Congress To Consider Car Leasing Radio Ad Reform

Bryan-D'Amato proposal would allow advertisers to offer disclaimer info via toll-free number

In a move that could unlock millions of dollars in new advertising revenue, two U.S. Senators last week introduced legislation that would ease disclosure requirements on radio ads for auto leasing and other financial services.

The Radio Consumer Information Act (S.1447), sponsored by Sens. **Richard Bryan** (D-

NV) and Alfonse D'Amato (R-NY), would permit radio advertisers to meet term disclosure requirements by including a toll-free telephone number directing consumers to point-of-purchase materials or providing some other method for obtaining the information. Rep. Larry LaRocco (D-ID) is expected to introduce a similar bill in the House of Representatives.

The new bills would amend three existing laws: the Consumer Leasing Act, the Truth in Lending Act, and the Truth in Savings Act. Under current laws, radio spots must include a disclosure statement so lengthy that there's little time left over to sell the product. While television and newspapers are under the same obligation, they can meet it using small-type disclosure statements that cause only minimal disruption of the sales message.

Lost Revenue

As a result, industry leaders say, radio has lost millions of dollars in revenue, and auto and financial services advertisers have been deprived of an effective marketing tool. According to RAB President Gary Fries, this handicap has become more costly in recent years with the boom in auto leasing's popularity.

Fries estimated that enactment of the Bryan-D'Amato bill could

DALLAS — Armed with a 9% increase in revenues so far this year, radio broadcasters came to the NAB Radio Show with smiles on their faces and — to the delight of many vendors — checkbooks in hand.

About the only note of concern was over attendance — the 6417 registrants numbered about 400 fewer than at last year's gathering in New Orleans.

Otherwise, the entire convention had the upbeat tone of an industry on an upswing. Nowhere was that more in evidence than perhaps the session on national spot sales.

"What a difference a year makes!" exclaimed Interep President Les Goldberg, who predicted 1993 national revenues would finish 7%-8% ahead of last year.

'Real' Gains

Katz Radio Group President Gordon Hastings concurred: "The numbers are real, not a cycle or a fluke, because of some fundamental changes taking place in the advertising business." Hastings said that advertisers (more so than agencies) are increasingly realizing the value of radio. Both Hastings and Goldberg credited efforts by rep companies, the RAB, and major group owners to educate advertisers on effective use of



Station off old gold, adds rock-flavored titles

Rumors of a KCBS-FM/Los Angeles format adjustment became reality last Friday (9/10) at 3pm when the four-year-old Gold outlet became "All Rock & Roll Oldies,

The call letters and PD Tommy Edwards remain in place, but some on-air staffers, including veteran L.A. morning personality Charlie Tuna, were released.

VP/GM Dave Van Dyke told R&R, "We're staying in the oldies arena, but we've set up a different category of oldies. We felt it was time to address a large segment of music people can't find in one place. This truly different format has elements of Gold and Classic Rock and is somewhere between the two. We're playing only the most popular and familiar music from a Classic Rock library.'

A sampling of artists from the kickoff hour included Rod Stewart, Bob Seger, Billy Joel, Rolling Stones, Van Morrison, and

Van Dyke said he believes the mid-60s through mid-80s-oriented

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Judges Appear Skeptical Of Indecency 'Safe Harbor' Law

A law that would limit indecent programming to a midnight-6am "safe harbor" came under heavy fire in federal court on Monday (9/13).

During an hour of oral argument before a three-judge panel of the U.S. Court of Appeals for the District of Columbia, attorneys for a coalition of broadcast groups contended that the midnight-6am corral goes beyond the government's legitimate interest in protecting children from inappropriate material and unconstitutionally limits adult access to explicit material. The judges seemed to agree.

Judge Patricia Wald told FCC Assistant General Counsel Jane Mago: "You're saying [adults] have the right to see this material, but they have to stay up beyond the normal person's endurance." Judge Harry Edwards expressed concern that by pushing explicit programming into the wee hours, the government is trying to replace parents as the arbiter of what children can hear and see.

The judges also seemed troubled by what they viewed as the FCC's failure to make a factual case

to support its contention that a midnight-6am indecency limit is necessary to protect children. "The evidence you've come up with is pretty thin," Chief Judge Abner Mikva told Mago.

Earlier Time Frame

Attorney Timothy Dyk, who argued the broadcasters' case, told the court the industry could live with a safe-harbor period that allowed explicit material to be aired in earlier evening hours and mornings. While children are in the audience at those times, the broadcasters have argued, they are likely to be under adult supervision.

A lawyer for the Pacifica Foundation added that the law poses a particular threat to noncommercial stations, which have limited financial resources and air much cuttingedge programming that could run afoul of FCC indecency rules.

Media Access Project Executive Director Andrew Schwartzman, whose group is part of the coalition fighting the law, said he was very encouraged by the tone of the judges' questioning. "All in all, they left the impression they are likely to throw out the law and send it back to square one.'

The law at issue in this case was enacted last year under the guiding hand of Sen. Robert Byrd (D-WV). Earlier this year the court agreed to bar enforcement of the law pending the outcome of the broadcast coalition's appeal. The FCC currently recognizes an 8pm-6am safe harbor during which explicit material may air without threat of Commission action.

Finance Sessions Lament Lack Of Lending

Despite a generally upbeat atmosphere brought on by improved revenues and a stronger market for station sales, financial sessions at the NAB Radio Show were dominated by complaints about the lack of available lending for most broadcasters.

During a question and answer period on Saturday (9/11), broker Bob Mahlman said it appeared that banks currently lending to the broadcasting industry were interested only in the largest group owners, leaving more than 8000 small station owners with no place

to go for money. "We have no way to expand anymore. There's no one willing to lend to us.

Panelists offered no hope of quick relief but did say they expected lenders to eventually move to smaller radio loans as they find it more difficult to find credit-worthy

big borrowers in other industries. For now, there's plenty of lending available - but only to those group owners who can qualify for loans of \$20 million or more.

Greyhound Financial VP Matt Breyne twice found himself (9/9 and 9/11) as the only panelist willing to finance radio loans for just a few million dollars. But he indicated the low-end market is doing just fine by his company. "Across the board in our portfolio, we're seeing strong revenue growth from the Keokuks to the Houstons."


Return Of Turpin

One sign of hope for smaller borrowers was the presence in Dallas of former AT&T Commerical Credit media lending head Steve Turpin. He was testing the waters to interest his new employer, CIT Group, in establishing a broadcast lending program.

Turpin told R&R he was looking first at deals in the \$5 million to \$15 million range for established group owners who made it through the recession with decent cash flow. The loans would be fixed-rate (currently around 8.5%) for 10-year amortization, although other terms are also available. Turpin had no trouble finding many potential borrowers eager to submit applications to his Atlanta office.

Current AT&T employees were also in evidence at the Radio Show. fueling expectations that the company is preparing a return to writing new loans, rather than just servicing its existing portfolio.

Viacom To Acquire Paramount, Create Five-Way DC Combo

iacom Inc. (AMEX: VIA) is creating the nation's first AM-AM-FM-FM-TV combo with the deal it announced Sunday (9/12) to acquire Paramount Communications Inc. (NYSE: PCI) in a cash and stock-swap deal valued at \$8.2 billion (\$1.1 billion for the cash portion).

Paramount doesn't own any radio properties. But it does own seven TV stations, and Viacom will need waivers of the FCC's one-toa-market rule (radio-TV) in two markets.

The five-way combination will be in Washington, where Viacom owns WMZQ-AM & FM and has a duopoly swap pending with Group W to acquire WCPT & WCXR. Paramount owns WDCA-TV/Washington. Paramount also owns WKBD-TV/Detroit, where Viacom owns crosstown WLTI. The DC swap dealing KIKK-AM & FM/Houston to Group W will eliminate the need for another waiver in Houston, where Paramount owns KTXHTV. "We foresee no regulatory problems [in securing the waivers] at this point," Viacom President/Radio Division Bill Figenshu told R&R.

