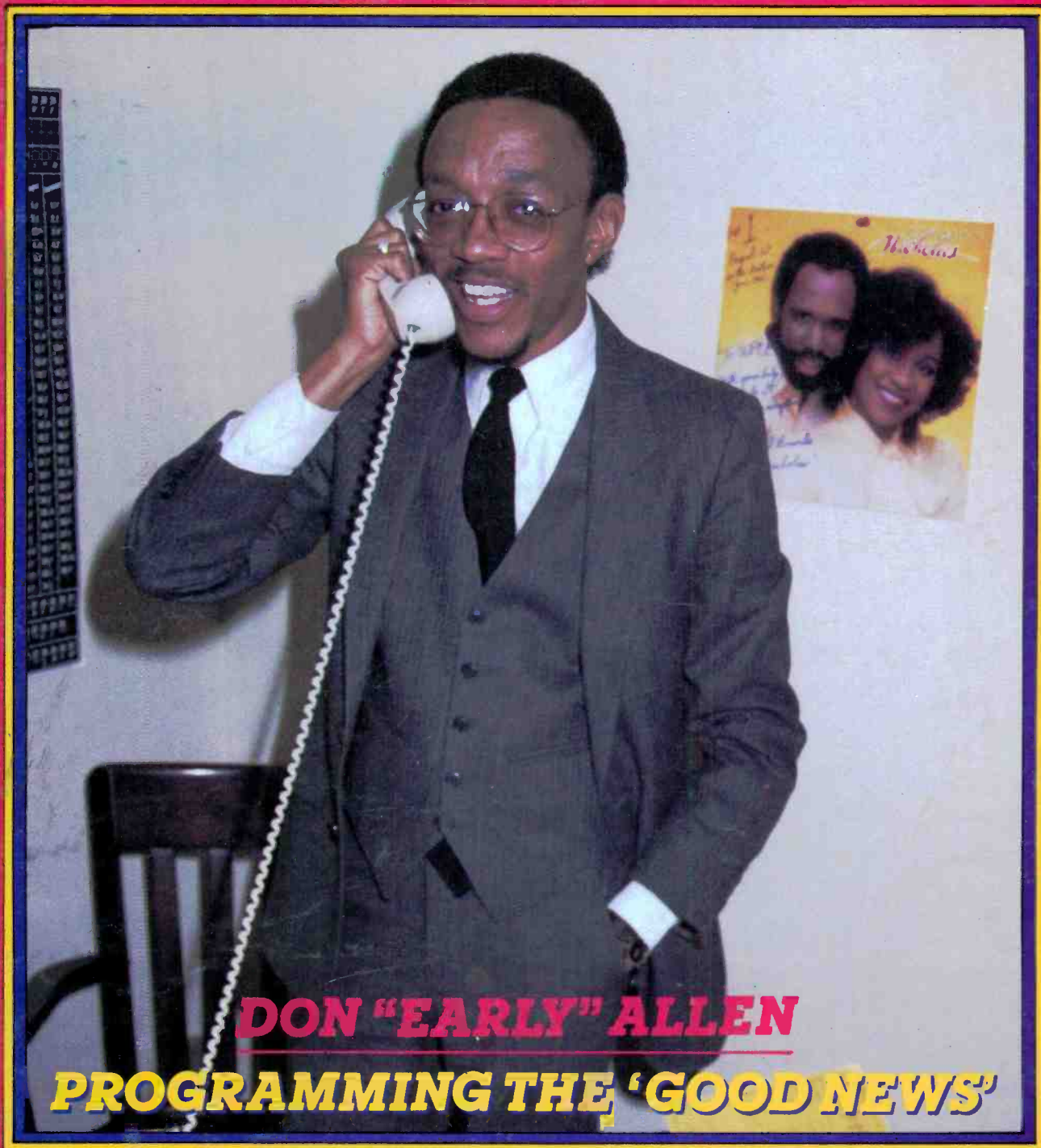

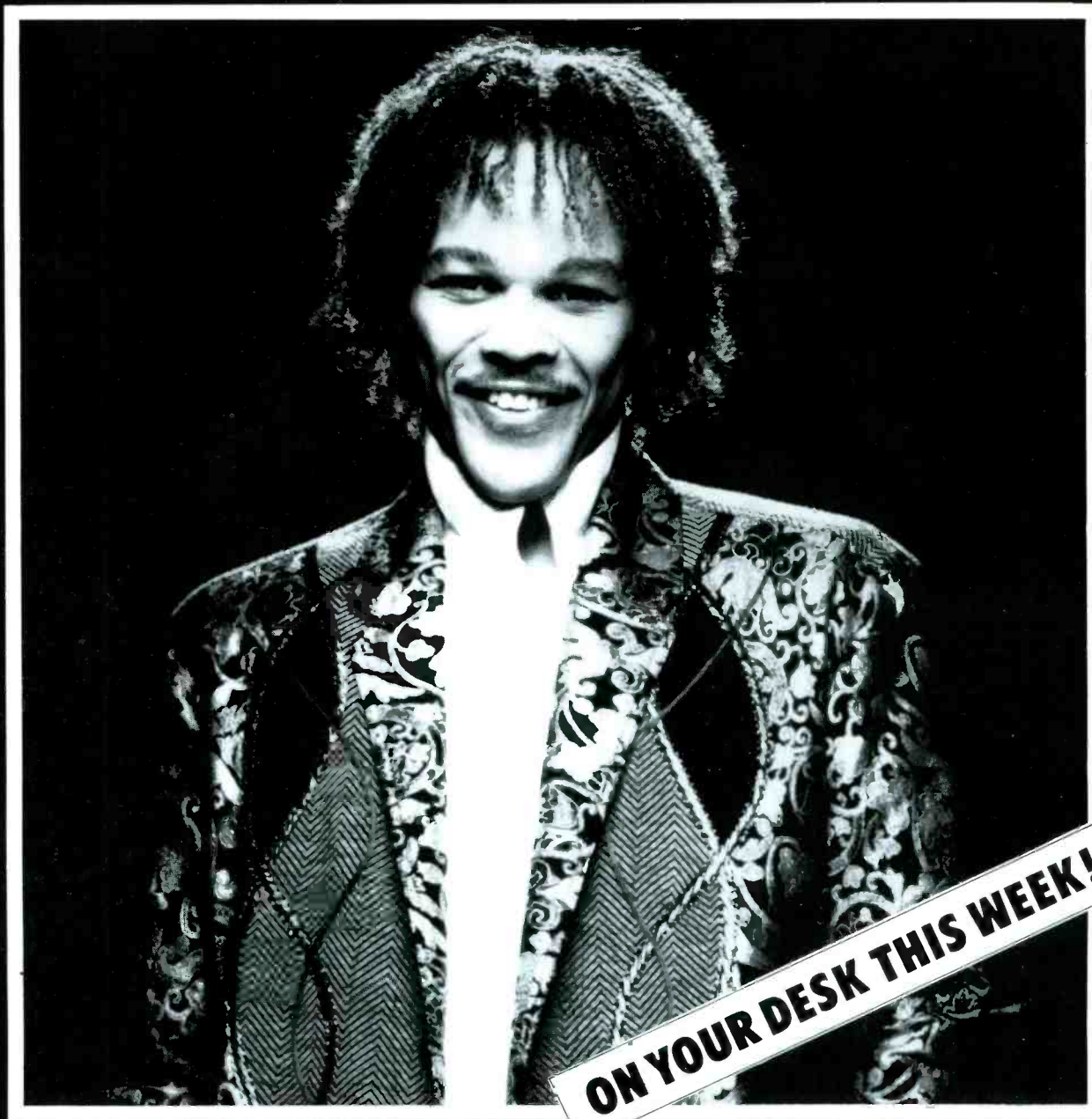

GUEST COMMENTARY



The following remarks are excerpted from the Keynote Address delivered by Irving Azoff, Pres., MCA Records, at the NARM Convention on Saturday, March 8, 1986.

We are an industry under siege. When I say we, I mean all of us who make a living from music: the artists, the record companies and the retailers.

First, let's talk about the artists. Pretty good year, huh? Great music - the year of "The Boss," Whitney, Dire Straits, Prince, Sting, Sade, Tears for Fears, etc. And aren't we proud of our artists' year of giving?

They are our software. It all starts with them. I say they delivered the goods, musically and morally.

Now how about the record companies. Our trade organi-

zation, the RIAA, is the laughing stock of the entertainment business. About the only thing we do right is certify gold and platinum records.

We blew the whole lyric controversy. The PMRC kicked our butts. Even the retailers were on our side on that one...

And how about those indies, huh? That genius who runs that famous publication, "Radio & Radio" - Dwight Case, the one who ran RKO radio? He's got a great solution. Let's charge the record companies for airplay...

Now how about retail. You guys did open up to better marketing tie-ins this year. In general, though, you have treated record companies like a major enemy.

If we are indeed an industry under siege and are going to do anything about it, we'd better air our differences and talk about what should be our mutual enemies. They come disguised as do-gooders, as legislators and as certain members of the media.

There are certainly bad apples in every basket. But are we really the villains we are now being painted to be? The attacks and witch hunts have become too intensified to laugh off.

