Roger Daltrey, "Days Of Light", Atlantic... This pick was pretty obvious when the CD single



came in the mail this week. How could you not make another Daltrey solo effort your Top Priority? Not to mention his brilliant appearance on the Howard Stern Show or even on the Howard Stern Show or even his visit to Regis (played by Robin Leach) and Kathie Lee! Since his solo career started in 1973 with his release of <u>Daltrey</u> (still one of his best to date) up through this new album, <u>Rocks In The Head</u>, Daltrey has been one of rock and roll's

has been one of rock and roll's strongest vocalists. The new project was produced by Gerard McMahon. Guitarist Ricky Byrd and drummer Tommy Price from Joan Jett and The Blackhearts add their talents to the album as well. Daltrey has never been known for prolific composition, but he co wrote 7 of the 10 new tracks for this project. With many as well. With many veteran rockers reaching a level of maturity that is coming out in their music these days (Don Henley, Tom Petty and Bruce Springsteen), Daltrey seems to be taking a walk down the same road with "Days Of Light." This mid-tempo boppin' track is a perfect way to kick off any weekend and has a Wilbury's feel to it. The pipeline is talking about it: WDVE's Gene Romano, "This is a prefix good song. It's a little poppy but it grows on you. I've a pretty good song. It's a little poppy, but it grows on you. I've always liked his solo material!" It's always nice when a new meat and potatos (or is that potatoes?) rock and roll group comes across our desk with a powerful debut number like this. The guys stopped by the Hard cabin a few weeks back and were the first to christen our new building with an acoustic perfor-mance. This L.A. based four man unit is made up of Rik Sanchez, Andre Bonter, Dennis Hill and Joey Phillipy. They are a no nonsense

group with just a little more to say than most on a debut single. This is a very timely song considering the current zeitgeist in our world. You'll hear some of rock's major influences here. Then 2 1/2 minutes into the track, you'll notice a sort of John Mellencamp feel to the vocals and percussion. WLZR's Darrin Arriens, "All rock and roll should be so good with lyrics to match. It's very timely with a familiar sound -- just different enough to set them apart from other bands!" KTYD's Brice Kendall, "They stopped by on their meet and greet and played us the tune. I thought it had a nice feel to it!" There's a Brand New Amerika and a brand new band a breakin'. U2, "Even Better Than The Real Thing", PLG... They formed in 1978. Nine unforgettable albums later, U2 has given Island/PLG proof that there is something "Better." Just when you think the band has created an LP that superbly reflects and captures the essence of U2, they re-group and reach within to create something "Even Better Than The Real Thing" (the new single). Achtung Baby (released in November of 1991) has performed like few others -- spawning #1 singles ("One," "Until The End Of The World," "Mysterious Ways") #1 LP status (remaining there for weeks) and selling out every venue during their current tour. "Even "shows similar promise on the AOR front. Edge plays with his usual flair, throwing an almost Beatle-like spice into his singular sonic string recipe with superb results. Matt (You know we never do uotes) Harris leaked the fact that "Even" has been in rotation at WEBN since the CD was released in 1991. Now the song is in heavy (saying a lot for burn resistance). Michael Young at WIOT is excited about the single (or experienced a super acid trip when he gave us his analysis) saying, "Brain Salad Surgery and The White Album combine for a psychedelic mind mesh that's 'Even Better Than The Real Thing" -- baby"! A bold Hard Hundred move of 77-49* and an A.A.A. chart debut at 45* leaves Bono and the boys in great shape for another extraordinary week. And don't pass up the non-lp bonus tracks, especially "Salome."

Giant. "Stay". Epic... With a ton of groups coming out that fall in the same arena as Giant, the battle for those open spaces on your playlist will only intensify throughout summer. *Time To Burn* is over the 100,000 mark, and that is without video support backing up the album's first single "Chained." There *is* a new video to support the second single "Stay." There are two versions of the song on the CD Pro and either one will do. 6 new adds roll in this week and the track will undoubtedly hit the Hard Hundred next Tuesday. KAZY's Lois Todd told us, "I heard 'Stay' right away and I knew it was a hit! This track has an incredible hook with a lot of crossover potential! I also talked with the Huff Brothers, and I was amazed at the number of groups they have played with. They have what it takes and I hope they're around for years to come!" KGGO's Jack Emmerson says, "I hope that everyone jumps on this one! They are one of the tightest groups out there. A band with less hair and more music!" WLZR's Darrin Arriens wrapped it up with, "The hook reminds me of something Asia would have done. By far the strongest single on the album!" 

That heavier stuff came in the form of her longtime pals and very first collaborators, ex-Rave-ups Jimmy Podrasky, Tim Jiminez and Terry Wilson. Kimm is also helped out by producer Matt Wallace, (Faith No More and The Replacements), who added a very raw but slick vibe to the track and the album. The first single "Will Work For Food" is a perfect example of her clear eyed social commentary that ranks up there with Melissa Etheridge, Suzanne Rhatigan, Sophie B. Hawkins and Tori Amos. Triple A stations may find Kimm's music a nice spice that is uptempo enough without being offensive. One listen to the whole album and you know that Kimm's been influenced by the likes of Bob Dylan to Suzanne Vega. She combines her Nashville (where she grew up) knowledge, and her L.A modern rock sound (where she lives now) for a potent blend of smart rock. WQNY's Mimi Griswold says, "We played a number of songs from her first album that did very well for us. Kimm's voice is melodic yet ballsy. This new cut has got more gut!" "Anything At All" and a meet and greet tour dragged him across the country and stacked the cards in Mitch's favor for continued success with this second single. Not as pop rock sounding as "Anything," this is an easy add. This single takes a step down in the tempo department, but Mitch has the same talent to belt out those big hooks with the same fury as Bryan Adams. The new CD Pro has two versions of the song and the unplugged cut has Bernie Leadon (Eagles) helping out on the strumming. KECH's Jim King stated what many feel, "I like Mitch as an artist. We played the last song, and it did very well for us!" RCA is committed to continuing Mitch's strong growth with eAOR format. Summmertime is usually the season that radio searches for those rock and roll love songs filled with emotion, and this could be one of the first. Even though many may be leary of its CHR feel, take our advice and beat your competition on this one!



Rhino Bucket, "Hey There", Reprise... Rhino Bucket's debut album saw some major Metal action, but mainstream AOR play eluded them. It was obvious from their introduction (almost two years ago) they were influenced by the baddest of all rock and roll bands, AC/DC. With just one listen, you'll recognize those Bon Scott sound-alike vocals that scream above sharp guitar action and driving percussion. All these comparisons to one of the format's premier hard rock bands doesn't seem to be a negative with most programmers. This time around, the label is ready to take these boys straight to the other side. WAQZ's Steve Schneider filed this, "People call us up thinking it's new AC/DC, and are surprised that Rhino Bucket can put out the same quality of music. This band is getting back to the roots of Heavy rock. 'Hey There' is a typical, straight ahead rocker for us!" KRXX's Lisa Lyons knows the haps, "I'm familiar with their music from my days at WAZU in Dayton. The band sounds like you-know-who, but our listeners seem to embrace testing this new song at night on 'Rock Hard' which is the 10pm-2am show. This seems to be another track of choice in the radio community and could be a future single. "Breakin' Up" is another track that really kicks and shows how much they can tear up in 5 minutes. This is by far an outstanding album for Glenn as well as AOR. It opens with the instrumental "Silent Spring" and glides into "Long Hot Summer" that tackles the issue of the freeway shootings in L.A. back in '88, and could be a theme song for the riot stricken areas of today. The title track "Strange Weather" is a mid-tempo song with those Glenn Frey vocals and piano arrangement we've heard so many times on past Eagle tunes. The song is all about relationships -- material everyone can relate to. "Agua Tranquillo" is another instrumental that moves into the funny and sarcastic mid-tempo look at "Love In The 21st Century" (including that 900 phone call), and has single written all over it. "He Took Advantage (Blues For Ronald Reagan)" is a shining example that Glenn Frey can write and play just as strong as Don Henley. "River Of Dreams" is a slow story of hopes and dreams. "I've Got Mine" (the first single) is loaded with pure truth about the attitude of most Americans. "Rising Sun" is another instrumental that rolls into the mid-tempo "Brave New World" (written while he was reading 'The Stand' by Stephen King). "Delicious" is a funny horn driven tune with a storyline that kills you! "A Walk In The Dark" is a loving ballad. "Before The Ship Goes Down" is great party track and "Big Life" could have been written for Donald Trump. Feedback: WZLZ's Paul Ericson, "It's always nice to hear Glenn's voice on the air! The Sighs, "Think About Soul", Charisma (9/24): The super-hyped smash-to-be Batman Returns hits the silver screen finally, and with a little imagination don't you think the very beginning of this song sounds like a hip, modified, modernized version of the original TV show theme song. Let's hope Prince isn't involved for this reason alone. WAQX's Dave Frisina lends an ear and donates playlist space: "Up and comers include The Sighs' 'Think About Soul' that just needs ears and space on the playlist to take off." Dumbo ears would be most preferable. KECH, KFMU, KLCX, KNCN, KROK, KTAO, WIYY and WLLZ assist the debut at

Cracker, "Teen Angst", Virgin (7/106): The main thing about this song is that everyone has their opinion about what the world needs now, but virtually nobody does anything about it. With everything accounted for, the song remains rooted at 18*.

Doc Lawrence, "Come Dry Your Eyes", Chameleon/Elektra (5/5): In the finest tradition of singer/songwriters, Chameleon hopes to break Doc big this year. There always seems to be at least one artist in this vein who distinguishes himself, shines above the rest, makes an impact and becomes the success story of the year. Doc Lawrence has that capability. And the goods with "Come Dry Your Eyes." KMMS's Colter Langan said it so well last week, we've invited him back for an encore quote this week: "The soul of Van Morrison, the growl of Bruce Springsteen, and the twang of Leon Russell." KBOY, KFMH, KMMS, WZZQ and WZZR don't waste any time.





T-Ride, "Backdoor Romeo", Hollywood (4/27): With some bands, there can only be one. Uniqueness, lack of inhibition, nonconformity, refusal to fit neatly into a predetermined formula -- these are all qualities that can't be copied nor attributed to someone else. All these qualities help to make T-Ride a singular force and uncustomary sensation. Eccentric.... Unconventional.... Outlandish.... Not to mention those three-part harmonies. The taunting, teasing, antagonizing and alluring tone has an infectious quality and sheepish attitude. KJOT, WRFX and WTPA slap down their add receipts, as increases already occur at KBPI, KNAC and WZNF. The 90-76* activity somehow makes sense of the preceding sense of the preceding.