Viacom's Paramount takeover, which is subject to stockholder approvals, will create a media conglomerate with more than \$6 billion in annual revenues and total capitalization of \$18 billion.

NewCity Seeks NewMoney On Wall Street

ewCity Communications is the latest radio group to join the Wall Street parade. However, Dick Ferguson's Connecticut-based group is going for a \$75 million bond offering rather than offering stock to the public. It plans to use the proceeds, plus the \$8 million from its pending sale of WYAI (see below), to repay existing debt and exercise an option to buy LMA partner KDIL/San Antonio for \$2.55 million.

NewCity's SEC filing shows it posted a net loss of \$2.9 million in 1992 — improved from a loss of \$4.7 million in 1991. Total revenues last year totaled \$55.9 million, up from \$52.2 million.

Cox's Atlanta Duopoly Clears First Hurdle

ox Enterprises' duopoly deal to acquire WYAI/La Grange-Atlanta from NewCity for \$8 million has cleared its first obstacle at the FCC. The Commission approved an application to switch the FM movein to a directional antenna, which will pull its signal back from a tiny corner of Atlanta.

Cox already owns crosstown WSB-AM-FM & TV and both of Atlanta's daily newspapers. But it claims that it won't need a waiver of the FCC's crossownership (newspaper) or one-to-a-market (radio-TV) rules now that the antenna change has been approved.

Jacor Communications, which owns WGST & WPCH/Atlanta, opposed the antenna change and filed a petition to deny the WYAI sale. Jacor claims Cox is misinterpreting the rules and still needs waivers.

Liberty Poised For First Duopoly?

ook for Mike Craven and Jim Thompson to make the first duopoly buy any day now for their fastgrowing Liberty Broadcasting. It looks like they'll be cutting a deal for Four Seasons Communications' WXTR/Washington, even before closing their purchase of WHFS/Washington-Baltimore.

It appears Liberty will also move into the Richmond market with Four Seasons' WMXB. That would leave Four Seasons with only one station, WAFX/Norfolk.

In other deal news:

 Clear Channel Communications (AMEX: CCU) is heading back to Wall Street with a 1.9 million share stock offering. The stock sale should raise about \$52 million for the company and \$7 million each for President Lowry Mays and Director Red McCombs, who are each selling a small portion of their Clear Channel stakes.

 One-On-One Sports announced an agreement to acquire controlling interest in Sports Entertainment Network. SEN carries about 150 radio affiliates nationwide for its 24-hour all-Sports format. One-On-One provides closed circuit play-by-play audio delivered via special receivers at major sporting events. Terms weren't disclosed

 Word Of Faith Fellowship is buying WTAS/Crete, IL from South Cook Broadcasting for \$800,000, rather than AM sister WCGO/Chicago Heights, IL as indicated in the FCC assignment application (and reported in last week's R&R). Look for a correction to be filed soon with the Commission. The FM is on 102.3 MHz with 3kw at 299 feet. Broker John W. Saunders represented the buyer.

stage even at a session focusing on new technologies. Panelists noted that merging multiple radio stations in a single market is forcing many station owners to adopt new computer-driven digital equipment much more rapidly than they might have without duopoly.

"I'm operating three radio stations out of the same studio with the same hard-drive system," noted Ogallala Broadcasting Co. President Ray Lockhart. He said the advanced technology had allowed him to reduce his staff from 18 to 13 people and suggested that fellow small-market broadcasters look into potential savings from computerization. "It means money to the bottom line."

Paxson Broadcasting President Bud Paxson warned that the "window of opportunity" for duopoly combinations will begin to close in a couple of years as the pool of available stations diminishes, noting, "I wouldn't want to compete without a duopoly in any of the Top 50 markets."

Paxson also pointed to the next step: "If you've enjoyed duopoly, consider expanding further within those same markets." He said his company is already negotiating with cable TV operators to "control all of the commercial inventory on four or five channels." Paxson added that radio broadcasters could also consider moving into print, billboards, and other media in their markets.

Consolidation Caveat

In another session on duopolies, FCC Audio Services Chief Larry Eads noted that several proposed combinations are still awaiting FCC rulings on just what is permitted under the relaxed ownership rules that took effect last fall. But he added this encouraging note for broadcasters: "We haven't denied any yet."

At the group owners' panel, Broadcast Alchemy President Frank Wood, CBS Radio Division President Nancy Widmann, Saga Communications CEO Ed Christian, and Cox Enterprises Exec. VP/Radio Robert Neil all gave upbeat reports on their duopoly experiences, but warned of perils if combinations are attempted without careful strategic planning.

"One bottom-tier radio station buying another bottom-tier station doesn't give you the critical mass that you need," warned Christian.

Widmann said not to expect many more duopoly deals out of her company, since CBS owns TV stations in many major markets and an FCC waiver would be needed to acquire an additional radio station.

However, no one is expecting any quick end to the duopoly-inspired station-buying frenzy, and Wood predicted that more sales-only combinations will be created to provide even more spot inventory for operators who already own the maximum number of stations in their market. "I think you're going to see huge selling combines," Wood said.

Duopoly Dilemmas

Potential problems with duopolies were pointed out in a Saturday sales session.

There's no set formula for what makes a duopoly work, warned EZ Communications President Alan Box. "It's really the competitive landscape and format holes — or lack of holes — in a market," he said. Box warned against such pitfalls as overdomination of a format niche (resulting in too few available dollars) or a gap in the two stations' demographics (making them hard

to sell in combination).

"We've struggled through our first LMA year," said KKCS-AM & FM/Colorado Springs VP/GM Bob Gourley of his experience adding KIKX to his combo. He warned of "massive problems" if you can't co-locate the stations and build a winning attitude at the LMA'd station. "You can't do it by remote control."

Gourley also said he erred in assuming that his existing sales staff would be able to devote the necessary time and effort to selling the additional station, since the KIKX sales staff was small and inexperienced. "Be sure the station you're taking over has some real [sales] hitters," he advised.

But even with the problems he's encountered, Gourley said he'd probably still do the LMA if he had the choice to make again.

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Regulatory Panels

A session on libel, hoaxes, and indecency shed little new light on those areas, but did feature a notable exchange between FCC Mass Media Enforcement Chief Charles Kelley and WLUP-AM & FM/Chicago VP/GM Larry Wert.

Wert, whose station is at the center of a lawsuit challenging the FCC's indecency enforcement policy, commandeered the microphone to complain that the Commission's definition of indecency is too murky. After several minutes of arguments back and forth, a seemingly frustrated Kelley finally declared, "If you can't understand the definition of indecency, maybe you're in the wrong line [of work]. It's not that difficult. The only people who can't understand what's indecent are broadcasters who broadcast indecency.'

The possible return of the Fairness Doctrine was a frequently mentioned topic in the news and talk-related session, with many broadcasters expressing concern that the policy's return poses a threat to the very survival of opinion-driven talk shows. However, attorney **Eric Bernthal** downplayed the threat, saying there is sufficient FCC case law on the Doctrine to allow stations to navigate its hazards.

Indecency fines and the Fairness Doctrine drew fire from the group heads as well, but no one was predicting any relief from Washington's attacks on the radio industry. "The indication we get out of Washington with this new administration settling in is that it is going to get worse before it gets better," said Widmann.

NAB NOTES

Operators Caucus Supports Arbitron Plan

Members of the Radio Operators Caucus gave a thumbs-up to Arbitron's plan to increase sample sizes by 70% over the next three years in return for modest subscriber rate increases. Without taking a formal vote on the issue, members gave the sample increase plan near-unanimous approval, said Cox Broadcasting Exec. VP/Radio Robert Neil at an NAB session.

Arbitron President **Stephen Morris** told **R&R** the ROC approval "goes a long way toward the goal of getting additional sample into the Winter '94 survey." But Morris said Arbitron will need a "substantial" number of signed commitments from stations before making a definite decision.

According to previously announced plans, Arbitron will increase sample by 30% next year, with the remainder coming over the following two years.

Also at the NAB, Arbitron took the wraps off its Maximiser analysis system.

