### **RECORD CENSORS HAVE** LEGISLATIVE FIELD DAY

Providing a counterpoint to the FCC's indecency crackdown, legislators in Pennsylvania, Florida, and Missouri propose drastic (if not unconstitutional) record-labeling laws. At their most extreme, under-18 consumers would be forbidden to buy records containing discussions of a long list of "sensitive" subjects, while retailers could face multiple penalties for sales to minors.

### SETS MINORITY POLICIES REVIEW **Supreme Court Refuses To Reinstate Fairness Doctrine** groups applauded the Supreme

Broadcast issues took center stage at the Supreme Court this week, as the justices refused to reinstate the Fairness Doctrine and announced they will examine the constitutionality of two FCC minority preference policies.

The high court's Monday (1/8) action on the Fairness Doctrine actually took the form of inaction. By refusing to hear the case of Syracuse Peace Council v. FCC, the justices let stand an appeals court ruling that the FCC had acted within its authority in its 1987 decision to drop the Fairness Doctrine.

The justices offered no comment on their refusal to hear the case, which stemmed from a



### WLIF Latest B/EZ In Soft AC Move

The tide of B/EZs making the move to AC swept up another participant last Monday (1/8) as WLIF/Baltimore joined the jetstream. At the newly monickered "Lite 102," PD Bob Moke and the on-air staff are unaffected by the format flip. Bob Lowry consults the station.

VP/GM Winnie Brugman commented, "We have shifted our music base periodically to meet the demands of a changing audience. Based on extensive in-market listener research, the timing of WLIF's move to Lite 102 is perfect for the '90s."

Moke told R&R, "We have very high hopes for it and the initial response from the advertising community appears to be positive. All the elements that made WLIF the most successful and consistently high-rated Baltimore radio station in the '80s will continue. We received fewer calls than we expected."

Moke continued, "There are no true Lite ACs in the market. We expect to pick up listeners who've been tuned to more intense vocalbased stations like [AC] WWMX, [Gold] WQSR, and WYST-FM. We won't play dance rhythms or anything intense."

The station has cut back on midday information. "We ran a live traffic update every hour and a full newscast every hour," Moke said. "Some of the newscasts are now headlines and we aren't doing as many traffic checks."

WLIF placed second 12+ in the fall Arbitron (7.9) and sixth in the summer Birch (5.3).

### FORMAT CHANGE LIKELY **Oakes Transferred** To KCTC As PD


WMEE & WQHK/Ft. Wayne OM Michael Oakes has been appointed PD of Tribune sister station KCTC/Sacramento. He replaces PD Gil Boucher and OM Dean Cull, who will both leave the B/EZ station in the next several months.

# FCC Chief Mulls Private Bath

Six months into his reign over the financially strapped FCC, Chairman Al Sikes is thinking about spending thousands of dollars of agency money to build his own throne room.

According to FCC officials, Sikes is considering adding a private restroom to his office so he doesn't have to use a nearby public lavatory. His aides say the restroom is teeming with individuals who have business before the Commission and would like to bend his ear.

"There is a problem with people trying to buttonhole [Sikes] every time he goes to the [public] restroom," said Sikes's Chief of Staff Charles Schott. "He asked for possible solutions and one of the suggestions was [the private bathroom]." Asking Sikes to use an existing Commissioners-only restroom was ruled out because that facility is located nearly twice as far from his office as the public restroom, according to FCC spokeswoman Maureen Peratino.


### **\$16,000 Plan**

According to Schott, Sikes recently balked at a \$16,000 plan but is still open to the idea of a more reasonably priced personal powder room.

"My guess is that we're going to continue to look at the idea," said Schott. "We run an open building here and [building a private restroom] is just a cost of doing that."

Both Schott and FCC Managing Director Andrew Fishel also expressed a belief that Sikes's position entitles him to his own commode. "All he is doing is bringing himself into line with other federal officials at his level," said Fishel. "Frankly, I was surprised he didn't already have this amenity."

Asked whether he thought broadcasters might rather see the \$16,000 spent on improving the turnaround time for applications, Fishel responded, "If [Sikes] determines this is an appropriate expenditure in the context of [the FCC's \$100 million budget], I don't know who on the outside has the knowledge to challenge him on that."



### Edens Searching For Sugar Daddy

dens Communications Inc. CEO Gary Edens is shopping for a sugar daddy to bankroll future expansion of his nine-station chain.

The company announced Thursday (1/4) that it has hired **Steven Rattner** of **Lazard Freres & Co.** "to assist in exploring strategic alternatives for the company." According to Edens, that includes "seeking a merger partner or a recapitalization.

"We just came off the biggest year in our history in both revenue and operating profit. We're not being forced to do this by banks or investors. We've been planning on doing this for some time so our company can grow," Edens said.

Both Edens and Rattner declined to place a value on the Phoenixbased company, which owns WRBQ-AM & FM/Tampa, WRVA & WRVQ/ Richmond, KOY-AM & FM/Phoenix, WWDE/Norfolk, and KKLQ-AM & FM/San Diego. Media broker Gary Stevens estimates the chain is worth in excess of \$150 million and, depending on the future prospects of the powerhouse Tampa property, possibly as much as \$200 million.

# **Record Industry Gears Up** For Labeling Fight

Recording industry representatives say they must educate their colleagues on the dangers of censorship, build more coalitions, and mount a skillful grassroots lobbying effort if they are to beat the lyric warning label legislation currently brewing in at least three state legislatures.

### Satellite Sound Broadcasting Prime Topic At NAB Meeting

NAB officials will gather in Rancho Mirage, CA for their semiannual joint board meeting beginning on Thursday (1/11). Future competitive threats from international satellite-delivered digital radio broadcasts will be a prime topic on the radio agenda.

NAB VP Michael Rau will explain a potentially revolutionary radio technology known as the Eureka 147 project, a joint venture of the European Broadcasting Union (EBU) and foreign receiver manufacturers, including Philips Electronics.

At a cost exceeding \$43 million, the Europeans have developed a new technology which allows broadcasters to transmit CD-quality digital stereo over UHF frequencies direct from satellites to cars equipped with tiny stick-like antennas.

While no frequencies are currently authorized for satellite sound broadcasting, an international agreement on spectrum allocation is slated for discussion in 1992 at the World Administrative Radio Conference. If spectrum is authorized, competition for it is expected to be stiff – only about a dozen channels may be available on each continent.

### **Renewal Reform On Tap**

The system will be demonstrated to American broadcasters at the upcoming NAB convention in Atlanta (3/31-4/3). EBU engineers outlined the project at last year's NAB convention in Las Vegas, but their presentation generated mostly yawns from a small audience of engineers.

The Radio Board convenes on January 16, with radio-only license renewal reform and the future of AM broadcasting also on the agenda. The Joint Board will meet on January 14 and 17, with much attention expected to be focused on telephone and cable issues.

As usual, about a dozen lawmakers will drop by to share their wisdom about the latest Capitol Hill maneuverings affecting the industry. Those scheduled to appear include farm broadcaster-turned-US Senator Conrad Burns (R-MT), Sen. James McClure (R-ID), and Reps. John Bryant (D-TX), Matthew Rinaldo (R-NJ), and Billy Tauzin (D-LA).

NAB attendees also will be mourning the passing of Radio Board member D. Mitchell Self, the owner of WLAY-AM & FM/ Sheffield, AL. He died Monday (1/8) of a suspected heart attack following a routine exercise session. Self, 53, was a 34-year veteran of the radio industry, having worked in Alabama, Mississippi, and Tennessee. He recently was voted Broadcaster of the Year by the Alabama Broadcasters Association. Self is survived by his wife, Jimmie, and five children. "We've got to educate our constituents – writers, artists, radio, retail people, right down the line," said NARAS President Mike Greene. "Despite all the coverage this issue just isn't sinking in. The industry has to learn that this type of legislation will affect more than just heavy metal bands."

Greene's sense of urgency stems from the fact that lawmakers in Pennsylvania, Florida, and Missouri either have or will soon consider bills that would require lyric warning labels and, in the case of one Florida proposal, actually prohibit the sale of some records to minors.

Greene was one of several industry group representatives who met recently in Washington to discuss strategies for beating the labeling bills. Among the other groups represented at the skull session were the RIAA, NARM, and the Music Publishers Association.

### **State Bills**

The Pennsylvania bill, which has been approved by the state's House of Representatives, would require parental warning stickers on records with song lyrics that deal with a variety of subjects, including the illegal use of drugs and alcohol, murder, suicide, and a wide range of offbeat sexual behavior.

