Changes At WLUP Empire

BULLET TO KPRI, MICHAELS LOOP PD

Jesse Bullet, recently departed PD at WLUP/Chicago (R&R 11-23), has accepted the newly-created position of Operations Manager/Assistant Station Manager at KPRI-KOGO/San Diego. WLUP afternoon personality Mitch Michaels has been named PD at the "Loop," his first programming job.

Bullet, who programmed KPRI in the past, said he would be supervising the programming of the AOR-formatted station, consulting Pop/Adult KOGO, and coordinating promotions for both stations. Bullet told R&R, "Dex Allen (GM for the stations) is a great teacher, and he made me a real sweetheart of a deal. I could have had other programming jobs, but this was special. I'll never have an opportunity like this again."

Allen commented, "Jesse's return to KPRI in this newly-created position will allow an extremely talented programmer the opportunity to grow into top-level management. I have the utmost confidence in Jesse and his management abilities. This new management team, which includes our GSM, Ron Henninger, will allow me to put my energies in the special areas that need attention the most." Allen stressed that despite Bullet's involvement in KPRI's programming, current PD Ern Gladden will remain in that position.

Michaels Makes Debut

Though new WLUP PD Michaels is new to programming, he has 10 years of mostly AOR experience, in Cleveland and for the last eight years in Chicago at WXRT, WDAI, WGLD, WKQX, and WLUP. "I think that's one of the major reasons I got the job," he told R&R. "I know the market and the competition. It's tough for someone to come in from out of town and assimilate all that information."

Michaels continued, "I foresee no major musical changes. Sky Daniels will continue as MD and his influence will be greatly increased. The staff here . . . is all ready to go strongly into the 80's, and I think that energy makes us ready to take on anyone. Let 'em come on."

DAHL FORMS NEW NETWORK, FOUR-HOUR MORNING SHOW FEATURED

WLUP/Chicago morning man Steve Dahl is a partner in a planned new network called the Alternative Radio Network. The first program will be a four-hour daily syn-

dedicated morning show by Dahl, originating in Chicago at WLUP, although he will do the show periodically in other affiliated markets. Dahl's partners are former Jet Records GM Bryan Blatt, ex-WLUP Promotions Director Dave Logan, and Pat McNally, formerly Sales Manager at WWWW/Detroit. Lee Abrams will also be involved in an unspecified capacity, Dahl told R&R.

Dahl hopes to launch the morning show March 1, with other programming ideas in the works. Affiliated stations will be announced in January. "We want to treat the United States as you would one city," Dahl told R&R. "We want to bring everyone together, take calls from all over the country. I've had this idea for three or four years. Traveling around to so many markets to promote my record made me realize how many stations are ready for more personality. It's a big move. I couldn't afford to do it if I didn't think this was the right time."

Dahl, who has also completed his first TV comedy-music special for WMAQ-TV/Chicago (airing 12-22), said he was setting up national sponsors for the syndicated morning show, and would probably provide a newscaster for stations who wanted it, but would break away for local news and spots as well. He will continue his WLUP morning show for the time being, and said the station would carry the networked program, adding, "Everything's cool with them."

REYNOLDS NAMED PRESIDENT, KALE PROMOTED

Golden West Restructures Top Level

Golden West Broadcasters has restructured its top executive tier, with John Reynolds becoming President/Chief Operating Officer from an Executive VP position. In addition, Golden West named three Division Presidents: Richard P. Kale for the Radio Division (formerly VP), Anthony B. Casara for Golden West Television (from VP/GM of KTLA-TV/Los Angeles, a position he maintains), and former Warner Cable QUBE VP/Programming Michael E. Marcovsky heading Golden West

Subscription Television.

Kale told R&R that the promotions resulted from Golden West's recent growth, adding that he will now serve on an Executive Committee with Reynolds, Casara, and Marcovsky. "My primary responsibility is all the radio operations," Kale said, "but in addition I'm involved in the decision-making processes in television. I'm delighted. The division is really starting to show great promise. This is the job I've been working toward over the past 11 years."

Year-Round Arbitron Sweeps Headed For Top Three Markets

Extended Measurement, Arbitron's technique of measuring radio virtually year-round, should soon be in use in New York, Los Angeles, Chicago, and San Diego. Pending receipt of signed contracts, it appears that a majority of subscribers in these markets have given their approval to 48 week-per-year ratings. The markets will go through a regular Jan./Feb. survey next year (which will end February 13) to be followed shortly thereafter by the Extended Measurement survey. The continuous sweeps will begin February 28 and go through November 26, 1980.

Extended Measurement involves taking the sample normally used on a four-week sweep and extending it over a 12-week period. In essence, the broadcasters in the

new EM markets will be involved in quarterly ratings periods, with subscribers receiving monthly trend reports from Arbitron in addition to the overall quarterly book. Extended Measurement was begun in the Spring '78 survey and has been tested in a 24-week mode (two 12-week sweeps per year) in Seattle, New Orleans, and Indianapolis. Evidently the tests have been going well enough for Arbitron to offer the new technique to the top markets.

According to Arbitron spokesperson Connie Anthes, Arbitron's marketing plans call for Extended Measurement to be offered to all markets with a metro in-tab goal of 1200. These additional markets would see the longer surveys implemented next fall, when the survey would begin September 4.

EXCLUDES BROADCASTING FROM NEW AMENDMENTS

Van Deerlin Calls For Presidential Equal Time Exemption

Continuing a fight for what he calls equality between print and the electronic press, Rep. Lionel Van Deerlin (D-CA) introduced legislation Tuesday, December 11, to repeal Section 312 (a) 7 of the Communications Act. If enacted it would allow stations to disregard equal time considerations when airing *nonpaid* broadcasts of any candidate for President or Vice President.

While admitting he's anticipating only partial support from his Senate counterpart, Communications Subcommittee Chairman Fritz Hollings, Van Deerlin said he's optimistic that a compromise can be reached to suspend equal time requirements for broadcasters wanting to offer free time to Presidential and Vice Presidential candidates during next year's election.

"Since Congress created the problem, Congress should deal with it," Van Deerlin said at a National Press Club breakfast, alluding to a 1971 amendment to the Communications Act that currently makes Presidential and Vice Presidential debates, documentaries, and extended news coverage subject to equal time considerations. The present law takes away journalists' ability to use their independent judgment, he said.

Let The Courts Decide Carter-Mondale Complaint

Calling it a political decision, Van Deerlin criticized the FCC's 4-3 decision to force the networks to sell the Carter-Mondale Campaign Committee a half hour of time, because it was decided along party lines. The courts should decide the constitutionality of paid political broadcasts, he said, noting his preference for increased diversity of media outlets to make campaigns less dependent on network exposure.

New Bill Will Omit Broadcast Issues

After an unsuccessful attempt to rewrite the Communications Act of 1934, Van Deerlin and four Communications Subcommittee members introduced legislation Thursday, December 13, to amend the law. However, the proposed new bill focuses specifically on establishing competition in the telephone industry, and Van Deerlin said he'll block all attempts to muddy the waters with broadcast issues.

Cosponsors of the new legislation are ranking Commerce Committee Republican Rep. Jim Broyhill (R-NC), ranking Republican Subcommittee member Jim Collins (R-TX), Rep. Al Swift (D-WA), and Rep. Tim Wirth (R-CO).



Radio Solicits Support For Iran Hostages

Radio has embarked upon a nationwide letter-writing campaign to express stateside support for the 50 U.S. citizens currently being held hostage in Iran. The campaign originated with KMPC/Los Angeles morning man Robert W. Morgan. Fearing that the hostages were deliberately being kept unaware of the extent of American sympathy for their position, he came up with the concept of listeners sending Christmas cards to the U.S. embassy in Tehran.

