variety of musical styles, as the group's latest single, "The Sun Does Rise," amply proves. Wobble's unique basslines support Islamic-flavored guitar and ethereal keyboard textures, resulting




in an original tapestry of sound that is innovative and danceable. Guest vocalist Dolores O'Riordan of The Cranberries completes the portrait, giving "The Sun Does Rise" the lyrical element that transforms it into a powerful single.

Cause & Effect

"It's Over Now"

"It's Over Now" serves as a testament to the vitality and durability of Cause & Effect, a band almost torn asunder by the unexpected death of keyboardist/writer Sean Rowley in 1992. As devastating as the loss was, Cause & Effect have picked up the pieces and landed again with a new single that carries on Rowley's vision of the band.

The band's beat-oriented pop is only nearing its peak with "It's Over Now." Robert Rowe's smooth vocals work in tandem with keyboard textures to create a track fueled by edgy atmospherics. "It's Over Now" succeeds mostly due to Cause & Effect's ability to inject human feelings and moods into largely electronic music, an ability that has created a track filled with both emotion and hooks.



Lotion

"Head"

Chaos/spinART

New York City's Lotion have already created a stir this year with both their name and their music. The band's *Full Isaac* album gained the band notice from both College Radio and a California band of the same name, who promptly filed suit when Chaos signed the band. The name games are now behind the band, and Chaos is reissuing *Full Isaac* and the outstanding single, "Head."

After only a couple of listens to "Head," it's easy to hear why Lotion have attracted so much attention so quickly. "Head," with its artful blend of electric and acoustic guitars, has already gained airplay at several commercial alternative stations, including WHFS and WHTG. The song is built atop a shuffling groove, which Lotion uses as a base to launch a litany of dynamic changes which accelerate toward the song's energetic conclusion.

The Elastic Purejoy

The Elastic Purejoy World Domination

Dave Allen has never been a man to be content with past glories. As the bass player for both Gang Of Four and Shriekback, Allen has already achieved more artistic successes than most rock musicians dream of. Yet Allen continues to press his artistic boundaries outward with new projects such as Low Pop Suicide and now, The Elastic Purejoy.

For The Elastic Purejoy, Allen has virtually abandoned his bass (he plays on only three tracks) in favor of focusing on vocals and songwriting. The Elastic Purejoy is a step away from Allen's past work into a more atmospheric realm of popular music whose past residents include Brian Eno and Syd Barrett. The music concentrates on evoking moods and feelings with breezy melodies and thoughtful lyrics, rather than relying on the guitar and beat heavy sounds that dominate the airwaves today. Highlights from a very solid and consistent debut include a cover of Eno's "Stiff," "If Samuel Beckett Had Met Lenny Bruce," "An Element Of Doubt," and a cover of Sebadoh's "Of Soul And Fire."

Nick Cave And The Bad Seeds

"Nobody's Baby Now"
Mute/Elektra

"Nobody's Baby Now," the first single from Nick Cave And The Bad Seeds' latest Mute/Elektra release, Let Love In, marks a strong return to the songstyles that made Cave one of the more underground figures of this developing format. Cave's smooth baritone leads the way for sparse piano and chilling, twangy guitar, which combine in a gently swinging, introspective mood piece.

Though The Bad Seeds have changed somewhat from their original inception in the mid-80s, they continue to play as cohesively as ever, bringing Cave's vision to full musical fruition. "Nobody's Baby Now" reminds us that Nick Cave's offbeat appeal (which played so appropriately in his screen appearance in Wim Wenders' Wings Of Desire) has not skipped a beat.