Now let's talk about the issues dividing our house - artists and labels on one side, NARM membership on the

other.

From where I sit, it looks like you retailers expect labels to take all the risks. I keep hearing complaints about a soft first-quarter due to lack of superstar product. Here's a hard fact. The number of new releases in 1978 was 4,170 albums; in 1984, there were 2,170. Fewer companies, fewer releases, fewer superstars.

With the rising cost of marketing, a label can spend up to a million dollars promoting a new artist.

Radio hasn't exactly reacted in an "artist development" sort of way this year, either. Sade, a-ha, Whitney, Tears for Fears were all great success stories, but how many more could there have been?

Everything is CHR now. 'Contemporary Hit Radio' is defined by "Radio & Radio" - the one that gave us parallels 1, 2 and 3 (150 stations for a 'Breaker'); the one that created hundreds of indies, and in my opinion, destroyed the usefulness of the whole system.

I love this business, its artists and its people. We're not perfect, but who is?

I've brought up some volatile points in the hope that it will challenge you to think about our industry. Because in the end, we are one industry.

THE AMEN CORNER

Three cheers for Irving Azoff! His refreshing candor cuts straight through to the real problem that's bleeding our industry: "paper adds" that have absolutely nothing to do with sales.

The record industry has been just about "paralleled" into bankruptcy. It's about time that record companies got back to the basics of hard-core street work to market and merchandise their product - the kind that Jimi Starks of E/P/A spoke about in a recent BRE article.

