## The Next Step After Arbitron...

It is with a good deal more sadness than anger that I view the total disarray of Arbitron's rating service. Here we have, in two weeks, two glaring incidents that demonstrate the utter foolishness of this \$2 billion business we call radio.

In Memphis, a postal employee is alleged to have taken seven diaries to a radio station and in San Jose six diaries are sent to a dead man so that the books can be offered for sale to a radio station.

At your convention in Atlanta two years ago, in heated discussions with then Arbitron President, Bill McClenaghan, I expressed my great misgiving about the methods that Arbitron was using to secure its measurement instrument...the diary itself. I pointed out then, and I believe now, that mailing a diary to the recipient in an enveloped marked "Your ARB Diary" is probably the least certain way to secure the information which Arbitron is trying to obtain. I said then, and I believe now, that anybody could figure some way to get those diaries out of the post office, especially since nobody is sitting breathlessly at home waiting for their diaries. And I viewed then, as I view now as completely inadequate the system that Arbitron says they used to be certain that the diaries have arrived at the proper house.

Time and Memphis have proven me to be all-too correct. It is interesting to note that no diary operation that attempts to measure anything as complex as radio anywhere in the world (with the exception of Canada where the diaries are delivered in a very official-looking government envelope, not a gaily decorated package) operates without personally placed and personally picked up diaries. The radio business in Australia and the marketing business in West Germany and Holland...all such rating services at least begin with a personally-placed and personally-picked up diary. The people who run those operations believe it to be crucial to personally place those diaries so that the explanations can be made to the person who will be filling out the diaries. Further, in most of those places they would never dream of putting 6 diaries in any one household. Most of them do not even use two. The opportunities for fraud grow and the opportunities for mis-

chief grow with every multiple-diary home.

Far from ending here with Memphis and San Jose, it is my judgment that this great excess will grow even more. If a radio station can double its audience from merely finding and fraudulently filling out seven diaries, obviously others will try it. In my judgment others have and have not been caught. It is for this reason that two years ago I offered in my markets, Charlotte and Jacksonville, to pay Arbitron the extra cost to personally place and pick up diaries if the other subscribers would not.

I am not persuaded by ARB's pleading that if they did personally place or pick up diaries then they would have a new problem...somebody might get to the interviewer. Surely, it's more difficult to get to a dozen or so interviewers in a market, than to illegally come by some of the tens of thousands of diaries that are floating around.

So I did the only thing my conscience would permit me to do, namely to cancel ARB...two and a half years ago at a time when my stations were doing very well in their books. If you can't believe the basic measurement instrument, if you don't believe in the security which is provided, how in heavens name can you run and operate a decent business.

The broadcast business should have done something about this long ago. It should have and it can yet, operate its own rating service as they do in Canada and Australia. It could put out the specifications it wishes for bids and simply buy

the service from that business that will provide it. It could provide us a rating service that will have personally placed and picked up diaries. It could provide us with a service that could have some telephone incidental checking on those diaries. It could provide us with double the sample size. It could provide us with annual county-by-county measurements. In short, it could provide us with a great many things Arbitron says they could do but the broadcaster wouldn't pay for. The price of Arbitron has doubled and then some in recent years, without any of these kinds of services. Surely, the broadcast business would pay for a decent service, one that would enable the owner of the station to sleep at night knowing that it wasn't some postal employee or some dead man filling out diaries (which can do serious damage to his stations).

The greatest possible damage is done to many of the young people who work in the some 6,000 radio stations in the United States. It is safe to predict that hundreds of them will lose their jobs come next January when another ARB book appears. Some may certainly lose those jobs on merit, but many will lose those jobs for no damn good reason except that their ratings went down. And in many of these cases, they may have gone down with reasons having to do with the performance of the employee.

I am not accusing the owner or the operator of any radio station of participating in this kind of sordid action. But how can anybody pro-

## NOW Calls For End To Record Ad Violence

California NOW, INC. of the National Organization for Women has joined with Women Against Violence Against Women (WAVAW), charging the record industry with gross irresponsibility and insensitivity to women by its continued use of images of physical and sexual violence in advertising and promoting its products, through direct depiction, as well as the implication, of violence against women.

