## Boston Scores An Unprecedented Top 20 Debut!



ock Radio received the new Boston CD-Pro on Wednesday, May 18. By Tuesday, May 24, the format had already played "I Need Your Love" 1,783 times! With 137 of the 185 stations that added this Boston cut having actually played it prior to Tuesday's add date, "I Need Your Love" was given an average of 13 PPWs per station - in less than a full week. Folks, this is HUGE!

When The Album Network became the first magazine to go with an entirely PPW-driven chart, there was no precedent for chart debuts. We knew that Top 5 debuts would be a thing of the past, but we also figured a Top 20 entry was perhaps unachievable. We was wrong. Boston's "I Need Your Love" enters the Power Cuts chart this week at #18\*, showing us a new standard for debuts.

Now, if you want to capitalize on the Boston hysteria, be sure to call your Album Network rep to sign up for our exclusive World Premiere broadcast of the *Walk On CD*. The 90-minute program airs Wednesday, June 1, and is hosted by Redbeard.

Pure And Simple is the name of Jett's first album for Warner Bros.. She's given her new label much to work with here. Rock Radio should jump all over this one.

The punchy and infectious "With You" has already helped Skin stay perched in the Top 10 at Adult Rock Radio for weeks. Now, it is time for the broader format of Rock Radio to invite Peter Himmelman to its party as well. Actually, that time came long ago, but Peter won't mind if you play him now - better late than never, and all that.

## The Cowboy Way

In The Cowboy Way, Woody Harrelson and Kiefer Sutherland play cowpokes who take on some bad guys in New York City. The trailers for it look great, and with these two dudes sharing top billing, the flick is gonna be a smash. And guess what, the soundtrack CD has some great moments as well.

Obviously, the Bon Jovi cut ("Good Guys Don't Always Wear White") is already out at Rock Radio. But this soundtrack doesn't end there. Paul Rodgers and Jeff Beck crank on the classic "On Broadway" (this one undoubtedly gets the major treatment in the film), while Blind Melon gives us reason to drool over the possibility of a new EP from them this summer; the band's cover of Velvet Underground's "Candy Says" is a down home, "sit on the front porch and strum the acoustic" kinda tune that should keep Rock Radio satisfied until the band's next release. Also, George Thorogood & The Destroyers kick ass on "Sonny Rides Again," while Cracker scores with "Blue Danube Blues."

Your listeners know Catherine Wheel from "Crank" (which is also on this *Chrome* CD), so let 'em have another taste of this band. Because, after all, don't you think they'll be as curious as you are about a song called "The Nude"?

When it comes to this band and this track, you gotta love the tenacity of Capricorn. The label has been working "In A Daydream" for months now (this is our third review), gaining Top 5 success at Adult Rock Radio. Now, Rock Radio gets another reason to consider playing this killer cut: An edit! At 3:35, it is at a manageable length.

The Freddy Jones Band is absolutely incredible live, and even though they're from Chicago, they are breaking out of the South: Consider this: "In A Daydream" is currently pulling #1 phones at WKLS/Atlanta, Top 5 phones at WRDU/Raleigh and WRFX/Charlotte, and it is on WAVF/Charleston. Now, play this sucka, because we're running out of things to say about it!

Stevie's long-awaited return is met with 74 out of the box adds at Rock Radio and a #74\* debut on the Power Cuts chart. The latter stat is the result of 276 plays at the format prior to Tuesday's reports.

WBAB, KDKB, WNEW, KLOS, WMMR and WQFM lead the list of outlets adding Stevie Nicks out of the box. Stevie's *Street Angel* hits retail on June 7 (it is already among our Top 20 Hot Futures), and her 1994 tour will begin in late July.

WHCN's Pam Brooks notes, "Stevie has a large and loyal following, and the song doesn't disappoint!" At WZNF, Roger The Dodger comments, "It's a very fine outing for her!"

played about two months under [the name] Collective Soul," remembers Ed Roland, "and that's when I just said, 'I've had enough.' We'd done South By Southwest, we had done all these conventions and had record people flying to see us and no one took interest.

"Basically, I had just had enough of the whole thing. So I told the guys, 'I'm dissolving the band - I do not want to do it anymore.'"

And with that, Roland banished Collective Soul to the scrap heap, where it became just another erstwhile band that never made it, that never enjoyed its moment in the sun, that gave up before realizing its dreams. Midnight was in the offing, and Cinderella had reluctantly dashed from the ball.


inescapable on the airwaves. About the time Roland was acclimating to high school, he picked up a guitar to see if he, too, could write songs like his heroes, of which Elton reigned supreme. To this day, Ed is not sure why he picked guitar over Elton's instrument of choice, but he was soon strumming songs of his own. By the time he'd graduated, Roland had learned enough to be accepted by the prestigious Berklee School of Music in Boston. But it wasn't music theory that Ed Roland ultimately absorbed in New England.

"Berklee was culture shock. I mean, I actually learned more life than I did music; being a preacher's son, and being from a small town, I really was sheltered, in everything." Roland stayed at Berklee for a year before returning home to Georgia in

more than the band making their own CD and mailing it out themselves. And, to be precise, at that time, Collective Soul really amounted to nothing more than the creative prowess of one man who was equally adept as a singer, songwriter, guitarist, producer and engineer you guessed it - Ed Roland.

"I did [the album] as a songwriter demo," he chuckles. "That's all the CD was meant to be. [I] tried to get a publishing deal, and ended up getting a record deal, which I'm very, very thankful for."

