The latter two have dropped off of this short list. The albums which remain from last time have not otherwise changed. Significant is the strength with which ELO and Lynyrd Skynyrd have powered their way onto the air. Bowie comes on, but not as strong as he should - which implies that the LP is still a little outside. The airplay is equivalent to a superstar getting polite applause. Any regional interest is generated out of the South, where Lynyrd Skynyrd is No. 1 in airplay and Camel is in 7th position while not cracking the top 10 anywhere else.

#### Christmas Programming Notes

In order to assist programmers, we have researched our back-issues and combined a list of promotions that our correspondents have used with success during past Holiday seasons. The first group listed would be run in conjunction with charities. (Public service-oriented promotions are extremely popular at this time.) The second group would involve primarily the station itself.

#### Charity

- A "Pollyanna" system of gift-giving. (A Pollyanna is the arrangement of having each person in an office, class or whatever, draw someone else's name and provide a gift for that person anonymously.) Station asks listeners to send in cards or gifts to be distributed by the charity. Each hour, six or eight names of donors are acknowledged on the air with thanks. At the end of the hour one of those names is announced as winner of a gift from the station. (WIP-Philadelphia, 1975)
- "Tree of Lights". Station broadcasts daily from a mobile unit set up at a downtown plaza. Listeners stop by to make contributions. Each \$5.00 donation lights a light on the charity's nearby Christmas tree. Various artists can be scheduled for personal appearances at the broadcast unit. (WSLR-Akron, 1974)
- "Operation Adoption". Listeners are asked to "adopt" an individual child from a local orphanage or children's home, by providing up to three presents for the child. (Station supplies clothing sizes, toys desired, and so forth.) Donors wrap and tag gifts, then take them to the station for delivery Christmas Eve. (KTVF-Phoenix, 1973)
- "Adoption". In cooperation with a foster-child organization, "adopt" as many children as possible, by giving them new shoes for Christmas. Station solicits contributions from listeners. (WMC-Memphis, 1976)
- "Secret Santa". Station selects letters from needy children, collected through local schools. Listeners are invited to "play Santa" by delivering gifts to the children in person. (KHEY-El Paso, 1976, 1977)
- #### Station
- "Artist Holiday Interviews". As artists make themselves available, station requests a description of their most memorable Christmas. Appropriate music is added and the three to four minute vignettes are aired hourly, starting mid-December. (WMC-Memphis, 1974)
- "Spell Christmas". Jerry Boulding in Chicago tells us of a current promotion WVON is running. Once an hour, listeners pick the letter out of "WVON" and whatever is under that letter--albums, cash, appliances, a trip--becomes their Christmas prize.
- "Christmas Spectacular". Offer a \$1,000 shopping spree as a grand prize. (KFMD-Shreveport, 1973)
- "Toy Shopping". A 3-minute toy shopping spree is offered in a local toy store in which the winner keeps all the toys they can put in a carriage. Winner is selected by letters nominating a family in need of toys. (Dick Smith, WORC-Worcester, 1974)
- "Christmas Greeting Call". Winners each day can call anywhere in the U.S.A., free. (Dick Smith, WORC-Worcester, 1974)
- "Santa's Bag". Listeners call in and choose a numbered gift out of Santa's bag. Gifts include cameras, popcorn poppers, TVs, and so on. (KBOX-Dallas, 1973)
- "Christmas Memories". Listeners submit in writing, thoughts of their most memorable Christmas. Staff edits and produces the "localized" memory into one to three-minute vignettes. (KFGO-Fargo, 1975)
- "Christmas Carol". Listeners send in wishes to a woman called "Christmas Carol" and she grants one wish daily for the twelve days before Christmas. Winners are judged by need, human interest appeal and station's ability to grant the wish. (WPOC-Baltimore, 1975)
- "Carolers". A station's "Carolers" are composed of local school, church and club choral groups. They give nightly Christmas concerts in shopping malls and can be recorded and broadcast Christmas Eve and Christmas Day. (WFTL-Ft. Lauderdale, 1974)
- "Year-End Review". Station plays its year-end review Christmas Day and listeners who guess the top five correctly receive watches or other items as prizes. (KERE-Denver, 1975)

Some interesting albums of a more pop dimension merit some note. Neil Diamond and John Denver won't get much airplay on progressive stations but they represent something we old hippies enjoy. That is, the infiltration into pop music of real artists. Both Diamond and Denver write their own material. Denver, especially, comes out of a folk music tradition which grounds him in a solid musical way. Better than some of the mindless turkeys who do make it in the pop world.

