

**Liberty Media Acquires 14% Emmis Stake For \$150 Million** BET to spend \$1 billion in radio acquisitions

Two of the giants of the cable TV world announced on Monday they would be entering the radio industry. First, Liberty Media Group said it will acquire a 14% stake in Emmis Communications for \$150 million; then, BET Holdings - in which Liberty has a 35% stake --- said it retained Bank of New York Capital Markets to seek \$1 billion in radio stations

The acquisition of 2.7 million class A common shares at \$55.56 each makes Liberty the second-largest investor in Emmis behind Chairman/ CEO Jeff Smulyan, who controls 69% of the voting stock in the company. He said the equity infusion will allow Emmis to pursue more radio acquisitions in the top 20 markets. This may include spinoffs from the Clear Channel-AMFM merger. he added, though the company

will be looking at deals everywhere.

BET founder/Chairman Robert Johnson - who said he could see BET assembling a billion-dollar radio group by this time next year called his radio venture "a major development in the growth of the BET brand," which includes the BET Cable Network and BET.com. an African-American-oriented web portal BET is co-developing with Liberty. Microsoft and others.

Johnson told R&R his newfound interest in radio was fueled by Clear Channel Chairman/CEO Lowry Mays' public pursuit of minority buyers for the divestitures. While it's no surprise BET will be seeking to leverage its name across Urban-formatted stations, many of the spinoff's don't fit that mold, and Johnson doesn't rule out going into related formats (NAC/Smooth Jazz, CHR,

# Summer Ratings Keep Rolling

Just 10 years ago Houston's two top Country stations, KILT and KIKK, were ranked No. 2 and No. 3 and shared 14.4 share points. In the latest summer '99 ratings results, thanks in part perhaps to changes in the ethnic makeup of the city and the way Arbitron surveys listeners, Country has lost five share points and KIKK is at its lowest point in more than 20 years (Infinity's other Country station in Houston, KILT, continues to lead the format with a 4.4 share). Over in Miami Clear Channel's WMGE, using a mix of '70s and '80s hits, skyrocketed in target demos and came up with a 1.6-3.5 12+ result in the summer. And in Seattle only two of the market's top 10 stations are owned by a megagroup. One of those stations, Sandusky-owned NAC/SJ KWJZ, catapulted to a record 4.6 share.

# **BMI Sued By Radio Consortium**

A dispute that has been simmering for three years reached a boiling point last week, as the Radio Music License Committee filed a lawsuit against BMI to change the way BMI charges radio stations for licensing agreements. The lawsuit, filed on Oct. 20 in federal district court in New York, asks a judge to resolve a dispute between the two sides about how much stations should have to pay BMI to play songs on the radio.

Currently BMI charges stations based on a percentage of station revenue. The RMLC wants BMI to charge stations on a per-play basis. 'The solution that we're searching for is for fees that stations pay for licenses not to be related to revenue that stations generate, but to some other pricing mechanism," RMLC Exec. Director Keith Meehan told R&R.

The RMLC represents nearly 3.000 radio stations, including most major groups and small operators. BMI represents tens of thousands of artists and collects license fees for playing their songs.

#### **No Middle Ground**

The two sides have been trying to reach a compromise on the issue for three years, ever since the contract between BMI and radio stations expired in 1996. Back then the RMLC began its campaign to alter the fee structure, but the two parties have had trouble finding a middle ground.

BMI and the RMLC have trouble agreeing on any aspect of this case right now. The RMLC says BMI takes about 1.6% of a station's revenue in license fees every year; BMI says the number is less than 1% of total radio industry revenues. The RMLC says radio is using less BMI music than ever: BMI says the industry is using more BMI music than ever.

The RMLC argues that the radio industry has changed dramatically under consolidation, and that the growth of radio revenues has nothing to do with a higher quality of music put out by BMI artists. Radio stations should not have to shell out more money just because they have found better ways to create revenue, Meehan said.

# **Radio Groups Look To Gain 'Critical** Mass' Following Clear Channel Deal Megamerger a top topic at Kagan conference

The titans of Radioland like what they're seeing these days and are optimistic about the future, certainly if it means catching some prime spinoffs from the massive Clear Channel-AMFM marriage. # **FCC Reveals Enforcement Bureau Structure**

The FCC unveiled the design of its new Enforcement Bureau on Tuesday. While indecency complaints will now be handled by the bureau's Investigations and Hearings Division, other matters, such as compliance with EEO regulations, will remain with the Mass Media Bureau.

FCC Chairman Bill Kennard announced during a meeting of the House Commerce Telecommunications Subcommittee on Tuesday that the new bureau, which consolidates enforcement functions and staffers

from four existing bureaus — including Mass Media — will be up and running on Nov. 8. The move comes as part of Kennard's five-year plan to restructure the agency.

The Investigations and Hearings Division will also deal with complaints

# FCC Reviews Average Six Months

CC merger reviews that take longer than six months are complicated by "complex issues of market structure," FCC Chairman Bill Kennard testified before the House Commerce Telecommunications Subcommittee Tuesday. In a hearing on Kennard's five-year plan to restructure the agency, Telecommunications Chairman Billy Tauzin grilled Kennard on what he thinks Congress meant when it repeated the commission's power to review mergers in the Telecommunications Act of 1996. Kennard replied that Congress did not strip the FCC of its authority to ensure that mergers are in the public interest. He also pointed out that the commission is forming an interagency task force to look at mergers, and that as part of the five-year plan the commission will seek to impose deadlines on reviews of petitions for review and reconsideration.

# FCC Says Y2K Not A Threat For Radio

A new FCC report says 80% of radio and TV stations are ready for the year 2000. "None of these elements or systems appear to be at risk for widespreadY2K-induced failure," said this week's survey, a follow-up to reports earlier this year that showed less readiness among broadcasters.

# Congressman Wants FCC To Collect Ethnic Complaints

Rep. Eliot Engel's Ethnic and Minority Bias Clearinghouse Act would have the FCC establish a central office charged with gathering complaints about how ethnic and minority groups are depicted on radio, broadcast TV and cable. The minority affairs section of that commission would then compile the grievances into a report for Congress. The section would also conduct an annual conference on the issues that would be advised by a committee made up of broadcasters, educators and others. There has been no action on the bill, but Engel said during a House Commerce Telecommunications Subcommittee hearing Tuesday that the NAACP supports the measure. FCC Chairman Bill Kennard and Commissioner Gloria Tristani also used that occasion to condemn a recent broadcast of the Westwood One-syndicated *The Don & Mike Show* as "an outrageous attack on Hispanics" (Kennard) and "the most racist, bigoted and demeaning piece of radio I've ever heard" (Tristani).

# How Doing 1 Or 2 Music Tests Per Year Can Be Hurting Your Ratings

More frequent music testing identified as key to success of Philadelphia's #1 rated 25-54 station\*

ur philosophy at B-101 is that TSL is to be guarded at all costs. The single most important investment we make to ensure high levels of listening is with our library music testing.

We test and freshen the library very regularly. This allows us to move a certain number of songs from Power to Secondary and vice versa. Some songs usually fall out and some songs always find their way from the shelf to the air. Frequent testing should really be the rule and not an option, particularly for any gold-based station. The way music is moving these days, and as listeners' tastes evolve at an unbelievable pace. stations just can't sit for five or six months and let the music mix get stale. When it does, the listeners can't put their finger on it, but it just sounds old and repetitious.

Here's the worst part of letting your music get stale: there is a real opportunity for fatigue with heavy listeners (core P-1's) when stations go more than a couple of months without a music test. And, it's important to remember that it's your core that gives you on average 75% of your quarter hours (higher on most ACs). When you are only playing 400 or 500 songs at a time, it really shouldn't be the same 400 or 500 for more than a couple of months in a row, especially "Here's the worst part of letting your music get stale: there is a real opportunity for fatigue with heavy listeners (core P-1's)... it's important to remember that it's your core that gives you on average 75% of your quarter hours..."

if you are in a tough battle with other stations in your format. If you're not in a direct format battle it still can suboptimize ratings. It's just not great to listen (for long periods of time, especially) to a station that sounds tired and stale. We believe this so strongly that we do five tests a year now using Music-Tec. We've been using Music-Tec tests for 12 straight books (over three years) and have gone up in share in our target every year. Our music NEVER gets stale. I know that's not affordable for every station, but before you spend money on TV and outside advertising, you've got to get your product as sharp as it can be. That means at least three tests per year.



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# EARNINGS Cox Posts Record Quarter

# Harris Sales Flat In Fiscal Q1; Saga, Viacom earnings up

Cox Radio (NYSE: CXR) reported that new purchases in Tampa and Louisville accounted for its 15% net revenue gain, to \$79.8 million from \$69.2 million. Broadcast cash flow was up 25%, to \$33.3 million from \$26.7 million. Same-station net revenues rose 15%, to \$75.2 million, while same-station BCF increased 27%, to \$33.2 million. Cox beat analysts'expectations by three cents, bringing 32 cents per share.

Despite a reported decrease in revenue and BCF at WSNY-FM/Columbus, OH, Saga Communications Inc. (Amex: SGA) had Q3 net revenue of \$23.9 million, up 20% from \$19.9 million the previous year. BCF was also up 20%, to \$9.8 million for the quarter. Net income for Saga was up 15%, to \$2.7 million or 20 cents per share. First Call's expectations were for 18 cents per share, but only one analyst was polled. Same-station net revenue grew 5% and BCF grew 9% in the quarter, but Saga said the numbers would have been higher had there not been a short-term decline in ratings at WSNY-FM.

Viacom Inc. (NYSE: VIA), which purchased CBS just last month, said that C3 earnings were \$111 million, up from \$86 million a year ago. Viacom hit analysts' expectations of earnings at 16 cents per share, up from 10 cents per share a year ago. Revenues were up slightly in the quarter, to \$3.33 billion from \$3.29 billion. Viacom plans to close on the CBS deal in the first halt of 2000.

Harris Corp. (NYSE: HRS) said there was some growth in international demand for its radio and TV gear, but a decline in sales for its microwave radio products meant that revenue for the commercial communications division went up only slightly, to \$203.5 million from \$201.4 million. Harris added that its costs have risen temporarily as it transitions to a pureplay communications equipment company. Harris earned 12 cents per share in the quarter, which was in line with analysts' expectations.

A merican Mobile Satellite Corp. (Nasdaq: SKYC) reported a thirdquarter EBITDA loss of \$19 million, as well as a net loss of \$66 million. The company says this was partly due to its acquisition of a majority stake in XM Satellite Radio, which had operating expenses of \$8.5 million in the quarter. At 87 cents per share, AMSC's net loss was less than First Call's estimate of \$1.02.

Net revenues for Internet music company Launch Media (Nasdaq: LAUN) were up 101%, to \$5.3 million from \$2.6 million last year. Including its acquisition of SW Networks and Musicvideos.com, pro forma revenues for the company rose to \$11.5 million in the first three quarters of '99 from \$6.1 million last year. Launch — which gets 84% of its revenue from advertising — added 30 new clients in the third quarter. At 73 cents per share, the company made two cents more than analysts expected.

# **Clear Channel Buys Ackerley's South Florida Billboards**

Clear Channel's Eller Media division will purchase Ackerley's 3,000-plus outdoor ad business in Miami-Ft. Lauderdale and West Palm Beach for \$300 million, the companies announced on Tuesday. Ackerley still has billboard divisions in Seattle-Tacoma, Boston and Portland, OR. The company said it would use the proceeds from the sale to fund future acquisitions. Clear Channel already has a heavy radio presence in the two Florida markets.

# FCC Flags Clear Channel, Cumulus Deals

C lear Channel would have a nine-station cluster and control a little more than 40% of ad revenue in the Youngstown-Warren market if it bought Gocom's WRTK-AM, WBBG-FM, WICT-FM & WTNX-FM. The FCC flagged the deal this week as both the station total and revenue share exceed commission limits. Clear Channel also owns WKBN-AM, WNIO-AM, WBTJ-FM, WMXY-FM & WNCD-FM in the market.

This week the FCC also flagged Cumulus' purchase of Cape Fear Radio's WGNI-FM & WMNX-FM/Wilmington, NC, in addition to WFNC-AM & FM, WQSM-FM & WRCQ-FM/Fayetteville, NC. According to BIA estimates, Cumulus would control slightly over 50% of the ad revenue in the Wilmington market, where it already owns WAAV-AM & FM and WWQQ-FM. In the Fayetteville market Cumulus currently has no holdings and would control less than 30% of the ad market, well below the FCC limit. However, when coupled with Beasley Broadcasting's six-group cluster in the market, the two companies would control over 80% of the market, BIA estimates show — above the FCC's 70% threshold for two entities in one market.

## FCC Fine Beat

• Acting on advice from its attorneys, Hill Country Radio — owner of four Texas radio outlets — issued new stock without filing the necessary paperwork with the FCC. The commission fined the quartet \$32,000 in August for the violation. But on learning of its mistake, Hill Country quickly filed Form 315 with the commission, and its penalty was reduced to \$12,000 last week.

• Kansas City broadcasters Michael Carter and son Miles Carter were each hit with an \$8,000 fine for what the commission says was an unauthorized transfer of control of KRLI-FM/Malta Bend, MO. The FCC said that Miles Carter built the FM CP and then in essence transferred control of the station to his father's company, KANZA Inc., which owns KAOL-AM & KMZU-FM/Kansas City and recently sold WHB-AM/Kansas City. The FCC says that although Miles Carter still owned the station in name, the station's main studio was located in the same building as the KANZA stations and was staffed and programmed by KANZA employees. Miles Carter told **R&R** that the fine is "absolutely not just," and that he believes a market competitor called the FCC to get him in trouble. Carter has 30 days to appeal the fine, and said he will probably do so.

• Willis Broadcasting stations KDLA-AM & KEAZ-FM/DeRidder, LA were fined \$5,000 for Emergency Alert System violations last week. According to the FCC, the stations failed to properly log EAS tests. The stations also failed to respond to FCC correspondence, the commission said.

# USADR's New York Digital Broadcast is Successful

USA Digital Radio conducted a final-phase on-air test over Infinity's WNEW-FM with talk host Tom Leykis at the mike Monday evening as part of the opening-night events for the fifth annual Radio Festival.

Meanwhile, the FCC last week delayed its decision on DAB rules. Without being specific about its concerns, the FCC temporarily tabled proposed rules for digital radio on which it was slated to vote. The FCC will instead vote on the item "on circulate," that is, in private. The IBOC DAB proponents — who have been waiting nearly a year for the commission to act on a petition by USADR — were not disappointed by the holdup.

# FCC Grants TV-Radio Waiver For Entravision

The FCC said last week that it will allow Entravision to add two more radio stations to its current holdings in El Paso, where the company already owns a TV station and two radio stations. It recently bought Magic Media's KATH-AM & KOFX-FM to go with KSVE-AM, KINT-FM & KINT-TV.