Demands have been made of Nesuhi Ertegun, President of WEA, Int. Inc., and the chief executives of Atlantic Records, Elektra Records, Warner Brothers Records, and Warner Communications called by NOW as "one of the prime offenders," to cease and desist from further use of such images, to cancel current

offensive advertising, and to withdraw from retail outlets by December 15, 1976 all offending advertising and promotion, including album covers.

The record companies must indicate their intention to comply with the demands by December 6, 1976, or face the possibility of a state-wide boycott of their products which include labels such as: Atco, Atlantic, Asylum, Elektra, Nonesuch, Reprise, and Warner Bros. While the aforementioned record companies have been targeted for immediate action other recording enterprises have been notified in writing that future campaigns may be launched against them should physical or sexual violence against women continue to be used to promote their products.





lect themselves from all of the employees who work for him, taking a short cut to success. Jim Seller, who started ARB, accurately points out in a recent article that 'one time out of three, the numbers that you get in one survey (even if it's perfectly done) is wrong by more than one standard error. One time out of 20, it's wrong by more than two standard errors. Two standard errors at an 8 or 9 share is four share points either way!'

The advertising agencies continue to call the tune and the broadcasters pay the piper. Most agencies have one research department. Therefore, it's handy for them to use the same basic technique for radio and television. It matters not that these are two totally different animals to them. It only matters that it simplifies their job.

Therefore, they reject Pulse as they rejected Hooper and they are not even interested in Source, which is an infinitely better diary method.

And so we are back to square one. We've got a great business. We do a good job and the report card that dominates the business, namely Arbitron, is unreliable, capricious, and we have got to change it. Two and one-half years ago, I got damn little support for my action. Now there will be more and all the damage done the last 2 1/2 years to human beings will some day be passed off as a nightmare for radio... the kind of nightmare Neilson made a dozen years ago. And that fate awaits Arbitron. The sooner the better.

(Ed. Note: The following is a copy of a letter sent to ARB's Larry Manuel by WJBQ's Jeff Ryder).

Dear Mr. Manuel:

By the looks of the alternatives on the enclosed card, it appears as though Arbitron has already decided to exclude vacation week from the 1977 Spring Sweep.

In light of the fact that the credibility of Arbitron's methodology (i.e., Memphis, San Jose) is coming under fire from a great number of broadcasters, your timing seems to be all wrong in introducing this proposal.

Consider that the majority of your subscribers are involved in only one survey yearly: April/May. To them, this survey should be representative of what takes place for the total year.

In the past, one of the four weeks, or one-fourth of the Spring Sweep, has been Easter vacation week for students. This naturally is of help to contemporary stations, as we all know that teens can affect the listening habits of adults in the household. But it has been a fair advantage, since roughly one-fourth of the total year, students are out of school, thereby affecting the listening habits of adults in the household.

The dates used for the spring sweep in the past are as perfect as they will ever be. Why should Arbitron do such an obvious disservice to its contemporary-formatted clients by changing the dates?

I fear that my argument is falling on deaf ears; that the decision has already been made to exclude the vacation week. And I also fear that this opinion card is merely "throwing us a bone."

Dear R&R:

I was upset by the Random Thought in the 11/19 R&R from Bill Phipps of G-105 in Metter, Georgia, it seemed inaccurate and unfair.

Although the thought talked vaguely of a "highly credible" PD, anyone who's remotely familiar with the area and knows that Metter and Vidalia are only thirty miles apart cannot question about to whom Phipps' allegations refer.

Having spent the last three years of my life in that area, it would please me to no end to see two credible stations evolve. But credibility is something you build for yourself, not something you steal from someone else.

The G-105 accusations are, to put it simply, wrong. I'm very familiar with the "highly credible" PD and his research methods, and I'm willing to put my credibility on the line and vouch for the accuracy of his information. I know that he wouldn't give out any information he didn't believe to be true. However, if G-105 still feels they're right in their charges, then let them name names and specifics. If they can't or won't do that, then they ought to keep their thoughts to themselves.

