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
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
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### THE EDITOR'S LETTERS (IN RANDOM ORDER)

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


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### Atlas Sound

Logos (KRANKY)



Bradford Cox once claimed that Deerhunter's breakthrough album, *Cryptograms*, was intended to invoke the feelings of human illness If so, *Logos*, the second album from his Atlas Sound side project, feels like the healing that comes after the sickness of *Cryptograms*. Instead of evoking nausea and decay, *Logos* feels serene and blissful. If *Logos* was nothing more a wash of calming warm waves of Brian Eno bubblebath electronics, basically the sonic equivalent of painkillers, it would still be a welcome addition to Cox's body of work. But

instead, Cox takes the rhythmic loops, gauzy chord progressions and whirring keyboards of ambient bedroom music and uses them as the foundations for a sprawling set of songs. The tracks range from the folksy "Attic Lights" and the Everly-Brothers-on-'ludes pop of "Shelia" to epic collaborations with Animal Collective's Noah "Panda Bear" Lennox and members of Stereolab that are some of the most expansive (and in the case of the Lennox collab, strangely danceable) things Cox has done yet. But not only has Cox impressively expanded his musical pallette beyond Deerhunter's noisy attack, but Logos shows there's more to this artist than anguish. Heck, sometimes he's a lot of fun. **MT**

### Bang Bang Eche Sonic Death Cuntttt [EP] (SELF-RELEASED)



New Zealand's Bang Bang Eche made waves last year with their frenetic single, "4 To The Floor," off their self-titled debut EP. Hailing from Christchurch, New Zealand and formed in 2007 by bassist T'Nealle Worsley, Bang have tightened their ranks from a quintet to a powerful fourpiece and are back with the pulsating, relentless four-song Sonic Death Cuntitt EP. The dancepunk collection kicks off with the frenzied "Fist Full Of Dollars," which starts with a brief synth build-up and then suddenly pummels you with a wall of bass, drums and synths before Zach Doney's distorted vocals assault you. Halfway through the band lefts you take a breather, when

Charlie Ryder lays down a mellow little guitar solo over James Sullivan's pounding drums. But the build-up starts again with sweet choral harmony before the synths, bass and percussion slam into you once more. "You're A Jerk" is less aggressive, but only marginally so. The band refuses to back down, keeping a frantic pace on drums and vocals, while maintaining a danceable and melodic beat on bass and synths. The last two tracks are disappointingly short—"Beat Up The Children" clocks in just under two minutes and "Dirt In The Water" just over The former track is the most unhinged Bang Bang Eche gets on this EP, but even those guitar freakouts are tightly executed. Barely restrained yet unbelievably tight, the Banger's latest EP is a brief but epic high-octane ride. **ML**

### Hudson Mohawke



23-year-old young-gun producer Hudson Mohawke successfully makes everyone else feel old and talentless with his debut full-length, Europe By applying a rhythmically complex and layered approach to the sound of glossy hip hop and R&R. this 18-track release opens up the possibility of a creative renaissance for those genres, one where sharp, multifarious production spits squarely in the face of cookie-cutter beats. It's easy to imagine someone with as much commercial scope as Lil' Wayne spitting over this Glaswegian's frenetic and hyperactive beats, which is what makes HudMo's sound and the possibilities of how far it could reach in the stratosphere

part cularly exciting You can delve into this album and reemerge with a little bit of everything some purple velvet (Prince) an argyle print sweater (Andre 3000) or a late-'80s hairdo (Janet Jackson) Relerences fly thick and fast on form robut churn with enough speed to create a product that is completely new and commendably ingenious. The album slides from booming low-frequency territory ("Gluetooth") to some smooth boogie-funk ("Tell Me What You Want." featuring L. A.'s purveyor of awesome, Dâm-Funk) and also wacky R&B. Armonico Hewa (THRILL JOCKEY)



