

Steve Earle, "Copperhead Road", Uni/MCA.... Steve's ascent to high priest of the New American country rock renaissance started back with 1985's "Guitar Town" album, and all kinds of AOR airplay on "I Ain't Ever Satisfied" from last year's "Exit O" album further cementing that status. Now, he's a wild and wooly dude we'd all like to tip a cold one with--but you had to know Steve was onto something special when over a hundred "rock" stations bent formerly rigid format guidelines to play the song. Now, with all kinds of anticipation, in rolls a song that takes a giant step in our stylistic direction--and it's practically all over but the shouting. The subject matter is strictly from the rock renegade perspective, and to our ears this is easily the closest any contemporary talent has come to evoking the grand tradition of The Band and early Little Feat. Somewhere, too many musicians and too many programmers took that urban exit away from the true spirit of American rock and roll--and if there's one man in a position to rekindle that flame, your listening to him.

HARD REPORT

THE

ddie Money, "Nothing To Lose", Columbia.... As per the front page, you've got to respect the hell out of 46 play increases when the new U2 rolls up 49--even more so when you tally the competition. We don't have to tell you how tight the space race is for each and every play per day. Equally significant is the fast Top 5 action, with KYYS, WEBN, WIXV, WKLC, KKDJ, KGGO and four more in with strong second week calls. As Brian Illes says, "Eddie's at his best when he sings with passion, and he's rarely done it better than on this song".... What's more, it only takes one listen to this killer leadoff number to know the stars were all in sync for the session. Just check out "Magic" or "The Love In Your Eyes" and tell us this isn't Eddie's deepest record since the first. Do your musical homework, and the only question you'll have to answer is "Why wait?" You're going to hear at least three huge singles in the making, and it's your unique format opportunity to make them count first on the dial. Just ask Randy--Money matters.

House Of Lords, "I Wanna Be Loved", RCA.... Given the fact that everything Gene Simmons

touches turns to platinum, this House has a foundation so solid we hear Donad Trump is already negotiating a takeover bid. But Gene won't be easy-as he says of the armored car, money bags and dollar signs logo, "Make of it what you will. If you think it's decadent and corporate, that's fine. I'm going for the gold. Actually, make that the platinum!". Gregg Giuffria's talents really deserve equal credit, but after the big guy cost us the first place Bowling Trophy two years ago with a lousy 126, there's no way he's getting co-billing in this writeup! Basically, this is Gregg's show all the way with new lead singer James Christian and ex-Alice Cooper hitman Ken Mary rounding things out. If you have an ear for really well honed meta-pop crunch, "I Wanna Be Loved" will lock your lobes instantly--and be advised research maven Greg Ausham is already in with very high hopes for future performance--and you know that means serious attention from the Midwest Mafia and beyond.

Record of the Week:

38 Special, "Rock And Roll Strategy", **A&M**.... As smart as it was to incorporate the talents of one Max Karl into the group--that's how smart it was for A&M to slip this biscuit into the fray at such an opportune time. That spells #1 Most Added with 134 stations and our highest 18* debut. KKZX's Christina Gorton comments, "They're back together and they sound great that way. This song is a perfect welcome back for one of the format's most successful bands".... From KILO's Alan White, "They an automatic here, with the new energy provided by Max Karl and the tried and true guitar sound".... From KZAM's Vince Mertz, "38 Special is living proof that there's life after Southern boogie". Now that the albums' in your hand, "Little Sheba" is the where you need to start. Also get familiar with "Second Chance" and "Never Be Lonely".

Keith Richards, "Take It So Hard", Virgin.... Keith's guitar contributions to the Stones have always been underrated or just flat-out overlooked in deference to Mick Taylor or Brian Jones. And it's true that his singing has been greeted with apprehension in the past. So then why is it that his solo release sounds so damn good? Perhaps it's a testament to the spirit and drive of rock and roll that is firmly embodied in this particular "Glimmer Twin". Maybe it has something to do with the keen interest that has always followed the question, who really was Pink? In any case, programmers have been dying to put this on the air since it was first unveiled at a series of listening extravaganzas--so bet the family jewels on #1 most added status this week. To the highlight film we go--first the LOOP's Dave Benson, "Let the aged and infirm among us celebrate the return of the sandbox surfer! For my money, the solo statement of the year belongs to Keith Richards".... Now over to David Anderson at WRQK in his two tone pimento cheese leisure suit, "I guess this week we'll see who the real 'heart and soul' of the Stones is. It's Keith, trust me!".... The Virgin set-up has been thorough and impressive with the only remaining question being the actual number of stations banging this baby OTB. That's like asking how many takers we can line up for free money. With every track on the LP sounding like a long-lost Stones classic, with a strong and soulful groove to the studio work, you can settle in for a long winter of airplay with one of rock and roll's true founding fathers.

HARD ACTS TO FOLLOW

Santana, "Black Magic Woman", Columbia.... Had enough of classic rock stations leaning on your core library in a current rotation context? Well, teach them the true meaning of "Payback is hell" with this live rendition of a song they play as often as you bang Guns 'N Roses! In the tradition of Dylan's "Biograph" and the excellent Clapton "Crossroads" collection, the boys at Columbia have unleashed this very special Santana retrospective. The logical place to begin exposure is with this 1982 live recording of one of the all time classics in every sense of the word. Featuring Alex Ligertwood handling the vocals and Carlos making the original Peter Green/Fleetwood Mac recording sound even more like a distant memory. Carlos' legend looms larger than ever. With a little concentrated play on this four star performance of perphaps the group's best known song, there's no reason why we can't help bring this giant of the fretboard into a clearer perspective to a whole new generation.

John Kilzer, "Memory In The Making", Geffen.... It's about time the Geffen brigade launched the title track from the colorful Kilzer man. When you combine John's distinctive throaty larynx with backround vocal support from the likes of Rosanne Cash and Rodney Crowell, you get to see that there's a softer soul lurking underneath this rock and roll professor. We're talking Summa Cum Laude here folks. And with the proven track record of the last two offerings on the airplay highway, "Memory In The Making" would seem an automatic to us. All you need is to announce the man's name and the curiosity factor is going to hand deliver a strong female cume and once this meaty yet mellow track from Mr. Kilzer gets going you will have to beat off those phones with a stick. John has been on the road more or less non-stop since the album hit the stands and chances are that your market has more than a few among the converted just waiting for this guy and his silk and grit approach.

Jethro Tull, "Overhang", Chrysalis.... With sales on the Tull box set proving that those thirty-something bankrolls don't wince at supporting their favored bands, the format has been opened up to the reality that what constituted some of our most cherished musical memories can just as easily propel us into the future. From the moment that breathy flute floats across the almost ELP like strains of the opening bars of "Overhang", you know that your inner ear is on a collision course with a primal musical force. Ian Anderson has always made the sonic pleasure centers his home and this original slice of music in a highly valued collection of earlier material is bound to jet up the Hard Hundred like a 747 on a date with destiny. By this time your audience is familiar with every nook and cranny of the package so don't miss your chance to maximize the impact of what has to be one of the seminal bands of this, or any, decade. Your audience has repeatedly shown themselves to be loyal to the bone with these guys and, considering the hang time of everything they have unleashed to date, you would have to be on helium to

The Bangles, in tour mount, Columbia.... The Bangles know how to tickle the mass "In Your Room", audience's fancy like no girl group since the golden days of the Go Go's, and this track has them back for their third consecutive attack on the coming Holiday charts. To us, that means it's a "deal with them if the music's right" scenario. And from where we sit (and listen), "In Your Room" is clearly a song you could and should deal with. Producer Davitt Sigerson has given the girls a leaner, more angular sound--and an overall ambience much closer to the style of female rock that's currently working so effectively with your listeners. Suzanna sounds downright mean this time out--and now that her celluloid thang is a side trip at best, it sounds to us as if they're more focused than ever. Anyone else hear a touch of "Revolver"?

think this cut will do anything else but follow in that well worn groove to the moon.

NEW PLAY PRIORITIES

Little Feat, "Long Time Till I Get Over You" WB.... It's almost inhuman of the "Bunny-people" to have an album this deep. I mean "Let It Roll" hasn't come close to wearing out it's welcome, with new air at 8, and increases at another 25--good enough for third place honors on the all important Increase Index. With "Long Time" we find Craig Fuller using his strongest Lowell George vocal timbre just beggin' ya to love him like you used to do---who could resist? We don't have to tell you how the upper-demos have reached deep into their pocket for this rocket of a comeback effort, so why wait for the obvious positive research feedback? Da Feats be happenin' and dey be happenin' now. Play along with the WB game plan, and no one gets hurt. As Cowan would say, these are the kind of guys who would call time out to kick a field goal, up by 30 with ten seconds to go. You only get to run up the score once a season, and with the Feat starting their third drive of the game, we're sure they'll bring this one down inside the 5 as well.

Rhythm Corps, "Father's Footsteps", Pasha.... The intro to this song is one of those perfect

Pasha.... The intro to this song is one of those perfect statements of what a band is all about. The interlocking guitars have a lyrical content that guarantees sustained listening deep into the first few minutes. By that time the trap has been sprung and a band that is fast calling down major market raves has your audience in the palm of their collective hand. New play on WLLZ, WLAV, WCCC, WRIK and KTYD has helped put the Corps on the Hard Hundred with a 97* ranking this week. This group of talented musicians are fast establishing themselves in the forefront of the new, very welcome, move to rock and roll that is fueled by something more than a foreign accent or an off the scale hormone count. Steady support on KBCO, KLOL, WRDU, WIYY and KFMU underscores the validity of this important new band and it would be a sin to let their quality sound slip by.

Vinnie Vincent, "Love Kills", Chrysalis.... You know the scenario with soundtracks by now, when the movie finally breaks at the box office you've filed the sucker under a pile of last month's tipsheets. Well dust off the latest "Nightmare" slab o'vinyl or better yet grab a copy of Vinnie's "All Systems Go", and cash in on the theme to the latest Freddie scare-a-thon. The movie did close to 50 million gross in just five weeks and with the witching hour right around the corner, you'd have to be a fool not to cash in on what's sure to be Halloween's first sell out ticket at the local theatre. They may not exactly leave the movie humming this little ditty, but you can bet that they will remember where they heard it when you put it on the air. MTV play on the video is through the roof and with Sutter and the Chrysalis promo ghouls ready to do a Freddie mask and glove give away, how can you not give this



Big Country, "Peace In Our Time", Reprise.... With KLBJ, KOAS, WSHE and 4 more joining the 131 station party in progress, it's safe to say that Stuart and gang have their sights set at cracking the big continent this time around. The dozen rotation increases on "King Of Emotion" show the momentum squarely on the upswing, and now you hold in your hands the whole ball of wax. The shift in style has obviously worked in their favor with programmers everwhere, but when you check the title track you'll find that they haven't forgotten "Field's Of Fire". As far as the rest of the LP, "Broken Heart" is a Townshend-esque tone poem with enough panache to punch through the core. Honorable mention must go to "From Here To Eternity", "Thousand Yard Stare", "River Of Hope" and "In This Place". Put aside those store made observations about this band and start getting real about on very serious fact, if you ignore this release now, down the road you'll be sorry.

Georgia Satellites, "Hippy Hippy Shake", Elektra.... On yet another stellar remake, we find the G. Sats taking on the Swinging Blue Jeans with all the fervor of a teenage boy on prom night. The end result is just as passionate and about as long in duration. With the "Cocktail" soundtrack entrenched at the top of the retail charts, we can't wait to see the second stage kick in with this proven audience grabber now an Elektra priority. It's new on KISS, KRXQ, KZAM, WIMZ, WRXK, WZZO and another eight, with the movie trailer generating early radio request action, we expect a top five showing in add land next week. WRXK's Greg Mull has his finger on the pulse of listeners everywhere, "Check out 'Hippy Hippy Shake' from the Georgia Satellites. It's 1:45 of pure jam! CHR's are gonna rip it up so we'd better do it first".... Speaking of the length, if it's a problem, we've been advised by none other than Jeff "Splicemonster" Cook, that he's ready to ship the edit.

Melissa Etheridge, "Like The Way I Do", Island.... If anything was to be learned by the growth pattern of "Bring Me Some Water", it's that sometimes you have to follow your instincts. With this track we hope the slow build is a thing of the past. As WCKO's Johnny James says, "Being one of the first stations to hop on the Melissa Etheridge bandwagon, I'm here to warn you about her new single 'Like The Way I Do'. We feel, judging by the response that it could be better than getting wet".... Her raw, emotional heart in a box set of pipes have taken the radio world by storm. And we see no reason why this follow-up shouldn't attain the top ten status of it's predicessor in half the time. Debut at 96* on the Hard Hundred and as WNGZ's Mike Verity says, "This is undoubtedly the best track on the record. The lyrics and groove are unbeatable". So what are you waiting for?