Finally, there are a couple of mixed metaphor albums of note. First, Emerson, Lake & Palmer Works II is a collection of individual pieces, sounding like leftovers from Works I, which fill in the time but don't make an album. The pieces are often very nice.

Then there is the Cher & Gregg Allman album which we partisans would have enjoyed more had it shown Cher to be the rock singer she could be. It only goes part of the way and Gregg becomes a party to some songs arranged to please her TV audience. They want to have it both ways.

Gavin's Gab

Bruce Cannon, KTAC-Tacoma, recounted a harrowing version of their experience with the massive flooding in western Washington last weekend. Heavy rains and melting snow caused the Puyallup and Snohomish Rivers to overflow and by Bruce's account, the water came within 1/2" of KTAC's transmitter early last Friday morning. Most of the staff, a large group of volunteers and members of the National Guard spent 16 hours in waist-deep water sandbagging the base of the transmitter. Near-freezing temperatures in and out of the water made warming up later, painful, but current from the transmitter would have felt worse had the water reached the tower. Fortunately, that didn't happen and by this weekend flood waters have receded, for the most part.  
 Correspondents across the country reported record snow storms and blizzards this week. Jay Scott at WEBC-Duluth talked about 30-below-0 weather, a four month old steel strike in northern Minnesota and the Duluth Transit Authority's recent strike, happening all at once. They set up a Ride Line connecting bus commuters with car pools and Jay estimates they've helped 3,000 people find rides to work. "Running On Empty"-Jackson Browne (Asylum) A month on the road with the incomparable Mr. Browne. Recorded at rehearsals, in the tour bus, at the Edwardsville Holiday Inn (Room 124) and on stage (in front of a real audience) "Running On Empty" has the raw edge that comes with these more casual recording sessions but it's really all within the nature of the man. The album has more than its share of road songs: RUNNING ON EMPTY/NOTHING BUT TIME/THE LOAD-OUT and STAY (Maurice Williams would never recognize the lyric) and they represent the heart and soul of the album.

Mailbag

Michael O'Shea, P.D. of KVI-Seattle, adds three more items to my recently published "Guidelines for PD's", as follows:

- 1) Make yourself available to your sales manager to go on sales calls. Not only will you make a solid impression on a prospective client...but you will learn the most basic and important element in business...the cash transaction.
- 2) Don't "motivate by memo". Each air personality (and staff member) has a different "hot button"...and therefore each should have a different way to be motivated. Learn the personality differences of each person in your department...then work with them in individual "one-on-one" meetings. Too many things can be written into memos (between the lines).
- 3) Set an example. If you expect your people to put in "full days", and give 110%...the Program Director must "lead" in the example setting. Short days and long lunches are hypocritical, when you ask your subordinates to do more than you do.

Before leaving WFTL-Ft. Lauderdale, Michael had the responsibility of finding a successor for his PD job. He writes that he was "absolutely appalled" at the way some people applied for the job. As a result, he compiled a list of do's and don'ts for job advancement:

- 1) Don't send a "form letter"...or a mimeographed resume. In most instances, this "first letter" will be the initial contact between the applicant and the manager or PD who's offering the job. This first contact should be positive...and leave a good impression. It should be in the form of a personal letter, outlining briefly who you are...and why you're writing.
- 2) Written presentation. Your initial letter should be accompanying a reasonably thorough and well thought out "written presentation". A tape would also be an important part of this presentation. If you're applying for a programming position it should be a tape of the station as a whole...including air personalities, promotions/contests, news, etc. The written presentation should include some of your programming philosophies, thoughts and observations...to give the reviewer a real chance to "get inside your head", because that's what he's interested in...your head, not your tape splicing talents.
- 3) Make it physically attractive. Dress it up...put it in a nice binder, categorize it by sections, include "scrapbook" glimpses of your past efforts (newspaper or trade paper clippings, awards, letters from community or industry leaders, letters from listeners, even.) If I'm asking a prospective employee to prepare such a presentation for me, I'll tell him/her that they cannot send me too much material. I need every ounce of input available to make such a critical decision.
- 4) The Interview. If the previously mentioned material has impressed the reviewer enough...then the next step in the "personal interview"...usually at the employers expense. Instead of just "winging" the interview...try to have a more specific "plan of attack" prepared and customized as much as possible for the market/station you're going into. Talk "goals"..."timetables"...and "methods of reaching goals and timetables". If possible, have this in writing, too.
- 5) The Wrapup. Most job offers (at least the biggies) don't come during the personal interview...but are made firm days or weeks later, after the employer has reviewed the other applicants...and has a chance to digest all data and applicants. Therefore, I suggest a "followup" letter, after the personal interview. In this letter, let the employer know how pleased you are to be considered for the opening, then again express to him/her the "goals" and "timetables" that you presented during the interview...and let the employer know that you're very confident that you are the person for the job, etc. Do not call the employer after the "followup" letter, unless he/she has asked you for the call.
- 6) Don't apply for every job. The aforementioned five steps are intricate and time consuming. Wait 'til the opening you are most suited for comes along...don't apply for jobs like a shotgun (with pellets flying in all directions). Apply like a high powered rifle...select the job "just right" for you...then take careful aim...and shoot one shot into the bullseye.

We're grateful for these ideas from Michael O'Shea. We'd like to hear from other readers on these - or any other - subjects.

Inside Progressive Radio  
(by George Meier, Editor of Walrus)

Though there were not very many albums released in the last couple of weeks, there are an abundance of interesting LP's.

Pat Metheny, for example, has established himself as a fine young jazz guitarist who is a bit on the intellectual side. His group's new live album shows another, more satisfying emotional side to his nature.

A further point of interest is the release of the Sex Pistols album in the U.S. Whether their angry intensity translates to the U.S. is the question mark of the year.

Then there is an inside out Earth, Wind & Fire. They move back to melodies. On the other hand, Parliament provides nothing new. They need nothing new. Just good music and their rare, musical sense of humor are enough to sustain them.

A different group of albums makes itself interesting because of miscalculations and malfunctions. There is the Alice Cooper Live album which is sonically like the arena it was recorded in and which doesn't improve the Cooper delivery like his recent studio LP's have. Likewise, 10cc gives a routine performance of their great tunes and their mediocre tunes. One record instead of two, would have done it better.

In a slight change of life, Bette Midler moves to the middle of the road while Boz Scaggs confirms his rhythm and bluesness. This time his songs aren't as strong as they have been.

Two notable albums round out the pile. Otis Blackwell's LP on Inner City charts the course that Elvis took while The Story of Star Wars uses clever editing and a narration to make Star Wars into a radio drama on record. It works, too!

We were very sorry to hear about the death of G. Laverne Flambeau. He was with Mid America Radio, Inc. for over twenty years.

Stations get extraordinarily magnanimous during the Holiday season. This is particularly noticeable as we hear more about some of the charity-oriented events that are being run. WJVA-South Bend conducts a "Penny Pitch" project that draws well from the community. The county welfare office selects several families who are in need of assistance. Shortly after Thanksgiving, WJVA begins requesting donations which are used to purchase goods and services for the families. Begun in 1975, "Penny Pitch" raised \$5,000 in 1975 and again in 1976. Local organizations such as the Jay-Cees and CBers assist in the fund-raising. WJVA's "Big Red Country Cruiser" delivers the presents Christmas Eve.

"Here at Y16 we're taking great pains to eliminate the things we find out are irritating our listeners, as much as possible and giving them more of what they want. Now as basic as that statement is, it's not hard to realize that there are a lot of typical top 40 stations not doing that. For example, we find that here in Jackson, people want to hear more than one record without talk. They don't like to hear the announcer talk over all the record intros. They do like to hear album cuts. And they do like the surprise element that you mentioned so many programmers have eliminated."