Spanish and Swahili seem like a strange combination of languages for a Japanese rock hand but for noise rockers 00100 it's an oddly suitable choice Array 4 7 00100's sixth full-length album gets its name from the words armonico (Spanish for harmonic') and hewa (Swahili for "air"), which OOIOO interprets as "air in a harmonious state. Since the band's formation in 1995 the group has gone through a number of line up changes but Yoshimi P we (of the Boredoms) remains at the helm as founder, songwriter and fearless leader. The newest album, out via Thrill lackey offers more of OOIOO's unique avantrock with the same quartet that created their last

release founder Yoshimi, guitarist Kayan, bassist Aya and drummer Ai. The album kicks off with "SOL" a pounding tribal anthem that begins with a drumbeat and whine, before Yoshimi and the gris take off on a wild free-flowing blend of beats, ambient noise and harmonic cries in Japanese. The congists aforeshadowing for the rest of the record, which is a blend of the organic and digital. Despite being sung in Japanese, tracks like "Irorun" won't lose anything in translation—the vocal lines are mostly nonsensical velos and cries, and the girls' voices more like instruments than anything else is a pulsating wave of dissonant sound, on which the buzzing guitars seem to chase the pounding snare and cymbal beat, pausing occasionally for respite Despite the chaoric imovement of the record Armonico Hewa never overwhelms. 

The overall mood on British duo Fuck Buttons second full-length is one that wavers between excitement and contentment. A minimalist intro sets the tone for each song and gradually assimilates the listener into the particular tunnel of sounds, thick with



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### Kurt Vile Childish Prodigy (MATADOR)



It's almost a throwback—like the kings of radio-rock, Springsteen and Neil Young—except reverberated through a pillow Philly's Kurt Vile has mastered this sound on his third solo effort, Childish Prodigy, to a smultaneously familiar and disonenting effect Vile made

a name for himself through the sorts of bedroom recordings that made listeners feel like they were eavesdropping through the wall on a neighboring Tom Petty sing-along. This time around, though, he sounds as if he s invited you in He holds onto his intimate psych-rock, but cleans it up with an air of assurance. Finger-picked chords keep pace as he leans deeply into his vocal amblings. Although heavy on the pedal, Vile makes sure not to lose you in the reverb by upping the rock-tone and whiskey-soaked wailing. The album alternates, somewhat haphazardly, between heaver rocking and a more lo-fir mumbling. On the winsome "Blackberry Song." Vile trails off, his musings lost as his skillful picking takes the forefront. This sort of wavering may edge on childish, but somehow he makes sure to take you wherever he s headed.



### White Rainbow

New Clouds (KRANKY)



With just four tracks, the follow-up to Adam Forkner's string of 2007 releases, New Clouds, is a gorgeous hourlong collection of relaxing electronic minimalism dotted with blinking electric blips and guitar picking that somehow

manages to sound wholly organic and in tune with nature. The afro-beat rhythms chatter over contrasting slow, buzzing orchestral notes as the 12-to 20-minute compositions take your ears on a wavening sonic journey. A delay pedal casts the gradual strums on "Major Spillage" into a watery oblivion before a crescendo of static tension and hand drums engulf them, and a soothing opening gives way to ricocheting synths on "Monday Boogies Forward Forever." Every time the beat drops, a forest comes alive at night with digital faines—White Clouds is definitely an ideal ambient companion to creativity or contemplation. **PH**

The xx (YOUNG TURKS-XL)



Romy Madley Croft and Oliver Sims have been friends since age three, and listening to their debut album, it's easy to imagine their slumber-party whispers. Joined by a few friends, but holding on to this sweet intimacy, The xx have gained a critical buzz in the UK

and left ears perked on both sides of the pond with their first self-titled album. Using sparse beats to carry slight, wounded vocals, xx's sound is as stripped down and focused as their intimate lyrics. Picking up where R&B-obsessed indies like Hot Chip and the Blow leave off, they veer away from the bumping, space sounds of, say, Timibaland, opting instead for barefooted beats and sonic bass lines. Using a drum machine, they leave space for creeping bass and haunting vocals. Croft and Sims easily fill what space is left with sexy call-andresponse, another R&B stronghold that they've mastered. Abstractly derivative, the duo foil radio-ready R&B's overtness, finding nuance in their sparring, Non-combative in their back-and-forth rapport, they make you want to lean in and listen closer. ZG