We as individuals should be striving to make ourselves better people and better programmers, which in turn will improve the quality of our industry and make us more responsive to the needs of our audience. But I don't feel we should be directing our energies at tearing each other down with unsubstantiated charges; it's counter-productive and would seem to be the product of small minds.

The G-105 allegations were at best a cheap shot. It upsets me that they were made and upsets me even more that R&R would allow itself to be the gun from which the shot was fired.





# BUSINESS NEWS

## Arbitron Expands Sample Frame

Arbitron Radio will include unlisted telephone households in radio samples beginning with the Spring survey. Arbitron studies of the characteristics of unlisted households show them to be younger, larger, more likely to be Black or Spanish and to listen to different types of radio stations than the general population. Arbitron's Research division began study of "Expanded Sample Frame" in 1973, and will use the expanded service in New York, Los Angeles, Chicago and San Francisco next year. An estimated 20 percent of the sample in these markets will be unlisted phone households.

## NIS Deadline Set

NBC Radio President Jack Thayer has announced that their News & Information Service will cease programming on May 29, 1977.

## Station Sues Over Breach Of Contract

Communico Inc., owner of WKSS-AM-FM/Hartford, has filed a suit in Federal Court charging Nationwide Communications Inc. with breach of contract because of their failure to consummate a purchase agreement for the stations. Communico says that there had been a definitive agreement between the two parties made in June stating that Nationwide would buy the two stations for \$1.8 million. The company claims that it was forced to make another sale agreement with Broad Street Communications at a lower price.

## Lin Broadcasting Projects \$6 Million Net

Lin Broadcasting Corp. spokesmen expect total net for 1976 to be approximately \$6 million. Last year, the company's net profits were \$4.2 million, and Wall Street experts project that 1977 will see a 20 to 25 percent net earnings increase.

## FCC Complaints Down In October

The Federal Communications Commission received 223 less complaints during the month of October than in September. Total for October was 2896. Comments and inquiries also dropped 503, for a total of 1497. 2866 letters were drafted in response to the public's mail.

## Broadcaster Sees Dim Future For Videodisc

Post-Newsweek Stations President Joel Chaseman sees the future of videodiscs and other software-type media items as "short lived," and commented that discs could be replaced by digital-synthesis systems in the not-too-distant future. Chaseman feels that free programs from regular broadcast stations will continue to be more acceptable to the public, and that discs may survive "only after a period of price adjustment which enables them to be produced for the price of paperback books or records."

## Station Questions Political Production

WJW/Cleveland is considering limiting paid production by their staff members of political spots to non-partisan elections and ballot issues. Four WJW newspeople recorded commercials for political candidates this year. News Director Joseph Dannery, who recorded a spot for a State Supreme Court candidate, said that the station would probably put the limits on their employees for future elections.

## NAB May Kill Code Membership Rule

The Executive Committee of the National Association of Broadcasters has asked their board to repeal a rule that requires members to belong to the NAB code before they can become members of the Association. The Committee's action came after a Los Angeles court ruled that the TV family hour code is illegal.

## Datsun Dealer Association Program Launched

Nissan Motors Corp. has announced that they will start a Datsun Dealers Association program for co-op advertising. Datsun will present the individual dealer groups with advertising plans which each group may accept or reject. Nissan would give participating dealer groups a certain dollar amount for each vehicle bought to be put in co-op ads, generating a possible multi-million dollar media budget. All dealer groups will incorporate separately under their own state charters.

## CAB Orders Corrective TWA Ad Campaign

TWA's "on time airline" ads have drawn fire from the Civil Aeronautics Board, which has issued an order preventing TWA from using the slogan and requiring the airline to spend \$1.6 million in advertising in 13 cities to "correct" the claims. A CAB law judge said that the ads misrepresent their statistics on the time regularity of airlines, and that the ads fail to make clear that TWA does not necessarily have the best performance record on some routes. TWA said that it would appeal the CAB's decision.