The sharp-looking Windows-based software will slice and dice numbers using custom geographical, demographic, and daypart definitions. Users, for example, can define markets by using only specific counties or even specific zip codes. They can even combine stations for LMA or duopoly purposes.

The software will ship to clients beginning next month.

CBS Renews Major League Baseball Pact

CBS Radio will carry Major League Baseball games for another six years, according to a deal signed by CBS Radio Network VP/GM Robert Kipperman and MLB Executive Council Chairman Bud Selig.

CBS has been carrying the games since 1976. It will air 40 regular season games, the All-Star game, all playoff games, and the World Series each year.

According to sources at the network, the deal is worth \$25 million, half of what it cost CBS five years ago.

StandardNews Buys Zapnews Fax Service

Pat Robertson's Broadcast Equities Inc. announced its long-rumored acquisition of Zapnews from the Tribune Company. The fax-delivered news service will be expanded and based in Washington, DC alongside Robertson's StandardNews radio networks. A former Republican presidential candidate, Robertson also owns and operates the CBN cable TV network.

DAB On Display

AT&T/Bell Laboratories and Amati Communications gave the radio industry its first look at their jointly developed in-band, on-channel (IBOC) DAB system. The booth display let listeners compare the DAB and FM signals as they were put through simulated multipath conditions.

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AT&T/Bell Labs Head/Advanced Audio Technology Nikil Jayant told an engineering session that his firm's PAC music compression system is "uniquely suited to the DAB challenge." He said AT&T hoped to

conduct over-the-air tests on WPBR/Princeton, NJ before submitting its equipment for NRSC testing that begins December 31.

Competing IBOC developer USA Digital Radio (Gannett, CBS, and Group W), which had displayed both its AM and FM IBOC systems at previous conventions, brought along only a listening booth for its MUSICAM compression system while its engineering team concentrated on building the equipment it will submit to NRSC.

Group W Radio Director/Engineering Glynn Walden gave the engineering session more information about the AM DAB system, which he said "is expected to exceed or match the analog coverage area." He also noted that when the analog signal is eventually turned off, the amount of ancillary data (paging, etc.) transmitted with the AM digital broadcast could be increased.

USA Digital representatives also presented FM multipath data gathered in Chicago using WBBM-FM and WGCI and offered the use

THREE-PART TECHNIQUE

How To Complain More Effectively

Ithough complaints are a basic part of human communication, most people tune out when criticism is thrown their way. Why? Complaints usually imply there's a flaw in someone's behavior - and contain a command to correct that flaw.

To lodge a more successful complaint, Dr. Suzette Haden Elgin author of "Genderspeak: Men, Women, And The Gentle Art Of Verbal Self-Defense" (John Wiley & Sons) — suggests using the "three-part message": "When you [X], I feel [Y], because [Z].

Part One: 'When You [X]'

Refer to one specific behavior, and make sure it's an act that's verifiable. Say, "When you yell " not "When you act like a

Part Two: 'I Feel [Y]'

State your emotion, but don't exaggerate. Say, "I feel distressed ...," not "I feel like a second-class citizen.

Remember: Make sure not to draw conclusions about the other person's feelings. Don't say, "I feel like you don't respect me . .

Part Three: 'Because [Z]'

Prove your right to complain. Prompt the other person to want to change his behavior by describing an indisputable consequence that this person would want to avoid.

Using the examples cited above, say "When you yell, I feel distressed, because I can't work productively." Avoid such statements as because it means you don't care about my feelings.



If what you say is concise and insightful, you'll carry more weight at future meetings. Warning: Never use meetings to say negative things about your subordinates. This can undermine the department — and you, as its manager

Admit mistakes were made.

- Explain why the mistakes happened.
- Show real concern and remorse.
- Fix the damage, as necessary.
- Seek help from the affected parties, and accept advice from the community and other third parties.
- Promise it won't ever happen again.
- Make reparations somehow.

Creating Job Requirements: What Works, What Doesn't

any factors can influence what should or should not be included when determining the list of requirements for a specific job.

To keep job specifications to a minimum, Robert Half — founder of the Menlo Park, CA-based consulting firm that bears his name suggests dividing the suggested qualifications into the following three categories:

Mandatory requirements Without these qualifications, you can't hire a prospect.

Preferred skills - It would help if the candidate had these.

Cosmetic credentials — These

look good, but aren't essential.

Ideally, Half recommends eliminating the "cosmetic" category and sticking with a minimum number from the "preferred" group. Specifications should be set by a limited number of executives.

Half also advises managers to be wary of falling into any or all of the following pitfalls:

Three Traps

Cloning. Getting someone who has the exact same background and skills as the incumbent is impossible. Finding similarities in background is easier, and people's strengths in various functions are bound to be different.

Misinformation. Many times a departing employee will add unnecessary requirements because this person simply wants to tell everyone just how terribly complex the job is.

Unnecessary specifications. This is too often the result of getting input from different levels of management — without regard to what kind of salary or other considerations such a candidate may require. You can wind up screening out a lot of talented people - who could do the job, but can't meet these unnecessary requirements this way.

Remember, ability and willingness to do the job are the major qualifications.

10 TIMELY IDEAS

Increasing Your Fourth-Quarter Billing

By Irwin Pollack

he fourth quarter's right around the corner, so now's the time to formulate ideas to present to retailers. If we wait any longer, we'll fall victims to cost-per-point and other reactive selling strategies.

Top-billers make sure they have a tangible idea in mind when calling on decision-makers — it's easier for prospects to say "yes" or "no" to a real concept.

If they buy, you've got an order. If they wait, go back with another idea a day or two later. Eventually, you'll hit paydirt.

Here's an overview of 10 supershrewd ideas that promise to close more orders in the weeks to come:

Go To Hell On Halloween

Give away a trip to Hell—
it's a city in Michigan,
about 10 miles south of Ann Arbor.
If you're in the vicinity, you can
send listeners to Hell in a
limousine!

This concept is ideal for AOR, CHR, and Classic Rock formats. Gear the contest to the sales department only by signing up retailers who want registration boxes and pay for the store traffic.

K-9 Kostume Kontest

This idea potentially can tie in with Kodak, Polaroid, and/or a local photo-finishing store. Pets and their owners can dress up for Halloween and have their pictures taken at a shopping center.

They can compete in different categories – such as best costume, closest pet/owner resemblance, creativity, etc. – to win prizes.

Coats For Kids

With colder weather approaching, this campaign focuses on collecting winter coats for market residents who can't afford them.

The drive can be sponsored by your station and a combination of retailers, with an emphasis on heavy store traffic. The best spon-

sors usually are convenience stores or dry cleaners.

concept.

Use sponsor-committed dollars to buy a spot bank telling listeners where to donate their coats. Retailers should be responsible for collection and distribution to a local Salvation Army office.

Veteran's Day Blood Banks

This idea originated at Religious WCBW-FM/St. Louis: Have your station team up with the American Red Cross to host a Veteran's Day blood drive.

Hold the five-hour event at two locations (i.e., noncompeting hotels with ballrooms). Sell two types of sponsorships: majors (hotels that can benefit from traffic) and minors (retailers who are interested in name mentions).

T-shirts bearing sponsors' logos should be given to each donor. Remember: Each pint of blood donated can save three lives — your event can save hundreds of lives.

Great American Smokeout

The Great American Smokeout takes place on November 20 this year. On this special day, ask submarine sandwich shops to give away a free cold turkey sub to anyone who comes in and throws away a pack of cigarettes — quitting smoking "cold turkey."

'Tanksgiving'

During Thanksgiving week, ask gas stations and/or oil companies to offer gas prices that match your frequency. Tell your audience it's just a way of saying, "'Tanks' for listening!"

Santa Calls

Ask listeners to register their children (and grand-children) at participating retail locations to win a phone call from "Santa Claus."

Have station staffers call parents to find out which toys their child received last year and hopes to receive this year, whether the child wrote to Santa, if the child's been good or bad, etc.

