



STP And Warren G Benefit From Shopping Spree!





Showing a major correlation between radio and MTV play, and record sales, Stone Temple Pilots' Purple and Warren G's Regulate... G Funk Era debut in the #1 and #2 slots, respectively, on our Hottest Sales Nationwide chart this week. In each case, you can point directly to widespread airplay and video play.

STP has two tracks in both the Power Cuts Top 12 and the Alternative Radio Top 12 from its *Purple* CD; "Big Empty," which preceded the album by a few weeks via the former #1-selling soundtrack to *The Crow*, and "Vasoline," which has had a clip in Exclusive rotation on MTV for a month now. Also, "Vasoline" and "Big Empty" have placed *Purple* at #3* on the RAWk Radio chart.

In Warren G's case, "Regulate" - his single with Nate Dogghas been on MTV for two months, and is currently in Heavy rotation. Moreover, the single has moved in the Top 40 at Hit Radio, landing at #38* this week. Warren, who is rapper Dr. Dre's little brother, also benefitted from a soundtrack - the #2-selling Above The Rim (which has been Top 10 since its release 12 weeks ago).

John Mellencamp

Dance Naked

In the title track from Mellencamp's long-awaited new CD (it's his first in nine months), John asks an unnamed person to get nekked and dance. Is he implying nudity? Not in a carnal sorta way. John is proposing a spiritual nakedness, an honesty beyond simply "telling the truth."

"Dance Naked" may get by a few people who aren't paying attention to its lyrical subtleties, but that shouldn't be the case with the bluntly-stated "Brothers." Musically, these two songs set the tone for Dance Naked. Sparse, bare, rootsy; hell, there isn't even a bass guitar on a lot of these new tunes. Not only is Dance Naked a nice follow up to last summer's Human Wheels, it is also a brilliant counterpoint to the rhythmic complexities of that CD. In addition to the single, try "When Margaret Comes To Town," "Too Much To Think About," "L.U.V.," "Another Sunny Day 12,25" and "The Big Jack."

Steve Miller Band

"Rock It"

Capitol

During Steve's two-decade relationship with Capitol, he released 15 albums. So, with Miller's greatest hits packages continuing to sell steadily, a box set at this juncture makes total sense. From 1968's rock standard "Living In The USA" to 1976's #1 smash "Rock 'N' Me," Steve's legacy is represented on *The Steve Miller Band Box Set*.

As with most box sets, Miller offers several previously unreleased cuts on this release. Among them is this brand new rockin' blues number, which was written by Miller and Neal Schon, and on which Steve plays his guitar with an uncanny resemblance to ZZ's Billy Gibbons.

Spin Doctors

Turn It Upside Down

It isn't their fault or anything, but the Spin Doctors have completely fucked up the time/space continuum. Cuz wasn't it just yesterday that "Two Princes" was getting played two billion times a day (a guesstimation) on every radio station in the known universe? So, how could it have been three years already since the six-million-selling CD Pocket



Full Of Kryptonite was released? The only answer we have to that perplexing quandary is to quit worrying about it and allow ourselves to fall headfirst into Turn It Upside Down.

The Spin Doctors bore no clear-cut influences on *Kryptonite*, and they haven't made it any easier to pin them down on *Turn It Upside Down*: Guitarist Eric Schenkman is once again funky and raucous, bassist Mark White still grooves, drummer Aaron Comess incites happy feet wherever he pounds his kit and Chris Barron continues to defy classification with his choppy melodies and off-the-cuff lyrical imagery.

Some of the obvious songs on *Turn It Upside Down* include "Big Fat Funky Booty," "You Let Your Heart Go Too Fast," "Indifference" (hello hitsville), "Mary Jane," "Laraby's Gang" and "At This Hour."

Billy Idol

"Speed"

Fox/Chrysalis/ERG

It was Billy Idol's snarl and Steve Stevens' guitar licks that made songs like "Rebel Yell," "Mony, Mony" and "To Be A Lover" a part of our rock n' roll vocabulary. Now, for the first time since Whiplash Smile, Idol and Stevens have again collaborated, and the outcome is every bit as electrifying as you'd hope it would be.

"Speed" is the title cut from the soundtrack to the new box office smash of the same name. With Stevens' flashy guitars and Idol's trademark vocals, "Speed" is Billy Idol at his rockin' best.



Roger Daltrey

Daltrey Sings Townshend Live At Carnegie Hall

Continuum

No rock pundit would knowingly downplay the importance of Pete Townshend's music. "So, what's so new about Roger Daltrey singing Townshend?" you may ask yourself. Well, this CD is a tribute, a celebration, of Pete's songs, as interpreted not only by the man who gave life to them in the first place, but also by Pete himself, as well as Linda Perry of 4 Non Blondes, and performed with John Entwistle, David Sanborn, The Chieftains and the Julliard Orchestra (conducted by Grammy-Award-Winner Michael Kamen).

Most of these songs are classics - from "Won't Get Fooled Again" to "Who Are You?" - so just about anything will work. And, with Daltrey on the road with this traveling extravaganza, you'll want to play it often to alert the Who fans among your audience. For spice, may we suggest songs like "Imagine A Man" (originally on *Who By Numbers*) and "The Sea Refuses No River" (from Townshend's *All The Best Cowboys Have Chinese Eyes*). These options will give your listeners a new glimpse into the songs of this masterful writer and the powerful voice of his lifelong friend.

Daltrey's tour begins on the 25th of this month, and continues through mid-September.

Syn"Love On M

"Love On My Side"

Like you, we get dozens of tapes and CDs from unsigned bands. Finding the time to hear each disc can be a daunting task, but occasionally we are rewarded with music so awesome we find it hard to believe a major label hasn't yet snatched up the group. This was the case with Collective Soul (we championed "Shine" weeks before Atlantic signed them).

Now, we implore you to listen to "Love On My Side" from LA's Syn. Similar to the way Karl Wallinger hides behind the name World Party, Syn is guitarist/singer/songwriter Ray Lane. You'll find "Love On My Side" on our Rock CD TuneUp

Redd Kross

"Visionary"

This Way Up/Mercury

Did you know that Redd Kross began back in 1978? Or that its core, Jeff and Steven McDonald, were 13 and nine, respectively, when the Southern California band formed? And did you know that *Phaseshifter*, Redd Kross' fifth and latest CD, has been hailed as "the best album of the year" by Def Leppard's Joe Elliott? Redd Kross, which is renowned for its live sets, is touring incessantly with Stone Temple Pilots and Meat Puppets.

"Visionary" is a superb example of the late 60s/early 70s pop bent of Redd Kross, which they underscore with rugged, riff-heavy guitars. Redd Kross can only be "the next big thing" for so long before the mainstream catches up to 'em. So, have at it, campers.

Infectious Grooves

"Cousin Randy"

Sony 550 Music

If bass is your first love, if you can't get enough of the percussive beauty of electric bass, then Infectious Grooves is your band. Reared in LA three years ago as a side project for Suicidal Tendencies' singer, Mike Muir, and bassist, Robert Trujillo, the Grooves make music best described by their own name.

