FCC Indecency Campaign Reaches New Climax

Four Stations Face Fines; More Under Scrutiny — Full Details Inside; 75 Complaints Dismissed

The latest development in the FCC's ongoing indecency crackdown might be described as good news and bad news. The good news is some 75 broadcast stations are off the hook. The bad - and more significant news is eight more radio stations are in the indecency soup.

Last Thursday (10/26) at its monthly open meeting, the commission announced that it has notified four radio stations that they may be liable for indecency fines ranging from \$2000 to \$10,000. Four other sta-

tions have been served notice that they are under investigation for possible indecency violations.

At the same meeting the Commission voted to begin an inquiry aimed at building a record to support a 24-hour ban on the broadcast of indecent material. That ban, mandated by legislation passed in late 1988, was put on hold earlier this year by a federal appeals court. The Commission opened its inquiry over the objections of the

NAB, which believes the appeals court erred when it gave the Commission a chance to build a case for the ban.

This latest round of action brings to 12 the number of radio stations cited for indecency since Al Sikes assumed the chairmanship of the FCC in August.

The stations facing possible fines are Cox Broadcasting's KFI/Los Angeles (\$6000) and WIOD/Miami (\$10,000); Guy Gannett Publishing's WZTA/ Miami (\$2000); and Nationwide Communications' KLUC/Las Vegas (\$2000). Those now under investigation are Diamond State Broadcasting's KCCL-AM & FM/Paris, AR; Pacific and Southern Co.'s KSD/St. Louis; Independent Group's WWWE/ Cleveland; and Infinity Broadcasting's WXRK/New York.

Dealing With A Mountain Of Gripes

The eight actions resulted from an FCC push to resolve its backlog of 95 radio and television indecency complaints. Fifty-one of those complaints were set aside because they in-INDECENCY/See Page 34

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KC's 'River' Flows To Recurrent Rock/AC

McFarland PD As NAC KCWV Becomes KRVK

Journal Communications has changed the format of newly purchased KCWV/Kansas City. The former NAC is now KRVK, "The River, 98.9 FM," with a Rock/AC format. The change occurred Friday (10/27) at 5:39pm, taking the market by surprise. WKRC/Cincinnati Asst. PD/afternoon personality Steve McFarland is programming the new station.

VP/GM Jon Schweitzer told R&R, "Several folks from our Milwaukee outlets were involved in the start-up, and Steve's name kept surfacing. After meeting him, we all knew this was just the kind of format he belongs with.

"The format is tailormade for the Kansas City market. It's a rock-based format in AC clothing, with a very adult presentation. We're going after the 30-44 demos, with a broad skew to the lucrative 25-54s.

McFarland, whose prior programming experience includes WLVV/Charlotte, NC; WROV/Roanoke, VA; and KSTT/Davenport, IA, commented to R&R, "There had been a lot of speculation about us changing formats, but no one had a hint as to where I was headed or what we were going to do."

Describing the format, he said, "It's rock music without heavy metal, no wimpy AC music like Air Supply, Whitney Houston, Barry Manilow, or Paula Abdul. Our core artists are the Eagles, Billy Joel, Elton John, Beatles, and CSNY. The music is library-based. Our currents will be recurrents as far as the industry's perception goes.

"We're not trying to collapse any other station in town," he added. We simply found a hole the market will respond to. It's the most dangerous format on any station

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
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Harlow, Zachary Now Voyager Group VPs

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RIAA 'Frightened' By Taping Report

But Tapers Buy More Music; Car Use Most Cited Reason For Home Taping

Halloween came a bit early this year for the RIAA, which says it's 'frightened'' by a new government study of home taping that indicates a vast majority of Americans believe the practice is generally ac-

''These findings frightening," said RIAA President Jay Berman. Just because the public is now copying music to the tune of \$1.5 billion per year does not make it right.

Public attitudes towards home taping and the costs to the music industry were among numerous questions probed in "Copyright & Home Copying," a 293-page report released this week by the Office of Technology Assessment (OTA). The survey says home taping may reduce prerecorded music sales by up to 22%, but also warns that figure may be much too high.

Berman said in a statement that RIAA is disappointed that the report offered no recommendations on how to protect the industry from losses caused by home taping. However, he added, RIAA hopes that the study's revelations about the scope of home recording will

provide ammunition for the industry in its fight for legislation to limit digital audio tape copying.

Widespread Taping

In a survey conducted as part of the OTA report, 75% of the respondents said it is acceptable to copy prerecorded material that they own for their personal use. Sixtythree percent said it is acceptable to make a copy of a prerecorded

Parker Promotes Five To VP

Gilbertson, who previously served as Controller/Radio Division for Palmer Communications, joined Parker two years ago.

Kazda, who will supervise the technical operations of the group, formerly was Asst. Corporate Technical Director at Doubleday Broadcasting in Denver before joining Parker three years ago.

Boen, who is a four-year Parker veteran, previously held the Station Manager post at KDWB-AM & FM/Minneapolis.

A three-year veteran of Parker, Buckley previously worked at KPOP/Sacramento.

Humm was GSM at KMJJ/Las Vegas before joining the company five years ago.

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Markey, Swift Not Sold On Renewal Reform Bill

Two key lawmakers, including the Chairman of the House Telecommunications Subcommittee, last week expressed doubts about the need for legislation to reform the radio license renewal process.

"I have grave concerns about wholesale reformation of the comparative renewal process," said subcommittee Chairman Ed Markey (D-MA). "I fully and firmly believe there is no justification for abuses of the licensing renewal process . . . but I am far from convinced that legislating significant changes in the renewal process is needed or warranted in the absence of significant evidence of

Markey said "available evidence" indicates the FCC's March rulemaking actions, which limited cash payments to competing applicants and imposed stricter financial reporting requirements on challengers (R&R 5/7), "made a pretty good start" toward eliminating renewal abuse.

Markey made his remarks during a Thursday (10/26) oversight hearing on the state of American radio - a hearing that focused

largely on H.R. 1136, the radio renewal reform bill introduced earlier this year by Rep. Matthew Rinaldo (R-NJ). Under H.R. 1136, a broadcaster would be immune from license challenges as long as his station had aired programming on issues of community concern and not committed serious or repeated violations of the communications laws or FCC rules.

Rep. Al Swift (D-WA) joined Markey in expressing skepticism about the need for renewal reform

legislation. After noting that none of the 1800 radio stations that have come up for renewal since March has faced a challenge, Swift accused broadcasters of "demanding guarantees ... out of a sense of paranoia."

"If I were you," he told the broadcasters who testified at the hearing, "I'd tiptoe out of here."

NAB spokeswoman Susan Kraus downplayed the significance of Markey's and Swift's comments. 'There's work to be done [on building support for the bill] and we knew that," said Kraus. "There is opposition but there is also support."

According to Kraus, H.R. 1136 currently has 161 cosponsors, including "just over half" of the members of the Telecommunications Subcommittee.

Kraus added the NAB was pleased the subcommittee held a hearing dedicated entirely to radio issues. She said the industry group was encouraged by the receptive attitude lawmakers demonstrated during the portion of the hearing that dealt with efforts to improve the technical quality of AM radio.



