



Rootsy, organic, homegrown, retro, powerful, captivating, unbelievable...you've heard it all before, but you haven't heard "Hold My Hand."


Dave Edmunds



"When I'm Dead And Gone"

Bonzo's sampled drums are unmistakable here. Another thing that is clear on "When I'm Dead And Gone" is just how different it sounds from the Rock Radio hit "Every Generation Got Its Own Disease."

This German sextet rocks on "When I'm Dead And Gone," tossing pop melodies about like it owns the rights. Mono is the CD, and with "...Dead And Gone," Fury In The Slaughterhouse proves it is no one-hit wonder. KBPI and WMMS are among the stations already on it, and you can't miss it on our Rock CD TuneUp #116.

John Hiatt

"Cross My Fingers" b/w "True Believer"

Raw, rough guitars and more melody than a song should be allowed to have. This is how we describe "Cross My Fingers," the latest cut from Hiatt's Perfectly Good Guitar CD. John owns the Adult Rock Radio format, but "Cross My Fingers" is pure rock!

Also included on this Pro is a new Hiatt rocker called "True Believer." This one comes not from Hiatt's CD, but from the upcoming Melanie Griffith film Milk Money. And don't miss John on the road with Jackson Browne, from mid-July through early September.

The Grays

"Same Thing"

Many respectable Rock Radio outlets did very well with the melodic "Very Best Years," from The Grays' debut, Ro Sham Bo. On "Same Thing," this LA-based quartet has an electric pop sound reminiscent of The Beatles, with a generous helping of some Crowded House-type approaches to the melodic structure blended in.

Though "Same Thing" is fraught with time-honored pop sensibilities, it also has a rugged edge that gives it all the appeal Rock Radio should need.

In the early 70s, Ronson and Bowie teamed up to deliver one of the finest rock n' roll albums ever! In 1994, a year after his death, Ronson is joined posthumously by his old friend David for their reading of this nugget.

Among the out of the boxers on "Rock It" are KTXQ, WKLS, WNEW, KYYS, WWDC, WSHE, WBAB, WFBQ, WMMR and WRIF.

Speaking of "Rock It," KATP PD Dale Miller says, "It's perfect for Texas, but it's also perfect for everywhere else. 'Rock It' sounds like classic Steve Miller, with ZZ Top worked in. Our audience loves it!" Guy Dark of WHDQ states, "This could have come from one of his classic albums!"

At WZNF, Roger The Dodger comments, "This is a great rock song! 'Rock It' is up-tempo, and it has a great solo and a massive hook!" Jamie Markley of WWCT calls "Rock It" "great boogie n' blues!"

WZZQ's Danny Wayne offers his opinion of "Speed," saying, "It's great to have the real Billy back!" Meanwhile, Dale Miller of KATP tells us, "It's cool! It also makes me think of Deep Purple."

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
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
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Spencer of The Mother Station, Memphis's latest offering to the rock n' roll stew. Her addiction? Guitars. "I'm a guitar freak. I'm a guitar fuckin' junkie, is what I am."

At 26, Spencer has been playing in earnest for a dozen years. In fact, Gwin was five when she got her first instrument, but her little boyfriend down the street sat on it and crushed it. Of course, she dispensed of the dinky scoundrel forthwith, but she didn't get another six-string until she was 14. Today, Gwin figures she owns about 10 guitars. "I'd have more," she points out, "but, you know, being poverty stricken...."

Gwin and singer Susan Marshall have both called me from Spencer's apartment, and just then there's a click on the line as someone tries to call through. It turns out a music store in town is phoning to see if Gwin can be lured down for a visit. Temptation comes from every direction, and it looks as though a 12-step plan may be in order to help Gwin kick the axe habit. But then again, it might not be a good idea to try and wean her from her guitar at this point. Sporting a grin I can detect through the phone, she tells me about a conversation she once had with her mom.

"I was like, 'I don't know - was I supposed to do something else?' My mom said, laughing, 'You can't do anything else!' So that was great encouragement: It's either panhandle or play."

It was after witnessing her first concert - Heart - that Gwin Spencer realized she must have another guitar. She was 14, impressionable and full of fire. Incessant practicing was the best way Gwin knew of to become the best guitarist she could become - not the best "woman" axe player.

"I think that if I could do anything, it would be to try and break down the thought of the 'girl guitar player' thing."

The Mother Station came together loosely around three, maybe four years ago; the name was nicked from the slogan of WDIA/Memphis, an old black radio station where, back in the 40s, B.B. King spun records. At the end of the 80s, Gwin was writing with her partner, Jo Beth Dunn - whose uncle, Donald "Duck" Dunn, is a bass playing legend in the world of soul music - and looking to put a new band together. Spencer, who had been working in area bands and honing her songwriting since her teens, knew that her songs were written in a range that would lend itself best to a female singer. If prospective applicants thought they might catch a break because the guitarist was also a woman, they were sadly mistaken. No ma'am, Gwin's criteria for hiring a singer was, frankly,

perhaps a bit unreasonable.

"When you grow up hearing Ann Wilson sing, you're gonna have to have a hell of a fucking singer, you know? That's all I was comparing it to - Aretha Franklin and Ann Wilson. And so, when they'd come in, I'd [say], 'You don't have the range of either one.' Those poor girls - it was pretty hard competition."

Twenty-six year old vocal powerhouse Susan Marshall, of the Utah/Oregon/Southern California/New Mexico/Memphis Marshalls, became aware of Gwin Spencer and her songwriting partner Jo Beth by working the same Memphis scene as a band in which Spencer and Dunn once played together. Impressed with their songwriting talents, Susan sought the pair out to see if they had any songs she might record.

"I wanted to do a demo to try to get something going for myself, so I called Jo Beth and Gwin. And Jo Beth said, 'Let us call you back, 'cause right now I'm helping Gwin get her band together. She's looking for a singer, a bass player and a keyboard player,' blah blah blah, 'so, lemme call you back in a couple months.'"

When auditions for a lead singer proved fruitless, Gwin decided to just sing the demos herself. Remembering the call from Susan, Jo Beth phoned her to see if she could give Gwin a few pointers - voice lessons, as it were. "I went over to Gwin's house, and we were just listening to some music," Susan recounts. "I will never forget it - she had on Lee Michaels' 'Do You Know What I Mean.' So I started singing along with that. And Gwin just looked at me, she looked at Jo Beth, and they walked outta the room.

"Gwin came back two seconds later and said, 'Um...do you wanna be the lead singer of our band?' 'No way, really? That's so cool!'" Susan recalls saying.

So, Gwin held on to her lofty standards and ultimately found exactly the type of singer she was looking for. "When Susie came in and sang two seconds' worth, I knew!"

"When I heard their songs, they blew me away," Susan Marshall says of Gwin Spencer and Jo Beth Dunn. "I mean, I couldn't believe they were writing something that I could feel. I really related to it. I mean, whenever they write, it's like they wrote it just for me."

