Broadcast Merit Raises At 4.3%

Merit raises for salaried employees in the broadcast industry will average 4.3% in 1993, according to a survey by management consultant Towers Perrin. Owing perhaps to optimism over their companies' economic prospects this year, broadcast industry managers are giving higher raises than they budgeted for at the end of last year.

According to the survey, managers planned to issue their top managers 3.7% this year but are actually giving out 4.5% raises. Middle managers were up for 4% in raises but will get 4.3%, and other salaried employees were budgeted for 3.9% raises but will see 4.2% more pay in 1993. The overall average of merit raises among 1800 companies covering 51 industry groups is 4.2% for management employees and 4.1% salaried employees.

The survey also noted that 18% of broadcasters offer variable pay opportunities to nonexecutive employees, compared to 30% for all companies surveyed. The trend coincides with a scaling-back of traditional merit-based systems among all

EZ Does It On Wall Street With \$50 Million IPO

EZ Communications Inc. is the latest radio group owner to join the IPO parade on Wall Street. It has filed with the SEC to offer \$50 million worth of stock to the public.


EZ proposes selling 3.4 million shares of stock at a price between \$11 and \$13 per share. The shares will be traded on NASDAQ with the symbol "EZCI."



KIKI Letter Draws Racism Charges

Hawaii's Office of Hawaiian Affairs has lashed out at KIKI/Honolulu GM Lee Coleman after receiving several copies of a controversial letter sent by Coleman to a Los Angeles advertising agency.

In a May 11 letter to Ketchum Advertising, Coleman wrote: "We discussed the fact that my audience was made up of professional, high income, white collar Caucasian and Japanese and not the Hawaiian or part-Hawaiian population." The letter also mentioned crosstown Hawaiian-formatted KCCN's support of the Sovereignty movement, aimed at "removing all foreigners and foreign businesses' from the islands.

OHA Chairman Clayton Hee responded to Coleman by saying, The first statement is racist stereotyping. Although the indigenous people of these islands have suffered socially and economically, Hawaiians are well represented in all strata, from a U.S. Senate seat to the governor of the state to the legislature, judiciary, and univer-

Hee added, "Your statement on sovereignty is equally repugnant. Few Hawaiians contend that Hawaii should exclude all non-

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Reorganization, Regionalization, **Employee Buyouts Announced At UPI**

United Press International announced a restructuring plan that will concentrate its news gathering, sales, marketing, and customer service efforts in six regional offices. The company also said it was offering early retirement and severance payments to all of its unionized employees.

UPI plans to consolidate its regional operations in Chicago, Dallas, Los Angeles, Miami, and New York, as well as its Washington headquarters. Each office will be headed by a regional manager. It will then be up to each regional manager to determine staffing needs at smaller bureaus.

'These improvements will re-establish UPI's ability to swiftly meet market needs and customer demands," said Executive Editor Steve Geimann. The company said it will be focusing on growth areas, which include services for broadcast clients and overseas.

Geimann added that most stations are already dealing with UPI's regional offices for broadcast services. The realignment, however, will focus on identifying client needs: "I do expect the clients will begin to see improved ser-

He noted that the UPI Radio Network will continue to house all of its operations in Washington. He wouldn't speculate on any staff changes, except to say that "we're evaluating what our needs are going to be across the board.

The company also announced that it would soon convert the UPI Radio Network to all-digital delivery. That announcement occurred a week after a similar one by its main competitor, AP Network UPI said several other multimillion-dollar investments are planned, including new computer terminals and processing equipment for its news gathering operations.

Geimann told R&R Tuesday (6/15) that 10 of 29 eligible employees (over age 58) had accepted the early retirement offer by last week's deadline. All LIPI emplovees have been offered a severance package that would pay one week of salary for each year of service up to 25 years and two weeks of salary for each year beyond 25. The deadline for that option is July 16. And Geimann noted that "we reserve the right to limit the number of acceptances.

He wouldn't divulge the number of employees who will be let go or how large a work force the company will need for the restructured operation. VP John Hayes did acknowledge in a UPI story that more stringers and contract workers would be used.

UPI is continuing contract negotiations with the Wire Service Guild. The union's most recent contract expired before UPI was purchased out of bankruptcy last year by Middle East Broadcasting Centre, and the Guild has been unable to come to terms with the new

Ginsburg Skeptical Of FCC Indecency

udge Ruth Bader Ginsburg, President Clinton's nominee to replace Justice Byron White on the Supreme Court, is a strong free-speech advocate who has expressed doubts about the FCC's indecency enforcement practices.

Ginsburg, who sits on the U.S. Court of Appeals for the District of Columbia, wrote the 1988 Action for Children's Television decision. It upheld the constitutionality of the FCC's current definition of indecency but questioned the agency's efforts to limit indecent programming to a post-midnight "safe harbor." Ginsburg argued that while the FCC has a legitimate interest in helping parents protect their children from indecent material, it has no right to make such material virtually inaccessible.

"She's shown a healthy skepticism about how the FCC operates," said Jane Kirtley, Executive Director of the Reporters Committee for Freedom of the Press. "I think that's a good attitude for a judge to have.

Media Access Project Executive Director Andrew Schwartzman said Ginsburg's attitude toward indecency is in keeping with her strong support of free-speech rights. "Broadcasters are likely to be more happy with her than with Byron White [on speech issues]. She'll be a lot more sensitive to First Amendment questions.

Ginsburg, who at this point seems headed for an easy confirmation, also has a record of support for the FCC's minority policies.

Agency Fortune Teller Sees Slower Spending

ixed economic news and public uncertainty about the near-term future have prompted McCann-Erickson VP/Forecasting Robert Coen to trim his estimates of 1993 ad spending growth.

Coen now expects advertisers to spend a total of \$139.3 billion in 1993, up 6.1% from 1992. He had predicted a 6.9% growth in December. He also predicts 1993 network and spot radio spending will total \$2.05 billion, a 6.5% increase over last year.

'Uncertainties about taxes, health care costs, and jobs are clearly a drag on the pickup in advertising," said Coen in his revised projections. "At the moment, the best we can see for 1993 is a muddling recovery with strong ad growth delayed until late this year and into 1994.

Jacor Begins Rights Offering

acor Communications has begun a rights offering to all shareholders except Zell/Chilmark, which owns 93% of the Cincinnati-based group owner following a recent restructuring

Eligible shareholders have a nontransferable right to buy 0.4212 of a share for each share owned on May 7. The purchase price is \$5.74 per share for a total of 345,476 shares that are being made available. Each shareholder who subscribes to his full allotment may also subscribe to buy shares not picked up by other shareholders.