Upon formulation of the plan, Morgan called fellow morning men Don Imus at WNBC/New York, Charlie Van Dyke at WRKO/Boston, and Ed Schwartz at WIND/Chicago, as well as those at the remainder of the Golden West stations (WTWR/Detroit's Ted Anthony, WCXI/Detroit's Deano Day, KVI/Seattle's Hardwick, KSFO/San Francisco's Gene Nelson, and KEX/Portland's Jim Hollister),

Lund Returns As WNBC PD

John Lund has once again taken the position of Program Director at WNBC/New York, replacing Bob Pittman, who recently joined Warner Cable (R&R 11-30). After programming WNBC before its switch from Pop/Adult to Top 40, Lund programmed for Rust Communications and at WISN/Milwaukee and most recently at KHOW/Denver.

WNBC GM Robert Sherman told R&R, "Some of the country's most renowned and successful programmers have expressed their availability for the program directorship of WNBC. We are delighted that from among those, John Lund has chosen to accept this assignment. John's background and past successes put him in an eminently unique position to take us from the excellent positioning Bob Pittman has left us with to the final home stretch - which is to be the mass appeal AM radio station in New York."

KHOW GM Sam Sherwood commented, "It's like going back home for him," and added that Assistant PD Brian Scott will become interim PD while the station looks for a "top-flight PD." Lund, who was unavailable for comment, takes up his new responsibilities December 17.

and asked that they too enlist the support of their listeners. According to Morgan, U.S. postal authorities in Chicago reported receiving 300,000 cards addressed to the U.S. embassy in Tehran within three days after Schwartz began soliciting his listeners' support.

Other stations joined in the expression of American concern, although their efforts were not always related to the above-mentioned campaign. FM100/Memphis PD Gary Guthrie reported gathering "thousands" of cards for the hostages; KFQD/Anchorage PD Tom Rivers and WHLM-AM-FM/Bloomsburg, PA PD Tom Benson also solicited large quantities.

Related Efforts

Meanwhile, KNUS/Dallas staff members volunteered to man the phones and solicit listeners' names to be placed on a telegram, which they had a station representative hand-deliver to the U.N. Iranian mission. The telegram, accepted by Ambassador Richard Petree of the U.S. mission to the U.N., contained 13,035 signatures, expressing KNUS listeners' support of President Carter's handling of the situation thus far. KNUS PD Jim White told R&R that the sta-

tion was currently requesting listeners to send in postcards, authorizing KNUS to add their names to follow-up telegrams, which the station intends to continue sending on a weekly basis until the hostages are freed.

WROV/Roanoke, VA took even more drastic action. Program Director Bart Prater drew up a petition demanding the hostages' release, added letters of support from listeners, chartered a twin-engine plane, and delivered the entire package to the Iranian embassy.

Beyond the nationwide Christmas card campaign and related shows of support, radio continued to score journalistic coups, as KEZY/Anaheim News Director Paul Crosswhite succeeded in placing a call to the U.S. embassy in Tehran and spoke with one of the students holding the Americans hostage. The student, identified only as "Y," assured Crosswhite on-air that the hostages are all in good health, that they still remained at the embassy, and denied reports that they were being held at gunpoint. However, "Y" did confirm that the embassy had been lined with explosives in order to ward off a possible CIA attack.

LOCAL AD SALES SET RECORD

'78 Radio Profits Up 26% Over '77

Profits, revenues, and expenses were all up for the radio industry, according to the latest FCC financial data. Total profits before taxes to commercial radio stations in 1978 were \$311 million, up 26% over 1977.

Total sales to advertisers were \$2.9 billion, up almost 16% from last year. More of those sales were from local and regional buys than ever before. Local ad sales hit an all-time high of \$2.2 billion, up 17%. National and regional spot sales were also up 13.5% to \$592 million.

But as revenues and profits soared, so did expenses. They hit an all-time high of \$2.3 billion, up 14.5%.

Networks Are The Losers

Although spot sales were generally up, radio networks had their worst year since the 1974 recession. Total network sales to advertisers were \$126 million, up only 7% from last year. By contrast, 1977 figures showed a 28% increase over 1976. Profits for the eight radio networks surveyed by the FCC (CBS, NBC, Mutual, Mutual Black,

and ABC's Contemporary, Information, Entertainment and FM networks) were down 39%.

R&R RATES EEO AS TOP WASHINGTON STORY

1979 Marks Biggest Push Ever For EEO Enforcement

During the year, broadcasters reported a greater percentage of minorities working at their stations than ever before, but the FCC still wasn't satisfied. Despite legislative proposals that would have taken EEO enforcement away from the FCC and complaints from broadcasters that filling out EEO forms is an undue burden, the FCC reaffirmed its strong commitment to EEO.

The FCC started off the year by issuing five short-term renewals in January and 19 conditional renewals. *In all, 10 short-term renewals were issued in 1979 and 83 stations were issued conditional renewals for EEO shortcomings.*

Commission Says No More Upgrading

In July, broadcasters were given further evidence of what one Washington communications attorney called a demonstration of the Commission's preoccupation with EEO. An involved attorney told R&R the case involving WHAM & WHFM/Rochester, NY put all licensees on notice that the Commission would no longer permit post-term upgrading to compensate for an inadequate EEO record during the license renewal term under review. In effect, the FCC was saying that licensees would run on their existing records.

Also this year:

- Chairman Ferris asked for and got money from Congress to establish an EEO Enforcement Branch in Dick Shiben's Broadcast Bureau. Glenn Wolfe was named to head the branch and given authority to hire five staff members, expected on board next month.
- An EEO Enforcement and Minority Enterprise Division was created in Bob Mann's Public Affairs Bureau. Ed Cardona was appointed Chief and Barbara Moran, a black woman, named Deputy Chief. The division informs radio stations, minorities, and the public about policies and programs which affect them, such as distress sales, tax certificates and minority loans.
- An agreement was reached between the FCC and the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission (EEOC) giving the FCC access to EEOC files on complaints against radio stations with 15 or more employees.

FCC Begins Crackdown On EEO Violations

JANUARY: In one sweeping action, the Commission hit five stations with short-term renewals for lack of females and minorities in top level positions. Nineteen other stations received renewals conditional to submitting frequent EEO progress reports. (See also R&R's top 1979 Washington story.)

In other actions:

- The court restored the FCC's discretion to define "substantial service" for incumbent licensees challenged at renewal time.
- Consumer activist Ralph Nader announced a campaign to involve the public in opposing Rep. Lionel Van Deerlin's (D-CA) proposed rewrite.
- The Commission announced consideration of part-time use of commercial radio stations by minorities.

Carnegie's Million \$ Recommendations Fizzle Fast

FEBRUARY: The Carnegie Commission's "Report on the Future of Public Broadcasting" suggested the current noncommercial broadcast system be restructured. Recommendations included the establishment of a program endowment, replacement of the Corporation for Public Broadcasting (CPB) with a private, nonprofit organization governed by Presidentially-appointed members, and creation by Congress of a spectrum fee charged to commercial radio stations to support public broadcasters. Reaction in all sectors was "so what?"

In other actions:

- In her final speech, FCC Commissioner Margita White criticized the FCC Chairman's Office for having too much power.
- NPR received an okay to build a \$16.6 million satellite system using "Westar."
- NTIA called for the use of FM directional antennas

as another possible means of squeezing more stations onto the dial.

- WSDR/Sterling, IL gained the right to broadcast weekly commentary from Radio Moscow under First Amendment protection. Other stations followed suit.
- Rep. Paul Findley (D-IL) introduced a nighttime radio bill to allow daytimers to operate full-time. Nothing has happened on it.