The songs that Susan can relate most to are the soulful kinda blues numbers that populate *Brand New Bag*, The Mother Station's introductory outing. Ranging from R&B-with-balls to hard, electric blues to fervent, soulful ballads, the 11 new songs on *Brand New Bag* (there's also a cover of the latter day Humble Pie cut, "Fool For A Pretty Face") all reside in a neighborhood where passion and explosive emotional release is the order of the day. Marshall comments, "It's like, 'Thank God someone is doing some feelin' around here,' 'cause I'm real tired of the pseudo-intellectual bullshit. I like to sing stuff from my heart, you know, something I can feel. They write that, and the band interprets it as that. We all put in our part and make it that."

Also playing their part in The Mother Station's music are keyboardist Paul Brown, bass player Michael Jacques and drummer Rick Shelton, all of whom came after Gwin and Susan first teamed up. In fact, the rest of The Mother Station was ever changing for roughly a year and a half after Gwin and Susan put the thing together. Whatever the reason for the exit of some of the early musicians, the constant in the current lineup of The Mother Station is a craving for making rock n' roll.

"Auditioning musicians, I realized that you can really

tell which people just *have* to play," Gwin tells me. "You know, the ones that, if they don't play, would just fucking blow up.

"And those are the psychotic people we wanted in the band!" she laughs.

"You can't just take wonderful players and stick them together. Something has to click. It's a chemistry thing, and the chemistry wasn't happening," says Susan of the initial lineups. She then goes on to explain how the band started to really mesh.

"Rick was the first one we found. He was fixing to give it up and move to Las Vegas - we caught him, like, three to four days before he was leaving to go. And he listened, he came and auditioned, we heard him play, and Gwin and I went outside the practice room and said, 'Oh my God, he's so incredible!' We were just hoping he'd wanna play with us, 'cause we had auditioned so many people, and we didn't click with anybody.

"And then we found Paul, our keyboard player, about six months before we did the record.

"But we still couldn't find a bass player, and we didn't know what to do. Finally, Rick, our drummer, heard about a friend in Nashville [who] had a friend in Houston, and this friend in Houston drove up to audition - and he was great. I mean, it was just unbelievable. He and Rick meshed so well. All the bass players that we would find would wanna play right on the beat, but we wanted to mess 'em up and say, 'Play sloppy. Let it go; don't be so perfect. Just feel.' And Michael is like that."

Working with veteran rock producer Joe Hardy, The Mother Station entered Memphis's Beale Street Studios last October, emerging in January with the final mixes of *Brand New Bag.* "[The studio] used to be this place called Peewee's Saloon," Marshall reports. "It was a pool hall/bar/gambling kinda place - something like that - back in the 20s. And they just leveled it. They didn't even move any of the shit - they just leveled the thing and built right on top of it."

The Mother Station used "Put The Blame On Me" as its first calling card. It's a conduit for Gwin Spencer's guitar wizardry - she is a damn fine guitarist - and Susan Marshall's vocal magic. Like the Stax/Volt material that was so important to these ladies during their formative years, "Put The Blame On Me" and all the other songs on Brand New Bag are packed with an honest, naked spirit that has - thankfully - made a resounding comeback after having been in hiding for much of the past decade.

"The music comes straight from our gut, straight from our soul," Susan explains, "and we're having a good time. I mean, we just want everyone to like our music like we like our music. We didn't create it because we were worried about what everyone else was thinkin'. We weren't thinkin', really, we were just feelin'. And that's what we want everyone else to do. Just feel the music, and jam on. I mean, it's just honest, straight ahead rock n' roll that you can feel good about - back to the days of Stax, when music really moved you."

"The most important thing is that it's real, and it just comes straight from the heart," Spencer concurs. "I think The Mother Station is a band that likes to groove and hang out on the backbeat, just have fun, and put every fucking thing they've got into it."

lain Levy, President and CEO of PolyGram and Chris Blackwell, Alsland founder and CEO, jointly announce the dissolution of PolyGram Label Group and the renewed independent status of Island Records; PLG's Executive VP, John Barbis, will become the new President of Island US, reporting directly to Blackwell, while PLG President Rick Dobbis will move to London and a senior management position.

According to Levy and Blackwell, the restructuring will enable Island (which has just come off its most successful year in its 31-year history) to become more efficient and creative in the development and

marketing of its artists.

Island will have its own radio promotion, retail, sales, marketing and publicity departments; the label's new and improved staff will be built from existing Island employees, as well as former PLG employees. The company's US branch will remain at its New York location. Island's distribution will continue to be handled by PolyGram Group Distribution, as will that of sister labels A&M, Mercury, Motown and PolyGram Classics & Jazz.

PLG, which previously coordinated sales, marketing and promotional efforts for Island, among other labels, was conceived in 1990 as an interim business entity, following the acquisition by PolyGram of some key companies. By acting as an umbrella corporation, it allowed the disparate labels it united to focus on growth. Plans for the other labels under the PLG umbrella, including

London, Polydor, Atlas and Blue Gorilla, will be announced shortly.

Regarding the tsunami of change inundating Island, Levy states, "Island Records is one of the most emulated labels in music history and Chris Blackwell is one of the industry's most admired figures. I believe Island in 1994 will surpass everyone's already high expectations in finding and developing artists in an attractive and seamless manner. Rick Dobbis and Johnny Barbis have been key players in this period, and their promotions reward their accomplishments in the last three years."

Of Island's new independence, and Barbis's appointment, Blackwell says, "PLG has done a tremendous job since its inception, and much of the credit should go to Rick Dobbis and Johnny Barbis. Along with their talented staff, they have helped take many of our artists to new levels, enabling us to concentrate on signing and developing new talent. Bringing the PLG staff into the Island fold will make us a stronger, more unified and successful company. I am very pleased with the new arrangement. Over the past few years, I have seen Johnny Barbis's hard work and dedication at PLG pay off. Johnny's depth of knowledge, talent and commitment to the artists he works with make him perfect to head the Island team."

Of his appointment, Barbis explains, "Island has always been an artist-oriented company, and this makes the prospect of working with the creative people such as Chris Blackwell and Alain Levy, along with the incredible team built at the current PLG and Island, a limitless horizon. I am honored to lead and be associated with such a diverse group of artists and people."

Prior to Barbis's tenure as Executive VP of PLG, he served in similar capacities at Geffen, ABC and

I can't wait to hear it on the air."

As predicted, WXPN/Philadelphia's Mike Morrison has been hired as Program Director for the station; being an LA native and an early pioneer of the Adult Rock format, Morrison views his segue as a sort of homecoming.

"It's been a dream of mine to go back to LA and do Adult Rock Radio," Morrison says. "So I guess you could say this is a dream come true for me. Los Angeles is desperately in need of a music radio station that serves up a high quality, diverse mix. I can't wait to get started."

Another prediction rings true: WBOS/Boston MD Merilee Kelly will come on board "FM 101.9" in the same capacity. Quips Kelly, "I don't know what's more exciting - the challenge, the scandal or working with Mike Morrison and Dennis

Constantine in creating a wonderful new radio station in Los Angeles.'

"FM 101.9" will broadcast from the former K-LITE/Los Angeles studios until construction on new broadcasting and performance facilities (situated on Forest Lawn Drive in Los Angeles) is completed.