Zell/Chilmark will buy any of the 345,476 shares still available after the rights offering expires on June 30

The agency isn't buying that line and wants to know if Bott "lacked candor" when he vowed to be a hands-on operator

In his statement, Williamson charged that Partech's assets have shrunk from \$400 million to \$100 million during Rayl's tenure, while annual revenues have plummeted from \$130 million to less than \$25 million. He said that under Rayl's management the company had gone from profitability to multimillion-dollar losses, and that its share price had dropped from \$4.75 to less than \$1.

'Slanderous Activity'

Rayl didn't return calls from R&R. The company issued a statement saying that it believed Williamson is acting alone - rather than representing a group of 17 shareholders — and is seeking leverage to settle a \$90,000 lawsuit by Partech in which Williamson is a defendant.

"Mr. Williamson has used his access to public news sources to engage in slanderous activity which raises questions as to both his ethics and his real motives," Rayl said in the statement. He said he would seek to have regulators investigate Williamson's activities and might bring a new legal action against the shareholder.

Partech owns WDZD/Shallotte. NC and 49% of WKKB (FM CP)/ Key Colony Beach, FL. It has announced deals to buy WMFL & WJPH/Monticello (Tallahassee), FL and WGMX/Marathon, FL.

Malrite To Liquidate WJJZ/Philly?

alrite Guaranteed Broadcast Partners L.P. (publicly traded partnership) reported second-quarter revenues of \$940,000 - a decrease from \$1.1 million a year earlier. Its ioss from operations was \$910,000, compared to a \$613,000 drop in 1992. The partnership posted a net loss of \$1.1 million (\$1.06 per Beneficial Unit Certificate) vs. a year-ago loss of \$647,000 (60 cents per certificate).

Malrite Guaran teed Broadcast Partners owns WJJZ/Philadelphia, the only Mairite Communications Group Inc. radio station not in-




cluded in Malrite Communications' pending merger with Shamrock Broadcasting. Mairite Communications is the general partner and general manager of Malrite Guaranteed Broadcast Partners. The company said it may be forced to liquidate the partnership in order to complete the Shamrock merger.

The quarterly report stated that the partnership had approximately \$253,000 in cash and cash equivalents and that those funds "may not be sufficient to fund the partnership's current commitments and proposed operations." The report said the partnership "has been pursuing alternatives, including obtaining a source of outside financing.

The report also noted that prior to ciosing the Shamrock merger, Malrite agreed to transfer all of its obligations under the partnership to the new entity that will manage Malrite's TV stations and "commence the winding up of the partnership in accordance with the terms of the partnership agreement and applicable law including, if necessary, the dissolution of the partnership.

Mairite stated that it may not be possible for it to transfer its obligations to the new entity without the consent of its limited partnership certificate holders, which would be impractical to obtain. "Matrite is exploring other alternatives to effect such a transfer, which may include the dissolution of the partnership and the appointment of a liquidating

McCann added, "Our experience and success in the Midwest enable us to provide solid help and ideas to stations that may otherwise be unable to afford such services

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

Selling Radio's Strength In The '90s

successful media campaigns blend several different elements into one all-inclusive package: a valuable product, an effective message, and enough exposure to motivate behavior by target consumers.


These days, many strategies use more than one medium within the overall plan. As a result, it's vital to examine the relative strengths and weaknesses of various media when designing these strategies.

Radio hasn't always been effective in selling the qualities it can add to a potential media mix: Sometimes we position radio "against" competitive media rather than sell its synergy with them. In other situations, we fail to highlight radio's own benefits.

We must spend more time showcasing radio's ability to complement and increase the effectiveness of ad campaigns already running on other media vehicles. Fur-




Effective ad campaigns are those that take advantage of the different strengths provided by each medium, combining them into one overall media strategy.

We must train our salespeople to be "marketing consultants" instead of "radio sellers." This new breed of salespeople must determine customers' needs, then position our medium's value to deliver sponsors' goals. As we move deeper into this process, salespeople also must become experts in positioning other media's benefits in order to design effective strategies.

Selling in conjunction with other media — rather than against them — will demand major adjustments in the way we approach each sales opportunity. Every medium delivers some value to the client, but no one vehicle can provide all the sales influence needed to reach and motivate target consumers.

Effective ad campaigns are those that take advantage of the

different strengths provided by each medium, combining them into one overall media strategy. (The adjacent chart highlights the relative strengths and weaknesses of some major media.)

Delivering Reach And Frequency

In certain areas, radio is superior to its competitors. However, radio doesn't always receive the credit it's due, because of the way we've positioned it in the past. For example, in positioning radio as a "frequency medium," we imply that we're unable to deliver the other half of the marketing equation: reach.

Basic analyses of audience estimates and reach/frequency results prove that radio delivers reach just as well as frequency in target demos — especially when you're analyzing multiweek schedules. Using radio alone, typical schedules allow advertisers to reach more than 80% of their target audience.

Multiweek Cume

The Arbitron diary measures only one week of listening. Years ago, Arbitron developed factors to estimate cume impact beyond one

week. However, many of today's reach/frequency systems don't include these multiweek cume factors, or they're offered only as an option

99 - Parking Parking 199

While we can debate the accuracy of these factors, most people agree that a four-week schedule of 12 spots per week (48 spots total) delivers more reach and less frequency than 48 spots concentrated in one week.

However, without using the multiweek cume factors, the schedule results are identical. In other words, radio is given no credit for building cume across weeks, even though we know this to be true. Since we're underselling radio's influence when stressing frequency at the expense of reach, isn't it a better idea to sell both?

Primary Vs. Secondary Media

Because listeners can participate in other activities while tuning in, some of our competitors describe radio as a "secondary" me**Evaluating Today's Media**

dium. In fact, even our own salespeople describe in-car radio as "most effective" because listening can be considered the primary activity when riding in a car.

However, today's lifestyles leave little time for any media consumption on a primary basis. How many people watch TV or read the newspaper in the absence of any other stimuli?

Radio, meanwhile, can follow listeners — regardless of activity, lifestyle, or location — and still maintain its effectiveness. Indeed, radio has become more of a *primary* medium as more and more pressure pervades the American lifestyle.

More Radio Strengths

Here are some additional radio strengths that other media fail to match:

- Delivering target demos including high-income and young consumer groups that don't use certain other media better than any other mass appeal vehicle. *Note*: Format fractionalization can be positioned as an advantage.
- Reaching customers away from home and close to point of purchase.
- Offering sponsors terrific flexibility in terms of schedule changes and copy adjustments.
- Using sound (theatre of the mind) as well as the loyalty between listeners and their favorite stations to establish emotional attachments.