# State Broadcasters Slam LPFM

C omplaints about the FCC's low-power radio proposal keep pouring in. Some of the statistics put forth in comments filed last week by the North Carolina and Virginia broadcasters' associations: At least 35 million listeners across the nation could be cut off from their community broadcasters if LPFM is implemented; the service could disrupt broadcasts by FM translators to more than 9 million people; and at least 3 million blind or print-handicapped citizens will lose radio reading services.

#### Moody's Rates Emmis Stock, Debt

**M** oody's gave Emmis Communications' \$125 million convertible preferred issue a "B3" and its \$200 million senior subordinated notes due 2009 offering a "B2." The investors' service said the rating was strengthened by the broadcaster's holdings in the top 10 markets, but tempered by expectations of future acquisitions — including some on the international front. Emmis has about \$600 million under existing bank loans that it could use for potential buys.

# Gore Wants TV Stations To Give Up Time

**D**igital TV broadcasters should provide five minutes a night for political discourse during the 30 days before an election, according to new recommendations to the FCC from an advisory committee formed by Vice President Al Gore. NAB spokesman Dennis Wharton told **R&R**, however, that "broadcasters provide thousands of hours of free time each election season." It is unclear whether the commission will apply the committee's recommendations, which include requiring broadcasters to use digital technology to warn hearing- or vision-impaired people of disasters, to radio as well. "There will be no lessening of our public interest programming as we transition to digital," asserted Wharton.

# Mitsubishi Electric To Build XM Car Receivers

Mitsubishi Electric, one of the leading Japanese suppliers of factory-installed car radios, has agreed to design, develop, produce and market radios capable of receiving XM Satellite Radio when the service debuts in 2001. Alpine, Delphi Delco, Motorola, Pioneer and Sharp have signed similar agreements with XM. General Motors has invested in the satellite-to-car programmer and will market the XM service in its new cars. XM expects to pact with other automobile manufacturers as well.

In related news, Globecomm Systems has signed a \$20 million contract to provide equipment for CD Radio's network of 100-plus terrestrial repeaters in 47 cities. Specifically, Hauppauge, NY-based Globecomm will provide modulation and power amplification gear for the network. The equipment is designed to fill in gaps in coverage caused by tall buildings in urban areas.

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

# CLUSTER SELLING: THE THEORY AND THE REALITY

SALES

dio stations, one of their goals is to in-

crease billing while holding or reducing expenses. Many revenue discussions revolve around how to sell the stations in combo, trombo or whatever combination makes sense. Issues like pricing, packaging and whether to have separate or combined sales staffs rise to the forefront of short- and long-term planning.

While the visions of group heads and owners drive radio's success, salespeople are the ones who actually get it done on a daily basis. It's at the sales level where theory stops and "the rubber hits the road." While owners talk of consolidation, however, the traditional radio sales model features separate staffs for each

station, and most salespeople have little experience in selling clusters.

The national sales environment breeds some of the best clusterselling **e**xperts in the country. The Katz Radio Group Dimensions sales staff has been cluster selling for years. From the national standpoint, we have seen many examples of what works and what doesn't.

The best way to sell clusters? We've found there really is no one "best" method. However, after many discussions, meetings and experiences, there is one thing of which we're absolutely certain:

Anyone who claims to have all the answers is probably wrong! Each cluster sales situation is different. Just as you cannot apply a cookie cutter approach to programming, there is no one way of selling clusters effectively.

But we can still use our experience to develop some general guidelines that apply across all situations. Here are three: People follow the money, follow their leaders and look for consistency.

#### **PEOPLE FOLLOW MONEY**

A station's commission structure largely determines how people interact and cooperate with each other. While every seller may agree in principle to help the sister station, there's an old but very simple management philosophy that applies to selling clusters: People follow the money! If the GSM and salespeople are paid for their station's performance and not on cluster performance, they will tend to protect their interests first and their sister stations' second.

Beyond financial incentives, management also has to fully support cluster selling. Colin Powell said, "Soldiers watch what their leaders do. You can give them classes and lecture them forever, but

When owners buy ra- it is your personal example that they will follow." Management support for cluster selling translates to seller support. Mixed or negative signals lead to confused and ineffective sales efforts.

> Here's an example: A station pitches an order for \$100,000. If we ask the station to change its pitch so it takes \$80,000 and its sister station can also get \$80,000, what happens? The \$160,000 cluster order turns into "bad business" for the station that would have gotten \$100,000. While the combination sell sounds good in theory, stations will compete for each dollar until someone in authority sells everyone on the value of the combined billing model.

Hand-in-hand with that is the importance of consistent focus. Sometimes the sales staff for station A supports cluster selling in the initial

stage, only to be confronted by the successful "old school" salesperson who has seen it all before. That salesperson's philosophy? Just keep doing what you're doing, and this new approach will blow over eventually. Unfortunately, management often looks the other way, not wanting to rock the boat with one of its most productive sellers.

When this happens, the staff for station B sees the lack of cooperation and refuses to work with A. Then the finger-pointing starts. Each station feels it is willing to work together, but "the other station" refuses to partici-

pate. Until management "thinks cluster" — and salespeople are paid to think cluster — it all just amounts to meetings and lip service.

Once the internal focus is aligned on group selling, the staff needs to market this position to clients and buyers. Based on our experience, here are some pointers.

First, Sales 101 tells us the majority of business depends on the relationship between buyer and seller. If a salesperson holds the position of preferred supplier, then the more the seller has to sell, the more the buyer can buy. In fact, each cluster seller becomes more valuable: The buyer's "favorite" salesperson can provide the whole market and deliver stations that match advertiser objectives.

With so many stations to offer, a salesperson can perform a true customer needs analysis, then target stations to meet those goals. The more focused that salesperson is on customer needs ---and the better the relationship with the person making the buying decisions — the more cluster sales will take place.

# **COMPASSION MAKES A DIFFERENCE**

"One of the most important factors in evaluating someone is the compassion

factor," said renowned jury consultant Jo-Ellan Dimitrius. Dimitrius, who helped Johnnie Cochran select the O.J. Simpson jury, told me about how one juror's compassion caught her attention. In 1998 Dimitrius was working with Francis Ford Coppola's attorney in Coppola's breach of contract suit against Warner Bros.

'Francis was going to create a remake of the classic Pinocchio, a project he was doing as a tribute to his son, who'd died a few years before in a tragic boating accident. During jury selection we had a Hispanic gentleman in his 50s who shared with us that he was a juvenile camp counselor in L.A. and had four children of his own and five foster children living with him at home. Just in that disclosure it became clear to me this was a man who really cared for children.



"What really pulled me in ... after he was questioned, the woman who followed him was in her 70s and started to cough uncontrollably. This man jumped up and said, 'Your honor, I know

CPR, and I'm going to help her.' He was compassionate and clearly a caretaker. He was not intimidated by the judge. He just did what needed to be done."

Dimitrius wanted this compassionate man on the jury, and Warner Bros.' counsel didn't object. So what happened? "The jury decided \$20 million in compensatory damages and \$60 million in punitive damages against Warner Bros. When I talked to the jurors afterward, he told me he was the juror leading the charge for \$125 million in punitive damages."

Compassion is something all of us need. Those who sincerely offer it often become successful because they're less judgmental, readily willing to help and want others to do well. Most people reciprocate those feelings.

Another important tip: When you visit an organization, use your powers of observation. Notice the building exterior, lobby, hallways and work space. Is the facility well-maintained or rundown? Are visitors given a warm welcome, or is there an impersonal reception area? Do the employees work diligently? Is there laughter? Is there profanity? What do they display on the walls? You're surrounded by revealing signs if you're paying attention.

Dimitrius says, "When you go into an individual's office, notice everything from the pictures on the credenza to the golf clubs in the corner. You can form a mutuality of interest. If I see a picture of a ski scene or a soccer picture of children, I'll ask about it. You've taken the time to notice these things, and you tend to get more self-disclosure. You've entered their emotional space. If you self-disclose, 'I have three children; I'm a skier and a soccer mom,' you're giving that person comfort and freedom to relate to you." It's also a great conversation starter, something many people need.

# CLUSTER SELLING: The theory and the reality

## **DETERMINE VALUE**

The cluster seller has to remain focused on providing value. This becomes more important as the cluster's size increases. No one buys stations just because someone owns and pitches the cluster. For a cluster sale to take place and for the owner to get more business than in the past, at least one of the following value propositions needs to be met. Of course, some are more desirable than others. Based on your cluster situation and the sale, determine which of these are appropriate:

• **Target delivery** All stations should provide a valuable targeted auchence that's right for the advertiser. Stations that do not deliver the audience the advertiser covets will create resistance to the overall package.

• **Pricing**: There may need to be a monetary incentive, possibly an overall volume discount. While we don't like it, and owners don't want it, discounts are a common incentive in any business today. Under certain circumstances people need to use them. The trick is to offer pricing only when it makes sense, not as an easy way to increase share.

• **Simplicity**: Cluster buys can make the buyer's life easier, offering market delivery, efficient pricing and one negotiation. However, the seller should recognize that the client monitors what the buyer does, so make sure the decisionmaker buys in to the pitch.

• **Promotional value that did not exist before**: As an example, the top station in the market wants high rates but will not give much in terms of promotion. A lower-tier sister station wants the business and would do anything for it. The buyer can get the promotion on the top station as an incentive to buy the lower-tier station.

• Coordinated added-value: The synergy among co-owned stations makes it possible to offer

promotions where the combined value exceeds that of individual packages. Stations can now run promotions that complement each other instead of offering disjointed plans that show little value or create confusion for the advertiser and listener.

• Increased added-value: Again, this may not be what we want, but it is something the buyer wants and something that can close a cluster sale. This list includes on- and off-air promotions as well as creative use of the station's website.

### **NO NEGATIVE SELLING**

Our experience also tells us that negative selling doesn't sit well in today's cluster environment. While negative selling was never admirable, now it's suicidal. Today's positioning needs to be precise and positive. By definition, clusters include many stations and formats, some of which look less desirable to any specific buyer. We believe that cluster selling forces salespeople to keep a broader perspective, with a focus on market delivery. That's helped move salespeople away from the "us against the world" mentality that leads to negative selling.

So the bottom line on cluster selling is ... there is no single "right" way. People must be flexible in today's world, stressing their relationships and focusing on the client's needs. Some of this sounds so simplistic, but knowing you should do something is sometimes very different from actually getting it done.

Perhaps the most crucial requirement is a management approach that rewards teamwork over individual sales performance. Just like there is no "I" in team, there's little room for single-station focus in a well-structured cluster selling situation.

# RADIO IMPROVES SIOUX CITY JEAN POOL

SITUATION: WJ Denims, a division of Aalfs Manufacturing, is a factory outlet store that wanted to promote selected clothing merchandise at "everyday low prices." Specific brands of jeans, shirts and shorts were to be targeted over a two-week period. The store had not used radio recently, but agreed to try the medium after being convinced that it could communicate a more personal message than print and prove more cost-effective than television.

**OBJECTIVE:** Increase sales by building the name awareness of WJ Denims. **CAMPAIGN:** WJ Denims ran a schedule of 68 commercials over a threeday period on Country KSUX/Sioux City, IA to build weekend sales (the ads ran Thursday, Friday and Saturday). The ad targeted adults with children. Produced by KSUX staff members, the commercial provided a creative, high-energy identity, making full use of sound effects and other production resources.

**RESULTS:** WJ Denims received immediate feedback from the commercials broadcast on KSUX. Listeners called the store to inquire about specific products advertised as price points, and store employees heard "KSUX" as the answer when polling walk-in customers about where they had heard about the store. Most importantly, sales increased on the days of advertising. These three measurement devices were a clear indication that radio gets results and contributed to the fact that WJ Denims continues to use radio for its advertising.

# **NETAID EXTENDS RADIO'S REACH**

Consolidation's brought plenty of talk about selling properties in combination, both within markets and

on a chainwide basis. But have you thought about the Internet and how it is, in effect, consolidating the global marketplace?

As e-commerce grows and the 'Net allows brands to be marketed across national borders, there's an international marketplace just starting to be tapped, and radio again has the opportunity to capitalize. Tom Rounds knows. As President of Radio Express, he was able to participate in a broadcast that was able to break through international borders, reaching 121 countries with a single commercial message.

As primary sponsor of the event, Rounds explained, Cisco Systems was trying to accomplish three things. First, it wanted to set up the world's biggest Internet server, capable of handling more hits than any before. Second, it wanted to promote the fact that it had made this technological breakthrough. Finally, it wanted to put the two together in an event that would not only showcase the technology, but also act as a catalyst to promote social awareness and change. Thus was born NetAid.

"The radio coverage extended the reach of an event like this way beyond anything that could've been done 10 or 15 years ago for Live Aid," Rounds noted. "There's now a common denominator music format, International Hit Radio. It's more or less what you'd see on the CHR chart, except there's more European influence. So the talent lineup made it what we'd call 'an easy clear,' because we're set up and in contact with stations from Bermuda to Bhutan."

But because of the Internet component and Cisco Systems' involvement, there were interesting hurdles to be cleared. To spread the message about the website and generate hits. any station airing the show had to air at least 150 NetAid spots citing Cisco as the sponsor. "What Cisco wanted to do was make sure it had a lot of hits and that it wouldn't crash,' said Rounds. "And they handled some 40 million hits from 160 countries. In terms of delivering the message Cisco Systems wanted to deliver, it got done. And of course everything was focused on the United Nations Development Program and ending poverty. So we were able to get - framed in a high-minded kind of way - a commercial message out in 121 countries. That's quite a feat. I don't think anybody's been able to do that before. It has opened up a new avenue for global radio advertising that didn't exist before

"The Internet may be changing all that, because there are no 'local' operations with any of the Internet companies. It's something without country borders, with budgets that are set up to reach the entire world, and good old radio is showing a huge amount of strength not only domestically with the Internet, but also globally."

physicality of consolidation - putting stations together. Phase two is where the real opportunities exist. You take that cluster and effectively grow market share. That will drive considerable growth."

While Morgan Stanley Dean Witter analyst Frank Bodenchak is bullish overall on the radio business and its future, he told Wilson, Weening and those attending the "Charting Trends in Values, Markets and Multiples" session that he is "very nervous that radio is reaching a peak in consolidation. He said he expects a rise in interest rates next year that could cool the consolidation fever.

"A recession is inevitable," Wilson said. "We'll have one at some point, but when we have one, I want my money in radio. This is a hell of a lot better business than we ever thought it would be." And it's not all bad in Bodenchak's book either: "Wall Street is looking at radio on a long-term basis."