Groove Family Cyco is the third full-length release from Infectious Grooves (do Muir and Trujillo ever sleep?), and it comes off as sort of a conceptual, musical stroll through dysfunctionaland. "Cousin Randy" is to be feared and loathed - the character, that is, not the rip-snortin', hard RAWkin' song. A word to the wise...play the edit.

DESIGNATED

DOYLE BRAMHALL

"Change It"

Doyle gave many Rock Rad o programmers reason to rejoice with his recent single, "Too Sorry." With that tune, Bramhall showed that he could step into the void left by the passing of Stevie Ray Vaughan. This week's Designated Hitter, "Change It," solidifies that not on.

"Change It" also comes from Bramhall's first album, Bird Nest On The Ground, and it features the killer fretwork of Robin Syler. Blues rock has always been necessary for balance at Rock Radio, and Doy'e's "Change It" offers your listeners some real, honest-to-goodness Texas blues.



On Deck

Smashing Pumpkins "Rocket" Virain

Smashing Pumpkins were already a phenomenon before "Disarm" made the band a household name among Rock Radio fans. With Siamese Dream certified Double-Platinum, and the clip for "Rocket" is already in Stress rotation on

MTV, the next single from the album has a strong buzz-on before the box. With Billy Corgan's distorted, buzz saw guitar licks out front, "Rocket" will give Rock Radio audiences a glimpse beyond the mass appeal of "Disarm."

Phish

"Sample In A Jar" Elektra

"Down With Disease" took this Vermont quartet farther into the mainstream realm than any previous tune (with better than 1,450 PPWs at its peak, "Disease" went to #22* on Power Cuts). "Sample In A Jar" is even easier to ingest than "Down With Disease."

Trey Anastasio's guitar is uncomplicated and his vocal melody memorable, so look for "Sample In A Jar" to push Phish even further along its path toward total acceptance at Rock Radio: WAVF, WHEB, WIZN and WWBR couldn't wait to play it.

Eleven

"Let Down (Left Out, Laughed At)" Third Rail/Hollywood

With "Reach Out," Rock Radio exhibited a willingness to go with the rhythm/groove-oriented Eleven. On "Let Down (Left Out, Laughed At)," singer Alain Johannes' voice comes off sounding a lot like Axl Rose's at times, helping to give the song a very strong appeal to this format.

"Reach Out" peaked at roughly 800 PPWs for a couple of weeks, giving rise to anticipation for the hard, quitar-dominated "Let Down" - which KISW, KEZE, WRZK and KQXR (28 PPWs already) jumped on early.

Outlaws

"Diablo Canyon"

Blues Bureau International/Shrapnel

Think of "Green Grass & High Tides." Now you've got the musical blueprint for "Diablo Canyon," a sorta distant relative of that 70s gem. Taken from the CD of the same name, "Diablo Canyon" is already getting played on a handful of Rock Radio reporters ahead of the box, including WQNY, WKLC, KSQY and KATP, where PD Dale Miller says, "'Diablo Canyon' is a great reaction record!"

If your listeners still love the Outlaws, then you must give them "Diablo Canyon."

King's X

"Pillow" Atlantic/TAG

Ignore the song title here, because there is nothing soft about "Pillow." From Ty Tabor's driving, grungy guitar riffs and runs to Jerry Gaskill's pounding rhythms to Doug Pinnick's thick bass lines and insistent, passionate vocal chanting, "Pillow" is rough, raw and hard. The only element that takes off a bit of the edge are the now familiar three-part harmonies that give depth to the chorus.

King's X is currently paired up with Motley Crue on a double-threat concert bill - don't miss it.

Lenny Kravitz takes the most added honors again this week with his cover of Kiss's "Deuce." With 41 new adds, "Deuce" is now on 104 Rock Radio reporters, and it enters the Power Cuts chart at #34*. This one is a Homer! now.


Among the 41 new are KLOL. reporters WLVQ, KTXQ, WMMR, WQFM, KATT and WKDF. WAAF spikes this one from 12 to 32 PPWs this week and KTAL ups its plays from four to 24 in one week. "Deuce"'s parent CD, Kiss My Ass, is this week's #7 Hot Future at retail.

At WLVQ, PD Bob Neumann explains, "We threw 'Deuce' on the air last week, and it got an immediate, huge phone reaction in all dayparts it's a great song!"

World Radio History

hough you'd be hard pres find it now, John Meller recorded his first album, Street Incident, back in 1976. and 18 amp returns with a collection of nine t comes so close behind last Human Wheels that it ough tagged for tailgatin'. Sparse, bones rockers inhabit this new CD john mellencamp In many ways, these songs are naked as the title implies. That does mean, however, that they are as blatan as they might appear. Take, for imstance, the title cut. Is Mellencamp really asking some woman to take her clothes off ar move to the groove? Could he be singing of something so base, shallow? Don't count on it. It's John Mellencamp we're talkin' about, and he always comes through with depth and quality. John was han wife and new baby boy, Hud, answered these questions.

Many songwriters find it more difficult to come up with new ideas when they've written the volume of songs that you have. How surprised are you that you can enjoy such an outpouring at this juncture in your career?

"I don't know that it's so difficult to come up with songs after 14 records. For a lot of people, I think the desire to make records leaves them after a

while.

"But for me, I drift in and out of having the desire to make records, so I figure if I've got the material - and it is my job - I should just go ahead and make records when I can."

Because Dance Naked comes so soon after Human Wheels, does it feel, in any way, like there is a stronger connection between the two than perhaps any other two albums you've done?

"Yeah, Dance Naked is kind of the boiled-down version of Human Wheels. Human Wheels took about a year to make, and we just pretty much stripped away all of the sparkly stuff - you know, a lotta percussion and things like that - [for] Dance Naked.

"There are some songs on Dance Naked that are just a guitar and drums - a lot of the songs on Dance Naked don't even have a bass

quitar on 'em."

Each of your last two singles have been covers of Van Morrison tunes. Were you at all concerned about releasing two Morrison tunes in a row?

"That's not really true - Van Morrison wrote 'Wild Night,' but he didn't write 'Baby, Please Don't Go.' And I never really considered the song from the movie a single, anyway - that was for a different record company, and I just sorta did a favor with that record."

Who is Me'Shell NdegéOcello, and how is it that she sings and plays on "Wild Night" with you?

"Me'Shell has one album out, and she had a single called 'If That Was Your Boyfriend (He Wasn't Last Night).' I heard her record and I liked it. I liked the way she played bass, so initially, we asked her to come and play bass. Then it dawned on us it might be nice to have her sing."

On this new CD, you sing about having "too much to think about." Some might say that thinking too much is a burden that creative people share. What benefits come from being a "thinker"?

"Well, I never really considered myself a 'thinker,' of any kind. I think there's a big difference between being a songwriter and being a thinker.