Combine these radio strengths with high reach and tremendous frequency, and you have one terrific advertising vehicle — and that's without mentioning promotions or efficiency!


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Radio has become more of a primary medium as more and more pressure pervades the American lifestyle.

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Owing to the nature of our medium and how it's used by the listener, there undoubtedly are some things that radio can't do. It doesn't excel in product demonstration or package identification, and there are limits to the amount of information it's able to convey in each spot.

Every medium is good at something. Recognizing our strengths — and creating ways to blend these strengths with other media — will allow radio to increase its share of the advertising pie.

and newspapers is up, these tasks account for only two of the 12 environmental activities surveyed that show any growth.

Other activities - such as separating trash and using biodegradable plastic garbage bags - are up only slightly, with the balance of activities relatively unchanged

Talkin' Trademarks

any trademarked terms have crept into the English language and replaced their generic counterparts as everyday words. For instance, most people use the trademark "Band-Aid" rather than the phrase "adhesive bandage."

Trademarks also can be used figuratively, as demonstrated by some of the following familiar trademarks and their oft-neglected definitions

Naugahyde: An artificial leather constructed of vinyl-coated fabric, this trademark can figuratively describe weather-beaten skin ("A good sun block is recommended because most race car fans get so engrossed they hardly notice their faces turning to Naugahyde" - Auto Week).

Kleenex: A trademark for a soft facial tissue, it is figuratively used in reference to the product's throwaway quality ("Looking at countries - and people — as 'disposable,' the Kleenex school of foreign policy" — columnist Mary McGrory.)

Velcro: Fastening tape consisting of nylon strips with minute hooks that lock onto corresponding strips of uncut pile. The Chicago Tribune symbolically referred to the early stages of a romance as the "Velcro period."

Lurex: A type of varn made of plastic-coated aluminum filaments, this trademark is used to evoke an artifical sense of shine ("The videos range from loud, Lurex pop nonsense..." - Time Out).

Rolodex: A desktop rotary file of removable cards used for names, addresses, and phone numbers. This trademark also can be used figuratively ("In the mental Rolodex of television producers, [she's] filed under Smart Women Who Can Talk" - Associated Press).

Pop'n Fresh: A trademark used for bread dough, it figuratively refers to the product's quick preparation time ("In the organic, whole-grain culture of contemporary Seattle, Brock Adams was something of a Pop'n Fresh anomaly" - Washington Post).

Jell-O: The trademark for a gelatin dessert — to which Zoo act Green Jelly can attest — this term also metaphorically represents the confection's texture ("If they want to turn their heads into Jell-O, that's their lookout" columnist Mike Royko).

Many of the above-mentioned words and phrases can be found in the American Heritage Dictionary Of The English Language, Third Edition (Houghton Mifflin Co./\$40). For more info, call Sandy Goroff-Mailly at (617) 725-5966.

Affluents Owning More Motorcycles

ne in five U.S. households with annual incomes of \$50,000 + owned a motorcycle in 1990 - up from 2% a decade earlier - according to a recent **Burke Marketing Research** survey conducted for the Irvine, CA-based Motorcyle Industry Council.

Conversely, motorcycle ownership among households with annual incomes of \$20,000 or less dropped from 27% in 1980 to 12% in 1990.

Meanwhile, motorcycle ownership among households with annual Incomes in the \$20,000-\$49,000 bracket climbed 6% between 1980 and 1990.

'Hershey's Kisses' To Beget 'Hugs'

the ready for "Hugs," the new version of Hershey Thew version of the Chocolate USA's "Hershey's Kisses." The milk and white chocolate treat - also available with almonds – will get its national rollout next month, according to Advertising Age. Look for seasonal versions of "Hugs" during the holidays as well.

"Hugs" is Hershey's second recent line extension to "Hershey's Kisses," following the debut of "Hershey's Kisses With Almonds" in 1990. "Hugs" also is part of Hershey's plan to keep its lead over runner-up M&M/Mars in the \$6.5 billion candy market.

Hershey's market share for the 12 months ending in February was 27.2%, up from 26.4% last year. The company spent an estimated \$76.3 million in measured media -\$9 million of which went to "Kisses"

during 1992. M&M/Mars's corresponding market share dropped from 24.4% to 22.6%, despite the company's \$94.9 million in advertising last year.

Preteens, Radio & Music

Then preteens 8-12 aren't in school, among their top free-time activities are listening to the radio (79% of the kids reported doing so) and listening to music in general (85%), according to a recent survey conducted at suburban malls on behalf of Sports Illustrated For Kids.

Girls Prefer Radio

Preteen girls listen to the radio more than boys - 82% vs. 76%, respectively. The total preteen radio listening audience – both sexes combined - also increases as the children get older: 82% of preteen radio listeners are 10-12 years old and 75% are age 8-9.

A solid majority of the total preteen audience (77%) also listen to tapes, CDs, and records. Of those, 79% are girls and 76% are boys (81% are 10-12 and 71% are 8-9).

Other Favorites


Other favorite preteen activities include watching TV (91%) and movies (87%), playing outside (86%), reading (84%), hanging out with friends (84%), and shopping (79%). Playing video games is popular with 70% of preteens.

Home activities include chores (67%) and taking care of family pets (60%). Board games (60%) and team sports (57%) are favored by a majority of preteens as well.

The agency noted that while adult-oriented formats, such as Country, Classic Rock, and AC, are flourishing - both in number of stations and revenues generated younger-skewing formats, including CHR and Urban, are losing stations and attracting less rev-

- · As popular music tastes and styles have multiplied, mainstream CHR stations may have be come too eclectic to hold the teen audience. Meanwhile, the agency says, radio has largely ignored some new styles — including rap that are popular with young people.
- Teenagers and young adults have found alternatives to commercial radio for learning about new music, including college radio and MTV.

Radio Response

Radio Network Association President Rick Devlin took issue with the survey, noting that while teen AQH figures may have dropped in recent years, the cume has held up nicely. He noted that stations which attract teens and young adults continue to do extremely well in most major markets. "Kids aren't walking around yet with MTV strapped to their wrists," remarked Devlin.

As for the 25-54 bulge, Devlin labeled that a good thing. "If you're going to be overindexed anywhere, 25-54 is the place to do it. As the great Willie Sutton said, 'That's where the money is.' "

Should we interpret this to mean that Hawaiian money is important to you, but the Hawaiian community is not?"

The local media quickly jumped on the story after Coleman's letter and Hee's response were made public.