# Friedman: Capitol/Nash. Reg. Promo Dir.

#### **Minority Ownership Gets Boost**

Minority-owned station groups will win big as a result of the Clear Channel-AMFM merger, figured the panelists. "I wish I were a minority," Wilson said. "Look at what Radio One stock is doing these days."

Bodenchak said a recent meeting with FCC commissioners convinced him that a more diverse set of radio station owners is "clearly in the mandate" at the commission. Bodenchak estimated that with perhaps as much as \$35 billion in unconsolidated stations potentially available, along with the possible return of the minority tax certificate, minority radio owners have much to gain over the near term.

**Small-Market Radio: A Solid Investment** 

"Strategically clustered smallmarket radio is a wonderful investment," Alta Communications Managing General Partner Brian McNeill said during a session on clustering of mid-sized markets called "The New Upside Potential." "The biggest problem out there: Prices are in danger of getting unsustainably high. Multiples are going up for the right reason, because of increased cash flow ... but also for the wrong reason, because of trickle-down from large-market radio, where demand for stations has driven up station prices."

Finding seasoned radio professionals is also difficult in smaller markets. Connoisseur Communications President Jeffrey Warshaw said his group makes a concerted effort to train and retain" staff. But according to Three Eagles Communications Chairman/CEO Rolland Johnson, "The worst thing for small-market stations will be if low-power FM is allowed. That will have a huge impact on station growth and revenues."

"The stumbling block is BMI's insistence on pricing the licenses as a percentage of revenue," he said. 'That's the way it has been historically, but the radio industry has changed dramatically in the last few years. BMI needs to recognize that."

A judge will apparently have to decide the matter. This is the first time the parties have been able to go before a judge to get a ruling in a license fee dispute. The rate court, which is where the suit was filed, was created in 1994 by the Justice Department.

BMI said in a press release that it

## 'Blanket' License Also At Issue

The RMLC is also asking the court to amend one other aspect of BMI's licensing arrangements. BMI currently charges radio stations based on either "blanket" license agreements or "program" license agreements. The RMLC says many stations fall into the "blanket" arrangement even though they use very little BMI music. Meehan says his group would prefer that stations only have to pay for the music they actually use.

In an industry where one of the major broadcast groups controls three of the top five syndicated talk shows out there, Talk America is looking to give stations the biggest choice of programs we possibly can, so that they can be competitive in their marketplace.

"It's not easy to build a network with a small amount of initial capital and limited resources, but Talk America President and co-founder Tom Star and the late John Crohan before him have managed to do just that. I believe we are now poised to take Talk America to the next level, and one of the ways I will be helping to do that is through attracting more investor capital to the network from the more traditional source of going to the public."



# FCC Allows KZRO Sale Despite Protest From KSOR

N PR affiliate KSOR-FM/Ashland, OR contested the 1996 sale of KZRO-FM/Dunsmuir, CA to Big Tree Communications. KSOR claimed KZRO owner Fatima Response lied to the commission in 1993 when it said it was incorporated in Oregon. According to Ron Kramer, Executive Director of KSOR licensee Jefferson Public Radio, in 1996 Fatima suddenly said it was incorporated in California, Kramer told R&R that behavior was "a flagrant abuse of commission rules." One source close to the deal told R&R, however, that Jefferson was competing fiercely for the Dunsmuir frequency when it became available in the early 1990s. In dismissing KSOR's claims earlier this month, the FCC said that it won't consider state incorporation issues that haven't been weighed by a state court.



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

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
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# FM Talk: The Future Is Now

Syndicator stakes his claim on Talk radio's next big wave

ver the past few years there's been a lot of speculation that Talk radio - traditionally and primarily an AM product --- will soon join the ranks of successful music stations and offer a whole new breed of Talk stations on the FM band.

One individual who is preaching the gospel of the "new generation" of FM Talk radio with the passion and fervor of a an evangelist at a revival meeting is Fisher Entertainment President Glenn Fisher.

The 31-year-old entrepreneur is literally betting his company's future on the success of FM Talk.

Just this past week his Santa Cruz, CA-based syndication company launched two new daily talk shows aimed specifically at the growing FM Talk radio market. Those two new shows, along with a third already established talk program, mean that Fisher now offers 11 hours a day of full-time talk programming that is squarely aimed at the younger demographics coveted by evolving FM Talkers. syndicated The John and Ken Show into more than 100 markets in under two years (1997-1999), Fisher suddenly found himself without the benefit of his company's biggest calling card this past March, when John and Ken opted out of the syndication business to join Drew Hayes' new team at KABC/Los Angeles as the station's new morning drive hosts. Forced to rethink his future whether he wanted to or not -Fisher decided to change his company's priorities to providing programming for what he sees as a rising tide of "new generation" Talk radio stations.

"I knew the old paradigm of Talk radio was going to undergo a profound shift simply because of the aging population," says Fisher. "People my age - in their late 20s and early

30s — are moving into good jobs, buying homes, having children, etc. They're thinking people with no desire to listen to Mariah Carey records all day long. There's no reason why Talk won't appeal to this generation, other than the fact that they are primarily FM radio listeners and most of today's available talk programming is still on the AM band. Our company aims to change that."

I recently caught up with Fisher as he was about to launch a coastto-coast tour searching for underperforming stations, which he sees as candidates for FM Talk. If your station is one that Fisher sets his sights on, expect a visit and a barrage of phone calls from this tireless proponent of what he firmly believes is the No. 1 growth format of the new millennium

R&R: Tell us how you first got bitten by the Talk radio bug.


GF: In 1985, when I was a 17year-old high school kid growing up in New York. I got a job interning at WNBC-AM. Growing up, it was always my favorite radio station. In retrospect, WNBC was sort of like an FM Talk station today, with personalities all day long. There were some unbelievably great talents on that station in its day - people like Imus, Soupy Sales, Big Wilson, Wolfman Jack and, of course, Howard Stern, It was a station with lots of improvisation, lots of phone calls and lots of self-expression by the personalities on the air. It was like nothing else on New York radio at that time. So I'd have to say that being at WNBC in those days is what really set me on a course to want to be in Talk radio.

R&R: So did you finally get that chance to host your own talk show? GF: Yes, after graduating from college I got a chance to host evenings at a little AM station in Albuquerque where I lasted all of about three months. I got on the air and started doing this liberal talk show in an area that was pretty conservative politically. I mixed with the listeners about as well as oil and water, so I soon found out what it felt like to get fired in radio. Following that I had a brief stint as a host in Ft. Myers, FL before moving to New York to work with MJI Broadcasting. Ultimately I moved back to Northern California to form Fisher Entertainment. where our first big success was syndicating The John and Ken Show.

R&R: What led you to your current concept of building much of your company around products targeted to FM Talk radio?

GF: The majority of successful morning shows on music FM stations across the country are talk shows. Howard Stern, Mancow, Bob and

Tom, Mark and Brian — they're all talk shows, and young people listen to them. Is there some unwritten rule out there that at 10am stations have to stop being entertaining and just play 10-in-a-row? Why shouldn't a radio station that is No. 1 in mornings with an all-talk show continue doing talk in middays, afternoons and nights? To date, most of the top 50 markets don't have a station doing all talk on FM, and I find that to be amazing. So I think there's a lot of potential for growth out there.

**R&R:** Why do you think the long-predicted growth of Talk on FM has taken so long to get started?

**GF:** The main reasons, in my opinion, are a shortage of talent and an economic barrier. Until recently there was not a lot of syndicated programming, as there is for more traditional AM Talkers, that an FM station could rely on in order to switch to Talk. And the cost of getting enough good local hosts — that's assuming you could even find them — is prohibitive in comparison to being the 10-in-a-row music station. The real benefit to doing

Talk on FM is increased inventory and revenues and a unique position. But that isn't something that happens right away. You have to first gain the position and get branded in the market as the FM Talk station. Now, with the syndicated shows

that are available from our company — along with shows from other suppliers — FM stations finally have a way to flip to all-Talk economically and establish a position that will allow them to grow their revenues over time. That will then allow them to eventually add more local programs to their mix of shows and become established in the same way that AM Talkers have been able to do over the past 10 years or so.

**R&R:** So you think that promoting syndicated shows to would-be FM Talk stations will actually be good for local talents?

GF: Absolutely! If we can be a catalyst to help stations make that flip to Talk, in the end it's going to present great opportunities for local talents, because it will open up a whole new group of stations not currently in the format that will become a lot of new prospective employers for talk talent. And it's syndication that will make it economically feasible for many of those stations to make the move to FM Talk. It's good for local talents and for syndicators. because the more outlets there are for Talk programming, the better it will be for all of us.

**R&R:** How do you respond to critics who say that most of the socalled new generation of talk hosts on FM are primarily focused on T&A and sex, and that they lack enough substance to sustain any long-term success?

**GF:** 1 agree. I think those hosts who rely on T&A and sexual themes as the majority of their content day in and day out will be very short-lived. Sure, they'll have immediate and early ratings spikes, just like a pop song that you play over and over until it's a hit, but then you get to the point where you don't ever want to hear it again. Although I think that sex certainly has its place in everyone's life, and Talk radio should reflect that, I also think that it shouldn't be more than maybe 25% or so of any host's content overall. The other 75% should be about all the other subjects out there that young adults in the target demographic talk about every day.

**R&R:** Your company now has three programs targeted to FM Talk. Give us a rundown of those shows and what you think the essence of each one is.

**GF:** Let's take them in the order in which they air. First up is Ed Tyll, who airs from noon-3pm ET, then Rick Emerson from 3-7pm ET and finally our newest show, John and Jeff, from 2-6am ET. Ed's show is what I'd call witty lifestyle talk delivered by a guy with just a bit of a sarcastic edge to him. Ed challenges the way you think about things and gets you to view life from a different point of view.

Rick Emerson is also somebody who makes you think. He looks at

the world from the perspective of a thirtysomething guy, so he really relates to the target demographic of FM Talk stations.

John and Jeff are two guys who came to my attention from Jack Silver, Program Director at KLSX-FM/ Los Angeles. Jack really deserves all the credit for nurturing and developing these guys over the last year or so. John is a New York City guy from the Bronx, and Jeff is a West Coast surfer dude. Their chemistry together is great, and they're just natural FM Talk entertainers.

**R&R:** In a world where big networks dominate the syndication field, do you find it to be any disadvantage being a smaller independent company?

GF: Well first of all, I have to take my hat off to Infinity Broadcasting, because they have given me the opportunity to launch two of our syndicated shows from a couple of their major-market stations — John and Jeff originate at KLSX in L.A., and Ed Tyll has recently relocated to Detroit, where he broadcasts from WKRK-FM. They have made it economically viable for my company to launch those shows, and I'm obviously very grateful to them for that opportunity.


That being said, being a smaller independent really offers us a tremendous amount of flexibility to move quickly on any show, from conception to bringing it to the marketplace. Some larger operations can take months or even a year to bring a show to the market, whereas we, for example, were able to develop John and Jeff's syndication deal in less than a month. In some of these large corporate situations the decisionmaking process can be so constipated that, in my opinion, it puts them at a creative disadvantage in many instances. It's just the way corporate structures tend to be. So no, I see no disadvantage to being an independent at all. 1 think it is definitely to our advantage.

**R&R:** What's the mission statement for Fisher Entertainment, and where do you hope to see the company headed in the next few years?

GF: "If you build it, they will come" would have to be our mission statement. We want to be the catalyst for helping any station that is considering making the switch to FM Talk to take the plunge. We want you to call Fisher Entertainment first. We'll help you to develop a consistent on-air lineup and quality Talk product that includes not only our own shows, but we'll also help you to identify and secure shows from other syndicators. We can even assist you in finding potential local talents for your station.

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

The "Dowling Dump" transmitter site was struck by fire, rendering KGOT's transmitter beyond repair just as the station was about to give away \$5,000 in a major promotion. PD/morning man Bill Stewart said KGOT was able to get by on "lightbulb" power for a few days while it awaited a replacement transmitter from Seattle. Station staffers kept their humor throughout the ordeal, however. Billy Joel's "We Didn't Start the Fire" got bumped up in rotation, and marshmallows were a big giveaway item over the weekend!

# 'Kissed' By Good Fortune





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

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## **Rossdale On The Science Of Things**

Bush lead singer/songwriter talks about group's new album and why he's a happy man

fter talking with Bush's **Gavin Rossdale**, you can't help but walk away with the sense that the singer/songwriter and the band are at the top of their game.

The group's first single, "The Chemicals Between Us," taken from its forthcoming Trauma Records album, *The Science of Things*, set a record by closing out the entire Alternative panel its first official day at radio. And no doubt the new disc will fly off the shelves at retail when it's released on Oct. 26.

But it's more than just the numbers. It's the way Rossdale discusses how the band recorded the new album; how he now feels onstage; how he's becoming less wrapped up in the intensity of marketing and promoting the album and is more into savoring the moment. It's also evident in the way he talks about the band's continued commitment to shaking hands and kissing babies with the media and fans. They haven't yet soured on the process.

Artistry aside. the last point has probably been the key reason for Bush's rise to prominence. Bush's music connects with rock fans, but the group fortifies that bond by remaining accessible. Add it all up, and it's no wonder the group has sold some 15 million albums worldwide and that the new disc is one of the mostanticipated rock releases of the year.

**R&R:** You seem to be in a very upbeat mood considering all the things you have to do in the next few weeks.

**GR:** I've decided to be very unpunk and find ways to really enjoy the process of the record coming out, because it doesn't happen that much. I want to enjoy myself and see the good side of things.

**R&R:** Why weren't you able to do that during previous releases?

**GR:** There always seemed to be different kinds of problems going on or personal issues. It feels really good just to fucking let go, accept myself and where I am and get on with it.

**R&R:** Let's talk about the record in general. What did you want to capture on this album?

**GR:** I wanted to make a record that was more hi-fi than the last one, *Razorblade Suitcase*. I was really proud of that one because it was so naked and raw. Many people would have thought it was a bad commercial move, which is precisely why I loved it. But I felt trying to make it more manicured would have been a dangerous move after *Sixteen Stone*.

So many people make records out of fear, and I wanted get rid of that fear and make an irreverent one that would be part of our career path, as opposed to worrying that our career would be dead if we didn't have another *Sixteen Stone*. That allowed us to do a more manicured record this time around, to be more reflective and to address a wider range of sounds and ideas. The last album I wrote in 10 pretty intense days. On this one I spent about three months and wrote about 25 songs.

**R&R:** It sounds like you purposely spent more time with the songs in order to smooth out the edges — or put the rough edges in at the appropriate places.

**GR:** I wanted a situation where I could put down a different idea, and then we could all experiment and sort them out. It was a lot of fun.