Meat Puppets

"We Don't Exist"

London/PLG

Phoenix, Arizona's Meat Puppets have come a long way from their days as touring mates with SST acts such as Husker Du and the Minutemen. Though most of their contemporaries met with dissolution or death, the Meat Puppets have continued to evolve, adhering to their high standard of composition while still managing to acquire a major deal with PolyGram. "We Don't Exist," the latest single from Too High To Die. demonstrates the band's aptitude for crafting songs that intelligently combine breakneck punk rhythms, country-esque guitar pickin' and an over-the-top rock n' roll approach. Expect "We Don't Exist" to follow "Backwater"'s successful path; with an album that features the mixing talents of Dave Jerden and the production genius of the Butthole Surfers' Paul Leary, the success is hardly a surprise.



After a seeming eternity waiting for 1993's / Mekons, it's fair to be shocked that album #11 is here so soon. Yet here it is, and one of the world's best live bands has done it again. Retreat From Memphis captures the diversity of the Mekons' styles while revealing the guitar snarl and brevity of their live shows. There's so much to choose from here, from reggae to pure sonic fuzz, and the Mekons do it all with ease, as if they're reinventing post-punk pop with each song. It's hard to believe everyone doesn't know about the Mekons by now, but Retreat From Memphis may well be the reason radio gives them their due. Possible cuts: "The Flame That Killed John Wayne," "Submerged," "Ice Rink In Berlin" and "Insignificance."

Dog Eat Dog has blended hardcore, hip-hop, rap, metal, thrash, horns and just about anything you can think of into a memorable musical collage. Whatever track you listen to, you can feel the beat of the street and the universal approach this band prefers. "No Fronts" seems to capture the unpretentious, honest essence of the band the best, thanks to its anthemic vibe. These guys are in it for nothing but the fun of it.

"Afterlife"

The veteran team of Bob Kulick (guitar), Graham Bonnet (vocals) and Jimmy Waldo (keyboards) is the heart of Blackthorne, and between them they've come up with 10 new, gravelly-voiced and guitar-walloped cuts. 



My Dying Bride

One of the coolest, but seemingly overlooked records this year is My Dying Bride's Turn Loose The Swans. It is here that we pay homage to these North Yorkshire deliverers of death and doom. Formed in 1990 by vocalist Aaron, guitarists Andy and Calvin and drummer Rick, My Dying Bride soon enlisted the talents of bassist Ade and eventually violinist/keyboardist Martin to bring the band into full, deadly bloom.

Turn Loose The Swans is musically dark and gothic



and shares the same black blood as Type O Negative's Bloody Kisses. Every song on Turn Loose...runs deep with lessons on the finer points of pain and despair. Stylistically ranging from just keys, strings and vocals on songs such as "Sear Me MCMXCIII" to the almost death-like title track, My Dying Bride present an intriguing record worthy of any true music lover's collection. Caution should be used when listening as this is as black as it gets.

Jimmy LaFave Highway Trance Bohemia Beat

Jimmy LaFave's second album, *Highway Trance*, has "classic" written all over it! LaFave has songs with killer lyrics, a voice to die for and the keen sensitivity to know the right level of instrumentation for each song. LaFave and his Night Tribe tackle each song as an entity unto itself, and have obviously labored to fulfill the initial vision he had for each song. The music can best be described as rockin' swing with a tinge of blues for flavor. But, to think it is only this would be to sell it short.

When you place this CD in your player and push start, be prepared to be totally taken away. "When The Tears Fall" features a stark but effective arrangement and a melancholy melody beautifully sung by LaFave. "Cafe In The Rain" shows a similar sensitivity, with a piano part that is perfectly paced with acoustic guitar. "The Open Road" manages to capture that feeling of adventure one gets when starting out on a long drive. And, "Minstrel Boy Howling At The Moon" expresses a quiet joy for the little things in life. Other strong contenders include "Early Summer Rain," "Prayer For You" and "Leslie, Talk To Me."

Jimmy LaFave's Highway Trance deserves your full attention.

Lisa Germano

Happiness

Lisa Germano is certainly traveling down a different road of Happiness than most of us.