Look for official announcements of the arrivals of KCRW/Los Angeles's Chris Douridas and KLOS/Los Angeles's Nicole Sandler as air talents next week.

Smaller Retailers Carve Their Own Niche

This is part two of our article focusing on the current environment and marketplace for music retailing as we head into the latter half of the decade. Last week, we were joined by Dutch Cramblitt, EMI's Senior Director/Retail Marketing, Patti Hauseman, Arista's Alternative Marketing Manager, Otis Ball, Manager of Pier Platters in Hoboken, Dan Gill, Head of Sales for Mammoth Records, Kathy Shedd, General Manager of the Down In The Valley music chain, Peter Tappen, Columbia's Manager/National Retail Marketing, and Wendy Perelstein, Owner of Mosh Pit, Inc.; to determine and evaluate what the REAL issues facing retailers are, as well as getting quite a few invaluable bits of insight on not only surviving but succeeding. The topics discussed last week included: Knowing your marketplace, making the price nice, finding a niche and a customer to go with it, and getting involved with labels and your market to exploit any and all opportunities available.

This week, we continue our probe into the minds of this group, every member of which is seeing plenty of action on the front lines of music retailing.

getting a perspective on promotions

Pier Platters' Otis Ball defined an unseen side effect of the expansion of the distribution of alternative and underground artists releases by the major labels (in addition to the indies), and how they dealt with it: "The whole US indie label scene has expanded so much and domestically, there are so many active labels doing the same kind of stuff. It's also been really tough in the past few years, since the major labels [began] putting out the obscure records we used to sell. Five years ago there weren't that many places to find Mudhoney records, nowadays you can go to the MALL and get them! That has made a difference with us. Now, we've found there's a *really* big market in Europe for a lot of this product; the collectors over there never saw any of it to begin with, so we have been able to develop those customers."

"Columbia [Records] concentrates on smaller stores, indies and some larger chains that are way out in the hinterlands of the US," explains Peter Tappen. "We support all these accounts with any and all means possible, via promotional items, getting retailers to club shows and supporting in-store play promotions. We are always aggressively pursuing to empower the retailer, by helping them become a recognized source of knowledge in their market with cutting edge information and specially packaged items, such as the Toad The Wet Sprocket special CD package which they can use as an in-store tool to aid in selling product."

For Perelstein at Mosh Pit, Inc., creating a "niche within a niche" has turned up an even wider range of customers for all the facets of her business. Perelstein explains, "We have a store in a nightchub where I book all the bands, Pure Energy. At first, we just kind of set up a table and sold stuff, but then the club gave me a space (I think it used to be a coat room) and my dad made a display case. We've filled the entire area up with posters and the fliers we make. Putting the 'Concrete [Marketing] Corner' down there has been really successful, since I can't put the more mainstream metal bands they feature in our regular store. [During business] nights, we have customers fill out [entries for] the monthly raffles and give away tattoos and cassette samplers. A lot of 'our people' have been winning Concretes' contests because we do them so much!" Perelstein hasn't stopped with just that unique aspect of marketing her products; she also places stock in six local stores (some of which are traditional music outlets, others are skate shops).

Kathy Shedd is making a LOT of noise for the labels and creating one successful store promotion after another at Down In The Valley. Shedd generously offers some examples of what a little determination (and a phone) can do for retailers: "I've got a salesperson, Kirsten, who designed a fantastic Father's Day promotion around a record called *Daddies Sing Goodnight*," she says. "She's called it 'The Best Dad In The World Coloring Contest.' Kids got to color their 'Best Dad' and some lucky dad won an autographed CD. Most people would assume that a promotion around children's product wouldn't be going on here - and they'd be wrong! It is happening simply because one of our salespersons was aggressive and followed a concept through."

Shedd continues, "We do small things like that and we do larger things, such as giving away three autographed Frank Zappa lithographs for the grand opening of our newest store. We do a lot of cross-promotions with other [lifestyle] retailers, such as giving away \$300 in Rollerblade equipment." But Shedd held out some of their best promotions for last: "We did a huge promotion with Pantera," she explains, "and gave away an autographed Pantera skateboard, with the helmet and pads - the whole thing! EastWest provided the prize, but I didn't just call up and simply ask them for it; I have really great label sales people who know we're active and can make things happen. The other great deal we have coming up is with Sony and KQRS, for the upcoming Pink Floyd concert in Minneapolis; they're giving away a sort



of backstage pass to commemorate the concert, and on the back of those passes is printed 'Register to win at Down In The Valley for a 92-second record run!' We beat out *both* Title Wave and Best Buy for this promotion, and there's 50,000 of these things that will be handed out!"

Needless to say, Shedd is very excited about their track record for outstanding promotions, but she's quick to give credit where it's due. "You have to just go ahead and go for this kind of stuff, and again, a GREAT sales person who pulls for us and helps put these things together makes a lot of difference. This Floyd promotion is running for our grand opening and it's one of the biggest promotions we've been a part of. Let your reps know that you are willing to work for their artists, with in-store play exposure, displays and developing artists promotions; it's about keeping the lines of communication open between the labels and your store."

setting the mood for sales

One example of modifying and expanding to your client base is what the Tower Records chain created in their new Southern California location, Tower Alternative, in Costa Mesa. Hitting the road for a little investigative field trip, we got a refreshing (if not somewhat yet undefined), look at Tower Records as they move into the next century. "The Lab," which is a small grouping of "alternative" stores (defined as an "anti-mall" offering an option to what would normally be found in a suburban shopping mall), is home to the first Tower Alternative outlet. The Lab, which was envisioned by Shaheen Sadeghi (who designed the line of Tower Clothing), is almost indescribable; it has the look and feel of a post-modern X'ers commune - bohemian and industrial. Great attention was paid to every detail and to the creation of a sense of random chaos - it's almost an artist's community open for the public to play in.

The vibe is unequaled, with fresh flowers, remnants of industrial decay reborn as a waterfall and a unique blend of eclectic, but friendly, stores all centered around the "living room." The "living room" is full of mismatched chairs, rugs, overstuffed couches, pillows, a pool table, a gallery and a performance stage and media screens for artists of all kinds. The Tower store itself was described by manger Metoyer as a throwback to the look Tower had in the 7Os; welcoming, comfortable and informal. Yet, this is the 90s, and this store has been through "The Lab Apocalypse" - now interior design means bare floors, exposed rebar and lighting, and walls that were destroyed in advance.

Also, this store inherited and modified another concept of Tower's - "loud rooms," where, excluding classical and jazz, the music is cranked up without much regard for frightening the more fragile shoppers.

Tower Alternative is *not* about alternative music; it is about an alternative way to shop. Yes, they can carry the full line of Tower product, if they wish, but they are not required to. They have more immediate access to imports and a freer reign with vinyl and local music. Tower Alternative has received a warm reception by their much-desired slice of shoppers in that "expendable dollar" category. The Lab's artist performances in the living room have been a highlight, and more unique promotions are on the way.

