

FCC Set To Act On Indecency Law

The FCC will likely take a first step this Thursday (9/17) toward implementing a new law restricting indecent broadcasts to the midnight-6am period.

According to sources, the commissioners will approve a notice of proposed rulemaking seeking public comment on revision of the agency's indecency enforcement policies. This would include determining permissible hours for airing blue material

Regardless of what those comments say, however, the agency is bound by the new law to limit indecency to midnight-6am. "We know what we're going to conclude regardless of the comments," said an FCC staffer. "It's like saying we're going to give you a fair trial - followed by a fine hanging.

The legislation was introduced and championed by Sen. Robert Bvrd (D-WV); President Bush signed the bill in late August. Until the new rule takes effect, said one source, the FCC will continue to

recognize its current 8pm-6am "safe harbor" during which broadcasters may air allegedly indecent material without risk of being fined by the agency.

Challenge Likely

A source close to a broadcast industry coalition that has opposed efforts to tighten the indecency rules said the group will probably go to court to overturn the new law. Such a suit will likely be filed after the FCC formally imposes the midnight-6am rule.

Veterans of recent indecency fights are confident the courts will reject the midnight-6am limit as an unconstitutional restriction of free speech. They base their optimism on a federal appeals court's 1988 rejection of an identical "safe harbor" FCC proposal. In that case, the judges said corralling indecent programming in the post-midnight time period made such material too inaccessible to adults, who have the right to hear it.

Implementation of the new law would have a minimal effect on radio, which often airs its raciest programming in the 6-10am morning drive period, a time when indecency is already prohibited.

WorldSpace Wins Caribbean DAB Satellite License

ashington-based WorldSpace Corp. has received a license from Trinidad and Tobago for the Western Hemisphere's first DAB satellite. Plans call for the satellite to begin beaming 36 audio channels across the Caribbean in 1995.

CaribStar 1 is the first satellite ever licensed by the government of Trinidad and Tobago, according to CaribSpace Ltd. Managing Director Napier Pillai. He said it would be launched in early 1995 by China's space program, just months after AfrISpace is scheduled to launch its first DAB satellite, serving Africa and the Middle East, Both CaribSpace and AfriSpace are subsidiaries of WorldSpace, headed by Chairman/CEO Noah Samara.

"International broadcasters, like the BBC and Voice of America, will be the first users," Pillai told R&R.



He said the Caribbean DAB channels are being offered to both commercial and government broad-

casters. Each FM-quality mono channel costs \$5 million for the life of the satellite, approximately 10 years. Pillai said no contracts had vet been signed.

Samara said the L-band satellite would cover most Caribbean islands, but probably exclude Puerto Rico and other U.S. territories because they have S-band DAB allocations. He would, however, like to include Cuba, regardless of whether the Castro government approves

Samara said fundraising efforts for the satellite projects are "doing fairly well" and will soon announce more AfriSpace channel sales. He noted the FCC recently modified its experimental license for the African satellite to specify L-band - rather than S-band - operation

Quayle Report Pushes Spectrum Auctions

The White House Council on Competitiveness, headed by Vice President Dan Quayle, is touting spectrum auctions as a way to improve U.S. competitiveness in communications. The council also applauded the FCC's new radio ownership rules in a report sent to President Bush.

"One area for reform is the currently inflexible system of spec-trum management," the report read. It said spectrum auctions wouldn't be a panacea, but claimed "greater reliance on market principles in spectrum management would benefit society by providing a greater opportunity for spectrum use in an economically efficient manner.

The report slammed the FCC's current licensing methods, calling comparative hearings "lengthy and cumbersome" and comparing

lotteries to the "Lotto America Contest."

While noting White House support of spectrum auction legislation with exemptions for police, fire, and ambulance users, the report didn't mention whether the exemption list should include broadcasting. National Telecommunications & Information Administration Director Greg Chapados recently told R&R the Bush administration would prefer competitive bidding "to the maximum extent," including broadcasting. But com-

promise legislation being crafted on Capitol Hill by Chapados's former boss, Sen. Ted Stevens (R-AK). Communications Subcommittee Chairman Sen. Daniel Inouye (D-HI), and others would exempt terrestrial broadcasting from an initial round of spectrum auctions

Quayle's report praised the FCC for its efforts to deregulate broadcasting, noting such changes as repeal of the Fairness Doctrine and elimination of various reporting requirements. But it said more reform is needed in the area of ownership limits and radio/TV/news-paper cross-ownership: "The FCC made a good start toward reform with its recent easing of radio rules. It should continue on this path."

EW ORLEANS - Radio financiers hailed duopoly deregulation as a historic opportunity to build powerful broadcasting chains, but warned the continuing credit drought will leave only well-heeled companies able to take advantage of good deals.

"It's very dry out there," said Rick Zeitleman. Speaking at Keck Mahin & Cate's finance conference, the Maryland dealmaker revealed he was forced to turn to a venture capital company for money after 35 banks turned him down.

"There are more bankers paying lip service to the industry than there are making loans," commented Jared Broadcasting President Ron Morey. What little bank credit exists is going to broadcasters with cash-flowing

properties in multiple markets, and turnaround money is simply unavailable. "Most major media lenders are looking at a minimum of \$10 million. Many are looking for \$50 million or more," said Bank of Boston Director Ann Helgen.

Media Venture Partners broker Elliot Evers predicted consolidation would occur primarily in medium and small markets, bankrolled via all-equity deals and innovative financing techniques. Noting "the concept of stick value is still very valuable," Evers said trading multiples upticked from seven to eight times cash flow because of deregulation.

Pacific Stock Exchange Eyes Small Stock Action

apital-starved broadcasters may get help from the Pacific Stock Exchange. It wants SEC clearance to trade small stocks authorized by the new federal Small Business Initiative and state-level Small Corporate Offering Registration (SCOR) programs.

"We feel this has tremendous potential because small business has a great need to raise small amounts of capital. We want to have as tight and orderly a market as possible. A regulated market will give small investors the confidence to participate," PSE VP/Listings David Semak told R&R Monday (9/14) during the North American Securities Administrators conference in New Orleans.

Companies can raise up to \$5 million with "Regulation A" offerings under the federal initiative and \$1 million under state SCOR programs with inexpensive fill-in-the-blanks offering documents.

Semak said the PSE, with trading floors in both Los Angeles and San Francisco, views a small business stock exchange as "a mom and pop investor vehicle," spurring new investment and acting as an "incubator for small companies." A market-making syndicate of California investment dealers is being formed, and the PSE wants 10 small stocks listed within a year

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

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


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

SA Digital Radio wowed attendees at last week's NAB Radio Show with demonstrations of advanced in-band AM and FM DAB. In an exclusive interview with R&R Washington Bureau Chief Pat Clawson, the group's top technological wizards -CBS Radio VP/Technical Operations Anthony Masiello, Group W Radio Director/Engineering E. Glynn Walden, and Gannett Radio VP/Engineering Paul Donahue - outlined how their revolutionary technology works and what it means for the radio industry.