Her list of session credits is longer than the yellow brick road and her many instrumental talents are legendary. After contributing material to the film "Falling From Grace," Germano funded the recording of her first album, *On The Way Down From The Moon Palace*, which was essentially a do-it-yourself effort. From this, she inked a deal and recorded a new album with Capitol Records. During Capitol's restructuring period that soon followed, 4AD approached the label to aquire a world-wide distribution deal. After further discussion, it was decided that 4AD was a more suitable home for Germano. Hence, we now have her latest release,



Happiness (produced by Daniel Lanois and Malcom Burn and remixed by John Fryer and Ivo), on 4AD.

To fully appreciate her unique talent, and the

unusual approach she takes to her songs and their arrangements, you need to pay close attention. Germano does not scream from the hilltops; rather, she whispers into your ear. Regardless of how avant-garde or experimental her music may be, it remains compelling, and it will certainly lend some adventure and daring to your station's sound. Check out the entrancing "Destroy The Flower," with its gradual crescendo, the deeply personal "Energy," which features cool mandolin and fiddle accents, "Cowboy," with its flippant lyrical phrasing, and the driving and odd "Sycopant."

David Knopfler

The Giver

Mesa

In 1977, David Knopfler, along with brother Mark, founded Dire Straits. The band went on to huge success, but after recording the first two studio albums, and touring extensively in support of them, Knopfler decided to leave the band, opting for a more settled life focusing on family, friendships and a self-imposed discipline that would allow

him to continue growing as a person and an artist. The Giver is Knopfler's sixth outing. He has managed to touch a wide audience (charting consistently on the British and European charts), earn the respect of his peers and gain critical accolades, while keeping a rather low profile. For him the reward has been learning about "good songwriting, with intelligent lyrics, intuitive rhythms and strong melodies."



The Giver reflects all of this in a subtle way, relying on cool grooves, progressive chord changes, haunting melodies and reserved, but confident vocals. On the surface you will notice all the similarities to Dire Straits, but upon further listens, you will begin to understand the many differences, too. There is an undercurrent of emotion and message that keep insisting you pay attention. Several powerful tracks standout, thanks to beautiful arrangements and richly organic instrumentation. Try "Mercy With The Wine," "Hey Jesus," "Carry On" or "A Father And A Son."

Sara K.

Play On Words

Chesky

Sara K. is somewhat of an enigma, beginning with the anonymity of her last name. At first you think her music is a rather straightforward blend of folk, blues and jazz, but after a few listens to *Play On Words*, you begin to feel she is playing with our heads! Her music is more like a hybrid of the above mentioned styles.

Sara's music clearly comes across best in a live, intimate setting and that is exactly the atmosphere that has been captured on her album. As it is stated on the disc, they used minimal miking techniques, and no overdubbing or artificial enhancements. All of this insured a pure and very much alive sound. You appreciate this most in songs like "Stop Those Bells," with its way cool slide guitar, "If I Could Sing Your Blues," a jazzy little number with an absolute perfect trumpet part, and "Burnin' Both Ends," which has a lyrical message we should all heed.

This David Chesky and Joel Diamond-produced disc deserves a lot more attention than it has received so far.

Soulhat

Good To Be Gone

Epic

Soulhat made some significant inroads with their last release, *Outdebox*, at Adult Rock Radio. So as not to lose any momentum, the band and Epic went back into the studio quickly and recorded *Good To Be Gone*.

Produced by the band and Nick Di Dia, Good To Be Gone shows considerable growth for Soulhat. The instrumentation and arrangements are much tighter, their sound is more clearly defined, and the direction is a little bit edgier. Kevin McKinney (vocals and guitars) wrote most of the material with the other band members, Brian Walsh (bass), Bill Cassis (guitar) and Barry Smith (drums), except for two which he penned himself. Several tracks strike me as perfect for the format: "Homer," "Big Noise," "Preacher Man," "Waited" and the title track.

As time goes by, some talents wane while others continue to develop and grow. The latter is the case with Stephen Stills. His voice is instantly recognizable, his music universal. With Stills Alone, we are given Stills at his purest. The album is essentially him and a guitar, doing what he does best: Singing songs from the heart. The album was produced, in part, by Stephen and the "famous" Albert brothers, Ron and Howard. Production credits also are given to Steve Alamo and Gerry Tolman.