"Don Juan's Reckless Daughter"-Joni Mitchell (Asylum) The formula is uniquely Joni's. She's almost single-handedly responsible for the merger of jazz and folk. This is a multi-level album with both the accessible and abstract trading off from cut to cut. Mitchell's acoustic guitar and the haunting bass of Jaco Pastorius set peculiar moods for her equally eccentric lyric. Contestants must call their versions in and must be able to recite the Clement C. Moore version before their own is considered. Winners get Christmas hams as prizes. KISD-Sioux Falls' "Magic Money Holidays" requires listeners to decorate their house, rooftop or lawn using the station somewhere within the decoration. Cash and prizes total \$6,000. Tom Evans at KISD described one entry being considered that featured a Santa wearing headphones. KPUG-Bellingham, Washington's "Christmas Car" promo has three prizes hidden in the back of the car and clues are given as to what they are. The car is driven around town for exposure but it's not one of the prizes. Tony Booth at WFBG-Altoona, Pa. described a promotion they call the "30 Hours of Christmas" that is run on Christmas Eve and Day. Vignettes, special local stories and documentaries are aired. Tony tells us the promotion has had great response the last eight years.

Charity efforts by stations are increasing also. We heard about this phenomenal food drive... WAAY-Huntsville collected 50,000 lbs. of food with the help of local high school students that will supply 1,500 needy families, this season. WLOF-Orlando held a "Christmas Cash for Kids" Radiothon for 48 hours earlier this week that raised \$2,100 for toys for local children. Steve Warren at WGLF-Tallahassee described a marriage ceremony performed on their airwaves that Steve says brought very encouraging response. A spontaneous conversation with the bride, taped prior to the wedding, became installments of the "Story of Linda and Greg" on the air. Listeners were invited to the wedding which was performed in a downtown park by WGLF General Manager Bruce Webb.

## Yearly Summary

Looking Back

A year ago we wrote that 1976 had been the year of the computer. To say now that 1977 was the year of the telephone would not be quite the case; but certainly radio found a new use for the phones in applying them to callout research. At some stations this form of music research has completely replaced the old dependence on sales reports from the stores. In addition to testing listener music preferences, it also permits programmers to sample listener attitudes and needs in non-music areas. Used properly, callout research can be a sort of continuing community ascertainment operation.

From the standpoint of statistical analysis, simply asking people what they like or dislike, and how much, is not a wholly reliable research technique, although in general the results are fairly accurate. It is a fact that what people do is a safer guide to their preferences than what they say. That was the reason that for over twenty years the records that people bought were the ones they liked best. The resulting sales charts were valid reflections of record popularity with the demographic group represented by the sample of those who bought the records. However, when the sample size of singles buyers became so small, radio programmers were compelled to find other means of determining music popularity trends.

The declining significance of the single record, plus the continued growth of album sales, have focused programmer interest on finding out which album cuts are most liked by their listeners. As a result of scattered callouts on the album level, some stations have successfully pinpointed specific standout album cuts. In the old days, most of these programmers wouldn't have put an album cut on their air until assured by the record people that it was definitely going to be released as a single. Now it doesn't seem to matter all that much.

The old boundaries that once sharply defined the different formats are being broken down. Pop hits make their way onto playlists in country, black and adult playlists. Country hits "crossover", as do the R&B's. Hybrid format variations continue to appear, as skilled programmers and consultants modify the old systems. We hear of "mellow rock", "personality rock", "progressive country", "album rock", "progressive rock", "progressive black", "beautiful music", "adult contemporary", and so on. This isn't to imply that all these labels came into being in 1977; it's just that the current radio year has witnessed the greatest ever multiplication of format ideas.

Many, if not most, of radio's changes have been either pioneered by FM stations or motivated on AM by the pressure of FM competition. In its early days, FM radio attracted few listeners and fewer advertising dollars. Minimum budgets often led either to automation or to small air staffs, overworked and underpaid. Commercial spots were few and far between, leaving lots of room for the music. In part, it was FM's long periods of uninterrupted music that produced a steady audience growth, mostly at AM's expense. When increasing commercial schedules started rolling in at FM's doors, most managers were shrewd enough not to overload the commercial spot content as AM had done. The year now ending has seen many AM stations cutting back on their maximum spot loads in order to meet the FM competition.

Another aspect of the FM vs. AM battle finds many major AM stations with heavy community commitments - pledges of air time for public service which many - though far from all - FM's have avoided. This is particularly notable in the field of black radio, where the established AM stations devote considerable time and effort toward bettering conditions in the black community, while the FM competition just plays the music.