When Florida legislators return to work this spring, they'll be confronted with two record-related bills. The first measure would bar Continued on Page 10

"We have an agreement in principle, but there's no final contract yet. I expect one within two weeks," Hayes told **R&R**. The former **Fairmont Broadcasting** executive's chief investor has some very deep pockets — New York investment banking house **Goldman Sachs**.

In an unrelated deal, another deep-pocketed broadcast financier, Boston's **TA Associates**, has kissed off its plans to acquire Washington, DCbased **United Broadcasting** for \$123 million. The plan has died because of snags involving United's spinoff of cable TV ownership interests.

### Ragan Henry Deal Machine Still Moving

Bentrepreneur Ragan Henry has run into trouble backing up his recent buying spree with bucks, but U.S. Radio COO Bob Hughes said that's not so.

"We just closed on a big financing from our chief lenders, **Continental Bank** and **Chrysler Financial**. And we're just a couple of weeks away from an equity closing backed by **Oppenheimer & Co.**," Hughes said. He added that the Company closed last week on its purchase of **WAKR & WONE/Akron** from **Summit** and the internal reorganization of Henry's **WBSK & WOWI/Norfolk, WQOK/Raleigh,** and **KJOJ/Houston**.

Still pending are the acquisitions of WRXJ & WCRJ/Jacksonville and WLOE & WMMY/Greensboro. "We're having difficulties getting all of the real estate issues in Florida closed. As for Greensboro, we're not satisfied on some technical issues. We're having discussions and hope it can be resolved soon," Hughes said.

### Sillerman Expects Europe Deal Within 18 Months

edia magnate **Robert F.X. Sillerman**, just back in Manhattan after a fundraising trip through Europe, predicted he'll be jumping into broadcast deals on the continent within 12-18 months.

The New York financier also said he was successful in drumming up overseas investors for his proposed \$100 million **Sillerman Communica-tions Partners** blind pool, which is being marketed by **PaineWebber**.

"There's a very fascinating experiment going on over there," the financier said. While "it's much too early to focus on a particular country or opportunity," he feels confident that moneymaking opportunities in Europe's commercial radio marketplace will abound for himself and associates **Carl Hirsch** and **Carl Brazell**.

Meanwhile, Chicago-based **Heller Financial** said it has ponied up \$36 million in loans and credit lines to bankroll Sillerman's **Captar Communications** venture with **R. Steven Hicks**.

### Shamrock Peels Off Stations To Cut Debt

Shamrock Broadcasting Inc. says it's selling three radio properties and placing two TV stations on the block in an effort to pare down debt and increase profitability.

In the first deal, AC KMGC/ Dallas will be sold for \$22 million to Cook Inlet Radio Partners L.P. The all-cash transaction includes a minority tax certificate. While no broker is involved in the Dallas transaction, Shamrock President Bill Clark says the company has retained Blackburn & Co. to sell WHB & KUDL/Kansas City. And broker Ted Hepburn will seek buyers for two Texas television stations, KTAB-TV/Abilene and KXXV-TV/Waco.

No Changes At KMGC

While Shamrock is not a highly leveraged company, the company's profits have been strained by the acquisition of several startup and turnaround properties during a five-year expansion program. Clark said relaxing debt will improve the prospect of dividends for the company's stockholders.

The company is a wholly owned subsidiary of Shamrock Holdings Inc., a Southern California conglomerate owned by the Roy Disney family. The company's other radio properties include KABL-AM & FM/San Francisco, WCXI & WWWW/Detroit, WWSW-AM & FM/Pittsburgh, WFOX/Atlanta, KXRX/Seattle, KXKL-FM/Denver, and KMLE/Phoenix.

Meanwhile, Cook Inlet officials say they are jubilant about their Dallas acquisition and plan no change in format or call letters. "Dallas is a target market for us, and KMGC fits our future perfectly," said Cook Inlet President Dan Mason.

Cook Inlet is controlled by Alaskan Native Americans and Eskimos. The company also owns WZLX/Boston, KFMK/Houston, KUBE/Seattle, WPGC-AM & FM/ Washington, WZGC/Atlanta, WUSN/Chicago, KOPA & KSLX/ Phoenix, and KZOL & KFMY/Salt Lake City.

### **Christian Upbeat Despite** Heavy Debts, Legal Woes

Baltimore talk host Alan Christian, who faces allegations he violated Maryland securities laws in the process of raising money for his Atlantic Coast Radio (ACR) investment firm, said he still hopes to make a go of the troubled company. This despite the demise of the ACR-owned Maryland State Network and the fact that he and ACR have amassed over \$1.4 million in debts.

### 'Start Over'

"There is money in the [financial] marketplace even for companies that are in receivership.' said Christian. "It's like playing Monopoly. We just have to step back to 'Go' and start over."

On Monday (1/8) Christian announced he was suspending indefinitely the broadcast operations of Maryland State Network, the which had shrunk from five affiliates to just two - WITH/Baltimore and WAMD/Aberdeen, MD. Christian said the move was part of a restructuring and economy drive necessary to obtain new short and longterm financing agreements for ACR.

According to documents filed recently in Baltimore Circuit Court, Christian has personal debts of \$269,452 and has defaulted on the first and second mortgages on his home. Among Christian's largest unsecured creditors is Tom Underwood, a listener who lent the talk host \$26,000.

Court papers also reveal ACR has debts of \$1.17 million, including \$678,301 raised from investors;

\$54,000 owed to stations that carried Maryland State Network's programming; and \$31,000 in legal fees

### **Happier Days Ahead?**

ACR's financial problems became public in early November when Maryland securities officials alleged the firm had sold unregistered securities through unlicensed agents. When Christian failed to produce the \$678,301 in investor funds, a Baltimore judge froze the assets of ACR and Christian and placed ACR in a temporary receivership.

Christian told R&R that despite ACR's problems, several banks, which he refused to identify, have tentatively agreed to provide him with short-term financing totalling \$10.5 million. He also claims to be on the verge of closing a \$300 million longterm financing arrangement with an organization he declined to name.

"I won't guarantee that this is absolutely, positively, definitely going to work out."

KCDA/Coeur d'Alene, ID, argued that approval of the deal would violate the FCC's newspaper crossownership rules and give the Hagadones an unacceptable level of control over the local media. The family already owns KVNI/Coeur d'Alene, that city's only daily newspaper, 11 regional papers, and the local telephone directories.

Rook also alleges that the Hagadones' plan to transfer control of NIB to Bradley and Burl Todd Hagadone in order to separate the radio stations' ownership from that of the Coeur d'Alene Press newspaper is a sham arrangement because Hagadone patriarch Duane Hagadone will retain de facto control over the stations.

### 'Short On Facts'

However, in its opposition to Rook's petition, NIB argues that Rook's petition is "long on generalities and short on facts" and presents "no evidence whatsoever of a future commonality of control between Todd and Duane Hagadone." Thus, NIB contends, Rook did not provide the quality of information required before the FCC can pursue the claims made

ern Indiana Broadcasters decision, NIB goes on to argue that "the existence of a family relationship by itself does not give rise to a question as to the degree of control which the father will exercise over a radio station owned by his sons."

NIB also challenged Rook's contention that the Hagadone-owned KVNI and Coeur d'Alene Press have engaged in unfair business practices against KCDA. But even if Hagadone businesses had engaged in anti-competitive behavior, NIB pointed out, the types of actions cited by Rook have not been of concern to the FCC since 1985 and should not weigh in the Commission's decision-making process.

The second bill would regulate the ways in which merchants could display records, books, and magazines that depict the blacklisted activities.

According to the RIAA, album warning label legislation was scheduled to be introduced this week in the Missouri legislature.

NARAS's Greene said that while professional lobbyists can be useful in the fight against such bills, they are no substitute for letters and personal visits to lawmakers from industry members who live in the battleground states.

Greene also hopes to involve artists in the effort to educate lawmakers. But unlike past hearings, where members were subject to harangues from hard rockers like Frank Zappa and Twisted Sister's Dee Snyder, Greene promises to roll out "demographically appropriate" artists who would be more likely to appeal to the middle-aged men who make up most legislative bodies.

### How NOT To Delegate

oes your idea of delegating tasks consist of placing projects on various parts of your desk? Do you return from a quick lunch on a 12-hour day only to find your subordinates busy .... writing letters to their friends?

