wenty years and 70 million albums later, Kiss and its legions of supporters in the Kiss Army have achieved the ultimate tribute from the likes of Lenny Kravitz, Gin Blossoms, Garth Brooks, Toad The Wet Sprocket, Anthrax, Extreme, The Lemonheads and Dinosaur Jr, among others. Kiss My Ass - Classic Kiss Regreoved went to radio this week, and radio returned a guilty verdict: "first degree coolness!"

Kravitz's "Deuce" (on which he is joined by Stevie Wonder) leads the way out of the chute at Rock Radio, picking up 59 adds. In the new PPW-oriented world, this one will enter the Power Cuts chart next week. Also gaining notice at Rock Radio are "Christine Sixteen," by the Gin Blossoms, "Strutter," from Extreme, Brooks' "Hard Luck Woman" and TTWS's "Rock And Roll All Nite." Plus, at RAWk Radio, Kiss My Ass was the #2 Most Added CD this week.

Moreover, our crack retail team tells us that *Kiss My Ass* is the #4 Hot Future this week, meaning the CD will be exiting stores in a hurry as soon as it's available.

The Top 30 Power Cut "Losin' Your Mind" has surprised virtually everyone who was convinced they knew exactly what Zakk Wylde's band was gonna sound like. If he's the guitarist on Ozzy Osbourne's last four albums, then he must be of the commercial/metal ilk, right? Ha, we say!

On its self-titled CD, Pride & Glory (drummer Brian Tichy and bassist James Lomenzo round out the explosive trio) rocks hard, leaning primarily toward a Southern-sounding, bluesy feel. It is Jersey boy Wylde's musical vision that created Pride & Glory, and they are his songs that make up the CD. Also, Wylde plays all the guitars, piano, harmonica, banjo and mandolin on the disc, and sings, to boot.

If you're lookin' to go deeper n' "Losin' Your Mind," look first to "Horse Called War," "Lovin' Woman," "Machine Gun Man" and "Cry Me A River." Also, "Sweet Jesus" and "Fadin' Away" are stunning eye-openers to the vast talents of Zakk Wylde.

Now, be sure and play this album so it will sell and Zakk can finally move his family outta the ramshackle house which graces the CD cover.

Helmet

Betty


If any of the current class of ultra-aggressive RAWkers is to see its appeal broaden to the mainstream, it will undoubtedly be New York's Helmet. Why? Because their third full-length release, *Betty*, has already created a thunderous buzz on the streets and because "Milktoast" not only benefits from its inclusion on the top-selling soundtrack to *The Crow*, but, in fact, the soundtrack itself profits from the song's inclusion.

Another clue to Helmet's impending success at Rock Radio is the fact that 44 programmers have already hipped themselves to "Milktoast," the first example of Betty's pulsating riffs and melodic power. These early believers include major market stations such as KIOZ, KISW, WQFM, KUPD, KEGL and KNAC. On Betty, "Milktoast" is spelled "Milquetoast" - not because Page Hamilton, John Stanier, Henry Bogdan and Rob Echeverria wanna be difficult, but because the version

on the band's CD loses the several seconds of sfx at the end, making it worthy of a name alteration.

Beyond"Milquetoast," Betty offers "Wilma's Rainbow," "I Know," "Overrated," "Sam Hell" and "Speechless" for Rock Radio.





Paul Weller "Sunflower"

We had this Traffic-like gem on our hold button at

The Album Network for a couple of weeks recently,

and the response we heard was among the

strongest ever for a song "on hold."

The hook goes, "I miss you so," and, upon hearing it, you'll not eradicate it from your memory in a kajillion years. Of Weller and his new single (from *Wild Wood*, his second solo outing), know that he was the mastermind behind The Jam and The Style Council, and that "Sunflower" is currently receiving play at Rock Radio outlets in the Northeast, the Southwest, the Pacific Northwest, the South and the

Midwest. Try either mix of this cut.

Suicidal Tendencies

"What You Need's A Friend"

LA's Suicidal Tendencies epitomize the notion of a "street-wise" band, having risen from those streets to become leaders in the aggressive/hard RAWk spectrum. Moreover, Mike Muir takes advantage of his spot as frontman in both Suicidal and Infectious Grooves to comment on life as he sees it.

Over the course of Suicidal's career, the band has evolved into a group of talented musicians who make awe-inspiring, powerful brain candy. You'll see what we mean when you listen to "What You Need's A Friend," which is taken from the new Suicidal For Life.

Chainsaw Kittens

"Pop Heiress Dies"

In the past couple of years, thanks to bands such as Soul Asylum, Nirvana and Collective Soul, Rock Radio has caught up with the massive, guitar-induced "wall of sound" pop rock fashioned by Oklahoma's Chainsaw Kittens. So, with this, the kinda sorta title track from the band's third CD (*Pop Heiress*), Chainsaw Kittens have a legitimate shot at major exposure from this format.

"Pop Heiress Dies" is laden with guitar hooks and hummable melodies.

Robin Trower

20th Century Blues

For his first album in four years, it was important to Robin that he be allowed to follow his heart and make the music that felt most right to him. The way to do that, he surmised, was to create his own label, giving him complete creative freedom and control over his musical destiny. The result, 20th Century Blues, is a throwback to Trower albums such as Bridge Of Sighs and For Earth Below. It is now Livingstone Brown on vocals, as opposed to James Dewar, but 20th Century Blues nonetheless harkens back to Robin's heyday, both in its attitude and in its full-throttle guitar attack.

The title track of this rockin' CD is gaining momentum at Rock Radio, as well it should. We also like "Precious Gift," "Whisper Up A Storm," "Step Into The Dark" and "Chase The Bone."

Storyville

"Bluest Eyes"

Storyville is the collective name of musicians who play with Austin-based singer Malford Milligan (a recent recipient of the Austin Music Awards' "Best Male Vocalist" trophy). "Bluest Eyes" - the title track of Storyville's first undertaking - is mid-tempo and poppish, and it boasts of more soul than one song should be allowed to possess. On it, Malford is ably backed up by, among others, Don Henley on vocals and Chris Layton (Double Trouble, Arc Angels) on drums.