## Idaho Potato To Use Radio Nationwide

Rising costs of television advertising have urged the Idaho Potato Association to split their ad budget, with a good portion going to radio buys. Target audience for the campaign is women 18 to 49 with incomes of \$12,000 or more. The buy will be placed in 21 markets, the majority receiving 20 week buys, and the rest 9 week runs. Scheduled for radio buys are New York, Chicago, Indianapolis, Cleveland, Philadelphia, Miami, Minneapolis, and Des Moines.

## Spaghetti Eaters Promotion

Hunt Prima Salsa Spaghetti Sauce will launch a three month promotion to find the "fastest and neatest" spaghetti eaters in the country, utilizing radio to support the contests. The public will be invited to participate in the promotion in separate contests in Boston, Philadelphia, New York, Washington D.C., Cleveland, Detroit, Milwaukee, Minneapolis, St. Louis, Winston-Salem, Jacksonville, Atlanta, Memphis, Dallas, Phoenix, Los Angeles, San Francisco and Seattle. Radio spots will tell listeners about the cash prizes offered in each city, with a \$200 first place, \$100 second and \$50 third to the best eaters.

## Holiday Sardine Push

Sixty second spots for King Oscar Sardines are running coast-to-coast on over 900 ABC, CBS and NBC network stations through the holidays, reminding consumers to stock up on sardines for their Christmas parties.

## Keep Your Batteries On Ice

The National Bureau of Standards passes along a tip on how to keep your flashlight and other small batteries fresher longer. Before being used, store your batteries in plastic bags in the refrigerator. The low temperature slows down chemical reactions in the cells.

# THE FCC

## [So You Can Understand It]

### FCC FURTHER MODIFIES BROADCAST RULES IN RE-REGULATION PROCESS

As part of its continuing re-regulation of broadcasting the Commission has made changes in a number of its rules.

In adopting its 15th Re-regulation Order this week, the FCC:

- Clarified the safety of life requirements of the rules as they pertain to transmitter and antenna system installation.
  - Provide for a continuing test authority for AM stations using directional antenna systems to make monitoring point and antenna proof of performance measurements.
  - Conformed the FM and TV rules with the AM rules as they pertain to special field test measurements, and removed compliance with Emergency Broadcast System (EBS) requirements from field test situations;
  - Substituted the more precise term "carrier-amplitude regulation" for the imprecise term "carrier shift;"
  - Amended the maintenance log rules for FM to achieve a parallelism with the transmission line calibration logging procedures established for TV stations.
  - Amended the AM maintenance log rules to reduce the required number of antenna base meter and monitor indications at stations using directional antenna systems.
  - Revised procedure for using the efficiency factor F used in transmitter output power determinations in FM and noncommercial FM.
  - Provided for an informal application procedure for transmitter changes that require a minimum amount of review to determine compatibility between an existing transmitter and a new FM exciter or stereo generator unit the licensee plans to install;
  - Deleted the requirement that only an alternate main FM transmitter having the same power rating as the licensed main transmitter may be installed, so long as the alternate main is capable of operating specifications.
  - Removed the one-year stability showing requirement for directional remote control applications for stations having both a type-approved antenna monitor and a sampling system meeting specifications for approval in Section 73.68, and to describe the necessary showings in the remote control application procedure rule Section 73.66.
- The action which amends Parts 1 and 73 of the rules, becomes effective December 13, 1976.

# TV News

### NBC ON TOP AGAIN

NBC's four and a half hour special "The First Fifty Years" helped push that network to the top position for the third straight week, for the week ending November 21st. NBC had a 21.1 rating, ABC 20.6, and CBS 19.1. ABC still holds down the season-to-date lead, but by less than one rating point. Top ten shows for the week were: "Happy Days," "Laverne & Shirley," "The First Fifty Years," "Sybil, Part Two," NBC movie "Billy Jack," "John Denver Special," "MASH," "The Waltons," "Good Times," and "The Jeffersons." Olivia Newton-John's ABC special came in 15th.

