## WPOC, WQYK, WUSY Top Nominees In '97 Airplay Monitor Radio Awards

The nominations for the 1997 Billboard/Airplay Monitor Radio Awards are here, and heritage country stations have them, or have the most of them, anyway. Format mainstays WPOC Baltimore; WQYK-FM Tampa, Fla.; and WUSY (US101) Chattanooga, Tenn., each of which represents a different market-size classification, all notched four nominations this year.

The Radio Awards ballots, which are enclosed in this issue, may be filled out and returned in the attached envelope before Aug. 22. Winners will be announced Oct. 18 at a banquet culminating the three-day Bill-

is nominated as local air personality of the year.

The third station to land four nominations, WQYK-FM, is nominated for medium-market station of the year. Mike Culotta is nominated as promotion/marketing director of the year, and OM/morning man Tom Rivers is nominated in both the PD/operations director of the year category and the local air personality category. Rivers is one of just two nonsyndicated personalities landing two country nominations this year. The other is KRYC Corpus Christi, Texas' Cactus Lou Ramirez, who is nominated as both small-market MD and local air personality of the year. WSIX Nashville after-



board/Airplay Monitor Radio Seminar and Awards at the Renaissance Resort in Orlando, Fla. Westwood One's Casey Kasem will host the awards show.

WPOC, which had five nominations last year, is nominated this time for major-market station of the year. APD/MD Greg Cole is nominated as MD of the year for the eighth time. He previously won in 1995. Promotion director Sheila Silverstein is nominated in the promotion/marketing director of the year category, which she has previously won three times, and morning host Laurie DeYoung is nominated for the third time as local air personality of the year.

WUSY is nominated as small-market station of the year. PD Clay Hunnicut and MD Bill Poindexter, who each assumed their current positions recently, are both nominated in their respective job categories. In addition, the team of David Earl and Dex

noon host Carl P. Mayfield also scored a dual nomination. He is up for both local air personality of the year and for network/syndicated program of the year for his weekly show, "Country's Most Wanted With Carl P. Mayfield," produced by SW Networks.

Four additional stations landed three nominations apiece: KFKF Kansas City, KYNG Dallas, WMIL Milwaukee, and WIVK-FM Knoxville, Tenn. Ten more stations had two nominations apiece.

KFKF is nominated for station of the year, PD/operations director of the year (Dale Carter), and MD of the year (Tony Stevens). Interestingly, KFKF will compete against sister station KBEQ in two of those categories. Carter will go head to head with KBEQ PD Mike Kennedy, and Stevens is competing with KBEQ's T.J. McEntire. This year's other interesting intra-market battle is between rivals



## Fourth Country Station To Hit Phoenix

**P**hoenix will get a fourth FM country station in September, when KOAZ flips from its current jazz format. Tim and Willy, the former morning team at crosstown KMLE and, more recently, WKXK Chicago, return to Phoenix to host mornings at KOAZ. The station is owned by MAC America, which is joining forces with Owens Broadcasting, owner of crosstown country stations KNIX and KCWW, to form a new company, OwensMAC Radio LLC, which will operate KOAZ and sister AC KESZ. Owens Broadcasting COO Michael Owens will be the managing partner. Until the creation of OwensMCA Radio, projected for late fall, Owens Broadcasting will operate and market KOAZ under an LMA.

KISZ (Kiss 97.9) Farmington, N.M., is the first country client for the Research Group's new Virtual Radio Programming service, which will provide stations voice-tracked programming via digital phone lines from Research Group HQ in Seattle. Research Group VP/co-owner Matt Killion is PD for the new service.

WHB Kansas City moves from 710 AM to 810 in a frequency swap with N/T KCMO.

SFX's Raleigh, N.C., director of sales Steve McCall is the new GM for SFX's Richmond, Va., stations, including country WKHK.

New outlet KEIN-FM signs on at 93.7 FM in Great Falls, Mont., running ABC Radio's country format. Sister station KEIN-AM flips from ABC's oldies format to ABC's Real Country format. KEIN-AM was the market's heritage country outlet for years.