R&R has received a copy of Coleman's subsequent response and apology to Hee, which stated, "I am sorry to see your misinterpretation of a very frustrating situation, with the background of which you are not familiar. Statements in the letter were factual and reflect what extensive local research has reported to us This is not a racist statement. It does not say that Hawaiians are poor or underachievers. It just states what the make-up and quality of our listeners are.

"I have noted your points and I accept them as your opinion. I understand you are responding to letters sent to you. I am sorry if it has disturbed you and people in the community."

Coleman has also asked Hee's office for all cover letters accompanying copies of Coleman's initial letter, claiming that his personal and business privacy may have been violated.

Neither Coleman nor KCCN GM Mike Kelly returned R&R's phone calls.

Assuming that the actual offering price is \$12 per share, EZ would receive \$30.1 million from the 2.75 million new shares being sold, increasing to \$35.8 million if the full overallotment is exercised

Looking For Duopolies

EZ plans to use the cash to reduce its outstanding debt and redeem its outstanding 12.7% senior subordinated notes. It expects to close a pending deal to buy KQBR/ Sacramento for \$2 million and exercise an option to buy WQKB/ Pittsburgh for \$5 million. Both would be duopoly buys; EZ already programs both stations under LMAs. EZ said it is interested in acquiring other Top 40 market properties, particularly duopolies with its existing stations.

After the public offering, Kellar and EZ President Alan Box would hold 81.8% of the company's voting power. They own all of EZ's Class B stock, which has 10 times the voting power of the Class A stock being sold to the public. After the 2.75 million new shares are sold, EZ will have approximately 6 million Class A shares outstanding and 2.7 million Class B shares.

Current EZ shareholders will see a substantial gain in their invest-

ment's value if the IPO is successful. They'll still own 68.3% of the group's equity, for which they paid \$1.4 million (24 cents per share).

EZ tried once before to go public in Fall 1987, but withdrew its \$21 million stock offering following that year's October stock market crash

Fiscal Fitness

EZ's SEC filing says the company "has grown significantly since fiscal 1980 when it owned and operated five radio stations with total net broadcasting revenue of approximately \$4.8 million." EZ said it had net revenues of \$47.5 million, operating income of \$12.7 million, and posted a net loss of \$587,000 in the fiscal year ending March 31, 1993.

As of March 31, EZ had total long-term debts of \$61.3 million -\$57.4 million under a \$70 million credit facility from Chase Manhattan Bank (including the current portion of \$287,000) and \$4.2 million in senior subordinated notes.

EZ paid a cash dividend of 15 cents per share in fiscal 1991, but says it doesn't anticipate paying future dividends. Instead, it plans

to retain any profits for expansion.

Dick Thompson's 35 'HOT Years

WHOT-AM &FM/Youngstown legend retires after programming the best hits of the '50s, '60s, '70s, '80s, and '90s

One of CHR's legendary PDs, 64-year old Dick Thompson, hung up his headphones last month after 35 years at WHOT-AM & FM/Youngstown, the last 33 as OM/PD.

In a business where you're often only as good as your latest Arbitrend, how does it feel to stay with one station through five different decades? In an exclusive interview, Thompson shares those feelings, some memories, and an assortment of observations about the format and radio in the coming years.

In The Beginning

R&R: When and how did you first begin your radio career?

DT: I've been in commercial radio since 1948 starting at WKRZ/Oil City, PA, just north of Pittsburgh. That station went on the air in 1946 and I did a teen show while I was still in high school.

My father was the printer of the Oil City Derrick. He wondered why I was obsessed with radio and suggested I find something stable like

R&R: How did you join WHOT and what were the early years

DT: Sherry was always willing to pick up and move, so in 1958 I went to WHOT, where I met owners Myron Jones and Bill Fleckenstein. Both have been wonderful friends through these many years and have made WHOT a great place to be. I've had quite a few offers over the years and we often thought about moving. But we loved the city, the people, and the station so much — it just didn't make sense.

I joined as News Director but became PD in 1960, when WHOT was a 250-watt daytimer at 1570 kHz. We stole the "Good Guys" identifier from WMCA/New York and changed frequencies in 1962 to 1330 kHz. That gave us 1kw day and 500 watts at night but we had a monstrous 11-tower directional array. We put up billboards of kids doing the twist with the slogan 'Twist your dial to 1330.'

WHOT stopped being a CHR on AM in 1983. We moved the format to our FM, WSRD, which was then a progressive rocker (The Wizard). The rock fans hated it but we shot to the top of the market again in no time.

Memories Live On

R&R: You've probably got some great memories . . .

DT: Probably my fondest memories are of the people I've worked with over the years. They were all characters. I learned it makes for good chemistry when you don't hire people like yourself. Hire people with their own personalities and make sure they have a lot of drive and desire.

Many of the people I hired have been around almost as long as I have been - we've had little turnover by comparison to the rest of the industry. Production Director Jerry Starr has been here for 30 years. One of my favorites was Boots Bell, who was here for 17 years and was probably our bestknown jock. Our present morning man, A.C. McCullough, started here 23 years ago as a parttimer and is a beloved figure in the community. Current afternoon personality Bob Popa has logged 15 years with us. [New PD] Tom Pappas



has been here five years — he's always had the desire and has the personality to motivate yet get along with everyone. It's very much a family here – that's important to everyone at the station.

R&R: What kinds of promotions was the station doing in the '60s?

DT: One of the most enjoyable things we did took place when the Beatles came to Pittsburgh in 1965. We ran a busload of teens to meet them and had 10,000 entries to get on that bus, which we considered a humongous response. The stories our listeners told on the air from that trip were amazing. Those kids were crazed.

When we'd just switched to 1330, we did a big promotion at Idora Amusement Park. We gave away a new Cadillac to the person guessing how many 1330s were on the car. Recently I was a guest of Jeff Kelly on [crosstown] WBBG and the daughter of the winner of that car called me.

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the steel mills or printing. I told him I was getting into radio because it was fun... and it's always been fun for me.

In 1953, I joined KSON (AM)/San Diego, which was Classical at the time. It became a Top 40 station, but we didn't have enough hip music, so I talked to [legendary jock] Hunter Hancock in Los Angeles. He helped us plug in some music by the Clovers, Ruth Brown, and the like. We lost all the blue chip accounts but went to No. 1 in six months and made money with the teens.

I met my wife Sherry in San Diego and we've been married 40 years. Her experience as a continuity manager has lent to her understanding of the business. I've always felt sorry for those who have families that don't understand the long hours and dedication needed to be a success in this line of work.