Dickey Betts, "Rock Bottom", Epic Three dozen more adds for this new DB tune including, KISS, KISW, KKDJ, KMOD, KRXQ, KXRX, WAOR, WCCC, WDHA, WGIR, WHJY, WIOT, WLLZ, WYNF and WZZO. That brings the base up to a healthy 96 in the second week of activity. Combine that with early increases at WGLF, WIXV, WOUR plus 4, and it's easy to see how Dickey was the second Biggest Mover with a 57-33* on the Hundred. WGIR's Karen A. Small takes a shot at the "Rave-O-Meter" (pat.pend.), "Dickey Betts 'Rock Bottom' builds on his solid Allman Brothers foundation yet he comes up with a tune uniquely his own. It sounds both classic and fresh" We've noticed quite a few new tunes with that Hammond organ/Leslie speaker sound popping up, and we can't think of anyone, save Felix Cavalerie of Rascals fame, who does it better than the Betts man.

John Lennon, "Jealous Guy", Capitol It's no surprise that 111 stations came in OTB this alternate take of one of John's finest melodies. Everyone wanted to chat about the second Most Added track this week. WRXK's Gregg Mull, "'Jealous Guy from John Lennon has always been my favorite track from the 'Imagine' album. It sounded great in 1971, and it sounds nice now. We're doing the world premiere of the movie so I put the track in Power. Awareness will be high and this is our audience".... KFMX's Jeff Ivan, "It's nice to have a beautifully remixed John Lennon track in our rotation".... KKAZ's Tony Montoya echoes many people's sentiments, "The John Lennon is so amazing. The first time I heard it I felt both happy and really sad at the same time. I was happy because the song is just so good and sad because the man behind it is lost to us all"....KKZX's Christina Gorton, "The John Lennon track is very welcome here and we are going to take it all the way. It is wonderful to have some positive reinforcement with all the negative going down right now. John has always been a pillar of the counter culture and his reappearance behind this beautiful song is refreshing to say the least" The album is on your desk and it's great to have a version of "A Day In The Life" without the segue intro....use it. Debut at 27* on the HH.

Metallica, "Eye Of The Beholder", Elektra.... You can't hide, you can't run and most importantly--YOU CAN'T IGNORE this band anymore! New action on a dozen including, KBOY, KKDJ, WDHA, WDIZ, WHCN, WLAV, WRIK and WHJY where Chris Herrmann funds this remark, "We're also on board with Metallica. How can you disregard the lines in front of local retail stores on release day".... It's steady on KILO, KISW, KOME, KOZZ, KQRS, KSJO, WBAB, WBCN, WLZR and more with Top 5 phones at KNCN, KQRS, KRZQ and WLZR. The sales are "Mondo bitchin" according to Sue at Elektra with the album at 1.2 million and moving at the rate of 200,000 units every ten days. WLAV's Dave Lange adds, "We're also on Metallica. Elektra didn't even hype or hustle---all they did was sell a lot of records, so what can you say. Number one sales speak loudly"....Can you imagine what will happen with the airplay factoring in?

New Frontier, "Under Fire", Mika/ Polydor.... Last weeks Biggest Mover continues to scratch and crawl its way up the Hundred with a 83-75* move. New air at KEZO, KOME, KZAP, WAPL, WIMZ, WLLZ and a couple more, bring the base up to 34. With the kind of heavy traffic we've seen in the last few weeks, it would be wise to pay attention when an act comes out of nowhere to generate this kind of response. WLLZ's Doug Podell joins the growing list of believers this week, "We've been looking for a slot to put this New Frontier record in and it finally gets the nod this week. Research indicates that this record should perform well"....as does KEZO's Bruce MacGregor, "I was just talking to Greg Ausham in Milwaukee who tells me he's doing really well with New Frontier. Apparently the research is coming back real strong which means this could be a record to deal with"....If you've mistakenly filed this away, pull it out and give it that second or third listen. The hook is bound to hit ya.

lan Gillan/Roger Glover, "Telephone Box", Virgin.... KBPI, KDJK, KJJO, KLOS, KSHE, KXRX, KZAM, WAQX, WEGR and 7 more stations finally pick up the add line. Ian and Roger crack the Top 50 of the Hard Hundred with a very healthy 54-42* move. Increases at KLBJ, KMJX, KRXQ, WAPL, WGIR and WVVV show that this side project is moving full steam ahead into a niche all it's own. KKAZ's Tony Montoya attests to the phone action and reaction, "The Gillan/Glover song is quickly recognized as a pseudo Deep Purple project and is working very well on the phones around here".... WAQX's Meg Stevens has a word or two, "Another great tune is Ian Gillan and Roger Glover's Deep Purple-less Telephone Box'. A new sound from a pair that have been around the block and are back stronger than ever"....Heavy airplay is logged from KAZY, KEZE, KKAZ, KLBJ, KNCN, KOWB, WGIR and WLZR. This is no trick, these purple expatriots have delivered the goods, so put 'em to use. You'll be glad you did.

Ozzy Osbourne, "Miracle Man", CBS Associated.... Debuting at 87* on the Hard Hundred with first week add action reported from KATP, KAZY, KILO, KISS, KISW, KQRS, KTXQ, WCCC, WGIR, WLLZ, WNEW, WPLR and 11 more. The master of mayhem looks like he's not only come up with a winner, but has proved he's got that Midas touch when it comes to finding new lead guitar gods. WGIR's Karen A. Small has these words of praise, "Ozzy's new record has barely hit the airwaves and already the phones are ringing off the hook for a dose of 'Miracle Man'. His new guitar player is smokin'!" WHJY's Chris Herrmann picks up, "Nice to see the Oz man opting for a less commercial approach, whatever 'Miracle Man' lacks in lyrical content, is more than compensated for by Zakk's six-string pyrotechnics. It's already a big item on the phones".... You know as well as we do that the lower end will always have a warm spot for Oz, so listen up to KILO's Alan White, "By the way, don't try to hide Ozzy Osbourne's 'Miracle Man' from your audience, they know it's out there".

Johnny Winter, "Rain", MCA.... After spending the last couple of years with independent Alligator Records, J.W. roars back on a major label. "Rain" is confirmation that his chops rank with the greats of the Blues/Rock genre. KBOY, KEZO, KISS, KKDJ, KLBJ, KRXQ, KSJO, WCCC, WLAV, WMMR and 16 more come in with first week adds. KKZX's Christina Gorton makes a lot of sense, "This Johnny Winter record sounds great. If you had any luck with Robert Cray, don't hesitate to put this slab of original blues/rock on the air'.... The intro is a dead ringer for the Allman's version of "One Way Out", and we all know how the core eats that classic up. We'll let that always informative KZEL music man, AI Scott, have the floor, "The new Johnny Winter is incredible if you like Blues but rockin' enough for the rest of your audience. A very strong late 80's style blues record at its best"....and finally KEZO's Bruce MacGregor, "For all the years he never got on radio, for Johnny Winter to break through in 1988 is a testament to the strength of blues/rock with today's AOR audience. Johnny is our strongest add this week. Enough of the wimpy Top 40 stuff, give us the meat and potatoes".... Debut at 80* on the Hard Hundred. Also early response on "Close To Me" (not the Carpenter's tune!)

Winger, "Madalaine", Atlantic.... We've been singing the praises of this fine slice of rock on the hard side ever since our first listen. It looks like the rest of the world is finally catching on. The station count has crept up to a resounding 78, thanks to new adds from WLAV, WNOR, WPLR, WRXK and another four. The increases are also worth mentioning, with KQWB, KRZQ, WDIZ and WRIK all upping play this week. KGB's Pam Edwards has been there from the git, "I told you so! I told you so! The Winger is proving itself. Sales are picking up daily, and the results are pouring in. The Scorpions don't pick just anybody to open their shows!"....KBER's John Edwards is impressed, "The strength for this band is definitely in the core males 20-25, no real negatives. Great active response and curiosity factor. People want to know who the hell the band is" Hey, the MTV play has been steadily building and you know what happens when the ladies get a gander at that Kip Winger chest hair, don't ya? Trapp is sure that "Zero population growth" is history thanks in part to Winger's off the scale showing on the "Babe-O-Meter" (pat. still pend.). 50-44* on the Hard Hundred and don't count out a mega-jump in the coming weeks.

Kansas, "Stand Beside Me", MCA The third Most Added track this week as 66 playlists welcome back these 70's superstars. KBER, KEZO, KGGO, KILO, KISS, KKDJ, KLBJ, KOME, KOZZ, KRQR, KRXQ, KSHE, KSJO, KTXQ, WAOR, WAPL, WCCC, WDVE, WEGR, WEZX, WLAV, WLLZ, WNEW, WYNF and WZZO are just a partial list of the impressive calls on hand. Whenever Kansas releases new material, one sure thing is the caliber of musicianship, as KILO's Alan White says, "Music mavens will get off on Steve Morse's guitar work on 'Stand Beside Me".... Don't forget the other Steve's (Walsh) female vocal appeal, witness WYBB's Lori Niks, "The first time we debuted the new Kansas in drive-time, the phones were lighting up an hour later. It's as if these listeners (all female!), got out of traffic, went home, picked up their phones and wanted to find out who did that great song" and WLLZ's Doug Podell can hear the band implementing the 80's in their sound, "We've been playing the new Kansas off the tape the last two weeks to great response. It has a lot of the traditional elements of a Kansas classic with a more modern feel".... The third highest debut on the HH, 46*.

IMPACT TRACKS

Randy Newman, "It's Money That Matters", Reprise..... What do the numbers 50 and 4 have in common? Randy Newman! Fifty adds this week including, KDKB, KISS, KJJO, KOME, KRIX, KZAM, WAOR, WAPL, WIMZ, WLLZ, WLUP, WONE, DC101 and a host of others. That makes Bandy the fourth Matter Adds others. That makes Randy the fourth Most Added, and speaking of fours, how about the fourth Biggest Move on the Hard Hundred---41-22*. Increases contribute to the chart success, with early ups at KSJO, KTAO, KXRX, KZRR, WBCN. WHFS, WLVQ, WXRT and another 8 (4x2!). The general consensus is that this is Randy's finest work in years, but don't take our word for it --- read on. WNGZ's Mike Verity, "The Randy Newman is also very cool. Anytime you put Randy's voice on the air you know you're going to get a reaction, and with Mark Knopfler's guitar sound in the mix, this registers as one of the most interesting tracks on the scene right now" The album is chock full O'goodies as well, just ask KTCZ's Jane Fredericksen, "Randy Newman's 'Land Of Dreams' is bound to please old fans and create new ones. The production is masterful, and the lyrics are as dry as this past summer in Minneapolis. The single is a strong pick but there's also a potential hit in 'Falling In Love' which features Jeff Lynne, Tom Petty and Mike Campbell. Unshakable hooks and plenty of tight vocals".

Tom Cochrane & Red Rider, "Big League", RCA.... Only two weeks in and Tom has cracked the century mark in station support. CHOM, KDJK, KGB, KISS, KLBJ, KTXQ, KXBR, WAPL, WDIZ, WEGR, WGIR, WIZN, WONE, DC101, WWWV, WXRT, WYNF, WZZO and conther 19 cull out the odd mot this work making Tam and the another 18 roll out the add mat this week, making Tom and the boys 5th Most Added. Even though the tune is about a hockey player, the World Series connection works as well. KNCN's Tim Parker says, "Tom Cochrane has given us a track that is timely as hell and sounds real good on top of it. 'Big League' moves up in rotation and we expect more reaction as time goes on".... The third Biggest Mover with rotational ups from, KEZE, KNCN, KQWB, KRXQ, KSJO, WRXK and more helping explain that 48-29* move on the Hard Hundred. WHEB's Scott Laudani chips in this high hard one, "Tom Cochrane with Red Rider is the refreshing sound AOR has been missing, 'Big League' is a big hit"....and CILQ's musical meteorologist, Joey Vendetta predicts a smash on the horizon, "The Tom Cochrane record is a monster---it smokes. Pick up on it while it's hot, after all how do you think we melt the snow in Toronto".

an Neville, "Not Just Another Girl" **Polydor....** Whenever you talk about critical acclaim, the name Neville is sure to pop up at some point in the conversation. Speaking of popping up, Aaron's oldest son, Ivan pops on 26 more stations this week including, KBCO, KBOY, KDJK, KKDJ, KOME, KRQR, KTAO, WDHA, WEQX, WLAV, WLLZ, WNEW, WRKI and WXRT. That brings the base up to a healthy half a hundred. If you haven't checked this track out you're missing a tasty musical combination of Huey Lewis, Robbie Robertson and Mr. Mister, with the unmistakable Neville stamp. WLLZ's Doug Podell warns, "Ivan Neville's 'Not Just Another Girl' sure sounds and looks like a good record. Don't let it pass you by ".... With Ivan all over the Keith Richards solo album, his visibility is at an all time high. If this track doesn't crossover to Top 40 we'll all be shocked and stunned, but not near as much as WNOR's Mark Bradley, "Ivan Neville will be a smash. If this this isn't a potential smash then I haven't heard one. Great hook, to the point, in and out. I don't know how anybody could dislike this song".... This week's Biggest Mover on the Hard Hundred, 95-59*.

