NAB Attacks Gov't. Performance Royalty Report

The National Association of Broadcasters issued a statement highly critical of the recent U.S. Copyright Office report recommending the adoption of performance royalty legislation. The NAB attacked the report's "highly speculative conclusions" and urged the Copyright office to "refrain from arbitrarily and capriciously...accepting the conclusions stated in the study as fact."

The Copyright Office report maintained that radio stations would have scant trouble affording performance royalty payments to record companies and performers at the rates proposed by the record royalty bill (HR 6063). Fees for radio stations were set at \$250 a year for the smallest stations, \$750 annually for larger outlets, and 1% of net advertising receipts for stations earning over \$200,000 yearly, with stations making less than \$25,000 a year exempted. Based on an analysis of almost 27,000 reports from 5660 radio stations from 1971-75, the report concluded that "radio broadcast stations would be able to pay a record music license fee without any significant impact, either on profit or on the number of stations in operation." Additionally, according to the study, stations "can and do pass along costs to their advertisers without loss of business or revenues," and thus would not be financially affected, since advertising demand for radio remained steady and would not fall off because of a rise in radio rates brought on by the added royalty payments.

NAB Challenges

The NAB challenged this assertion, stating that "changes in the rates of one medium can encourage advertisers to shift their advertising

to other media." The NAB also criticized the government study for ignoring an important broadcasters' argument: that radio stations might be forced to reduce the quantity or quality of programming because of increased costs from royalty payments.

The NAB also stated that the report itself had found that the financial benefit to performers would be minimal ("slight, but favorable" were the study's terms), and that a significant portion of the revenues would be consumed in administration costs (monitoring station plays and distributing the royalties). The study estimated about \$15 million as the projected figure for 1978 performance royalty payments.

Hidden Profits?

Another portion of the government study alleged that "hidden profits" made the financial status of many stations appear less healthy than was actually the case, and allowed many stations apparently

Hoffer Exits KRAK Programming Post

Jay Hoffer, Vice President of Programming for Hercules Broadcasting, has left that position, R&R has learned. Hercules owns KMPS/KEUT-FM/Seattle and KRAK/KEWT-FM/Sacramento; Hoffer had been with KRAK for almost 18 years in executive positions, starting as Station Manager in 1960. John McGray, Vice President, Sales for Hercules, a 12-year KRAK veteran, has also exited.

Hoffer declined to comment to R&R on his departure stating only that "management reorganization" was taking place. Hercules own-

George Klein Found Guilty

Former WHBQ/Memphis Program Director George Klein was found guilty on one count of conspiracy in an explosive Arbitron diary theft case (R&R 12-2). He was found innocent on three counts of mail fraud, but faces a maximum sentence of five years' imprisonment and a \$10,000 fine.

Following two days of heated testimony, the jury deliberated three-and-a-half hours before delivering their verdict Thursday (12-1). Sentencing was expected to

take place in approximately three weeks. Klein's lawyer indicated that an appeal would be filed, while his employers, the proprietors of the Mid-South Fair/Libertyland theme park in Memphis, indicated that Klein would remain in his job as Public Relations Director. After the trial, Klein, who had testified that WHBQ General Manager Dick French had been responsible for the diary conspiracy, reaffirmed his belief in his own innocence. French had denied Klein's allegations during the trial.

Capitol Forms EMI America Label Under Mazza; Jordan Appointed National Promotion Director

Capitol Industries-EMI, Inc. unveiled their long-promised new label, EMI America, as announced by President Bhaskar Menon, who will serve as Chairman and Chief Executive of the new company. As revealed earlier (R&R 9-30), Jim Mazza, former Vice President of Marketing at Capitol, will serve as President/Chief Operating Of-

ficer of EMI America. Don Grierson, most recently Merchandising and Advertising Director at Capitol, was appointed Vice President of A&R, while Bill Straw, a former Warner Bros. attorney, becomes Director of Business Affairs.