After discussing the Tower Alternative store with Arista's Patti Hauseman, she clicked onto what she sees as a really positive trend. "There are a lot of record stores with coffee houses in them, some that are partially clubs," she says. "There's so much more of that going on, and it's a really cool vibe. It kind of all goes back to the music and I guess maybe people's love of music. I would love to have a record store here in NYC [where] I could just go and sit on the couch, hang out and listen to music and smoke cigarettes and read books, and - most importantly - BUY RECORDS!

"With the stores that are experimenting with different atmospheres and vibes, isn't that what's going to draw you back in there? It's the whole 'comfort factor,' people will always go back to where they feel comfortable, where they feel they belong. Everyone, especially the huge market of young people, wants to know there's a place where they can go, feel comfortable and belong. It's fucking cool! I just did this 'comfort thing' with my own office; now it's a really productive place to work," finishes Patti.

"A store's atmosphere is very important; more retailers should adopt a 'hands-on store' attitude," says Mammoth's Dan Gill. "Be able to open up and listen to any CD you want. There are chains here on the East Coast as well as elsewhere that are very successful with that concept. Especially so, in a market where there is no modern Rock Radio station, you have to be able to sell that kind of special product without the help of alternative airplay support. The are some stores out there that are really doing that well in markets lacking modern Rock Radio support."



is it time to consider an attitude adjustment?

Gill also highlights another often ignored factor for any retailer: "Customer service is so important. I think most stores have really gotten away from that - I'm sick of the bullshit 'indie rock attitude.' These stores would sell so many more records if they were nice to the customers and didn't put on the attitude. Maybe it works positively for them in a way, but I think that's a big problem; it's a very clique situation and they are really being hurt financially by it. Retailers could increase their productivity, maybe they just don't care about the revenue, or they're not business-oriented. They may be in it just because of the music, and that's why they want to be an independent store. A lot of customers are intimidated by most record stores. Hey, take a step backward and see how you're really operating."

That attitude can swing both ways though, for any retailer, and that's where really knowing youncustomers is critical. At Pier Platters, they sheepishly acknowledge the

"AA" (alternative attitude): "All of us here definitely have our specific [product] likes and dislikes, but it sort of seems like, when we just try to concentrate on those things, no one else cares but us!" exclaims Ball. "We've definitely had to hire new people to work here, because we were all getting so cranky! We were scaring people out, so the fact that customers are still coming here isn't because

we're handing them a cup of coffee when they walk in!" So, attitude can be interpreted and perceived quite differently by both retailers and their customers.

You better believe that Hauseman has her opinion on the 'tude issue: "That 'attitude' is all a part of the whole 'alternative thing,'" she says. "Different needs for different clientele. There's totally a niche for service! Another reason I shop at indie stores is because the people who work there, even though they have a bit of an attitude, really know their shit! I would much rather walk into any independent store and find the record or get the information I need."

As if he realizes changing some stores' personnel's attitudes is only a dream,

Columbia's Peter Tappen voiced his feelings about attitude, as well as apathy; "We're currently working Bruce Cockburn's Dart To The Heart album, and I can't tell you how many employees I talk to on a regular basis who haven't even taken the time or bothered to listen when we tell them how to pronounce his name properly," he admits. "I feel that customer service is almost on equal footing [with] atmosphere and product selection in defining a store's revenue."

Shedd simply states, "My staff knows that when we show a customer to the country section to buy a CD, the cash they pay for that is just as green as it will be for any other type of product. We bend over backward to make and keep the sale here, everything from addressing our customers by their first name to massive amounts of special ordering, and we immediately call all of our other stores to locate

and transfer product that a customer is looking for."

As Senior Director of Retail Marketing for EMI, Cramblitt is sensitive to the balance of personality and specialized product awareness. "Customer service is absolutely critical, especially with the fragmentation of genres and the on-going introduction of so many styles of music," he explains. "The successful trend retailer is one who really understands breaking music and can then identify and provide it for [his or her] customers. The genre consumer who looks for the most happening things is continually seeking out the stores with that product, and a store's employees who are knowledgeable

and enthusiastic and can grow and nuture that customer base. It's not too difficult for anybody to sell hit product to consumers, but it takes a certain expertise, love and knowledge of music to sell the newer and fringe artists (like a Pavement or Milla) to a notoriously selective clientele. That includes knowledge of not only artists, but the area radio stations, clubs and musical publications, as well as import and underground releases."

this isn't over yet!

Ball had some thoughts on Pier Platters' possible future and the effects they may feel: "I don't know if the major label influx into the indie world is more of a threat than mass merchandisers," he says. "There's supposedly a Sam Goody opening, literally, across the street from us. We're counting on the mail-order business and our regulars who will continue to buy here. This whole retail end of the business is so up in the air with all the new and different means of delivering the music to the consumer. With the talk of what may be coming down in five to 10 years from

now, this niche may actually be one of the things, that if we're still around, will make us not quite anachronistic. We'll have all the weird seven-inches and out-of-print things that this computer technology won't have. I imagine there will still be some sort of indie scene that will be effectively shut out of all technology, and there will be some retail outlets just for that purpose."



"This is really a very exciting time for retailing," says Tappen. "With so many cookie-cutter merchandisers in the marketplace, the industry is just primed for those who want to go beyond and do something different."

"Retailers need to look at the successful outlets in their market, even the mass merchandisers, and see what aspects of their business they're excelling at, and then exploit those things on a different level," offers Cramblitt. "Try more unique and alternative options to the standard means of promoting and selling records (in an unorthodox location). The retailer's attitude toward their business is crucial; they need to continue to be involved in new music and [not] give up."

surviving the century and living to tell about it

So, why is it that stores like Waterloo, Zia's, Y&T and Twisters among many others, continue to go on strong? It seems that they are able to immediately identify and service their markets - markets which are constantly changing.

Are a store's atmosphere and services offered powerful enough to compete with *super-mass-megastores*? Will the further exploitation of the sensory overloading, stale, non-environments of these stores shave off of a retailer's existing customer base? Absolutely, but only in a marginal way. Mass merchandisers and the reality of direct-product delivery to the consumer will primarily be tapping a currently dormant customer, who hasn't been excited about going into trendy stores to purchase music.

As we've seen here from the many examples and options that have been presented, the reality of today's retail marketplace is not one of total corporate control. But, competitors have to learn to coexist if they want to remain in business. It will be up to individual business people to determine just what the critical factors driving their markets are.

As Cramblitt puts it, "Have a total involvement in [your] customers' buying habits and lifestyles." Hauseman reminds us, "I want to make an impact on the marketplace and help out the stores that help my records. It all comes around; the key for retailers is to *get more involved with the records!*" And, as an exclamation of a fighting (and winning) attitude, we return to Perelstein, who simply states, "When Media Play first opened, it was like, 'Oh man, we're history!' But you just have to get right down in there with 'em!"

Retail also digs the album - Purple is #1* on the In-Store Play chart again! It also remains #1* on the Hottest Sales Nationwide, with 100 MarketMakers showing #1 sales and 213 reporting Top 10 mentions.

MTV has re-added the video for "Big Empty" from their "Unplugged" show into Stress rotation, while the "Vasoline" clip is Exclusive there. On Power Cuts, "Big Empty" is #6* (with 3,444 Plays Per Week) and "Vasoline" is #12* (receiving 2,482 spins). "Vasoline" is also the #3 Most Requested song.

