At that time, Gold certification was awarded to tapes which sold in excess of 25,000 units, or \$1 million, while Platinum certifications went to tapes which sold more than 50,000 units, or \$2 million. "Who knew back then that VCRs and movie rentals would become the big business that it has in just a few years," the spokesperson remarked.

Today, RIAA Gold and Platinum video certifications vary from category to category. For theatrical videos, Gold means at least 75,000 units (\$3 million) and Platinum means at least 150,000 units (\$6 million). For non-theatrical tapes, Gold means at least 30,000 units (\$1.2 million), while Platinum means at least 60,000 units (\$2.4 million). Music video, whose standard remains at the 1981 level, will continue to be certified Gold at 25,000 units and Platinum at 50,000 units.

Industry speculation now points to the International Tape/Disc Association to take the lead in theatrical and non-theatrical sales certifications. The Motion Picture Association of America, once viewed as an obvious RIAA successor for theatrical video certifications, has reportedly decided not to certify videocassettes.



### Majors See Bountiful CD Christmas

NEW YORK — "Phenomenal," was the one word that MCA's Harold Sulman used when asked how this Christmas season's CD picture looked. "We'll be able to meet demand by early November because we're getting production of over a million CDs a month for October, November and December about five times as much as we were getting last Christmas."

In a spot survey of four of the major labels last week—Warner Bros. and Capitol were unavailable for comment—a rosy CD Christmas was predicted across the board. After a couple of years of hand-wringing are CDs going to catch on? where can we get the production from?—the labels contacted seem ready to meet the Yule season—and the expected post-holiday boom—head on.

"How are we doing in terms of supply?" said CBS' Jerry Shulman. "We're doing excellently, that's why our 'Buy One Get One Free' promotion is under way. Obviously we feel quite confident that we can fulfill all of these additional sales that we're going to generate from it. Without question, we feel that we have not only been able to satisfy our accounts — and I think our fill is overwhelmingly the best in the industry — but we also feel that we have been able to stockpile enough CDs in anticipation of this program, so we can satisfy the customers who buy five and then expect to get one free."

"As far as we're concerned, our supply is good and is going to continue to be good," said PolyGram's Harry Anger. "We've had good fill so far, through the whole growth of this project, and we believe that it will continue to be good."

None of the labels contacted would commit to any Yuletime promotions – a la CBS' package – but everybody suggested that possible deals were in the offing.

"We will be running significant promotions with our CD product," said RCA's Rick Dobbis. "We treat the CD as a front line configuration, meaning that we believe that it is a part of our product line that has to be dealt with as we deal with LPs and cassettes."

Dobbis joined the other labels in predicting adequate supply, but cautioned, "As always with CDs, the concern really is for any projects that are really explosive where you can't project sufficiently. We believe we'll have an adequate supply, but you can never tell just how explosive any particular project might become. You're in the position where you don't want to be out of anything, but there is one good reason to be out of something—the record explodes. That we can live with. We won't be happy about it, but we'll live with it."

As for anticipated hot items, all the labels bubbled forth. Dobbis pointed to Bruce Hornsby as a front-line CD mover for RCA, and also expressed confidence in the success of Novus and Bluebird, RCA's foray into jazz, which will debut early next month with simultaneous LP, cassette, and CD issues. Shulman fingered the Bruce Springsteen live set as CBS' big number, saying, "that's occupying weeks and weeks of our production." He also pointed to the release in early November of 14 Rolling Stones titles—LPs previously on Atlantic—on CD.

PolyGram, of course, will be in the November Stones CD sweepstakes, with their reissues of the band's London catalogue on CD. Beyond that, Anger said that, for the most part, "What we're finding is the hot items are the items that are selling well in all formats. Things like Bon Jovi, Cinderella, the Moody Blues, and Emerson, Lake & Powell." MCA's Sulman suggested that MCA's big titles would be Boston's "Third Stage" and "Miami Vice II." He also mentioned "the Impulse stuff – there's a second set coming – will do real well, and we've got about 20 classical titles. But the biggest stuff is going to be the rock and roll hits."

All the labels rued the fact that CD production demands still forces the digital format to lag about a month behind LPs and cassettes in release scheduling—though on less trend-oriented material (jazz, classics, rock reissues), the tendency seems to be to hold up the LPs and cassettes until the CDs are ready.

"It's a self-fulfilling prophecy," said CBS' Shulman about the anticipated CD crush before, and just after, Christmas. "There are five times more people with CD players, so there's no question that it's going to be gangbusters."

### Moss Music Introduces CD "Wallet"

IEW YORK--The Moss Music Group has atroduced a new package for CDs, which it alls the CD Wallet. Moss has created a new assical label, Vox Prima, which will utilize ne packaging.

The CD Wallet is a cardboard box, meauring about 5" by 11 1/4" by 1/8". After ne consumer takes the package home, a ardboard stiffener is removed from the box nd the box folds into the same size as the tandard jewel box. The CD Wallet, before is folded, is about the third of the width of long cardboard box with an enclosed jewel box. According to Ira Moss, president of the Moss Music Group, "The consumer is currently paying at list price between two dollars and four dollars for a CD package that is relatively unsatisfactory to many purchasers. The CD Wallet affords consumers packaging at a lower price...." The CD Wallet will be made available through licensing to all labels through Berkley Marketing.

Vox Prima, the new Moss classical CD label, will record new performances as well as reissue items from the catalogue of the Vox label.

### Home Taping Addressed By CISAC Congress

EW YORK--CISAC (the International confederation of Authors, Composers and ublishers) addressed the issue of home tap ig during its recent 35th annual Congress, eld in Madrid. Dennis De Freitas, chairman f the British Copyright Council, on behalf f the U.K. copyright organizations PRS/ ICPS, called for CISAC to call upon all overnments whose countries recognize the alue of the copyright system to take steps vithout delay to introduce schemes to proide remuneration for authors and other inerested persons whose works are subject to xtensive home taping. According to De reitas, a U.K. study showed that in 1983, 66 million hours of music were taped, aproximately six times more hours of music aped than bought

Jean Loup Tournier, the general manager of French copyright socities SACEM and SDRM, said, "The public must understand that by paying only a small amount for each cassette it obtains...guarantees...a continuous flow of new cultural and amusement products." Gerry Willemsen, the general manager of BUMA/STEMRA, the Dutch copyright organizations, bemoaned the fact that the Netherlands still do not have any legislative provision covering home taping.