Rhino Bucket

"Pain"

There is no denying the resemblance of this LA-based band to AC/DC. So, we don't even think it would behoove us to try and steer you away from the obvious. What we will point out about Rhino Bucket's new release ("Pain" is the first track from *Pain*, the Bucket's third CD) is how much it will appeal to precisely the same crowd that loves the band fronted by Angus and Brian.

"Experience"

Diamond Dave is back with a tune underscoring the fact that he is a little wiser and owns a little more savvy for having lived through each of his 38 years. "Experience" is the next offering from Your Filthy Little Mouth, and it seems to take us back musically to a time when admission into underground speakeasies could be had by invitation only.

This song is equal parts blues licks, sexy chicks and Dave's sardonic lyrical wit. "Experience" will add a touch of class to any Rock Radio outlet.



Peter Frampton "Shelter Through The Night"

Rock Radio spoke, and Relativity listened. So, up next from Frampton is this electric guitar rocker,

crammed to the gills with plenty of edge and balls. "Shelter Through The Night" gets to radio just before Peter hits the road for his summer tour (and, just before The Album Network brings you an exclusive 90-minute live broadcast of a dress rehearsal on Saturday, June 18 - have you signed up yet?).

Check this one out on our Rock CD TuneUp #116; it has the same sorta style and attitude as "Day In The Sun." WLZR, DC101, KATP and WXRC all refused to wait on "Shelter Through The Night."

The Smithereens

"Everything I Have Is Blue"

RCA

Rock Radio made "Miles From Nowhere" a Top 15 Power Cut, ultimately playing it nearly 2,300 times a week. Now comes "Everything I Have Is Blue," which is also from *A Date With The Smithereens*; this one's a dark rocker that evokes the same sort of feelings that the first couple of Smithereens albums did.

These guys have a long history of successes at Rock Radio, and "Everything I Have Is Blue" will be the next song to add to the story (KLBJ and WXRC went on it early). You'll find it on our Rock CD TuneUp #116.

Sheryl Crow

"All I Wanna Do"

A&M

This distinctive songstress has been embraced equally by Rock, Alternative and Adult Rock Radio, while MTV had the clip for "Leaving Las Vegas" in rotation for more than three months (meaning Sheryl Crow has developed name recognition from coast to coast).

In "All I Wanna Do," Sheryl weaves images of her LA homeland around a tale of noon-time drinking and people watching. David Baerwald's slide guitar wails here, which should help it appeal to upper demos. This one is also included on AN Rock CD TuneUp #116, and KROQ is already leading the pack on "All I Wanna Do."

Tori Amos

"Cornflake Girl"

Atlantic/TAG

You already know Tori's singular style and appeal, and we're betting that many more Rock Radio programmers have been blown away by her compelling live performances than have actually added her records. As our format continues to chase upper demos to satisfy \$\$\$-minded GMs and sales managers, we will continue to plug Tori Amos. She makes sense for Rock Radio in a lot of ways - particularly because her music is awesome.

Tori's former Top 10-selling *Under The Pink* CD is now Gold and climbing, while "Cornflake Girl" has already gone Top 20 at Alternative Radio.

Hash

"American Chorus"

Elektra

You know how the Meat Puppets took the raw guitar energy and fluid, airtight vocal harmonies and melodies of "Backwater" all the way to #3 on Power Cuts? Well, you won't confuse this psychedelic rocker from Hash's debut venture with that Puppets hit, but it does reek of the same elements that made "Backwater" so popular with your listeners.

Hash may be unknown thus far to the American rock music scene, but the seductive "American Chorus" could change all that.



Lenny and Stevie Wonder grab the attention of 59 Rock Radio PDs with this tribute to Kiss. "Deuce" receives the most adds of the several tracks reported from Kiss My Ass, and it will enter Power Cuts next week.

Among the out of the box supporters for Lenny's "Deuce" are WBZX, WBAB, KLOS, WMMS, WIYY, WXTB, WAAF and KSHE. From a commercial standpoint, this one comes from this week's #4 Hot Future CD at retail.

At WSFM, John Stevens says of Kiss My Ass: "This record will bridge the generation gap and reach old and new fans alike...what a cool concept!" WHDQ's Guy Dark points out, "Lenny has always worked for us, and his cover of 'Deuce' sounds great!"

Jay Lopez of WSFL tells us, "This is the best Lenny Kravitz track I've heard! Stevie Wonder's harmonica will blow you away!"

CARY HOEY "Low Rider"



"Low Rider' by Hoey is such a kickass tune! His interpretation of this familiar song is killer!"

Belinda Simmons, KEZE Gary has quickly endeared himself to Rock Radio with his guitar instrumentals, the latest of which nails down 47 out of the box adds this week. "Low Rider" picks up 172 reported PPWs by add day, so the song debuts on the Power Cuts chart at #92*.

Not only do KDKB, WBZX, KEGL, KRXQ, WIXV and WDHA add "Low Rider," but WDIZ, WUFX and WOZN are already playing it three times a day. Moreover, 'DIZ and WKLT are picking up heavy phones on Hoey's latest.

Jason Wright of KMKF exclaims, "This rocks! It's the perfect summer song!" WBZX's Ronni Hunter concurs, saying: "'Low Rider' is the perfect summer track!"

At WIZN, Mike Luoma beams, "Hoey rocks! This is a fast, potent follow up," while WXKE PD Rick West notes, "Gary Hoey made a lot of friends last time, and it's paying off this time around!"

SAMMY HAGAR "Buying My Way Into Heaven"

There was no way this smoker from the Red Rocker was gonna get missed on add day, as evidenced by 44 first-week reports. Eleven Rock Radio outlets were on "Buying My Way Into Heaven" early, and with 192 plays overall, the song comes on the Power Cuts chart at #87*.

Even as Hagar and the band work on the next Van Halen CD, KIOZ, WLZR, KSHE, WSHE, KSJO and KTXQ all add "Buying My Way Into Heaven."

Ronni Hunter, MD at WBZX, states, "It's a juicy one, and it works!" At WAOR, PD Bill Martin figures, "We're playing everything else off Sammy's greatest hits album, so why not play 'Buying My Way Into Heaven'?!"

Also, WWBR's Don Alias comments, "'Buying My Way Into Heaven' is a blazing summertime tune; it's definitely one of Sammy's standout tracks, and it's destined to be a classic!"