**R&R:** Sonically, you branched out on this album.

**GR:** A lot of it had to do with the music I was listening to at the time. But you always have to be pushing

some kind of envelope. In a way the band pulled me back more than I envisioned. I would have been more experimental, but they wanted to do more rock songs. We reached a great balance; we are a band after all. I have to be conscious of their feelings and what they want to do.

**R&R:** It's been close to two years since Razorblade Suitcase was released. Would you have liked this record to come out sooner?

**GR:** Yes. Obviously there were some legal issues we had to deal with. But I believe in the spirit of Tao and synchronicity. Everything is working so well now, it's not an issue.

Originally, this album was going to come out around Woodstock, and our show there would have been our triumphant return. It was going to be a marketing wet dream, and it got all fucked up. But we ended up being the "antisell band," which is kind of rare these days. We were doing shows, but we weren't plugging any album. We were just out there playing, which we hadn't done for about two years.

It was a marketing hernia that worked in our favor, I think, because it ended up lending a purity that's sorely lacking in the music business. So much is done purely for commercial gain, and I think the music is suffering greatly from that. The whole industry seems to be run with an angle of fear. People are scared of losing their jobs because of all these mergers. No wonder the music scene is a little tired — so much of the energy has been taken out of it.

In the '60s people never had to contend with the Internet or computer games or films. There was so much

more rebellion and freedom. Now you have to fight with everything else just to get a little bit of space.

**R&R:** I commend you guys for doing those shows. Most bands would have just shelved the performances and waited until the release date. But I have to believe doing the shows strengthened the bond you have with your fans. Do you agree?

**GR:** Yeah. I don't know what it is, but I'm really happy about the way things are going. We were playing the other night — I think it was in Augusta, GA — and I felt the strangest connection, like I could be playing to 25,000 people, but it felt like I was playing to only one person in the room yet was still totally attuned to what was going on. I don't think it was the tequila talking. It was for real. I remember thinking, "How the fuck did this happen?" It was pretty intense. It made all this craziness and travel worth it.

**R&R:** Bush has a commendable

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"In a way the band pulled me back more than I envisioned. I would have been more experimental, but they wanted to do more rock songs. We reached a great balance; we are a band after all."

road ethic when it comes to the U.S. Why don't other British bands follow suit?

**GR:** It's a funny thing. When we started this band, I remember it seemed like a terrible commercial decision, because Brit pop was so popular at the time. But I always had a job, and then I'd go out and play, which is more like the American punk ethic. There's a strange feeling in England that if you're in a band, you just have to sign on welfare and then sit around and wait for the world to come to you. If they don't, then it's the world's fault, not yours.

After we made *Sixteen Stone*, we lost our distribution deal, and I had to go back to work for something like seven months. It broke my heart to do it, but I had to. I had to eat and pay my rent just like any regular person.

**R&R:** You reached out to your fans again, like many other bands, via MP3. How important is it for Bush to remain connected to the younger fans, who are increasingly Internet-savy?

**GR:** You have to have a handle on what's going on, and the Internet is very exciting. People have been talking about the Internet for the past 15 years, but it's still in its infancy in terms of what it's going to do and how it's going to dominate our lives. It's great to be at the forefront of that.

**R&R:** Bush continues to do several radio festivals each year despite the general feeling in the industry that festivals are a big hassle for everyone involved except the radio station. How important are those shows to the group?

**GR:** I've never minded them. Some people say they suck and hate doing them, but I always saw them as a chance to play for people. Also, you get to play for people who wouldn't necessarily come to see you. They came to see other bands. I like going up against the unconverted. I love to fly in the face of that.

**R&R:** I'm surprised that hasn't gotten old to you yet.

**GR:** No, I love it, and I think the reason is because I started late in this business. Music is like all the women I've ever known in my life. It's the greatest mystery.

**R&R:** Let's talk a little about some of the songs on the album. What's up with you and machines?

**GR:** I am obsessed by machines, aren't I? To me, machines are the mechanism for the future. Machines are progress. A warm machine could be either a person or a savior.

I also wanted the idea of having another song like "Greedy Fly." "State of mind" songs are what I call them. And I liked the idea of starting the album with the line "I memorized the basics," which represents all of us trying to get on with life. And the line "making strange faces" is how we have to contort ourselves to conform and get on within society. The warm machine was this savior, a mechanism of getting from A to B, with B being a good place.

**R&R:** What's your favorite song on the album?

**GR:** "English Fire," because it's me at my most twisted, and it's the most progressive song on the album. I couldn't have written that song on the first two albums because I wasn't good enough. It represents a hardening of my musical arteries.

**R&R:** I understand the song "Letting the Cables Sleep" is a tribute to a friend who had AIDS?


GR: Yes. It's primarily a song about communication. It's a very emotional song. It's easily a love song. One of the themes at the core of the album is communication, because words are the source of everything — the source of understanding and progress. My friend didn't want to tell anyone he was HIV-positive because of the stigma attached to it. That made me feel pretty bad about not being there for him and that he couldn't tell us what was going on. It struck me that to reach a place of peace and happiness, it's important to communicate in order to get there.

**R&R:** What I like about your music is the combination of polish and rough edges and that the tyrics always hold out some kind of hope.

**GR:** There has to be. It can't be either "nothing can stop us now" or decay and destruction. The best lyric on the album is "the only way out is through," which I believe is a famous philosopher's line.

I'm really an optimistic person, but I'm totally obsessed with death because I love life so much. I'm so aware of how fragile we are and how temporary everything is. But I'm also obsessed with contradiction. I hope that's why we have so many fans, that they see the honesty about all the contradiction. I'm very contradictory myself. I'm 17 people at least, and I don't think I'm unique. That's the job of anyone who writes songs, to find a way to say things so people say, "Fuck, yeah. That's totally how I feel and where I'm at."

At the end of the day Bob Dylan said everything there has to be said in songs. Once he wrote his songs, what's the point of anyone writing anything else? Well, the point is that we all have different ways of expressing similar things. You just have to use newer language. As for the subject matter, he covered it.



## Hot AC To Beth Hart: We Love 'L.A.'

Superstar records are flooding radio, but newcomers continue to get a shot. The latest example is **Beth Hart**, whose new single, "L.A. Song," taken from her new album, *Screamin' for My Supper*, has broken through at Hot AC and is beginning to show significant growth at CHR/Pop and other formats.

Stations supporting the 143/Lava/ Atlantic singer/songwriter's ballad include Hot ACs such as WPLJ/New York, KYSR/Los Angeles, WTMX/ Chicago, WBMX/Boston, WWMX/

Baltimore, WXPT/Minneapolis. KHMX/Houston, WVRV/St. Louis, KZON/Phoenix. KLLC/San Francisco, KFMB/San Diego, KZZO/ Sacramento and KBBT/Portland, and CHR/Pop outlets WXKS/Boston, WWZZ/Washington, WKRQ/Cincinnati, KJYO/Oklahoma City and KZZP/Phoenix.

This is the second time around for Hart, who was discovered busking on the Third Street Promenade in Santa Monica, CA. Her rock-based debut and a long 1995 tour, which included Lollapalooza, won over fans. But on her new disc Hart softened the rock edge and branched out even more, cowriting with such songwriters as Glen Burtnick (Patti Smith, Don Henley), Lanny Cordola and the Los Angeles team of Gregg Sutton and Bob Thiele. She also produced several tracks on the album with longtime collaborator Tal Herzberg and Oliver Leiber.

Recalling Hart's work on this new album, 143 Head/A&R Jaymes Foster-Levy said, "She really spread her wings a bit on this album, and I think working with the other producers and songwriters helped. They really supported her and encouraged her to express herself, and she came through."

"She really opened up her heart on this album and matured as a producer and a songwriter," comments 143 President Larry Frazin, who provided A&R direction along with Foster-Levy, 143 founder David Foster and Lava President Jason Flom.

Realizing that Screamin' for My Supper represented a departure from Hart's previous album, Atlantic Records opted to work Hot AC this time around. Atlantic Sr. VP/Promotion **Danny Buch** comments, "We were fortunate in that we got of couple of important programmers to believe early on. It's a slow ballad, but those people heard it and really started supporting it. When you have a record like this, you don't need the razzle-dazzle of being Most Added or whatever. It's much better when you can piece together several success stories and then spread them. And now we're starting to see great research, like at WXKS, where the song is No. 1 18-49."

And piecing together success stories is exactly what Atlantic has done. In markets where "L.A. Song" is receiving significant airplay, such as Boston, New York and Minneapolis, the album has become a top 200-selling disc. What's also interesting about those sales is that Atlantic has only now begun its price and positioning campaign for the disc.

Over at KYSR "L.A. Song" was the first single MD **Chris Patyk** was worked on when he joined the station. "I literally drove from Phoenix to L.A. and walked in the door, and that first day the Atlantic reps started talking to me about the song," says Patyk, who initially spun the cut at night. "All I could think of is. 'Boy, isn't this fitting."

The song got a big boost when KYSR PD Angela Perelli heard the track during the station's nightly "Midnight Snack" feature. Patyk continues, "She immediately and absolutely fell in love with it."

As for the song's appeal, Patyk observes, "It has a universal theme of wanting to change your life or make a break. I think everybody can relate to that and has felt that way at one point in his or her lifetime."

With airplay at Hot AC off and running — the label has pretty much locked up the major markets and now has to secure the secondaries — Atlantic is now turning up the heat at CHR. Buch notes, "If you look at CHR, you're seeing credible artists getting a shot. But if you look closer at the songs, you'll see people want realness to their lyrics."

Interestingly, an early concern about Hart's single was that it was too Los Angeles-oriented and that it wouldn't translate well to other markets. That's certainly not the case at WYOY/Jackson, MS, where the album is thisclose to breaking into the top 100 sellers in that market after only a few weeks of medium-rotation airplay. Comments WYOY PD Kevin Vaughan, whose station has consistently ranked among the four most-listened-to outlets in the city, "We saw a good indication of how much people liked the record when she opened for Edwin McCain in August. Nobody knew who she was, but there was such a buzz from her performance that the stores couldn't keep the record in stock. Then we saw the early buzz at some pretty influential stations and felt compelled to support it, and it's really starting to pay off for us."


Going forward, Hart will complete her headlining tour of Hard Rock Cafes, presented by American Express. She'll perform in Boston on Nov. 1, New York on Nov. 2, Philadelphia on Nov. 3, Washington on Nov. 4, Atlanta on Nov. 9 and Miami on Nov. 11. Another major tour is also in the works.

Screamin' for My Supper was released on August 3 and is scanning around 3,000 copies a week. To date it has scanned nearly 20,000 copies.

Ready For Takeoff: The Bihlman Bros.

Down 'n' dirty blues rock fans might want to take a listen to the northern Michigan group the **Bihlman Bros.**' forthcoming new album, *Sweet Tooth*, which is set to be released on Nov. 19 on their own label, **Steelhead Records**. The group's new single, "Burnin' in My Soul," has become a staple at Rock **WKLT/NW Michigan**. The song has been the No. 1 requested song at the station for the past three weeks. *Day by Day*, the band's debut CD, sold about 1,800 copies.

The band, which features Jeff on guitar and vocals and Scot on drums, has been together for about two years and has played with some of the biggest names in blues-rock around, including Buddy Guy, ZZ Top and Ray Charles. The group also supported Son Seals during the latter's recent performance at the White House ... Congrats to ska/rock outfit Edna's Goldfish, who ink a development deal with RCA Records. --Steve Wonsiewicz

Paul Arthurs, who exited the group in August. Oasis have yet to find a bassist to succeed Paul McGuigan, who left in the summer. Oasis' new album, *Where Did It All Go Wrong*, will be released in February, while the leadoff single, "Go Let It Out,"



will be serviced to radio in January. In the meantime the group will play a series of radio festivals in the U.S. in December, with the first on Dec. 3 for Alternative **WPLY**/**Philadelphia**.

New to the fold: Danny Goldberg's Artemis Records has signed Steve Earle and formed a joint venture with E-Squared Records, the label owned by Earle and partner Jack Emerson. The new partnership will release the Philadelphia-based band Marah's new album next spring. Earle is expected to begin work on his first E-Squared/ Artemis release in November ... Online record label >en.music group, headed by Gary Gersh and John Silva, has signed the El Paso-based band at.the.drive.in. Look for their new album next spring ... CMC has inked Canadian metal band Annihilator. A new album is expected to be released on Jan. 25.

New release roundup: Hip-hop rocker Everlast will release a five-song EP titled Today on Nov. 16. The set includes the song "Put Your Lights On," which is included on Santana's new album, Supernatural. Everlast will also embark on a national club tour beginning Nov. 11 in Miami ... Motley Crue will release their first live album on Nov. 23 titled Live: Entertainment or Death. The disc features the band's original lineup ... Toad The Wet Sprocket will release their last album on Nov. 9. Titled P.S. (A Toad Retrospective), the set features 16 of the band's greatest hits, two new songs and a demo version of "P.S." ... Shawn Mullins will release The First Ten Years, a collection of material from his previous self-released albums and three new songs that have appeared on recent movie soundtracks ... To commemorate the 20th anniversary of the release of Pink Floyd's epic album The Wall, EMI will issue Is There Anybody Out There? The Wall Live on Dec. 1.

etc.) if they fit strategically within a market. Johnson said BET will need at least \$600 million in equity to get started, but his company will have no trouble raising the funds.

While Liberty's focus has been on the cable and interactive industries, President/CEO Robert Bennett said the company has been seeking a radio partner for some time. "Our investment is intended to facilitate Emmis' growth through the acquisition of majormarket radio properties." he said, adding that Liberty has carried on talks with Emmis for some months.

To accommodate Liberty's purchase, Emmis will reduce the size of two recent equity offerings by 20%, meaning the company will sell 3.4 million shares of class A common stock, while Smulyan will offer 240,000 shares. Because of FCC regulations restricting ownership of cable systems and TV groups (Liberty parent TCI owns the former, while Emmis has six TV stations), Liberty executives will not take any board seats at Emmis.

#### Synergies

Though he referred to telecommunications mogul and Liberty Chairman John Malone as "the quintessential value investor," First Union Capital Markets analyst Bishop Cheen emphasized that the deal was not just a value investment for Englewood, CO-based Liberty, which has stakes in a number of cable, Internet and other communications companies.

"We see strategic fits with everything Liberty does," Smulyan declared. Bennett concurred: "There are a lot of potential points of intersection."

The most obvious synergy, of course, would be cross-promotion of Liberty's cable and Internet holdings (iVillage, Sportsline USA and priceline.com) on Emmis and BET radio stations. "There is an incredible convergence of the 'Net and radio from a promotional and content standpoint," Cheen told **R&R**. "Radio can drive all those eyes and ears to those sites." He added that promotion of websites is an expensive endeavor: It can cost a top 10 site up to \$200 million annually for a successful ad campaign.