Olympia, Bingham In Financial Fight

lympia Broadcasting Corp. has been slapped with a \$1.49 million lawsuit in a Seattle court by Bingham Broadcasting, amid allegations that it defaulted on payments due involving the purchase of two Alaskan combos.

Bingham says it's owed the money for KYAK & KGOT/Anchorage and KIAK & KQRZ/Fairbanks. Under terms of the purchase agreement, Olympia was supposed to pay approximately \$1.47 million to Bingham on or before September 30, 1989, either in cash or Olympia common stock. Bingham says the payment wasn't made at all, and it wants a Seattle court to order damages. Olympia counters that Bingham hasn't turned over audited financial statements, so it can't calculate the precise payment

"The fact that Olympia has not made payment to Bingham constitutes a default under our senior loan agreements," says Olympia Chalrman Jaime Ireland. He adds the bankers have chosen not to act, but they could declare default and accelerate loan payments totalling \$5.77 million.

New Federal Rules For Leveraged Deals

n a move that could spell trouble for some radio entrepreneurs, Uncle Sam announced a further crackdown Monday (10/30) on bank financing of "HLTs": highly

A banking circular issued by the Comptroller of the Currency, the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation, and the Federal Reserve Board defines HLT deals for the first time — and warns financial institutions to be wary of bankrolling such deals.

Under the new federal rules, any deal meeting only one of the following conditions qualifies for HLT status: "(1) The transaction at least doubles the subject company's liabilities and results in a leverage ratio higher than 50%; (2) the transaction results in a leverage ratio higher than 75%; (3) the transaction is designated as an HLT by a syndication agent." Finally, if there's any doubt, the feds can step in and declare HLT status for a deal.

Station Trading Surge Forecast By Kagan Panel

Congressional approval of a capital gains tax cut and low interest rates may soon spur a resurgence of station trading, according to media analyst Paul Kagan.

About 200 attendees at last week's Kagan radio financial conference in New York were told the climate for station trading is improving after a slowdown this year. That's because many owners will be quick to take profits if tax laws change, and others will sell to avoid making hefty loan payments which are now coming due from deals concluded two years ago. "Depending on what happens to capital gains, we may look back on the '80s as a period of giant profit sharing," Kagan told attendees. He added that buyers now seem to be interested in holding stations longer, with "quick-flips not as prevalent" as in recent years.

Brokers See Higher Volume

Top brokers predicted station trading will proceed in a more orderly manner than during the gold-rush days of 1986, with early signs indicating a quick pickup in station volume.

"We've got more inquiries than we've ever seen about buying radio stations and more inquiries from people who have kept their powder dry," said Americom Radio Brokers partner Bill Steding. Media broker Gary Stevens agreed with that assessment, adding that

State Acquires Sonrise Files

North Carolina authorities have taken possession of the financial records of Sonrise Management Services, the controversial radio investment firm currently under investigation by the state for possible securities violations.

According to Deputy North Carolina Securities Administrator Steve Waltis, state investigators recently traveled to Sonrise's Columbus, GA headquarters, where they picked up some 60 boxes of records and transported them back to Raleigh.

Wallis said he and his staff are currently conducting an inventory of the files, which were made available by Sonrise Chairman Kenneth

"Our inventory will determine if there's anything of interest and whether there's anything we need to look at," said Wallis. "It may help us wrap up our investigation or it may make it more complex."

North Carolina has been probing Sonrise Management's business practices since early this year in an effort to determine if the firm misled investors, who poured some \$16million into groups formed to pursue new FM licenses.

radio station trading will not be afflicted with the stagnation affecting TV station sales because the deal sizes are smaller.

"I would not expect to see values dropping because a lot of product is available," said Infinity Broadcasting CEO Mel Karmazin.

Industry Bankers Cautious

A panel of broadcast bankers said new federal attention toward highly leveraged transactions is cooling the lending climate for all but the most stable deals. Buyers are being encouraged to develop a greater equity foundation than in

"Many of the big deals are now in workouts," said Steve Pruett of Blackburn Capital Markets, "You simply have to have more equity up front in order to have deals hap-

Steve Turpin, a banker with Pacificorp in Atlanta, added that lenders are increasingly looking at station deals "based on a conservative profile. I'm cautiously optimistic (about deals) as opposed to wildly optimistic, as I was two years ago. But there's still a lot of money out there." Turpin says station buyers are facing a drying up of mezzanine-level financing, but insurance company financing remains plentiful for transactions valued in excess of \$10 million.

Lyman Upset At Kagan Case Study

adio Ventures CEO Jerry Lyman is more than a little miffed about his proposed \$23 million purchase of WMXB/Richmond being used as a case study during last week's Paul Kagan radio finance conference in

Bankers and brokers alike criticized the ex-RKO chief for paying too much for the property. But what really ticked him off was the fact that the deal was being dissected in public before it had even closed.

"An injustice was done," Lyman says. "I was upset because the whole ng was out of context, and the numbers were all wrong."

Lyman says his big-money deal may actually wind up somewhere south of the magic \$23 million mark because it's priced on a basis of ten times tralling cash flow for this year — just like his \$33 million purchase this week of Ragan Henry's WXTR/Washington.


Handy To Americom, Balsbaugh Objects





THREE-MONTH TREND PERCENTAGE OF CHANGE



Within the book's 256 pages are personal observations by group members and celebrity guests (including Janis Joplin and noted author Ken Kesey) as well as original articles and reviews about the band that have appeared in various magazines over the years.

Everybody's Workin' On The Weekends

Americans Average 14 Hours Of Chores

omen spend an average of 14 hours and 17 minutes of their weekend time on chores, while men spend 11 hours and 36 minutes of their weekends working, according to a recent survey conducted on behalf of the Hilton hotel chain.

All together, Americans average 14 hours of chores on a typical weekend. Although men spend about an hour and a half more time on household repairs and about 23 minutes more time working at their jobs, women spend more time cooking (29 minutes), doing laundry (25 minutes), shopping for groceries (15 minutes), and cleaning (14 minutes) than men.

Bill-Payin' Blues

The worst chore? Paying bills is at the bottom of the list for 89% of us (but 10% find bill-paying relaxing!). Fortunately, this dreaded activity takes up just 34 minutes of the weekend.

The most time-consuming chore is working at one's job, the survey says. Work takes up almost three hours each weekend, followed by cleaning (2:17), errands (1:43), and laundry (1:18).

If you've got kids, you can kiss your free time goodbye. Those with children spend 66% more time cleaning on the weekends, 52% more time doing laundry, and 42% more time cooking.



A Computer That Makes Pizza Arrives

ooking for the perfect hands-off approach to feeding the masses who show up at your next big promotion? Try using the "Anytime Pizza" maker—a completely computer-automated pizza makin' machine that produces seven-inch pies in around three minutes.

Hungry consumers can select up to seven ingredients and two different sauces per pie, and enter their choices via the pizza maker's keyboard.

Then, an array of sensors weigh out individual crusts and pre-set amounts of each ingredient (all stored in refrigerated canisters inside the machine). Finally, the machine's IBM computer brain sets the pizza's cooking time, based on the amount of toppings selected.