Masiello: I think it presents the technical solutions to problems that DAB brought about. Those problems are economic and political, and involve the longevity of our industry. I think this in-band onchannel system allows broadcasters to migrate to digital without losing their business



What's the major technological breakthrough?


Masiello: On the FM side, it's the ability to separate the analog and digital signals with a superfast receiver chip. We call it cancella-tion and extraction. It's being done with chip technology invented at the University of Illinois. [The technology is] called ACT - acoustic charged transport. It's our belief that without [this] technology, both in-band on-channel and in-band adjacent-channel DAB are impossible




Masiello: Instead of being silicon-based, it uses gallium arsenide. Most broadcasters today have something on their property that uses galli-um arsenide – the low-noise amplifier on the front end of every satellite receiving dish. When you take the ability of this RADIC CHA 47.5

material to vibrate and couple it with new technology that was invented, [this] allows it to become a very, very fast processor, operating at 360 MHz. It performs 46 billion multiplies and accumulates per second. That's equivalent to about seven Cray supercomputers. That speed allows the signal extraction process to take place. Hughes Aircraft is setting up a fabrication line to make these chips, so this has commercial viability




Donahue: AM uses enhanced MUSICAM, which has been a byproduct of our research. The AM receiver chip is silicon-based, and it will be combined with the FM chip into a single chip set through a process known as bumpbonding. The chips will come only AM-FM. We are not going to sell FM-only chips. We're only going to build systems that upgrade AM and FM simultaneously. Beyond that, we can't say much about the AM chip or how it works right now. A year ago, we were in the same position [with] the FM chip. We don't want to educate our competitors until we feel we've adequately protected our position.




Donahue: What we're showing in AM is clear-

ly the most spectrally efficient application of a digital signal that's ever been demonstrated. Last year when we said we would do this in the AM band, people said we were crazy. On AM, we're getting FM-like quality in stereo on the same spectrum that an ordinary AM station occupies



Donahue: Just by nature. Remember, the AM band doesn't have multipath, so you don't need a wide signal to accommodate it. We have solutions for the AM issues that have to be overcome. Interference and noise problems such as thunderstorms, power lines, and going under bridges are history. There's no interference or impulse noise. You will have full 96db signalto-noise ratio, full-quality, interference-free AM.



Walden: We're not de-AM. AM will be a greatly enhanced 15 kHz system. FM will be a full 20-kHz, CD-quality system without multipath. We are going to bring multipath im-munity to FM and noise-free immunity to AM. Coverage of AM is not going to dramatically change. We are maintaining the status quo.





ERGONOMICS 101

Make Your Office Healthier & More Productive

F rgonomics – people's interaction with their work environment – can affect an employee's productivity and health. According to a recent article in Business Week, you can avoid these risks by taking frequent breaks and ergonomically retrofitting the following office items:

Chairs

Chairs are the most ergonomically important pieces of office furniture. An acceptable chair should conform to your height, allow your feet to rest flat on the ground, and support your lower back where your spine curves inward.

parallel to the floor. Its edge also should slope downward to eliminate any sharp surface that could cut into the backs of your knees.

Although the best chairs usually cost between \$400 and \$1000, you can reduce costs by modifying your existing chair. Cheaper alternatives include installing foam or inflatable pillows to fill the gap between the chair's back and your spine and using footrests to help your heel and toe rest comfortably.

Computer Screens

Since most of today's jobs center around computer usage, it's crucial that all computer-related hardware is ergonomically correct.

For example, to avoid repeatedly tilting your neck upward, the top of the computer screen should be at eye level or slightly below. You can raise your monitor using modular plastic stands (sold at computer stores for about \$6), but a telephone book can serve the same purpose.

Keyboards

Your keyboard should be placed at elbow level, enabling you to type with your arms fully extended. This keeps your wrists stress-free and reduces the risk of Carpal Tunnel Syndrome, a nerve affliction that occurs when bending your hands back toward your body.

Support your forearms by installing cushions to the front of your desk or to your chair armrests. Also acceptable are wrist rests – soft panels placed at the base of the keyboard – but they're often misused (don't lean on this wrist rest while typing – take short breaks and relax your hands on top of it).

Accessories

Document holders situated next to or below the monitor keep your neck and head from twisting. In fact, placing the holder at the same level as your screen can reduce eye strain since you won't have to refocus when reading back and forth between the two.

Furthermore, telephone headsets are critical for people who frequently make and receive calls. Not only do they relieve neck pressure, they also leave your hands free to type. Sold at officesupply stores and electronics shops, a good headset will cost between \$80 and \$100.

Lighting

Your office should sport two types of lighting: Soft overhead indirect light that won't reflect on your computer screen and tabletop task lamps that will illuminate your immediate work area.

If your overhead lighting is too bright, simply remove one or two bulbs and reposition your monitor to eliminate glare.

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

Divorced Dads & Visitation Rights

he issue of child visitation is often a sensitive issue to most divorced fathers without custody of their children. Three researchers - Elizabeth Hervey Stephen of Georgetown University, Vicki A. Freeman of Yale, and Jennifer Hess of the U.S. Census Bureau - conducted a study based on the 1987-88 National Survey of Families and Households to see how often these men saw their kids

A surprisingly large number (29%) didn't see their children at all over the course of a year. At the opposite end of the spectrum, 23% saw their kids at least once a week. An additional 19% visited their children between one and three times a month. The remaining 29%

saw their children less than once a

amount of time accounted for in those visits, finding that 15% spent between one and three weeks together each year, and another 10% spent four weeks or more.

Remarriage of one or both parents as well as the age or sex of the children involved had no effect on the frequency or time of visitation. While distance greatly affected the number of visits, it had little impact on the amount of time spent together.

However, joint custody agree-ments generally meant more visits, and child-support arrangements usually translated into less time spent together.

CDs Revitalize **Jukebox Sales**

ust as CDs breathed new life into catalog record sales, they're working similar wonders for the jukebox, bringing the machines' 25-year sales slump to an end. This year's jukebox sales total will likely be the highest since the early '70s.

The Amusement & Music Operators Assoc. projects 25,000 jukeboxes will be shipped this year, more than double the 1985 total, when sales slipped to their lowest level ever.

Much of this current success is attributed to the advent of CD jukeboxes that store up to 1400 titles, compared to the 160 selections available in the old-fashioned variety.

Since many CD jukes accept only \$1 and \$5 bills, increased profit margins once again make them attractive options for bars, restaurants, and retailers. Some CD jukes are finding their way into homes as well.

International jukebox sales are also rising, to an expected 8000 this year. That's good news for the U.S., home to three of the world's six largest manufacturers.

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

Latest, Lightest Cellular Phones

ith pocket-sized models expected to account for 25% of all cellular phone sales this year, two firms — Arlington Heights, IL-based **Motorola** and Hauppauge, NY-based **Audiovox** — each recently introduced the lightest units yet.

Motorola — which broke the halfpound barrier with last year's "MicroTAC Lite" unit (**R&R** 12/13/91) — has unveiled a version more than 20% lighter, the "MicroTAC Ultra Lite."