Looking back on 1977's trends, we see a growing similarity in the music being played on adult contemporary stations and those that we still euphemistically call "top 40". We also note that many A-C stations have shortened their playlists and reduced the time intervals in their record rotation patterns. Top 40, on the other hand, has been getting away from its old, impersonal, high energy sound and, in some instances, encouraging its air people to emerge as personalities.

During the past year, as in all other years, we at The Gavin Report are grateful for the loyal co-operation of our correspondents and for the confidence and support of our subscribers. As our readership continues to grow, we are more aware than ever of our responsibility for accurate and dependable reflections of record popularity trends throughout the nation. As we get ready to start a new year, we're resolved to maintain the high standards of independence and integrity that our readers have come to expect.

Inside Progressive Radio  
(by George Meier, Editor of Walrus)

Year's End

If you were to snap a picture of 1977 for comparison with 1967, aside from the browning edges, the differences would be negligible. A decade ago, tightly formatted pop radio had no way to include the vast amount of album music which was exploding around it. The result, with the help of the FCC, was the emergence of progressive radio. Not half as radical as people said, the new format was just another system for exposing an abundance of new music.

1977 closes the first ten years of the new format, a period which parallels the first ten years of Top 40 radio in its move from a jock-centered concept to a program-centered formulation.

Lee Abrams, the progressive programming consultant who is teaching the old boys new tricks, is the unquestioned dominant figure. He consults around 35 stations, but his concepts have influenced many more than that.

Progressive radio is now, by comparison at least, a tightly formatted popular form. Whether it will be able to adjust to an important new wave of music, the tides of which have only begun to reach our shores, is a key to the immediate future. Just how tightly reined are the progressives? Will their resistance to the new wave generate new radio formats to slice another chunk out of the total rock audience? Or will they learn from the error ten years ago which permitted their very existence? Will they absorb the new age of music which started in 1977?

Tune in next year as the '60's continue to fade.

May

Country music takes over New York's Carnegie Hall for a coast-to-coast radio network broadcast, featuring many top country stars. Meri Wilson's recording of "TELEPHONE MAN" motivates a storm of favorable phone requests and also some listener protests. Regional Radio Meeting in Philadelphia. Appreciation dinner for retiring ABC promotion man, Matty Singer. PD shuffle: Les Garland from WRKO to KFRC; Ed Brady from WMGC-Cleveland to WSLR-Akron.

June

WQXI-Atlanta holds 9th Annual Raft Race - 60,000 people on rafts in river, 200,000 spectators line river banks. KOIN-Portland becomes KYTE, switches from A-C to rock format. Regional Radio Meeting in Milwaukee. Charles Warner and Bob Pittman resign as GM & PD respectively at WMAQ to take similar jobs at WNBC; replaced by Burton Sherwood as GM and Bill Hennes as PD, both from WIBG. Regional Radio Meeting in Denver, Ken Palmer the star. Damaging fire sweeps studios of WMC-Memphis, but they were off the air only ten minutes. PD shuffle: Dean Tyler from WIP to WNEW; Joel Denver from WFIL to 96X-Miami; Gary Stevens promoted at KIOA-Des Moines

July

Mel Phillips, ex-WNBC, sets up shop in New York as radio program consultant. Sizzling heat in Midwest and East. Power failure in New York shuts down stations lacking emergency generators. Another Johnstown flood. PD shuffle: Mark Denver promoted at WWWL-Miami; Quincy McCoy from Y100 to Z93-Atlanta. Paul Drew resigns as Program Co-ordinator of RKO chain, continues as consultant.

August

Nation mourns death of Elvis Presley. Over 60,000 attend 3rd Annual WIRE Country Picnic in Indianapolis. PD shuffle: Dave Shaw from KKUA to KORL-Honolulu; Ray Quinn from WAMS to Y100. Announcement of Janet's untimely death draws widespread expressions of sorrow and sympathy from her legion of friends throughout the nation.