J.J. Jordan, R&R's first Top 40 Editor, has been appointed National Promotion Director of the

new label. Jordan served for a year as Top 40 Editor, during which time he was instrumental in preparing the paper's "Top 40 Story" special, as well as debuting the "Street Talk" column. Before his R&R stint, Jordan was a renowned radio programmer, serving as National Program Director for the Star stations, and Program Director at WHBQ/Memphis and WRKO/Boston, among others.

Commenting on the orientation and purpose of the new label, Menon stated: "The formation of EMI America represents a significant milestone in the development of the Capitol-EMI Group of worldwide music companies. The new label will be an independent source of top American talent for world markets and a means of enhancing our...marketing success in the U.S. EMI America will rapidly establish total national promotion and marketing capability to support its own distinctive artist roster...I am particularly delighted at the selection of Jim Mazza as President of our new label...Mazza...brings a wealth of experience, drive and professional accomplishment to his new duties. He is supported by three executives of outstanding ability with proven track records, and I believe that the EMI America operating team is among the industry's finest and most dynamic."

EMI America will share distribution and manufacturing facilities with Capitol, with international licensing going to Capitol Canada and EMI associates outside North America. The new label will not be based in the Capitol Tower, but will locate on Sunset Blvd. in Hollywood, with the address to be announced in a month's time.

Arbitron Sets Survey Dates For 1978

Arbitron Radio has announced the dates for the company's four surveys for 1978. According to Arbitron, this marks the first time the company has set all four survey dates in advance. The dates are as follows:

January/February—January 5-February 1

April/May—April 6-May 3

July/August—July 6-August 2

October/November—October 19-November 15

All surveys run four weeks. The April/May sweep does not include Easter (March 26 in 1978), and the October/November dates should miss the World Series, barring postponements from bad weather. Arbitron also announced that beginning with the publication of the July/August results, two new features will be listed on the Facilities Page (page 4) of the market reports; and a Market Data Table will include figures for metro area newspaper circulation, radio's weekly come, and the average number of quarter hours listened to for persons 12 plus, men 18 plus, and women 18 plus for a specific market.

Keith Richard Ordered To Stand Trial

Rolling Stone guitarist Keith Richard was ordered Friday (12-2) by a Toronto judge to stand trial on heroin trafficking charges which

carry a maximum life sentence. Richard had earlier pleaded not guilty to charges of possessing almost an ounce of heroin for pur-

poses of trafficking, along with a cocaine possession charge.

However, Judge H.A. Rice rejected Richard's statements that he had no intention of trafficking in heroin. The judge said that enough evidence existed to convince a jury that Richard might have given some of the heroin found in his Toronto hotel room in February to his common-law wife, Anita Palenberg. Under Canadian law, heroin trafficking can constitute the gift of the drugs to another person. Richard denied that Ms. Palenberg knew about the heroin.

Richard's \$25,000 cash bail was continued, and he was ordered to appear in court February 6, 1978, for the setting of a trial date. Richard's attorneys requested a judge and jury trial.

Allen Klein Retrial Date Set


January 30, 1978, has been set as the date for the retrial of ABCKO Industries President Allen Klein on tax evasion charges. A mistrial was declared (R&R 11-18) in the government's first attempt to try Klein on charges stemming from alleged failure to report income derived from selling promotional copies of Beatles records. The sentencing of Klein's former promotion associate, Pete Bennett, has still not been set.

Mel Phillips Joins Hooper Radio

Mel Phillips, a prominent radio figure for 17 years, has been appointed General Manager of C.E. Hooper, Inc., the ratings firm which dominated the field in the 50's and early 60's. Phillips told R&R that the company "has big plans" to launch a new concerted effort in the ratings field.

Phillips most recently headed his own programming consulting firm. Previously he was Program Manager at WNBC/New York. He was Program Director of WRKO/Boston from 1966-1972, and held the same position at KQV/Pittsburgh. Phillips was also involved with WOR-FM/New York, during which time the call letters were changed to WXLO (99X). He was



also Associate Director of National Promotion at Epic Records from 1974 to 1976.

It's a striking method of establishing the station's longterm presence and appeal in the market.