Weighing in at 5.9 ounces, the unit offers 65 minutes of talk time on a battery charge plus an optional VibraCall feature that allows users to supplant the audible ringer with a vibrating one

Audiovox, meanwhile, debuts the "MVX-700 Minivox Lite" phone (pictured), a 6.2 ounce model that's just 0.6 inches thick. Offering more than an hour of talk time, the phone permits battery changes without disrupting calls. An optional extended-life battery boosts talk time to 100 minutes

MiniDisc Set For December Debut

S ony has set an early December debut for its new MiniDisc hardware and software technology (**R&R** 5/24/91). Two MiniDisc Walkman units will go on sale at that time, with a car stereo player slated to follow in early '93.

Concurrent with the December launch, approximately 300 prerecorded titles will be released in the MiniDisc format. Labels participating in the rollout include Atlantic, Blue Note, Capitol, Chrysalis, Columbia, Elektra, EMI, Epic, Liberty, SBK, Virgin, and Warner Bros./Reprise.

Recordable 60-minute blank MiniDiscs also will be made available at that time, carrying a suggested list price of \$13.99. Longer-playing discs — capable of recording up to 74 minutes — are expected to appear next spring.


The "MZ-1" — one of the two pieces of hardware set to arrive in December — records and plays discs. The "MZ-2P" is a playback-only model. The former lists for \$749.95. The latter carries a \$549.95 suggested retail price.

Each can be powered by a rechargeable battery, AC adapter, or car battery. Batteries and adapters, as well as headphones, patch cords, and carrying cases, are included with the units. The MZ-1 also has a micro-phone jack to accomodate live recordings.

AM/FM Car Units Coming

The car player will consist of an in-dash AM/FM tuner with a controller for the trunk-mounted MiniDisc changer. It'll retail for \$979.95. Incidentally, all MiniDisc hardware will feature a 10-second data buffer that enables the music to continue uninterrupted if the disc tracking is disrupted by an external shock. 

New 'RIF VP/GM **Clint Sly** told ST, "Jim's a super guy and has a lot of talent, but the bottom line is that we only have room for one program-type person in the building."

Back at 'LZR, Promotion Dir. John Duncan has been upped to PD.

Kauai At Storm

Hurricane Iniki knocked all four of Kauai's radio stations off the air last Friday (9/11). At presstime, only KONG-AM & FM/Lihue had resumed broadcasting. According to the combo's Rodney Sanchez, the stations' tower "crumbled like a paper clip," although the studios escaped serious damage. The AM is now broadcasting from a 400-foot wire strung between two trees; the FM from a makeshift 40-foot tower. The station's CHR format has given way to Informational programming, which is expected to remain in place for several weeks.

Sanchez estimates 90% of the structures on the island have been devastated, and says the county government and Red Cross are doing a great job with the relief effort. But he predicts tough times ahead for the station, since most of the island's potential revenue will be channeled into the rebuilding effort.

Orleans — which has been partnered with **EZ Communications** CHR **B97** for the past year — is being sold for \$3.1 million to **Phase II** owner **Ed Muniz.** The LMA remains in effect for the next 90 days.

Incidentally, since 'MXZ's studios are at B97 and virtually all 'MXZ staffers are employed by EZ, Muniz will have to hire an entire staff and create studio space.

Concurrently, B97 PD **Elvis Duran** — who took the job two short weeks ago — has left the building owing to philosophical differences. (Word is B97 will take a more adult CHR direction.) Will Elvis eventually turn up elsewhere in the Crescent City?

Last week's item in ST regarding rumored changes in the promo department at **PLG** was unconfirmed and turned out to be in error. **R&R** apologizes to our friends at PLG for any inconvenience.



What's the deal with those rumors about a station swap between **Cox** and **Viacom?** Tongue-waggers have Viacom giving Hot AC **KYSR/L.A.** to Cox to pair with **KFI & KOST**, with Cox giving up Classic Rocker

WCKG/Chicago to pair with Viacom AC WLIT. Nevertheless, Viacom Radio Division Prez
Bill Figenshu vigorously denied the scuttlebutt, telling ST, "It's *not* happening. Generally we don't comment on these things, but the stories that are going around are getting so wild that I'll tell you — it just isn't true. There have been no discussions with

Economic Outlook

Stranland opened his session, "The Economy: When Will We Stop Singing The Blues," with a 10-minute economics lesson. He said deregulation, the 1990 deficit reduction agreement, the Persian Gulf War, the S&L bailout, and the ongoing recession have contributed to "tumultuous economic stagnation."

Using the American auto industry as an example, Stranland asked station managers, "Do you want to know who's the most coldblooded, hard-hearted sucker in the free market system? He's not at the factory. He's your customer.

"Did you know your customers could care less if your shop closed up tonight and you're on the street looking for a job? If they can find better quality, a better price, in a better environment, they'll drop you like a bad habit in a New York minute.

Stranland told the attendees not to depend on either presidential candidate to have a realistic solution for an economic recovery. He suggested that business operators not any federal agency or branch of government - can spur a recovery

There was a bright note: Stranland said the auto industry will sell 9.5 million cars next year, compared to this year's 8.8 million.

Tips For Success

Popcorn warned broadcasters not to rest on their laurels. "The future is changing every single second," she said. "You have to know how to completely change yourself, your world, and your life" to succeed personally and commercially.

Consumer research, Popcorn said, will be the key to ongoing success. She then outlined 13 elements that affect all phases of our lives and our futures (see below).

Political Forum

Mutual talk host Larry King moderated a forum between Democratic National Chairman Ron Brown and his Republican counterpart, Rich Bond.

Brown said the Bush campaign's emphasis on Bill Clinton's draft record is meant to deflect attention from "the slowest period of economic growth since the presidency of Herbert Hoover."

"Most of you are small business people," said Brown to the NAB crowd. "Most of you own one radio station. I own a radio station. I know what this administration has done to small business. I know that [WKYS/Washington VP/GM] Skip Finley, who runs our station, is spending more time talking to lenders than he is to vendors.

Throughout the convention, industry leaders displayed anxiety over a continuing credit crunch and warned that consolidation efforts may be stalled in medium and smaller markets because a quick turnaround in the credit climate is

portfolios. "It's a broadcasting epidemic," remarked Greyhound Financial VP Matt Breyne.

Lending managers said money is still available for acquisitions and mergers, but only for major players with strong management teams. Norwest Bank's Nancy Barber said operators ideally should have at least three stations in three unrelated markets before seeking financing. Bank of Boston VP Ann Helgen said her institution isn't interested in any deals valued at less than \$10 million, and prefers transactions valued at \$50 million or more

Star Stewart

The man of the hour at the convention was FCC Mass Media Bureau Chief Roy Stewart, who seemed to have achieved major star status within the industry. Any panel he appeared at was standingroom-only, with broadcasters repeatedly praising him for his support of deregulation and other causes championed by the industry.