We also did a scavenger hunt which made everyone in town crazy looking for things. And we brought a lot of stars out to Idora. There was the main ballroom where the big acts played, the stage outside where the secondary acts performed, and a ballpark where the up-and-comers got to play. I remember hosting a concert out at the ballpark — the band was the Eagles long before they had a hit. They sounded a bit too country at the time, but they were all really nice and determined to be big

R&R: What was the music scene like back then?

DT: In the earlier days, there were record distributors everywhere. We had a lot of major stars coming through the market on a regular basis for appearances, concerts, and interviews on the air. If they stopped by, we'd talk with them and play their music on the

air right away. There wasn't a lot of testing and research. Everything we knew came from Cashbox, Billboard, or Variety - R&R wasn't around then.

No one worried about demos — the music back then spanned so many demos. You can't do that today, but it sure was fun back then. We pulled a 50 share in the [long-defunct] Hooper ratings as a daytimer, but there was no competition.

CHR's Present State

R&R: How do you see things to-day?

DT: I've lived through all the trends. Recently, we discovered that the thing we didn't do best was being a rock station. We'd been a pop music station forever and it didn't fit our image when we tried to be a Rock 40. [Crosstown AOR WNCD] CD106 wasn't about to be had. We suffered greatly but we're back on track. If the hits are out there, why not play them?

I don't believe CHR is dead. We've twisted ourselves into corners and narrowed ourselves down to being extremely careful, which has spawned a blandness in radio. The average listener enjoys a combination of music and there's a good selection out there today. Personality on the air — with your talent and as a station — is still an important part of success. Don't be boring or they won't need you. While cable technology and its music services will cut in, your localism, flavor, and personalty will set you apart.

In recent years, I've talked to too many people who are afraid to take a chance. Blandness and lack of creativity are radio's biggest problems today. We're anemic — we need to be secure with ourselves again. Make sure your people are out in public so they know the area and are aware of the fashions and trends. Trends are important, but we can't buy into the fads or we'll blow our listeners away.

Teen Believer

R&R: You've always been a proponent of youth radio. Why are sta-

tions having so much trouble making CHR work financially?

DT: Most stations aren't locally owned anymore, and the increase in LMAs and duopolies has really changed the operating perspectives. Unfortunately, we've lost a lot of talent and a lot of stations have had to cut back because of the economy. I hate to see all this happen.

Radio was anti-teen in several periods but we've always weathered it. It's CHR's biggest problem today. If you lop off teens, the 18-34s we currently have will have no basis from which to grow.

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The music has kept me young these many years. Too many PDs aren't as excited about the music as they should be.

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Remember, teens become young adults. AC radio is nice but there's no excitement. Teens keep the population tuned into radio. I've always felt teens are where it's at. We've got to be gutsy and rekindle a desire for cultivating young listeners. We've got to get them involved with radio for the sake of the future of the business.

Most recently, we lost our teens with the Rock 40 format, and we were worried someone would take them away before we fixed the problem. We're playing hit music again, the phones are ringing again, the teens are back, and they tell everyone what's going on — so our 18-34s are growing as well. It may be 1993, but teens still bring in adults. It's too bad the advertisers on Madison Avenue can't wake up to this fact because this 25-54 thing is hurting us.

If you're going to suppress teen music and not play rap, you've got to identify which are the right records for this age cell in your market. These blanket generalizations stations make about not playing certain types of music have really hurt the format. Let's face it, rap and dance music are popular and reflect what's going on out there.

R&R: What about today's nonmusic personalities, like Howard Stern?

DT: I've always felt that being yourself on the air — being believable and honest with the audience — is what works. Sadly, most CHRs and other formats restrict their people with liner cards. That's why Stern is such a standout. I'm sure that if you met him in person, you'd find him a nice guy — his act is just show business. But even though I think he's a great entertainer, I don't personally like what he does.

You can be blue and be funny, but leave the body parts out of it. I don't think Howard's show is the kind of radio I could embrace. I don't blame him for trying to get away with what he does, but there still has to be some goodness out there — and I believe that's the ultimate winner. Another marvelous entertainer who's true to himself is Rush Limbaugh.

Retirement Plans

R&R: What are your plans for the future, and do you have any parting advice?

DT: I've been planning this for a year. I even gave them a year's notice. They had a big retirement party for me and about 150 folks showed up. I'm proud to have been part of this whole thing. The gave me a trip for two to the Orient as a going-away present, so Sherry and I are leaving soon for Japan, Korea, Hong Kong, Singapore, and Hawaii. When I return, I'm going to do some community projects and some consulting, but basically take it easy.

I'm going to miss this. My last fulltime airshift was a few years back, and I wasn't a marvelous DJ, but I was talking to [former WJET-FM PD] Jim Cook a short time back and telling him I still get excited about the music. The music has kept me young these many years. Too many PDs aren't as excited about the music as they should be. The format lends itself to energy and fun.

CHR isn't over the hill — it's there to be captured as long as we understand that teens are the stepping stone. I've loved every day of this business and being with WHOT. You have to love this business. If you don't, get out and make room for someone who does.

FSA RECAP

Springfield's Red-Hot WHYN

Although it wasn't one of the nine Full-Service ACs registering No. 1 35-64 winter Arbitron stats, WHYN (AM)/ Springfield, MA still posted impressive winter-winter 25-54 and 35-64 gains.

Talk It Up

"I attribute our [35-64 gains] to our talk programming," says PD Bill Hess. "We still play music, but we've capitalized on cume brought in by [syndicated personality] Rush Limbaugh. Whether you agree or disagree with him, he's usually entertaining.

WHYN (AM) supports Limbaugh with a billboard campaign. His noon-3pm conservative slants are followed by Dan Yorke's locally originated, three-hour talk segment. "We've [fine-tuned] it. It's not too harsh. but it's entertaining and informative.'

The station previously broadcast syndicated talk programming by then-ABC/current CNBC personality Tom Snyder. "I always felt Snyder was a real plus for us," says Hess. "I'd received complaints about other talk shows, but his listeners did something [unique]: They thanked me for carrying a network talk show. It was a sad day when we learned he would [no longer be doing his show].'

Hosted by Dan Williams and sports sidekick Fred King, WHYN (AM)'s morning show is, according to Hess, "a bit radical. FSA morning shows tend to be 'safe.' But we have no problem doing satire and character voices or tackling hot issues. We play about two or three songs per hour. We also have services you'd expect from an FSA like Accu-Weather, Paul Harvey, and a great news heritage.'

Specific Targets

While his station has an overall image to promote, Hess maintains, "The smartest thing we've done is realize we should target some of our marketing to specific personalities and dayparts.

