

Top Level Changes At Arbitron

Larry Manuel resigned his VP/GM position at Arbitron Radio this past Monday to enter into radio station ownership. Manuel will announce the properties involved in a few weeks. A.J. "Rick" Aurichio has been named VP/GM of Arbitron Radio, replacing the departing Manuel. Aurichio's appointment was announced Monday (7) by Arbitron President Theodore F. Shaker. For the past year Aurichio has held the position as President of Compu/Net Inc., a division of Arbitron, and will continue in this capacity, holding

down a dual management role. During his tenure at Arbitron, Mr. Aurichio has been responsible for the planning, development and marketing of radio, television and custom designed research services. One of his most notable achievements was ADI. Prior to joining Arbitron, Mr. Aurichio was President and co-founder of Marketronics Inc. He was also a former Associate Media Director of Dancer, Fitzgerald, Sample Inc. and earlier was Research Supervisor at Young and Rubicam.



Pop-Country singer Glen Campbell was the guest of honor last Monday evening (7) at a gala party and receptions held at the Capitol Tower in downtown Hollywood. The festivities were held in Capitol recording studio "A," where Campbell had recorded many of his top hits. More than 250 persons were in attendance, including friends of the singer, industry notables, musicians, as well as many representatives from the ra-

dio, TV and news media. Artists like Seals & Crofts, who recorded with Campbell as a group known as The Champs; Kenny Rogers and songwriter Jimmy Webb, who penned many of Campbell's million-selling singles; were among the many attendees.

TIP SHEET BATTLE:

Meier's 'Walrus' Vs. Rudman's 'FMQB'

A tip sheet battle has broken out between George Meier's long established "Walrus" and the new ADR section of independent promotion man Kal Rudman's "Friday Morning Quarterback." In light of Rudman's introduction of an AOR information service, edited by ex-WQDR/Raleigh PD Bill Hard, a significant amount of industry comment has arisen regarding the integrity of a tip sheet being published by an independent promotion man.

Rudman charges record companies, managers, and music publishers weekly promotion fees ranging from \$150 to \$500 to promote records, and accepts advertising in his tip sheet at rates up to \$1000 per page, as documented in an industry survey conducted by Radio & Records.

Among the discoveries revealed in Radio & Records' research was an apparent cover-up in regard to AOR programmers, as most of those surveyed by R&R were unaware of Rudman being a highly-paid independent promotion man.

George Meier's "Walrus" was the first on the AOR scene eight years

ago, and has been the pioneer tip sheet for AOR radio since then. Meier's radio background is extensive and his tip sheet includes unedited music reports from his stations, and positive and negative reviews of albums and concerts by Meier and his reporters. "Walrus" accepts no advertising, and subscriptions are Meier's only source of income.

In contrast, Rudman's record company advertising runs throughout the pages of Hard's AOR section. As the competition between the two sheets heats up, serious comments and criticisms have been raised by top programmers like Tom Yates, PD of KLOS/Los Angeles. In his AOR column on page 20 of this issue, Mike Harrison details programmers' comments and takes an in-depth look at the AOR tip sheet battle, drawing historical parallels between the rise of Top 40 radio and its resultant tip sheet services and the current ascendancy of AOR radio. The furor is just beginning, and R&R feels that this is a crucial issue which involves everyone in the radio and record industries.

Record Companies Win Background Music Rights

A Federal District Court in Seattle, Washington has rendered the first judicial decision that the duplication of sound recordings for use in a background music system constitutes infringement of a record company's rights.

The court decided, as a matter of law, that the unauthorized duplication of sound recordings constituted infringement of statutory copyrights, and also constituted unfair competition as to those recordings issued

prior to February 15, 1972, when recordings first became federally copyrightable.

Plaintiffs documented the motion with proof that hundreds of their respective recordings were duplicated without authorization by defendants on magnetic tape, playable from 6 to 12 hours, and were then distributed to restaurants and other retail establishments for use as background music.

Eagles One-Day Sell Out

The Eagles have kicked off their Eastern tour with an immediate sell-out of their Madison Square Garden, two Nassau Coliseum and two Largo, Washington D.C. dates.

The sellout occurred in one day and grossed almost \$1 million, putting the Eagles on top as the hottest American band.