Peter Murphy, "You're So Close", RCA (3/6): The former Bauhaus front man has never played down his Bowie (circa "Heroes") tendencies, and this track is certainly a prime example of Murphy at his super cool best. Percolating rhythms and sharp-as-razor riffs will leave both the upper and lower end of your demo sufficiently breathless. Currently on a headlining tour, Peter Murphy is not just for those who gauge themselves in black anymore. KCLB, WAVF and WZZR join KFMU, WEQX and WSHE tale Peter Murphy on an airplay ride where it's just beginning its AOR safari.



Flame, "Rain", Giant The week's highest new entry--at 36, with add action at WIYY, WLZR, WNCD and KATM. Bill Betts comments, "We don't really tally requests, but we are getting calls. Plus the jocks are talking about it. A surprise." Down in the Springs, KILO's Steve Fratt adds, "The band has tons of potential and we really like it. Unique sound." WIYY wasn't in a quote kinda mood, but we were able to pry this "A decent mid-tempo song that performs a function at night" out of him. Ditto WCMF's Dave Kane, "The amount of phone calls for the amount of time it's been on is certainly OK."

Saigon Kick, "Love Is On The Way", Third Stone/Atlantic "Hostile Youth" (as serviced to Metal Radio) has held down lead track honors to date, but it's time to take a hard listen to "Love Is On The Way." KBER, WXTB and WZZR hit it this week, with Mike Lee commenting, "I played it once on the air, and our jocks were getting calls two weeks later. We've popped it right into heavy, and we're getting ten times the calls of anything else on the air." Hip yourself to what will be a very big record.

Babylon A.D., "Bad Blood". Arista Mainstream rock radio moved the track 63-54*, as COR stations repond with a 19-17* advance. It's new on KAZY, KIBZ, KUPD and WIYY. WAAF increases play, with Pirate, KBPI, KILO, KNCN, KRRK, KRXQ, WLZR and WXTB among those already in. Check your Street-O-Meter. Your actives know about this band.

Iron Maiden, "Wasting Love", Epic Following the same road paved by Metallica and Queensryche, here's Maiden's giant mass appeal multi format career maker--not that their album sales success to date hasn't been enviable. "After all these years their time has finally come," was how KIOZ's Peg Pollard put it." And Bill Betts adds, "I was stunned. This doesn't sound like them. We don't play them as a rule, but I think this will be a hit." KBPI and WAQZ lead the way, with mondo add totals a definite in our next report.

Rhino Bucket, "Hey There", Reprise If you've got to sound like somebody, might as well not screw around. The guitar/vocal interplay may be a little close for comfort for snooty industry types, but Rhino Bucket does AC/DC so well that you've got to at least test the record.

Roxy Blue, "Luv On Me", Geffen It's formula, no doubt about it, but this time it's the time tested medium tempo/big chorus one listen item--as opposed to the Van Halen rip that hurt them with some programmers the last time out. "Luv" ain't rocket science, but it works just fine on first pass, and just gets better from there.

Giant. "Stay". Epic As all the reviews on "Chained" said, Dan Huff's studio skills are second to none--and his key cuts consistently reflect those chops. "Stay" takes the intensity down a notch or two, but there's no denying that it's a better song. A number of folks -- WLZR's Darren Arriens for instance -called the tune when the Lp first hit, and it will do nothing but up the project's already solid momentum.

Slaughter, "Real Love", Chrysalis/ERG With tracks like this lurking, one has to wonder why it wasn't first out of the chute. No daypart restrictions, obviously better testing, and clearly much wider appeal. Plus, as Mike Lee notes, "The fan base is so incredible. What the hell, they just sent the CD to 10,000 fans." 26-24*, with adds at WIYY and WHVY and KBPI increasing.

Slik Toxik, "White Lies, Black Truth", Capitol Their name ain't helping them, but those who've taken time to get next to the song dig the lyric and the music. KIOZ did well with "Helluvatime," and Peg Pollard tells us the people in San Diego love this track, too.

Adult Alternative Airplay

Lemonheads, "It's A Shame About Ray", Atlantic The title track from Lemonheads' latest album jumped from 45 to 33* on the Alternative chart, and Triple A is not far behind. With WEQX, WXRT, KEYV, KTAO, WWCD, WKOC, KAVE, WBCN and WDET already on this one, look for an AAA debut no later than next week. WEQX's quotable Kerry Grey offered, "AOR meets Alternative. This record is perfect for what we're doing. 'Ray' is not just a college record, it's very accessible. And it's not only the hook I like, there's a lot to be said for the friendliness of the guitar. After four weeks on the new music show, it's got a big enough buzz that we consider it a pretty good 'EQX record."

The Sighs. "Think About Soul". Charisma Triple A will be going deep on this album and The Sighs should emerge as format faves. KZYR OM Tony Mauro tells us, "We like the whole album. It fits in very nicely with our sound. 'Think About Soul' is a great track, and it's doing well for us. Another track that really jumped out at me is 'Heroes Are Made For Falling.' That's one for all dayparts." In addition to those already mentioned, we suggest digging further into What Goes On for "Diamonds In Blue" (especially) and "No Caroline." Caroline.

Joe Henry, "Good Fortune", Mammoth Records The first volley served from Short Man's Room was the #3 Most Added record at Triple A this week. Early believers in this true Adult Alternative artist are KFMG, KTAO and WDET. Brad Hockmeyer at KTAO commented, "Joe Henry is part of our library. When he puts something out, I play it. We've had great success with his past work, and we're real happy with this new one. We added it this week, but I expect it to hit Heavy rotation soon." Heavy rotation soon.'

Ian McCulloch, "Lover, Lover Lover", Sire The second solo project from the ex-Bunnymen has been dancing in and out of the AAA chart for weeks and lands solidly at 38* with this of the AAA chart for weeks and lands solidly at 38* with this Leonard Cohen song. WKOC was hip to "Lover" early, and PD Lauren McLeash commented, "The song has been doing very well for us. It echoes of The Bunnymen (get it?). Ian has put more of himself into this solo project. We featured the album on our 'Sunday Night CD Side Show,' and immediately got calls from the local record stores saying that people are purchasing the album."

Black Crowes. "Thorn In My Pride", Columbia There have been some artists who have had two tracks on the AAA chart simultaneously. Not to be outdone, the flamboyant (not to mention, painfully thin) Crowes are one of the few bands to score a hat trick. "Thorn In My Pride" was one of the biggest movers this week, going from 34 to 24*, and "Sting Mc" and "Hotel Illness" are not far behind, at 31* and 35* respectively. WWCD increased "Thorn" to Heavy rotation this week, joining WRNX and WXRT.

Black Velvet Band, "Lullaby", Elektra A lot of the AAA stations have been on "Lullaby" since it first crossed their desks. It finally debuts on the chart at 48* thanks to KFMG, KBCO, KTAO, KZYR, WKXE, WVBR, KFMU, KTCZ and WZEW. This song has plenty of life left in it, so don't let it slip away. KBCO's eloquent Ginger Havlat called in after her boat docked to say, "This is a really nice record that's being lost. Our staff had an immediate 'Yes!' after only one listen. Don't let this effort get lost in a stack of hot summer releases. It does warrant attention." releases. It does warrant attention."

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ARBITRON REVISES RADIO GUIDELINES

The Arbitron Company have released a bulletin to radio station management nationwide stating that Arbitron's Spring 1992 Radio Market Reports will contain updated guidelines on Rating Distortion and Special Station Activities. The following revised guidelines were listed in the bulletin and are effective immediately:

* Any station activity which has the potential to result in a station having access to current survey diaries and/or the identity or whereabouts of current or future diarykeepers is a violation of Arbitron's guidelines on Rating Distortion.

* Any announcement, statement or activity which could alert, sensitize or remind diarykeepers about past, current or future surveys in any way which might encourage participation in a current or future survey is a violation of Arbitron's guidelines on Rating Bias.

* Sourcing of previous survey information in the form of advertising which promotes a station's success in prior surveys, as permitted by contractual agreement with Arbitron, does not constitute Rating Bias. Note, however, that references to a station's performance in prior surveys in the context of appeals for support are not protected under this guideline, and may, in fact, be violations of Arbitron's guidelines on Rating Bias.

* Arbitron will review activities conducted at any time -- not just during, or four weeks prior to, a survey -- for compliance with these guidelines if, in Arbitron's judgment, the activity has the potential to undermine the credibility of the survey.

Arbitron released the bulletin to clarify the company's position with respect to activities which have been conducted in recent surveys by radio stations and to remind stations of the importance of previewing activities in order to avoid possible citation. Examples of unacceptable activities cited in the bulletin included a station which sponsored an ad in a local newspaper asking for the names and addresses of individuals who have participated in Arbitron, Birch or Nielsen ratings surveys, and a station that was making regular on-air announcements informing listeners that the Arbitron survey would be taken soon and encouraging them to participate.

NEW YORK'S NELSON EXITS WW1

Don Nelson, WNEW (AM) and WYNY VP/GM announced his resignation from Westwood One's Nostalgia/Country outlet. Nelson stated that, "The first six months of WYNY's fiscal year just concluded and set an all-time high for both gross bill and operating profits. The station's latest Arbitrend of a 2.9 share 12 + has the station poised for a great Spring book." Bob Moore, Executive VP of the WW1 Stations Group commented, "Westwood One is saddened by Don's decision to relocate, and hopefully, we will be able to continue to work together in the future." Nelson has been with the stations for a year and a half and plans to return to Southern California to explore management options and to look into ownership opportunities. A replacement for the position is expected to be named soon.

Last Thursday at 1:15 the station loaded up "Hotel California" and commenced to repeat play it right up 'til Midnight, followed by nothing but Eagles for the rest of the weekend. Think of the liner opportunities. "America's first All Eagles radio station," "Desperado Radio." and "The

All Eagles radio," and "The Eagle --living life in the fast lane," were just a few. Brian tells us he even threw in "Please Be Home For Christmas" three or four times, along with all the solo stuff. Then at 6am Monday, the station came out rockin'. "We felt the two urban stations in the market had a two and sometimes three month jump on most of the hit urban product, so they were burned by the time we got them. So we've decided to go the other way, since everyone else in the market is so late on rock product, and in many cases misses it altogether. We still play the hits -- the **Depeche Mode** and **New Orders**, the synthy stuff -- but we're going to stay away from Dance and Rap." From GM Bart **Brandmiller** on down, it's truly a team effort. I've had an opportunity to really grow in this position" As for his replacement, "It's all brand new news here. I'm sure Bart will evaluate all potential candidates from both inside and out."