Look for Anytime Pizza makers — retail priced at around \$50,000 each — to start popping up in the nation's convenience stores, movie theaters, school cafeterias, and elsewhere in the coming months.

'GRiDPad' Computerizes Printed Handwriting



ouldn't it be great if someone could combine a notepad and a computer, so your salespeople wouldn't have to spend so much time transcribing their notes onto their PCs?

Someone did. "GRiDPad," developed by Fremont, CA-based **GRID Systems Corp.**, actually recognizes printed handwriting and translates it into computerized text.

Plus, the device measures a mere 9 x 12 inches (with a ten-inch diagonal screen), and weighs only 4 1/2 pounds.

GRiDPad's complex software digitizes characters written with an electronic pen. The tiny PC is MS-DOS compatible, and can be hooked to a printer for paper copies. Customized and standard business forms are available for use in conjunction with the unit as well.

Turn Screen-Dreams Into Reality Machine Converts Computer Images To 3-D Objects In Hours

magine a machine that can—at the flick of a switch—convert a glowing computer-screen image into a tangible object. Valencia, CA-based 3-D Systems Inc. not only envisioned such a machine, it recently built a fully functioning model of one.

Working with a newly developed technology dubbed "stereolithography," the company's boundary-pushing machine can transform a computer-generated design into a three-dimensional object within hours.


Here's how it works: a computer slices the design into cross-sections and uses a laser to imprint each section into the surface of a container of liquid polymer. Heat from the laser causes the polymer to

harden into a thin slice of the completed model. Each hardened layer then drops a fraction of an inch below the liquid polymer's surface, allowing the next slice to be added on top of it.

The process produces a solid model (up to ten inches wide, long, and high) that can either be

painted, or added to other parts that have been produced by the same process to make working prototypes.

The \$250,000 machines are already being used to help make auto and aerospace parts, copiers, and computers as well as to produce a variety of healthcare products.





With KOFY-AM & FM headed for Viacom ownership and crosstown Emmis property KXXX up for sale (with CapCites/ ABC, Jacor, and Cook Inlet rumored to be likely suitors) Berger — who wants to stay in the Bay Area — has at least a pair of primo situations to explore.

Gannett denies that KNUA/Seattle VP/GM Mark Kaye is heading for the GM slot at WDAE & WUSA/Tampa recently vacated by Gerry DeFrancesco when he returned to program KIIS/L.A.

Gannett Radio Division President Jay Cook told ST that Kaye is one of several candidates being considered, but that the search has only just begun. Cook also says there's no truth to the rumor that KNUA is on the block.

Despite what you may have read elsewhere, KLTE/Oklahoma City has not changed formats. GM Wayne Walker told ST that the Entercom AC station hasn't gone Gold, emphasizing that KLTE has made "modifications."

Look for WYCR/York PD Willie B. to head west to join OM Gerry Cagle at KWOD/Sacramento.

Pollack Media Group/Nashville President Moon Mullins has just inked the Nashville Network as a client.

Much-sought-after WAPE-AM & FM/ Jacksonville PD Bill Pasha has now been boosted to OM.

WXRK Gets Jaggered Edge

Mix's Up In Phoenix

KZZP/Phoenix has begun easing the phrase "Mix 104.7" into its legal ID. Gosh. that's the same phrase that appeared last weekend in a local newspaper advert. What does this mean?

"Nothing," says Nationwide National PD Guy Zapoleon, who denies the station will adopt a format similar to sister WOMX (formerly BJ105)/Orlando.



volved broadcasts that took place at night. The Commission currently has authority to act only against indecent material aired during daytime hours, a time when it is believed a substantial number of children might be in the audience.

Fourteen more complaints were dismissed because they lacked a tape or transcript of the broadcast or were otherwise defective.

Twenty-one complaints were dropped because the broadcasts involved did not meet the FCC's definition of indecency as "language or material that, in context, depicts or describes, in terms patently offensive as measured by contemporary community standards for the broadcast medium, sexual or excretory organs or activities."

What They Said, What They Say

The eight stations that were cited have 30 days to respond to the FCC. These are the allegations they must address:

 WXRK was cited for a December, 1988 Howard Stern Christmas party bit that included references to masturbation and repeated use of the word "penis."

This is the second time Stern has been cited for alleged indecency by the FCC. In 1987, Infinity's WYSP/ Philadelphia received an indecency warning from the commission because of a Stern broadcast.

Infinity President Mel Karmazin said the company will argue that the newly-cited material is not indecent, "even by the FCC's vague standards."

Stern could not be reached for comment. However, during his Monday (10/30) show the shock jock downplayed the new proceeding while taking a swipe at the Commission.

"We've been issued a letter, we'll issue a letter and that'll be the end of it," Stern said. "They're like the Spanish Inquisition, the FCC."

Stern also criticized the radio industry for what he sees as its lack of support in his battles with government regulators. "They don't understand that the First Amendment affects all of them," he said.

• KSD was cited for a September 1987 broadcast during which an air personality read excerpts from a Playboy interview in which PTL scandal figure Jessica Hahn vividly described being forced into an act of oral sex.

KSD Pres./GM Merrell Hansen said the station's attorneys are currently reviewing the complaint. She offered no further comment.

• KLUC drew the commission's wrath for playing Prince's "Erotic City" at 7:53pm on May 16, 1988. According to a transcript attached to the FCC's letter, the song's lyrics include the word "fuck." (Although most industry observers have assumed the word to be "funk," the song's lyric sheet does indeed have it as "fuck.") Warner Bros. VP/Publicity Bob Merlis told R&R, "It puzzles us that a record drawing no sign of fire from any regulatory agency in the mid-'80s when it was released is suddenly off limits at the beginning of the '90s."

The Bits That Went Too Far

Instructive Excerpts From The FCC Files

In the interests of providing full information on a controversial and important issue, following are excerpts from the FCC's transcripts of listener complaints detailing specific on-air incidents that inspired Commission proposals of fines or further investigation.

KCCL-AM & FM/Paris, AR was cited for an alleged on-air conversation between GM Gene Williams and his son. Williams's son allegedly said, "To all you listeners in Paris, Arkansas, don't bend over in front of my dad. Gene Williams will fuck you in the ass."

This, according to the FCC, prompted Williams to respond, "You fucking asshole, I told you we were on the air." To which the son responded, "I don't give a damn."

KLUC/Las Vegas faces a possible fine for playing Prince's "Erotic City" at 7:53 pm. The song, according to the transcripts, includes such lines as "Fuck so pretty you and me," and "We can fuck all night into the dawn, makin' love 'til cherry's gone." (Aside from inserting a nonexistent "all night" into the second cited verse, this interpretation seems to agree with the song's published lyrics.)

WXRK/New York is under investigation for a bit in which Howard Stern discussed a "guy who plays the piano with his penis," and said to sidekick Robin Quivers, who was about to be hypnotized, "Every time I rub my ear, you'll be orgasming."

WWWE/Cleveland afternoon host Gary Dee prompted an investigation of the station with a conversation in which a caller said, "Lou told me Chris James gives fellatio okay. My dream is to get in Chris James's pants." Dee's response: "You know, you are just like a little kid masturbating in public."

