

# Branson's Assault On Radio Airwaves

After AM and FM comes...JM, or Jumbo Modulation. "This development," promises British billionaire entrepreneur Richard Branson, "will put

conventional radio station owners in a complete tailspin."

Station owners will be alone. Government regulators and music copyright owners are also bound to be challenged by Branson's revolutionary develwhich opment, exploits the littleknown and under-utilized IM band of the broadcasting spectrum nestling in the range between FM and shortwave.

On his JM service Branson, who founded Virgin Records, a chain of megastores, and Virgin Airways, intends to circumvent regulatory controls by beaming a powerful

high-fidelity stereo signal across great swathes of the U.S. from Virgin Atlantic airplanes which will act like sub-orbital satellites.

With new routes across continental America planned to keep at least three planes in the air in strategic locations at any one time, the new service will effectively provide a national network comprising 10 separate format music stations, plus a news/talk station.

Branson, who first entered the radio business last year with Virgin 1215 in the UK, contends the JM networks will not be subject to FCC rules and as a further blow to a music industry already worried by new technology avoiding normal distribution

methods, Branson intends to exploit a loophole in copyright legislation. If successful, he will not have to pay a cent in royalties for music played on the air.

Branson said that he hit upon the idea when trying

to work out how to make more use of his growing fleet of expensive aircraft and at the same time improve the in-flight entertainment package.

In an exclusive interview with Gavin, which he whimsically chose to conduct by standard satellite uplink, Branson said: "I'm glad I got out of the record business when I did, but now I've got to decide what to do with my existing radio station and record retail holdings. We are planning a rapid worldwide roll-out for the JM service and at this rate I could make myself obsolete within five years."

The official launch date for Jumbo Modulation is, naturally, April 1.

# FCC Issues Warning On Minority Hiring

If your minority hiring practices have been lax since you last renewed your station's broadcast license, you could run into trouble with the FCC.

At the recent NAB '94 convention, a panel of attorneys warned that when license renewal applications start again in 1995, the Commission will be scrutinizing the interviewing, hiring and promotion of women and minorities.

"Go home and audit your hiring and promotion policy," attorney Richard Zaragoza urged.

The Commission will be looking closely at minority and female rates of hire, and if it's 50% less than parity, and the promotion is

less than 50% of parity, the offending station runs the risk of being fined.

"This is not something to take lightly," FCC attorney Charles W. (Chuck) Kelley warned. "The Commission, Congress and the White House feels very strongly about these issues."

EEO guidelines have been re-written since the Clinton Administration took over, and broadcasters are being urged by the FCC to study the new rules. They will be in effect retroactive to the last time a station applied for renewal.

At a separate meeting, Sconnix Broadcasting partner Randy Odeneal called expressed his dislike for the new policy, and went as far as calling it "scary," but he urged broadcasters to be diligent in their interviewing and hiring policies.

In the attorneys meeting, a broadcaster from a small market expressed frustration about the new rules. "I don't know how I can fix it," he said. All the attorneys on the panel sat up and said, almost in unison: "You can't fix it."

A participant, after pointing out that there were no women or minorities on the panel, told broadcasters who were looking for places to search out women and minorities to look to organizations such as the American Women in Radio and Television (AWRT), the National Association of Black Owned Broadcasters (NABOB), and even local universities for qualified applicants.

# **KKSF Loses Bias Suit**

Ginnie Waters, a weekend talk-show host on KKSF-San Francisco, has won a lawsuit she filed after she was terminated while on pregnancy-disability leave. She said her pregnancy had caused the dismissal, a violation of state and federal law. A San Francisco Superior Court jury awarded her \$87,500 in back pay and damages for emotional distress.

The jury found no "despicable conduct" and awarded no punitive damages.

Steve Feinstein, program director at the Brown Broadcasting-owned station, declined to comment on the matter. However, Waters, whose show featured interviews with a wide range of subjects in arts and entertainment and had been on

the A² station since mid-1989 until she was fired in July 1992, was happy to talk.

"It was never about the amount," she said. "To have 12 people tell you you're right...that's worth all the money in the world."

