Wyoming Station Attacks Civic "Corruption"

KRKK/Rock Springs, Wyoming has been instrumental in fighting to expose evidence of reported widespread corruption and possible criminal activity allegedly connected with city government officials, while Station Manager Bill Luzmoor has been subpoenaed by the Wyoming State Grand Jury to testify on those matters.

As related to R&R by Luzmoor and Program Director Rod Tucker, the station's involvement began last year. Paul J. Wattaha, an accountant and Mayor of Rock Springs for 21 years, was charged on over 70 counts of embezzlement by a local druggist in the summer of 1977. The civil portion of the case was settled for \$25,000; while the criminal charges were "never pursued." CBS' "60 Minutes" news program then became interested, and used Luzmoor as their local contact. Two segments of "60 Minutes" covering alleged corruption in Rock Springs and focussing on evidence of apparent blatant prostitution aired in October 1977. The segments also touched on the Mayor's embezzlement case.

FCC Response Concealed?

In December 1977, Tucker told R&R, the City Council of Rock Springs passed and sent the FCC a resolution on the subject of the "60 Minutes" segments requesting equal time on CBS for city representatives under provisions of the Commission's Fairness Doctrine. Nothing more was heard about any FCC response to the resolution until last week. "KRKK News learned that the FCC had responded to that resolution," said Tucker. "But the response had never been made public. The FCC letter was mailed to the city December 5. KRKK News asked City Clerk Don Fornengo for a copy of the letter. Fornengo said he did not have one, and told us that the letter had been personally sent to Mayor Wattaha." The Mayor had claimed that this is not a public document because it is a situation that is in litigation at the moment and

therefore does not need to be revealed to the public. KRKK, according to Tucker, checked Wyoming law and found that "very probably" the letter should be part of the public record, open to inspection.

In any case, Tucker said KRKK "contacted the Head of the FCC Division of Political Broadcasting and the Fairness Doctrine, who told us that Fornengo's statement was 'hogwash' and that the FCC response was not sent to the Mayor as a personal letter." The FCC response, scheduled to be released by the Mayor's office "under pressure" from KRKK News coverage, reportedly stated in no uncertain terms that the city had no grounds for invoking the Fairness Doctrine and did not merit equal time.

Station Official Involved

Following the "60 Minutes" segments, which brought Rock Springs some national notoriety as a "Sin City," Luzmoor said that the city opened hearings on a local club's liquor license. According to Luzmoor, the hearings became an "attempt to vindicate the Mayor." Luzmoor himself was subpoenaed because city officials believed he had been responsible for inducing "60 Minutes" to come to the city, which Luzmoor denies. "I refused to honor the subpoena," he said. "I did not show up. They then got a District Court order for me to appear, and at that point the State Grand Jury meeting in Cheyenne intervened and asked that I be excused from testifying at that hearing, because I was expected to be subpoenaed to testify before the statewide Grand Jury. And," Luzmoor continued, "I have been subpoenaed to testify regarding alleged corruption in government and possible criminal activity in Sweetwater County," where Rock Springs is located. The date for Luzmoor's appearance has not yet been set, but the story of KRKK's involvement with its local issues is apparently far from over.

Wings Album Aired In Advance By Century

In a rapid series of events last week, the Century Broadcasting chain acquired a tape copy of the new Paul McCartney & Wings album, aired it on its four AOR stations, and then dropped it the following day after Wings legal representative Lee Eastman informed them that the songs on the album were not yet licensed for broadcast. Source of the tape, supplied to Century at least a month ahead of the album's official release date, was still undisclosed.

Century National Programming Director Bob Burch put the album on the chain's KSHE/St. Louis, KWST/Los Angeles, WABX/Detroit and KMEL/San Francisco Friday (2-24) immediately after receiving it. When informed, Eastman sent telegrams to the stations asking that they cease and desist from playing the album, as the songs had not been officially licensed and various publishing technicalities had not yet been completed. He announced Wings' management's intention to file lawsuits against all parties playing the album before March 20 if the cease and desist request was not honored.

Burch told R&R: "We have received a request from management and the upper echelon at Capitol Records requesting that we cease further airplay of the album, at which time I did pull the recording from all four stations. This was late Saturday afternoon."