STONE TEMPLE PILOTS "Vasoline"



"Vasoline' should erase the 'Pearl Jam wanna-be' stigma!" Guy Dark, WHDQ

Stone Temple Pilots' "Vasoline" grabs an additional 39 adds at the format, putting the song on 180 stations now. And, with a 1,007-play spike, the first single from *Purple* jams to #16* on the Power Cuts chart.

Forty-seven Rock Radio outlets up their PPWs on "Vasoline," including KLOL (seven to 17) and WQFM (five to 17). Plus, KEGL, KIOZ, KSJO, KISS, KISW, WMMS and WAAF are all playing this one at least 25 times a week.

Not surprisingly, *Purple* is this week's #1 Hot Future at the retail level.

WSHE MD John Rozz remarks, "Stone Temple Pilots' 'Vasoline' is a great record! We've been on it from the moment we received it, and we can't wait until they visit South Florida!" At WKLT, Terri Ray calls "Vasoline" an "absolute automatic - and a great song!"

"Selling The Drama"

"Selling The Drama" lands on the New Action Airplay chart for a sixth straight week, benefiting from 25 more adds at Rock Radio. On our PPW-driven Power Cuts chart, a 387-play spike equals a jump to #21*.







World Radio History

On Wednesday, June 1, The Album Network World Premiered Boston's new CD, Walk On. If you weren't able to hear Tom Scholz discussing the ins and outs of Walk On, here's your opportunity to catch up with what's been going on with the guitarist/ songwriter/producer/ godhead since we last heard from Boston.

World Radio History

What's happened in your life since the end of the *Third Stage* tour in 1987? Have you been working on *Walk On* for seven years?

"Well, I'd like to tell you what's been going on in my life for the last seven years, but it would be really embarrassing. So, how about if I just leave it at I had some really good times...and some really bad times. It was basically your running soap opera-like condensed novelette, but it did give me some ideas for songs.

"In between the significant events in my life, I put together a new studio, and a lot of guys in the band

production time and technical complexity from encroaching on the vitality and "soul" of the music performances?

"The technical side of making a record is just a necessary evil that you have to put up with, in the course of trying to get your music on the tape. It's a pain, it takes a long time, it's tedious. But it really makes me look forward to those rare moments when I actually get to pick up a guitar and play it.

"And I'd say the most important thing about making a Boston record is that basically, I break all the rules. All

and cruelty? Well, actually, I think there are a few, but most people aren't. However, most people don't know [about] things that go on behind the scenes, which are covered up by individuals who like to make money [from] them. And people should know about these things, so we included a couple of pictures and some organizations that, if someone is interested in finding out more information, they can write to, to find out just what really goes on with these things.

"The four I chose to put on the liner notes are four of a very long list. Things that people aren't aware of. For

helped. It took two years to build the studio, a year or so of developing some new gadgets and equipment - which got used on this record - and then three years of actually recording Walk On. We started in November of 1990 and finished in December of 1993."

You're the producer, the engineer, the guitar player, the songwriter, the designer of new recording techniques, the builder of the studio, etc. Which of these many hats gives you the most enjoyment when it comes to making a Boston record?

"The very best hat to wear in the studio is the listener hat. I know a few people who seem to do that all the time, but unfortunately, I have to do all those other jobs in between so I can do that 'listener' job once in a while. I don't get to do that too much, but every night, when I'm done in the studio, I always crank the speakers and play back whatever I've been working on - maxed out...which is why I can't hear these questions, because I have absolutely no response left in my ears.

"Aside from listening, I guess I'd have to say playing guitar is definitely the most exciting. I don't get to do that very much. Most of the time, I am wearing the producer hat, which is, by far, the hardest. That's a bad hat. I wish I could find another way to do these records."

Walk On is the fourth Boston record in 18 years. Has that been enough to satisfy you musically? Do you wish there could have been another album or two?

"Oh sure, rub it in. Is that enough to satisfy me musically? Uh, no, but it's been enough to exhaust me mentally. I wish there could have been another 10 [albums]. I've already worn out my cassette of Walk On. Maybe they'll come a little faster now that we have this new studio built. I don't think it'll ever happen any quicker than three years, though."

How do you keep from losing your objectivity, as an artist and producer, when you work so long and meticulously on the same recordings repeatedly?

"Well, it's easy - I just throw everything out at the end of the day and start over again. Actually, it's all those breaks to go upstairs and raid the refrigerator. You know, it gives everything that fresh sound when you come back and listen to it.

"Realistically, I think I lost my objectivity years ago. I just record until I like it, that's all I know."

How important are the technological aspects of making a Boston record, as compared to the performance side, and how do you keep the the tracks are recorded way too hot - if I'm not bending the needles on the meter bridge, then it's not loud enough. And the singer stands right next to the 24-track deck and I make sure that my guitar is making lots of background noise. Basically, you break all the rules and you come up with something that sounds different than everybody else."

The album kicks off with the song 'I Need Your Love.' Tell us about it.

"I Need Your Love' was the first song written, it was the first song recorded, it was the first song completed. And I put it on first on the album because it's all pure Boston and it's my answer to all those people who've stopped me in the street every day for the last six years, saying, 'So what are you doing now? Are you still playing any music? What about Boston? Is that all over?' No way, Ray."

You write a lot about relationships, emotions, feelings. Are these the kinds of topics that interest you most as a songwriter?

"No, [they're] the topics that interest me the most as a person. Like most people, my personal life is a total chaotic mess most of the time. And emotions, feelings - all that stuff - are about the only things I can think about. Well, not the only things I can think about, but if I wrote songs about sex all the time, I don't think I could get away with it."

Which song came together the easiest in terms of recording and performances, and which song was the most difficult to get finished?

"I thought they were all next to impossible."

In the liner notes, you really stress your use of real musicians and instruments, both on Walk On and on stage, plus you list all of the technical equipment used to make the album (which you did on Third Stage as well). Why is that important to you to tell the audience?

"Well, because seeing bands on stage pretending to sing and play these parts, where the drummer has got the headphones on, following the click track, and somebody's on the side hitting notes on a sampler to play singing parts...that really makes me gag. We don't do that. And I don't think anybody should. I mean, it's supposed to be rock n' roll, and [if] you can't do it...you need a new

There's a bold statement included in the liner notes: WALK ON - AGAINST VIOLENCE AND CRUELTY.