Waters' show, called Something Different, had been renewed in late 1991, and she had been given a raise the following February, the month before she went on leave. Assured by management that she would not be cancelled (an experience she had gone through eight years ago), said Waters, she was shocked to hear from KKSF, three weeks before she was due back, that her show might be cancelled. Days before her scheduled return, she was terminated

with no severance pay. According to Richard Satz, Waters' attorney (and brother), "their side was that she was cancelled due to poor economic performance of the station, and of low ratings on her show. But," he asked Gavin rhetorically, "what changed between February and July of 1991? Their economics improved, and her ratings were generally better for her time slot."

Waters was in New York for an appearance on Sally Jessy Raphael's show. Before leaving, she said she hoped that, with her victory, that "women no longer have to be put in the position of making a choice between having children and work."

Brown and KKSF have the right to appeal the decision.

# NAB Panels Cover Small Markets, Promotions, Jobs, Infomercials

NAB '94, which set an attendance record by passing the 70,000 mark, was really a video extravaganza, but radio programmers and executives who made the trip to Las Vegas were rewarded with interesting and informative sessions.

Equal employment guidelines were of utmost concern to broadcasters who are heading toward the next round of license renewals in 1995 (see page 3), but they could choose from a full slate of information-packed sessions. Here are some highlights:

• Small/Medium Market Idea Swap. Even though the convention didn't officially begin until Monday morning, a full house greeted the four panelists at this

session, which offered new ideas to smaller stations who are looking for creative and cost-effective ways to build both revenue and recognition.

Both Dan Latham of WBEX/WKKJ-Cincinnati and Richard Wartell Manhattan (Kan.) Broadcasting, Inc. stressed the importance of local and regional sports in secondary markets. "In small towns, sometimes not much is going on and the weekly game is a big event," said Latham. "High school sports in America is something you can hang your hat

Wartell's FM is a musicoriented album station, and his outlet woos listeners by offering them a chance to become "couch potatoes." A couch is placed on the arena floor at Kansas Jayhawks games. Retailers supply refreshments and receive visibility during the game. The well-received promotion generates revenue in the form of ad dollars for the station and recognition for the advertiser.

• Best of the Best Radio Promotion. Representatives from stations who were recognized by the NAB for the best community service-and promotion-oriented promotions of 1993 laid out in detail some fascinating promotions.

WPXC-Hyannis' Al Makkay described his station's listener's as "rock and roll party animals." With Coca-Cola's help, WPXC devised a designated driver program. Participating restaurants and clubs pro-

vide free non-alcoholic beverages to a party's designated driver, who wears a WPXC button to identify his or herself. Coca-Cola picks up the tab, and Cape Codbenefits. Makkay claims that alcohol-related automobile accidents in his area have decreased by 20% since the program started.

 Radio Group Heads Forum. After discussing the ramifications of the new EEO guidelines, top executives discussed how to deal with the shrinking job market which is sometimes spurred by duopoly; sometimes by financial constraints. Jeff Trumper of Trumper Communications Inc. described receiving hundreds of resumes from qualified applicants for a position he had open. "The job prospects are grim," he said to the agreement of the panel. "In addition, people may not be able to move, so it's important to find different ways of compensa-

• Infomercials—What Radio Managers Must Know About This Multi-Billion Dollar Opportunity. Four proponents told, in detail, how radio can capitalize on this lucrative market. To them, it wasn't a matter of if, but when radio will start to log large blocks of time for pre-produced, pre-paid commercial programming.

Lowell Paxson of Paxson Broadcasting, who is already having success with infomercials, told attendees how to set up a good program. "Ask yourself, 'Does the product have a story to tell'," he said. In urging broadcasters to consider infomercials, IDB's Peter Hartz said, "The traditional pattern of how we buy is changing...now...all you have to consider is, 'Do they have a credit card?' "

A skeptical programmer asked the panel if participating stations could inject some of its programming into an infomercial. "Use it to sell," advised Paxson.

Throughout NAB '94, radio broadcasters and exhibitors hummed quietly alongside the everencroaching video boom. In the group heads meeting, an international guest asked the panel what radio's role will be in people's lives in 10 years. "Maybe radio's on the bike path that runs alongside the congestion on the superhighway," said Sconnix's Odeneal.

# St. Louis DJs Back On Air—and in Hot Seat

Steve Shannon and D.C. Chymes have set St. Louis on its ear again.

The two WKBQ disc jockeys, who last May were fired after they called a woman listener a "nigger" on the air, but returned to the station in January, are dodging talk that they are partially responsible for the death of a local TV weatherman.