To keep yourself constantly busy, if not falling behind – and to make sure no one screws up your precious projects – follow these ten tips on how NOT to delegate, courtesy of James Jenks and John M. Kelly, authors of the book, Don't Do. Delegate.

• Stockpile information. Keep your mail, memos, and ideas to... yourself.

• Impose methods. Make sure your staff knows there's only *one* way to do the work - your way.

• Do all the talking. How can your employees describe your brilliant ideas? • Maintain ambiguous time frames. Allow a few hours (or days, if possible) of leeway.

• Assign tasks without the necessary tools. Your subordinates will be forced to return to you for help.

• Don't point out perils. See above reason.

• Delegate half a project. This is a tried-and-true method of confusing your staff.

• Let them fight their own battles. Don't get involved in others' problems.

• Hog the spotlight. You are in charge — take credit where credit's due.

• Seek out scapegoats. Your employees are probably responsible for most of the department's mistakes, anyway.

### 31% Of US Executives Contract The Five-Year Itch

Have you been on the same gig for a few years? Does the situation leave you feeling unchallenged, bored, or burned out? Take heart – you're not alone.

According to a survey of executives at 100 of the nation's top 1000 corporations by San Franciscobased management specialists **Robert Half International Inc.**, 31% of executives who remain in the same position for up to five years will not only see their energy evaporate, but will also witness their creativity and performance levels suffer as well.

An additional 13% feel the same slump after six to ten years on the

same job, 1% after 11 or more years, and an amazing 5% "don't know." Interestingly, half of the survey's respondents say they feel "no impact" from prolonged periods in the same position.

How can you beat the five-year blues? Robert Half Chairman Max Messmer suggests that executives develop ways to "reenergize themselves" and become "their own toughest taskmasters, like great athletes who continually train."

# Advertising Challenges Of 1990: The Manufacturers

s we enter the dawn of this new decade, we face many challenges in the sales industry. For radio salespeople to excel, we'll have to have a better understanding of the problems that our advertisers face. This week's column will examine the advertising challenges that confront manufacturers today.

Along with accounting for most national business, manufacturers represent a significant percentage of local revenues via bottlers, distributors, agencies, etc. Manufacturers also are facing more financial pressure from retailers than ever before. This will affect (and has affected) their brand advertising dollars.

In fact, it's becoming increasingly expensive for manufacturers just to get their products on the shelves, let alone keep them in-store.

To better understand the process, we've prepared a list of financial obligations that manufacturers often have to retailers. Retailers' requirements vary, of course, so bear in mind that this list is meant to be used only as a guideline.

Also keep in mind that the larger a retailer, the more contributions it may require. Similarly, the larger a manufacturer, the lower "It's becoming increasingly expensive for manufacturers just to get their products on the shelves, let alone keep them in-store."



### **Presentation Fee**

A phenomenon that started in the food business, the presentation fee is spreading to other categories. It is the fee a manufacturer pays for the retailer to listen - yes, just to sit down and listen - to a new product presentation.

### **Slotting Fee**

Manufacturers pay this common placement fee to a retailer for initially slotting (setting up) their products on the shelf and in the stock area, and implementing an inventory control system.

As with all fees, this one varies from a few thousand to hundreds of thousands of dollars. We've heard that one Western grocery chain has a beverage slotting fee of \$900,000!

### **Bulk Purchase Fee**

Intended to drive up additional margins for the retailer, this "quantity discount" allowance is based on the total amount of product to be placed in a store.

### **Display Fee**

If a manufacturer wants its products featured in an additional display – such as an end aisle, which greatly increases impulse sales – it must pay the retailer this virtually universal allowance.

### **Spoilage Fee**

Manufacturers of products with short shelf lives must pay the retailer a spoilage allowance. This fee usually is preset, and must be paid in full – regardless of the actual amount of spoilage.

### How The Fees Affect You

The practice of charging manufacturers a variety of fees is sure to bring about at least two major changes in the advertising arena. First, it will affect the amount and frequency of brand dollars invested in generic consumer advertising.

Second, it will result in the cancellation or revision of co-op programs. If a manufacturer must pay all of these allowances, why would it provide yet *another* contribution? Many manufacturers already have canceled such programs, most visibly in the electronics and food industries.

In addition, such fees greatly reduce the ability of smaller local and regional retailers to advertise. It is common for larger retailers to receive ten cents for every manufacturer's dollar.

Stations and national reps should begin boning up on their presentation strategies to better penetrate brand, regional, and corporate marketing managers. The best plans will include definitive case sales and promotions as well as display, demo, and sampling opportunities.

### **Opening Fees**

A new store opening allowance is a predetermined slotting fee for stocking products in the retailer's new outlet. A grand opening allowance is a fee for inclusion in a new store's display and advertising.

### **Guaranteed Sale Fee**

Many retailers require that manufacturers sell their products on a type of consignment basis. With a guaranteed sale fee, the retailer pays only for the products that are sold.

### Shrinkage Fee

Shrinkage is retail-speak for theft. Since some products have high theft rates, the retailer often makes a manufacturer pay for the losses from the product display.

### **Failure Fee**

This relatively new fee, being promoted by a few powerful retailers, is one a manufacturer must pay if a product's sales aren't as high as projected. The allowance is intended to compensate the retailer for sacrificing sales of a more popular product in the shelf space of the "failed" product.

### Samples/Trial Sizes

Free samples or trial sizes of a product often are included in arrangement with a manufacturer. These packages usually are featured in displays with similar products.

### Product Liability Insurance

To protect themselves against product tampering and consumer lawsuits, retailers often require manufacturers to be included as a rider on product liability insurance. Some retailers even suggest carrying manufacturers on an insurance policy.





# Americans Name Their Favorite Indulgences

when it comes to hedonistic hankerings, Americans are more likely to treat themselves to relatively inexpensive items rather than spoil themselves rotten with expensive spending sprees.

According to the NYC-based **Roper Organization**, making a long-distance phone call to a friend, and buying a book or magazine are the top indulgences of the US populace (at 35% each). On the other hand, less than a fifth of Americans indulge in such extravagant activities as purchasing something *really* expensive, treating themselves to a massage, or tipping back a flute of champagne.


Other favored indulgences – from a list of 18 choices – include taking a long bath and shopping for clothes (both 34%). Incidentally, women are far more likely than men to name a "long bath" as a top treat (46% vs. 20%). Similarly, adult females are more likely than their male counterparts to shop for clothes (43% vs. 23%), and to eat a special dessert (30% vs. 17%) as a treat.

Men Buy More Music

More men than women indulge in buying prerecorded music (26% vs. 18%), and males also hold the edge on females when it comes to purchasing something for a hobby (31% vs. 22%) and drinking champagne or other special cocktails (16% vs. 12%).

Taking in a movie is the top indulgence of the under-30 crowd (listed by 44%), followed by shopping (42%). Meanwhile, professionals and executives say they indulge in buying a book (46%) and dining at an expensive restaurant (41%).

Finally, our passion for massages reflects distinct regional differences. Folks in the West (11%) are more likely than their Southern and Midwestern counterparts (3% each) to indulge in a pleasurable back rub.

### Market For CD Players Hot

### 11% Of Young Adults Plan To Purchase

**P**rofessionals, executives, and young adults are more likely than the average Joe to own a compact disc player. According to a recent survey conducted by the NYC-based Roper Organization, 15% of adults under the age of 30 and 19% of executives and professionals currently own a CD player. By comparison, only 11% of the US general population currently own one of the compact disc playing devices.

More importantly, 8% of professionals and 11% of young adults plan to buy a CD player in 1990, while only 6% of the general population plan to do so.

Furthermore, CD player manufacturers will likely be wooing the college-educated consumer in the coming year. Although 17% already own a player, an additional 8% plan to buy one. Other key markets include Western US residents (16% own and 8% plan to buy) and VCR households (16% own and 7% plan to buy).

Interestingly, America's collective CD player owners tend to seek out other forms of high-tech home entertainment. For example, 92% of CD player households also contain a VCR. By comparison, only 65% of total US households are equipped with a videocassette recorder/player.

### Money Talks — On The Phone

he greater a household's annual salary, the greater number of phones — and phone numbers — it has, according to a recent survey by the NYC-based LINK Resources Corp.

The 1987 study found that US households earning more than \$60,000 average nearly twice as many telephones as those earning less than \$15,000 (3.3 vs. 1.7). Also, nearly 20% of affluent homes have more than one line or number, compared with just 2.5% of households making less than \$15,000.