Collective Soul took root toward the end of the 80s, when Roland, along with drummer Shane Evans and lead guitarist Ross Childress (both of whom were in their teens at the time), played together in an outfit called Marching Two Step.



d Roland was born in Atlanta, Georgia, in August of 1963. When he was eight, his father, a Southern Baptist minister, and his mother, a teacher of special children, moved the family 20 miles south, to suburban Stockbridge. A year later, Dean Roland was born.

As young boys, Ed and Dean were introduced to music by their father; as the head of his church, the senior Roland could often be found leading his congregation in song. "Hymn music has always been a big part of our upbringing," Ed relates by phone from his parents' home, where he has been convalescing with strep throat. "And music was very much a part of our family; it's like that good ol', jolly Mayberry-and-Stockbridge-sit-on-your-front-porch-and-sing, type thing."

The radio stations in Atlanta provided Ed with his pop music inspiration, and in the mid-70s, Elton John and AC/DC were

1983. While other musicians have learned a progressive, almost classical sensibility at Berklee (Steve Vai and Dream Theater included), Roland applied his compositional training in a more simplified manner.

"When writing, I naturally go more melodic, instead of, like, saying, 'Okay, here are cool chords I'm piecing together; I'll make a melody out of this.' I really think my melodies are just pop songs. People don't use that word, 'pop' - they're scared to use that word - and I don't understand why. I don't see anything wrong with it...it just means it's a melodic song. I would like to think of myself as a melodic writer."

Then, in the fall of 1992, Roland, Evans and Childress sought to roughen their sound a bit, so the trio excused themselves from the rest of the band and adopted the name Collective Soul. The concept of "collective soul," which refers to a universal spirit, or connection, between everyone, was discovered by Roland in Ayn Rand's classic novel, "The Fountainhead." As a name, it has nothing whatsoever to do with this band, Ed tells me. "It was the first name [that, after hearing it], everybody went, 'That's it.'"

But, by Thanksgiving, 1992, it was over, and our story has now come full circle. Barely two months after forming Collective Soul, Ed Roland, who plays the part of Cinderella in our story, had left the ball. Luckily, he also left behind a glass slipper.

"That's when my manager, Bill Richardson, said, 'Don't give up'; he bought some studio

"So, I sat in the studio for three months and wrote 10 songs," Ed recounts for me. This was in the early part of 1993, and he pretty much did everything, playing most of the quitars and bass, programming the drum machine and handling the vocals. He also produced and engineered the sessions with his friend and unofficial band member Matt Serletic, who had also played in Marching Two Step.

At the time of this writing spree in early 93, Ed Roland was pushing 30 and had been trying to get a deal for more than a decade. Disillusionment had become his constant companion and he wasn't sure what to do next. Seeking direction, he carefully pondered a course in which to take his music. What came of this contemplation was a lyrical plea for inspiration called "Shine." Underneath this lyric, Roland laid a discordant musical bed of heavily distorted, polluted, grungy guitar riffs.

"I know," Ed laughs when I bring up this dichotomy. "Seriously, it wasn't too long [before] I was thinking about

of a band feel, and sent it out to the record labels," Ed says.

"And everybody turned us down again," Roland says, perhaps still not believing the turn of events. This time, however, Collective Soul did get noticed by someone.

he also sent it to radio stations. WJRR in Orlando played it, and before we knew it, we sold, like, 16,000 units in the Orlando area, and we started getting airplay all across the United States: Bill was sending it out everywhere, to see what would happen. They were small radio stations, but they loved it, and they reported to

see if there'd be any kind and it caught everybody's attention. Then, all of a sudden, "And [the station] called me one all the record labels called us.

> So, Doug Morris, CEO of Atlantic, and Jason Flom, [VP of A&R], called Bill and said, 'We want this band, we'll sign 'em today.' So, Jason flew down to Orlando, saw us perform - we sold out the place - flew me and Bill back to New York and we worked out everything within two hours."

> Atlantic Records signed Collective Soul in February of this year, and began working "Shine" right off the Rising Storm CD within a couple of weeks. Eventually, the label remastered Ed Roland's original demo tape and released their disc a few weeks own ago. Ironically, and even as Atlantic's accountants tabulate the potential windfall from sales of Hints Allegations And Things Left Unsaid, there are people at the company who realize it, too, was among the labels which passed on Ed Roland's songs numerous times. By Ed's own estimation, every major label rejected his tape each year since the mid 80s.

ints Allegations And Things Left Unsaid is a dozen pop/ rock songs and one orchestral instrumental (at the band's choosing, one song was left off of the Atlantic version). Because they were written showcase Ed Roland's songwriting skills, these tunes predominantly come from a first person perspective and are offsprings of Ed's own experiences.

Among the CD's strengths is the way each song has its own individual personality, which Ed achieved by varying the textures, instrumentation and guitar tones from track to track. Curiously, Roland says this was pretty much accidental. "'Cause they were done as a songwriter demo, I tried to make each song different," he illustrates. "I wanted to show a little variety as a songwriter."

In "Shine," Collective Soul currently has the most often played rock song in North America, the #1 Most Requested rock song (it has been so for more than a month) and one of the heaviest-played videos on MTV. They also have one of the fastest-selling albums in the nation. All of this is a bit much for Roland to comprehend just yet.

"It is real difficult - it's almost like it's unreal. I know that sounds so cliche, but it's just happened so fast, you know? It's - I don't know - [chuckles] it's great, it's incredible.