Stewart said deregulation did not give station owners a license to neglect their responsibilities as licensees, and he warned them not to become "trapped" by LMA agreements. "Don't call it a licensing agreement and go to the beach," he said. FCC inspectors will continue to examine stations to determine if licensees are in control, and he said turning stations completely over to time brokers could come back to haunt owners at license renewal time.

The major issue facing the industry, Stewart contended, is technoloespecially the advent of satellite-delivered digital audio broadcasting. He made it clear that the Commission will not stop satellite DAB and he urged the industry to come to grips with that reality.

In-Band DAB Hailed

Broadcasters were buzzing over the major technological innovation of the convention, the introduction of over-the-air in-band DAB on both the AM and FM bands by USA Digital Radio.

Engineers simulcast DAB signals over analog FM transmissions of public station WWNO/New Orleans, using only 19 watts to broadcast a brilliantly clear FM signal. But it was a crystal-clear highfidelity AM DAB broadcast on 1660 kHz - using only four watts - that captured industry attention. In the case of both bands, the DAB signal piggybacked on the analog broadcast does not have to be the same program.

"It's just amazing; the quality is magnificent. This is definitely the wave of the future," commented NAB Radio Chairman Wayne Vriesman.

USA Digital Radio, formerly known as Project Acorn, is bankrolled by CBS, Gannett, and Group W Radio, among others. Project leaders would not disclose any details of the revolutionary AM DAB technology, but for the first time they disclosed that the FM technology is spun off from Pentagon electronic warfare research.

Using gallium arsenide chips and a process known as acoustic charged transport (ACT), DAB receiver chips, USA Digital officials said, will soon be manufactured by Hughes Aircraft for a cost of \$7 to \$10 each and will provide CD-quality 20-20,000 kHz signals for FM. The AM DAB chips, which are silicon-based, provide an enhanced AM service which rivals current FM technology in sound quality and is interference-free.

"This is the most revolutionary IC ever developed for telecommunications. Some people describe this as the Intel chip of the communications industry," according to CBS Radio VP/Engineering Tony Masiello. He said USA's is the only DAB system which is in-band-compatible for both AM and FM and does not require new spectrum.

Arbitron Alternatives?

Officials at Arbitron privately admit that they have been subjected to a marked increase in "bashing" since the demise of Birch, the ratings firm's only competitor, nine months ago.

In the panel, "Is Arbitron Our Only Answer?," frustrations and disappointments of dealing with the leading rating service were voiced by such panelists as KFMB/ San Diego VP/GM Paul Palmer, who recently dropped Arbitron.

"There are lots of unhappy Arbitron campers out there," he pointed out. "The most support I had [after dropping Arbitron] came from our local sales staff. We sell results."

How competitive do you see the USA Digital Radio system being in the standards-setting competition sponsored by the Electronic Industries Association?

Walden: There's no other proponent that has a chance. [Our competitors] don't have an upward compatibility for both AM and FM. No one else is even talking about an AM system. Anybody who is promoting a system that does not provide for AM, politically, is not really looking at what's going to happen. There's no spectrum for Eureka in this country. This convention closed the curtain on analog broadcasting. Now we can say for sure that AM radio is going to be a digital system.



What's the next step?

Masiello: Our next step is a mobile demonstration. We hope to have that in 90 days, but we're not going to rush it for the sake of any show. It will be there when it's complete and when we're sure we can offer the system, as designed, to be multipath-free.



Masiello: Time. Give us time to do the work properly.

At the session "Evolution Of Radio Programming In The '90s,' **Coleman Research President Jon** Coleman forecast that the impact of new technologies and outside audio sources would mean fewer GMs and PDs. He also doesn't anticipate seeing many new music formats. "It's almost impossible to discern differences between many stations. There are no more music niches available.

Panelists also discussed FM's future with a consensus that there will be a decline in music and an increase in compelling talk personalities. Along those lines, multi-market morning man Howard Stern was referred to as being an entire radio station, not just a morning man.

Hot Topic

Although Hot AC may be a growing format, it might not be for ev-eryone. WQAL/Cleveland PD Dave Ervin remarked, "The fash-ionable thing for mainstream and heritage ACs to do is fill the Hot AC hole, but they're making a mistake."

the initiation of major projects, and the addition of numerous affiliated entities to our organization in the past 10 years," Snider remarked.

Regarding the music, WKQI/Detroit PD Steve Weed observed, "We look for the unique breakthrough records that set us apart the songs that our competition can't play."

At an Urban AC session, WVAZ/ Chicago's Tony Kidd said, "The unique advantage Urban ACs can provide is an exclusive cume.'

WEZY/Lakeland, FL's LeRoy Bradley noted during an Easy Listening session that the staff of his automated station had shrunk from 32 to 14. "In the '80s, we were fat, dumb, and happy. This is still a viable format; 90% of our business is direct." Staff members are required to attend such local events as Chamber of Commerce meetings.

CHR Changing

At a modestly attended CHR session, KPWR/Los Angeles PD Rick Cummings predicted that the format will continue to move in a "rap and rhythmic" direction. He said that with the exception of a few markets such as Indianapolis, ethnic audiences seem to be where the format is selling.

"But times have changed," said Cummings. "Conducting a bumper sticker giveaway doesn't cut it anymore. We now have to pass out condoms to our audience.

Attendees at the Top 40 Legends session were disappointed to discover that only Paul Drew joined moderator Les Garland on the panel. Buzz Bennett and Mike Joseph were no-shows.

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

'Deep Blues' Soundtrack Due



Mini-Market Music Monsters

Profiling WKHQ/Charlevoix, MI and WZOQ/Lima, OH

This week the CHR spotlight falls on two small market monsters in the Midwest: WKHQ (106-KHQ)/Charlevoix, MI and WZOQ/Lima, OH.

Sprawling Metro

The first stop is 106-KHQ – a 12-year CHR veteran. It's located in the Northwest Michigan Arbitron market (No. 195, 12+ metro population 143,200) and covers three cities – Petoskey, Traverse City, and Charlevoix.



Music Monitor

Using the principal positioner "Today's Best Music, **106-KHQ**," OM/PD **Chris Davis** runs an 11-minute commercial load that can peak in drivetimes at 15 minutes during the height of the summer tourist season. Here's a sample 5pm hour.

"From end to end the metro is 100 miles long," says OM/PD Chris Davis. "Our 100kw stick is right in the middle, so we have no coverage problems. But there are five stations using two signals to cover the whole metro. We actually serve the larger cities of Petoskey and Traverse City. Traverse City is 45 miles away and Petoskey is 20 miles from the studios, and we have our sales offices in those two cities. There is no sales office in Charlevoix, which is located on Lake Michigan and is more of a tourist mecca for folks from Detroit and Chicago.

Because of year-round tourism – summer activities include golfing, boating, fishing, and waterskiing, while winter action features cross-country and downhill skiing as well as ice skating and snowmobiling – each of the three cities has separate but symbiotic economies. "This is considered a growth area in the state," says Davis.