There is no substitute for one-on-one contact with radio stations and record shops. And only those companies that cover themselves in the streets - along with airplay - will survive today.

**BLACK INDIE PROMOTION
DISMISSAL PROTEST SET**

Los Angeles: A press conference held amid the backdrop of the NARM convention on Sunday served notice that black civil rights organizations and concerned blacks within the music industry are prepared to take action to protest "the unilateral dismissal of all independent record promoters" in the wake of the recent probe.

Led by longtime entertainment industry activist Rev. Al Sharpton, head of the New York-based National Youth Movement, with the support of the NAACP and PUSH, the effort is geared to encourage labels to enter into negotiations regarding the reinstatement of black promoters.

While acknowledging that some companies (which were not identified) have already come forward and made positive moves in this direction, Sharpton warned that the protest could "escalate into a full-scale grassroots boycott of all labels who refuse to negotiate in good faith."

Flanked by Willis Edwards of the Hollywood/Beverly Hills Chapter of the NAACP and BRE publisher Sidney Miller, who heads the Chapter's Task Force to Investigate the Record Industry, Sharpton pointed out the inequity in an action that severely affects the survival of black professionals in an industry to which the black consumer contributes 40% of its gross revenues.

Alluding to the multi-million dollar figure cited in the indie promotion probe, Sharpton commented: "Whites should not be allowed to sit down at an \$80 million table and greedily overstuff themselves and then ask blacks, who were not even invited to the dinner, to participate in some mass regurgitation."

He continued: "There are those men who recognize that black promotion men are not implicated in the allegations. They are smart enough to know that labels must develop some way to ensure that those black dollars keep flowing in."

**FED PAYOLA PROBE
MAIN TOPIC AT NARM
CONVENTION**

Los Angeles: As expected, the recent allegations of mob/payola practices within the record industry, and the sudden dismissal of payola-tainted indie promoters by major record companies, was

a hot topic at the National Assn. of Recording Merchandiser's 28th annual convention held last weekend at the Century Plaza Hotel.

While the official order of business at the conference was the dissemination of information on how to effectively retail and market merchandise, the primary subject between speeches and seminars was the payola controversy.

Scheduled on the first day of the event was an independent distributors' gathering that centered on the indie record promotion debate and how it could possibly help the distributors.

Robert Perloff of Universal Records distributors said that he supported a federal probe of the indies scandal as a "positive move" that could open the door for distributors to get airplay of their product. Perloff claimed that indie distributors have been "locked out" of getting airplay for their records.

While Whitney Houston, Sade and USA for Africa's "We Are the World" were among the big winners at NARM's Best-Seller awards presentation, the record retailers' complaint about the lack of new superstar releases in the first quarter was a major issue.

Manufacturers attempted to soothe retailers' concerns by promoting "exciting" new LPs from such heavyweights as Prince, Michael Jackson, Lionel Richie and Tina Turner.

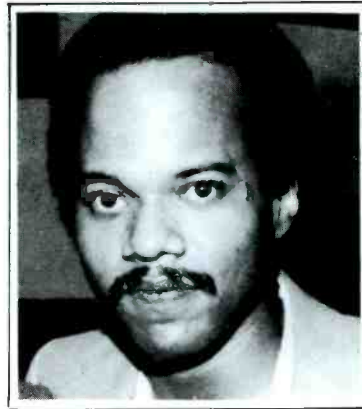
In attendance were over 1,700 record company executives, retail chain owners, indie distributors, one-stops, rack jobbers, buyers, merchandisers, retail managers and sales people.

So from Louisiana's capital city comes the news that WTKL's PD Broady, who had carried the daytimer to format dominance and its mid-day air personality, E. Rodney, whose unique blues-flavored show is a daypart leader, will both be at the programming helm of local stations.

Broady moves across town as PD of KQXL-FM, the market's strong (and only) urban FM-er, while Jones moves up to PD at WTKL, still holding its own despite its limitations as an AM daytimer.

The battle of the vets is on in Baton Rouge. Stay tuned.

**WHAM SPLITS FROM
MANAGEMENT CO.
WITH SOUTH-AFRICAN
TIES**

London: British pop duo Wham!(whose own dissolution was recently reported) has split from its management company, Nomis, following a takeover by Kunick Leisure, a 34% South African-owned company.

According to singer George Michael, he and partner Andrew Ridgeley had agreed to leave the group several months ago, but that "changes with the management company" forced him to make the announcement sooner than planned.

Kunick, one of the owners of the controversial Sun City entertainment complex, recently acquired ownership of promoter Harvey Goldsmith's Allied Entertainment Group. Goldsmith's recent concert promotions have included Stevie Wonder, Bruce Springsteen and the Rolling Stones (along with organizing the Live Aid famine benefit at Wembley Station).

He has been the target of criticism from artists for allowing Kunick to buy into his company and, reportedly, some acts have considered

boycotting his promotions.

Following the loss of Wham!, one of Nomis' biggest earners, Kunick postponed a special stockholders meeting to ratify the \$7,400,000 pact, which is now in jeopardy.

New York: Waymon Jones has been named National Director/Urban-Black Promotion at PolyGram Records, according to a recent announcement by VP/Urban-Black Promotion Leroy Little.

Jones assumes the national post following his previous assignment as Northeast/North Atlantic Regional Promotion Manager for the label.