Austrian pop star Falco sent a message to the Congress, encouraging it to continue to fight for a levy on blank tapes. "The best things in life are not always free," said Falco, "that is why I want to be paid for the use of my songs."

### Bennett Named VP Promotion for MCA



The whole idea is to cut a bunch of public service announcements featuring Bruce Willis, Madonna, Cyndi Lauper, Steve Jones, Andy Taylor, Belinda Carlisle, Phil Collins, and others."

DesBarres's new album, "Somebody Up There Likes Me" (Gold Mountain/MCA), represents his resurgence as an individual and a recording artist, and, as such, is a powerfully personal document. "This record is about me. It was like a floodgate of all sorts of personal emotions," he says. "Everything else I had written before was objective — about something — as opposed to what I was feeling, so all this pent-up stuff came out. I had been suppressing these feelings in the past and they just came out on the album.

the album. "The majority of the stuff that I had done before used to be written for an audience I thought existed, by an artist that I had created," he says. "I abandoned the artist I had created because he was fueled by the drugs, the myth of the melodramatic decadent rock star."

On this album, DesBarres veers from stock rock whenever the emotional content demands it. "Somebody Up There Likes Me" includes a moving ballad ("Too Good To Be Bad"), a Stoneish title track, the Wilson Pickett-styled "Locked In The Cage Of Love" (written by Eurythmic's Dave Stewart), several cuts backed by The Tower Of Power horns, and a personally appropriate cover of Johnny Nash's "I Can See Clearly Now."

"I heard 'I Can See Clearly...' on the radio and said that sounds good for the record," he says. "I've always loved the song, I love the lyrics" - he pauses -- "and it seemed appropriate for me now that all the obstacles have disappeared."

### Scorsese Mixes Blues Into The Color Of Money

LOS ANGELES – The film: Touchstone Pictures' *The Color Of Money*, a much-anticipated sequel to the Paul Newman-Jackie Gleason classic from 1961 in which Newman reprises his Oscar-nominated role as billiards master 'Fast' Eddie Felson. The picture, directed by Martin Scorsese, also stars Tom Cruise as Felson's pool playing protegè.

The soundtrack: an MCA release just now being shipped which features cuts by Don Henley; Eric Clapton; Robert Palmer; Willie Dixon; Mark Knoffler; Warren Zevon; and B.B. King, as well as pieces from the film's score; composed by Robbie Robertson and arranged by Gil Evans. The likely first single (and video from *The Color Of Money* will be Clapton's "It's In The Way You Use It."

Well, although this seems yet another prominent motion picture joined at the hip to yet another pop-laden soundtrack, there's actually far more at work, and at stake, here. In reality, *The Color Of Money* marks a serious, and long overdue effort to shed more light on a unique style of music which is too often relegated to the shadows, namely, the blues. After all, Scorsese obviously reasoned, what other genre of music could so perfectly reflect the moody, smokefilled pool halls in which so much of the picture's action takes place?

In a three-way conversation last week, Chris Montan, Touchstone's director of creative affairs, music; and Robin Garb, the studio's vice president of music, motion pictures and television, discussed *The Color Of Money* sountrack with *Cash Box.* "The great part of this project," Montan first commented, "was that Martin Scorsese really knows music. He has a tremendous feel for it and very much envisioned a somewhat bluesy score from the jump. In fact, he basically hand-picked the artists involved and, because of his stature as a director, was able to attract a level of talent you rarely get on one album."

Concurring, Garb added, "These artists not only recognized they were getting the opportunity to work with Scorsese on a sequel to a classic, but also, I think, realized we weren't simply trying to grab on to their success and talent in order to just get a hit record." According to Montan, the director

"approached the artists as being the best in their field, and in essense said to them, 'I want you to make my movie better, based on your skill, not on your fame."

In most cases, when 'poptracks' are being assembled, the musicians who are brought in are simply asked to contribute songs which are later cut in to the body of the film. For *The Color Of Money*, however, the tact was quite different. Each of the songs was not only recorded specifically for the film, but the artists were, for the most part, 'assigned' individual scenes to tackle musically. In this way, each of the songs (although Knoffler opted to compose purely orchestral material for his scene) ties in stylistically and structurally with what is happening on the screen.

Describing the music in *The Color Of Money*, Montan said, "The mood of the film, as we've mentioned, called for a bluesy, urban sound. And what I like most about the final soundtrack is that the songs blend in so well with the score. It's very coherent in that sense. Eric's song is one of the most outgoing things he's written in years and he's very excited about it. Robert Palmer wrote a fabulous seven minute piece (one of two songs he recorded for the movie) which is very different from what you might expect, since it's not as uptempo as

### POINTS WEST

THE BENEFIT WAS BOSS-Last week's Bridge School benefit might well go down in rock history as one of the most monumental benefit events ever staged, featuring, as it did, the reunion of Crosby, Stills, Nash & Young and Bruce Springsteen's only show of 1986. Fans flocked to Northern California's recently opened Shoreline Amphitheatre from as far away as New Jersey, and helped raise over 1/4 million for physically handicapped youngsters with speach impairments. The event was organized by Neil Young and wife Peggy, whose two sons are victims of cerebral palsy, and also featured such artists as Tom Petty, Robin Williams, Don Henley, J.D. Souther. Timothy B. Schmit and Nils Lofgren. As you might easily imagine, over 60,000 requests for tickets (at \$21 a throw) were received for this onenight-only show, with a sell-out final attendance tally of 17,213.

**BACK ON TRACKS**—After four years in absentia, **Iggy Pop** is going back on the road for a world tour in support of his recent **A&M Records** release, "Blah Blah Blah." The LP, which is solid Pop (if a mite unadventurous) has received mostly favorable reviews, and its first single, "Cry For Love," has had a strong reception from radio - the strongest for any single in Pop's lengthy career.

From there it's Europe, and then back to the states again for what his publicists call a "more extensive tour." Japan and Australia are scheduled after that.