"You always dream of it." he admits, switching momentarily to a more distant, third person viewpoint, "but you thought it'd come a little bit slower, if that makes sense.

"I worked so many years to get to this point, I didn't think it'd be what I call 'that 12 years of overnight success' type thing. It's really strange, and it really does just catch me off guard."

In the midst of it all, Ed and Dean Roland, Shane Evans, Ross Childress, Will Turpin (who Collective Soul's bassist) and Matthew Serletic (who is on the road playing keys and percussion) are packing clubs all over America. "[We want to] let people know that we are a band," explains Ed. "In my head, I know it was a songwriter demo, and I have to overcome that; I know most people don't realize it, but [for] me, it's very self-gratifying to get out there and let people see us as a band.

"Plus, it's fun. I mean, I'm out there with my friends; I have my brother, and the rest of 'em are all like my brothers. I mean, we really are enjoying this. It's everybody's dream."





## Skibitsky To Helm New Denver FM As GM

No official word yet regarding the format Skibitsky and company will adopt, but with just-exited KBCO programmer



Although he remains on board as KBCO's consultant, Dennis Constantine has not assumed the interim PD reins for the heritage Adult Rocker, despite what you made have read elsewhere. Look for an official PD announcement to roll out of the station in the coming weeks.



The word "Cope" has a special meaning to us here in the Album Network retail kingdom; it's as close to the heart as Tuesdays are to Hell, for VP Mark Cope. And "Cope" also happens to be the swingin' lead track off of Flippin' Out, the RCA Records label debut for Boston's Gigolo Aunts. Many of you retailers have been introduced to the Gigolos via BMG's focused in-store exposure campaign, but now it's time to do a double-take and probe a little deeper into just why these Gigolo Aunts will have your customers Flippin' Out.


The band took on the name Gigolo Aunts (lead singer Dave Gibb's father's favorite Syd Barrett song - why not?) and split small-town NY for Boston in 87, to take on the scene developing there and to unfurl their own style of American rock-driven and British melody-influenced (God forbid) pop music! Bostonians took a fancy to the Gigolo Aunts, even though they did not personify the rough-edged music the grunge world was about to embrace.

"We've always done what we want, we've always had a slightly off-kilter way of doing things," explains lyricist and bassist Steve Hurley. And it was that attitude and sense of true creative style that led the Gigolos to Britain, where their indie 45 (with "Cope" and

"Bloom" on it) soon became a favorite of the notoriously nasty British press, garnering the honor of Top Indie Single of the Year in 1992 from the "New Music Express."

Not missing a beat, the band toured furiously, supporting the Wonderstuff, and performed a smashing set at last year's Reading Festival. Finally, the US got a taste of the Gigolo Aunts on Full-On Bloom, an EP released by Alias, which was followed by a Stateside tour.

Now, Flippin' Out fulfills the obvious next step for this feisty pop band. The single, "Cope" is having immediate results from airplay in markets such as hometown Boston (WFNX and WEQX), Washington, DC (WHFS), Cincinnati (WOXY) and Amarillo (KACV). Retail support for Flippin' Out has been strong, with in-store play developing a sales pattern that is as hard to ignore as the pleading vocals of Gibbs and the other menbers of this group of innocent rock misfits that are the Gigolo Aunts.



"If I Only Had A Brain"

Dallas native Mark Griffin's alter ego, MC 900 Ft. Jesus, has created some of the most coolly detached and inspired hip-hop music of the decade. "If I Only Had A Brain" mixes the smooth, industrial hip-hop beats that characterize MC 900 Ft. Jesus's sound with Griffin's colorful tongue-in-cheek narrative. The highly stylized sound is enjoyable on both musical and lyrical levels. The song flows with a breezy ease, guided by Griffin's blend of organic, jazzy hip-hop and electronic elements. With a new label and his continually fresh sound, Griffin returns with "If I Only Had A Brain," a track with the potential to become the mantra for any number of scatterheaded and over-stressed people, not to mention a big reaction record for programmers everywhere.

#### **Lloyd Cole** "Morning Is Broken"

Why it has taken this long for Lloyd Cole's latest work to be released here in the States is something of a mystery, given the considerable talent of Cole. Thankfully, Rykodisc has stepped into the breach to release Cole's Bad Vibes album, from which 'Morning Is Broken" is taken.

There's no arguing the fact that Cole is one of the most talented songwriters to emerge from the UK in the past decade, a claim that was founded on his work with The Commotions and has continued to ring true throughout his solo career. Cole has always had a knack for turning phrases to achieve maximum effect in his songs, which he continues to do with the mellifluous sound of "Morning Is Broken." The timbre of Cole's voice works in tandem with rich guitar melody to make "Morning Is Broken" yet another in a long line of top drawer pop songs released by Cole.



#### Toad The Wet **Sprocket**

Dulcinea Columbia

The fully textured and experimentally recorded brew of intelligent pop songwriting that is known as Toad The Wet Sprocket has returned with another strong Columbia release, entitled Dulcinea. Featuring the Santa Barbara band's trademark acoustic/electric guitar layers and thoughtful vocals, Dulcinea delivers another set of compelling and memorable songs, tirelessly hummable and personally endearing. The warm reception and explosive growth that the album's first single, "Fall Down," has experienced are good indications that Dulcinea has the hook-laden singles to generate the same outstanding listener response that has characterized the group's music since their 1989 debut.