Senate Gets Started On Its Own Revision To The Communications Act

MARCH: Senators Fritz Hollings (D-SC) and Barry Goldwater (R-AZ) introduced separate legislation to amend the Communications Act. Both Senators favored revising the original law as opposed to the total rewrite proposed in the House.

The Hollings bill (S.611) would set fees at 20 times a full-time broadcaster's 60-second spot rate and 10 times for daytimers, while Goldwater's bill (S.622) would charge only the cost of regulation, which would be much lower.

Far more active in pursuing legislation, Goldwater and S.622 co-sponsor Sen. Harrison Schmitt

(R-NM) recirculated their bill with revisions in November for comment. The revised version continued to call for indefinite radio licenses and prohibiting the FCC from regulating formats, logging, news and public affairs programs, ascertainment, commercials, and from enforcing the Fairness Doctrine.

In other actions:

- Rep. Lionel Van Deerlin (D-CA) introduced a new bill (H.R. 3333) that proposed to completely rewrite the Communications Act of 1934. His co-sponsors were Rep. Jim Collins (R-TX) and Rep. James Broyhill (R-NC).
- Rep. Van Deerlin keynoted the R&R Convention in Los Angeles from ABC studios in Washington via satellite on a 20-foot screen.
- The White House introduced its Regulation Reform Act. Specifically, President Carter proposed to fund public participation in agencies' actions to the tune of \$20 million a year.
- Broadcasters assembled in Washington, D.C. shortly after the farmers left to rally against over-regulation. As with the farmers, the effect has been minimal.

First Ever Distress Sale Approved

APRIL: The FCC okayed its first distress sale under its 11-month old policy to WAEO/Rinelander, WI. WAEO was sold for 54% of the market value to a 100% minority-owned company. The only precedent to come from the decision required that all future distress sale applications be accompanied by two professional appraisals of stations' worth.

In other actions:

- President Carter submitted legislation banning easy search and seizure tactics on broadcast and newspaper journalist's work. If enacted, the law would revise a court decision in the Zucher vs. Stanford Daily case.
- The Supreme Court sent the blanket music license case back to the U.S. Court of Appeals for review.
- The U.S. Postal Service, after great broadcaster outcry, reached a consent agreement with Pacific West in its mail fraud activities.

FCC Takes Licenses, Imposes Program Reports

MAY: The FCC cracked down on stations for fraudulent billing and other violations by revoking their licenses. WIGO/Atlanta (lottery), KDRG/Deer Lodge, MT (transfer of station license and falsification of station logs), and WJPD/Ishpeming, MI (fraudulent billing) had their licenses revoked; and WKND/Windsor, CT was set for hearing on fraudulent billing practices.

Sonderling Broadcasting Corp.'s WOL-AM/Washington was designated for hearing in May on charges of payola and plugola, ending a three-year investigation. That decision, however, did not affect a proposed acquisition of the Sonderling Corporation by Viacom International. Neither did it affect the sale of WOL to a local black group (FCC approval pending) at a distress sale price.

In a separate action, WPXY/Rochester, NY was required to furnish quarterly reports on public affairs programming for failure to meet ascertainment requirements.

Testimonies Revealed Minimal Support For The Rewrite

JUNE: Broadcasters, labor unions, citizens' groups all opposed the Van Deerlin proposal to eliminate the "public interest" standard contained in the original 1934 communications law. All came to Washington during May and June

to tell House Communications Subcommittee members their concern. Over in the Senate, meanwhile, Sen. Barry Goldwater warned FCC Chairman Charles Ferris that he would continue to push for changes in the law because the Commission was dragging its feet on deregulation.

Van Deerlin's Rewrite Dead

JULY: After two years of discussions, H.R. 3333 (Rewrite) died from lack of attention from House Communications Subcommittee members and lack of support from broadcasters and citizens' groups. Later, Subcommittee member Rep. Al Swift (D-WA), advocated substituting a dollar requirement for the Commission's time requirement to measure broadcasters' public service.

Supreme Court Okayed Closed Courtrooms

During July, the Supreme Court declared there was no constitutional right for the press or public to attend criminal trials. In its Gannett decision, it upheld lower court judges' controversial authority to close doors at pretrial hearings.

Three months later, the High Court agreed to hear a case which it was hoped might clarify that decision, involving Richmond Newspapers and a Virginia judge who barred press and public from a murder trial. Also in October, an Arkansas reporter opened a courtroom by reading a statement asking to have his station's attorney make a case for keeping the courtroom open to the press.

By November, motions to close courtrooms were requested in over 100 cases across the country, with judges granting them about half the time.

In a separate action, the U.S. Court of Appeals ruled the FCC wasn't holding enough hearings on sales of radio stations with unique formats which proposed to change programming. NAB, NRBA, and communications lawyers criticized the ruling.

FCC Criticized For Lack Of Planning And Low Morale

AUGUST: The Government Accounting Office (GAO) issued a report highly critical of the FCC in many areas, specifically its lack of planning and low morale. FCC Chairman Charles Ferris reacted quickly, agreeing in part. Later, he instituted several programs to enhance communications among high-level executives, including a weekend retreat and hiring an outside consulting firm, River At Sunrise Institute, for \$100,000. Rep. Van Deerlin called for an investigation.

In other actions:

- FCC Commissioner Tyrone Brown supported breaking up AM/FM combos.
- FCC defended decision on eight California stations in violation of Fairness Doctrine when challenged by courts.
- A study demonstrating small markets don't suffer from lack of competition was prepared by NRBA.
- RKO announced its entry into radio networking.

FCC Unveiled Radio Deregulation Options

SEPTEMBER: The FCC issued a Notice of Inquiry on radio deregulation to analyze technical rules, policies, and regulation. Immediate concerns were levied from Ralph Nader and the National Black Media Coalition (NBMC), who blasted the Commission's suggestions. Broadcasters saluted the FCC proposals.

During its debate, individuals voiced different feelings about deregulation. Commissioners Anne Jones and Abbott Washburn questioned the defense of inadequacies at license renewal time using proposed new "marketplace guidelines." Commissioner Tyrone Brown preferred to substitute a fixed minimum percentage of locally produced public interest programs, rather than eliminate existing nonentertainment guidelines altogether.

What emerged from the Broadcast Bureau were six options, including Brown's, adopted for comments. FCC Chairman Charles Ferris summarized his feelings as in favor of increasing radio outlets, diversifying ownership and employment, and the Commission presumption that consumer demand be the replacement for regulation.

The Commission later held public workshops in Boston, Houston, Sacramento, and Wheeling, WV to explain the deregulation proposals and educate the public on how to comment.

In other actions:

- The FCC decided the National Black Media Coalition (NBMC) lacked "standing" (i.e., did not have a significant number of members) and upheld an earlier decision involving WHMI/Howell, MI. In 1977, WHMI asked for a special small market ascertainment exemption, which the Commission granted in 1979 and which NBMC attempted to block. WHMI required a special waiver since it was located within Detroit's SMSA. The FCC granted the waiver initially because Howell has a population of under 10,000 and was located barely within the SMSA.
- FCC said it might consider a legal lottery system for comparative hearing cases for construction permits. Consideration was triggered by controversy of a new FC station in Media, PA which had previously been awarded to Greater Media.
- The Senate rejected Federal Election Committee (FEC) regulations to keep political debates off commercial radio and TV. FCC Chairman Ferris supported the Senate decision.
- FCC granted additional tax certificates to minority interests in radio station sales to promote minority ownership: KODA/Houston sold by Taft Broadcasting Corp. to Spanish Broadcasting Corp., and WPDQ/Jacksonville, sold by Mel-Lin, Inc. to BENI of Jacksonville, Inc.