WARREN G. Regulate...G Funk Era Violator/RAU/PLG · 523338

About seven years ago, 213 was a struggling new group that hung and recorded in the backroom studio of a socially conscious Long Beach retailer (Calvin Anderson of VIP Records). Warren Griffin, Calvin Broadus (aka Snoop Rock Ski, aka Snoop Dogg) and Nate Hale (Nate Dogg) continued to move their tapes around town, with little response.

Then followed a series of unrelated events that led to the formation of the G Funk Era (a "click," of sorts) - and Warren G.'s reputation as a producer was growing. He's now rap's newest, brightest star, thanks to overwhelming success from the Above The Rim soundtrack, and the single, "Regulate." lt's receiving 1,265 PPWs at Urban Radio.

Regulate...G Funk Era holds tight at #2* on the Hottest Sales Nation-wide, with 19 more chart debuts reported. Significant upward moves are reported by Kemp Mill/Baltimore 41-7, Peaches Ent./Miami 6-3, and Michigan Where House/Lansing 3-1.

SPIN DOCTORS Turn It Upside Down Epic + 62907

Because Pocketful Of Kryptonite sold for so long with many hit singles and to this day, remains a steady seller, it is hard to believe that it has been three years since its release. Turn It Upside Down comes just in time for summer, a season that suits the band's brand of pop/rock/funk.

The single, "Cleopatra's Cat," logs 1,699 spins at Rock Radio, while the album receives 527 PPWs at Adult Rock Radio. The next single, "You Let Your Heart Go Too Fast," makes its Power Cuts debut at #94*. The Spin Doctors performed that song last week when they appeared on "The Late Show With David Letterman." The video for "Cleopatra's Cat" is in What's New rotation on VH-1, and it's in On rotation at MTV.

Turn It Upside Down hits the Hottest Sales Nationwide at #15* and debuts at #9* on the In-Store Play chart. A total of 152 MarketMakers report chart debuts, including An Die Musik/Baltimore #8, HMV 86th & Lexington/NYC #2 and Best Buy/Minneapolis #7.

Zingalamaduni debuts on the Hottest Sales Nation-wide at #25* and at #13* on the In-Store Play chart. Chart debuts are reported by 128 buyers, including Tower/Cambridge #8, Poplar Tunes/Memphis #7, Rough Trade/San Francisco #3, Orpheum/Seattle #5 and Abbey Road OS/Santa Ana #3.

The single, "Can You Feel The Love Tonight," is Top 10 at Hit Radio, receiving 5,493 PPWs, and it's #1 for a second week at Adult Radio. The video is in What's New rotation on VH-1.

The Lion King offers a glimpse of things to come with its 36-22* increase up the Hottest Sales Nationwide. Another 31 accounts show chart debuts, with monster upward moves at Tower/Washington, DC, 20-5, National Record Mart/Pittsburgh 24-18, and Blockbuster Music Plus/Dallas 86-28, to name a few.

There are plenty of activities planned that will keep sales on Vince Gill's When Love Finds You fresh throughout the year. There's talk of a Vince Gill television special, and plans are in the works for a "Vince Unplugged" show to be taped in July. In October, he will co-host the CMA Awards show. But before that, "What The Cowgirls Do" (with Michael McDonald) will be the second smash single released

When Love Finds You moves 20-17* on the Hottest Sales Nationwide, with 16 more debuts reported, including Blockbuster Music Plus/Atlanta #8, Music Vision/St. Louis #22, Believe In Music/Grand Rapids #35 and Compact Discovery/Frederick #22.

BOSTON Walk On MGA - 10973

John continues, "The new singer fits in real well and the overall sound of the record is just tremendous." How many bands can you think of that released a total of three records in 18 years, with each record selling no less than four million copies? Not many. And now, Walk On is well on its way to joining its predecessors. The album is #4* on a very tight Hottest Sales Nationwide, with 180 total mentions, 124 of which are Top 20 or better. including Strawberries/ Boston #5 and Blockbuster Music Plus/Atlanta #5.

The single, "I Need Your Love," is Top 5 on Power Cuts, with 3,487 Plays Per Week; at Hit Radio, it's receiving 2,505 PPWs for a #31* chart position.

PATTI LABELLE Gems MCA · 10870

Dwayne states, "KCET play has been instrumental in bringing Patti to a wider audience. She's a Vegas favorite; there has been a buzz on the record, and we get great response whenever we play it in-store." Next to her powerhouse singing, Patti's personality is a part of her that excels, whether it's live, in a sitcom or on a TV talk show (she appeared last week on "The Oprah Winfrey Show").

Her latest single, "The Right Kinda Lover," is Top 10 at Urban Radio, receiving 2,104 PPWs, and BET has the video in Heavy. Gems picks up a 35-28* increase on the Hottest Sales Nationwide, with debuts at Michigan Where House/Lansing #20, and Record Theatre/Baltimore #3, to name a few.

SUICIDAL TENDENCIES Suicidal For Life

Suicidal For Life makes its Hottest Sales Nation-wide debut at #47*, with 100 sales debuts reported, including Aces/Tampa #1, Record & Tape Trader/Baltimore #10 and Dingleberry's/Dayton #8. At RAWk Radio, the album is #11*.

ANT BANKS The Big Badass



"As Too Short's writer/producer, Ant Banks has been part of some dangeroussounding music, which carries over to his own records."

The Big Badass comes in at #56* on the Hottest Sales Nationwide, with 52 chart debuts reported, including Independent/Colorado Springs #4, Poplar Tunes/Memphis #4, the Homer's Chain/Omaha #27, Dr. Wax/Chicago #22 and Blockbuster Music Plus/Dallas #35.

Airplay on "Black Hole Sun" is through the roof and deservedly so. This track is one of those where you feel the need to turn up the volume every time. On Power Cuts "Black Hole Sun" is at #3*, its up 310 spins to 3,983 PPWs. Soundgarden also take over the request lines, they have both the #1 Most Requested Song and the #1 Most Requested Album. Furthermore, Superunknown still reigns #1 at RAWk Radio, the album has held that spot for over 4 months! The video enters its third week in Heavy rotation on MTV.

Superunknown hops, skips and jumps 15-10* on the Hottest Sales Nationwide. Upward moves Tower/Uptown include NYC 70-38, Manifest Discs/Greenville 53-14 and Tower Alternative/Costa Mesa 29-9.

"Offspring have polished the skate-punk sound; Smash is exploding into the mainstream!"

Alan Ostroff, Go **Boy/Redondo Beach**

Offspring are the top retail story of the week as Smash surges up a full twenty spots on the Hottest Sales Nationwide, rocketing 59-39*. Its no wonder, considering that the exposure of this band is multiplying exponentially each and every week. "Come Out And Play" debuts on Power Cuts at #88*, with 207 PPWs, and at VIRTU-ALLYALTERNATIVE Radio the track moves 7-5*, breaking the 1,000 mark with a total of 1,016 spins. On the video side, MTV bumps up "Come Out And Play" into Buzz Bin.

