30 Years After Its Launch, Does The Spirit of KPPC Live In Triple-A?

In 1967, a small station in Pasadena, Calif., started serving Los Angeles with its first free-form FM programming. On its 30th anniversary, we asked those involved and those touched by Tom Donahue's KPPC about their memories of the station itself and its impact on today's triple-A programming and rock radio overall. And while some format observers see at least a "broken line" between the original progressive rock radio and triple-A's neo-progressivism, at least one dissenter still regards "progressive" and "format" as mutually exclusive.

Today Jeff Gonzer is PD at Westwood One's Adult Rock format. In the late '60s, he listened to KPPC as a student and aspired to work at the station, which he soon did, as morning host. His résumé went on to include stints with KMET and, even as recently as last year, triple-A KSCA L.A. during its last days.

Only in America could such free-spirited programming be birthed by a bureaucracy, but Gonzer says it was

the FCC-mandated end of simulcasting that left big companies around the country with FM stations scratching their collective heads, asking, "What do we do now with these signals?" Suddenly they needed extra programming," says Gonzer.

Soon, folks like Les Carter, B. Mitchel Reed, Donahue, the Obscene Steven Clean, Mississippi Fats, Dr. Demento, Johnny Otis, and the Credibility Gap's Harry Shearer, Michael McKeon, and David Lander were filling that time, creating "a real spirit of adventure in the music and programming," says Gonzer.

Gonzer says the station was truly underground. "The antenna was below the average terrain of Southern California," he recalls. Even the studio, initially, was in the basement of the Pasadena Presbyterian Church (hence the KPPC calls).

A morning host for a time at the station, Gonzer recalls doing a very hippie-oriented show, "eclectic and music-driven. I used to run old radio shows." Those shows, like "I Love A



Letters: The Passion Of Triple-A

I just finished reading your article ["Are Triple-A Stations Less Passionate? Or More Mature?," Aug. 8] and feel the need to comment on a couple of points.

While the growth of triple-A, like the growth of any other format, will force stations to become more choosy in which artists they play, the format as a whole has not lost its reputation for jumping out on artists that fit. In addition, they are [more] willing to step out for independent artists and labels than any other format.

In setting up our Sherri Jackson record, we took her on a six-week national promo tour. With no field staff and no reputation to speak of, we dragged Sherri and ourselves around the country to stations that had never heard of us, and more importantly, never heard of her. Because we could.

Looking back over our initial "wish list" for station visits, it doesn't surprise me that we were able to bring Sherri to major-market stations... With these successful visits, it also came as no surprise when we were No. 1 most added our first week out, virtually unheard of for an unknown independent artist. Because it fit.

As much as we all treat this like the business it is, triple-A is attempting to be the last bastion for stations that are "about the music" (remember that phrase?). With this in mind, they also have learned to resist music that doesn't work for them. Find a record that does, like Dar Williams or Huffamoose, and they'll be there for you. Because it works.

The marketing plans for every mainstream rock, AC, or modern rock [act] released these days starts with "We'll start it at triple-A, create a base, and then cross it over." Sometimes, however, triple-A is not the right format for it. Radio ends up feeling that labels have no grasp of what they're trying to achieve, and labels feel that if it can't make it at triple-A, then they have

no reason to take it anywhere else. Unfortunately, this dilemma is about as old as "How can you get an add without a chart position when you can't get a chart position without the add?" Sadly, there are no answers.

I think all of us label folk have been a little frustrated with what triple-A has become in the last few years. Your article focused on the highlights, such as Bruce Warren, of why triple-A is still a great radio option for us and the listening public. Yes, we can't forget the actual listeners out there.

One of the positives that triple-A has kept is that every station and DJ has its own personality and opinion. This does make it more difficult for the label promotion people to get all their ducks in a row. On the other hand, it is enjoyable to talk to someone at a station that cares about the music rather than a 'droid that is just following a format, such as AC or pop.