High-income households are more likely to have designer or novelty phones (13% vs. 4%), cordless models (17% vs. 4%), and two-line phones (4% vs. 1%). They're less likely to call "976" numbers for recorded information, however.

Affluent households are more aware of — and more likely to subscribe to — custom-calling services than low-income families. Consult the chart below for the distribution of several of these services by annual household income:

### 45-54s Eat Up Their Earnings

where the probably know that 45to 54-year-olds earn and spend more than those in any other demo. Here's another statistic you might not be aware of - they also eat more.

The number of 45- to 54-year-olds is expected to skyrocket 47% between 1990 and 2000, according to the newly released *Almanac Of Consumer Markets*. In other words, there will be more than 37.6 million 45-54s by the year 2000, up from 25.5 million this year.

If current trends continue, 45-54s will spend much more than any other age group on food in the '90s. In 1986, households headed by this demo spent an average of \$78.22 a week on edibles -31% more than the national average.

Their favorite foods include eggs (on which they spent 49% more than the average American), seafood (48% more), beef (47%), and pork (42%). Maybe that's why 30% of all us 45-54s are overweight.



### **WBLZ Moves From Urban To Oldies**


### New Calls WGRR; Allen PD



### **Power Pig Hogs Ratings; Q105 Files Suit**

The Upset of an admittedly short year just took place in Tampa, as Jacor's WFLZ (Power Plg 93) roared to number one 12+ in the fall Arbitron. The Pig skyrocketed 2.6-11.6, while simulcast WRBQ-AM & FM (Q105) slid into second with a 14.4-9.6 showing.

Meanwhile, the legal battle over Power Pig's distribution of its "Screw Q105" T-shirts got a little hotter, as Q105 parent **Edens** filed suit in Florida State Court (1/9) seeking injunctive relief — plus *damages* — on the grounds of service mark infringement.

And . . . Power Pig night jock **Tim Dukes** has reportedly filed a battery complaint against Q105 morning zoo staffer **Ward Smith** over the latter's part in the alleged bottle rocket/bumper sticker-slapping incident that took place in the Q105 parking lot late last year.

As we went to press, ST learned that **KITS/SF** and morning man **Perry Stone** have parted company.

### **KGB** Defections

'Twas a wild Wednesday (1/3) at KGB/San Diego. Not only did APD/MD Pam Edwards exit (see Page 22), but longtime KGB personalities Michael Berger (six years) and Jeff Prescott (14 years) — the station's AM drive team since '86 — defected for mornings at crosstown New Rock outlet 91X. Overnighter Gregg Steele is now interim MD.

Expect John Hayes's Alliance Broadcasting and Emmis to ink the X100/SF sale within the next two weeks. Hayes denies he'll take the CHR station Hot AC.

Look for Country **WYAY & WYAI/Atlanta** to name a new OM, maybe even about the time you finish reading this sentence.

Sixteen tons o' unsubstantiated talk about the possible sale of **IRS Records** to either **PolyGram** or **EMI** — for somewhere between \$25-\$30 million. IRS Prez **Jay Boberg** told ST, "We are not uninterested in the concept, but relish our status as one of the few remaining independent companies ...."

In the meantime, VP/Promo **Barry Lyons** has all but inked a new multi-year deal with the label. So it's biz as usual, for now.

Spike all those rumors about Island VP/ Promo Bob Catania splitting . . . if he can hammer out a new deal with new Prez Mike Bone. AOR **KRSP/SLC** PD **Ron Bowen** is out after three months. OM **Steve Carlson** will handle PD duties until a replacement is named.

**WOMC/Detroit** Station Manager/PD Jay **Clark** is out. No replacement named at the AC. Meanwhile, former 'OMC morning man **Tom Ryan** has been rehired for AM drive after an absence of several years.

ST hears Jack Daniel — recently upped from PD to GM at AOR WRFX/Charlotte — is thisclose to inking his successor. The frontrunner: WAVF/Charleston, SC VP/ Programming Jeff Kent.

### Asylum Filling Up

ST hears **Marko Babineau** is talking to a *lotta* people — including **Chrysalis** national promo dude **Michael Van Orsdale, Capitol** National Pop Director **Frank Palombi**, and former **Columbia** national rep **George Chaltas** — about the national promo slot at **Asylum**.

Meanwhile, Babineau has locked up the label's SF local slot, as **Mike Silvia** comes over from **CEMA Distribution** in L.A.

And . . . is **Elektra Entertainment** head honcho **Bob Krasnow** balking about giving up the name Asylum?

ST hears that the name **Hollywood Records** has *not* been cleared for use, seeing as how there's already at least four other firms that claim rights to it.

Label chief **Peter Paterno** will look to either secure rights to the Hollywood name or think of a new one. Meanwhile, he's starting to put together a list of VP/Promo candidates.

### Straight To The Point

KQPT/Sacramento has resolved its "The Point" service mark litigation against Radio Ventura's KXPT/Oxnard-Ventura, CA. A consent judgment has been entered by the Federal District Court in L.A. that will enjoin Radio Ventura from using "The Point" in connection with KXPT. As part of the settlement, Radio Ventura made a cash payment to KQPT parent Duchossols Communications.




### **Ridin' With The King**



Continued from Page 1 "The court's decision is another nail in the Fairness Doctrine's coffin," said Radio-Television News Directors Association President Dave Bartlett. "Congress ought to get the message by now that the FCC was correct when it dropped the Fairness Doctrine – but I still expect a fight over codification during this session."

Two lawmakers certain to lead any such fight are Rep. John Dingell (D-MI) and Sen. Ernest Hollings (D-SC), both of whom issued statements confirming their continued support for the Fairness Doctrine. Dingell's statement contained a thinly veiled threat aimed at broadcasters.

"If broadcasters have no special responsibilities," Dingell said, "this makes it far more difficult to justify their special status and license under law."

Despite such tough talk, Bartlett said he is confident neither the two stand-alone Fairness bills pending in Congress nor measures bearing codification language will make it to the floor of either chamber. "I think President Bush has made it clear he will veto any such bill, so what's the point of bringing it to the floor for a vote?" said Bartlett.

### **Minority Setback**

Supporters of the FCC's minority preference policies, meanwhile, admit they are concerned that the current Supreme Court, which has demonstrated a desire to limit affirmative action programs, will hear two cases challenging the constitutionality of the FCC's minority preference policies.

"This is definitely the wrong Supreme Court to be hearing these cases," said National Black Media Coalition Chairman Pluria Marshall.

The two cases the Justices accepted are Astroline Communications v. Shurberg Broadcasting, which focuses on the minority distress sale policy, and Metro Broadcasting v. FCC, which involves the Commission's practice of granting preferences to minority-controlled entities in the comparative licensing process.

Last spring a three-judge panel of the US Appeals Court in Washington, ruling in the Shurberg case, found that the distress sale policy deprives nonminorities of their right to due process. Three weeks later a different panel of the same court heard the Metro case and upheld the minority preference policy.

National Association of Black-Owned Broadcasters Exec. Director James Winston said he believes the court is likely to issue a split decision upholding the comparative preference and striking down the distress sale.

With a ruling in the two cases expected by early summer, Winston said his group has stepped up its efforts to protect all three minority policies – the minority tax certificate is the third – by having them written into law, something Sen. Daniel Inouye (D-HI) says he's also committed to doing. If the policies become law, their opponents would have to launch a new court challenge in order to overturn them.







## RATINGS & RESEARCH

## The Dangers Of Being Too Selective

Only a few decades ago, audience and marketing research studies were unheard of in radio broadcasting. However, times have changed, and research has become part of management's standard operating procedure. Unfortunately, the dependence on research is also problematic.

Research guidelines, which are scientific by nature, are being ignored in order to match budgets, express individual beliefs, and promote research companies' products. One area of great concern relates to the size of samples now used in research projects, wherein the opinions of too few are being used to confirm the opinions of many. If nothing is done to correct this use of inadequate sample sizes, radio research may become a liability rather than an asset in the decision-making process.

### **Emerging Importance**

When nonratings research first entered the radio field, many broadcasters were skeptical about its purposes and uses. Decisionmakers determined what an audience *needed*. There was little concern about what an audience *wanted*.

Most broadcasters considered radio programming as a form of artistic creativity and, therefore, believed there was no need for outside intervention — especially from listeners. But as research was more widely used and shown to be helpful in increasing audience numbers, radio decision-makers began to see the value of asking audiences what they wanted, as well as determining what types of listeners tuned in and why.