AT RCA, L.A.—You've probably heard about how RCA Records has gone and "invited" its employees to quit (with generous compensation, especially for long-term workers). That was several weeks ago. Well, it just so happens that RCA's L.A. offices are located a few floors below the *Points West* word precessor. Glory be! So we did some unofficial snooping, and here's what we found out: At least four West Coast staffers have taken RCA up on the offer, and several more remain tentative. Those who inside sources said are definitely leaving include general manager **Ed Sherlock** - a 40-year RCA veteran; director of a&r administration **Joan Deary** (who doesn't leave until the end of November); News and info head **Mort Fleischmann** (he stays 'til January); and receptionist **Betty Fergit**, who's been with the company for 25 years. The word is that more resignations will be made firm when Bertelsmann formally takes the reigns in early December. Incidentally, RCA is throwing a party for the first raft of departing staffers at **Don Wardell's** house October 24.

### NEW FACES TO WATCH

"The musical communication among the members is amazing considering the short period of time we've been together," says Peter McIan of his new band, The City.

Although Peter Mclan's name is probably not immediately familiar, the many artists he has produced or written songs for, Men At Work, Pat Benatar, and Barbara Streisand, are. Although the City is mostly the brainchild of Mclan, a tall, bearded affable sort who has had an extrememly well-rounded musical career as a bandleader, solo artist, songwriter, string arranger and A&R man, "this band, " Mclan told *Cash Box*, "was set up to get five people who enjoy playing togther."

Because McIan spent so much time working down under, many assume he Australian. "Contrary to popular belief, I'm not Australian," McIan says. The band consists of McIan on Keyboards and vocals, lead-vocalist Billy Trudel, former Men At Work drummer, Jerry Speiser, Stuart Mathis on guitar, and bassist, Wade Biery.

On their Chrysalis debut album, "Foundation," the City provide a bright, catchy kind of pop with plenty of textural guitar work and swirling keyboards, but most obvious are the soaring vocal harmonies which the listener might associate with Men At Work. "Men At Work," Mclan explains, "had never done harmonies before we started working together and it's a sound that I've always liked so it was incorporated. It's consistent with other records I've been involved with." Although McIan's production and writing touch is felt, the overall sound of the City is a collage of all the band members collective influences including, Sam Cooke, the Police, Phil Collins, Genesis and Big Country among others. "Every record is a cooperative enterprise," says McIan.

While Mclan's immediate impetus in forming the City was an "outlet for writing," creatively, Mclan wants to be a band member. "Wherever the idea comes from, the band wasn't set up as an exclusive vehicle for may writing." This is also evident in Mclan's decision to find someone other than himself to do the lead vocals. Although Mclan is a

lented vocalist, he says "For me, sing ing is more a function of writing. I neve thought my own instrument was a: good as if someone else were singing the song. Billy (Trudel) has a bette voice than I do. He brings to the song what I had envisioned happening with them. He has the range, the power to do what I hoped would be done and just can't." Trudel, possessor of a silk tenor, lists Sam Cooke and Steve Perry as influences. "Foundation" is Trudel vinyl debut and he says working with the City "has been a dream come true." Trudel was chosen from over 200 dema tapes McIan had listened to.

Although Mclan wrote all the lyrics fo this album, thematically accessible por traits of everyday concerns, the musiwas often co-written and Mclan expect that lyrics will be co-written in the future as well. "I really didn't want to make grand gestures. I wanted to write about things that were pretty clode to home," Mclan explains. ""Walkaway," for ir stance, came about because of all the jobs I've been in, the jobs we've all hac working in factories or lugging cop downstairs."

The album was recorded in a relativel. short period of time in Mclan's hom studio. "There was very little in the way of drum machines and sequencers, says Mclan. "We pretty much playe live. We all wanted it to be as live sound ing a record as possible." Mclan de scribed the atmosphere in the studio a very comfortable. "There seemed to b a real cohesive unit right from th strart, everybody seemed to listen t everybody else and that rare...unusual."

Besides new lead singer Joseph Williams (composer John Williams' son) whose silky tenor pervades new album, an impressive list of guests including, Miles Davis, Don Henley, Michael McDonald and David Sanborn all lend a hand to their new effort. "Instead of trying to do something that sounds like Don Henley or Michael McDonald," says Lukather, "why don't we just call the real guys to do it."

It's no secret that both Jeff Porcaro and Steve Lukather who have played separately for the likes of Steely Dan, Bozz Scaggs, Randy Newman, the Tubes and many others, have been two of the busiest, most sought after session players in the business, but it's interesting to learn that they weren't child prodigies who holed themselves up in their bedrooms practicing to be virtuosos.

Jeff recalls growing up under a semi-musical environment. "My dad plays (percussion), my mom plays but when I reflect on it, music was around as much as for anybody. It wasn't like there were a lot of musical instruments around the house. My dad had one drum set that would be at the house once in a while if he wan't working. It wasn't like chimes and percussion everywhere. I was just a fan of music. I didn't study drums per se. I took lessons for two years when I was nine and 10, but I couldn't stand reading music and practicing. The rest was just social, just digging music and saying, I can play somewhat, let's play with some other musicians.

It was doing Bar Mitzvahs and wedding receptions on weekends with Paich where he honed his drumming skills. "Doing casuals, you didn't play a lot of Top 40. You had to know country tunes, bossa novas—all the standards." He also would "isit in" with stage or big bands at Valley Junior college where he would play after "cutting class" at a neighboring high school. Considering himself a poor musical chart reader, when playing with that band after hearing the "figures" once, he would get them correct the next time. "A lot of my early sessions were just, what do you call, shukin' and jivin'." "I've made a career of it myself," Lukather joined in. Jeff lists Jimi Hendrix as a major influence.