Bob Richards, a meteorologist for KSDK/TV, had allegedly stalked and harassed a Farmington, Mo. woman and on Friday, March 18, she won a protective order forbidding Richards from having contact with her.

The following Tuesday morning, the woman, Donna Henry, called Steve and D.C. and they put her on the air. She described her relationship and breakup with Richards, and even played taped messages from her answering machine. One was from a

man she said was Richards, asking that they get back together.

That night, after his weather forecast, Richards went to the airport, took his Piper Cherokee up 400 feet and went into a nose dive that killed him.

Local broadcast media played up the airing of Henry's call to WKBQ, calling it "an unforgivable sin," and "cruel and vicious." J.C. Corcoran of WFXB/FM went as far as to say Shannon and Chymes were "clearly responsible" for Richards' death.

Shannon responded: "Are we responsible? No. Do we regret doing the interview? No. Do we regret the loss of a life? You have to feel that way." Shannon maintained he had no malicious intent when airing the interview and said he played the story straight.

"The whole reason this controversy has arisen is I

have competitors who are capitalizing on an uncomfortable situation," WKBQ program director Cruze told GAVIN. "The interview was well-executed; it was not a satire or parody. It amazes me that there are people trying to link these events. (Shannon and Chymes) did nothing out of line and, I might add, nothmy competitors wouldn't have done if they had the chance." Cruze said he was very sad about what happened.

This incident spurred Subway Sandwiches and Salads to pull its advertising, and, according to WKBQ general manager Bill Viands, two other advertisers have asked to go "on hiatus." Viands, however, said Steve and D.C. had done the right thing, and that they wouldn't have aired the interview if they had known how Richards might respond.

### Give Matt Mills a Great Big KISS

Twenty-five year radio vet Matt Mills has moved to Boston, where he'll be senior vice president/general manager of KISS 108 (WXKS/FM), replacing John Madison who left the company last month to join PolyGram Group Distribution (PGD) as vice president of sales and branch distribution.

Mills was president and general manager of WERE/AM and WNCX/FM-Cleveland and before that oversaw operations for five radio stations as vice-president/general manager of the Orlando-based Paxson Broadcasting.

"I'm thrilled to be given the opportunity to work with Rich Balsbaugh and his fine staff at Pyramid," says Mills. "I'm also looking forward to the duopoly involving WJMN. The long-range opportunities are endless."

"Matt has the kind of broad experience that makes him perfect for KISS 108 and for the challenges we will face when we take over WJMN later this year," said Balsbaugh, CEO of Pyramid Broadcasting. "I'm confident that KISS will continue to be successful with his leadership."

#### MCA's R&B/ Country LP Hits the Stage

The MCA Records' Rhythm Country And Blues album came to life at Universal Amphitheatre on March 23, in a benefit performance for the Country Music Foundation and the Rhythm and Blues Foundation.

Almost all the artists involved took the stage. Among the most memorable performances were Natalie Cole and Reba McEntire's "Since I Fell For You," Patti LaBelle and Ronnie Milsap (who substituted for Travis Tritt) with "When Something Is Wrong With My Baby," a Reba/ Pointer Sisters/Clint Black/Gladys Knight rendition of "I Heard It Through The Grapevine," and Aaron Neville and Mickey Gilley teaming up on "The Grand Tour." The late Conway Twitty was missed. His duet partner, Sam Moore (of Sam & Dave fame), played video clips from their recording session and then sang "It's Only Make Believe," Twitty's biggest pop hit. The night received an extra spark from surprise guests Willie Nelson and Bob Dylan. Nelson performed "Funny How Time Slips Away" and the Patsy Cline standard "Crazy," which he wrote. Dylan teamed up with Trisha Yearwood for his song, "Tomorrow Night."

### Gavinites' Books

Three members of the GAVIN family have published two new books that have received instant attention in the general press.

Kent and Keith Zimmerman, who edit



every section of Gavin that's not tied down, are the co-authors, with John Lydon, of *Rotten: No Irish, No Blacks, No Dogs* (St. Martin's Press), the autobiography of Johnny Rotten of the seminal punk band, the Sex Pistols.

Although the book's publication date is April 7, the *New York Times* printed an excerpt last Sunday (March 27), entitled "Dissing the Queen," about a boat party the Pistols concocted for the silver jubilee of Queen Elizabeth II in 1977, resulting in several arrests for disturbing the peace with their song, "God Save the Queen."