### OTHER TV NEWS

Fall network programming involving scenes of personal violence, such as shootings, fights, etc., was up substantially from last summer, according to a study by a monitoring service retained by the National Citizens Committee for Broadcasting. 64 percent of shows monitored contained violence, compared with 61 percent during the summer. When other acts of violence, such as chase scenes, natural disasters, and the like are added in to the other hardcore violence, the percentage of programming rose to 78.

## Mike Harrison

### A Most Unusual Commercial Policy...



As brought up at the AOR sessions of recent national radio conventions and as evidenced in the text of R&R's "Great Debate," the subject of how to deal with commercial content remains one of the format's primary and most controversial concerns. Although there is a sizeable AOR block, enjoying ratings and economic success, whose posture toward commercials varies little from that of most Top 40's, a good number of AOR's voice complaints that much of the stuff that comes from the mighty Madison Avenue type spot factories interfere with their programming on both esthetic and image/environmental levels.

Being a format of variety, the exploration of AOR radio should include a look at the philosophical poles. In the area of "commercial policy," Chicago's WXRT has got to be an interesting, clear cut extreme.

Taking the cue from Chicago's Classical music oriented "Fine Arts Station," WXRT bills itself as "Chicago's Fine Rock Station" and in order to preserve the sophistication that they believe the logo (as well as the audience) demands, have created a policy in which the only voice you'll hear on a show is the voice of the show's host. No exceptions. All spots are done live. The only spots that come close to approaching the mix of what most stations would consider conventional are the record, concert, and movie spots which are done live by the announcer over a pre-recorded carted bed of the artist's music or a piece of the soundtrack. This deviation from their norm exists because as the station's Business Manager Seth Mason puts it, "It's hard to sell music without letting your audience hear some of it and we feel that a portion of a movie soundtrack is valid and at times can be very helpful to sell a movie."

If the capturing of the programming environment of a Classical music station playing selected Rock music is their goal, WXRT has possibly succeeded on that level. Having heard the station first hand, I was struck by the fact that even though the station lacked the superficial luster of jingles and hype that usually acts as seasoning to make a radio station that plays Rock sound like a Rock radio station, it wasn't replaced by the pseudo-hipness that usually fills the vacuum left when radio tries to eliminate what it considers to be un-hip or less than credible. It was pleasantly sophisticated. At least it was for the one show I heard conducted by John Platt.

WXRT's offbeat commercial policy was born of an equally offbeat station history. In 1972, WXRT was a broker blocked foreign language station that started a midnight to 6am experiment playing Progressive Rock music. Seth Mason, John Platt, and Bob Schulman were jocks at WGLD then, right up to that station's abandonment of an early strain of AOR. The three moved over to WXRT where they broker blocked their own 10pm to 5 am segment of the station forming their own separate corporation which contracted to supply the talent, sell the advertising, and run the business for that time period. By 1975 they had taken over the 6pm to 5am portion of the station, resisting titles, and running the operation through an administrative "troika." By the end of the year, it became a 3pm starting time at which point the business arrangement was changed. According to Mason, "When we went to a 3 o'clock starting time it became inevitable that we would have to become employees of the station because we didn't want to risk having a brokered block that was so large that one of the other brokered

blocks of one or two hours of Greek or German programming could point to the FCC and say, 'Hey, that brokered block now has X amount of hours and we've only got one and we're getting cut back.' So we had to become employees. We became employees under the terms of what were basically the same control situations as we had when we were independantly contracting. The station owner, Dan Lee, always has the right of last rejection and everything, but he basically lets us run every thing as we see fit, and we keep him well informed as to major decisions and what we want to do and what is right for the station."

The ratings have been good, considering the time limitations of the AOR segment. In the Arbitron, they pulled an impressive number one men 18-34, 3pm to midnight, and that was enough fuel to fire the 24 hour a day cause, status the station reached in April of this year. Now that they are a full fledged 24 hour a day AOR in the heart of Chicago, the pressures of the outside business world have forced the troika to assume standard titles; Seth Mason, Business Manager; John Platt, Program Director; and Bob Schulman, Music Director.