There are several great tracks that you could be playing, including "Isn't It So," "The Ballad Of Hollis Brown," "Amazonia" and "Treetop Flyer."

The album is a scorching New Orleans blues and jazz album, featuring the uncompromising talents of Allen Toussaint, Toots Thielemans, Michael Brecker, Will Calhoun, Ray Anderson, Paul Griffin, Eddie Gomez, Joe Bonadio, Phil Hamilton and Chuck St. Troy.

The album is a collection of classics such as "Brickyard Blues," "I Walk On Guilded Splinters" and "Blue Monk," and some new tunes, including "Don't Mow Your Lawn," "Ruby's Flowers" and "The Blue Lady." Throughout, we are treated to great horn solos, cool organ and piano, tasty guitar licks, wailing harmonica and soulful vocals.

Richard Meyer has been a major behind-the-scenes force in folk music for many years. He has served as Fast Folk's editor and in-house producer since 1986 (Fast Folk is a non-profit co-op publication and record label which provides a haven for new and developing folk artists/songwriters). Having produced over 40 albums, Meyer certainly knows the ins and outs of recording and producing folk artists and singer/songwriters.

With his latest release, A Letter From The Open Sky, we get a clear sense of his own songwriting and singing talents. Several tracks are engaging and thoughtful, including "Blind October," "Centuries End," "Grey Metal" and the title track.

Michael Jerling is another member of the Fast Folk Musical Magazine cooperative. He has done his share of traveling the coffeehouses and folk havens of America, initially as an opening act, but more recently as a headliner. His music is not limited to folk purism in any sense of the word. It is certainly acoustic-based, with to-the-point lyrics and skilled guitar phrasing, but it also contains a wealth of American musical influences, from country to rock to rhythm & blues.

Jerling's New Suit Of Clothes delivers us a full and broadly arranged collection of songs. Highlights include the introspective "Time To Begin Again," the jazzy "Shadowland," the touching "I Can't See Me" and the bouncy "Without My Chains."

Western Vogue has developed a good base of support throughout the Western region of the States. They have had tracks on compilations produced by KBCO and KZON, and have two previous albums out. With *Perils And Passions*, they hope to spread their appeal to a national level. Comprised of John Ashton (electric guitar), William Tell Pinner (drums), Mike Reid (bass) and frontwoman Shauna Strecker (acoustic guitar, keyboards and vocals), this feisty combo delivers honest, raw and emotional music.

Their music is a sometimes rough, sometimes pleasant blend of Western, blues and rock, all wrapped around Shauna's soaring vocals. The songs speak of the highs and lows of life, but the overwhelming emotions of hope and unshakable faith are what's left at the end. Listen to "True For You," "All I Ever Wanted," "Too Many Loves" or "The Lucky One," and you'll understand what I mean.

With Out Of The Valley, his fourth release for High Street, Gorka broadens his repertoire a bit and introduces us to a new set of characters, in addition to his perennial "think positive" message. "Up Until Then" tells us of a lonely girl hoping to meet Mr. Perfect in all the wrong places. "Thoughtless Behavior" examines the irresponsible practices of some men concerning pregnancy. The title track explores the loosely spoken dreams of small-towners pining about "leaving the valley." "Good Noise" simply instructs us to be grateful for the good things in life and, if you don't have something good to say, not to say anything at all. And "Furniture" smoothly drives home the fact that many things we think will "fix" us are shallow and short-lived.

Gorka traveled to Nashville to record *Out Of The Valley*. Noted guitarist and producer John Jennings was brought on board, and it was he who recruited an all-star cast of players for the album, including Mary-Chapin Carpenter, Kathy Mattea and Jonell Mosser on vocals, Leo Kottke on guitar, Matt Rollings on keyboards, Tim O'Brien on mandolin, Michael Manring on bass and Dave Mattacks on drums. The sessions were quick and full of energy with a minimum of overdubs.