The second Jazz Aspen festival benefitting Global ReLeaf and sponsored by United Airlines took place this past weekend with an all-star lineup that included The Count Basie Orchestra with Frank Foster conducting, The Dirty Dozen Brass Band, Dr. John, The Turtle Island String Quartet, Take 6, Dave Grusin, Diane Schuur, Don Grusin, Ernie Watts... to name a few. This year's program started off with a wonderful gala dinner dance benefitting Global ReLeaf. The Count Basie Orchestra was flawless. Also, as part of program that evening, there was a heartfelt tribute to women in jazz. "This year's program represented three thematic and diverse evenings," said the founder and producer of the festival, James Horowitz. "New Orleans, 'New Voices,' and 'An Evening With GRP' underscored Jazz Aspen's commitment to a well balanced program designed to entertain and challenge the participating artists and audiences. I think we achieved that." 

KNAC'S HEAVIEST METAL... STEELE

KNAC first got attention as a modern rock outlet in the early 80's. By 1985, it had switched to "pure rock", a hard driving format laced with hard rock and metal. Since that time, KNAC and the genre have become synonymous. Its visibility in the L.A. metro and recognition outside the market are second to none. KNAC is the New York Times of Hard Rock and Heavy Metal, truly the radio station of record. Currently at the helm of KNAC is Gregg Steele. Gregg joined the station a little over a year ago from KGB/San Diego. He has proven himself as a sharp programmer and has the station sounding its best in years. He is one of a handful of PDs who understand the aesthetics of a niche format and the realities of doing business in the 90's. We caught up to him after the R&R Convention. He has a lot to say and he certainly "steeles" the show ...

I guess the biggest thing right now in your mindset is the perceived possibility of repositioning from Pirate.

Gregg: Yes. They've talked an awful lot about reshaping their radio station. And they've already changed a lot of things musically. But I wouldn't count them a fixed radio station yet. Carey did a lot of good there. The change from Carey to Greg is going to be a pretty interesting one. Musically, they've gone to much more of a softer edge with the 18 to 24's, and not playing as many hard rock records. They're playing more of the ballad type records. They're playing a lot more War-rant and White Lion, as well as delving into some unusual cuts from 25 to 34 records. Gregg: Yes. They've talked an awful lot some unusual cuts from 25 to 34 records. They'rc playing some Uriah Heap, they'rc playing Mott The Hoople, they'rc playing some Doors. It's kind of disjointed right now. It seemed more cohesive under Carey, musically. I think they'll be much more focused and much more intense by the start of the Summer book.

So, you're definitely noticing some different things over there.

Gregg: Oh, yeah. Musically, they do sound a lot different. Before, it was more in KNAC's face. The library cuts were much more catered to the KNAC listener, whereas now, I'm hearing records that aren't being addressed in the market, music that KNAC finds to be just a little bit dynamically soft. And KLOS isn't playing any of them, either.

It seems to me that anything that remotely resembles a hair band is relegated to the flavor of last month.

Gregg: Sort of. But I'm also not seeing them get on the new Firehouse. I'm not them get on the new Firehouse. I'm not seeing them get on a lot of the newer tracks. They're playing records that never were played in this market, or if they were played, they were played by Scott Shannon's Pirate. I'm also hearing the Gene Loves Jezebel track 'Jealous' quite a bit, whereas Carey never would have played that played that.

Another interesting aspect of the Pirate situation came up in a conversation I was having in the hallway at R&R, and that is Lonn Friend, of course, editing RIP and having access to press advances, which have been finding their way onto Pirate. The KISS album is a good example, as are Vince Neil and Faith No More. What do you feel about that whole thing? about that whole thing?

act upon good faith. I don't think that it's to anyone's best interest to play a song three months in advance, when it's not even ready to come out yet.

I would assume that, having been the hard rock station in town for so long, you've got label people coming in now, in terms of shared bands with Pirate, wanting to be 'fair' with their promotions, right?

When KNAC breaks a band and plays it for six years, and then a station like Pirate starts playing it, it gets to be a little difficult. Do you think the battle between KNAC and Pirate will boil down to pop metal vs. real metal?

Gregg: Definitely. They're playing a much lighter selection of pop metal than we are. We're not -- even though we're perceived We're not -- even though we're perceived as being an all metal radio station -- just metal. We're a good, hard rock, solid, con-sistent, 18-34 Male radio station with a signal problem. And the signal problem is not going to change. But we do play an awful lot of the same tracks that they play. They just lean a tad more pop than we do. That's a real good assessment. A real good evaluation. It will come down to what's a real hard rock record and what's just a pop hard rock record. hard rock record.

Back to the Pirate question for minute. In the past, have there been any instances where it looked like an L.A. station with a big signal was getting ready to move on your turf

was getting ready to move on your tury? Gregg: No. There have been rumors about Z-Rock coming in for a long period of time. And if they come into Los An-geles, at this point, it would not be good timing, with Pirate around. A lot of people know that KNAC is so well-ingrained in people's heads as the choice for hard rock in Southern California, that it's not very likely, nor is it feasible to outdo KNAC. I wish people success if they want to try that. But the people that worked here before me really did an excellent job of promoting this radio station as an intense, hard-driving radio station as an intense, hard-driving mofo.

It's never waffled, either, has it?

Gregg: There were a couple of different time periods. Obviously, the station has changed to meet the needs of the listeners, and catered itself a little bit differently to **about that whole thing? Gregg:** There's two different sides to the coin. There's the press angle, and then there's the radio angle. Press, as press, is given advance copies so that they can write stories, whereas radio, you get an advance and you know you're not supposed to play it. And Lonn doesn't follow those kind of rules. Whenever Lonn plays an advance, I've either got it, or I have it the next day, and I'll start airing it at that point only. I don't believe in hurting anyone's game plan and hurting the artist or the label by going against their wishes. We all have to the ever-changing demands of the market.

Gregg: Yes. What ends up happening is, when major promotions or major artists are coming into town, they'll usually give KNAC the first night, or they will try to keep the shows neutral, and then work out promotions for each radio station. And everyone's been pretty willing to deal with that.

When does that get to be a problem?

Gregg: When KNAC breaks a band and plays it for six years, and then a station like Pirate starts playing it, it gets to be a little difficult. KNAC really helped to establish these bands when no one else would. And when they go on to become very successful, a lot of it's due to the music hitting the listeners at a time when they're really ready listeners at a time when they're really ready for that type or style of music. And a lot of it is the increased exposure that they're getting on other radio stations. But to for-sake KNAC's involvement for a radio sta-tion that just might not be around in the next six months, gets to be an uphill battle. You end up having to do a lot of fighting to keep things in KNAC's favor.

Are you verbal and expressive with the labels in that regard? You don't mince words?

Gregg: I try to be as aggressive as I can with the labels and management. I remind them of where their bands got their start and where their band's real strong heritage ties lie. And usually, they're very accom-modating and understand KNAC's needs, as well as the band's needs.

How is the station's artist connection quotient? Are you wired into a lot of bands?

Gregg: Pretty much. I'd have to say that we have good relationships with a lot of people. I can't think of too many cases where KNAC doesn't have a good relationship with bands or management.

You certainly must believe that if there is an audience anywhere that's capable of dis-cerning the difference, it's L.A.

Gregg: KNAC has been here for six full ycars now, and we've always been very true to our audience. They tell us what they like and what they don't like. We respond to the needs of the hard rock community, and they all insist on nothing but the finest. Granted, there are some times that we'll play something that is more of the pop variety, but that's only to attract a few of

the fringe listeners that aren't in the 18-24 Male core.

Give us some examples of what's as pop as you'll go.

Gregg: We're playing the Lynch Mob track, 'Tangled In The Web'. It's a little bit lighter. It's not a real heavy track. Lynch Mob has a strong foundation at KNAC, based on their last record being a little bit more intense, and of course, George's work in Dokken. And it's going to cross airplay. Pirate's playing it, too. I think KLOS might actually be playing that track. That's just a good rock record from a good rock artist. It doesn't lean metal, however, we're playing it. There's a lot of interest in records like those. It really gets down to the bands that have not been an important part of KNAC of late -- the White Lions, and bands such as that. Those are the ones that you're going to see more at Pirate and less at KNAC.

How heavy do you go? Do you play Slayer? Gregg: I do play Slayer. Dayparted, of course.

How about Sepultura?

Gregg: We play Sepultura on our Manic Metal show that we do on Monday nights, but it's not part of our regular programming. We're quite deep into the standard hard rock metal bands. We play more Metallica than anybody in the planet. We play a ton of Iron Maiden.

Do you test any of your COR stuff?

Gregg: No.

It's strictly gut?

Gregg: Yeah, we go by gut here. And we've always done very well with the gut. My General Manager, Gary Price, believes very strongly in a programmer who will use his gut, and not relying on research, because it's very difficult to test out metal records. You're already a niche. You're going to cut yourself even more to the bone by using a research method that is not reaching the exact people who are listening to your radio station. You can end up using every data base that you've got already implemented at the radio station. But then again, you're looking at the wide smattering of people that listen to all different kinds of music. Some people might like some of the really heavier, older Metallica stuff, and some people might like the Lynch Mob more. I don't think you can really use a strong focus group in the heavy metal arena.

And you also have the advantage of being in a niche format, that you're core audience is going to be pretty vocal, so their bullshit detector is going to go off if you step out of line.

Gregg: Absolutely. In a focus group, you can throw in some non-metal type artists. You can play some Heart, or some Jimi Hendrix, or some Pink Floyd and get favorable results because that's the kind of music that these people have been listening to for X period of time, since they were kids. But just because it comes back favorable on the test, doesn't mean that I'm going to be playing Heart, or Pink Floyd, or Jimi Hendrix because it doesn't fit the scope of the radio station.

And you do a really good job in playing older bands that relate to the newer bands, which is kind of a throw back to the original idea of alterative progressive AOR stations. For instance, it makes sense to play T-Rex because that's who a lot of the bands are influenced by.

Gregg: Exactly. Those kinds of bands are really important to us, too. To be able to play on influences, there are tons of them in hard rock. KNAC has even gone back to start playing some Sex Pistols music be-

cause of the full circle that metal has come with punk rock.

There was an interesting piece in Saturday's LA Times about the influence of Black Sabbath. That was a fascinating piece. So many of today's musicians cite them as a seminal influence.

Gregg: I saw that. And it's nice to have them back. They've put together an incredible record. And Ronnie has always been a part of KNAC since we signed on. Ronnie has been a valuable artist for this radio station. And he'll continue to be, too, whether Black Sabbath goes anywhere or not -- I'm sure they will. We've had terrific response to both tracks that we've played.