FCC Gives Green Light To Radio Nets' Use Of Satellites

OCTOBER: The FCC said commercial radio networks could begin use of direct satellite-to-stations transmission. As a result, broadcasters overwhelmed dish manufacturers with orders while networks considered share use.

Meanwhile, NPR began its first transmission via satellite to affiliates' earth terminals in Oregon and Utah.

Nine Kiloherz Debate Staged

By October, government tests at three stations measuring the difficulty of reducing AM spacing from 10 to 9 kHz had been completed. The results demonstrated only slight difficulty in making the switch, but showed a need to perform changes on a case-by-case basis.

Later, the National Telecommunications Information Administration (NTIA), which had conducted the tests with the assistance of the FCC's Field Office Division, admitted it erred in evaluating data on car receivers, but said that information was not used in compiling the report and therefore the report stood complete.

NTIA got the ball rolling in January when it asked the FCC for a rulemaking advocating the reduction. While not going that far, the Commission did issue a Notice of Inquiry.

Stereo Goes Nowhere — All Year Long

Meanwhile, AM stereo remained stalled all year awaiting a 9 kHz decision by the FCC, despite Broadcast Bureau Chief Dick Shiben's statement that additional engineers would be hired to complete its overall evaluation of 9 kHz and its relationship to stereo.

In August, the Senate appropriated \$440,000 for a study which the FCC authorized in November. In addition, the FCC in September also awarded a contract to Stillman, Moffet & Kowalski, consulting engineers, to assess the cost to broadcasters of converting to 9 kHz. The nine-month contract totaled \$228,583.

NTIA Chief Henry Geller and White House Advisor Steve Simmons assured NAB board members in October that reduced spacing would produce only 400 to 700 new stations.

Car radio manufacturers Tandy Corp. and General Electric asked the FCC to allow advanced notice to make new receivers if FCC adopts 9 kHz. In a turn of events, clears finally united with daytimers, saying reducing 9 kHz channel spacing would be a far better means of fulfilling the demand for new stations than breaking up clear channel stations, but still held strong reservations, and like most other broadcasters urged the FCC not to make a hasty decision.

In other actions:

- NBMC (National Black Media Coalition) accused certain stations of manipulating playlists to discriminate against black artists.
- NRBA scoffed at rumors of NAB/NRBA merger.
- Rep. Ron Mottl (D-OH) introduced a bill to have broadcasters make profits public.

WARC '79: Was Anything Accomplished?

NOVEMBER: It was to have concluded by the end of November, but actual actions weren't finalized until late last week. Between 1400 and 2000 delegates from around the world attended the 11-week World Administrative Radio Conference (WARC), which met to discuss the feasibility of a technical reallocation of the radio spectrum.

Although in one sense of the word "accomplish," there were numerous actions, in real terms the votes led toward a more *status quo* preservation of the spectrum because of the balance of forces among countries, the extreme difficulty of restructuring what's already in place, and finally the sheer number of delegates.

It was the first such conference in 20 years and although the next world meeting is 15 years away, a regional Western Hemisphere conference is scheduled for March, 1980.

In other actions:

- Rep. Bob Kastenmeier (D-WI)'s Subcommittee held hearings on "performer's royalty" during late November. Broadcasters continued heavy opposition. In August, a bill was introduced in the Senate by Harrison Williams (D-NJ) identical to Rep. George Dan-ielson's (D-CA) House bill.
- U.S. Court of Appeals upheld FCC decision to refuse license of WBBL/Berlin, NH for double billing, calling for future criminal prosecutions.
- Sen. Barry Goldwater circulated new draft of S.622, a revision of the Communications Act of 1934.







Anyone interested in being on the Big 89 "skywave," which is said to reach into about 48 states, should contact Mr. Gehron with a tape and resume.

MCA Distributing closed its branches in San Francisco, Houston, Charlotte and Hartford last week. All sales and promotion people attached to the four outlets will now operate from their residences. MCA Distributing President Al Bergano said, "The physical structures have been eliminated in these areas because these were flat markets and our projections showed no real growth patterns over the next three or four years."

Three former Infinity staffers have moved to Arista, as part of the latter company's restructuring. Joel Newman has been named Arista's Associate Director of National Promotion based in L.A. Greg Feldman becomes Arista's Seattle rep, and Rob Sides joins Arista in Houston.

John Mack Flanagan, formerly of KFRC/San Francisco, is now a member of the KCBS-FM/San Francisco air staff.

The EMI-Thorn deal was completed last week (12-5) following the approval of both companies' stockholders. The \$340 million sale gives birth to a new company to be called Thorn-EMI Ltd.

... Gathers No Moss

Tom Owens, PD of KZEW/Dallas, has learned a valuable lesson. He was quoted in the Random Notes section of Rolling Stone as saying that KZEW played no female artists on the station.

Well, what really happened is explained by Tom "Ellen Foley came to the city and we weren't playing her record at that time. We went to dinner and talked. One of the promo guys must have told her we weren't playing any females. She apparently passed that along to Rolling Stone. They called me and printed about 50% of what I said.

"The point I was trying to make is that there are fewer females who are currently successful in recording rock 'n' roll music. So, there's an intrinsically diminished share of airplay. But that doesn't mean we don't play females."

Will Tom talk to Rolling Stone again? "Trying to relay to a consumer-oriented publication something to do with the process of choosing music for a radio station is like trying to teach trigonometry to a three-year-old."

We'll take that as a "no."



It all started as sort of a funny thought, but like some of the best promotional ideas, it really took off. WSPT/Stevens Point decided that Miss Piggy should have a shot at the Academy Awards, because if she won, she would certainly *be there* to graciously accept. The station began circulating petitions around town and within a very few days collected over 7000 signatures! What makes this even more remarkable is that a companion petition drive was going on in town at the same time.

The other signature gathering effort was on behalf of a ballot measure which would have moved Highway 10, a longtime problem road which cuts right through the heart of Stevens Point, to another location. This burning issue, which has plagued the area for over 20 years, gathered less than 3000 names during the same period. This one goes to Miss Piggy hooves down!

Network '80 has had to call off its scheduled live New Year's Eve broadcast of the Outlaws, Molly Hatchet, and 38 Special, but all is not lost. They will tape the concert (which will be held) and offer it free to stations for airing sometime in January.

KRLA/Los Angeles has a new Program Director. Jack Roth, who has been with KRLA for the past three years in programming and production, has been promoted to PD for the 50 kw L.A. rocker.

Allen Meis is no longer the National Promotion Director for Island Records. He has left the company without announcing any immediate future plans and can be reached at (213) 342-5220.

In other promotion changes this week, Billy Gerber has left his West Coast Director of Operations slot with Nemperor to join Lookout Management in Los Angeles. Lookout handles Joni Mitchell and Tom Petty, among others.

Tom Nast has resigned at WBBF/Rochester to join PD Howie Castle at WSYR-FM/Syracuse. Tom will be MD for the AOR station.

Rob Senn leaves the West Coast to return to Atlanta as Southeast Regional Promotion Director for MCA, replacing Jim Francis. This is just the first of more MCA promotional changes to come.

The FCC has moved to stop the American Express Company's proposed purchase of 50% of the stock of Warner Cable Corporation. Apparently the government sees the deal as a violation of its crossownership rules. However, with a few divestitures, the merger may still be OK.



