Clinton, Talk Hosts Berate Each Other Over Bombing

Officials insist Limbaugh was not a target

Not since FDR's "Fireside Chats" has an incumbent president done so much for radio: In the aftermath of last week's Oklahoma City bombing, President Clinton Monday (4/24) lashed out at what he called "loud and angry voices" on the airwaves that "try to keep some people as paranoid as possible." That set talk hosts howl-

ing and phone lines blinking through the rest of the week.

Although presidential aides flatly denied it, some mainstream media identified the implied targets as Rush Limbaugh and other conservative talk show hosts. With the critical spotlight focused on Talk radio, many hosts went on the defensive.

Oklahoma City Radio Still Not Back To Normal

A week after the appalling tragedy that befell Oklahoma City, radio managers admit it's been difficult trying to restore some degree of normalcy in their lives or at their stations while rescue workers continue to search for victims of last Wednesday's terrorist bombing. Yet through it all, the city's stations worked hard to provide information and comfort to their listeners.

"It's not anywhere close to being back to normal," observed Miles Chandler, GM of Clear Channel's N/T KTOK-AM, Country KEBC-FM, and CHR KJYO-FM. "They still have not gotten to where they expect to find a lot of bodies. Once they find them and have all the funerals, then maybe it will be all over."

Chandler said life over the last week has been a blur to most of his staff. "We have 130 employees — we're bound to have people directly affected. Staff members have friends and neighbors who are still missing." A close neighbor of Chandler's

was one of the first casualties discovered.

Urban KVSP-AM was hit hard by the blast. Morning co-host Carla Wade lost her father, a civil engineer who worked in the building; and PD Darnell Swift's 18-month-old nephew was killed (though the victim's sister and mother survived).

KATT-FM PD Chris Baker said his station is still trying to resume regular programming. "But it's tough considering what's going on in the city. We still haven't done any outside promotions or self-promos since last Wednesday ... the best thing we can do is to use that time to promote what's going on with the needs of the rescue efforts."

'Like A Sonic Boom'

Though most of Oklahoma City's stations are situated miles from the bombed building, all of the radio people contacted felt the shock waves.

"Our station is about four or five miles north of downtown and not close enough for any-

one to be injured by flying glass," KYIS-FM PD Brenda Bennett said. "I was about 10 miles away when it hap-

Radio Everywhere Pitched In For Oklahoma Relief

It's not unusual for radio stations around the country to pitch in following a disaster of some sort, but the industry's reaction to the Oklahoma City bombing was unprecedented in its immediacy and volume of response.

Stations of all musical stripes in all regions interrupted their formats in favor of news updates, listener phone calls, blood drives, and appeals for donations. Among the many highlights:



White House In Opposition To Some Dereg Proposals

The White House late last week sent Senate leaders a list of concerns about Sen. **Larry Pressler's** (R-SD) telecom bill. While the document primarily dealt with telephone and cable issues, some broadcast provisions came into question:

- The Clinton administration objects to extending radio license terms from seven to 10 years and eliminating opportunities for comparative hearings if incumbent broadcasters are in basic compliance with FCC rules. "These provisions seriously weaken the FCC's ability to enforce a broadcaster's obligation to provide service in the public interest," the White House memo said.

- Although the list is mum on radio ownership (as was the version of the Pressler bill approved by the Senate Commerce Committee), the administration strongly objects to raising TV ownership limits and eliminating the TV-cable cross-ownership ban. Those issues, it says, should be left to the FCC.

Vote Delayed

The Senate, which returned to Washington this week, had been expected to vote on the bill as early as next week. But the vote may be delayed by several weeks while the lawmakers take up the issue of anti-terrorism legislation following last week's Oklahoma City bombing.

Commerce Committee members have been working behind the scenes on an amendment to eliminate or relax ownership rules for radio. Sponsors of the amendment include Sens. **Trent Lott** (R-MS),

KLSX Launches Battle With Hispanic Group Over Stern

■ At least 40 Dallas complaints logged at FCC

KLSX-FM/Los Angeles GM **Bob Moore** is aggressively combating a **Howard Stern**-inspired advertiser boycott by the Los Angeles-based **National Hispanic Media Coalition** (R&R 4/21). In an announcement that started airing Tuesday (4/25), Moore told listeners to "turn the radio off" if they don't like what they hear, rather than boycott his advertisers.

The Hispanic group became irate after hearing Stern talk about slain Tejano star **Selena**. On the day of her funeral (4/3), Stern played her music to the accompaniment of gunshot sounds and made inflammatory comments about her and her fans.

The group, along with other Hispanic organizations, then began a

Minority Radio Station Buyers: Funding Is Available

NEW YORK — Racism isn't going away. But it's still possible for minorities to buy radio stations.

That was the good news/bad news declared during an NTIA-sponsored seminar (4/19) on minority financing and capital development. NTIA Administrator **Larry Irving** used the session at New

York Law School to unveil a government study that concluded white entrepreneurs are more likely to receive loans than minority applicants with the same education and qualifications.

'Get Around' Racism

Irving pledged the **Clinton** administration will do more to encourage minority ownership, despite the recent repeal of the **FCC's** Minority Tax Certificate program. But with affirmative action under review at the White House and under attack

on Capitol Hill, Irving refused to say what might be done to help minority station buyers.

KGFJ-AM/Los Angeles President/**GM William Shearer** told attendees that racism isn't going away. But he insisted that African-American entrepreneurs can "get around" racism, even without minority tax certificates, and find fi-

ancing for deals that make business sense.

Financial panelists **Donald Green** of **Connecticut Green Ventures** and **Eric Von Hendrix** of **GE Capital** agreed that they and other funding sources have plenty of money available to fund minority purchases. "The difficulty has been finding good deals," Von Hendrix said.

Most Radio Groups Post Gains

Clear Channel Communications (NYSE: CCU) reported first-quarter net income of \$2.7 million (15 cents per share), up from \$2.0 million (12 cents) a year ago. Gross revenues were \$58.6 million, up from \$38.9 million. After-tax cash flow was \$11.1 million (63 cents), up from \$7.5 million (44 cents).

During the quarter, Clear Channel announced its first international acquisition. The company will pay approximately \$75 million for a 50% stake in **Australian Radio Network Limited**, which will own nine radio stations in Australia. That deal is expected to close by the end of the second quarter.

Clear Channel owns 35 radio stations, three state radio networks, and nine TV stations.

Capital Cities/ABC (NYSE: CCB) announced first-quarter net income of \$157.8 million (\$1.02 per share), up from \$116.1 million (76 cents). Net revenues were \$1.61 billion, up from \$1.40 billion. Broadcast revenues were \$1.33 billion, up from \$1.14 billion. Broadcast operating income was \$226.9 million, up from \$197.3 million. The company said radio revenues "increased moderately."

Capital Cities/ABC owns 21 radio stations, **ABC Radio Networks**, eight TV stations, **ABC Television Network**, **ESPN**, and publishing interests.

EZ Communications (Nasdaq: EZCIA) reported a first-quarter net loss of \$593,000 (seven cents per share), compared to net income of \$125,000 (one cent) a year ago. Gross revenues were \$18.7 million, up from \$14.1 million.

Broadcast-cash flow was \$4.3 million, up from \$3.8 million.

EZ Communications owns 18 radio stations.

Jacor Communications (Nasdaq: JCOR) reported first-quarter net income of \$751,000 (four cents per share), compared to a loss of \$220,000 (one cent) a year ago. Revenues were \$26.8 million, up from \$22 million. Broadcast cash flow was \$4.1 million, up from \$2.6 million. On a same-stations basis, cash flow was up 54%.

Jacor owns 15 radio stations and is buying **WPPT-FM/Cincinnati**.

Citicasters (Nasdaq: CITI) posted first-quarter earnings of \$1.3 million (14 cents per share), compared to a loss of \$1.8 million (15 cents) a year ago. Net revenues were \$29 million, down from \$48.4 million. Operating cash flow was \$8 million, down from \$14.2 million.

On a same-stations basis — adjusted for the sale of most of its TV group — Citicasters said its earnings were an improvement from a loss of \$800,000 (seven cents) a year ago on revenues of \$26.9 million and operating income of \$2.5 million.

Citicasters also announced a three-for-two stock split, effective for shareholders at the close of business May 4.

Citicasters owns 11 radio stations, is buying **KKCW-FM/Portland, OR**, and owns two TV stations.

Hefel Broadcasting (Nasdaq: HBCCA) announced a net loss of \$849,000 (eight cents) for its fiscal second quarter ended

Broadcasters Exempted In House Performance Rights Bill

DAB would be exempted from royalty payments under a performance rights bill (H.R. 1506) introduced by House Intellectual Property Subcommittee Chairman Rep. **Carlos Moorhead** (R-CA).

The exemption for broadcasters, when the industry moves to digital delivery, is similar to one included in a Senate bill introduced earlier. And it won Moorhead praise from **NAB**, which had often been at odds with the previous chairman, Rep. **William Hughes** (D-NJ), who retired last year.

"Your legislation correctly focuses the attention where proponents of this bill believe it should be — at those business

interests that could endanger the retail sale of prerecorded music," NAB President **Eddie Fritts** said in a letter to Moorhead.

Under Moorhead's bill, digital performance rights would apply only to subscription-supported digital satellite radio, cable, and future home direct-delivery digital audio.

CD Radio Systems President **Robert Briskman**, whose company has proposed a subscription satellite service, said the bill "has merit." But he complained that it unfairly singles out satellite radio and "doesn't really address the major part of the inequity" — meaning traditional broadcasters.

Hearings are tentatively set for May 17 and 18.

Record Highs For Merger Partners

Wall Street traders have added their blessings to the FCC's approval of **Evergreen Media's** (Nasdaq: EVGM) deal to acquire **Broadcasting Partners Inc.** (Nasdaq: BPIX).

Both stocks hit record highs last week, following the FCC's recent action to approve the sale and allow Evergreen an unprecedented waiver to own four FMs in Chicago for up to a year. Evergreen rose even higher Tuesday (4/25) to \$19; BPIX was at \$20.25, 13 cents below its high.

