(Music Editorial)

VOCAL GROUPS

The record business has a new sensation—vocal groups.

For months now, everyone has been wondering and asking what the new trend would be. Now we know.

It's fascinating to watch the changing aspects of the music business. A decade ago, the band was the big thing. Then they faded and gave way to a host of female singers such as Dinah Shore, Helen Forrest, Helen O'Connell etc. After the female singers, male singers gained such supremacy that *The Cash Box* in an issue a couple of years ago was moved to ask editorially "What Happened To The Female Singers". Then came the "new sound" phase in which every instrument that could be used to create an unusual note was employed on record. This led into the lush instrumental trend in which some of the loveliest records of recent date were released. And now finally we have the groups.

The trend is so pronounced that in this week's top juke box tunes, 8 of the first 12 records are sung by groups. They include "Three Coins In The Fountain" by The Four Aces; "Hernando's Hideaway" which although it is Archie Bleyer's reording, is sung by his chorons; "The Happy Wanderer" which also is sung by a chorons while featuring Frank Weir; "I Understand Just How You Feel" by The Four Tunes; "Isle Of Capri" by The Gaylords; "Crazy 'Bout You Baby" by The Crew-Cuts; "Wedding Bells" by The Four Aces; and "I Get So Lonely" by The Four Knights.

As if this list weren't conclusive enough, there are several other disks by groups which are moving up fast.

They are: "Goodnight, Sweetheart, Goodnight" by The McGuire Sisters; "Sh-Boom" by The Crew-Cuts; "The Little Shoemaker" by The Gaylords; "Gilly Gilly Ossenfeffer" by The Four Lads; "Sweetheart" by The Hilltoppers; and "Leave It To Your Heart" by The Ames Brothers.

The situation has become so intense that almost every diskery is on the lookout for new groups, even though they may already have several signed. And the possibilities involved are demonstrated by Mercury's several smash hits with both The Gaylords and The Crew-Cuts.

How long this trend will last is impossible to predict. What we do know is that it can only do good for the record business. It is giving it a lift and a sense of excitement at a time when it needs them very much. And from the current groups, we're positive that some will make the permanent grade in our entertainment picture and will be around, enjoying great reputations, long after the trend has passed. Just as today, trend or no trend, artists in all categories whether they be male or female singers, come up with consistent hits.

It is these trends, changes, differences in tastes at different times which make our business such a fascinating one. So much so, that even now, in the midst of one of the strongest trends we've ever experienced, people are already asking, "What's next?"

"What's next?"

We're still hoping—as are many, many people in the music business—that it's the bands.

Presently, they're heading to the top with a tender ballad "I Understand Just How You Feel." This latest side has a barber shop quartet flavoring. As long as the boys keep mixing 'em up, they can't help but hit. Top drawer material with a melody and lyric that stays with you. Flip is rhythm item called "Lonesome" with a good bluesy flavor. We're wild about the upper lid.

Future Goodman plans include a possible European tour with a jazz group.



She will return to New York just prior to the Chase engagement to cut more sides for Decca with the Victor Young Orchestra.

Deejays Like Capitol's Cueing Disk

NEW YORK — The record industry's conversion to 45rpm releases for radio stations has been favorably met in all cities, with the exception of a few metropolitan areas such as New York, Newark and Philadelphia.

Last week Hal Cook received a TWX from Frank Ward of Station WKBK in Buffalo, N. Y.

Here is the quotation of Ward's wire to Cook:

I am so pleased with Capitol Records that I wanted to get in touch with you right away and tell you so. We were very much up in the air about 45rpm conversion. We were, that is, until just about 5 minutes ago when Roy Jacobs our local Cap man dropped off your new plastic cueing disk to aid in 45 playing.

We have just tried it out and it is the best darn thing I could ever imagine to assist in the changeover and to help the operators get things going ok. We all at the station cannot thank you and Cap enough for

the foresight displayed in such an accessory. Hope we can get 2 or 3 more in next few weeks.

The same reaction was gotten in Chicago and Detroit when at first radio stations didn't like the idea of receiving 45rpm releases but after the Capitol cueing disks were received, within twenty-four hours reports came in that the stations had changed their minds.

Capitol Records has sent out two cueing disks each to 2,250 stations with initial shipments of 45's. Additional cueing disks are being pressed and will be available to the radio stations throughout the country. The Capitol cueing disk is a twelve inch platter made of filled vinyl double the weight of an LP album.