Capitol Vice President of Promotion Bruce Wendell, commenting on the source of the leak, told R&R: "Capitol had absolutely nothing to do with it. There is no way on earth that I would want that released until it's time. If I

had a copy of the album today, legally I would not be permitted to give it to a radio station...The songs have not been cleared for airplay." Wendell declined to speculate as to the actual source, but added that Bartell National Program Director Charlie Lake had told him that he had gotten a copy of the tape and decided not to air

it. The 14-track album, "London Town," which apparently does not contain either side of Wings' recent "Girls' School"/"Mull Of Kintyre" single, generated "phenomenal" listener response from Century station audiences, according to Burch. Wendell said he was "hoping for" an early April release for the album.

INDUSTRY HONORS ARISTA PRESIDENT

In a dramatic speech, Arista President Clive Davis called on the record industry to "rise up and spread the word" about its achievements and growing maturity, comparing recent outside criticism and media portrayals to the McCarthy era and urging industry representatives, "Don't let us be raked over any more." The remarks were made at a tribute to Davis at the Beverly Wilshire Hotel for the pur-

WEA, and thanking the assemblage, Davis' remarks took on a darker tone. "You know that four years ago the situation was quite different than what prevails tonight," the former Columbia Records President said. "I woke up one day and found my world had collapsed around me suddenly without warning. I found out what it was like to be entwined with people who had no care for the human spirit.



Ertegun commented: "We are very pleased and honored that the Scotti Brothers have chosen the Atlantic family to be their partner in this exciting new venture. Over the years, we have been fortunate to participate in the birth and growth of...the Asylum, RSO and Big Tree labels, among others. Now...we believe that Atlantic-Scotti will become a great new musical force, and we look forward enthusiastically to working with the Scottis on this very special project."

NAACP Issues New L.A. Broadcast Demands

The Beverly Hills-Hollywood branch of the NAACP has issued a list of 20 demands, centering on alleged programming and employment discrimination, to the Los Angeles television and radio community. The demands were expected "to be implemented immediately." The chapter had announced plans to file damage suits against over 20 stations last fall (R&R 9-2-77) in an attempt to block license renewals. A new statement from the group's Labor and Industry Committee says: "We note that despite our announced intentions" (referring to the damage suit plans) "it was the decision of the entire industry in the Los Angeles service area to ignore our complaints...we shall continue our efforts to bring to an end the employment atrocities perpetrated by the networks, their owned and operated stations, the Public Broadcasting Service, and the local independent stations." Telegrams requesting federal intervention have been sent to the Attorney General and President Carter.

The demands, aimed mainly at television stations, include calls for hiring of blacks in public relations, censoring, and script supervision

capacities; an increase in black-oriented programming and employment training; and "the opportunity" for black production companies "to develop commercial projects for TV programming as is the ongoing practice for independent Caucasian and Jewish production companies." Following the list of demands, the organization again cites its intent to file license denial petitions if the demands are not implemented.

Foreman Assumes ABC Radio Network Programming Position

Richard A. Foreman has been named Vice President and Director of Programming for the ABC Radio Network. Radio Network President Edward F. McLaughlin, in making the announcement, said that Foreman's "wide and varied experience with a number of the nation's leading broadcast organizations...uniquely qualifies him to direct the

programming efforts of the four ABC Radio Network program services—the American Contemporary, American Entertainment, American FM and American Information Radio Networks."

Copyright Office To Support Performer's Royalties

Register of Copyrights Barbara Ringer will reportedly recommend legislation this week establishing performers' royalties, in a development that surprises few industry observers. The Copyright Office report supporting the concept has been eagerly awaited for some time by proponents of the legislation. Rep. George Danielson of California has introduced a bill requiring broadcasters and other users of

recorded music to pay royalties to record performers and manufacturers, and hearings on the subject are scheduled by Wisconsin Rep. Robert Kastenmeier's Judiciary Subcommittee on Courts, Civil Liberties, and the Administration of Justice. The hearings are set for March 21 in Washington, with Ms. Ringer as a witness, and for March 28 and 29 in Los Angeles, with industry witnesses invited.

Jim Davis New WXYZ Program Director

Jim Davis has been appointed Program Director of WXYZ/Detroit. Joe Baccarella, Operations Director of the ABC owned-and-operated Pop/Adult station, remains in that post as the station moves to a new divided-responsibility approach, with Davis taking charge of programming details and Baccarella handling corporate/administrative/promotion responsibilities.