KFI/Los Angeles is staring at a possible \$6000 fine as the result of three conversations between midday host Tom Leykis and callers. In

WZTA/Miami may be forced to cough up \$2000 because of its 6am broadcast of "Penis Envy," a song with such lyrics as "If I had a penis, I'd take it to parties/I'd stretch it and stroke it and shove it at smarties/I'd take it to pet shows and teach it to stay/I'd stuff it in turkeys on Thanksgiving Day."

WIOD/Miami is also in trouble over "Penis Envy." However, the \$10,000 fine the FCC wants to impose on the station also stems from other broadcasts, including the songs "Jet Boy Jet Girl," "Candy Wrapper," and "Walk With An Erection," and a mock commercial for Butch Beer. "Jet Boy" (recorded by Elton Motello and Captain Sensible) includes the lyrics, "Jet boy, jet girl, gonna take you 'round the world/I'm going to make them penetrate, I'm going to make you be a girl" and "Oh, oh, he gives me head."

The Butch Beer spot is filled with sexual double entendre, including such lines as "Come find a butch flavor lickety split" and "Next time you're eating out, order a butch."

Cox Broadcasting Exec. VP/Radio Michael Faherty, addressing both the KFI and WIOD proceedings, said the company believes that the popularity of Leykis and Rogers makes it impossible for the FCC to maintain that the material the two hosts air violates contemporary community standards. (KFI PD George Oliva told R&R the station maintains stricter standards than the FCC's.) Cox, Faherty said, will make a decision on how to respond to the commission sometime in the next week to ten

days.

Leykis, who plans to dedicate several shows to the indecency issue, commented to the *L.A. Times*, "Why are they singling out radio? The fact is there is nothing on my show that you don't see on television on 'Oprah,' 'Geraldo,' 'Donahue,' or 'A Current Affair.'"

Guy Gannett officials could not be reached for comment.

 The FCC action against KCCL was prompted by a reported episode in which the son of GM Gene Williams allegedly said on the air, "Gene Williams will fuck you in the ass," a remark that prompted a comparable response from Williams.

KCCL OM/PD Leigha Fox said she has been told by station staffers that the alleged conversation between Williams and his son did take place in the station's studios but was not broadcast. According to Fox, KCCL officials believe the complaint was filed by a disgruntled ex-employee who left the station just after the alleged incident took place.

 WWWE was cited for four June
 15, 1989 conversations between afternoon shocker Gary Dee and callers who discussed sexual fantasies and physical defects involving sex organs.

GM Harvey Simms could not be reached for comment.

Mixed Reaction From Radio's Critics

Sen. Jesse Helms (R-NC), an outspoken critic of blue radio, last week praised the Commission's action. "The FCC's action simply enforces the law proscribing indecent material," said Helms in a statement. "It is heartening that the new commissioners have so quickly made clear that it is important to protect our children from this garbage."

The leaders of two indecency watchdog groups offered differing opinions on the crackdown. Ed McAteer, Executive Director of the Religious Roundtable said the fines proposed by the Commission will have little impact on the cited stations. The Commission's action, he said, "is a public relations thing" designed to mollify the "pro-family and conservative religious" groups that supported George Bush in the 1988 presidential election.

But John Price, whose Decency in Broadcasting led the campaign against WFBQ/Indianapolis, said he is pleased with the current crackdown, which he termed "more than cosmetic."

item to give to a friend. However, 75% of those surveyed said home taping for monetary gain is unacceptable.

Forty percent of those surveyed had taped a piece of music in the preceding year.

Those who had made home tapes during that time listened to more music and purchased more music than non-tapers, according to the report. The most frequent reason cited by respondents for making a home tape was to have music to listen to in their car. Fewer than 20% made tapes for friends or taped borrowed records. Most tapers used LPs rather than CDs or cassettes.

A Caveat On Costs

The conclusion that home taping may reduce prerecorded music sales by up to 22% was arrived at by asking survey participants whether they could or would have purchased a piece of music if they had been barred from taping it. Such hypothetical questions, OTA warns, are not always reliable predictors of consumer behavior. As a result, OTA said, the 22% figure may be "excessively high."

OTA officials also noted that while home taping certainly costs the recording industry some revenue, it may also create sales by exposing consumers to new music they might then purchase in prerecorded form.



Impulse Power

Four Out Of Ten Music Purchases Unplanned

Surveys taken for the past two years reveal that four out of every ten records bought are impulse buys consumers decide to purchase after entering a record store. The greatest sales stimulators are price and having heard a song on the radio.

Categorizing their last music buy in response to mail questionnaires, 63% of surveyed music consumers said they had intended to buy what they ended up purchasing before they entered the store. Men were much more impulsive than women: 58% of men's purchases were perceived as planned, vs. 67% of women's purchases.

Nearly the same figures show up in diary entries of actual purchases. 57% of men's purchases during April/May/June of this year were planned, vs. 64% of women's purchases.

Perception Vs. Reality

A difference between perception and reality occurs among consumers 18-24. This may be because they think they should be less impulsive as they reach that age segment, and that they should be less influenced by outside stimuli. In reality, their behavior is just as impulsive as everyone else's.

Of 18-24s, 67% said their last purchase was planned. But according to diaries only 59% included the records they bought on their shopping lists before they entered the store.

Black music consumers are more likely than their white counterparts to make planned purchases. Blacks reported 67% of their last purchases were planned.

White consumers thought they were less impulsive than they in-

Changes In Store

The size of music software is getting smaller, and retailers must think of ways to overcome this miniaturization's effect on displays that catch impulse buyers' eyes.

Greater emphasis has been put on cassettes, the elimination of CD "long boxes" has been proposed, the 12" vinyl album is facing extinction, and Digital Audio Tape is the smallest of all formats. More creativity will be needed when it comes to display and informational material inside the store to make sure the 40% of sales that come from impulse purchases aren't lost.

Sampling devices and in-store play of music also will be needed to guide consumers toward such impulse buys.


dicated in their diaries (63% cited prior planning in the questionnaire compared to 60% in the diary record).

Music consumers in the Midwest are more likely to make an unplanned purchase than buyers in other parts of the country. Those who live in that area recorded in their diaries that 55% of their purchases were planned, compared to the better than 61% figures that characterized the other three regions of the country. Midwest buyers believed their behavior was closer to the norm.

Education Factor

College grads make more impulse buys than consumers with high school or less education. The likely reason: college grads have more money.



Money is a prime motivator in the entire process of unplanned buys in a record store: 40% of unplanned purchases are made because of a sale price. Consumers 18-24 are the most affected by sales price. It's of much less importance among the very young, who are more likely to be influenced by a friend.

Money, however, isn't the only thing that matters. The number one influence for all record purchases (planned and unplanned) is hearing a song on the radio. Three out of ten purchases are attributed to radio stimuli.

Consumers of all ages tend to browse in record stores, and that's when they discover their unplanned buys. Black consumers are less likely to browse; their purchases "The number one influence for all record purchases (planned and unplanned) is hearing a song on the radio."

are much more planned than those of buyers in other racial, age, or gender segments, and money could also be a factor.

