

The first 13 releases are Miles Davis' "Kind of Blue" (with an unusual new cover that features a later photo of Miles Davis on the front than the original issue, corrects the nearly 30-year-old sequencing error for the second side, and leaves an incorrect spelling of Cannonball Adderley's last name), "Bitches Brew," "In A Silent Way," and "Sketches of Spain," all in more-or-less original covers, with original liner notes; Billie Holiday's "Lady In Satin," with a new stereo version of one track; Benny Goodman's landmark "Live at Carnegie Hall" and a new compilation of Goodman small bands from the '50s, "Sextet;" "First Time," the only meeting of the Duke Ellington and Count Basie Orchestras; Dave Brubeck's 'Time Out,'' as originally issued, and "Plays Music from West Side Story and Other Shows and Films," a new compilation; Louis Armstrong's "Plays W.C. Handy" and "Satch Plays Fats," each made up of two-thirds alternate takes replacing the originally-issued takes (something CBS' Bob Altshuler, who did a&r work on the project, said is due to the fact that the original tapes of the original takes were "in the kind of condition that made it impossible for us to make these digital transfers, they were in terrible shape"); and a sampler containing a track from each album, save "Bitches Brew" and "In A Silent Way." RIAA Reports Few Gold & latinum Awards; Counterfeit Record Seizures In '86

YORK-The RIAA certified only a ul of gold and platinum albums in Janwith the Bruce Springsteen boxed-set ot making its first appearance.

"Killers," Iron Maiden; "First Of"Corey Hart; "Guitars, Cadillacs,

Etc., Etc.," Dwight Yoakam; "Under the Blue Moon," New Edition; "Long Time Coming," Ready for the World; "Life's Rich Pageant," R.E.M.; and "Whoever's In New England," Reba McIntyre. Motley Crue Uncensored received the only gold music video certification.

In its year-end report, the RIAA announced that 1986 proved a bounty for the seizure of pirate and counterfeit cassettes, with 465,000 of them nabbed during the course of the year. This represents a 21% increase over 1985. In all, 682 anti-piracy cases were opened in 1986, giving rise to investigations in 43 states, the District of Columbia, and Puerto Rico. In 1986, 32 law enforcement agencies, working in conjunction with prosecutors' offices at federal, state and local levels, contributed to 69 arrests, 38 convictions, and 94 piracy-related seizures throughout the country, 12 involving illegal manufacturing operations.



However, the battle emboldened Hollywood Palladium had, as of presstime, no plans to cancel the band's Saturday (2/7) show.

NEW FACES TO WATCH!

NEW YORK — Anyone looking for the next big debut need look no farther than The Big Dish. This Scottish quintet has all the elements of an '80's superact, and all the imagination it takes to capture a wide international audience. They also have what many other bands don't: a debut album, "Swimmer" (Warner Bros.), with enough hooky songs to keep radio and retail busy for quite some time.

Steve Lindsay writes with a painterly eye for detail, and a keen sense of the tragedy underlying everday experience. Like many rockers, Lindsay and guitarist Brian McPhie attended art school before forming the band; Lindsay even briefly tried to sell his paintings but didn't exactly do a booming business. "I think I did sell a painting to my uncle," he quips. "But even if I had started selling a lot of paintings I still would have given a chance to playing with a band for a living."

What is it about art school that brings out the rocker in so many people? "It's something that's always intrigued me," says Lindsay. "Guys like John Lennon, David Byrne, Keith Richards were art school. A lot of people in art school tend to be quite musical."

McPhie has a different theory. "It's a breeding ground for egomaniacs," he jokes. "People are surrounded by other people of the same mentality who are trying to express themselves. It's a good environment to get your feelings out."

The Big Dish use visual images to fine effect in many of the songs. "Prospect Street," for example, is Lindsay's musical version of the painting by Edward Hopper. Other songs like "Jealous" and "The Loneliest Man In The World" provide fresh and often poignant takes on a wide range of emotional themes.

"Personally, I hate to be lonely," says Lindsay, talking about "The Loneliest Man In The World," his favorite track. "If I hadn't somebody to talk to I think I'd crack up. And I think that a lot of the problems that people have are because of not having somebody to talk to, not having anybody to explain what you're going through. I hate seeing lonely people; it really cracks me up."

But many of the other songs have a more innocent quality, like the title track which is about swimming, one of Lindsay's hobbies. "We had a swim this morning," he says, looking out the window at the worst Manhattan blizzard in years. "There's a swimming pool on the roof of the penthouse so we all had a swim."

"Swimming" and "Slide," the first single, have particularly inspired and unusual choruses that virtually leap out of the speakers. "It was kind of spontaneous," he says, "and sometimes that's the best thing you do. Sometimes the first thing that comes out of your head is usually the most immediate for other people as well."

"I usually get the general feel and the hook first," he says. "You have to try to keep the spark that comes along with having a new tune. I usually write in batches of three or four songs at a time." It be hard to think of tunes more mele or meaningful than "Waterloo Sun"Shangri-La," "Two Sisters," "Get n Line," and "Oklahoma U.S.A." States for more than four years (due to a union dispute), a black-hole in their career that they've only recently fully recovered from. But the Kinks finally returned to the U.S. in 1969, to support their "Arthur...Or The Decline Of The British Empire" album. They followed that with their last album for Reprise, 1970's "Lola Vs. Powerman And The Moneygoround — Part One," which yielded their first hit single in years with "Lola."

They signed to RCA in 1971 and their debut album for that label is perhaps their best, a desert-island masterwork called "Muswell Hillbillies." That LP captured the full bloom of Davies obsessions with lost innocence, lost paradise, human frailty, and the essential comedy at the center of all tragedy (and vice versa).

The rest of the Kinks's LPs for RCA were theatrical albums that were unjustly overlooked both critically and commercially. Those albums may one day be seen as visionary forerunners of the video age, since the accompanying tours were as much visual spectacle as music. Though "Preservation Act I," "Preservation Act II," the droll white-collar blues of "Soap Opera," and "Schoolboys In Disgrace" may not have been fully realized by the band during the non-video seventies when they were released, such tracks as "Sweet Lady Genevieve," "Cricket," "Nine To Five," "Face In The Crowd," "Schooldays," and "Hardway" stand with the best of the Kinks catalogue.

In 1977, the modern-day Kinks were born, as the band signed with Arista and made a conscious attempt at a more commercial sound. The result was the modest "Sleepwalker," followed by "Misfits" (Davies answer to the punk movement), and the mega-hit "Low Budget" which turned them into arena superstars. Interestingly, while the punks were busy overthrowing the old guard, they often championed The Kinks. In fact, seminal new wavers Nick Lowe and Chryssie Hynde even revived Davies's "Stop Your Sobbing" for The Pretenders first album, and Davies was instrumental in (continued on page 28)

EAST COASTINGS

SCRUFFY THE CAT is about to happen. That's been no secret to anyone who's heard the band's excellent debut EP, "High Octane Revival" (Relativity), though not even that album prepares you for the ferocity of their live show. At CBGB's (1/31) they brought The Stones, The Faces, The Yardbirds, The Ventures, The Band, ZZ Top and about half a dozen other influences together on stage for what sounded like a one-man battle of the bands. The strategy is basic: put down a sonic boom, lav some cheesy farfisa over the melodies, and turn the amps to 11. The result is magic: fans dance, blather with hosannas, and otherwise get beside themselves. And this Boston quintet can do it with their eyes closed, what with the tatooed drummer hitting the snare while chugging a Bud, and the guitarist ripping out leads haywire as tumbleweed in a sandstorm. Relativity will release a full-length Scruffy album on April 15, and is currently readying discs by Wiseblood, Dirtdish, Coil, and The Offbeats.

JEM's Passport label is set to release the long-awaited album by NY band Crossfire Choir, and it's a bashing 14-song collection that's shouty, cathartic, and danceable. And from PVC is an EP by The Angry Samoans titled "Yesterday Started Tomorrow" and the top tracks are "Electrocution" and a butchering of "Somebody To Love" that sounds like someone's long overdue comeuppance.....Jeff Lorber, who recently played the Ritz, used to be known more for his jazz fusion than the r&b he's currently doing. Lorber's ninth album, "Private Passion" (Warner Bros.), is his fourth consecutive foray into light funk and it's currently halfway up the CB B/C chart and steadily crossing into pop territory. Part of the LP's strength is in vocalists Karyn White and Michael Jeffries, who help turn it into what Lorber calls his "most commercial" LP to date....This year's 'Cinderella' story may well belong to Geffen group Tesla. The band's debut album, "Mechanical Resonance," seems likely to follow the same pattern as "Night Songs," and the fact that they're currently opening for David Lee Roth probably won't hurt matters any. Said one band member of the Roth gig: "I feel like one of the luckiest guys in the world right now"....Birdland, a late seventies rock band founded by the Rattlers' Mickey Leigh and the late Lester Bangs, has finally been captured on record. Leigh partly financed the EP's pressing by selling ads on the back cover (shades of Sigue Sigue Sputnik), and the five song collection of Bangs/Leigh tunes was recorded on the sly at Electric Ladyland in 1979. "A friend of ours kind of snuck us into Electric Ladyland when they were rebuilding one of the studios," says Leigh, "and we just let the tape roll." Highlights include "Accidents Of God" and "I'm In Love With My Walls," which The Rattlers sometimes cover in concert....Yoko Ono will collaborate with choreographer Jennifer Muller and others in a music and dance performance being staged at Manhattan's Joyce Theatre in early April.... A UN subcommittee has removed Paul Simon from its list of artists who have broken the S.A. boycott....Tommy (Ramone) Erdelyi has produced a demo tape by a driving and splashy band called **Hard** Facts. Top track: "Save Me." (ph.: 212-362-3496)....Beatles-catalogue owner Michael Jackson has given the Fat Boys approval to release their version of "Baby, You're A Rich Man" for the soundtrack of the Warner Bros. film Disorderlies. Now let's convince Jackson to let the Beastie Boys come out with their cover of "I'm Down."