Commenting on Jones' appointment, Little said, "Wayman has displayed quality leadership, sincere efforts, skilled execution, and most of all, professionalism at its best. I look forward to a long and rewarding relationship."

Jones joined PolyGram in 1984, after a stint as Northeast District Manager/R&B for Arista.

REGGIE UTLEY, KMAX, LOS ANGELES: PROMOTING THE BODY OF CHRIST

It is no secret that Christians come in all garden varieties, so it shouldn't be surprising that a guy once known as "Reggie Rockin' L.A." is also known as one of gospel music's most enthusiastic promoters.

Reggie Utley, formerly a music director at L.A.'s KGFJ under the reign of program director J.B. Stone, and a fixture at the station for nearly six years, has done everything from present gospel skating parties to Sunday brunches in the name of promoting the "Good News."

He is currently an account executive and Sunday morning mike man at L.A. station KMAX, where he is renewing

his faith in gospel.

During his stay at KGFJ, Utley is credited with developing a solid Sunday gospel program, a chore he gleefully accepted until his departure from the station in 1980 to work at Pasadena-based station KMAX.

Although he has been able to bring his spirited commitment to the music of both KGFJ and KMAX, Utley claims that there are no outlets in the Los Angeles market to properly promote the music.

"Outlets for gospel music are very limited," he told BRE recently. "Most of the stations that offer any religious programming mainly do church programming. They may throw in some music every now-and-then.

"There's a definite need for a 24hour (gospel music) outlet in Los Angeles," Utley continued.

But Utley also said that secular stations were beginning to play more inspirational or message oriented music by artists such as The Winans and Tramaine Hawkins.

"We have had artists that are crossing over," Utley noted, "and better produced LPs have expanded the opportunity for inspirational gospel to be played more widely.

"But there are some traditional Christian values being stretched," he con-

tinued, adding, "Most of it (inspirational records) is message music, not gospel."

Utley has supported his beliefs about the important mission of gospel music in the community.

For the last two years, he has been the host of a gospel music skating party twice a week at Skateland U.S.A. in L.A. suburb Compton.

"I wanted to present a family-oriented atmosphere that would really appeal to Christians," Utley explained.

Other efforts to get people to support the gospel have included Utley's co-promotion with KMAX and NBA basketball team the L.A. Clippers.

Players such as Marques Johnson and Junior Bridgeman came to one of Utley's Gospel Sunday brunch concerts and shared their faith in God.

An added treat during the brunches is the concerts featuring local gospel talent.

Utley even went a step further when he helped put on the "Gospel Sunsplash '85" in Los Angeles.

Whatever it takes to get the message to the masses, Utley is willing to venture.

As he put it, "I am totally about my Father."

DON "EARLY" ALLEN

PROGRAMMING THE 'GOOD NEWS'

People need the Gospel. The Gospel is "good news," which is what Don "Early" Allen programs for the Norfolk, Va.-based Willis Broadcasting Corp.'s 13 stations.

The national chain program director's approach differs from that used in most local formats catering to church music because he is a firm believer in the business of radio.

"While there is a need for such programming in people's lives," he told BRE recently, "and while we must be committed to saving some souls through radio, radio is a business."

Allen, who is a 16-year radio vet, says that the sound of the "Good News" has become more sophisticated, more contemporary and has found its way into secular formats, "which makes my job much easier."

"Groups like The Winans and acts like Tramaine are starting to appear more frequently on the urban and R&B playlists. They are getting a good response and bringing the inspirational message to a wider audience," Allen maintains.

The Buffalo, N.Y.-native added that more sophisticated production qualities, less emphasis on quartets and choirs and major label involvement in the marketing of this music have broadened its exposure.

He said that that black inspirational music is becoming the new "crossover" music for urban radio.

Listening to Allen, one might think that his comments are time-tested over years of trial and error.

But this young man must be a quick study.

Most people work until they reach mid-life to attain a coveted position in a major corporation, especially when they spring forth from humble beginnings.

When they do excel at an early age, they are often called "wunderkinds," and are lauded for their indefatigable drive toward success and accomplishment.

Allen, recently appointed to his current post as national program director of Willis Broadcasting Corp., has managed to rise through the ranks of radio to this current plateau in just 16 years.

What makes this remarkable is that Allen is only 30-years old.

At this mature juncture in his life, Allen is now responsible for the sound - and success - of 14 stations in the Willis chain.

The markets, primarily in the South, include: Trenton, NJ; Gary, IN; Norfolk, Richmond and Roanoke, VA; Jacksonville, FL; New Orleans, LA; St. Louis, MO; and Thomasville and Charlotte, NC.

Although the formats of the stations are inspira-

tional/gospel-oriented, Allen maintains an air shift on WOWI-FM in Norfolk, which is urban-formatted. The dual roles are handled with ease and present no apparent conflicts in his programming duties.

Allen's interests are not confined to broadcasting, though, as Allen has ventured into inspirational recording with the single, "You're My Fire," co-written and produced by Grammy Award-winner Sanchez Harley and gospel stalwart Bobby Jones.

Allen says that the record may soon bring a major label contract.

His versatility in radio and expertise in programming provide Allen with the opportunity to wear many hats at Willis Broadcasting. But he doesn't seem to mind because, as he put it, "It's all about radio and radio is a very important part of my life."

His unique perspective has been developed through many years in urban and R&B radio as a mikeman.