John Gorka has, once again, created an expose of the human condition, both its shiny and seedy sides. His final words, as always, are: There is more good than bad in the world.

2ND VIEWING

If you take the time to really listen to Billy Falcon's Letters From A Paper Ship, and get past his previous image, you will quickly recognize that the true

home for his music is at Adult Rock Radio! Several tracks on the album are introspective and touching. "Cold Hard World," "Paper Ship" and my favorite, "Lovebirds," all seem to be natural choices. If you have ever had the chance to meet Billy Falcon, or see him perform in an intimate setting, his taient and sensitivity come across loud and clear.



Networking in The Public Radio Networking (6 Network)

rirst off, let's get our terminology straight: Each local community station or public radio station is an entity unto itself, and is supported by its community and its regular "users." National Public Radio (NPR), American Public Radio (APR) and similar monikers are national networks the local stations subscribe to. Public Radio is far and away best source for in-depth news and public affairs coverage, often via the national or international networks, such as "National Public Radio News," "The MacNeil-Leher Report" (many stations carry the audio feed), "All Things Considered" and "The BBC World News Service." This is often augmented by locally produced news, community issue and lifestyle shows. For many years, Public Radio has also been the haven for music that doesn't have to answer to the commercial requirements privately-owned radio does. But they still need to garner, and hold onto, a discernible audience. For many years, on the music level, they have done this by being the source for quality classical and jazz programming.

> However, the past few years now, somewhat of a revolution has begun at Public Radio. Although the cornerstone at most stations is still news and public affairs, many stations have expanded dramatically in their involvement and exposure of music - all kinds of music. These stations have created specialty shows that feature anything from blues to reggae, world beat to African, eclectic rock to fusion. The listenership of these shows are avid about the particular type of music featured, and they can be quickly motivated to attend a show or to buy an album. To gain some insight as to what is happening here, I talked to several of the key players on the local and national level.

> "This listenership is very pro-active," observes Public Radio Promotion Specialist Louisa Rodrigues of radioActive. "They tune into these shows for the specific reason of hearing, or hearing about, the kind of music they like." Likewise, Rodrigues goes on to say, "The people involved in programming and hosting these shows are equally motivated by their love for a particular type of music, and can be a wealth of information, either on the air, or when a listener calls into the station."

Many may term these "specialty shows" as block programming, but Chris Douridas, Music Director for Los Angeles' KCRW and host of "Morning Becomes Eclectic," feels that this term is far too narrow to describe what these shows mean to their communities and what they do for the stations' images within those communities. Certainly, to pull off such shows with professionalism and credibility, you need "programmers who know their stuff."

But there is another benefit here. various programming specialists act as a powerful network of 'feelers' for us." points out Douridas. "They each bring what they have learned and discovered back to the station, and we all share in that knowledge." KCRW is known worldwide for its unique style of musical programming and the freedom it affords each show's host. Douridas points to the long-standing relationships everyone at the station has had with the import buyers at certain LA tastemaker retail accounts, such as Rhino, Aron's and Prime Cuts. These hosts have also developed relationships with editors and reviewers of local, national and international newspapers and periodicals. In addition, they are often provided new and unreleased (in the US) music by industry A&R people, record producers, engineers and the artists themselves. Douridas explains, "Being in LA, the heart of the entertainment industry, the kind of initial buzz KCRW can create is well known."

Other stations, such as WXPN in Philadelphia, choose to blend these individual shows into an overall programming philosophy. In many ways, WXPN was an early precursor to the Adult Rock format of today, beginning this approach in the late 80s. They still have a few "eclectic specialty shows," but the station is now homogeneous in its sound. Explains Bruce Ranes, producer of the nationally syndicated daily, two-hour show "World Cafe," which originates from WXPN, "We realized we were onto something that could revitalize the station (WXPN is over 50 years old), and reposition itself in terms of the type of listenership we could attract. We were always the third [Public Radio] station, so we decided to change our programming stance.