MORE HARD ACTS

Jon Astley, "Put This Love To The Test", Atlantic.... Remember when you were a teenager and concerned about looking cool in the eyes of your peers? Even if you really liked something, it was always a risk to come out in favor of a new clothing style, hair-do or band until it was espoused by a certain percentage of the "in crowd". It's childish, but we hear similar reservations over and over from our radio contacts, "I love the Jon Astley, but we're going to wait and see how it works at other stations". You who hesitate should know that 55 of your peers are now playing with Jon, including big kids on the block such as WMMR, KLOL, WIYY, KZAP, DC101, KLBJ, WHCN, WBCN, KYYS and WCCC. WKQQ's Stacy Yelton moves Jon into heavy rotation and quips, "If you have inhibitions about 'Put This Love...', use Double-Q as an example. We try to be as inoffensive as possible, however what could be offensive about an adult record with an undeniable hook. Hell, we all get horny sometimes".... It's cool, it's a hit, it's at 62*. If you wait too long and miss this one, your audience will know that you're square.


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"I WANNA BE LOVED"

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Heralding the arrival of Simmons Records

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Survivor, "Didn't Know It Was Love", Scotti Brothers.... As predicted, this tune ended up as one of our biggest movers this week. WNEW, WLUP, KBER, WLAV, WRKI, WWTR, KDJK and half a dozen others are drawn in by that patented, uplifting chorus. At WEGR in Memphis, Drake Hall is impressed, "Survivor's 'Didn't Know It Was Love' is a pleasant surprise. Hometown boy Jimi Jamieson and the dudes are back with some very good stuff".... The chart reflects a giant 89-70* leap, and perennial winners such as WEBN, WFBQ, KGGO, KEZO, KISW and WLLZ all recognize the value of spinning Survivor before the cross-town competition burns it to a crisp.

Crossfire Choir, "The Canary Song",

Irack.... Here we have a sing-a-long song for the entire family (pets included). After just a listen or two, even the most shy and introverted will be crooning in the shower at the top of their lungs (soap on a rope/Mr. Microphone optional). Early action on this Jersey (via Florida) band represents both the alternative and mainstream side of the fence and includes WDIZ, WKLC, WXRT, WHFS, WDRE, and KABL. Also in on the action is long-time supporter WHTG where **Rich Robinson** says, "Crossfire Choir has a strong following around here, They've always been at the top of our most requested list, and with 'Canary Song' they've done it again. I think this is the one to cross them over to mainstream success".... A song with this much potential deserves at least a test or two. Put it on and let your listeners vote.

Screaming Tribesmen, "I've Got A Feeling", RYKO.... Don't expect RYKO to stop fighting for this record. Believe it, there are a lot of people green with envy over the fact that RYKO gets to work this album. If you've been guilty of major-label myopia in the past, mend your ways and focus in on what could only be described as a Rock Radio natural. The Tribesmen make their first appearance on the Hard Hundred at 97* after KROQ and KISW (!) join up with 15 already on including WFNX, WVVV, WHFS, KFMH, WRCN and KTCL and WBCN where support in Boston has translated into huge sales. WCKO's Chip Matthews ups the track into heavy rotation and adds, "Make no bones (or flowers) about it. 'I've Got A Feeling' is a heavy all-demos song with a 60's feel and lyrics for the 80's".... Sometimes it pays dividends to take note of the little guys in the industry--especially when they've got the goods to back up their bragging.

Tuesday Blue, "Love Me Simple", EMI....

With roots-rock, blues-rock and guitar-rock in plentiful supply at present, it seems as if clean, crisp, high-quality pop ought to be in strong demand. In the midst of all the "chugga-chugga" and "thumpa-thumpa" that we know and love as AOR radio, it's wise to take the best quality songs from this genre and use them liberally to add some brightness and diversity to the ol' playlist. If you're shopping for "Playlist Helper" be sure to put Ireland's Tuesday Blue at the top of the list. As with any new band, it's hard to lay-off the comparisons when attempting to describe their style. **KEZO's Bruce McGregor** builds on the Irish connection, "We're out of the box on Tuesday Blue. From the 'U2 can do no wrong school', this is just a great song".... At **KRZQ**, **Max Volume** hears roughly the same influences, "Tuesday Blue is more than just a U2 or Simple Minds clone. They are refreshing on their own".... In addition to KEZO and KRZQ, early play is noted at KFMU, KTCL, WHFS, WHTG and at KACV where top 5 phones are registered.

Michelle Shocked, "If Love Was A Train", Mercury.... Although stylistically different from Melissa Etheridge's "Bring Me Some Water", we see this Michelle Shocked track developing in much the same way. Steady progress manifested by 10-15 adds each week along with enthusiastic audience response is pushing Michelle further up the Hard Hundred at each stop. 14 adds this week paced by WNEW, WLAV, WLLZ, KBCO, WBRU and KTYD translate into a 65-54* Hard Hundred move. WNEW's Lorraine Caruso is a new fan, "The next female vocalist to listen to is Michelle Shocked. 'If Love Was A Train' is smooth, sexy, upbeat and cool, and has a place in AOR radio".... 54 stations are already on board, with more getting on than off at each stop. So to get a good seat you should act now or go hop a boxcar. Hunters & Collectors, "Back On The Breadline", IRS.... After years of playing together, it just might be "Fate" that has Hunters & Collectors poised for American success. The forward progress continues for "Back On The Breadline", and the track is sitting at 85*. WBCN, WDHA and KRQU move the song up in rotation, and this week's adds include KATP, WRIK and KKAZ where Tony Montoya believes in second chances. "I listened to the Hunters & Collectors a long time ago and went back to it this week. What I found was an excellent track with legs for the format. This song is prime for the current direction of AOR".... Be sure to check out Mike Marrone's interview with the band's Mark Seymour to follow in this issue.

Kix, "Cold Blood", Atlantic.... It's an East coast breakout and a Hard Hundred debut for this hard-workin', hard-rockin' Baltimore area band. The mid-Atlantic markets are pretty much locked up with play on DC101, WIYY, WWTR, WHTF, WDVE, and WTPA. Now the word is spreading as evidenced by play in Tampa, L.A., Texas and Milwaukee. The boys are scoring top-5 phones in Pittsburgh, and **WDVE's Anthony Alfonsi** tells us, "Kix is one of those bands that has paid more than their fair share of dues while in search of a mainstream break. 'Cold Blood' should prove to be their springboard".... "Blow My Fuse" is the band's fourth effort on Atlantic records and represents the best produced platter to date from an act that was here-to-fore best known for their killer live sets. A debut this week at 99* and rumblings of big things to come.

Northern Pikes, "One Good Reason", Virgin.... Not a band to be pigeon-holed in any one particular style, the Pike's unique and radical departure from LP #1 caught a few programmers by surprise. The guitars are more prominent, and the sound carries an edge straight from the "Hippy Head Shot" era (circa 1968). After adapting to the new sound of the band, the programmers we spoke with have been flashing the "thumbs-up" signal. KOAS's Mike Gardner has a typical response, "We love the new Northern Pikes, and overall it is very much an improvement over their first album".... Early support comes from KATP, KFMU, KJOT, WCKO, WHTG, KTAO, KFMH, KTCL and WWRB.

Rock City Angels, "Deep Inside My Heart", Getten... Keep a close eye on this track. Judging by the liberal early play at several major market stations, "Deep Inside My Heart" is on its way to the upper reaches of the Hard Hundred. Among the 40 + reporters already spinning this track are KTXQ, WCMF, WLLZ, KZAP, WFBQ, WKDF, KEZO, WQFM, WLZR, KOME, KXRX and WCCC. WKLS, KAZY and KEZE all increase rotation, and the chart reflects a 75-67* move. This is a band that combines the "down n' dirty" charm of say, Guns N' Roses with the blues-rock punch of ZZ Top. Try to find a 2:45 slot in the ol' Selector system for this song, and we're sure that the small airplay investment will pay off big programming dividends.

Richard Thompson, "Turning Of The Tide", Capitol.... Long time fans of Richard are no doubt rejoicing (in a dignified manner, to be certain) about "Turning Of The Tide" taking the last available position on this week's Hard Hundred. Despite a brilliant career with Fairport Convention, wife Linda and as a solo artist, mass appeal success hasn't yet been able to catch up to Richard's musical vision. Now could be the time, and "Turning Of The Tide" should be the vehicle. WBRU, KISS, KPEZ, WGIR, WIZN, WWVU, WMJY and KTCL are new this week. They join 15 OTB stations including KBCO, WHFS, KMOD, WFNX and KTYD. If you've counted yourself among this man's silent admirers of the past years, then you're probably just waiting for an open slot for this one.

Bulletboys. "Smooth Up", Warner Brothers.... In these cynical times, it's always nice to write about a band that is concerned about the social issues that face the average listener. The Bulletboys are spreading their message of safe sex across America from the West coast. And what is that message, you ask?... Safe sex means not falling out of bed (rim shot...pause for laughter). Well, there must be someone in your building who hasn't heard that joke. All kidding aside, we can tell you that this Ted Templeman-produced song is our highest debut from a new band, checking in at 92* this week. The list of early believers includes KZAP, WRXK, KGON, KAZY, WQFM, KNAC, KRXQ, WAPL and 15 others. We all need to cop an attitude every now and then, and this is the perfect band for post 7pm airwave attitude adjustment.

ALBUM PLAY PRIORITIES HARD REPORT —

Midnight Oil, "Dreamworld", Columbia.... Getting fired up for a solid run at the upper third of the chart, those Midnight Oil believers are beginning to see the payoff on all their hard work. "Anyone not on Midnight Oil's 'Dreamworld' should really listen again", sez Ty Banks up North at KQWB, "This is turning out to be the catchiest sing-a-long Midnight Oil single yet." And isn't "sing" the root word in single after all? Adds on KRXQ, KXRX, WNEW, WAAF and KPEZ help power up that 56-47* move and the rotational ups at KSJO, WSTZ, KATT and Ty's own KQWB are showing that this sound is more than a little welcome in the American mainstream.

THE

Smithereens, "Drown In My Own Tears", Capitol.... Nobody is crying at the Tower however. Not

with those powerhouse adds at KRQR, WDIZ, WHJY and WCMF contributing to a week that could prove pivotal to this project. 'This song could be the best thing on the entire album", according to WNPQ's Eric St John, "If you supported these guys during their struggling days don't pull back on your commitment now." Increases on KMJX, WFYV, WNEW and WLVQ keeps the pressure up but that move into Power at KGB is the capper. Research driven PD's tell us the band is a huge success with call-out and the concert reviews are equally strong from coast to coast as their road show with Paul Kelly rolls on. Holding steady at 35 on the HH and waiting for that reporter status to hit the century mark next week.

Van Halen, "Feels So Good", Warner Brothers.... Are you ready for more of Hurricane Eddie? Those folks at KGB, KMBY, KZAM, DC-101, KISW and WRXK, (where they know a little something about the topic in hand), are all battening down the hatches and getting ready for the next Halen onslaught. The welcome mat for these guys is not only out but actually nailed down with some serious ten penny jobs. A 23-17* jump on the HH sees some major increases on KATT, KLOS, KTYD, KXRX and WNPQ while those phones are blowing in the wind at WAAF, WXLP, WRUF, WKRR and WTKX. When you get talking about the prime acts of the 80's it is impossible to walk by these guys and who would want to anyway?

Robert Cray, "Night Patrol", Mercury....

Just as those last blues grooves on "Don't Be Afraid Of The Dark" started to get transparent from all the play it got on American AOR, here comes a tonic for your turntable. "Night Patrol" checks in just like a good Marine and the perimeter is alive with the crosstalk of sentry duty at KZAP and KRXQ in Sacramento while KILO, KBOY, KPEZ, WMJY and WWRB are all joining in a downbeat parade that gets Robert positioned with a 96-77* jaunt on the Hard Hundred. Don't miss this shot at one of America's true originals. Your airsound could stand to get a little blue from time to time, don't you think? Steadfy play at KEZO, KISS, WLAV, KYYS, KEZE and WDHA makes us think the answer is pretty obvious.

Scorpions, "Don't Stop At The Top", Mercury.... No worry there campers. The Germans are blitzing far beyond the impact of their involvement in the Monsters Tour and a helpless America can only twitch and writhe in their wake. KZEL's AI Scott leads the pack of ears in residence who knows the real thing when it parks a tank on his front yard. "The Scorpions have done more to remain true to their original vision than many other metal inspired bands." 12 adds this week kick start the track with KICT, KAZY, KRXQ, KSJO, WWCK and KISS adding their weight to a song that is bare moments from a debut.

CHARTSTARS <u>Bad Company, "No Smoke Without A Fire", Atlantic....</u> The chart is so bloody thick with 70s bands, that if it weren't for the digital disc angle, we might all get confused in a terminal time warp. Leading the new-release-on-life is Bad Company. Here's just a smattering of smart stations: KGB, KLOS, KOAS, KOMP, WAAF, WCMF, WDVE, WHCN and WHEB. Such a count helps to up the chart ante 5-4*, and don't expect 'em to diminish in quantity. The phone factor plays a major role in this latest of success stories, 45 stations, including KEZE, KMOD, WAPL, WDVE, WIOT and WONE. And last, but absolutely not least says **Tony Montoya** of **KKAZ**, "The Bad Company song gets top five phones this week. It definitely doesn't sound like the old band, so that obviously isn't the draw. It's just a good rock and roll track that has people real excited".

