"Mack the Knife" Big Single; Three Sinatra LP's in Top 10; "Come Dance With Me" No. 1

A richly varied line-up of disks made the "favorite singles" record chart this year — ranging in style and flavor from the spunky novelty "Chipmunk Song" to the stirring "Battle Hymn of the Republic" by the Mormon Tabernacle Choir.

At least three of the disks were from albums, including the No. 1 platter, Bobby Darin's "Mack the Knife," Nina Simone's "I Loves You Porgy," and the Mormon Tabernacle Choir record—a real-left-field pop click.

Several oldies made the "favorite singles" chart-"Mack the Knife" (from "The Three Penny Opera") the French standard "The Three Bells," "Misty," Gershwin's "I Loves You Porgy" and, of course, "The Battle Hymn of the Republic."

The winning records spotlight style changes for two artists-Bobby Darin-heretofore known as a rock and roll chanter in the singles market-was hailed as a coming Sinatra when his swingin' "Mack the Knife" became a singles hit. The Browns stepped out of the country field to become full-fledged pop favorites. Darin, incidentally, won the No. 1 singles record poll by an overwhelming majority.

Four of the "favorite singles" were also No. 1 on the "Hot 100" chart during the past year—"Mack the Knife," "Venus," "The Three Bells" and "The Chipmunk Song." The last named actually became a hit in December, 1958, but carried over into 1959.

Sarah Vaughan took two places on the singles chart with one record—her two-side hit "Broken Hearted Melody" backed by "Misty." If the vote hadn't split she would have tied with the Browns for the No. 3 spot.

Frank Sinatra and Bobby Darin-No. 1 and 2 on the "favorite singles" chart — reverse positions on the "Favorite LP" chart. Sinatra's "Come Dance With Me" album pulled more than three times as many votes as the runnerup—Darin's "That's All." Darin's "Mack the Knife" single was originally released in the Atco LP.

Sinatra—practically a one-man chart—has two other packages on the LP listing—"No One Cares" (No. 5) and "Only the Lonely" (No. 10). Last year he had two on the chart, including the No. 1 LP "Come Fly With Me."

Johnny Mathis would have placed higher on the LP chart if votes hadn't been divided between three of his albums. Similarly, Nat King Cole would have placed if his votes hadn't been distributed among three different packages.

Three canaries made the LP chart this year—Ella Fitzgerald, Peggy Lee and Eydie Gorme, as compared to an all-male line-up last year. The Peggy Lee-George Shearing album; "Beauty and the Beast" is of particular significance in this poll, since it was recorded during the disk jockey convention in Miami last May.

Altho there isn't one original-cast album on the chart this year, Henry Mancini's "Music From Peter Gunn" (background jazz for the TV series "Peter Gunn") shows up as No. 7. Mancini also takes No. 1 honors as the "most promising" band.

Only repeat LP favorites this year are Sinatra, Mitch Miller and Mathis, all of whom had winning albums in the 1958 jockey poll.

Sinatra, Darin Dominate Male-Vocalist Category; Sinatra Is Double-Winner

Veteran Frank Sinatra and newcomer Bobby Darin dominate the "male vocalist" category this year. It's an old story with Sinatra, of course, who has walked off with top honors for the last several years. He's the No. 1 favorite artist again this year and also the most-played—chalking up more than twice as many votes as his nearest competitors.

Darin, the only artist to appear on all three "male vocalist" charts, also walks off with No. 1 honors on the "most promising" chart with an overwhelming majority of votes. Last year he was No. 10.

Showing up for the first time on the "favorite" listing, Darin is in fifth place; while Johnny Mathis moves up to the No. 3 slot, Nat King Cole to No. 2, and Perry Como slips slightly to No. 4.


In keeping with the loyalty displayed by jocks toward their long-time favorites, it's interesting to note that Sinatra, Cole, Como, Crosby, Mathis and Steve Lawrence all appeared on the "favorite" chart last year, and the first four named were also winners of the 1956 poll.

Missing from the 'favorite' chart this year are Pat Boone—No. 4 last year—Dean Martin, Elvis Presley, Eddie Fisher and Tony Bennett. However, both Presley and Boone appear on the "most played" listing.

The "most played" listing indicates the continuing strength of rock and roll in programming, via the inclusion of Paul Anka, Frankie Avalon and Presley.

The rock and rollers and young warblers also registered well on the "most promising" chart. Lloyd Price, Bobby Rydell, Anka, and Brook Benton were voted in, plus Jimmy Darren, Avalon, Ray Peterson, Jerry Wallace, Mark Murphy, and Johnny Nash. Only Darin and Nash were on the chart last year.