The Zimmermen initiated the book by approaching Lydon, and interviewed him along with numerous cohorts. "Working with John Lydon

was a three-year adventure," says Kent. "Not only is *Rotten* a personal history, it finally answers the question truthfully: Who killed the Sex Pistols?"

Meantime, Managing Editor Ben Fong-Torres



has published The Rice Room (Hyperion), a memoirs (written without the Zimmermen) of growing up in Chinatown and winding up as a chronicler of the '60s scene-and beyond—at Rolling Stone magazine. At the same time, Ben did a freewheeling Sunday show for eight years on KSAN-San Francisco. The book drew a pre-publication rave from Publishers Weekly and a front-page review last Sunday in the San Francisco Chronicle. But, says Ben, "My favorite review is still the one Steve Martin was kind enough to give me to run on the back cover." It reads: "The Rice Room is a poignant examination of Ben's life. I couldn't put it down...in fact, I'm still holding it."

# How to Tickle Those PC Ivories

Passport Designs Inc. has produced a program that proves why the personal computer's keyboard is called a keyboard.

A new version of the company's MusicTime program allows PC users to type songs, transforming the keyboard into a musical instrument. "We've added the ability to play directly from the QWERTY keyboard, and you don't need a MIDI keyboard to make music," David Kusek, founder of Passport Designs

told Gavin. The new version is also easier to use, incorporates more color and will retail for less (around \$80). Compton's New Media is a distributor making the program available in record stores, including Tower, Virgin megastores, and J&R Music World.

"The main idea is it's a lot of fun, and with broader software people can rekindle an interest in music and take that interest further," says Kusek. He estimates that there are 4-6 million

amateur musicians who took music lessons at one time and own a personal computer.

Tunes appear note for note on a monitor, then can be arranged, recorded and printed. MusicTime is compatible with MacIntosh and IBM Windows, and the quality of sound depends on the computer's sound card. The program comes with prerecorded music, and sounds can be saved, or combined with other sounds. —DAVE BERAN

### **POWER 92's TV Taping Backfires**

KKFR/FM-Phoenix, taping a TV commercial for the station at a local sports bar, wound up with exactly what it didn't want: bad press.

The station, which recently changed from a Dance/Top 40 format to Top 40, invited listeners to show up at a sports bar to appear in the commercial, but, according to one listener, people of color were rejected.

Katherine Irvin, 25, said she and the only other two African-Americans, along with two Hispanic men who showed up for the taping, were escorted to the street, given a "Power 92" T-shirt, and excused.

"I'm so hurt," she said. "It was all full of white people just staring at us...going out in a line. This has never happened to me before. This was in my face. Now I know it doesn't just happen in the movies."

The station declined comment to local press, but Scott Johnson, the director of the commercial, defended himself, saying that he didn't choose any African-Americans, but that "it wasn't racial. It was technical and how many could fit on the dance floor." He also said the blacks "were dressed with a very casual look."

But many of the 29 chosen participants were casually dressed, and all got T-shirts that they were instructed to wear for the commercial.

RADIO: Label shipped single, "The Bonny Swans," with special artwork in late February. They are shipping PRO-CD with edits of five different tracks to A<sup>3</sup> and A<sup>2</sup> on April 5. A special words and music interview CD will go out to radio, press and retail in a few weeks.

Publicity: An all-out publicity campaign is planned. Special electronic press kit with performance and in-studio footage, and footage of McKennitt in Europe researching the album. # **Inside Top 40**

When **Don Nordine**, GM at **POWER 102 (KPXR)**-Anchorage made the difficult decision to change format early last month, he did it with a great deal of emotion. Nordine began his radio career in Top 40 during Easter weekend of 1973 in Grand Forks, N.D., and up until about four weeks ago, was involved with the format.

Unlike some managers who have little or no emotional attachment to a particular format. Don is passionate about Top 40. So why did his station flip to ARROW? The answer demands a short case history. When POWER 102 was born in September, 1986, the average age in Anchorage was just over 25 and the lone Top 40, KGOT, was pulling 14 to 17 shares every book POWER 102 management felt they were in need of some competition," said Nordine. "When we went on the air we provided the market with an alternative Top 40 choice for the first time.