Bon Jovi, "Bad Medicine", Mercury.... Somebody get some urinalysis samples quick, 'coz the way they're out of the blocks is downright unnatural ala the recent 100 Meter escapade. Holding up the specimen cup is KILO's Dr. Alan White, "'New Jersey' shot to the top of our retail the first week out in a real horse race between Metallica, Def Leppard and Guns n' Roses".... Watch for this week's 4-3* HH move to repeat itself, this track is just the first surge of adrenaline. Jeff Ivan of KFMX can just see the future of his playlist, "The more I listen to the new Bon Jovi, the more I love it. Tons of singles to be found on this one".... This album didn't just open up, it was mauled apart with a sledgehammer.

U2, "Desire", Island Let's face it, if so inclined, they could cover "Attack of the Killer Tomatoes" and half of LA would turn out to watch them on a rooftop. People were amazed at the longevity of "Joshua Tree," in spite of its unexpected languidness. This track fluidly combines the rawness of "War" and the folk swirlings of "Jesus Christ". Scott Laudani of WHEB sums it up tersely with: "U2's 'Desire' has energy to burn, non-stop emotion in motion".... 1-1* seems just anticlimactic after a superlative debut, and the station count is pushed over the double-century mark with 12 more adds from the likes of KBER, KBPI, KOAS, WIXV, WIYY and WKGR. Comparable performances in the album chart are in the wings for the release of "Rattle and Hum" itself.

Gregg Allman, "Slip Away", Epic.... Gregg's killah jump on the Hard Hundred 51-38* is only diminished by his loss in the Mr. Confederate Tattoo Trophy category, which can only be awarded to blues cruncher Johnny Winter. For now, Gregg will have to make do with the Mr. Congeniality prize, or the nasty Cher anecdote Award. But in the hearts of mucho programmers, he's still their number one dude. 81 stations, plussed by 18 adds from the likes of KFMU, KMJX, KSHE, WAAF, WCCC, WCMF, WDVE, WGIR, WSTZ, WTPA and WZZQ. KBCO, KILO, WDIZ, WIMZ, WIOT, WMJY, and WWRB comprise the increases division.

Jeff Healey, "Confidence Man," Arista.... Stevie Wonder comparisons aren't really kosher, but the prodigy storylines are disturbingly similar. "I've heard of overcoming a handicap, but this Jeff Healey guy is truly unbelievable, and so is his instant success of his debut release See the Light'" exclaims Mike Verity of WNGZ. To boot, WZEW's Kerry Gray remarks, "Jeff Healey is just remarkable. What a talent this man is. 'Confidence Man' is my number one in-car favorite".... And when the MD carts a tape home, you're talkin' more than a purely political 'get off my case' add. 14 adds, 14 increases, aided by zero drops and zero decreases, pushes 44-37* on the Hard Hundred.

Vixen, "Edge of a Broken Heart", EMI All-female bands enter and exit the scene with unsurprising regularity, but this gang o'gals ought to worm their way into rotations all over the country. After igniting the active imaginations amongst the staff here, they've moved on to similar raves from the testosterone inflicted. One such victim, WRIK's Craig Bradley admits at a recent Spandex Anonymous meeting, "Vixen won't budge from heavy, and barrages us with number 1 requests for the second straight week".... His company is considerable, 101 stations, such as KISS, KNAC, KOME, KWHL, WAPL, WCCC and WLLZ. The Hard Hundred recognizes their inevitable appeal with a 33-31* move.

Night Ranger, "Did It For Love", MCA....

This week is volume two of AI Scott's dissertation on Ranger's newest release. "This Night Ranger album has multiple track depth. This has to be some of their best stuff ever and the production lends a real boost to some great songs" sayeth the dude from KZEL. Nice, but, I don't think you can get a doctorate in ballad-ology. Others pursue their undergraduate work, such as 13 adds from KJJO, WDHA, WEGR, WTKX and WZXL. Shining the teacher's apple are KFMG, KGON, KRQR, KSJO, WDIZ, WLLZ, and WQFM. Continuing its climb on the Hard Hundred 24-20*, with not a drop in sight.



Tower sells the collection for a mere \$1.99 and guarantees good in-store placement to spread the word on deserving bands like E*I*E*I*O, Young Fresh Fellows and The Pontiac Brothers. The label informs us that they will be following up this campaign with a press and radio mailing as well. Look for yours when it hits the office.

We certainly hope that the dismal ratings of the Hard Rock special on network TV won't diminish that enthusiasm. Scher's Performance Video will be responsible for production duties on the new series of shows. The success of the Ritz has really been noteworthy, with the club setting the standard in New York for attendance and gate when compared to any other venue in the same category. Now it seems the time has come for John Scher and his little entertainment empire to hit the national stage in a big way with Viacom's backing.

THE LUCKIEST MAN IN THE WORLD How many times have you wanted to cut loose and format a station the way your heart and ears

How many times have you wanted to cut loose and format a station the way your heart and ears dictated instead of the way your consultant commanded? What about the chance to run a radio operation with no concern whatsoever about the impact of Arbitron? Or how about getting a mandate from ownership to reflect the best in America through music? It is safe to say that this recipe for radio happiness must remain a mere dream for most of us. But not John Florence and his staff at KUSW. This shortwave pioneer has been putting music into the lifeblood of the entire planet with a minimum of limitations and a maximum impact. Somewhere, there is a smiling rock and roll deity, happy that this station exists.

JT: How long have you been on the air?

John: Since the day after Christmas 1987. But we have been working on the concept for about five years. Ralph Carlson had the idea on a tour bus to see WRNO in New Orleans. WRNO is a Top 40 station and the first shortwave station in the country to operate as a commercial property. Joe Costello is the owner and Ralph really got the bug after talking to Joe. But things always take longer than you expect so it stretched into a five year project to get everything done.

JT: How did you guys expand commercial broadcast to the shortwave band?

John: Previously, it wasn't legal to operate commercial shortwave stations at all. That band was largely reserved for government broadcasts and they didn't allow private operators to use it. Well, Joe Costello had this idea for WNOR and went to Washington and said, "Why not?" Some questions of national interest came into play but by volunteering to stick to the rules and regs of the FCC, all those issues were resolved.

JT: Has there been much advertising response yet?

John: It has been building slowly but right now I just think it's too brand new. One of the things we must contend with, is that we must be licensed for international broadcast and KUSW, for instance, is licensed in Toronto, which means we must advertise products that are available in that city.

JT: What kind of clients are you dealing with at this time?

John: It varies, we are just getting started handling a lot of Per Inquiry accounts, it's just the beginning in a lot of ways for us. One thing we make use of is the fact that a lot of short wave listeners are catalog users so that's the natural way of getting the message to them. As a result, we have developed our own catalog approach to access those listeners.

JT: This job sounds like the shot of a lifetime. How did you get the brass ring?

John: I was MD at KRSP and on the air for 3 years and, quite frankly, the format we wanted to do on KUSW had me written all over it. When it came time to do this project I was ecstatic to get this chance. It really is a dream come true for me and a lot of people in the industry. I mean, I am virtually surrounded by music here and I can reach over and pull out whatever I want. Man, it's a trip to be able to play a little Bob Wills or Taj Mahal from time to time.

JT: Is the international scope of your broadcasting changing the way you think about programming much, a little, or not at all?

John: It has made a huge change in the way I think about those considerations. It's exciting to be able to do what we are doing and think of it in world terms. We are very proud to be projecting a vision of American music. We play the music of other countries as well as American artists because that's part of the global community we are becoming more and more involved with.

JT: Do you have a name for the format?

John: We like to call it American Contemporary Classic. Currently we are looking at going to 24 hours a day but for the moment we can only keep things going for 12 hours right now.

JT: How do things look from a financial viewpoint at this time?

John: I think we're sitting on a gold mine, I really do. Indications are that we are becoming one of the most listened to shortwaves in the world and the global shortwave audience is huge.

JT: How can we find the station?

John: When you get East of Denver we come in like a local station on the 19 meter band. As for our dial position, it's a bit

complicated because we have to change our frequency every three hours.

JT: Why would that be necessary?

John: It all has to do with the rotation of the Earth. We need to swap frequencies for greater signal effect. But from 10am to 4pm (Mountain Time) we can be heard on 15650.

JT: Speaking of signal strength, how much juice does it take to rock the world?

John: The transmitter radiates at a solid two and a half million watts of power.

JT: That will get the word out to Java and back.

John: No kidding. We have received letters from Finland and Australia among other countries but the part I like are the letters we get from people like a garage in Boston who listen to us as if we were their local station. Or the people who have shortwave in their cars in Chicago. They sort of have to figure out our dial position for themselves and that makes listening to us a kind of secret society.

JT: Now the key is to make no secret of what you are really about. Now is the time to go public in a big way.

John: I agree and the reaction is definitely there. We have gotten positive response from virtually every spot on the globe and it has really changed my perception of the world community. It can overwhelm you just how nice all the people in the world are and how eager they are to talk to America.

JT: What oddities strike you as the most perplexing in this everywhere at once, global broadcasting operation of yours.

John: It's amazing to me how everything we do must be done in Universal Time which is the same as Greenwich Mean Time. The weather reports are also a lot of fun. It's a kick to say the sun is setting in Paris and there's fog hanging low in Hong Kong.

JT: Radio without ratings must be a different scene altogether.

John: We aren't worried about ARB, they just can't handle us. We have approached them though and the rule is; if we get diaries in a market anywhere in the country, then those will get credited. It might be nice to get those numbers but it's great not to have to worry about them either.

JT: This must be one of the most exhilarating chances in your entire career.

John: Out of nowhere we put this radio station on the air and the whole world is hearing it. The response has been incredible and the response can best be described as a genuine fondness for the music we are playing. I mean, when a fur trapper two hundred miles from the nearest road way up North in Canada writes about how he takes his shortwave along with him and listens to our station constantly, I am suddenly there with that isolated man. One very interesting fact, that isn't largely known in America, is that in many countries shortwave is the most listened to radio band there is. The BBC alone can claim something like 200 million listeners around the world.

Considering the excessive broadcast property values in America right and the next to nothing expense of setting up a shortwave station, you might expect a landrush to this new branch of the media. But with the international complications and a complex sales mechanism to balance, I doubt that too many group owners are ready to dance on air in this particular manner. No, leave it to the frontiersmen of the One World mindset, the functional dreamers of the new millennia to take the music of America to the world. The rest of us can go back to losing sleep over what demographic subsection calls the tune this year. Color me green. JIM TRAPP

"Hunting and Collecting with Mark and Mike"

Although Hunters and Collectors are considered a new band by many people here in the States, that isn't so. They have been together since 1981 and just recently released their best shot at the U.S. charts. I had the pleasure of speaking with singer/writer Mark Seymour and as you'll see, this is not just another band from Down Under, but a band with an intelligent approach to the "pushing forty" phenomenon we call Rock and Roll. Enjoy!

MIKE: I've noticed a kind of softening of the band's sound. Is this a conscious effort to streamline your sound or just the normal growth pattern?

MARK: I think we made a conscious decision before we made "Human Frailty" back in 1985. We more or less derived what kind of music we wanted to play at that point, and this album is a fairly natural evolution. It wasn't so much the sound we made the decision about but the style of the music, and we weren't really sure who our audience was. I mean, we were asking ourselves "Who are the people relating to our music?"

MIKE: Were you talking about the cult following here in the States or home in Australia?

MARK: At that point it was Australia because we hadn't had any success abroad. We were thinking in terms of the public in general. I think it's more a question of focusing rather than streamlining. That holds true for bands like Midnight Oil as well. I was having a conversation just the other night with an Australian journalist that has been a fan for a long time and he asked me kind of the same question. Only he was very skeptical about us becoming part of the mainstream. But to me, as I said to him, "look we were writing very commercial music four years ago".

MIKE: Right. I thought "Throw Your Arms Around Me", was going to be the big breakthrough here.

MARK: Yeah, you can write commercial songs til the cows come home, but unless you're out there plugging away and making your presence felt for a long enough time it doesn't matter.

MIKE: Now what about this rumor? I heard that the reason "Throw Your Arms" didn't get the attention it deserved over here was that Tina Turner was going to record it and therefore your version was held back. Truth or fiction?

MARK: Fiction. We actually released that song twice in Australia, once on a live album and of course on "Human Frailty". At that stage we were still going through the process, even in that territory, of convincing the industry that we were a commercial proposition. We'd sort of like grown up in the clubs and because we had such a tight rein on the control of the production and the sleeve and such, it took a while for radio to realize that this was in fact commercial. So in order to prove a point we tried to get another artist to record it. We sent it to Tina's management cause we knew she was working on a record. Michael (Waters) knows her management quite well. But to tell you the truth I don't know if she ever even heard the song. I mean, it never wound up on any of her records. (Laughs)

MIKE: How did it do in Australia? Was it ever a hit there or in any other part of the world?

MARK: Not on those specific terms, but what it did do in Australia was help "Human Frailty" a lot. We first released the live version and we had a really good live video that basically helped promote the album.

MIKE: How did "Human Frailty" do at home, saleswise?

MARK: It went gold in about six weeks.

MIKE: Which is how many copies, 100,000?

MARK: (Laughing) Oh no, only 35,000! That's something a lot of American's don't realize. It's a big difference.

MIKE: Where do you think "Fate" has improved on the kind of shift or focus in direction first found on "Human Frailty"?