It's interesting that Ronnie and Wendy, for being on the forefront of metal for so long, underneath it are really hardcore, smart, savvy business people. Do you find that's a stereotype about metal radio? That it's really as much a serious business as any other style of music?

Gregg: Probably, in the general perception of the audience. But for those of us in the industry, we've known people like Cliff Bernstein and Peter Mensch to be very sharp businessmen for years and years. And look at the bands that they've got --Queensryche, Tesla, Def Leppard, Metallica. These guys really have their business smarts. And they always make the right decisions. They've got a great roster of young bands, too, that are really going to become a force. They have Warrior Soul, that I think is going to become something really big, and the new Suicidal Tendencies record is going to be huge.

Do you feel like, as the graying of America continues, that you're going to find metal fans who were in their late teens and early 20's, that will be in the 25 + demo and 30 +, and that you're a long-term growth format? **Gregg:** I really believe that. Metal isn't just an 18-24 Male thing. after them. We've already gotten to that step, six years ago, when we started doing this. So, we're sitting in a good position. We're just waiting for everyone to get into that 25 + .

Speaking of that, KNAC is owned by Fred Sands, a realtor in Southern California. And as Loscalzo noted that that's a very straight organization owning a hard rock radio station. What are these guys like to work with? What do they think of the format?

Gregg: Fred, personally, really enjoys the format. He was a big fan of the radio station when we switched. He felt it was the right thing to do at the right time, in a business sense, and it's worked out to be something that has made Fred a real happy guy. KNAC, within the first year, operated in the black, and continues to do so every year. Real estate hasn't exactly gone through the roof in Southern California, so it's particularly important to Fred that we continue to do as good of a job as we do. It's an odd marriage, to have the typical white collar organization owning such a blue collar radio station. But it's a great marriage.

Do you foresee that blue collar ID changing at all?

Gregg: Yes, it's probably going to happen. You can drive down the street in Los Angeles and see Mercedes and BMW's with KNAC stickers...

It's a good thing they've got those high end Blaupunkt radios, they can pick you up.

Gregg: (Laughs) Exactly. The acceptance of hard rock has become so great within the last two years, with a lot of the harder rock bands -- basically the Cliff Bernstein, Peter Mensch bands -- all getting a lot more widespread, mainstream appeal. It's now okay to really like hard rock music. And the acceptance of KNAC is even greater among the white collar, whereas it's still perfect for blue collar listeners, too.

It's really tough to determine why people are accepting hard rock so much more, but I'm very pleased that they are. There are obviously a lot of people that still typecast the radio station as devil worshipping heathens that sacrifice their children every night.

Given the fact that, as of this juncture, your ratings don't reflect that, what makes you feel that way?

Gregg: Our ratings are the way they are, primarily because of our signal.

Okay. Tell us what inspires your long term confidence.

Gregg: There are more and more successful bands, and as I've just pointed out, a couple of key ones. Metallica is one example that we've been playing forever. And we'll continue to be playing them for a long, long period of time. These are the bands that started in 1983, that had a strong following of 18 to 24-year olds, that still love the band to pieces, and have now grown into this older demo. The same thing is happening with Queensryche. Tesla is going to follow that way, and Def Leppard certainly did, too. All of these artists have very, very loyal fan bases. And as the band progresses, their audience is progressing, as well, as individuals. I see the general acceptance of hard rock, heavy metal music over the last two years to be a future watershed for radio stations like this. The people that put this radio station together were very wise to cater to a niche audience. That day is coming very soon where niche formatting is going to be the most successful way that you can program your radio station. You now exactly who you're going after and why you're going

Rolling Stone magazine did that myth vs. reality ad four or five years ago. If you guys did that for KNAC, what would it look like, in terms of your listenership. What's the stereotype and what's the reality?

Gregg: There are obviously strong stereotypes to a metal radio station. People believe that this radio station will eat them alive if they turn it on... and in many cases, we do. We are loud and aggressive, and certainly in the face of a lot of people. But a lot of people have found that they need that challenge. They need that high that KNAC can provide them. It's really tough to determine why people are accepting hard rock so much more, but I'm very pleased that they are. There are obviously a lot of people that still typecast the radio station as devil worshipping heathens that sacrifice their children every night.

Have you found that the '90s swing back to a little more conservatism has effected you at all?

Gregg: No, it hasn't effected us in an advertising standpoint, and it certainly hasn't dwindled our listenership or our promotions. The thing that's probably hurt more than anything is still the economy. Because we're very promotionally-driven, we do a lot of audience participation promotions that require the audience to go out to, say a nightclub. People aren't drinking

nearly as much as they were. People are being a little bit more responsible. They don't have as much expendable income. They do, however, still buy concert tickets and they still do buy records in droves. And hard rock records are now selling at a much higher clip than they've ever sold, in mass quantity. So, it's a question of getting the listener to participate at the radio station, at a level that we all need here to continue to bring advertising dollars in. And they're still there. And we're still operating very efficiently. It's just a case of the economy, more than conservatism.

And your signal situation is unfixable?

Gregg: There's a potential increase coming in the next six months, that would mean an additional 40% of wattage. If that was to happen, we still wouldn't cover the [San Fernando] valley in the strength that we would need. But the areas where you can barely pick us up would be able to pick us up pretty well.

Do you concentrate much on TSL? Is maintenance a big programming consideration for KNAC?

Gregg: We do a lot of TSL work. We have one feature on Monday where we're commercial free. We play no commercials for 24 solid hours to increase our TSL. But our TSL is rather strong. Our problem is our cume. We're not sampling enough humans. There's only a few ways that a station without a signal can improve their cume. necessary thing in these hard economic times. You've always got to be promotionally oriented, and market yourself in a much better fashion. This is just one way of responding to what's going on in this economic situation.

If you've got to give everybody a promotion who does a timebuy, I guess you're up pretty late thinking up promotions?

Gregg: We do a great many promotions. This past weekend we were at two events everyday. And it gets to be a real hard thing to manage and supervise. We've got a lot of tremendously hard working people here that put in many extra hours because they believe so strongly in what KNAC is all about. And they come off as a terrific success. Virtually every promotion we do is a major home run.

Do you feel like the excitement and enthusiasm of the staff there -- that KNAC's energy supersedes what you might tend to find at most garden variety AOR stations?

Gregg: Yes, it's amazing. There are so many people that want to be a part of the things that we do here. Any other station that I've worked at, there's always been good support throughout the staff. But at KNAC, it's like a team. It's like a family. And everybody rolls up their sleeves and shows up and helps out because they believe so strongly in what we do. And the listeners are just as vocal and as active as the people that work here. We've always had a very strong and loyal fan base.

Our biggest strength is to know who we are and who we're servicing, and then just continue to service the hell out of them. Play them the music that they want to hear, and give them the kind of promotions that they want to be given, but not worry so much about increasing the cume by the magic of outdoor and television.

How do you do it with a deficient signal?

Gregg: That's a good question. We've done some billboard campaigns. Maybe do some TV. But we don't want to spend an awful lot of money that we haven't seen tremendous results from. In the past, we've done a little bit of TV and some outdoor, but it hasn't returned on such a large scale that we found it to be cost effective. Our biggest strength is to know who we are and who we're servicing, and then just continue to service the hell out of them. Play them the music that they want to hear, and give them the kind of promotions that they want to be given, but not worry so much about increasing the cume by the magic of outdoor and television because, quite frankly, we have not seen tremendous results in the campaigns that we've done.

How much print do you do?

Gregg: We do more print than anything. In a lot of the rock magazines around Los Angeles, we do probably a page in each issue of all the major hard rock, L.A. based street magazines. And that's really the extent of our advertising, with an occasional billboard here and there.

Where is most of your revenue derived from? Local retailers?

Gregg: We do most of our business with our promotions. And we have strong promotional ties with nightclubs, so that's the biggest area of revenue.

How are the record companies?

Gregg: The record companies are alright. People aren't doing the kinds of buys that they used to do. We just redesigned a new angle on the timebuy situation. Now, if anyone wants to do a timebuy, we're giving them a promotion, so we're building them a better return on their investment. It's a

How about the music director question? How long have you been at the station?

Gregg: A year and a couple of months. So, Randy came in for a couple of months. It just didn't work out?

Gregg: Randy's a great guy. I think he's a terrific human being. But when Randy came in, he didn't posses some of the skills that I'd hoped that he had. I could work with a lot of the things that he didn't have. But it got down to him just pulling the trigger while pointing the gun in the wrong area too many times.

Why is it taking you so long to fill that job?

Gregg: It's a combination of things. There are some people out there that I'm really interested in that are under contract. There's the question that my General Manager has. He feels that the sound of the station has never been better than when I'm handling both jobs. And I've got real strong support from my Promotion Director to help me handle some of the tasks that the Program Director would normally deal with. So, it's kind of a combination of letting things ride out because I've been successful so far in waiting for that right player to become available.

But it's something that you're actively looking to fill at this point?

Gregg: Yes. There are people in-house that are actually quite good, too. It's just a question of getting that right person. Understanding metal and understanding hard rock, and understanding AOR is something that you need to be a good Music Director at this station. Bryan Shock, when he was here, was a terrific Music Director. Ross Goza was a terrific Music Director when he was here, too. They understood all of the politics and the needs within the station to play the right kind of

music, to find out and seek out the right type of intensity for this station. And a lot of the Music Director applicants that I've spoken with, they're as interested in metal as they always have been, but they don't necessarily understand the AOR side. We're an AOR reporting radio station, as well as a metal station. And most metal people deal with metal from a two hour, block formatted show perspective. We're not that way. We're not going to open up the floodgates at six o'clock in the morning and say, 'Hey, how are you? It's six o'clock. Now, let's play Napalm Death.' We do not aggressively take an all metal, all the time stance. We're simply a hard rock radio station that leans metal. Getting the right person to understand that is not easy.

Is it that the AOR people really have limited metal knowledge?

Gregg: Very much so. A lot of AOR's perception of metal is a lot of hair bands or softer tracks of Metallica. Whereas, we'll play damn near everything off the new Metallica record. It might be a little loud, and maybe a little disjointed for the average AOR Music Director, but that's just because where they're from and where the type of music that they normally play or are accustomed to is not the same as what's happening in Los Angeles at KNAC. It's a difficult thing. People's perception of metal is different all around the world. Finding the person that can gather up all of the elements that are already in place at KNAC and in the marketplace, with us being an aggressive AOR station, as well as a metal station, it's a fine, fine line. And finding the right person is not an easy task.

Do you feel like the MD hire is age-keyed? Do you think it's tough to find somebody, let's say over 30, who could do that job?