Albert Brooks was one, and Ken Levine is another who segues with ease from one form

of media to another. Ken, who is one of the top independent television producers, at 20th Century-Fox, also still likes to fling on radio intermittently as Beaver Cleaver at KHTZ. In Ken's embryonic radio years he was also known as Johnny Lizard, Erwin Rommel and Tokyo Rose, if my memory is correct.

Ken and David Isaacs were the producers of "M*A*S*H" and wrote 19 episodes themselves during their stint with the top-rated CBS show. They felt they could not improve on what they had already contributed as story editors and producers, and decided to take on new challenges. At this moment they have two pilots that should have Fred Silverman audibly chortling.


The tall and skinny Cleaver, nee Lizard, and I were talking recently (occasionally to each other) and recalling the days when he would bring me sports scores to read on my KMPC show. Ken liked to do word plays even then, for instance: DUKE PUFFED RICE 97-92 IN AN OVERTIME TONIGHT. But he confessed that he had troubles with our News Director, who for some reason would not allow any news or sports writer to mention the word, "CLOBBER" on the air. Young Levine once gave me a score saying UCLA's BRUINS MASS-MURDERED CALIFORNIA 112-78, which passed the former director's censorial O.K. But never say

CLOBBERED.

Now that Ken is successful and well-to-do, he often sits in the Wealthy Room of the Beverly Hills Hotel saying the word CLOBBERED to himself and smiling, thinking of the News Director's dictum!

Willard R. Espy tells us we may have the makings of an eponym. An eponym is a noun: 1) someone after whom a country or institution is named, or 2) someone whose name has become closely associated with some period, movement, or theory. R.J. Gatling created the Gatling Gun (also the term "Gat" is derived from R.J.). Same is true for James Bowie, the Bowie Knife; Henry Deringer for his pistol, the Henry, etc. According to Espy, when Judge Lynch began hanging miscreants out of hand, he became an eponym for punishment without due legal process.

There are people in our business who have already become part of our vocabulary. Who has not referred to a McLendon or a Storz format, because they indeed started Top 40 radio and spawned hundreds of imitators. I'm sure 50 years from now, about the time you'll be getting this column in the mail, there will be others added to the list. One radio executive has been actively trying for years to be synonymous with the business, but it's doubtful that the dictionaries and encyclopedias will be printing his name. "Dipstick" just doesn't have the right ring to it.



CBS Back On Top After Close Race

CBS resumed its recent winning ways in the Nielsen skirmishes for the week ending Dec. 9, edging ABC by half an average rating point after finishing second last week. CBS had a 19.8 average rating for the week, ABC earned a 19.3, and NBC, with just two programs (Nos. 16 and 19) in the top 20, finished third with 16.5. CBS had seven of the top ten and ten in the top 20 in fashioning its third win in four weeks.

Topping the list for the first time this season was the CBS comedy "Alice," followed by 2) "60 Minutes" (CBS) 3) "Three's Company" (ABC) 4) "One Day At A Time" (CBS) 5) "The Jeffersons" (CBS) 6) "Taxi" (ABC) 7) "Aunt Mary" (CBS TV movie) 8) "Mork & Mindy" (ABC) in a solid comeback 9) "Archie's Place" (CBS), and 10) "M*A*S*H" (CBS).

ABC dominated the 11-20 sector with five shows to CBS's three and NBC's two. ABC's "Happy Days" tied with CBS's "Trapper John MD" for 11th, followed by 13) "John Denver Special" (ABC) 14) "WKRP In Cincinnati" (CBS) 15) "Soap" (ABC) 16) "Little Rascals" special (NBC) 17) "My Old Man" (CBS movie) tied with "Angie" (ABC) 19) "CHiPs" (NBC) tied with "Barney Miller" (ABC).

MUSIC & RADIO ON TV: "WKRP In Cincinnati" has been enjoying healthy ratings this season — maybe too healthy. As Howard "Dr. Johnny Fever" Hesseman remarked while hosting "Saturday Night Live" last weekend, CBS has decided to move "WKRP" to a different time slot. Of course, most successful shows must face this possibility, and often it doesn't hurt ("One Day At A Time" 's move from Wednesday to Sunday has resulted in improved ratings, for instance). But "WKRP" is moving out of its protected cushion at 9:30 Mondays (following "M*A*S*H") to the more vulnerable 8pm Monday slot, where the Monday Night Football threat is no longer a factor, but NBC's "Little House On The Prairie" is. "WKRP" started off in that time period last season and was nearly cancelled after shaky ratings. It remains to be seen whether its subsequent rise to popularity will sustain high ratings this time around.

Elton John and Cher have been set as hosts for the seventh "American Music Awards," Jan. 18 on ABC.

VIDEOSCOPE:

RCA EYES ANNUAL \$7.5 BILLION VIDEO DISC MARKET BY 1990: RCA has announced its "SelectaVision" videodisc system will be available to U.S. consumers by the first quarter of 1981 with demonstration models to be shipped to dealers by the end of 1980 (R&R 10-26). The firm projects it will sell 200,000 units, priced at under \$500, during the first year of availability and that the combined sales of videodiscs and videodisc players will reach \$7.5 billion per year by 1990 . . . KIRSHNER, ITC, DISNEY PRODUCT PACTED: In a related development, RCA has entered into agreements with Walt Disney Prods., Don Kirshner Prods. and ITC Entertainment in efforts to expand its 300-title videodisc catalog. The Disney pact includes 16 feature films ("20 Thousand Leagues Under The Sea," "The Love Bug," and "The Shaggy Dog," among others) and eight one-hour TV programs, while the Kirshner contract calls for a series of musical discs to be produced from new and existing material prepared by Kirshner. The ITC agreement consists of a 72-minute film, "To Russia . . . With Elton," covering Elton John's recent concert tour of the U.S.S.R., which RCA will manufacture on videodisc . . . LONG PLAYING TAPE: A line of VHS and Beta format tape cassettes designed for use with the new longer-playing recorders is now available from Fuji. These slower speed tapes feature improved signal-to-noise ratios with less dropout so that tape and head life are increased when tapes are in contact with moving recorder heads for longer periods of time, such as during the slow-speed play or freeze frame operations . . .

TOP-40

Even though some may look back on 1979 as a less than spectacular year for the music industry financially, Top 40 radio was more active musically in 1979 than in 1978. More songs made the Top 15 of R&R's National Airplay/30 (121 this year versus 112 for 1978) and more songs achieved the number one spot (20 in 1979 compared to only 15 last year).

Disco's influence on the early months of 1979 is clearly illustrated by this year's airplay champ, Rod Stewart, and his "Da Ya Think I'm Sexy." Rod's disco/rock tune hit number one on January 26 and stayed there for the next six weeks. No other song during the year remained number one longer.

Donna Summer placed four singles on the Top 79 as a solo artist and collaborated with Barbra Streisand for a fifth. Other disco-oriented artists enjoying multiple Top 40 chart successes were Chic and the Bee Gees, each having three titles on this year's list.

A host of artists placed two songs in the Top 79. They were Peaches & Herb, Commodores, Supertramp, Earth, Wind & Fire (plus a third with the Emotions), Little River Band, Electric Light Orchestra, Kenny Rogers, Knack, and the Doobie Brothers. Barbra Streisand had one hit as a soloist and another with Donna Summer.

If 1979 was the year of anything, it was most likely the year of the group. 54% of the Top 79 were songs by groups, compared to a 40% figure in 1978. Part of the increase could be accounted for by the return of three supergroups, who were conspicuous by their absence in 1978. New albums arrived from Fleetwood Mac,

Eagles, and Led Zeppelin, putting supergroup hits back on Top 40 radio.