You also discussed stations calling labels. I realize these MDs and PDs are very busy, but aren't we all? It is great when a station calls to say they are excited about a release. It gets the label excited; when the label is excited, it is more likely to spend money with the station. Next thing you know, that phone call was worth the dime and effort.

In general, this article reminded me why I like talking to triple-A and why I like listening to it.

Bonneville Trades Buzz To Chancellor

Modern adult WDBZ (the Buzz) New York parent Bonneville will exit the market in a multi-station trade with Chancellor Media, according to an option agreement between Bonneville and the two companies that will become Chancellor Media (Chancellor Broadcasting and Evergreen Media). Chancellor's growing New York holdings already include classic rock WAXQ. Along with WDBZ, which has reverted to previous calls WNSR, Chancellor gets AC KBIG Los Angeles and oldies KLDE Houston. Bonneville picks up Chancellor's country KZLA L.A. and news/classical combo WTOP/WGMS Washington, D.C. Expect an LMA of WDBZ to be in effect after Sept. 1; Evergreen says no format change can take place until then.

In other Chancellor/Evergreen news, Evergreen Media has received a request for additional information from the Justice Department regarding the acquisition of Katz Media. The DOJ, however, did approve the sale of Heritage Media to News Corp., thus facilitating the attached sale of Heritage's radio stations to Sinclair.

Jacor continues its march through Ohio, picking up album WNCN Youngstown.

FCC general counsel **Bill Kennard** has been officially nominated for FCC chairman.

Big Head Todd, He's Like A God On Denver BDS Custom Chart

As triple-A programmers gather for the Boulder Summit this weekend, Airplay Monitor and BDS offer this glimpse of Denver airplay, combining spin data from triple-A KBCO, album KBPI, moderns KTCL and KXPX, and modern adult KALC. This BDS custom chart covers July 31 through Aug. 6.

One of the most noticeable differences here is the success of hometown heroes Big Head Todd & the Monsters. "Please Don't Tell Her" is currently No. 4—with spins at KBCO, KXPX, and KALC—though it's not on any of the charts to which those stations report.

Across-the-board favorites being spun by all

five stations linked up for this custom chart are Live, "Turn My Head" (No. 1); Tonic, "If You Could Only See" (5); Third Eye Blind, "Semi-Charmed Life" (7); Mighty Mighty Bosstones, "The Impression That I Get" (8); Sublime, "What I Got" (38); and Goo Goo Dolls, "Name" (still No. 40).

Live won the battle of spins, but the song with the most listeners was, again, by Big Head Todd, catching 855,300 sets of ears to Live's 735,800. Sarah McLachlan's "Building A Mystery," while No. 2 in spins, also bested Live in listeners with a cume of 839,000.

Finally Seeing Forest For The Trees

"If you can show me the artist who creates truly brilliant, challenging, seminal work who is also a regular joe, I'll pay you a hundred bucks," says Geffen director of A&R **Tony Berg** about **Carl Stephenson**, the multitasking musician responsible for **Forest For The Trees**. "He's an unusual man who makes unusual music."

While Stephenson may be an exceptional artist, it's taken four years for the self-titled **Forest For The Trees** album to be given a release date (Sept. 9). Unbeknownst to his label, family, and friends at the time, Stephenson had begun experiencing extreme anxiety after submitting his album, and consequently the entire project was put on hiatus until all parties agreed to move forward.

Stephenson was introduced to Berg in 1993. At the time, the producer/songwriter/musician had been in Los Angeles for three years following a stint in Houston as a producer for his friend's Rap-A-Lot label. In Stephenson's hand the day he met the A&R executive was the complete **Forest For The Trees** album, an adventurous concoction of hip-hop grooves, pop psychedelia, and unique instrumentation that he had written and produced and for which he played violin, didgeridoo, sitar, and keyboards and programmed drums. "His music had a complete lack of inhibition, and he had an innocence about him," says Berg.