GAC is the most dominant agency. Seven of top 10 "favorites," nine of the "most played" and five of the "most promising" honors are taken by GAC artists.

Ella Fitzgerald Favorite; Connie Francis Most Played; Nina Simone Most Promising

Eight of last year's 10 favorite female vocalists finished at the top again this year, thereby indicating that loyalty continues to be a strong factor in determining a deejay's personal preferences. Only Connie Francis and Sarah Vaughan are new to the list, and Miss Vaughan made the chart in 1957.

Doris Day and Patti Page who have rotated No. 1 and No. 2 positions for the last three years, moved down this year and Ella Fitzgerald takes over the top spot. At the same time her Verve LP, "Ella Fitzgerald Sings the George and Ira Gershwin Songbook" is listed as No. 8 on the jockey's "favorite LP" chart this year.

Also appearing on the "favorite LP" chart this year are albums by two other of the jock's "favorite female vocalists"—Eydie Gorme's "On Stage" and Peggy Lee's "Beauty and the Beat" with George Shearing. Miss Lee made a big hit with spinners attending the deejay convention in Miami last May. She and Shearing cut the "Beauty" package during a Capitol "open-house" recording session.

Connie Francis, who won "most promising female vocalist" top honors last year, is a full-fledged "favorite" this year—No. 7. Thanks to a steady string of best-selling singles (as well as LP's) Miss Francis, also is No. 1 on the "most played" chart, which spotlights seven other "favorites"—Doris Day, Peggy Lee, Sarah Vaughan, Ella Fitzgerald, Patti Page, Eydie Gorme and Keely Smith.

Rounding out the "most played" group—on the strength of singles hits—are Dinah Washington, Joni James and Jane Morgan. Sarah Vaughan's return to the "favorite" chart was undoubtedly helped by her two-sided singles hit "Broken-Hearted Melody" backed by "Misty." Both sides are listed by the jocks on their "favorite singles" record chart this year.

With the exception of Dakota Staton, artists appearing on the "most promising" chart are all new to the poll. Nina Simone undoubtedly rates the No. 1 spot because of her smash hit single "I Loves You Porgy." Interestingly, she recorded the side (from an album) for Bethlehem, but by the time it became a hit she had already left that label to join Colpix.

The "most promising" selection is evenly divided between singles and LP artists, but Capitol dominates labelwise, in keeping with its policy of introducing young LP talent. Capitol artists (placing No. 6 thru No. 9 in the order named) are Mavis Rivers, Susan Barrett, Janice Harper and Dakota Staton.

Hi-Lo's Top Singing Group; Kingston Trio Wins Twice-Favorite and Most Played

The Hi-Lo's, the darlings of the modern sound enthusiasts, finished on top of the heap this year in deejay balloting for their favorite vocal groups. The group jumped from a fourth-place finish last year into the top spot.

Interestingly enough, aside from this notable position change, the first four finishers last year also finished among the first four in the current poll. This year the Four Freshmen, the Ames Brothers and the Four Lads, who finished in one, two, three order, each moved down a step to wind up the race in two, three, four order.

Of the seven other listed finishers in the "favorite" group category, three new entries moved into the money. These were the Coasters, on the basis of a continuing string of hit disks, and the King Sisters and the Axidentals, each on the basis of a highly modern sound.

Among other finishers were the Kingston Trio and the Kirby Stone Four. Tied last year in eighth position, the groups moved up to fifth and sixth slots respectively. The McGuire Sisters and the Mills Brothers also both finished in the money this year as last.

There was considerable duplication noted in the balloting for most played vocal groups and jockeys' own favorites. For example, the Hi-Lo's and the Kingston Trio, first and fifth in the "favorite" category, merely switched these positions in the most played grouping. In between this pair were the Ames Brothers, the Four Lads and the Four Freshmen. The same three finished third, fourth and second in the "favorite" polling.

Other most played finishers included five groups, all of which were represented during the year by significant hit activity. This was particularly true of the Browns, and largely on the strength of one hit, since their follow-up, "Scarlet Ribbons," was not released until balloting was already in full swing. Prior to this the Browns' popularity was largely limited to the country field.

The Coasters, the McGuire Sisters, the Platters and the Fleetwoods were also named in most played voting, with the latter group making its initial appearance in the annual Billboard deejay poll.

As might be expected, the third vocal group category, that of "most promising" talent, had the most displacement from last year's list. Only two finishers remained from the 1958 breakdown. Oddly enough, the two, the Kingston Trio and the Playmates, finished in first and sixth positions, the same respective slots as their showings last year.