Thus, research very quickly became acceptable. Using research is now commonplace, but a commonplace attitude often leads to misuse and irrationality. Therein lies the problem.

### **Behavioral Research**

Radio research falls under the broad category of "behavioral research," which simply means that human subjects (or respondents) are tested and/or measured as opposed to inanimate objects such as the atmosphere or titanium.

In the hard sciences (i.e., physics and chemistry), which deal with static uniform elements, a researcher who identifies the basic elements contained in a sample of a material known as "silver" will

find the exact same elements in a totally different sample of material named "silver." However, this static quality isn't true in behavioral research, where one respondent's answers may be totally opposite those of another respondent even though, for example, both respondents may be 18-year-old males who have identical backgrounds and lifestyles.

The problem in conducting research with humans is that no two people are the same. Prediction, therefore, becomes very difficult and sometimes impossible. To address this problem, behavioral researchers use large samples of respondents. The hard science researcher may only require a sample of one or two subjects or compounds to determine if something "is or isn't." Behavioral science researchers aren't as lucky predictions or judgments based on a sample of only one or two

respondents would be absurd.

The confusion and misunderstanding about what research can and cannot do are creating significant and potentially dangerous problems for station owners and management. For example, too many station managers are relying on improperly conceived and conducted research and/or are using research data as the sole basis for decision-making.

All too often, research companies are hired to prove a point or

collect evidence for a decision that's already been made. In these cases, regardless of what research concludes, the results are interpreted to fit the immediate need. Frequently a valid and reliable research project will present an objective conclusion, only to have decision-makers declare the data is "garbage" or "the results can't be correct. I know my market, my station, and my listeners. The research is wrong."

If that's the case, then why conduct the research? Why hire someone from the outside to provide a scientifically based objective viewpoint only to "shoot down" the results? Researchers face this situation all the time, and it appears to be increasing by leaps and bounds.

Consider this: many radio station decision-makers find great value in research information. They want to know as much as possible about their market, station, and listeners. They use research data to make intelligent decisions, and many of them help guide their station to great success. What's happening now is that the role of research is losing its "scientific" basis and entering the "quick fix" realm. In too many instances, once-thoughtful station management succumbs to the appeal of research projects that offer something "new," but with little substance.

The usual scenario is this: previously successful decisions took into account research data which involved hundreds of respondents. The large sample eliminated the influences of a few people who might distort the feelings and attitudes of the general population. Decisions were based on scientifically valid and reliable information. Lately, however, the idea has developed to gather information from more highly selected groups of people. A disturbing trend is emerging - decision-making bassubsamples minute populations rather than the broader picture.

#### Subsample Example

For example, instead of interviewing 500 18-34 females, a typical project might now include 500 females, with the requirement that 50% be fans of the radio station (the effective subsample now

## **Determining Sample Size**

The appropriate sample size used in any project is based on three considerations:

• The amount of sampling error management is willing to tolerate • The available research budget

Time constraints

One or more of these items may affect sample size, but the bottom line recommendation is to use as large a sample as possible.

The method for determining sample size is simple. However, for some reason, a misguided method of determining sample size has crept into radio research. For example, a broadcaster who wants to conduct a telephone study usually contacts a research company and asks for (or is sold) a study using a 300, 400, or 500person sample (or another increment of 100; apparently, time or practice has established a magical significance on increments of 100).

The correct approach to determining sample size is exactly opposite:

• Telephone Perceptual Studles — The total sample size for this research should be "backed into," not predetermined. The method is simple: a specific cell (age, sex, favorite station, etc.) should have a minimum of 75 respondents. Suppose management wants to

equals 250 and the sampling error goes up). The next study requires 500 females (50% who are fans), but 50% of these fans must also listen to the primary competitor (subsample is now 125).

Added to this is the requirement that 50% of these fans must also live in the northern part of the city (subsample = 62), 50% must also listen to radio for at least three hours per day (subsample = 31), 50% must also cume an AC station (subsample = 16), and 50% must listen to the station's morning show (subsample = 8). And so on.

Instead of collecting valid and reliable data from 500 respondents (with adequate cell sizes representing an acceptable sampling error), management now wants information from eight (or fewer) listeners to represent how the remainder of the 18-34 population thinks.

This minuscule sampling procedure is not only irrational, it's look at both men and women (aged 25-34, 35-44, and 45-54) and fans of the station (all in individual cells). This study would involve seven subsamples and should include a total sample of 525 (7 x 75) people as a minimum. To reduce sampling error, each cell can be increased according to budget and time constraints.


Telephone perceptual studies should *never* be purchased by a station or sold by a research company solely on the basis of sample size alone. The sample size should be determined on the basis of the design and requirements of the study.

• Music Tests - Sample sizes for individual cells in music tests can be reduced, since these studies fall under the statistics category known as "repeated measures." That is, one respondent provides hundreds of measurements or ratings in one project (300-400 song titles). In music tests, no individual subsample should fall below 25 respondents. If cell sizes are used which are below 25 respondents, the results cannot be considered as accurate measures, but only as indications of the true measures or ratings.

dangerous. Radio isn't a simple compound like silver. It's an emotional medium that respondents use in very individual ways. Valid and reliable data are developed only by investigating a variety of individuals. Unfortunately, the trend in many telephone studies and auditorium music tests is to allow a handful of respondents (all of whom may be totally opposite from the other members of the population) to dictate what's good and what's bad about radio.

In summary, the problem of minuscule sampling is becoming commonplace in all types of radio research. Although researchers argue against the practice, it is radio stations that pay research bills, and the practice continues. If nothing is done to correct this problem – and correct it quickly – those who use research involving small samples may face potentially disastrous futures. Radio managers may find themselves managing an Edsel.

Poll Indicates There's No Dance Music Explosion

The fall Birch reports show CHR/Dance stations leading the pack in New York and Los Angeles. Is dance music, which has helped catapult these stations over their rivals, about to explode in a re-creation of the disco era? Soundata panelists give us reason to believe it won't.

Two out of three music consumers like dance music. Four of every ten who do like it feel very strongly about it. Overall, only half of the male music buyers said they liked dance music, compared to seven out of ten females. Women are also twice as likely as men to strongly like dance music.


Dance knows no age boundaries: all age segments gave a better than 60% positive response, with music consumers 45+ professing the highest positive feelings. Surely their idea of dance music is quite different from that of a 15-yearold's. But both are identifying what they perceive as dance music.


While 62% of white panel members said they like or strongly like dance music, that number rose to nearly 90% among black music buyers. Education, on the other hand, played no part in these preferences. Geographically, dance music is much hotter in the West (69%) than in the Northeast (61%).

**Teens Hear More Dance** Do music consumers think their radio stations are currently playing more dance music than they played, say, six months ago? Not really - 75% said they find no difference, while those who said they're hearing more or less dance music on the radio split evenly with 12% each.

Age factored into these responses, as it also influenced the choice of radio stations. The older a person is, the less likely he is to perceive more dance on the radio. Younger consumers, who tend to

Forty percent of our respondents had attended a dance club featuring live or recorded music in the six months prior to the poll, with 18-24s dominating (the only age group in which a majority had gone clubbing). Those 45+ folks who told us they loved dance music had gone out the least. There was no significant racial or geographic difference in club habits.

The remainder noticed no such dif-

Two out of three said they were going dancing about as often or more often than they had six months prior. Interestingly, the group claiming the highest percentage of those dancing less was the 18-24s - the core.

One in four active music buyers said dance clubs influenced his music purchases, with the young most swayed. Black music buyers are likelier to be influenced than whites. The higher the education, the less influence clubs play on music purchases.

#### **Less Dance At Home**

Dance music is being played less on a friend-to-friend basis in homes, with 75% indicating no difference and three of every remaining four saying they play less dance music when with friends. Music consumers under the age of 18 were evenly divided on the point. The older a person gets the less likely he is to play dance music with friends.

The data indicates there's no great resurgence in dance music. There's no perceived increase in dance airplay (except among the young), club attendance, club impact on purchases, or dance video viewership.

In big cities, where Urban and CHR stations have taken on some of each other's musical characteristics, the distinctions grow less clear to the listener. Rock-leaning CHRs drive some listeners toward UCs and Urban-leaning CHRs. MTV has played a role in the increased number of dance videos, and has had some influence on what pop radio plays. Yet there's no concrete statistical base to indicate wholesale change.