Around the same time, Berg had just brought to the label **Beck** and **That Dog**, who were all in the same sort of musical circles. In fact, during one casual and spontaneous evening of recording by Stephenson and Hansen, the song "Loser" was spawned. Besides co-writing and co-producing the track, Stephenson co-produced Beck's "Mellow Gold" on his home studio equipment and co-wrote several of its songs. "You're looking at a man whose impact on popular music is, in my opinion, already fairly profound," says Berg.

But as Berg began working closer with Stephenson, it became apparent that something was amiss. "He turned in the album. Then he immediately started revising it and remixing it and remixing it and rewriting it and remixing it and re-evaluating it and reconsidering it," says Berg. "And I could see it wasn't the normal editing process that an artist goes through. It was deeper than that. It was a manifestation of some larger anxieties."

Berg, who won't discuss Stephenson's problems more specifically, says Geffen opted to hold the release indefinitely. However, it was never a consideration during these times that the **Forest For The Trees** album might be banished to the vaults for good. "For two reasons. The album demonstrated great musical foresight, almost prescience. Because today, we're seeing an album he delivered four years ago not only sounds contemporary, it sounds challenging in 1997," says Berg. "I always had faith in this record and in Carl personally, and what derailed the project for these four years was simply that he wasn't really ready to have it out there. And rather than force the issue upon him, I was comfortable saying, 'Let's just hold onto this for a while and wait until all the attention that can be focused upon an artist is something you're ready for.'"

While technology allows more and more artists to record, mix, and produce themselves, producing oneself means the artist loses a resource and an outside ally in the producer. As Berg notes, "Anyone who assumes this much responsibility on any project, whether it's **Orson Welles** starring in, producing, and directing 'Citizen Kane' or Carl Stephenson assuming all these roles on **Forest For The Trees**, that artist exposes himself to a number of pressures. And if one is having difficulty letting go, to have taken on all these responsibilities can only exacerbate that difficulty."

Though not intended this way, it's ironic that the name Stephenson chose for his project could be seen as specifically referring to the whole process he's been through with the **Forest For The Trees** record (the moniker refers instead to the artist's love of nature.)

Berg believes the album is forward-reaching in its unique lack of musical prejudice and is as potentially commercial as it is an artistic statement. Most impressive, he says, is Stephenson's ability to make everything seem musically compatible. "It's his ability to integrate metal guitar with folk guitar with bagpipes with hip-hop rhythms with a rapper with anything and make it work that characterizes his work." A host of musical friends contribute to the album, including Beck, who adds vocals and harmonica on two tracks and contributes a humorous rap to a U.K. B-side called "Jet Engine."

"It was like a neighborhood project. You know, it reminds me a little bit of **Sly & the Family Stone**," he says. "In that it's kind of a family vibe, people from disparate backgrounds who get together and make something work. And it has a message of great optimism to it, much as Sly did."

And while Berg concedes the situation—which consumed a part of nearly each day over a four-year period—was unique for him, an overriding belief in Stephenson prevailed. "If you just dismiss the music for a moment, I just adore this guy. He's just an utterly good guy," he says. "He has a boyishness that's so appealing and so unforced. He's a compelling figure." And on a musical level, the **Forest For The Trees** album is equally inviting in its purity of heart. "What this album demonstrates is that if one goes into the studio without prejudice, without preconception, and simply lets the music take over, great things will happen."

30 Years After Its Launch, Does The Spirit of KPPC Live In Triple-A?

Mystery" or "Mandrake The Magician" were given to him by Joel Siegal, now film critic for "Good Morning America." Back then, Siegal, as "Uncle Joel," hosted a show that focused on classic radio dramas.

Siegal's eventual ties to movies wasn't KPPC's only brush with cinematic celebrity. The 1978 film "FM" was an amalgamation of a real event that saw the KPPC staff fired from the station after barricading themselves in the studios, but that story was combined with characters based on jocks from the station that would eventually claim the KPPC mantle, KMET.