First Boston analyst **Harry DeMott** said he upgraded his recommendation to "buy" after the FCC approval and added that Evergreen also received a boost from new sports rights deals in Chicago to air the White Sox and Bulls.





Is Park Communications Still In Play?

A surprise late bid could top a pending deal to sell **Park Communications** (Nasdaq: PARC) for \$711.4 million.

Shareholders are scheduled to vote May 11 on the deal, announced last October, to sell the radio/TV/newspaper company to **Park Acquisitions Inc.**, a new firm headed by investors **Donald Tomlin** and **Gary Knapp**. But Park Communications told the SEC last week that it had been notified by an unnamed individual who intended to submit a "superior acquisition proposal" by Monday (4/24).

Who's In The Race?

Based on descriptive terms in the SEC filing, the late bidder appears to be **David Lampel**, an African-American businessman who had claimed he was shut out of the formal round of bidding because of his race — an allegation that was denied by Park Communications and its financial advisor, **Goldman, Sachs & Co.**

There was no word at R&R's Tuesday deadline (4/25) on whether a bid had been submitted. Company officials referred R&R to their attorney, who didn't return telephone calls. Lampel also didn't respond to messages left on his answering machine.

H&D Draws \$15 Million Bid

Bidders with deeper pockets have until May 17 to top a bid of \$15.3 million by **Bill Sherard** and **Rick Zitelman** for the eight-station **H&D Communications** group.

Sherard's and Zitelman's **Spring Broadcasting** was the top bidder in a sale that drew 25 bids for some or all of the stations. But under procedures set by the Boston federal court that placed H&D in receivership, the unsuccessful bidders — or anyone else — have until May 17 to beat the Spring bid by at least \$325,000.

Broker **Randall Jeffery** is handling the sale for his **Media Venture Partners** associate **Charles Giddens**, who is the court-appointed receiver.

March 31, compared to net income of \$63,000 (one cent) a year ago. Revenues were \$13.6 million, up from \$4.1 million. Broadcast cash flow was \$3.1 million, up from \$1.6 million.

On a pro-forma basis, Hefel said revenues for its current roster of stations rose to \$13.6 million from \$12.6 million and cash flow rose to \$3.1 million from \$2.5 million.

Hefel owns 13 radio stations and is buying **WOPA-AM/Chicago.**

Katz Media Group (AMEX: KTZ), in its first earnings report since its public stock offering, posted a first-quarter net loss of \$1.5 million (17 cents per share), compared to a loss of \$5.3 million (no comparable per share data) a year ago. Net operating revenues were \$39.1 million, up from \$35.4 million.

Katz Media Group owns five radio rep firms and two TV rep firms.

Westinghouse Electric Corp.

(NYSE: WX) reported first-quarter net income applicable to common stock of \$2 million (one cent per share), down from \$23 million (seven cents). Revenues were \$2.02 billion, up from \$1.74 billion. Broadcasting operating profits were \$35 million, up from \$33.7 million.

Westinghouse's **Group W Broadcasting** subsidiary owns 61 radio stations, is buying two others, and owns five TV stations.

Heritage Media (AMEX: HTG)

posted first-quarter net income of \$1.5 million (eight cents per share), compared to a loss of \$604,000 (four cents) a year ago. Revenues were \$83.3 million, up from \$65.3 million. Operating cash flow was up 21% to \$17.9 million.

Heritage Media owns 15 radio stations, eight TV stations, and the nation's largest in-store marketing company.



boycott of companies that advertise on the Stern program.

Listeners React

In the announcement, Moore solicits listener support: "I'd like to know what you think about someone else trying to silence a voice they disagree with." That is followed by the Hispanic Media Coalition's phone number.

According to coalition spokeswoman Nancy Mendez, 18 calls were recorded on the group's answering machine shortly after Moore's message began airing. Several of the

calls were laced with profanity and racial remarks, she noted, and two calls sided with the coalition.

If Moore really wants to know what his listeners think, Mendez said, he should have given out the station's number, not the coalition's.

Picket Successful

Coalition Chairman Alex Nogales said his group is continuing to boycott advertisers in Los Angeles and across the country. He said his group was successful in getting *Sit 'n Sleep Mattresses* of Culver City, CA, to pull its ads from Stern's program after about 150 protesters picketed the store Thursday (4/20) and Saturday (4/22).

The company had advertised on Stern's show the past four years, Nogales said. *Sit 'n Sleep* President Larry Miller declined comment, as did KLSX's Moore.

As of Tuesday (4/25), KEGF-FM/Dallas listeners alone had sent the FCC at least 40 complaints about Stern; FCC staffers didn't have tallies available for other stations airing Stern's show.

Nogales said his group plans to file official complaints when Stern affiliates' licenses come up for renewal. He has sent about 40 copies of a tape of Stern's comments about Selena to community leaders, media outlets, and select FCC officials. "It isn't enough to just file complaints," he said.

Ostroff Upped To MCA Sr. VP Post



pened, and it felt like a sonic boom or incredible thunder. The doors were shaking, and I didn't know what was happening."

Stations swung into action last Wednesday within seconds of the explosion. KTOK reporter Carrie Hulsey was just a half-block away, en route to a federal court, when she grabbed her two-way radio and interrupted programming to describe what she just felt. Soon after, the reports were simulcast on co-owned KEBC and KJYO.

Things became complicated at Clear Channel's studios when a bomb threat was phoned in later in the day — the FBI has offices in the same building — and the place was evacuated. A sufficient number of staffers to keep the three stations going managed to remain in the building.

Bennett said a KYIS promotion was in progress when the blast hit. "An entire fire department division happened to be at the promotion. They all instantly knew there was something terribly wrong, and they were out of there."

Tremendous Impact

At KMGL-FM, GM Rob Adair reported, "We left the AC world and became a terrific News/Talk radio for 24 hours. I was in News/Talk radio for 12 years, and I'm amazed at how our air personalities became great news anchors. I'm very proud of our gang."

Although his station is six miles north of the blast, Adair said, "We didn't just feel it — we thought a plane crashed in the yard. It was just phenomenal. If you went downtown to see this building, you'd think the [impact] would have been felt in neighboring states. I've never seen anything like it."

Steve English, PD of NAC KTNT-FM, said he turned to his news director after the blast and remarked, "Maybe we should look outside and see if there's a mushroom cloud," because it was such a huge explosion. "Moments later we learned what happened."

Although most of the other market's stations dropped format and commercials to air breaking news, English decided to stick with his station's format, punctuated by periodic news updates. "We stayed with our 40-minute music sets. We generally maintained our regular format, and we got a lot of positive calls from listeners thanking us."

Call-Ins Welcomed

In the hours following the explosion, many stations began encouraging listeners to phone in and express their feelings. KTOK host Carol Arnold took calls on an open line, and ND Jerry Bohnen stayed on the air until 1am.

"We opened the phones up, and our listeners immediately vented," remarked KATT & KYIS GM Larry Bastida. "We also had a lot of calls from listeners who expressed appreciation for our coverage."

Even Religious KQCV-AM & KNLT-FM took calls. "We've had a tremendous response from people," GM Robin Jones said. "Everyone wants to know, 'Why does God let this happen?'"

Bennett said some of the calls to KYIS have been very dramatic. "The nurse who assisted in amputating a

person's leg called, and we heard from someone who lost his wife and two children in the day-care center. Then we heard from a woman talking about her twin boys who survived. There were horrible stories and wonderful ones at the same time."

Many of the city's stations aired last Sunday's emotional memorial service attended by President Clinton and the Rev. Billy Graham.

Relief Efforts Continue

While many stations are slowly moving back to their regular formats, most continue with various relief efforts. Market-leading KXXY-AM & FM edited Alabama's "Angels Among Us" to insert messages phoned in to the station from artists, including Okies Reba McEntire, Ronnie Dunn, Garth Brooks, Vince Gill, and Pam Tillis, among others.

KATT is pressing a CD with local artists' versions of Live's "Lightning Crashes" and Eric Clapton's "Tears In Heaven," interspersed with comments from the memorial service.

Baker said the city's greatest concern is currently focused on the rescue workers. "They're going through a lot of leather gloves, steel-toed boots, and other clothing because of the condition of the building, so we're trying to keep a continuous supply for them."

"Our night guy, Greg Zoobeck, found out that many of the firemen and rescue workers didn't have opportunities to obtain cigarettes and smokeless tobacco between shifts, so he got on the air and made the appeal. Within an hour, the workers had more than they will ever use. Another listener and his son brought their TV and Nintendo system down to where the workers are staying, and gave it to them so they wouldn't be bored between shifts."

Taking Stock

Perhaps like many Oklahomans, many of the radio executives said they've spent some time over the last few days expressing thanks for their own health, as well as appreciation to be in a community that responded so well to the disaster.

"I was supposed to have been downtown at Children's Hospital last Wednesday because my daughter is getting treatments there, but I postponed it one day," recalled KJYO PD Mike McCoy. "That really makes me feel like someone was looking over me!"


"It's an enormous story," said Jim Palmer, ND of Sports/Talk WKY-AM. "It's one that has affected us emotionally and professionally. There are so many little developments, from the rescue to the investigation to the identification of the victims. It goes on and on and on."

Baker expressed his appreciation to his radio industry colleagues for their relief efforts and words of encouragement. "Thanks to everyone all over for their support. I've heard from many friends in the radio and record communities — some I haven't heard from in 10 or 15 years. We thank everyone for their prayers."

Limbaugh criticized newspapers and TV programs for reporting that Clinton had aimed his attack at talk radio hosts such as himself. Limbaugh, however, went out of his way to applaud the *New York Times* — regarded by Limbaugh and other conservatives as one of the bastions of the "liberal media elite" — for "accurately reporting" that Clinton aides denied the president was targeting a particular program.

Rush Satisfied?

Limbaugh offered somewhat of an olive branch to the administration: "I would like to take this opportunity to do what I can — however much or however little it is — to offer a bit of calm in this whole situation and to accept the words of the [president's] spokesmen when they say these comments were not directed at me."

He noted that right-wing extremist groups — some of whom have their own programs on shortwave or small-market stations — have attacked him for being too liberal.