Suspects Arrested In Forest Extortion Attempt

Los Angeles-based concert promoter David Forest was the subject of an alleged extortion attempt last week, with the Los Angeles Police Department announcing the apprehension of four juveniles in connection with the threats. One of the four, a 17-year-old boy, reportedly called Forest claiming to be part of the Mafia and demanding \$100,000, threatening the promoter with death. The boy allegedly called again later, reduced his demand to \$64,000, and was picked up at a drop-off point in suburban El Monte with a 16-year-old girl. Two other alleged accomplices, 15 and

16-year-old girls, were arrested subsequently.

A spokesman for Forest's Fun Productions emphasized to R&R that the incident was "totally unrelated to (the recent shooting murder of) Steve Wolf," also a prominent L.A. concert promoter. The spokesman described the incident as a "total joke" and expressed satisfaction that the suspects had been apprehended. A police spokesman involved with both the Forest and Wolf cases also declared that no connection existed between the two.

Crocker Perjury Conviction Overturned

The perjury conviction of former WBLS/New York Program Director Frankie Crocker was overturned by the Third Circuit Court of Appeals in Newark last week. Crocker had been convicted of lying to a grand jury about an alleged cash gift from a record promotion firm. The court's reversal ruled that the ori-

ginal trial judge had allowed inadmissible testimony irrelevant to the actual indictment against Crocker. The Federal Government has the option of appealing the latest decision to the entire Court of Appeals or setting a new trial for Crocker—or dropping the case entirely.

operating at a loss to remain on the air for years. The NAB attacked this contention sharply, calling it "hasty and speculative... (it) totally ignores the numerous other valid explanations for their continued operation." The NAB also criticized the Copyright Office itself, stating it had not been given sufficient time to prepare a proper rebuttal, which it said would be forthcoming in more detail. According to the NAB, the Copyright Office "has only succeeded in obtaining a study which reaches no firm conclusions and fails to provide any really reliable or useful information—and interested parties are foreclosed from preparing an appropriately substantial response."

Johnson Enters Fray

Adding more fuel to the fire, former FCC Commissioner Nicholas Johnson proclaimed his support of the performance royalty plan, stating "Broadcasters are so used to getting everything for nothing, they're surprised when somebody asks them to pay for what they get." Johnson added, in a more general vein, "I suppose the broadcasters, while they pile up profits, would throw out the minimum wage law and even reinstitute slavery if they could."

Broadway Opening "Show Business" TV Campaign

The Broadway department store chain, one of the West's largest, has launched one of the most extensive television spot campaigns in its history, playing up a "sophisticated" show-business theme in 30-second spots. The commercials are aimed at the Christmas market, with two themes: "Opening Night Is Christmas" and "This Year The Big Hits Come From The Broadway." Over 2000 commercials will air through the campaign's closing December 11, with 800 in Los Angeles (network affiliates and independents) and the remainder of the store's other Western markets, such as Phoenix, Bakersfield, Las Vegas, Tucson, Salt Lake City, and Albuquerque.

Sears Sets Safeguards After Ad Agency Bankruptcy

Following the bankruptcy of its Southeastern ad agency, Sears, Roebuck & Co. has set up a system designed to guard against defaults in payment to broadcasters. The Lindsey, Bradley & Johnston Advertising concern declared bankruptcy in October, listing \$2.4 million in liabilities with almost 800 broadcast stations listed as creditors. Sears business reportedly made up a considerable portion of that amount, and the company is apparently of the opinion that the obligation to pay is the bankrupt agency's, a situation which would offer little hope of collection for the stations involved (similar to agency-failures recently reported in R&R).

However, Sears is establishing a new system in Memphis with its new agency there, Leslie Advertising Agency. Stations are asked to return to Sears a card certifying that they have received payment from the ad agency in a specific month. And Leslie itself has been required to take out insurance indemnifying Sears in the event of a default.