"Now there's a new thought...'walk on against violence and cruelty.' I mean, is there anybody who is for violence

instance, when you go to your favorite Italian restaurant and order a veal dish, they got that veal [by] pulling a calf from its mother at birth [and] chaining [it] in a crate in the dark for two months, in a place too small for it [to] even, like, turn around. I think if people know those things [they] won't buy veal next time. So that's the idea."

Why is it important to take these social concerns of yours and share them with Boston fans? Would you consider performing a concert to benefit any of these organizations?

"Well, I think it's important to share social concerns with anybody that can make a difference, and with pretty much all those things that Boston endorse and that I endorse, everybody can make a difference real easily, just by knowing about what's going on.

"Yes, we would perform a concert to benefit those organizations; in fact, we've donated an enormous sum of money and done lots of promotional work for organizations that help with these things.

"We really got serious on that question, didn't we? Okay, back to my normal self."

> You put out a curious press release regarding the time lag between your delivery of the new album and its pending release by MCA. What was the intent of that press release?

"Well, there were a lot of rumors about when the album was going to be released. I heard rumors saying December, January, February, March, April, May...the band wasn't talking about it at all. We've kept very quiet about things - it was our job just to make a record.

"The album was actually available to MCA back in December of last year, and for whatever reason, they elected not to release it until June of this year. We don't know why that is, but we wanted to make sure that everybody knew it wasn't us. We wanted it out there. We were hoping to go on tour this summer, but we're going on tour this fall."

Despite the length of time between records, a lot of fans have hung with Boston from the beginning to now, as there is much anticipation for the new album. What would you like to say to and about your fans?

"I'd like to say they have really good taste in music.
"Seriously...I think that it's great. I'd like to say thanks to everybody who hung in there and realized that Boston was just trying to do [the best music] and not [make] the most money."

Not surprisingly, former KBCO programmer Doug Clifton has been named PD/midday talent, while KNNC/Austin PD Bruce Jones (Bill Raffe) comes aboard as MD/afternoon driver. KBPI veteran Pete MacKay joins for mornings, and KZYR/Avon MD Jackie Selby takes nights. SBR partner Ray Skibitsky will be

overseeing the operation as Station Manager. The personality lineup will debut next week, following the musically intensive sign-on.

Calling itself "Denver's Rock Alternative," "The Peak"s music mix will focus on rock alternative songs from the 80s and 90s by artists including U2, R.E.M., Peter Gabriel, Sting and Pearl Jam, mixed with music from new bands like Counting Crows, Cracker, Toad The Wet Sprocket, Sarah McLachlan and Gin Blossoms. The Peak's format was developed by SBR, with research from Mike Henry at Paragon Research.

"I'm very excited to be involved with this new radio station," Clifton tells Network News. "It's been 25 years since the last commercial FM station signed on, and I couldn't be more pleased to have this opportunity! It's going to be a tremendous challenge...probably the biggest challenge that I've ever had in my broadcast career, but we're looking forward to it. We have a great group of people here!"



Conte steps up from her role as VP/Media & Artist Relations. From 1978 to 1988, she held various posts with the label, before moving to EMI Records as VP/Press & Publicity. She rejoined Atlantic in 1990.

Pearl Jam Vs. Ticketmaster

While The Stones, Pink Floyd and the Eagles tour the US with tickets running from \$50 to over \$100 per seat, Pearl Jam shelved its summer tour because they couldn't get concert operators and a ticket service agency to lower their fees so they could charge their fans less than \$20 a ticket.

Last month, the band filed a complaint with the Justice Department's antitrust division, alleging that the Ticketmaster agency enjoys a national monopoly over ticket distribution and that its service charge dramatically inflates ticket prices. Furthermore, Pearl Jam claims that the LA-based operation has used its considerable clout to keep promoters from booking the band's low-cost summer tour. Specifically, the Justice Department is looking into allegations that the agency persuaded promoters to boycott the band's choice of venues that charged just \$18 a ticket and a service fee of no more than \$1.80. (Ticketmaster's usual fee runs anywhere from \$5 to \$8 per ticket.)

"We're just trying to look out for our fans," Pearl Jam manager Kelly Curtis told the "LA Times." "A large percentage of the people who love Pearl Jam just don't have very much money, and we want them to be able to attend our concerts. It's all just as simple as that."

Ticketmaster denies any wrongdoing and promoters and venue operators have lined up squarely in the agency's corner. They credit the agency for creating new sources of revenue for concert operators, as well as their efficient and relatively equitable method of simultaneous ticket distribution. Furthermore, the surcharges can't be arbitrarily reduced, since they are part of a legal contract.

Yet Ticketmaster has been anything but immune to these kinds of charges. Days after the company settled on a 1992 price-fixing lawsuit (where it admitted no wrongdoing, but gave \$1.5 million in tickets to charity and paid legal fees), consumers in six states filed another class-action suit against the corporation.

The unlikeliest villain in this brouhaha is, of all parties, the Justice Department. In 1991, it gave the go ahead for Ticketmaster to basically buy out its sole competitor, Ticketron. That gave the agency almost total control over the sales and distribution of concert tickets for all the major venues in America.



Rapidly gathering momentum, Live's "Selling The Drama" jumps 26-21* on Power Cuts, increasing 387 spins to chalk up a total of 1,730 PPWs. "Selling The Drama" found a bunch of new believers this week as 25 stations (nine of them majors) added the track. Still in Stress rotation at MTV, and still on tour, Live are letting their presence be known.

Retailers are experiencing Throwing Copper firsthand as customers throw their pennies toward the cash register. MarketMaker accounts are firmly behind this release, with many reporting heavy, heavy in-store play. The album is #34 on the Hottest Sales Nationwide, upward moves include Tower/DC 84-53, Tracks/Indianapolis 18-5 and Tower Alternative/ Costa Mesa 22-10.

AEROSMITH Get A Grip

"I played the shit out of Get A Grip over the last two weeks and - boom - it moves up the chart!"

Jack is a smart guy; he knows it's time to push Aerosmith in the store again. After all, "Crazy" is all over the radio, and MTV play on Aerosmith continues to hold the public's interest. "Crazy" is #5* on Power Cuts, with 3,187 PPWs (shooting up 415 spins over last week). It's also the #6 Most Requested song, with 25 reports. Is there anyone out there in Rock Radio who's not playing Aerosmith? It doesn't look like it.