The Village Voice's Robert Christgau may be the only critic that matters, but is he the only DJ that matters too? Christgau played obscurities by Aztec Camera, the Y-Pants, and James Brown, as well as superb wondertracks like Husker Du's "Crystal," They Might Be Giants's impossibly fragile "Hideaway Folk Family," and The Minutemen's "The Price Of Paradise." Now that's radio.

Aside from the musical brilliance, their clever lyrics perfectly match the mood. On Wagner and Aron's "A T.V. Guide in the Olduvai Gorge," the ultimate existential comedy, Wagner sings, "Now she beckons with a pitchfork/And a crackling cathode face/But even when I'm next to her/I feel a little out of place/Like a T.V.Guide in the Olduvai Gorge." On Davis' darkly comic tale of probate, "Who got the pearls?" he sings, "Grandma died at fifty eight/Her soul rose up through the real estate/She had smile like a little girl's/And by the way, Who got the pearls?"

On their homespun EP "New Campfire Songs," produced by critical darling Pete Case, all the charm and intensity present in their show is retained.

For now, this L.A.-based foursome is probably one of the best kept secrets around, but a recent signing with a new I.R.S. subsidiary label, P.M.R.C., which stands for Primitive Man Recording Company (yuk, yuk), should rectify the situation. THE RITZ, NY — When I first heard Bruce Hornsby, I wrongly figured him for an '80's Gerry Rafferty — pleasant, innocuously tuneful, essentially harmless. But in this deli next to where I live, I heard "The Way It Is" almost every night on the radio as I went to buy food, and that piano riff followed me out of the store and back to my apartment. After several more listens, and seeing him at the Ritz (2/2), I discovered that he was actually more like an updated Jackson Browne, albeit for a digital, less promiscuous generation.

In fact, if twenty years from now someone were to ask what pop music was like in the '80's, I would probably show him a video of this show since it would be hard to imagine it happening at any other time in history. When Hornsby played ocatve variations on the "The Way It Is" piano figure, one could virtually hear the shape of this decade, and one could see that *Miami Vice*, the New Age boom, and the aging of the *Big Chill* generation had to happen before Hornsby could sum it all up.

His fans looked like a demographic caricature; full of late-thirtyish, high-end middle managers for the Fortune 500 who gather around the CD player on Friday evenings and clink glasses to "The Western Skyline" while talking co-ops and futures. It would not be surprising if three-fifths of the crowd owned CD players since Hornsby is currently number one on the CD charts. So why did this basically non-club crowd make it out in droves to the Ritz on a Monday night? To see one of their own, a thoroughly representative thirty-two year member of the babyboom generation - that large, aging population bubble which is still the dominant force in America.

The medium in this case matches the message, and that medium is the CD, which gives us a squeaky clean, unambiguous sound - a "framer's intent" sound, so to speak - and Hornsby's music fits right in with that medium. Hornsby reflects a time in which the sexual revolution has been defeated by AIDS and middle-age. The unlustiness of his songs speaks to an era in which we want our lovers to be True Blue and tell us True Stories and True Confessions because people are convinced that someone lying about their romantic past in 1987 could be hazardous to one's health. And the "The Way It Is," "The Wild Frontier" - spark memories in fans old enough to remember Cronkite's famous sign-off or JFK's inauguration address.

In the year-end issue of Cash Box, I wrote that there seemed to be a non-rock impulse manifesting itself in pop music. "The Way It Is" is a perfect example of that, largely because it is structured not around a chorus, but rather around a simple tag line that is an extension of its verses. That structure is a sort of metaphor for what life is like after age thirty when experience takes place more on an even plateau, not on peaks, and there is less of a seeking-out of quick excitement and epiphanic moments. It is significant then that in trying to get a record deal Hornsby approached Windham Hill with his album, since his music does indeed have more in common with lite-jazz and folk than rock.

But there is also a distanced kookiness to the guy which the crowd seemed to enjoy. He played an accordian solo before doing "The Wild Frontier" (accompanied by a rap about his love for that instrument), and this eccentricity came off like a staged remnant of 'the way we were,' a token reminder of the days when Big Chillers went to Vermont to make pottery, or tried to get rich playing the kazoo.

His sound is big and crowd-pleasing and more appropriate to arenas than to a club. One got the feeling that this was the last time one would see Hornsby in a small venue, that this guy is destined for three-nightsat-the-Garden success. His next album should do that for him, and he played one of the songs from it, a pretty piano-ballad that had couples slow-dancing and holding hands.

Whether this decade produces a culminating event like Woodstock (Live-Aid was actually the culminating event of the sixties) is anybody's guess, but chances are if it does it will probably happen with a whimper, not a bang, and it will sound something like Bruce Hornsby and The Range.

Dave Edmunds

THE RITZ, NY — Dave Edmunds has played three Manhattan shows in the last six months and his recent Ritz gig (1/31) was easily his best. It was even better than his live album, "I Hear You Rockin" (Columbia), which only hints at the sturdy, surefooted power he has in concert. From the start, he hit the right pace and pitch and never let up as he played a set that, as always, included a disproportionate amount of Edmunds oldies.

The strongest songs of the set came from his eight-year-old "Repeat When Necessary" L.P. That record applied pop compactness to roots rock, taking traditional forms and molding them in the image of late seventies new wave, which made him more of a pop artist than a roots revivalist. Then again, he does it so well that both sides want to claim him, but he is more closely associated with the Stiff stable of the late sevnties. Whatever the case, Edmunds can still sellout two nights at the Ritz on the strength of that album and assorted mastertracks he's done before and since.

"Crawling From The Wreckage," the quintessential show opener, kicked off this gig, and Edmunds played it straight rather than doing the muddled version on the live album. That song and (especially) "Girls Talk" go a long way toward proving that Edmunds can recognize a great tune beneath a lacklustre treatment, or rescue a song from a homely arrangement and turn in the definitive version. To this day it's still hard to figure out how he came up with his arrangement of "Girls Talk" just on the basis of the flaccid version Elvis Costello had written at the time. That's why covering 'The Wanderer'' isn't such a great idea, because the song is already too well known and the standing version already definitive. This is where Edmunds confuses being an interpretive artist with being a cover artist, and there's a big difference; interpretation re-makes, covering merely reiterates. "Girls Talk" is an interpretation, "The Wanderer" is a cover.

In most cases, Edmunds continues to remake his older songs. For example, no two versions of "Queen Of Hearts" ever seem to sound the same, and here he elongated the song's intro, drew out the tension, and delayed the vocals — slight but significant alterations that made it new. Even overplayed tunes like Nick Lowe's "I Knew The Bride" wear well, in much the same way that rock classics of any era have a timeless, evergreen quality.

The key to Edmunds live sound is simple (though hard to achieve): lots of groove and no dead air. He's so effective that during one zydeco stomper, fans were moving around so much that the balcony was vibrating and the silhouettes on the wall were shaking back and forth. A new generation discovering Edmunds, and his timeless appeal is working its magic once again. Edmunds's show is such a guaranteed kick that most of the crowd would probably return to see him at the Ritz next week if he were playing.

In the spring, Best will have completed a listening room "like record stores used to have" with a library of 120 selections. "Customers will be able to sample new releases on compact disc and cassettes." says Lindgren. He hopes to "make a splash" with their Grand Opening in March which includes extensive giveaways and tie-ins with KROQ-FM and other local radio stations. "Fashion Island management felt a record store was vital in creating a wellbalanced mix of merchants in the center and in giving our customers-young and old alike-the kinds of stores they want," explains Barbara Roppolo, director of Fashion Island management. "Best Record's reputation for qulity, service and selection fits well with the rype of merchant we have carefully sought to enhance the diversity and character of Fashoin Island."

METAL FANS SWARM TOWER— Los Angeles metal madmen, Lizzy Borden, who were voted one of the PMRC's infamous "Filthy Fifteen," recently made an appearance at Tower Records in Panorama City, the morning after their sold-out Country Club show. In order to meet the band, fans lined up for blocks at the Tower store hours prior to their arrival. Fans were let into the store in small groups where the band autographed posters and copies of their album "Menace To Society" which has enjoyed substantial national success. A mini-album, "Terror Rising," is due to hit record stores in mid-March.