September

Elma Greer, Robyn Bebbington and Lisa Smith join staff of The Gavin Report. Gary Taylor named managing editor. Great Texas Raft race on Brazos River sponsored by KRZI-Waco, 132 rafts, over 30,000 spectators. Regional Radio meeting in Portland, Oregon, tops all our others in number of people registered. Carol Singer resigns as music director of WRKO. Airman Don Cox comes to KHJ from 13Q. Beau Raines replaces Lee Douglas as PD at WPEZ. Jim Heath moves from KULF-Houston to KCMO-Kansas City as air talent. Kevin Metheny from KMJC-San Diego to WIBG (now WZZD) as PD.

The Year Of The Album 1977  
(by Ron Fell)

1977 saw radio giving more attention to albums than in any previous year. The album format stations multiplied like rabbits and became serious threats to traditional singles-oriented rock stations. These new stations were only acknowledging what record companies already knew: albums are where it's at. Individual songs can be played successfully before they are pressed with a big hole in the middle.

Few will challenge the Gavin Report's designation of Fleetwood Mac's "Rumours" as Album of the Year. Four hit singles and significant airplay for nearly every other cut on the album have kept "Rumours" active on our stations' turntables for the entire year.

Heavy airplay was rewarded by our correspondents for outstanding albums by Steely Dan, Steve Miller, James Taylor, Heart, Abba, Barbra Streisand and Barry Manilow.

Peter Frampton and Boz Scaggs released albums this year which suffered by comparison with their 1976 masterpieces but nonetheless have realized sizeable airplay.

1977 marked the successful reformation of Crosby, Stills & Nash, and the return to prominence for Santana, Gregg Allman, Dave Mason, Jennifer Warnes, Cat Stevens and the Grateful Dead. Randy Newman came out of hiding with another masterpiece, "Little Criminals". The real crime is the interminably long wait between Newman albums.

Some artists released albums this year which were artistically progressive but were beyond the perimeters of pop rock. Emerson, Lake & Palmer's "Works I" and "Works II", Pink Floyd's "Animals" and David Bowie's "Heroes" will linger long after much of the formula rock and roll of the mid '70's becomes tomorrow's nostalgia.

Trend of the year was New Wave and/or Punk Rock. Elvis Costello and the Sex Pistols exposed themselves to Americans with Fall '77 releases, but look for Television, Talking Heads, and the Stranglers to contribute in '78 with improved presentations over their initial offerings this year. I'm of the opinion that New Wave can make a dent here next year but it may take some compromise on the part of artists and audiences. We are not likely to see anarchy and violence as entertainment in America, unless it's on the six o'clock news.

Three "Live" albums of an historic nature surfaced in '77. The Bee Gees' "Here At Last", The Rolling Stones' "Love You Live", and the Beatles' "Hollywood Bowl". While the Beatles' 1963 concert got only curiosity play, the Stones got plenty of airplay. The Bee Gees were close to perfect with their "one take" performance - a true state of the art recording.

The most successful new group of 1977 was Foreigner. A steady stream of quality singles has flowed from our March 4th "Album of the Week".

Linda Ronstadt's "Simple Man, Simple Dreams" gave birth to two hit singles almost simultaneously and two other hot cuts are waiting in the wings - TUMBLIN' DICE and POOR POOR PITIFUL ME.

Kenny Loggins and Dennis Wilson got long-awaited opportunities to solo and their works were acknowledged with appreciable airplay.

In the Country field there were some very popular albums again this year with RCA taking the lion's share of airplay through albums by Waylon Jennings, Ronnie Milsap, Jim Ed Brown & Helen Cornelius, Dolly Parton and Dave & Sugar. Emmylou Harris and the two sisters, Crystal Gayle and Loretta Lynn, contributed significantly to the biggest year of female vocalists in the history of recorded music, while Vern Gosdin, Kenny Rogers and Don Williams albums were among the stronger male entries in '77.

Earth, Wind and Fire's "All 'N All", released just before Thanksgiving, may well prove to be one of the biggest black albums ever. Other significant black albums by Donna Summer and the Commodores (two each), the Brothers Johnson, and the Emotions prove that the R&B/Disco sound is not limited to singles.

At the close of the year, Electric Light Orchestra's "Out Of The Blue" was getting great airplay out of its first single, TURN TO STONE and five other cuts from the two-record set. Neil Diamond and John Denver were dominating A/C play.

As we turn to 1978, look for more good music and increased airplay for Karla Bonoff, Bob Welch, George Thorogood (Rounder Records), Rockets (Tortoise/RCA), Eddie Money, The Babys, and Andrew Gold.