Gregg: I don't think that it's age-keyed at all. It's good to have somebody that has a little maturity because most metal guys, when they come out of college, have been doing metal, and only metal. And when you're walking into Los Angeles, it's a pretty competitive market. We're based in Long Beach, but I'm competing with all of the other rock stations in Los Angeles for presents on shows, and I need to have a radio station that reflects the needs of all of the hard rock listeners in the Los Angeles area. To understand, politically, how to deal with all of the elements that you need to on a Los Angeles level, you need to have somebody with a little maturity. They don't have to be 30. They can be 23. They can be 20, as long as they have a certain maturity level.

What was it, coming out of KGB, that prepared you to get in there and do that job?

Gregg: I learned an great deal from Ted Edwards about programming, period. Ted's a pretty well-rounded guy, and understands a lot of programming elements that I think a lot of people haven't quite been able to grasp. He knows how to make the cake. He knows exactly what ingredients to put in. And I learned a lot from watching him.

Were you allowed to learn the music when you got in there, or were you fairly aware when you made seg from KGB to KNAC.

Gregg: I'm a big fan of music, in general. And I've been a fan of hard rock music for a long period of time. When I came up to KNAC, it was important for me to have a strong Music Director like Bryan Shock, who had done a metal show in San Diego. And he had spent some time -about a year or so -- as Music Director at KNAC already, and that really helped me make the transition, probably better than anything.

Do you consider yourself a tough add?

Gregg: On a good day, I'm a tough add, but everybody fancies themselves as a

tough add. The songs have to really fit the sound of the radio station. And there's a lot of bands that many record companies would like to believe would fit KNAC that, at that moment, don't. We're trying not to play as many hair bands, but yet, a lot of record company mentality is that if it's a hair band, then it's metal. We don't see it that way. We base ourselves on integrity. that way. We base ourselves on integrity. In a lot of cases, hair bands don't have as much credibility with my audience as a band like Metallica does. I'm difficult to get to play a lot of crossover tracks. But obviously, we do play a number of them obviously, we do play a number of them. And they're really important.

Having worked at AOR, how would you rate that format's sense of musical integrity?

Gregg: It's really tough to estimate be-cause there's so many different types of AOR radio stations. I think the most successful ones in the last two years have been the ones that have leaned a little bit more 18-34, and have opened themselves up to playing more currents, and understanding that this is a growth format, and people will grow into the 25 + cell.

How have you done, as far as integrating the Seattle sound

Gregg: It's a tough mix to put a lot of that kind of music in at one given time. There's so much of it out now, and there's so much of it that's very good. However, not everybody in the audience wants to hear Love On Ice, for example. Now, there's a band that has a small following, and this new song is quite good. But I can't play five songs in an hour that are alternative based. songs in an hour that are alternative based. You've got Pearl Jam, and Soundgarden, and Temple Of The Dog, and Alice In Chains, and Nirvana. They're all over the place. They're very popular tracks with my audience. But there are people in the audience that would rather hear Dokken and Whitesnake and Ratt. And a lot of times, those audiences aren't the exact same. KNAC was born with bands like Dokken, Whitesnake, Ratt. And I need to continue to play those. continue to play those.

What basic positioning liners do you use on the air to image the station?

Gregg: The interesting thing is, if you lis-ten to Pirate, you'll hear all of my imaging liners. They're taking everything I use. It's quite comical. It's very flattering, actually. They want to become just like KNAC, and they're going to steal everything that we've ever done. 'KNAC, Loud and Proud' is something that we use. We also have all kinds of standard things that we use, like 'KNAC Kirke Ase' 'KNAC Kicks Ass'

And the main handle is 'Pure Rock'?

Gregg: 'Pure Rock, 105.5 KNAC.'

Do you use any attitudinal at all?

Gregg: Tons of them.

What do you guys have that you're running? Gregg: Right now we're using, 'Whoever made up the rules for radio in Southern California obviously never expected us'; 'If you can't party with the big boys, don't turn us on'; 'The station your mother warned you about'; 'KNAC's the station from hell.'

The other thing I wanted to cover was that you have a lot of promotional items. At least, when I was there, I saw Frisbees and stuff. Do you have anything more than Fris-bees and T-shirts? And do you market them at all through stores? at all through stores?

Gregg: Yes. Actually, we've got a real good marketing campaign. We're in all of the Tower Record stores in Southern California, as well as about 120 mom and pop retailers. And we merchandise every-thing from hats, sweatshirts, sweatpants, bottle openers, bandanas, KNAC tapestries, underwear.

And those are all sold through Tower?

Gregg: Yes, through Tower and the mom and pop chains. There's a handful that we give away, as well. We sell so many T-shirts and hats and sweatshirts. I think we're really well marketed. You can't go a day without seeing somebody wearing a KNAC T-shirt.

And getting back to drop-ins. Do you send out or is it all done in-house?

We do a lot of our weekend Gregg: promotions and speciality promotions in-house. But our main standard station liners are done by John Lisle, who's doing the morning show down at KISS/San An-tonio. He's been the voice of KNAC since we signed on. He has a real crisp, deep, distinctive voice, that really carves out KNAC's call letters in the minds of the listeners.

sary. I just don't think it's quite on target. It's just kind of tacky to me.

Motorcycles tend not to have that much of a rebellious image anymore.

Gregg: Not anymore. A lot of my listeners have motorcycles. They don't need to see girls riding around on a Pirate Harley. It's a contradiction. People that listen to the radio station know that people who listen to that station don't drive Harleys. Or if they do, they're a yuppie Harley-driving crowd, and not this street image. The bot-tom line is that Pirate doesn't have much of a street image. They spend a lot of money to promote themselves, and it hasn't worked. They've tried to do a lot of street promotions that have just not made them a player. They can continue to spend all the money that they want.

Do you do any movie drop-ins, or anything like that? What have been your most successful street promotions of late?

Gregg: Yes, we tie in movie drops with a lot of the liners that we use. We use a ton of different attitudinal type sweepers. We're very in your face. And we try to project that image with our jocks, as well as well the superst as with the sweepers.

How much back announcing and educating of listeners do you feel like is necessary with your approach?

Gregg: We play almost 50% current, and our jocks front and back sell all new product, anything that's not in a Power rotation. It's vital for the audience to know what these tracks are. And it's really a good thing for me, when I go through my sales reports and find out what records are selling more because I'm playing it a little bit more, now. It's my responsibility to inform these listeners what it is that they beard I want my audience when they bear heard. I want my audience, when they hear a record, to like it and then go out and purchase it because KNAC turned them onto this project. KNAC's main competition, also, is the tape deck, more so than any other radio station. And that's good. I'd rather have them listen to tapes than another radio station.

Do you actively work at selling records?

Gregg: That's not what I would consider my job, but it's something that I do because it's important to the audience. The audience wants to hear good, new music. When I was a kid, if I would hear about something on the radio and I liked it, I wanted to be able to go out and buy it and have the good faith and trust in the radio station that I listened to that the record was station that I listened to that the record was good. And I think that's a service that I owe to the kids that listen to the radio station. They hear the song, and if they like it, they might go out and buy it. So, yeah, I guess I am in the business of selling records. But that's not my #1 goal. Ob-viously, that's to play good music. Conse-quently, they'll go out and buy the record if they like it.

You don't have anything like the Pirate Cycle Sluts, whatever they call them?

Gregg: The Harley Girls. We don't think that we need to go to that kind of gimmick-ry to bring people into the radio station. We've always had strong presence on the street, and will continue to do so. The Harley girls is an attempt to bring in male listeners by seeing their sexual fantasies come to life. A young girl riding a Harley motorcycle, to them, that's very hip and very street. We don't think that's neces-

Gregg: We did a Beachfest outdoor con-cert about a month back with Bangalore Choir and War Babies, and a couple of other bands. Attendance was about 7,000. We had terrific listener response. They were very excited about the opportunity to see some of these bands in this outdoor setting.

What sorts of promotions have you found are not particularly reliable for a much harder positioned radio station

Gregg: That's a good question. We try so many different promotions, and they all come off pretty well. There have been very few promotions that haven't come off.

Do you work primarily with the AOR promotion community, or a specially desig-nated reps, or a combination of the two?

Gregg: I deal with them all. That's where time management comes in. We deal with the AOR people, the metal people, and a lot of independent people that work some of these crossover metal AOR tracks. We set up promotions with all of them. There's no one or the other that we deal with exclusively.

Are the labels as manic and frantic for add timetables as the whole breaker mentality has mainstream companies thinking, or is that a slightly different pace regarding your station?

It varies from week to week, Gregg: depending on the pressure that that par-A lot of times, people know that KNAC just cannot play that track. And KNAC knows what's right. They've always pulled the right trigger every time.

Roger Daltrey's Got "Rocks In The Head"

"I wanted to do a rock and roll album. I'd always shied away from it before, because I thought, 'The Who do that, The Who do that.' But I decided to take it on the chin and make a real rock record. I honestly think it's the best thing I've done apart from the group." Roger Daltrey on his new solo album, Rocks In The Head (Atlantic). Roger Daltrey is a happy guy these days. He has a brand new solo album and has found the courage to go out on his own and make a rock and roll record regardless of the comparisons it's likely to draw with his past. Why, he's even found the confidence to co-write seven of the album's tracks. He thanks producer and collaborator Gerard McMahon for doing that. To sum it up, <u>Rocks In The Head</u> is definitely Daltrey's most ambitious and satisfying musical undertaking in a long time. In an exclusive interview and one that should raise a few eyebrows, Roger Daltrey reveals his rarely known personal side as he talks openly and frankly about music, The Who, Pete Townsend, the making of his first solo record in nearly a decade, politics and family, among other things, from one of rock n' roll's finest.

Roger: So what do you think of my new album? *I think it's your most focused solo work to date.*

Roger: Well, thank you. I actually wanted to make this one.

It sounds like you had a little fun.

Roger: I had a lot of fun. I had good people around me. Really good people.

In 1989, if someone would've asked you, 'When is Roger Daltrey going to record another solo album?' you would've responded, 'Never!' And yet you had a change of heart only a little more than a year later. What caused the change?

Roger: Two things really. One was the '89 tour. It was a relevation for me. It was a revelation to me in the fact that the band for the first time was playing at a stage volume that enabled me to actually hear myself.

Well, isn't that nice?

Roger: It bloody was, and I didn't have to shout.

So all these years you had no idea what you were singing live or how you sounded? Amazing.

Roger: Yeah. I could actually appreciate my singing. So that was wonderful and I really enjoyed that tour. That was the start of it. And at the end of it I was hoping that The Who would then go on to hopefully make a record. Which didn't happen.

You had said to me during our last interview around that time that it looked like a pretty sure thing that The Who would record an album of new material. Why do you think it didn't happen?