At KFGY (Froggy 92.9) Santa Rosa, Calif., Rick Jackson relinquishes the PD stripes to concentrate on his morning duties. In other "froggy" news, KFRG San Bernardino, Calif., recently named its new traffic reporter "Toady Foster."

WANN Annapolis, Md., which had been running ABC's Real Country, is dark and for sale, according to The M Street Journal.

Diana Buckmann joins KEEY (K102) Minneapolis as promotion director. She pre-

viously held that position at the Minnesota Renaissance Festival.

Get well wishes to KAJA San Antonio, Texas, PD/p.m. driver Keith Montgomery, who was diagnosed with polyps on his vocal chords and was set to undergo surgery July 16. He can't speak for the next three to six weeks but wants the industry to know people can still leave him voice-mail messages, E-mail him at keithm@kj97.com, or talk to MD Jennie James. Production director Johnny Shannon will handle afternoons until Montgomery recovers.

Jo Thomas is upped from nights to afternoons at KYCY San Francisco. She replaces J.D., who recently moved to mornings.

WTNT Tallahassee, Fla., morning host Scooter Thomas heads to Jacksonville, Fla., where he will be production manager for the SFX stations there.

No replacement has been named; T&Rs to VP of programming Denny Alexander.

Steve Appleby joins suburban Pittsburgh country outlet WASP as morning co-host from the late-night slot at crosstown WLSW. He replaces Jay

Maynard, who exits radio.

At WXYC Wilmington, Del., J.P. Owens is upped from P/T to the 3-8 p.m. shift. He replaces Bert Clay, who recently moved to WPOC Baltimore.

Lori Blackshaw is named promotion director of KDBB San Luis Obispo, Calif., and sisters KZOZ and KWVW. She was in the marketing department for a city festival.

Fred Sanders joins all-news WBBM-AM Chicago to host a new overnight trucker's show, according to The Chicago Sun-Times. Sanders is best known for hosting a similar show on crosstown WMAQ, dating back to its country era, and for founding the nationally syndicated Interstate Radio Network.

United Stations Radio Networks is set to launch a three-hour weekly country show hosted by KMLE Phoenix morning men Ben and Brian. "Super Country With Ben And Brian" will debut the weekend of Aug. 2-3 and feature Music Row reports from Nashville-based talent Lucy Grant.

## Country Holding On To Hits Longer

**W**ith the format having recently experienced two of the biggest records in recent memory, I wonder if we're experiencing a trend or a coincidence. For 12 weeks, the No. 1 spot on our airplay chart was controlled by just three titles, suggesting that country radio is holding on to hits longer. Music Row is churning out more durable material, or both. For 12 weeks, George Strait's "One Night At A Time" dominated for five consecutive weeks. Then Bryan White's "Sittin' On Go" spent one week at No. 1 before "It's Your Love," by Tim McGraw (with Faith Hill) began a six-week stay there.

The last time a country record led for six straight weeks was during the warm months of 1977, when Waylon Jennings reigned with "Luckenbach, Texas (Back To The Basics Of Love)," now widely known as the signature song of the '70s outlaw movement. But these more recent examples of such durability probably suggest more conservatism than revolution.

Houston-based radio programming consultant Pam Shane of Shane Media Services hopes it means local programmers are paying closer attention to their audiences. "In our research projects, we've found that many programmers have been dumping records at the very point [at which] they start to become familiar to the audience, and generally speaking, they are tired of the constant outpouring of unfamiliar artists," she says. Shane, who has more than 20 country radio clients, says it's also a matter of the format being driven as much by artists as by individual songs. "In George [Strait's] case, he's given the format such strong records over the past nine to 11 months, the passion for [recurrent] songs like 'Carried Away' and 'Check Yes Or No' rivals that of 'One Night At A Time' and 'Carrying Your Love With Me.'"