"The song Too Much To Think About," really, is more written from an 'every average day person' [perspective]. I mean, with all the input that we get from all these wonderful news shows on television now, and the fact that we get to see everything 10,000 times, sometimes I think it would be hard for anybody to make a decision about what is real and what isn't real. I mean, the fact that we all think crime numbers are up when, in reality, crime is down in the United States since 1976, tells us that someone's building a false reality. So it's up to us to think about what is real and what's not.

"I don't really think it has much to do with me being a deep 'thinker' it's just trying to sift through the shit. This world's so full of shit, a guy's

bound to step in it sooner or later."

I'm sure it's been years since you had to worry about making money from your music. If that is true, how has that fact affected your music?

"Well oddly enough, I never really worried about making money. Even during the mid-80s, when I had 20-some hit records in a row, I never worried about making money. I was very fortunate in the fact that I just happened to write in that vein at that time, and I still write that way. So, if a song's a hit, great; and if it's not, well then, I hope at least I liked the song when I was writing it.

"I didn't enjoy all the songs. Like, I never really came to appreciate 'Jack And Diane' until 10 years after I had written it, and I saw how happy it made other people. There's a lot of reasons why people like songs, or don't like songs, and, in the case of 'Jack And Diane,' I liked it

because so many other people liked it."

Mike Wanchic has been with you since the days when your band was called The Zone. How important has Mike been to the Mellencamp sound?

"Mike Wanchic has been a friend and a very loyal musician to me over the years, just as Kenny Aronoff and Toby Myers have been. How important are they to the sound? Well, a band is a band - whatever Mike brings to the party, he brings to the party. I don't really look at it as the 'Mellencamp sound'...I look at it more as the family that we've been able to create.

"If you look at the bands that started playing the same time I did, very few, if any, have the same amount of [original] players who still perform

on the records and on tour, as Mike, Kenny and Toby do."

Mike is now also co-producing with you; what does he bring to the mix as a co-producer?

"Mike takes care of the little detail things that I don't really enjoy taking care of, but he is also very conservative in the studio. So, if I start getting out to left field, Mike is always the little voice that kinda goes, 'Now, we're drifting here [chuckles]. Let's try not to get too far out of line."

As you prepare for your first tour in two years, what will you do differently than previous tours? What aspects would you like to

see stay consistent with past tours?

"On this tour, I plan to rearrange all the old songs to the point almost that you won't be able to recognize them until I start singing, and we've got a smaller band on this tour. I think people have seen enough of John Mellencamp with all the people, so now, the band is basically myself, Mike, Kenny, Toby, a new kid named Andy York and a percussionist/guitar player - well, a girl who plays just about everything - named Mindy Jostyn. So, it's gonna be a much smaller stage, a much smaller production."

You pulled off your acting/directing debut quite admirably in "Falling From Grace"; any plans or aspirations to do a second movie?

"Well, I appreciate the compliment, but another movie? I don't really know. I did the first one to have something to do. So I don't know, maybe I would, maybe I won't. I really haven't planned on anything. You know me - I never planned nothing in my life."

You don't think of yourself as a political person, even though that is the way many other people perceive you. What is your perception of yourself with regards to politics and social issues?

"Well, I hate the 90s. I hate how all of the liberal things of the 60s have been turned and twisted into something not so good. I think it's evident with all of these social agencies that have gone awry. I mean, I still think they're needed, but how we use people like Woody Allen as entertainment for ourselves, and how that guy's life was made miserable for whatever reason - I don't know if he's guilty or not, but we definitely didn't need to know about it in the press, and we definitely didn't need to judge him on whether he had bad judgment or not.

"And the fact that the government could come into our houses and investigate on somebody's say-so, for whatever reason...our individual rights, to me, seem to be diminishing, and until these people start paying my bills and buying my cars and supporting me and my kids, I want them the fuck out of my life. I think it's a sad state of affairs when the government can openly investigate anyone. And then, to me, it feels like [they think] it's their duty to put the people on television. I think it stinks

I don't like the 90s."

The guys in U2 have gone out of their way to dispel the notion that they are spokesmen. You have been very outspoken at times, and you have tirelessly given of yourself for causes such as Farm Aid; what are your thoughts on being perceived as a spokesman?

"Well, I guess if the guys in U2 think it's a good idea, I do, too [chuckles].
"I don't know. I never really considered myself a spokesman, nor did I ever want to hang on anybody's crosses. I just thought it was important to give back whatever I could to people. You know; goodwill - there's nothing like it."

The Feathers Are A Flyin' In Cleveland!

Buzzard Employee Cuts Lines During Stern's "Funeral"



If this story weren't so damn incredulous, you'd think it was a set-up.

On Friday morning, June 10, Howard Stern made good on his promise to hold a mock "funeral" in the city of Cleveland, celebrating his triumph in the ratings over two-year ratings champ John Lanigan at WMJI-FM.

Traditionally, when Stern's show becomes #1 (in this case, after 18 months on the air at Cleveland classic rocker WNCX), a mock funeral and street party ensues, in which the competition is killed in effigy and the show celebrates its "superior" status. This particular morning was no exception, as Stern and his assembled cast of crazies (which included Mary Jo and Joey Buttafuoco, Roger Clinton, David Lee Roth and the band America) flaunted themselves among

hordes of fawning fans, broadcasting the shenanigans live over the air to the entire Howard Stern network of stations.

Then, someone cut the wires that fed the satellite.

Police quickly apprehended the culprit, who confessed he had snipped the cables. When pressed further, he admitted that he was employed at crosstown rival WMMS.

Needless to say, the buzz surrounding the already-hot Cleveland radio wars went into hyperdrive. Following the incident, two inspectors from the FCC field office in Detroit were dispatched to investigate the matter, while WMMS stands firm, maintaining that "WMMS did not and does not authorize, encourage or condone the interruption of another radio station's broadcast." The individual in question, identified as William Alfred, has been suspended pending further investigation.

"When I first heard about it, I went and talked to our

troops," says OmniAmerica Chairman/CEO Carl Hirsch. "They were furious; they wanted to kill him. I asked why, and they said the day before, the guy bragged that he had an [all access] pass and was going to cause trouble - in full view of the staff and two department heads. He was told we don't need any help, not to do anything and not to get *near* there. Our problem with him is violating a direct order. As to what he did there, that's between him, his lawyers and the court system."

Hirsch also spoke with Infinity CEO Mel Karmazin and denied any station involvement. "We're on the same page, and there's no real problem," Hirsch told Album Network. "A person apparently acted on his own and we're dealing with that"

We caught up with WNCX VP/GM Walt Tiburski and The Buzzard's OM, John Gorman, for more on both sides of the story:



Walt Tiburski "Howard went to the Rock

and Roll Hall of Fame site to receive a presentation from Hall of Fame Director Dennis Barrie. Right as he was getting his award, we assume another radio station - although we do not know which station - interfered with our broadcast on our Marti units. All stations share the few frequencies [available to] these remote broadcast units...sort of like the buddy system. Somebody violated that, and stepped all over the broadcast by saying, 'Fuck you, fuck you,' etc. Of course, we had to dump out of the broadcast, and go to back-up, which was a cellular phone.