#### Renegade Soundwave

"Renegade Soundwave"

From their days in past years as standards of the English club party scene, Renegade Soundwave have earned a solid reputation as a group of beat-oriented music's most eclectic proponents, mixing the likes of techno, dub and funk into one danceable mix. Switching stylistic dominance too quickly to be accurately pigeonholed, Renegade Soundwave have returned with a fresh, self-titled single (to be found on their upcoming Mute/Elektra release, Howyoudoin?) that is fueled by a driving acoustic strumming progression. By venturing into such uncharted instrumental terrain, Renegade Soundwave members Gary Asquith and Danny Briottet demonstrate their stance as true innovators, capable of molding their established sequencing styles into more accessible pop composition.



#### Mexico 70

"Wonderful Lie"

Big Pop/Fox

Mexico 70 has nothing to do with their namesake country; in fact, the band is English. Mexico 70's sound is, however, very befitting of their English origins. This isn't limp, insipid, flavor of the month pop from the UK, but English pop in the best sense. "Wonderful Lie," which is taken from both the PCU soundtrack and the band's upcoming debut, is filled with ringing guitar melodies and a strong, forthright presence that smells of crossover success.

#### Lush "Hypocrite" 4AD/Reprise

The English noise/pop band Lush have returned with "Hypocrite," the first single from their upcoming Reprise release, Split. Following in the footsteps of their successful 1992 debut, Spooky, Lush create a single that is at once driving and sensitive. Featuring hard-edged guitar and bass riffs mixed with fierce, energetic drumming, "Hypocrite" still manages to retain an ethereal emotionality through the vocals of Miki Berenvi. With co-production by Mike Hedges and Alan Moulder (who's worked with Smashing Pumpkins and Nine Inch Nails), it's no wonder that "Hypocrite" bears such a heartarresting feel, at once melodically simple and sonically complex.

#### Eat

"Bleed Me White"

Eat have more than impressed the world of alternative with their revitalized 90s approach, which has yielded their recent release, Epicure. Bleed Me White," the second single from that album, demonstrates that the band has hardly lost its stride from its days as one of King's Cross, England's finest groups of the 80s. Since that era, Eat temporarily disbanded and then reformed with two new guitarists. The results have been astounding, as proven by the hard-edged, Arabian-tinged riff and sonorous chorus of "Bleed Me White." Vocalist Ange Dolittle sings powerfully, adding lyrical integrity to a song that already glows with musical power.

#### **Alison Moyet**

"Falling"

Alison Moyet's latest single, "Falling," bears witness to her foray into the realm of dance ideas, where her gentle and lucid vocals blend quite easily with a smooth drum beat and floating, minimal keyboard chords. Moyet's voice still retains its unique character, which originally gained her so much recognition as a member of Yaz. As a solo artist, Moyet has consistently gained more critical praise, even managing to earn a Grammy nomination for her last album, Hoodoo. Tracks like "Falling," from her current Columbia release, Essex, show Movet's continued vocal and artistic growth.



#### Big Drill Car No Worse For The Wear Headhunter/Cargo

Since finding a home in 1993 on San Diego's Cargo Records, the Orange County band Big Drill Car have delivered some of the decade's most bruising hooks. They now return with a barrage of high energy compositions on *No Worse For The Wear*. Citing influences as diverse as Sebadoh, Kiss and Adrian Belew, Big Drill Car concoct a songwriting style that reflects pop hook ideals built around the structures of punk-style drumming and riffs.

With a lineup change that finds Darren Morris on bass and Keith Fallis behind the drums, Big Drill Car have locked even more tightly onto their vision of hard-edged songs that revel in distorted guitar and pumping basslines. Frank Daly's harmonic sense has matured considerably, as the vocal contributions to songs like "Friend Of Mine" and "Crystal's Ball" amply demonstrate. Give a listen to No Worse For The Wear, and you, too, will understand why College Alternative programmers have already recognized Big Drill Car as one of the indie community's hottest commodities.

#### The Auteurs

"Lenny Valentino"
Hut USA/Vernon Yard

The latest single from The Auteurs, "Lenny Valentino," follows up brilliantly on the momentum created by the band's successful 1993 debut. New Wave. Coming from the forthcoming Vernon Yard release, Now I'm A Cowboy, "Lenny Valentino" depicts the funeral of an imaginary cross-breed actor, half Lenny Bruce and half Rudolph Valentino. Combining ringing guitar chords with a pop-paced drum beat, The Auteurs create a sound that is guided by Luke Haines' vocals, which lie somewhere between the artistic approaches of Neil Tennant and Marc Bolan.

#### Violent Femmes

New Times Elektra

Since their inception in the early 80s, Milwaukee's Violent Femmes have served up a dark mixture of acoustic guitar, electric bass and angry vocals that has helped define the pace and style of what has become known as alternative music. Their latest release, *New Times*, has all of the flavor for which the Femmes are known, proving that the time-honored group is still capable of making valuable contributions to its genre.

Gordon Gano's vocals continue to provide the degree of chill that they always have, adding to the unique balance of straight chord arrangements and self-conscious wackiness. The album's first single, "Breakin' Up," continues to

gain Alternative Radio airplay, demonstrating once again that the Femmes are just as potent as they were in the days of their surprising debut more than a decade ago.

#### Medicine

"Time Baby III"

As The Crow continues to reap big money at the box office and the soundtrack explodes at retail, it's the perfect time to dig deeper into the album to find there's much more than just The Cure and Stone Temple Pilots there. One of the album's finest cuts is the lushly orchestrated "Time Baby III" from Medicine, which will also be featured on a soon-to-be-released Medicine EP.