Doug Montgomery, OM of WBCT/WCUZ

Grand Rapids, Mich., says longer stays at the top indicate that the passion for the format is coming back. "For George and Tim to have this kind of endurance definitely sends a wake-up call to everyone that the artistry must be there, especially when the core [artists] step up to the plate," he says. "They can't throw crap out there and expect the audience to get excited about it."

Titles that remain at the top longer aren't the only dynamic to consider. During the period of dominance by the McGraw release, the records held out of No. 1 have generally continued to show significant increases. Ty Herndon's "Loved Too Much" can easily be considered a major success for the format, and it grew steadily despite McGraw's strong run at the top. The same can be said for Reba McEntire's "I'd Rather Ride Around With You," which gained steadily during the period, suggesting that these releases have continued to build momentum with the audience even though McGraw came out ahead in spins.

At intermediate points in our airplay chart, certain other releases have been slower to build but appear to be breaking through after being played for more than 10 weeks. Mark Chesnutt's "Let It Rain," Sons Of The Desert's "Whatever Comes First," and Rick Trevino's "I Only Get This Way With You" have all accumulated nearly 20 weeks, showing steady gains the entire time. At any time during the past two years, these releases would probably have been discarded as failures as early as a month ago, just at the time when their familiarity levels were beginning to increase.

Of course, time will tell whether there is a trend developing, but for the time being, it probably suggests that programmers are generally taking more pains to identify the hit potential of new releases, then making a stronger commitment of developmental time to those they identify as hits.

### Brokop, Paycheck Sign With Sony

**F**ormer Capitol Nashville artist Lisa Brokop has signed a recording deal with Sony Music Nashville. She has not yet been assigned to a specific Sony label. Also, Sony's Lucky Dog Records has signed Johnny Paycheck.

Tony Morreale exits the Southeast regional job at Columbia to join another label. No replacement has been named.

Monument Records' new regional staff will consist of former Imprint Northeast regional R.J. Meacham in the Northeast; Epic promotion coordinator Wix Wichmann in the Southeast; Mike Ring, formerly of Sony's pop label 550 Music, in the Southwest; and former Epic pop promoter Pam Newman on the West Coast. Tommy Laird, the former promotion assistant at Warner Bros., will be Monument's promotion coordinator.

Lanie Miller exits Shindler-Turner Promotions, where she was national promotion coordinator.

Clint Black, Patty Loveless, and Bryan White will announce the 1997 Country Music Assn. Award final nominees 9:30 a.m. CST

Aug. 5 in Nashville's Grand Ole Opry Court Yard. The awards show will be televised Sept. 24 live on CBS-TV 8-11 p.m. EST.

Six new members have been elected to the Academy of Country Music board of directors: Clint Black (artist/entertainer), Fred Reiser (club operator/employee), Brent Maher (composer), John Hobbs (musician/band-leader), Billboard and Country Airplay Monitor's Wade Jessen (publications), and WGAR Cleveland GM John Blassingame (radio). Nine other board members were re-elected. Fifteen others have another year to go on their two-year terms.

Tom Long has been promoted to VP of Balmur Publishing. He has been with the company for 3½ years. Also, Bill Eason joins Crutchfield Music as creative director. He most recently was VP of marketing, sales, and promotion at I.D. Recordings.

Joe Diffie was recently summoned to court to testify in a legal battle over publishing for his hit song "Prop Me Up Beside The Jukebox." Diffie was quickly dismissed by the plaintiff's lawyer, who said the issue was between the songwriters and the publishing firms involved. The plaintiff in the case claims the song was stolen from him.

Congratulations to Marty Stuart, who wed Connie Smith July 8 in Pine Ridge, S.D. This is the second marriage for Stuart, 38, and the fourth for Smith, 55.

Michigan-based AEM Records has launched a country imprint, Gecko Music Group. The first release, due Aug. 5, is from the quintet Clinton River.