## **Metal Fatigue**

In a recent telephone survey, 22% of music consumers said they either liked or strongly liked heavy metal music. That percentage was off ever so slightly from last June's findings. Information indicates a sizable number of teens may be changing their attitude toward metal.

in June, half of the Soundata teen music consumers said they liked metal music. In our most recent poll, positive responses dropped to 42%, while negatives rose from 35% to 42% - a dead heat. There was some erosion among 18-24s as well.

When asked how they learned about new heavy metal bands, respondents were allowed to give as many answers as they wanted. MTV led the pack, cited by 44% of those who said they liked heavy metal. Hadio ran a close second (42%) and word of mouth finished third (29%).


Among teens word of mouth came in first (45%), MTV ran second (32%), and radio posted third (23%). Among 18-24s, MTV reigned, noted by more than 60%.

We're seeing evidence of a cycle that has occurred time and again with anti-status quo music. Once it's absorbed by the main-

stream it loses its hipness. That's proven by the way most young teens say they find out about metal: they still hear about it from their friends. When it becomes the steady diet offered by a host of radio stations, it loses its renegade attraction.

Monitor metal carefully. As soon as the mainstream abandons it again, its hipness quotient will multiply.

## Radio Urged To Share MLK's Birthday 'Heritage'

s a tribute to Dr. Martin Luther King, Columbia Records is asking all US radio stations to simultaneously play Earth, Wind & Fire's just released "Heritage" single at precisely 12:00 noon on January 15 which would've been the slain civil rights leader's 61st birthday.

The label also says it'll donate a portion of the proceeds from sale of the single, which features a guest vocal appearance from Motown recording artists the Boys, to the King Center. Meanwhile, look for EW&F's new LP - also titled "Heritage" – later next month.

### **Cueing The Subject**

The life and career of renowned musician/composer/producer Quincy Jones will be the subject of a documentary film, titled "Places You Find Love," scheduled to be released via Warner Bros.' film division this fall.

The flick, which takes its title from a song on Q's recently released "Back On The Block" Qwest/ WB LP, will feature interview footage from folks who've figured prominently in Jones's nearly 40-year career, including Frank Sinatra, Ray Charles, Ella Fitzgerald, Michael Jackson, Donna Summer, Ice-T, Lionel Hampton, Dizzy Gillespie, and Barbra Streisand. No word as yet on an accompanying soundtrack.

Incidentally, Warner Bros. is also planning to launch a prime-time animation project (!) starring a character - based on Jones - titled "The Dude."



## **Florida Promoters Pull Ostrich Trick**

Y'know how the mighty tourist state of Florida has decided to save a few bucks? By discontinuing publication of its Tourist Events brochure! A broadcaster who calls or writes for a list of special events and tourist attractions gets back a pathetic letter about budget cuts.

While 49 other states and the District of Columbia continue to invest money to promote tourism, the Sunshine State, undeniably one of the world's favorite vacation destinations, has decided it's too expensive to prime the pump by printing the traditional events calendars. Absolutely astonishing. Other people's priorities amaze me.

I do research every month for several hundred DJs and reporters who don't want to miss big, important events, and who enjoy making calls to the various Slug Festivals, bed races on ice, Ugly Snowman contests, and other weird diversions cooked up in communities across the nation. Florida is the only state no longer making any effort to promote this kind of feature story coverage. As I write this, I have a call in to the errant state's Department of Commerce. The phone rang a couple of times, the line picked up, then I was disconnected. I called back and got a human, who took my name and number.

As I wait for the return call, I speculate about what could have happened down there. Have foreigners finally bought a controlling interest in Florida and quietly decided to cut publicity so the lines will be shorter at Disney World?

Maybe Miami is full because of this Noriega business and the locals want to keep the parking places for themselves. Perhaps Tampa doesn't want to promote the Gasparila Pirate Invasion because it might give potential visitors an unfavorable impression of boat traffic in the Bay. Is it that the Swamp Cabbage Festival at LaBelle too grossly misrepresents Floridians' diet?

### **Any Volunteers?**

We radio people are keenly conscious of the value of promotion. It takes time, effort, imagination, and a certain amount of money to promote, but we wouldn't think of *not* pitching.

Golly, gang, maybe we could do a public service! Perhaps a big, successful station could volunteer to send a hot GSM or PD down there to rescue Florida's PR shop.

Surely our sunshine-besotted friends know the hoary story of the businessman who heard the economy was going to decline, so he decided to conserve money by discontinuing his advertising — and sure enough, his business declined.

By the same logic, one might stop breathing in order to avoid inhaling smog. Hmmm. At this point, it appears they're also saving on the phone bill.

**MONDAY, JANUARY 22** — Historically this has been one of the year's most bitterly cold days. The US alltime low temperature of 85 degrees below zero was set at Mount Carroll, IL in 1930. In 1989, the day's lowest high temperature was 66 below at Chandalar Lake, AK. In 1985, the "freeze of the century" damaged 90% of Florida's citrus crops; the same day in '85, Virginia's alltime low of 30 below zero was recorded at Mountain Lake. America announced in 1955 it would develop intercontinental missiles with nuclear warheads. Thornton Wilder's play "Our Town" premiered in 1938 and won a Pulitzer. Columbia Phonograph Co. was formed in Washington, DC in 1889; it became CBS.

Earthquakes and mudslides destroyed dozens of villages in the mountains of Soviet Central Asia in 1989. A World Airways DC-10 skidded off a Logan Airport runway into Boston harbor in 1982, killing two passengers. The temperature was 80 below zero at Prospect Creek, AK in 1971, the state's alltime low temperature. **NBC** broadcast the first "educational" television program in 1942, a training film for WWII air raid wardens around New York City. *Birthdays*: Princess Caroline 33. "MacGyver" Richard Anderson 40.

WEDNESDAY, JANUARY 24 — After spending ten years on death row and being the subject of a television movie and five books, **Ted Bundy** was executed in Florida in 1989 for murdering two college coeds and a 12-yearold girl. Bundy was suspected of at least 30 other murders, and confessed to several of them in his last hours. Voyager 2 made its close fly-by of Uranus in 1986, sending back pictures as it passed within about 50,000 miles. Beer in cans was first distributed in Richmond, VA in 1935. The Soviet Union renamed the city of Petrograd in 1924, calling it Leningrad in honor of the late revolutionary leader. The first Boy Scout troop was formed in England in 1908 by Sir **Robert Baden-Powell**, an army general. Gold was discovered at Sutter's Mill, CA in 1848, the start of the Gold Rush.

Journalist **Edwin Newman** 71.

Tying in with Rainbow Foods and Catholic Charities, the station set up four trailers which were active through New Year's Day collecting food and clothing for the Twin Cities' nearly 4000 homeless.


• KIIS-FM/Los Angeles afternoon driver "Magic" Matt remained on-air continuously for 32 hours (11/22). His appeal, cosponsored by Blue Chip Mayflower Van Lines and Vons Foods, netted more than 27,000 pounds of food for the Los Angeles Regional Food Bank. His on-air battle cry was "KIIS hunger goodbye for the holidays."

• WPLJ/New York morning character Howard The Cabdriver helped Aris Isotoner Gloves distribute 10,000 pairs of new gloves to the Big Apple's street residents. Listeners were asked to drop off old gloves or cash contributions at Penn Station and the Staten Island Ferry terminals.


## Puttin' On **The Bits**

Sooo ... it's the dawn of a new decade and you're thinking maybe this would be an excellent time to steal er, I mean borrow - some new bits to spice up your morning show. Well, I'm happy to report there is life beyond "Tabloid Trash" and the "Dreaded Morning Oldie."

Not that there's anything wrong with the old AM drive workhorses. Like the great classic tunes, some bits simply don't burn. Listeners grow very comfortable with favorite bits - something you invariably discover when you try to take one off the air!

Nevertheless, there's nothing like a good new feature to freshen things up and keep your core entertained. With that in mind, I called a bunch of AOR programmers and gathered several bits for your perusal. I specifically requested bits (or variations of bits) that were either originated in-house or hadn't achieved widespread popularity.

Even so, though a particular PD may be credited with donating a bit to this column, that doesn't necessarily mean he or his station originated the idea. In fact, several contributors went out of their way to say they stole the bit (or the concept) from another source. WRXK/Ft. Myers, FL PD Swingin' Dick Tyler echoes several of his peers when he says, "Adam had the last original idea."



Polls, Cats & Chainsaws

Speaking of Tyler, he offered a couple of interesting ideas 'RXK has found successful:

• Harris Poll - A personality randomly selects someone named Harris from a phone book and calls to ask his opinion on a hot topic.