Limbaugh also denied trying to make political hay from the tragedy. "I can't speak for all of Talk radio, and I never intend to," Limbaugh said. "But I can tell you that I studiously and purposely avoided any political reference to this [bombing] whatsoever — any attempt to forge the advancement of my particular political views. But the president threw that to the wind on Sunday night and then on Monday and began this approach of divisiveness, and I'm happy to see now that the White House is rushing in and saying, 'Wait a minute, the president was not talking about Rush Limbaugh here.'"

North Miffed

Failed senatorial candidate-turned-talk host **Oliver North** saw the president's remarks as a definite attack on Talk radio. "There is not a more vociferous, articulate critic of the administration than me," he said. "But I actually commended the president for his handling of the Oklahoma City bombing — and this is the paycheck I get."

North challenged Clinton to name names if he really believes what he says: "Don't paint people with such broad brush strokes."

North further criticized the Clinton administration for turning tragedy into a political advantage. "When you couple that [President Clinton's remarks] with the president's talk about a 'minor departure from our civil liberties tradition,' it's downright scary," he said.

\$100,000 Challenge

The **Media Research Center**, an Alexandria, VA-based conservative media watchdog group, has offered to donate \$100,000 to Clinton's favorite charity if he can name one national radio talk show host advocating terrorism. "Bill Clinton and his allies in the media are doing a terrible disservice to the memory of the victims of the Oklahoma City bombing by trying to score cheap political points," said Chairman **L. Brent Bozell**.

The *New York Post* reported that accused Oklahoma City bomber **Timothy McVeigh** was a fan of **William Cooper**, whose program airs

nightly on **Worldwide Christian Radio** (a Nashville-based shortwave station). In addition to Cooper, WCR airs a program featuring **Mark Koerneke**, head of the **Michigan Militia**. News reports said McVeigh had attended Michigan Militia meetings, but group officials denied knowing him.

Infinity syndicated talker **G. Gordon Liddy** said talk show hosts who preach conservative views should not rein in their banter. In a news conference aired live on his Tuesday show, Liddy denied there was any conspiracy to fire up fringe groups. He suggested that if President Clinton blames Talk radio for the Oklahoma blast, the president should wait for the trial. "Let's see if the evidence says, 'We blew up this building because talk show hosts told us to do it or inflamed our passions.'"

Liddy reprised a comment that drew controversy last fall, when he counseled listeners to "shoot an attacking ATF agent in the head" because he might be wearing bulletproof vests over his chest. At the news conference, he said to instead "go twice for the body, then the groin."

As for the danger of militia groups, Liddy advised the public not to worry: "I know some of the militia people; they are fine people. I don't think they are dangerous at all."

In response to the controversy, **KCKC/Riverside** announced it was cancelling Liddy's show. "We believe we are entering an era where we need to embrace greater understanding and compassion rather than foster or encourage extremist action," the station said in a statement.

WCKY/Cincinnati admitted it's received negative calls about Liddy and said it will allow listeners to decide whether to keep him or lose him via a telephone poll.

'Tri-Lateral Paranoids'

On the flip side of the Talk radio coin, liberal talk host **Ellen Ratner** said the president wasn't talking about Rush Limbaugh at all. "That's BS. The president was talking about people who stir up hate. Limbaugh stirs up dissatisfaction. [Clinton] was talking about what I call the 'tri-lateral paranoids.' He's going after people like **Bo Gritz** and **Chuck Harder**."

Westwood One national talker **Tom Leykis** also supported the president's position.

Gritz, a **Talk America Network** host, told **ABC-TV's** "20/20" last week the planning and execution of the bombing was like a "Rembrandt painting."

Meanwhile, **Harder's People's Radio Network** hired former FCC General Counsel **Bruce Fein** to investigate what Harder termed "reckless smears" following the Oklahoma bombing. "We will do all that is necessary to make sure that anyone who falsely pulls us or our affiliates into the reckless whirlwind are held fully accountable," Harder said in a statement.

Records, the pop music label, but he is not responsible for country or black music. **Lenny Waronker**, who is expected to leave, is President of **Warner Bros. Records Inc.**, the parent company.

Speaking with **R&R**, Baker stressed "respect for the artists" and his determination to continue in the spirit of former Chairman/CEO **Mo Ostin** and Waronker. "This was the most creative environment to work in in the music business, one of the great places to work. I was brought up under those people, and I totally believe their philosophy works."

"There are a lot of bands we want to break already on the label, and there are a lot of bands I want to sign."

"We are two medium-size companies now, instead of one large one. We're so much more focused, and things don't slip by as easily: We cover tours better, the radio situation, the press situation, all of it. We have more time to think, and we can continue marketing bands over a longer period of time. Not everybody has the same rate of growth, and the creative process takes time. I want to be there for artists on all the different levels."

Reprise Revamp

Goldberg also stated, "From his days on the San Francisco underground scene through his incredible successes at **Sire**, **Howie** has established an unparalleled reputation as an executive who not only takes risks, but has the experience and ability to make those risks pay off. By the same token, **Reprise** has always been about the new and unexpected. [They're] a perfect match."

Klein told **R&R** about some of the changes he's planned. The roster will be smaller to ensure that every band "gets a shot." Don't expect **Reprise** to engage in signing wars for hot new acts, but do expect to see the label's A&R people more integrated into the marketing and planning meetings.

Klein noted, "It's the toughest thing in the world when you've got three good records, and you're trying to work them all at the same time. You get three adds each— maybe if you'd gotten seven adds on one band it would give you much more of a story."

Because of alternative's dramatic growth, he plans to add a national promotion person by boosting **Reprise** New York local **Bob Divney** to an East Coast-based national post in the next few weeks.

New Development

VP/Director Contemporary Music **Craig Kostich** has just been promoted to Sr. VP in charge of a new department, according to Klein. "We've abolished the Product Management department. Something about the name made me nauseous — what a way to talk about our artists and their music ... as 'product.'"

"We've put together something called 'Artist Development & Special Marketing,' so we'll have marketing specialists to work with the bands. We'll have more people doing that so we're not 100% dependent on radio. We have some great artists who might not fit radio at the moment, although maybe in four or five years, they'll be perfect for it."

Tracing The Ascents

Baker worked at **Epic** and **Elektra/Asylum** before joining **WB** as a tape evaluator 17 years ago. He became Waronker's assistant in 1983 while continuing to work in A&R, and was named VP/Product Management in 1987, where he's remained until now.

Klein got his start in radio at college **WUSB/Stony Brook, NY** in the late '60s. He started what he called the country's first "alternative music" radio show on **KSAN/San Francisco** in the late '70s, and later worked on-air at **KSJO/San Jose** and **KUSF/SF**. By 1982 he'd merged his influential new wave label, **415 Records**, into **Columbia**. In 1987 he was named VP/GM of **Sire Records** and added **WB VP** stripes in '88.



WYUU Sues Mktg. Dir. For Moving Costs!

Former WYUU/Tampa Mktg./Promotion Dir. **Lu Valentino** is being sued by WYUU owner **Entercom** for moving costs associated with her relocation from NYC to Tampa approximately one year ago.

Valentino claims she resigned and left the station in December due to station pressure: "They were giving me a hard time for months and months, telling me I wasn't fitting in; they kept memos coming every day."

Owing to a non-compete clause, she couldn't work in Tampa. Because she only worked nine months of her one-year contract, Valentino only paid back a portion (more than half) of her moving expenses. She asked the station "to forgive the remaining \$750 because she couldn't afford it, couldn't work in Tampa, and had to move again." She says the station refused the offer as well as a payment plan.

Valentino — currently handling evenings at **WXXL/Orlando** — is headed to court this week as the station seeks payment of the \$750 plus court costs.

WYUU GM **Steve Godofsky** — who's worked with Valentino three times in the past — told ST, "Everything she said was a lie."

KBCO/Denver PD Judy McNutt will exit the heritage Progressive outlet next month to rejoin **CommuniTech Communications & Technology For Broadcasters** as a

consultant. Incidentally, 'BCO will be the company's first full-service client. (Does this explain those 16 tongues o' rumblings outta Denver about potential KBCO staff changes?)

SW Radio Networks hires noted lawyer **Alan Dershowitz** for weekend talk duties, beginning in June.

Major Minor Story?

ST hears that *Rolling Stone* writer **Peter Wilkinson** is doing a feature story on the late **Charlie Minor** for a forthcoming issue.

Saul Frischling closed Monday (4/24) on his \$5.5 million duopoly purchase of **WRRK-FM/Pittsburgh** from **Robert Copeland** — a deal that's been pending since February 1993!

Earlier this month, the **FCC** settled a pending EEO complaint by fining the station \$16,000, granting its license renewal, and approving the sale. (Which means broker **Michael Bergner** finally gets to cash his commission check.)

After five months as "The Rocket," **KRQT/Houston** changes its moniker to "The Buzz." GM **Pat Fant** notes, "The Buzz' more accurately describes the station's music and attitude." He said his only plans were to "find a mountain and look at a lake for a while. After that, I don't have a clue. You don't make those decisions when you're burned out." No word from Curb regarding a replacement at this early date.

EZ Communications VP & Nat'l PD Doug McGuire tells ST the scuttlebutt about **KSD-FM/St. Louis** changing formats to CHR is unfounded: "We paid a premium price for this Classic Rock station and we plan to keep it that way."

Condolences to the family 'n' friends of **Howard Cosell**. The 77-year-old broadcaster — whose **ABC Radio** career spanned five decades — died of a heart embolism on Sunday (4/23).

The **Carter Broadcast Group** — which operates **KPRT-AM & KPRS-FM/KC** — was honored as one of the Top 10 Small Businesses of the Year by the Greater Kansas City Chamber of Commerce. The first-place winner will be announced May 5.



Black Talk WOL Stakes Its Claim In Newt Land

If, for some really bizarre reason, you had to describe the current state of Talk radio in three words in order to save your life, you'd be safe with: conservative white guys.

But while the format is dominated by the right-of-center views that appeal to many Americans, there are still several major-market stations out there offering a minority view — in more than one sense of the word. They are America's Black Talk stations.

Serving The Underserved

Among the best known of these is WOL/Washington, which broad-

casts from the center of the conservative white guy universe — and is doing quite nicely, thank you. WOL GM Tony Washington says his station makes its way by focusing on an underserved — and underappreciated — audience.