The station Santa then calls right back to talk to the child. When the child answers, a voice says, "North Pole operator, call from Santa Claus, hold please." Record the magic to be played on-air later. Set up a different sponsor for each call.

Designated Drivers

Ask a sparkling water, juice, or nonalcoholic brew company to promote a "Don't drink and drive" campaign from mid-November through year's end.

Issue ''designated driver'' punch-out cards; partiers who order safe beverages at participating outlets get one of 10 holes punched. Listeners who turn in punched-out cards win free dinners or other prizes from the sponsor or cosponsors.

Santa On Wheels

As a service to advertisers, you can offer remote and/or spot packages to provide local retailers with a turnkey Santa Claus operation.

This event is designed to highlight a specific day of the week as chosen by the retailer — just as they would a regular schedule or remote.

Included in the expenses: the cost of hiring Santa, set-up, assistants, camera, film, balloons, and prizes for the kids.

The Snowball Effect

This program offers big potential from Christmas through the end of February. Advertisers invest in a number of commercials each week; as long as they maintain the schedule, they get a certain number of free (or low-charge) spots.

For example: Buy 12 the first week, get one free; buy 12 the second week, get two free; in the third week, buy 12, get three free, and so on. If the program runs for 12 weeks, the client gets a heavy schedule of buying 12 and getting 12 free

To prevent sell-out situations, you may want to air the free (or low-charge) commercials on a Monday-Sunday basis or on a fourpart daypart rotation.

Offering ideas instead of discounts allows us to separate ourselves from our competitors, offer value-added promotions, and give clients something tangible to sink their teeth into.

Once we put these — and other traffic-building ideas — to work, we'll be able to superserve our clients' needs: increasing store traffic, moving more product, and making the cash register ring more often.



Dre didn't, but his suburban neighbors may wish he had. He plays music at concert volume, and when they complain, he says, "I slam the door in their face. I paid a mil-plus for this house, so I figure I can do whatever the fuck I want to do in it. As far as I'm concerned, this house right here is the only house on the block"

of its multipath data collection van to NRSC

The FCC's Larry Eads told expanded AM band hopefuls that the first construction permits for the 1610-1700 kHz channels will likely be issued next May. He said interference improvement factors are now being calculated for stations that applied to migrate to the expanded band.

"Use it or lose it" was the advice for licensed stations that aren't on the air. "We're going to turn up the heat in the next few months," Eads warned. He said stations that have been dark for 12 months or more are likely to be designated for revocation hearings.

dio-TV news operation, while WWWE/Cleveland PD Jay Clark suggested that a market's more news-intensive stations could develop new revenue streams by selling their news product to other stations in their market.

In "News And Information Programming In The '90s," WLS-AM & FM/Chicago President/GM Tom Tradup laid out his advice for cost-effective success in the Talk format. In developing Talk programming, he said, stations should strive for variety and fun, as opposed to getting hung up in protracted discussions of ponderous issues or crusades

"It's Oral Roberts's job to save people - not ours," Tradup joked. "Don't take yourself too seriously." He also urged Talk stations to move their programming to FM as soon as possible because that's where the younger audience Talk seeks can be

AOR panelists discussed the direction of the format, its music, finding and developing talent, and the age-old issue of whether radio has a responsibility to break new music. KQRC/Kansas City PD Doug Sorensen stated, "My responsibility is to my station and my company. AOR is a format of passion, music, enthusiasm, and the people who care about it. It is the record companies' responsibility to find the best bands and make them available to radio."



WHFS/Baltimore PD Robert Benjamin noted, "There are no absolutes in this group of people. Generation X has more to do with an attitude than a rigid demographic. The attitude started with the punk rock movement in 1977, when there was a band called Generation X. That would put the age group of the top end up to 35. Punk was not embraced by its generation, unlike the hippie movement in 1965.

USA Today/Sky Radio VP Holland Cooke said, "Advertisers covet them because they haven't vet formed lifetime product loyalties. Most of what's been written about Busters has been written by Boomers. Boomers grew up letting TV executives, newspaper editors, and radio programmers choose what they saw, read, and heard. This crowd won't. What they have in common is [that they have] little in common.'

Exhibit Arena

While there was some grumbling over the NAB's announcement that it will share next year's exhibit floor with three other organizations, many exhibitors were encouraged by an upswing in spending on equipment and production software.

There didn't seem to be as many people through the exhibit halls this year, but most exhibitors saw quality, if not quantity this year," observed Dave Burns, who with his firm, Radio NetWorks, consults equipment suppliers.

There was a sharp increase in the number of vendors offering hard disk storage systems and associated equipment, such as touchscreen consoles and digital editing decks. Burns credits the popularity in hard disk systems to small-market operators. "They are the ones that have to cut expenses in order to survive . . I know of some stations that are now able to lock up the studio at night and leave it unattended because of the sophistication and reliability of the digital automation they bought."

Continued from Page 1 generate \$20 million per year in new radio revenues from national automobile advertisers. Additional millions could also flow from the nation's 17,000 car dealers, he said.

Although the Consumer Federation of America has agreed not to oppose the bill. NAB officials acknowledge that some lawmakers may be hesitant to vote for any bill that even appears to weaken a consumer protection law. But such reluctance, they said, can be overcome by showing the lawmakers that consumers will actually have access to *more* information under the proposed legislation.

While newspapers could lose revenue to radio under the relaxed rules, a senior NAB staffer said they are unlikely to oppose the legislation. "Newspapers need broadcasters on too many other issues, including advertising deductibility, to fight this," said the source.

and stay out on the front lines with your employees. "We never use the term 'management' ... we are all laborers," the billionaire businessman said.

Perot used most of his speech to push his current cause — defeat of the North American Free Trade Agreement, which would abolish most trade barriers between the U.S., Canada, and Mexico. He claimed the treaty will send hundreds of thousands of U.S. manufacturing jobs to Mexico.

"We must never give away our country's sovereignty," Perot said. He claimed that foreign lobbyists were the moving force behind the U.S. government's negotiations on the treaty. According to Perot, millions of Americans have rallied to join him in opposing NAFTA, and "that sucker is in trouble."

Revisiting the main theme of last year's campaign, Perot denounced President Clinton's economic policies and warned of the consequences of continuing deficits. "We're spending our children's money. We're leaving them a debt they cannot pay, and nothing could be worse than that," he said.

Networking The Crowd

Is a Perot radio network next for the businessman turned activist? Perot told the audience of radio pros that he is frequently approached with suggestions that he launch a radio talk show. (A Perot aide later told R&R that what's being considered is a short daily commentary — perhaps five minutes — which could air from Perot's home.) Perot asked interested broadcasters to leave their cards in boxes outside the theater. "I will be in contact with you," he promised.

"I just don't know enough [about NAFTA], but I think he ought to do a talk show," said Cromwell Group President Bud Walters. He said some Mexican broadcasters who were sitting near him during the speech disuted Perot's claims about the treaty.

Whether or not they agreed with his message, there was no doubt that broadcasters found Perot entertaining. "He's good at the one-liners," noted Rodgers Broadcasting President David Rodgers.

K-Live 105: Alive Again In Dubuque

Blowing up market myths generates success

KLYV (K-Live 105)/Dubuque, IA hit the bottom of a two-book downward spiral in Spring '92, posting a fourthranked 9.0 in the Arbitron 12+ race. But with the arrival of new PD Joe Dawson in November of last year, this spring was a different story: KLYV jumped into a second-place tie with Country WJOD by scoring a 13.0.

Break With The Past

When he started, Dawson (who was recently named Group PD for station owner Communications Properties) listened to what KLYV previously sounded like and weighed the opinions of station staffers then did the exact opposite. "KLYV was a very sleepy station - an AC wannabe with Bette Midler, Michael Bolton, and Amy Grant as core artists, a four-hour power rotation, and a lot of gold. The people who still listened to KLYV perceived it as a bad CHR - the direction was way off. Everyone at KLYV kept telling me this is a conservative market and the people didn't like new music.