1979 brought the return of several artists who had not been on the charts recently, but had enjoyed hits before. Long dry spells evaporated for Herb Alpert and Dionne Warwick. Peaches & Herb, complete with a new "Peaches," scored twice in '79. The Doobies roared back in 1979 with their "Minute By Minute" album placing two hit singles on the Top 79. "What A Fool Believes" finished at number 2. Other artists who returned with hits, after at least a year off, were Robert John, Gloria Gaynor, Pointer Sisters, Kenny Rogers, Maxine Nightingale, Sister Sledge, Elton John, Michael Jackson, Jacksons, George Harrison, and Orleans.

Every year has its share of impressive newcomers, but perhaps the most dramatic debut in recent history was the Knack's in 1979. After much publicity surrounding their eventual signing with Capitol Records and all the obvious comparisons to the Beatles in both sound and graphics, the group proved themselves to be more than worth all the generated talk with hit singles and a very big debut album.

Other new artists, at least to Top 40 audiences, had their first hits in 1979. Blondie broke through to mass appeal listeners for the first time, as did the Cars, Robert Palmer, Journey, and Cheap Trick.

New male vocalists debuting in '79 included Randy Vanwarmer, M, and Nick Lowe. John Stewart, had last been on Top 40 radio as a member of the Kingston Trio, struck "Gold" as a soloist in 1979. New females joining the hitmakers this year were Rickie Lee Jones, Nicolette Larson, Anita Ward, Cheryl Lynn, and Amii Stewart.

1979 also brought new groups like Dire Straits, Sniff

'N' The Tears, and the TV-created Blues Brothers onto the charts for the first time.

The actual breakdown of the Top 79 hits of 1979 is as follows: groups 43, females 15, males 14, duets two, and two instrumental performances. Newcomers accounted for 23% of the Top 79, with established artists (or returning "known" artists) accounting for 77%.

Top 40 radio's musical experimentation, which began in 1978, continued into 1979. Disco had a major influence on the first four months of the year, but then its apparent attractiveness declined in the eyes of many Top 40 programmers. The anti-disco backlash had begun and Top 40 radio headed in several different directions.

The 200 R&R Top 40 reporting stations, whose weekly lists collectively make up each edition of the National Airplay/30, represent all facets of the evolving Top 40 musical scene. The common factor that links all 200 stations is their success in the ratings, which only underlines that Top 40's evolution into different musical areas is working. The diversity in music programming represented on this year's Top 79 also underlines the search for an alternative sound, when disco began disappearing from Top 40 radio at mid-year. The impact of that continuing search on 1980 should guarantee us another year full of musical surprises.

The Top 40 - 79 of 1979 was computed using weekly R&R National Airplay/30's from January 12, 1979 through November 30, 1979. A simple reverse point-value system was used and accumulated numbers were totaled and ranked. That ranking is representative of this year's radio airplay as reported each week by R&R's 200 Top 40 reporting stations.

Through The Looking Glass: Dancemusic In 1980

Once again it's the holiday season, signalling the approach of a new year and the close of another decade. The 70's were witness to numerous economic and political as well as social events, one of which was the disco phenomenon, which caused considerable excitement and some confusion.

With this in mind we conducted an informal survey among our reporters, the results of which will be presented in two parts. In light of the current mass appeal trend, we first queried the stations regarding the future of Dancemusic radio formats in 1980.

Wanda Ramos, Music Director, **WKTU/ New York** said, "Dancemusic will be highly sophisticated. We will be playing some rock

and roll and adding ballads, but we will still maintain the disco sound." "It's still growing," according to **Eric Garcia**, **KITT-FM/San Diego**. "We are adding some rock cross-overs but are very specialized in our selection . . ."

Mike Roberts, PD of **WSOQ/Syracuse**, sees for 1980 "certain markets incorporating more R&B and fusion music with other markets utilizing more rock. It will undergo a metamorphosis, however the music form is here to stay." On the other hand, **Michael Jones** of **KRLY/Houston**, says that "people will never stop dancing. You must be careful not to get involved in too many different types of music; the record must fit the overall sound of your station."

KKCS/Colorado Springs Music Director **Jed Blakovich** feels, "There will always be an R&B base, especially in certain markets. Dancemusic has a larger playground than Top 40 because it deals with all forms of music." Along the same lines, **Mike Wagner**, PD, **KIIS-FM/Los Angeles**, sees Dancemusic as a "very viable format which gives the listener more than Top 40 because of its broader base."

Barry Richards of **WDON/Washington, DC** believes that most Dancemusic stations have changed direction and are either more R&B or more Top 40 now, or they will be in 1980 . . . Echoing his sentiments is **Paula Matthews**, **KTLK/Denver**, who sees Dancemusic "becoming incorporated into Top 40 with no real

division." **WBOS/Boston's MD Jane Duncklee** points out that "Dancemusic will continue to grow and must evolve, using a blend of Top 40, with the dependency on beats per minute fading."

Rick Nuhn, **KXTC/Phoenix** summarizes, "The future of Dancemusic is the future of contemporary radio. There is a younger generation growing up on Dancemusic as we grew up on rock and roll. Top 40 radio of the 80's will be Dancemusic-oriented."

The overall consensus is that Dancemusic is a mixture of Top 40, R&B, and Disco, thereby expanding its mass appeal. Next week we will delve into the question of the changes occurring within the record industry and their affect on Dancemusic.





Pop/Rhythms

The Top 79 of '79 is a mixture of many interesting and different artists and music. We tabulated our listings each week throughout the year to the end of November in the weekly Pop/Rhythms "Hottest" section, with the most consistently popular records in that section showing up in the Top 79, listed alphabetically for your convenience.

Topping the list this year, two artists had three records apiece in the Top 79, Earth, Wind & Fire

and Chic. Ten other artists charted twice: the Commodores, Gap Band, GQ, Michael Jackson, Rick James, Peaches & Herb, Teddy Pendergrass, Sister Sledge, Donna Summer, and Switch.

Notable comebacks for the year included Gene Chandler (who started back in 1961 with "Duke Of Earl"), Peaches & Herb, Kool & The Gang, and Herb Alpert.

Eight self-contained groups showed up on the solo artist-dominated list, with only one female group, Sister Sledge, represented.

New artists are the lifeblood of any record label, and 14 new artists made the Top 79. There were nine

female artists and 18 solo male artists.

Records played in other music formats accounted for 35% of the Top 79. Artists like Donna Summer and Raydio had great Top 40 success as well as Dancemusic acceptance; Anita Ward and the Commodores are two other examples of many. White artists enjoyed acceptance in the Pop/Rhythms field in 1979, including Bobby Caldwell and Rod Stewart.

Eleven ballads made the Top 79, contrasting with the generally upbeat feeling of the year's hits, and for one final interesting figure - 18% of the songs listed had the word "love" in their titles.



TOP 79 OF '79

AOR

The AOR 79 of 1979 compiles airplay data from R&R's Album Airplay/40 charts of January through November of 1979. Albums which debuted close to year's end may show up significantly higher on 1980's year-end chart than they did for 1979.

Nine artists made Number One this year: Bad Co., Cars ("Candy-O"), Dire Straits (first album), Doobie Bros., Eagles, Knack, Led Zeppelin, Rod Stewart and Supertramp. Supertramp spent more weeks at number one than any other band, with eleven weeks total in the top spot.

Four groups landed two albums on the charts: Cars, Dire Straits, Cheap Trick and Styx.

This was a good year for debuting artists; eighteen charted on our year-end compilation. They were AC/DC, Blues Bros., Bram Tchaikovsky, Dire Straits, Fabulous Poodles, Ian Gomm, Joe Jackson, Rickie Lee Jones, Knack, Nick Lowe, McGuinn, Clark & Hillman, Molly Hatchet, New England, Police, Records, Sad Cafe, Sniff 'N' The Tears, Toto, and Tycoon.