### Sherrié Austin

#### "LUCKY IN LOVE" (ARISTA)

Twenty-six-year-old Sherrié (pronounced sha-ree) Austin began performing at country festivals in her native Australia at age 13, and a year later she was opening dates for Johnny Cash. Her family relocated to Los Angeles, and a few years later Austin decided to move to Nashville to pursue her songwriting career, selling her musical equipment to raise the plane fare. Her debut album, "Words," includes a guest appearance by Vince Gill on the track "I Wanna Fall In Love (So Hard It Hurts.)"

### Blake & Brian

#### "ANOTHER PERFECT DAY" (CURB)

Two years ago, producer Chuck Howard first had the idea to pair singer-songwriters Blake Weldon and Brian Gowan as a duo. After meeting at a restaurant halfway between their respective Texas hometowns of Lufkin and Temple, they agreed to the idea. Waylon Jennings and Charlie Daniels have served as mentors for the duo and have speaking parts in the song "Don't Apologize," which Jennings co-wrote for Blake & Brian. Gowan first met Jennings when he sold merchandise for Jennings on the road. Gowan attended Texas A&M University as a premed student but transferred to Nashville's Belmont University for its music business program. In addition to writing credits on the Blake & Brian album, Gowan has a cut, "Take It From Someone Who Knows," on the upcoming Emilio set. Weldon planned to be a professional baseball player until a shoulder injury sidelined him. Weldon's original band, Texas Fire, won KKBQ Houston's battle of the bands, beating 49 other entries and becoming the official band for KKBQ, which gave it the opportunity to do commercials and make appearances.

### Lila McCann

#### "DOWN CAME A BLACKBIRD" (ASYLUM)

Seattle native Lila McCann made her singing debut with her father's band at the age of 4. She was signed to a development deal with Asylum at age 12. Now 15 and going into her sophomore year of high school, McCann plays guitar and wrote one of the songs on her debut album, "Lila," which also contains a cover of Sheena Easton's hit "Almost Over You."

### Dean Miller

#### "NOWHERE, USA" (CAPITOL NASHVILLE)

Son of the late Roger Miller, Dean Miller originally chose to enter the acting field. After



graduating from high school in New Mexico, Miller studied acting in college, performed in plays and a few commercials, and scrounged for work in Los Angeles, all the while playing music on the side. Eventually, he chose music over acting and moved to Nashville to pursue a career.

### Michael Peterson

#### "DRINK, SWEAR, STEAL & LIE" (REPRISE)

When Michael Peterson was 4 years old, he saw the Beatles on TV, turned to his brother, and said, "Someday I'm going to do that." Years later, Peterson began traveling to Nashville from his home in eastern Washington to pursue a songwriting deal, which he landed with Warner/Chappell in 1996. Peterson, who now lives in Nashville, says he writes songs while mowing his

lawn, and if the lawn is finished before the song, he moves on to his neighbors' lawns. His self-titled album is due July 15. He's spending the summer performing at radio station concerts across the country, and on Aug. 30 he will open for Willie Nelson at West Fest.

### Raybon Bros.

#### "BUTTERFLY KISSES" (MCA)

Marty Raybon enjoyed a long string of successes as a member of Shenandoah but recently left that group to team with his brother, Tim, as part of a duo recently signed to MCA. They made an immediate impact with this debut single by becoming part of a three-way cover battle. The siblings first developed a passion for music while playing in their father's bluegrass ensemble, American Bluegrass. Their debut album is scheduled for an August release.

### ★ Jason Sellers

#### "I'M YOUR MAN" (BNA)

Starting at the age of 4, Jason Sellers spent his childhood on the road with his family's gospel group, playing bass and singing with his parents and brother at 200 dates a year in Texas and Oklahoma. Arriving in Nashville at the age of 19, the Gilmer, Texas, native picked up the phone and called Vince Gill for advice, even though the two had never met. Gill encouraged him, gave him some work singing and playing bass, and recommended him for a job playing with Billy Joe Royal. After two years with Royal, Sellers spent four more years playing with Ricky Skaggs. He signed with Starstruck Writers Group in 1996 and with BNA this year. Now 26, he has had songs recorded by Pam Tillis, Lonestar, Skaggs, and Lee Ann Womack.

