## Albright Pares Playlists, Heavy Rotation At BP Client Stations

It's going to be harder for songs to make it into heavy rotation at BP Programming-consulted stations, now that GM Jay Albright has cut back the number of heavies on his recommended list to clients from nine to five. He has cut the number of recommended songs overall from 32 to 28.

The decision affects about 50 BP-consulted stations, plus about a hundred others that subscribe to the company's syndicated format. Albright says he made the move because he is "worried that [songs in heavy rotation are] getting awfully unfamiliar."

Albright's move heightens what has been a slow-building trend toward tighter lists in country. "There are the Alan Jacksons, Reba McEntires, and Brooks & Dunns, but beyond that, when you're playing a category that represents the core sound of your station, there are currently about five or six of the songs by [those] artists that [the audience] truly . . . doesn't know. When that happens, then it's time to slow down," he says.

"I know this won't be popular in Nashville, and I'm certainly not trying to kill the format. If anything, what I hope to do is enable the ones who do cut through—whether it's a Shania Twain, David Lee Murphy, a

## Stark Named Managing Editor

Phyllis Stark, senior radio editor of Billboard magazine, has been named managing editor of Country Airplay Monitor effective Aug. 7. She replaces Steve Wonsiewicz, who exits to pursue other opportunities.

"Steve was one of the rare folks who became a fixture on Music Row in a short amount of time," said Airplay Monitor editor Sean Ross. "The only way to replace him was with somebody like Phyllis who was already well liked and well respected by so much of the country radio community and who had a strong, longtime love of the music and the format. I'm thrilled about working with her again as Country Airplay Monitor completes its evolution to the only full-service country trade serving the needs of radio and the record community."

"In my six years at Billboard, I wrote about all radio formats, but country has always been my primary interest," says Stark. "I've formed some wonderful relationships in the country radio community over the years, and I look forward to furthering those and developing many more. The Nashville community has already been so welcoming and supportive of this move, as they have been of Airplay Monitor for the last two years."

Stark joined Billboard's radio section in 1989, becoming associate radio editor in 1991, radio editor in 1992, and senior radio editor in September 1994. Until Labor Day, she will continue to be based in Billboard's New York offices at 212-536-5032; thereafter, she can be reached at 615-321-4284.



## Rhett Akins

"THAT AIN'T MY TRUCK" (DECCA)

Valdosta, Ga., native Akins attended the University of Georgia with hopes of making the NFL, but returned home after a year. His first public performance was at a wedding-rehearsal dinner, which led to gigs at frat parties and hotel lounges, then a 1992 move to Nashville, where he began co-writing and recording demos. Within a year, he was offered three record contracts. When Akins' publisher pitched his songs for Mark Chesnut, Decca took the songs and the guy who wrote them.

## Jeff Carson

"NOT ON YOUR LOVE" (MCG/CURB)

This Arkansas native found a job singing at Nashville's Opryland Hotel before signing as a demo singer, often performing as many as 20-30 demos per week, some of which became hits for Diamond Rio ("Mirror Mirror") and Tracy Lawrence ("I See It Now" and "Runnin' Behind"). James Taylor and Merle Haggard are influences.

## Kenny Chesney

"ALL I NEED TO KNOW" (BNA)

Luttrell, Tenn., native Chesney's mother and aunt were regulars on a gospel radio show. He started songwriting and singing while at college in Johnson City, Tenn.; in 1990, he moved to Nashville with a marketing degree. After months of day jobs and night writing, Chesney landed a publishing deal, then became Capricorn's first country artist.

## Terri Clark

"BETTER THINGS TO DO" (MERCURY)

During the '50s and '60s, Terri Clark's maternal grandparents, Canadian country stars Ray and Betty Gauthier, opened for such legends as George Jones and Johnny Cash. Clark's mother even dabbled in music, playing folk songs in local coffeehouses. At age 9, Clark picked up her mother's guitar and taught herself to play. Clark moved to Nashville in '87, right after high school, and on her third day in town landed a gig singing and waiting tables at Tootsie's Orchid Lounge for \$15 plus tips. She landed her first record deal in May '94. Clark, 26, co-wrote 11 of the 12 songs on her self-titled debut album.

## Helen Darling

"JENNY COME BACK" (DECCA)

Louisiana native Darling knew early on that she wanted to be a singer. After attending the University of Texas, she went to Chicago to record a ketchup commercial. A few months spent as a jingle singer earned her enough money to pursue her dream in Nashville. Garth Brooks took an interest in her career and personally called labels, producers, and publishers for her. Her self-titled debut is due in August.

## Ty England

"SHOULD'VE ASKED HER FASTER" (RCA)

Oklahoma City native England, who played guitar by age 5, met Garth Brooks at Okla-

homa State University, where the two promised to help each other to stardom. England toured with Brooks' Stillwater Band for six years until he met another Garth in 1990. Producer Garth Fundis signed England in August 1994. His self-titled debut album hits this August.

## Brett James

"FEMALE BONDING" (CAREER)

Oklahoma City native James was born to a doctor and a classically trained pianist. His own musical upbringing included playing guitar, piano, sax, and drums; singing in church; and touring with a youth group. James' decision to leave med school and pursue music met with surprising support from his family. He wrote or co-wrote all the songs on his debut album.

## David Lee Murphy

"DUST ON THE BOTTLE" (MCA)

Murphy arrived in Nashville in July 1983 from Herrin, Ill., and within six months was opening for Steve Earle. Reba McEntire cut his "Red Roses Won't Work Now" in 1985, and Doug Stone recorded his "High Weeds And Rust." In 1992, MCA/Nashville signed Murphy.

## Perfect Stranger

"YOU HAVE THE RIGHT TO REMAIN SILENT" (CURB)

The band's first incarnation came in high school, when musical rivals Shayne Morrison and Richard Raines teamed up under the name of a Southern Pacific song. Steve Murray and Andy Ginn joined the band four years ago.

## Kim Richey

"JUST MY LUCK" (MERCURY)

Dayton, Ohio, native Richey got the music bug from her aunt, who owned a record shop. She learned to play guitar in high school and in college formed a band with Bill Lloyd. When that ended, Richey spent a few years traveling, then moved to Nashville in 1988 to pursue singing and songwriting.

## Daryle Singletary

"I LET HER LIE" (GIANT)

Raised on a small farm outside Whigham, Ga., Singletary's parents and grandparents performed as a gospel quartet at local church and civic gatherings, and his grandfather led the church choir for nearly 30 years. Singletary moved to Nashville in 1990 and caught the attention of Lib Hatcher-Travis and Randy Travis, then sang backup in Travis' road band.

## Bryan White

"SOMEONE ELSE'S STAR" (ASYLUM)

Oklahoma City-born White was raised on everything from Merle Haggard to Earth, Wind & Fire. A drummer at age 5, he was pushed by his mom to sing. In 1992, he moved to Nashville and quickly became a sought-after demo singer.