I asked Mason if the station would be open to changing their commercial policy if the agencies started producing commercials they considered complimentary, compatible, and credible to their format and audience. He responded, "Here's where you start to get into a situation where you made your bed and you sleep in it. I'd say we get one out of twenty spots where I'd say, 'Boy, it's a shame, that's so good that I'd really like to run it, it's really humorous, or it's really catchy, etc.' But I still think that we'd rather pass on that one and save the air sound from the other nineteen."

On the subject of agency support of WXRT's hard line policy, Mason indicated that even though many of the buyers who are interested in making "the quick buy" without the hassle of having to modify to the station's needs and requirements have trouble understanding what they're all about, there are many agencies and large firms which have been more than supportive enough to make WXRT a profitable venture. He recited a long list of national companies which have modified to their live-copy-only approach and put 7-Up right at the top. "First and foremost, and without a doubt, the most cooperative people and the most progressive people of all are the people from 7-Up. We went to them three years ago with the idea of doing something called the Un-Concert, which would involve, essentially, a live opening message and a live closing message, 'This is the Un-Concert, it's an uninterrupted hour of music that's brought to you by the Un-Cola, 7-Up.' And they came with us with no ratings and have been with us ever since." The station even has two local dragstrips as sponsors and both are done with live non-screaming deliveries, quite the opposite of the style that such places are known to use in their advertising nationwide.

As far as the rate card is concerned, Mason told us that the station's policy in that department is as firm as their commercial policy. "There are no deals on this radio station and we feel good about that. In the long run, our advertisers do too because they know that the agency or retailer up the street, or the other record company, or the agency out of town are all paying the same rates based on the same volume of business as it's laid out clearly on our rate card. It's something we feel strongly about and we feel it's a definite sales advantage."

Finally, I asked Mason if the jocks are instructed to be on the air salesmen and if they ever encountered difficulty or complaints in the jocks not always giving the optimum performance of the heavy load of live commercial copy. He responded, "Occasionally you'll get an advertiser who feels that 'Oh, I love the way John Platt does my spots, but I don't like the way someone else does them. That can be a bit of a problem in this kind of format in which you can't have John Platt record a spot and have it played on somebody else's show. Generally, we make the jock aware that the advertisers has expressed a desire to have a little bit more go into their commercial and we try to have them aware of it so they can, when it comes around, do the best job possible. Obviously, if somebody has a bonafide complaint at a specific time, we go back to the aircheck machine and listen to the spot and if the jock did, in fact, make a mistake or didn't deliver the commercial, we'll run a make-good for those people. Our rules and regulations are strict enough that we're not going to be that hard on those terms. If it gets down to a real bone of contention, we'll just instruct the traffic department not to schedule that particular spot in that particular show. That has only happened twice in four years, so my feeling is that our jocks all do a pretty good job on commercials. That's an important concept here. The jock is doing a program of 60 minutes an hour, not 52. The jock is responsible for the 8 minutes of commercials as well as the 52 minutes of music and how good a job they do on those commercials is as important, if not more important, than how good a job they do on those 52 minutes of music. Because if we can't get advertising results with this commercial policy, then there's no way we're going to justify it over some jingled commercials or pre-recorded commercials."

As I mentioned, WXRT's commercial policy is the extreme manifestation of the complaint that just about every radio person, at one time or another, has expressed about many commercials not fitting within the texture of their stations. Even though they have closed themselves off to the wealth of creativity that can be found in the world of agency and pre-recorded spots, part of the very basic fibre of radio, they are forcing the issue of agency people reconsidering their attitudes toward and handling of AOR radio, an area that too many fall short in. Thus, they are contributing to the upgrading of the spots that other radio stations with more conventional commercial policies will be running on their airwaves. It's always reassuring to see somebody in a major market situation draw the line with the courage to back up their convictions. It is my hope, however, that when the day comes that the commercial producing industry is in sync with the radio programming industry, a state that WXRT will have contributed toward achieving, the radio station will not have shut the door on their enjoying the benefits of an enlightened situation, or at least will have found a comfortable level and balance between success and the satisfaction gotten from standing behind an esthetic posture and principle.