"It's God's country up here. And when you're in God's country you do God's promotions, which means being outdoors no matter what the weather - as long as it's not storming. We have two station vehicles, an Explorer and a refurbished Chevy van, that we use to get around and make our presence known. In the spring we got them out as much as possible — and in this market there are lots of reasons. The folks here will find any excuse to party, which is why there are about 60-70 yearly festivals. We tie in with or show up at all of them. Many of them are held to give the tourists something to do — sort of like a weekly fiesta at a Mexican resort."

Hot Numbers, Great Demos

How did WKHQ/Charlevolx, MI and WZOQ/Lima, OH fare in the Spring '92 Arbitron?

WKHQ rose 10.3-13.6 to claim the number two spot 12+ behind market leader Country WTCM (19.9-20.0). The market's biggest upset:

AOR FM/FM simulcast combo WKLT & WKLZ, which fell 18.9 10.2. In its market's first Arbitron, WZOQ finished first 12+ with 20.5, pacing itself well ahead of second-place Country WIMT (12.3) Here's how each station ranked in key demos.

Davis himself is still learning what's happening in the market; he arrived this past May after a number of years at WZPL/Indianapolis as APD/Research Director. He relies on GM Charles Walker who is also the owner – and con-

Lima Belongs To The Zoo

Unlike WKHQ/Charlevoix, MI (see story above), WZOQ (92-Zoo)/Lima, OH is landlocked and industrial. Arbitron market #209 (metro 12+ population 125,400) is situated halfway between Dayton and Toledo - 71 and 72 miles from each respectively - and 45 miles east of Ft. Wayne, IN.

'Shot And A Beer' Town

Two-year PD/morning man Tom Gallagher describes his market: "One of the biggest employers is the BP Chemical plant, and we also have General Dynamics, Honda, Procter & Gamble, and a Ford engine plant making up the balance of the workforce.

"This is basically a blue-collar town, where the people are very friendly and down-to-earth. Hold the white wine, it's a 'shot and a beer' type of town. The audience leans a bit to the rock side; it will tolerate some dance but not much rap. A Kris Kross is 50-50 down the middle in terms of likes and dislikes.

"[MD/night jammer] Susan Cruze and I try to tailor the sound to the market by talking to the people - seeing what records they buy, which concerts turn them on

- and most importantly by using a lot of gut. We don't have a lot of money for research - and for now that's a good thing. As a PD or MD, you need gut. If you don't have it or don't develop one, and you rely too heavily on research, it will make you sterile-sounding. I've seen stations in bigger markets lose their creativity, spontaneity, and ratings from relying on too much research."

Lacking the funds for TV and billboards, Gallagher decided to aim at the sizable audience he suspected he already had. (Lima had not been rated by Arbitron before spring.) "We did the '\$5000 Free Money Giveaway,' which is a spinoff on the 'Dollar Bill Game.' We'd announce part of the serial number on a dollar bill and take the ninth caller who had a buck with the matching sequence of numbers to win some cash. All the

winners went into a drawing for the \$5000 grand prize. And, during the last part of the book we did a 'Stick It And Win' bumper sticker promotion. With our van we'd spot a listener and offer a choice of four envelopes, with prizes ranging from gift certificates to \$100.





sultant Pete Michaels (brother of WZPL OM/PD Don Lundon) to learn the localisms. But the key, he says, is doing imaginative radio.

"We had some billboards and TV time during the spring, and we've got our bumper stickers, which are a vehicle for winning small items like CDs, movie tickets, and concert tickets. The rest is just a lot of smoke and mirrors. Thankfully we do have a nearby venue - the Castle - and acts like Metallica, Ozzy Osbourne, Slaughter, Ugly Kid Joe, Tesla, and Firehouse have made recent appearances.

Speaking of music, Davis says, "The market leans rock, and we're aggressive that way musically, but we're smart enough to play the big hits of all types that are massappeal, especially to 25-34. Twenty percent of the metro is in this demo, so by doing well here we score strong on both sides of the target. We do some callouts - my forte - but aren't afraid to start records in the market."

Aside from craving more promotional/marketing dollars - the universal radio need - Davis says his biggest problem is staffing the station. "The bucks are decent

compared to the cost of living, but the biggest selling point is that we're in a such a beautiful location and the station has state-of-the-art equipment."

The lineup features morning man The Captain (Bill Vogel), who has been with 106-KHQ almost since its inception. Davis does 10-noon. Promotion Dir. Lee Ann Curtis handles noon-3pm, coming over recently from WUPS/Houghton Lake, MI. The 3-7pm shift is filled by Keith Michaels, who joined a year ago from WVIC/Lansing. Taking the 7-midnight stint is 22-year-old Stu-Man (Stu Sonefeld), who joined the station five years ago, while station veteran Jim Miller does overnights. "For the market's size we surprise everyone who hears the station." Davis says. "Our music is strong and the personalities communicate and are interactive with the listeners and community. Next book we're headed for No. 1."

summer weather and be in the public's eye as much as possible. We're tied into the community by hosting one of the stages at the 'Square Fair,' a downtown celebration; broadcasting from the Allen County Fair; and hosting recent concerts like Cheap Trick this past summer.'

Civic Interaction "GM Bill Glover, GSM Dan Lynch, and I get together monthly for a major session to plan out promotions, activities, and how we can get involved civicly. I'm on the Easter Seals Board. 92-Zoo is the sponsoring station for the annual St. Jude's haunted house, which raised \$17,000 last year. We're also active supporters of the local chapter of the Cancer Society.'

While compensated public appearances are desirable, Galla-gher notes that his staff is ready to hit the streets for remotes and nonrevenue generating appearances. "Unlike a lot of CHRs today that are looking to shed teens, we're very active in the schools. We know the parents appreciate our efforts. 92-Zoo recently got involved with the 'Prom Promise' to get kids to abstain from alcohol that night, and we're often found at schools talking about radio as a career and sponsoring people to talk about saying no to drugs.

Gallagher notes the station's lineup as follows: "Following me,

from 10-3pm, is Tony Hammer, who has been here for almost six years. A permanent afternoon jock is pending; [the slot is] currently being filled on an interim basis after the recent death of Ricky Geronimo, who contracted spinal meningitis in mid-July. My MD, Susan Cruze, has been here for two years, and overnights it's 21-year old Kevin Fox, who has been here for almost five years."



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"I feel very fortunate we've done as well as we have with the number of outside 50kw signals [nine, with an equal number home to the metro] compared to our 3kw signal. We're also fortunate that Country WIMT [the market's strongest FM with 11kw] didn't follow the national trend and take the market. And the newest competitor - Gold WBUK - only pulled an 8.2 this book. We all feel great about being No. 1. and we're working harder than ever to stay there.'

Dealing With The 'Trend From Hell'

One bad trend can ruin your whole day. There you are, cruising along on your way to another solid book, when suddenly – for no apparent reason – your ratings disappear like Jagermeister at a hospitality suite.

So what do you do? You extrapolate the data and discover one four-week period when your audience all but vanished. You contact **Arbitron**, they conduct a thorough investigation, and assure you there's no problem on their end. You, of course, have a BIG problem.