Payola/Plugola Hearings Begin

The Federal Communications Commission is set to begin hearings February 16, 1977 on the new probe into payola and plugola. The hearings will be open to the public, and are expected to begin with the investigation into alleged activities by disc jockeys at Washington D.C. station WOL. FCC Administrative Law Judge Joseph Sturmer has been assigned the probe, which according to insiders could last several years, and is expected to include hearings in many cities around the country.

Stewart Leaves UA, Henry Leaves Shelter

Late Tuesday (8) Mike Stewart tendered his resignation as Chairman of the Board of United Artists Publishing. Future plans were not announced by Stewart and Transamerica had not at press time named a replacement.

Ron Henry resigned his GM position at Shelter Records late Tuesday (8) after a three year tenure. Henry has moved into the personal management field with his first client being The Dwight Twilley Band.

Arbitron Forms Small Market Department

Arbitron Radio has announced the establishment of a Small Radio Market Department to serve markets not regularly measured by Arbitron. The Small Market division will be an extension of Arbitron Radio's regular sales and service staff. According to Arbitron Radio VP William Engel, "It will stimulate communication between Arbitron and stations in un-syndicated markets. Now we will be able to offer individual attention to the broadcast audience research needs of small radio market stations." The division will be based in Beltsville, Maryland, and will be headed up by Penny Johnson and Richard Gaspell.

State Day Celebration

KLEO/Wichita commemorated the anniversary of Kansas' statehood with their "State Day." Members of the group Kansas helped in the celebration, voicing promos for giveaways during the day. Prizes awarded included Kansas "Left-overture" albums, Kansas' jigsaw puzzles, and seeds from the state flower, the Sunflower.

L.A. Convention Cancelled

The National Association of Broadcasters Radio Programming Convention scheduled in Los Angeles in September, has been cancelled, according to the NAB. The regular NAB Convention, March 27 through 30 in Washington D.C. will take place as scheduled.

WBJW Saves The Zoo

WBJW/Orlando is undertaking a huge charity effort to "Save The Central Florida Zoo" from bankruptcy. The zoo is dangerously close to closing, and needs nearly \$125,000 to pay off debts. "BJ105" and the Orlando Jaycees are planning a major Rock concert in the 72,000 capacity Tangerine Bowl. Date set for the event is April 9th, during the Easter weekend. Program Director Tom West is currently working with record executives from all companies to obtain services of major Rock acts to help support the cause.





Chicago


WMET/Chicago asked their audience to send in ideas to conserve energy, in 25 words or less, giving them a chance to win a custom,



Business News

FCC Votes On Multiple Ownership

New rules affecting multiple ownership of broadcast stations have been adopted by the FCC. The Commission voted to let "passive" investors own 10 percent of broadcast stock in several companies, if they sign disclaimers stating that they will not vote the shares. This rule may apply to owners of stock in companies that would regularly come under multiple ownership regulations. The Commission also said that they will amend their rules to prohibit acquisition of a station that was within 100 miles of two other signals owned by the same company.

Broadcasters Hit License Challengers

The National Association of Broadcasters has formally filed a statement with the FCC, claiming that citizen's groups who challenge station licenses prior to renewal time are in many cases not representative of the community at large. The NAB notes that many such groups do not have as large a membership as their filings to the FCC claim, and that they are formed immediately prior to renewal periods. The Association has asked the Commission to establish standards in which specific factual information accompany the groups' petitions against license-holders.

Broadcast Profits Up

Lin Broadcasting reports 1976 profits up to \$6.1 million, from year-ago figures of \$4.2 million. Gross figures attained in '76 were \$37.9 million.

Six months earnings for Starr Broadcasting Group were up dramatically to \$570,945, from \$33,932 a year ago. Gross earnings up to the end of last year were \$16 million.

Capital Cities Communication's profits were \$35.6 million, as compared to \$25.4 million in 1975.

Bartell-Downe Merger Complete

Downe Communications Inc. has announced that their merger with Bartell Media Corp. has been completed. Downe had owned 66 percent of Bartell stock before the turnover. Bartell stock has been cancelled, with owners receiving \$1.25 per share held.