It is the general feeling that the cueing disk will be a tremendous asset to the entire record industry as it holds all labels and will solve a major problem with all radio stations who feature recorded music.

The flip, "Please Don't Freeze," is an equally powerful item with a change of pace tempo. Material is strong on both sides and the Brown treatments should ride them right to the top.



"Mambo Week At Victor" Celebrated With Release Devoted To Mambos

NEW YORK—In keeping with the current mambo rage, RCA Victor is putting out a special mambo release next week—that is, the entire Victor release will be exclusive mambo records. A special disk jockey kit will be sent out with the records.

In connection with this "Mambo Week At Victor" a special field trip is being made by Herman Diaz and Fran Amaru of the International Department. Diaz' itinerary includes Boston, Buffalo, Cleveland, Detroit and Pittsburgh. Amaru will hit New York, Philadelphia, Washington, D. C., St. Louis, Kansas City, Chicago and Dallas. They will call on distributors, dealers and disk jockeys, to make them aware of the huge market now crying for this type of music.

Victor's outstanding mambo artist, Perez Prado, opens at the Waldorf in New York on July 27.

In the kit which Victor is sending with its release, the mambo craze is explained this way:

Mambo, the music with the startling beat and infectious rhythm, is sweeping the world like an epidemic. It is Cuban in origin, but universal in its appeal.

No one man can claim to be its creator. It has been a long time evolving from other basic forms of Afro-Cuban rhythms. The "danzon," one of the oldest of the Cuban social dances, has a mambo flavor in the "montuno" part of the dance.

There is one man, however, who must be given the credit for having made the mambo as popular as it is today. The man is Damaso Perez Prado, better known as Perez Prado, and still better known as "The King of the Mambo." Born and raised in Cuba, Prado chose music as his career. A pianist at first, he played with the most famous Cuban dance orchestras including the "Casino de la Playa" orchestra, which, at that time, was considered the greatest of them all. But playing the piano in an orchestra did not satisfy his creative ambitions, and he turned to arranging. It was rough going at first. Very few

understood his musical expressions which he called mambos. It was at this stage of his career that he was called upon to make the arrangements for an RCA Victor recording artist who was to record in Havana. Prado conducted the orchestra during the rehearsals, and he so impressed Herman Diaz, A & R manager of International Records for RCA Victor, that he was given a contract on the spot. Nothing much happened for a while. Prado then moved to Mexico City, and pandemonium broke loose in all of Latin America. First the Mexicans went wild over Prado's dance orchestra and the mambo. As an RCA Victor recording artist, he started to record immediately in our Mexico City studios under the able supervision of Mariano Rivera Conde, RCA Victor's A & R chief in Mexico City. With Pancho Cardenas at the control board, RCA Victor came up with some of the most exciting dance records ever. Mambo swept like wildfire through all the countries south of the border and in the Caribbean.

The world today has no boundaries. From Havana to Miami, from Miami to New York, to Los Angeles, Chicago, Baltimore, Philadelphia, the mambo swept like a tidal wave. It grows as its savage irresistible rhythm moves on across the land. It appeals to young and old alike. Some just like to sit and listen to this haunting, captivating form of musical expression. Others, who are more fortunate, can go to mambo palaces such as the Palladium in New York or the Zenda in Los Angeles and sit for hours watching the dancers put on exhibitions that literally leave both the dancers and the spectators breathless—yet begging for more.

One last bit about Prado. In all his records you will hear him shout a few times during the performance. This shout has now been accepted as a Prado trademark. Actually, what he says is "Dilo"—Spanish for "Say it." He is shouting to his men to "Say it with more expression"—to give it all they have.



A GLIMPSE INTO THE FUTURE

If "Pay-As-You-Look-Television" Becomes Fact Will Juke Box-TV Receiver Combinations Be Next Big Music Development?

Before going one word further let it be known that this article deals with gazing into the crystal ball of the future and therefore is, in the main, based on conjecture.

For many, many months applications for "pay-as-you-look-television" have been pending decision before the FCC (Federal Communications Commission). So far none have been placed into actual operation.

There are many astute and far seeing business men who do believe that, sooner or later, "pay-as-you-look-television" will become fact.

An article in this regard, written by Millard C. Faught, appeared in the July, 1954 issue of "The American Mercury." This same article was digested and appeared in the July, 1954 issue of "Reader's Digest" where millions of peoples had the opportunity to read it. There is no doubt that a great many in this industry also read it.