Medicine appears in the film performing the track, giving "Time Baby III" built-in exposure to your audience. And no, your ears don't deceive - that is the voice of Elizabeth Fraser from the Cocteau Twins floating in unison with the delicate, but assured, vocals of Beth Thompson. The track is remixed by Cocteau Twins architect Robin Guthrie, whose signature style melds perfectly with the music of Medicine, resulting in a rich sound that combines the best elements of both Medicine and the Cocteau Twins.

allas' Tripping Daisy is now one of the brightest acts to attract the attention of the alternative music fanbase that exists in the Southwestern states. Though that area isn't largely populated by horticulturalists or psilocybe fanatics, Tripping Daisy has developed into an act that draws consistent and growing crowds of core fans. Persistent touring has indeed raised the group's local profile considerably. Regardless of the promise of success, Tripping Daisy's energetic road schedule apparently emanates from a true affection for live performance. As the band's creative pillar Tim DeLaughter says, "We've turned into a touring band that just loves to tour and that's what this band is all about now; touring our asses off. I mean, we tour non-stop."

A band's commitment to its music will always draw respect, which may explain the response Tripping Daisy has experienced in their shows. Tim has more than devoted himself to his craft, almost living the starving artist caricature to the fullest degree. In the pursuit of the successful musical path, Tim has undergone moves from his native Dallas to LA, Colorado, and back again, all the while supporting himself on a string of odd jobs. Playing open mics in multiple states only confirmed Tim's suspicion that he belonged in a band. Accordingly, he began the tough process of forming a group, facilitated. oddly enough, by a shining pillar of support and guidance, his girlfriend Julie. (As they say, behind every great man is a great woman.) According to Tim, "Julie introduced me to Wes, who she knew from acting school. I never met the guy before, so he came over with his guitar and we jammed. Immediately, we started writing songs; the hemistry was there." After completing the band's formation, all that remained was a name. As their initial gig approached, the band's members grasped for a suitable nomber, but inevitably, they were saved by one of their catalysts, as Julie suggested Tripping Daisies. The idea was met with the ambivalence typical of a collection of musicians. As Tim says, "We were like, 'well, whatever; if we don't like it, we'll change it." The reception to Tripping Daisy's debut gig was too overwhelming for an identity crisis, though, so Julie's idea became a solid band name in the consideration of all of the anticipated fans.

Tripping Daisy's success on the Southwest circuit isn't merely a result of good composition, or awe-inspiring musicality. Rather, the interaction of the band members in the live setting leads to powerful jams that have progressed all the way into full songs, making Tripping Daisy a group whose material's strength rests very much on their performance chemistry. "Six of the songs on Bill [the band's Island Red debut] were actually written live," explains DeLaughter. "We do a lot of

improvising on stage. We'd go into a tangent and jam, and before you knew it, a new song would come out. I would just sing whatever was on the top of my head and that was what the song

was about." The full energy and spirit of live Tripping Daisy is now available to

more of the public than just the band's Southwestern following as Island Red releases *Get It On*, a collection of live renditions of five of the songs from *Bill*. This EP provides a more than adequate representation of the band's onstage power, and should continue the momentum started by the group's first two singles, "My Umbrella" and "Blown Away" (a version of which is included in the EP).

The compositional process that Tripping Daisy undergoes in the live setting gives them a true quality of development that their loyal fans have already experienced. The most interesting songwriting jam fans have seen occurred one night when Tim performed drenched in blood, recovering from a knife attack from the night before (a result of trying to break up a violent and unfair fight) that left him in need of 20 stitches. Tim sums up the attack, commenting, "It was pretty heavy-duty, man. We had a gig the very next night, and "Blown Away" was pretty much inspired by that incident and was written live that night."

Appropriately, "Blown Away" evokes a vivid depiction of the woes of street crime. According to the Tripping Daisy himself, "'Blown Away' is about how the value of human life has declined because of the rise of handguns and violence and all that bullshit." "Blown Away" is one of the strongest tracks from Bill, and has already received significant Alternative Radio airplay. Tim describes the single's accompanying video as "groundbreaking," and rightly so. The band enlisted the help of director Alex Halperin, a New York University graduate and short-filmmaker, who had always wanted to make a video. Halperin suggested using claymation, an idea that was heartily agreed on by the band. With a crew of eight that included Johnny Henson (son of the late, great Muppeteer, Jim), Alex spent the next two months ming clay renditions of the bandmembers. The result gets great

late, great Muppeteer, Jim), Alex spent the next two months filming clay renditions of the bandmembers. The result gets great reviews from DeLaughter, who explains, "The video is all about the death of humans, but it's all claymation. It's really interesting and very cool; I'm excited about it."

Despite the frills of an experimental video, or the lofty ideals that pervade some of his lyrics (*Bill's* lyrical content ranges from condemnations of violence and televangelism, to pleas for greater care for the elderly), Tim DeLaughter still feels that his agenda as a musician is merely to connect with people so that they can truly enjoy music. As he says, "I just wanna give people a ride, maybe an escape from what's going on at the time." It seems that he really wants to give his listeners part of himself, for the music is his escape as well. "When I sing the chorus to "On The Ground" it's like I'm literally flying a thousand miles an hour. I love that feeling." Just give *Bill* or *Get It On* a few spins, and you will probably realize why the buzz in the

Southwest is much louder than just a bunch of horse enamored flies.

indeed... WSGR's impressive. loudman, Mark Morden, recently had the privilege of escorting two winners from his radio show to see



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#### **Seal** Seal ZTT/Sire/WB

Few artists have burst onto the musical scene as quickly and completely as Seal did a few years back with "Crazy." But, if you spent time with the rest of the album, you became aware that there was another side to his music. Much of that album hinted at an artist who was much deeper lyrically, and more sensitive vocally, than his multi-format success image would suggest.