The battle was underway. Nordine has nothing but praise for the staff at kGOT who, he recalls, "was extremely vulnerable when we went on the air." But, he notes, "They became a very good radio station very fast." When asked if it became a question of who was going to blink first, Don answers that it was changing market conditions. In fact, he claims that over the years both stations were relatively successful, with no clear winner or loser.

Rather than being a "format of the masses," Nordine believes that Top 40 has skewed younger and younger and is now a 12-34 format. Meanwhile, the average age in Anchorage is 30 and over. "KPXR was extremely efficient in our target demo," he says. "Besides dominating teens, we did well 18-24 and 18-34, just like what one would expect from a Top 40 and we did particularly well with women." But, Nordine says, "I was forced to look at the available dollars targeted for teens and 18-34s in Anchorage and

do some gazing at the crystal ball."

What he saw was a station that, although profitable, lagged behind the market as a whole. KPXR's revenues grew by less than one percent in 1992-1993, but the rest of Anchorage saw sales growth of 16%. Beyond the fight for dollars. Nordine considered the perception of the call letters and the station's image in the minds of the client. He says, "What it boils down to is that the battle of the pygmies is over. It was simply two very good radio stations fighting over a very small piece of the pie." "In order to run a viable Top 40 correctly you need to be an active, in-your-face type of station, which is expensive

Nordine feels that by being successful in the format, which as he mentioned earlier means attracting a significant portion of the younger audience, POWER 102 was actually being punished by advertisers. Certainly the beer and wine industry, who he says won't buy a station with a higher than 15% teen count, are partly to blame—but they're not the only culprits. Nordine and his sales staff tried to get across the message that "Young people not only control the radio, they control a significant portion of the buying habits of the whole family." He says there have been some great pieces written on the subject, which were part of the sales pitch: "Either buyers are not empowered to change things or they simply refuse to look beyond who is writing the check to see the sphere of influence.

Being a GM who truly wanted to hold onto the format. Nordine never discounted the emotions involved. So far, he has yet to feel any net effect but, he says, "The sales impact hasn't been negative. Most importantly, Nordine declares, "Just because I'm not associated with the format right now doesn't mean I've lost faith in it or that it's dead. The person who claims that is very mistaken."

Beth & Paul's "In The Time It Takes" is just blasting up the chart, Moving #39 to #25 to #15 over the past two issues, it should be well inside the top ten when next we check. It still captures MOST ADDED status with another 26 new this week like KELO, KCRE, WMJQ, WQID, WSTU, WSPT, WLDR, KOSI and KBOI. Two-thirds of all players report quality rotation, and 78% of the stations on it before this week report solid rotation.

**Karla Bonoffs** 15 minutes in the limelight has turned into the third decade with her love theme from *Eight Seconds*, "Standing Right Next To Me." It's now officially top 20 in our format, with 113 players and a 79% HIT FACTOR.

Unlike his debut, the slow-to-develop "Jessie," **Joshua Kadison**'s new single, "Beautiful In My Eyes," is taking off like a rocket. In its first four weeks the track has gathered 158 stations, a 61% HIT FACTOR

and a chart ranking of 19. The CHARTBOUND to =19 is the format's biggest two-week move and gives Kadison the format's HOT designation this week.

The story on **The Story** is a developing one as the bad math of "Two and Two Are Five" adds up to a five-point chart move with a current HIT FACTOR of 76% from stations like WFRO, WTSX, KELI, KBOL, KMGN, WQTU, WCKQ and WTTR.

As predicted in the last issue, **Madonna**'s "I'll Remember (Theme from *With Honors*)" debuts above all others at #30 on the chart. What we didn't predict was that it would top MOST ADDED again with a mighty 70 more players. The list of newcomers includes KXYQ, WRQX, WBMX, KYMG, WJLK, KRNO, WMJQ, WCOD, KGLE and WEIM.

CHARTBOUND is crowded with probables like **Heart**, **Toni Braxton** and **Lisa Keith** who are just moments away from numbered status. Lisa Keith leads the threesome in HIT FACTOR with 26%, while Heart leads in total stations with 93

and Braxton leads in ADDs this week with a mighty 52.

Last week's RECORD TO WATCH, All-4-One's "So Much In Love" pulls in 6 ADDs (KLZY, WHLM, WKTJ, WMYJ, WOHS and WTTR) and quality rotations are in from KSSK, KLSS, KSXY, WQLH, WAHR, KEYW, KVIC, KCRE, KOSO, K103, and KISQ.