The Very Best, a collaborative project between London-based producers Radioc it (Etienne Tron and Johan Karlberg) and London-via-Malawi singer Esau Mwamwaya, offers more than the ubiquitous

Featuring an army of industry heavyweights on vocals, the fifth installment of Easement Jaxx's cross-pollinated, genre-defying club bangers warrant their return-to-reign in the realm of hipster-dance royalty. The DJ duo demonstrates their i inmatched abil-

ity at pairing unapologetically dance-inflected beats with a host of unlikely candidates (Eli "Paperboy" Reed, anyone?) The gruesome twosome try their hand at 2-Tone-style production on Santigold's contribution, "Saga," which packs an impressive nouveau-Specials punch just a few tracks down from "Scars," their explosive hip-hop opener. The album's highpoint arrives midway through the album as a 76-year-old Yoko Ono delivers a tripped-out classic that puts her amateur 20-something competitors to shame. Virginian brothers the Clipse successfully add another dimension to their sonic personas on Til The Casket Drops while strategically avoiding alienating any of their loval foot soldiers. Pharrell convinces Pusha T and Malice

to aim for more radio-friendly fire on their third album, as proven by the Neptunes-produced palm-tree-and-fast-car ode "I'm Good" or the more Euro-dance vibe of the arpeggiated synths on "Champion." The Clipse's harder edge, however remains in fact, and the tracks produced by D.I. Khalil and Sean C And LV adopt a sinister sense of urgency. Aside from the Clipse's usual subject matter, to which not everyone can relate, the most unifying element of the collection is a whole lot of bass. And luckily for them, bootyshaking seems to be the universal language.



he way in which the New York four-piece Flying Machines came together seems almost cinematic. Co-founders William Ryan George (vocalist/keyboardist) and John Wlaysewski (guitarist) met through another band they were both playing in. It didn't take long before they realized that they would much rather start their own group, and, thus, the two began writing music together. After some months, personal issues began taking a toll on George, and he suddenly up and left for California. Apart from two letters that he left in their rehearsal space, he gave his bandmates no notice whatsoever. "I didn't know what to do, I felt like I was kind of," George pauses, "drowning."

Luckilly for the band, Wlaysewski kept the faith. During their time apart, he started promoting the group's music and sent it out into the depths and far reaches of the blogosphere. The response was overwhelmingly positive. "It kind of solidified in my mind that the music was actually something good," Wlaysewski says. After a few months, he reached out to George and announced that their band had a gig in two weeks. He told George they would be playing their material either with or without him.


Now given enough spark to return and rejoin the band, George flew back to New York exactly a week before their scheduled show. "I couldn't imagine giving up on something that I had spent two-and-half years waiting to get, and I had finally got it," he remembers. George and Wlaysewski began feverishly rehearsing, and recruited current Flying Machines drummer Ken Weisbach along the way, before playing their first show.

After that everything seemed to fall into place. Flying Machines gigged incessantly around town for the next two years and added current bass player Evan Joyce to their lineup, and then Yahoo! Music came calling, yanking them out of local-only recognition and onto millions of computers courtesy of placement of their track on the TV series Psych. Flying Machines subsequently went on to win Converse's Get Out Of The Garage competition and now they've just released their self-titled debut on Meteor 17 Records.

The ten-track release alternates between classic-rock and power pop, focusing on hyper melodies that demand a level of skill from their players that they ably deliver. Flying Machines' musicianship is clean and muscular, buffing their melodies to an aggressive sheen that showcases the impressive range of George's vocals and the expansive tones of Wlaysewski's guitar as he pads the spaces between verses and chorus.