Now we have Seal's follow up, and there is little doubt left as to where his musical heart is. This tall, ominous and almost brooding man displays a remarkable propensity toward the intimate and sensitive. The music on *Seal* is incredibly compassionate. Through reserved use of emotional power, both vocally and in the arrangements, he communicates quiet moments of sorrow or joy, of confusion or conviction, of failure or triumph. One could easily (and erroneously) dismiss it as too slick, too jazzy, too cosmopolitan, but if you delve in deeper, you will be amazed!

Trevor Horn's production is subliminal in nature. You have to pay attention to appreciate all the subtle nuances and flavors built around the songs and their messages. Our introduction to the album is "Prayer For The Dying." This smooth tune belies its multi-leveled, turbulent message about the end of one phase of life and the beginning of another. "Dreaming In Metaphors" is an ambitious piece that literally takes us on a sonic roller coaster ride as it deals with romantic reality versus romantic dreams. The duet with Rickie Lee Jones, "If I Could," is about hope that human understanding and cooperation are just around the corner. And "Bring It On" is the album's tour de force.

Seal has chosen to create music that is from his heart and not necessarily for "the masses." His genius and passion deserve the time it takes from us to understand them.

Jimmy Buffet
Fruitcakes
Margaritavilla/MCA

Alright all you parrot-heads, it's Jimmy Buffet time again! In case you hadn't noticed, he is one of the strongest selling catalog artists there is (his box set is the third highest selling one of all time, and #1 for MCA!). He consistently sells out his shows (over one million people saw him last year!), and he is now a best-selling author. This man for all seasons should be played for all of the above reasons!

He and his Coral Reefers Band have been the sometimes sarcastic, sometimes wistful voice of the baby-boom generation since before they had the title. That has not changed with *Fruitcakes* (produced by Russ Kunkel). There is the lighthearted, devil-may-care side of Buffett in "Everybody's Got A Cousin In Miami," "Frenchman For The Night," "Love In The Library" and "Vampires, Mummies And The Holy Ghost." There is also the introspective and armchair-philosophical side displayed in songs like "Lone Palm,"

"Quietly Making Noise" and, my favorite, "Delaney Talks To Statues."

Jimmy Buffett represents that wanderlust in all of us. His tropical rock sound manages to touch a sympathetic chord, one that represents the desire to just run off to a tropical island somewhere, and leave this crazy rat race behind. Most of us can't do that, but through his albums, and his shows, we can get a glimpse of paradise.

#### The Iguanas

Nuevo Boogaloo

This New Orleans-based band represents everything that is integral to the Crescent City's musical tradition. Their special blend of sounds and styles is synonymous with what we have come to expect from groups that emerge from that rich musical caldron. Originally founded in 1989, it didn't take long for The Iguanas to gain a successful reputation, garnering Nawlin's Big Easy Award for Best Emerging Talent in 1990 and another for Best New Rock Band in 1991. They tour extensively (opening for Buffett last year), and it is in this live setting that the band has evolved their unique sound.

Their debut release in 1993, and the inclusion of their version of "Fortune Teller" in the *Jimmy Hollywood* OST, have put The Iguanas on the map at Adult Rock Radio. Now, with *Nuevo Boogaloo*, they are bound for the next level of success. Their music, which defies categorization, takes elements from Tex-Mex, New Orleans R&B, roots rock, Caribbean and salsa music. They fit somewhere between The Neville Brothers and Los Lobos.

The key tracks to listen to are "Boom Boom," "Panama Tones/Nuevo Boogaloo," "Angel" and "Hey Sweet Darling."

#### John Mellencamp

Dance Naked

Hot on the heels of *Human Wheels* comes John Mellencamp's latest effort, *Dance Naked*. His rendition of Van Morrison's "Wild Night," featuring the talents of Me' Shell Ndegeocello, is already being played by the vast majority of Adult Rock stations with great reaction.

On Dance Naked (ooh la la!), he has stripped his sound down a bit. The songs are what we would expect - straightforward rock with Americana lyrics and concise arrangements. In fact, most of the album was recorded in one take with a little overfulthing as possible to give it a

arrangements. In fact, most of the album was recorded in one take, with as little overdubbing as possible, to give it a "live" feel. Guitarist Mike Wanchic, a long-time member of John's band, produced the album along with Mellencamp. And, of course, it was recorded at Belmont Mall Studio

In addition to "Wild Night," I am certain a few other tracks will immediately find their way onto the airwaves, including "Another Sunny Day 12/25," which is essentially Mellencamp singing to an acoustic accompaniment, "Brothers," with its punchy arrangement and way cool break, "Too Much To Think About," which is just hard enough to fit, and the title track.

Needless to say, John Mellencamp is a staple artist for the format, and *Dance Naked* is another good example of how consistent and talented he really is. By the way, look for an extensive tour beginning this summer.

#### **B-Tribe**

in Belmont, IN.

Fiesta Fatal!