Get A Grip gets a firm handhold on the Hottest Sales Nationwide, moving 73-62*. The album redebuts at 22 accounts and marks 25 upward moves, including Tempo/Santa Barbara 46-25, Manifest Discs/Greenville 57-39, Tower/Stonestown 81-47 and Tower/Honolulu 41-27.

CRACKER Kerosene Hat

"Cracker recently played the 'HFS-tival,' and they're getting a ton of MTV play - sales are up on *Kerosene Hat*!"

Both Cracker singles, "Get Off This" and "Low" are up on Power Cuts this week. This airplay is greatly contributing to the total of 2,267 PPWs logged by Kerosene Hat, which is #16* on the Hottest Airplay chart. "Get Off This" is up to 1,701 PPWs (it's the #23* Power Cut), and MTV has nudged the video for the song into Active rotation.

Cracker are getting a good amount of well deserved attention, and it's paying off at retail, where *Kerosene Hat* advances 76-75* on the Hottest Sales Nationwide. MarketMakers reporting upward moves include Record Theatre/Syracuse 29-19, Amoeba/Berkeley 64-28, Tower/San Mateo 72-48 and Dingleberry's/ Dayton 72-34.

OFFSPRING Smash

"It's huge! Heavy airplay, endcap displays and our listening stations shoot *Smash* into the Top 10!"

Like landing next week's Buzz Clip on MTV, where the video is already in Stress rotation. Like scoring the fourth highest debut of the week on the Hottest Sales Nationwide, where Smash comes in at #78*. The Offspring are breaking out nationwide in a big way, and the 58 upward moves and 26 debuts at retail this week are only the beginning. Check 'em out for vourself, as they start a national tour in July!






Summer 94 is coming and the temperature's rising, nerves are fraying, tempers are flaring and even the most obtuse of us are dimly aware of a certain unease in the air. Out of similar circumstances in the summer of 69 came an amorphous collusion of sounds, styles and



ethnicities fused into the genre-crossing musical melting pot known as WAR. "What If's" pop-jazz-funk is as infectious as its message is positive. "I'm The One (Who Understands)" and "Smile For Me" strike something deep inside the soul with their laidback grooves touched by hints of forlorn reminiscence. "East L.A." and "Wild Rodriguez" showcase the Latin slink and loco-funk that made "Lowrider" a part of the social subconsciousness. In short, Peace Sign is an album of all-out, no-holds-barred WAR at their best.

It is sad to say, but the problems that gripped us in the past are still unresolved today. Racism, intolerance and man's inhumanity to man continue to dominate the social landscape. Thankfully, there is WAR to help salve the wounds and ease the pain of the citizens of today's world. Retailers, play the hell out of this one and you will get results. Radio, ditto. Be sure to catch WAR on tour this summer. In this age of wars and rumors of war, WAR grants us one of the few ways to find peace within ourselves. Anyone with passion, desire and a heartbeat should take them up on their offer. You won't regret it.




with songwriter Jamie Kyle.


Helmet





his social concerns, or political punch, either.



Cuts To The Chase offers us two sides of this talented performer and songwriter. "Side One (The Declaration)" is the socially concerned Havens. He has decided to cover tunes by a variety of artists, and he succeeds beautifully in imprinting his own style on each of them. Key tracks include Jackson Browne's "Lives In The Balance," Sting's "They Dance Alone," Jessie Colin Young's "Darkness, Darkness," Kris Kristofferson's "The Hawk" and his self-penned "Young Boy."

"Side Two (Independence)" deals more with the relationships between people. He again makes an excellent choice of songs, including Bill Perry's "Fade

To Blue," Clapton & Cray's "Old Love," Marty Balin's "Comin' Back To Me" (I love this song!) and Bob Lind's "How The Nights Can Fly."

As a special treat, the CD-Pro of "My Father's Shoes" includes three bonus tracks that were recorded live at the KCRW studios: Van Morrison's "Tupelo Honey," Donovan's "Wear Your Love Like Heaven" and an original, "No One Left To Crown."

In this year of the 25th Anniversary of Woodstock, it is reassuring to hear Richie Havens continue to spread his idealism through "folk" music to audiences new and old!



This great collection came as a complete surprise when I opened it up. With all the Yes reincarnation projects out there at the moment, I didn't expect to see a solo effort by Jon Anderson - especially a solo project that is a complete divergence from his mainstream work.

Deseo is an exploration into the music and spirit of Latin America. While it remains true to its acoustic heritage, it is, at the same time, extremely contemporary. Jon is joined by such musicial luminaries of the Caribbean, and Central and South America,



as Milton Nascimento of Brazil, Ruben Rada of Uruguay and Maria Conchita Alonso. Other guest artists include Glen Monroig, Eduarto del Signore, Cecelia Toussaint, Valentine Vargas and the group, Boca Livre.

Deseo is very listenable and, I believe, very programmable. There is a primitive beauty and natural grace to every track. I especially like "Amore Real," "Bridges," "Floresta," "This Child," "Midnight Dancing" and the title track.

Kristen Hall Be Careful What You Wish For...

Be careful when you listen to Kristen Hall's latest release, *Be Careful What You Wish For...*, because you are going to fall in love with it! Her music has a tender, familiar quality that makes you feel instantly comfortable with it.

Although you might expect the more organic, acoustic approach of Hall's first



two albums, this time around her expressive vocals are surrounded by a diverse collection of instruments from pedal-steel guitar to cello to mandolin to autoharp to guitarorgan, and an increased presence of electric guitar, drums, bass and piano. Each song is carefully constructed to convey her vision of love, romance and friendships. Her lyrics are always written from a first-person perspective, but they touch on feelings that we can all relate to. One can't help but feel the sense of strength and hope that comes as a result of these experiences.

About making music, Hall states, "It is a cathartic process for me. I have these feelings that I've *got* to express, or they will consume me!" Several tracks give us the opportunity to share in this ritual. The obvious start-off track is "Cry Tomorrow" (featuring a duet with Matthew Sweet). I also feel strongly about "Open Arms" (with its cool string arrangement), "Proud Man" (with Larry Gowan on vocals), "Prey To You," "Moment In A Day" and "Don't Tell Me." Zap Mama Sabsylma

Luaka Bop/WB

Formed in 1990 by Marie Daulne, this multi-cultural, multi-lingual, multi-talented vocal ensemble immediately took the world by storm when they released their debut, *Zap Mama*. They became part of the spearhead movement to bring international (world, if you will) music to the masses.