That's because while you and I know monthly and quarterly "wobbles" are part 'n' parcel of Arbitron's ratings methodology, most buyers either don't understand that or don't care. They're going to hammer you on cost per point. And no matter how you look at it, that ridiculous trend is going to cost you money. Sometimes it can even cost you your *job*.

Jon Sinton knows all about what he calls the "capricious gods of Arbitron." As an owner and consultant, he's benefitted from *and* been burned by the Arbitron ratings system.

So, following my recent demonstration of how silly it is to judge stations based on trends, Sinton was inspired to write this letter:

In my years as a consultant and owner, the dreaded "black-hole" monthly has reared its ugly head more than once. You know, the Trend From Hell — the one where you would have looked better if you'd just gone dark that month and saved the expense and trouble of broadcasting.

This spring, our WROQ/Greenville-Spartanburg had its upward ratings march violently and unceremoniously stopped. In the winter we had passed the Hot AC competitor and were at or approaching the top in 12+, 18-34, and 25-54. While neither programming nor competition changed one iota between winter and spring, Rock 101 died a horrible death. Closer examination (see graph) revealed we had been sucked up by the aforementioned "black hole" in phase one of the survey.

The arbitrariness (pun definitely intended) of the numbers provides a painful lesson. We've reaffirmed a couple of things we all knew to begin with: Live by the numbers and you will ultimately die by the numbers; the nature of statistics is such that this can happen anywhere, anytime.

Until and unless the sample size is quadrupled, you are at their mercy.

Since so many stations have been victimized by inexplicably poor trends, I decided to expand on Sinton's letter and phoned him for details.





What Happened?

Getting socked in the first month of the spring survey was particularly painful for Sinton and his staff, since 'ROQ was coming off its best book ever: an 8.5 12+, with No. 1 rankers in persons 18-34, men 18-34, and men 25-54.

The spring book, however, was a disaster: The station plummeted to

"Given what we had accomplished in the winter, we fully expected the spring book would be the one to really put us over the top," Sinton recalls. "So when that first trend



came out, ['ROQ GM] **Bob Bellin** calls me and says, 'It's like you're bowling in a three-game tournament, except you don't get to bowl the first game.'"

Naturally, the station immediately contacted Arbitron. "Their reaction was pathetic," Sinton complains. "The first thing they told us was, 'It's just a trend. We always tell you not to overreact to these trends. And you can't do extrapolations. Don't break out a month at a time.' But when you totally disappear in a trend that's going to be averaged to create a book, you're going to be screwed. As soon as you get a trend like that you know the spring book is lost.

"Finally, when the spring book came out and we showed them the graph, making it crystal clear they simply didn't get a good diary Nationally, a bad book is definitely going to cost you dollars, and there's nothing you can do about it. – Jon Sinton

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drop, their only response to us was, 'Gee, we didn't have to weight the [individual cells] that much. We feel very strongly the book is accurate. It's just one of those things.'

"They never admit there could be a problem. And if you think about it from their perspective, they can never afford to do that. They're under such pressure; they can't afford a crack in their armor. I mean, we have *friends* there, and they turned a cold shoulder to us. They *know* what sort of trouble it would put their company in if they [agreed with us] that the sample size is ludicrously low."

Taking The Offensive

Since the hellish monthly came in phase one of the spring survey, 'ROQ was prepared well in advance to deal with an off book. "What we decided to do was take the offensive," Sinton explains. "We hit the street with that graph and began to show advertisers what monthlies look like and what our ratings really were if you average them over a long period of time."

While talking directly to local clients – people with whom you (ideally) have solid relationships – can help lessen a bad book's impact, Sinton says dealing with national buys is another matter.

"National advertisers don't give a shit. We're represented by Banner, which is part of Katz Radio Group, and we think they're terrific. But even they said to us, 'Look, we're dealing with 28- and 30-year-old media buyers who just don't give a shit. They're going to call us up on their computer ranking systems and see what the number is. And it's going to be a lot lower than it was last time.'

"Local business is not done that way. It's done on a much more personal basis. You can sit across the desk from a person — instead of a computer — and say. "You listen to our radio station and know it moves product for you. Are you going to believe your own ears, or are you going to believe Arbitron when they say we didn't exist in the month of April?"

"Nationally, however, a bad book is definitely going to cost you dollars, and there's nothing you

can do about it. [National buyers] are going to gleefully beat you about the head and shoulders and make you collapse your rates. That's the game the national media buyer plays."

Sinton sees an ironic "silver lining" in all of this: "The 'good news' is that national sales are off horribly - worse than 1991, which was the worst year since World War II so the dollars weren't really there to begin with."

Even though Sinton believes the station's local damage control will be effective, he's understandably more than a bit peeved at having to defend a bad book he doesn't feel was warranted. "Ultimately, I don't think this will cost us the big money. But our real complaint is:

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Arbitron has a very large error rate, but a lot of people simply don't acknowledge it or understand it. - Jon Sinton

We spend a great deal of money every year for Arbitron, and here they are making our jobs more difficult instead of easier.

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Understanding Statistics

In a broader sense, the problems that one bad month can cause are amplified by the general lack of understanding of how statistics work. People tend to be blinded by numbers. Your station goes 3.4-3.2, and everyone starts talking about a

"down book." That's absurd, because Arbitron's sample error rate is far greater than 0.2.

"Arbitron has a very large error rate, but a lot of people simply don't acknowledge it or understand Sinton confirms. "What Arit." bitron is really doing is saying, 'Okay, here are the numbers you've paid for - but don't hold us to them.' Because the sample is so low, the standard error has to be very high. We call it Arbitron's 'wiggle room.' It protects them.

"Unfortunately, most people don't pay close attention to that. As a culture we're inundated by polls and surveys and various other statistical measurements, and we've become quite callous to the whole process. We look at the numbers and take them at face value. The battle we're fighting in Greenville-Spartanburg this quarter is to get people not to look at the numbers at face value.

"Until you have movement outside the standard error rate, you don't know if that movement is real. Only then can you go back and try to figure out what happened. In our case we found that in a typical month, Arbitron can identify over 5000 listeners of ours in the 25-54 age group. But in the month of April they could only identify 200 of them. At that point we knew it was a diary-drop problem that had nothing to do with the product.'

Meaningless Trends


Perhaps the most frightening thing about relying on Arbitron numbers is that many owners, GMs, and PDs don't understand statistics and margin of error any more than buyers do. Stations lambaste the entire ratings process, then turn around and make important decisions based on what happens from one month to the next.

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"Most trend moves are so far within the envelope of standard error that they're meaningless," Sinton observes. "Yet GMs and PDs get fired over them. It's a danger that reared its ugly head when the industry went through its Wall Street phase in the '80s, when we put a lot of people in power who are managers of balance sheets instead of managers of companies and people. When you introduce accountants and lawyers to the creative process, a lot of people end up getting fired for no reason at all.