MARK: The production! Of course there are certain aspects of that we are not entirely happy with. You have to continually explore those things with each new record, but that to me would be the biggest improvement. My vocals have definitely relaxed more also.

MIKE: If you were a promo guy here in the States, how would you convince someone to play "Back On The Breadline"?

MARK: Well, I'd just say it's new, it's fresh and it's honest.

MIKE: And it has something to say.

MARK: Let's just look at from a business mentality. You either look at things positively or you shy away from them. The main thing is, you can never underestimate the perception of the public. If the public is exposed to something that's new, they're interested. I sometimes think that a lot of people in the industry are frightened of alienating the public and I think the public is quite often more excited by something new than the industry gives them credit for.

MIKE: I agree 100% but what can you do about it?

MARK: The only road we can really take ultimately is just persistence and perseverance. You've got to keep plugging away and win the confidence of people.

MIKE: Hunters and Collectors was not started by your average bunch of guys looking to get laid and party. You all had serious careers. How about a rundown?

MARK: O.K., I was an English teacher (much laughter), and there is also a doctor, an engineer and an architect.

MIKE: Why did you decide to make music your career?

MARK: I had defiantly decided that there was no way I was going to be a teacher. I had sort of never grown up in the respect of making a decision in college and when I was faced with a teaching job I said to myself, I don't know what I want to do --- but I don't want to do this. I had always liked music, it was sort of a gut thing. Although I had played with these guys in garage bands and stuff before.

MIKE: How does one go about convincing this group of "young professionals" to give it all up for the grunge and grime of yet another rock band?

MARK: Well they were prepared to pursue a career in their respective chosen fields. The hardest person to convince was Doug (Falconer-drums), the doctor. After all, he has his degree and could go back to it tomorrow. It was more a case of action speaks louder than words. For the first couple of years I had to basically show them i wasn't going to freak out and run away. I just had to inspire their confidence but something like that doesn't happen overnight.

MIKE: What are you feelings toward American radio?

MARK: It's funny, you know. It's all speculation, but the feeling I get from American radio is that so many people in the industry are talking about how it's sort of going through a conservative faze; that it's resisting change. I mean, I get people very close to me within the industry saying, "The thing you've got to understand, and you don't because you're a musician, is that radio isn't interested in breaking new records, it's only interested in selling advertising." To that I say, how come I've met so many people in the industry who really like music, who are enthusiastic about rock music? I'm meeting all these people and then get told the opposite. It's almost like the left hand doesn't know what the right hand is doing. The thing is, if enough people are going around thinking the industry is going through a conservative phase then that's basically the way it's going to behave.

MIKE: Are you planing to tour here or is this just a press trip?

MARK: We were going to tour with Crowded House starting this month and going right through to November. But Eddie Rayner's, (Ex-Split Enz keyboard and touring keyboards for Crowded House), wife had another baby and it looked like it was going to be difficult, so the tour was pushed back. So instead of us trying to madly organize something on short notice we'd just see if the record's got legs. It's kind of like a blessing in disguise, because what we're going to do is come back in February and tour solidly for ten weeks.

MIKE: Well all I can say is good luck and thanks for spending the time with us here at the lake.

MARK: Thank you, the place is lovely and I had a great time.

That Petrol Emotion "End Of The Millennium Psychosis Blues" (Virgin) Ever since the band burst onto the scene with "Manic Pop Thrili" in 1986, their gutsy attempt to squash pop standards has inflicted new excitement and raw energy into modern rock music as we know it. That Petrol Emotion is driven by a politico-emotional force and the music takes shape around a new sound dimension with each new return to vinyl. That Petrol Tide has turned towards a more turbulent time period that finds this band playing a pivotal role in the evolution of progressive music. The daring spirit they exuded from the start continues to manifest itself as a swirling mass of guitars over a staccato rhythm base, marking the signature sound that we have come to expect. As Roli Mosimann returns to producer's chair once again, they stretch out to experiment with newer styling like the swaying tones and squeeze box sounds in "Cellophane"; the militant drum work and laser effects in "Candy Love Satellite" and the sparse, paranoid swing in "Dark Shattered Man". "Tension" pays tribute to the funk and dance single, "Big Decision" (from the last Lp), with its squealing strings and synth-laced percussion, much like the R&B singed "Groove Check". "End Of The Millennium" oozes with minor-melodies and a heap of percussive hooks as we delve into a challenging and off center album that will make you want to absorb every note.



The Game Theory "Two Steps From The Middle Ages" (Enigma) Their last album, "Lolita Nation", sent us chasing after a double album dose of the band in many moods while they indulged in more eclectic moments throughout. "Two Steps From The Middle Ages" seems like the alter-ego follow up, the solid pop master piece of a different kind that pulls their music more into focus with continued production skills furnished by Mitch Easter. Depending on what side of the Game Theory you like to play, their new album undoubtedly offers the most tantalizing mix of songs ever, and "You Drive" is the most solidly placed piece of music that Scott Miller has concocted to date. And he has put forth an album that's thoughtful, well paced and filled with light hearted songs and even brighter arrangements. "Don't Entertain Me Twice" grinds as one of the few heavy songs to sink into; and depth is a radio reality this time with "What The Whole World Wants", "Rolling With The Moody Girls", "Wyoming" and "Throwing The Election" delivering the goods to keep radio and press working harder in '88.

NEW RELEASES

Camouflage "Voices & Images" (Atlantic) The German trio that makes the cool and calculated sounds of Camouflage enters the U.S. with a debut album that has already taken Germany, Hong Kong and even Singapore by storm with the single "The Great Commandment". Depeche Mode comparisons are flying high, but have only proven to be a positive association for this very young but successful group. Their high tech approach and bigger than life production has been an important factor in skyrocketing reaction, but the rest of the album support and continue that excitement - no problem. Ultra-sophisticated sound layering and seductive glossy texture of their songs will definitely keep radio and club clientele on their toes and moving to steaming songs like "That Smiling Face", "Neighbours", "Strangers Thoughts" and "I Once Had A Dream".

Steve Earle "Copperhead Road" 12" (UNI) The sun is finally rising on a new age for Steve Earle, an American artist who continues to re-introduce country roots back into popular mC ic, only this time the fireworks are flying in anticipation of his latest single. "The new record's a logical progression from the first two. The big difference is that in a lot of places where the producer stopped me before, I didn't

stop this time," says Earle. This gives us more insight into this Nashville based singer's precision aim. After two albums, various collaborations and production credit under his belt for The Bible, he continues to unleash his passion for home grown riffs, while sharing some of his outside music experiences in the process. His use of keyboards to affect euro-folk imagery, could get glazed over the first time because of its subtle presence, but the overall results are what count. Steve's country origins are definitely dressed in rock threads that make him look better than ever, and it's time to let the real talent speak for itself.

Souled American "Fe" (Rough Trade) Hailing from the Chicago area, WXRT's Lin Brehmer spurred us on to a band who has garnered huge reaction on a local level, and who just plain sounds like the midwest's answer to Camper Van Beethoven to me. They walk down rocky roads with a country sound that loses its footing at times, sinks into folk persuasion (Jim Trapp's howling right now) and glides along at its own pace to the beat of their own drum. But that drum never loses its purpose as indicated by "Magic Bullets". "Soldier's Joy" bounces with a reggae feel and a backlash of harmonica and the quirky nature of "Lottery Brazil" confirms that there's a musical hunch going on here that with prick up your ears in a shot. What to make of this band of outsiders? Get the "Full Picture" by piecing together the traditional influences they draw from and you will be amazed by their simple assessment of music from the heartland of America. Miracles never cease...







The Ophelias are a four piece band from the Bay Area who have enjoyed national college radio airplay recently upon release of their second album, "Oriental Head", this summer. They are a band that many programmers find hard to understand, yet hard to resist at the same time. Although The Ophelias are still a mystery to many at this point, the wit and wisdom of band leader Leslie Medford may help clear up some of the confusion. I saw Leslie perform a live acoustic set during the New Music Seminar in New York City, and have admired their craft ever since I heard their first album on Strange Weekend Records. The performance inspired this interview which may be a bit late in the game, but it's never too late to catch up with a band that is going places. Hopefully you'll see what I mean.

Dawn Hood: Can you explain the Shakespearean theme that surrounds some of your songs?

Leslie Medford: Sometimes a little too much is made of it. It's just a motif we use. Ophelia as a character is an interesting person who even has rock and roll applications that people can delve into if they want to. But we're not a Shakespearean band or a renaissance style band. We're a rock and roll band with a taste for classic archetypes and competent readers!

Dawn: Some of your influences include Marc Bolan?

Leslie: I'm a T Rex fan and have been for quite a while. He used a lot of imagery that is good for the Ophelias, often talking about a tripped out young maidens. He liked Shakespear and was an intellectual, and he even mentioned Shakespeare throughout five or six songs of his career. He was in the band who originally did "Midsummernight's Scene" (which is found on "Oriental Head") before T Rex.

Dawn: Is is true that Rough Trade will re-issue your debut album that was originally put out by a small independent label called Strange Weekend?

Les/ie: Yes. Rough Trade is the only distributor of the record right now and they have a few copies of it left, and they do intend to release it on vinyl and cassette. That should be available later this year.

Dawn: Two songs that really jumped off of the first album were "Mr. Rabbit" and "Palindrome". What is "Palindrome" about?

Leslie: The lyrics just popped into my head, and the song was written back in 1983. Each verse just expresses an observation about people, and some of the syntax is a bit unusual. It focuses on history being almost impossible to chronicle, because of the old saying that history is written by the winners, and there's a big difference between the actual event and the version of the event when it gets stamped into the history books.

Dawn: It's hard to describe the band in words, as sometimes its uniqueness is shocking. You are true to your art, yet you say you're a rock band. What do you think makes up a good rock song?

Leslie: Well, aside from a good beat, good lyrics and good words, you need people you can transform a song into an emotional or evocative musical setting. Those categories are what it's all about. Good vocals and a good mix are also the key to communicating the message, making it seem real when it comes over the radio. I like to hear words in rock songs, although the songs don't have to say anything, as long as their is some clever and unique way about the music.

Dawn: What other groups are you listening to right now?

Les/ie: I must confess, the more I'm involved with the Ophelias music and the vehicle of it, the less I listen to music. I'm broke so I don't buy a lot of records, but I do like the Jane's Addiction album and I've listened to the Pixies and Hugo Largo. We played a show with Hugo Largo and the Kinks cover they do live is amazing.

Dawn: What are the range of instruments the Ophelias use to get the imagery across?

Leslie: On the record we supplement the usual drums, bass and guitar (both electric and acoustic) with lots of vocals and overlayed harmonies, but there is also trumpet, recorder, harmonica, acoustic piano, organ, tympani, orchestra bells and assorted percussion. We try to use different settings on the board to give each song a different texture.

Dawn: What's in store for the Ophelias in the near future?

Leslie: Well, our biggest desire is to be on the road and tour the country for the first time, probably near October 15th. We look forward to playing on Halloween, with music from the "Night Of Halloween" Ep and recording our next album which should take place over the holidays.

Dawn: When you are approached by people who have never heard the Ophelias, how do you describe the band?

Leslie: I'd just say we're a rock and roll band, because to me, we have a lot in common with bands like the Beatles which is something the press never seems to bring out when they talk about our uniqueness and eccentricity. We have a lot in common with the "experimental" bands who were popular in the 60's: The Beatles, The Stones, The Kinks and The Who. Our records do touch on a lot of styles and we do sing songs with strong melodies, strong rhythms and catchy hooks (at least we think so). Other inspirations like Syd Barrett, Pink Floyd and other bands on the fringe are also reference points for us. We are a rock band in the best sense of the word. We're dealing with pop music and we're not trying to be particularly eccentric, but the short memory of the people involved information, write to The Ophelias Appreciation Society, P.O. HEAVY HITTERS

Helloween, "Keeper Of The Seven Keys, Part II", RCA.... Last year's "Keeper...Part I" effectively set the stage for one of metal's best and fastest rising stars. It was a great album that had critics and fans raving, but now with "...Part II", this band has really hit their stride and have put out their best work to date. Michael Kiske leads this band further and further up the ladder to stardom with his stellar vocal workouts and his contributions on the songwriting front. Fellow band members Markus Grofskopf (bass), Michael Weikath (guitar), Ingo Schwichtenberg (drums) and Kai Hansen (guitars) also churn out some of the most energetic and optimistic sounding music I've ever heard. Songs like "Eagle Fly Free", "Dr. Stein", "Rise And Fall", "Save Us", "I Want Out" and the title track are all prime examples of metal done right, with "We Got The Right" quickly becoming one of my all time favorites. Tight melody and guitar lines, thundering bass and drum interaction, those amazing Geoff Tate/Bruce Dickinson type vocals and excellent and witty songwriting are all gonna drive this record right up the charts and straight into the hearts and purse strings of American metal heads. In fact, this week the first single, "Save Us" debuted on Hard Hitters at 35*. Now, with the release of the full album, watch for blow-out reaction from our metal reporters and their fans. One of the best new releases this fall. (C.B.)