"We essentially began to offer 'World Cafe' on a national level as an example of what other Public Radio stations could do to make themselves a little more hip," continues Ranes. "We saw how this type of programming radically increased our listenership and their support. We ultimately hoped that 'World Cafe' could be the way for some stations to open the door to Adult Rock programming. Part of the idea was to regain those disenfranchised Rock Radio listeners who had pretty much given up on commercial radio and their tightened playlist. Just because someone turns 35 doesn't mean they are no longer interested in learning about new music."

Well, WXPN's idea to make "World Cafe" more than just a local programming tool has certainly been a success. The show went national via satellite in October of 1991, and is now carried by more than 75 public stations across the country. The show has also developed a tremendous reputation for showcasing artists, not only via their recordings, but also in a live, in-studio setting. with interviews and performances. To date, well over 300 artists have visited their studios, and record labels and artist management firms are well aware of the show's importance in developing an artist's career. Ranes says, "The labels are much more aware of the show and what it can do for an artist. When the label has someone new they are trying to introduce to the public, they are all over us to get them on the show. But, when we want a more established or heritage-type artist for

ur own positioning, it is more difficult to get the cooperation. Overall though, our relationship with the music industry is good."

> What is the next step for "World Cafe" and other national shows? To get commercial radio on-line as affiliates. I spoke with Beth Talisman of Public Radio International (the new name for American Public Radio as of July 1). She is in charge of selling the shows they carry, such as "World Cafe," "ECHO" and "Mountain Stage," to commercial radio. She states, "The real obstacle is that most commercial stations are geared to satellites like SATCOM C5 and are not 'tuned' into the NPR satellite (which all public shows use).

With shows like 'World Cafe,' which is live daily, this is a problem. With our weekly shows that are produced ahead of time, we can easily provide commercial radio with a DAT." Evidently, the only stipulation is that if a commercial station wants a show, no Public Radio station in the market can already be carrying it.

Another way to reach a broader constituency is by releasing "Best Of" compilations on disc. Andy Ridenour, of "Live From Mountain Stage," explains how they struck a deal with Blue Plate Records to release a series of Best Of Mountain Stage compilations, currently on volume six. "We have been national since April of 1989, and we are now on over 125 affiliates," he says. "One way for us to help fund the production of the show,



and to pay for our basic overhead, is to provide our music on commercially available compact discs. The deal is set up in a 'friendly nations' framework, with the artists either donating the use of their music or waiving certain types of royalties." He is quick to point out, however, that, although they do make some much-needed money selling these Best Of Mountain Stage volumes, "The real value is on the PR level. They have proven to be a great way to dramatically increase the national awareness of 'Live From Mountain Stage.'"

Many commercial stations have put together various types of compilations but all of those have basically been limited to local distribution and, usually, the proceeds go to local charities...KBCO, KTCZ, KFOG and many other stations have completed several volumes. Now, a Public Radio station has taken it one step further.

KCRW, renowned for its in-studio live performances, has recently released the first volume of *Rare On Air/Live Performances* on Mammoth Records. Chris Douridas says this is the first time a Public Radio station has commercially released a disc worldwide. "The deal is such that the artists waive their performance royalties and only get paid on the mechanicals," he explains. "Not only will we make much-needed money from commercial sales for the station's overhead, but we also used it as a premium in our latest fund drive. In lieu of a dollar advance, we took product instead, and we were able to parlay it into over \$60.000 for the station!"

Certainly, semi-annual fund drives are a crucial necessity for Public Radio stations. They are constantly looking for new ways to entice underwriters and increase local listener support. Mikel Ellcessor, PD of WYEP in Pittsburgh, says, "Networking with national and local underwriters is a constant but rewarding challenge. We keep trying to come up with new angles that can be passed on to our users. Recently, we worked a deal out with a locally-based long-distance phone company whose service we were able to offer as a premium. Our station is 70% user-driven, and I need new ways to reach and motivate them."