"Our mission statement is simple," says Washington. "We provide news and information to African-Americans. While most talk shows and stations, like Rush Limbaugh, focus on the middle-class-to-rich segment, we focus on the middle class-to-poor audience."

The station, which is owned by longtime community activist, talk host, and radio entrepreneur Cathy Hughes, takes that news commitment very seriously. AM drive begins with a 30-minute newsblock followed by a news-intensive morning talk show.

"Our morning host, Bernie McCain, has about 20 minutes per

hour to talk," says Washington. "During that time he expands on [the top news stories of the day]." The rest of the day's talk lineup, which is simulcast on co-owned WOLB/

Baltimore, is heavily laced with newscasts, information segments, and news features, including an hour of news in afternoon drive.

No Slant

Although WOL's news is keyed to the African-American audience, the station does not slant its stories to provide any sort of "black perspective." That's the host's job. According to Washington: "If Newt Gingrich says, 'Let's bomb all the welfare people,' we'll ask whether that includes those who receive big business tax breaks, defense contractor subsidies, or farm subsidies. In Washington, if you have a voice, you get subsidies. If you don't have a voice, they call it welfare."

McCain's 6-10am morning program is followed by a midday show hosted by local attorney-turned-talk-er Eric St. James. The bulk of PM drive (2-6pm) belongs to Cathy

Hughes, whose fiery rhetoric, community-organizing, and crusade against alleged racism at the *Washington Post*, have helped give WOL a notoriety that far exceeds its ratings.

While Hughes has become somewhat less visible as her business responsibilities have grown, she still has the remarkable power to mobilize her audience. The Washington Humane Society, for example, last year pulled an advertisement linking animal abuse and child abuse after Hughes took up

the cause of a WOL caller who charged that the ad's montage photo of a black child and a cat was demeaning to African-American kids.

Steady Lineup

From 6-8pm WOL carries TPT News' Bill Christian news hour and talk program. Early evening (8-10pm) is a checkerboard of advice shows and programs hosted by lo-

cal politicians, including the District of Columbia's congressional delegate, Eleanor Holmes Norton. The 10pm-2am slot is given over to American Urban Networks' Bob Laws show, which is followed by a local talk program.

The weekend lineup includes ousted NAACP Exec. Director Benjamin Chavis. The station is also exploring the possibility of adding former Virginia governor Doug Wilder to its weekend schedule. Wilder hosts a daily midday show on WRVA/Richmond.

WOL currently is airing wall-to-wall coverage of the Simpson murder trial. According to Washington, that decision was based on listener demand and management's sense that the coverage will teach the community something about how the legal system works.

Faithful Audience

WOL's approach has attracted a faithful, not insignificant audience. The station's average 1.5 share over the past year makes it competitive with Greater Media's struggling Talk WWRC/Washington in the Arbitron 12+ race. And while its demographics may not sparkle on paper, Washington says advertisers are starting to discover the value of advertising to the "WOL Family," as members of the audience are known.

In a city marked by huge salaries, expensive housing, and high population turnover, WOL attracts the mid-level worker bees — veteran teachers, federal employees, low-level managers, and others — who have a surprising amount of discretionary income.

"Our average listener may have a household income of just \$50,000," he explains. "But they are people

who have lived in their houses for 25 years, make a small house payment, and have more disposable income than people who make a lot more money. These [listeners] buy more goods and services than the guy who moves to Washington and makes \$150,000, but had to pay \$300,000 for his house."

Washington says that if WOL's revenues are to grow significantly, the station must also convince suburban businesses — car dealers and shopping malls, for example — that members of the WOL Family who live in the District of Columbia, do indeed travel to the 'burbs to do their shopping. Business equipment suppliers, he adds, need to understand that WOL's audience includes a number of people whose mid-level jobs give them influence over office purchasing decisions.

"Our mission statement is simple. We provide news and information to African-Americans."

"Even if they don't make the actual purchase, they are the ones who [do the research] and make the buying recommendations," Washington explains. And while his sales staff wrestles with these challenges, Washington says the programming and promotion departments need to focus on expanding the ranks of WOL Family members.

"We've just about perfected our programming," he says. "Now, we've got to promote ourselves."



So Many Calls ... So Little Time

□ CHR PD, MD share how they've mastered music call overload

Among all of the pressing programming problems and issues facing today's Country's PDs and MDs, one of the most-talked about topics is phone calls. More precisely, the question is how to handle the increasing number of music calls that come into a station each week.

It wasn't too long ago that there were only six or seven country record labels — and a relative handful of country independent record promoters. As we're all too well aware, the number of labels has skyrocketed to 21 in the last few years and the number of indies has multiplied geometrically.

Label staffs have expanded as well, with national and regional directors, and regional VPs all vying for phone time. And the number of people hiring indies — including managers and publishers — has been on the rise, too. Not surprisingly, then, the sheer volume of music calls being made to Country radio stations has reached, uh, record proportions.

Controlling The Workload

One programmer recently told me his station has 10 phone lines. One day the GM walked by and saw eight lines on hold. "Nuclear" was the word the PD used to describe the GM's demeanor when the receptionist told him that all eight were record promoters on hold. "The only vision [the GM] had was of clients calling to buy advertising — and getting a busy signal. We're very close to not allowing anyone to hold."

As this was being written, I received a fax from another PD who sent an open letter to labels and independents, notifying them that his station was no longer taking calls from indies. The opening graph read:

"I'm very sorry to inform you of our decision to limit the calls we can accept to promote your music product. Because we share a facility with two other very active stations, we are

doing everything possible to control the front desk's work load. To this end, we will only accept music promotion calls from the record labels."

These examples are included to illustrate that the increasing volume of calls is indeed a problem. For some tips on coping with mass quantities of calls, I thought I'd head out of the format to chat with some folks who've been dealing with loads of labels for years — CHR PDs and MDs.

Mega Call Load

Unlike Country, many CHR labels have local promoters in addition to national and VP level execs, which adds to the call load. Both PDs interviewed for this piece also talk with PDs/MDs from around the country who want information about records that are working in their respective markets.

While waiting to chat with **WHTZ/New York MD Andy Shane**, I asked **Cathy Donovan**, PD **Steve Kingston's** assistant, how many labels they're in contact with. And — after the groan — she said she has 25 pages of record company contacts in her computer.

It's hard to imagine any station gets more calls than WHTZ. Shane says he takes between 200-300 music-related calls per week. He says there are roughly 40 labels he deals with on a regular basis — meaning he talks with at least one person from the label at least once per week. Shane adds that Kingston may take as many as twice that number of calls. Shane says he handles the music calls while Kingston deals with calls regarding the business of music; i.e., dialogues about concerts, promotions, etc. that may take place with artist managers or label execs.

While Shane's not regularly on the air (he does pull an occasional shift), he does have numerous additional responsibilities that limit the time he can spend on the phone talking about records.

In addition to listening to all of the new music that comes into the station each week, he schedules music, accumulates requests, sales, and callout research, works with Kingston on rotations, supervises the request line operators (hires, fires, and works with them), and sets up the music-oriented weekend specialty shows.

Additionally, in a situation that only affects a few stations in select cities, he sets aside a "record day." On Thursday mornings, label reps are welcomed at the station, and Shane spends five to 10 minutes with anybody who comes by. He says he

sees 30-35 folks on a typical day.

Calvin Hicks is the PD/MD/afternoon talent at **WWKX/Myrtle Beach, SC** and also handles station promotions. That alone tells you his time for calls is restricted, so he's had to designate call-in parameters. He takes 42 calls per week from both labels and independents and limits music calls to 10am-12:30pm on Mondays. Hicks accepts independent promotion calls, noting, "Sometimes they can give insight into something the label didn't have time to research."

Shane doesn't have a set day or time to take calls. "They can call at any time during the week. If I can take the call, I do. I often take calls while I'm doing other things. If I can't get with them right then, a message is taken and I call them back." And he doesn't take calls from independent promoters, a local policy that has nothing to do with reducing the volume of calls.

Just The Facts

Shane and Hicks agree that talking with promoters is an important part of selecting music for the station. Shane notes, "It's part of my job to talk with record reps. Even though 80% of the time I'm already aware of what they're telling me about records, it's important they have the chance to provide me with information I don't know. Without that information, I'd be a step behind. The contact with them also helps maintain the relationships Z100 has built with labels — something that's always been important to this station."

Asked if he had any tips on how to handle the incredible volume of calls within a heavy workload, he laughs, "There is no 'easy' way to handle it. It's very hard. You just have to do it. Taking calls from record reps is a necessary, very important part of my job. I just have to make sure that each call is straight, to the point, and that they're giving me information that's not overkill."

Shane and Hicks seem to have stricter music-call guidelines than I've heard laid down by their Country counterparts. Shane notes, "I've told the label reps the type of info I'm looking for. They also know what I don't want. For instance, I don't care how records are doing in markets that aren't relevant to this city and this station."

"I let them give me all the pertinent, factual information they want. But the second caller who tries to give me the same information someone else has given me is quickly asked to move on to new info or another record."

Hicks lays down the law as well. "They know they have five to 10 minutes to do what they have to do and then they're off. You have to

have a passion for the music to do this job. I make it my business to have already listened to all the product, so I'm usually aware of what they're calling about. When we get on the phone, we review how the song sounds and whether or not it fits with our sound. Then I listen to their spiel about why it should go on our station."

Hicks's tight call schedule allows little time for chit-chat. He says, "If reps start to ramble, I tell them we've got a great relationship but there are other relationships I have to work on — and it's 'see ya.'"

Hicks reserves Thursday afternoon from noon-2pm to chat about promotions/events the station and labels are putting together or upcoming album projects. He enlists the aid of his office manager — who knows the players and the big picture — to ensure these calls are strictly about that kind of business.

"I wear a lot of hats here, so I don't have time for reps to give me a double sell on Mondays and Thursdays. It's very important for me to have someone who controls the calls. After my Monday calls, I give her a list of people I'm going to talk with on Thursday. She knows who I'm expecting and tells those who aren't on the list I'm not taking music calls."