Facing a challenge not uncommon in markets Dubuque's size, Dawson had a "zero research budget, so I had to find out for myself what was going on [see 'Tracking The Actives With No Dough']. I

began reading the local paper. absorbed who was advertising what and, of course, the local news and events. When I got into it, there was an entirely different story. I went to the library and found that Dubuque is Iowa's voungest city. with a mean age of 26 8. It's heavily Catholic and consumes more beer

Total Package

While the music is important to KLYV's success, Dawson says, "Rather then spend time worrying about the music all day every day, we look at the station as a total entertainment package. As an industry, we're most guilty of not creating enough tune-ins. For starters, I suggest cross-promotion between dayparts. Our personalities are allowed to be themselves, which creates an element of surprise. They talk about the city and what goes on. They have the freedom to talk every other song, which allows for more music identification and relatability.

"The personalities are the glue that holds the station together. We're successful at targeting 18-34s because the staff lives the lifestyle and hangs out at places, businesses, and events the demo cares about. That's what they want to hear about on KLYV. If they don't like the package, they won't listen. And you've got to remember that you can't please everyone — in trying to do so, you'll please no one.

Promotion Nets \$\$\$

In terms of increased dollars for KLYV, Dawson explains what this successful ratings book means. "The previous book netted KLYV almost no national buys. Now that

we've regained our 18-34 numbers [tied for first with AC KATF] and doubled our 25-54s [No. 3], this book represents a story to tell on the streets locally and nationally. With strong adult numbers, we're not only growing in categories like beer, soft drinks, clothing, and entertainment, but we can now compete in the banking, department store, auto, and airline sectors. And with Full-Service AM WDBQ [6.8-9.3, No. 3 12+], we have a great combo to sell."

KLYV's primary on-air promotion during the spring book was "Hot Trip Hi/Low," in which a travel agency traded the trips for spots. Sales reaped a bonanza form the giveaway as well because of the promotion's mechanics: The contest was promoted each hour at :08 and callers were solicited going into the :35 stopset, and the extra attention generated by the contest allowed sales to sell that :35 break at a premium rate.

KLYV teamed with McDonalds for a bumper sticker campaign, with the traditional sticker-spotting giveaways and a sticker-back coupon tied into specials announced on the air. A scattering of billboards, some traded TV time with the local ABC affiliate, plus cable buys on CNN, USA, and ESPN to reach some out-of-format listeners, rounded out the spring media campaign promoting "K-Live 105, Dubuque's No. 1 radio station.'

Dawson believes the energy and excitement he's injected back into the music and presentation will serve the station well in ratings books to come.

Tracking The Actives With No Dough

elying on home-grown resources, KLYV PD Joe Dawson details how he stays on top of the market without the luxury of earmarked research funds.

"VP/GM Kevin Kelly has put together a computer program that allows us to take the pulse of the market almost like the old Birch surveys. We've got over 3000 names in the database, and our weekly survey helps find out cume impressions and attitudes toward our station and others in the

Dawson's survey asks:

- What are your favorite and second-favorite stations?
- What station do you listen to at work?
- What stations do you listen to at home?
- Has your favorite station changed over the last few weeks?

Is it better or worse?

"We don't ask any questions about music. If they like what you're doing, they like the music. The only music criteria I'm concerned with is if the single sells, the CD sells, and if the cut generates requests.

"If a cut can't generate activity in these areas after several weeks of airplay, it's toast. I don't buy into the prevailing CHR philosophy that songs must test well with passives. That's what got this station and the format into trouble. CHR is not perceived as a background format, and if we don't support listeners' new music expectations, they'll go away. It's like going to McDonalds and being told, 'No burgers, but we have pizza today.

'Positive black vibe,' newfound Hispanic weighting propel Orlando win

After several strong books, WJHM (102 JAMZ) became Orlando's No.1 station, with an 8.3-10.0 12+ jump in the Spring '93 Arbitron. Its closest competitor, Country WWKA, slipped 9.7-8.6 in the same period.

PD Duff Lindsey has been with the Beasley station since its inception. As he sees it, the only difference this book was that "the Hispanic weighting showed up, and we figure we got a good portion of that group statistic, which inflated our numbers into the double digits. We think they were there before, but we've never gotten credit for all our Latin listeners in the past.

"We've always gotten credit for all our black listeners, but the station's cume is about 30% black and 30% Hispanic. So the credit for our

Hispanic listenership this time pushed us ahead of the Country station."

WJHM held fast among older demos in the spring book. Among 18-34s, it moved up almost two points to score more than an 11



share and take second place (trailing CHR WXXL). Lindsey notes, "We're also No. 1 in teens and No. 2 18-34 and 18-49. That's a broader demo, but it shows that once you take the over-50s out of the mix, the station goes way up." The station is eighth among 25-54s in Orlando, a market with 21 stations above the line and 22 below it.

Honest, Accessible

"We came into the market five years ago saying we were going to be real honest and up-front about what the station is," says Lindsey. "We knew the buyers and the listeners would appreciate the station, because it's accessible to everyone. It certainly doesn't exclude non-blacks from its listenership, but we don't court any particular ethnic group — other than blacks, our target.

"We are extremely aggressive when we hit the streets. We feel we


should be on every buy that comes through this market, and we have the numbers to back that up, so we get the buys. It's just a matter of being honest with yourself and your businesspeople about who you are. Then it becomes a non-issue."

On-Air Mix Sells

WJHM has an interracial airstaff, but, as Lindsey notes, "Every time there's an opening here, it becomes harder to maintain that balance. It's not like your people are plugs or square pegs in round holes. It's whether these people complement each other, and whether the mix complements a broad spectrum of the listeners. I think we really have found a good balance for our air personality

"I've never been one to say, 'Oh, a white person has left, so we have to replace them with another white person.' I just put the best person into the available job. The black percentage of our total number of persons on the air has increased over the years because when we've had openings, those talents have been available and have fit the sound of the station

"I think we have a good mix. I very seldom hear any negatives from black listeners who think we have too many whites. Our white audience thinks we should have black announcers and a black vibe — or they wouldn't be listening to us. They want to hear a station that has a positive black vibe where they're just as welcome as everyone else."

Promo Profile

During the Spring '93 sweep, WJHM's main promotion was a recurring contest called "Beat The Bomb," in which callers played a waiting game with a ticking "bomb." Lindsey comments,

Specialty Programming


Lindsey concludes with a list of WJHM's specialty programming: "'The Thunderstorm' is a half-hour oldies-based lunchtime program that runs Monday through Friday. The 'Thunderstorm' dance mix, nightly from 10pm-midnight, has a much more current music presentation and a youthful appeal. We follow that with a 'Quiet Storm' program from midnight-4am. We have gospel on Sundays from 6am-9am."



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

END OF AN ERA

KLOL/Houston Bids Adieu To A Rock & Roll Ritual

Last Saturday (9/11), KLOL/Houston held its 10th and final - annual Rock & Roll Auction. Since its inception, the event has raised half a million dollars to benefit 10 different charities.


Auction director Doug Harris re-calls its origins: "On my first day at KLOL, I found a box of rock & roll memorabilia the station was saving for an auction. We held it at a mall record store; 200 people showed up, and we raised \$1300."

From those humble beginnings, the event grew to monstrous proportions. This year's auction - like the five that preceded it was held at Houston's Summit Arena, where celebrities like Robin Zander, Roger Glover, John Waite, Earl Slick, Ann & Nancy Wilson, Ian Moore, King's X, Slaughter's Blas Elias and Mark Slaughter, Jeff Watson (ex-Night Ranger), and Sass Jordan helped the station raise more than \$101,000, a new auction record.

So why would the station pull the plug on a promotion that's shown such incredible growth? "We felt sooner or later, the audience would tire of this particular activity.' Harris says, "and we wanted to go out with a bang.

"It's important that heritage AORs not lapse into this '25 years of Rock & Roll' business, serving up the same things over and over And before it got to the point of being a dinosaur, we wanted to retire the auction with the proper enthusiasm and get on with producing some other things. We want to stay fresh.

