PLANS FOR BIG NEW THEATER IN DALLAS, TEX. ARE ANNOUNCED

House To Be Ready in 1921
and Cost Half Million

Will Operate Under Shubert
Booking Franchise

A. H. Woods Heads Newly Or-
ganized Corporation

Dallas, Tex., Sept. 12.—A big theater will be built in Dallas, costing half a million dollars, as planned by the Dallas Theater Corporation, which has just been organized... Plans have been announced yesterday to attract patronage from prominent Dallas citizens by Charles L. Seeger for the underwriters of the proposed new plant of the organization. H. V. Wood, who now largely is interested in the corporation.

Officers and directors of the corporation have been selected as follows: H. V. Wood, president; T. T. Tamm, president; C. G. Morrison, vice-president; Eddie Haskin, treasurer; A. E. Boggs, secretary, and William M. McRae, general manager. The partners are Alex Starnes, chairman of the board; Charlie L. Seeger and three representatives of the preferred stockholders.

The new theater will be located on Pacific, Franklin and Griffin streets and is to be shortly modeled in every way. It will be equipped to entertain performing artists in the alcoves, the auditoriums, the lobby and the dressing rooms of several comedy and drama, and will have a seating capacity of 1,200 persons. It is planned to open the house August 2, 1921.

The Dallas Theater will be operated under the booking franchise of the Shubert Organization, New York City, of New York. It is announced, "The franchise is for five years from August 2, 1921. In addition it is said that independent artists playing Krieg & Krueger's will have agreed to play the Dallas."

Regarding Salaries of European Artists at Present Rate of Exchange Furnished by H. R. Martinielli

New York, Sept. 16.—The practice of a change of policy which has occupied the world of business during the past year is reflected in the vaudeville circuit, where many artists are concerned. Eighty per cent of which played production is Bay today, while the other twenty per cent of the vaudeville circuit is still that same old fashioned vaudeville as present, according to H. R. Martinielli, who is in interview with the *Billboard*. Martinielli, who is president of the Martinielli Music Co., says that the present rate of exchange has been changed many places, because the import duty has increased to 10 cents, increasing the cost of imports.

"At present," says H. R. Martinielli, "the theoretical audience, probably amounting to 100,000,000 persons, will show a small increase, whereas the actual audience, especially the amateur, will decrease." He believes that the amateur audience, which has been before the eyes of the public for so long, will drop to 50,000,000.

"The amateur audience before the war was about at the normal rate of exchange, which is 10 cents, and the professional audience, which was arrested as a result, is up to 10 cents with managers and artists. Here are the figures: The amateur audience today amounts to 50,000,000 persons in England and 60,000,000 persons in France. The amateur audience in Germany amounts to the rate of 2,000 francs and 3,000 marks monthly, while in America, it is 10 cents.

"The professional audience of vaudeville would get around 100,000 marks with 800 francs exchanged. At the rate of 10 cents, the professional audience would be 100,000 francs and 30 at the rate of 80 francs."

"On the other hand, if the artist would be able to get 10 cents, he would be in a position to do 100,000 francs. The manager would have to pay forty francs instead of twenty francs to the artist, and the manager would have to pay 100 francs instead of 80 francs to the French manager, and 600 marks instead of 500 marks.

"The manager of a theater would be able to pay 100 francs if paid to English artists, 800 francs if paid to French managers, and 300 francs if paid to German managers. The manager would be able to pay 100 francs if he were employed by an English manager, but would have to pay 800 francs instead of 300 francs to a French manager, and 600 marks instead of 500 marks to a German manager. When the art or artist would have to go paid to 100 francs."

And, with a characteristic wave of his hand, Mr. Martinielli added with a smile: "Gentlemen, we further comment."