Davis, who was most recently Program Director at KLIF/Dallas, told R&R: "The corporation made a decision that programming the radio station might encompass a programming team, that maybe two heads are better than one. This move is with Joe's agreement and the General Manager's agreement. I think it's an exciting con-



cept." Baccarella added, "I will be supervising engineering, programming, and the News Department and working directly with programming until Jim gets going. Then I'll be able to spend most of my time with all three departments and can take care of the corporate responsibilities. Now that we have Jim in here we'll be able to achieve greater success."

Another Side To Arbitron/Norfolk Case


Dear R&R:

Your February 17th issue carries a story headlined "Arbitron Wins Copyright Case." Although not factually incorrect, it is incomplete and leaves a wrong impression. WQRK, bound to silence by the agreement, cannot answer. However, WGH, a party to these proceedings, is under no restrictions and your readers should know the facts.

Arbitron initially brought a suit for \$100,000 against WQRK to compensate for the price of the book and damages. Thereupon WQRK countered with a \$100,000 law suit against Arbitron based on unfair pricing and restrictions. After many months of negotiations WQRK dropped their suit and Arbitron settled for a figure less than the attorney fees would have been for WQRK had they gone to trial.

In the case of WQRK they took the least expensive way out in the interest of economy. And the decision to drop the major claim against Arbitron was pretty well decided when the Federal judge separated the two cases, which would have necessitated two long and

Beatles Slide Down Liverpool Poll

The Beatles may be the targets of a worldwide rush of nostalgia and devotion, but in their hometown, they seem to be prophets (or profits) without honor. Although the Liverpool Council finally (and somewhat reluctantly) agreed to construct a statue of the four mop-tops, the Beatles received another blow from the home folks. Local radio outlet Radio Merseyside polled listeners on their all-time favorite oldies, and the Beatles placed only one record ("Hey Jude" at number six) in the top 30, compared to three each for Buddy Holly and Elvis Presley. Records by Procol Harum, instrumental group The Shadows, and even the obscure mid-60's singer Don Charles placed ahead of the Fab Four's entry, and the overall winner was "Runaway" by Del Shannon, who once topped the Beatles on a national tour in 1963 and apparently still does top them in Liverpool.

Bloch Heads Contemporary Music Division At Rogers & Cowan

Paul Bloch has been appointed President of the Contemporary Music Division of Rogers & Cowan, Inc. He has been with the public relations firm for 16 years, having most recently been a Senior Vice-President. He has supervised the operations of the Contemporary Music Division for the past three years, resulting in substantial growth, according to Chairman Henry C. Rogers and President Warren J. Cowan. Before concentrating on the music division, Bloch served as an account executive in all areas of entertainment.

Star Wars Sequel Announced

George Lucas and Lucasfilm Limited has announced the commencement of the first "Star Wars" sequel (untitled as yet), to be distributed again by 20th Century Fox and budgeted at \$10 million. Mark Hamill, Harrison Ford and Carrie Fisher will once again play (respectively) Luke Skywalker, Han Solo, and the Princess Leia; while the script (by longtime science fiction author Leigh Brackett) is taken from the second of twelve stories by Lucas in "The Adventures of Luke Skywalker." Irvin Kershner directs, and production starts this summer.

Sotet Takes Over Mercury National Album Promotion

Jim Sotet has been named to head up National Album Promotion for Phonogram/Mercury, reporting to National Promotion Director Jim Taylor. Sotet will be based in Mercury's Chicago offices and will concentrate on all levels of AOR radio. He was formerly National/Secondary Promotion Manager at Mercury, and before that was Music Director of WABX/Detroit, Program Director at WCMF/Rochester, and PD at WPHD/Buffalo.

Disney Ends Pay TV Opposition, Supplies QUBE

Walt Disney Productions, the last major holdout against cable/pay TV, will license a film package to Warner Cable's QUBE system, currently based in Columbus, Ohio. QUBE's two-way communication ability was reportedly a prime factor in swaying Disney. The company had apparently been waiting for per-program billing to become a reality, and QUBE is the only major system currently offering that service as well. Details of titles offered in the package were not available.

NBC Begins Radio Affiliate/Network Meetings

NBC held meetings with representatives of regional radio affiliates in San Francisco and Arlington, Virginia last week, as part of its third series of sessions designed to promote and increase network programming, news and Co-Op Dateline Services. NBC Radio Network Vice President/General Manager Marion Stephenson and WNBC/New York Program Manager Bob Pittman spoke at the meetings. Meetings are scheduled in Seattle March 29 and Nashville March 31, with five more set for later in the year (see R&R Calendar for details).