The less money consumers have to spend, the more planned their music purchases become. Based on Street Pulse Group data, music is not an item that is constantly bought without discretion.

Our data indicates 60% of un-

planned purchases — those not motivated by sales price considerations — are spurred by many factors that are under the control of record distributors and retailers — such as display space (see sidebar).

Consumers Want BackAnnouncing


Four out of five music consumers say that when they listen to the radio they want to know the name of the song played and the artist who sings it, but the announcer fails to identify it. This is an increase from last year's dissatisfaction rate.

When a similar question was asked in February 1989, 72% said announcers regularly failed to identify the songs played on the radio. Younger consumers/listeners seem much more upset with this practice six months later.

An agree/disagree statement in **Soundata** (August, '89) was used to measure consumers' desire for back-announcing. Consumers 20 years of age or younger were most likely to agree with the dissatisfaction statement. Nearly nine out of ten people 18-20 felt it was true. Agreement with the statement by at least 75% is apparent among all consumers throughout the 35-44 segment.

Sometimes a hit song will spark an idea for a column, but I'm not sure there's enough material to justify an allout, full-page effort. Return Of The Shack Attack

The B-52's breakthrough smash "Love Shack" also adds another entry to a very short list: hit songs about shacks.

Although I suspect that many of the clubs discussed in various hits (like New Orleans's fabled "I Like It Like That" night spot, or the "House of Blue Lights") were located in shacks, specific title references are few. Aside from the Love Shack, we've got the "Psychedelic Shack," the where-it's-at locale immortalized by the Temptations, and Jimmy Gilmer's "Sugar Shack," which, "swingin

A Small Dose Of Poison

Alice Cooper is poised to return to the Top 20 with "Poison," which posed the question of other songs dealing with this deathly topic. The answer is yes and no.

If you equate drugs like heroin, cocaine, alcohol, whatever, with poison, there's no shortage. But that's a whole other debate, and a whole other column (though not one that I'm in any hurry to com-

Otherwise, songs about poison are probably outnumbered by groups with poison-themed names (Pretty Poison, Poison Girls, Poison Ring, and of course P 1 1 1 1 Poison themselves). The most well-known poison song is a mild one, "Poison lvy," as spread by the Coasters, Rolling Stones, Paramounts, Billy Thorpe, and (different song) Faster Pussycat.

in addition, there's "Poison Arrow" by ABC and a couple of more specific brand-name songs, "Bel-

ladonna" by Stevie Nicks and the immortal "Strychnine" by the Sonics. I can't dredge up anything regarding hemlock, curare, ibogaine, or arsenic (or Arsenio, for that matter).

Dr. Feelgood Is Back

Motley Crue's revived an old rock & roll legend with "Dr. Feelgood." This marks at least the fourth incarnation for the character.

First (unless there are a bunch of old blues versions, which is entirely possible) there was Dr. Feelgood & The Interns, whose first early-'60s hit was titled "Dr. Feelgood," describing a selfstyled physician who specialized in BIG women ("about 400 pounds" was the good doctor's ideal). Dr. Feelgood (the artist) a veteran boogie pianist nam ed Willie Perryman, who also recorded as Plano Red.

Then Aretha Franklin titled a B-side "Dr. Feelgood," another amorously-inclined medical practitioner. In the mid-'70s Dr. Feelgood Mk III came into being, a British pub-rock/blues band simply called Dr. Feelgood (probably after the Mk 1 band).




The Feelgood Saga: Sex, drugs, rock

Big Names Queue Up For 1990 Silver Clef Awards Concert

AUL McCARTNEY, PINK FLOYD, PHIL COL-LINS, TEARS FOR FEARS, and STATUS QUO have each confirmed that they'll appear at the Nordoff-Robbins Silver Clef Award-Winners show at Knebworth Park, Hertfordshire on Saturday, June 30 next year.

Another six or seven major names are expected to be added to the bill, culled from the winners of the charity's Silver Clef awards between now and June. Among them are sure to be several major international stars.



FIRST RADIO JOBS

Rising Above The Poverty Level

There's one thing they don't mention when seducing people into the glamorous broadcasting industry: the pay is initially so bad you must take odd jobs to support the radio gig. It was just such a case of first-job poverty that led to my inaugural extra-cash opportunity — the great Tower Climb For Money.

A light needed to be replaced. To avoid paying a professional tower man, the station offered a smaller wad of money to anyone who would simply climb up, screw in a new bulb, climb down, and take the \$250.

Maybe it was only \$50. Whatever it was, it seemed like a good chunk of cash at the time, so I accepted the challenge. But first, late that afternoon, I decided to get a sneak preview. I walked out to the tower's base to reconnoiter the situation. See where the rungs were. Lay the groundwork.

A pleasant breeze brought the smell of salt air off the Gulf as I grasped a handful of steel and began the test climb. It was easy. After several minutes of upward progress, I stopped to look at the panoramic view of the city and the bay.

Hmmm. No view yet. I was only as high as the top of a two-story building. Not even up to the first set of guy wires yet. Funny how high it seems when you look down.

High-Wire Act

But looking straight ahead is much worse. Right in front of your nose is blistered old paint liberally sprinkled with rust flakes. The entire tower seems to be hollowed by corrosion from Hell, which has been relentlessly eating away the metal's strength year after year.

With all that rust, probably not much more than just the paint is holding the whole tower together. And now comes wind — gusts of wind making that Swiss-cheese deathtrap sway and shudder horribly.

Those who haven't been there cannot know and understand the mighty, conflicting forces Mother Nature can put to work at the 20-foot level. The dead weight of corroded guy wires is directly atop a column of hollow paint, assaulted by near-hurricane gusts (which mysteriously don't even move trees at the edge of the open field), while the entire shaky mass is simultaneously being subtly sucked down into unstable swampland.

They expect a person to climb up past those next guy wires, the set after that, and the ones way above that — to the very cloud-enshrouded top — to replace a light-bulb for 250 lousy bucks?

Well, the great Tower Climb for Money fizzled around the threestory level. I retreated to ground level. A pro showed up a few days later, changed some bulbs, pocketed a fat check, and commented that the tower was "one of the better ones around here."

Last I heard, 20+ years later, the thing was still standing.

KBER KICKS KRSP

Edwards Bears Down

What a difference a year makes! Twelve months ago, perennial Salt Lake City AOR leader KRSP had just completed another rout of challenger KBER (The Bear) and appeared to have everything going its way. Sure, KRSP's Arbitron 12+ was down 8.9-7.6, but the Carlson rocker, a market powerhouse for several years, was still number one 18-34 by a comfortable margin. KBER, on the other hand, had sunk 2.6-2.1 and showed no signs of an impending turnaround.

Four books later, that unlikely turnaround has occurred: the Bear netted 5.3 in the summer book, while KRSP tumbled to 3.7, the lowest 12+ in the station's history.