Queen comparisons somehow seem inevitable given George's lithe, Freddy Mercury-like vocal tones. And though George admits spending his adolescent years singing along to Queen's Greatest Hits in his bathroom in order to test his vocal chops, he notes that the rest of Flying Machines has less of a history with that band than he does. "I know for a fact that the other three band members would never list Queen in their top five bands," he says. Instead, they mention artists like Tom Waits and Bob Dylan as more immediate influences.

Wlaysewski says he waded through 12 different bands looking for the right kind of chemistry before finding himself in his current outfit. And he seems to have found a permanent home in Flying Machines. "It's not like a whole bunch of egos getting in a room, hoping they get heard and someone pats them on the back for being talented," he says. "I want to be in a project where everyone's serving the best idea." And that's exactly what Flying Machines does, with one unified voice.



# PLACE TO BURY STRANGERS WANT TO SHOW YOU WHAT IT CAN REALLY DO

During a tour stop in Boston three years ago, Ofiver Ackermann was approached by a fan named John Whitney, who begged him to let him release A Place To Bury Strangers' first album on his label. He had fallen in love with the group's sound: a combination of oceans of thick, sinister feedback and mechanically precise punk rhythms. But Ackermann wasn't so sure. Actually, he didn't even think he had an album.

Not that he lacked music. Ackermann had recorded a series of noisy EPs that split the difference between shoegazing and headbanging since forming A Place To Bury Strangers in 2004, and sold those CD-Rs at shows. Some were made with early line-ups, some featured only him, and he wasn't certain any of it was ready for official release. "It was just like, demos or whatever. I just thought that we were going to record all those songs properly," he says. "We even tried to limit it to, like, 500 copies. 'Cause I didn't really want the album to come out. It took me eight or nine months to decide to even agree to put out this album. And [Whitney] had written on a napkin, 'I want to put out your album and give you guys all of the money from it.' And I was like, 'I don't know if that's such a good deal,'" says Ackermann with a laugh.

Eventually, bassist Jono MOFO talked him into it. "Let's just do it so you don't have to sit around and burn CD-Rs all day, Oli," went the salient argument. After much haggling and hand-wringing on Ackermann's part, A Place To Bury Strangers was released in early 2007 to rave reviews and bountiful blog buzz via Whitney's Killer Pimp label. A year later, "some dude with a headset" that worked for Nine Inch Nails brought A Place To Bury Strangers to the side of a Dallas arena's stage and told them "'I'm going to block out the lights, then you guys are going to go on," Ackermann remembers, "and everyone starts freakin' going nuts and cheering like crazy. And we're like, 'What the fuck is going on?"

Ackermann, who is as even-keeled in temper and wiry in stature as his music is overwhelming and epic, was born in Virginia and grew up loving punk groups like the Dead Kennedys as well as his parents' Phil Spector albums. He eventually moved to New York to play in a band with a friend, but said friend was more interested in partying. Undeterred, Ackermann supported himself by building custom guitar pedals. His company Death By Audio, also the name of his studio, specializes in devices that help turn guitars into noise-machines; the first popular model he introduced was called Total Sonic Annihilation. (One pedal, which produced a sound Ackermann compares to "the end of the world or alien space landings," even proved "too crazy" for mass production.)

Eventually, Ackermann decided to play drums for a large group with "like twelve, ten kids in this band. And I was like, 'Ok, I'm trying to, like, remember all these guys' names.' And then the next day, one of the guys calls me and he's like, 'I just kicked everybody else out of the band, I want you to play guitar.'" Members came and went—that guy who kept him on eventually left as well—and a preliminarily version of A Place To Bury Strangers was born.