The Hell Called Hold

As mentioned at the outset, a backlog of record reps on hold can drive managers — and receptionists — to

apoplexy. To keep that from happening, Shane reiterates that if he's available he takes the call; if not a message is taken. The potential for hold logjams is one of the reasons Shane says he doesn't have set windows to take calls. He feels those small call-time slots can create the problem. "Set times force people to try and crowd in at the same time. Knowing they can call anytime during the week releases some of that pressure."

Because Hicks has limited call times, he too is concerned about calls on hold jamming the switchboard. He has a policy limiting the number of holding lines to two at any one time. "I'm not trying to blow them off — I respect the job they have to do. If I miss a call, I make it a point to call them back. I return all calls; it's amazing how many PDs don't. But I figure I need them as much as they need me. This whole thing is about working together."

Call 'Em Back

Returning calls to 10-15 folks who didn't connect with the first time around sounds like a great idea — until the phone bill comes in. But Hicks offers a solution to that as well.

"Just call the record reps and ask them to call you right back. I leave them the number for the private line in my office, which I use for this purpose. I guarantee you they'll call right back. Most have the respect not to use that number for regular music calls. But there are some snakes who will try to use it other times. If that bothers you, put a machine on the line to screen calls when you're not expecting a callback."

Shane often sets aside the last half-hour of the day to return calls. He laughs, "Sometimes I get lucky and they're already gone for the day, which throws the ball back in their court."

Editor's Comments

If you have some time-saving tips that enable you to deal with the deluge of calls Country outlets are now receiving, let me know and I'll pass them along in a future column.

We'll also present the labels' side in a future column. The amount of time record reps spend on hold is truly astounding. It's nothing for them to be on hold for 45 minutes or more, waiting to conduct five minutes or so worth of business. Some have told me they remain on hold because so few PDs/MDs call them back. A modest proposal: Wouldn't it be more cost-effective for labels to install a toll free 800 phone number for people to call them back, instead of paying all that money to be on hold? Just a thought. Let me know yours.







Top-Of-Mind Issues Facing UC PDs

Five PDs talk about their industry concerns and why action is necessary

In my weekly conversations with people working in the Urban area of the industry, I'm hearing louder sounds of uncertainty and fear concerning stability in our business. Five PDs lay out what they feel are the most pressing issues.

Ownership Commitment

Seven-year programming vet and current WIZF/Cincinnati interim PD Phil Davis says, "The most pressing issue as I see it is ownership. I'm talking about ownership having a commitment as far as making their radio station, their business, the best. That commitment does not usually trickle down to the average employee. And some departments aren't born ... like research. Most Urban radio stations especially, unless you're in a Top 10 market, don't take the time nor the money to put such a useful tool in place for their market."

for Black broadcasters but smaller organizations too, what's going to happen to them? Are they going to be able to hold on to their properties, or are the larger organizations going to be allowed to just come in and buy them up because they have massive amounts of money available to them? And will they be allowed to just buy and buy and [eventually] squeeze all Black broadcasters and the little folks out of the business altogether?"

Fox, who prior to joining 'IBB was WPEG/Charlotte, NC MD/morning talent, also questions job security. "Are we going to be able to hold on to a job going into the 21st century? That has me concerned. Look at what's happening

"Well, all types of research are needed. There's market research and sales research to find out who you are going to target as a potential advertiser. At WIZF, our owners [Blue Chip Broadcasting] have done

research on every facet of the business. I'm very impressed with the research and the money spent to find out what this product was all about."

Another concern for Davis is reinvestment. "I'm not concerned about it here, but in other markets around the country. In the Urban format, money is not reinvested back into the stations. There seems to be no commitment to reinvest

money to get better equipment or to make your product better serve your community."

Big Vs. Small Businesses

WIBB/Macon, GA PD Kevin Fox's concerns start at the top:

Washington. "I know the FCC, the Senate, and the House of Representatives are about to take a vote on the number of radio stations that individuals and companies can own. And it makes me wonder, not only

ly seems like it's easy for any owner to get rid of six or seven people and save themselves some money by slapping on some satellite format, [thereby] putting a lot of talented people out on the street. That's just not the way things should be in this country or anywhere else. If we really love this business, it seems like all of us will have to learn to be versatile."

Duopoly Danger

WJHM/Orlando PD Duff Lindsay is a longtime industry veteran, having programmed in San Diego, Miami, and Orlando. "I think one of the most pressing issues confronting our format today deals with the duopoly situations coming into markets the size of Orlando. What we see is the potential for there to be two or three companies running the entire industry. The Urban

radio station isn't immune to that, and in a market like Orlando, it's a big part of this scene. It's only a matter of time before it fits into that conglomerate. Then the issue becomes: where, when, and how does it fit?"

WJHM has had it their own way for quite awhile, still winning not only the rating numbers, but the multicultural listener battle also. "With WJHM you're talking about a radio station that's been very successful and has had massive success in this market. And I think we've had this success because

of the station being youthful, which has also allowed us to have this broad market spread across the listener spectrum. I do see that it could become part of a group of other stations with one owner, and the other stations appealing to other listeners from a different or additional demographic. This would give the group an advantage in the sales arena to be able to sell a bigger percentage of advertising in the market.

"I don't see the big conglomerate taking over this station. Quite frankly, it might be the other way around where we [Beasley Broadcasting] would buy other local stations making this envisioned group I'm talking about. The idea would be to give the company a broad spectrum of appeal for advertisers; WJHM already has a rock-hard hold on a large portion of the market."

Attracting/Keeping Great Talent

According to WACR/Tupelo, MS PD Jerold Jackson, "The most paramount issue I think about in our format is personality radio: The return of it and the lack of it in small and secondary markets. One of the problems I have is not having enough money to get and/or be able to attract major talent, whether it's up-and-coming talent or established talent. I'm also faced with my location's last name — Mississippi — which has a stigma attached to it. Some people in our industry think we're all wearing straw hats and overalls. Some also think we're not

that competitive or don't take us seriously because of the market size. But that just isn't the case.

"Now, while the lack of revenue in the market to pay large dollars for talent is one thing, what I see going on in a lot of markets is people aren't being groomed in the art of personality radio as top-notch personalities. I'm afraid that we're getting away from personality radio, which has been the building block of success for Black radio since its beginnings.

This is something that I see at Urban stations across the country.

"We try and encourage that type of radio here by having regular aircheck sessions and by sitting down and finding out what's happening with our on-air talent. That's when we need to tackle together and make sure we're achieving those goals. The aim should always be: Take talent to a higher level of professionalism, which ultimately pleases the listeners, and benefits the person, and the station. I think our format is getting into the problem of letting personality radio be replaced by a satellite, liners, and a cue tone."

Who's Getting Cut?

Seventeen-year vet Joe Booker, who programmed KIPR/Little Rock prior to his current PD duties at WWDM/Columbia, SC, is concerned with the big picture. "Our black and Urban artists have got to start looking at what's taking place in our business. With the downsizing in our business, the people who are suffering the most seem to be the African-Americans. And if you look at the other side of things you'll notice that a number of black artists have hits at the top of the charts and the formats that are getting results and playing the music are the Urban formats.

"With CHRs basically crossing over (Rhythmic/CHR), it really concerns me when I also see the record industry cutting their black music divisions and putting more

black folks out of work. And what music is selling with the public? I think you can answer that for yourself. Now, the next move will be into the Black/Urban radio side of the business, especially with the new FCC regulations. I guess this is the adjustment that myself and other program directors are going to have to make if we want to stay in this business. We're going to have to be ready to program more than one radio station if we're with a group that has a duopoly situation."





Atlantic Records' Underground Radio

VP/Promotion Danny Buch explains low-power radio's promotional benefits

Most radio programmers dream of owning their own radio station. Now Atlantic VP/Promotion **Danny Buch** and Sr. VP **Andrea Ganis** have found a way — low-power radio. Buch and company feel they're sitting on what could be the next hot trend. He explains the idea's evolution and the unique ways the label is using the technology.

An Idea Is Born

Buch recalls, "Last year, I was reading an article in the *L.A. Times* about how small businesses like realtors were using low-power radio signals to sell homes. The realtor would display a sign encouraging interested buyers to tune to an AM frequency. They'd hear a recorded message with information on the home for sale.

"A light bulb went off in my head. I thought if you use one of these sig-

nals to broadcast where many people are stuck, as opposed to just in front of a home or business, there would be no limit to how far you could take this.

"Former *KDWB/Minneapolis PD* **Mark Bolke** once told me, 'radio is about delivering bodies.' So I figured whether you have a 50,000-watt signal going to

100,000 people spread over three states, or a 100-milliwatt station broadcasting to 100,000 people spread under one mile, it's still the same amount of bodies."

Buch put his idea into action in New York City. First he bought FCC-regulated equipment. Then, after careful studies, found a broadcast site outside the Holland Tunnel. He notes, "We read studies from the Tri-borough Bridge & Tunnel Authority, the Mass Transit Authority, and the outdoor billboard companies to identify traffic flow patterns. We discovered that close to three million people drive into Manhattan every day. To get to Manhattan, you have to drive through narrow thoroughfares like the Midtown Tun-

nel, Holland Tunnel, George Washington Bridge, etc. People wait an average of 17 minutes in morning drive to pay the toll and enter the tunnel.

"We figured since that's where people wait the most to get into the city, we'd put up a low-power signal there and play Atlantic artists' music. This was a new concept. So we bought a signal and put it on the roof of a Texaco station right outside the Holland Tunnel. The Texaco station owner was willing to try new mar-

"Andrea and I recruited Atlantic interns to wear sombrero hats and walk with sandwich signs that read 'Take a traffic jam vacation. Music by B-Tribe. Next 500 feet only' at the entrance of the Holland Tunnel where cars were waiting. We did this for three days. Within a week, **Soundscan** showed a 21% spike in sales on B-Tribe. At the **Tower Records** downtown, where most of these people end up driving, B-Tribe went from No. 85 to No. 45 in sales."

After this successful trial, Ganis and Buch knew they were onto something. But the question of attracting listeners arose. Buch concedes, "Nobody's going to tune out **Don Imus** or **Howard Stern** to listen to this AM signal. So we had to come up with a concept to entice people to listen in that zone once

the novelty wore off." So with the blessing of **Time Warner Group** **COO Doug Morris**, and Atlantic President **Val Azoli**, he hired former **Mercury A&R Director** and **WBCN/Boston** and **WXRK/New York APD** **Bob Kranes** as Director/Low-Power Radio Ventures for Atlantic.