A total of 123 MarketMaker accounts are charting Smash, and this week marked 33 debuts and 59 upward moves. Enormous gains are evident at several large accounts, including Strawberries/Boston 82-38, Blockbuster Music Plus/Dallas 51-24. Cat's/Nashville 37-16 and Tower/Tacoma 49-21.

"Aerosmith rule!" Tim Shelton, Main St. Records/Mt. Vernon

Tim states: "Aerosmith are one of the greatest rock n' roll bands ever! They've been writing really good material recently, and the public has responded. In addition, at least four or five stations around here play a ton of Aerosmith, including KSHE in St. Louis. Get A Grip is a great summertime cruising album, and hey, their videos have great chicks!"







One Step Ahead Of The Spider

Dallas native Mark Griffin has gained a steadily growing following with his unique take on rap music: a hybrid of jazz samples and beats and the coolly detached sermons of a white guy with more than a knack for telling a story. Tracks like "The Killer Inside Me" and the radio-friendly "The City Sleeps" carried the MC's work to higher circles while still making a true artistic development in one of America's most controversial genres.

Griffin's signing to American gives us One Step Ahead Of The Spider, which proves to be another step in the progression of his vision. Mainly working from a bank of samples of his own musicians, MC constructs 10 tracks of jazzy hip-hop, over which he relates more compelling yarns. Obviously drawing on an array of influences, Griffin forges an interesting and unique tangent to rap circles, further proving to the stubborn establishment the disparate depths that hip-hop is capable of.

Adrian Belew "Never Enough"

Adrian Belew has time and again made some of this era's most valuable contributions to the playing of the guitar, while writing songs that aren't necessarily bogged down with too much of that instrument. Toting a resume that features stints with David Bowie, King Crimson and the Talking Heads, Belew is no stranger to the art of songcrafting, which he again proves with "Never Enough," the latest single from his Caroline release, Here. Shedding the experimental flair of some of his earlier work, Belew adheres to a solo agenda that focuses on strong hooks and endearing riffs. This focus, combined with Belew's strong, crystal-clear vocals, renders a single which should easily follow the successful path set by Here's first track, "I See You." Fans should also note the CD single's inclusion of three non-album tracks - acoustic versions of "Burned By The Fire We Make," "Peace On Earth" and "Dream Life."

"White, Discussion"

Radioactive

Live has captivated the alternative music world this year with the energetic "Selling The Drama," which spent an entire month atop the VIRTUALLYALTERNATIVE radio chart. "White, Discussion" looks to follow that success in earnest. Beginning with a softer, more low-key look at Live, the song quickly accelerates into more aggressive territory, as vocalist Ed Kowalczyk's narrative launches into a recurring cry of "Look what all this talking got us, baby." Behind Kowalczyk is a bombastic instrumental accompaniment of pounding drums and sometimes ringing, sometimes cacophonous guitar that drives the implied madness of the song home.



The Smithereens

"Everything I Have Is Blue"

"Everything I Have Is Blue" follows hot on the heels of "Miles From Nowhere," the successful and welcome return single from these long-time alternative favorites. The track begins with guitar riffs that guide the course of the song before Pat DiNizio chimes in with his unmistakable voice and lyrics about love gone wrong. The song is filled with enigmatic power, provided, in particular, by the brooding rhythm section, which snakes in and around the gritty guitar work of Jim Babjak. "Everything I Have Is Blue" offers everything you've come to expect from The Smithereens: Powerful guitar melodies, a solid beat, lyrical insight and DiNizio's trademark vocals.


Helmet

Betty

Interscope/TAG

When Interscope signed Helmet two years ago and released their album *Meantime*, they set the future of heavy music in a new direction and unknowingly paved the way for a fresh genre of noun-named bands that would relish heavy grooves of musical minimalism. Helmet guitarist Page Hamilton shed his jazz training to forge a new level of band tightness that continues to baffle and amaze the group's live audiences.

Having firmly established their approach with *Meantime*, Helmet now gives us *Betty*, which proves to be a strong fulfillment of the promise of the band's last record. *Betty* offers all of the intense and distorted riffs of the first record, but moves forward in complexity, often featuring frantic (but obviously skilled) soloing and cadential chord movement more typical of progressive experimentalism (Hamilton even takes a stab at straight jazz performance with the intro to "Beautiful Love"). Songs like "Biscuits For Smut" and "Clean" will leave the ears of astute listeners smoking, yet yearning for more. The success that "Milquetoast" has already seen at Alternative Radio is a good indication that *Betty* will be making waves in the format for some time to come.



Orangutang

"Shiny Like Gold"

Boston's Orangutang are on the edge of raising many eyebrows at this format with their first full-length Imago release, *Dead Sailor Acid Blues*. The first single from the album, "Shiny Like Gold," shows the band's affinity for melodious phrases rooted in lilting guitar lines that gracefully ride the line between distorted power and grace. Focusing on a slightly lighter sound than found on their EP, Orangutang has forged a song of shining warmth that retains the intelligence so often devoid in pop composition. Alternative listeners will surely take to "Shiny Like Gold," which could hardly fail with such tunefully sharp hooks.



Jah Wobble's Invaders Of The Heart

Take Me To God

From his days with PiL to his contributions to Bill Laswell's musical visions to his booming basslines within the Orb's "Blue Room," Jah Wobble has consistently demonstrated a taste for the eclectic, showing little or no qualms about full-blown experimentation. Wobble has definitely taken this approach with his own group, Invaders Of The Heart, evidenced by their first release, a masterfully recorded, dual-channel live session, and *Take Me To God*, the band's latest studio effort. Featuring guest appearances by Dolores O'Riordan, Chaka Demus & Pliers and Gavin Friday, *Take Me To God* indulges in reggae, dub, pop and jazz (care of the gentle phras-

ing of horn sessionist Harry Beckett), yet it never strays far from the

world music tinges that characterized so much of the group's first record. Wobble presides over all, infrequently adding his individual vibe of new age polemics. With *Take Me To God*, Jah Wobble has created an album of great artistic depth that still provides affable, singles like "The Sun Does Rise," which is already gaining the adds of alternative programmers across the country.



Bracket "Why Should Eye"

"Why Should Eye"

Mining the same fertile ground that bands such as Green Day and All do, Bracket delivers a forceful piece of popcore with "Why Should Eye." Probing life's great existential questions, Forestville, California's Bracket deliver a powerful blend of pop ideas and punk aesthetics in "Why Should Eye." From the upcoming Caroline release 924 Forestville Street, "Why Should Eye" features Bracket's trademark songsmithing - a combination of punchy power chords, straight punk drumming and lyrical thoughtfulness. "Why Should Eye" is a driving song that's a lot of fun, with just the right amount of power balancing its stylish pop hooks.