The fact remains that, as more and more telecasting stations come into being, cost of network programs and even local shows continue to increase tremendously, with the result that the entertainment being offered by the telecasters, due to lack of sponsors, continues to fall in quality.

It is believed, as movie magnate Samuel Goldwyn put it sometime ago, that when the home audience begins to pay for programs, television will then become an ally of the movies.

At the same time the top sporting contests and other outstanding events will come within the range of all the peoples everywhere in the nation who care to pay the price to see these.

The former "million dollar gates" of championship fights, the enthusiasts of "pay-as-you-look-television" believe, will probably become \$10,000,000.00 gates.

Even the most elementary computation of the amount of monies which can be taken in for a championship fight, these enthusiasts

claim, by making it available at 50¢ or \$1.00 or even more per television receiver gives some idea, multiplying the price against the number of TV receivers in the nation, as to what this can actually amount to in cold, hard cash.

One large television receiver manufacturer has come up with an idea whereby all that the receiving set owner need do is simply dial a certain telephone number to unscramble the picture he wants. The cost would then be added onto his monthly telephone bill.

Another is reported to have a special type key which, when inserted into a unit that will be attached to the TV receiver, will also unscramble the picture.

Another has a special type card, which is also inserted into a special unit attached to the TV receiver, and which also unscrambles the picture to be viewed.

In short, a great many ingenious plans are all prepared, awaiting the time when FCC will grant approval for "pay-as-you-look-television."

There is no doubt, some claim, that this has to come into being eventually. Just when, no one can say. "But," these people stubbornly insist, "it simply must come."

Regardless of all the ingenious collection devices which have been brought into being for checking on the use of "pay-as-you-look-television," the simplest, the best, and the one and only one that will work, will pay off, and will eliminate losses of many kinds, is still the coin operated machine's coin chute.

In short, for commercial "pay-as-you-look-television" in taverns and all other retail outlets, the one best method which can be adopted is "coin-operated-pay-as-you-look-television."

This, then, leads to the crystal-ball question that, if and when at sometime in the future "pay-as-you-look-television" does come into being, will the juke box operator be able to feature this right along with his present musical instrument, either in a combination ma-

chine or as a special machine connected with his juke box?

General opinion is that, should FCC ever grant rights for the operation of "pay-as-you-look-television," automatic music manufacturers will probably tie in with it.

These manufacturers will then be able to present an instrument which should surpass even the wildest dreams of all the present operating fraternity.

The operator should not look for this to come about this year, or next year, or even the year after next. This is, as yet, far away. It is only in the 'dream stage' at this time, regardless of all the applications for "pay-as-you-look-television" that are on file and pending decision before FCC.

There are still a great, great many arguments pro and con regarding even asking the public to pay for TV programs, especially when leading advertisers are willing to pay fabulous amounts to sponsor free programs of top caliber.

It may all wind up in the tightest kind of knotted muddle anyone has ever yet dreamed of. It may be years and years before the knot can be sufficiently unwound to obtain public consideration.

Even if it were left up to a national or local vote of the owners of TV receivers it is highly doubtful whether, at the present development stage of television, a majority of the TV owners would vote affirmatively in regard to "pay-as-you-look-television" programs.

All this again emphasizes the fact that the coin machine operators who have developed their locations and made friends of the location owners, who have always featured the finest equipment and therefore have the confidence of the retailers with whom they deal, will be in the enviable position to take immediate advantage of "pay-as-you-look-television" when, and if, it ever does come into being.

Those operators who have been slipshod in their operational methods, who have neglected their locations will, as has always happened in the past, lose out when new developments are presented.

Here and There

NEW YORK—The Saturday Evening Post ran a full page ad in the local newspapers this week using a copy theme that pointed out the true value of its magazine. It said: "pickup . . . You won't find it in Standard Rate and Data. (Advertising source book). It's not in any A.B.C. report. (Circulation service). Yet the number of times a reader returns to his magazine can determine the effectiveness of your advertising. For the more often a magazine is picked up and read, the more often the ads are seen." The Saturday Evening Post then went on to tell that its readers pick it up about 5 times. This statement struck with full force, and makes us realize more than ever that the advertisers in the Cash Box receive full value for their money. Not only is the circulation concentrated exclusively for the coin machine industry (no waste coverage), but *The Cash Box* is read thoroughly, and probably picked up a hundred times during the week. And furthermore, not only does the subscriber himself perform this ritual, but probably another dozen coin machine people do the same with the same issue.