THE LIPMAN REPORT CONTIN-UES-Here are questions # and # from Macey Lipman Marketing firm's 1986 year-end "State Of The Business" survey: "What percentage were CD sales up over last year? Sales were up an overwhelming 74.6% over last year at this time of the year. Our 1985 survey showed a 16% increase over the previous year. Our figure may be high for another reason, and that is because almost all of our panel carried greater inventory, and that delivery is less of a problem than last year. Fills were better than expected. Retailers also anticipate big after X-mas to January sales because of the CD players sold this season. There were few returns, however, there were several examples of returns due to defects. New age music picked up on CD. Several accounts were cutting back on their Jazz and Classical vinyl catalog, and replacing them with CD. Black oreinted stores were barely carring or selling

CD's because their customers don't have CD players. We experienced a small dilemma because certain Motown catalog is only available on CD (Temptations).

Are you carrying more, less, or the same titles on vinyl as you did last year? 11% of the dealers called were carrying more, 54% less, and 35% were carrying the same. Retailers carrying the same titles on vinyl as last year did mention that they are carrying

less quantities of each title. Stores willimited buying power told us that the will direct their money to CD's. Or large chain told us that they will great reduce their classical selections on vin in 1987. Another large retail chain sa that they will carry less vinyl, but we tailor their inventory to specialized contele, that is to say, a sotre that self Blues artists will carry a full complement of Blues selections on vinyl.

ON JAZZI

PASSING ON-Alfred Lion, who founded Blue Note Records in 1939, died February 2 at the age of 77. Lion was known for his uncompromising attention to quality, giving Blue Note its reputation for never issuing a bad session. He took great joy in recent years at the revitalized Blue Note, which has reissued many of the gems recorded by Lion and his partner Francis Wolff, and made a rare public appearance, and a touching speech, at Blue Note's big coming out concert of two years ago. Alfred Lion is one of those nonmusicians who had an extraordinary impact on the history of jazz. His legacy is the timeless classics he recorded from 1939 into the 1960s, and the demanding, professional way he recorded thom

THEY'LL BE AROUND-Alec Wilder, the composer who died a couple of years ago, left behind more than an unique legacy of urbane music that comfortably blended Tin Pan Alley, jazz and classical musics, and a unique book, The American Popular Song: The Great Innovators 1900-1950 (Oxford University Press), that is something of a milestone. He left behind a large group of friends who are intent on celebrating each and every one of Alec Wilder's birthdays with a concert of Wilder's music. The concerts are intended as celebrations, and they are traditionally followed by a reception and dinner at the Algonquin Hotel, where Wilder resided and whose entire staff is invited to the concert each year (in fact, some of the concert is always repeated at the Algonquin for those members of the staff who had to remain on duty). This year "Celebrating Wilder's Life & Music" will take place at the Weill Recital Hall at Carnegie Hall on February 14. The performers will include Marian McPartland, Jackie Cain & Roy Kral, Marlene Ver Planck, Glenn Bowen, Harvey Phillips, the New York Woodwind Quintet, and Manny Albam, and the music will include Wilder's popular songs, a sonata, and a couple of suites. Harvey Phillips (the tubaist whose Harvey Phillips Foundation sponsors the concert) and Gunther Schuller are the co-

SEARCHING-The third annual Hennessy Cognac Jazz Search has begun combing the highways and byways for unexposed jazz talent. In fact, they've expanded their search, with New Orleans and Detroit joining New York and Los Angeles as competition cities. The way it works: a jazz group sends a tape to Hennessy (Suite JAZZ, 2801B Ocean Park Blvd., Santa Monica, CA 90405), which submits the tape to "a panel of experts." Three group finalists for each city (that's a dozen groups in all, mind you) will be selected, with each of them getting \$500. Then, after a knock-down-drag-out set of semifinals (one in each city, judged, presumably, by "a panel of experts"), each of the three final groups will be handed 1,000 bucks and given accomodations in and airfare to Los Angeles, where the finals will take place on June 11. The winner of that then gets to play with the big boys as part of the Playboy Jazz Festival and gets Kareem Abdul-Jabbar's Cranberry Records to provide them with a demo (and take first crack at signing them). Fusion groups, by the way, seem to dominate, but, presumably, a dixieland band is welcome to

BOPPING AROUND—Please check around elsewhere in this issue for a story on Columbia's enormous new jazz program, "Columbia Jazz Masterpieces." There are some odd things about some of the first releases that should be of interest...Bob Thiele's Doctor Jazz label has just reissued an excellent pair of 1959 sessions from Bob Thiele's Signature Records: the Ray Bryant Trio's "Now's The Time," and "The Soul of Toots Thielemans" (with the Ray Bryant Trio)...Staggerlee, which is being described as a "rhythm and blues musical," will open for previews next week at New York's Second Avenue Theatre. Vernel Bagneris (who wrote One Mo' Time) wrote it, Allen Toussaint (who composed numerous New Orleans r&b classics) composed it, and Ruth Brown (who sang numerous r&b hits) is in it. More on that at a later date...Corky Siegel, described as a "rock/blues harmonica virtuoso," will be debuting what is being described as a "new genre of music" when she unveils her "Symphonic Blues" with the National Symphony at Washington, D.C.'s Kennedy Center February 19 & 20... Wynton Marsalis will host a special edition of the Essence television show, focusing on Wynton's hometown of New Orleans; look for it this month (and start packing for the New Orleans Jazz & Heritage Festival, just around the corner - April 24-May 7)...An interesting pair of concerts will be taking place here in New York over the next couple of weeks: Sun Ra & His Alter-Destiny 21st Century Omniverse Arkestra will be offering a special tribute to Duke Ellington and Fletcher Henderson, February 17, and a special tribute to Count Basie and Jimmie Lunceford, February 24, at the Bottom Line. The place should rock with earthquakian vigor.

PROFILES



Mark Jackson - MD WHYT Radio - Detroit, MI

"My fother and I built a pirote rodia station when I was twelve years old, and I've been subscribing to industry trades since I was sixteen. Bosically I grew up in the business - it's quite literally in my blaod."

Does this saund familiar? Mony radio professionals will undaubtedly sense o kindred spirit in Mark Jackson, music director at WHYT in Detroit. He laves working in radio, and he knew very early that it wos his speciol colling, as do so mony dedicated radio people.

He credits his teenage interest in the genre to his father, who olso felt the tug af the oirwayes. "He storted aut about 20 years ago as

o General Sales Monager at a small AM/FM comba in the western partian of Michigan, so all my life I've hung oraund radio stations."

While attending college at Eastern Michigan University, Mark begon warking parttime at WHYT, which had recently switched fram a beoutiful music farmat to Mike Jaseph's Hat Hits, and needed a guy to "schlep around, drive the van, thot kind af stuff..." While still in schaal, his experience allowed him ta take on the role af assistant production director ot the statian, and he utilized the responsibility of the pasition ta create research and collout departments at WHYT.

"After I got out of school, I was oble to assume the role here of research director/ ossistant production director, ond over the last couple af years I've sart of evolved into the music director position." Mark is extremely excited obout WHYT's prospects for the future, and the direction that his hame station is taking.

The recent history af Detrait rodio is on interesting one, and Mork has found himself right in the middle of a ropidly chonging and expanding morketplace. "When WHYT first came on the air here in Detroit, there was a very unusual situotion. There were four AOR statians in town, and not really any CHR autlet at oll. CKLW was here, but the listenership just wosn't there for AM rodio. So when we first hit town, Mike Jaseph had a very intense farmat that grabbed a lot of attention, and I think it kind of set the morket on its eor." The Gannett Carparatian decided to cash in an some of the up-for-grobs CHR action in the

matar city, and WCZY become o worthy competitar shartly thereafter. "It's been a clossic dogfight ever since - we're within o cauple af points of each other every boak, ond often there's less thon o point difference. It's always very exciting. Naw we have a third stotion here ond it's even tougher! How many markets do you know with three P1 reparters?"

Mark ond Rick Gillette, WHYT's program director, have tried ta carve aut o solid piece of the CHR pie by hiring The Electrifying Mojo, a flamboyant nightime personolity, away from on Urban competitor. Mojo was getting huge numbers an his previous stotion by playing scratched and master-mixed versians of essentially the same songs that were beginning to crossover successfully ta CHR in Detroit's block-influenced demographic market.

Mork odmits o slight leon toward an Urban saund, but insists that it is merited by Detroit's unique demos. "We have a little bit of that leon to us - we're a CHR, but we're o soulful CHR. We're the kind af statian that's gaing ta play a Gregory Abbott early, because that's the mix of this city. I think we're offering the best af bath warlds.

"That's really the beauty of the format, becouse if yau're executing it right, then CHR shauld be a blending of what yaur market is obout. If you were somewhere else, it might be on alternative lean, ar an AOR lean. But because it's a blending of all these types of music tagether, it allaws itself ta slont taward trends without becoming encompassed by these trends and becoming out of dote."

WHYT seems to be a Top 40 station th nat ofroid to toke a certoin stonce within 1 morket to try ta increase their share, and this becoming somewhat rare in tadoy's home nized CHR format. Mork olso feels confic about CHR's obility to roll over the Clc Rack bondwagon that has thrust its way u vited into every majar morket, simply becc of CHR's tendency toward lang-term ev tion and perpetual change. "I think the station that's evolving and on the move eventually win out, and I think that's why C itol Cities has mode the commitment to WI because they wont o stotion that's going to here for the long term." Mark pramises this cammitment will be possed on to WH's loyol listeners through even bigger and be pramatians and giveoways, surpossing yeor's "Kool Cruise," where Kool & The G played on o WHYT-chartered riverboat 500 lucky winners.