Back then, his poetry was militant as opposed to violent, prophesizing about the homelessness and strife that's commonplace today. Scott-Heron has maintained a profile in Europe, and Spirits is a prodigal return of sorts. The album was recorded with Malcolm Cecil (who has worked with artists as diverse as Stevie Wonder and Steve Hillage), and the new songs fill a decade and a half void, using poetry, jazz, and whatever music forms happen to be at Scott-Heron's disposable. The voice is still familiar, the content is intellect-driven, and Gil seems to have mellowed with wisdom. Dig the opening response to the rappers, "Message To The Messengers."

#### LOREENA MCKENNITT The Mask and Mirror (Warner Bros./QR)


Loreena McKennitt's music never fails to bring a tear, so beautiful is her voice, so deft are her instrumental skills. *The Mask and Mirror* is precisely the kind of album we feared would be misinterpreted on the A³ level, yet its three-week trend of 49-39-33 is an enlightening lesson in how deep this format goes. Chart numbers aside, Loreena's a success story that requires a halfway effort that both A³ and A² seem willing to tackle. Quite simply, we might not



hear a more splendid song than "The Bonny Swans" all year long. Those inclined may continue the journey with "The Dark Night Of The Soul" and our second fave, the Eastern percussive "Marrakesh Night Market."



Wynton revs up the septet with *In This House On This Morning*, a liturgical total concept, thick with soulful, spiritual images of the days when Sunday morning

meant church choirs, sermons, offerings and congregations rather than cheese puffs and NFL doubleheaders. For airplay consideration, we suggest jumping to the second half of the second disc with the rousing "Invitation" into the stoic swing of "Recessional," culminated by the thumping "Uptempo Posthude." You

can hear the amens flying through trombonist Wycliffe Gordon's parting solo. Meanwhile, papa Ellis Marsalis tops the Most Added pack with Whistle Stop, aided by sons Eranford, Jason and, as producer, Delfeayo. This is much more of a blowing record with Branford tearing the roof off on "Mozartin', "Whistle Stop" and "Cochise." But Ellis is never more than a few bars behind with some clever licks of his own. "Tain" Watts and Robert Hurst are severe on rhythm, freeing up Branford to go inside or outside as he chooses



## Hard Rock Releases

SPHINK Test (Heart & Soul)



Emerging from Chicago's rock scene, where they've been enthusiastically embraced by the local rockers for the last couple of years, is Sphinx with their debut record Test. Lurking between hard rock and metal, Sphinx (Nick Langis, vocals; George Langis, guitar; Tim Mattefs, bass; Pete Stergios, drums) joins the ranks of bands like Candlebox Stone Temple Pilots and Soundgarden who represent the current rock sound. The band has an adrenaline-pumping feel similar to old Van Halen; not that they sound like them, but they have the same capture-the-moment energy. The title track introduces churning guitar grooves that swarm around kickin' drum slams, vibrance bass lines and careening vocals, and sets the pace for the album. Flowing melodic guitars and mellow rhythms can be found on "Death Of a Poet" (megaphone vocals, very cool). "I Know" and "Kevin " Adventurous album stations will find the later two to be compatible to their playlist and should give 'em a whirl. Hard rock metal listeners will enjoy the quick gritty guitars on "Out Of My Head," "Ionestown." "Tribe." "Underground" and "Glass Dolls."

Stations that have already taken the *Test* include WSUP, KDUR, KQAL, WHMH, WSGR, KMSA, WMHB and WCWP. Sphinx is a rock band with the potential to crossover to album radio if given the chance.

#### SHEER TERROR Old, New, Borrowed & Blue (Blackout!)

Sheer Terror (Paul Bearer, vocals; Mark Neuman, guitar; Mike Walter, bass; Pat Cronin, drums) has surfaced from New York's underground to bring us a five-song EP with a title describing exactly what the band has to offer. The first track, "Walls," dates back to the '80s, and showcases heavy metallic guitar/bass grinds, pounding drums and throaty punk vocals. "Broken" is a new tune featuring metal guitar riffs that grow into massive romping rhythms backed by powerful drumming and vocal growls that occasionally tone down into hollow yells. "Goodbye, Farwell" is another new song that has dark metallic guitar rhythms guiding the morbid vocals down the path of sorrow. Not a happy tune, but sordid metal listeners will get into this. "Everything's Fine" is the borrowed tune, since this was originally recorded by the Saints. This is an upbeat song that has kind of an alternative twist, with the addition of keyboards and sampled horns courtesy of Type O Negative's keyboardist Josh Silver. The last track, (the bonus hidden track), is a quiet rendition of Johnny Cash's "I Still Miss Someone." Sheer Terror offers an interesting EP that's worthy of a few spins. Check it Out.