Enigma

"Out From The Deep" Charisma/Virgin

Michael Cretu, a Romanian musician versed in studio technique, combines seemingly exclusive elements in the lush recording projects that he calls Enigma. Enigma's first album surprised traditionalists and dance music lovers alike with its sublime fusion of Gregorian chants and modern beat programming. Cretu's second Enigma project, The Cross Of Changes, strays into pop ideas of greater radio accessibility, giving us the hit "Return To Innocence" and the album's most recent single, "Out From The Deep." Combining gritty vocals with an infectious and smooth pop progression, Cretu molds a single of individual character, further highlighted by smooth beats and an incendiary guitar solo. "Out From The Deep" has all of the pop formula that made a chart-topper out of "Return To Innocence," featuring a more aggressive spirit and a feel-good emotionality that certainly spell summer success.

ollowing the successful premiere of their short film To Kill A Dead Man, Portishead have released their debut single, "Numb," to widespread acclaim. The band consists of singer Beth Gibbons and musician/producer Geoff Barrow. Together they have managed to weld the brooding, ambient quality of the film soundtracks they cite as an influence together with soulful vocals and hip-hoppish backing, and the result is perhaps the most singular debut record we've heard this year. The band makes use of such overlooked classic instruments as the Fender Rhodes and even the hand-controlled Theremin synthesizer (of "Good Vibrations" fame). The band's unique sound and the release of the film (which didn't even feature the single!) before the record have succeeded in generating high expectations for the band (named after a small town in the English West Country). Portishead's debut album should be ready for release by the end of next summer.

Also causing considerable excitement is the forthcoming release of Orbital's third album, Snivilisation. The London-based techno duo (brothers Paul and Phil Hartnoll) have long been regarded as among the finest exponents of UK techno since their first single, "Chime," reached #17 in the charts in 1990. Since then they have released two untitled albums (known as the "green" and "brown" LPs), both of which have been instrumental affairs. As well as being the band's first titled album, Snivilisation is also Orbital's first to feature a vocalist. Orbital says they have been influenced by listening to pirate "Jungle" techno radio stations, many of which are broadcast from the East London area where the band records. "Jungle" is an extremely fast form of techno based around speeded up breakbeats that receives no licensed radio airplay; the records themselves are often only available from specialist dealers, and the scene, its music and the parties associated with it exist almost completely underground from the established music scene and industry. The band also says they have been influenced by listening to the work of avant-garde composers such as Michael Nyman, and the potential results of such a diverse combination of sounds suggest that Snivilisation could well be one of the most talked about releases of the year. The public will have a chance to judge for themselves when Orbital takes the stage this Saturday at the Glastonbury Festival. The album itself will be released in mid-August.


On the subject of Glastonbury, the festival suffered something of a setback last week when the main "pyramid" stage was completely destroyed by fire. The fire was thought to be the result of an electrical fault, but in spite of the demise of the stage, which had long been the centerpiece of the festival, a replacement has been installed, and organizer Michael Eavis has announced that things will carry on as normal. Good news for the 100,000 or so music fans that will be making their annual pilgrimage to the best festival of the year this weekend.






Pro-Pain "Make War Not Love"







Dead Orchestra Sounds Like Time Tastes Choke Hit



Martin Page

The House Of Stone And Light Mercury

Martin Page has written hit songs over the years for a diverse group of artists, including Robbie Robertson, Go West, Heart and Starship. With *The House Of Stone And Light*, he now gets the opportunity to perform his own material. Helping to augment this talented songwriter's efforts on his album are such luminaries as Robertson, Phil Collins, Paul Moore (Blue Nile), Geoffery Oryema, Brenda Russell and Bernie Taupin, who co-wrote two of the songs with Page.

Every composition on the album shimmers; the production is consummate and the melodies are timeless. And if that isn't enough, Martin Page has a wonderful voice! We have been introduced to the album's title track via the Adult Rock TuneUp #2, and now we have the entire collection to digest. Beyond "In The House Of Stone And Light" and its uplifting message of renewal, there is "Shape The Invisible," which has subtle Celtic undertones and a powerful plea for global understanding and tolerance within its lush arrangement; "I Was Made For You," which is a beautiful proposal of love; "Put On Your Red Dress," which carries further the testimony of love, and "In My Room," which deals with domestic violence.

Martin Page has come from the shadows and stepped into the light. The House Of Stone And Light (which took two years to produce), is a bright debut album from an inspired writer/performer.

Hootie & The Blowfish

Cracked Rear View Atlantic/TAG

Don't let the name of this great new band mislead you. Hootie & The Blowfish are about as far away from a college party band as you can get! Since they formed in 1989, these fellow classmates of the University of South Carolina - Mark Bryan (guitars), Dean Felber (bass), Jim Sonefeld (drums) and Darius Rucker (lead vocals) - have developed a diehard base of fans throughout the South. Their 1993 indie EP,



Kootchypop (which was produced by Don Dixon), has sold in excess of 40,000 copies and the band has a respectable fan club of well over 4,000 members.

Hootie & The Blowfish's debut Atlantic release, Cracked Rear View (the title was inspired by the John Hiatt song) was produced by Don Gehman (R.E.M., John Mellencamp) and features songs of subtle complexity and depth of emotion. Their sound is folk-rock based (with just a hint of Southern boogie) and serious, and at times, its almost melancholy. But there is also a hopeful side to the band that celebrates those hard won and close-kept joys in life. Rucker's voice is deep and expressive, and will remind you of the earnest quality you hear in the vocals of other young singers such as Eddie Vedder and Layne Staley.

In addition to "I'm Goin' Home" (featured on the latest Adult Rock TuneUp), several other tracks exhibit the band's honest sound, including, "Hannah Jane," "Hold My Hand," "Look Away," "Not Even The Trees" and, my favorite, "Running From An Angel."



Freedy Johnston

This Perfect World Elektra

Freedy Johnston's first album for Elektra, *This Perfect World*, is as the title implies...perfect for Adult Rock Radio! After two critically-acclaimed independent releases, and extensive touring (on his own, and with acts like They Might Be Giants and Cowboy Junkies), he is ready for the "big time." After just one

listen to the album, you'll like it, and after a few listens, you'll be totally hooked! Johnston's songs are deceivingly simple on the surface, but they are actually quite complex in their subtle arrangements (which range from acoustic guitars to full-on electric accompaniment) and musical accents, and they have symbolic lyrics that create exact pictures in the mind's eye.

The sound of *This Perfect World* is crisp and immediate, thanks to the talents of producer Butch Vig, who has worked on the breakthrough albums of such artists as Nirvana, Smashing Pumpkins and Sonic Youth. "Bad Reputation" represents well Freedy's musical stance. It and other songs, like "Can't Sink This Town" (which has a really cool guitar riff) and the downhome "Gone Like The Water," seem to proclaim "You can put me down, but you can't keep me down!" On the dark and more moody side, we have songs like "Evie's Tears," "This Perfect World" and the jazz-flavored "Cold Again," which display Johnston's knack for capturing quiet moments of sorrow or joy.

Freedy Johnston's songs will linger long after the disc is over. His music is delicate and sentient.


Precious Little Victories Mesa

This Scottish singer/songwriter has built an impressive following in the UK, and has won over the hearts of the media on both sides of the Atlantic. The Scotsman voted Precious Little Victories the album of the year in 1993 (it was released last year over there), saying, "If 1994 isn't the year for Luala, there is no justice in the world!" Folk Roots states, "even when she rocks, she still sounds like she's in a confessional and that she's singing to you alone!"