But Harris says he's learned a lot from the auction about the impor-



tance of event marketing. "It's a way to stay in touch with listeners and also sponsors, which has been an important aspect of the auction. Our position has always been to take a proactive role with clients. We go to them with a plan we explain what the station will be involved with and ask them to sponsor the official pace car or T-shirts or security. We take sales opportunities that might not be as exciting and make them more palatable for the audience. And we give the client a chance to be part of something really cool.

Animal Attraction

This year's beneficiary for the auction was the Stevens & Pruett Foundation For Children & Animals, a charity close to the hearts of its namesakes, KLOL morning men Mark Stevens and Jim Pruett. Harris notes, "When you have a morning show with their reputation, there aren't a lot of charitable activities these guys can support and appear sincere about. But this charity is a way of life for Jim, his family, and Mark.

"It's a working ranch that cares for abused and neglected farm and ranch animals. In Texas, there's a problem with horses who can no longer do the workload or are neglected or abused. They're usually put to sleep. The ranch rescues these animals and puts them up for sale or auction if possible, but most importantly - rehabilitates them. Phase two is to bring abused and neglected children out to care for the animals. It's really a wonderful pairing.

"Jim's been living on the ranch for a while, and he came to us and asked what the station could do to help. Over the years we've done different things, but this is the biggest and will have the most dramatic impact. The proceeds will go toward building the first lodge for the first 12 kids that will live there permanently."

The Sweet And Sour

Although the auction was a tremendous success, it left PD Ted Edwards with mixed feelings. "Let me be honest - and controversial. We greatly appreciate the cooperation we got. Most of the local and national record people have been very generous with their time, contributions, and with contact time with the bands. It's a very good example of the record and radio industries working hand-in-hand to accomplish something.

"At the same time, it raises an issue that becomes very bothersome in working with the recording industry. We're told week in and week out how integral we are to the

careers and development of the artists we work with. We're encouraged to exhibit our passion for music with airplay. But then getting people to put aside some of their free time to bring star quality to an event like the auction is equal to pulling teeth out of a wild boar.

"One band told us they thought what we were doing was too commercial and they didn't want to participate. They wouldn't even send us an auction item. To be told that our venture is too commercial when all the money goes to a charity strikes me as funny, especially since this band still charges for their records and concert tickets."

Edwards is also upset with what he perceives as formatic bias. "It's kind of infuriating to read about CHR stations that do promotions and get huge artists. Are we doing something wrong? Or is CHR doing something right? Or is it just the importance of that format over AOR in selling records?

"The auction has been really gratifying and kind of disturbing at the same time. The people that come in year after year - as well as this year's guests - have been really fabulous. For the Wilson sisters to play such a long set was really touching. All of our guests this year were wonderful to put some of their free time aside and hang with us. And we think we took





MIDWEST RECAP

Current Music Helps WHBC-FM

Mainstream AC WHBC-FM/Canton, OH and Hot AC WIOG/Saginaw, MI are in different stages of format evolution. Spring Arbitron results reveal both stations are on the right track.

Approximately three years have elapsed since "More Music/More Variety" WHBC-FM flipped from B/EZ to AC. This past sweep, the station was rewarded with No. 1 25-54 and 35-64 trophies

PD/morning man Mike Benson. who arrived one week before the start of the survey, credits the gains largely to attention paid to music flow and tempo. "The tendency had been for the station to be too soft for too long. In addition, playing lots of oldies in a row made us sound like a Gold station.

"We brought a little more life and personality to the station. There was also a higher profile and more promoting of the station."
Approximately 600 songs currently comprise WHBC-FM's base library.

Today's CHR

Benson arrived from AOR WROQ/Greenville, SC after several years away from AC. "My [desire] to return to programming [contributed] to the move to Canton. It's been about eight years since I programmed an AC, and it's been a little difficult readjusting to the fact that you can't offend people. You have to be outrageous without being blue.

"AC has become what CHR once was. We offer a good variety of contemporary music. Some ACs can now mix Dwight Yoakam and Dire Straits with mainstream

Aggressive Current List

Because he's usually unafraid to add new music right away, Benson has one of the format's more aggressive current playlists. WHBC-FM's typical format clock calls for

a minimum of four - and as many as eight - currents an hour, as well as two to four recurrents.

'We're responsible to the industry for keeping people interested in new product," he declares. "I pay attention to the Top 5 records in all other formats. If a record's strong enough and compatible with our sound, we might consider playing

In his first book, Benson boosted his station's morning drive 25-54 ranking from third (in Fall '92) to first. "The station had always been passive and music-intensive. There hadn't been much audience interaction or fun contests. [Once we started interacting], it really made a difference.

"My plan was to take us to No. 1 in mornings within 18 months. Our call letter heritage certainly helped, but everyone on staff was surprised by how quickly we made it. Our cume was good, and we gave people such good radio, they stayed with us."

Outside Factors

As Canton's lone metro AC, WHBC-FM faces format competition from Cleveland's WLTF, WDOK, and WQAL. It enjoys a nearly two-share 35-64 advantage over sister Full-Service outlet WHBC (AM) and Gold WZKL. "We try to superserve our core and just do good radio. We were pleasantly surprised in all [demos].

"WZKL held its own and stayed strong. We didn't take much [audience] from them. Most of our growth came from 'blocking' Canton listeners who might have 'escaped' to Cleveland or Akron stations. They found comfort in what we were doing."

Because Canton has no local TV outlets and relies on Cleveland stations, it's nearly impossible for local radio to promote itself on that medium. "We haven't researched the [effectiveness] of cable, but our company does a tremendous job with billboards. This spring, we used very little print.'

Stocking The Prizes

WHBC-FM's spring on-air contesting was very low-key. "Much of what we did was just smoke and mirrors," jokes Benson. "We don't give away cars or cash, so our lifestyle ticket giveaways were made to sound bigger than life.

'We've been stockpiling trips and electronics for the fall book There will be concert tickets and getaways, and we'll probably do a montage of daily giveaways between fall and Christmas."

WIOG/Saginaw, MI has followed a unique path to Hot AC. After years of mammoth 12+ numbers, the station had slipped to a 6.1 by the Winter '93 Arbitron. But springspring increases across the board have brought it up to No. 2 among 18-34s and 25-54s and fourth among 35-64s. It's No. 3 12+ with a 9.6 share.

'Over a period that ended in fall '91, WIOG was No. 1 for 17 [consecutive 12+] Arbitrons," recalls VP/GM John Casey. As an AOR. the station had regularly posted high numbers under consultant E. Alvin Davis. "But the market expanded and added several more signals which increased fragmentation. Suddenly, we had three AORs." WIOG adopted a CHR lean to combat erosion, but that tactic wasn't very effective.

The 30+ shares became a thing of the past, and last summer,

Casey summoned consultant Gary Berkowitz. "We tried being Adult CHR during the day and Dance

CHR at night, but it just didn't work," Casey says. "When a heritage station like ours goes through [market fragmentation], it's very demoralizing to see those numbers go down. [Former PD] Rick Belcher did a fantastic job of keeping people's spirits up during that period.

"Outside of a limited telemarketing campaign and some TV, we did very little outside advertising. By the first of this year, we were focusing on the music and our primary target - which is still 18-34 women.'

As a result of Booth American's corporate decision to have only onair programmers, Casey replaced Belcher with Jerry Noble, who arrived several weeks ago from WYSS/Sault Ste. Marie, MI.

WIOG's format challenge comes from Soft AC WGER, but Casey says, "We don't see ourselves competing with them. We don't want to veer too far to the other side."

PD/PM driver Noble adds, "WGER has attacked us on the air." but 'the more commotion, the more promotion.' We don't care what they say about us, so long as they keep talking about us."

According to Casey, much of WIOG's gains came at the expense of crosstown Gold outlet WHNN. 'It was strange, however, that the only cell we went down in was women 25-34, which is a very key area for us. We love our 25-54 numbers, but our goal is to own 25-34s and to be a solid No. 1 with 18-34 women.'