# THE CHARLATANS Up To Our Hips (B.Banquet/Atlantic)

After a rocky year The Charlatans return with their third, and perhaps most difficult album, Up To Our Hips. Apparently the band would send him tapes of songs and he'd send back ideas for his keyboard parts and harmonies. Not exactly ideal circumstances in which to record "that critical third album," but except for a couple of less than par moments, The Charlatans have weathered the storm, and produced a number of gems in the process. Like Between 10th and 11th, many of the songs on Up To Our Hips are second and third listen charmers; like the most entertaining albums, Up To Our Hips yields a different favorite with each listen. By my third or fourth time around, the sparse, understated "Autograph" firmly replaced immediate tracks like "Jesus Hairdo," "I Never Want An Easy Life...," "Come In 21" and the title track as favorites, although "Jesus Hairdo" is certainly the big radio smash. The band will do a sprint through America this month, and are expected back in June for a more thorough tour. 

# FRETBLANKET Twisted EP (Atlas/PLG)

When you hear that Fretblanket is a young quartet from Stourbridge, England, certain expectations might run through your head, but let me cut you off at the pass: Fretblanket do not sound like fellow Midlanders Pop Will Eat Itself, The Wonder Stuff or Ned's Atomic Dustbin. On the contrary, Fretblanket's rough-ntumble sound has more in common with their American cousins (Nirvana meets early Soul Asylum?) than their fellow countrymen, including the aforementioned Stourbridge posse. The four songs on this College radio-only release are some of the band's earliest work, and are sharp testaments to teenage lust ("Me and the animal lover/never far from each other" and "Take off my clothes and drag me to the sea"), frustration ("That girl never knows I'm here/'tho I've been following her 'round for years" and "You flip the words I say on their back") and naivete ("Could you ever be so cynical/I'm Captain Invisible"). All of these songs are strong enough to be singles in their own right, but only "Twisted" will surface on the band's forthcoming album, Junkfuel. Enjoy the others while you've got them

We recommend starting with "Daddy's Gone To California," "All Time High" and "Lettuce Is Far Out."

# **Import Indie**

#### **GERM'S CHOICE '94** A Choice Collection Of Music As **Featured On The KUSF Demo** Tape Show (911 RECORDS, 1139 COLE ST., SAN FRANCISCO, CA 94117)

Back when I was a music director (in 1988 to be exact), KUSF-San Francisco released a local compilation that was assembled by Germ, the host of the station's demo tape show. Now he's back with Germ's Choice '94, a sequel collection of local artists. In a region with as varied a music scene as the Bay Area's, it's difficult to cull bands from too many different "sub-scenes" without compromising the over-all continuity of a compilation; however, Germ limits his '94 picks (and I'm generalizing just a bit here) to those bands that offer horns or horn sections, moody and textural UK-leaning rock or female vocals. Therefore, I prefer-for the most part-the oddities: Dieselhed's simultaneously touching and tongue-in-cheek opus "Be A Band," Go Van Gogh's mystery-tinged, horn-driven instrumental "Gypsy Taksim," Speedboat's

nerdy, nasal, indie-rock ditty "Waste Of Time," as well as the tracks from Symon's New Blue Diamonds and the Mermen (see review below). It's great to see college stations reaching into their pockets to support local bands; congratulations to KUSF, and also to KFSR and KJHK, for their own recent releases. - SEANA BARUTH

#### 7" SPOTLIGHT: Granfaloon Bus - "Coffee Girl" (Hairy) and The Zip Code Rapists' Sing And Play The **Matador Records Catalogue** (Ecstatic Piss)

A couple of the worthwhile Bay Area bands that are omitted from Germ's Choice '94 are Granfaloon Bus and the Zip Code Rapists, both of whom have new singles currently available. Granfaloon's newest appears on the fledgeling Hairy label, and it features "Coffee Girl" backed with "Sip Away." "Coffee Girl," a yearning, straining little pop song with twangy vocals, some "ooh-la-la's" and smart lyrics, tells of an unrequited crush and sounds

a tad like Neil Young doing a scruffy slacker anthem. "Sip Away" is a rollicking waltz accented by mournful accordian.