"We wanted to establish this low-power system to potential advertisers, ourselves, and **Gannett** outdoor, who gave us a free billboard outside of the tunnel to advertise our frequency."

The Win Zone

Kranes notes, "We had to find proof that we were getting listeners. We also had to establish a prize system because the Mass Transit Authority didn't want people walking the street handing out free tolls. So we posted signs that read 'Free Tolls? 1510 AM Next 500 Feet Only.' Listeners turn their radios and hear 'You've just wandered into "The Win Zone," we will pay your toll. When you get to work dial (212) YOU-WINN. The call is free and we'll send you a free toll or a prize if you mention today's password — "Hootie." Then we play 30 seconds of **Hootie & The Blowfish**. We repeat the number and password. When people call this interactive phone system, a recording gives them info on a variety of things including artists, New York radio stations, and upcoming concerts.

"It costs as much as \$4 to go through one of the major arteries into New York, so we award prizes like a week's worth of tolls, CDs, and coupons good for the Holland or Midtown Tunnels. We award about

25-30 free tolls a week and 150-200 winners a day per location. Everyone who listens in The Win Zone and calls our prize line with that day's password wins something."

Buch adds, "The message runs only about 6-1/2 minutes. That way we have the best chance of impacting consumers at least once while they're waiting to get through the tunnel." Today, Atlantic has low-power radio promotion signals outside New York's Holland (1510 AM) and Queens-Midtown tunnels (1410 AM).

The Page/Plant Promotion

When **Jimmy Page/Robert Plant** recently performed two shows at the New Jersey Meadowland Arena, Atlantic provided concertgoers with an opportunity to tap into low-power with the first-ever underground live broadcast. Says Buch, "We did live pre- and post-concert radio shows for 40,000 tailgating people. We gave away prizes via the 212 YOU-WINN number and a **Miller Lite Page/Plant** museum in the parking lot.

"Contests centered around the **Page/Plant 'No Quarter' LP**, the **'Encomium'**

tribute LP, as well as featuring our new artist, **Never The Bride**. In addition, Bob promoted every New York station playing those albums and had **WNEW's Carol Miller** on-air live. I don't think that's ever been done — two stations promoting each other live.

"We had an army of interns out there with signs. Everybody in the promotion department, including

Andrea, Director/Pop Promo **Monte Lipman**, Head of AOR Promo **Lea Pisacane**, and Director/Alternative Promo **Tod Elmore**, were out there telling people to turn us on. The signs read 'Free CDs 91.9 FM This Parking Lot Only,' 'See Page/Plant In L.A. Free,' etc. We gave out fliers, worked a deal with the Meadowlands for signage, and had **Robert Plant** mention it on TV."

Benefits And Tie-Ins

Atlantic has gone to great lengths to offer commercial radio stations co-promotional opportunities. In the very near future you'll hear promotion spots for **WHTZ (Z100)/New York** and **WNEW** on the Atlantic low-power system in New York City. Atlantic is offering all New York commercial music stations the opportunity to use low-power radio to promote their stations.

Buch notes, "I must add that commercial radio is the primary vehicle for selling records. Anything that would work against commercial radio would spell doom for breaking new Atlantic music."

According to Buch, the ultimate goal with low-power

radio is "to create additional exposure for Atlantic artists, break new acts, and maximize sales. In the future we also hope to turn this project into a revenue generator. We hope to put signals up wherever people are stuck in traffic like airports, shopping malls, stadiums, etc. A **Musicland** could put a CD on special that afternoon. You could train people in shopping malls to listen for specials with that day's password.

"We want to put them on the tops of stadiums and entertainment complexes so after NY Giants games or concerts people can get deals on **Starter** sportswear or find out what bar to go to for free beer."

Look for Atlantic Underground Radio coming to your town soon.

keting ideas and wanted to increase his business, too. He agreed, and in return we put his advertisements on our radio frequency.

"Like faxes and cellular phones, low-power technology has been around since the '60s. But sometimes the applications are not exploited until decades later. We broadcast with 100 milliwatts, which is a tenth of a watt. If you go into an area where there is an unoccupied frequency, and you're not pumping out more than 100 milliwatts, you may use that frequency. This complies with FCC rules and regulations."

The Trial Run

"For our first trial project we used **B-Tribe**, who wasn't getting any other airplay in New York," Buch says.

"LIGHTNING CRASHES" by Live (Radioactive) is leading the charge to overtake Green Day. "LIGHTNING" bolts from 3.84-4.00 in total favorability and takes top honors among women 18-24.

Hootie & The Blowfish surge to fourth place in CALLOUT AMERICA this week as "LET HER CRY" (Atlantic) rises 3.55-3.82 in total favorability. "LET" performs well in all demos, including a 3.73 among women 25-34, with still only 45.9% familiarity in that cell.

"RUN-AROUND," the debut CHR hit for Blues Traveler (A&M), leaps 3.38-3.63 in total favorability in addition to performing best among women 25-34, where its 3.85 favorability score places it third. The Rites Of Spring Contesting

□ Most stations still favor cash giveaways and listeners respond in droves

Few stations would risk going through a spring book without scheduling some type of contest. As this sample of three ACs shows, money remains radio's favorite contest prize.

Loyalty Pays Off

For the past several years, KMZQ/Las Vegas's "CD Jukebox" gave listeners hourly chances to score \$1000. "It was pretty exciting, but this year we're trying something a bit more [personal]," notes PD Jeff Cochran. "We're doing five 'Loyal Listener Tributes' at a time. We read a list of five names, and the first of those people who calls in within 10 minutes wins \$500." The others who call within 10 minutes each get \$100. "We'll probably do a few a day, and we could get hit for \$900 each time we play.

"People have been faxing and mailing in their names for this contest. All of them will wind up in our database and we'll be able to communicate with them again. When we do a 'fax-in' contest, it's not uncommon to get several thousand entries in a matter of days."

While Cochran recognizes that spring contests are a way of life, he notes, "They're very important, but many stations aren't getting back a big bang for their buck. If you don't have something competitive on the air, you'll get out-sizzled by the people across the street."

Some prizes may sound more alluring, but, as Cochran remarks, "Cash is still king. People really like it when you get out the checkbook. It's not uncommon for [locals] to win \$100,000 on a slot machine. The way we're doing our promotion makes us sound a bit more *real*. People think they have a good chance to win."

Thanks to its unique market setting, Bright AC KMZQ competes with such things as a casino that gives away two cars every day during May. "They have their customers, we have ours, and we share some," maintains Cochran. "The nature of the people in this market is to play — they do participate!"

Broken Promises

Since March 30, loyal KVLV/McAllen, TX listeners have been taking advantage of the station's deliberate violation of a 9am-5pm "No Repeat" promise. The contest runs through June 22 — it's expected to cost the station approximately \$7000.

At 7:20am, a song airs and is identified as the one that will be repeated. PD Roger Scott says, "We're absolutely positive we're gaining TSL

because of this contest. Each daily winner receives [frequency-related] \$107 and is eligible for the grand

prize — a trip for two anywhere in the country on American Airlines."

Over *Cinco de Mayo* weekend, KVLV will send two people to the Eagles' Denver concert date. But, as Scott points out, cash makes the biggest impact on McAllen residents. "We're very close to the Mexican border and heavily influenced by the peso's devaluation. This is one of the poorest per capita markets, and \$107 is a lot of money for those living down here. People in this area don't travel much, and a trip is a real privilege. We look very good to the audience when we give away this kind of money."

Doubling The Money

Lite Rock WSRW/Worcester, MA has budgeted \$40,000 for a "Song Of The Day" promotion it launched April 17. "That's a lot of money for this market [No. 101], and we'll give away \$1000 a day [Monday-Fri-

In Quest Of Fairness

Many readers responded to R&R's recent (4/7) theme issue on new technology in radio's workplace. Com-Quest President Garry Mitchell, however, took issue with certain remarks Fairwest President Reg Johns made about interactive phone systems. Here are some excerpts from his letter.

"Mr. Johns is wrong in his assertion that PCs aren't as flexible as [mini-computers]. Fairwest developed its interactive system seven years ago and had to run it on a mini-computer platform. Since then, vast improvements in PC memory and hard disc storage — as well as enormous price cuts — have made the PC a more logical choice."

Commenting on the process he's developed, Mitchell notes his PC system "is capable of doing smart surveys, handling up to 55 phone lines simultaneously, and branching out to alternate research questions. The technology ... is already there with PCs, and at about 20% of the cost point of a mini-system."

Stations Cash In On Alternative Prizes

Money is powerful, but it isn't *always* radio's top-drawer contest award, as these three stations have found.

Family Affairs

Soft AC WDOK/Cleveland PD Sue Wilson reinforces the station's dial position by shelling out \$102,

but admits, "We stay away from giving out a lot of cash, because we know we can't win this market's money battle. [Instead], we focus on family vacations and getaways. Since many people in our 35-44 demo are married with children, vacations are a perfect match."

Having recently given away three Orlando trips, Wilson now sets her sights north of the border. Thirteen 'DOK listeners and their families will get to attend the Canadian stage debut of "Beauty And The Beast."

Wilson explains, "Cleveland isn't far

from Toronto. The play is being heavily marketed, and we're the station they wanted for tie-ins. Our get-away weekends include four theater passes and overnight lodging. We're doing one giveaway a week throughout the book."

She points out, "Stations can give anything away, but if people don't like the on-air product, it's not going to work."

Jazz On AC?

"The hottest thing we're doing this spring involves our participation with [the NBA's] Utah Jazz," notes PD Jim Morales, who makes it very easy for listeners to land tickets on HotAC KISN-FM/Salt Lake City. "We give them to caller seven and zero in on the biggest games — against teams like Seattle, Orlando, and Phoenix."

The Jazz is the lone major league sports franchise in Salt Lake City — and all of Utah. "Traditionally, the game appeals only to males," Morales comments. "In this town, though,

it's also popular with females. The Jazz is our state's pride and joy."