He started his career at Buffalo station WBLK where his father, Don Allen, Sr., remains religious program director after 21 years.

He acquired his first full-time air shift at WBLK, where he handled an afternoon drive shift, titled "Express Yourself."

While at the station, Allen graduated from the State

University of New York at Buffalo with a degree in communications.

He moved on to WUFO in Buffalo, where he set up an internship for students desiring a career in broadcasting.

After two years on board at WUFO, Allen accepted an opportunity to go on the air in Dallas at KKDA.

Heeding the old adage, "Go west, young man," Allen did just that. He ventured all the way to the coast in Los Angeles where he worked for KKTT, now known as KGFJ.

But it proved to be a short stint and in 1978, he returned to the Eastern seaboard where he took over mike duties at WWRL, an R&B station in New York.

He spent six successful years on the air there, before the station was purchased by Unity Broadcasting.

"They bought the station and switched the format to inspirational," Allen recalls, adding that the audience response was not immediate, but "the (audience) reaction did grow."

Shortly after Allen gave WWRL's contemporary inspirational format its 'legs' in an urban setting, he moved on to the post with Willis Broadcasting.

He said that most of the church organizations, individuals and the preachers who had block program slots

NATIONAL BLACK MEDIA COALITION REPORT THE COMMUNITY BLUES

A recent Black Radio Exclusive article contained a quote which exemplifies the state of black radio and its opinion of the blues, as well as the inevitable consequences: "Radio may not sing the blues right away, but I'm sure it can hum a few bars once in a while. The blues can keep radio in the black."

Over the last decade, music lovers have struggled to rid themselves of old taboos and prejudices concerning blues. They've gained a whole new appreciation of the blues and the unique art form it has been in American culture.

In the past, blues music carried a legacy of racial and religious stigma. Whites tended to dismiss the blues as "cotton patch music" or "nigruh wailing," while many blacks scorned the blues as the devil's music or - especially after the civil rights movement of the 1960's - as "Uncle Tom music." Gospel lovers considered it sinful to even listen to it.

"People have the misconception that the blues is sad and depressing music, but the blues tells a story. It's not all sad music," said Vic Givens, regional promoter, Malaco Records, a blues/gospel label.

There has been a resurgence of blues music, according to Dr. William Ferris, director of the center for the study of Southern Culture at the University of Mississippi, noted blues author and filmmaker. He makes the study of the blues a major part of the center's activities and has created a blues archives which contains more than 35,000 blues recordings, 10,000 books, plus periodicals, photographs and other research materials.

"Blues popularity has grown nationwide. Last year at the Chicago Blues Festival, 200,000 people attended. At the Delta Blues Festival, 30,000 people were there, so it's extremely popular," said Ferris.

On the other hand, the popularity of the blues is not as strong as it should be within black radio. "How can you turn your back on your music?" asked Jack Gibson, publisher of Jack The Rapper the controversial weekly newsletter which addresses the problems and

injustices encountered by blacks in the radio and record industries.

Recently Gibson wrote an open letter to black radio chastising it for losing its identity with the community: "Come back home where you belong. Leave that urban contemporary, or whatever you wanna call it, alone."

You can't be white, so come on home, and start playing what you know best - Good Black Music. Don't desert your black listener and your black communities. Remember they need you and you need them."

According to Vic Givens, "urban contemporary" programming seems to have lost its identity and role in the community. "Young programmers feel blues music is not progressive enough," he said.

"In their attempt to attract white listeners, assuming that they don't want to hear the blues, the programmers try to please the agencies by playing more crossover music."

The assumption that whites do not like the blues is another misconception because whites were listening to the blues before it became popular on commercial radio, Givens added. "Blues used to only be heard on public stations. And who listens to and supports public broadcasting anyway?" he asked.

"Some black radio stations have run away from this American classic," said Joe Medlin, former blues recording artist, now VP of sales and marketing, Krystal Records. "They aren't standing up for what they should."

"Blacks are going to lose the blues," says Gibson. "Black radio should quit trying to be white - and play some good black music."

Let's remember, before it's too late: "The blues can keep radio in the Black."

RIAA/VIDEO CERTIFIES HIGHEST AMOUNT OF MUSIC VIDEOS YET

RIAA/Video, the video arm of the Recording Industry Assn. of America (RIAA), recently announced five gold certifications and one platinum award for music videos during the month of February, the highest total since the category was created last October.

"Motown 25: Yesterday, Today, Forever" was the first music video to attain platinum status. The video was released by MGM/UA.

The gold awards given during February, however, by no means reflect the youth-oriented nature of most music videos.

Among the five videos certified gold in February by RIAA/Video are "Frank Sinatra - Portrait of an Album," an MGM/UA release which surely appeals to the '40s pop set.

VIDSHORTS: There are ethnic answers to everything, unfortunately, and Magnum Entertainment has a cinema/home video answer to Mario Puzo's gangster classic, dubbed - hold your coffee now - "The Black Godfather."

It's, naturally, the story of a black gangster who claws his way to the top of a ghetto drug syndicate.

Sounds more like a film that should have been called "Black Scarface" or "Superfly - The Second, Third, Fourth or... Chapter."

Another new video, one that is likely to more seriously appeal to less escapist tastes, is "Quincy Jones...A Celebration," a made for home video tribute

to the maestro.