Thirtysomething Revisited

Terre Haute's WTHI cracks the 30-share mark

Three weeks ago I spotlighted 10 Country stations, all of which posted 30+ shares (12+) in the Spring '92 Arbitron survey of 263 markets. However, there were actually 11 stations which turned the trick; I inadvertently omitted WTHI/Terre Haute, IN from this exalted list.

WTHI posted the first 30 share in station history. Its growth has been steady the last three years: 26.3-29.4-34.7. Its 25-54 shares also hit an all-time high, notching in the upper 30s. WTHI has claimed No. 1 12+ and 25-54 honors for the last 10 years. In 1982, it topped the market with a 17 share.

Interestingly, while WTHI's numbers have soared, the rest of the stations have earned shares equivalent to what stations posted in 1982. "Every year I think we've hit the peak and can't grow anymore. But each year we do," laughs PD Barry Kent, who joined WTHI as PD/morning host in 1982.

WTHI's dominance shows up in every daypart:

- Its 12+ lead is almost 21 shares over the second place finisher.
- In 25-54, it leads No. 2 AC WMJI by more than 23 shares.
- WTHI's morning show leads the 25-54 pack by 24 shares.



WTHI's biggest growth occurred when the station poked through the 30 barrier in 18-34 (a gain of nearly seven points). Kent credits the music for the increase, noting the station is positioned as "Today's hot new country and yesterday's favorites." The gold library still features a healthy dose of music from '75-'85, though few pre-'75 titles are included.

Some additional Arbitron high-lights:

- WTHI's 12+ shares exceed 30 in every daypart except nights.
- Middays fall just short of the 40 mark in 25-54.
 The station notches a 40+ 35-54
- share, with middays just shy of the 50 mark.

WTHI's spring promotion push was minimal. The main emphasis: Getting into as many of the surrounding satellite towns as possible. Also, since the station is owned by the Hulman family, owners of the Indianapolis Motor Speedway, programming and contests involving the Indy 500 played a major role in the early spring.

The \$5100 winning bid benefited Brooks's favorite charity, "Feed The Children." The anonymous winner sent her to children to the show, where they had their jackets autographed by Garth.

Local celebs – mainly TV personalities – were coerced . . . er, invited to become country singers for a night. 





Morgan Creek To Flow Through Nashville

NASHVILLE THIS WEEK

Ready to make a big splash on the country scene in upcoming months, Morgan Creek Records recently inked a deal with Shelby Lynne and will open a Nashville office soon after the first of the year.

Home to artists such as Little Feat, Mary's Danish, Voice Farm, and Christine In The Attic, the label only recently entered the country arena. According to President Jim Mazza, one of Morgan Creek's intentions as a fledgling label was to expand into different formats if and when they felt they had the expertise to do so.

"[Having worked at] Capitol, Liberty, EMI, and United Artists, I had a pretty extensive country background and felt I would be able to make some contribution. One of the things we didn't want to do was be the 'flavor of the month' or jump on a business that's growing and expanding just because it's popular. That happens a lot when any format starts to expand – a lot of people want to get into it."

When Lynne's representative contacted Morgan Creek about the possibility of her signing with the label, Mazza says they jumped at the chance. "Though we were only vaguely familiar with her music, we knew she had a reputation as a great singer. So when they contacted us, we didn't even have to think about it – we just said, 'Let's go.'

"Shelby does some things I haven't seen in a girl so young before. I first saw her in a room of 1500, and she was able to project all the way to the back of the room. She's a unique and special talent. And if we pick the right material, the audience will come to her."

Lynne will begin working on her first Morgan Creek project later this month in Nashville. She and producer Brent Maher are currently gathering material for the LP, which will be recorded live and, according to Mazza, is an "exciting concept album." The label is also looking at three or four soundtrack options for Lynne, something the company hopes to further pursue with Lynne and other country artists once the Nashville office is in place.

"Our intent is to bring what we do well – great soundtracks and our film association – to Nashville so we can offer movie opportunities

to artists and maybe even do some films with a country orientation. We have the entire film production slate going through these offices all day long. We're looking at available slots and have people calling us with songs for those slots. This will really tie Nashville to the film community, which we like a lot." (The label's an affiliate of Morgan Creek Productions, which produced "Young Guns," "Pacific Heights," and robin Hood: Prince Of Thieves.")



New signings may also be announced at that time, although Mazza thinks building the country roster will be a slow process.

"We want to bring something of value to this industry. We don't want to be opportunists. Hopefully, we can help [country music's] growth develop into a lot of different areas, expand it, and make country music even more prominent in American culture than it is today."



The Education Of WBRU

Providence rocker nearly doubles ratings for best performance yet

It was a sizzling Spring '92 Arbitron for WBRU/Provi-

dence.

The Brown Broadcasting Service station skyrocketed 2.7-4.2 - its best book since flipping to New Rock four years ago, and it also earned several more "best ever" accolades: third in persons 18-34, second in men 18-34, and third in men 25-34

Professor PD

PD Michael Osbourne, who joined the station last year from crosstown CHR WPRO-FM, believes the jump is a result of consistency. "Our ratings can't be attributed to what we did in just the last three months. It's doing the same things well, day in and day out. People try to be too creative, thinking there's something wrong with doing the same thing twice.

Osbourne's job is particularly challenging because of WBRU's Brown University affiliation. Although the station is commercial, Osborne's the only professional on the programming staff. Since his personalities are students, Osborne says one of his ongoing concerns is jock development.

'The first thing I ask every jock is, 'What is your prime on-air function?' It's not to educate the audience about the music - it's to get people to listen longer. It's a matter of stressing basics to make people listen.

WBRU DJs direct their on-air talk toward the upper end of the station's 18-34-year-old core. "I want them to talk about what 25-30year-olds are interested in," Osbourne explains. "Radio is not one-dimensional. What the jocks

Familiarity Breeds Success

Osbourne's major station adjustments were redefining, repositioning, and tightening the presentation. "A lot of things weren't being done right. We tightened up promos and liners and made sure the call letters were mentioned all the time

"I want the station positioned as what the audience wants it to be. We need to give them what they want, not what we think they want. When I got here, music changes were being made when the staff was tired of the music, instead of when listeners were burnt. Just because we're a new music station doesn't mean we have to completely shift every eight weeks. We now stay with the music longer for familiarity.'

Oshourne also credits the more familiar mix with helping to boost ratings. "We had an incredible cume jump, which means more people are sampling. It's a matter of more people finding us because a lot more of this music is crossing over. About 25% of our music is being played by CHRs 'PRO-FM and WWKX and AOR WHJY. We make clear that 'BRU played them first, plays them more often, and will

continue to play them. "When 'HJY goes into commercials and listeners come to us. they'll hear something familiar. These people aren't as tolerant as our core listeners, so I've got to make it familiar. Hopefully, they'll think it's cool and stay.

'BRU leans more toward guitaroriented rock than dance, but its mix is balanced. "Our current percentage ranges from 45% in mornings to 60% at night. We don't shy away from anything," Osbourne says. "We're playing House Of Pain; at the same time, we're playing Helmet. The station's moniker is 'We dare to be different.' But we keep in mind we're a commercial station and need to be as mass appeal as we can without alienating our core."