Hess outlines the cross-promotion between nine-year morning man Williams and the local TV outlet carrying "Jeopardy" and "Wheel Of Fortune": "Listeners watch for Williams between the two shows. If they correctly match



the question and answer [from the night before] on his morning show, they win \$100.

"I can't promote WHYN (AM) as one 'thing.' An AC music station can say it plays the 'biggest hits of the '70s, '80s, and today.' But FSAs must talk about their morning and talk shows. This is block programming; our marketing promotes the station's different aspects."

mornings on WHYN-FM "WHYN (AM) isn't a weak sister. It's a major player and gets the same attention [as WHYN-FM]. Marketingwise, no other AM station in the market steps up to the plate like we

Red Sox Rule

Extremely sports-intensive, WHYN (AM) is Springfield's home for the Boston-based Red Sox, Celtics, and Bruins. "The Red Sox are the real ratings push at night. The Bruins and Celtics don't show any great numbers but are excellent sales and promotional vehicles.

The station also slots a 6-8pm sports call-in show. Hess says host Scott Coen's hot topics are "the Red Sox, the Red Sox, the Red Sox. Even in the dead of winter, people are obsessed with them.

"We have solid numbers overall and believe we'll see continued growth. Limbaugh should remain hot, the morning show's always been strong, and the Red Sox should stay [in the pennant race] throughout the summer.

"People go bonkers over it," says Michaels Free. "For years, we've been getting calls from people begging to know when we'd play it so they could tape it."

The Four Tops' "I Believe In You And Me" is another non-hit that generates exceptional response as a wedding tune. "People send us blank cassettes with selfaddressed, stamped envelopes and ask us to record the song for them. Until now, the song had been hard

TALK GROUP MARKS FIFTH CONVENTION

NARTSH's Burns Looks Fore And Aft

Four years ago, emboldened by the publicity generated from their role in stalling a Congressional pay raise, a group of radio talkers led by WRKO/Boston's Jerry Williams formed the National Association of Radio Talk Show Hosts (NARTSH).

WOR Network host Gene Burns helped found the group and remains a leader.

On the occasion of NARTSH's fifth annual convention this week (6/17-6/19) in Chicago, Burns talked candidly with R&R about where the group has been — and the serious challenges it faces in the near future.

R&R: What has NARTSH accomplished in its first five years?

GB: I think we managed to outgrow the initial image that it was sort of a Jerry Williams phenomenon, and that he was going to employ it as a personal weapon or forum for his pet issues.

By lasting for five years, by not becoming a cabal, and by not doing political issues together, we have demonstrated that we really are an industry group. And we have grown. I don't think we have grown as fast as we would like, but we have grown. In this type of thing, being around for a while enhances your credibility.

R&R: One criticism of NARTSH is that, with the exception of yourself and one or two other people, it's a group of small-time talkers. Don't you need to get Talk's big names involved?

GB: I think it's absolutely essential that we get those people. It seems to me that [successful major market talkers] have an obligation to our craft to [get involved with NARTSH], encourage younger people, and share their knowledge.

But it's tough getting them to do that because a lot of the major

market types say, "What's in it for me?" And, frankly, we can't do much for those who are very successful.

At the convention, we're giving an award to Larry King. He has avoided us up until this point for whatever reason. The fact that he has agreed to appear gives me some encouragement that he recognizes we're not some fly-by-night outfit.

R&R: Speaking of awards, how is that Rush Limbaugh has never been honored by NARTSH?

GB: We negotiate with the potential recipients, and one of the requirements is that you attend the convention. We will not give that award to you and have somebody receive it for you.

Rush has been approached in the past, and for whatever reason was

not able to be there. I think in the last two years he's been on the board's mind and people have spoken for him at board meetings. This year, he might well have received [the Talk Show Host of the Year Award] had it not been for the fact that he apparently couldn't be there to receive it.

R&R: Is NARTSH planning to expand to include television talkers?

GB: The members of the board have consistently taken up questions about expanding to include television. I do not favor that move. The reason this organization was founded — from what Jerry tells me — is that radio talk people just didn't have an industry group of their own. It would be inimical to that impulse to include television now.

R&R: As you look at expanding the group, have you considered encouraging more PD and management involvement?

GB: We do that — we have a category of membership for station managers and PDs. [But] we do not have a large number of management people involved in the organization. I think some managers are afraid of the organization. They are wary of us because they feel if we become too powerful as an interest group representing the interests of talk hosts, we may be across the table from them some day.

R&R: Your conventions have been criticized in the past for a lack of professional development substance. Any plans to beef up the content?

GB: Well, we're certainly trying to do that. [But because of financial realities] we can't afford to pay these [experts and consultants]. I mean, most of these people pay their own expenses, so sometimes we have to take what we can get.

The more [talk hosts] who get involved in NARTSH, the more credibility we'll have with people who will ultimately say, "Well all right, I will pay my own expenses if you can't afford it, because I have something to contribute."

R&R: NARTSH has also been attacked for its dependence on special interest groups. Your Exec. Director, Carol Nashe is a PR person for Blue Cross and Blue Shield of Massachusetts, which allows her to do NARTSH work from their office on their time.

GB: Well, obviously we realize there is a perception problem, but we can't do anything about that. No one has ever suggested that I do anything on the air involving Blue Cross. I would hope they would be smart enough to know that would be one way to guarantee that I

With regard to Carol, she is leaving Blue Cross/Blue Shield and is going to work for us fulltime. So we will no longer get some of the perks Blue Cross has been willing to give us.

wouldn't.

We will pay her, and the board understands that means our expenses are going to increase rather remarkably and this is no longer fun and games. We must now come out of the embryonic stage and watch the balance sheet and raise money.

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[As for the other special interest groups that sponsor NARTSH events] I don't think we have done anything dishonorable by involving them — I wish we didn't have to. I wish the organization had \$10 million in the bank, and we could say we are putting on a free convention. Would I be happier if we didn't have to ask corporate sponsors, particularly those that are in the high-profile movements? Sure! Someday maybe we will.

R&R: What do you see in NARTSH's short-term future?

GB: We are entering a very difficult time. The transition from the kind of support — almost invisible to most members — that we got from Blue Cross/Blue Shield to paying our own way in every particular, is a time fraught with great danger. Nobody has any magic money machine. This is going to require a great deal of sacrifice on the part of board members, and we are going to have to be very astute.

This organization will sink or swim in the next two years — not the next five years. Which means we have a great deal of work to do and could use all the help we can get in doing it.

Most importantly, we absolutely must broaden the participation of Top 20 market talk show hosts. If we can't put on a blitz and sell the idea [that successful talk hosts should be involved in NARTSH], then we may have to come to the point where we will have to say, "Well, NARTSH was a wonderful idea but it apparently is not needed by the people for whom it is designed."