Some of Q's favorite artists are featured on this vid, including James Ingram, Patti Austin, Ray Charles and the myriad of jazz artists with whom his earlier years are associated.

Rappers, rhymers and lyric writers, Select recording trio Whistle recently completed production on the video of their "(Nothing Serious) Just Buggin'" hit.

The debut single was written by UTFO's Kangol and Howie Tee, credited with Select's "Roxanne" explosion.

The vidclip is produced by Soffer-Pantelich Productions, whose credits include Fat Boys, UTFO, Full Force and Lisa Lisa.

throughout the chain thought "it was a refreshing change and that there was a new type of gospel music out there."

"There was some resistance from some of the preachers," he added, "but it's generally agreed that this has been a positive move."

He noted that, "We've attracted more of the same audience that urban stations are after - the 18-34-year old listener."

He said that the audience has been receptive to the station's network community programming, such as the "Crusade for Christ" public affairs and the more secular-oriented "Community Roundtable."

From the sales standpoint, Allen said that while the chain accepted national advertisements from some beer and wine companies, "there's been no negative reaction. It comes down to a matter of economics - they know we have to pay for the stations."

It is apparent that Allen's perspective on radio is well rooted in the values that make inspirational music programming important to the greater community and in the economic realities that make radio the competitive business it is.

Allen said that he would not trade his current spot for a return to urban radio, necessarily.

"I like my current programming involvement," he said. "It's given me a chance to be innovative, especially being the first chain to offer this kind of programming."

"No," he affirmed, "I really don't miss the other side."

SHIRLEY CAESAR EXPANDS A MUCH-HONORED CAREER IN GOSPEL MUSIC

Shirley Caesar, Gospel's grand First Lady, broke all records in the female Gospel category, as she received her fifth award at the recent Grammy ceremonies. Caesar won for Best Female Soul Gospel Vocal Performance for her single entitled, *Martin* - a tribute to Martin Luther King Jr. on Word's Rejoice label.

She previously enjoyed the distinction of being the only Gospel artist to have won the coveted award twice in a row.

Caesar commented, "We give honor to the Lord Jesus Christ for making (these awards) possible." When asked at a recent press conference how much of an influence the Lord had made in her putting the *Martin* single on her *Celebration* album, she proclaimed joyfully, "Two hundred percent of the influence came from the Lord!"

Caesar, who was also named "Most Outstanding Gospel Artist" at the 18th annual NAACP Image Awards Ceremonies honoring the positive achievements of blacks in the arts and media, has been quite busy these days. She is not only bringing healthy sales to the Word label and its distributor, A&M Records, but is also exploring other facets of her talents.

Caesar is featured on the Rejoice Records' release, *Jubilee Live*, along with Al Green, The Williams Brothers and Bobby Jones and New Life, an effort in which the proceeds will benefit the

troubled Fisk University in Nashville, TN.

Gospel's First Lady has also expanded her career focus to acting. Her recent debut in live theatre, playing the part of Sister Hope in the successful musical entitled *Resolution*, is just the beginning.

Further honing her new-found talents, she is working with West Coast drama coach, Betty Bridges - mother of TV star Todd Bridges. Guest appearances on TV comedy and variety series appearances may very well be in the offing.

Caesar - who began her music ministry with the famed Gospel Caravans and notables like Alvertina Walker, Inez Andrews, Cassetta George, Dorothy Norwood, and (then) pianist, James Cleveland - has inspired many to follow in her footsteps.

From "Little Shirley Caesar," to "The First Lady of Gospel," Shirley Caesar is a living testimony to the vast and exciting options open to Gospel artists today.

'MUSIC LESSON' MARKS RETURN OF ORIGINAL WAILERS TO VINYL ON SHANACHIE

The late Bob Marley, Peter Tosh and Bunny Wailer together again on vinyl? No, it's not a crude joke. It's the 12" single "Music Lessons" just released by Shanachie Records.

Backed with "Nice Time," the big single features Marley, Tosh, Wailer, Constantine 'Vision' Walker and Junior Brathwaite vocals based on an unreleased track by the late reggae king.

The single is also the prelude to a new Wailers' LP due for spring release.

It further marks the renaissance of the Wailers' Tuff Gong Records label. The album will feature other obscure tracks from the Wailers' vault.

The Wailers ARE alive.

Some New Releases: To some, the term "Race 'n' Rhythm" might harken back to the days when black music, Latin music, or any music not performed by Anglo artists, could only be found in record stores in the "race music" bins at the back of the store.

While it is not real clear why Northstar recording artists Race 'N' Rhythm chose such a name, it is more clear that this music is eclectic.

The Oakland-based band has been the opening act for such groups as the S.O.S. Band, Bloodstone, Con Funk

Shun, Etta James and Peaches and Herb.

They've just released this eight-song LP to display their versatility with all forms of the music rooted in the black experience and programmers should give it a listen. Produced by the group with Michael Cotten, this is pop music, no matter how you color it.

Meadowlark Records, a division of New Jersey-based label Shanachie Records, recently released a spate of African music releases.

One such release is actually reggae-based - "Land of the Genesis" by the Dallol Band.

This seven-piece outfit uses horns, heavy backbeat and electronic keyboard textures to achieve a pleasant, non-adventurous effect.

Bob Marley's widow, Rita, says of the band, "Dallol is following in Bob's footsteps. I can see a great future for them."

See for yourself.