### Sons Of The Desert

#### "WHATEVER COMES FIRST" (EPIC)

Sons Of The Desert formed in Waco, Texas, and honed their skills in dance halls and nightclubs, traveling for two years in a '72 Dodge Apollo RV. In an unusual move for Nashville, album producers Doug Johnson and Johnny Slate let the band members play on their Epic debut album. Lead singer Drew Womack penned most of the material on the 10-song set. The group recently marked the release of its debut album, "Whatever Comes First," with a free concert for more than 300 fans in the parking lot of the Hastings record store in Waco, where Womack used to work.

### Billy Yates

#### "FLOWERS" (ALMO SOUNDS)

Billy Yates' first cut as a songwriter was the George Jones song "I Don't Need Your Rockin' Chair"; he went on to write songs for Ricochet, Ricky Van Shelton, Kenny Chesney, Sara Evans, and David Allan Coe, while supporting himself and his wife, Nancy, as a barber. Raised on a farm in the foothills of the Ozarks, he got an early start performing live on a regular Sunday-morning broadcast on KDFN Doniphan, Mo., where he worked nights after graduating from high school.



## WPOC, WQYK, WUSY Top Nominees In '97 Airplay Monitor Radio Awards

KILT and KKBQ (93Q) Houston, which are both nominated in the major-market station of the year category.

The local air personality category this year also contains two interesting head-to-head rivalries. In the major-market classification, KSCS

Dallas' Terry Dorsey and crosstown KYNG's A.W. Pantoja are nominated in the same category. In the medium-market grouping, WSIX's Mayfield is nominated in competition with his station's morning man, Gerry House, as well as with House's competitor, Bill Cody of crosstown WSM-FM. House has won that award for the last five years.

In addition to Pantoja, KYNG is nominated for station of the year and PD of the year (Dan Pearman). WMIL, which had four nominations last year, is nominated this year for station of the year, PD/operations director of the year (Kerry Wolfe), and MD of the year (Mitch Morgan). WIVK-FM is nominated for station, PD/operations director (Les Acree), and MD (Chris Huff).

A total of 36 stations in 30 markets shared the 65 country nominations in individual station categories. In addition, five consultants and five syndicators of country programming also received nominations.

Dallas and Kansas City were the markets with the most country nominations. Each received five. Nashville was close behind with four nominations, followed by Austin, Texas; Houston; and Minneapolis with three each, and Chicago with two. Looking at the all-format picture, New York was first with 21 nominations—none from country, followed by Chicago (17), Houston and Austin (15), and Dallas, and Milwaukee (13).

In addition to WPOC's Silverstein and WQYK's Culotta, the promotion/marketing director of the year nominees are KSCS' Tami Griffin; WWYZ Hartford, Conn.'s Stephen Peters; and Charlie Dean, formerly of WBOB-FM Minneapolis.

Dean, who was also nominated last year, is not the only nominee this year who no longer works at the station for which he or she is nominated. Morning team Tim Hattrick and Willy D. Loon are recognized this year for their work at the now defunct WKXK Chicago. They have just recently announced plans to return to Phoenix to host mornings at KOAZ, which is set to flip from jazz to country in September. Ironically,

Hattrick and Loon were also nominated last year for their work at KNIX Phoenix, after they had already moved on to WKXK. Neither Dean's WBOB-FM nor WKXK is still a country station.

Two consultants from the same company are among the five nominated as country radio consultant of the year. Jaye Albright and Keith Hill of Albright, Hill & O'Malley are nominated along with Bob Moody of McVay Media, Craig Scott of Craig Scott & Associates, and Rusty Walker of Rusty Walker Consulting. This is Moody's first nomination as a consultant. He has previously won as PD/operations director of the year when he was at WPOC. Scott is nominated for the second time this year. Albright and Hill

have been nominated twice before. Walker has won the award for the last two years.