With Sabsylma, they continue to blend elements of ygmy, Central African, Arabic, Afro-Cuban and American soul and gospel music, and they expand their musical/cultural repertoire even more. From the Moroccan-based "Fi Dunia" to the authentic Australian bush rhythms in "Awakening Of Australia," from the mystical airs of "India" to the reworking of African traditional songs like "Mamadit" and "Adjosio," we have a tapestry of sound and heritage that transcends categorization and socio-political boundaries.

Simply said, Zap Mama are "of the world" and are universal. Their natural talents can help to bring us all together.

Why do a tribute to Kiss? How about some facts: They have sold over 70 million records, have had innumerable hit songs over the past 20 years and have literally created their own genre! So now you know! Although this project is targeted mainly for Rock Radio, Adult Rock can come to the party, too. Check out Lenny Kravitz's workover of "Deuce." Or, try Garth Brooks doing "Hard Luck Woman," and be sure to listen to Toad The Wet Sprocket's slowed down version of "Rock And Roll All Nite."

There is something for everyone on this tribute.

Jah Wobble's Invaders Of The Heart Take Me To God Island/PLG

This experimental project takes many twists and turns to create a concoction of sounds and hypnotic grooves that will leave you uplifted and recharged. Ever since his days in PiL, Jah Wobble has built a sound and loyal fan base and *Take Me To God* is sure to expand it. His regular players (John Reynolds on drums, Mark Ferda on keyboards and Justin Adams on guitars) are joined

by a myriad of vocalists, each contributing their unique talent to the songs on which they are featured. These vocalists include Dolores O'Riordan (The Cranberries), Anneli M. Drecker (Bel Canto), Gavin Friday and raga superstars Chaka Demus liers. A good place to start is "The Sun Does Rise," which features O'Riordan.

Disappear FearDisappear Fear Philo

These sisters make a lot of music simply with their songs, their voices and one acoustic guitar (with

some backup accompaniment). Disappear Fear is Sonia Rutstein and Cindy Frank, and with a little help from their friends (Janis Ian, Jon Carroll, Pete Wasner, Bill Cuomo, Kenny Greenberg, Don Kerce and producer Craig Krampf), they create honest and unpretentious music. Their self-titled album contains 10 new songs written by Sonia and a cover of Phil Ochs' "Is Anybody There?". There is a social immediacy to their music that will remind you of the early days of Bob Dylan and his protest-song peers. Check out "Who's So Scared," "Be The One" and "The Missing Song."

These rebels from Canada have created quite a sensation in their homeland. They have now crossed the border to wreak havoc in America. Lead by vocalist and harp player Hugh Dillon, Headstones dish out a rock sound that is raw and angry...but don't be misled. There is a softer side to this band that reveals an unexpected sensitivity and tenderness. Go directly to "When Something Stands For Nothing," with its incredible hook, The Traveling Wilbury's "Tweeter And The Monkey Man" or the wonderfully sung "Three Angels."

Headstones deserve a good listen.

Firefall

Messenger Redstone

Firefall is one of the few surviving bands of a genre that included the Eagles, Poco, CSN and The Flying Burrito Bros. Their string of hit songs can go around the block more than once. With *Messenger*, Firefall recaptures the freshness, craftsmanship and spark they had in those early days. This album features all-new songs, such as "When The River Rises," "Very First Moment," "Love Find A Way" and "Just As You Are."

Firefall has not lost their emotional and heartfelt flair. Their music will be warmly welcomed by the older segment of your audience.

David Halley Stray Dog Talk dos

If David Halley isn't out performing his own material, he's playing with the likes of artists such as Jimmy Dale Gilmore, Jerry Jeff Walker, Kris McKay, Ray Willie Hubbard and Tish Hinojosa (many of whom have recorded his songs). Originally released in Europe in 1989, dos Records has picked up Stray Dog Talk as a follow up to Halley's successful Broken Spell project released last year. The songs are stripped down and full of raw emotion, and they clearly display the strong songwriting talents of this Lubbock-born artist. Check out the lively "Live And Learn," the tender "If Ever You Need Me" and the cool and jazzy "Dreamlife."

Kashtin

Innu TriStar

Kashtin (which is Innu for tornado) has created guite a sensation in Canada. The band is comprised of native Innu Indians whose reservation lies at the mouth of the St. Lawrence Seaway in eastern Quebec. Though only 10,000 people in Canada speak their language, they have sold over 350,000 copies of their album! With Innu, Kashtin has put a contemporary spin on an ancient heritage. The principals in the band are Claude McKenzie and Florent Vollant, who work with four other musicians. They have managed to take native musical themes (and their native language) and smoothly integrate them into a more popular roots rock structure. Check out "Nikanish" ("My People"), "Apu Tshekuan Nikan Kuian" ("Nothing Can Stop Me"), "Tshinuau" ("All Of You") and "Son Of The Sun" (the only song in English).

Kashtin's music is exciting and different!

The Nitty Gritty Dirt Band Acoustic Liberty

As the title clearly suggests, The Nitty Gritty Dirt Band have gone back to the basics to recapture the essence of the music they have always loved: Traditional American music. Acoustic is the band's 26th album, and, although, through the years, they have been labeled as being anything from country to bluegrass to folk to rock, what they have really been all along is just an American band playing the music they love! As with any of their albums, the musicianship is impeccable, the harmonies are right on and the songs are tight and enlightening. I like several tracks from the album, including "Cupid's Got A Gun," "Let It Roll" and "Tryin' Times."

Alison Brown

Look Left Vanguard

Alison Brown incorporates a broad spectrum of musical idioms on her third Vanguard release, *Look Left*. This album goes way beyond her well-known bluegrass banjo and guitar pickin'. The music is influenced by a variety of diverse styles that include Cajun, Australian, Celtic, Native American, Caribbean and jazz. Performing on the album along

with Alison are producer/bassist Garry West, keyboardist John Burr, drummer Rick Reed and several special guest artists including, Andy Narell (steel pans), Paul McCandless (sax), Joey Miskulin (accordion), Bill Miller (wood flute), Matt Eakle (jazz flute), Vassar Clements (fiddle) and Seamus Egan (Irish pipes). This broad list of musicians is a good clue as to the breadth of music contained on the album. Check out "Etouffee Brutus," "The Red Earth," "Deep North" and "Cara's Way."