Once you have listened to Carol Laula's debut American release, you'll understand why critics are testifying on behalf of her music. The album displays her stunning vocals and finely hewed songs. Laula wrote all the material on *Precious Little Victories*. The music's acoustic roots are based in folk and rock, but you will detect a slight tinge of delta blues and Appalachian reel, as well. The intelligent lyrics touch on a broad range of emotions. Each song paints a specific, intimate moment. Check out "Raincloud Court," "In A Dream," "Lonely Tonight" and "Silent Watching Daughter" (which she co-wrote with Jane Wiedlen).

Jessie Colin Young

Swept Away Ridgetop

Few artists have had as distinctive a career as Jessie Colin Young. Over the years, he has crooned his way into our hearts with beautifully insightful lyrics and memorable melodies. It is no different with his passionate and tender Swept Away.




The album displays Young's trademark sound of soft acoustic arrangements, floating, sweet melodies and restrained vocal delivery. "Swept Away" recounts that special afternoon when he and his wife, Connie, first met. "Misty Roses," written by Tim Harden, has always been a personal favorite of his, and this version features great guitar playing by Jerry Cortez. "Waterfall" hints at the deeper mysteries of life and the healing power of "mother" water. "Catfish" is Young's tribute to Danny O'Keefe, whom he has always admired. "Liamana" is a song from the 1920s written by Lei Collins. It is about one's family home (he sings it in the traditional Hawaiian falsetto). And, there are also two songs written for his children: "Cheyenne" for his son and "Street Of Broken Dreams" for his daughter.

Swept Away is Jessie Colin Young's tribute to love. It was inspired by the love and affection he has for his wife, and his now-grown children of a previous marriage. Clearly he appreciates and cherishes these intimate attachments in his life, and draws from their energy.

Middleman

Mr. Multiface I.R.S.

This trio boasts members from points all over the globe, and their worldly lineup is reflected in their music. Born and raised in France, lead singer and bassist Tom Windrif left home at the age of 16 for the Berklee School of Music in Boston. There he met guitarist Dave Levita, with whom he had common musical interests. The two moved to Barbados and played in a calypso/reggae band for a time. From there, they went to London where they met



drummer Rob Man, and the nucleus of what was to become Middleman was created. Middleman's music has island-flavored rhythms and floating guitar melodies, not unlike the Police, and a pop sensibility that sizzles like Crowded House. The energy on their debut release, Mr. Multiface, is wonderfully represented by "Hello Loneliness" (on Adult Rock TuneUp #2). Other songs that lean toward Adult Rock include "Spacefarer," "Fools Don't Cry" and "Another Yesterday."

Although Middleman's sound will satisfy more than one radio format, it is best suited for Adult Rock Radio.

America

Hourglass American Gramaphone

In 1970, three sons of U.S. Military officers stationed in England broke onto the international music scene with a song called "A Horse With No Name." The group was called America. Well, it is 24 years later, and after a string of #1 hits and 18 albums, Gerry Beckley and Dewey Bunnell are still creating music with their own distinctive sound. Styles and fads have come and gone, but America have remained steadfast.

With Hourglass (their first release on American Gramaphone), America proves to us, once again, that they can write songs that almost anyone can relate to. It includes 10 new songs, two of which were written during the band's heyday, but never recorded. Every song on the album captures America's magic. I like "Young Moon," "Sleeper Train," "Whole Wide World" and "You Can Do Magic." Featured on the disc are Carl Wilson contributing backup vocals, Nick Linderman on guitars and Chip Davis handling the arrangements.

What have the guys been doing these past few years? They have toured several times with the Beachboys, and they spend their non-performing hours with their families

Youssou N'Dour

The Guide (Wommat) Chaos/Columbia

The international acclaim for Youssou N'Dour is reaching monstrous proportions! Even though he has been performing in his native country, Senegal, since he was 12 years old, his world-wide awareness only began back in 1986 when he recorded and toured with Peter Gabriel. Since then, he has recorded many more times for Gabriel, has been included in several of the WOMAD tours, and was also a co-headliner with Gabriel, Sting and Bruce Springsteen for Amnesty International. In 1992, he released Eyes Open, which firmly cemented his international reputation.

We now have N'Dour's latest effort, The Guide (Wommat). The album is a reflection of his personal beliefs, and it features special guests Branford Marsalis and Neneh Cherry. Adult Rock Radio has already begun to support N'Dour's African-flavored pop sound by playing the gorgeous "7 Seconds" (a new child is born every seven seconds!), on which N'Dour duets with Cherry. Other tracks you should sample include "Old Man (Gorgu)," "Mame Bamba" and his captivating rendition of Dylan's "Chimes Of Freedom."

Manu Dibango

Wakafrika Giant

When Manu Dibango came to Europe as a young student, he might have easily decided to pursue his studies and return to his native Cameroon with a diploma. Instead, he was bitten by the musical bug and hasn't been able to shake the fever since. Spending many years in Paris, Manu was thoroughly engulfed by the Parisian jazz scene, whose music and attitude has deeply influenced him in all areas of his life. Having since returned to his beloved Africa, Dibango has experimented and successfully combined the free-form elements of jazz with traditional African music. This hybrid sound has generated world-wide appeal for his music.

On Wakafrika, we are provided with a broad selection of Dibango's music. Several guests from all walks of the musical world appear on the album, including Youssou N'Dour, Alex Brown, Peter Gabriel, Geoffery Oryema, Salif Kieta, Sinead O'Connor, Ladysmith Black Mambazo, King Sunny Adé and Youre Kundá.

Check out "Soul Makossa," his version of "Biko," "Homeless" and "Diarabi." There are also some great instrumentals on the album, including the title track and "Lady."




Nervous Laughter November



ave Edmunds is back with his first album in four years, and what a great collection of songs it is! This album contains a broader spectrum of musical styles than we usually find on one of his projects, but don't worry, Edmunds does not sacrifice any of his happy-go-lucky attitude! He plays and sings everything on the album (the last time he recorded this way was in 1970 when he recorded his classic, *Rockpile*), and wrote most of the material. With *Plugged In*, we are once again reminded of what a talented guy Edmunds really is!

The lead off track gets us going right out of the "chute." "Chutes And Ladders" has a driving beat, a never-get-enough-of riff and cool double-entendre lyrics that refer to that good ol' game o' life. "Half Way Down" has a Zydeco party feel and talks about temptin' the devil and gettin' just a tad too wild. "Beach Boy Blood" is...well, you can figure this one out pretty easily. "Better Word For Love" is more on the serious side. It is an acoustic-based number, with a lush arrangement and lyrics of frustration. And, "Standing At The Crossroads" is your basic boogie woogie tune, with tinkling piano, 50s chord riffs and a sing-along melody. There is something for everybody on *Plugged In*.

Edmunds' music delivers a message we should all remember: Don't take life too seriously, and for God's sake, have some fun!

Now Rhino Records have entered the world of chant with their upcoming release, *Chantmania*, and we've gotta tell ya, this disc is hilarious! A true hoot.