MOFO and drummer Jay Space were already playing in a group when they shared a bill with the proto-Place. Space was instantly impressed. "This is the band I want to be in" he remembers thinking. "Like, it blew me away. It was loud and fucking crazy, and I was like, 'Shit, man, this band fuckin' rules!' And then I became friends with those guys." The pair eventually joined up and the official A Place To Bury Strangers line-up was in place.


Though Ackermann was unsure about its release, A Place To Bury Strangers' sudden popularity so blindsided the group that, as MOFO says, it wasn't until several months after its release that the group realized it needed to hire a manager and publicist. A year later, the group had toured with MGMT and Nine Inch Nails, headlined a showcase at CMJ Music Marathon and signed to Mute. He also had plenty of chances to road test new products for Death By Audio, which was also doing great business. U2, TV On The Radio, Lou Reed and even Lady Gaga became clients. Though Ackermann is quick to stress that he never used his pedal company to pass a Strangers CD along or otherwise promote his group. "I'm not really into like any of those cheap promotion tactics or anything like that," he says. "I always think that stuff is cheesy."

Once the intial shock wore off, Ackermann felt vindicated by the praise for Place. "Some people were telling me that the songs really needed to be recorded in a proper studio for people to even pay attention. And I'd been doing this, like, D.I.Y. kind of music thing for a really long time," he says. "And so to have people actually like the album, it was... you know, I was actually kind of doing something right with these kinds of sounds and whatnot."

A Płace To Bury Strangers push those kind of sounds even further on their sophomore release Exploding Head, which they self-recorded with help from David Bowie producer Andy Smith (who helped with vocals and mixing). The group's trademark overdriven sheets of guitar have gone widescreen, but remain overheated, while the low-end has grown more confident and full. Just as impressively, the webs of guitar gossamer have been laid over crystalline pop melodies and heart-wrenching, sublimely bummed-out vocals.

"We thought of this album, that it's going to be an actual album. We spent the time to craft it as such. It went on its own little roll-ercoaster ride or whatever, as opposed to the first album which was more a collection of songs or something," Ackermann says. "The songs transition one into the other to be a complete journey, it kind of builds up in the rights spots."

And while A Place To Bury Strangers have been on a journey of their own as well, Ackermann admits that he still has a hard time letting go. "Working on those sounds could take almost forever," he says. "I mean, I could even... you know, I wouldn't mind redoing the entire album and reworking everything."

something different." So began production work on the Temper Trap's debut record, *Conditions*, an intercontinental swapping of mixes that lasted for quite a few months.

And the product isn't far from the band's can't-look-away live show. It is post-rock shoegazing taken to dizzying heights, rising miles above the mediocrity typical of stadium rock hopefuls with no more than a "big" sound. The confident and distinctly nasal vocals of frontman and founder Mandagi juxtapose against reverb-heavy guitar flourishes that waft uneasify through the record like ominous pre-cyclone winds. Their keyboards dabble in a retrofuturistic aesthetic and the manic, speedy and polished guitars resonate like a spectral holler caught in an echo chamber. Even the tenebrous lyrics, matched with the clangorous roar of "Down River" and "Science Of Fear" manage to convey an onward moving sense of dismay without resorting to maudlin melancholy, and the tensile strength behind the thumping, wordless and self-explanatory "Drum Song" closes the album, a mere ten tracks in length, far too soon.

### Around The World

Although almost equal in size to the continental US, Australia has a much more limited touring circuit. "For a band like us, there were only really three places that we could play on a regular basis," says Sillitto. "That would be Melbourne—our hometown—Sydney and Brisbane." To properly tour for its new record, the Temper Trap needed to establish a base camp in the northern hemisphere. And soon enough they were headed for the UK. By relocating the band to London, they tossed all their chips in the pot. Leaving family and friends proved a bit strenuous, but since moving, the Temper Trap have earned a UK Top 20 hit with "Science Of Fear" and have had a track featured in both a rugby video game and the cutesy alt-love flick (500) Days Of Summer, the latter serving as a formal introduction to the US mainstream.