Johnson also sees the opportunity to leverage artists whose videos appear on BET's cable networks on the radio stations. Or hosts with popular shows on the channels could get syndicated radio programs.

In addition, Liberty has a 94% interest in TCl Music, which in turn owns cable radio service DMX and music video channel The Box. Cheen said there may be possibilities for content deals on that front.

Smulyan said the Liberty deal gives Emmis a technology partner that it could parlay into the Internet portal that it is developing with several other radio broadcasters.

#### Interrelationships

Liberty was formed in 1990 by Malone — then co-owner of TCI and was run as the programming arm of TCI. Liberty evolved to become a venture capital unit of TCI as well, gaining stakes in numerous cable, telephony and satellite entities, including Discovery Communications (owner of The Discovery Channel), Court TV, Encore Media (owner of Encore and STARZ!), E! Entertainment Television, QVC, USA Networks and Sprint PCS Group. Liberty also has investments in international communications properties such as Argentina's Cablevision S.A. and Japan's Jupiter Telecommunications.

Also noteworthy is that the Emmis deal marks the introduction of telecommunications giant AT&T — which merged with TCl in March in a \$48 billion megamerger — into radio.

The BET plan would seem to make BET a competitive threat to Radio One, but Schroder analyst Niraj Gupta told **R&R** "the world is big enough for two Urban-oriented, African Americantargeted radio groups." BET and Radio One, in fact, are joining hands to develop four African-American Talk and music channels for XM Satellite Radio, whose service is slated to launch in 2001.

Radio One is not slowing down its acquisition pace either: It plans to raise \$200 million from the sale of 5 million shares of class A common stock in order to buy more stations, as well as to pay down \$69 million in pending deals and bank loans. The offering includes 4 million shares sold by Radio One and 1 million shares sold by various company shareholders. The sale will be underwritten by Credit Suisse First Boston.

clude stints at WZGC-FM/Atlanta, WAAF-FM/Boston and WCCC-AM & FM/Hartford. He has also served as Station Manager at KHEY-AM & FM and KPRR-FM/El Paso, and as OM of WAKR-AM & WONE-FM/Akron. He began his radio career at WGBB-AM & WBAB-FM/Nassau-Suffolk in 1980.

Furst is a 27-year broadcasting vet who was formerly VP/Programming for Gulfstar. He will continue to oversee 75 stations in 18 Southeastern markets. Before joining Capstar. he was National PD for NewCity Communications.

Hawkins will continue to oversee 60 stations in approximately 14 Western cities, having previously served as VP/Programming of Pacific Star. "It's great to be reunited with David and Steve, because I worked at Chancellor before I came over here for Capstar," He told **R&R**. 



While **R&R**'s first CHR chart was published on October 5, 1973, it wasn't until April 22, 1994 that the CHR chart included separate breakouts for Pop and the emerging Rhythmic format. The first month of the new Rhythmic chart belonged to R. Kelly's "Bump N' Grind." Five and a half years later Christina Aguilera's "Genie in a Bottle" was also passing the one-month mark at No. 1. From Kelly to Christina, Rhythmic's upper crust is listed here for your enjoyment.

The No. 1 album and the No. 1 Callout America position belong to Santana's "Smooth" featuring Rob Thomas of Matchbox 20 (Arista). A true hit crosses all demographics, and Santana is No. 7 with women 12-17 and No. 1 among women 18-24 and 25-34.

Lou Bega has the No. 1 song on the CHR/Pop chart with "Mambo No. 5 (A Little Bit...) (RCA), and he's No. 2 on the Callout America chart with strong across-the-board demographic appeal and an overall 3.81 to Santana's 3.84. Bega's follow-up single, "Tricky Tricky." rolls on Nov. 29.

Dayparting seems to be holding back the chart position for "What's My Age Again?" by **Blink-182** (MCA), but the audience has spoken. After a chart-topping ride at Alternative, "Age" is No. 1 with women 12-17 and No. 7 among women 18-24.

Mariah Carey is not going to break any hearts with her debut this week for "Heartbreaker" (Columbia). Carey debuts with a 3.53 and is No. 6 out of the box with women 12-17. Demos in detail:

12-17 — Blink-182, **98 Degrees**, Lou Bega, **Christina Aguilera**, **Britney Spears**, Mariah Carey, Santana f/Rob Thomas, Whitney Houston, **Backstreet Boys** and **702**.

18-24 — Santana f/Rob Thomas, Backstreet Boys tied with 702, Whitney Houston, **Len**, TLC, Blink-182 tied with Lou Bega, 98 Degrees and Sugar Ray.

25-34 — Santana f/Rob Thomas tied with Lou Bega, Smash Mouth, Sugar Ray, TLC, Backstreet Boys tied with Goo Goo Dolls, 98 Degrees and Len.

A song to watch is "My Love Is Your Love" by Whitney Houston (Arista), a Callout America Hit Potential moving 3.56-3.63.



## **Flashback Festival Scores Big With Listeners**

WALR/Atlanta's old school event is a success

ALR (Kiss 104.7)/Atlanta's Flashback Festival is a celebration of old school music from the '70s, '80s and '90s. The concert features soulful ballads that tell love stories, along with the kind of funk music that emerges from Ohio and Minneapolis.

WALR Promotions & Marketing Director **Kathy Daniels** has been in that position for approximately five months, but she's been in the industry for several years. Prior to assuming her

current position she was with WAGA-TV in Atlanta, and earlier in her career she was the Promotions & Marketing Director for WHTA (Hot 97)/Atlanta.

#### **Old School Event**

I asked Kathy to explain the concept of the Flashback Festival. "It's really all about recognizing old school music," she said. "The idea is to get a number of popular groups to come together to perform live here in Atlanta. The festival consists of live performances.

"This year was the first year we incorporated a Fan Fair. That was where we invited our sponsors for the event to come onsite and display products and distribute information. It was actually like a carnival set up in the corridor of the venue. As people were entering the venue, they had the opportunity to drop by all the booths, purchase or sample items and pick up brochures and other printed material of interest. They also had the opportunity to meet local TV personalities — and all this happened on the way to their seats." This year's event took place at

the Lakewood Amphitheatre in Atlanta. When I asked Kathy about the capacity of the venue, she said that it holds 20,000 people. So did the festival attract 20.000? "We were sold out," she replied. "Twenty-plus!"

I asked Kathy what she felt was the station's greatest accomplishment when it came to this year's

event. "Timeliness. We put together a schedule, and pretty much all the groups showed up on time. There was no lull time between the acts. The show was executed and ran very smoothly. We had five acts to work with, and everything got started at 6pm and ended at 11:30pm." And the cost of a ticket to this event? "It was only \$10." As you can tell, Kiss 104.7 listeners got a real bang for their buck!

#### **Planning Ahead**


I asked Kathy about lead time and how much planning it takes to make an event of this size go off smoothly. "My advice is that anyone putting on this type of promotion or event should start at least six months in advance or maybe a little more. I came on board in this position about four to five weeks in advance of the promotion, so there were a number of things I had to just jump right into. They had a number of things already finalized — the venue was in place and the artists were secured.

"In most cases the largest number of loose ends one would run into would be in the sales sponsorships, because there are so many clients involved in an event of this magnitude that you have to make sure all of them are receiving everything they've been promised."

Since WALR is an Urban AC outlet. I wanted to know how doing events there compares with doing events for stations that have a more youth-oriented approach. I especially wanted to know about the security and safety of the fans. "What I really like is the fact that it was very peaceful," Kathy replied. "Everybody just enjoyed themselves throughout the show. People were laughing, dancing and basically just having fun all evening. When you do an old school show, it's something so different from where I came from. doing hip-hop. It's really a good feeling when it's a show that you could bring your entire family to.

hip-hop. But old school is so clean, and it kind of takes you back to the days of the 'family reunion.' That was a good thing for me to be a part of for the first time in my life."



There are many singles out there (after all, at least 18 songs went for adds last week). I'm confused, 'cause I don't know which artist to do. I like many of the songs that are out now, and it's hard to pick just one. But while I'm listening to one CD in particular, the decision is made. I loved this artist's second single, "Still in My Heart," but the cut that made me stop typing and look at the CD player was "Unbelievable." First I had to see if it was the radio or if the CD was still playing — it was the CD. Then I had to see which track had this young woman singing for her life, and it was track No. 12. My confusion was over, and my "Artist Breakdown" had a name — **Tracie Spencer**.

Spencer's debut single, "It's All About You (Not About Me)," reintroduced us to a female who had obviously grown as a vocalist and matured into a beautiful young woman. Viewing love from a different angle, "Tender Kisses" were a thing of the past. In this situation Spencer talked about selfishness and loyalty, among other things. Now she comes on a softer tip in her latest joint. Singing of eternal love, Spen-



cer confesses to dude that even though they're apart physically, emotionally they'll always be together. "Feelin' your thoughts when you think of me..." (damn, that's some serious telepathy right there). Homegirl is all into dude and wants to know if they can actually be a couple in "Feelin' You." I'm lovin' the flow of "No Matter," and "Closer" gives the warning, "The closer that you get to me/The more I wanna make you see/That you'll never find a love like mine/I think about you all the time."

On a more emotional note, on "Nothing Broken but My Heart" homegirl apparently looks well physically, but emotionally she's a basket case, suffering over the remnants of a failed relationship. (Talk about a play on words --- the title suggests that damage to such an organ is trivial.) On "Not Gonna Cry," a decision has been made - the last tear has fallen for dude. The intro of "It's on Tonight" reminded me of "Pop Life" by Prince. In this single, things are about to happen, if you know what I mean. And my favorite, "Unbelievable," is sooo beautiful! Spencer has such a beautiful voice, and this ballad is the magic carpet on which her voice rides. Finding it hard to believe that a relationship is over, she sings of the pain and confusion endured after the fact. This single brought tears to my eyes, because if you've ever loved someone so much only to have him or her walk away from you, you can understand her pain. Then to hear her say the last words in the song, "I'll be movin' on," you can only admire her strength.

*Tracie* is a great CD. From track No. 1 to No. 12, this CD has Ms. Spencer showcasing her vocal maturity. Peace.

# **Measuring The Morning Music**

□ A look at what music — and how much — top stations are playing

ow much music do you play in the morning? What percentage of it is current, recurrent or gold? And how much '80s gold do you play in morning drive?

I was kind of wondering about that myself, so I turned to my trusty Mediabase 24/7 website to get a feel for what some of Country's top stations were doing with their morning music. I surveyed 13 stations from a variety of categories: Major-market stand-alones, stations in markets with two or three Country outlets in a competitive situation, and stations in markets with two Country outlets owned by the same company. In a future column we'll profile some top Country stations representing other market sizes.

A few caveats as you read the stats and armchair analysis. First, to an outside observer attempting to determine whether to categorize a record as current, recurrent or gold, the lines can be rather blurry. And of course, there's no way someone outside a station can know for sure where a PD/MD puts a record. But for the purposes of this exercise, a current is a record on the **R&R** Country chart for issue date 10/22/99. To try to account for the various levels of recurrents, I defined that category as records that were on the **R&R** chart in either 1998 or 1999. All others fall into gold.

This analysis is based on what the stations played in morning drive on Wednesday, Oct. 20. I included the 10am hour to show the differences between mornings and middays. All years of songs are Mediabase dates. The "box scores" are elsewhere on this page, but here are a few observations about the songs played on Oct. 20.

#### **Major-Market Stand-Alones**

Here are some observations on three major-market Country outlets with no format competitors.

WYNY/New York: Of the 14 golds played in four hours, nine were from the '90s. Jimmy Buffett's "Margaritaville" (1977) played during the 6am hour, the 8am hour featured Roy Orbison's "You Got It" (1988) and Terry Cashman's "Talkin' Baseball" (remember, the Yankees and Mets were in playoff games at the time). Clint Black's "Nobody's Home" (1989) and the Kenny Rogers/ Sheena Easton duet "We've Got Tonight" (1983) aired during the 9am hour. (It's interesting to note that the two songs were separated by one record in the fourth quarter-hour.) Two different Martina McBride songs played during the 9am hour about 35-40 minutes apart: "I Love You" and "Wrong Again."

**KZLA/Los Angeles:** KZLA averaged 3-5 more songs per hour than either WYNY or WUSN. Over the four hours KZLA played 46 tunes, WYNY 32 and WUSN 36. Of KZLA's 21 golds, 17 were from the '90s, three from the '80s and one

from the '70s. The golds were **Charlie Daniels Bands**' "Devil Went Down to Georgia" (1979) and **Shenandoah's** "Two Dozen Roses" (1989) in the 6am hour, **Alabama's** "Feels So Right" (1981) in the 7am hour and **The Judds**' "Why Not Me" (1984) in the 8am hour. I checked until 1pm, and there was only one other song from the '80s after 10am — KLZA played the live version of **Garth Brooks & Billy Joel's** "Ain't Goin' Down 'Til the Sun Cornes Up" (1989).

WUSN/Chicago: Of the 21 golds played, 17 were from the '90s and four were from the '80s. In the 7am hour 'USN played The Judds' "Rockin' With the Rhythm of the Rain" (1986), and in the 8am hour Don Williams' "I Believe in You" (1980) and Alabama's "Song of the South" (1988) with two songs in between, one of which was listed as a "novelty tune." In the 9am hour they played K.T. Oslin's "'80s Ladies" (1987).

#### Mornings In The Big D

**Overall:** Dallas is, of course, a market with three Country outlets, each with a different owner. KPLX and KYNG played two or three more songs per hour than KSCS. It was also interesting to note that, for all the stations, mornings leaned current and gold, with recurrents playing a lesser role.

KPLX: Currents and golds were played in about equal proportion each hour, with few recurrents. The 8am hour included Hank Williams Jr.'s "Family Tradition" (1979), and around 9:40am George Strait's "Amarillo by Moming" (1982) aired. The 9am hour was also home to Pat Green's "Songs About Texas" --- remember, The Wolf has carved out a musical position with Texas tunes. But it also steps out with brand-new music in the moming - during the 6am hour it aired The Dixie Chicks' "Cowboy Take Me Away," in the 8am hour Alecia Elliott's "I'm Diggin' It" and in the 9am hour Steve Holy's "Don't Make Me Beg."

KSCS: A consistent four records an hour during the 6am-8am span, heavy on the gold and recurrent (eight of 12). There were two '80s songs among the 10 golds: **Reba McEntire**'s "Somebody Should Leave" (1985) in the 6am hour and **Sawyer Brown's** "The Race is On" (1989) in the 8am hour. With 22 songs in four hours it's heavy on the hits, but not to the exclusion of some newer acts, among them **Shane Minor**'s "Slave to the Habit," Jerry Kilgore's "Love Trip," **Andy Griggs**' "I'll Go Crazy" and **Brad Paisley**'s "He Didn't Have to Be."