Commission Complaints Down

The Federal Communications Commission reports a significant drop in the number of complaints received for the month of December. Totalling 1777, complaints were down 2199 from November. Comments and inquiries were also down to 1512. Commission staffers penned 805 letters to the public regarding comments.

No Postal Rate Increases This Year

The U.S. Postal Service has some good news for consumers. Postmaster General Benjamin Bailar said they have decided not to raise any postage rates in 1977, and will give a break to major publishers who pre-sort mail. Bailar said that postal service finances have improved enough to delay any price hikes until 1978. The break for publishers is still in the proposal stages, and no specific price-break amounts were announced, although they are expected to give anywhere from 5 to 20 percent discounts for pre-sorted magazines and newspapers.

San Francisco Format Switch

After the demise of NBC's News & Information Service, the network's owned and operated FM outlet has switched call letters to KYUU, and introduced "The Great Ones" format. General Manager William Dwyer said that the new format bridges a music gap in available stations in the market, emphasizing vocal arrangements. Station had been KNAI during the all-news reign.

Former Senator On Public Radio

Former New York U.S. Senator James L. Buckley has been named as a regular commentator on National Public Radio, beginning in March. Buckley will be featured during NPR's "All Things Considered" newsmagazine every Thursday.

Baggage Liability Raised

Industry people that travel a good deal of the time will be pleased to know that the Civil Aeronautics Board has raised the amount of airline liability on lost baggage from \$500 to \$750. Additionally, the Board ruled that airlines must compensate travelers for expenses incurred because of luggage loss, including rental of clothes and other items. Business expenses caused by the losses are also subject to reimbursement.

CB Slowdown

The stunning growth of CB radio sales in the past few years has apparently reached a leveling-off period. Although industry people feel that 10 million sets will be sold in '77, that figure is almost exactly the same as the amount sold in 1976, after sales had doubled in 1974 and 1975. A number of retailers feel that there is still some consumer confusion about the new 40 channel sets, while many old 23 channel sets are backlogged in stores. The Electronics Industries Association notes that CB sales are expected to level off at 55 million units nationwide, which represents one set for every two cars on the road.

Rush On Souped Up Caddies

The latest rage to hit America's streets is custom-designed Cadillac trucks. Although General Motors isn't exactly elated that their prized luxury model is being tampered with, many body shops are turning stock Eldorados and Coupe De Villes into pickup trucks, at prices reaching over \$20,000. One Miami garage offers a 24 carat gold emblem and wood rear deck at an asking price \$24,900.

TV News

"Roots" Makes History

The eyes of America were practically all glued to ABC's "Roots" for the week ending January 30, with the final two hour Sunday episode becoming the most watched television show in history. ABC garnered the highest rating, 35.5, and share, 52.1, in the history of television. CBS had a 16.2 rating, NBC only 13.2. ABC has estimated that nearly 85 percent of all TV homes available viewed all or part of "Roots." The series held down all seven top positions for the week, followed by more ABC shows. Eighth place went to "Happy Days," ninth was the "Fonzie Loves Pinkie" special, 10th "Six Million Dollar Man." To add to the other networks' depression, no non-ABC programs even showed up until CBS' "All In The Family," at 17th place.

Arbitron Television's Meter Audience Estimates for the week of January 22 through 28 shows an equally impressive showing for "Roots." In Los Angeles metered households, the top 6 position were held down by "Roots" episodes, followed by "Baretta," "Barney Miller," "Fonzie Loves Pinkie," "Happy Days," and "Six Million Dollar Man." In New York, again the top 6 went to "Roots," then "Happy Days," "Barney Miller," "Fonzie Loves Pinkie," and "Welcome Back Kotter." Arbitron has "Roots" final episode with a monstrous 80 share in New York.

Other TV News

Los Angeles' Channel 52 will be the forerunner in pay TV systems, under new FCC rules. Beginning April 1, the station will televise first run movies, sports events and other specials with National Subscription Television bankrolling the project. NST has announced that





AOR

Mike Harrison

If I were to stand by and keep silent about the current AOR tip sheet duel underway between *Walrus* and the *Friday Morning Quarterback (FMQB) Album Report* (see page 1), it would be a dereliction of my journalistic editorial obligation. We at *Radio & Records* see the consequences of its outcome seriously affecting the present position and future direction of AOR radio's image within the industry, as well as the very fibre of the genre's meaningful conception. Although it is usually our policy to remain impartial in competitive struggles between the free enterprise organizations within the industry that we serve as the sole newspaper, this particular situation is serious enough to warrant our speaking out so some extremely pertinent facts can be known.