"The second incident occurred back at the fixed site. Our lines were cut, and this momentarily interrupted our broadcast. Not only to our station, but to the entire Stern network. Fortunately, we had thought ahead and, based on the fact we had heard lots of heavy rumors of sabotage, I had backup lines in place, and we got right back up.

"The interesting thing is that an employee of WMMS was arrested and charged by the Cleveland police for breaking and entering, disruption of public service and possession of criminal tools. That individual is an engineering assistant at WMMS.

"I think what we have here is a dangerous scenario, one that goes beyond guerrilla warfare and good, aggressive competition. We have people who feel they can exist above the law conducting criminal activities and not feeling that they have any consequences to pay. We're consulting at this time with our FCC lawyers, as well as our local legal counsel, and our company's intent is to vigorously pursue and prosecute this legally, on the advice of our counsel."

Album Network: Did anybody at WMMS have any knowledge

of what was going on with this engineer?

John Gorman

"No. We do not authorize, encourage or condone the interruption of any broadcast, nor will we tolerate any such conduct from any of our employees. The individual allegedly involved in this incident in question - the satellite feed cut - has been suspended pending further investigation of the allegations against him.

"We feel that there is a possibility that the reported action could be nothing more than a publicity stunt...it could have been engineered by our competition. One thing that we have learned is that this individual in question received a restricted area access pass to the Stern broadcast site from a current WNCX employee, who was a former WMMS employee. Upon our investigation thus far, we are confident that people will come to a different understanding of these events when the truth is made public.

"We believe in healthy and tough competition, but we don't condone breaking any laws. If anybody does, they'll be disciplined to the extent necessary, up to and including discharge."

Do you feel you're in any danger of having your license revoked?

"No, because we as a station did nothing wrong. This individual took it upon himself. We still don't have all the facts." There were some other things that were done before the broadcast, like the tombstone that Stern had made up was sent back with his own name on it....

"The fact of the matter is that we did, legally, do our best...I mean, here's a person, competition, coming into this town, and among the things we did was to have a plane flying a tow banner reading, 'Buzzards Feast On Dead Meat, Howard.' We also had bumper stickers and flyers printed up that said, 'RIH, Howard.' That stands for 'Rot In Hell.' We depicted the Buzzard with a pitchfork jabbing a naked Howard in the ass. We did the usual types of promotions we're famous for. I do understand he was having a tombstone made that said, 'Here lies Lanigan and The Buzzard.' I don't know how it happened, but when they opened up the tombstone, it

read, 'Here lies Howard Stern.'"

Was it true that you gave away money to people who brought in copies of a magazine which featured Howard on the cover?

"It was a magazine called 'Scene.' This paper has been pro-Stern, and we decided to just have some fun with it. Both WMMS and WMJI conducted individual promotions that morning, where we gave \$500 to the person who brought the most copies of 'Scene' magazine to the studios. We called the magazine after it was all over to come pick up the copies. They were not happy with our promotion...I guess they're the kind of people who can dish out things, but they can't take it! They got all their papers back, and we moved on from there."

Your reputation as a fierce competitor is well-known by anybody who's ever dealt with you....

"Exactly. Anybody who's ever dealt with me knows that I'm very competitive, but [I] don't break laws."

Where does this put the current radio war in Cleveland right now? Does this escalate it to a whole new level?

"I don't think so. We plan on continuing to operate as we have been operating. It's our style...we're competitive people."

Doug Podell was on the air last Friday making some remarks about you not being top dog in town anymore. Do you have any comment about what he said?

"I think he said that I thought I owned the city. I don't know where I was ever quoted in my life saying that I own any city. If that's Doug's own perception, then I guess it's his problem, not mine."

How long do you think it will be before the whole legal matter is cleared up?

"I have no idea. It's back to business as usual here.

"I'll be the first to say that Howard was probably correct in saying that WMMS handed him the audience, because it's no secret that the station went through some very rough times, and it definitely lost direction. Our feeling is that we are putting the station back on track...we're supposed to announce a new morning show shortly. We made the necessary improvements - we brought back some people, and we've brought in a lot of new people. I'm confident that this radio station is going to be dominant in this market for a long time to come."





This agreement was terminated upon Trans-World's failure to complete the transaction by the date required.

Pietrangelo states, "The company has no intention of seeking a new buyer for the stores. Business has been excellent and we are pursuing plans to open additional stores, including a location in Toms River, NJ, in the fall of this year."

Alwilk Records is a specialty retailer which has 10 stores located throughout New Jersey and handles music software and other related products.

Taking On Goliath

Smaller Retailers Carve Their Own Niche

Occasionally, us trade geeks escape our own little hell of reports and charts, we see the world, we live a little, and we let label people buy us lunch! One such outing last month found the Album Network Retail crew dining with ERG's Senior Director/Retail Marketing, Dutch Cramblitt, when our Retail Editor, Yvette Ziraldo Oyabe, asked for an explanation about a nasty problem that is plaguing many retailers.

The conversation that ensued sparked more than just anger; it prompted all of us to take a longer look at some issues that may or may not be what they first appear.

Minus the martinis, here's what was on our plate (and is also on the agendas of hundreds of retailers regardless of size): How can small and medium-sized chains, as well as the indie retailer, survive in a world where mass merchandise, megastores, corporate consolidation (and a generally hostile economic environment) seem to be entirely eating up established retail territory faster than termites in a woodpile? When faced with the corporate retailers' and discount music sellers' buying power, loss-leader and at-cost pricing, strong advertising budgets and virtually endless depth and variety of stock, most retailers feel frustrated, at the very least.

The one burning question not to be ignored: Are mass-merchandisers and other corporate giants the real threat retailers face in the latter half of the 90s, or is it simply a case of not adapting to an ever-shifting marketplace?

All fair-trade and pricing laws are currently being met, so store operators can't resort to a legal route to try and halt the rapidly advancing mass-merchandising of music retailing. Add to that the financial muscle this new breed of retailers possess, and most stores can never hope to match the imbalance in commerce. So, for the strongest to survive this thinning of the herd, small retailers will have to flex their creative muscle and fight for their territory, customers and revenue in a guerilla warfare-like way not before needed.