Mork Jockson, like music directors ev where, would eventually like to pilot his a station from the program directar's seot, for right naw he's content to be a loyal dedicated team player at Detrait's Wh''I'm very committed to this station. I'm young and I want to gother some more eyrience. But I'd love to stay with Capital Cit they've been very good to me." Where Mark Jackson ends up dawn the road, he toke with him on inbred love of radio enaugh knowledge accumulated from o time spent in the business to moke him o cess in any market.



Dianne Quander Lyricist Warner Brothers Music

Intellegent, diverse ond beautiful daesn't even begin to describe the essence of the lovely Dianne Quonder. Six co-written cuts with top artists in less thon a year is on envioble record far this brilliant lyricist. To date, those killer cuts include Anita Baker's "Caught Up In The Rapture," RJ's Latest Arrival's "Heaven In Your Arms," Jean Carne's "The Flame Of Love," Freddie Jackson's "I Can't Let You Go" and Steppin' Into The Night" from the movie "Armed And Danaerous."

Aside fram oll this, her numerous talents have led her into such pasitians as air personality, sound engineer and professional writer of commercial copy. She is also learning to produce, and through a love for foshion, hos even managed clathing boutiques. Naw how much more diverse can one be?

Born in Washington, D.C., Dianne spent the greater port of her childhood developing an eor for sophistocated music. Her father, singer James "Wade" Wallace, was a major influence on Dianne's love for the art, and at age 10, Dianne was listening to the records of Dizzy Gillespie, Nat King Cole and John Coltrane.

In 1971, Dionne decided to try her hand at radio, ond jocked far quiet storm formated **WHUR and WPFW-FM** in Washington, D.C., ond **WSTA-FM**, St. Thomos, V.I. She then become a sound engineer for **Burg Music**, Woshington, D.C., ond engineered live shows for **Patrice Rushen**.

With oll this music in her bockground, why do you suppose this tolented lody has a current profession as a lyricist? Well, for one thing, Dianne majored in journalism with a focus on english liturature. The truth is, she holds on exceptionally rare command over the english longuage. She has written commercial copy professionally for Lee Bailey Productions, and even come up with the name "Ro-

dioscope" for Lee's magazine of the airwoves. Dianne has the unique ability to express feelings on paper, so you con bet that her songs are going to continue to hit us, just as they olwoys hove, right in the heart.

While working her 9-5 gigs, such as a receptionist for **Stevie Wonder** and **Earth, Wind and Fire**, Dianne wauld push herself to write every evening after work. "One thing I reolized eorly on," exploines Dionne, "was to be prepared for when my time come, because I knew I would be expected to perform of the drop of a hat."

Dianne's fovorite place to find collaborators is on the bock of olbum covers. Thot's haw she met her current other holf, Garry Glenn. Before Glenn, however, she faund producer Benjamin Wright. "Benjamin wos o tremendous help to me. He tore opart o lyric of mine, which made me so mad, that I decided I she was going to be really good. So, I enrolled in the Cat Cohen School of Music where I met lyricist Steve Cohen. Steve gove me the necessory tools and mechanics of song structure, and todoy, I con lyricolly point ony situotion.

Now let's get bock to Gorry Glenn. Dianne found Gorry by looking on the bock of on Eorth, Wind ond Fire olbum. She describes the relotionship as o match mode in heoven. They both grew up with the some idols, (Smokey Robinson, Linda Creed, Thom Bell, Burt Bacherach, Hal David, etc...), and they know exoctly what to write for each other. "It's os if we ore the some person. I couldn't hove osked for o more perfect writing portner."

Like many writers, Dianne believes that the melody is the core of a song, and Garry is an incredible vocalist with a knock for beautiful meladies. For example, Garry wrote, "Be Careful How You Treat My Love," for Phyllis Hyman

When Dianne has a melody in her head, hawever, she is frustratingly unoble to express it, becouse she does nat sing ar play on instrument. Sa, she is presently making the search for o great vocal teacher. Also, production seems to be in her stars, as she is studying under the guidence af praducers Dean Gant and Michael Powell, and hos alreody produced 2 very good demos of tunes that she wrote with "Lokeside's" Steven Shockley.

Although her hits hove primarily been ballads, Dianne loves the challenge of writing in any tempa, os in Freddie Jackson's, "I Can't Let Yau Go." When asked to describe her style she replied, "I am a visually romantic staryteller wha likes fluid lyrics with a twist."

Recent demagraphics seem to be telling us that more ond more of the listening public is becomming focused on quiet storm materiol. One of Dionne's theories obout this, is that the generation of boby boomers were brought up on it, and ore now getting back into buying records ond listening to music. "Thot's whot Anito Boker, Freddie Jockson ond Luther Vandross olbums ore oil about. It oil goes bock to the Burt Bacheroch, Thom Bell and Linda Creed kind of feel," ond the foct that odult contemporory seems to be on the rise ogoin is excellent news for writers like Dionne.

Gorry and Dionne each have a co-

publishing controct with Warn Brothers Music. Rachel Fields took a risk by pulling an known like Dianne in on Garry's exing deol, and fortunotely, Rache won the jackpot. Dianne's success rapidly turning her into o well souofter writer, and current projects clude songs for Hiroshima, Perick Henderson, Glenn Jone Carl Anderson and Fredd Washington.

Right now, Dionne is welcoming tentian from the industry, but let ossure you that her climb towords s cess has been no bowl of cherries. ing Black, a woman and strictly lyricist, she reolly hod to fight for spect. "Sometimes, situations wo occur in which peaple would say me, 'well, you don't know music,' at had to convince certoin people t yes I could heor music, but that ly were just os important. One thin love obout Garry is that he respeny opinion and hos confidence in m

In the words of o pra, Dionne's vise to up and coming writers is agaressive! You have to go out a moke things happen. If I hadn't g out and looked for o writing part I'd still be waiting around. Also, h your skills down, becouse you will automatically more agressive from confidence you will gain in know whot you con do, and mast imparte support your creotivity. So, if you stuck in a 9-5 that drains the life ou you, find samething creative ob yourself with which you con eorn income with while writing. I had a l for clothing, so I guit the 9-5's to w in boutiques. It was just the bolon needed to keep going."

The beoutiful ond elegant Dia Quonder hos brightened up the sc writing scene with her chorm, posititude ond enormous tolent, ond are fortunote to receive the fruit her wonderous gifts. Dionne, your con hordly woit for more!

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COUNTRY PROFILES .



Wade Jessen-Music Director KSOP-FM—Salt Lake City, UT

SALT LAKE CITY—"Cauntry born and cauntry bred" is a term that describes Wade Jessen well-but it could be changed to "cauntry radia born and cauntry radio bred" as well. A-way aut West in Utah, little Wade was raised up ronge-wise and country-praud by Gary and Rasalee in typical rancher fashion, which included listening to clear cauntry stations such as WBAP in Dallas/Fart Worth. Add to this homey setting an Uncle Fred, Fred Brawn, a 25-year radio man in the orea, and you have a picture of Jessen's earliest influences.

"I had a naturol, inbarn love far country music," Wade soys, odding that he also has a natural ear far cauntry hits. "Marilyn Monrae had her legs insured; I shauld have my ears insured. I con't carry a tune, but I can smell a hit a mile oway." Thraw in Uncle Fred and this natural bent takes an the appearance of an inherited canditian—ar at least a family tradition. As a result, when Wade entered his profession of the age of 16, his family was probably not overly surprised.

"I had a lot of credits [in my juniar year] and really only needed to go to school halfdays," Wade explains. "So what I did was get a job at o small town radia statian, KNEU in Raosevelt, Utah, abaut 30 miles fram home, and worked there port time through my junior and seniar years.'

After groduotian, he warked full time at KNEU for a couple of manths, but then maved an to Salt Lake City and KSOP in 1979. After several years he became music director there and warked the mid-day shift.

One doy in the foll af 1984, Jessen heard a small vaice in the wildnerness crying "Help." It was his hometown stotian, KNEU—and they needed him. New awners had just taken aver the station and they wanted Wade to came back for a year ta help them get off the graund. "I just couldn't soy no," Wade says, and adds jakingly, "It was kind of like getting a secand shot at your childhood sweeheart."

After the agreed upon year, however, Jessen returned to Salt Lake ond KSOP. "Part af me wanted to stay," he admits. "I enjayed a wonderful year with my parents. After all, I'd left home at age 17 and this gave me an opportunity to get reacquointed with them." But, on the other hand, KSOP was a familyowned business that had "token him in" when he was 17, so it was like leaving ane hearth and home to go to another.

With familial pride, Jessen talked about KSOP, pointing out the stability of the 32year-old station and the fact that KSOP was the first radio station in the world to broodcast country music in FM stereo 24 hours o

day.
"We also have our own in-house booking agency which handles all the major acts who came through Salt Lake City," Jessen adds praudly, as if he was spinning records at KSOP during the decade befare he was barn, "We used to bring in Kitty Wells back in the '50s and it grew into a full-time business far the station."