And the touring sure is good. "In Europe or in the States, you can play in a different town every night and you're fresh and new," Sillitto explains. "Especially in Europe, you can visit twenty different countries in a month. It's a lot different being in a much bigger population, I guess, in comparison to Australia." Such incessant touring is the quartet's lifeblood; the Temper Trap feeds off a crowd's energy. "I love impressing people and I love playing. The more people get into the songs and what we're doing, the better we play. And that's how we fuel our live shows."

And they sure are feeling the crowd's love now, most notably in the UK, where £10 tickets to their sold-out shows are getting scalped at an 800 percent mark-up. "I guess it makes me feel good, because it shows that there's

a demand," says Sillitto. But, like a true artist who knows the value of his art can be measured by more than just nickels, dimes and a few pence, he adds, "I just hope that people don't actually sell them for that amount. I hope that people come to the show rather than try to sell them for as much money as they can get."

Silletto, like the rest of the band, connects with fans via the Temper Trap's web forum. "Fans ask you questions and they post things up there and they might be questions that they're asking other fans, and [we're] able to give them the answer straight from the horse's mouth," he says of the forum, which he obviously relishes. "I think they appreciate it and it's kind of gratifying in a way." (Not that there's much dirt rolling around about the band. "There's nothing incriminating about us, we're very plain, normal people," he says.)

They subscribe to a pay-it-foreword idea with fans. Just last month Sillitto kindly hooked one up with a pair of tickets to a sold-out gig. "He wrote up trying to find [tickets], and I wrote back to him and gave him two tickets. So I think it's just a really nice community thing... I mean, he was having a hard time, and I didn't want him to go and spend 80 dollars-80 pounds-on a ticket that someone bought for 10."

Not that fans should be looking for hand-outs. But Sillitto thinks of it less as charity and more like making fans for life. "I [gave] him and his wife a ticket to the show and they'll always come back to our gigs," he says. "So it's the least I could do."

His new album, Summer Of Fear, concerns the period of time, roughly summer '07 and onwards, after a breakup with his ex. "I was sort of out on my own," he remembers. "I would crash on people's coaches. And the last time I VE BEEN IN A I had been that out in the air was the summer after September 11." An Ore-**VERY REFLECTIVE PERIOD** gon native and lifelong indie rock fan, IN MY LIFE , THINHING ABOUT Robinson moved to the city to attend WHAT THE HELL THE NEXT STEP New York University at the turn of the century. One of the recurring themes OF MY LIFE IS GOING TO BE of Summer is how his post-break up life mirrored the summer of 2002. That era was the first time he fully considered himself a New Yorker (the attacks "fused" him to the city), and began applying himself as a songwriter (and show-seeing scenester) in earnest, in-between stints of sleeping on his friend's

Robinson might be obsessed with the past decade of life in New York, but in fairness, he did see a lot of the city's music history first hand. "I feel like I got to live a lot of zeitgeists in a weird way." begun working on its follow-up with TV On The Radio's Kyp Malone, who he met during a particularly fruitful shopping trip. (They hit it off when they realized they were both on their way to a Grizzly Bear show.)

Fortunately, Robinson can side-step any accusations of Zelig-like rightplace-right-time success with his solid-if sideways-songwriting, confident voice, and ear for adventurous arrangements and produc-

tion, which we'll hear even more of soon. Even before Fear hit shops, via his new deal with Saddle Creek, Robinson was already well into writing his third album, which he hopes to finish between tours. But you might want to wait until next summer to ask him what it's about.

"I feel like I very much exhausted a lot of themes and shut the door on a lot of stuff that I had been writing about for a really long time," he says. "I've been in a very reflective period in my life, thinking about what the hell the next step of my life is going to be and where I go from here. I spent a lot of time hanging out on the street. I'm sure I want something else in my life at this point, and I don't know what."

