Those seeking licenses must file applications with the city auditor in their handwriting and give hashes, age, address and description of articles to be sold. Health examinations are required when feedstulfs are to be sold. If applicant he ever 21 he must have a certificate from the board of elections showing that he has voted in the last general election in the city: if under 21 he must have his hirth certificate or a certificate of it. No license will be issued to anylone under 12 years. The applicant must furnish two photographs, one for the licenses and the other for the city's records. GRAND JURY

One of the most interesting reports perhaps ever made on petty gambling was contained in that of a grand jury in Springfield, Sangamon County, Illinois, during January, 1939, reporting to the Circuit Court of that county.

The report made up 13 pages in detail and the conclusions drawn by the jurors therefrom are reprinted herewith for reference purposes. It will be noticed that the report is especially opposed to "syndicate" control of petty gambling and also to legal partiality to such forms of gambling as pari-mutuels. The unfairness of newspapers in reporting petty gambling is also emphasized. The conclusion is as follows:

impressed that in view of the obvious fact that thousands of citizens gamble in one form or another, regardless of the law, absolute suppression by public officers is out of the question. We believe that it could not be accomplished without a standing army, and from the evidence submitted to us we suspect that a large part of the army would be in the guardhouse much of the time—probably playing there. Allowing one working day for the trial of each case, and testimony and exhibits before us would have warranted the starting of cases against petty offenders, private citizens who like to play and have played in violation of the law, requiring by actual calculation more than 240 years to try in court, not to mention the public expense of the trials.

"We are advised that it is legal in Illinois to take part in pari-mutual betting at a duly licensed race track, but against the law to do the same sort of thing in a bookin," and we fail to see any issue of general public morality to be involved in such discrimination. We suspect that it is purely a matter of commercial enterprise influencing the quality of our laws in the moral field—a fact in our opinion not conducive to general respect for them.

Suggest Licensed Gaming

an excuse to any public officer not to do his duty to keep down public gambling as a tempfation to the youth of the city and county alike to follow the pathway of so-

called easy money, as an apparent if not a real manifestation of public and official corruption, and as a source of revenue for the protection of persons engaged in all manner of crime.

"Yet, without expressing any opinion one way or another, we urge for general consideration the question of the advisibility of modifying our anti-gambling laws so as to provide for licensing in a limited way, to secure better control and as a means of providing additional public revenue, lessening trime and corruption, and for general civic betterment in those respects.

"We counsel the public to be skeptical of and not too avid in believing newspaper stories of Sangamon County gambling, either as to its prevalence or its absence—stories many of which we have found from the evidence and even by admission of some of the writers themselves to be oftentimes inaccurate and misleading.

"We find that on occasion they are published apparently to injure or aid some individual or group, as the case may be, or to serve some other end with accuracy being a secondary consideration. We find unmistakable evidence that gambling not under syndicated control has been singled out for public attack, while that carried on by a syndicate has been largely ignored.

Withhold Indictments

"In the hope that publication of a summary of the facts heard by us may of itself sufficiently arouse public interest and opinion—without which little or nothing can be accomplished in any event—to achieve the desired curtailment of public gambling abuses, we withhold the bringing of additional true bills at this time, but leave with the State's attorney a complete record of our findings to be used by him as a basis for further proceedings should this report within a reasonable time be found to have failed of its purpose.

"We conclude by venturing to express the opinion that no one can look at the full picture without recognisting that substantial gains have been made in the public interest in curtafling racketeer-gangster activities in this county, syndicated crime having been practically broken up by the present county officers, with additional gains for the public in prospect."