Upon first listen, one could easily compare the Barcelona Tribe Of Soulsters - B-Tribe - to a cross between Enigma and The Gipsy Kings, but, although the music may have a similar spiritual quality to it, *Fiesta Fatal!* is much more passionate. The brainchild of German-born Claus Zundel (he has resided in Ibiza for the past 15 years), B-Tribe injects elements of dance/African rhythms into the traditional and unwavering styles

of flamenco, which may seem, at first, to be at odds with each other. However, the opposite is the case. It somehow works wonderfully, without diluting the essence of either influence.

The international music community has embraced this hybrid sound in a big way, and the sensation is now crossing the ocean to America. The clubs were the first places the excitement entered, which created strong sales pockets all over the country. Now, radio is picking up on the buzz. Atlantic has included a Pro-CD along with the full album to point you toward the track that seems most suitable for Adult Rock Radio ("You Won't



See Me Cry"), but I dare you to go further into this project, where the real energy lies. Spend some time with the title track (there are three different versions), "Lo Siento" and "Una Vez Mas." It only takes a few listens to become completely fanatical about this music.

If projects like Deep Forest, Baka Beyond, William Orbit, Enigma, Sahara Blue and Material have worked for you, then B-Tribe is the next logical programming step to take.

#### **Trapezoid**

Remembered Ways

Trapezoid is a band, a way of viewing life and, to the members, a lifelong commitment. Their music is of the land, of the quiet strength of people and the basic truths in life. The key members of the "Zoid" are: Paul Reisler (electric, acoustic and slide guitars, hand-made string instruments), who has traveled and performed around the world with the band since 1975...besides performing, he also produces, directs major folk festivals and makes stringed instruments; Martha Sandefer (vocals, rhythm guitar and bass), who performed for many years with Paul Winter's Consort, Jim Scott and the New Christy Minstrels, and has done considerable session work; Cecil Hooker (violin), who has been playing since he was five years old in a variety of musical idioms; and Bob Read (piano, keyboards, sax, flute, clarinet, percussion), who owns the recording studio where *Remembered Ways* was recorded - he also co-produced and engineered the album.

Listening to Trapezoid's songs will give you a warm and comfortable feeling. Their music is organic, natural and flowing. Several tracks merit airplay, including "Time Has Taken," "Old Wood," "Ramblin' Heart" and a couple of cool instrumentals: "Hawk" and "Rappahannock."

#### Jimi Hendrix

MCA

This collection of rare and never-before-released recordings is a must for every fan of the blues, or Hendrix. Except for "Born Under A Bad Sign," "Catfish Blues" and "Bleeding Heart," all the tunes are originals. It reminds us, once again, what a timeless and unsurpassed talent Mr. Hendrix was!

#### **G.** Love

G. Love And Special Sauce Epic/OKeh

The release of G. Love And Special Sauce marks the rebirth of OKeh Records. Originally founded in 1916, the label helped kick off the careers of such greats as Louis Armstrong, Duke Ellington and Mississippi John Hurt. Now, Epic hopes to start off the careers of some 90s-style roots artists. G. Love is a Boston-based trio, with cool raps, down-home vocal styles and unique, semi-acoustic accompaniment. They take the heart of the blues and go one step further.

#### **Terry Evans**

Blues For Thought

Pointblank/Charisma

Still riding high on the crest of John Hammond's Trouble No More, Pointblank hits us with their next release, by singer/guitarist Terry Evans. Evans has been a foremost session vocalist for many years, singing with such artists as John Fogerty, Ry Cooder and John Lee Hooker. With Blues For Thought, he gets to step up front. The album was produced by Cooder, who also plays guitar on the disc. The recording also features Jim Keltner, Spooner Oldham, Robert Ward, Frankie Ford and the Paramount Singers. Whether Evans is belting out a Willie Dixon classic or one of his own compositions, his confidence and vocal command clearly stand out!

#### **Etta James**

Mystery Lady

Private Music

I had the opportunity to witness Miss Etta James perform at the new House Of Blues in LA recently, and was mesmerized by her talent, charisma and command of the audience. She is truly a pro! On Mystery Lady, she was able to fulfill a wish she has had for many years...to interpret many of the classic songs made immortal by Billy Holiday. This album really goes beyond musical genres or format restrictions; her talent and the songs themselves are universal!

#### **Scott Henderson**

Dog Party

Scott Henderson's Dog Party is one part fun, one part virtuosity and two parts "the blues." He has honored a great genre of music, and, at the same time, given it his own wailing interpretation. Henderson is an incredible guitarist, but as a finale, the last track, "Too Many Gittars," features not only himself, but four other great guitarists as well (Willie Scoggins, Steve Trovato, Keith Wyatt and T.J. Helmerich). And, on top of all of this...his dogs are really cute!

#### **Lewis Cowdrey**

It's Lewis

Antone's

Blues vocalist/guitarist/harmonica player Lewis Cowdrey gets the chance to strut his stuff again on It's Lewis! He has been a major player for many years in the Austin club circuit, and beyond. It's Lewis features a smooth blend of Texas-style blues, R&B grooves and rockin' boogie-woogie shuffles. Cowdrey wrote six of the 14 songs and chose some great classics, by such talents as James Brown, Holland/Dozier/Holland and Johnny Littlejohn to cover. There's guitars, organ, horns, harmonica and "girl talkin" galore! Check out "Not Doing Too Bad," "Itchy & Scratchy," "Wade In The Water" and the title track.