In the next two years we have to answer that question, and it will not be easy.

Digging Into The Format's Gold Mine

Vintage music improves overall product, educates audience

While the majority of mainstream UCs are current-based, they also rely on recurrents and gold to strengthen their overall music appeal. This week, two programmers discuss the importance of gold and how it contributes to a better music mix.

Strategic Programming

WZHT (Hot 105)/Montgomery, AL PD Monica May notes, "Our two gold selections per hour are strategically placed during our most important quarter-hours. We play a recurrent at the top of the hour, then move directly into a gold selection. Coming out of our second sweep of music — around the :22 slot — we play a song from our power rotation, followed by the second gold.

"Our gold categories go as far back as 15-20 years. An R&B example is the Temptations' 'I Wish It Would Rain.' [Selections by] the Four Tops work well in this market; Marvin Gaye songs are the best. Some funk examples include George Clinton and Parliament/Funkadelic — they're the mainstays of our gold library."

May says its necessary to daypart her gold selections. "Funk, for example, only comes up after 3pm each day. Meanwhile, Marvin Gaye, Tammy Terrell, and the Four Tops all can be played during

middays and the last couple of hours of morning drive. We don't program any gold between 6-10pm — that's when we triple our teen numbers. We kick into our youth-oriented approach and jam the current hits. During the later hours of the night, our format calls for one gold selection per hour

"Programmers must ensure the gold they use is the correct music for their geographical areas. Something that works well up north might not work as well in a Southern market. I like to get input from our air personalities. Their knowledge of local music helps determine when and which gold tracks will best serve our purposes. Gold can help your overall efforts in putting out good musical product; if you don't take care in the selection of your gold music, you can get hurt."

Oldies & Youngsters

At WVLR (V103)/Roanoke-Lynchburg, OM/PD Ladd Goins — a 25-year market veteran — says, "This market is very traditional. You don't want to take the chance of shoving too much new music down people's throats, [so gold works well here].

"Sundays 3-7pm, we air an oldies show featuring the hits of the '50s, '60s, and '70s. We play such vintage artists as Fats Domino, the Platters, the Miracles, the Temptations, and other Motown artists. The show is getting great response from the public. The Roanoke area never had a local show like this before."

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While older listeners enjoy the show, it receives most of its positive response from listeners in their early 20s. "When I play a song from the '60s, younger listeners call to say they like it or that it sounds like one of the new songs we're playing," Goins says. "These

people usually have heard the vintage song sampled in a current tune, but have never heard the original version. For example, Silk's 'Happy Days' uses a sample from James Brown's 'Payback,' and C.E.B.'s 'To The Point' comes from Honey Cone's 'Stick Up.'

"Occasionally, I'll play the original version followed by a bit of the current song to compare the two. I played Stevie Wonder's 'Hey Love' every week while Mr. Lee f/R. Kelly's version of the song was out earlier this year. Listeners called to ask if the song I was playing was a new Stevie Wonder tune!

"But the audience seems to enjoy it, and it can be educational, too. Kids usually are surprised to discover some of their favorite current songs weren't originally written or performed by the groups they're into. These listeners have given their peers credit for coming up with hit songs. When they discover that's not true, they then give credit to the older music."

V103 also incorporates gold into its regular programming. "Among the 11-12 records we play per hour, we program two gold selections during mornings and middays. In afternoon drive, we program one gold per hour; it varies between

one and two per hour at night. But these are recent gold songs — from about 1980 to 1992 — not the older stuff played on our Sunday show. We also have our recurrents that are past hits, which play a very important role in our daily music mix "

TALKIN' 'BOUT 'OUR GENERATION'

WOXY's Loyal Listeners

WOXY (97X)/Cincinnati recently unveiled a loyal listener club dubbed "Our Generation." PD Phil Manning explains the concept.

"The idea originated from a brainstorming session with the entire staff last November," recalls Manning. "We were trying to figure out how we could get to know our listeners better. We've been paying attention to 'Generation X' for 10 years. Now everybody's making a big deal out of it — this is our bread and butter.

"We didn't want to hype our listeners, but we wanted to do something different. Through our club, we'll be able to do a lot of things to make the listeners feel more special about their station. Each listener means something to us, and all their opinions matter. We're not going to change our station for one opinion, but people feel better if they can put their two cents in. It gives them the feeling they have a hand or say in what's happening at the station."

97X opted not to do membership cards. "We didn't want to have to depend on other people," says Manning. "We don't want to have to rely on five or 10 retail outlets through a discount or whatever. What happens if they back out? Then our listeners are stuck."

Listeners React

The club garnered more than 400 responses in its first couple of weeks. "It's staggering to see how



different these registration forms are from the people who phone our request lines," explains Manning. "The Our Generation people are older than we anticipated. The response has generally been from listeners 27+ years old. It's shocking: The male-female split is closer to 50-50 than you would expect.

"Our Promotion Director, Julie Maxwell, gathers all the returned registration forms and distributes them to the staff to write personal return letters (key chain or bumper sticker included). We thank them for joining and mention our plans, explaining that we're in the infant stage and they should bear with us. The attitude is we have a little club — it's not the most important thing you're going to do, but we're going to do something to reward you because you've been such a great listener.

"I put a P.S. on my letters with an upcoming station event. For example, 'Are you a Sand Rubies fan? Well, we're doing a low-dough show on June 11 for \$1.97. Hope to see you there!' I've also written, 'As PD I'm responsible for the entire on-air sound — if you have any questions or comments feel free to call me. This is your radio station as well '''

Daily Maintenance

Manning says the station doesn't promote Our Generation on-air. "We don't want to pound it into listeners' heads, because it's going to be around forever. We've channeled half of our on-air giveaways into Our Generation contests. When we do an exclusive giveaway, we mention it's for club members and say if you'd like to be involved, give us a call here at the station. We don't hype it. We don't even say what it is. We bring ad copies to station events, but leave them off to the side for people to grab if they want.



We don't want to pound the club into listeners' heads, because it's going to be around forever.

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"We're generating a weekly mailing list for each member's birthday. Gifts range from concert tickets to a win-before-you-buy CD. We write a letter wishing them a happy birthday, informing them for their birthday we're giving them such and such. People are flabbergasted; they can't believe we're thinking of them on their birthday.

"For instance, we gave away 10,000 Maniacs tickets to five people who had birthdays in the next two weeks. We're even giving people a choice. We tell them. 'We'll give you pavilion tickets or we'll give you lawn tickets and a chance to meet the band. Give me a call back in a couple days after you think about it.