After living with this topic and watching the fur fly around our offices, it seemed time to dig a little deeper and get some much needed perspective! After all, it's not problems we all need - it's USABLE SOLUTIONS! The lovely and slightly deranged Patti Hauseman, Arista's Alternative Marketing Manager, threw herself into the fire, along with Cramblitt. We hope their insights, along with those of Otis Ball, Manager of Pier Platters in Hoboken, Dan Gill, Head of Sales for Mammoth Records, Kathy Shedd, General Manager of the Down In The Valley music chain, Peter Tappen, Manager of National Retail Marketing for Columbia, and Wendy Perelstein, Owner of Mosh Pit, Inc., give retailers some credible, viable and necessary realities and options for those who dare to sell the music they love for a living.

know your marketplace

Starting with what the overall vibe of today's retail climate is, Cramblitt pointed out that in his travels to, and work with, the nation's retailers, he's noticed an increasing number of stores (and chains) that are simply oblivious to their marketplace, their competition, and the fact that the casual prosperity of the 70s, sadly, was 20 years ago. Many retailers seem to have stuck their proverbial heads in the sand, and have ignored that when you're in a business that deals exclusively in entertainment, trends and emotions, change is necessary. Cramblitt was not denying that there is a very obvious and very large threat posed to the retail community by the corporate mass-merchandisers' encroachment, but could this be a situation of blaming the problem on the most visible bully?

Arista's Hauseman feels that there are always going to be indies and small chains, because they are genre specific and do cater to certain clientele. But they need to have enough diversity to be able to cater to someone who just happens in off the street. The indie stores have always had a much more active and

knowledgeable music consumer, and the average large chain or megastore just won't have the product they desire. Says Hauseman, "Unfortunately, the stores that go under are the ones that are not conscious of what's going on in their community and what their clientele is *really* looking for. What a lot of retailers want and need is their fair share of things, and this will depend on each specific market. But indies and small chains will unavoidably be more affected by the mass-merchandisers."

Columbia's Peter Tappen has been working on his retail trend homework and has this to offer: "I've been looking into stores that don't necessarily sell music as their primary source of income," he says. "Working the angle of 'lifestyle,' there's an excellent opportunity for retailers to do something totally different; make your store more about a lifestyle, as opposed to just being another record store. There's a store here in New York, The Earth Friendly Company, which carries soaps, metaphysical books and those types of products. Also, they deal in experimental music, and want to get into some more contemporary artists. I've been sending them music from Youssou N'Dour and Jamiroquai, stuff along those lines. You can be shopping there, listening to music and perusing books, or maybe even trying on some new clothes! Business owners who want to focus on trend-retailing need to find out what lifestyles are happening in their markets and develop those concepts."

Mosh Pit's Wendy Perelstein is not speaking idly when she offers, "You've got to specialize in *something...*some specific kind of music, because if you try to carry a full-line selection, you're totally putting yourself in direct competition with the big stores; and they will sell the same music for much less than you can. When Media Play opened a mile from us last October, it was like, 'Hey, where is everybody?' The store is so HUGE, and they had even brought in some of the really heavy stuff that we carry! They're not getting anything specialized, but at the outset, a lot of our people went over there and bought stuff. However, they've ended up coming back to us, because of our personalized service and my ability to find and stock a huge selection of heavy music and related items."

Mammoth's Dan Gill has a good perspective on the retail situation. Mammoth is a small, but rapidly expanding label, and as such, Gill has dealings with all levels of retail. "Stores have to get more creative," he states. "I compare it to the difference between an indie label and a major label; you don't have the resources that these large labels have, so you have to use your *creative resources* - you have to be one step ahead! Knowing your market and your niche is so important; so is being able to target that market. When a mass-merchandiser moves into town, the indie retailer may have to change their philosophy on the type or depth of inventory they carry, or maybe consider expanding into different product genres. It's very easy for a superstore to appear in a market and just wipe everybody out, because none of the area's retailers are meeting the community's needs."

Unfortunately pricing is an issue. However, as with most challenges retailers face, it can be collared. The big chains appeal to your average American shopper, and whether you're an indie, or a small or big chain, pricing will be important only to the extent of the disposable income your customers have to check new music out with, explains Hauseman: "When I shop, and I've got money to spend, I'm going to end up going

with lower-priced new music. Not all stores can do the pricing of the mass-merchandisers and bigger chains, but personally, I wouldn't leave an independent store to go to another location just to get \$2 off a record I want. That's just kind of a pain in the ass." Cramblitt seconds Hauseman's opinion: "No matter how inexpensive the product is, if customers can't find and buy the music they want, then what good is a [lower] price?" he asks.

Tappen offers a point of view that holds true for many shoppers: "If I shop in larger retail stores, it's because of the immediate convenience of a 'hot' product that I have to have," he offers. "But, if it's not on sale, I won't bother. Occasionally, I'll find myself making an impulse purchase at a mass-merchandiser, but the independent retail outlet will get my cash almost every time. [The smaller store] is always going to bring out the collector in serious music consumers."

When Mosh Pit woke up to find Goliath setting up shop down the street, they acted offensively, eliminating the possibility of only being able to react defensively later on. Perelstein explains, "One of the main things we started to do when we realized we were losing business to Media Play and Sound Warehouse was get products in from Europe, stuff [the mass-merchandisers] just don't have. Everything from really heavy metal T-shirts to product from [death] metal bands overseas. We've lowered our prices to compete, and we try to make up for the profit loss by selling more; these things brought a lot of our customers back."

Kathy Shedd, the calm voice of "just do it" retailing, has a keen sense for business and a sharp intuition for spotting often overlooked financial opportunities. In defining life on the retail war front, Shedd explains, "Down In The Valley has been in business here [in the Minneapolis area] for 22 years; we are now faced with not only Title Wave, but Blockbuster Music Plus, Best Buy and Circuit City! These places are selling new releases for \$9.96 and \$10.88; they're making all their profit in washing machines and other [high-ticket] items - they're totally using the music as a loss-leader only to get people in the stores. That's really hard to compete against. But we do, with our savings on the mid-lines, our first-week sale prices on new releases and our discount VIP Club Card, which brings our regular prices in line with the giant retailers."

The vindicating milepost here is that Down In The Valley has just held the grand opening for its fifth store - in a market where you can't even throw a rock without hitting a mass-merchandiser.

Shedd offers some hard-won fighting skills, stating, "We still have a lot of product they don't have, and a knowledgeable staff is equally as valuable. We're trying to be competitive on new release prices as much as we can be, we lowered our catalog prices on all mid-line product and, most importantly, we always take advantage of any kind of discounts from the labels. That includes product rebates and Sony's 300-day dating (which is great); PolyGram has their mid-line product sale-priced always, without huge box-lot order requirements, and CEMA has an ongoing 10% discount across-the-board on their midlines. Most of the labels have finally gotten down to dealing

with us smaller retailers, and it makes some of those deals really beneficial - an extra four or five percent does make a difference when the guy down the street is selling new releases for under \$10!"

Megastores can really compete with some of the best indie retailers, if they carry a full line of product or deep catalog product sections of indie rock, jazz or classical music, says Gill. "I am against used product, but it does seem to be the answer for some struggling operations. They can do very well, by making their

profit margin and so much more. It offers a way to stay competitive."