Seduce, "Watchin", I.R.S..... Detroit's bad boys had a pretty good run with their rough and tough new album "Too Much Ain't Enough". With the momentum winding down just a bit, it's great to see the new 12" finally hitting the streets. "Watchin'" is one of the best tracks on the Lp and one that received a lot of attention from the metal masses on the Lp's first go 'round on the airwaves. In true Seduce fashion, this song is gritty and raw sounding and features lyrics that sketch a grim and, unfortunately realistic picture of some of the U.S.' inner cities' worst nightmares. That is, drugs and poverty a la, "Watchin' people pick through my garbage, little children poke holes in their arms....I watch and I wait as the world, falls apart". I've said it before, but I'll say it again, for a three-piece, these guys can sure generate an impressive powerhouse sound. Among their musical merits are David Black's consistently aggressive guitar stylings, Mark Andrews' clever and solid bass lines and natural and appealing vocals and "then" drummer Chuck Berns' strong and straightforward stix work. This song should be an easy play for all metal programs. If you were slow to jump on the first single, "Any Time Or Place" don't wait on this one and you'll be watchin' the phones light up for this one. (C.B.)

Fortune, "The Wolf Will Survive", Unsigned.... Ok boys and girls, take out your newly arrived copy of the Hard Hitters III CD. Try to get past the

biggies like Metallica, Ozzy, Anthrax, Flotsam, and Exciter and skip to track #12. Once you get there you will hear Stratagem Management's latest and greatest discovery. They're not signed yet, but they sound like seasoned studio veterans. Unlike most hungry young metal bands, these guys have a definite, identifiable style featuring great guitars, powerhouse vocals and yes, keyboards too. While they've been compared to Queensryche (God only knows why) and even Stryper, a little of that old Y&T influence still shines through. The average age of band members Bob Vose (vocals), Dave Vargas (drums), Kevin Belanger (bass), Pete DiStephano and Bill Plourde (guitars) is, remarkably, only 19, the oldest being 21. They've just started a month long national club tour opening for Baltimore's Mannequin and reports say that in most instances, the club owner has asked the band to return and headline. These guys have what it takes to be on their way to a multi-album, major label deal and there has already been some interest. Sacred Reich, "War Pigs"/Anvil, "Blood On The Ice", Metal Blade.... These are just two of a flood of new Metal Blade releases, and they are both extremely important records to know about. First we have some eagerly awaited new material from Phoenix thrashers Sacred Reich. What it is, is a new, re-vamped version of Black Sabbath's classic "War Pigs". Since it's Sacred Reich, you should be able to assume that it is much heavier than the Sabs could ever have dreamt of doing it back in the 70's. It also features some excellent production from the able hands of Bill Metoyer. With this band's checkered past, (the departure and return of bassist Phil Rind and the near departure of drummer Greg Hall), this new version should see the light of day on many a metal chart. Second, it's Canada's heaviest metal. That's right, Lips and the boys from Anvil have returned with ice hockey's anthem of anthems. The song opens with a heavy, progressive riff and then proceeds to get quite thrashy before becoming somewhat reminiscent of something out of "Ride The Lightening". The middle part of the song sounds a bit like Savatage as well. These guys seem to really want to change the poser image created by the "Mad Dog" video and they're doing a fantastic job of it. -- If you're looking for crunchers, it doesn't get much better than this. (J.L.)


Rock City Angels, "Young Man's Blues", Geffen.... This band's bio should be called "A Success

Story From Hell". This band was originally formed by the group's main songwriter Bobby Durango and bassist Andy Panik in 1982 as a punk band in Florida. Since then, they've changed numerous members as well as relocating to L.A. and then to Memphis. The band's current line-up consists of Durango, Panik, drummer Jackie D. Dukes, guitarist Doug Banx and guitarist Mike Barnes, all of whom have been deemed social misfits (kind of like the Guns N'Roses syndrome, isn't it? Not surprising since the same A&R guy signed both bands). This is their debut Lp and, though not a real metal record, there is definitely some harder edged stuff to be found on it. Most of the material, however is blues-based hard rock. One of the songs, "Beyond Babylon" actually has a kind of funk-type feel to it. Other noteworthy cuts are the bluesy "Boy From Hell's Kitchen", the Doorsish ballad "Mary", the rocker "Hush Child" and the Lp's real screamer, "Deep Inside My Heart", which has been chosen as the first 12". As such, "Deep" has been picking up many AOR adds as well as quite a few on the metal side of the pond. Also check out "Hard To Hold" (no it's not a Rick Springfield cover) for even more straightforward rock n'roll. (J.L.)

The Stand, "The Stand", Carlyle.... Who'da thunk it. From the land where Willie is King and the Grand 'Ol Opry is his castle, come Gus and the brothers Simmonz. Sounds kind of like a bad Disney movie doesn't it? They are, in all seriousness, a super-tight foursome of melodic, power metal from a part of the country which really isn't known for a heavy metal influence. This self-titled debut Ep includes four excellent tracks including "If You See Kay" which is also on the Foundations Forum '88 CD sampler. From the opening notes of "Nuclear Waist", (what a cool title!), it's obvious that vocalist Gus V. Palas III, guitarist Michael Simmonz and his brothers, Paul (drums) and Jamie (bass) are looking to kick some serious ass. The first thing I noticed about this band was that Paul Simmonz is a brilliant drummer. This initial impression was soon etched in stone because as I read the bio I discovered that he is a former member of Tommy Aldridge's old band Black Oak Arkansas. Listen to him on the first cut. Then check out "All The Wrong Reasons" (not because of it's stand on suicide, but because it's the best song on the record) and "Graduation Day" to find out what the buzz is all about. (J.L.)

Dead End, "Junk", Metal Blade.... Japan isn't just known for exporting cars and computers to the good ol' USA anymore. In recent years they have also sent us some very promising and talented metal acts in the form of Loudness, EZO and last year this band's American debut "Ghost Of Romance". With that record having introduced them to these shores, the new release should firmly solidify their standing as one of metal's best imports. The appeal of this band and this song in particular, lies in the richness of their melody lines and their obvious awareness of what works with American metal audiences. The song is catchy, utilizes interesting riffs and time changes, while Morrie's vocals and English skills (remedial metal - Our own Slave's doing quite well in that and we're so proud of him) are developing by leaps and bounds with every project. While the lyrics are still not always the easiest to understand, he definitely has the art of rock and roll phrasing down to a science. Overall, this band has the goods it takes to make this record a real goer on the airplay charts, and to give the Germans some healthy competition for that much sought after slice of the American money pie that metal has become. Who said the War ever ended? (C.B.)

BulletBoys, "BulletBoys", WB.... L.A. has the nastiest way of cranking out bad boy rockers who have "the touch" for down and dirty lyrics on top of rockin' rhythms. Add that Templeman magic and you get a rock monster of unpredictable proportions. You either love a band like this or you don't. Either way you have to respect their appreciation of a good groove. If there's one to be found, chances are they're gonna make the most of it and they do. The lead track "Smooth Up In Ya", hit the air full force this week, helping them tie for #2 Most Added Metal with the Oz himself. And if that sexual meandering wasn't enough to satisfy the insatiable needs of you closet perverts - look there's more! In fact, there are nine other tracks that deliver (uh hmn) just as much punch per square inch. With titles ranging from "Hard As A Rock", "Kissin' Kitty", "Crank Me Up" and "F#9" who could ask for anything more? Seriously though, the Brother's Warner certainly have their hands full with this band, who are no doubt shooting for the top. They've got the goods and they've got the looks but when it comes to rock - it ain't necessarily what you got, but how you use it. Suffice it to say, these boys know how to use it. (C.B.)

METAL MUSIC NEWS

Greetings to one and all from Metal Control Center deep in the heart of Queens, New York. This is Sal "Earl Of Earache" Treppiedi with this metal news. We have some surprising personnel changes to report. Let's get to the news.

Our first bit of news concerns a band that The Earl likes to refer to as "the greatest non-arena metal band on earth". Of course, I'm referring to, the one and only, **Manowar**. Word from our source is that **Ross The Boss** has parted company with the rest of the band. No word on why the separation occurred. The band recently completed work on their forthcoming album on Atlantic Records. Word also has it that the band has already replaced Ross with a guitarist they found while recording the album in Chicago. This new guitarist still remains nameless. Meanwhile, Ross The Boss is said to be looking to put a new band together. More details as they come in. We also hope to have a word with **Joey DeMaio** in the weeks to come.

After months of speculation the inevitable has apparently happened. Strong rumors persist that **Dokken** has called it quits. According to our sources, **Don Dokken** will go solo and remain under the career guidance of **Cliff Burnstein**, **Peter Mensch** and **Q-Prime Management**. Meanwhile, guitarist **George Lynch** has gone and formed **The Lynch Mob**. No word on what **Jeff Pilson** or **Wild Mick Brown** are going to be doing. Dokken breakup rumors have been circulating for several months, although it seems like years. Even before the band embarked on the U.S. Monsters Of Rock tour, strong rumors were running rampant that the band would break up following the tour. Also, reports surfaced in major metal magazines that Don Dokken was working on a solo album that would be nothing like the Dokken sound. Apparently, one or both have or will come true.

Roadracer Records is at it again. They have signed another one of tomorrow's stars. This time, it is Canada's Annihilator. The band is currently recording their debut album for release in February of 1989. The album is, as yet, untitled. The brains behind Annihilator is Ottawa born Jeff Waters. Waters formed the band in 1985. In November of 1988, the band released what has turned out to be a classic demo. That demo, entitled "Phantasmagoria", earned Annihilator the honor of being voted one of the ten best demos of 1986. Unfortunately, Waters could not find the right musicians to work with. With that, he moved to Vancouver and slowly put together Annihilator's current lineup. It features Waters on lead guitar, Randy Rampage on vocals, Casey Toews on rhythm guitar, Wayne Darley on bass and Ray Hartman on drums. Tracks expected to be on their debut Roadracer release include: "Alison Hell", "Schizos Are Never Alone" and "Word Salad". Roadracer plans to service a two song rough demo. Keep your ears open for this one.

Epitaph Records have two interesting artists with new releases. The first is an all female act called L7. This band features Bonita Sparks, 21 (guitar and vocals), Suzi Gardner, 22 (guitar and vocals), Jennifer Finch, 20 (bass and vocals), and Anne Anderson, 20 (drums). These girls are a Gang Green/Circle Jerks/Megadeth cross. One listen to their self-titled album will prove that these girls can rock. Featured songs include "Cat O' Nine Tails", "Metal Stampede" and "Uncle Bob". L7 is currently on tour with the second band the Epitaph has released, Bad Religion. One name that you should recognize is Greg Hetson. Hetson is the former guitarist of the Circle Jerks. The rest of the band features Greg Graffin, the only original member (vocals), Jay Gurewitz (guitar), in his second stint with the band drummer Peter Finestone and bassist Jay Bontley. Bad Religion has been together since 1980. In that span, they have released three al-

On hand were Brooklyn's own Playmate along with Law & Order, Tuff Luck and several other top acts. The Earl would like to wish L'Amours George and Mike Parente, Richard Sanders of Loud & Proud Management and last, but not least, Chuck "The Roar Of L'Amour" Kaye along with the rest of the L'Amour staff, past and present, continued success for many years to come and thanks for making The Big Apple the heavy metal capitol of the world.

THE HARD REPORT ———

The Saint Goes Marching On

Back in 1983 Armored Saint released their first Ep (which sold 15,000 copies) on Metal Blade Records. It was that recording which led to their eventual signing with Chrysalis Records and the releases of "March Of The Saint", "Delirious Nomad" and last year's "Raising Fear". Now, five years later they have parted company with that label and are in search of another. In the meantime, the band hasn't let up one bit and has in fact returned to the metal scene with a live Ep (on Metal Blade) that is devastating the airplay charts. Known for their live shows, their energetic presence and 100 percent delivery, it's no surprise that this record has created such a strong response from the metal community. A much liked and respected band, the Saint continues it's march towards the top, with new guitarist Jeff Duncan in tow. Vocalist John Bush, called to update us on the band's current situation and where it's headed in 1989.

Chris: How are things going with you guys now that you're in-between albums? The live Ep is doing great.

John: It's goin' okay. We just heard that we might be doing a few dates so if that's the case we'll be real happy. In the meantime we're just doing a lot of writing and getting a lot of really happening new songs. We've got about ten done now are hoping to do about 10 more. We're just keeping busy and we're doing a show for the RIP magazine party. We're really happy with the way Metal Blade is handling the Ep and we're keeping busy with interviews and stuff and it's fun.

Chris: Well, what can we look for on the new album, musically? Any real differences from the last one?

John: Oh, lots of good stuff. There's a lot of diversity to it, to be quite honest. We have a couple of ballad type songs and some fast stuff and some slow, double bass, heavy stuff. You'll dig it, I guarantee it.

Chris: Why have you chosen to go to a five piece at this point, especially since you've done so well as a four piece?

John: Uhm, well thanks. To be honest we just kind of figured that this was a chapter in the band's history that we would like to close and so move on to another. We wanted to bring in somebody new because we felt it would make the sound better. And since Brian Slagel is standing right here, because he pestered us for so long to get another guitar player because he said the sound wasn't complete. So, that was really the icing on the cake for that one, no but really we just wanted to fill in the sound and thought another person would add a spark to the band, and that's happened. We feel a hundred percent better. If you thought the band was powerful as a four piece, just wait. I mean you better try to sew your face on to your head cause it just might get ripped off when you see us live.