Roger: Uh, I don't know. Ask Pete, he's the one who basically stopped it from happening. Why? Who the fuck knows. He probably had fifty million reasons why.

Were you disappointed?

Roger: No. I know that it will happen when the time is right. And I'll be quite honest, the time is becoming more right by the day. (Laughs.)

Maybe it's a good thing a Who album didn't happen when you wanted it to because now you've become a songwriter. You co-wrote seven tunes on your new solo disc. That's a first for you.

Roger: That's right -- it is. Anyway, the second thing to make me change my mind was my producer and co-writer Gerard McMahon. He's a guy who actually made me believe in myself -- that I could have a solo career and that I could enjoy it -- and enjoy being a solo artist. Before that I could never enjoy it.

Why?

Roger: Well, I just always wanted to be the singer in The Who. And the last ten years has obviously been denied me.

You sound a little bitter. Do you blame Pete?

Roger: Well, it's always been his decision that's affected the state of the group. But am I bitter you ask? Nah, I'm not really bitter. Because of that situation I took up an acting career and I've done quite well at it. I've lived off it for the last ten years. I've done very well. But Gerard McMahon was the man who actually gave me the confidence I needed in myself.

How does one instill confidence in somebody who has practically done it all in rock 'n' roll?

Roger: He was just pretty honest about my previous records. And I've always been very honest about them as well. I've always treated my solo career up to now as a hobby. So what did he say to you to bring out all this confidence that you say you were lacking?

Roger: He just had a passion about rock n' roll and I recognized that passion, the passion in him. And that's something that I have within me. He just said things that showed me that he had the ability to focus what I had to give to a record to make it work. He'd never produced a record before and I said to him, 'I don't really care that you never produced a record before. I want you to produce my record.' He did it. We had fun. He gave me the confidence to write for the first time. Or write well.

You also wrote some songs with guitarist Ricky Byrd formerly of Joan Jett.

Roger: Yeah. Ricky's a great writer. We did a couple of tunes together. The whole thing was very organic. I believe in the chemistry of groups. Groups of people. I feel it's always better than just being alone as a single individual.

At least you have someone else other than yourself to bounce your ideas off of.

Roger: That's right.

<u>Rocks In The Head</u> -- great album title. There must be a funny story behind that name for the record. Do you have a funny story to tell me?

Roger: It's a phrase I've always heard me mother tell me. 'You've got rocks in your head, Roger me boy!'

What's the personal attachment to that phrase?

Roger: Rocks In The Head? It's just a great album title and I don't want to go into it any more than that.

Oh, come on, Roger. There must be something funny you can tell me. You've got a gleam in your eye and you're smirking. Come on Roger – give me a little dirt! Let's have some fun here!

Roger: Dirt...fun...with Rocks In The Head? Nah...Fuck off!

We'll get back to that.

Roger: No, we won't. (Smiling.)

As a producer, how does he get Roger Daltrey to put out his best performance, to reach his potential in the studio especially when the producer involved, Mr. McMahon, never produced a record before? Let's focus on vocals. How did he get you to sing up to your potential?

Roger: I like to work in the studio when I'm doing vocals -- just me and the producer. And it's a very weird process. Doing a vocal for a record, well, once you've done it you can go out and copy it. But when you're constructing the feel of the song there's a million different ways you can sing it when you first start. It's like painting with your voice.

Colors?

Roger: Yeah, and so I like it to be very bare. Just myself and the producer and that's it. We just literally did five or six different vocals and had a basic composite going and analyzed it by saying, 'Yeah that works here and that works there' until you've got the best of everything. Once you've got it and you hear it then you can go and copy it in a performance just straight away. It's amazing to me.

How do you feel at this point in your career when you listen to yourself sing on tape?

Roger: You're never happy.

Are you comfortable with it?

Roger: I'm more comfortable now than I've ever been. But you're never really totally happy because you end up going back and saying, 'Oh, I wish I'd done this part better this way or that way.' But, I mean, you do have to draw a line, so there's a place where you say, 'That's the best that I can do.' Obviously this needs to be done for creative and financial reasons or you'll never get out of the studio being a perfectionist that I consider myself. If you put an album together and start off with two songs and they're your most favorite songs. But then you cut four more and those first two end up going down on your list of favorites and so on. So you end up with something like eleven songs and you end up with four or so down at the bottom that are your least favorites. And even if you got rid of them and brought in four others there still would be four others that would make their way to the bottom of the list. So you're on a perpetual circle of negativity if you're not careful. You have to come to a point and say, 'That's the best that I can do with the money I've got.'

Speaking of money, what did it cost to make this record? \$500,000?

Roger: It was somewhere in the middle.

Any plans for videos?

Roger: No.

No videos -- why?

Roger: I'm not really interested.

But most labels feel a video is very important in selling a record.

Roger: Well, we'll see. If I had to make a video I'd make a performance video because those are the only kind of videos I like. I can't say, though, that I've ever been a lover of that medium. It's not that I hate videos but it's just something that I've never really been interested in.

There are also people who say that sometimes a video can hurt the image of an artist. In the case of Billy Squier, he made a video that hurt his career and he hasn't had much success since.

Roger: Really? I must get that video. (Laughter.)

Where do you get your sense of humor from? You're a sick fuck!

Roger: I'm just me. That's how I am. I can be pretty sick...definitely. (Smiles.) The English sense of humor...if anyone could buttonhole that...I don't know.

Growing up -- were you close with your folks?

Roger: Not really. No. My folks are dead now but I was never really close with them. That was part of my teenage angst. I wasn't close to them at all.

You were the rebel then.

Roger: Oh, very much so.

Any regrets?

Roger: Not regrets. I mean, you can't change the way you are. And that's how I was born and that's how I was. It made me what I am and you can't change that either. So there's no point in having regrets. It's important to recognize what you are.

Most people don't know that. And they'd like to think that they're something that they're not. Your folks again -- did they approve of your desire to sing and play rock 'n' roll?

Roger: Well, my folks, they were in the war and they're from that Forties and Fifties generation.

What were their occupations?

Roger: My dad worked in an office and my mom, she didn't work. She was a housewife. And they were part of that generation that wanted everything safe and sound. They wanted everything neatly packaged and I can understand why. Their life had been blown apart by Hitler. So obviously there was a conflict with someone like me in the house. I think at the time my folks must've thought I was a complete lunatic.

How does it feel, man? You're writing now.

Roger: It feels great. The writing is the exciting bit but then you have to talk about it which sucks. It sucks big time. Too many people picking my brain. Music shouldn't really be talked about at all, should it? That's the ridiculous thing about this business. That's a paradox.

As an artist myself, I understand your sentiments. But as a businessman, I understand the reality of it all.

Roger: But then you've got to sell it and I understand that, too.

But then not everybody understands or has that creative process.

Roger: Yeah, but I believe everybody's got that creative process if they just look for it. Everybody's got it. Everyone can do something creative in their life. You just have to believe it and not be frightened. I've been in this business 25 fucking years and I've been terrified of writing a song. I've written mediocrc songs

that slipped out of me here and there. And all this time all I had to do was be brave about it and go, 'Fuck it! I can do it!' And you can.

Who cares what anyone says.

Roger: Yes. What'll they do? Bite my head off? I've been in this business this long I can certainly survive another year. (Laughs.)

How did you determine the subject matter you wrote about? Did you draw from personal experience?

Roger: Yeah, and from conversations we all had. Talking about your life and how you feel about different things.

How do you get comfortable being a collaborator with somebody? I mean, you're leaving yourself vulnerable, aren't you?

Roger: Of course. But we're all friends and working with these guys was really good fun. I mean, for the first time in my life outside of The Who and even the first time in my life I've had a bunch of mates that I played with who became my best friends. One thing people don't realize about The Who -- although we were a band -- we were never really friendly on that kind of level. Because we were together so much all the other friends in my life disappeared. They kind of dropped out. So it's the first time in my life that I've had a bunch of mates that I like hanging out with and going out with. I mean, now I like going out with the guys. Before that I said, 'Fuck going out with the guys. I'd just rather go out with the girls!' It was true! But now I have real friends.

It's amazing that it's taken you...

Roger: 48 years! (Laughs.) Ahhhh!!!!! You're 48?

Roger: Yeah, and it feels 48.

Can you say 'Fifty?'

Roger: No, because it doesn't feel fucking 50. I feel 48. And becoming 50 doesn't bother me.

I don't know about you, but it would freak the crap out of me to hit 50. No thank you, but I think I'd be 49 forever. 50 to me is middle age.

Roger: Of course it's middle age. And you're going to get there one day whether you like it or not. Everybody just has to realize that life is a perpetual battle against the microbe. It's you against that. And that microbe's ambition is to reduce you into a pile of compost. Once you understand that it doesn't fucking matter how old you are. (Laughs.) So let's have a little fun because in the end we're just a potential heap of shit.

What are you going to do now?

Roger: I'm just hoping the record's a hit. I think it has a good chance of being a hit. I think I've done what I set out to do -- and that is to make a mature rock n' roll record that hasn't gone soft on the edges or gone middle of the road. And I think this record's got longevity in it because it stands up to a lot of listens. So let's hope it sells.

Pete is working ...

Roger: Who?

Pete...

Roger: Oh, him.

He's been consulting on a possible Broadway bound version of Tommy that's opening at the Lahoya Playhouse in San Diego. Have you had any involvement in that at all?

Roger: No. The only involvement that we have is that they want to represent it as The Who's *Tommy* and we okayed it. I'm very proud of anyone playing our music. And I'll lend any support I can give them, but we're not directly involved in the production.

Have they asked you for suggestions?

Roger: They're calling it The Who's work of *Tommy* but apparently they've changed the plot quite a bit from the original. So that'll be quite interesting.

You approve of that?

Roger: Well, Pete's obviously approved it.

Don't you have a say?

Roger: Well, he owns most of the songs.

So it's gotten down to that.

Roger: Yeah, it does get down to that because nothing is really sacred, is it? It's better than being on a fucking car commercial or a...

Aren't you glad Michael Jackson didn't purchase your song catalogue.

Roger: You don't have any idea what it feels like when you're sitting at home and the TV's on and a car comes on the screen and it's got your voice on it doing 'Who Are You.' Ughhhhh! I just want to punch Pete out for that. Or 'Pinball Wizard' on a bank commercial! It makes me want to puke!

So Pete's sold out?

Roger: Yeah. He's done it. It's happened. All these commercials are real. They've been all over the tube. I just couldn't believe that Pete's sold them out like that.

Why? Michael Jackson did that to Paul McCartney.