PSA Quota Requested Again

The FCC has been asked to reconsider its recent rejection of a petition to establish firmer guidelines on public service announcements (R&R 10-21). The Public Media Center, along with approximately 65 citizen's groups and five members of Congress, has petitioned the Commission to reconsider the original petition, which called for PSA's to be aired during more desirable time periods, and a minimum requirement of three PSA's totalling at least 90 seconds to be carried every two hours, among other proposals. In support of their new request, the petitioners cited a study which monitored 67 television stations between 6-11pm. In 335 broadcast hours, according to the study, 46 minutes were devoted to PSA's. Under the minimum requirement proposed by the petitioners, about 250 minutes would have been devoted to PSA's.

Broadcast Complaints Set New FCC Record

The FCC reports that it received 77,844 complaints related to broadcast matters in fiscal 1977, breaking last year's record of 74,761 and establishing a new overall high mark. The new record was accomplished even with a drop in Fairness Doctrine complaints from 42,000 to 2000, since 1977 was not an election year. The main reasons for the new mark were sharp increases in miscellaneous programming complaints (10,000 to 29,000) and an even greater proportionate rise in obscenity/indecency/profanity complaints (6000 to 20,000). It was not stated whether complaints about ABC's controversial television series "Soap," the reported target of several large-scale organized protest drives, were included in this year's tally.


SCBA Announces Officers, Board Members

The Southern California Broadcasters Association has announced its 1978 officers and board members. Peter Newell, Vice President/General Manager of KPOL-AM-FM, is Chairman of the Board. KLOS Vice President/General Manager John Winnaman is Vice Chairman. Treasurer is KFI/KOST Vice President/General Manager James Wesley, Jr.; while Joe Dorton, Vice President/General Manager of KBIG/KBRT, was appointed Secretary. Board members are Bill Beaton of KIEV/Glendale, Ed Boyd of KIS-AM-FM, TEN-Q/KGBS' Paul Cassidy, KFAC-AM-FM's George Frittinger, Ben Hoberman of KABC, George Nicholaw of KNX, Gary Price of KDAY, Stan Spero of KMPC, KHJ's Tim Sullivan, Pat Shaughnessy of KIQQ(K100), KLAC's Bill Ward, Stan Warwick of KGIL, and Gordon Mason of KJOI.

16 Congressmen Own Broadcast Holdings

A total of sixteen members of Congress (ten representatives, six senators) have direct or family interests in radio or television facilities. Twenty-one Congressmen owned holdings in 1975. Rep. Cecil C. Heftel of Hawaii, the major holder of broadcast interests as President of Heftel Broadcasting, is selling off most of his interests, including Y100/Miami and 13Q/WSHH-FM/Pittsburgh. Another major holder is Rep. Nick Rahall of West Virginia, son of Rahall Communications Chairman N. Joe Rahall and co-trustee of almost 50% of the company's common voting shares. Rahall will merge (subject to FCC approval) with Gulf Life Holding Co., involving WNDE and WFBQ-FM/Indianapolis among other facilities. The company also recently sold WLCY and WYNF-FM/Tampa to Harte-Hanks Communications. Others with holdings include Rep. Thomas L. Ashley of Ohio, with a small portion of Combined Communications stock; Sen. Jesse A. Helms of North Carolina, with a few shares of Capitol Broadcasting; and Rep. Willie G. Helner of North Carolina, who with his wife owns Helner Radio (licensee of WRKB-AM-FM/Kannapolis, Nc. Many of the other Congressmen are related to substantial shareholders in communications organizations.



What's New?

Wonder Where The Yellow Went

That familiar lemon-sour shade characterizing the phone book's **Yellow Pages** may be in for some competition on its own pages. The **Bell System's** main printers are experimenting with multi-color and perhaps full-color ads to be featured in the Yellow Pages. And that's a source of a different color.

Phone Purchase Policy Put On Hold?

The FCC's order permitting consumers to buy their own phones, which was recently upheld by the **Supreme Court** (**What's New** 10-28), is encountering resistance from the **Communications Workers** union. The group, claiming a potential 100,000 jobs may be lost, has asked Congress to review the FCC own-your-own-phone policy. Another request by the union concerns a proposed law limiting the importing of foreign-made phone equipment made to supply the new market.