Peter Case Sings Like Hell *Vanguard*

This street troubadour turned recording artist has just delivered his fourth solo outing. Unlike his past albums, which were recorded in big, fancy studios with luminary producers like T Bone Burnett and Mitchell Froom, Sings Like Hell is stripped down to bare bones (it's basically him and an acoustic guitar with a little fiddle and piano now and then). He recorded it on a two-track recorder set up in the living room of his friend, fellow musician and makeshift producer Marvin Etzioni. The 13 songs are a collection of tunes Case has loved and performed for many years. They include David Allen Coe's "Walkin' Bum," Lefty Frizell's "Waltz Of The Angels," Blind Willie McTell's "Brokendown Engine," Roy Orbison's "Down The Line" and his self-penned "North Coast Blues."


Rebecca Pidgeon

Not only are we introduced to a new solo artist with this release, we are also introduced to a new digital recording innovation called High Resolution Technology, which oversamples everything 128 times. You may be familiar with Rebecca from her past work as the lead singer in the groundbreaking folk rock group Ruby Blue. She also recently starred in the New York stage production of her husband's (David Mamet) play, "Oleana." Her music is steeped in strong Celtic traditions, but it also utilizes a more sophisticated New York "piano bar" arrangement style. Key tracks include "The Raven" (co-written with her husband), "You Need Me There," "Seven Hours" and her rendition of "Spanish Harlem."

More Than Skin Deep

At 34, recent LA transplant Peter Himmelman (who hails originally from Minneapolis) could be considered a music veteran: With his old band, Sussman Lawrence, he released two albums, and he just recently released his sixth solo effort, a conceptual project called *Skin*. Yet, apart from, it seems, music fans with discriminating taste, no one seems to know him. "Huh? I've heard the name somewhere" is a common response.

Ironically, his music isn't hard to grasp: It's a straightforward blend of pop, rock and folk, but Himmelman is an astute student and practitioner of Judaism, and it dominates his songwriting and lifestyle - Skin is based entirely on Jewish teachings; he refuses to play on the Sabbath; he brings kosher eats on the road. Did we mention he was Bob Dylan's son-in-law?

Speaking to Peter Himmelman on the phone can be deceiving. He speaks in a wry monotone which makes it difficult to know when he's joking around and when he's serious (he could be seriously joking). Last April 1 - or Good Friday, depending on your beliefs - found him, I think, in a humorous mood as our conversation was punctuated by instructions to his children.

Dominic Griffin: Is it Good Friday for you? Peter Himmelman: "It's not a bad Friday!"

Okay. Is it a celebration?

"Well, it is many things. It's about getting out of your limitations, physical, spiritual and emotional. You eat flat bread, which symbolizes humility before God, the only sure means of escaping limitations and cutting back on ego. And since ego is a big part of my life, it is very painful."

Can you explain to me, in a couple of sentences, what the record is about?

"It's sort of a study on how it is that a pure innocent soul can be defiled. How is it this purity can be lost, and how is it regained?"

Is there a lesson to be learned from the record? "I guess if there is a lesson, it's that things we think are

"I guess if there is a lesson, it's that things we think are permanent are more transitory."

Our time on earth?

"Yeah, even our desire for the material things that we surround ourselves with...[we shouldn't] place so much import on the things that drive us nuts in the moment."

So can we expect 'Skin: The Broadway Musical'?

"Yeah - I'd like to blow it into one. When we play live, we play the whole album the first half of the show. The second half is requests."

Do you see stardom at the end of your tunnel?

"Yeah, stardom, I guess, in my own terms. My problem, which is both a merit and sort of a black mark, is that I always thought I was a star; playing at the Junior High dance or whatever, you feel like that. Otherwise, you'd have to give it up. You feel like you've got something special to offer, 'cause that's what a star is. If there's a certain amount of money you have to make, I'm quite sure I haven't hit that yet. A certain amount of records? I haven't hit that yet, either. But the people who I admire for their careers, like Tom Waits, or even Donald Fagen, are people who just completely do what they want; they have a really strong, loyal following, like an author of books [would have]."

Do you see yourself in the same vein?

"I'd like to, but I wouldn't flatter myself by putting myself in there. But that is how I would idealize...that would be my goal."

If I was a genie and I granted you two wishes, what would they be?

"One, to bring the Messiah and create an era of peace...the culmination of human existence in a perfect era of peace and well-being for all of existence. Two, I'd ask, at the same time, for a really tall glass of refreshing ice tea while I sat back and enjoyed the peace, with lemon and clear ice cubes."

What one contemporary song in history do you wish you wrote?

"There's a really pretty song called 'Shenandoah.'

Have you ever heard it? Things like that I really like."

Not 'Stairway To Heaven'?

"If there was any opening, mellow guitar riff that I wanted to write, it would have been that one. It's incredible."

What about 'Ice Ice Baby'?

"No, never really seized upon that one. I like that kind of American thing that brings you back into nature. Other than that, it would have to be 'Livin' For The City' by Stevie Wonder."

How do Catholicism and Judaism differ?

"The difference between Judaism and Catholicism is that you can't convert out of Judaism."

Said who?

"You can't."

So, if you wanted to become a Catholic, you couldn't?

"Well, I could, but I would never lose Judaism. All I would become is a heretical Jew. I could never leave it...it's an essential soul type. It's deep, very deep. If I went to see the Pope every Monday and ate ham each and every minute of the day, I would just be considered an apostate Jew. Now, you, on the other hand, since Catholicism is pretty much contingent on your faith or your 'lack of,' could convert to Islam and completely denounce your Catholicism."

Well, you kinda got an unfair advantage over us.

"I don't see it like that."

But if we were two football teams, you would have one up on us.

"Why is that?"

You can't convert out, but we can go to you.

"Well, you can't come to me so easily. You guys want me really bad...there are institutions all over the world to get Jews. It doesn't look good for Catholics to have Jews running around - you know that. As long as there are practicing Jews around saying, 'No, no, no, no...the old covenant has *not* gone.' It's still here, and it doesn't look good for Catholics. So, in one way, we do have an advantage. But you've got a bigger team. Our stamina is unparalleled, though - 3,300 years of playing in the mud."