Trib Runs With New York Radio

The Trib, New York's newest morning daily newspaper, has started a \$100,000 radio campaign with spots on 13 stations. The paper is promoted in the spots as "the all-day newspaper... as pertinent in the evening as it is in the morning." Following the completion of an introductory TV campaign, the Trib decided on the radio campaign as the best way to keep the audience aware that the paper was "out there." The new paper, claiming circulation of 200,000, also redesigned its logo to appear in bright blue as it continues its fight to establish itself with the Daily News, the Post, and the Times in town.

Akai Okays \$2 Million Radio/Print Push

Akai America Ltd., maker of Akai audio and video products, has launched a year-long \$2 million ad campaign in the radio and print areas. The radio spots will be dealer-tagged and set for important metropolitan markets, with an original musical score. Print ads will be placed in audio/video enthusiast publications and rock magazines, in addition to a few general interest publications.

French Radio Pirates Try To Kick Out The Jamming

15 French pirate radio stations banded together to prevent government broadcast-jamming efforts, according to a *Newsprint* report. Last week the 15 illegal outlets began broadcasting simultaneously, hoping to overtax the government's ability to jam the airwaves. A government financed broadcast monopoly controls the public airwaves in France, but pirates, in a situation similar to mid-sixties England, have been broadcasting offering a wider range of music (mostly pop and rock) and political viewpoints. British pirates, which introduced American-style Top 40 radio to the country, were forced off the air in 1967 by government decrees backed by threats of force, but their efforts led to more BBC pop music programming and eventually the chain of independent stations which competes against the BBC currently. The French pirates apparently have the same goals in mind.

Lin Purchases Shares For Options

Lin Broadcasting announced that it will acquire over 53,000 of its common shares to be utilized for employee stock option and stock purchase plans. More shares may also be purchased at a later date for use in the same plans.

TV News

U.S. Second In World TV Set Standings

The United States ranks second in the world for television set concentration, with 571 sets per 1000 population. Only tiny Monaco, with 640 sets per 1000, topped the U.S. in the UNESCO-organized study. Canada ranked third with 411 per 1000, followed by Sweden with 352, England with 320, Denmark (308), East Germany (307), and West Germany and Finland tied with 306 sets per 1000.

Meanwhile, Arbitron reports that 58.3 million American households have color TV, up 4 million from 1976. 36 markets had 85 percent or above color-set penetration, with Ft. Myers, Florida leading with a 91 percent figure. Las Vegas had 89 percent, and Colorado Springs/Pueblo, San Diego, and Los Angeles all had scored 88 percent penetration. Arbitron's UHF penetration figures show 67.9 million households with UHF capability, up 2.4 million from last year, and representing 93 percent of all TV households in the country. Seven markets have reached the 99 percent mark: Bakersfield, Fresno, Madison, Peoria, Springfield (Massachusetts), Springfield (Illinois), and Youngstown.

ABC Wins; "Three's Company" Hits No. One For First Time

ABC took home another in a series of weekly victories for the week ending February 19 in the Nielsen ratings. The network earned a 22.2 rating, compared to CBS with a 19.9 and NBC's 17.9. The ABC victory was spurred by a relatively new series "Three's Company" attaining its highest rating ever (36.1) and taking first place for the week, even edging the Ali-Spinks championship bout on CBS. "Three's Company" was up against the last episode of NBC's poorly-rated "King" presentation and a CBS documentary on nuclear devastation, with most viewers apparently opting for comedy under the circumstances.

The fight finished second for the week, followed by 3) "Laverne & Shirley" (ABC) 4) "Happy Days" (ABC) 5) "Bob Hope Special" (NBC), as usual finishing in fine rating shape 6) "MASH" (CBS), with one of its best showings and an encouraging sign for its recent move to Monday night 7) "Love Boat" (ABC), a special presentation for Valentine's Day 8) "60 Minutes" (CBS) 9) "Soap" (ABC), one of its best showings, but still a considerable drop-off from its "Three's Company" lead-in and 10) "Charlie's Angels" (ABC). John Denver's Australian special (ABC) ended up in 27th place with a 19.8 rating.

CBS managed to break ABC's normal stranglehold on the New York and Los Angeles markets in Arbitron's rating week ending February 17, thanks largely to the Ali-Spinks fight. The boxing extravaganza tied for first in New York with "Three's Company," followed by 3) "Soap" 4) "Happy Days" and "Laverne & Shirley" in a tie 6) "Charlie's Angels" and CBS' "All In The Family" tied 8) "Family" and the "Love Boat Valentine Special" tied (both ABC) and in tenth place, a tie between the regular showing of "Love Boat" and "Welcome Back Kotter."