Fuel For The City

A specially-designed **Mercedes Benz**, driven on a specially-designed test track in West Germany, has established what Mercedes claims is an all-time fuel economy record: 1585 miles per gallon. The company did not state whether the car used ethyl or low-lead...or even gasoline.

Rocks To Roll In New Album

A new proposed album by **Robin Lumley**, keyboard player for **Passport's Brand X**, will be getting down to the geological roots of Rock—by using the sound of actual rocks to create music. Lumley's plan is to record sounds such as the "wind whistling through boulders" in Arabia, water dripping on English rocks, the sound of Shetland Island sand "being squished," sand-falls in the Sahara, and others. Then the sounds will be programmed into a Mellotron, which will be used to record a composition written in a primitive scale used by prehistoric players of bone flutes. Fleetwood Mac Sweep Rock Radio Awards

Fleetwood Mac dominated the first Rock Radio Awards, winning four "Crystals" in the balloting, taken from 132,000 voters. The awards were devised by DIR Broadcasting, and were formally announced via a two-hour show which was aired Nov. 24 on 258 AOR stations nationally, hosted by Grace Slick and R&R's Mike Harrison. Fleetwood Mac won Best group, Best Album ("Rumours"), Best Song and Best Single ("Dreams" for both) awards. Peter Frampton was voted Best Male Singer, with Linda Ronstadt the female counterpart. Stevie Wonder won Best Singer-Songwriter and Boston won Best Album Debut.

No Stopping "Star Wars"; New Record Coming

"Star Wars" continues to smash records everywhere, with domestic gross reaching \$184.4 million as of November 14, and international reaction following the same pattern. Domestic rentals are expected to surpass "Jaws" in the very near future, according to 20th Century. 20th Century Records, meanwhile, has released a new record called "The Story Of Star Wars," which is a 50-minute summary of the film, with voices, sound effects, and music taken from the original soundtrack with occasional narrative bridges added to tell the full story. A full-color book featuring over 30 pictures is also included.

Phonogram Adds De-Lite For Distribution

Phonogram/Mercury will distribute De-Lite Records product exclusively as a result of a recently-concluded agreement between the two companies. First product is scheduled for December, with albums by a new group called Made In The USA and label stalwarts Kool & the Gang. Other acts on De-Lite include the Kay-Gees, Crown Heights Affair, and Frankie Avalon. Phonogram/Mercury also acquires catalog distribution rights.

FCC Update

FCC Refuses Rulemaking To Require More PSA Time

The FCC has refused a request to institute rulemaking proceedings looking to require stations to make more time available during more desirable time periods for the airing of PSA's. The FCC concluded that adoption of any such rule would intrude into the sensitive area of station programming. But it did not in any way indicate that PSA's were not an important area of concern to it.

Court Affirms FCC On Fairness Holding

A Court of Appeals affirmed the FCC holding that two Georgia TV stations were not unreasonable in having concluded that certain advertisements presented by a public utility did not violate Fairness Doctrine requirements by presenting only one side of the controversial issue of rate increase. Importantly, the court stated (what most licensees already know), that where FCC upholds the licensee's "fairness" judgement, court reversal will rarely follow. The more basic concern is the FCC's varying position on "fairness" matters in which it not infrequently substitutes its own judgement on "fairness" aspects (such as what is a "controversial local issue") for that of a station.

FCC Designates Renewal Hearing

FCC has designated for hearing the License Renewal Application of WTVP/Tupelo on the basis of charges that the licensee was using the station to advance its non-radio (i.e. business activities) in an anti-competitive manner. The FCC has in the past been particularly sensitive to any use of broadcast stations to advance principals' non-broadcast business interests as an instance of unfair competition with others in the same non-broadcast business who cannot call upon their stations to assist them.

FCC Defers Transfer

FCC has indefinitely deferred action (or approval) on an Application for Transfer of Control of Rocket Radio, Inc., licensee of WFPM/Ft. Valley, Georgia on the basis of an ALJ's Decision in another separate case that Rocket was not qualified to be an FCC licensee. The ALJ decision will obviously be appealed to the full FCC, but the ultimate test will come if they find Rocket disqualified as a licensee, since it has in recent years "blown hot and cold" as to whether such conduct solely at another station comes over to be held against other stations owned by the same licensee.