• Spin The Cat - Rather than use a traditional wheel to determine listener prizes, 'RXK plunks a poor feline on its back and "spins the cat," utilizing appropriate sound effects. (As a cat lover I find this repugnant, but you be the judge.)

• Nuclear Sports - Tyler admits he has "no idea" why 'RXK labels its sports reports "nuclear" and accompanies them with the sounds of bombs and the like. "We do it just to be tacky, I guess," he says. "We always try to keep things left of center."

WBLM/Portland, ME also makes use of explosive sfx:

• Name That Target - This bit grew out of a longstanding Maine controversy regarding cruise missile testing. Using clues, the caller must identify which town is targeted for destruction. If he's correct, the target is nuked. If he's incorrect, his town is nuked.

"Basically, people are on the line for their towns," 'BLM OM Jose Diaz explains. "If they get it right, they save the town and win a prize. If they're wrong, their town goes up in flames!'

• Chainsaw Trivia – In this warped variation on the traditional trivia contest, when a caller can't answer the question, the personality fires up the 'BLM chainsaw and cuts off one of the caller's limbs. Diaz reports: "It works best when the listener really gets into it and starts screaming, 'Oh no, my finger's going! Help!' "

• Bachelor Refrigerator Bachelors (and bachelorettes) get a chance to rid themselves of ancient items residing in their refrig erators by trading them in for prizes.

### **Gabe's Deadly Bit**

You've heard of "Rock & Roll Heaven," where Jimi, Janis, Jim, John, and the other dearly departed rockers (yes, even some whose names don't begin with J) reside? KFMQ/Lincoln PD Gabe Baptiste takes the concept a step further with the:

An increasingly popular method to raise money is to produce CD and/or cassette compilations like the four pictured here. Two feature morning bits; the others spotlight



KTCZ/Minneapolis invited 13 artists to provide material for "The Cities' Sampler." Much of the material is previously unreleased or commercially unavailable.

• Wheel Of Death - Callers spin the wheel and win an album from the person indicated. However, not everyone on the wheel is a musician, nor are they necessarily dead. Examples: Hitler, Noriega, and Slim Whitman.

"Ferdinand Marcos was on the wheel way before he passed away," notes Baptiste. "We keep it fresh, not only with people who died recently but with people we just wish would die."

• Mr. Slogan - "We give you the slogan, you tell us the product," Baptiste explains. "When we first started doing it, I planned on going to the library and pulling out all the Life magazines from the past 20 years. But then I found out there's a game you can use called 'Adver-teasing.' " Note: Mr. Slogan provides a good way to involve your valued advertisers.

### **Tasty Ideas**

KBOY/Medford, OR rekindles fond educational memories with:

 School Lunch Menus – A daily review of what local schools will be serving for lunch, spiced with appropriate sfx (including a tasteful burp). "A big cumer," claims PD/ morning guru Wild Bill Scott, who notes the most popular dish cooked up by Medford's fine school system is the delicious, nutritious "Wiener Wrap."

Every morning, WTPA/Harrisburg, PA listeners are invited to:

• Sing Along With Ed's Wife -This creatively titled bit relies on the vocal talents (or lack thereof) of morning man Ed Coffey's wife Polly. She sings a song to a certain point; the caller has to sing the next line correctly to win.

Acknowledging that a lot of stations use bits similar to this, 'TPA

PD Jeff Kauffman says the singalong works especially well "because Polly's not a rock & roll singer. She's this middle-class suburban wife with three kids who hasn't heard half the songs she's singing. The best part of the bit is hearing Polly - having the caller on-air is incidental."

• Veal Of Fortune – Originally titled "Wheel Of Meat," the bit received a new moniker after Kauffman found out the previous name had been copyrighted and syndicated. (Kauffman says Coffey actually came up with the bit years ago.) Callers answer trivia questions and spin the wheel to win cuts of meat.

### From WHCN/Hartford PD Bob Bittens:

• Marching Weathermen - The weather forecast is done as a calland-response march, led by AM drive character "Sgt. Spike." This is another syndicated bit: Bittens claims 'HCN morning man Michael Picozzi originated the idea years ago at WYSP/Philadelphia.

KRNA/Cedar Rapids spices up its weather forecasts in a couple of different ways. The AM drive instudio band - which plays real instruments, by the way - sings the forecast to the tune of a well-known song. Alternatively, callers are invited to shout along in "Hey Weather," an idea PD Mark Vos says the station adopted from the widespread use of Gary Glitter's "Rock & Roll Pt. 2" at sporting events

### **Stranger Than Fiction**

KRZQ/Reno GM Daniel Cook reports a great deal of success with:

 Confess Your Own Crime This is the same concept as those ubiquitous "976" confession lines. The station enhances the bit with an FBI theme song and appropriate sfx.

• Driveup Microphone - Periodically the station simply hangs a microphone outside the studios and invites listeners to come by and say anything. The best responses are edited and used on-air.

KATT/Oklahoma City used the movie "Blaze" to inspire a bit called:

• The Greatest Office Scandal -Listeners are enticed to call and discuss - anonymously, of course the dirty little things going on where they work. The caller whose scandal is judged best wins a trip to New Orleans to create his own scandal. PD Scott Douglas says the bit works because, as usual, "real life is stranger than fiction.'

From WAQY/Springfield, MA:

• The Worst That Could Happen Listeners are encouraged to send the station a bride-to-be's name and phone number; morning guys call her up and try to convince her not to go through with wedding, using the Brooklyn Bridge oldie "Worst That Could Happen" with horror movie sounds spliced in.

"It's one of those things you think wouldn't be that popular," says PD

Keith Masters. "But when we took it off the air for a rest, people just called and called."

### **Poetic License**

Finally, WIXV/Savannah PD Virgil Thompson chimes in with a simple contest called:

• Who's That Guy/Gal? - 'IXV breakfast flake John Garber developed this feature to allow him to show off his poetic skills. Listeners must figure out who Garber is describing. A recent effort:

## **A Dream Deferred?**

Radio, Record Execs Reflect On King Holiday Observance

This year marks the fourth annual observance of Martin Luther King Jr. Day (1/15). In honor of the holiday, I called several broadcasters and music industry executives and asked what more needs to be done to "keep the dream alive."

James Alexander, WJLB/Detroit

"Broadcasters and the communications industry in general could help establish a theme or tradition for this holiday, such as the unification of the country's diverse communities. Martin Luther King Jr. stood for that. If we could establish a theme, it might shed a new light on this holiday.

"Our station will be doing a number of things the week of the national holiday. And we'll be airing PSAs that actually refer to the things I've outlined."

### Lynn Tolliver, WZAK/Cleveland

"UC/Black radio must help educate the children of this country about who Martin Luther King Jr. was, what he stood for, what he accomplished, and what the entire civil rights struggle was. There are children both black and white who don't know who King was, what he went through, or why he died. They should be taught what an influential person he was, not only in this country, but in the world.

## Black Vacation Dollars Reach Billions

Black tourism, a \$25 billion industry by recent estimates, is growing, and special services and organizations are springing up to offer alternative getaways. African-American travel groups like the Brotherhood Of Skiers. with over 9000 members; Chocolate Singles FSO International; and the camper-oriented Black Pack are becoming big business - the Skiers spent over \$3 million last winter at Steamboat Springs, Colorado. A decade ago no one took them seriously. Foreign tourism boards have also begun targeting the black traveler. African and Caribbean nations have hired New York ad agencies to promote black tourism; the Bahamas, where black travelers spend an estimated \$60-\$70 million a year, uses targeted advertising.

"Acknowledging Dr. King as an African-American who made his mark is the best thing we can do. Without his accomplishments, a lot of us wouldn't be where we are today. But I don't think the entire American population will ever acknowledge this great man's accomplishments or celebrate his birthday. The people who were affected most by his presence should be the people affected most by his absence."

### Michael Spears, KKDA/Dallas

"As a Black radio station it's important for us to be a clearinghouse for information about community events. Broadcasters should publicize this information via PSAs and concert lines.

"On January 14 the Junior Black Academy, its director Curtis King, and our Community Affairs Director, Joycelyn Johnson, have arranged to cosponsor a Melba Moore tribute concert to Dr. King. On January 15, the Dallas Museum of Art and K104 are cosponsoring a black art exhibit. Various speakers will appear, including author Alex Haley and poet Maya Angelou.