While Utah Jazz play-by-play is heard on Sports KISN-AM, KISN-FM remains active on its own with the team. Morales points out, "We've had sign contests, our morning show has broadcast live from players' homes, we've talked with players' wives, and we've given listeners a chance

to have breakfast with some Jazz players. We do fine with our own contacts within the team's organization, and we don't work in tandem with KISN-AM."

Regarding spring book contesting in general, Morales adds, "Softer ACs aren't as active [promotionally] as we are. 'Call in and win' contesting is a non-issue for them."

Free Marital Bliss

Bright AC KMXR/Corpus Christi, TX continues its ongoing "Office Jackpot," but the spring sweep's promotional centerpiece is a "Wedding Extravaganza," which will run throughout May.

"We'll give away the entire wedding package, including either a Jamaica or Bahamas honeymoon, catering, dress, cake, and tuxes," notes PD Jesse DeLeon. "The only thing the bride will need to provide is the groom. If a mother wins, she can

transfer it to her daughter. An already married couple can renew their vows on their anniversary and have a big celebration.

"It's a very detail-oriented promotion that involves many clients, but we don't want it to be only client-driven. It should also be beneficial for us, and we hope to increase audience by getting people excited about it."





Format War: Label Reaction

Last week's column focused on Rock programmers who are fighting for equal billing with Alternative stations. While the majority of current titles are being played at both formats, Rock radio says record label favoritism toward Alternative stations is unfair to Rock.

The following Rock promotion executives give radio some honest feedback on the current crisis and suggestions on how to deal with it.

'No Cut-And-Dried Answers'

Geffen's Alan Oremen says, "At present, bands, artists, co-pros, etc. are the hot button in the industry. It's difficult attaining solutions and making everyone happy, because there are so many different variables involved. There are no cut-and-dried answers, and the politics often thrust our local people and the Rock departments into extremely volatile situations. What KISW [Seattle] and KLOS [L.A.] did with their press releases last week definitely sparked everyone's attention."

"What it comes down to is this: Each market is different, as is each band and each artist. There may be more history with an artist at one station than at another, which definitely goes into the decision-making process. We look at when a track or multiple tracks were added, but also — and sometimes more important — how much is the station committed to the project? With what frequency is it being played?"

"Another thing that makes a difference is what kind of event is being planned. If it's a concert with 10,000-20,000 people, that's a major factor in terms of exposure. Obviously, in these situations a neutral show would solve the problem, and sometimes it does. But that's not always the best solution, because sometimes neither station gets behind the show (I'm not talking about major superstar artists), and the band ends up getting hurt."

"In some markets there's a major relationship between a station and a concert promoter or venue, and that sometimes affects a co-pro. In all these situations we fight the battles for Rock radio, and we'd love the end result to go in Rock's favor, but unfortunately, that's not always the case."

Total Impressions

Of Rock's claims of foul play regarding "presents," Island's Dave Ross says, "To a large degree it's a

How To Achieve Equal Access

Some programmers feel it's a bitter pill to swallow, but the fact remains that record labels support those stations that have a proven track history for music sales. Here are a few elements to consider:

- Try to rotate more of your records on a more frequent basis. Promotion executives say the play levels at Rock outlets WAXQ/New York, WAAF/Boston, and WXTB/Tampa do draw attention within labels' corporate offices.

- Be very active with your local concert promoters in building a good relationship. You'd be surprised how many stations don't have good relationships with them, and that can be an important factor.

- Be pro-active in record company relationships. Either the PD or MD should be accessible every week.

non-issue at Island, because we take each case individually and look at who added it first and how much they played it. We've never made any blanket assumptions as to whether a particular project must go to Alternative or Rock. However, it's true that certain stations have been slighted in the past, and some will probably feel slighted in the future.

"We have to weigh the issues and decide whether the station that plays the record 40 times a week deserves the 'presents' over the station playing it 20 times a week. Sometimes the station playing it 20 times a week plays the record three times longer, so the total impressions in the aggregate is greater. So with certain artists we take a more long-term approach and look at the whole issue in a complete sense."

Ross advises Rock stations to run a historical title analysis report on specific titles to see how many total plays a track has received to date.

"The Meat Puppets are an excel-

lent example: while Alternative was whaling the group, they were whipping Rock. But when Alternative was done with it, Rock kept going. Sometimes these things have a way of equaling themselves out."

As to Rock not getting serviced at the same time as Alternative, Ross says, "It's incumbent on me to know my customer and what he's interested in. Therefore, we have a good grasp of when and where to deliver the music. I've never heard a complaint from the stations with pro-active MDs who talk to their reps every week. Most complaints come from the guys who don't talk a lot to the record community."

"However, we're reassessing the way we do business concerning starting projects at the same time at both formats, since they share so much of the same music."

'The New Corporate Rock'

IRS's Karen Lee notes, "Rock stations' not getting respect is an issue they brought on themselves by being closed to new music or only being open to it when it was already a huge record. Now that Alternative has hit on a hot trend — which happens to be Rock — and it's making huge strides at breaking new Rock artists, Rock automatically wants a piece of the action."

"The real problem I have isn't with Rock — it's with Alternative tightening up. In the past, IRS never had a problem getting a shot on a good record on Alternative. But now, [Alternative] has turned into the new corporate rock station. If it's not a testosterone-ridden sound, they don't want to touch it. It's a huge guitar trend, and the PJ Harvey and Letters To Cleo records are few and far between."

"If Rock's statement to the record industry is that they want a piece of the bands when they play locally, then they have to act that way. Besides rotating records more, Rock also needs to be more open-minded toward new music. It'll take them some time to get where they need to be — it's a building process, and they won't get everything they want today."

Labels Failed

Giant's Barry Lyons says, "I've always refused to have a 'Director/Alternative' or 'Director/AOR.' When you force stations into those categories, you give your field people an excuse to be lazy about deal-

ing with radio stations. We've always tried to deal with every station based on its territory, signal coverage, and whether it pulls an audience. That's what should really count.

"This is exactly the reason stations wanted to be CHR reporters 10 years ago — they thought CHR got better treatment from the labels. If that's what people today are thinking, then I believe the labels have failed somewhere along the way. I don't give a rat's ass who reports anywhere if they're playing my music — never have, never will. Every station deserves equal treatment based on the support they give an artist and, to some degree, based on what the station means in the marketplace."

"That doesn't always mean ratings, because some stations — whether Rock or Alternative —

have a proven ability to sell product beyond what you'd expect based on their ratings. There are also stations with humongous ratings that couldn't move a CD with a truck. "There should be two distinctions for charts: one for winning stations and one for losers! I want good stations playing my music, and I don't care what they're called or whether they report to a chart. Debating whether a station should be classified as Rock or Alternative is useless and irrelevant. We'll work with any station that wants to work with us."

Q101/Chicago Counters Unfairness Claims

W KQX/Chicago (Q101) Regional VP/PD Bill Gamble sent me the following letter.

I enjoyed last week's column about how Alternative radio is receiving "special treatment" from the labels. I agree — Alternative is getting more than the other Rock formats. The reason — we've earned it.

The job of labels and artist management is selling records and developing careers. They're always going to favor groups and organizations that help them achieve those goals. Q101 is the number one coming station in Chicago. We reach over a million people a week.

The reason stations like Q101, KEGE [Minneapolis], and WLUM [Milwaukee] are able to put on these events is because we sell more records than the other Rock stations in the market. This is not a new phenomenon. Successful radio stations have always reaped the benefits.

It doesn't matter whether you call yourself Alternative, AOR, CHR, AAA, or Country. If you have the ratings, sell records, and break new bands, labels will be eager to work with you.

More Thoughts On Imaging (Stationality)

Production pros talk about humor, originality, texture, and fun

In this second column on imaging, Radio Potato's Jerry Lentz and One On One Productions' Dennis Daniel and Steve Morrison explain how they create the right image for Alternative stations.

'Dangerous & Different'

"I want to make a station sound a little dangerous and different to capture the listeners' attention," says Lentz, who does imaging for about 40 Alternative stations. He says he tries to create a "non-radio announcer sound," but notes, "It's really hard, because most PDs want their station to sound like another station. I've been pretty successful at trying to stretch that envelope a bit. A station sends me ideas, and I'll always add my own. I use a lot of twisted and sarcastic humor in my writing. For example, [I'll say,] 'This station is not ...' and then say what the station is.

"In a liner, I want to get across that anything can happen — the crazies have taken over the asylum. There's also a lot of potty humor. Every market is saturated, and the

"We don't like to imitate anybody else," says Daniel, who credits

former WDRE OM/DP Tom Calderone — now a Jacobs Media consultant — as a major influence. "We're really rabid about being original. Unless we're imaging a particular band, we use our own original music — not a library of stingers and drops. We've made our own music beds of composed music with guitar licks and drums. Working with original music gives you a lot more to do creatively, because you can design your promos around the music."

Movie drops play a role in the duo's imaging. Daniel explains, "We use movie drops as an element in the overall package, just as much as a sound effect or a piece of music. Instead of using a common phraseology from movies, I can take anything and make it work somehow within the context of what we're talking about. We listen to the drops and come up with ideas on how to project ideas through the movie bite. For example, [drop] 'This is no fantasy, [voice] WDRE, [drop] no careless ramblings of somebody's imagination [voice] Modern Rock.'

"One of the tricks is staying creative and coming up with a lot of ideas. We do about 400 different voices; Steve and I do a lot of the same ones. We listen to a lot of effects, and that inspires ideas."

Morrison comments, "The modern rock audience tends to be pedantic about the music. The format grew out of people who wanted to be original and to be their own people. [Listeners] are very critical of entertainers and hosers, and they can spot a phony a mile away. The main thrust of what we do is invite everyone in on the joke. Everyone laughs, and you instantly connect. We use comedy to get people to listen, and then we turn them into fans."

'Humor' Your Audience

■ Using comedy 'to redefine format boundaries'

Comedian **Andy Kaufman** first came to the public's attention on the premiere episode of "Saturday Night Live" almost 20 years ago. His innovative comedy stylings and performances ranged from inter-gender wrestling to impersonating **Elvis**. He was best known as "Taxi"'s lovable immigrant mechanic, **Latka Gravas**. He died May 16, 1984 at the age of 35. So ... what does this have to do with Progressive radio?