We certainly are not against healthy competition within our industry, but the type of competition that the *FMQB Album Report* is imposing upon *Walrus* necessitates our revealing certain negative aspects of both its methodology and intent.

In *Radio & Records'* recent investigation into the matter, which I personally was involved in, it was absolutely shocking to hear statements such as Mike Bechtel, Program Director of KXFM/Santa Maria, commenting: "Last year, I got 3 or 4 issues of Rudman containing reports that I never gave him. Also, he was saying that we were getting phone reaction from records we weren't even playing. I gather he was taking our reports from other sources and then distorting them to meet his own promotional purposes." Revealing statements of that nature substantiate the fears that many industry members hold for an independent promotion man publishing a tip sheet.

Now that credible cultural sources and tip sheets such as *Walrus* and its publisher, George Meier, have proven that the AOR field is not only a major force within the industry, but a highly lucrative one as well, the Album Oriented Rock ballpark is being rapidly entered by a number of opportunists looking to make "the quick buck." The primary thing to remember is that the most important factor that made AOR the success it is and will insure the continuation of that success is the credibility that makes up its foundation and very fibre no matter what type of legitimate methodology is employed. This is the common bond that links so diverse and multi-dimensional a spectrum. That is the quality that has given AOR the edge in feeling the pulse of so great a listening body and the ability to continually reflect it through its natural evolutionary changes. Therefore, it is vital that AOR prevent all less-than-upfront operations from becoming part of its anatomical structure, no matter how large or small they may originally appear.

The inescapable truth is that the *FMQB Album Report* is just another manifestation of Kal Rudman's *Friday Morning Quarterback*, the Top 40 tip sheet owned and operated by (in Bill Hard's own words written in

his published opening message): "The Notorious" Kal Rudman. Kal Rudman is an independent promotion man! On a business level, Bill Hard's Album Report Section and Kal Rudman's Friday Morning Quarterback are one and the same. Bill Hard gets paid by Kal Rudman. Kal Rudman gets paid by the record companies to promote their records.

Radio & Records' research, in checking with several record company promotion executives, established that Rudman's price for weekly promotion of records varies from \$150 to \$500 per week, per company and, in some cases more depending upon the size of the company and the amount of product. In addition, the advertising rates in the publication side of his promotional operation also vary from client to client, up to \$1000 per page.

An independent promotion man editing and publishing a tip sheet labeled "A Factual Programming Guide" while keeping most of his radio readership unaware of his dual personality and functions (as revealed in the *Radio & Records* investigation into the matter) is uncomfortably close to the type of elusive overtones which have already cast a blemish on the otherwise respectable relationship between Top 40 radio and the record industry, a blemish that most of the industry's sincerely dedicated participants are hoping, desperately, to eradicate.

The following statement was made by Tom Yates, Program Director of ABC-FM Radio's KLOS/Los Angeles: "I have severe professional differences with the Rudman sheet based on the fact that, for a period of time, KLOS was listed as a reporting station, up to and including the use of our Music Director's name, when, in point of fact, KLOS has never reported to Rudman. It seems they were copying the reports from other sources. We have no intention of reporting to Rudman in the future."

Having encountered little resistance in building a limited Top 40 following for his tip sheet, in spite of his being a paid independent promotion man, Rudman obviously smells a whole new fertile chicken coop in the budding AOR scene. Realizing that he has little clout with AOR broadcasters to effectively compete with *Walrus* himself, the logical thing to do was find a buffer-type spokesman from the format's own ranks. That spokesman is Bill Hard, whom Rudman plucked from the Program Directorship of the Lee Abrams-consulted WQDR/Raleigh, North Carolina, to carry out his intentions.

"'Bill,' he said 'I'm going to make you a star! Get yourself up here to Harry Chill (Cherry Hill) and put together an album sheet that will revolutionize the bizniz.'..."