The nine new entries were made up entirely of pop hit makers, at least one of which, the Chipmunks, might be designated a phantom group. Be that as it may, the little animals with the speeded-up voices turned out to be quite the pace setters and in future years one or more "acts" of this type might well be expected to follow their forebears onto the "most promising" chart.

Only one group, the Kingston Trio, achieved the distinction of being named on all three charts. Last year the same group was named in most played and "favorite" categories.

Mr. & Mrs. Prima Favorite Duo; Top Honors Also Go To Bud & Travis, Everlys

With a growing number of successful duos hitting the charts and the airwaves this year, The Billboard for the first time has separated this category from that of vocal groups in general for ballotting by deejays in The Billboard's 12th Annual Poll.

For the first time, jocks have named their favorite, most played and most promising vocal duos. In the first voting of its kind, it is interesting to note that five different duos managed to place in all three voting categories.

By far the most successful of the five is the couple known as Bud and Travis, who despite the lack of a substantial pop hit, turned up in the top spot in the most promising category, number four in most played balloting and in third spot in the "favorite" category.

The Kalin twins, who were extremely hot earlier in the year with singles successes placed fourth, third and fourth respectively in the same categories. Art and Dotty Todd, who actually enjoyed a substantial hit over a year ago, left a deep impression with the jocks too. The group finished as the third most promising group and showed up in seventh position in the two other categories.

Skip and Flip, another duo that burst on the scene this year with the hit, "It Was I," was voted second most promising duo, behind Bud and Travis. In most played and "favorite" categories they showed in sixth and ninth positions respectively.

Homer and Jethro, another group normally associated with the country field, made the jump into all three voting groups too, on the strength of their novelty smash, "The Battle of Kookamonga."

In another development, one duo which existed as a disk act only, Bing Crosby and Rosemary Clooney, was voted into both the most played and "favorite" categories. In line with this it's interesting to note that the No. 1 favorite duo, Louis Prima and Keely Smith, also work separately, as well as a team.

In the voting for the general category of vocal groups, it is noted that a phantom trio known as the Chipmunks were named among jock favorites. So it is in the duo category with the Nutty Squirrels, whose disk of "Uh! Oh!" which is a very recent phenomenon employing the speeded up voice recording technique, showing up in the most promising classification.

Deejays Like Shearing Best; Vote Denny Most Promising; Gives Jonah Jones Most Spins

This year, as last year, George Shearing's Quintet finished first as the Favorite Instrumental Group of America's disk jockeys. And the Jonah Jones Quartet was second, as they were in 1958. However, in the "most promising" instrumental group category, Martin Denny and his combo, virtually unknown last year, swept the top post as the "most promising" group.

Right behind Denny was Santa and Johnny, who zoomed into popularity with their disking of "Sleep Walk." Jonah Jones and his quartet nailed down the No. I spot in the "most played" category for instrumental groups with Duane Eddy, the swinging guitarist, right behind them.

The jockeys showed off their "hipness" with some of their selections of "favorite" instrumental groups. Modern jazzmen such as Dave Brubeck's Four, the Ahmad Jamal Trio, the Miles Davis Combo and the Dave Pell Octet, all finished high in the popularity poll.

For those jocks who cling a bit to tradition, the Benny Goodman Sextet and the Three Suns combo also finished in the money. The "most played" category showed an amazingly varied collection of instrumental groups.

In addition to Jonah Jones, a traditional jazz combo. and Duane Eddy, a rockabilly group, there were Santo and Johnny, mood musicians with a triplet beat; George Shearing, a modern jazz quintet; Martin Denny, a Hawaiian group with bird sounds; Johnny and The Hurricanes, pounding rock and rollers; Ahmad Jamal, a very cool jazz combo; Dave Brubeck, hot and cool jazzmen; Ray Conniff, big styled studio ork and chorus; Kai Winding, a modern jazz combo with a trombone sound, and Bill Haley and his Comets, grandaddy of the modern rock and rollers.

Of the "most promising" instrumental winners, many have become well known as album artists, others for their single hits. Martin Denny made the charts with his albums of "Exotica," and "Primitivo," as well as his singles of "Quiet Village" and "Enchanted Sea."

Ahmad Jamal has a string of album hits, and Santo and Johnny have had two single hits, "Sleep Walk" and "Tear Drop." Johnny and the Hurricanes have had such single hits as "Red River Rock," "Crossfire" and "Reveille Rock." Sandy Nelson's big single has been "Teen Beat," Andre Previn made a hit single with David Rose's Ork titled "Like Young."

Altho he has made many, many potent album waxings, Cozy Cole, after many years of fine jazz albums, came thru with two big single hits, "Topsy, Part II" and "Turvey, Part II," Ramsey Lewis has been turning out some fine jazz albums for Argo Records, Duane Eddy has racked up hit after single hit, and The Islanders came thru with a click disk, "The Enchanted Sea."