Roger: He's entitled to do it because it's his publishing. That's his entitlement. But what I don't think they're entitled to do is to go out and copy The Who and copy the way I sung it cause that's me and I care about that. It pisses me off and makes me fucking angry!

So what do you say to Pete now that he's done this?

Roger: What I'd like to say now that it's a fucking reality is where's my percentage?!?!

That's fine. I mean, in a way, I agree with you. Pete may have written the song but it's your vocal performance that's also responsible for the song's success.

Roger: It's the vocal you remember just as much as you remember the song, but *you* tell them that. He's really upset me.

You ever sue anybody for that?

Roger: You can't! There's nothing you can do. Nothing.

That sucks.

Roger: It certainly does. It certainly does suck!

On to a more pleasant subject. How do you get your voice in shape?

Roger: I do all these voice exercises. (Starts making all these weird vocal noises.) Believe it or not, all this opens the voice up. I guess I sound more like a farm animal than a rock n' roll singer when I do that, but it really works.

You don't smoke?

Roger: No.

You don't drink?

Roger: Oh, I drink like a fish. (Smiles proudly.) I drink like a fish and I do like the occasional joint. You can't ignore it. I mean, it's part of my past.

Yeah. It's probably part of that teenage angst you were talking about earlier.

Roger: Yeah, that's it. All that rebellion.

Tell me a fan story. I've talked to everyone -- from the Stones to Rod Stewart -- and everyone has given me a wild or funny or macabre fan story. Have you got one?

Roger: Oh God! I'm not ready for this one. With The Who, the weirdest one happened in regards to, what's his name? Mansfield?

You mean, Charles Manson?

Roger: Yeah, that's him. Not Charles Manson but his disciples. The Red Robes. These Manson followers. They started hanging around Who gigs. This woman named Moon something or another, I think she was the one who took a shot at President Ford in the Seventies. And they were after me. And they gave me a crystal ball! And like a dickhead I accepted it! Oh shit! I couldn't get rid of this crystal ball. So I had to find a white witch to take it off me. Now this happened after Manson and his gang killed Sharon Tate. That was kind of macabre. That thing sat in my room for months while I tried to find someone to take it off my hands. Crystal balls -- it's heavy shit. I put duct tape around it because I believe in it, you know. And I was deathly afraid of what this crystal ball could do to me. I mean, these were crazy people! And they really spooked me!

Wow! New subject -- the L.A. riots. Your feelings?

Roger: The same thing can happen anywhere and I don't know what you really do about it. What astounds me most about the L.A. riots is America's ability to completely turn a blind eye to it for the last 20 years. That never ceases to amaze me. Since Watts the problem has never really gone away. It amazes me how everyone is so surprised when things finally go bang. America is surprised. I don't know what should be done about it, though. You have incredibly big social problems here and I don't think it's all necessarily a matter of money. I think money obviously is part of it. The welfare state here has been badly, badly neglected. It needs radical new thinking.

Many people say that the riots didn't take place in New York City because, in a way, we have a healthy society in that we ventilate our feelings when something bothers us. A New Yorker will be quick to

tell you off, for instance, if you're driving a car and you cut someone off. You're bound to hear a loudly worded, 'Fuck you!'

Roger: Yeah, and in L.A. they'll just look in the next car and see if there's a star in it. It's true.

Do you follow American politics? How do you feel about Ross Perot?

Roger: My feelings about it being an outsider looking in is that Ronald Reagan was your ultimate president and he showed the job to be what I've always felt it was -- a job for an out-of-work old B actor! And occasional chimpanzee. And it's a really wonderful job for someone like that. So now knowing what the job is, who really gives a fuck who's going to get it? Your two political parties, and I'm a man who hates party politics, the whole problem that democracy has got in the West is party politics. It becomes self stifling. So once you realize what the job is and you ask. 'What the hell do they really do anyway?' They're all really frontmen. But one thing Perot is doing is shaking up the two political parties, and they really do need shaking up. And hopefully he'll become a kind of catalyst for something good happening. I mean, you can't be any worse off with him than you are with Bush. I mean, the man is an animal. He's an absolute disaster. You see, I'm a complete cynic when it comes to politicians. And I think most of the public feel that way now. I think that's why Perot is a good bet to put your money on. I think he could win it.

This country wants radical change.

Roger: The people of America have had it up to here with all the bullshit that they've been fed by politicians. And Perot's hit the nail on the head when he says when you're sick you go to a doctor, and when you have bad politics you keep going back to bad politicians, and that's not a good thing for America and her people. What has any politician ever really done for anybody in their life? Most of them have never had a real job. It's a fucking joke.

In many people's eyes, Perot's a businessman and they feel this country needs a businessman to help it through its economic troubles.

Roger: The only thing that concerns me is that Perot will probably end up being a fascist. But you still have to go back to the fact that even if he is a fascist how much power will he really have in that job anyway? You can't do much worse a job of it than already has been done, that's for sure.

Let's get close to home with John Major just narrowly winning a victory for re-election. Comments? There are also those who feel Margaret Thatcher got a bad deal in the way she was removed from her post?

Roger: Well, as far as Margaret Thatcher is concerned, she got a bad deal in the way they got rid of her. And the great thing about British politics is that we can get rid of you if need be. She became, like, a megalomaniac at the end. She had no opposition for something like thirteen or fourteen years. It was abysmal. So if you have no opposition then you can get away with anything and that's exactly what happened. She became this all encompassing megalomaniac. She needed to be pulled down a peg or two. And the beauty of English politics is that it's been built within the system that we can actually do that. You can't do that in America and you've a megalomaniac up there as president now. And you just might even vote him in again. You can't get rid of him unless you threaten to impeach him like you did with Richard Nixon. So, in some ways, it's a rough deal, but for the people it's a safety valve. John Major, I think, is going to be a brilliant statesman. He's proved to be a really caring man. Sincerely cares about people, and unlike most politicians, he's a working class man. He's blue collar from a theatrical background. He's been unemployed and he's actually worked in real jobs that people can relate to. I try to look on at politicians by their actions -- not by what they say. When we went through the Gulf War, which I'm incredibly cynical about, I think it was engineered so they could try out the weapons because they've got to make so many cuts. I mean, we need a war so we can try this stuff out.


Oh, I truly hope you're wrong about that.

Roger: No, really. That's my theory. When you add it all up that's what I think. And then there's the Rio Summit. Bush has only made it worse for himself over there. And this planet we live on will not wait around for the politicians to make up their minds. I mean, we're either going to survive on this planet or the planet will survive without us. There's no 'ifs,' 'ands' or 'buts.' Whether we are part of the jigsaw is up to us. The planet will take care of itself. Don't worry about that. And this is the future of mankind we're talking about here. This is no joke. It's time to put politics aside and put the interest of the people and of the quality of life first and foremost -- or accept the consequences. The future is today and we better act now while we can.

Levitation, "Need For Not" (CAPITOL) Terry



Bickers fled the perceived confines of House Of Love to expand his musical vocabulary, and as who anyone bothered to embrace sublime the "Coterie" EP will attest, Levitation appears to be his sonic technicolor dream come true. Although some of us treated the aforementioned disc

as an album, "Need For Not" is actually the band's debut full length offering. Levitation are a band out of time--- caught in an era that isn't as quick to appreciate those set on redefining "the grain" of popular music. Think about it. Although this section is coined/defined as "alternative"-- just how far left of the dial do we really go today? And I'm not talking about being "art damaged" for art's sake. Same as it ever was? In a word--- No! Levitation will force you awake, if you let them. At times they almost reek of incense, but the serious chops of the players involved leave an open-mouth glaze on the face of every musician in the crowd. Call it "Head Music" if you must, but don't minimize the fact that Levitation seem to reach safely home from another angle. Taking things from the top: "Against Nature" starts the set with a combination of Floyd-ian trippitronics and common denominator throb--- unquestionably a "hit single" in every sense of the word. "World Again" was the advance romance, and is easily the band's stab at "accepted" song structure, by way of Syd Barrett that is! "Hangnail" pulls the harpsichord out of mothballs, but places it in the hands of Lothar And The Hand People--- all under three minutes. "Resist" is the first instantly identifiable manifestation of true beauty, an organic, soulful mantra--- "Sometimes, I feel like everyone knows." It'll be a black light daze for most on "Arcs Of Light And Dew", but "Pieces Of Mary" is an epic worth investigation. The studio version of "Smile" is next, and this is the tune that inspired massive hallucinations in anyone who heard the live version from "Coterie"--- a veritable band hallmark calling card. As we wind down the disc, the somber "Embedded" leads to "Coterie", an explanation of angles and light --- patently beautiful and resolutely required. Relax your mind and float downstream. (MM)

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Faith No More, "Angel Dust" (REPRISE) Those of you cynics expecting a major league compromise here will be disappointed. F.N.M. have put together an album that in most respects is harder and more obtuse than their breakthrough smash sophomore "Epic" effort. Mike Patton was involved from the start of this project (he joined the band after tracks were finished on the last LP) and the result is a true band effort. It's kicks off with the intensity of "Land of Sunshine" a Floyd influenced nugget (hey, it sounds like "Astronomy Dominie" on the intro, alright?) and doesn't let up for the duration of the album. You've already become acquainted with "MidLife Crisis" (shades of pre-Patton "We Care A Lot") and it's heartfelt lyrics like " your menstruating heart/It ain't bleedin' enough for two/ It's a midlife crisis." According to Dr. Marrone, the album was originally titled "Crack Hitler" but some label honchos thought the title (or was it really the subject...listen and decide) too hot to handle. Gee, "Angel Dust" is a real compromise---ehh? The track features plinks of guitar work reminiscent of "Shaft" (!). Other major tunes to spew open from this highly digestible disc are

"Caffeine", "Be Aggressive" and "Kindergarten." (P.S. Gross out your Morrissey fan friends with the back cover of the booklet!) Already thrusting 20-12* on the chart. (JL)