Is the Shilo referred to [on the new album] the Israelite Holy Ground?

"Well, it could be, but it's also a pretty word. It harkens back to a world of serenity, a moment in life where you felt a moment of perfection in an otherwise imperfect life. And then again, it's a nice word. It looks good printed, sounds good coming out of the mouth...."

This is your sixth solo record. Have you ever worried when the phone rings that it's the label, calling to say, 'Thanks, Peter, but this ain't working out'? "A better question is, 'Are there moments when I don't worry about it?!!'"

How 'bout a more optimistic question: Now that the Adult Rock format is taking hold, is this something, in your opinion, that will help bring your music to more of America?

"People have told me this, but I don't make too much of a study of this 'cause it doesn't help me one bit. I just make the records that I make. But the good thing are the people who have been fans, at radio specifically... people who, I think, in the past, had callously relegated me to some sort of status of unimportance."

Radio people are fans of your music, but because you're not charting on Top 40, they won't play your record.

"Well, I would say, prior to whatever you call this format, in terms of the radio play I've gotten, I was relegated to a level of non-importance, and I think that has all changed now. I think the level of importance...[to his daughter: 'She put the chair on your finger? Okay - go tell her not to.']...the sky's the limit, as far as this album can go."

Is fatherhood as simple as that?

"The thing is, fatherhood is a trillion simple decisions. Looked at individually they are simple, but collectively, it's the most complicated thing in the world. It's the largest watch with the most moving pieces."

I'm practicing with my dog in preparation.

"It's the same thing, but imagine your dog could talk, pull on your sleeve. Kids are cuter, though. The joy a dog brings; multiply it by a thousand."

If or when Skin sold five million copies, what changes would occur in your life?

"Steve Martin was once asked what changes had occurred in his life when he started to make lots of money, and he said, 'I just don't worry about money anymore.' Not that his life had gotten any better, or that anything changed, except, 'All the time, I used to think about where the next check was coming from to feed the kids and send them to school; well, that'll be just one less thing to think about.'"

Money, to you, would mean not having to think about certain responsibilities?

"Not that I'm a righteous person, but part of our tradition is giving a strict amount to charity. It's pretty much like brushing your teeth; it's that integrated, and there are a lot of people I'd like to shell out money to."

What was the last record you bought, or that the label gave you?

"I got the PJ Harvey record. It's interesting...it's not exactly my cup of tea, but I've listened to it many times. The Pixies, an old Neil Young record, *Harvest*, Paul Westerberg, Bob Marley. I listen to KCRW [public radio] a lot, just to hear new stuff."

Very noble of you.

"Yes, a very noble thing to do; I get a good cross section of stuff, and then people send me tapes all the time."

Unsolicited?

"Yeah. I feel like an A&R guy. I really listen to a lot of people's tapes."

Are sex, drugs and rock n' roll part of your life?

"Sure."

What drugs?

"Well, I take Advil if I get a headache, and I've got kids, so, obviously, there's sex involved."

I was hoping for something a little stronger?

"Ibuprofen? I smoked a lot of weed in high school."

If you could change one little rule of Judaism, what would it be?

"One rule? To make it easier: That you can get a glimpse of God easier."

"If you really want to question my faith...have you ever stopped and thought, 'This life is a joke'? I do. I question my own faith."

You're headlining. Have you previously tried to open up, instead?

"I've tried, but it just doesn't work well with my schedule."

Have you ever wished the Sabbath was on a Monday?

"Then you'd have a big problem with Mondays. If I wanted to do it, I could. No one's really got a gun to my head. Anyway, I'd rather headline. The open-

ing thing is a concept...it's not like a guaranteed thing. You're playing to someone else's fans."

Are you tired with music?

"I'm tired with aspects of the music business, the unrelated parts of the business. I like getting together with friends and jamming or being by myself and playing or being at a show. I sometimes wish I didn't have any relation to anything other than that."

Very Utopian. You could do that, but you'd be working at the local Kosher deli for a living.

"That's right. And that wouldn't be any good at all. I've got no complaints. I don't think there is any big conspiracy; there's no point in feeling like that."

Do you have a favorite Jewish joke?

"Yeah, a good, clean one...[to his son: 'Do that again, and you'll have to absorb punitive measures from your father.']."

Can I quote you on that? 'Child beater Peter Himmelman.'

"Oh God! Anyway, there are three guys at a synagogue: A rabbi, a scholar and a janitor. On the Yom Kippur, the rabbi looks before God into the heavens and says, 'God, almighty God, compared to you, I'm nothing.' The scholar looks at heaven and says, 'God, before you I'm nothing. I'm nothing.' Then this janitor looks at God and says, 'God, to you I'm nothing,' and the other two guys look at him and say, 'Humph. Look who thinks he's nothing.'"

I understand you don't like talking about your father-in-law. What do you talk about with Bob?

"I don't mind. Some people ask this question first, and I always kid around with them: 'You should see the way he pours his milk. He wets each cornflake individually...it's got to mean something; it's special, not normal. It's weird.' And people print this stuff!"

What do Bob and Pete talk about, though?

"Not much. Nothing out of the ordinary."

Does he threaten you with regards to his daughter's well-being?

"No.

Could you make it up, please? It'd be a good read.

"Could be good for my career "

Perry Farrel, owner of the "Lollapalooza" trademark, and J. Walter Thompson, acting attorney for the Ford Motor Company, have agreed that the car manufacturer will cease using the name "Lollapalooza" in its advertising.

A recent Ford Escort GT ad that used the trademark festival name caught the attention of Farrell and other "Lollapalooza" organizers, who objected to its unauthorized use and the implied connection between Ford and the "Lollapalooza" festival.

Thompson and Ford initially disagreed with Farrell and company about the infringement...until

Farrell pointed out that "Lollapalooza" is a registered trademark, and being so, is heavily protected by law.

Farrell and Ford have amicably resolved their differences; the "Lollapalooza" reference has been deleted from Ford's advertisements, and Thompson, on behalf of Ford, has made a donation of an undisclosed amount to a rain forest charity, at Farrell's suggestion.