Warner Bros. topped all competition by placing 14 albums on the chart, with Columbia next at 11 charting acts.

Of the charting artists, 75 were male and 4 female. 59 were groups and another 20 were individual artists backed by various musicians. 45 were American acts and 34 were foreign.

Conspicuous in their absence this year were several artists who performed well on 1978's year-end compilation but who did not release new album product for 1979, including Rolling Stones, Bob Seger, Jackson Browne, Bruce Springsteen, Warren Zevon, Steely Dan, Boston, Genesis and Linda Ronstadt.

Country stations WUNI/Mobile and WVMI/Biloxi were effected... Cliffie Stone and Paul Kallinger inducted into the "Disc Jockey Hall of Fame"... Bill Bailey of KENR/Houston, Terry Slane of WGTO/Cypress Gardens, FL, and Dugg Collins from KZIP/Amarillo named the CMA's "Disc Jockeys of the Year"... WDAF/Kansas City PD Ted Cramer voted as the 1979 Ugly of the Year by a group of his peers... The R&R Country chart recorded a first when two records, T.G. Sheppard's "Last Cheater's Waltz" (WB) and John Conlee's "Before My Time" (MCA) were both listed as "number one" for the week of October 12, 1979... Ric Libby steps down as OD of KENR/Houston after nine years to get into radio sales for the station... Bill Hart is let go at Plough's WJJD/Chicago after five years with them. He is replaced by former KBOX/Dallas and WPOC/Baltimore PD Pete Porter... WGMA/Hollywood, FL drops Country format and makes the national news when PD Dave Denver, as air personality Earl McDaniels, gets on the air and badmouths rednecks and country music. 

Country

One of the best years for country music is rapidly coming to a close. Again this year, the "pop-flavored" sound dominated the airwaves of Country radio. Most will agree, along with better radio programming, personality, news, and community involvement, Country radio sounded better than ever because of the quality music product in 1979. The numbers are in and here is what happened:

Starting at the top, Kenny Rogers's single, "She Believes In Me," on United Artists Records was Number One for 1979. For the year, Rogers had three Number One songs as an individual and another with Dottie West in a duo performance. A close second to Kenny Rogers was Anne Murray's "I Just Fall In Love Again," as Rogers's record just edged Anne's for the top Country single of 1979.


Of the three singles Anne Murray had on the chart in 1979, all went to Number One. She controlled the top of the weekly charts for seven weeks. As a solo, Kenny Rogers's three singles were at Number One for six weeks total. (This week, the Rogers single "Coward Of The County," went to Number One, making that his third for the year.) Beyond the six weeks at Number One for his solo efforts, Rogers helped command another three weeks at Number One with his duet with Dottie West.

Conway Twitty and Crystal Gayle each had four songs make the "Top 79." (Again, technically, Kenny Rogers appears on this chart five times; three times on his own and twice with Dottie West.)

The following artists had three singles on this year's "Top 79:" Ronnie Milsap, Anne Murray, Oak Ridge Boys, Dolly Parton, Charley Pride, Eddie Rabbitt, Kenny Rogers, T.G. Sheppard, Mel Tillis, Conway Twitty and Don Williams. Each of these artists had two records listed: Moe Bandy, Jim Ed Brown & Helen Cornelius, John Conlee, Johnny Duncan, Merle Haggard, Emmylou Harris, Waylon Jennings, Loretta Lynn, Barbara Mandrell, Willie Nelson (one as a duet with Leon Russell), Kenny Rogers & Dottie West, Gene Watson, Hank Williams Jr., and Tammy Wynette.

During the past year, there were 31 different number one records. Looking at R&R's calculations for 1978, the following recording artists had Number One singles this year, but did not have any last year: the Bellamy Brothers, John Conlee, the Charlie Daniels Band, Anne Murray, Oak Ridge Boys, T.G. Sheppard, Conway Twitty, and Hank Williams Jr.

Two Number One records were recorded by each of the following: John Conlee, Crystal Gayle, Ronnie Milsap, Dolly Parton, Charley Pride, Conway Twitty and Don Williams. As an interesting side note, two songs this year reached Number One, then dropped back to Number Two, returning to the Number One position on the following week's R&R Country chart. Ronnie Milsap's "Back On My Mind Again" was Number One the week of February 9, dropping to Number Two on February 16, only to retain its Number One status on February 23. Eddie Rabbitt's "Every Which Way But Loose" was Number One on February 2, dropped to Number Two on February 9, and returned to Number One on the 16th.

R&R would also like to salute the two producers who produced the most Number One records of the year. First, Jim Ed Norman should be recognized for helping to create the sound of Anne Murray. As previously mentioned, her three Number One songs were at the top of the weekly R&R Country charts a total of seven weeks. The other producer deserving of recognition is Larry Butler. His genius was the guiding force behind Kenny Rogers and

the Kenny Rogers & Dottie West singles of 1979. As was mentioned before, their four songs (three for Kenny and one for the duet) held Number One in R&R for a total of nine weeks during 1979. Hats off to two of the "best in the Country!"

The two most active record labels of 1979 were RCA and MCA Records, followed closely by Columbia/Epic Records. RCA, for the second year in a row, was the leading label with 17 records on the "Top 79 of 1979." MCA Records had 16. With the merger of MCA and ABC Records in the earlier part of 1979, you could technically add three more records to their list. Since they were originally released on ABC, these songs are listed as ABC/MCA in our chart. CBS Records (Columbia and Epic Records) had a total of 12 rec-



ords on the R&R list; nine for Columbia and three for Epic. United Artists brought in nine records, Warner Brothers and Elektra Records each had seven, and Capitol totalled six records in the "Top 79." RCA and MCA equally controlled the Number One spot on the weekly Country charts; each having eight Number One records. Those eight records gave each label 12 weeks of chart dominance; between them a total of 24 weeks of Number One songs were from RCA and MCA Records.

Again, looking back to 1978, here is a list of the names that did not show on last year's year-end charts. Moe Bandy, Moe & Joe, Razy Bailey, the Bellamy Brothers, the Charlie Daniels Band, Tanya Tucker, Gene Watson, Hank Williams Jr. and Willie & Leon. All of these appeared on this year's final list of the top hits of the year.

The only other breakout we have is in artist categories. Forty-six of the "Top 79" in Country were by male vocalists. Twenty were by female vocalists and thirteen would fall in the group or vocal duo category.

Indeed, it was a GREAT year for Country Music!



JANUARY: Sarah Carter Bayes, wife of the late A.P. Carter and the last surviving member of the original Carter Family (Maybelle died in the fall of 1978), died at the age of 80 in Lodi, CA . . . "Dolly & Carol In Nashville" was taped at the Opry House, to be seen on Valentine's Day . . . Dolly Parton named by Mr. Blackwell #1 on the "Worst Dressed Women" list for the year . . . Ray Baker resigned his VP position at Acuff-Rose . . . Hit songwriter Wayne Walker ("Burning Memories," "I've Got A New Heartache," "Are You Sincere," "All The Time," and hundreds of other Country and Pop giants), died after a long battle with cancer . . . Roger Sovine (he's Red Sovine's son) named VP of the Welk Music Group, whose writers include Don Williams, Bob McDill, and Wayland Hollyfield. Sovine had been with BMI since 1972 . . . Sonny James signed with Monument Records . . . Elektra signed Susie Allanson, Hank Williams Jr., and Jerry Lee Lewis . . . Tom T. Hall in the March issue of Penthouse magazine . . . Jim Halsey Co. presented Roy Clark, Don Williams, and the Oak Ridge Boys in the first country show in Monte Carlo, Monaco, then the next night at the Midem in Cannes, France . . . Eddie Kilroy produced Faron Young's first MCA session . . . Willie Nelson Hollywooded where they were filming movie scenes based on his "Red Headed Stranger" . . . Waylon Jennings played a benefit