Pier Platters has established a great reputation for finding just about anything, and that is a strong advantage for them. Otis Ball expands on the store's concept: "We specialize in vinyl, seven-inch singles and all kinds of collectible and indie product in general," he explains. "We travel the world to find the weird and really rare stuff! It's a little frustrating, our niche...but we've backed ourselves into this corner and it's too late to change! I guess the biggest thing that makes us different is the fact that we're focused in one aspect: Indie rock...it's our big thing. We really don't do much in the other stuff, because indie rock in itself is such a big category, especially the collectible things. I think it's the reason we're such a good store. Sometimes we are sort of vain idiots who would rather have all the records instead of just making sure we have the latest hit product. Our mail order business is the biggest reason we still let ourselves search out and stock all this collectible stuff - it keeps us alive!"

Mosh Pit, Inc., Wendy Perelstein's hard rockin' empire, is not only a prime example of the development and expansion of a specialized niche - it serves as a floodlight of hope for anyone who believes in and skillfully executes their dreams and expertise. "Pit Magazine," Mosh Pit Records and a mail-order business, as well as Perelstein's metal booking agency, are not only keeping her head above water - they've got

her swimming with the big sharks.

The names Perelstein and Mosh Pit are not taken lightly in Colorado Springs, Denver and the surrounding areas. After her first entrepreneurial outing as a nightclub owner (when she was barely into her 20s), Perelstein experienced what a lot of red tape can do to a business that needs to generate green cash. "I just decided I wanted to start the kind of music business that wasn't totally [dependent] on the economy of this town," explains Perelstein. "I didn't have much money after the nightclub closed, so I started handling consignment music from local bands. That grew into a mail-order business that I ran from my home, until people thought I was dealing in stuff other than



The independent, trend retailer can fight the mass-merchandiser and discount music-seller by identifying a unique need in their

marketplace and exploiting it. If you look at a chain like Zia's in Phoenix, which competes and grows in a market with an aggressive discount music-seller, you'll see that their success comes from a total involvement in their customers' music buying habits and lifestyles. They've become a valuable component of the music scene in their area by tying in all aspects of music and entertainment. Zia's is involved with the clubs, radio stations and local video outlets, and is especially active in the local music scene.

Before you say to yourself, "This is too much, it can't be done," consider some other options. "Don't let yourself just be a store standing there - get the community involved with you, sponsor community events - it will help you and the community; you'll keep your name out there more and more." offers Hauseman. "How much does it cost to have your name put on a T-shirt? Word of mouth is free, and the big chains, what do they care about that? They're moving hit product; they're only looking for your typical American customer to come in and buy your typical middle American product."

Continues Hauseman, "You know what? They [the small retailer] could buy one \$250 six disc CD player per store (say they have a six-store chain), and all of the sudden, they would have a listening station in each of their stores! They should know what shows are going on in their marketplace, they can go out and offer couponing - there are alternatives! I do marketing, and believe me, there are always alternatives! If you are in touch with the consumer and your marketplace scan, find a way to push forward.

"The stores who are really supporting my records and are really doing their damnedest to help them along, I'm going to make sure they get support from us. I want to work with retailers who become involved with projects. The more a store is active like that, the more I am throwing my available advertising dollars there. I want to make an impact on the marketplace and help out the stores that helped my record. It all comes around, and the key for retailers is to get more involved with the records!"

It will take a lot more promoting, and some imaging, but people will know us. We have several labels, including some adult and alternative acts, but my heart is in rock. I want to do everything possible to take these labels as far as I can." We're pulling for ya, Meg!



Overkill "Fast Junkie"

Has it really been 10 years since the first Overkill record? Oh well, time flies when you're having fun! Yeah, New York thrash returns this week with "Fast Junkie," the first single from W.F.O. (Overkill's seventh album). "Fast Junkie" is fast-paced and crunchy, with vocalist Bobby Ellsworth expelling rapid-fire phrasings in a fashion that is well-deserving of his nickname, "Blitz." Also included on this CD-Pro is the album track "Gasoline Dream," which takes us on an epic journey through numerous time changes and moods. This is by far the coolest and most aggressive Overkill yet!

Mutha's Day Out My Soul Is Wet Chrysolis/ERG

This is far too good of an album not to happen. Despite their youth, Mutha's Day Out is far



ahead of the pack, with one rapper and one singer working together and battling for attention. The guitars are nice and fat, making for some burly shythms and romping tunes. We've recommended "Locked" and "What You See/We All Bleed Red" previously, but there's so much more to groove on in My Soul Is Wet. "Green" exposes a bit of the band's Southern roots in a modern, more alternative setting. "Ding Ding Man" is a tension-filled trip, and "Blank Page" adds a funked up element, and has a real memorable chorus. This is a damn good album, and it's chock full of reasons to play it.

Vocalist Dawn Crosby has had a very interesting career. She was one of the first females to front a thrash band (in Detente in the mid-80s), and when the



first Fear Of God album came out a few years ago, she was leading her band into industrial turf (which was nowhere near as popular as it is now). On *Toxic Voodoo*, there are glimpses of the past, but also windows toward the future. The album is a bizarre, yet appealing collection of sounds that accompanies some real metal. This is not for the meek. The intensity of this recording will have the VU meter pinned and quivering in pain.

Cyclone Temple

Cyclone Temple has taken a hard to find, out of print EP, and a new singer, Sonny DeLuca, and fused them with some new songs to create *My Friend Lonely*. Big Greg Fulton still wields a mighty axe, and on this record he uses his enormous talent to stretch out musically. The title track nibbles a bit on a reggae vibe before getting down to some real serious business. "Down The Drain" and "Comfortably Superficial" are crushers, with some of the meatiest rhythms imaginable burning out of Greg's Flying V. Put this one in the CD player and duck!

Infectious Grooves

Cousin Randy doesn't sound like the kind of guy you'd bring home for mom to meet over dinner. A six-foot, seven-inch tall psycho mutherfucker with a curious history, "Cousin



Randy" is the subject of Mike Muir's surreal observations this time. The Grooves are chunky and funky on this cut, as the story unfolds and the guitars bark out behind Muir's inside story of lunacy up close and personal. Somehow, Muir figures out how to make madness and mental illness fun.

Clutch

"A Shogun Named Marcus"

If you haven't clued into Clutch yet, you must be living in a cave. This four-piece band from the nation's capital put down some of the most punish-

ing grooves this side of the Swans, as "A Shogun Named Marcus" amply illustrates. "A Shogun Named Marcus" lunges at you immediately with its swaggering, mind-staggering rhythm section while the raging guitar attempts to throttle the life right out of you. If you're still conscious, Neil Fallon's vocals deliver a guttural kick that'll drag you into the pits of delightful musical destruction.

Yowzaa, yowzaa, yowzaa, RAWk Radio should eat this up. The "A Shogun Named Marcus" CD5 also comes with three live tracks - "Rats," "Juggernaut" (which is not on the album) and a live version of "A Shogun Named Marcus" (featuring Max Cavalera and Andreas Kisser of Sepultura) - plus a previously unreleased song, "Molt." All of these tunes should find a home at the format. If Clutch are too much for you, maybe you should think about switching to an easy-listening station where the musical terrain is much safer.