Another Meadowlark release comes from Zimbabwe's Thomas Mapfumo, who is considered in his native land to be one of the most accessible folk artists and purveyors of the chimurenga sound.

Titled "The Chimurenga Singles," the album is a collection of Mapfumo's music from 1976-1980 and features uplifting rhythmic dirges that belie the strife in which they were created.

If you like juju and other folky sounds from this part of the African continent, this is a must.

Mapfumo is also featured on another Meadowlark anthology, "Go South," which features his music along with the varied styles of other popular sub-Saharan musics.

Onike, Sankomota, Souzy Kasseya, Dele Abiodun, Samaba Mapangala, and Orchestra Virunga join Mapfumo on this wax, perhaps the most pleasing of the bunch.

Another release from the parent label, Shanachie, is the "Indestructible Beat of Soweto," another collection of music from various artists who harken from the segregated townships of South Africa.

While these rhythms and grooves have been popularized in Western pop music the last decade, there is something more primal and urgent evident here.

The second volume of the Zulu Jive series, "Soweto" is a combination of folk story telling and pungent rhythms of the most high.

A sure bet for the Afro-ophile music lover.

SHEILA E.'S CONCERT CROWNED BY PRINCE-LY VISIT

Sheila E.'s Thursday night concert at L.A.'s Universal Amphitheatre turned out to be one of the hottest live events in recent memory. The reigning queen of percussion wowed the audience with her multi-faceted talents. The real bombshell, however, came at the end of the show in the spectacular encore.

But first things first. Sheila knows what it takes to keep today's sophisticated audiences happy, offering an explosive stage show that underscored her carefully cultivated image as a member of the "Prince" family.

Elegant pillars, awash with smoke effects, greeted the crowd as the curtain rose. Sheila stepped out in a flashing electric coat, quickly discarded as the band broke into a rocking version of her hit "Sister Fate," followed by the sensuous strains of Prince's "Erotic City."

Highlighting cuts from her "Romance 1600" album, the show included sometimes overly generous portions of 'cute' stage banter. Playmate Sheila threw bubble gum to the audience and donned kiddie pajamas for the innocuous sexual overtones of "Toy Box."

But some of the concert's most riveting moments came during the extended percussion interludes featuring conga and timbale man Karl Peraza. Sheila's dad, ex-Santana member Pete Escovedo, introduced his daughter to authentic Afro-Cuban Santeria drumming techniques. Her conga duet with Karl demonstrated this ancient tradition to the obvious delight of the predominantly young urban crowd.

Leaving no doubt that she is indeed a well-rounded entertainer, Sheila revealed another dimension in her rendition of the moving ballad "Bedtime Story," which whipped the male segment of the crowd into a near frenzy. Ending the set on an upbeat note, the band kicked into an extended rap groove before the curtain went down.

Those unfortunates who had the audacity to leave early missed the rockiest encore this reviewer has seen. They also missed forty minutes worth of superstar Prince, as he joined Sheila for the smash "A Love Bizarre."

Teasing the crowd to the

breaking point, Prince romped through the aisles with his bodyguards, who also doubled as backup singers and dancers on stage. More of the Prince family joined Sheila and company onstage, including cool female guitarist Wendy Melvoin and "The Family" tenor saxophonist Eric Leeds. Clearly enjoying himself, Prince performed long versions of "America" and the current top-charting single "Kiss."

Demonstrating plenty of new moves and an energetic attitude, Prince lent credence to rumors that, contrary to his public statements, the world's foremost contemporary music performer may be gearing up for another tour.

THE GODFATHER ROCKS AMPHITHEATRE

Spurred by his recent chart smash, "Living in America," James Brown, a/k/a the Godfather of Soul, entertained a near-capacity crowd at the Universal Amphitheatre recently with an everything-but-the-kitchen-sink performance. Poured into one of his custom-made, vein-popping suits, Brown rumbled through his immense repertoire of soul classics, belting out songs like "Papa's Got A Brand New Bag" and "Please, Please, Please" with a gospel-tinged fervor.

This show was vintage Brown. There were the false starts from the band, the Godfather's trademark dance steps, the unexpected drops to the stage floor and, of course, his primal grunts, moans, and cries of "hit me!"

However, this two-hour adventure in funk was not without its flaws. Instead of squeezing as many hits as possible into the show, Brown chose to extend many tunes into long-winded jams. He also rambled on at times, paying tribute to living celebrities and eulogizing dead ones. Then there were the numerous band introductions and even an appearance by Mrs. James Brown (the Godmother of Soul?) Even Boy George dropped by during the encore. And "Living In America" was performed twice. There's more, but why ramble.

Some people will complain that Brown has not progressed musically in two decades. Indeed, "Living In America" is actually a definitive Brown groove given the 80's treatment.

Still, when it came to delivering woeful weepers like "Try Me" and "It's A Man's World," Brown proved he still has the soul to justify the "Godfather" label.

Yarbrough and Peoples opened the show with a frisky 45-minute set of urban R&B, which featured the current hit "Guilty."

THE O'JAYS AND PHYLLIS HYMAN AT THE BEVERLY THEATRE

The O'Jays may not sell records in abundance as they did in the early and mid-'70s, but the polished trio still brought a great deal of professionalism and soul to the stage during a recent engagement at the Beverly Theatre in Los Angeles. Some groups without current hits merely go through the motions; but Eddie Levert, Walter Williams and Sammy Strain sang and danced with zeal, shedding buckets of sweat as they raced through early gospel-charged Philadelphia soul classics.