"We'll also air 'King: A Musical Tribute,' a three-hour syndicated special, on Sunday evening. We've arranged for the syndicator to make dubs of the program – at no charge – for all public libraries and schools in the area to use as reference material. It's our privilege to serve the black community in North Texas. So we try to do as much as we can to keep the dream alive. There are generations of young people who need the reminder and the information."

### Sam Weaver, WQMG/Greensboro, NC

"When the holiday was a news story, broadcasters dealt with it appropriately until it became a legal holiday. Since then they haven't taken it seriously – not the Congress, who voted on the holiday; not the business community or the media – none have taken it as seriously as it should be taken. Our leaders must take a stand on the holiday and what King meant to our country."

### Jack Patterson, KDAY/Los Angeles

"We have to help educate those who weren't there when Dr. King's thoughts and actions were taking hold in America. So many of us were so young, all we know of his teachings is what we might have heard. We as broadcasters are responsible for keeping the dream alive. We have to educate our future, which is our kids."

### Ray Boyd, WBLS/New York

"It was a long hard fight for us to get our political leaders to pass a bill for this holiday. We in Black radio are the primary source of information for the black community, so we must advocate total dedication to the observance of this day in our nation's history. No matter how you celebrate it, do it – that's the most important thing."

### Sharon Heyward, Virgin Records

"We spend money on radio promotions all the time. Some of that money could go toward promotional trips to send children to the King Center in Atlanta so they could better understand what Dr. King's life was about and why we celebrate his birthday. We could help keep the dream alive by educating our children about what he accomplished. If we'd work together we could do these things."

### A.D. Washington, MCA Records

"Martin Luther King Jr. means a great deal to me because I was directly involved in the struggle and have benefitted from it. I truly believe that if it hadn't been for King or someone like him, black people would not have moved forward as far as we have today. We have to do everything in our power to make sure the holiday is recognized and observed by all Ameri-

## **Educating The Next Generation**

Martin Luther King III serves as a Fulton County Commissioner in Atlanta. He was kind enough to contribute his time and comments to this King Jr. tribute, suggesting ways broadcasters/entertainers could facilitate public acceptance of the national holiday.

"Broadcasters can make a tremendous impact on our society. First, an historical perspective has to be designed that makes us as African-Americans appreciate our history and heritage. We must also educate the majority population. White Americans must learn not just to respect, but to appreciate and understand that our history and heritage are just as important as theirs.

"That historical perspective should start with the '50s, when blacks couldn't ride buses the way whites could. It should trace the evolution of the '60s 'sit-in movement,' including the freedom rides in 1961, the Civil Rights Act in 1964, the Voting Rights Act in 1965, and Fair Housing in 1968. The only way you know where you're going is to have a sense of where you came from. That's the first thing I would stress about the movement. We should educate the generations to come, and broadcasters could do that on an enormous scale,"

Commissioner King also addressed what those in the entertainment industry can do. "I think the entertainment community wants to participate, but we who understand the movement can help those in entertainment discover what in fact they can do.

"Many times people only look at the objective — the objective was to secure a bill to legalize the holiday. But the one thing we must do is maximize the impact of entertainers. If it had not been for **Stevle Wonder** and many others, we might not have a holiday today.

"I urge all those in the media and entertainment industry to visit the King Center. We want them to understand we're trying to provide a world where we can live without destroying persons or property. I really believe that once the community understands our mission, my father's birthday will be continually enhanced. The objective is to live out the philosophy he talked about, and cherish love, freedom, justice, and equality for all mankind."



## MOTOR CITY MAINSTAY McCarthy Marks 25 Years On WJR

Many announcers claim to be personalities, but WJR/ Detroit AM drive maven J.P. McCarthy is a personality in the truest sense. (J.P. stands for Joseph Priestly — close friends call him Joe.) Last month, he marked his 25th consecutive year at the Motor City heritage Full-Service AC.

### **The Second Time Around**

This is McCarthy's second stint at 'JR. He first joined up in 1956 and left for KGO/San Francisco after a stay of nearly seven years. The Bay Area visit was short-lived, as McCarthy returned to 'JR after 18 months.

WJR arranged a special weeklong party to celebrate the air personality's silver anniversary. "It built up as the week went along," recalled PD Jimmy Barrett. "It turned out great from a scheduling standpoint because the biggest day of the celebration was Friday (12/8) — his actual anniversary date.

"He's an incredible institution in this market. He literally knows everybody. At a moment's notice, he's able to contact anyone in this town of any importance for an interview or comment. J.P. lets the events of the day and week dictate the direction of his show. As with most other great morning show hosts, he has a certain amount of predetermined features which are a regular part of the show."

An avid sports fan, McCarthy delivers sports segments himself. Tigers Manager Sparky Anderson

An updated (1989) J.P. McCarthy.

is a regular member of the morning show during the baseball campaign. (WJR is the Tigers' flagship station.)

McCarthy is also adept at handling the political scene. Said Barrett, "He's one of the few morning show hosts who had both major presidential candidates on his show before the '88 election. I'll never forget the conversation J.P. had with **Bush**. It was like they were neighbors. Bush opened by saying, 'Hi Joe, how've you been?' It's like the two of them had been out bowling and had a beer the night before.''

## In AM Drive, Nobody Shoots 'JR

While **WJR/Detroit** morning man **J.P. McCarthy**'s 12+ **Arbitron** stats were down a tad this spring and summer, the 25-year WJR vet continues to dominate the city's early morning daypart.

McCarthy's six-book (spring, '88-summer, '89) 12+ ratings average is 13.6. No other station's AM driver achieved double digits for *any* of those sweeps.

Among adults 35-64, McCarthy's strength is even greater (six-book average: 17.9). Only News **WWJ** (summer, '88) scored twin digits in that demo.

Stations coming in second to McCarthy (with the amount they trail WJR in parentheses) have been:

McCarthy's *five-book* (summer, '88-summer, '89) 12+ **Birch** average is 12.4. No other station in those surveys scored double figures. In each of the five books, WJLB finished second; this summer was the UC's weakest performance.

Among 35-64s in Birch (summer, '89), WJR and McCarthy logged a greater than 2-1 advantage over second place CHR WKQI (formerly WCZY).

### **Properly Focused**


McCarthy is a multifaceted morning guy who's taken his act on the road. In addition to handling AM drive duties, he hosts the station's 40-minute newsmaker interview program, "Focus," which airs weekdays following Paul Harvey (12:20pm).

Barrett reported, "People in the business who are familiar with J.P. agree on at least one thing about him: he's one of the best radio interviewers you'd want to hear. He has an uncanny ability to always ask the right questions. J.P.'s able to pull information from people information most other interviewers would never get. His guests seem to tell him anything he wants to know."

### PAL's Pal

Like many other communityminded broadcasters, McCarthy has his favorite local charity; in his case, it's PAL, the Police Athletic League. That organization is run by Detroit police officers who help bring sports and sports training

Barrett cautions would-be Mc-Carthy copycats that the master's act is unique. "You couldn't teach somebody to perform like J.P.; so much of what he does comes from natural ability. You can't effectively teach those kinds of interviewing skills and techniques."




## **Christmas Wrap**

## An Open Letter To USA Today's David Zimmerman

### Dear David,

Where in the world did you ever get the notion, as you stated in USA Today (12/28/89), that Country radio is "often manned by burned-out rock programmers who underestimate Country listeners" and that these programmers fight oldies stations by "plugging in quasi-country oldies like the Eagles' tired 'Lyin' Eyes?'

I don't know who provides you with input on the Country radio scene. But I can't imagine how, based on reality as I know it, you came to either of those conclusions. You and USA Today have done a tremendous disservice to the men and women who program the more than 2300 Country radio stations in America. The piece wrongly diminishes their efforts in the eyes of their listeners.

There are, in fact, a number of Country programmers who have come from the AC or CHR ranks. But I can't think of a single one who might be considered "burned-out." The implication is that they couldn't cut it in rock any longer so they moved to Country because it's an easier format in which to compete. As you and I have discussed in the past, the sheer number of formats targeting 25-54 adults makes that an absurd idea. The same intense competition for the 25-54 audience precludes any programmer from underestimating the listener. He who underestimates the audience is not burned out, he's out of work.

As for "Lyin' Eyes" and others of its genre, they are played because they continually test well with the audience.

David, readers understand reviews reflect the critic's opinion. But when a review is presented as an authoritative article - as yours was -USA Today's hundreds of thousands of readers take what you said about programmers to be fact. It isn't. I know.