Walk On

Downset was every bit as poignant and riveting as their new album is, and they were power-packed on stage. There was a video crew there to film their performance, and the audio portion was taped for future use Can we say 'B-sides'? A couple of days before the famous Donnington festival took place, the papers were full of accounts from the concert and everyone was talking about it. The lineup itself was impressive and it looks like the big European concerts are taking a lesson from the staging at Lollapaloosa. Aerosmith headlined, with Pride & Glory, Extreme, Pantera, Sepultura a.nd Skin also on the bill. Festival planners included a smaller side-stage to keep the patrons busy during the changeovers for the bigger bands. Biohazard was one of the bands that got a shot to do their thing during the lag time and they caused quite a stir. Being so used to having audience participation i.e.: (a steady stream of bodies coming onto the stage and diving back into the crowd) made the Domnington audience seem too tame for Brooklyn's finest. So they invited the crowd up past the security barrier and total chaos ensued - with the organizers pulling the plug after three songs, fearing a repeat of violence that cost a few lives at a previous version of this same outdoor gathering. Biohazard's tour of Europe definitely had the locals buzzing I was so happy to see that King's X had landed a headlining date at the Hollywood Palace (June 17) in the midst of their dates with Molley Crue. It has been way too long between shows for the mighty King's X in LA, and, being one of the greatest bands on earth, every concert is treasured. Maybe we can hang with Doug at the show and see what's up with him, Ty and Jierry, It was also strange to see the Motley Crue itinerary and notice that there is not an LA date yet. Plenty of other shows around us, but no show here. Also, I was pleasantly surprised to see that Thunder was on the bill with King's X. It turns out they have been in LA recording a new album, and a live show should be some fun away from the tedium of recording # Testament was in the studio finishing off their record with producer Garth Richardson here in town, and the reports are very heavy! S American Recordings are planning a busy fall for us, as their main metal acts get ready for a frontal assault. Slayer's album is finished, and the working title is Divine Intervention. So far it looks like there will be a lot of fest vities surrounding the release in late August to celebrate the fact that the Slayer catalog is Gold. The new Danzig is done as well, and after Glenn's most recent success, this could be a very important album for him and his band.

Spawned in the depths of New York in 1988, welcome one of RAWk's favorite new bands, Wicked Maraya. In addition to spending time on the local club circuit, Wicked Maraya have also garnered respect on the West Coast by opening for bands like Asphalt Ballet.

Signed to Mausoleum in 1993, Wicked Maraya's debut (and Mausoleum's debut US release), Cycles, is an album

There is a wonderful story behind this project. As most of you are aware, Sara Hickman used to be on Elektra. This album was originally suppose to be released via that label, but due to a series of unfortunate events, the album was never released, and Sara and Elektra parted company. Hickman wanted to buy back the masters but didn't have the money. Over the past year, with the help of friends, the support of her fan club (who were instrumental in helping to raise the funds), and the eventual sell-

ing of her house, furniture and some

prized possessions, Hickman was able to buy back her songs. Because this entire experience was nothing short of a miracle in Sara's mind, she has named this album Necessary Angels. credits many of her fan club members in the liner notes, and she gave them all hand-numbered bracelets!

With this kind of spiritual energy behind the project, how could it be anything but incredible?! Necessary Angels includes much of the material she originally recorded for Elektra, but she has since recorded four more songs, which have been included on the disc. Hickman's music remains compassionate and universal. Some of the songs feature bare-bones production. while others include full accompaniment. Literally every tune is a work of art. That being the case, I could suggest any track and be on the mark, but do let me point out "Pursuit Of Happiness" (featured on Adult Rock TuneUp #2), "Shadowboxing," "Sister And Sam" and "Time Will Tell."

Sara Hickman's music is her avenue to reach out to people. Her empathy and concern for all of us is real.

These young lads from Glasgow have a vision as to how they think music ought to sound. Band leader and producer Joe McAlinden was trained in the classics as a boy, but was also heavily influenced by other "classic" composers, such as Brian Wilson, Lennon and McCartney and Alex Chilton. These

influences are readily evident in the distinct music of Superstar. In 1992 they released a self-produced, low-budget EP wryly entitled Greatest Hits, Volume One, which was met with critical acclaim upon its release

On Superstar, the band's sense of melody, impeccable harmonies and sophisticated instrumentation (which includes strings and brass, along with the more traditional pop/rock instruments) belie their young age and limited experience. Clearly they have continued to hone their singular musical vision, focusing on appealing pop-rock that pays tribute to the past while displaying a renegade element of experimentation.

In addition the lead track, "Feels Like Forever" (track #4 on Adult Rock TuneUp #2), check out "Don't Wanna Die," "I Can't Help It." "Let's Get Lost" and my favorite, "Thought For Today."

Glen Clark Looking For The Connection

Glen Clark's songs have been recorded by many musical giants throughout the years including Bonnie Raitt, Kris Kristofferson, Rita Coolidge and even Dizzy Gillespie! In his own right, he is a premier harpist, keyboardist and vocalist. In the 70s, this Fort



Worth native moved to LA and began to play with artists like Delbert McClinton, Kris Kristofferson, Danny Timms and Stephen Bruton. The latter two, along with Clark, went on to play with Bonnie Raitt for many years. After that, Glen began concentrating on his solo career. So now, after three decades of making music with and for others, Clark finally steps into the spotlight with his dos debut release. Looking For The Connection.

This album clearly reveals his vast array of musical experience, which runs from rock to country to blues to gospel, and includes everything in between! Several tracks stand out as Adult Rock contenders, "Leap Of Faith" (which you can find on Adult Rock TuneUp #2). Tales From The Urban Prairie Sony 550 Music

With certain artists, that elusive but allimportant creative chemistry can make all the difference in the world! Such is the case with Wendy Robinson and Polly Hancock, aka The Popinjays (named after a famous London pub), who present their traditionally flavored pop sound with unexpected style and



grace. Originally formed in 1990, this band was first introduced into the US via an import on Big Cat Records. In 1992, their first Stateside release, Epic's Flying Down To Mono Valley, produced by Ian Broudie (Lightning Seeds), established The Popinjays as a band to pay serious attention to. We now have Tales From The Urban Prairie on the aggressive new Sony 550 Music.

Certainly the suggested first track, "When I Believed In You," is perfect for Adult Rock Radio, with its swaying melody, beautiful arrangement and sweet, sweet harmonies. This song well represents The Popinjays' musical persuasion. Other tracks continue on this path, including "Feelin" and "Slowly I Reach." There is also a more lighthearted and whimsical side to the band, as is evident in songs like "Queen Of The Parking Lot," "Hurricane" and "Buffalo," although their rich sound remains



Comprised of Angelo and Alice Palladino, the Palladinos have been traveling and performing throughout the United Kingdom and Europe for the past 13 years! Producer John Ravenhill, a longtime friend, found the means to record an album of their road-tested songs. Alice sent the recording off to an ex-classmate from Newcastle-Upon-Tyne named Gordon Sumner. Sting loved the material so much he promptly signed them to his Pangaea label.