Ted Alvy was working as producer for B. Mitchel Reed's show. He's currently working on two books on L.A. and West Coast underground radio. He recalls the KPPC owners coming to the conclusion that they didn't need a bunch of "long-haired, barefoot hippies" playing the music. They could bring their own people in and play the same records.

Gonzer remembers the staff suspecting that they were going to be fired. "So we all went on the air and barricaded ourselves in the studio," he says. The staff went on the air with the news that they may be fired. The support, though, during the short standoff was incredible. "Record companies were bringing catered deli platters," Gonzer says.

Even artists voiced their support. Alvy says, "The Beatles and Stones sent telegrams." There were benefit shows from Buffalo Springfield, the Doors, Firesign Theatre, and Quicksilver Messenger Service. "The musicians were really supporting this kind of radio," says Alvy.

That all ended at 11 p.m. on a Sunday, when GM Doug Cox, the station's engineer, and the Pasadena police marched into the office and put an end to the "siege."

Gonzer says that after the ordeal there was just one P/T jock left on the air. The other jocks were strategizing about where they could take their unique brand of radio. During a break in the meetings, they phoned the lone leftover jock and convinced him to quit right on the air.

That kind of mentality, where jocks would passionately defend their station, was reflected off-air in the listeners. Today, says Gonzer, "Howard Stern has got rabid fans, and other shows have tremendous followings, but for KPPC and KMET, people actually loved the radio stations. They were driven by this need to be a part of it."

A LISTENER REMEMBERS

What distinguished KPPC in the mind of Ken Barnes, editor of Microsoft's Music Central, was "playing [an] eclectic range of album cuts venturing into classical and long jazz tracks." He says it must have been "very liberating for the jocks, [but] maybe not for the listener."

KPPC broke the mold, but to Barnes, while it was a radical new sound, "in L.A. it was not quite a radical departure, because L.A. had some pretty adventurous top 40s on AM, especially in '66. . . . But KPPC took it further and took it into the American artists, fueled by the summer of love and burgeoning hippie acts."

Barnes' rearview mirror isn't all rosy. "Jock-wise, even then I thought it was pretty self-indulgent," he says. "They were rattling on to excess. Some of them had the talent to do that."

Barnes recalls that "all of a sudden these very tight and restrictive parameters of AM radio were lifted. They indulged themselves with the freedom to talk and some hit on interesting modes of communication and others didn't."

And while the music was educational, "I have a lingering memory of hearing far too much Dino Valenti before he was in Quicksilver," Barnes says. "For all that great stuff you would discover and the joy of that, there was so much truly awful music that you had to put up with. It wasn't paradise for a listener. A couple of times you'd revert back to the top 40, where if you heard something you didn't like you knew it would be over in two minutes."

TRACING TRIPLE-A LINEAGE

While Barnes can trace a line from KPPC to today's triple-As, "it's a broken line or a line with a line with a lot of ellipses in it," he says. "Triple-A was in many ways a conscious return at least in the beginning to that spirit of experimentation and free-form programming. There were a lot of theme sets and programming at KPPC, and some return to that in triple-A. In public radio and stations like WXRT Chicago, there is a line of continuity that really never went away. At least some of the early permutations survived. In other cases, it was a conscious flashback to an earlier, less-regimented time. Like, 'Wow, let's try this again. Let's [go] back to album rock's roots.'"

But several years into triple-A's history, Barnes is hard-pressed to hear much of that progressive fire. As a Seattle resident, he does consider KMTT (the Mountain) "one of the more intelligently but formally formatted stations" and says the format "still gives its jocks a freedom of expression not found in all formats."

Still, Barnes insists, "the musical experiments can't be the same. The period's different. The culture is different now. I wonder if the kind of eclecticism of '67 is possible today with the volume and variety of music available today."

Barnes says KPPC had the effect of making L.A.'s top 40s hipper. It's a parallel he sees in today's triple-As and their relationship to modern adult. "Modern adult was smart to figure you can take all that inoffensive cream off the top," says Barnes. "That's a big dilemma for triple-A, [because] where do they go next? Are they forced to become classic rockers?"