**KYNG:** Of the 31 songs played in the four hours, 23 were gold, six current and only two recurrent, and only two currents

aired between 6am and 8am. Doses of the '80s were sprinkled through the morning: **Dwight Yoakam**'s "Guitars, Cadillacs" (1987) kicked off the 6am hour. The last two records of the five played during the 7am hour were George Strait's "Ocean Front Property" (1987) and Yoakam's "Little Ways" (1987). (By the way, all five records that hour were from '96 or before.) The 8am hour ended with Reba's "I Know How He Feels" (1988).

#### **Music City Mornings**

As in Dallas, there are three competitors with three different owners. WKDF played 20 songs, WSIX 26 and WSM-FM 37.

WKDF: Music City 103, which hangs its hat on playing music not heard on other Country stations, played Hank Jr.'s "A Country Boy Can Survive" (1982) in the 6am hour, The Judds' "Why Not Me" (1984) in the 7am hour and George Jones' new song, "The Cold Hard Truth," in the 8am hour. 'KDF waits until 10am to kick up the music count, while WSM-FM and 'SIX bump it up at 9am.

WSIX: Half of its 26 moming drive songs were gold, with a pair coming from the '80s: Keith Whitley's "Don't Close Your Eyes" (1988) in the 8am hour and George Strait's "Let's Fall to Pieces Together" (1984) in the 9am hour. The 9am hour also featured a pair of brand-new tunes: Mark Wills' "Back at One" and Holy's "Don't Make Me Beg." Five of the six other songs WSIX played over the four hours were gold, which actually makes the station sound more gold-oriented than WKDF, especially since nine of the 13 tunes were from 1994 or before.

WSM-FM: It averages three-four songs an hour more than both WKDF and WSIX, and the bulk of those extra titles are recurrents (see chart). At least on Oct. 20 the golds leaned toward records from 1990-1994. WSM-FM reached back the furthest of the three competitors, ending the 6am hour with **Charley Pride**'s "Hope You're Feelin' Me..." (1975), but that was the only song played from before 1990.

#### Two-Station/One-Owner Markets


Here's a look at Atlanta, where ABC Inc. owns WKHX and WYAY, and Cincinnati, where AMFM has a monopoly on the Country market with WUBE and WYGY.

Atlanta: First impression: For two stations with very high-profile morning personalities, both are playing more currents per hour than I would have expected. Also, the two stations seem to mirror one another musically more than I would have expected from two stations with one owner. WKHX played 36 songs with 12 current, nine recur-

rent and 15 gold. WYAY played 34 tunes, including10 current, 10 recurrent and 14 gold. WKHX's gold leaned pre-1995, while WYAY's was clumped 1993-95.

WKHX: This was the most symmetrically structured of all the stations I looked at, with every hour having the same number of records and being right on a three-current, two-recurrent and four-gold template. (Though I may have miscategorized one of the 8am hour songs.) There was one pre-'90s gold per hour. Of the 11 golds from the '90s, nine were from before 1995. The old gold: 6am hour, The Judds' "Rockin'..." (1986); 7am, The Forester Sisters' "I Fell in Love..." (1985); 8am, Linda Ronstadt's "When Will I Be Loved" (1974); and 9am, The Judds' "Why Not Me" (1984).

WYAY: I have to admit that 'YAY leaned much more toward recurrent and gold than I would have expected. Again, according to the definitions applied above - not the station criteria - I counted 24 of the 34 songs played in four hours as recurrent or gold. There was a tune from '81 in the 6am hour — Barbara Mandrell's "I Was Country When Country Wasn't Cool" - and a song from 1979 in the 8am hour, CDB's "Devil Went Down to Georgia." I was surprised at the former, but expected the latter. The currents were all at least in the top 20 on the R&R chart, which was not something I expected from a station flanking the mainstream mothership of WKHX. Of course, as in all of these cases, it's important to remember that we are talking about music in morning drives.

Cincinnati: WUBE: I spotted very little outside what you'd expect from WUBE — the five or six records in each hour between 6am-9am were hits — although I was a bit surprised to find it played nothing from before 1992 on that particular morning. WUBE leapt from five songs in the 8am hour to 13 tunes in the 9am hour, and it was there that there were two brand-new songs by new acts — Sonya Isaacs' "On My Way to You" and Keith Urban's "It's a Love Thing" within two songs of one another. Outside of those, the currents were all top 20.

WYGY: The morning drive currents are relatively conservative for a station described by WUBE PD and AMFM VP/Country programming Tim Closson as the "Country onramp" to WUBE. Exceptions to that conservatism were Wills' "Back at One" in the 6am hour and Jennifer Day's "The Fun of Your Love" ending the 9am hour. WYGY played 39 songs in the four hours, WUBE 29. The 10 extra tunes were split into three more currents and seven more recurrents. It was also interesting to see WYGY play Chris Gaines' "Lost in You" in the middle of the 8am hour and then two songs later play Garth Brooks' "Papa Loved Mama."



# **A Little Bluer Now A Little Better**

□ Country acts continue to embrace a connection to bluegrass

• ooking at the description on paper, it was hard to predict that Country radio in the '90s would embrace a trio that featured the fiddle and banjo. Then we heard the music.

That trio was **The Dixie Chicks**, who have sold more than 7 million copies of their Monument debut album, *Wide Open Spaces*, and another 2 million of their recent follow-up, *Fly*.

Granted, The Dixie Chicks are unique and mix a diverse array of musical influences. And, no offense to Dixie Chick Emily Robison, but you can bet that she's heard this oftrepeated joke: What's the definition of a true optimist? A banjo player with a pager.

As Vince Gill pointed out on this year's CMA Awards show, one of the things that gave banjos a bad reputation was the theme from the film *Deliverance*. Sure, it brought the instrument back to the forefront, but some of the scenes from the film also gave it a certain ... uh ... stigma.

While the Dixie Chicks are not a bluegrass act, their combination of acoustic guitar, fiddle and banjo is rooted in the bluegrass tradition. It's highly unlikely that straight-ahead bluegrass music will ever find a solid place at mainstream Country radio, although there are some undercurrents that continue to point out country's tie to bluegrass.

A case in point is **Ralph Stanley**'s *Clinch Mountain Country*, which last week won Album of the Year and Recorded Event of the Year honors at the International Bluegrass Music Association's annual awards presentation in Owensboro, KY. The Rebel Records release featured the bluegrass legend performing with an all-star cast of duet partners, including Gill, Patty Loveless, Marty Stuart, George Jones and Bob Dylan.

And just this week Dolly Parton returned to her musical roots with her first Sugar Hill project, *The Grass Is Blue*, a CD featuring original songs, bluegrass standards and covers of songs first recorded by Billy Joel and the rock band Blackfoot.

Concurrently, the new Nashvillebased Shell Point label released Larry Cordle & Lonesome Standard Time's *Murder on Music Row*. Cordle's songs have been recorded by Garth Brooks, George Strait, Trisha Yearwood, John Michael Montgomery and Diamond Rio, but his most famous song is probably "Highway 40 Blues," a major hit for Ricky Skaggs. The song "Murder on Music Row" is a cleverly written outcry against pop-oriented country music, although Cordle's recording leans more toward traditional country than it does bluegrass. While Shell Point has no immediate plans to service the track as a single, some mainstream Country stations — including Nashville's WSM-AM and WKDF-FM have provided airplay.

#### **IBMA Awards Recap**

Joe Diffie, Ricky Skaggs and Tom T. Hall were among the hosts at last week's International Bluegrass Music Association awards show. In addition to the two awards garnered by Ralph Stanley's Clinch Mountain Country, other major awards were accepted by the Del McCoury Band (Entertainer of the Year), IIIrd Tyme Out (Vocal Group), Ricky Skaggs & Kentucky Thunder (Instrumental Group), Ronnie Bowman (Male Vocalist) and Lynn Morris (Female Vocalist). Fiddler Kenny Baker, a longtime sideman to the late Bill Monroe, was inducted into the IBMA's Hall of Honor.

When the Christian Country Music Association Awards nominations were officially announced last week, T. Graham Brown received three nods. His "Wine Into Water" was nominated for Song and Video of the Year, and Brown is also up for Mainstream Country Artist. Other Mainstream Country Artist nominees include Charlie Daniels, Vince Gill, Emmylou Harris and Margo Smith. In addition to Brown, three other mainstream acts are nominated in the Video of the Year category: Jessica Andrews' "I Will Be There For You," LeAnn Rimes' "You Light Up My Life" and Steve Wariner's "Holes in the Floor of Heaven."

The CCMA Awards show, set for Nov. 4 at Nashville's Ryman Auditorium, will be hosted by Linda Davis and former Shenandoah frontman Marty Raybon.

#### **Adkins Is No Slugger**

Trace Adkins acknowledges that rumors began flying when the release of his third Capitol album was delayed. The project, *More*, arrives in stores Tuesday. Adkins says the delays resulted from some unforeseen circumstances, including finally finding the right producer and a two-month period in which the singer nursed a leg that he broke trying to push his truck out of the mud on his farm.

Before teaming with producer Trey Bruce, Adkins says, "We tried a couple of guys — real well-known producers. It was kind of like a marriage that split up because of irreconcilable differences. It was a nofault divorce. It's just that our styles didn't mesh. It took some time to find who we thought would really give us what we wanted."

As for his injury, Adkins says, "I physically couldn't stand up for a couple of months without being in pain. I wanted to sing this album with emotion, and I needed to be able to put pain in where pain needed to be, but not that kind of pain. I don't feel like I sing very well when I'm sitting down, so I really needed to be able to stand up and deliver on the album. That was the time we took to find some more songs. I think we found a couple of really good ones during that period that we wouldn't otherwise have found."

Adkins admits that he also waited to "let things sort of sort themselves out" with the new leadership at his label, but he emphasizes that the process did *not* include a physical altercation with Capitol/Nashville President/CEO Pat Quigley. That rumor had been the talk of Nashville earlier this year.

Adkins says, "I heard that one a lot. It stemmed from the first meeting we had. There came a point where Pat stood up across the table and pointed his finger at me and said, 'F\*\*k you!' And I stood up and said, 'No, f\*\*k you!' It was very loud, and people up and down the halls heard this." Regarding the language, Adkins says, "He expresses himself a lot like I do. He's from New York, and I've spent 10 years working in the oil fields. I say that word in everyday conversation with my mother, so it's kind of just the way I express myself. #### Trace Adkins More (Capitol)

As we approach the year 2000, you have to appreciate a country singer who describes his style of music as "pain and sex." As Trace Adkins says, "That's life, man. I've never been one who looked for the rainbow. I'm too busy standing in the rain." Adkins even admits that his ideal album would consist of dark themes, although he lightens things up on his third album. *More*, with the up-tempo "I Can Dig It" and a collaboration with Asleep At The Wheel on the humorous Western swing tune "All Hat, No Cattle." Paul Worley produced the latter track,

but the bulk of the project was produced by Adkins' longtime friend Trey Bruce, the son of singer/songwriter Ed Bruce. About selecting a producer, Adkins says, "I needed that comfort factor. I needed to know the person — who he was, what he was about and where his head was." Adkins says *More* is "a little edgier" than his two previous albums. He explains, "I think there's a little rawness to it. This one is medium rare, and that's exactly what I wanted. I'm gonna open myself up and let people see what I'm about. This is who I am." The album contains the current single, "Don't Lie." Other highlights include "Working Man's Wages" (a tribute to Adkins' bluecollar parents) and "Every Other Friday at Five" (dealing with the heartache of a divorced father).



### Tracy Byrd It's About Time (RCA)

*It's About Time* is Tracy Byrd's first album for RCA, and it marks his first album as a producer. Sharing production duties with Billy Joe Walker Jr., Byrd says the change has had a big effect on his music. He explains, "This album was a joy to make. I was having so much fun in the studio that in the back of my mind I was saying, 'Boy, this has got to be good.' And then I'd listen to what we'd done so far, and I'd think, 'You know what? This is incredible 'I was totally satisfied.'' Noting that he records songs he can identify with, Byrd says, "I choose songs with myself in mind — something that gets

to me or says something about what I might be going through in my life. That's part

of being an artist, especially a country artist." Regarding the album's mid-tempo title track. Byrd remarks, "The one thing that people always say they need more of is time. This song's about a man who realizes that his priorities are a little bit screwed up, and he needs to get back in line and take care of his family. And it's definitely something I've been through." *It's About Time* contains Byrd's RCA debut single, "Put Your Hand in Mine," as well as the Texas shuffle "Undo the Right," a Hank Cochran/Willie Nelson composition that was a hit for Ray Price in the '60s.



## Ty Herndon

**Steam** (Epic) About recording his new album, *Steam*, Ty Herndon says, "My record label gave me the opportunity to select songs by myself, which allowed me to create what I consider to be the ultimate record." He explains, "Every one of us has five or six records that we keep in the car to listen to all the time. I wanted to make that kind of record." The first single, the title track, moves to No. 20 on this week's **R&R** Country Singles chart, but Herndon is also especially pleased with the song's video.

He says, "I always wanted to make a live performance-style video because people often come to my show and are surprised by the extreme energy of it all. By the end of the night people are dancing on their chairs, and we're hanging from the rafters." *Steam* was produced by Joe Scaife, whose previous credits include work with Montgomery Gentry and K.T. Oslin. In addition to the current single, other highlights include "I Can't Do It All," "Putting the Brakes on Time" and "No Mercy." By popular demand from fans, the album also includes Herndon's version of "You Can Leave Your Hat On," a song previously recorded by Joe Cocker.




## Toby Keith

How Do You Like Me Now? (Dream Works)

Explaining his decision to sign with DreamWorks, Toby Keith says, "Once in a while the stars line up, and when they do, you can feel it. I've had five albums — four golds and a platinum — and I also threw a Christmas album in. This was all in a span of six years. I've been on a handful of labels, but at DreamWorks they really rolled out the red carpet and treated me like a superstar. I couldn't ask for more than that." DreamWorks' Nashville division is headed by producer James Stroud, who worked with Keith on his 1997 album *Dream Walkin*'. Keith says,

"We work hard in the studio, and when we're done we expect it to be good. We expect it to work. We expect it to compete. When we're done, if James is jumping up and down like a Little League shortstop, then I don't have to go any further. We're very serious about making great music." Keith has a writer's credit on nine songs on his DreamWorks debut. He says, "I look for something that sounds unlike anything on the record, and I don't want anything middle-of-the-road. The three cuts on the album that I didn't write are all kind of oddball songs." Keith has previewed the album with the current single, "When Love Fades."





# Same Station, Same Owner

## □ An exclusive R&R research project

se whatever sweeping generalizations you'd like to indicate that consolidation has been a major factor in our industry, and you'd probably still understate the situation. But try this statistic — based on an exclusive R&R research project — on for size: Only 11% of ACs in the format for the past 10 years still do some variation of AC for the same owner.