KBER's dramatic increase is particularly surprising because the Devine station was something of an industry joke when John Edwards was named PD last year - the station's fourth PD since its March '86 inception. The Bear had been wildly inconsistent, attempting several distinctly different musical approaches in its brief history under consultants B/A/D/E, John Gorman, and Dave Logan. To make matters worse, KBER's signal covered only 60% of the 80-mile tri-city metro comprised of Ogden, Provo. and Salt Lake.

(Fewer than half of the market's FMs cover the entire metro; KRSP is one of the lucky ones that does. The Bear recently rectified the situation by buying Albimar's KDAB and switching frequencies. The timing of the swap made it possible for KBER to actually broadcast on two frequencies at the same time for about a month. KRSP protested the unusual situation to the FCC, but Edwards claims the Bear received prior permission for the dual broadcast.)

Given those unsavory circumstances, it's easy to understand why everyone in the industry tried to convince Edwards not to take the KBER job. But the former KBPI/Denver APD/MD was in-

trigued, not only by the idea of becoming a PD, but by the opportunity to experiment with a hybrid format similar to what was being employed at 'BPI.

"The reason Chris Devine called me is that KBER GSM Susan Andrews brought a monitor of KBPI into his office and said, 'Maybe this is what we should be doing,' Edwards recalls. "After sitting down with Chris and looking at the mar-ket, I was sure the 'BPI format would work nicely here. The Bear could go nowhere but up, so I looked at it as a challenge and a chance to showcase my abilities. My initial intention was to take the job, hone nıy programming skills at KBER for a couple years, and go back to KBPI. But the second I left Denver, (KBPI) changed the format."

Youngest Market

Salt Lake's unique demographic skew convinced Edwards that a format heavily dependant on 18-24 would be successful. With a median age of 24, the market is the nation's youngest.

Subsequent research confirmed Edwards's suspicions that Salt Lake's 18-34 audience wasn't being properly served. It also revealed KBER's target audience wasn't especially interested in many of the core artists favored by KRSP and most AORs, including stalwarts like the Beatles, Rolling Stones, and the Who. Edwards decided to ignore such "classics" and develop a very focused, hit-oriented rock approach.

"Considering how young the

market is, it seemed obvious that was the way to go," Edwards says.

"Still, you always want to have the facts and figures to back you up, and the callout and auditorium tests showed we made the right choice."

Thus far the numbers support the research: prior to Edwards's arrival, KBER was seventh in 18-34 men, while KRSP was a solid number one. This time around it's the Bear on top; KRSP has slipped to third. And KBER, while still well behind KRSP 25-34, has doubled its upper demos since summer '88.

Today's KBER music mix is about 40% current/recurrent, with an extremely tight playlist perhaps most noteworthy for what it doesn't include. For example, the Bear was the only AOR reporter in the country that didn't play "Mixed Emotions." You won't find Jethro Tull's "Aqualung" in the library, either. Anything remotely rootsy or blues-based — George Thorogood, Stevie Ray Vaughan, Georgia Satellites — rarely makes it on the air.

"The research simply tells us that kind of material doesn't work in Salt Lake City," Edwards says. "This station is programmed by its audience."

KBER also differs from most other AORs in that it utilizes a decidedly CHR delivery. "We talk over intros and never backsell," Edwards says. "It's always forward momentum."

KRSP Vulnerable

Edwards was certain KRSP, which was employing Frank Felix's conservative approach, was extremely vulnerable on the lower end. "KRSP was doing the old-line AOR which tries to serve everyone: the 16-year-old male and the 49-year-old male," he explains.

Actually, KRSP was vulnerable to just about any serious competition. After several years of having the market to itself, the station "fell asleep at the wheel," according to new KRSP PD Ron Bowen. "It's not anything we haven't seen before. They got fat and lazy, and no one was keeping them honest. It's a prime example of what happens when sales starts programming the radio station. They were running as many as 15 units an hour."

Taking a nap was the last thing KRSP could afford. Not only was KBER starting to get its act together, but new Pollack-consulted Classic Rock rival KLZX had just signed on.

Despite the newfound competi-

tion, KRSP "didn't react at all," according to Edwards. "They were used to people trying to go up against them, and no one had beaten them before. And KBER had already been here for a couple of years and failed. So it's understandable if they didn't consider us much of a threat."

Felix Out, Harris In

However, when KRSP's ratings fell again in the fall book, the station did act, firing Felix and bringing George Harris aboard. Edwards says that was KRSP's biggest mistake.

"Frank understood this market as well as anyone," Edwards says. "The station was very focused. But George, of course, brought in his WMMR more-variety philosophy, and KRSP is all over the road.

"I find it very hard to believe that what's working in Philadelphia will work in Salt Lake City. Consultants in general, and George Harris in particular, tend to think what they do at one station can work anywhere in the country. But

New Rocker Nets Best Book Ever

KBER/Salt Lake City OM John Edwards calls cross-town New Rock outlet KJQN the Bear's "alter-ego," explaining, "Salt Lake City is not only a hard-rockin' town. It's a modern music town. And KJQN does a great job serving that audience."

KJQN did a particularly good job this past summer, recovering nicely from a spring slide and rising 2.2-3.8, the station's best 12+ in its brief history. The jump occurred despite the concurrent increase by CHR hybrid KZHT, which almost doubled its audience (2.6-4.9) under the direction of PD Lou Simon. ('ZHT incorporates several New Rock acts in its music mix and shares substantial cume with KJQN.)

"I certainly hope the *last* book was an aberration, and this is what's really happening," says KJQN PD **Mike Summers**, who experimented with New Rock formats at a number of Salt Lake stations before getting a fulltime commitment from KJQN in early 1988. "We really weren't sure what to expect this time around."

KJQN is "on the dance side of modern music," with a similar music mix to that of WDRE/Long Island or KITS/San Francisco, according to Summers. He attributes the station's recent success to a

concerted effort to "clean up our presentation. We've always been saddled with an awful lot of small promotions, and I worked very closely with the sales department to remedy the situation."

you've got to come into the market and research it locally."

Bowen, who came to KRSP from Harris client WZBH/Ocean City, MD, agrees KRSP's consultant shift could have been smoother: "KRSP went from 400 titles to 1600 titles in the blink of an eye. It was a knee-jerk reaction, and the audience just went, 'Whoa!' You've got to test the market, and we went too far. But we've pulled back considerably since then."

It should be emphasized that KRSP's losses have come entirely in the 18-24 demo. (It attracts only one-fifth the young men it lured just one year ago.) In contrast, the station's 25-34 numbers are almost exactly the same as they were following the summer '88 book.

It's also crucial to know that KRSP lost ten-year morning show Bammes & Carter, who inked a deal with KLZX at the beginning of the summer. (The pair sat out a three-month no-compete, so their impact on KLZX won't be known for a while.) KRSP's morning numbers subsequently plunged below a three share.

Another possible factor in KRSP's decline, according to Bowen, is the fact that longtime PD Randy Rose, who recently left after buying KPGA/San Luis Obispo, was involved in making the 'PGA deal at the same time KRSP faced its toughest challenge. It's not unreasonable to assume that, as a lame-duck PD, Rose couldn't devote his full energies to KRSP.