Ellcessor goes on to say, "Since we are a relatively new entity in Pittsburgh (they switched programming in 1990), local networking is very important to our station's growth in the community. We have to have a pulse on the local music scene, local lively arts scene, social concerns and so on. We simply must stay on the pulse as to what our listeners' tastes and concerns are. I utilize the local record retailers and contacts I have developed at our local press, and I have tremendous respect for our local record label reps. These reps often come up with creative and cost-effective ideas for us to implement into the station."

So much of what has fueled this "revolution" at Public Radio has been the belief that music is the key to transforming the type of listeners who use and support it. Almost all the music-based national shows were originally produced for a local or semi-regional audience. There is one highly successful show, however, that was conceived with a national audience in mind from the beginning " "E-Town." Music is certainly the draw of the show, but it is ultimately the vehicle for a higher cause...that cause being increased environmental awareness and explaining what we, on a local and national level, can do to improve the world.

Lori Martin, Public Relations Director and "woman of many hats" explains, "'E-Town' generally works out to be about 75% music and 25% environmental stuff. Nick Forster, the show's producer, played for many years in a bluegrass band that traveled all over the world. It all began about five years ago when they were playing in Sophia, the capital of Bulgaria, and were appalled at the horrible pollution they saw. Nick had never seen such a polluted place in his life! They proceeded to perform in front of thousands of people and, at that moment, he realized the undivided attention he had, and that music could be a tremendous way to help carry the message of environmental concern. He came back to the US, and he and his wife, Helen, started to do the research and paperwork for a show using artists and their music as a way to herald environmental action. He did a pilot, presented it to National Public Radio for distribution and, in 1991, we went on-line."

The reach of the show has grown tremendously. Earth Day 94 was their third anniversary, a day on which they not only celebrated our Earth, but also the fact that "E-Town" is now carried by over 126 stations! Almost all of the shows originate from the Boulder Theater, a turn-of-the-century facility that has "gone through many uses, but still has that old theater charm," Martin says. "We started out with more folk/activist-type artists, but the type of performers has expanded considerably (over 400 artists have performed on "E-Town"). Now that we have national recognition, and...record companies and management companies are putting more dollars behind our type of artists (Adult Rock), we are being included in their initial marketing plans. It is important, though, that these artists come to do 'E-Town' on a promotional level, because we can be perceived as competition to the local

promoters, since we record the show in front of a live audience."

The format of the show includes performances by two to three artists, and an interview with the headliner which is geared toward environmental concerns and the efforts that particular artist puts forth for the cause. Then, there is a feature on a particular affiliate's local community action on behalf of the environment. Martin explains what her involvement means to her: "It has been very satisfying for me," she says. "I was never really environmentally concerned before, and I am not sure how much my efforts are doing to help the world, but it feels good and I love being involved with the artists and their music. The meaning of the show is an added bonus to my conscience."

"E-Town" is also making the effort to reach a broader audience by syndicating to commercial radio. Since it is recorded ahead of time and then edited into an hour-long show, it can be offered on DAT. "We are working with KBCO right now to have them get involved," says Martin. "You see, we don't have a Denver affiliate for the show, so if we can work it out with them, we should also be able to do it in other markets."

As this national Public Radio "network" continues to evolve, many of its premier programmers are talking with each other to share ideas, concerns and successes. Jeff Luchsinger, PD of KERA/Dallas, says, "I talk to some other Public Radio PDs pretty regularly. In particular, I like what Mikel Ellcessor at WYEP and Norm Beeker of WCBE have to say, and I respect what they have accomplished." He also compares notes with various PDs at the conventions he attends, especially the annual Public Radio Programmers Convention, which will convene this year in September in Seattle. At conventions, he finds that "most programmers are very willing to compare notes and share experiences. This is especially true of the Adult Rock stations, as this format gains interest from stations that want to get involved in Adult Rock programming."