That's what I found after tracking ownership 10 years ago, five years ago and today. We've recently dealt with air personality (10/8) and PD (10/22) longevity; this week's column focuses on a similar vein regarding the companies signing the checks.

About 10 years ago 177 top 100market ACs were controlled by 129 different chains or individual owners. Five years ago 208 top 100market format stations were under the umbrella of 153 separate companies. A spike in total station count from 1989 comes from the inclusion of Hot AC and Pop/Alternative.

This year 70 organizations call the shots for approximately 200 top 100-market ACs. From that group, only the following top 100-market stations have been in the format for at least the last decade and have been owned by the same company over that span. In the following list the market number is first, followed by the calls, city and owner.

# The Fifth Annual Label Summit

□ Music industry execs gather for earnest discussion of issues

eventy-five record industry figures convened Oct. 14 at Santa Monica's beautiful club Arcadia for **R&R**'s fifth NAC/Smooth Jazz label summit. Format flips away from NAC/ SJ have prompted deep concern about the future in the smooth jazz record community, so it was no surprise that the meeting's tone was subdued.

KTWV (The Wave)/L.A. VP/GM **Tim Pohlman** attended for the Summit's first hour to field questions. The Wave is one of Infinity's eight Los Angeles radio holdings. With KNX-AM, KCBS-FM, KFWB, KLSX, KRLA, KRTH and KROQ as well as The Wave, the company's market cluster reaches a staggering 9 million listeners weekly in Southern California. Pohlman certainly understands the big picture, as well as the ways consolidation has changed the roles of specific stations and formats.

"Labels are naturally concerned about the NAC stations that have dropped out," Pohlman said, "because when you're dealing with fewer reporters overall, when one drops out, the thud is a lot louder than if one drops from the Rock or Country arena. But dropouts are coming from mostly medium and smaller markets, and we have to hope the majority of them are coming from consolidation, in which stations without a track record of doing well over time are dropped. You've got to wonder whether that's because those stations have taken a cookie-cutter approach. The cookie-cutter approach doesn't work in any format, and NAC is not an exception."

A Formula For Success "There is a formula for success in this format, and it starts with investing in a good consultant to research what kind of music to play."

"When you look at the NAC stations in the top 15 markets, I can safely say that every one is performing at a very high level and outperforming its budget, with only one exception. They are highly profitable and successful. At The Wave we are focused on growth. We are looking for new ways to grow our revenue and our ratings. and they're out there.

"Should the record industry worry about the NAC format having a short shelf life over the next few years? I don't think so! Before too long, depending on the makeup of the market, you're going to see NAC stations in markets where there are opportunities.

"What's good is that big companies are investing in some mid- and small-sized markets. They usually and more creative today."

Although attendees unanimously supported the idea of adding select noncommercial reporters, **R&R Publisher/CEO Erica Farber** said that she has a problem with reconciling the inclusion of noncoms, since that would be inconsistent with **R&R**'s policy in other formats. Rather, she expressed the hope that more commercial stations would flip to or sign on as NAC/SJ in the near fnture. She suggested we use the research resources available in **R&R** to identify markets where there may be a hole for NAC/SJ radio.

\*Informative and Encouraging'

Assessing the summit. Verve Group VP/A&R Bud Harner observed, "The summit was informative and encouraging. One great thing to come out of it was Erica's idea to identify existing stations in four or five markets and formulate a recommendation to the big radio companies as to why they should consider NAC for those markets. Ideas like that would never have happened except for the summit. Tim Pohlman's remarks helped us understand that a decision to flip, as CBS/Infinity did with KMJZ/Minneapolis, is based on what's happening in a market at any given time. He also said that the way to bring in younger listeners to the format was 'current music and new music,' which was right on the money.`

"The summit spirit was somewhat subdued," said Warner Bros." **Deborah Lewow**, "but it was productive in terms of ideas for partnerships with existing Smooth Jazz stations, especially since most labels cannot afford the \$800-\$1,000 per spot the heavy hitters command."

Vision Management President Leanne Meyers reflected, "I'm continuously caught off-guard, surprised and inspired by the forthright, creative, constructive contribution Erica Farber shares when we gather at the R&R NAC/SJ summit. I've been in this business quite some time, yet I find her support of NAC and every other format unique. Heads up, gang! We owe R&R more than the lip service, malaise and apathy that were shown in response at the meeting. I think R&R's actions deserve more of our focus, time and energy. Opportunity knocks but once twice for us, thanks to Carol, [R&R's Dir. Charts & Formats] Kevin McCabe and Erica.'

Ion Ballroom, a beautiful art deco building with commanding views of the harbor. Through the years Good has attracted a loyal base of ardent fans in California, and today his audience includes a growing number from more distant parts. I met a Chris Botti fan who had flown 3,000 miles from Pennsylvania to attend and another Smooth Jazz partisan from Arizona who is so deeply into the music that he actually has a list of his five favorite sidemen!

Guitarist Joyce Cooling skillfully kicked off Friday night's show with a performance that set a crowd-pleasing tone for the weekend. During intermission Bona Fide — propelled by Slim Man's driving bass grooves — had the overflow crowd dancing. The band also played the afterparty at the Catalina Country Club, a new addition to the festival's activities. Pianist David Benoit closed with an artful, well-nuanced set that demonstrated his formidable playing and composing skills as he moved from classics such as "Cast Your Fate to the Wind" and "Linus and Lucy" to his recent chart-topper, "ReJoyce."

I missed Chris Standring's set the following day, but heard he was in top form as expected. Brian Culbertson followed, playing hit after hit to the adoring crowd. He ended with two tunes that featured his wicked trombone. (An instrument that, in his hands, may become one heard on Smooth Jazz radio.) Saxman Steve Cole, who had lent his support to Culbertson earlier in the day, opened the evening with a tuneful, wellreceived set. Headliner Jonathan Butler's introspective songs, rendered with exquisite tenderness, would probably have been more effective in an intimate setting rather than for Saturday night's party-hearty crowd. The Braxton Brothers opened Sunday's midday show, followed by

Warren Hill.

The festival's highlight for me was Chris Botti's performance, his last as a soloist until the completion of Sting's tour in 2001. From the current hit "Drive Time" to "First Wish," "Regroovable" and a moody selection from the *Caught* soundtrack, Botti displayed stunning musical authority. His reading of Blue Nile founder Paul Buchanan's "Easter Parade," which Botti plans to record on a future orchestrated project in London, was one of the most achingly beautiful, memorable experiences in my life as a concertgoer. Botti's progressive voice evokes memories of early Chuck Mangione and the ghosts of Chet Baker and Miles, but it sounds like the future to me.

Candy Dulfer capped the festival with an accomplished, balanced set. She plays signature '70s-inflected funk grooves as convincingly as anyone and contrasts her full-tilt ballsiness with jazz stylings that are smooth as silk.

Pohlman continued. "Frank Cody and Broadcast Architecture have proven to be the best, so I don't know why, if you're an NAC station, you wouldn't want to be partnered with those guys.

# NAC notes with Carol Archer

**Dave Koz** stays at No. 1 again this week with "Together Again" (Capitol). Boney James' "Body Language" (Warner Bros.) is breathing down Koz's neck, as Brian Culbertson's "Back in the Day" (Atlantic) — with 100% of the panel and top Most Increased honors at +105 plays aggressively gears up to overtake both.

Brian McKnight's evocative "Back at One" (Motown) vaults 14-9\*, an impressive achievement for any vocal.

Not surprisingly. **Joyce Cooling's** "Callie" (**Heads Up**) achieves 16\*/Breaker status this week in only its third week on the chart. A very strong entry.

David Benoit's "Miles After Dark" (GRP/ VMG) picked up a recommendation from Broadcast Architecture, and it's no wonder: The track absolutely smolders! Top New & Active, it's also top Most Added, with 16 stations coming aboard,

including KOAl/Dallas and WJCD/Norfolk. Kenny Garrett's "Simply Said" (Warner **Bros.)** is demonstrating persuasive programmer acceptance. The track earned eight new adds including one at KKSF/S.F. — and rotation increases such as 12 plays at KOAI and 11 this week on WNUA/Chicago.

Leo Gandelman's "Rise" (Jazzica) is another song that is building credible airplay with each week: Gandelman was newly added by WJCD, and he's getting 10 plays at KKSF, 13 at WJZI/Milwaukee and 14 at KMGQ/Santa Barbara. See "Heads Up" for more on this release.

A monster new release is **Richard Elliot's** incredible "On the Fly" (**Blue Note**), which sounds like an absolute smash to me. **Bernie Kimble** must agree, because he added it well in advance of its Nov. 8 add date this week at WNW V/Cleveland.

Among the very strongest releases to cross my desk during the past week were Grover Washington Jr.'s "The Night Fantastic" (Columbia); Phillipe Saisse's "Ever Up and Onward" (GRP/ VMG); Steve Cole's "It's Gonna Be Alright" (Atlantic); and Spyro Gyra's "Breezeway" (Windham Hill Jazz).

The fourth quarter in NAC/Smooth Jazz is blessed once again this year with a multitude of excellent songs to play through the end of the year. And as if that's not good news enough. Fourplay's wonderful *Snowbound* (Warner Bros.) CD will be in your hands shortly.

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#### Leo Gandelman Brazilian Soul Jazzica

Leo Gandelman's latest (please pronounce his name "Lay-o Gahn-del-mahn"), Brazilian Soul (Jazzica), is as cool as a sip of *caipirinha*, the Bahian equivalent of a margarita. Gandelman has enjoyed a modicum of airplay at NAC/SJ in the past, but

on *Brazilian Soul* the multi-instrumentalist (soprano, alto and bari sax; keys) opens a floodgate of choices for this format. His cover of "Rise" is entirely fresh, substituting sax for Herb Alpert's masterful trumpet lines. Its progressive, streetwise arrangement really makes the song sparkle. The track "Maracatu Atomico" deserves your attention as well, and I also like "No Comments" and the midtempo "Living on Sand Too." Gandelman plays with passion and authority, two qualities that are showcased to perfection on this stirring collection.

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This season's most auspicious holiday release, Fourplay's Snowbound (Warner Bros.), was produced by Warner's Executive VP/GM Jazz Matt Pierson. I asked him to describe his vision for the project.



Fourplay had never done a Christmas album, nor had Bob James! Fourplay are *such* a great band to me, like the Modern Jazz Quartet of contemporary jazz. It made sense to do a holiday record between full-blown Fourplay records, especially since they've grown so much through months of touring. They played The Blue Note the week. before we recorded, and they were feeling really tight.

My concept was to record in a different way. Usually each member brings in some songs, they'll fine-tune and arrange them, and they'll spend a day per tune recording. I wanted to capture something more like a live performance, so we recorded five tunes a day. Once they got in the studio, it really flowed. When you make a record, the first takes always have magic. If you do more takes, maybe it'll clean up some and sound more tight, but it often doesn't have that same magic.



**Bob James** brought in a few arrangements he'e worked out completely, with charts printed and everything, for "Angels We Have Heard on High." "The Holly and the Ivy" and "Merry Little

Stroll," which is "Midnight Stroll" and "Have Yourself a Merry Little Christmas" together. In the same way, Nathan East contributed "Hark! The Herald Angels Sing." Harvey Mason brought an arrangement of "Away in a Manger." Then some other tunes happened in the studio. I brought in "Snowbound" and "River" because I wanted some songs that aren't typical Christmas carols, but are seasonal. "Snowbound" definitely has a smooth jazz vibe; it made sense to me on several fronts. This band has a Steely Dan vibe anyway — plus Larry Carlton played on so many of their records. For my taste, I love Donald Fagen, but I felt his version of "Snowbound" didn't achieve what the tune could reach. So I brought in Jerry Hey, my all-time hero, to arrange the horns. He wrote all the horn arrangements for Earth, Wind & Fire; Al Jarreau; Toto; and Michael Jackson, and lately he's done a lot of work with Paul Brown. I was also hoping to get "Snowbound" and "River" played at radio before people start playing Christmas music.

Fourplay and I got to Warner Bros. at about the same time. Bob James is a very close friend of mine, and over the years I've gotten close to the rest of the guys. I always wanted to work with them, but as with many acts, they are a self-produced band. It was a big step for them to work with someone, but I produced Bob's straight-up record. But if this record was going to happen, someone had to get involved as a producer to organize and pull it together. When you've got a band — especially one like Fourplay that's an equal and very democratic setup where there's not a leader per se — there's got to be a lot of communication. We only had about three weeks to get the record completed.

I'm extremely proud of *Snowbound* for a couple of reasons. One, it's just a great record! It plays as well as any Christmas album I've ever heard, just straight down as an album. But what I'm most proud of is that I was able to go in and document this band just blowing! There's a perception that all these contemporary jazz guys don't really do that, that they rely on a rhythm track and fix solos that they couldn't do live, that it's about something mechanical. But Fourplay is really a jazz quartet with soloing, and I'm proud to have captured that.

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



Is the air in Austin so bad that you need to wear a gas mask? Whether it is or not. hometown heroes Freak House have a fetish for wearing the masks onstage --- and they may well protect the foursome from their own caustic blend of industrial and metal. Clubgoers, however, are willing to bathe in the sonic chaos of the band's live show, which has earned Freak House open invitations from club agents across Texas. Touring throughout the Lone Star State has allowed the band to draft fans into the Freak Army with distinctive Tshirts, stickers and, of course, intense music.

The band formed in 1994 when vocalist Rob Ferrebe and guitarist Matt Clark began collaborating on what would become their first independently released CD, Addicted to the Numb. The band's sound evolved, as did its lineup to include drummer Ace Alonzo and bassist Scott Thomas. Signed to L.A. indie label QED Entertainment in 1998, the band collaborated with producer Tom Fletcher (Ozzy Osbourne, Suicidal Tendencies) to deliver Subculture Revolution. A five-song sampler from the album has been catching the ear of specialty show hosts like Larry Mac of **Frank Correia** Asst. Rock Editor

KUPD/Phoenix's Red Radio Underground. "Put simply. Freak House freakin' rocks!" exclaims Mac

With a refrain of "There's more of us," the title track aptly describes the band's growing fan base. Besides picking up CDs at live shows, fans have downloaded MP3s from the band's website (www.freakhouse.com) and bought Subculture Revolution from QED's site (www.aedentertainment.com). Kane, host of WXTM/St. Louis' Monday Night Metal. is a firsthand witness to the band's growing popularity both on-air and online: "The incredible buzz about Freak House started when I would get e-mails left and right about this band. These people were able to download the audio, and they wanted more! I've never received more requests about one band - these guys are really turning heads.'