#### W.C. Clark

Heart Of Gold

Black Top

Since the 50s, W.C. Clark has been a major influence on the Texas music scene. He has always been interested in a vast variety of music, from blues to R&B to jazz. He played with Joe Tex for many years, and played in road shows with artists like Percy Mayfield, Joe Turner, Brook Benton and Joe Hinton. In the 70s, he once again rooted himself back in Austin and formed the W.C. Clark Blues Revue. On Heart Of Gold, we are given a solid dose of big band blues and soul, and we are given the chance to experience the music of one of the founding fathers of Austin's blues and soul heritage.

Jimmie Vaughan had this to say about Clark: "W.C. is one of the most gifted and soulful musician/singer/songwriters I have ever heard."

#### Michael Hill's Blues Mob

Bloodlines

Alligator

"Guitar Player Magazine" aptly described Michael Hill's Blues Mob by calling Bloodlines "a cliche-smashing debut [that] delivers hard blues for hard times." Hailing from the South Bronx in New York, young Michael Hill began to interact with bands like Living Colour, and joined the Black Rock Coalition, in which he honed his hard-edged and driving style of blues. (In fact, Living Colour's Vernon Reid makes a guest appearance on the album.)

The music on Bloodlines speaks of hard times and living on the streets in urban America. There is an urgency and raw energy to the music that will quickly grab you.

#### Terry Walsh & 2 A.M.

Harriett

Terry Walsh & 2 A.M. are a Minneapolis-based quartet that have their own special brand of blues. It is a little uptown and slick, but it does get the point across: No matter where you live, or how you live, everybody has gotten the blues some time in their life. The musicianship on Harriett is tight, the vocals are expressive and the energy level is high. Check out "Uptown Express" and "The Other Side."

#### **Matt Smith Band**

Delta Radio

New Millennium

If you live on the East Coast, you know about the Matt Smith Band. These guys have been giggin' around for a long time. They have finally recorded what lots of people have seen live for years on tape; hence we now have their debut release, Delta Radio. Their sound is a mixture of blues and funk, and just enough jazzy-horns flavor to make it interesting. Several tracks got my attention on the first listen, including "Perfect World" and "It's Not That I Am Afraid Of Love."



There comes a time in each of our lives when we must take a good, hard look at the path we chose, and we often discover that what was so important to us way back when is really not what is important in the long run! Such is the feeling you get when listening to Stevie Nick's latest release, Street Angel (her first studio project in five years!).

Sure, we are given some classic Stevie Nicks "wild-hearted" songs, such as the killer "Blue Denim," "Docklands," and "Maybe Love (Will Change Your Mind)," but much of the material on this album seems to reflect more of a personal retrospective. Songs like "Greta" (isn't it really about her?) and "Rose Garden" explore the empty hole in the gut that beautiful homes and big cars can't fill. The title track deals with

relationships that have no real future, and "Unconditional Love" reminds us to be grateful for the love we have had in our life, even if it was just for a while.

Street Angel was produced by Nicks and Thom Panunzio. Glen Parrish was executive producer and the mixing was done by Chris Lord-Alge. The list of luminaries who contributed to the recording of the album includes Mike Campbell and Benmont Tench (from The Heartbreakers), Andy Fairweather (from Eric Clapton's band), Eagles co-founder Bernie Leadon, David Crosby, master drummer Kenny Aronoff and Bob Dylan (who plays guitar and harmonica on his "Just Like A Woman")!

Stevie Nicks is an immense talent, and always has been! Her music consistently touches the heart and soul

Rock Radio in my humble opinion, is totally missing a smash song with Michael Been's "Us." That being the case, Adult Rock has the chance to grab onto a great project and get a

programming advantage at the same time! Perhaps the lead track is a little hard for your station, but other tracks on Been's self-produced *On The Verge Of A Nervous Breakthrough* could easily fit into your station's sound. Check out "Luminous," "She," "For Your Love" and my recommendation, "To Feel This Way."

Much of the younger audience who listened to The Call back in the 80s has grown up to be the bottom end of the Adult Rock audience, and they want to hear an artist that fits into their musical meniories. Michael Been is a perfect artist for this. He hasn't forgotten the rebel edge of his past, but it has certainly been tempered by time and experience.

Sound familiar?

In the wake of rumors of an imminent TV movie about the life and death of Nirvana frontman Kurt Cobain, very real plans for a big-screen adaptation of the Washingtonian's tale have surfaced.


Although it appears that the TV movie won't be happening, a talent agency known for its aggressive business philosophy has snapped up the book rights to Dave Thompson's "Never Fade Away: The Kurt Cobain Story," a quickly written - and unauthorized - bio of the musician's life that hit the stands just weeks after Cobain's body was discovered.

Paradigm Talent enlisted screenwriter Richard Dilello (writer of "Colors" and "Bad Boys," and a client of the agency) to script the movie version of Thompson's book, after convincing its publisher, St. Martin's Press, that the company would not churn out a poorly made, exploitative flick. It seems that the talent agency's client is a good choice - in addition to his film credits, he wrote "The Last Cocktail Party," a book many consider to be the definitive bio on The Beatles (it even garnered approval from John Lennon).

Although Paradigm has the rights to a bio and a well known writer working on the script, the eventual sale of the film could be a tough nut to crack. Cobain's surviving family members, including widow Courtney Love, have steadfastly refused big-dollar offers to sell the rights to "Come As You Are," Nirvana's authorized biography.

#### Bryan Adams Rocks Wembley