"When we give away CDs, we ask the listeners to call and tell us what they think. I talked to a girl today about the new Waterboys CD. The one-on-one response makes the listener feel completely involved in the station."

Birth Of A Promo

Manning admitted he had been hesitant about launching the club. "We were concerned with the benefit for the listener. We asked ourselves, 'What is the value to the listener? How are we going to be able to stay in their face every cou-

OXY (97X)/Cincinnati kicked off its Our Generation loyal listener club by running a full-page ad in three issues of a local bimonthly alternative paper, Everybody's News. The station also plans to advertise in local college newspapers when school is back in session. Here's how the ad reads.



ple of months?' We felt the copy is irreverent enough and goofy enough for them to say, 'What the hell-it's only 29 cents.'

"Each listener can get four, six,

eight, or nine things from us a year. This isn't a marketing or advertising ploy. It's a god's-honest, very grass-roots oriented plan to get to know our listeners better."



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KLAQ/EI Paso and its remarkable rising ratings

Just six Arbitron sweeps ago, KLAQ/El Paso registered a 6.6 12+ share, good for no higher than seventh in the market's Summer '91 book. Eighteen months later, PD Will Douglass took the station to a Winter '93 13.0 share, making it one of the highest-rated AORs in the country and a serious threat to topple perennial market leader Country KHEY.

In fact, the latest Arbitrend showed KLAQ soaring to first in the market with a 13.8. The station also placed first with adults 18-34 and finished a close third in adults 25-54. What's the key to the D&F Communications outlet's success?

One reason: Douglass constantly emphasizes the basics. He explains, "We identify our station by dial position and call letters: 95.5 FM KLAQ. I've worked at stations that use nicknames, but Arbitron asks listeners to write down call letters. It's hard for listeners to remember them if you don't use them. And you don't know how often you're getting new listeners, so it's important to bang the calls."

Music And Mayhem

Douglass strives to make sure that tuning in KLAQ is an enjoyable experience. "We're a fun station to listen to and we play the right music. We're pretty tight with the classics, but a little wider with currents. We're out in the streets a lot and we have a sense of humor on the air.

"Big Al Buzz & Patti have a talk-oriented morning show. They discuss everything from the presidential election to gays in the its success. Here's a sampling of the liners it uses

- · "We don't want listeners with good taste, we want listeners that taste good.
- · Over "Chopsticks": "It may not be your favorite song, but it has a lot of the same notes.
- "We think Dolly Parton is a lot more fun to watch than listen to [clip of a Parton song] – so picture her and listen to us."
- 'Another billion songs in a

Many of the station's promotions are also done with a tongue-incheek twist, such as its "Win A Beetle, See A Beatle" contest tied in with a recent Paul McCartney show. But some others are played straight, including one major winter promotion. Douglass recalls, "We played 'Billboard Poker.' We put up 54 billboards, each with a different card and sponsor. We'd ask listeners for a particular poker hand, like a straight flush. They had to call in and list the cards along with the sponsor. Clients bought the package, which got them on a billboard plus on-air mentions throughout the promotion. Prizes included trips to Las Vegas, cash, and other clientrelated gifts. It worked well and was a lot more fun than 'High-Low Jackpot' or 'Cash Song Of The

military to the grossest thing restaurant employees have done to food. They're topical and use a lot of listener participation. They take it to the edge and cross the line now and then, but I like that. I'd rather reel them in than push them toward the line.

Douglass cites the station's onair irreverence as another factor in

favorable competitive situation. Because we're right on the border, half of the market's stations are licensed to and program for Juarez, Mexico. Of the ones in the U.S., several are Spanish-language. Therefore, we don't have as many English stations as most markets this size

If we're not one of the top two [25-54] stations, we're going to miss out on a majority of national dollars.

Juarez that don't count because they can't be rated. Yet our signal clearly covers the entire area. Arbitron's now trying to rate television in that market. If they get enough response, they might try radio too. It'd be interesting to see what would happen if both markets were combined, especially with the free trade agreement.

"We're pro-free trade in El Paso because the trade barriers make it difficult for us to do business. Free trade's a big issue here. At the present time, national businesses and agencies don't even count the million and a half people across the border.

Rock, Race, & Reality

However, serving two countries and cultures poses interesting programming challenges. Douglass notes, "We're 67.8% Hispanic. When you're programming to a Hispanic market, you have to be a rocking rock station. Soft, upper-demo artists aren't as valid. We're the hardest thing on the dial, but we still play the hits. The most important element for us is familiari-

Familiarity is also crucial in attracting desperately needed upper demos. "In markets 25 and lower, 25-54 is the major demo people buy We have to do well in that demo. If we're not one of the top two stations, we're going to miss out on a majority of national dollars. That's painful in a market as poor as El Paso. That's why we lean Classic Rock. It's not that we're conspiring with a consultant to be more classic - it's a result of the marketplace. A lot of record executives

fail to look at that when they start bashing us for not playing enough new music. But we're 33% current 44% if you include recurrents. We find the best songs and play them for a long time. We'll stay on a record 28-36 weeks if it's hot and doesn't burn out."

Fun-Raising Activities

KLAQ helps maintain its top-ofmind awareness by getting involved with the community through a number of high-profile events. "Every year, we sponsor the KLAQ International Balloon Festival. We're proud that we actually put it on ourselves. Most stations just tie into an existing event. We put together a committee from the community, front the money, and get bands toplay. It's held at a 'Wet And Wild' park - the balloons go up in the morning, people hang out all day with their families, then the concerts start in the late afternoon.

"This year we had Dream Theater, Galactic Cowboys, Sand Rubies, Blue Oyster Cult, Triumph, the Posies, and a couple of local bands over the three-day holiday. It cost \$10 and proceeds benefited our in-house charity, 'A Million Koins For Kids,' which aids various El Paso children's charities. We've done this eight years in a row. It's been a good way to get our call letters out and reinforce our image in the community.

Another popular event takes place prior to Thanksgiving: KLAQ's "Rock Radiothon." According to Douglass, "We play anything people want . . . for a price. All the money goes to A Million Koins For Kids. It's amazing what we end up playing. We had to play Billy Ray Cyrus's 'Achy Breaky Heart' into Metallica last year. We charged \$200 for 'Achy Breaky Heart,' but let people buy Metallica for \$25. Overall, the event sounded a lot better than I thought it would.

In spite of unique programming challenges, the entire staff - from CEO Charlie Cohn to parttimers and office personnel - works hard to achieve its goal of being the best station possible. The team effort has paid off in the ratings and given the staff a boost toward its next goal: Staying on top with those winning shares.