Returning ta the present, Jessen talks about his jab, if it can be called that with a description like this: "My pleasure and thrill and joy in life is to pragram country music. In my job I get ta sit far five haurs a day and listen to the results af my wark. It's exciting every day. When it becames a rautine, I think I'll get aut af the business."

That's the statement of a happy man.

"No, son, when we said we wanted you to be an m.d., that's nat what we meant." Somewhere in Rob Hough's affice at KWKH, there oughta be a picture to go with that caption, although his folks might not be amused. Throughout his education as a pre-med student at Southwest Missouri Stote, they probably thought their son's job at KTTS was just part-time work to help out the ole finances.

Then came...The Decisian. "I gat my premed degree and had been accepted into Missauri University-Calumbio Medical Schaal," Rab recalls. "I was daing evenings, and it came time to graduate callege ond leave the radia, get aff the air and ga ta med schoal. And much ta my parents dismay (my mother still thraws it up ta me), I cauldn't get aff the radia! I just couldn't see not being here. Ta this day, I'm mokin' 75 bucks a week an the radia and not o dactar." But there's not even a hint af rearet in his vaice.

Actually, his folks cauld nat have been all that surprised. Rab says he wanted to be in radio even as a smoll bay in Springfield, Missouri. While his parents thought they were raising a future dactor, Rob says he was "probably in every station in town with my nase pressed up against the windaw, wishing I could be that guy on the rodio. That's all I every really wanted to be."

At that point, Rob didn't core what stotion, he didn't care what the farmat, he just wanted on the other side of that windaw. "I made the rounds. I went to every station, including the religious anes. I just wanted ta be on the radio.

When he was 17, the high schaal kid finally made it inside a radia statian daar, at KTTS in Springfield. It was definit part-time. "I just hung oraund and dre them nuts, affering to sweep floors, ! shaes, anything that needed to be done

That was the start of a beautiful reloti ship-Rob stayed at KTTS far 13 year from 1973 until 1986. (Yes, falks, this v the very station he cauldn't passibly ler ta go to med schoal.) As it turned aut, F earned the saught-after initials much ec er at KTTS than he would have at Misso University. In 1978, he called his pare and told them that he had finally becc

Lost year, Rab left Springfield, movi ta Shreveport and KWKH. And even t he didn't really leave the family since two signols ore sisters. He did, howe, have to leave his title behind, entering W "This is the as progrom directar. statian I've ever been pragram director," Rab says praudly, "and it's a 50,(wott o.m. and a 100,000 watt f.m." reol rewards af his jab, Rab cantinues "hearing o gaad praduct an the air knawing by and large that you're respo ble far it. That's a goad feeling."

THE SCANDINAVIAN CONNEC-TION-VCM Scandinavia, Inc. has set up shop on the West Coast, with offices in Beverly Hills and San Francisco. The company distributes film and video to all of Scandinavia, and is now moving into the area of co-financing and co-production, and the new Beverly Hills office, headed by Anne Bakken, is key to that endeavor. "This is the start of our plan to implement co-financing and co-production operations," says Bakken, "V.C.M would not become involved in producing a film we could not sell, so we will offer producers the unique opportunity to co-produce with a distributor who has a proven track record in their own territories." The Nordic market, in which the company has distributed numerous American video titles over the last six years, is growing rapidly at present, according to VCM. It's certainly one of the most affluent markets, though VCR penetration rests at approximately 28 percent per household. The company also says there are about 1,500 specialized video outlets in Scandinavia.

DO NOT COLORIZE!—The new Stabilizers' video, *One Simple Thing*, bears a terse directive: "Do Not Colorize." The video, directed by **David Fincher**, was shot in black & white with obvious artistic intent, similar to that of many filmmakers of Hollywood's Golden Era, whose art is now being destroyed by greed.

ANOTHER BIG YEAR—1986 was another very good year for the makers of VCRs and video related equipment, according to the latest report from the Consumer Electronics Group. With U.S. household VCR penetration now standing at around 40 percent, VCRs sold nearly 13.2 million units in 1986, amounting to a sales increase of 11 percent over 1985. VCRs sold, believe it or not, at a rate of 36.000 a day.

FIGHTING BACK—The Video Software Dealers Association issued its first anti-piracy newsletter this month. The newsletter, called "Piracy Playback," shows retailers that they can make a difference by reporting instances of piracy. In listing highlights of some recent piracy cases in various states (with information from the Film Security Office of the Motion Picture Association of America), the letter is bound to offer encouragement to the

battle-weary foes of illegal tape duping. It also provides dealers with an 800 number piracy hotline (800-257-5259).

HOME VIDEO REVIEW: Help! -MPI Home Video - \$69.95 From the Illinois-based home video company that brought you The Beatles' A Hard Day's Night last year comes the second of the fab four's glorious cinematic romps. Pure farce is the order of the day where Help! is concerned, and while the continual sight gags, silly twists in story and other low humor do get tiring, you'd have to be tired of The Beatles before fast-forwarding through any of it. As a film, Help!, shot in 1965, holds up about as well as any teen-oriented escapade of the period, better - if considered in its proper historical context. The plot is entirely beside the point, of course, but this is the one in which the four musicians, playing themselves, are pursued by several interests, each out to nab Ringo's giant ruby ring which neither he, nor anyone else, is able to pry loose from his finger. Very much jovial intrigue ensues, filmed against a globe trotting backdrop of London, Austria, and the Bahamas befitting, it would seem, the jetsetting young superstars' taste for travel. The brazen whimsy and utter hysteria of this film serves as a time capsule to the actual hysteria of Beatlemania. Produced by Walter Shenson and directed by Richard Lester (the same team who did A Hard Days Night), the film has been "colorcorrected," meaning that its original color has been restored, and inlcudes digital Hi-Fi stereo sound, which is especially nice considering the film is primarily a vehicle for the music in much the same function music videos serve

LEONARD SLATKIN-SAINT LOUIS SYMPHONY ORCHESTRA—Mahler Symphony No. 1 in D, "Titan"—Telarc CD-80066—Producer: Robert Woods—No List—Bar Coded

Mahler's first symphony has a beguiling sanguine surface, but the dark horror that emerges in clear view in his later work—especially the Ninth Symphony—is only suggested here. Slatkin and the St. Louis give us an even, sympathetic treatment without a lot of emotional gushing. Mahler's obsession with impending death and life's inevitable cycles is inescapable, though.

MICHAEL MURRAY-JAHJA LING-ROYAL PHILHARMONIC ORCHES-TRA—Duprè Symphony in G Minor-Rheinberger Organ Concerto No. 1 in F— Telarc CD-80136—Producer:Robert Woods—No List—Bar Coded

The rare coupling of orchestra and pipe organ is displayed full-blown here. Frenchman Duprè's Symphony and two Rheinberger concertos (one included on this disc) are about the extent of literature calling for the organ/orchestra ensemble. It is a marvelous experience as demonstrated on this digital CD featuring organist Murray. Rumbling lows and thunderous, booming crescendos blend perfectly with the orchestra.

I MUSICI—Rota Concerto per archi-Respighi Antiche danze ed arie per liuto-Elgar Serenade for Strings-Barber Adagio—Philips 416 356—Producer: not listed—No List—Bar Coded

This is one of the richest musical experiences you are likely to have. The chamber ensemble I Musici is simply superb. Especially on Barber's Adagio, the romantic strains are deeply moving. The Barber piece is timely as well, for its moving use in the film *Platoon*. Don't miss this one if you have an affinity for intimate chamber music. The members of I Musici play on vintage instruments dating to the 1700s.

MORTON SUBOTNICK—The Key To Songs-Return—New Albion NA012—Producer: Michael Hoenig—No List

One of the pioneers of modern electronic composition unleashes this furious, unabashedly adventurous CD. The first piece, "The Key To Songs" is programatic—sort of—based on painter Max Ernst's 1933 novel-as-collage, *A Week of Kindness, or The Seven Deadly Elements*. The second is a commission that surfaced last year in which the composer honors the return Halley's Comet. The first is an exotic mix of traditional ensemble and Subotnick's Yamaha Computer Assisted Music System (YCAMS). The second is realized entirely on the YCAMS.

VALERY AFANASSIEV—Edition Lockenhaus Vol. 3—ECM New Series ECM 1328—Producers: Manfred Eicher-Gidon Kremer—List: 9.98

Violinist Kremer, organizer of the Lockenhaus Festival, keeps his commitment alive to bring attention to little known and under-performed pieces. This is Vol. 3 and contains Schubert's last Sonata, the B Flat Op. Posth. D 960. It is a dark, horror-filled piece and is performed exquisite passion by pianist Afanassiev.

WERNER PIRCHNER—EU—ECM New Series ECM 1314/15—Producer: Manfred Eicher—List: 19.98

Manfred Eicher continues his passionate support of 20th Century composition with the latest in his ECM New Series releases. Here composer/accordionist Pirchner explodes the limitations of categories by combining elements as disparate as European cafe song, Erik Satie and Dada by way of Frank Zappa. The two-record set contains ample examples of Pirchner's sonorous and slowly developed pieces, all of which are strikingly original.