The Zip Code Rapists' new EP, The Zip Code Rapists Sing And Play The Matador Records Catalogue, purports to be a new release from the Dutch label Ecstatic Piss. But, knowing ZCR frontman Gregg Turkington, that might just as easily be a fake label concocted to justify charging an import price for a domestic release. Or maybe I'm way paranoid. Anyway, ZCR exists to drag the overblown rock and roll monster back to ground level and make it eat dirt. This time, ZCR are out to humble indie-rock pillar Matador Records, and on this EP. they irreverently butcher Bettie Serveert, Liz Phair and Pavement's "Cut Your Hair," while somewhat politely rendering the Thinking Fellers' "Hurricane." ZCR (as this label's name might suggest) takes the piss out of Matador, mocks the imprint's influential status, and generally succeeds at the mission inscribed on the 7"; "the point is to

make the stupidity of every day life a visible issue." -SEANA BARUTH

#### MERMEN Food For Other Fish (KELPTONE RECORDS, 3100 VICENTE ST., APT. #202, SAN FRANCISCO, CA 94116)

Summer is around the corner and surf bands everywhere are waxing their axes. The Mermen are a Bay Area trio with an almost religious reverence for everything surf, and these 12 instrumentals were records ed live using a two-track DAT. "My Black Bag's" relentless distortion shoots the curl as Martyn Jones' drums revel in skirt work mode. The distorted guitar gives way to reverb that scatters everywhere at once like food at a shark feeding frenzy. "Honeybomb" is another full-throttle rocker with a harrowing guitar and a thick reef of teeming bass. Tracks like "Bondage Of The Sea" and "Madagasgar" have a slow ebb and lulling guitar that glistens like the sea. If you're in the mood to get wet check out this estuary of great instrumentals that testify to the demiurge that is surf.

The most highly-anticipated soundtrack of the summer cooks up tangy, spicy flavors that are sure to tickle the taste buds of both G-funk lovers and R&B connossieurs. Had this not been the CD companion to Above The Rim, the album could've easily been named On The Under From The Inside. The Death Row inmates dominate, serving as our hosts through the sights and sounds (real and imagined) of a generation moved by satisfaction and survival. The play button unleashes tales of forbidden desire. Death Row songstress Jewell finally gets to flex her pipes for not one, but two full songs. "It's Not Deep Enough" and "Gonna Give It To Ya," her duet with "Nasty Man" Aaron Hall showcase her strong, sultry voice. D.J. Rogers' "Doggie Style" and H-Town's "Part Time Lover" get straight to the point with silky-smooth tracks, and are sure to steam up the tinted windows of your jeep. Of course, lessons of urban game theory come glidin' through the speakers courtesy of Tha Dogg Pound Gangstas, The Lady Of Rage, and Nate Dogg & Warren G. Delivering "Big Pimpin'," "Afro Puffs" and "Regulate" respectively, Death Row churns out three Check the Scott-Heronesque monologue at the end of "Big Pimpin" and Rage's

> fiery spray of mind-blowin' rhymes. The Above The Rim soundtrack marks the return of 2nd II None with some nayasty funk, and heralds the arrival of newcomers Rhythm and

Knowledge, Sweet Sable, and Paradise, all of who hold their own among a who's who of Black music's newest superstars, including 2 Pac, Treach, SWV, and Al B. Sure. Soundtracks are breaking new acts faster than labels are, okay? This treasure chest is laden with hot radio singles and is guaranteed to take you bumpin' (and grindin') through the summer and beyond.

#### **BOB WOODRUFF Dreams & Saturday Nights (Asylum)**



But Woodruff, with his breathy singing style and earthy lyrics, sounds more like a heavenly cross between Gram Parsons and Michael Stipe. There are lots of nods to Parsons on this album: the most Gram-ish is one of the highlights, "The Year We Tried To Kill The Pain." My other faves are "Dreams & Saturday Nights," with its swirly R.E.M. intro, "Caroline," and the amazing "Poisoned At The Well." There is some commercial stuff here, too,

most notably "Alright." The best, most surprising record I've heard out of Nashville this year.