## **Return On Investment**

□ Do radio station festivals show tangible results for participants?

here's no doubt that radio station festival shows are a hot political issue. Programmers generally resent being turned into concert promoters, and label representatives generally resent being turned into booking agents. But if all the work is done right, can good things happen for everyone involved? To answer that question, I talked with WPLY (Y100)/Philadelphia PD Jim McGuinn, 550/Work VP Joel Klaiman and Aware Records Head/Promotion Gregg Latterman.

McGuinn was actually the first person to bring this question to my attention. He called me shortly after his station's summer "Feztival." Normally when I get a call after a station festival, the discussion revolves around how great the bands were. how big the crowd was or any number of other station-related matters. But McGuinn called me with some different news, and it was related to a question that cuts to the heart of any heated radio/record festival discussion: "The question is," McGuinn said, "do labels actually see a return on the investment of politics and, oftentimes, financial commitment to a radio station by playing a show? Our show is an example of where it did."

I followed this up with the obvious question of whether radio should even care about such things; shouldn't it only worry about its show and listeners? "As a program director, my priorities are to have a good show, satisfy my listeners and increase my ratings," McGuinn said. "But the side effects of doing those things are that I want the band to come away feeling it was a professionally run show and



a good experience, and have them self some records."

#### **Broken Records**

McGuinn threw down the gauntlet and stated that his show was unequivocally an example of successful collaboration. Klaiman agreed wholeheartedly: "We broke records on that day. G. Love & Special Sauce sold over 400 units on site, and Fuel sold over 200 units. As a direct result of the Y100 show, [music retailer] HMV being on site and the publicity around it, G. Love debuted at No. 13 in the market. The show allowed Y100 the opportunity to talk about G. Love and the new album, and they definitely



mentioned it in terms such as, 'See G. Love and buy the new album at the show.'"

McGuinn gave his overview of the retail impact: "The week after the show the G.

**Gregg Latterman** down record ranked at No. 13 out of the box in Philly and No. 113 nationally. We sold 2,300 pieces out of its 13,000 sold that week. The Len record went 58-27 in Philly that week. while nationally it went 64-51. The Lit record went 44-36; the Offspring record went 50-37. Even Fuel, a record that is a year old, went 130-81 that week. Headliners The Barenaked Ladies went from 164 to 117. These are not small numbers. Just look at the Len record, which increased from 842 pieces sold to 1,431 sold. That's a *big* jump.

"In fact, the G. Love & Special Sauce story is a perfect example of how this is a win-win situation. Would we have played it as much if they weren't playing the show? Would they have gotten as much ancillary promotion in terms of being a part of promos, being talked about on the radio and being interviewed on the radio? Probably not. Now here's a band that, in their first three weeks of sales in Philly, have sold over 5.000 copies, which is way ahead of the pace of their last album in Philadelphia."

#### The Festival 'In-Store'

One of the biggest reasons the Y100 Feztival was immediately successful for the artists was that it not only included an on-site retailer (which in itself is a rarity), but the station also set up numerous autograph sessions with the bands at the retailer's tent. That turned out to be a potent sales combination.

"The first few years we did the show, we did meet-and-greets that were extremely limited," said McGuinn, explaining the station's rationale for the HMV tent. "We thought it would be better to make it a bigger thing and, at the same time, put the onus on the artists, the man"Do labels actually see a return on the investment of politics and, oftentimes, financial commitment to a radio station by playing a show? agers and the labels to bring their artists to the HMV tent, where the CDs were being sold, for signing sessions. A lot of labels were very aggressive about pursuing it, and that netted quite a bit of sales."

Klaiman pointed out one of the things that worked in WPLY's favor: It had already done a number of autograph areas during previous shows. "It really helps if it becomes a regular part of the show. People will know to run over to the right side of the stage after a set, because that's where the band will be to sign autographs.

"Another point that needs to be mentioned: It is rare for bands to witness the point-of-sale experience. They hear about it from the label or they see the sales figures, but to be at an event where someone is buying the record and ripping the plastic off the CD, then coming up to the artist and asking them to sign it ... that's got to feel pretty good."

McGuinn summarizes the key to making these types of things a success for the artist: "On site, the bands that wanted to do the work reaped the benefits. G. Love signed autographs for two hours. They met a lot of fans, and they sold a lot of records. Having HMV there was definitely a positive for all parties."

#### Making It Work For The Long Term

It's all well and good to sell some CDs at a festival, but are there longterm benefits to playing a festival that can be quantified? Yes, said McGuinn. "Train is the most dramatic example. When we added that record, it was selling 100 units a week. Then it went to 300, then 500. The week of the festival it went to 800, and this week it was over 1,000. No one else is playing it. All you can do is say, "That's Y100."

"It works because it's all connected: We have a record in medium rotation; the band commits to the festival and plays the side stage; we start getting curiosity calls; the airplay goes up; the research comes back strong; and then we move the song into heavy rotation. It is all connected, and the sales are a result of that."

To make such an impact around a station festival requires a great deal of work on the label's part, and a willing radio partner is key. "To make it work, you have to work the show," Latterman explained. "Just to be put on the show, be spun 10 times a week and have a handful of CDs in the market ... that's worthless. You don't even need the band to tour if that's all you're doing. "For instance, with Train in Houston, we were put on the air with the understanding that the band would play the festival. So you use that as the anchor. Train's management and Columbia's Chris Woltman went in with the station and built in some market support. By the time Train played the show, there were units in the marketplace and special contests in effect."

Klaiman agreed: "This does not happen in every market. I wish that it did. You'll see clear benefits from the good shows that are put together over a number of months, but the shows that slap three random acts together and call it a birthday festival don't always do that for you."

#### The Future: Micromarketing


I asked Latterman if most stations are willing to work with labels to maximize the exposure for the artist in the market in preparation for the show. "It depends," he replied. "The stations that do work with you are the best stations. They understand it is worthless for them to put their energy into a band unless it works for them. But it is hard. An example is Dovetail Joint, who played a show for KNRK/Portland. If we were closer, we could have built a great little thing with them, but it is so expensive to fly there.

"I do think, however, that distance will become less of a problem as labels start to do more and more micromarketing. Instead of doing a tour of the whole country, bands will continually tour a region until it happens. You have to do that and work the market. That's also the only way to ensure there are enough units in the market, no matter how much is paid to get co-op support at retail."

Like so many things in life, if everyone works together and works hard, good things can happen. This is surely the case with festival shows. There's no denying a properly run and promoted station festival can dramatically improve an artist's position in the marketplace, but it takes more than simply being on the show. As Latterman concluded. "It's nice to say you were on the show, but if you want to get anything out of it in terms of sales, you have to have more going on than just the show."

A lot of the harder-edged rock, like Limp Bizkit's "Re-Arranged," Sevendust's "Denial" and the new Rage Against The Machine, has been requesting top 5 phones for us, but Filter's "Take a Picture," which is a much softer song, has been No. I phones for the past two weeks now. As far as research



goes, the Red Hot Chili Peppers' "Around the World," Creed's "Higher," Kid Rock's "Cowboy" and Sevendust are all coming back strong for us. I'm really liking the Sevendust record; it sounds great on the air. little more than a year ago Joel Hollander was GM of WFAN/New York, the highestbilling radio station in America. In fact, Hollander had been part of the original WFAN team and played a major role in the station's 11-year streak as the leader in Sports Talk radio.

When it was announced that

Hollander had been named President and CEO of Westwood One, America's largest radio network, there were many who wondered how he could give up such a great job. But Hollander jumped into the new position with both feet and hasn't stopped running since.

On the personal side, his 1993 founding — with his wife, Susan — of the CJ Foundation for Sudden Infant Death Syndrome is his proudest accomplishment. The foundation was born out of the loss of one of their children, and with the backing of WFAN and the incredible commitment of morning personality Don Imus, the foundation has raised \$7 million. Thus Hollander knows firsthand how much of an impact radio has within the community, and he feels it is very important that the airwaves be utilized even more for good works than they currently are.

**Beginning his career:** "I-picked radio when I got out of college. I started at a 1,000-watt daytime station in Delan, FL called WETO. I don't even know if it exists today. It was a mom-and-pop radio station. I really wanted to be on the air. I was doing rip and read on Saturdays, college and high school sports, and I was pretty terrible. It was a great experience, though, radio at its grass roots. I learned how to write copy, sell and collect money. That's why I got into sales."

Moving up the ladder: "I kind of worked my way through Daytona Beach for a year, then came back to my home, New York. Judy Ellis gave me a shot at 99X in January of 1980. It all started from there. I floated through a few stations and got a management job at the then-infamous New York Radio Network, Doubleday, WAPP and WHN. I went on to become Local Sales Manager at WRKS. I had three job offers in August of 1986. One was to go to work for Sillerman when he was just starting at WCBM in Baltimore. The next was to be GSM of WRKS, and that's when Jeff Smulyan bought WHN and then WAPP. WHN was kind of thrown into the deal, being a not-verysuccessful AM station at the time.

"I decided to go with Jeff, which was an important decision. If I hadn't, I would never have been at WFAN. Jeff had this crazy idea about Sports radio, and I thought it was great, being a New Yorker and a sports fanatic. We started July 1. It was probably one of the most miserable failures ever in broadcasting in its first 18 months. In October of the

following year Jeff entered into an agreement with the NBC stations. I met Mr. Imus for the first time, and his first words to me were, 'How do you feel, f—khead, I just doubled your billing!'

"We took the station from \$5 million to \$27 million in revenue over a two-year period. The station had just started doing well when, unfortunately, Jeff ran into some problems and had to sell. The single best thing that ever happened to me was when Mel bought it. He immediately made me GM. We took the station to new heights over a five-year period, record cash flows. I think we were the first radio station ever to produce and sell five professional teams at once — the Giants, Jets, Knicks, Rangers and Mets, and then St. John's. We put Imus into syndication, and *Mike and the Mad Dog* were wildly successful and are still prohably the premier sports talk show in the country"

still probably the premier sports talk show in the country.' Biggest difference between the station side and the network side: "One of the things I bring to the table is that I sat on the other side, and I know what it is for a GSM or GM, when they're sold out, to have a network deal. They're having a tough time with it. I understand what their problems are probably better than somebody who may be in the position but who hasn't sat there. I know when things are good and when things are bad. I think I can communicate that to the GMs. I probably spend as much time on the phone with GMs and'GSMs as with anybody else."

State of network radio: "It's as healthy as it's ever been. The year 2000 is looking unbelievable. There's no reason to believe it's not going to continue. Westwood is a dominant force in the network arena. AMFM's done a good job, Premiere's done a good job, and ABC's a good competitor. You have four strong companies competing in the network arena. We were all just in Amelia Island at an ANA Convention, which I don't believe has happened at this level, with the four presidents speaking, presenting case studies and carrying the flag for network radio."

Mission of Westwood One: "We want to be the most successful network. We want to be very affiliate-friendly. We want to work for advertisers, and we want to create as much shareholder value as we can."

The structure of the company: "With over 1,100 people — with the traffic component, it is 3,300 people it's a very big company. We're in the process of integrating Metro and Shadow. We have our major sales operations in New York and Los Angeles and offices in Chicago, Detroit, Dallas and Atlanta on the Westwood side. On the Metro/ Shadow side we're in 81 cities. We are in the traffic and news business, 24 formats, short- and long-form programming, specials and sports. We're always looking to develop new programs, which is very important. We've had a few successful launches over the last 30 to 60 days with *Inside the Huddle*, with Boomer Esiason and Chris Russo. *Onion Radio* and *CBS Market Watch* have been wildly successful."

Long-range goals: "One-hundred-dollar stock as fast as we can get there, and to be the biggest and best at what we do. We need to get the lion's share of dollars on the table and create new dollars for network radio, and not just dot-com business — which, however, I think is very important. The dot-com business has been great across all platforms, whether it's local or national, network, print or TV. We have to keep that going." Current challenges: "Most immediate is integrating

**Current challenges:** "Most immediate is integrating Metro Traffic into Westwood and getting our internal communication systems where they need to be. They have improved dramatically. There's a lot of information that Metro brings to the table, and we have to disseminate that information from 81 cities."

With the purchase of Metro and having Shadow, is the focus more information-driven? "We'll do anything that makes sense for our affiliated radio stations, whether it's news, traffic, weather, sports, concerts — whatever is out there that can be a win-win for Westwood One and the affiliates, we'll do."

**Differentiating his company from its competitors:** "We're really very different. Nobody else is in the traffic business. We have more shows and more tonnage than the others. We worry about ourselves and let the rest take care of itself."

Effect of Clear Channel purchasing AMFM: "We think Clear Channel are very good operators. We do business with them and obviously will continue doing business with them. It's a very good company, and I think that anybody who says they know what their plan is right now is lying, because I don't believe *they* know. Nobody has ever run that many stations before."

What the Viacom merger means: "It's a positive platform for us. We already do business with MTV and Blockbuster. I think it potentially gives us more ammunition."

Internet strategy: "We are in the game. We did our first deal about 60 days ago. We did a swap for promotion with CBS Sportsline, where they wanted to brand themselves and their site through our football, hockey and college football games. What we got was a return in equity, which was about 450,000 shares of stock. That's a very good deal for us, and it's a very good deal for them. It's really one of those win-win deals. We're looking to do others."

**Future of network compensation:** "It's a game I didn't create. It's obviously fairly important. To me, if you have to compensate to clear a program, to a large degree that means the sales staff did not position the value of that product correctly. It depends on the individual product. Compensation is part of the network arena, and I say it will continue to be."

Advice for stations when affiliating with a network: "Make sure you're not just doing it for the comp. If there is programming involved, make sure it's good for your station, that it's woven into what you need. I'd be careful what you take."

How stations should manage the relationship with their network: "It's a two-way street. A lot of stations, when they hear the network guy call or the traffic guy call, might not think it's the most important call of the day, but there's a lot of value the networks bring to a local radio station, and they can help over a period of time. "

Most influential individual: "At the beginning of my career Judy Ellis helped me a lot. Over the last ten years, Mel Karmazin and Farid Suleman."

Career highlight: "The year we became the No. 1 revenue station at WFAN. When we started the format, most people gave it six months to a year and said it would never work. Now there are over 250 Sports radio stations." Career disappointment: "I'm not the type of person

who looks back. I've been fortunate I haven't had too many disappointments in my career." Favorite radio format: "I love Sports, and I like

Oldies."

Favorite song: "Tears in Heaven' by Eric Clapton." Favorite TV show: "The Sopranos." Favorite movie: "Most recently, Analyze This."

Favorite book: "Gone With the Wind."

Favorite restaurant: "I don't have a favorite. I like a good steakhouse."

Beverage of choice: "Diet Coke."

**Hobbies:** "Following the market, obviously. Basketball and going to my kids' games."

Stock recommendation: "Do you think I'm not going to say Westwood, CBS and Infinity?"

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
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