### **BIG STAR**

#### KEEP AN EYE ON THE SKY (Rhino)

If the only two songs that Big Star ever recorded were "Thirteen," a brazenly fragile ode to fleeting youth, and "Holocaust," a shocking raw depiction of depression, they would still more than justify the cult following they've earned since the '70s. But the box set *Keep An Eye On The Sky* proves that the group wrote dozens of other great songs, too. *Sky* gathers together alternate mixes and demos that sound better than the Big Star albums currently available on CD, as well as early pre-Star songs from principal songwriters Chris Bell and Alex Chilton. And it's not just their own cultishly adored songs that they slay—the collection's live disc includes killer covers of songs by T.Rex, the Kinks and the Flying Burrito Brothers. MT

### HALL AND OATES

### DO WHAT YOU WANT, BE WHAT YOU ARE: THE MUSIC OF DARYL HALL AND JOHN OATES (Sony Legacy)

There's no middle ground with Hall And Oates. Every single song on their new four-disc, career-spanning box set either is an unmitigated winner that demands that you love it more than you love your own mother or an easy listening abomination, smothered in cheese and smooth sax solos. Enough ironic nostalgia and kitsch factor has accumulated for the Philadelphia blue-eyed soul crooners that they could probably headline Coachella at this point, and "Rich Girl" and "I Can't Go For That (No Can Do)" are the only songs the house band on Heaven's casino cruise knows. But be forewarned: this set includes a cover of "You've Lost That Lovin' Feeling," which sounds exactly how you'd think it would. MT

# JESUS LIZARD PURE/HEAD, GOAT, LIAR, DOWN (Touch And Go)

Although it is boxed up, all shiny and new the Jesus Lizard's reissued Touch And Go catalog echoes with visceral grit, which makes sense given that each album was meticulously remastered by Steve Albini and original engineer Bob Weston. Pure/Head, Goat, Liar and Down all come as gatefold vinyl, each packaged with a booklet full of photos and JL ephemera, as well as recording accounts from each band member. And with a combined total of 17 bonus tracks—from a live recording of "Seasick" to studio session of "Gladiator"—these reissues are any obsessive collector's dream. LH

#### **PIXIES**

### **MINOTAUR** (Artist In Residence)

In the retrospective of the Influential Boston outfit's brief but powerful career, all five of the Pixies' studio albums are remastered and accompanied by a DVD of the foursome's 1991 show at Brixton Academy in London. But this heavyweight collection (seriously, it's pushing 25 pounds!) was the brainchild of artist Vaughan Oliver, the man behind the visual for many 4AD bands including the Cocteau Twins and Dead Can Dance, so naturally there must be more to it. Two books—one bound by ultra lux faux fur—host a collection of modern photography from Simon Larbalestier, the original photographer for all of the band's album covers, and fine art inspired by the Pixies' work. Not that Surfer Rosa needs anything besides a good set of speakers, but in an unmatched feat of boxing up musical achievements, the Pixies' Minotaur takes the bull by the horns. LH



#### **JULIET NAKED**

Nick Hornby, the Brit who brought music nerds to the cultural forefront with High Fidelity, takes his depictions of musical obsessives a step further in Juliet, Naked. Living in a dilapidated seaside resort town, Annie has been stuck in a complacently mediocre relationship for 15 years with a man who seems to love the music of '80s phenom-turned-recluse Tucker Crowe more than her. To spite her compulsive lover, Annie posts an insightful yet negative review of Crowe's latest album, only to provoke the penniless Dylanesque singer-songwriter, now living the low life in rural Pennsylvania with his young son, to strike up causal e-mail correspondence with the woman who so thoughtfully slammed his record. Not unlike his previous works, Juliet, Naked, is standard romantic-comedy fare and, as such, is rather predictable. It's Hornby's knack for penning true-to-life dialogue, however, that adds character depth and helps the novel avoid mushy clichés. LH