Similarly, Lukather just learned to play by playing. "I started when I was seven. I didn't have any musical training at all. I taught myself. Older guys would teach me chords or a couple of licks." He finally took some lessons for two years in junior high, learning how to read music. "You can only go so far teaching yourself and at that point, I really wanted to do sessions." While Lukather is now well versed in many guitar styles, they came later. "I was totally into rock and roll. I hated jazz, black music and soul music when I was a kid. All I wanted to listen to was stuff that was cranked up and burnin', guitar stuff, because I was a guitar player. I was very naive, and I wish I had gotten into that stuff, but later in life I got

Their reckless, unshaven barroom style blows away the whole roots 'n' roll movement with a sound that smacks as much of The Del-Lords as it does Lynyrd

Skynyrd. Withvarious forms of '70's rock coming back into style, it was inevitable that the Satellites's brand of southern-boogie revisionism would happen and happen big. It was somewhat ironic, though, that they were so wellreceived at CBGB's, since CBGB's was the place where dinosaurs like Skynyrd were debunked more than a decade ago. But, then again, that was more than a decade ago. Since then, the new guard has gotten older and the old guard sounds fresh by comparison. Face it: roots modernists like The True Believers and Rank and File have never written or recorded a song as substantial as Skynyrd's "What's Your Name" or Marshall Tucker's "Twenty Four Hours At A Time." But The Satellites have-in no small part because they could give a damn about market fashion. "Battleship Chains," with its dramatic chord changes, sounds destined to become a standard, and "Keep Your Hands To Yourself," which is already getting plenty of AOR airplay, recalls Bob Dylan circa "On The Road Again." In concert, the band gets progressively tighter, looser and more drunken-sounding as they play convincing covers of "Maybelline" and "Route 66" alongside songs from their stunning Elektra debut album. The Georgia Satellites succeed because they have re-evaluated the southern-rock genre, informed it with the lessons of punk, and blown the whole thing sky high, as opposed to just eight miles high. (The Satellites will tour with Jason and The Scorchers later this fall.)

**CLUBLAND RELOCATES** – Clubs in the Times Square area are beginning to book rock acts, taking up a slack caused by the closure earlier this year of several downtown venues. The Southern Funk Cafe (330 W. 42d St.) offers live rock music on Saturday and Sunday nights and they intend to expand bookings to include weekdays. A "neighborhood bar" called Tin Pan Alley (220 W. 49th St.), while not booking rock bands at all, features performances by experimental or politically oriented musicians. In the past, **Mofungo** and **The Ordinaires** have played there. But more than any other Times Square club, Nirvana (One Times Square Plaza) is actively seeking to fill the gap in clubland. Alan Dranow and Frank D'Amico have organized a Wednesday night showcase series that spotlights unsigned or newly signed bands. "With all the clubs that have closed, there was no place for bands to play," says Dranow. "So we came up with the idea to give these bands a place to play.' And what a place: bands perform in front of a window that provides a 16th floor view of the heart of Times Square (take note video directors). "We really don't have a headlining slot," says Dranow. "We have a prime showcasing slot and we require that a major label or a major agency or management company request that they be seen." Recent showcases have featured CBS's Shy Talk and an unsigned band called The Backsliders. "While we are able to satisfy as many requests as possible, 1 don't think it's going to fill a vacuum," he says. "There are a lot more bands than there are clubs willing to give them a showcase."

**CONCERTS IN BRIEF – A-ha** came to Radio City October 11 for a show that caused more female screeches and shrieks than any concert since Adam Ant's recent one here. Lead singer Morten Harket could do no wrong as he crooned his way through upbeat versions of songs from their new "Scoundrel Days"(Warner Bros.) album and their "Hunting High and Low" debut. A-ha played a diversity of material that included an acoustic ballad and some raucous rock as well as their patented brand of Euro-pop. Unexpected highlight: "Looking For The Whales." Casablanca's A = 440 opened, creating much excitement with a mini-set of songs from their self-titled debut....Cinderella opened for David Lee Roth at MSG October 4 as part of a tour that is coinciding with the band's rapid commercial ascent. The reason for their popularity is clear: While other metal bands get pompous and operatic, Cinderella gets down to basics. Vocalist Tom Keifer has the gritty vocal style of a Steve Marriot or Brian Johnson and when they slam into songs like "Nobody's Fool" the band has a great brooding intensity. At Tavern On The Green October 10, PolyGram threw a luncheon celebrating the gold certification of the quartet's debut album, "Night Songs" (Mercury), which has become one of the big chart successes of '86 and bodes well for a platinum follow-up.

### INTERNATIONAL -UK BUZZ

The Average White Band, set to record a new album in New York in December, recruited unknown British singer John Wilson. Wilson, brother of British R&B singer Mari, was introduced to the band through their drummer Steve Ferrone, currently working on the next Duran Duran album. Wilson was recording his upcoming solo album at Maison Rouge Studios and he impressed Ferrone with his voice.

Though excited about the project, Wilson hopes he can run his budding solo career simultaneously. "Having those guys behind you is like someone giving you a big push from behind.

"We hope to tour some time in 1987," he says. Next week he releases a new solo single, a cover version of the classic Walker Brothers hit "The Sun Ain't Gonna Shine"...

The Icicle Works have an infectious new single called "Who Do You Want For Your Love?" Singer **Ian** McNabb bemoans Liverpool. "You can't go anywhere to relax. You can't escape the music business because everyone on the bus wants to talk about drum rises, mixes, and studio rates. The trouble with Liverpool bands is they all sound the same. They all emulate The Bunnymen, they never have anything new. For instance, we've never had an original idea in all of our lives. But we've got lots of enthusiasm." At this time of home truths, he also confessed, "I still have to sleep with the light on, and I'm terrified of cockroaches"...

One of the bands he praises on the Liverpool scene is **Black**, whose single "Wonderful Life" is creating a buzz in indie circles. Black is actually just one person, Colin Vearncomb, who dresses all in...black. The rest of his band is made of up people who play in other bands: Here's Johnny's bassist and Grown Up Strange's guitarist. Colin sings opera in his spare time and practices running marathons...

The latest London hip hop act to break through is Faze One. They are Stepski, Genio, and DJ Chinn, and they are Streetwave's answer to Run-DMC. Chinn and Stepski are cousins who lost contact for seven years and met again when Stepski and Genio attempted to raise the week's rent by entertaining tourists in Covent Garden. Dave Ogrin, who has worked with Real Roxanne, UTFO, Kurtis Blow, and Grandmaster Flash, has produced the debut single, "Laying Down a Beat/Stronger Than Strong." The layers of sound are compelling enough in themselves, but record company boss Morgan Khan sought to bring out an attention-grabbing alternative mix featuring lots of swear words. The band themselves thought this was a bit boring and, says Chinn, "We don't want little kids swearing. It's not good for them." They are about to be signed to a major label in the US, where they will complete a new tour in November...