CHICAGO — Starting with the very beginning of the modern coin machine industry, we have watched (and took part) in its great growth to its present day giant proportions. It's no mystery at all to us. The people connected with the industry are far ahead of those in most industries. Their minds are keener, they work harder, and often, when necessary, are willing to take chances. One of these brilliant minds, which years ago stepped to lead the coin machine industry to its present path, is James Mangan, familiarly known to all as Jim. Today, Jim is still showing the way thru his work in the firm of Mangan & Eckland, coin machine constants. For an idea of Jim's brilliant thinking, read the story about his "Celestia" elsewhere in this issue.

WASHINGTON, D.C. — We recently reported in this column (June issue) that savings of individuals had increased about 12½ billions in the past year. Our concluding sentence was "Let them (the people) get word of an optimistic nature, and the money will get into good circulation again." It is reported that now the signs are appearing that the public is letting some of their money go to products, instead of saving it all. It is felt that the buyer is regaining confidence in the overall economy — their job and paycheck, sales and profits. The economists claim that the usual increase hasn't been startling, but it is a critically important shift in the trend. If it continues, it will be one of the strongest signals of all that the next move of business will be substantially up.

NO "SUMMER SLUMP" SEEN

Even In Territories Where General Biz Conditions Off, Fine Equipment By Amusement Games And Phono Manufacturers Make It Possible For Ops To Keep Collections Up

CHICAGO—An unusual economic situation prevails thruout the nation today, with some areas showing higher sales and profits, while other territories are off from their 1953 figures. The reaction from these conditions reflect on the collections from coin operated equipment, creating a somewhat spotty national picture.

Whatever the answer may be, operators in general are far from pessimistic, as the top grade equipment being turned out by all the factories is making it possible to keep collections from falling too far. In those areas where activity is great, these new machines are bringing in exceptionally high averages, regardless of what used to be called the "summer slump".

An indication of the industry's good health is the fact that some of the factories here have cancelled vacations scheduled for their personnel. It became absolutely imperative that the production lines be kept going so that sufficient machines could be shipped to take care of orders on hand and continually coming in.

Most of the factories, following many years of precedence, have set its summer vacation schedules for its factory and office people, and rather than disrupt any plans its employees have already made, are just going thru with its plans. However, demand for machines has been so great, these factories have arranged for overtime production schedules, so that shipments could be made to distributors, as well as creating a stockpile of machines to rush out when they reopen.

What the reason for this activity is could be attributed to the unusually fine money earning amusement machines. As far as music machines are concerned, every manufacturer has outstanding equipment, and the operators themselves have learned that their collections are bettered, particularly in the summer months, when they program the machines with the recordings that the public will pay their coins to listen to. Over the past few years, operators of juke boxes have devoted more time to study the listening habits of their patrons and have given them the records they want. Naturally, this policy has brought in the extra coin needed during the summer months so that their collections haven't fallen off to the extent they have in years gone by.

Another factor that has helped to modify the past "summer slumps" is the fact that so many people are on the road, taking auto vacations. Roadside eateries and entertainment spots reflect the added patronage with increased takes on coin operated equipment.

Chicago Pinball Licenses Would Net State Some \$300,000

Pinball Licenses Now Bring Illinois \$260,000

CHICAGO—"Legalization of pinball machines in Chicago would net the state more than \$300,000 in new revenue" stated Malden Jones, staff writer for the local newspaper, Chicago American, in a news story originating from Springfield, the state's capitol.

It was reported that State Revenue Director Richard J. Lyons said that more than 5,200 pinballs operating in downstate counties are already yielding \$260,000 in license fees.

At the present time the City of Chicago is challenging the efforts of local coinmen to obtain licenses.

"This fact," he added, "plus the overwhelming operator and distributor acceptance of the 'Nelson Modernization Kit,' now that it has been seen first hand, indicates that even with expanded facilities overtime production must continue for sometime to come."

Wanna Buy Some Nothin'?

Jim Mangan Tells All On National TV Program

CHICAGO—James (Jim) T. Mangan, Mangan & Eckland, this city, advertising designers and coin machine consultants, made his TV debut last week on an outlet covering 78 stations in the United States, South America and Japan.

Mangan is known to thousands of coinmen thruout the world, and has a well earned reputation for versatility, progressiveness and deep thinking.

Back in 1948 Jim secured complete rights to the sky by seizing all space in all directions from the Earth in

Mangan advises that he is already working on a scientific development aimed at extracting free energy from the sky by means of a telepath-radio beam which does tricks to the electronic and magnetic waves in the sky.