FCC Upholds Assignment

The FCC has rejected a petition to designate for hearing an assignment of station WTW/Cleveland despite charges that it was already clear that the Assignee would not assume existing Collective Bargaining Agreements entered into by the Assignor. The FCC noted an earlier Supreme Court holding that such agreements were not per se binding upon a successor-employer which the Assignee would be, so that FCC would not compel it to honor such Assignor Union Agreements.

FCC Denies Review

FCC denied Adler Broadcasting Company, former licensee of WAVE/Baltimore, its review on forfeiture levied against it, even though the technical violations had voluntarily been disclosed by the licensee itself.

FCC Conditions FM Grant

The FCC has held that its grant of a new FM station at Lincoln, Nebraska would be conditioned on a subsequent showing that interference shown during equipment tests to exist to a TV station (that filed a timely objection) would be alleviated before the FM's Program Test Authority would be granted. If not so alleviated, FCC stated that the FM's Program Test Authority would not be granted.

FCC Liberalizes FM Translator Rules

The FCC has amended its FM rules to permit the unattended operations of FM broadcast translator stations that are now permitted to FM station.

Gerrity New WB National Album Promotion Director

George Gerrity has been appointed National Album Promotion Director at Warner Bros. Records. According to Vice President/Director of Promotion Russ Thyret, Gerrity will work closely with David Young, who holds the same title as well. Gerrity has been with Warners for seven years, and was most recently National Artist Relations Supervisor for the label.



Test Book For Commercial Radio License Out

A revised 1978 edition of "Tests-Answers For FCC First And Second Class Commercial License," a book by Warren Weagant, is now available from Command Productions, Radio Engineering Division, P.O. Box 26348, San Francisco, CA 94126, with a \$9.95 price tag. The book features 15 "updated" multiple-choice tests based on the actual FCC exam, plus self-study tests and tips.

ABC, Pickwick Pact For Budget Line

ABC Records and Pickwick International have signed a budget-line licensing agreement granting Pickwick re-release rights on selected ABC product. Plans call for over 150 albums to be issued in three years. ABC has also renewed its agreement with GRT for tape product.



Columbia Unfurls Main Sail

Columbia Records has signed an exclusive production deal with Main Sail Music, a company owned by Larry Fitzgerald and Mark Hartley, principals in the Fitzgerald-Hartley Management Company. According to CBS Records President Bruce Lundvall, Fitzgerald and Hartley will find and develop new talent for the label, and will be involved with the "total creative package" from discovery to development and refinement. 





An alarming thought has been bothering me lately...as programmers face increased competition from all formats, they seem to have less and less time to actually "program." We have all seen it happen; the young, dynamic PD enters the job with energy, sensitivity and real imagination. Slowly the pressures of mounting competition force the programmer to devote more working hours to less productive "defensive" maneuvers. The General Manager, also feeling the pressure on the sales level, passes some of the day-to-day operational duties down to the Program Director.

The programmer is now spending more and more time within the radio station and less time doing what he or she was hired to do. The PD doesn't have the time for the sensitivity toward the staff. The energy level drops off and worst of all, imagination becomes a luxury the programmer can no longer afford.

Wrong! I believe that a Program Director should direct, motivate and lead a radio station, but must also remain "in touch" with the audience. That audience contact cannot be maintained if the programmer must spend long hours each day in the station itself.

The freedom to create requires time and energy. Time is something PD's should be allowed to have, to use as they feel necessary. Time to create, time away from the confines of the station. Time away from the forest to perhaps get a better look at the trees. And with time comes the energy to create. As long as radio contains the element of entertainment, the creativity must be there. Don't let your time get away!

We Are Not Alone

With all the pre-publicity for the Columbia Picture's "Close Encounters Of The Third Kind" the movie has certainly come into the public consciousness. I was lucky enough to see an early screening of the movie and I must say it is a film that people will indeed be talking about from the moment they leave the theatre. 






Contests, Concerts & Promotions