Neil Tennant of the Pet Shop Boys says he'll stop fronting his own group soon and "instead we'll change the line-up every year or so-suddenly there will be four 16-year-old boys as the Pet Shop Boys and then the next thing you know they will be replaced by two 35-year-old Elaine Paige types. We'll be fed up with it all by then, so we'll just write the music. We'll be able to spend our time doing nice things like going to bed early. We won't have to have our photograph taken or be asked why we are called the Pet Shop Boys." **Chrissey Iley**

## N JAZZ

ASSICS—I wonder if the young fan knows how lucky he is? As rely as 10 years ago, there were a cking number of certified jazz classics of print. Seminal recordings by the s of **Miles Davis, Charlie Parker, Ionious Monk, Duke Ellington**, many, many other jazz titans were available through collector's outusually at a whopping premium.

1 1986, the mind boggles at what is lable. As far as the first three names itioned above, virtually everything e three gentlemen ever recorded rything—is readily available in a stocked record store. I mean, you have Miles Davis soup to nuts for a hundred bucks. And now that RCA ack on the stick—their new Novus Bluebird releases (including essen-Ellington, Mingus, Rollins, and eman Hawkins-the latter reing to print, finally, Hawk's groundking "Body and Soul")—it seems the jazz reissue surge is only just inning. If a young-or not-song—novice wants to explore jazz ory, it's all there for the exploring. Vhat brings this all to mind is the sue, by Fantasy Records, of "The erside History of Classic Jazz," a record boxed set of early-read: Swing Era—jazz styles. Originally ed some 30 years ago, "The River-History" is a splendid introduction he roots of every note of jazz-all way down to the most synthesized fusion-being played today. Proed by Bill Grauer and Orrin pnews — and including a useful inth essay by jazz historian Charles vard Smith -- "The Riverside His-" does quite handily what not even thickest jazz reference book can -it gives you the sounds and helps to make the musical connections rself. The set is broken down into sets: Backgrounds (African vocals, y spirituals, crude blues and brass d recordings, etc.), Ragtime (Scott lin, James Scott, et al), The es (Bessie Smith, Big Bill onzy, et al), New Orleans Style ng Oliver with Louis Armstrong, ly Roll Morton, etc.), Boogie Woo-(Jimmy Yancey, Meade Lux vis, etc.), South Side Chicago hnny Dodds, Lovie Austin, et al), cago Style (Bix Beiderbecke, ngy Manone, et al), Harlem (Duke ington, Fletcher Henderson, ), New York Style (Muggsy Span-Yank Lawson, etc.), and New Oris Revival (Bunk Johnson, Kid 1, et al). The set devotes about one to each artist, which makes it a wonful sampler of jazz's traditional es, but which makes it seem as if rybody represented is equal in imtance. That, as Smith's essay makes ir, is, of course, not the case. What is case is that the styles represented these five albums are all part of what kes up jazz-and, frankly, rock and and numerous other indigenous nerican musical forms-today. Close

listening here reveals palpable connections flowing throughout the sides how the music represented by the Backgrounds set is so much a part of everything that follows. There are many jazz boxed sets now available — and several more pending before Christmas — but most appeal, quite naturally, to those with specific tastes in jazz. "The Riverside History of Classic Jazz" is the one set that should interest everybody and is the perfect Christmas item for anybody with even a passing interest in American music.

Landmark Records-owned, by the way, by the same Orrin Keepnewshas just added a couple of items to this year's reissue roster: Volumes Four and Five in "The Cannonball Adderley Collection," which gathers some of the great altoist's LPs for various labels under one roof. Volume Four, "Cannonball Adderley and the Poll-Winners," is a '60 date featuring Wes Montgomery, Ray Brown, Victor Feldman, and Louis Hayes; Volume Five, "At The Lighthouse," is a '60 live session featuring Adderley's working Quintet-Nat Adderley, Sam Jones, Feldman, and Haves.

Also just out are three new Atlantic double-album compilations that are not really jazz records, but are certainly-at least two of them—related to jazz. "**Joe** Turner: Rhythm and Blues Years" and Esther Phillips' "Set Me Free" are sets of R&B recordings by a pair of vocalists who always kept a toe dipped in jazz waters; in fact, the Turner set completely blurs the line between the small band jazz of the early-'50s and early rock and roll (which is why Turner was just elected to the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame as a regular inductee, rather than, like Louis Jordan, as a "pioneer"). The other Atlantic set, "Aretha Franklin: 30 Greatest Hits," needs no endorsement here-it ain't jazz, but, mmmmmmmm, is it good.

The Total Music Meeting, generally a festival of the avant-garde, is this year called Trombone Music, and if you like your 'bones you'll want to leg it to Berlin — many slide bearers'll be there.

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## PROFILES



MARK SHANDS 95INZ-WINZ RADIO

Toke a radio station whose carporate structure has made o mojor financial commitment towords a totol stotion rennovation and whot do you come up with? WINZ in Miomi Florida. And who's right there ready to jump an the band wagon? Who else but--Mork Shonds, assistont progrom ond music directar at WINZ.

Mork's been reody since his lucky break at the beginning of his broadcosting coreer. He wos "picked up off the streets by nane other than Bill Tonner in Starkville Mississsippi." Mark credits Tonner for launching his radio coreer; "He was o gaad teacher" ond Mork's broadcasting profession has taken off from there.

He storted in radio right out of high school ond fine-tuned his rodio skills during that ever nastalgic Woodstock ero when radia careers were built on the bosis of the love for rock n' roll.

FLASH BOX

His timing was right to begin with. He started in radia at a time af social and palitical innavatian and individualism. There was alat af raam and support far experimentatian. It was olso an era afwhat ane might say--af 'mossive papulatian grawth.' Therefare, participating in the baby-baam era he cauldn't have helped but develop a unique perspective abaut this vibrant generatian.

Mark's seen this generatian grow up, raise families and became more 'mellaw.' They are the 25 to 50 niche' in our society todoy. 'Each drives to work every day and paints their house an the weekend'' besides being actively involved in social and community events. They are the target oudience of WINZ. A special portion of our country that Mark feels, ''ore more musically interested and in-tune todoy.'' He would even go as far as saying that they're the niche' WINZ thinks will tip the competitive scole.

In the least, one con soy they ore of incredible interest and fascination to this Miami based stotian. Enough so that the corporate structure ond radio stoff ore putting their money where their mouth is in backing o campaign to torget this market. Mastly becouse of their radia philasophy of responding to the oudience's lead.