"Three's Company" topped the Los Angeles ratings, with "Happy Days" in second and "Laverne & Shirley" in third. NBC managed to crack the top ten with its "Bob Hope Special" in fourth, followed by 5) Ali-Spinks 6) "Love Boat Special," "Soap," and CBS' "MASH" in a three-way knot 9) "Charlie's Angels" and 10) "All In The Family."

Roger Davis is the new Music Director of WOW/Omaha, Ne.






This is it! This is the weekend that represents a lot of careful planning and anticipation. This is Convention '78, Radio and Records' fourth annual gathering. The thousands of us gathered this weekend in Dallas represent a multi-billion dollar segment of American business. The music, which serves as a common bond for us all, makes this a business that is certainly a pleasure. So, welcome to Dallas!

For those of you who cannot be with us, we will miss you, but next week's issue of R&R will feature complete coverage of Convention '78.

Portland Flies A KYTE

Close observers of the Northwest are well aware of the current battle being staged in Portland, Oregon. KGW, longtime leader in Portland, is now facing a new challenger.

Last May 1, KYTE was born under the direction of Mike Davis, Program Director. KYTE, formerly the Pop/Adult-News-Sports KOIN, became a full-fledged Top 40 station in direct competition with KGW.

Mike Davis knew he had his work cut out for him when he took on KGW and he has the utmost respect for them, "They do everything right. There isn't anything I can find that they do wrong." So how do you fight an opponent as formidable as KGW? For Mike the answer was in "positioning."

While KGW was "tight and consistent, very professional," KYTE took a different approach. Mike told his new jock staff, "I wanted a good professional-type sound, but I wanted our people to really be 'people.' I encourage them to show their emotions. Get 'up' if they feel like it, have a good time!" The staff currently includes morning man Don Wright, originally from KGW and KISN. Middays, J.J. Jeffrey from WKY; afternoons, Pat Clark; nights, Ron Leonard "the Boogie Man" from KCBQ; late nights, Tom Brooks; and Music Director Karen Knight handles the all night show.

Mike approaches the Top 40 format with less regimentation than most. As he explained, "We threw out the liner-cards. We give the staff 'promo memos' twice a week along with 'activity memos' and from those, they prepare and write their own shows. They write their own lines as far as promos go. I just tell them the important points that must be covered and they work it from there."

KYTE does use jingles out of stop sets into music, but the personalities do not talk over the intros following jingles. Promotionally, the station does frequent "sales promotions" involving clients. The cooperation between sales and programming is considerable and has allowed KYTE to increase their billing even before the first rating readout arrived. Mike explained, "We try to make the sales promotions sound like 'programming promotions,' so they are very effective both for the station and the client."

Research has played a major role in the early success KYTE has enjoyed, but as opposed to "call-out" research, Mike prefers the use of "focus groups." Mike explains his preference for this type of research: "I like (focus groups) because you can get a feel for how the total presentation of our music strikes them as a group and individually. It's one-on-one and you can usually tell when you are getting a true reaction and when you aren't. We even occasionally play them airchecks of different jocks to see how they feel about one guy versus another."

The bottom line is that after six months under a new Program Director, KYTE debuted in the October-November Arbitron with a 7.5 share of the total 12 plus audience. KGW still leads the Portland market with a 10.1 and Country-formatted KWJJ is second with a 8.5. KYTE's debut is impressive, especially in view of KGW's long-held strength. The Portland radio battle promises to be one to keep an eye on as we move toward the Spring sweep. Mike Davis feels confident about KYTE, but you can be sure that Mike Phillips, Program Director of KGW, is not about to surrender, nor is Michael O'Brien at KPAM.

McCartney To Program B-100

As tipped last week (Street Talk 2/24), C.C. McCartney has been named the new Program Director of B-100(KFMB-FM)/San Diego. C.C. will take over from Bobby Rich, who recently took over 99-X/New York City.

C.C. McCartney most recently was the Program Director of KTLK/Denver, but he has been in the Denver market for the last two years. C.C. told me, "Bobby Christian, Rick Brady and I started 99KX. Then last year I came across the street to KTLK." That Spring book, April-May '77, KTLK beat 96KX for the first time.