In 1977, more than 2,000 contemporary albums were released. Some record companies over-committed in their zeal to secure large portions of airplay, stretching programmers to the limit trying to absorb all the music intended for their formats. By summer of this year, some companies realized their mistake and commenced to drastically trim their talent rosters. This efficiency move will manifest itself in 1978 with fewer albums, probably of higher quality. The increased cost of vinyl and the exorbitant cost of production, coupled with the high failure factor were the real reasons we saw the \$7.98 list for so many albums. Hopefully, 1978 will be a year when a higher ratio of good to bad will come about preventing further waste of time and money.

October

Regional Radio Meeting in Louisville. Bill celebrates his 70th birthday with a group of friends at New York City's Friars Club. Country Music Festival in Nashville October 10-15. Earth News sold - becomes Newsprint. Female artists hold the top 5 spots on Gavin Report's Recommended Playlist. KRZI-Waco transmitter burns down. Gary Firth replaces Al McLaughlin as PD at KRIZ-Phoenix.

November

Christy Wright resigns as music co-ordinator for RKO group. Debbie Avison hired as music analyst for KHJ. Richard Woodward now doing the music at WRKO. Michael Spears resigns at KHJ. PD shuffle: Dick Bentley promoted at WBBM/FM; Roger W. Morgan from KOIL to KMJC-San Diego.

December

Floods in Western Washington threaten many radio transmitters. Record snow and cold in Midwest and East, with 1977 going out on the same furious note on which it began last January. PD shuffle: Larry Ahrens promoted at KBCQ-Roswell; Bill McCown promoted at WANS-Anderson; Rick Erickson from WQUA-Quad Cities to KSTT-Davenport. Gary Stevens named president of Doubleday Broadcasting.

Looking Ahead

As we looked ahead just one year ago, we noted "a mixed economy that shows softness in several areas, continuing tensions in Southern Africa and the Near East, worldwide problems in the fields of energy and monetary stability, plus localized problems like housing, taxes, inflation, conservation and atomic power."

It seems that as 1977 draws to a close we are still confronted with the same set of problems, some more critical than before, others seemingly nearer to a solution.

Radio faces a new danger - the possibility of a new copyright law that will require payment of royalties to performers and record companies for the broadcast use of their recordings. At present, all the heavy artillery of the NAB, the NRBA, the RAB and many individual radio powerhouses is trained on Congress, ready for a total effort to block such legislation. The recording industry, for obvious reasons, supports the legislation that is so strongly opposed by broadcasters.

Our sympathies are naturally on radio's side. If it became necessary to increase rate cards to cover this new kind of royalty payments, it would place radio at a competitive disadvantage versus other media in the struggle for the advertising dollar.

One weakness in the record companies' case is the failure to demonstrate inequity in the existing arrangement. Producers and performers today - and record companies as well - profit from the excellence of their work, in direct proportion to its popular appeal, as reflected in sales. The proposed new law would in effect provide a blanket subsidy for record companies and their artists without reference to the quality of their product.

Under the proposed legislation, a major station, billing a million dollars a year, would pay annual royalties of 1% of the gross, \$10,000 plus \$750 for the license. That doesn't sound like a large bite at first glance, but when looked at in terms of how much it would cut into the bottom line, it would make a substantial dent in the profits.

Press reports indicate that proponents of the new copyright bill seem to outnumber those who side with broadcasters. If the bill passes, radio will just have to live with it. And maybe it won't be quite as bad as it is now being painted. After all, the bill omits the 1% royalty from smaller stations and provides total exemption for the smallest. Even with major stations, a rate card increase to offset the royalties would be small compared to some of the rate increases made recently to compensate for reduced commercial spot loads. After all, radio has survived worse difficulties: the ASCAP blackout in 1940, the musicians' ban a few years later, the battle between 33 1/3's & 45's and the advent of television, to mention only a few. As we look forward to 1978, we're confident of radio's profitable survival, regardless of new laws.

And so it's time to wrap up another year and consign it to memories - some sad, some happy. The Christmas season is a time for families and friends, renewing their love and affection for each other. We wish for all our readers the friendly warmth that these days generate, as we turn from our selfish concerns and devote ourselves to bringing happiness to others.