The mojar changes in the market Mork's seen since the 60's ond 70's has been audience awareness and the development of a discerning perception of the medio taday. "People are owore of hipe now," they're cautious of 'get em ond grob em pramotions' or superficial pragramming techniques. Mork and WINZ don't believe in the 'shave it down their throat' hard sell. WINZ, with camplete support from Gonnett, is embarking on a non-stereotypical rodio crusade. Last December, Gannett brought forth a prapasol to implement a plan that wauld take WINZ beyond their already strang stand in the ethnic/urban market af Miami. They naw want the "whale Sha-Bang." They're spreading their wings beyond south Flarida fram Dade caunty to the Flarida Keyes.

The statian is re-lacating, changing farmat and expanding their statian pramotians. They've recently completed o rodio/televisian advertising campaign and have maved the station fram downtown Miomi to the Dade County line.

They're looking at the whole market instead of facusing solely on the Miami areo. What does this mean for the stotion in generol? Alot more freedom ta experiment with their rodio product.

Is this toa risky? No, not in the leost. WINZ is willing to take risks ond expand their product developing their proposal in a very intelligent ond creative woy. They're nat locked into the canservative business mode. The basics af rodio programming (experimintotion ond eliminotion) is whot this team is courogeously attempting to do.

Far a start, they've developed some of the most extensive morket research af ony station in the area. Processing 30-40 colls a week in local retail record stores, they "see the stuff they're playing--selling." They also trade soles information freely with their sources which gives them the extro edge in music programming.

The industry needs on odditional technological change that will be a long time coming occording to Mark. It's a change that would roise technological sophisiticatian in rotings research in order to relieve some of the pressure on programmers to increase their rotings through extensive research. This would free them up ta do more creotive work with their radia product. "The radio business can't be sa pre-occupied with the ratings ta the paint where their product suffers." The radia industry "hos lost a little bit of it's zing since we've all grown up and became business peaple. We're not apt ta take chances because of the pressure ta produce ratings." This corparate paronoio has alsa rabbed the radia industry af the creative chance taking pracess involved in radio programmingresulting in a less entertoining medium."

The secret to successful progromming is; to delegate outhority well and "not second guess your radio stoff." This inspires on individuol responsibility omong ony programming stoff. Allowing for this exciting self expression mokes a rodio station tick. If o radio teom feels this equal trust among their corporote structure or peers, the otmosphere can't help but be inspirational.

Haw many radia stations con you nome that have the corporate support that would allow them, or even encouroge them, to completely expand their radio product? Back up new ideas in radio progromming to the extent of loying big bucks on the table to process o complete station overhoul? Can't get past the pointer finger? Neither can I which mokes WINZ on exiciting and challenging new radio project to wotch for.



# COUNTRY PROFILES



NICKUS—Music Director AIX-Turlock, CA

JRLOCK, CA—''People sometimes y thot living in Modesto or Turlock like living in the sticks, but since meone invented television, we've een living in New York...''

Not only hove such ot-home deces os TV hod o mojor "broodeng" effect on his listeners, but, soys 4 Nickus from his vontoge point os susic director for KMIX in Turlock, b hos the proximity of such o mojor osmopoliton center os Son Froncisb. A lot of his listeners, during the reek, ore doing just whot you might xpect rurol Americons to be doig-fishing, taking core of the pickp truck or chewing on o strow or wo. "But on the weekend they're ever in Son Froncisco getting ophisticoted."

With thot in mind, Nickus operness from whot he refers to os o "lifestyle formot"— one thot springs tirectly from the highly-diversified astes of his oudience os well os from he direction given him by monogenent: goin listeners, core torget 25-49. His listener-goining formot ncorporotes o brood spectrum of styles ond sounds, oll under an umorello of being "country." From his perspective, "o lot of things fit into o formot os it's evolving."

His first gig wos up in Yakimo, WA with o ploylist comprised of Andy Willioms, Potti Poge, etc. Unfortunotely, Uncle drofted him ond he wound up in the Novy on o helicopter corrier. Citing the foct thot the ship hod 1400 men ond thot they hod broodcost potential on board, he monoged to smooth-talk the coptain into building a low-cost record library (LPs in the Orient were going for about a quarter opiece) and having music broodcost throughout the ship doily, until lights out. A born rodio mon, it would appear.

Ed hos continued in rodio for ten yeors, with his first country job being ot KAER in Socromento. Eventually he was hired as music director ot KFIV (later colled KZUN), changing it to a country format, and in June '85 went to KMIX as music director and mid-day mon.

He hos developed o "very personoble" relotionship with the stotion's listening oudience. "I'm o regulor guy. I tolk obout regulor things, things that people do every doy. I try to relote os their nextdoor neighbor."



CHRIS TAYLOR—Program and Music Director KIXZ—Amarillo

AMARILLO,TX—There ore songs obout being the seventh son of a seventh son, but how obout being the odopted son of on odopted son? Better yet, how obout being o rodio mon who's the odopted son of o rodio mon who's the odopted son of o rodio mon? (You could olmost soy thot rodio is in the bloodline, except...)

Anywoy, for Chris Toylor it wos originally outo mechanicsville. That wos where he hod stoked his cloim. He studied it, he worked ot it ond generolly intended to stoy with it, until he developed whot wos diognosed sometimes os on orthritic condition ond mechonicking become too difficult to handle. So he went bock to college (os o business mojor) ond, becouse of dod's ond gronddod's bockgrounds, decided to check out the college station. Except for a short time when he quit school ond went to work selling outomotive ports, he's been port of the rodio community ever since. As o coreer, it storted on o port-time bosis up ot KYSM-Moncoto, MN (o job followed by the oforementioned foroy into outomotive ports), and later over to KOLM in Rochester for summer

work. Then it bock to Moncoto where he eorned his full-time wings. The string continued over to WMAD in Modison, WI, through KNNN in Omoho for six or seven yeors ond then on to KSO for o short period. He ultimotely londed in Amorillo 3 yeors ogo.

Eorly fomily influences once ogoin hod some significance for him, in that what little knowledge he *claimed* to have about music was generally *more* than what the other oir personalities had. The result was that he's been official or unofficial music director almost ever since he storted.

Over that period, he learned that odult oudiences don't want to hear the some things over and over. Thus he fovors a long playlist approach to country broadcosting. With last week's CMA owards still echoing in the oir, he offers that "it's time that Noshvile wokes up to the fact that people want *traditional* country music."