Casey accepts WIOG's older 35-64 numbers, but admits, "In this day and age, a station can't shoot that broadly. In a way, I'd rather see that 35-64 audience go to WGER, where it belongs.'

Because of Saginaw's rock orientation, Casey has worded WIOG's positioning statement to exclude only rap. "Many women in this market identify with rock music. We'd never say we don't play hard rock. [Instead], we promote that we play all the hits — without the

Noble comments, "Our audience is interested in current music, and we have a 50/50 current/noncurrent mix. There's a good balance of '80s and '90s songs to create a perception of variety, but rap is a negative to our listeners.

BIRTH OF A FORMAT

KCBQ Hoping To Rebound With Modern Oldies

KCBQ's call letters evoke much in San Diego's history of contemporary music. Recently, however, the station had fallen upon tough times as a Gold station and been overtaken by crosstown format foe KBZS.

So Compass Radio Group's KCBQ lured KBZS PD Rich Brother Robbin back to the station he programmed during its glory days as a contemporary station. He readied and refined a new format he devised three years ago while struggling as a first-time station owner in Tucson. "Modern Oldies" bowed on KCBQ the last weekend of July.

"Nobody would listen to me for five seconds about it," recalls Robbin. "It was the most frustrating period in my life. I was told it might be the next great radio format, but people wanted to see research. Since research costs money, I needed to find someone who'd fund the project."

Enter KCBQ, which expressed interest in Robbin's new concept. "They could clearly see that the hole for this format was gigantic, and we went with it. It's fortunate that this idea fell into the hands of [Compass President/CEO] Bob Hughes, who is a true radio maverick. Without his help, it might have been lost in the shuffle. He's the guy who deserves kudos for having courage, vision, and [a desire] to put fun back into radio."

Rediscovering Lost Oldies

Modern Oldies basically relies on lost oldies from the early '70s to 1985, what Robbin calls "the hot hits of the '70s and '80s."

He explains, "Most traditional Gold stations start with music from the late '50s and go to about 1971. Many of these stations make their formats work with 400 songs. We could make it work with 350-400 because the songs are twice as long. A long hour for a traditional Gold station contains 23 songs; a long hour for us has 15 songs."

The total number of songs in KCBQ's Modern Oldies library –

including those available for requests — is approximately 1000.

Robbin believes the new format should avoid songs that are more generic to other formats: "When you hear [Fontella Bass's] 'Rescue Me,' you know you're listening to a Gold station. While many Gold stations test and play [Gladys Knight & The Pips's] 'Midnight Train To Georgia,' it's more of an AC song — so let them have it.

"Modern Oldies will play extremely strong 'pop' songs that are no longer being played. The stations that *may* play them are very aggressive ACs, and for them, it's not their foundation — it's window dressing."

As for the format's core songs, Robbin remarks, [Elton John's] 'Philadelphia Freedom' is big, and Pilot's 'Magic' brings you to your knees. The format is a cross between an alligator and parrot. You don't know what it is, but when it talks, you listen."

No Narrowcasting

The reaction, Robbin is happy to say, has been overwhelming. "We're fun and we'll break your neck. When people call us, they babble about how great we sound. When a group of us listened to the first few hours, we were choked with emotion and couldn't talk.

"KCBQ has tremendous tempo, and there's great excitement from our [on-air talent]. Some people may think the musical pendulum swings a bit too wide, but that's the problem with today's radio. Everybody is narrowcasting, and the fun is gone — it's been taken out. [Other stations' announcers] are reading three-line [statements] about what their stations are or aren't."

Mr. Robbin's Wild Ride

Just six weeks have passed since Modern Oldies debuted, but copycats would seem to be inevitable. Robbin says, "A considerable amount of time and money has been invested so far, and we've uncovered and discarded a number of mistakes others don't need to make. The biggest mistake we almost made was an [improper] focus on music. Music research was expensive, because we had to test 1200 songs."

The time will soon come for Robbin to consider elements other than music. "Anybody doing this format

will have the luxury of shocking the audience for the first few months. But after the honeymoon's over, the station [must] marry the community.

"Stations are a theme park, and the music is a ride. It's a big ride, but only a ride. When a station relies totally on music, it never breaks into the mainstream and usually winds up with a three share."

Broad Appeal

Robbin doesn't envision KCBQ making an instant "worst-to-first" ratings leap. "We'll make a good [initial] jump and have several more fat increases to get us in the game very quickly. Our goal is to be No. 1, and we'll do everything possible to make that happen."

Robbin believes that, rather than taking a large chunk of audience from one station, Modern Oldies will take a little from several stations. "All my San Diego radio brethren will sacrifice a few coins to allow us to sit at the head table."

Label Debuts Slow In Last Quarter

Four artists debut as labels finish out year, gear up for '94

Only four new artists are set to debut by December. Here's what's in store productwise for the last quarter of

A Giant Debut

Giant/Nashville introduces Daron Norwood's debut single, "If It Wasn't For Her," in November. The Lubbock native has been performing since he was two. After high school he moved to Nashville and landed gigs playing piano with Jim Ed Brown, Shelly West, and Rex Allen Jr. The owner of Atlanta's Buckboard club heard Norwood's demo and invited him to play there, later giving him a regular slot. When Danny Davenport (who discovered Travis Tritt) heard Norwood, he alerted Giant/ Nashville President James Stroud, and Norwood was signed to the label.

More From Mercury

Mercury/Nashville will debut two new artists this fall. Bo "T." a Charlotte native who's spent years opening for acts such as Garth Brooks, K.T. Oslin, and Alabama, also hosts and produces his own hometown cable TV series. His first single, "The Cutting Edge Of Love," is set for release in late October.

Becky Williams's inaugural single is due in mid-November. The Salt Lake City resident has been playing to audiences since she was five. At 14, she cut and released her first independent record, which spent several weeks on the charts. Williams honed her performing skills opening for artists such as Steve Wariner and Gary Morris, and by 17 signed with Mercury/ Nashville.

Rolling Out At RCA

RCA/Nashville newcomer Jamie O' Hara spent several years as one-half of the O'Kanes duo. The Toledo native was an All-American halfback in high school and looked

forward to a football career until an injury forced him to change plans. He took up the guitar and two years later moved to Nashville, where he began writing. He hooked up with writer Kieran Kane, and the two recorded for CBS as the O'Kanes until they split in 1990. His first single, "What's A Good Ole Boy To Do," is slated for late October.

Other Label Activity

A number of labels not introducing new artists are still in the midst of working on records for artists who debuted last quarter.

WBCT's Signal For Success

320,000-watt outlet broadcasts 'most music' to Grand Rapids and beyond

In only three books, WBCT/Grand Rapids has become the market's No. 1 Country outlet. What's more, its 320,000 watts make it the most powerful FM in America.

Arbitron figures show WBCT edged the market's Country mainstay, WCUZ-FM, 7.6-7.3 12+ for top format honors. WBCT also beat 'CUZ-FM by almost two shares 25-54, while taking the 18-34 Country crown by more than seven points.

"Grand Rapids listeners who wanted a lot of country music weren't being served," says WBCT PD/MD Lee Cory. "WCUZ-FM was service- and informationoriented. We set out to be the 'most music' station and don't overload the air with a lot of informational

To secure the music image, WBCT debuted with 45-minute music sweeps and seven units an hour. Last June, it adopted a "20-in-arow" stance outside of morning drive. "Strategically, being musicintensive is our bread and butter,' says Cory. "We wanted to own the music image and didn't think any-one could get close to 20 in a row."

WBCT now implements "floating clocks": A five-unit spot break follows each 20-song sweep, regardless of when the sweep ends. In the future, Cory plans to solidify the position's impact by offering a "20-in-a-row guarantee.

Ballad Categories

WBCT's music mix is 80% current/recurrent. The remaining 20% is gold, which dates back about five years. The station plays mostly uptempo songs, which initially caused Cory some scheduling conflicts - many of the format's major hits are power

ballads. Consequently, he adopted hot clocks, which incorporate specific slots for ballads.