> I asked Luchsinger about the national shows, as his is one of the stations who has chosen not to carry many specialty or syndicated shows. His response was, "We needed to get away from the 'block programming' image of the station a number of years back when we decided to reposition it, but I do carry certain things that give us a flavor we can't generate locally. For example, I carry 'Live From Mountain Stage,' the weekend edition of 'World Cafe' and 'Afro-Pop.' As far as local specialty shows, I am coming around to the idea that the right one or two might work for us now. If someone came to us with an idea and had the right enthusiasm and knowledge, then

we would probably go for it. Right now, I am considering a blues show."

So, in some ways, this new kind of Public Radio has come full circle. Initially, the effort was to get away from specialty or block-style programming, but via national shows and local success stories, there is a renewed belief that they can be useful and successful. Definitely, Public Radio is often the only source for certain kinds of music on the radio. From my overview, I have seen how artists like Deep Forest, William Orbit, Us3 and Loreena Makennitt were able to gain an initial foothold of audience awareness through Public Radio exposure. The buzz has to start somewhere, and more often than not, that somewhere is Public Radio. Through various forms of networking, the programmers know they are an important conduit to expose not only new ideas, but new and exciting kinds of music. Whether they take the more eclectic or mainstream approach, Public Radio has reminded the community that what's new can be found at the lower end of the radio dial! The listeners know that the people behind these stations are doing it for love and certainly not money! As Bruce Ranes says, "I think what makes this format fun to do and what makes it compelling is that you can throw a curve ball at your audience every now and then."

Now that all the pertinent publications are in a monitored or plays per week mode, it's important that PDs get a quick course in interpreting the charts. Anyone who's worked with the BDS charts over the past two years knows that these charts, like the stock market, go up and down and hardly ever in a straight, upward direction. For example, a band appears on "Rockline" and plays their new track. That week, there's an artificial bump of around 75-100 spins. The next week, those spins disappear and an otherwise healthy record ends up having a lousy number of total play increases or it even has less spins than the previous week and loses its bullet. That record's not over, but some uninformed people may think it is.

If several "quick rotating" stations have A-Z weeks or special programming during a holiday period, that will play havoc with the charts. If people don't pay attention as to why things happen, once again, the uninformed could prematurely kill a record. One other situation comes to mind. In the event of a major album debut (ie: **Pink**

Floyd), where several cuts from an album get played very, very heavily the first few days, the additional plays on such a record will have an adverse effect on other currents already on the air. The point I'm trying to make is that it is incumbent on each decision maker at every radio station to realize that the charts have many things that affect them. Merely moving backwards on the chart may not mean a thing when it comes to knowing the "health" of any particular track.

These numbers vary because of various dayparts, artist conflicts, etc. Asking for "two more spins a week" is basically a ridiculous concept, unless we manually spike the record, which is a pain in the ass and screws with other record rotations. Or, you're asking for "paper spins," which is insulting. I'm not being impatient with you (who, me?), I'm just trying to explain that you're still looking for H, M, L bumps, or, at least with our station, major spin bumps. So, if you call and ask for "two more spins this week," I will laugh a little and you won't see those minute changes, except by chance. And please show this to your bosses! Courtney Love Cleared Of Charges

Courtney Love widow of Kurt Obain, has been legally vindicated...it seems that enminal charges filed against her shortly before the discovery of her husband's suicide have been dropped.

Love's legal nightmare began when she placed a call to the front desk of the hotel where she was staying, and complained about an allergic reaction to a *prescription drug* - not a heroin OD.



Police arrived with paramedics after hotel officials called 911. Love was arrested after being forcefully admitted to Century City Hospital here in LA, the suspected victim of a heroin overdose. Love was charged with possession of a controlled substance, possession of drug paraphernalia and possession of stolen property.

Although the case against the singer (whose battles with drug addiction have been quite public) looked good, the case began to unravel as soon as Love reached the hospital.


Mellencamp Hits The Road

Kiss N' Ass