In the syndication field, there are two distinct award categories. The first, nationally syndicated air personality of the year, is a non-format-specific category that honors personalities with full air shifts that are syndicated daily and appear on more than one station. Blair Garner of Premiere Radio Networks' overnight show "After MidNite With Blair Garner" is nominated in that category for the third consecutive year and, like last year, is the only country nominee in the category. This year, he will compete against ABC Radio Networks' R&B morning man Tom Joyner and R&B afternoon jock Doug Banks, Evergreen Media's morning man Mancow Muller, and CBS Radio's morning man Howard Stern.

The second syndication category, network/syndicated program of the year, is intended to honor weekly longform and daily shortform programming. The four nominees this year are

ABC Radio Networks' "American Country Countdown With Bob Kingsley," SW Networks' "Country's Most Wanted With Carl P. Mayfield," Morris International's "NASCAR Country," and Westwood One's "The Weekly Country Music Countdown." Due to a processing error, "After MidNite With Blair Garner" also appears on the ballot in this category, although as a daily, full air-shift program, it is not eligible there. Please refrain from voting for Garner's program in this category, as it is ineligible. He remains eligible in the nationally syndicated air personality of the year category.

This is the eleventh consecutive year Kingsley has been nominated for "American Country Countdown," which he hosts and produces. He has taken home the prize for the last 10 years.

In this era of megopoly, it was Chancellor Media that collected the most radio awards across all formats, picking up 45 when you add in the recently merged Viacom and soon-to-be-merged Evergreen Media. It's followed by CBS and ARS (38 each), and SFX (27).

The annual awards, which are cosponsored by Airplay Monitor and sister publication Billboard, honor excellence in radio broadcasting in eight categories and seven format classifications: adult, country, mainstream rock, modern rock, R&R, top 40, and triple-A. Nominees were determined by the readers of the four Airplay Monitor magazines who cast write-in votes on a preliminary ballot that appeared in the magazine's May 2 issue.

A final ballot listing nominees in every category and format is included with this issue and will also appear in all domestic copies of Billboard's July 26 issue. The Billboard/Airplay Monitor Radio Seminar and Awards is scheduled for Oct. 16-18 in Orlando. Award winners will not be notified in advance.

The 1997 awards cover the period of May 1996 to May 1997. Stations in the top 20 Arbitron markets are eligible for the major-market awards. Markets Nos. 21-50 are considered medium for the purposes of these awards. All remaining stations are counted in the small-market category.

## MONITOR PROFILE

### Swedberg's Busier Than Ever Now That K102's The Only Country In M/SP

**A**s attendees of the annual Upper Midwest Communications Conclave converge on Minneapolis this week, they will have just one country station to listen to this year. WBOB-FM's format flip to active rock April 15 leaves heritage station KEEY (K102) as the only country game in town.

While glad to be rid of a format rival, K102 PD Gregg Swedberg says WBOB-FM gave him a good battle for a few years and twice beat KEEY in the 12-plus ratings. "WBOB was just a massively well-produced radio station with massive formatics," he says. "That was a hell of a radio station and a hell of a fight."

KEEY picked up three former WBOB personalities but hasn't made any significant musical changes since WBOB's flip. Since the two stations were co-owned for the last eight months and K102 had about a month's advance warning of WBOB's transition, Swedberg says there was very little adjustment to becoming a one-

country-station market again.

"Fortunately, even though it was a bitter, bloody competition, once it was done it was remarkable how professional everybody was," he says. "There was potential for real ugliness here, but . . . for as hard fought as it was, all the people that came to this station [from WBOB] were welcomed with open arms. It's remarkable how much smarter we are when we can work together, because there are no absolutely right answers in this business."

KEEY's parent, Chancellor Media, bought WBOB-FM on Swedberg's birthday, Aug. 26, which he says was "a hell of a birthday present for me. Between August and March we thought there would be two country stations, but it became clear there was little potential for growth for two." Even with another new active rock outlet in town, he says, "there was an obvious hole in the market for a rock station."