# VIDEO NEWS AUDIO/VIDEO

CORPORATE SHUFFLE-RCA/ Columbia Pictures Home Video is giving the boot to its MusicVision music video staff, effective at the end of this year. Seems music video hasn't lived up to company expectations, and while MusicVision will remain a leading music video label, its staff will be jettisoned (possibly to be absorbed into the RCA/Columbia staff). The cuts reportedly include senior product manager Bob Mercer, product manager Robert Knight, national sales manager Jim Crowley, regional sales manager Lynn Temenski and a secretary. MusicVision tasks will be handled by general RCA/Columbia staffers after the phase-out. Does the shuffle spell bad times in the music video biz? Not necessarily. A shift in focus - away from music - is more like it. Also, the company says it's expanding in other areas. Still, publicly held video industry stock has had a pale complexion for some time. languishing at low levels. Reports say a bad rep for video is afoot, due partly to recent CBS/Fox Video lavoffs, the demise of Video Associates and Prism Entertainment's recent jilting by propective buyer Fries Entertainment. More than this, some insiders say the industry is currently experiencing that long-awaited, and virtually inevitable "levelling off" period discussed by many a video seminar panel in recent years, the likes of which only a boom industry can undergo.

STEREO STATS---Stereo TV continues its gains in the television marketplace, and according to the most recent statistics from the Electronics Industry Association (EIA), not only have the major broadcast networks made major commitments to the stereo signal, at least one network, NBC (the leader in stereo broadcasts), savs it will begin broadcasting commercials in stereo beginning this month. By year's end, the EIA expects some 500 affiliate stations to be broadcasting in stereo, as compared to the 300 now doing so (stereo signals already reach over 80 percent of the homes in this country). Stereo TVs will make up approximately 20 percent of the 17.3 million color TVs expected to be sold in the U.S. by the end of 1986-100 percent over last year-a figure that should jump to around 30 percent by the end of next year. The EIA also says that as consumers become more aware of the availability of stereo TV, radio simulcasts will soon be history. Incidentally, prices on stereo sets begin at around \$450, but the EIA says prices are already coming down, and stereo decoders for regular TVs can be had for about \$120.



HOME VIDEO REVIEW: Head-**RCA/Columbia Pictures Home** Video-\$69.95 Those yearning for a hike back to the psychedelia of the late 60's need look no further. This featurelength music movie from the Monkees was written and produced by Jack Nicholson and Robert Rafelson (who also collaborated on Five Easy Pieces), directed by Rafelson, and features an intriguing array of cameo appearances everyone from Annette Funicello to Frank Zappa-in a bizarre, seemingly drug-induced cinematic romp. Head is vintage 1968 longform music video, now considered a pioneering effort in the genre. There is no plot to speak of, nor is there much of a story. The movie is an adventure of the mind, utilizing the sets and sound stages of a staggering late '60s Hollywood film industry for backdrops to sheer flights of directorial fancy, spotlighting America's greatest TV band in fashionably quirky sequences set to highly derivative psychedelic rock (some of which was cowritten by Carole King). A "trippy" environment is affected throughout, in what appears to be the pre-fab band's last ditch effort at actual artistic acceptance once their TV series had floundered. In retrospect, however, especially since the Monkees' emergence as an MTV generation novelty, the tape is a fascinating example of mainstream '60s "drug culture" filmmaking.

Of Merit's "Tic Tac Trivia", here's another quote, "My only regret is that I didn't order ten times more of this piece!" Cinematronic's "World Series" is unquestionably the best baseball game ever made up, up to now . . . and I hear that this factory will show some new additions to their system at AMOA."

## AMOA Urges Ops To Support Jukebox Compulsory License

CHICAGO – With the adjournment of the 99th Congress, AMOA has issued a special bulletin to operator members urging them to contact their congressional delegations in behalf of the jukebox compulsory license. Senators and Representatives have returned to their repsective states and districts to campaign for re-relection which provides an ideal opportunity for one on one dialogue.

As stated in the bulletin, "Just before Congress adjourned, legislation was introduced to eliminate the compulsory license for jukeboxes in order to make U.S. copyright law compatible with the Berne Convention for the Protection of Literary and Artistic Works, a century-old international agreement that governs the treatment of copyrighted material in countries other than the country of origin. The Berne Convention has 78 members, and the Senate will begin consideration in 1987 of the question of whether the U.S. law must be made 'compatible' with Berne, thus the move for its elimination. Although the bill in question (S.2904, introduced by retiring Senator Mathias, R-MD) received no consideration in 1986, the issue is sure to resurface in 1987, and AMOA must begin preparation now in order to protect the industry's future."

The bulletin went on to explain what the elimination of the compulsory license will mean for operators. Following are the three principal points stressed by AMOA.

# Pinball Expo On A Roll For Second Straight Year

As an art form pinball has always had its fair share of supporters. But it wasn't until 1985 that they had ever been formally brought together under one roof for the express purpose of exchanging ideas and, generally, celebrating this coin-op stalwart.

The brainchild of Robert Berk, Pinball Expo '86 is back and looking to be even better than its inaugural staging. Scheduled for November 21st to the 23rd, at the O'Hare/Kennedy Holiday Inn in Rosemont, Illinois (just outside Chicago and near the airport), the show is really something out of the ordinary.

The Expo is feature-packed with a variety of exhibits that, for some, is sure to bring back memories. There will be over 100 machines in the exhibit hall, with everything from countertop pinballs from the '30s to the latest models now making news on location. In addition, there will be many items for sale, similar to an old-fashioned flea market—including backglasses, playfields, replacement parts, t-shirts, books, brochures and more.

But the Expo isn't just an extravaganza of memorabilia. It is, instead, an opportunity to talk with hard-core afficianados of pinball who have keen insights into what makes a given layout or game design better than another. For individuals in the industry, this pinball showcase can be an intensive learning experience that can only prove to be beneficial.

And Berk has gone to great lengths to ensure that the Expo generates as much excitement as it did last year. There is a full slate of seminars covering an impressive array of topics. Highlights include Steve Young talking about "Pinball Restoration" 1. The purpose of the license was to avoid a situation where operators would be required to negotiate royalty agreements individually with artists or their representatives. Without the license, such negotiations might be required, clearly an impossible task when one considers the number of jukeboxes in operation and the number of copyrighted musical works in question.