Again, in the actual words of Bill Hard: "Then one day it happened. The fateful phone on the desk called my name, and it was Mr. Rudman on the line. 'Bill,' he said, 'I'm going to make you a star! Get yourself up here to Harry Chill (Cherry Hill) and put together an album sheet that will revolutionize the bizniz.'" Hard went on to say: "Shortly thereafter a rather mysterious stranger showed up at the office (WQDR) with a round trip plane ticket to Cherry Hill. He suggested that it would be best for my health if I hopped on flight 666 that evening. I noticed he spoke with a slight twinge of Jerseyese... and you know as well as I do those guys don't fool around. So, rather than sleep with the fishes, I hopped da plane."

Then Bill Hard said: "When I got to New

Jersey, I explained to Kal that I had absolutely no interest in leaving my happy and secure position with WQDR and yes, I'd be glad to take the job. He's persuasive...what can I say! Maybe I was blinded by the thunderous glint of all those gold records. Maybe it was that..."

Gold record! Start is that the motivation that inspired Bill Hard to revolutionize the "bizniz?"

"About the only thing now that would be revolutionary to the growing and healthy world of AOR would be corruption..."

The people at *FMQB* think that by offering AOR radio a couple of questionable features in their tip sheet that *Walrus* does not, they are going to be revolutionizing the field, I can only ask the question, "Where have they been all these years?" The revolution is over. About the only thing now that would be revolutionary to the growing and healthy world of AOR would be corruption. Yes, I have to admit...it has yet to rear its ugly head among our ranks.

Now, let's take an objective look at how this new AOR tip sheet already seems to be distorting music information in such a manner as to set AOR radio up for its (*FMQB's*) own promotional purposes, under the guise of offering AOR radio two features that *Walrus* does not. It's interesting, also, the way they've been blown up as major ideological failings so that AOR broadcasters actually might believe that they are designed for their programming benefit. They are, 1) the listing of actual number of plays per day (at the stations that are prepared and willing to report such information and 2) the creating of a philosophical schism between so-called "Progressive AOR's" and "Commercial AOR's," a classification that anyone with a substantial feel for the format will realize can only be arrived at by subjective determination and quite elementary mental processes. That's the basis of the whole package...at least on paper.

As far as "eliminating the grey area" and getting down to the number of plays per day of an album on an AOR station, even if that number is as miniscule as .5 (that's right, 1/2 play per day), I believe the statement issued to us by Norm Winer, Program Director of WBCN/Boston, describes our skepticism succinctly: "The Rudman sheet is prying out of context the factors that make up how we play our records and ignoring the very fibre of what our format is all about. That is a dangerous misrepresentation of AOR or Progressive radio. I certainly won't report to them."

It has taken years for AOR radio to cast off the stigma of being an easy mark for promotion people to get reports from, even when the records in question are getting a minimal amount of airplay. The spotlighting of albums that spend most of their lives in the control room bin and little time on the actual turntable is a promotional tool that can only come back and bite AOR programmers in their progressive rears. That is not the effective sharing of information. It is the lending of half truths that may be recycled into whole hypes. On the other hand, even with albums that are getting significant play, the premise of an AOR station revealing the number of times they make it to the turntable will eventually create a restricted and imitation-fostering situation that will take the spark of spontaneity out of the format's very guts, thus reducing it to a national herd of homogenized followers with failings far beyond those that have been known to victimize Top 40 radio.

As far as the splitting of the stations by ideological differences is concerned, that again is a promotional tool designed to give

the record industry the choice of two charts in which to find something positive to go around showing about their records. It's sort of like saying, "My record is doing well on the stations that like it. The ones that don't like it do not count." Worse, though, the division of the AOR ranks is the circa-1972 thinking that almost caused the death of Progressive radio during the early years of this decade, that preceded the concept of AOR, which gave each station that plays album music the total freedom to open/close/restrict/change/experiment with their methodology without the stigma of mindless black-and-white thinking casting a label upon them for record promotional purposes. This forces them to program to fit the category instead of leaving the category loose enough to fit the programmers' creative right to program as he or she chooses, to meet numerous changing day-to-day needs for their individual markets.

Many radio people are so hungry to see their names and call letters in print of any kind that they lose sight of the fact that they are actually lending their names, reputations, and credibility to any sheet they report to. The process of sharing classified information with your colleagues is a very serious matter which should never be taken lightly.