Gonzer does hear KPPC's heritage in today's triple-A. "I think it's worthy to lay claim to the history." At KSCA, he says, listeners "turned it on [in the morning] and turned it off when they go to bed. . . . When I look at triple-A now, it's almost a continuation of what went on then, only then the musical spectrum was really wide."

Having Melissa Etheridge call KSCA during the station's swan-song broadcast reminded Gonzer of the relationship KPPC had with the music community. "They felt as much a part of the station as we felt playing their music," says Gonzer. "There was a certain camaraderie with the entertainment community that was very much like KPPC." In the final analysis, Gonzer says, the primary parallel between his first and most recent progressive stations was that "they both died prematurely."

To Alvy, Gonzer is one of the few people who still embodies the free-form spirit of KPPC on the air. "He's got a grasp of the music, communicates with the audience, and has that background," says Alvy. "He's learned how to make formatted stuff sound unformatted."

But Alvy is a die-hard in his wish to return to free-form days. Triple-A just doesn't cut it. "Everything sounds real sterile," he says. "You cannot do underground radio if the DJs don't choose their music."

To those who would debate the value of life without music scheduling today, Alvy notes that "when a talk-radio jock is on the air, he runs his own show. That's basically free-form radio." Alvy insists there should be one or two stations in L.A. alone applying that free-form ideal to music. "You need a strong, creative person that's not afraid to do that."

"What I don't like about the triple-A format is it is a format," says Alvy. "The concept of triple-A, if done right, is to eventually get a staff that knows what they're doing and get rid of the computers. You should be working without a net. And if you have dead air, that's OK."

During free-form radio's heyday, programmers Tom Donahue and Les Carter would talk to interviewers about wanting to own their own stations. That that was the only way to get that type of creative radio. Alvy says that shortly before Donahue's death, he was working on a deal with Francis Ford Coppola that would have the film producer purchase a signal in San Francisco (which, with the old KKCY, came closer than many markets to a KPPC flashback) and have Donahue run it. Says Alvy, "Things would have been completely different in radio."

MONITOR PROFILE

Educated, Loyal Listeners Keep Laura Hopper's KPIG From Slaughter

In a week when we're celebrating the 30th anniversary of KPPC Los Angeles (see story, page 1), it seems completely relevant to check in with Laura Hopper, PD at KPIG Monterey, Calif., perhaps one of the true standard-bearers of KPPC's legacy—a progressive country outlet that has since segued to triple-A. Much of Hopper's outlook echoed that of others we spoke with who'd been involved with KPPC. "I started in radio as a runaway," she says. At 17, "I ran into a radio station, and I stayed."

She worked her way west and ran into the legendary '70s alternative country outlet KFAT Gilroy, Calif. (now KUFX San Jose, Calif.), which, she says, "was probably the least-powerful station in all of North America when we bought it." After five years, it was time for a new challenge, and Hopper left shortly before KFAT's demise to help launch classical rival KBOQ.

After several stops in the market, her work at KBOQ convinced Hopper that she could do

recent sale, mid-book, which turned into a marketing coup. Hopper said the in-house announcement of the sale blindsided them. Informed that Eletra Broadcasting was going public with the sale the next day, Hopper went on-air with the news first. "We got this tremendous flood of support," she says. "We had a huge, huge, listener response, and we had a lot of publicity. Newspapers, all the media did publicity on it. And I think that has a lot to do with the increase in the numbers. We got a lot of mail addressed 'Dear new owners.' We refer to them affectionately—sort of—as the suits."

Eletra did give KPIG one other gift that's kept on giving and feeds its aura of lo-fi high visibility. About a year ago it gave the station a bus-tail campaign. "They bought it for two months," Hopper says, "and the nice thing about Santa Cruz County is, if somebody else doesn't buy [the space], they leave them on. They've been on there for a year. It was the cheapest marketing plan." She's trying to get the new owner to kick in some money for another campaign.