Like many R&B groups who reigned in the pre-disco era, the O'Jays' slick choreography, sweet harmonies and matching outfits may seem archaic to some who prefer their music with tons of glitter and pretense. However, the O'Jays are a refreshing breath of air, especially when Levert be-

gins spilling his guts on tortured ballads like "Your Body's Here With Me (But Your Mind Is On the Other Side of Town)." Writhing with emotion, the diminutive vocalist stopped the show with this number, then picked up steam for the expected finale, "For the Love of Money."

The O'Jays were backed by an efficient rhythm section augmented by a brass section. If there was any problem with this show, it was that too many memorable hits that had to be squeezed into medleys. Nevertheless, for 75 minutes the O'Jays gave fans what they wanted: A class act, good vibes and the hits.

It was a little frustrating watching and listening to show opener Phyllis Hyman. With black vocalists like Whitney Houston and Sade currently enjoying so much popularity, you would think that the strikingly beautiful and vocally gifted Hyman would receive comparable exposure.

But then maybe Hyman's choice of material undermines her. Songs like "Betcha Be Golly Wow" are ideal for her husky, haunting vocal style, but newer material comes minus the ear-grabbing hooks that spell HIT. Still, Hyman's electric vocals and combination of sophistication and sass make you think that one day she'll really hit big.

**NATALIE COLE AND
CHUCK JACKSON
REUNITED AT
HOLLYWOOD SOUND
LAB**

"I've missed working with Chuck," said pretty vocalist Natalie Cole in a recent interview at the Sound Lab recording studios in Hollywood where she and producer

Chuck Jackson are laying down the final vocals on their latest collaboration. "Chuck is one of the few producers that I feel knows how to work with me. He really gives me a lot of space and has always been able to just tune in on the kind of input that I need. Chuck knows me, so he's got a big advantage. I hope there's more collaborating between us in the future."

It has been at least three years since the two have worked together. The musical marriage between Cole, Jackson and Cole's late husband, Rev. Marvin Yancy, yielded the following hit record offspring: "Inseparable," "This Will Be," "Mr. Melody," "Sophisticated Lady," "I've Got Love On My Mind," "Our Love" and "I'm Catching Hell." These are just a few of the songs that are the foundation on which Cole's recording career - which began in 1975 - is built.

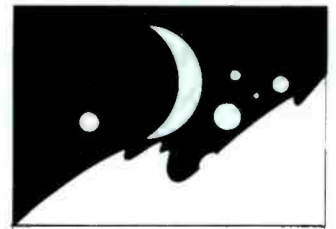
So will she be sticking to the old Cole-Jackson-Yancy formula? "Well, (the formula) works well for me on ballads," she affirmed. "However, there will be some songs with little gadgets and toys on them. We'll have some solid R&B material, along with a contemporary, today sound - but never

omitting the class that goes with the package of Natalie Cole. That's just something that I'd feel uncomfortable not doing."

Though it is projected that the album may be released in May, Cole admitted, "This album is still a baby. It's still really at a very early stage, but the progress we've made and the performances so far are very encouraging."

Aside from her work with Jackson, the album will include tracks with several other producers. When asked why her reunion with Jackson was three years in the making, she said, "Because Chuck had worked with my husband Marvin for so many years, it was difficult for him to think about writing with someone else. They had such a unique relationship. It took awhile before Chuck could find the right kind of person to hook up with."

"He certainly feels that (writer/producer) Drake Frey is someone he can work with and that's how our reunion came about," she said. "He finally called and told me he wanted to work with me again. And I said, 'well, what you got?'" Smiling, she added, "Chuck knows there is always an open door for him."

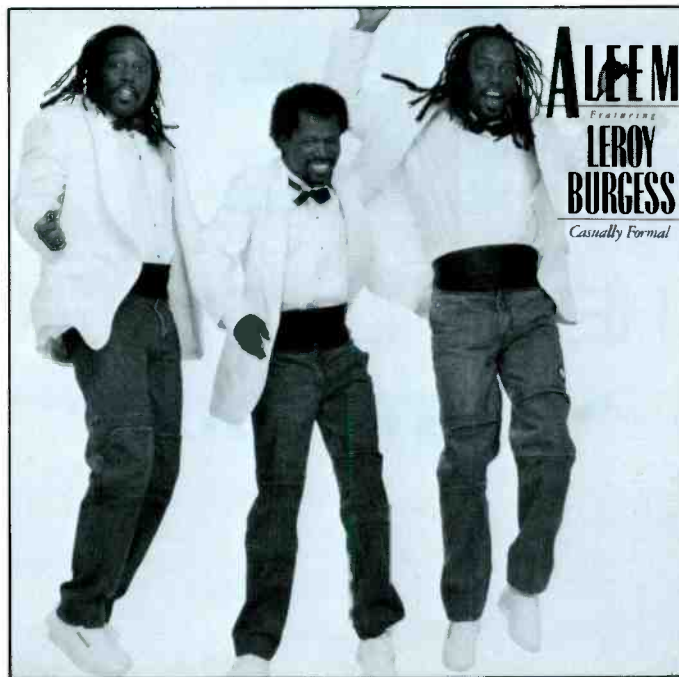