Believe it or not, Swedberg says his job is more complicated now, because he has all the market's country promotions, including three to four appearances a day and "more sales opportunities," resulting in the station becoming "remarkably busy. I thought without the competition we'd be able to relax a little bit. We haven't been able to breathe, let alone relax."

If a new competitor did come into the market to take WBOB's place, Swedberg says, it'd have to have pretty deep pockets and a lot of patience, because he's programming a much better station now than he was pre-WBOB. "When 'BOB came along we didn't have a clue, and we readily admit it," he says. "The bottom line is we are a lot smarter about the way we do business than we used to be."

Although spring Arbitrions were not due at the station until July 17, Swedberg was expecting to see some improvement over the winter, when the station was tied for No. 4. In the first two spring Arbitrations, K102 was up but hadn't "leapt to the top of the charts" in WBOB's ab-

sence, possibly because the morning man for WBOB's new rock format, Howard Stern, was drawing some curiosity to that station. Swedberg doesn't expect to see the benefits of WBOB's change until at least the fall book.

In the past 18 months, Swedberg says, he has "overhauled the air staff [after] we realized what we needed to do here was have fun across the board . . . that's when things started to turn around. I'm not necessarily saying we're more interesting than BOB was, just more interesting than K102 used to be."

Like almost everyone else today, Swedberg is being more cautious than ever about new music. "We're not crazy about mediocre records by non-superstars," he says. "You can't believe in all the new acts. That's hard for the labels to digest. You have to get behind the ones that you believe in."

K102 continues to dip back into the library for high-testing early-'80s material from Alabama and Reba McEntire but is generally 55%-60% current and recurrent, with a list of about 40 currents. Swedberg disagrees with PDs who have cut their current lists back into the teens. "Nobody's right so often that they can afford to play 15 records," he says. "You're missing something if you're only playing 15."

Regionally, Swedberg reports that tear-jerker ballads, like Billy Yates' "Flowers" and Tammy Graham's "A Dozen Red Roses," performed better in Minneapolis than nationally, as did current singles from River Road, Sammy Kershaw, and Lee Roy Parnell and James Bonamy's last single, "The Swing." Also performing well there is anything by a band. What generally doesn't do well are ultra-traditional male or female vocals.

"It's a case of playing what's right for your market," says Swedberg, who laments that it is rarely done in country. "In top 40 you're called a genius when you find that one record that nobody else has found. In country you're called an idiot if you do that, because you're not playing along with the machine."

Here's a recent afternoon hour on KEEY: Wynonna, "No One Else On Earth"; Billy Ray Cyrus, "It's All The Same To Me"; Dan Seals, "Bop"; Tim McGraw, "It's Your Love"; Tracy Byrd, "Holdin' Heaven"; Sherrie Austin, "Lucky In Love"; George Strait, "One Night At A Time"; Reba McEntire, "Fancy"; Trace Adkins, "This Ain't No Thinkin' Thing"; Alabama, "Dancin', Shaggin' On The Boulevard"; Alan Jackson, "Livin' On Love"; and Trisha Yearwood, "How Do I Live."

While Swedberg doesn't believe the country format is in trouble, he does see it suffering from "trying to stuff a TSL format into a high-cume box." In other words, because country benefits from a high TSL from a relatively small cume, it suffers when it takes on a format rival and shares that TSL. Only in "real good, traditional country markets" can country sustain competition, he believes.

As part of Chancellor, which has a powerful string of country outlets, Swedberg benefits from the group's synergy and the ability to network with other Chancellor PDs. As for industry fears that the group would become "some big, ugly corporate monolith," he says, "Nobody is adding records on my station but me."

Swedberg says Chancellor has demonstrated to Music Row that, according to an internal study, one out of every eight country records sold in America is sold in a Chancellor country market. "We are more than happy to help move country music along, because, in general, if country music does well, because we have so many country stations, we should do well."