Ask **Constantine Consulting's** Special Projects Director **James Dann**, who compares Kaufman's comedic uniqueness to the Progressive format. The following is excerpted from a presentation Dann made at the recent Constantine Programming & Promotions Summit in Los Angeles.



James Dann

Andy Kaufman — Progressive Comedy

The recent **NBC** television special, "A Comedy Salute To **Andy Kaufman**," elicited quite a few reactions from me, many of them unexpected. While it was great to settle in and relive moments of brilliance from this innovative performer, I also found that much of the praise given to Andy's comedic stylings could and should be applied to what we in the Progressive format strive for. When **Lily Tomlin** offered that Andy was able to "redefine the boundaries of comedy" and "pave the way for a new breed of comedian who did not have to tell a joke to make you laugh," it occurred to me that we could say the same about our role in radio.

• Think of what we serve to our listeners who have been fed the same basic diet of formats for years and how we can benefit by "redefining boundaries."

Producer **Lorne Michaels**, who featured Andy's bizarre talents as early as the first episode of "Satu-

day Night Live," succinctly described Andy's art as "conceptual, pure, and more importantly, what he wanted to do."

In many ways, so is ours.

'Impress Me'

While viewing highlights of some of Andy Kaufman's first appearances on "The Tonight Show," I envisioned the Progressive audience in the role held by the longtime king of late-night TV. **Johnny Carson** would sit back in his chair and say, "Impress me," while every sort of imaginable talent crossed his stage. In the words of the tribute's hosts, "Andy always had something new for Johnny — and Johnny was delighted with that prospect."

• It's a good reminder for us to continue looking for those surprises that this format is able to spring on our audience (i.e., "Forgotten Favorites," "Vinyl Rarities," "Select-A-Sets").

It's easy to isolate the common thread in the adulation expressed by several generations of comedy greats in their recollections of Andy's work: **Dick Van Dyke** said,

"He loved to break the rules." **Sinbad** noted, "What he did was good for comedy — there were no boundaries." **David Letterman** remarked, "There was no better guest than Andy. You never knew what he was going to do other than that it would be strange and exciting." **Richard Belzer**, commenting on both Andy's wrestling persona and his alter-ego "Tony Clifton," expressed awe at how "remarkable [it was] for an entertainer to want to be a provocateur, to challenge people to think 'What is entertainment?'"

• What are the most challenging things you've done for your audience's benefit lately?

Elitist Curtain

One of the more frequent criticisms of the Progressive format is its elitism, not allowing the listener "behind the Wizard's curtain" often enough for us to seem human. Andy Kaufman once loaded his entire Carnegie Hall audience into buses and took them out for milk and cookies after the show.

Tribute co-host and "Taxi" co-star **Marilyn Henner** showed video clips from Andy's other job — what the comedian described as "something to fall back on" if his comedy career ended. Following "Taxi" rehearsals, Andy would strap on an apron, punch a time card, and bus tables at Jerry's Deli. In his own words, "I don't want to go around thinking I'm any more special than anybody else because I'm not. I'm just a human being. Working as a busboy reminds me of that."

• Morning show remote ideas, anyone?

There is still an awfully fresh quality to the humor profiled on the salute to Andy Kaufman, who left us 11 years ago this May. He never seemed to stop creating, or in the words of current box office king **Jim Carrey**, to "take it to the next level." While much of the press given to the Progressive format continues to focus on the "heritage" stations that have been doing it the longest, we should all pause and give thought to the things we are doing today that will be the format's legacy tomorrow.

• Dare to create the buzz in your own market that will be the talk of the market — maybe the industry — no matter what the outcome. We must, as was said about Andy, continue to "amaze, inspire, and influence."



All The Listeners Money Can't Buy

Format programmers agree contests must provide some lifestyle benefits

This week, we continue to explore leading programmers' thoughts about the effectiveness of contesting for this format.

Creating Ambiance

KTWV (The Wave)/Los Angeles PD Chris Brodie says contesting means something entirely different for NAC than it does for other formats. She questions the wisdom of throwing money at listeners.

"It's totally inappropriate to get into the arena of giving away \$1000 an hour. Some say \$1000 is the magic number, but the real magic to NAC contesting is more about image than [something tangible]. Building TSL through forced listening is something with which to be careful. But you certainly can tease with something music-intensive, such as great tickets to a core artist's show at a fabulous venue, hinting that such fabulous prizes are coming up.

"In a lot of our research and the response we've received to things we've done, we've found if something special is added to a package that's a lifestyle benefit, it works

well. Also, the cassette mailer we did last fall incorporated an off-air contest to motivate more sampling. Then, when someone finds the station and likes it, we build TSL as well as cume."

I asked Brodie whether contests produce a measurable ratings bump for the Wave, but she says they're only one thread in the station's tapestry. "We're never one-dimensional in our marketing during any specific quarter. It's just not what we think works. We've never thrown every resource into one pot — and certainly not with contesting because you simply can't compete with that \$1000 a day down the street at the CHR.

"But contesting is important, especially because it creates an ambiance about the station — the impression that something special is going on that money can't buy. The core listener, especially, loves to get involved in an event that's very exclusive and gives the feeling of being in an exclusive club. That can create for the listener a powerful bond with your station."

Backstage Passes

Echoing Brodie's sentiments, WNUA/Chicago OM/MD Lee Hansen says the best bet in the realm of contesting is to give listeners something they can't get elsewhere. "We love to do front-row seats and backstage passes. When we did this for a Pat Metheny show recently, the announcer [who

awarded the prize to the winner] said he'd never before heard a 40-year-old man from [suburban] Shomberg scream into the phone — the man was that thrilled to have won. Maybe he

could have bought front-row seats, but only 'NUA could get him the chance to meet Pat backstage. Besides, when people have disposable income, they paint the baby's room, install a sprinkler system or an addition to the house, or buy a large-screen TV so they can watch Michael Jordan rather than [splurge on] concert tickets.

"We also do 'Smooth Jazz Getaways' where we'll take qualifiers throughout the week and give away, for example, Pat Metheny's new CD and the chance to win a trip to an attractive destination to see Pat in concert. Considering Chicago winters, there are a lot of choices of where to send people. Last time, winners went to Dallas. In the big picture, luxury getaways like the St. Lucia Jazz Festival are our favorites. In the little picture, it's concerts here in town — but with special treatment like dinner, a limo, and the chance to meet the artist."

Midnight At The Oasis

When he discusses contesting, WNUA's new APD/MD, Tom Miller, draws on his experience programming KOAI (The Oasis)/Dallas.

"Numerous perceptual studies we did in Dallas showed that our listeners there don't want contesting. In fact, it's one of our lowest-scoring items when we ask them what elements they like and want on our station — from music to announcers to weather. Oasis listeners come to the station to get away from the hype. They come primarily for the music.

"The only exception is when we built contests around music and artists. And contests must be subtle. We're not about 'more music, more money, more fun.' We prefer to

present a contest as part of one of our shows. We've also given away one trip as part of our New Year's Eve countdown. Beforehand, we teased that contestants might win a trip to a jazz festival in Jamaica, but they had to listen through the hours up to midnight. Before playing the last song of the year, we told them to call in. It was very radioesque, and

it worked pretty well considering that radio listening on that particular night probably isn't too high.

"I'm also a big believer in off-air contests; i.e., through telemarketing. They're very effective at giving someone an additional reason to listen to the station, particularly if that person isn't already a listener. The morning person can say something like, 'Thank you, John Ryan, for listening,' and that's the listener's cue to collect his prize. To other listeners, there doesn't seem to be a contest going on because it's so transparent. But it's a great way to thank a listener and make someone feel good."

Ticket Window's Open

KLJZ/New Orleans PD Shirley Maldonado says, as NAC has matured, contesting has played an increasingly important role in the format's success. "When the format started, the driving idea was to be different from any other station, and that included contesting. But NAC was

different from the outset because we play so many instrumentals. So now we've gone back and incorporated basic, tried-and-true radio principles that have worked in other formats, like contesting. I use it to get people to come the station and to increase TSL.

"In this market especially, we try to give away music-oriented prizes because that's part of the listeners' edu-

cation process. Recently, we did our first listener appreciation concert that functioned as both promotion and contest. We had Boney James headlining, Larry Coryell with Donald Harrison, Doc Powell with Greg Karukas, and [local artist] David Torkanowsky at Tipitina's.

"We didn't tie in with an advertiser, and we didn't want to sell tickets. Rather, we gave tickets away on-air. For two weeks before the event, we set up a schedule when our imaginary ticket window would be open. Listeners had 10 minutes to call to get on the guest list. Over 600 people got to bring a guest to a great concert as their reward for listening to this station. Then, after the contesting was over, we gave directions to the event — and reminded people there would be others in the future so they wouldn't feel left out."

KKSF/San Francisco PD Steve Feinstein's comment about contests may provide the perfect punctuation: "Contesting is a fine adjunct, but it's no substitute for focused, effective programming."

Ex-WNUA GM Kept Door Open For All

Dean Williams works on-air at WGN/Chicago, but he was morning man at crosstown WNUA during four of the five years that John Gehron was GM. Williams responds to comments in a recent column (R&R 3/3) wherein current WNUA GM Ralph Sherman stated, "I was amazed to learn that some people [on staff] had never before been in the GM's office."

During my association working with John Gehron [at WNUA], everyone was treated with a great deal of respect, dignity, and fairness, coupled with an environment that encouraged everyone's input and creativity. Anyone at any time could walk into John's office without an appointment to discuss problems, offer ideas, ask questions, or just shoot the bull.

John made everyone at the station feel as though they were the most important people around. It didn't matter if you were the morning man or the garbage man, everyone's thoughts and ideas were heard and taken into consideration.

Anyone who claims to have never been in the GM's office during John's tenure must have been in the wrong building. It was nearly impossible to have not been caught up and motivated by his outstanding management style.

It's NAC's loss that he has left the format, and his Boston colleagues [at WRKO-AM] gain by having such an outstanding manager on their team. If you've ever thought about what characteristics an ideal GM should have, you'd probably be pretty close to describing John Gehron. Ask anyone who has known him: Very few GM/MDs will ever come close.