Although 'BRU has tightened up and become more "professional," it retains some collegiate quirks. For example, the station plays nothing but jazz in weekday overnights and urban music every Sunday for the entire day



Promotion Boost

Osbourne has also upped 'BRU's promotional quotient. Whereas giveaways were once reserved solely for "Free Stuff Fridays," the station now runs contests every day. Most of the spring promotions were based around area concerts. "One night we had the Cure and Social Distortion in town at different venues," Osbourne recalls. And the station was heavily involved with the Lollapalooza tour, printing 20,000 commemorative bumper stickers.

In April, 'BRU sent a listener and station surf reporter Peter Pan to a private villa in Costa Rica. "It was a straight registration deal with a client. It was a real adventure - they had to ride five hours in a four-wheeler to the airport.

The first free show featured Doctor Rain, Bootsauce, and local act Angry Salad; headlining the second were the Waterlillies, 24-7 Spyz, and the **Cliffs Of Dooneen**.

'BRU's next extravaganza is built around the station's 23rd birthday. (Prior to flipping to New Rock, it was AOR.) Artists-scheduled to appear at the three-day event include Michael Penn, Too Much Joy, Soul Asylum, Gene Loves





Contemporary Hits Score Younger Demos For AMs

Outdistanced only by crosstown Country WWWW in the Spring '92 Arbitron 25-54 arena, WJR/Detroit once again logged good enough stats to earn the market's 35-64 crown.

"We still play music as we try hitting the 40-50 crowd," says PD Phil Boyce. "The majority of our music is played from 10am-noon and on weekends.'

Morning Drive Smorgasbord

One morning drive song per hour also is aired, but as Boyce explains, "It's usually a favorite of [27-year morning mainstay] J.P. McCarthy. His show has gradually evolved into a talk show, but he can't seem to part with the music.

"The 10am-noon segment is still music-oriented, but we do a lot of interviews and other things - it's not the typical music show. There's no other music on the station from noon to morning drive.

On November 15, McCarthy – along with countdown kingpin Casey Kasem - will be inducted in the Radio Hall of Fame.

Hosted by Paul Harvey, the eremonies will be broadcast by WJR, WBZ/Boston, KDKA/Pittsburgh, KABC/Los Angeles, KOA/ Denver, KFBK/Sacramento, WMAL/Washington, WSM/Nashville, and others.

Musically In Vogue Satisfying WJR's broad listener demos with music on AM is quite challenging. "I use music to make the station sound more contemporary," Boyce says. "We watch the AC charts and play Amy Grant and

[Billy Ray Cyrus's] 'Achy Breaky Heart.' Playing currents also gives our show hosts a way of being on the cutting edge of what's happening in today's radio.

When Boyce arrived at WJR approximately 18 months ago, he added about 200 songs to give the station a more contemporary feel. "Our playlist [library] is huge," he "There are about 400 songs says. on it, and we rotate currents as well."

Certain tunes Boyce inserted indicate 'JR is anything but a laidback FSA. "We put in Huey Lewis & The News's 'Heart Of Rock 'N' Roll' and Madonna's 'Vogue,'" he says. "I pulled out Madonna after we received many complaints. For

whatever reason, our listeners were revolted by it.

"But we're playing her new one ["This Used To Be My Playground"], and only one [female listener] complained. She wondered why we'd play something by such a 'slut.'"

In addition to slotting music in the above-noted dayparts, Boyce programs another way. "We're using a combination of current hits

and oldies as bumpers within our talk shows," he says. "The contemporary music picks up the pace and prevents us from sounding boring. It can also help us sound more appealing to younger demos. If I can give a new group of listeners a welcome feeling, I've done my iob.'

Harwell On Deck?

Last year, WJR - the Detroit Tigers' flagship station - received an avalanche of negative press when Tigers brass forced legendary announcer Ernie Harwell into retirement. Although announcers are team employees, WJR was blamed for benching the classy Harwell.

The team now has a new owner, and Harwell may return to Tigertown. "He's already met with the club," Boyce says. "We'll be involved at some point because we're the station that turns on the transmitter. If the new ownership feels that Ernie can contribute to the broadcasts, we'd be open to that suggestion.

"I want WJR to come out looking good and not get caught in another PR disaster. It's a very strange turn of events - it'll be interesting

30-50," Dirkx says. "We play music that will be comfortable to our audience. We're not very aggressive with currents and recurrents. Approximately one-third of our music is from the '60s, one-third is from the '70s, and the rest is from the '80s [forward]."

market's healthy AM climate. "It wasn't long ago [Winter '89] that we had a 4.7 [12+] and now we have a 10.7 [which places KEX first 12+]. We've figured out something here on the AM band. KXL (AM) also does well here." Among persons 12+ this spring, KXL (AM) ranked fifth 12+ (6.4),

and Gold KKSN(AM) scored a 4.4 to finish 10th.

In the NBA's off-season, KEX slots talk programming from 6pm-6am. "There's a two-hour [6-8pm], locally-produced sports talk show that's been popular," Dirkx says.

Initial Success

KEX was one of the ABC affiliates carrying Tom Snyder and Deborah Norville gabfests. Since those programs were cancelled, Dirkx says, "We're one of those radio stations that's looking for new evening talk programming. The rumor about Norville leaving was out there a long time, but we were surprised the network pulled the plug so quickly on both shows."

The station's main spring promotional activity involved a con-

test initiated by Dirkx. "We were successful with the \$1000 Initial Reaction," he says. "It's a simple game where you listen for your initials to be called out over the air. The 11th caller with the initials we announce wins \$1000. There's also a number of interesting twists that generate cume and TSL. We play it several times a day, and it works because there are several ways to win without having the actual initials.'

Ad-Libbing As They Go

Aware that some fellow FSAs recently evolved into Talk or News/ Talk, Dirkx says, "There's no FSA handbook, and there's only a handful of good ones left. It isn't like other formats where you can go out and buy your competitor's jingle package, hire a consultant, and put on the format. [FSAs like ours] make it up as they go along.

"We're looking for ways to make our stations interesting, exciting, and compelling. FSA PDs continue to pioneer the format. We can't copy very many stations, so we use our programming wits to make it work.

"It's our best book in 16 years," boasts OM Mike Dirkx, who attributes some of the healthy gains to the NBA's Portland Trailblazers. 'We had tremendous night numbers - thanks to them. There was a lot of excitement for the team, and that operates as a nice cume magnet for us. [Trailblazer demos] are slanted a bit more male than female, but the team tends to cut across all demos, male and female."

Close Shave

Admitting KEX may not always repeat as the market's 25-54 pacesetter, Kirkx says, "We're going to stay competitive. We've really worked hard the last four years on shaving down the demo, without blowing off upper-end listeners. It's a long evolutionary process and some younger demos have found and become hooked on us."

Music continues to play a role at the station, but the approach re-mains conservative. "Our target is

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