GAVIN BRYARS—Three Viennese Dancers—ECM New Series ECM 1323—Producer: Manfred Eicher—List: 9.98

Bryars writes for an add assortment of tuned percussion instruments including glockenspiel, crotales and gongs as well as strings and French horn. The result on this record is an interesting, arresting and introspective piece with Reichian sensibilities.

Beastie Boys' Date in San Diego Cancelled

LOS ANGELES — A scheduled concert by rap group The Beastie Boys was cancelled last week. According to Linda Stack, faculty advisor to the Pop Events Committee of the University of California, San Diego, the February 8 appearance of The Beastie Boys was struck from the calendar due to disturbances reported during the first week of the group's national tour. Stack cited reports that the group had "trashed the dressing room" on their opening night in Montana, as well as other "rowdy behavior," as prompting the decision.

The group, whose enormously popular Def Jam/Columbia Records album "Licensed To Ill" is rocketing up the charts, is noted for their wild image. But according to Stack, the school can jeopardize neither its gymnasium nor its concertgoers. She noted that the group's management would not give assurances that disturbances would be avoided. The university's decision was reached Monday, February 2 as reports continued from other venues that the band was "inciting rowdy behavior," Stack said.

Tracy Moris, director of programming at the University of Montana, Missoula, confirmed that problems did exist at the group's tour-opening show there Thursday, January 29. According to Moris, The Beastie Boys did extensive damage (reportedly \$400) to the dressing room, including breaking light fixtures and painting graffiti on the walls. In addition, the band reportedly threw full beer cans and bottles into the audience and incited the crowd, in Moris' words, "to party," which resulted in some of the auditorium's seats being damaged. The group has been banned from performing at the University in the future.

According to an aid to Mike Sweeney,

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shaping the early career of Tom Robinson.

With 1981's "Give The People What They Want," the Kinks finally became succesful enough so that, for the first time in their career, they headlined Madison Square Garden - an occasion for which Davies flew in his mother. And the hits kept on coming, from "Destroyer" and "Come Dancing" to "Don't Forget To Dance" and "Do It Again," while his songwriting sometimes even equalled "Muswell..." levels with tunes like "Better Things" and "Missing

Today, Davies seems drawn as much to theatre and film projects as to music. He wrote and directed Return To Waterloo for London's Channel 4-TV in 1985, made a cameo in Julian Temple's film Absolute Beginners last year, and is working with a smail theatre company to revive "Preservation Act I" for the British stage this year. Davies was brimming with ideas during our interview session, talking up four or five major projects and several tour scenarios including possible small venue performances accompanied only by a piano player. But he is particulalry excited by "Think Visual" and particularly proud of such songs as "Lost and Found" and "Working At The Factory."

In conversation, Davies is not just witty; he is often downright hilarious — in fact, at one point on the tape one can't hear Davies because of this interviewer's laughter (note section on Ike Turner). He talks candidly about many celebrities, has high praise for Buster Poindexter, words of advice for Elvis Costello, criticism for Bon Jovi, and fascination for heavy metal in general. What emerges is a portrait of a compulsively creative artist, unpredictable, mercurial, quickwitted. Though Davies has had a reputation as being the Garbo of rock — the guarded star who rarely talks to the press — he has agreed to do interviews for the first time in three years, and this is one of them.

CASH BOX: What do you think is the strongest period of your entire career? Would you say "Muswell Hillbillies"?

DAVIES: "Muswell Hillbillies" was a really strong album in the sense that it worked as an album vet it worked as an overall concept. And it said a lot about a period in time, about a place where I did grow up, and it worked as a piece of sociology as well as an album. It had some great songs on it. I would say "Muswell Hillbillies" is a good album.

CASH BOX: Was that album really sparked by your family being moved out of Caledonian

DAVIES: It was generations before me. That book you read was kind of not accurate. It was generations before me. What it was about was the movement from the inner cities to the suburbs. That's what's apparently happening a lot in America in towns where industry brings people into the cities. Cities are built for industry and then there's no need for the industry any more and there's no need for the people.

CASH BOX: What would you suggest to someone caught in a dead end like that? How did you get out?

DAVIES: Music. That's how a lot of people still do. A lot of new bands do that. It's music or nothing now though. When I started it was music or the factory. Now it's music or nothing.

CASH BOX: You've got a song, "Working At The Factory," on the new album saying that music saved you from the factory yet at the same time now it's kind of like the factory itself.

DAVIES: That's more like my rebelliousagainst the industry that I've been involved in. Like, when I started this, I mean all bands when they start, it's like a couple

of kids in a garage band. They make a tape and they think it's great. And to them rock 'n' roll is freedom. It certainly was for me and a lot of people like me. Especially in England. I mean for a lot of kids in England leaving school without a job, a lot of them go play in bands, subsidized by the dole or unemployment benefits. And the other alternative, if they get work, is the factory or work that is really beneath what they're qualified to do because computers have taken over most of the jobs. So for me in a sense it was freedom from the sort of factory I was involved in - not literally a factory, I was a college student and I saw a dead end - it's freedom from any dead end. The factory is a metaphor for a dead end. Soon (The Kinks) became part of what has become an industry now and people depend on sales figures and reports from stores and all that. It just starts off with an innocent piece of tape, with the band trying to make music, and it gets taken out of our hands. I find myself in a sense being in an industry that's out of my control, and being dictated to by an industry. And that's the subjective meaning behind that song. So you trade one factory for another.

CASH BOX: Do you see any realistic scenarios for a really fulfilling adult life? I mean, there's the factory and then there's the factory: is that what you're saying?

DAVIES: The only compromise is to be a starving artist but that is not realistic to me. It's a thing I go through, an internal struggle. I don't like the business side of it but I have to live with it and tolerate it because it's a necessary evil. It's there. It's not just me, it's the band as well. They've all got lives outside their music, they've got their own personal lives. Fortunately, the Kinks have never been a spendthrift band. It's always been kind of an easy band to maintain. They don't have their Porsche cars and in a sense they're a working class band. And that's

CASH BOX: How about the relationship between you and your brother: how much of that is staged and how much of that is for real in terms of fights onstage?

DAVIES: I don't think you can stage a relationship like that. I'm not that sort of person - and I don't think Dave is - who can capitalize on it to the extent that we will manufacture a rift between us or an argument or an explosion at a gig. I'd rather that there wasn't a volatile relationship but there is. It's just one of those things that's there, it's not manufactured. If I could manufacture it. I'd manufacture it the other way and play it down. Sometimes it's very exciting, it makes the music very exciting. Other times it just dissipates what I'm trying to do.

CASH BOX: If Dave were not around do you think the tension that creates your songs would maybe dissipate?

DAVIES: I think that a relationship if it's very intense, a compassionate relationship, will inspire creativity. I know a writer, he's a scriptwriter, who was married to this woman and they used to fight all the time. Real violent quarrels. But his writing was great. Unfortunately she died of cancer and he remarried and he's got a very safe home with a wife who doesn't speak and his work is very dull.

CASH BOX: Is there one particular album that you wished you hadn't recorded?

DAVIES: Yeah, there's a couple that on them there's a few really good songs. Umm (pause). I'm sure there is. Yeah - "Preservation."

CASH BOX: "Act II"?

DAVIES: Yeah, the double album. Not because I don't like it but because now is the time to do it. I wasted all my ideas then. Because there was no vehicle for me to actually make the album and see it through as an entity. So I wished I hadn't recorded it then. Not because I didn't like the material, but because it was the wrong time for it.

CASH BOX: Are you thinking of doing a live show where you include all the small songs that the real Kinks fans like?

DAVIES: I'd like the flexibility to do a rock show like we've been known for in the last five years and then go somewhere and play someplace small and do like maybe just me and a piano player. Do songs, like Elvis Costello did. He did a little tour like that.

CASH BOX: He had the spinning wheel. That would work well with all the songs you've got.

DAVIES: I could do the wheel of fortune. CASH BOX: If you could make any kind of album you wanted to, what kind of stuff would you do? Would you make something closer to 'Soap Opera," or "Misfits" or 'Low Budget"?

DAVIES: I'd like to make an album - and I think we come close to it with this one with all those ingredients. The poetics of the thing in "Misfits" I think we've got in "Lost and Found," the heaviness of "Low Budget" - all those ingredients. Cause that's what a good Kinks show or album is - it's all that stuff.

CASH BOX: Of the new songs, what are you most proud of? "Killing Time"?

DAVIES: I love "Killing Time" as a track because I've been singing that song for a couple of years. It's great when you're walking along humming a song and you think, where have I heard that one before, and you say, oh I'm writing it. I'm quite proud of the luric in that. And I like the vocal, I rarely - I can't stand my vocals but I don't mind that. "Lost and Found"s good and also "Working At The Factory." As this record stands, I'm 100% behind what l've done.

CASH BOX: How about your vocals sometimes they get boozy

DAVIES: I know. It's dreadful.

CASH BOX: No, it's really wonderful sounding. Did you ever cut vocals drunk or is that just part of the ambience you want to get across?