Bowen Promises 'World Class Radio'

Whatever the reasons for KRSP's troubles, Bowen's convinced the station has "bottomed out. The killer instinct is back. The ownership definitely had a change of attitude and has now given me the tools I need. We're going to be much more active and aggressive

promotionally. And the programming is now back in the hands of the programming department. We're going to do world-class radio: good, clean, and professional.

"Musically, I have to take a good, hard look at the station's heritage. I'm not going to make a lot of changes right off the bat, nor do I want to let the cat out of the bag about what I might do. John's done a good job at KBER recognizing the needs of the younger audience, but there are plenty of people who want to hear the classic artists as well."

Edwards is understandably excited about KBER's frequency change. "We only covered 60% of the market. We didn't cover Ogden, which is all blue collar. Now we cover 100% of the metro, so our audience growth should be phenomenal. We have a good shot at becoming one of the market's top three stations."

CHR's Soft Summer Book

While there were some notable ratings successes in the recently released Arbitron, the summer was by and large a soft one for CHR. Ironically, during a period when CHR numbers typically go through the roof, many ACs posted dramatic gains.

No doubt several factors contributed to the summer decline, but continued format fragmentation, as well as Arbitron's soft diary, seem to have been in the forefront. What can CHR programmers do to extend daytime TSLs and program without sounding schizophrenic from daypart to daypart? Several programmers offer their observations and possible solutions.

ACs SKYROCKET

Mainstream Adjustments?

KMEL/San Francisco PD Keith Naftaly sees the format continuing to narrowcast. "Mainstream CHRs are going to have to make minor adjustments against the fragmentation of niche programming." According to Naftaly, this summer's music wasn't a problem. "We're just seeing some dips as a function of individual marketplaces and increased competition."

He isn't happy with the outlet's 5.6-4.8 dip, but he chalks some of it up to having two division-leading baseball clubs in his market. "Our

biggest losses were in 18-24 men. At least we didn't see our audience flocking to (crosstown CHR) KXXX (X100) or to (UC) KSOL. It's surprising since our 'Summer Jam' promotion has been a traditional ratings booster. But my callouts and perceptuals validate my assertion that KMEL is stronger than it's ever been. I'm not going to make changes off a book like this."

Recognizing that daytime listening must be maximized by CHR, Naftaly has set up a "Power-Fax Network" to help corral in-office listening. "Listeners fax their names and those of co-workers along with their alltime top five favorites. Each hour from 10am-2pm we have an office winner scoring pizza parties, floral arrangements, and such. Then we choose an office of the day and we play back that office's top five, awarding \$500-\$1000. As a result, our middays were up this summer.

"We also do a noon workout. It's a 45-minute mix of today's upbeat dance hits with adult appeal like

Paula Abdul and Bobby Brown mixed in with a few classic dance tracks for flavor. Another popular feature is a live midday remote from a health club, offering free memberships; it's worked well tied in with some diet centers."

Don't Soften Music

Naftaly doesn't believe in reacting to Arbitron methodology by repositioning the station. "My gut says moving in an AC direction is the wrong way to go. You can trap adults without losing teens by careful dayparting with differences in presentation and attitude. The changes should be subtle so you stay mass appeal without wimping the station out.

"What's exciting about CHR is the energy in the music; the day we begin to soften the level is the day trouble begins. As far as Arbitron goes, no survey is going to be perfect for everyone. I won't lie and say I'm happy about passive listening earning quarter-hours, but my job is to present the best product and get ratings."

'CHR Got Screwed'

A longstanding critic of Arbitron's Colram (soft diary) format is Nationwide National PD Guy Zapoleon. "After spending time at Arbitron and looking at the 18-34 females, I noted lots of 30-minute entries in morning and afternoon drives for the CHRs, and then eight- to ten-hour entries for the Lite AC station playing in the background at the office. This verbiage in the diaries asking for what people hear versus what they actually listen to is the big problem.


"While on a panel at the NAB, I told (AC WEAZ/Philadelphia owner) Jerry Lee, who had a big hand in designing the Colram diary, that CHR got screwed. He im-

plied CHR didn't get screwed, and in fact AC got what it deserved. I still believe advertisers want people to *listen*, not just hear their spots in the background; sales departments had better educate media buyers to this."

Zapoleon feels the way to combat this AC advantage is to target away-from-home and in-office listeners during daytime hours. "Don't overreact to the ACs. There are a lot of at-work places that

aren't offices, where a CHR will fit in better. Health spas, clothing stores, sandwich shops, and the home are areas of concentration we're overlooking."

Variety, notes Zapoleon, is still CHR's biggest asset. "Whenever CHR tries to go back to its roots as a variety format after coming off a period of overfocusing, as we did on dance product, there are always growing pains. The reason CHR is

the perfect format is because it's the only true variety format.

"A year ago I was quoted as saying rock was back and we were going to have to deal with it. Now stations have overreacted like many did with dance music. Thankfully we have lots of great mass appeal music and can offer the variety listeners really want."

Overall CHR Shares Up

DC-based consultant Alan Burns, President of Alan Burns & Associates, adds that while individual CHR station shares are being sliced up, there has been an increase in the overall number of CHR AQH shares in most markets. "The format's in great shape," declares Burns. "In the summer and fall listening can be scattered, with increased outdoor and vacation activity. Then with school starting, football games and TV shows disrupt listening patterns.

"A year ago in Detroit it took a five share to win in CHR and currently it takes a high four. But there are now three stations in the format. Los Angeles is the best example of this phenomenon. A few years back KIIS was solo and pulled a ten share to win. Then Power 106 (KPWR) signed on and a high six or mid-seven share would do it. Next Pirate Radio (KQLZ) comes along. While the individual scores are smaller, there are now a total of 18 CHR shares in the L.A. summer book."


Burns believes the Arbitron diary is a big factor against CHR. "This has got to be the best book for AC in many years. I have to scratch my head. I just don't think there were as many people lying around the pool listening to AC this summer as Arbitron would have us believe. I don't see Arbitron making any changes in the diary anytime soon as they don't really care much about formats — they're interested in money. CHR broadcasters will have to scream loud and long before you see any changes."

people to listen — can help. Says Burns, "CHR has an inferiority complex about daytime listening. Unfortunately, the list of remedies isn't long, but you can experiment with a few things like a top five at noon. WDFX/Detroit is doing it. Feature programming is one advantage AC has over CHR. Many CHRs that violate the format with features can run into trouble, so go slowly here."





Radiothon Set To Benefit St. Jude

On November 19, 45 of country music's biggest stars will lend their talents to charity in what promises to be one of the most incredible "concerts" ever. The 12-hour event (9am-9pm CST) is set to air as a radiothon on more than 800 Country stations, with proceeds benefiting St. Jude Children's Research Hospital in Memphis. The project is called "Country Cares For St. Jude's Kids."

A Dream Begins

Those of you who heard Randy Owen's (Alabama) keynote address at this year's Country Radio Seminar may recall a challenge he issued. "Because of our visibility," he said, "we have an opportunity to do a tremendous amount of good for organizations like St. Jude that really help. For me, it's more than an opportunity, it's an obligation."