Coming from a winning radio station to another winning radio station is an enviable position to be in, but also a tricky one. I asked C.C. how he felt about the takeover in San Diego: "I feel that I'll just have to size things up. There shouldn't really be any changes made. It's going the right direction now and Bobby (Rich) and I program very much alike. It's almost amazing when you listen to the

two stations, (B-100 & KTLK), because the similarities are there. It's real close." Rick Brady becomes the new Program Director at KTLK with Mike Shannon in as Rick's assistant. Randy Jay continues as KTLK's Music Director.

You know who you are." Industry's "Special Mission" Davis then turned to a more general topic. "All of you know that our industry is so special...so unique, and yet our industry is in need of all of us to care about its fate. We all can't afford for our voices to be muffled now. We suffer so much criticism and are frequently painted in such crass terms in the media that we become non-recognizable, and yet so many sit back and don't fight back. Executives are often painted in sleazy terms. Rock is considered child-like...a passing fancy. Artists are frequently painted as noncommunicative addicts and bad societal influences. And yet we sit back in disarray and so few of us stand up to be counted and speak out...

"Look what we give to the world. We should be ever so proud...You all have a special mission. You should never forget that you are dealing with today's creators, the minds and talents who are affecting the lives of countless millions everywhere. The theme of tonight is caring. Well, care more! Care more about the industry in which we work. Don't let us be raked over any more. An industry which has contributed so much has come of age, and the world must know it as it exists, not as it is supposed to exist. There needs to be a clarion call for all of you to rise up and spread the word. You all deserve it. The public deserves it. Music deserves it."

Following the dinner and speech, Davis was saluted musically by Barry Manilow, Melissa Manchester, Gladys Knight & the Pips, and Andy Williams.

The tribute, sixth in the series, reportedly raised the largest amount of money for the City of Hope in the dinners' history.

Grammys A "Mockery"?

Dear R&R:

The Eagles must really have not expected to win the Grammy award for "Hotel California."

To put "Hotel California" in the same category as "You Light Up My Life," "Evergreen," "Don't It Make My Brown Eyes Blue," and "Blue Bayou" is a mockery of the whole music industry.

It's time for the recording industry to recognize that "Rock" is a viable

force. I do not advocate the abolition of the "Pop" vocal awards. There is a difference between "Rock" and "Pop," however, and the Grammy awards committee doesn't seem to understand that! R&R and other leading trade papers now have a "Pop/Adult" section in addition to a "Rock" or "Top 30" section. Perhaps 50 percent of the music that is currently being programmed on contemporary and AOR stations is automatically disqualified from Grammy nominations.

Even the Country category had mostly "crossover" nominations that were also programmed on "Pop/Adult" and "Rock" stations.

I fail to see how Debby Boone, Shaun Cassidy, Andy Gibb, Steven Bishop, and Foreigner could possibly be grouped into a single category for "Best New Artist."

The Grammy awards committee should create a new "Rock" category to reflect music as it really is. "Till Pan Alley" was a dead concept long before the Grammy award was conceived, 20 years ago.







Columbus: A Changing AOR Market

Longtime Columbus AOR station WCOL-FM has announced an upcoming change in call letters and format. MD Mike Perkins spoke of the new format in general terms, saying "it will be much tighter than it is now but we'll still be aware of album product. It might be a graft between AOR and a list."

Perkins claims that no one on the staff will be let go. "The staff was all interviewed on a one-to-one basis," he explained, "and they all said that they could cope with it, and they all seem enthusiastic about it."

According to Perkins, the changes are not the result of poor ratings. "It's not a turn-tail-and-run sort of thing. We're just trying to look ahead to longterm survival." Perkins said that station management feels that "the financial base for AOR programming is not as big in this market as it was before. The music and buying tastes are getting pretty conservative."

Tom Teuber, PD at competing Columbus AOR station QFM96 sees the market differently. "I agree that this is a conservative market. Obviously the music has to reflect the community. But it's no secret that our Abrams Superstars format is a fairly conservative format, so it fits the area. And one thing you have to consider, even though Arbitron doesn't, is that there's fifty thousand Ohio State students here. Even though they don't get the diaries they certainly patronize our advertisers. You can't ignore them."

Teuber added, "I think WMMS' success in nearby Cleveland has demonstrated to all of us no matter what the market that AOR is the format of the future. I think there's still tremendous growth potential for this format in any market, I don't care where it is. I've always quoted Tom Donahue when he was at KSAN, who said, 'I consider this a middle of the road station; we're just in the middle of a different road.'"




Inside Nashville