Chris: Can you talk at all about the new guitarist or is that still kind of under wraps?

John: Well, you know we're doing a lot of writing with Jeff (Duncan) right now, but we really haven't focused on totally blowing him out until the new record because he isn't on the Ep. That gives us another thing to talk about when the new one comes out. A lot of people know about him obviously, but we're trying to keep it somewhat underwraps until then and then we'll really give it a big shabang. If we do the live dates he's gonna be with us on those so that'll get a lot of people, the actual fans, to talking. We'll just take it slow and let things develop naturally.

Chris: How did you hook up with Metal Blade to get the Ep out?

John: We were between record labels after parting ways with Chrysalis, which was definitely a breath of fresh air for us, and we knew it might take some time for us to get on a new label and get that whole thing going. So Brian (Slagel) was real generous about offering to put out an Ep, just to keep our name in the public and to keep the buzz going about Armored Saint. So we said, "look we have this tape that we recorded for Z-Rock on the last tour, let's take a listen to it and see if it's worthy of putting on vinyl" and we did and it came out great. We mixed some of the songs as best we could. There are no over-dubs on the tape at all. We just picked the songs that were the best performances and put it out. It helps us keep our name out there while were kind of in that get out feet back on the ground stage. It's doing a great job. I wouldn't doubt if this sells as much as the Chrysalis releases. I'd be real excited if it did.

Chris: It wouldn't be too surprising if it did, because the response to it has be incredible and it's taking the chart by storm.

John: The Ep is not flawless. It's Armored Saint in the raw and there are some mistakes, but that's the way we wanted it. We're a true live band and when you get out to see us live, you don't really know what to expect. It's gonna be wild and crazy you can bet on that, every show is a little different, so this is just the best representation of what we're about. We're real happy about it. We think it's a cool project and it's a lot of fun. A lot of live albums these days you get a live drum track and the rest is done in a studio and that's not live. We're really opposed to that and that's why we put this out. We feel it's a TRUE representation of what we're really all about.

Chris: Well you do have that reputation of being a great live act, do you think that overshadows your studio work? Do you think they maybe don't take that seriously enough?

John: No, not at all. Studio and live albums are just different. When you make an album, you take your time and nurture it and make it the best you can, when you play a live show it's just a 50 or 60 minute set that you play for the moment. Armored St., we're a real musical, versatile band and when we make albums we try to do the most that we can. The reputation of being a live band is in our favor because we're really energized when we play live. When we do records we just take a slightly different attitude towards it.

Chris: Why put "No Reason To Live" on it?

John: Basically because people have been harping on it for the last four or five years, asking why we haven't put it on a record. And Brian, it must have been one of his favorite Armored Saint songs or something, was pushing for it. We said, "hey we don't really want to go in and record a song that we wrote five years ago so why don't we just put it on in its natural form and see what the reaction is". It's been real good and that song has been getting a lot of response.

Chris: I understand that you do have definite label interest.

John: Oh yeah. There's a lot of it. I mean Armored Saint getting a major deal should be no problem. It's just getting the right deal. We were on Chrysalis and it was the wrong deal for us. I can tell you that with Chrysalis it basically scarred us and it made us realize that getting a major record deal doesn't mean shit. It just means you have a record deal. It doesn't mean you're not going to be a "star" and a lot of musicians and rock and rollers think that's the case and it's not and they'll find out the hard way if they think that way. What we want to make sure is that we get on a label that is totally committed to Armored Saint and believes in what we're doing and can market it and take it and get it to people. We'll see. We're waiting to see what the best situation is and then jump on it.


Chris: What do you want your friends and fans out there to know about Armored Saint, while they await a new album on a new label?

John: Just be patient because we're trying to be. And just know that Armored Saint will deliver the best metal possible because that's what we're all about. We are totally dedicated to making our fans creem in their jeans on our music. It's gonna be great. We always put 100 percent into whatever we do. Whether it's a live album, live show or a new album, we always do the most we can. You can bet that it's gonna kick ass.

Nine of the 12 guitarists featured on the "Guitar Speak, Vol. 1" album will bring a "Night Of The Guitars" tour to four California cities during the last week of October, beginning in San Francisco on October 26, and including the Greek Theatre in Los Angeles on the 28th. Alvin Lee, Steve Howe, Randy California, Steve Hunter, Leslie West, Peter Haycock, Robbie Krieger, Ronnie Montrose and Eric Johnson will appear at the shows. The same line-up will probably make a more extensive U.S. tour in January or February. The guitarists are among the dozen featured on "Guitar Speak, Vol. 1," which is one of the first four releases on IRS Records' No Speak series. Other LPs, all scheduled for a mid-October release, are from Hunter, Jimmy "Z" and Billy Currie of Ultravox.

The Human League have released their first new single in over two years, "Love Is All That Matters," which like their previous single, "Human," was written by Jimmy Jam and Terry Lewis. The band will have a greatest hits album coming out soon.



Melissa Etheridge says she'll go into the studio in January to record a new album. She's already begun unveiling new songs on her current U.S. tour, including "Angel," "No Souvenirs," and "Royal Station 4/16," a song written while looking out of her hotel room at the rail station in Newcastle, England, while touring there several months ago. Ironically, when Etheridge played "Bring Me Some Water" in Atlanta, workman had blocked off a major street outside the club to repair a water main that had broken earklier in the day.

R.E.M. have a greatest hits album of sorts just coming out (on I.R.S. Records). It's called "Eponymous," and includes a song called "Romance, which was on the "Made In Heaven" film soundtrack. It also includes the original version of "Radio Free Europe" as released on independent label, Hibtone, as well as alternative versions of "Gardening At Night" and "The Finest Worksong." **Peter Buck** wrote the liner notes for the LP, which includes a photo of **Michael Stipe** from his high school yearbook, in which Stipe has added the comment "they airbrushed my face," as well as some other artwork for the LP.

The High Court in London has acted against the sale of bootleg t-shirts outside of concerts where **Metallica** are playing to promote their new "And Justice For All" album. The band went to court after the shirts were sold outside the opening of the band's tour in Edinburgh, Scotland. Judge Sir Leonard Hoffman granted an order banning unauthorized t-shirt sales at upcoming concerts in Britain.



Jimmy Cliff plans a sequel to the film "The Harder They Come," which was released 15 years ago.

Tom Cochrane & Red Rider will have their new album, "Victory Day," out on October 4. It was produced by Don Gehman, who has worked with John Cougar Mellencamp and R.E.M.



Willis "Be Bop" Edwards, road manager for B.B. King, is writing a book about the blues guitarist, called "B.B. King, Then And Now." Edwards has been with King since 1952, when he began working as King's valet.

Phil Collins has received the "Songwriter Of The Year" award from the American Society of Composers, Authors & Publishers for the second consecutive year. He wins the award for being the writer whose songs had the greatest number of performances in the United States last year.

Even before the official unveling ceremony, someone defaced **John Lennon**'s star on the Hollywood Walk of Fame. Someone wrote "I buried John" above his name on the sidewalk, and a pictograph at the center of the star was also scratched. The Hollywood Chamber of Commerce had the damage repaired in time for an unveiling ceremony with Yoko Ono.

Just in time for the similarly-names holiday, **Helloween** have a new album coming out next month called "Keeper Of The Seven Keys Part II." The band have filmed a video for "I Want Out" on location in Europe.

The House Of Lords' debut self-titled album will be out in mid-October. It features keyboardist Greg Giuffria and bass player Chuck wright, fomerly of quiet Riot. It's the first album on Gene Simmons' record label.

Steve Earle has been fined \$500 and given a year probation after pleading no contest to a charge of resisting arrest in Dallas, Texas. Earle had been charged with assaulting a police officer after a show on New Year's Eve at Dallas Alley, a nightclub in Dallas. Earle maintains that the police officer attacked him.

Well Red have recorded a new album in New York with George Clinton and Larry Smith producing. The Lp is called "Respect Due." "All the tracks on the album are related even though people may think that they won't be because of having George and Larry as producers" says the band's singer Lorenzo.

Ten people were arrested for possession of over 46,000 doses of LSD after undercover police mingled with groups of fans who had camped out fot the **Grateful Dead**'s Philadelphia show. The undercover officers say they wandered in the crowd for two hours, and tried to purchased 10,000 tabs of LSD.

James Brown has been arrested again, this time near his home in Augusta, Georgia, after leading police officers on a chase in and out of South Carolina. Brown was charged in Georgia with simple assault, carrying a pistol without a license, carrying a deadly weapon at a public gathering and seven misdemeanor charges. Then, he was charged in South Carolina with two counts of assault and battery with intent to kill, failure to stop for an officer's light and siren, and driving under the influence. He was free on bond in both jurisdictions. Police in Richmond County, South Carolina, say the incident began in Augusta when Brown carried a pistol and shotgun into a room in the building where he has his business office. An insurance seminar was taking place, and witnesses say Brown, mumbling, demanded to know who had been using "his restroom," and then ordered two women to lock the bathroom door and give him the key. Police say Brown then left the office and was followed by a sheriff's officer into South Carolina, where officers shot out the front tires of Brown's pickup truck. But Brown continued to drive the truck, with two flat tires, back into Georgia. Police say they chased Brown for about two miles in Augusta before the truck became stuck. Police say they found a shotgun in the truck, but no handgun. Brown denies having a pistol. "I had a gun that wouldn't fire," he says. "It was no pistol -- it was a gun that wouldn't fire." The day after that series of events, Brown was arrested again in Augusta -- this time on charges of driving under the influence, driving with a suspended license and improper movement on the roadway. Brown's explanation this time was that he wasn't DUI, he was only under "The influence of wanting to get back and forth from work.

Willie Nelson claims to have smoked dope on the roof of the White House during the Carter administration. In his new autobiography, "Willie," Nelson says he and a friend went to the top of the White House, after being invited to play during a Rose Garden reception. "I guess the White house is the safest place I can think of to smoke dope," Nelson says in the book. "I let the weed cover me with a pleasing cloud and reflected on what a strange trip it had been from smoking cedar bark and grapevine at the age of four or five...to sitting on the White House roof sharing a number in a warm, humid night."

John Hansen is the new guitarist for the Slickee Boys, replacing Kim Kane, a founding member of the band, who left to form a new band called Date Bait. Hansen has been roadie and sound man for the last few years. "We like to keep these things in the family," comments lead singer Mark Noone. Drummer Dan Palenski has returned to the band's line-up, as well. The band plans to release a live album, recorded in Europe in June, by the end of the year.

Grace Jones' next album is called "No Compromise," and includes 10 songs, including "Bullet-Proof Heart" and "Driving Satisfaction." The LP was completed in only two weeks. "Most of the songs were written in 10 minutes right in the studio," Jones says. "This album represents a natural progression for me. It's basically a project which is relationship-inspired." Jones is referring to her relationship with songwriter & producer **Chris Stanley**. "It's about our relationship mixed with some of the relationships I've gone through and had told **Chris** about." Jones co-wrote the songs for her last album, "Inside Story," with **Bruce Woolley**. "Bruce is great musically but he didn't have the drama for the stories."



Boston and Farrenheit played at an AIDS Action Committee benefit concert at Boston Garden on Monday night. The show was Boston's only live appearance in the U.S. this year. "This was obviously a worthy cause," says Tom Scholz, "and Monday's show can make a big difference in money and awareness...at least in this part of the country. There are still a lot of real Dark Ages/Victorian outlooks on what this disease is that are just not appropriate."

In a 1975 interview with John Lennon that appears in Spin Magazine, the former Beatle says he loved living at the Dakota in New York. "It's secure...people can't get in...which was happening in the other apartment," he says in the interview. "You just couldn't go out to the front door because there would be someone weird."

John Denver got a chilly reception when he was allowed to speak at the weekly astronaut meeting at the Johnson Space Center. Denver has been making noises about going into space for either NASA or the Soviet Union. "A waste of time and an insult to the astronauts who had better things to do," one veteran astronaut said of the meeting. Denver mentioned at the meeting that other Americans have also been invited to fly with the Soviets, and one astronaut at the meeting is said to have shouted, "Who? Jane Fonda?" Denver asked that the briefing be closed and off the record.

The Wailers expect to sign a record deal (with Atlantic Records) "within the next two weeks," according to lead vocalist Junior Marvin. The band is hoping to have a debut album out in early spring. "The Wailers have an unimistakable sound as far as reggae's concerned...which is something that we kind of live more than learn," Marvin says. "We're mainly concentrating on the caliber of songs and try to make sure that we have songs as good a standard as 'No Woman, No Cry,' Is This Love' and 'I Shot The Sheriff,' which is not an easy thing to do."

Leo Kottke's new album is called "Regards From Chuck Pink," and the liner notes on the album describe Chuck Pink as "the guy you don't want to hear from -- the drunken uncle at the family reunion." Kottke admits it's "all baloney," though -- an attempt to raise curiousity about his new album, which is

getting promoted by his publicist as New Age. "I've tried writing my own biographies," Kottke explains. "I've turned a few of my own biographies in, but they're always rejected by the record labels. It baffles me."