Pianists Dominate Solo Poll; Jamal Rated Most Promising; 2 Awards for Erroll Garner

This year, for the first time, The Billboard started a new category in its 12th Annual Disk Jockey Poll, Solo Instrumentalists, and pianists swept the field. Erroll Garner, who has won many polls in his career, came out on top in both the Favorite Solo Instrumentalist category as well as the Most Played division. (This latter post was won in spite of the fact that Garner has not had a new album release in close to a year.)

Pianist Ahmad Jamal, who has scored repeatedly with his Argo waxings, won the "most promising" category. Close behind Garner was Roger Williams, who has stayed high up on the popularity charts since his recording of "Autumn Leaves" brought him fame a few years ago.

Other pianists who finished high on the polls are Andre Previn, the co-composer of the hit tune "Like

Young," Eddie Heywood, George Shearing, Martin Denny and Ramsey Lewis. Denny, whose album of "Exotica" started a new trend sound-wise, finished second to Jamal as the "most promising" soloist.

Duane Eddy did rather well this year too. He was third in the "most promising" category, seventh in the "favorite" solo instrumentalists category and third in the "most promising" division. There were two trumpet players who finished high on the polls, Jonah Jones and Miles Davis.

There were two drummers who made their mark as well, one being Cozy Cole, one of the few "old-timers" in the popularity polls, and Preston Epps, whose "Bongo Rock" was a big hit this year. Two organists, Dave Cortez and Bill Doggett were nominated, Cortez for "most played," and Doggett for one of the "most promising" soloists.

Benny Goodman was the other "old-timer" to make the "most played" list, finishing 10th. Ramsey Lewis, jazz pianist with his own group out of Chicago, finished 8th on the "most promising" list, and right behind him was Jackie Noguez, French artist whose big hit this year was "Cio Cio Bambino."

Kenton-Basie Favorites Tie; TV's Mancini Most Promising; Les Elgart Gets Most Spins

Veteran bandleaders Stan Kenton and Count Basie tie for first position as the deejay's "favorite" bands this year, thereby pointing up the spinners' strong personal preference for swinging modern ork treatments.

With the exception of Nelson Riddle, Ray Conniff, Billy May and Glenn Miller, the "favorite" bands this year are traveling orks. Missing from the "favorite" list this year are Ray Anthony, Billy Vaughn, and Warren Covington (Tommy Dorsey).

However, both Anthony and Vaughn are in the top 5 on the "most played" chart, and Covington is on the "most promising" list. Surprisingly, Les Elgart, No. 1 on the "most played" list, shows up as low man on the "favorite" chart.

The late Glenn Miller, who died in a plane crash more than 15 years ago during World War II, is still a prime favorite with the jocks. Re-packaging of old Miller sides and the release of newly discovered Miller waxold radio broadcasts, etc.-apparently sparked more air play for Miller disks during 1959.

Harry James, who didn't make it last year, is No. 9 on the "most played" chart this time. James recently organized a new band, which is said to be his hottest aggregation since the forties.

Ray Conniff, Billy Vaughn, and Henry Mancini-all non-traveling bands-made the "most played" list on the strength of best selling LP's-"Billy Vaughn Plays the Million Sellers," Conniff's "Broadway in Rhythm," Mancini's chart topper "Peter Gunn," etc.

The "most promising" band chart spotlights an interesting group of contrasting styles, ranging from the hard-driving jazz treatments of the No. 1 winner Mancini to the lush string-styling of the Knightsbridge Strings and the bouncy satirical take-offs on the twenties of Ira Ironstrings (veteran ork leader-guitarist Alvino Ray).

The big musical trend in television during 1959 was original jazz background music for private eye film series-"Peter Gunn," "77 Sunset Strip," etc. This trend is strikingly reflected in the "most promising" poll.

Mancini, conductor-composer for the top-rated "Peter Gunn" TV series, walks off with No. 1 "most promising" honors, while another TV jazz man, Don Ralke, is No. 7. Altho Ralke is conductor-arranger for TV's "Bourbon Street Beat" series, his 1959 record hit was a waxing of the "77 Sunset Strip" theme.



But only a relatively small number of stations receive free LP service from the record manufacturers because of the high costs involved. However, many record companies have had special subscription services available for some time.

As a special programming service to broadcasters, The Billboard here rounds up details and prices on many of these plans available on an annual basis, listed alphabetically by manufacturer. Most labels not listed here make albums available to deejays and stations at a special per-album price, but they do not offer year-round LP services. Average price on per-album deals is \$1 for monaural, and \$1.25 to \$1.50 for stereo.