2. Without the protection of the compulsory license, operators would be wide open to legal actions for copyright infringement. Fines and penalties for copyright infringement can be severe, and number in the thousands of dollars.

3. Without the compulsory license, the performing rights societies will have far more opportunity to collect more money from jukebox operators.

According to AMOA, "the retention of the compulsory license is critical to the survival of the industry, which has already experienced substantial decline. In 1978, 144,000 licensed jukeboxes were in operation. In 1985, only 100,000 machines were licensed, a decrease of almost one-third."

Operators are urged to phone or write their Senators or Representatives with the following, simple message "The compulsory license for jukeboxes must be retained" and to be sure and submit copies of all correspondence to AMOA Government Relations Office, 1101 Connecticut Ave., N.W., Suite 700, Washington, D.C. 20036.

And for those who are game enough, Flip Out '86 is destined to be an event of bragging rights for the next year, when the Expo stages a Pinball Tournament competition on site with the top prize being a new pinball machines. All this and more with the weekend capped off by the Pinball Expo '86 banquet Saturday night.

Without any affiliation to any organization, the Pinball Expo has come a long way from its inception and this year should firmly establish the showcase as an annual industry affair well worth supporting and being a part of.

# COIN MACHINE

## Mike Mazzaroli: A Man And His Parts!

CHICAGO—Parts men are a breed unto themselves. Even Darwin never catalogued them. Mike Mazzaroli, Atlas Distributing of Chicago's able parts manager, has logged ten years in the business, and we need to trek back in time to distant Milwaukee to find his roots.

**Cash Box:** How did you get into this business?

**Mike:** I graduated the University of Wisonsin at Milwaukee and went to work in Penney's warehouse. I was a liason between the warehouse and the buyers in New York. I quit and became manager of health and beauty aids at Treasure Island. When I got tired of the 90-hour work week, I registered with a headhunter. In 1976 I took a job with S.L. London. I guess it was my vast experience in health and beauty aids that won Perry London over!

**Cash Box:** How long did you stay there?

**Mike:** I left London in 1985. At that time I had a giant opportunity to work with Jerry Marcus and Eddie Pellegrini at Atlas. There were no hard feelings at London, but the opportunity was so much better at Atlas.

**Cash Box:** When you first started in 1976, what made you think you could run a parts department?

**Mike:** I had to learn from the ground up. I thought it was a simple re-order type job, similar to a hardware store. I didn't realize you had to take into account new products.

**Cash Box:** After ten years experience, how do you run a successful parts department?

**Mike:** Most importantly, you have to have good people. John O'Neill, our main counter man at Atlas, for example. You have to stay with the customer until you figure out what he needs. Sometimes he can't explain it. However, when you do take time on the 50¢ widget, he'll remember you when he wants to buy a bolt of pool cloth. You must try and make it easy for customers to do business with you. Sometimes it's like a game of charades trying to guess what part a guy needs.

**Cash Box:** Given the unlimited number of parts you deal with, how do you know what to stock?

**Mike:** You learn from past history, actually. What you do is check with the factory on what they think will break. You get parts people who are familiar with the games so they'll know what may break, like our man Moose Shaeffler, for example. He's got mechanical aptitude. You need to anticipate your customer's needs and buy inventory before he asks for it.

**Cash Box:**Do you use any promotional aids or advertisements?

**Mike:** We send out six flyers a year. We use a digital, revolving display sign at the counter and we have point-of-purchase specials.

Cash Box: Is this effective?

**Mike:** I don't actually know. My position is to inform people. It's something that must

be done . . . it's the cost of doing business, but I don't consider whether it's effective or not. Unfortunately, many people don't even read flyers, but they really lose out when they don't.

**Cash Box:** What is the importance of a parts department's location?

**Mike:** It's important to run a parts department in a busy area, an area where there are a lot of service men going back and forth on calls. You need floor traffic . . . impulse buying. The flow of \$20 orders keeps a parts department going. It's easier for me to drive 30 miles into town from the suburbs than for 20 operators to drive out for me.

**Cash Box:** What is your most common complaint?

**Mike:** Horrible pricing on spare parts. Also, delays in getting parts.

**Cash Box:** How do you handle these complaints?

**Mike:** I tell the customer the truth on the part department cost and ask him if he thinks my margin is fair. Generally, the customer is stunned that the mark-ups are so low. I also try to reason with the customer on delays and high pricing. I tell them ahead of time on both, right when they order so they are not shcoked by the price or the delay when the part comes in.

**Cash Box:** What is the upside of the business?

**Mike:** Frankly, the opportunity to make money. It's also interesting working with a changing industry . . . it's never boring . . . and 90% of the people I work with, I like. Busines is good, and I'm pleased with my association with Ed and Jerry at Atlas.

Cash Box: What is the downside?

**Mike:** Of course, the worst part is the drive in from the suburbs . . . but I don't like the hassle over delinquent bills either.

**Cash Box:** What changes would you like to see in the business?

**Mike:** I'd like to improve our ability to communicate with operators. This is very important. Getting information to them should be made easier and we must tell them up front what games are coming, and which ones are good. Improving the distributor's credibility so that his views have more validity in the marketplace is another important factor.

Cash Box: Any parting words?

**Mike:** Just to thank the customers for their support ... especially my friends in Wisconsin for coming with me to Atlas during the transition period; and local customers for trusting me as the new kid on the block.

1. Want to preserve the life of your pinball and increase its trade-in or resale value/ Put mylar on the playfield. Most games come with it, but if they don't, just buy a sheet and cut to fit. It's a worthwhile investment.

2. Owners of Sega Hang-On and Enduro Racer, who are tired of paynmg \$18 plus to replace the constantly breaking spring assemblies in the handle should take heed of the follwoing advice. One serviceman suggests that you go to any hardware store and pick up a standard clutch spring which goes for less than a dollar. Normally you need to replace only the spring and not the entire assembly.

3. Here's some advice on conversions from a prestigious east coast operator. Cover the overlay on the control panel with a sheet of clear plastic. It's simple to screw in and it saves the panel from grafitt wholesale destruction.

4. Also on conversions. Space game shoot 'em ups like Alcon, Halley's C and Tokio get more play and better ( tions when you use cabinets like Tron, Mach III and Astron Belt with the f pilot style joysticks.