The third annual Nashville Tribute to Gram Parsons and Clarence White, two former members of the Byrds, takes place in Nashville on October 1. Foster & Lloyd, Michael Clarke of the Byrds, Carlene Carter, Arlo Guthrie, Sid Griffin of the Long Ryders and Freddy Weller are among the artists who perform at the show at The Cannery. Surprise guests have made it to the past two tribute shows, and Emmylou Harris is expected to appear again this year.

Before leaving for dates in Australia and South America, Mick Jagger put on a private show for about a hundred people at the George Lucas' Skywalker Ranch studio, where Jagger and band had been rehearsing. The two-hour show included a cover of Jimi Hendrix' "Foxy Lady." Also included was a new song called "What Kind Of World Is This," and "Wild Colonial Boy," from the soundtrack to "Ned Kelly."

One of south Florida's longest-running rock venues is closing. **The Hollywood Sportatorium**, near Miami, will close in late October after a country music show. The Sportatorium's general manager says that with a new venue available, the Miami Arena, "we have lost some concerts and we made the decision to close it." Some people are glad the venue is closing. It was an out of the way location, almost near the Everglades, and did not have the best acoustics.

Drummer Charlie Benante says Anthrax "really nit-picked" over their new and fourth album, "State Of Euphoria," spending six or seven weeks on the LP. It was never really a conscious thing, like, let's put more melody into it," says Scott Ian. "But if the material's better and the riffs are better, then there's more room for vocals."

The Bangles' next album, "Everything," will be out in mid-October. The LP, the band's third, includes 13 songs, including the single "In Your Room," which will be released a few days before the LP. The album includes songs written with Rachel Sweet and Vinnie Vincent, among others, and was produced by Davitt Sigerson, who has worked with Rickie Lee Jones and David & David. The band is planning a U.S. tour in Jenuary.

Graham Parker is in the middle of a short acoustic tour, which wraps up October 9. Parker says he got the idea from John Hiatt, after meeting Hiatt when Marti Jones invited them to play with her at the Bottom Line in New York. "When I play, people are always shouting out songs I don't perform anymore like 'Hotel Chambermaid' and 'Lady Doctor.' But doing them solo gives the songs new life."

Sonic Youth begin a two-month tour in late October in conjunction with their new double album, "Daydream Nation" (on Blast First/Enigma/Capitol). The dates begin in Boston, October 27, then includes shows in the northeast, midwest, California, and then into the southwest and southeast U.S., ending in Washington, D.C., December 11. The band's "Ciccone Youth" album is now "further delayed until early 1989."

Tommy Conwell & The Young Rumblers have begun their first headlining U.S. tour, which continues through early November. The tour is in support of the band's "Rumble" album.

Two benefit concerts are being held in October in Austin, Texas, to raise money for the non-profit **Rhythm & Blues Foundation**. Stevie Ray Vaughan & Double Trouble, the **Fabulous Thunderbirds** and **Bonnie Raitt** will appear at the shows. Thunderbirds drummer **Fran Christina** says "the whole idea of the Foundation is to supply things like medical insurance and legal help for" early R&B artists. He cites the example of Ruth Brown. "She had been out of the business... working as a maid for 20 years. Now she's back on the road... in movies, stage productions, she's made an album. Her voice is as strong as it ever was."

The master recording of **Rick Astley**'s new album was apparently not destroyed in a fire at the studios of Stock/Aitken/Waterman in London. While the master tapes of the album did melt in the fire, the recordings had already been transferred and exist elsewhere. "The album will still be out in November as planned," says a spokesman for the studio. "It's a matter of course to have more than one copy of new recorded material just in case something like this happens."

Fish left **Marillion** because of differences "both musically and lyrically," according to a statement from the group. "It has been mutually agreed by all five members of Marillion that Fish leave the band." Fish says he's planning to go solo to explore different musical directions. "I've had a brilliant seven years with Marillion," he says. "I'm very excited by this move and I'm looking forward to continuing writing and performing music and getting involved in a number of alternative projects that I never had the freedom to pursue within the framework of the band. I still hold a great deal of respect for Marillion and I want to thank them for giving me the opportunity of having reached this point in my career." Keyboardist **Mark Kelly** says the band is currently working on a studio album, and also plans to release a "live double album encapsulating the band's seven year career, and we're hoping to see it released during November."


INTERNATIONAL CHART CHAT

U2's "Desire" made the highest debut onto Britain's top 20 singles chart this week, entering at the number 3 spot. Duran Duran's "I Don't Want Your Love" reached number 20, while Erasure's "A Little Respect" entered at 19. 18-17 Bon Jovi's "Bad Medicine" moved 18-17, Yello's "The Race" slipped from 7 to 12, and the Proclaimers moved from 12 to 11 with "I'm Gonna Be." The Pet Shop Boys' "Domino Dancing" moved 9-7, Phil Collins' "A Groovy Kind Of Love" stayed at number two, while the Hollies' "He Ain't Heavy, He's My Brother" maintained the top spot for a second week.

Big Country playing six nights in Moscow this week, making them the first band to play in the Soviet Union without the help of any state-run organizations....The soundtrack to the film "Heartbreak Hotel" will be released early next month. As well as including original versions of some Elvis Presley tunes, the soundtrack album will also include Alice Cooper's "I'm Eighteen" and Dobie Gray's "Drift Away."....Robbie Robertson will appear in the film "Insomnia," being directed by David Fincher. It will be filmed in New York City early next year. Martin Scorsese is the film's executive producer....Cindy Lee Berryhill is about to record an album with producer Lenny Kaye, who has recently worked with Suzanne Vega and Soul Asylum....Adam Roth is the new guitarist for the Del Fuegos, who will record a new album later this year....The Psychedelic Furs' Richard Butler says he's working on a solo album, as well as a new group LP Van Halen plans a 36-city arena tour this fall, following the "Monsters Of Rock" dates this summer.... Bryan Ferry liked the Cuban-American band Conjunto Cespedes so much when they opened for him at the University of California at Berkeley, that he asked them to open for him in Los Angeles and possibley on some other of his concert dates....An album is being released including covers of songs written by Neil Young. That Petrol Emotion, Sonic Youth and Soul Asylum are contributing. Soul Asylum's track will be a version of "Barstool Blues."....The Scorpions and Kingdom Come have begun their own tour after the Monsters Of Rock dates. "We think there's enough interest," says Scorpions singer Klause Meine. UK MUSIC NEWS

As exclusively revealed by "The Hard Report", Keith Richards releases his first solo album, slated for an October 3rd UK release date. "Talk Is Cheap" will be released by Virgin Records and features several guests, including Bootsy Collins. Fellow Rolling Stone, Ron Wood, commenting on the album a few weeks ago, described the record as quite "soulish, which is what he's really into." The album comprises of 11 tracks. Richards plans to play The United States soon.

British teen band Bros are suing the weekly tabloid, "The Sunday People" for defammation after claiming that a heroin dealer had visited the band. Under the banner headline "Heroin In Bros House", the Rupert Murdoch owned paper alleged that he had visited the apartment block where band member Luke lives. Although never actually stating that Luke had bought heroin from the dealer, the band's lawyers are unhesitatingly beginning legal action. A spokesman for Bros. who have scored three top ten singles in Britain, said this week: "This has to be the most pathetic piece of sensationalist journalism and it has no basis in fact whatsoever. The band and their lawyers are taking it very seriously indeed and a writ has already been issued. Our lawyers have instructions to pursue the proceedings as quickly as possible towards a trial when the band have every confidence that they will be awarded a substantial sum in damages." The Sunday People had no comment to make on the proceedings.

The Human League release a new single, as a prelude to their forthcoming Greatest Hits album. Despite a two year silence, the new single, "Love Is All That Matters", is not really new, but from their last album "Crash. The group, who are based in the north England town of Sheffield, are about to go into the studio to record a new album.

Fellow Sheffield natives, who achieved a similar success around the same time, Heaven 17, are also set to return. Most famous for their 1981 album, "Penthouse And Pavement". band member Martyn Ware admits that the group have an identity crisis: "We don't know who we are anymore. We're so out of the mainstream and far apart from anything that is categorizable. We are a very odd group, there's no doubt about it. We're completely adrift; we don't even have a corner to ourselves. We just do what we do and there's nothing we can do to change that. It's either popular or it isn't. It's not in our control at all." Since the last 17 album, Martyn Ware has been sitting in the producer's chair - most notably for Tina Turner and Terence Trent D'Arby. He says his latest ambition is to produce a new band called The Eight Track Cartridge Family, because he likes the name and thinks it will look good next to the other names on his resume. In the meantime, the forthcoming Heaven 17 album is "Teddy Bear Duke And Psycho".

The concert that has been called the largest and most ambitious ever planned, is facing controversy and turmoil. Jean-Michel Jarre had planned to stage his notorious laser concert in the docklands area of south-east London, with the blessing of the Docklands Development Corporation who have been successfully turning the area into an alternative business district, from a dying port district. But the local council are not happy with the plans, citing poor emergency facilities as the most serious issue. With promoters planning at least 500,000 people to view the concert, Newham Council have said they cannot possibly see how a fire truck, could get to an emergency unhindered. Last week, it seemed as though the show would definitely be stopped, but this week, after a weekend of negotiations, promoters RGE Events said that Jarre may still play London but only if the original plans are drastically scaled down. "The New Musical Express" speculated that there may be two smaller concerts instead of the original one, with strict crowd control. With many less than 100,000 spectators expected for each concert, Houston will still be able to lay claim to the largest concert of all, in 1986. It is also thought that the promoters may be looking at other British cities like Liverpool and Glasgow to carry out their original plans, although they would then lose the substantial money invested by The Docklands Corporation and would have to raise funds elsewhere.

Any day now, U2, whose new single, "Desire" shot into the UK charts, will be putting the finishing touches to their new movie, "Rattle And Hum", due for release in early November. The movie features live footage from their massive "Joshua Tree" tour of The United States. Here in Britain, the distributors, UIP are planning to premiere the film in London's Leicester Square, October 31st in conjunction with the human rights pressure group, Amnesty International. But according to "Time Out" magazine, the distributor is getting concerned at how long the editing is taking. Ever perfectionists, U2 are personally involved in almost every edit. The accompanying double album is said to have received so many last minute alterations that it only just made the cutting deadlines. Such is the care lavished on the project that the film has already missed the deadline for a magazine and TV press screening. and UIP still have no copy to show the press. They appparently did have a copy once, used for the distributor's own conference, but the band insisted it be immediatley destroyed after one screening. Just a few more cuts - they said.

UK INDUSTRY NEWS

At their annual sales conference at the English seaside town of Eastbourne, PolyGram staff have been having their fears massaged over the rumoured sale of the company, by PolyGram Chairman Maurice Oberstein. He stated: "I know nothing more about the sale than you, apart from what I've read but it doesn't trouble me at all. When you think about it, the fact that PolyGram shares are saleable, shows the value that has been built up in PolyGram over the years." PolyGram are currently owned by the Dutch electronics firm, Philips.



According to "Record Mirror's" Cool Cuts Charts, the most happenning club funk record at the moment is "Royal House" by Royal House with "Sharp As A Knife" by Brandon Cooke at 2, featuring Roxanne Shante. In The Independent Label singles chart "What Is There To Smile About" by The Close Lobsters (Fire) is new at 7, while the fab new single by My Bloody Valentine "You Make Me Realise" (Creation) is a climber from 12 to 7. "Deanna" by Nick Cave is a new entry at 2; while the number one indie single is "Birthday " by The Sugarcubes (One Little Indian), the new "Christmas" mix featuring The Jesus And Mary Chain. Two high new entries in the indie album charts: "The Nephilim" by The Fields of Nephilim (Situation) enters at 2 while entering the chart at one and bumping off Michelle Shocked - "Rank" the new live album by the late Smiths on Rough Trade Records. In the new UK Album Charts "The Spirit Of Eden" by Talk Talk enters at 19. In at 13 "Ancient Heart" by the gifted 19 year old singer/songwriter Tanita Tikaram. New at 7 the soundtrack to "Buster" while entering at 6 the brand new album by The Proclaimers, "Sunshine On Leath", a virtually faultless album in my estimation, a sheer pleasure to have on my turntable. At 5 Tracy Chapman; at 4 Michael Jackson; at 3 "Rap Trax" by Various; at 2 Kylie Minogue and at 1 "Hot City Nights" by Various Artists. The chart compilers, Gallup, are considering taking out various artist albums, as they do in the Billboard charts. There was an immediate and predictable outcry from companies like K-Tel and Ronco. "He Ain't Heavy, He's My Brother" by The Hollies is the new number one single which first reached number 3 in 1969. Only two recordings have been older upon reaching number one. "Reet Petite" by Jackie Wilson was nearly 30 years old when it hit the top in December 1986, while Ben E. Kings' "Stand By Me" was 25 years old when it reached number one, February 1987. "He Ain't Heavy ... " is the Hollies second British number one. Their first was "I'm Alive" in 1965. They therefore establish another record for the longest span of number one singles - beating Elvis Presley's 1957 to 1977 and eclipsing the 14-1/2 year record created by Diana Ross, when she topped the chart with "Chain Reaction" in 1986.