DAVIES: No. I have done vocals drunk. I have done vocals in various states, emotional states. Sometimes you just go in there like first thing in the morning and it's the best vocal - first take, when vou're learning it. I do the best vocal when I'm actually completing the song for the first time and I sit down and sing it for the first time. Then I start to think about it and I get tricky. As soon as I start to use tricks it dies away.

CASH BOX: How do you come up with your songs: do you write in a studio or at home, on the guitar, with a band -

DAVIES: I'm one of these people who writes when I have to. But I make notes all the time. I have no one place where I write because I do travel a lot. I love traveling. I think I write best in transit. I'm not one of these people who says I'm taking January off and I'm going to write and I go away to an island and come up with all these great songs. Can't do it. And I'm not a very technical guy. I've got one of those four track machines but I don't know how to work it.

CASH BOX: There's one story I read where you woke up one morning in (1968) with the lyric to "Waterloo Sunset." Is that how it happened?

DAVIES: Yeah (Nods head). Cause I'm one of these writers that carries ideas through, thinks of lines and writes them down and doesn't resolve it, and when they wake up they've got it. I did the last verse of "Lost and Found" that way. Woke up and there it was. The one about (sings it). I kind of like that. It's not that it's inspiration from a heavenly body. It's just that I finally worked it out.

CASH BOX: I read where for the intro to "Lola" somebody said you needed a grabby beginning like you had with "You Really Got Me.

DAVIES: Yeah, that's right. We had the twinkly beginning that sounded like Donc van, some folky beginning and I wanted power chords on it but it was kind of a tough? song for that. I thought they were great chords on the front and I built them up will the National ovation guitar, the same styll of guitar that's on the Dire Straits ("Brothers in Arms") sleeve. I bought one of those for about a hundred dollars and use the Martin guitar and I just double tracked those and gave it those powerful sounded And it's the intro that makes it.

The first thing I learned from making cords is make the first ten seconds as grade as possible. If you can hold their interest fo. thirty seconds or a minute you've got a hit But that was a long time ago. What yo gotta do now is bore people with a repetitive rhythm pattern for a couple of minutes Then they're hypnotized into believing its great. A lot of it is hypnotism. It started in the discos in the late seventies where ve sequed tracks through the bass drum bed Giorgio Moroder did a whole album with the same rhythm all the way through. Did yo 🕯

CASH BOX: No, but the repetition is right; You did do "Superman" though.

DAVIES: That was half a send up. They sending up inspired me to write a son about a man who actually involved himself in all the problems of the world like strikes. and all that and he wishes he could fly like Superman and get everybody out of the

CASH BOX: How about "Rock 'N' Roll Cities": is that trying to capture the caffeing ated tempo of radio?

DAVIES: It's a good tempo I think. It wasn't there when we put the drums down because the drums are taken straight fron the demo. Mick Avory played drums on that. I heard the demo and I said that sound: great, the drumming is really good and they said that's Mick, the guy we fired. Well we didn't fire him, we agreed to a mutual parting. I said keep the drumming and lose the rest, redo the rest. But Mick had the rig feel. The tempo is real important. Mick wasn't a technically great drummer but he had the tempo.

lke Turner came to our studio once and he said when everybody thinks of four beats toa bar he thinks of two. So instead of going one-two-three-four he goes one (pause) two-So you are going slower, it's more solid. think white music thinks on eighths (makes staccato sound) soul music is (beats steady tempo).

DAVIES: What's happened to lke Turner? CASH BOX: He recently did a press conference where he explained no he didn't beat his wife.

DAVIES: He should do an album called "Beat The Wife." (Strikes a mock-dramatic pose and belts:) "Yeahhh, beat the wife."

CASH BOX: (Laughs). He did come out off a rehab center but he could (laughs) -DAVIES: Call it "Beat The Wife" and have

tracks on it like (crooning) "I Didn't Mean It, Baby." (pauses)

That's sad. I don't think she (Tina) would have happened without him. But she just outgrew him. I find her really inspiring. It was such a thrill cause we were doing Top Of The Pops because we had a number one record in England at the time "River Deep, Mountain High" came out and I had only heard the record, and had all these fantasies. about what they looked like. And when sha jumped out into the show I said, wow she's great. And she's still good. They'll never be another like her.

CASH BOX: I saw her once, and with the wig and everything she looked a bit like at transvestite -

DAVIES: In the promo for "Rock 'n' Roll Cities" I have a Tina Turner lookalike... a really good lookalke that has those legs and (continued on page 29)

But the problem with em was "Preservation" would have been it show in a theatre — I'm convinced — Re'd been able to tour it as long as theatre ompanies do tours and work it as long. ometimes it takes a year for a show to evelop. But we had to come up with anher album. So I found it difficult to funcon in the music industry and do the artistic ings I wanted to do. Like, theatre and the ck industry do not actually gell time-wise. same as I'm having difficulty in the film orld. The actual life span of making a film nd creating it — writing it, producing it, ost-production — is around two years on a g budget. With an album it's turned over ich quicker. The two time scales are totaldifferent.

ASH BOX: How about "Soap Opera"? ow could Norman be Starmaker at the me time? That's been bothering me.

AVIES: That bothers me too. That's nny, I found a film I made of it, a live oncert. And I watched it and I found it uite a disturbing film. If you knock out the usic and see what the story's about it's uite worrying. I wondered, hmm did I write at? And I watched it and I had forgotten e show and I was waiting to see what was oing to happen because it worried me. eah it was kind of deep and psychotic asn't it? It's this accountant Norman who elieves he's me. Actually it's me readjustng being Norman again, which is a nut thing. ou can get whatever you want out of it. It's ther me being normal or this ordinary guy etending he's me. And all the questions at throws up when I saw it again for the st time since we performed it worried me

At the time I wrote it I was saying to yself you should get out of this and stop hat you're doing. I really wanted to write ays and films and music for the theatre.

ASH BOX: What exactly was going on in sur life during that theatrical period?

AVIES: Things were going alright. But I ink it was trouble communicating what I inted to do to he record company. I went them - it sounds like ages ago, 1974 - and aid I really think we should make visual oums. Film albums to show clips and show cinemas and on TV. This was RCA Rerds. And they said we don't see that hapning, we don't want to do that, we're in music business you know. The ironic rt was that it was RCA video disc that put half the money for Return To Waterloo. vas the frustration of not getting my ideas across to the people who were putting my

And they couldn't find a place for me. You've got to fit in a format because if you don't you become quirky, in the back bin at the record shop, the quacky bin. Or the loony bins. There's a loony bin shop for bands like us. It's so easy like if they have John Denver they go yeah John Denver we know where to put him. David Bowie, we know where to put him. And Dolly Parton, of course we know where to put her. But these Kinks we don't know where to put them. Put them in the loony bins.

CASH BOX: Do you think if they had promoted that stuff like "Soap Opera," "Premoted that stuff like "Soap Opera," servation," and "Schoolboys," it would have sold? Some of it's good.

DAVIES: Some of the songs are good.

DAVIES: I think Elvis Costello really had it but he's lost it a little bit. I mean he's lost his way, but he's still writing good songs. Billy Bragg had it for a while but I think he's been absorbed in the whole socialist aura. When he started he had good little pictures of real life in his songs, about the humble people. But now he's becoming very politicized. It was the same with Tom Robinson when I was involved in his career: it was great to begin with but if you are going to be political the songs have to be good. It's not enough to have a slogan and a banner....Suzanne Vega writes neat little tunes, good little chords, a nice voice, I mean you can't knock her really. To tell the truth I don't hear the lyrics behind the Bon Jovi record - I don't get that. And I don't get Europe. Heavy metal, I mean, is still the only thing that's funny to me. I can't wait for Judas Priest to do their next big hype and Iron Maiden

When we did "Preservation" onstage I remember we started it at a college somewhere upstate and it was a rock 'n' roll college with the fists going and the beer was going. And then we walked on and started the show and all the jaws dropped for the first ten minutes like that scene in the film The Producers when they do "Springtime For Hitler." Then people started shouting out let's hear rock n roll. But at the end of the show we got standing applause because we tried something different. The fantastic thing is that that material contractually has come back to us and I think our present record company wants to buy the catalogue.

CASH BOX: MCA is buying the catalogue?

DAVIES: They want to market the catalogue. Because on there are some of our classic songs from that period. It could be an interesting thing, because apparently on CD a lot of the older stuff sounds really good.

CASH BOX: Who are some of the songwriters you admire today, some of the new tion in Big Country, the inspiring sound, but it doesn't go anywhere else. I love the hope it has in it, the uplifting quality.

CASH BOX: You mentioned Tom Robinson: was "Prince Of The Punks" about him?

DAVIES: Half about him and half about Malcolm McLaren really. Because I could see that Malcolm McLaren was a con artist, he even conned the band he managed. But not so much about Tom Robinson. Tom just wanted to make it. He wanted to get out of his factory. But I'm kind of proud of when I was connected with him.

CASH BOX: How much did the punks spur you to do "Misfits"?

DAVIES: Well, it definitely inspired me to write "Misifts" because if you wrote anything at all poetic in 1977 or '78 you were crucified. So I went out and wrote a poetic song.

CASH BOX: Do you make it to the clubs every now and then when you're in New York?