"I make sure the ballads are at least six positions apart in the clock," Cory notes. "Those are the only times ballads will play. If a [non-movable] current ballad is scheduled, the scheduling software automatically selects a title from my 'fall-back' category and schedules a medium or uptempo record."

Artist separation has been shortened, too. As Cory explains, "I loosened it up to 45 minutes. Most Country stations' [separations] run 60-75 minutes. If most PDs took a hard look at their TSL, they'd find 45 minutes is just fine - especially in drive times.

WBCT's emphasis on music carries over to its promotional philosophy. "Every promotion we do is somehow tied to country music," states Cory. "We've done about 30 concerts during the past year to establish WBCT as the concert station. Our signal allows us to be the host station for concerts in a number of markets - many in cities a normal Grand Rapids station couldn't even think about going."

Still, a huge signal has its negative aspects. For instance, programming WBCT is like programming a TV station - it attempts to serve such a large area. And although WBCT provides temperatures for Kalamazoo, Battle Creek. Muskegon, etc., it often finds itself having to issue severe weather warnings to people who live 21/2 hours from Grand Rapids. "It's something we feel we have to do," says Cory.

The signal poses other interesting challenges. For example, weekend remotes often originate from towns located more than two hours out of Grand Rapids. That, of


The station also has a statewide, toll-free phone number for requests; it fields 15,000-20,000 calls per month. Meanwhile, 'BCT does no traffic reports. "Luckily, Grand Rapids doesn't have much of a traffic problem," jokes Cory.

In addition, the station gets many requests from outside community charities. "That's difficult to deal with," says Cory. "We want to help everybody. But we're a Grand Rapids radio station that's where we live and want to be, even though we serve other areas.'

Talent Pool

Cory also credits the station's success to its talent: morning team Neal Dionne and Reese Rickards, middayer Kelly Iris, afternoon personality Dave Conrad, evening talent Den Vogol, and overnighter Matt Fisher.

"We made a conscious effort to hire top professionals," says Cory. We refer to our audience as the 'listener family' and take a very '90s, personable, hip approach. Even though we're uptempo, we don't use a CHR-type jock approach. CHR is a short-TSL format by design. It doesn't need the kind of restrictions forced by jocks who talk at people - not to them. SMALL-MARKET SUCCESS STORY

The Wizard's Magical Debut

Dr. Michael Brooks wanted a progressive station like WXRT/Chicago. So he bought a station in Lafayette, IN, dubbed it WIIZ (The Wizard), and signed it on six months ago. When the audience favored the New Rock end of the musical spectrum, however, the Wizard adjusted and went on to score an impressive spring debut.

Though it came on-air just a couple weeks before the start of the Spring '93 book, the Wizard cast a spell with a 5.6 12+ debut. It ranked fifth among 18-34s with nearly a 10 share and tied for se cond among men 18-34, trailing only Classic Rock WKHY and WFBQ (Indianapolis).

"The two stations that dropped significantly were WKHY and [AC] WGLM," notes Asst. PD Elizabeth Daubel. "We took nearly half of WKHY's numbers, and WGLM lost about 30% of their previous numbers. I know this format attracts many non-radio listeners, so I'm not going to say we stole their audience, but they sure did lose."

In the Spring '93 book, 'KHY lost six and a half shares 12+, while 'GLM dropped more than four shares. In persons 18-34, 'KHY fell 7.7 shares — plummeting below its longtime 20 share. 'GLM slipped 1.5 shares.

'Unlimited Radio'

The Wizard began with only 150 CDs. "Now we have probably 2000 CDs," says Daubel. "Originally, we were much closer to an 'XRT style. We found out two and a half months in that New Rock worked better than progressive or blues. The progressive and blues music wasn't what people seemed to fall in love with.

"We like to describe the music as 'unlimited radio.' We target all

listeners. We lean more toward the rock end. It's the sound that people in the Midwest enjoy. We're conscious of it not being too male or female. We're careful to watch how much of one sound we play.

"It's New Rock with progressive and classic artist touches, but it's not Classic Rock. If we're going to play the new artists, we need to have respect for their heritage. I don't think it's a leap of faith to play the Doors or Jimi Hendrix when we're playing new artists who cite them as influences. Not showing respect for these artists is short changing the format.

"Twenty percent of the adds each week are upper-demosounding records. Any record we add is treated like any other song. We won't daypart John Wesley Harding, the Story, John Hiatt, or Melissa Etheridge. We're selective with the upper-demo music where we're confident they can be 24-hour songs.

"Most of our heavy rotation artists are depth records — U2, Matthew Sweet, Midnight Oil, and Paul Westerberg. We'll earmark two or three songs and let the DJ choose which track to play. We allow the DJs the same freedom with our gold category. They can play a different Joe Jackson or Elvis Costello song if it blends better."

In WIIZ's transition from progressive to New Rock, blues was the only musical casualty. "We realized that Chicago is a blues town, and we're not," Daubel says. "'XRT has groomed its listeners for a legacy amount of time. We now have a specialty blues show on Sunday nights — it fills the niche more effectively.

"We play the more aggressive music weeknights from 11pm-midnight, which we call the 'Hour Of Power.' We play techno, industrial, rap, and harder-edged old and new music. It gives people what they crave without having the entire evening infiltrated with it."

Musical Education

Daubel and PD Buzz Fitzgerald have focused heavily on grooming their air talents and audience. "We've focused heavily on educating the DJs about the music," Daubel explains. "All of them have come from other formats. We give each one all the bios from the new bands, and they're responsible for reading them to get their information level up on the music. We also keep "The Trouser Press [Record Guide]" and a music thesaurus in the studio.

"I put cheat sheets inside the jewel cases of a lot of new CDs. For example: This band is on tour now. They're going to be on Letterman. This song is actually about . . . This is a remake of . . . When it seems like it's been said enough, I pull it and put something else in. We tell them the best way to learn is to read the trades and liner notes. Bit by bit,

Long-Term Marketing

Though it's kept a low promotional profile, WIIZ (The Wizard) has blitzed Lafayette, IN with outdoor advertising.

Asst PD **Elizabeth Daubel** says, "We don't have a big budget — everything we do is looked at as a long-term thing. Everywhere we've spent money, it's been visible and long-lasting."

"We put 15 billboards up when we signed on. We've moved some for better positioning, but now we have our permanent locations for a year. This is a competitive market for outdoor advertising, especially during the ratings period.

"We're renting a bus from the city. We pay a monthly fee of \$1000 to use it. It's purple with our logo on it, along with pictures of some of our staple high-visibility artists. It's a travelling billboard for us that runs almost 24 hours a day. There's advertising space on the back of the bus that we sell too."

The Wizard will adopt a new promotional vehicle in a matter of weeks: a '72 Cadillac hearse, which the station plans to purchase. "This vehicle will be highly

visible — a billboard for us wherever we go — and we own it," says Daubel.

WIIZ has done just one print ad:
"We ran an ad in the [Purdue]
university newspaper in an issue
they mail home to the kids over the
summer," Daubel explains. "The ad
featured a sampling of artists we
play — from the Red Hot Chili Peppers to the Velvet Underground to
the Beatles. We also listed artists
like L7, Pere Ubu, and Ethyl
Meatplow. We wanted to show
how diverse we are and list stuff the
kids might not know about. The last
line of the ad states, 'Absolutely no
Michael Bolton whatsoever.'

"We've just been trying to bring the music to the community and get them acclimated to it. We did three small shows during the book. We've taken a friendly, grass-roots approach. We sent people to Lollapalooza, but we've made a lot more friends with the smaller things we've done."

you start to learn a whole legacy

"We're trying to maintain a music-friendly on-air image — making ourselves very accessible as far as informing people about the music. Our goal over the summer was to make friends in the community with Lafayette proper.

"Now the [Purdue University] students are back, and we'll be active on campus this fall. They were around for just a short time after we signed on. We planted a seed in their mind that we were here, and then we had the whole summer to fine-tune and get real internal. Now we have 30,000 more potential listeners."