Now that we have the chance to hear Travelling Dark ourselves, we can easily understand why Sting was so impressed. The

Palladinos' organic and traditional sound, and easy flowing style, somehow have strong modern appeal. Their songs of "everyday life" tell of Angelo's and Alice's experiences of living both in London and in the country, and the good and bad of both. Their keen sense of melody, a blend of electric and acoustic instrumentation and lyrics that tell many a tale, extend a warm invitation to go on a musical journey with The Palladinos.

Several tracks stand out including "Rocking The Black Road" (featured on Adult Rock TuneUp #2), "In This Place Here," "Northern Flashes," "Boom Town" and "In My City Heart."

Special four-track EP

Epic Canada

Hemingway Corner was initially singer/songwriters David Martin and Johnny Douglas. About a year ago, they released their self-titled debut album in Canada, which generated five Top 10 singles and extensive touring for the band. Missing his family in Nashville, Douglas has since left the band and has been replaced by Scott Dibble and Mark Sterling. The new lineup has put together this four-song EP of three original compositions, and their interpretation of Neil Young's "Tell Me Why" (which will be included on the Neil Young tribute album now in the works).

Their music is warm, human and very appealing. Their sound is reminiscent of Poco, Batdorf & Rodney and Cowboy. All four songs on this EP are custom made for Adult Rock Radio. The vocals/harmonies are sincere and beautiful, the acoustic guitar work is tough and assertive and the songs are accomplished.

If Billy Pilgrim, Jackopierce or Jump In The Water work for you, then Hemingway Corner is your next stop.



Razor & Tie

This package is the first in a series that captures several special evenings at New York's famed Bottom Line between 1991 to 1993. The idea was to put together four or five song-writers each night (among them seasoned performers, behind-the-scenes types, old pros and newly-budding talent), and let them take over the stage for the evening. They would perform their own tunes, or ones that had special meaning to them. As stated on the disc itself, it was simply "a bunch of songwriters sittin' around singing." Minimal rehearsal time was given, so as to preserve the element of spontaneity and improvisation. The results were nothing short of inspired!

Everything on *In Their Own Words - Volume One* is a special celebration of "the song," but do focus in on Barrett Strong doing his "Heard It Through The Grapevine," Richard Thompson ripping through "I Feel So Good," Lucinda Williams' sweet version of "Positively 4th Street" and Graham Parker's moving rendition of "No Woman, No Cry."

THE DEVLINS

CAPITOL

Boy, am I glad that Capitol Records is going after The Devlins again! Not only was *Drift* one of the best albums of 1993 (only God knows why it didn't explode), but it is also one of the best albums of 1994!

To recap, The Devlins are comprised of Colin Devlin (composer, lead vocals, guitars), his brother Peter (co-writer, mandolin, 12-string acoustic guitar), Sean Devitt (percussion) and Naill Macken (keyboards). They are from Dublin. The album was produced by Malcolm Burn (Chris Whitley, Bob Dylan), with finishing "touches" added by Dave Bottrel (a member of Peter Gabriel's Real World Studios staff). Until recently, the band had been on the road opening for Sarah McLachlan; now they're back on the road again with Sheryl Crow. The new version of "Someone To Talk To" involved further production and mixing by Josh Deutsch and Shelly Yakus, and it's a perfect example of the directness of Colin's lyrics, and The Devlin's simple yet passionate, no-frills approach to their music.

As soon as I placed the CD back into my player, and began to reacquaint myself with Drift, I was reminded of how special this album is, and how The Devlins' music immediately grabs onto you and takes you with it. The first song, "I Knew That," has a little more of an edge than most of the album, but it serves the purpose of wiping your emotional slate clean. "Everytime You Go" showcases the punch band leader Colin Devlin is capable of with his voice (and with his songs). It has a driving beat, echoing guitars and an eerie little organ sound. The next track to grab me was "Drift." This song has a soft, friendly bounce, a hypnotic groove that's impossible to resist and great guitar work. "Almost Made You Smile" builds into a powerful arrangement that complements its message, which concerns the need to spiritually connect with another human being. And, then there's "Alone In The Dark," which along with the single, should be receiving heavy spins on every Adult Rock Radio station in America!

To quote our original review from April of last year, "The use of passion and intimacy are vital to the expression of The Devlin's music, and these elements are heavily apparent throughout *Drift*...creating a compelling and effective debut album."

2ND VIEWING

DAVE ALVIN King Of California HIGHTONE

Dave Alvin's latest album is about change and growth. It represents his continued musical evolution, and, at the same time, it serves as a point of reference for him to see his progress.

The music is sincere, the playing is down-home, and the delivery is heartfelt.

He has chosen a variety of songs to be on *King Of California*, including some from his days with The Blasters. In his own words, "I wanted to do a quieter collection of old, new, borrowed and blue songs." Most of the tunes he has recorded here are story-songs about people realizing that their dreams may not always come true, and about how they survive day to day, keeping their hearts intact. Check out the title track, his new version of "Fourth Of July" and "Mother Earth" for starters.

This album has quietly debuted on the Adult Rock Airplay chart, and it continues to build steadily in spins each week. If you haven't taken the time to investigate this Greg Leisz production, I believe you are missing some great music for your station!


More Than Sonic

The band's material sounded great live - and between Yes's quadrophonic PA set-up and their cool new *Concertsonics* stereo broadcast, the sound quality was stellar!

Although we've covered the topic before, we've still been hearing a lot of questions about Yes's Concertsonics experiments, which the band has tied in with radio promotions. So, for all you Rock Radio stations running the promotion, and anyone else who

Concertsonics is an experimental stereo broadcast of Yes's live audio program. Ticket buyers in the prearranged section - near the stage, in an area 60 to 80 feet wide - who have headphones and a Walkman type FM receiver (which runs on at least two AA batteries) will be able to tune in and hear the special stereo broadcast of the show with virtually no blurring of the sound and incredible stereo effects.

The band states that audience members will "experience a new dimension in sound unheard before in a live concert environment," and having experienced it personally at Yes's live rehearsal, we have to agree! This is the first time an stereo broadcast experiment like Concertsonics has ever been put on in a live concert setting, and Yes has once again managed to be both artistic and innovative!

Radio stations running the Concertsonics promotion are giving away Walkman receivers and tickets to the special section for free. However, if you buy a ticket to a seat in the section, there are no extra charges (you'll just have to provide your own headphones and receiver). If you're not in the Concertsonics seating area, you may still be able to hear the broadcast over your headsets, but it might sound delayed or echoey.

By the way, Yes suggests you use the type of headphones that fit *into* your ear, unless you can afford the pricey, studio-type headsets. Boomboxes and other portable stereos are *not* allowed in the concert.

Finally, if you want to listen to the band's quadrophonic PA system instead of the broadcast, feel free! You can switch back and forth whenever you want!

Now that we've given you the Concertsonics scoop, go out and experience this great band live!