for FICAP (Federation of International Country Air Personalities) in Orlando, Florida, raising \$10,000 . . . Skiatook Roy Clark Municipal Airport in the Tulsa suburb, took its name from a famous music personality . . . Tommy Lee Jones was named to portray Mooney, husband of Loretta Lynn, in her "Coal Miner's Daughter" movie . . . Loretta made a rare Opry appearance to introduce Sissy Spacek, who portrays Loretta in the movie of her life . . . Johnny Rodriguez joined Epic Records . . . Huey Meaux's new Starlite record label (with Freddy Fender) made a distribution deal with CBS . . . Porter Wagoner unveiled his new "Rock-Disco" show, complete with flashing lights, synthesizer, and the rock/disco group Mighty High . . . Nashville TV weatherman Brian Christie's "Pardon Me Ray" sold over 200,000 copies before UA Music, owner of "Chattanooga Choo Choo," the original song parodied, warned of infringement. Christie and producer Bill Baugh went back in, using the same music track, changed the melody, re-recorded the vocal, and sold another 300,000 . . . Freddy Weller taped a guesting on "Fantasy Island" . . . 15 stars at the Pontiac, MI Silverdome performed on the 2nd annual "World's Largest Indoor Country Show," taped for an NBC-TV "Big Event" . . . Eddie Rabbitt and the Oak Ridge Boys drew 41,000 at the Houston Fat Stock Show & Rodeo, breaking Olivia Newton-John's previous attendance record there . . . TOP OF '79

P/A



The story this year, in terms of comebacks, starts right at the very top of the Pop/Adult list. **Herb Alpert** has not experienced such massive airplay and adult acceptance since his vocal treatment of the Bacharach-David song, "This Guy's In Love" in mid-1968. Alpert's return to the forefront in popular music, more than a decade later, comes in the form of his early hit recordings — trumpet, not voice. While we are talking of such lofty positions, the Number 2 overall P/A entry for 1979, **Dionne Warwick's** "I'll Never Love This Way Again," holds a common bond of sorts with Alpert in-as-much as Warwick's version of Alpert's Bacharach-David hit was a giant the next year — titled "This Girl's In Love." Both of these great artists close the 70's on a high note.

In the #3 position for '79 is a well-known lady, **Anne Murray**. While she didn't score as dramatically as she did last year (when she offered multi-award-winning "You Needed Me"), her three Number 1 releases: "I Just Fall In Love Again," overall third for the year; "Shadows In The Moonlight," her summer smash; and the recent "Broken Hearted Me" have certainly placed her as the First Lady of Pop/Adult music this year. In checking R&R's files, Ms. Murray is the first artist ever to have three number one singles in any given year!

Kenny Rogers, another from the pop side of country music, came very close to equalling Murray's chart record by scoring two number one entries with his top-of-the-year offering, plus "The Gambler" peaking in '79 at #7. Reaching the top spot were the ballads, "She Believes In Me" (which registered an overall #4 ranking) and "You Decorated My Life."

The no surprise top ten entry this year goes to **Barbra Streisand**, scoring with her solo "The Main Event/Fight" and a duo effort with disco queen **Donna Summer**, "No More Tears/Enough Is Enough." Back again is **Maxine Nightingale** with a new label and another smash entry, "Lead Me On."

Although **Peaches & Herb** have scored before, never have they come in as strong with P/A audiences as they have with "Reunited." **Randy VanWarmer's** "Just When I Needed You Most" and another top ten instrumental, "Music Box Dancer" by **Frank Mills**, feature new artists who scored substantially for the first time. Anchoring the top ten is **Robert John**, who's been around, but with few hits until "Sad Eyes."

Special Mention

Some artists missed the year's top ten but still deserve acknowledgement. **Earth, Wind & Fire** with "After The Love Has Gone," reached the weekly top spot on 9-14. **Michael Johnson's** "This Night Won't Last Forever" reached a high of #4 September 21st. The **Commodores** registered a near bullseye with "Sail On" and "Still," both reaching the runner-up spot within a six-week period of each other. Additionally, another double-scoring artist, **Maureen McGovern**, made her mark on the last slice of the '70's with "Different Worlds" peaking at No. 3, and topped it off with "Can You Read My Mind" at No. 6.

An Intriguing Postscript

Interesting to note that in the top ten of '79 no groups are represented (**Peaches & Herb** at #9 would be called a duo), which is quite a different story compared to the bulk of the decade.

... Then There Were Triple Plays

The dominance factor was not quite as concentrated this year as compared to 1978, when the **Bee Gees**, **Barry Manilow**, and **Billy Joel** divided most of the pie. However, there were strongholds such as the aforementioned **Kenny Rogers**, **Anne Murray**, and the **Bee Gees** winding up with three top 15 entries during the year. The following are first-timers in this exclusive category: **Doobie Brothers**, with "What A Fool Believes" achieving the highest of their three with a #5 in late March; **Little River Band's** "Lonesome Loser" topped at #8 in September, with special mention for "Lady," which peaked during late last year but continued strong in the early stages of 1979; and finally **Gerry Rafferty**, whose biggest score was with "Get It Right Next Time," which topped at #10.

And Then There Were Two

There were many who scored two top 15 entries, with special mention for the following who scored their deuce in the top 5: **Barry Manilow** (maybe an off year for him, but a giant by any other standard) had both "Somewhere In The Night" and "Ships" climb to the No. 1 position. Both **Commodores** entries, "Sail On" and "Still," got to the No. 2 slot. **Neil Diamond** made a comeback of sorts as he scored with "Forever In Blue Jeans" at No. 3 and "Say Maybe" peaking at No. 5. **Billy Joel** wound up the decade with "My Life" and "Honesty" reaching No. 2 & No. 4 respectively. **Olivia Newton-John** continues to charm as she leveled twice at #2 with "A Little More Love" and "Deeper Than The Night."

Dynamic Duos

As mentioned earlier, 1979 took on an artist comeback feel with Alpert and Warwick scoring so heavily. To a lesser degree, the same thing happened to the **Captain & Tennille**, who last year scored only once but came back with two this year, and on two different labels, **A&M** and **Casablanca**. But the most interesting "duo" note is **Barbra Streisand**. The versatile performer registered top 5 entries with two different partners: **Neil Diamond** on "You Don't Bring Me Flowers" and **Donna Summer** with "No More Tears."

First Time On Top

Newer artists scoring all the way for the first time are always gratifying to note, and this year is no exception. **Earth, Wind & Fire's** "After The Love Has Gone" hit the No. 1 slot in September. **Nicolette Larson** did it in February with "Lotta Love," **Frank Mills** gave 1979 its first instrumental chart topper in March with "Music Box Dancer," and **Suzi Quatro & Chris Norman** teamed up for April's "Stumblin' In."

Trends

An observation of trends is always, at best, subjective. But after talking with several key Pop/Adult programmers during the waning days of the 70's, there appears to be a continuing course towards a softer and more mature approach. Acts that were considered just a few years ago to be unplayable on a P/A outlet are now making great gains in the adult market. Artists like **Dr. Hook**, **Earth, Wind & Fire**, **Commodores**, **Nigel Olsson**, **Bob Seger**, and **Styx**, to mention a few, have realized new heights artistically, and certainly financially, by molding their talent to a more discerning audience. As we know, water will seek its own level — so, maybe, does the music as the population grows older.