Owen's involvement with St. Jude began a couple of years ago when his buddy and former college classmate, WYAY & WYAI/Atlanta morning personality Rhubarb Jones, asked Owen to participate in the stations' local radiothons for the charity. While at an Atlanta banquet attended by St. Jude founder Danny Thomas, Owen ran the radiothon idea past the TV star. Thomas immediately embraced the project.

"It's a natural," wrote Thomas in a letter soliciting artists' help, "because St. Jude kids and country music have so much in common. The music speaks straight to the heart, reminding us of the importance of love and laughter in the face of pain, the deep meaning of simple joys, the value of courage, the necessity of faith against huge odds."

'Fantasy' Concert

As Owen's dream began to take shape, Alabama PR Director and point man Greg Fowler, Jones, and WOW/Omaha PD Gene Bridges (who got involved in response to Owen's seminar challenge) started

Where Hope Lives

Founded 27 years ago by entertainer **Danny Thomas**, St. Jude Children's Research Hospital is one of the world's premier research centers for children with catastrophic diseases, primarily cancers. Its mission is to save lives by finding the causes of and cures for these fatal diseases.

Some of the things I learned on my hospital tour with Alabama's Randy Owen:

- No one is turned away because of inability to pay or lack of insurance. In fact, no financial questions are asked and there aren't any requisites for admission.
- The hospital pays all costs for the patient and his family: transportation to Memphis, hotel rooms, and food, in addition to medical costs. The transportation tab alone is \$1.5 million a year.
- There are only 40 beds, occupied by those most seriously ill. At any given time, hundreds of others are treated on an outpatient basis. They are boarded at area hotels, frequently for weeks.
- The blood and medicine dispensed to Sf. Jude's 40 bed patients and outpatients is equivalent to that used in a 2500-bed hospital.
- The survival rate for kids with cancer 30 years ago was only ten percent. Today, it's 60%.

to work in conjunction with the Russ Reid Company, a Los Angeles-based production firm that specializes in fundraising telethons.

They hit upon the idea of doing a "Fantasy Concert," and called managers soliciting tapes of artists in concert which could be included. (Participants are listed elsewhere on this page.)

For those without satellite facilities, the full 12 hours will be offered on disk for broadcast the following week.

Country/Charity Connection

Over the past couple of years, I've written about the enormous sums of money raised during local St. Jude fundraisers. Early radiothons were conducted on various formats, but the best results came from Country outlets. WWKA/Orlando has raised almost \$500,000 in the past three years; WCRJ/Jacksonville raised \$70,000 in 42 hours one year; and WYAY set a record by piling up \$534,000 in 42 hours its first year ('87) and broke that record last year by generating more than one million dollars.

Perhaps the best reason to carry an event like this was expressed by WWKA PD Steve Holbrook: "The great thing about the radiothon is it benefits the station and the community. Our station is familyoriented, and our audience can relate to the family aspects of the event. It makes them feel good about us. The community benefits because the hospital stays open and helps local kids as well as those from around the world."

A Personal Note


One of the reasons local fundraisers have been so successful is that station staffers are invited to tour St. Jude prior to the radiothon. It serves to heighten awareness and enthusiasm for the event and the hospital.

A couple of weeks ago, I had the opportunity to accompany Owen and several others on such a tour. I must admit it was one of the more difficult things I've ever done. Seeing kids who are suffering from a catastrophic illness is chilling and very unsettling. Most of us take healthiness for granted, operating under a "that happens to other people" syndrome. But it's impossible not to become emotional when you encounter a room full of children wearing baseball caps to cover their chemotherapy-induced hair loss

Yet, the hospital is not a bleak place. There's an incredible air of hope. And that hope is there because donations enable the hospital and research center to exist. But the healing and medical breakthroughs can continue only if the money does.

We in Country have always been proud that we were somehow "different" from those in other formats — that we enjoy a brotherhood-type unity that grew out of our love for music. Here's our chance to show what we can do when we get together and put our minds to it.



Artist Roundup



WTTR'S SPENCER FOR HIRE

This Bet's For The Birds

Some people just don't learn from others' mistakes. Pete Rose landed in a heap of trouble for gambling, but that predicament didn't deter WTTR/Westminster, MD's Steve Spencer. Consequently, the midday personality had to pay the price.

Like a host of mid-Atlantic fanatics, Spencer allowed himself to get caught up in "Orioles Fever." As this year's regular season was winding down, Baltimore's birds were staging one of the most dramatic comebacks in sports history. Only one thing stood in the way of a division championship: the perennially pesky Toronto Blue Javs

Spencer, after seven years on WTTR, was so convinced his Orioles were destined for glory this season that he bet his show on it. The wager started out as a simple "steamed crabs for lobsters" exchange, but the stakes increased.

Destiny's Darlings

As part of a live on-air bit, Spencer bet CJRN/Niagara Falls, Ontario PM driver Bob Dancy that if the Blue Jays beat Baltimore, he (Spencer) would shell out the crabs

and work Dancy's show for a week. But if Baltimore realized its impossible dream finish, Dancy with lobsters in tow - would have to travel to Maryland and serve as a one-week sub for Spencer.

Toronto won - Spencer lost and the story developed an added sour note: it seems the Baltimore booster never cleared his enthusiastic outburst with GM Dwight Dingle, who informed the daring DJ he'd have to pay his own expenses. "We got him a very cheap flight on Air Tragedy," Dingle reported. "He flew into Buffalo (the nearest airport) and the round trip between Baltimore and Buffalo was peanuts." As it turned out,



Spencer covered the airfare, WTTR paid for his meals, and CJRN footed the hotel bill.

Spencer honored his bet by working for Dancy the week of October 23, and phoned WTTR with daily reports. He may have actually come out ahead on the deal. His WTTR shift is 9am-2pm, while Dancy pulls a comparatively lighter 4-7pm routine.

WTTR and CJRN are affiliates of the Orioles and Blue Jays radio networks, respectively.

WMGK Listeners' Hit List

As the decade draws to a close, it's safe to assume people will be asked to list their favorite songs from the past ten years and/or 1989. WMGK/Philadelphia's "Harvey In The Morning" put a different spin on this old idea by inviting listeners to nominate the worst songs of all time.

Hot Response

The AM driver was inspired when a listener sent in the lyrics to the Bells' "Stay Awhile," asking if Harvey could tell her the title of the song. After playing it, he termed the tune "one of the worst songs of all time." Listeners quickly took issue with him. They didn't mind Harvey trashing the tune, but they had their own nominees for the dubious alltime title.

Midday personality Chris McCoy seized on the hot response and suggested an entire program be devoted to determine the real stinkers. Originally, WMGK planned to keep phone lines open for "worst song" nominations during Harvey's entire October 18 shift. That scenario changed because of the devastating San Francisco earthquake that hit the previous evening. The station aired expanded quake coverage all morning, and felt the timing for the program wasn't right.

It was postponed to 10/25, at which time Harvey showed up for his shift appropriately attired in plaid bell-bottomed pants and a flowered shirt. Among the "winners": Morris Albert's "Feelings," Starland Vocal Band's "Afternoon

Delight," Bobby Goldsboro's "Honey," and Paul Anka's "(You're) Having My Baby."