Here's a sample hour on KPIG: Neal Coty, "Chance And Circumstance"; Joe Ely, "Whenever Kindness Fails"; String Cheese Incident, "Johnny Cash"; Lyle Lovett, "Long Tall Texan"; Steve Earle & the V-Roys, "Johnny Too Bad"; Blues Traveler, "Most Precarious"; Rodney Crowell, "My Past Is Present"; Marcia Ball, "The Story Of My Life"; Kenny Wayne Shepard, "Aberdeen"; Bottle Rockets, "Waitin' On A Train"; Dan Baird, "Knocked Up"; Sonny Landreth, "Common Law Love"; and Hans Thee-sink, "Power of Love."

At KPIG, Hopper says, "The DJs have a lot of freedom to program their own show, which makes them a lot happier." One overriding guideline is to keep the music uptempo. "Not that we don't play some ballads and slow stuff," Hopper says. While categories play in fixed positions, jocks are free to play whatever they want from a category with no regard to whether the last jock played it or not.

Hopper counts Robert Earl Keen, John Hiatt, Bonnie Raitt, Natalie Merchant, and Joan Osborne as core artists. With KPIG having evolved from progressive country, one category she now shies away from during the regular format is bluegrass. "A lot of bluegrass alienates more people than you gain," she says, although KPIG maintains a bluegrass specialty show.

Although KPIG will go out on a limb, musically, it has taken to heart the programming philosophy that success lies beyond the music. The icing on its musical cake is "fun." "So many people on the radio today are not having fun," Hopper says. "I wanted to do an ad campaign, the KPIG challenge—I dare you to tune up and down the dial and find anybody who's having any fun." And we are. People say that to us all the time. "Ooh, I'd love to work there. You guys have so much fun." I say, "Yep, we do."

Comedy pervades the day. Drop-ins and funny bits are not relegated solely to mornings. Even spots, Hopper says, display a sense of humor befitting the calls. "We do a lot of pig stuff. We call ourselves the Pig Sty. We're back at the Sty." The request line is the Swine Line.

Even public-service announcements reflect that attitude. At KPIG, they're called Hog Calls and center on a station answering machine. People call with PSAs, things they want to sell, garage sales, comments on programming and politics, lost dogs, rides sought or offered, and job openings. Then the station goes through its "messages" and airs them as is 10 minutes after the hour, every other hour. "We just say, 'If we don't like it, we won't use it.' And that's the only qualifier," says Hopper.

classical better. She got an investor to back her in a station, but its spotty signal had classical aficionados turning their noses up at the then KLZC. "We thought, 'What will people listen to come hell or high water?'" KPIG. They'll listen to this music. They don't care. I have people who listen to this station on the other side of the mountains. They get mostly static. They don't care. They just listen anyway. They go to the top of their water towers to put antennas up.

"We threw our hands up in disgust one day and said, 'Heck, I've got all the records. Let's just do it.' And of course everyone who worked at KFAT never got another job, so they were all still here. They were all available."

KPIG flipped to progressive country in 1987 with a brief detour to satellite top 40 in the early '90s. It returned to country in 1991 but never made money. When the owner told Hopper in 1995 it was time to sell, "I couldn't say that infamous 'It's really going to work this time' line one more time. I just felt stupid," she said.

Funny thing is, in a month KPIG started to make money. "It was a dramatic turnaround in finances, although the station wasn't doing anything different," says Hopper. "I don't know what happened. . . . We had no new sales staff. If anything, we were in a worse place, because a couple of people decided they weren't going to work for the new owners and split. It was cosmic. . . . Somebody's karma was screwed up."

Today, KPIG just polished off the spring book with a 2.7-4.0 rise, 12-plus, good for sixth place in the market. Hopper credits an educated audience with KPIG's success. "I don't think that people can just jump into this format as a listener or jump into a market with this as a broadcaster," Hopper says. "One of the nice things about this market is we've had such good, educational radio for a long time, which supports us and opens people's minds."

Another key to KPIG's success was its most