It takes time and proof before a reputation such as that of *Walrus* can be counted upon. In the 8 years of *Walrus'* existence, under the ownership and direction of George Meier, it has done nothing but lend credibility to the concept of the industry tip sheet and AOR radio, in general. Meier is not affiliated as a partner or shareholder with any radio or record industry corporate entity and answers to no one but his readers. The only ads he has accepted are those for and by broadcasters for which there has never been a charge. *Walrus* has always provided AOR broadcasters, whom it has served exclusively, with an open forum in which they could see their thoughts, opinions, views, philosophies, and personal messages published without restriction or editing. In addition, its pages have always been open to all and any music information that its contributors are willing to submit. Finally, *Walrus* has offered its readers both negative and positive reviews of albums and concerts, while distinctly outlining the border between objective fact and subjective opinion. We consider that to be the major ethical requirement of any tip sheet and for their adherence to these guidelines, both George Meier and *Walrus* deserve the industry's commendations and support.

From our vantage point as observers of the current AOR tip sheet duel, we at *Radio & Records* must point out that it is not simply a matter of "which one is better." Although we support *Walrus*, we will always be in favor of seeing new ways of doing things and support all well intentioned newcomers to the AOR world who have something positive to offer...as long as there are no strings attached.





It is hard to believe the Third Annual R&R Convention is next week in Dallas. I know this year's participants will not only enjoy the planned activities, but the many special surprises should make this event the talk of the industry for a long time. Looking forward to seeing you there. If by chance you are not going to make it this year, in two weeks we will have a complete photographed report in R&R. Again this reminder for all of our Country reporting stations: The deadline for next week's news and music research reports will be NO LATER THAN 2 pm (Pacific Time) WEDNESDAY, FEBRUARY 16. Please make a note of this.

NEWS NOTES: In four to six weeks, according to PD BILL BARDEN, WISZ/Baltimore will change formats from Country to Pop/Adult. No staff changes are planned...Rumors of a possible shutdown of Hitsville Records, Motown's Country division are totally false according to RAY RUFF, Director of the label's operations. The story was started because of a major cutback in their promotional staff. Ruff told me because of the lack of record sales in many areas of the country, mainly due to the severe weather conditions, the label wanted to find a way to save some money during this time. The duties of promotion have been delegated to members of Motown's promotional staff...RON NORWOOD, who recently had tremendous success at KGA/Spokane, will replace RICK STEWART as PD of KMPS/Seattle. DON KENNEDY, formerly with KGA's sister station in Eugene, Oregon, KEED, will take over as Operations Director of KGA... The HERB SCOTT station in Harrisburg, Pennsylvania, WFEC will become a Country station next Monday (14). The PD will be DENE HALLAM, who had been with Rocker WAVZ/New Haven. BOB MALEY is General Manager. Hallam called to say he is very excited about the new direction of the station. Also, he needs a good morning personality. (717) 238-5122...

More tidbits of news later in my show, but before I run out of space this week, here are a few of the interesting promotions I have failed to mention in the last few weeks: TERRY WOOD, Operations Director of WONE/Dayton, tells of a trivia contest the station is running that has proved effective in recycling their audience. The morning drive jock gives a question on-the-air and the answer is told on the afternoon show, and vice versa. After the answer is given on either show, listeners are asked to call in the question and answer. Winning call wins \$9.80 and then becomes eligible for the grand prize, a new car...KXRB/Sioux Falls is running a promotion to keep people listening longer. In their "Country Countback Contest" the audience calls in and can win various prizes by being able to name the last five songs. The show starring ROY CLARK, FREDDY FENDER, DON WILLIAMS, HANK THOMPSON, and BUCK TRENT, will be broadcast on WHN and WMAQ, Chicago. Other stations may be added for future broadcasts on a "mini-network"...KRAK/Sacramento early morning air personality JOEY MITCHELL has been involved in a couple interesting projects on his show. Recently, he enrolled in a stop-smoking course. As he progressed through the day he related his classroom experiences to his audience. KRAK's JAY HOFFER said Mitchell has pledged not to eat the station log after he goes through his fingernails. Mitchell, who also is a photographer, has been giving on-air photography tips to his audience...KKYX/San Antonio, held their Fifth Annual Great Country River Festival last weekend...More goodies next week...