DAVIES: I go and see Buster Poindexter

sometimes. I know David because I nearly signed the New York Dolls to Konk. I came over here esepcailly to sign them.

CASH BOX: What stopped you?

DAVIES: Because they wanted a lot of money (laughs). I think they were a wonderful band, they were one of the great lost bands. The thing about David Johansen is that one day he's gonna be a big star. I hope I can make a film to give him a part in. Cause he'd be really good. He's a guy who looks like he deserves what's coming to him, he's got that sort of cocky face. You know what I mean?

CASH BOX: He really does.

DAVIES: And I think the Buster Poindexter Band is really good. It's a good night out....I've been down (to Tramps) three or four times to see him there. It's great.

CASH BOX: How about the early days: what really happened that made it so you couldn't tour here for four years in the sixties?

DAVIES: Managers at the time had a disagreement with a promoter that we didn't really know about. I was about eighteen, nineteen, it was my first time in America. I remember the first time I came to New York I stayed in my hotel room. I was too scared to go out.

But there was something we didn't know about and the unions got involved and we got banned. And it was only lifted after we apologized for something we didn't do. Then we came back and we had to start from scratch. Because though we had hits people weren't in tune with what we were doing cause the first time we came here we had all those heavy rock n roll hits. Then during the period we didn't come we had all those ballads and all those lyrical songs and we're the sort of band that has to be seen so the audience can keep up with what we're doing, otherwise you lose touch. Certainly in that period, because that's when I was developing as a writer. But as we couldn't come here for four years there was a big hole in our career.

CASH BOX: But here you were writing your best songs like "Two Sisters" and "Waterloo Sunset." Didn't you feel — what is this?

DAVIES: Well I felt anger. It was just a real frustrating time (when) we couldn't get back. That's why I moved here in '78 and decided to give it a crack here.

CASH BOX: How have you managed to retain a certain amount of innocence after all you've been through?

DAVIES: First lesson I learned is to make people laugh at something because if you can be witty it's the biggest weapon ever. That's why I write sort of tounge in cheek lyrics. There's no point in going and trying to blow people away with your guitar, and power chords don't do anything except give you a headache. But if you can hit someone with wit and a good lyric it's better. A lot of my songs were inspired by - not depressbut bad situations. So come out ing laughing.

"I guess the intentions are pretty straight forward," says Jerry Shulman, vice president, marketing development. "CBS has a wonderful catalogue of what we think are classic jazz performances and we have been trying for some time to really bring them back, reissue them in the best quality sound reproduction that we can manage. We have really gone to great trouble to bring these to

Many of the albums in the "Jazz Masterpieces'' program have been widely available as CBS "Nice Price" midlines or through Columbia Special Products. In every case, several months before an album's digitallyremastered reissue, the other versions of the album will be deleted.

'Our initial release focused in on real classic albums," says Gary Pacheco, director of marketing and product development, "albums we felt were true historic landmarks. In the future, we're going to be doing a lot of new series in the "Jazz Masterpieces" line-we're going to do various compilations, keyed-in to time periods and, also, kinds of music. We're also going to be putting together totally new, comprehensive collections: we're going to do a complete retrospective of Billie Holiday's career, for instance; we're going to put together a number of Louis Armstrong collections-big band collections, small combo collections. We're going to do the same thing for Duke Ellington and Count Basie, it's really going to be a total reworking of the catalogue. Pacheco and Shulman emphasize that the program will be, mainly, for albums recorded prior to 1960 (the many Miles Davis' are, of course, an exception) and will be selective. They both rail against a recentlyimported eight-CD Billie Holiday collection from CBS Japan.

"Have you seen that Japan package?" asks Pacheco. "In my opinion, first of all, the sound quality stinks. We are not going to duplicate that package. We are not going to release a lot of the alternate takes. I really don't think that there are many consumers out there who want to hear three versions of the same song. We're going to pick the best take and put that on the record. In our efforts, sometimes, to satisfy the collectors who want all that stuff, you turn off the mass of people.'

But George Butler says that such decisions will be made on a case-by-case basis. "It's a situation where we discuss and decide and just see what ought to be. There's nothing that's etched in stone on any of this.

"It is our intention to reactivate Shelter Records and sign new acts to the label," said Ralfini. "The increase of activity will, of course, generate greater income to the publishing companies. Most of the catalogue has not been avaible in many territories around the world for some years, and the has been tremendous interest in issuing t catalogue on CD in these territories as w as promoting certain artists by reissuing lected singles and albums. The label cludes numerous gold and platinum albu by artists including Leon Russell, Tom Pe & The Heartbreakers, Phoebe Sno Dwight Twilley, Freddie King, the G Band, and many more."

Ralfini also stated that the compa plans to build a video company, to produ and release a wide mix of programs.

pared to \$51,738,000 or \$.69 per share 1985. Operating income decreased 82 p cent, income before taxes decreased 87 p cent and net income decreased 58 percent compared to 1985.

Music Entertainment reported reco revenues and increased operating income for both periods compared to 1985.

So, yes, applaud for Willie and for Farm Aid—as many of America's farmers are and many of the people those farmers feed should be. But also applaud for Mon Reve, and all the Mon Reves and Willie Nelsons in the family of country music entertainers, in fact in the family of people as a whole, who go so far out of their way to help in the cause. The "cause," when you get right down to it, is the sharing of the burden of fellow travelers so that none of the load is too heavy to bear.



GOSPEL MUSIC— AN INTERNATIONAL LANGUAGE

By Bram Keizer

Ithough the words of the Gospel are always have been "international," pel music, internationally viewed, still a long way to go. There already are itories in the world where the good and of gospel music can be heard, but nost cases, it is more limited to local ious music than to the music we depet these days as being gospel.

there is no doubt that gospel music its roots in America, but this very fact tes some problems for gospel music rs outside the U.S.

he first barrier is language. Although by people in the world do speak, or at tunderstand, the English language, it ill a problem to many. Therefore, gossongs need to be translated into local uage before they can be passed on to artists and producers.

his translation will take some time, time is also needed for the artists to y these new songs. The majority of American gospel artists are still amas or have untrained voices.

one of the reasons is the lack of musieducation in the public or university sol systems in most countries. In erica everybody seems to take music ons at the elementary school level, all colleges have their bands and rs. In other countries, those who t to be educated in music must go to cial schools or a private music her.

ince the songs have been translated the artists reach a level of professionevelopment, we will start to see some ilts. From my own experience, I do say that it will take approximately e years before these results of songt exploitation and/or promotion beo be visible. After this point has been hed it will mushroom.

nother drawback to be faced is that e is no gospel music recording indusn Europe like that in America. There

are some labels, but they are not very powerful, and the records they release are usually American product. These do not always fit our European ears, sounding "too American" to us.

Does this all mean that there is no future for gospel music in Europe or the rest of the world outside America? No, to the contrary! In countries where something is happening in the gospel music industry, many local composers and lyricists are writing contemporary gospel music instead of the style works they did before. And many small organizations are trying to find each other to join hands in their efforts to let people know that gospel music is out there.

If we aid these efforts (and there is no doubt about the willingness to do so), then we create a world network of people and organizations all speaking the same "international" language of gospel music. Bram Keizer is managing director for Universal Songs Holland, a music publishing company based in Hilversum, the Netherlands, representing (besides their own extensive catalog) many catalogs from America, England and other countries. In addition, he is one of the founders and the current president of the Gospel Music Association-Holland and is a vice president on the board of the American Gospel Music Association.



Rich Mullins' second LP is some work of art. His songs, which he wrote or co-wrote, deal with emotions as they relate to faith. Simple, yet intense, melodies emphasize his lyrics. Highlights include the inspiring "Verge Of A Miracle," the ballad "Be With You" and the acapella-harmonies on the '50's style "Faith Without Works" ("is about as useless as a screen door on a submarine"). These are pictures you won't want to miss.



Opening the door for Christians into heavy metal music, Stryper pulls no punches when it comes to lyrics that drive home the message. For example, the title cut, "To Hell With The Devil" would get the meaning across even if it had no lyrics! All of the tunes contain solid songwriting, and with the addition of dynamic lead vocals by Michael Sweet, they do a very credible job. A pleasant surprise lies between the lines of the ballad "All Of Me." It's a *slow* song sung in a high mode.



Two New Games From Data East

CHICAGO—"Last Mission", an "affordable" dedicated upright game, and "Firetrap", a vertical kit, were recently introduced by Data East of San Jose, California.

Last Mission calls for skill and strategy as the player invades hostile forces with a multitude of acquired weapons, using a 360 degree joystick for firing action and control. The objective is to restore honor to the outcasts and in their quest the players move through vertical and horizontal scrolling as they seek out and destroy enemies by maneuvering their aircraft in every scene over an area which is sixteen times greater than the monitor screen.

Firetrap's unique game play challenges

players to climb burning skyscrapers, distinguish the fires and rescue those who are trapped inside. Armed with water bombs and a good pair of hands they must avoid such obstacles as falling bricks, cars, glass, etc. as they make their way to the top. Control comes from two joysticks so players must climb and shoot their water cannon simultaneously using a pair of 4-way joysticks to add to the challenge.