Joey Molland, "The Pilgrim" (RYKODISC) The term "survivor" is often tossed about with little true meaning, but when you're dealing with a solo effort from what's left of Badfinger --- it's certainly appropriate. Sure many famous musicians have prematurely expired over the years, but there is only one band that had two members commit suicide--- and 8 years apart no less! In some respects, the tragic circumstances surrounding Badfinger (death and lawsuits primarily--- and in some ways similarly) obscured, for many, the rich history of their musical output. Joey wasn't a member yet during the recording of their "Magic Christian Music" debut (for the most part recorded when they were still The Iveys), but over the rest of the band's history he was a prime mover, integral to every incarnation. From the hard rock power pop of their Apple work ("Ass" remains an overlooked classic), the under rated Warner Bros. albums, an acoustic flavored outing on Elektra ("Airwaves") and somewhat lackluster effort on Radio Records in 1981 (with cover art by Peter Max), Joey Molland's songs were always a highlight. One previous solo effort ("After The Pearl" from 1984) is

exceedingly rare, so in many ways this release is the first "official" Joey Molland solo album (at least in regard to the general public.) "The Pilgrim" encompasses all aspects of Molland's musical ebb and flow, from the rough-edged rock of "It Makes Me Sick" to the gentle acoustic ballad "All Caught Up", which makes a nod to his past (namely, "I'd Die Babe" from "Straight Up".) Just how relevant Joey Molland is to our format is a matter of perception, why not ask The Posies, Jellyfish, Let's Active or even Matthew Sweet what they think? In the meantime, check out those tracks already mentioned, as well as "Vampire Wedding" (inspired by Anne Rice), "In My Dreams" or the rocking rave of "The Party's Over". (MM)

Balloon, "Gravity" (DEDICATED/RCA) It is Ba-ll-oon!! No this is not an F Troop cast treasure, and Larry Storch is not playing anything on the sessions. Actually, Balloon is for fans of Roxy Music and Nico--- or even the embryonic Velvets. Simply put, the album is one which warrants the "b" word (as in "brilliant".) The smell (and feel) of Velvet is not far off the mark as two musicians on the LP have worked with John Cale -- Ronald Jones and Darryl Johnson. The influence of Bryan Ferry may be heard vocally on "Bellvue" while the ghost of "Sweet Jane" haunts "I Can't Leave Her." The pace moves up a notch as the group teams up with Sarah McLachlan on "Tightrope Walker"--- which will immediately remind you of "Moonshadow." Other tunes of interest include the lead off track ("Why Did It Take So Long") and the haunting "Paraffin Flat." The album was recorded in Daniel Lanois' New Orleans studio and produced expertly by Michael Brook (Mary Margaret O'Hara, Youssou N'Dour). To keep the Canadian connection going, if you've found Leonard Cohen or the recent spate of singer-songwriters to be your cup 'o' joe, let this Balloon float over the air

immediately. (JL)

FAITH NO MORE



Lindsey Buckingham, "Out Of The Cradle" (REPRISE) Yes, we know that Lindsey Buckingham was part of a band that could very well be looked upon as the epitome of AOR. And granted, not all the tracks on his long awaited third "solo" album will fit everyone's ideas/ideals of good alternative programming (whatever the hell that is these days.) But to ignore music primarily on the basis of preconceptions is being just as ignorant as those who refuse to take a band like Nirvana (yesterday) or Pavement (today) seriously--- until they get on a major label. Lindsey Buckingham has always been an interesting character, I guess it's his affection for Brian Wilson (or perhaps his Rundgren-esque tendencies) that makes him so personally endearing. At any rate, there's no denying the man's an original with legitimate talent, and "Out Of The Cradle" contains moments of skewed, twisted pop that should make even non-fans smile. The introspective and darkly erotic "Street Of Dreams" is like David Lynch meets T Bone Burnett and Marty Balin circa "Comin' Back To Me", while "Don't Look Down" (and the intro) is a psychedelic vertigo vision filled with a quirky "Alice In

Wonderland" hue and charm. "Countdown" could be Roy Orbison jamming with Dwight Twilley (backing vocals by The Partridge Family, of course) and "All My Sorrows" is what The Association would have sounded like on "Cherish"---- if it had been written by Leonard Cohen. "This Is The Time" would be a good choice for a blindfold test, with its acid washed layers of controlled frenzy. Lindsey played just about every instrument and produced this session with old pal and confidant Richard Dashut, recording mostly at his expansive home studio over a period of years. It's just that attention to detail that will forever link Buckingham to the very same twisted genius he so admires (i.e. Wilson and Phil Spector.) As he says in the spoken intro to "Surrender The Rain", "I've got to stop this obsession and start living again!"-- not an easy thing to do when musical perfection is what you're after. For the AAA readers, be aware that "You Do Or You Don't" will be a massive AOR/CHR hit eventually. (MM)





U2. "Even Better Than The Real Thing" CD5 (ISLAND/PLG) Forget all about the main tune on this EP, we all know it quite well by now (or should), and those who haven't yet played it will -- while some who already have --- will again. The focus of this release should be placed on the three bonus non-LP tracks, after all it's not like your audience will exactly turn a deaf ear to new/exclusive material from U2! Even though their tour was easily their most theatrical outing ever, "Achtung Baby" is (in many ways) the band's return to their original groove. A song like the previously unreleased demo of "Where Did It All Go Wrong" will connect even with those U2 fans wary since the massive breakthrough acclaim kicked in. The track shows that this really is the same band who made up the brilliant "October" on the spot in the studio, jamming, connecting and insistent. "Salome" gives another texture to their Emerald Isle mystique with its throbbing eccentricity, and some will already be familiar with this remix of "Lady With The Spinning Head" as a bonus on the promo only/picture disc of "Zoo Station." (MM)

The Chills, "The Male Monster From The ID" (SLASH/REPRISE) Long one of the most luminous pop



lights to beacon from New Zealand, The Chills should already be a household name--- if only for their aptly titled "Heavenly Pop Hit", and not to mention 1986's brilliant "Kaleidoscope World" album. Martin Phillipps lives in a world where guitars ring true and harmonies glisten above lyrics that sometimes paint a not too pretty picture (see 82's "Pink Frost"), but more

often than not everything is bathed in a sublime, "golly this might be heaven" type glow. This first track from "Soft Bomb", an album that will be near the top of this year end fave list (see next week's cover for proof), is a textbook gorgeous Chills offering. Already on stations like KRCK, KTAO, WFNX, WHTG, WLAV, WNCS and more, this is the picture you'll find next to the term "timeless pop beauty". Don't miss the feeling. (MM)

Skrew, "Sympathy For The Devil" (METAL **BLADE/WB)** Let's get a few things clear right up front; 1.)



This is not to be confused with the same school of 60's covers that inspired The Candy Skins remake of "For What It's Worth". 2.) This is not really a single, so to speak. In the first place Skrew sound more like Motorhead meets the Surgical Penis Klinik, and in the second this is only the "focus" track from their "Burning In Water, Drowning In Flame" album. The Austin


based duo of Adam Grossman (guitar/vocals) and Danny Lohner (guitar) cut their teeth in the hardcore trenches of Angkor Wat, and followed a harder edged industrial trail, as opossed to the normal dance club route. Eventually meeting up with Al Jourgensen, who is rapidly becoming almost James Brown like-maybe we'l soon call him "The Hardest Working Man In Industrial/Hardcore", or a similar meaningless title. Skrew are in your face like ESPN wishes Major League Baseball was, and they're not real happy about things either! You can bet the farm Keith would love this update of The Stones. Wake up and smell the napalm. (MM)

Chris Connelly, "July" EP (WAX TRAX) The founding



father of Fini Tribe moved here from his native Scotland quite a while back, and his involvement in the industrial circles of Ministry and Revolting Cocks make him a very recognizable name. The only problem is that unless you've heard Chris' first solo album ("Whiplash Boychild"), there's no way you'll be ready for the almost toned down, Bowie meets Steve Hillage head trip that is the music/stance of Chris Connelly as a solo artist. "July" is taken from his forthcoming sophomore effort, cunningly titled "Phenobarb-Bam-Ba-Lam", and it's a garage blast of power chords and pure pound--- but also highly melodious, a rare treat indeed. Filling out this Ep are new versions of "This Edge Of Midnight" and "The Last Of Joy" (both originally found on "Whiplash"), as well as the arresting spoken word piece---"Trash". Vital! (MM)

The other extra, "Sometimes", is almost a rewrite of "Eve Of Destruction", and perhaps it's that familiar riff that has us swearing it's made a past bonus appearances. Are they J&M or Jesus And Mary? Does it matter when it sounds this good loud? No! (MM)

Kimm Rogers, "Will Work For Food" (IS-LAND/PLG) The first single from Kimm's second album is



inspired by a sign that many people on the West Coast are seeing held by the homeless, Will Work For Food. A sad state of affairs, right? After all, what year is this? Is it that easy to forget that we swore we'd never repeat the horror that filled many of our parents and grandparents, as they were forced to sell apples on the street for change during the Depression? Tears For

Fears said it best, "Memories fade, but the thought still lingers"-only now more than ever. If you're familiar with her acoustic debut, be aware that Kimm has toughened up her angelic soprano by enlisting friends The Rave-Ups (Jimmer Podrasky, Terry Wilson and Tim Jiminez) as the backing band, and producer Matt Wallace (Faith No More/Replacements/etc) behind the board for her upcoming "Two Sides" follow-up. Ms. Rogers' recent New York industry showcase left the crowd hooting for more, and we're sure this track is explanation enough why. Picture a more aggressive Innocence Mission, but let your ears decide. (MM)

James McMurtry always provides a great listen and this new



effort ("<u>Candyland</u>" on Columbia Records) continues in his already legendary tradition. 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

Faith No More, "Angel Dust", Reprise.... It's final-ly happened. Those silly San Fran rowdies have returned with a



record that keeps pace with their unparalleled schizophrenia. The long awaited follow-up to the platinum "The Real Thing", takes experimentation by the horns, flails it about, and infiltrates the ragged remains with an undeniably catchy quality, divulged through twisting carnival effects, big bad grooves, and Mike Patton's outer-spaced lyrics and multiple personality vocals. Not willing to conform to the wall of

expectations they no doubt found themselves facing following the success of the last album, the band once again did the most obvious thing they could have... they bolted. The result is the psycho drama of "Angel Dust". A wonderful record that redefines itself with every listen, especially when the infectious nature of Jim Martin's nail-biting guitar magic starts to sink in, your foot gets caught up in the whirlpool of off-beat grooves culled by Billy Gould and Mike Bordin, and you're off and spinning amidst the soaring keyboard swells of Roddy Bottum. The ultra catchy lead cut "*Midlife Crisis*", is already spreading all over the airwaves and MTV--with a bizarre and incredible video. But now, the full scary package lays at your sticky fingertips. "Caffeine" cranks (naturally), "RV" is twisted, "Malpractice" absolutely screams, "A Small Victory" is a monster hit waiting to happen (my fave so far), "Kindergarten" is a smash and so true, "Smaller And Smaller" is a mesmerizing delight, "Crack Hitler" is crazed, "Jizzlobber" hurts, and "Everything's Ruined" is great, it rocks and tells an interesting tale. "Midnight Cowboy"... funny. They're all unique. The Mr. Bungle experience rears its sick head here and there and the result as you might expect, is an even more entertaining Faith No More. It's the record some would probably have preferred they didn't make, but it's one I bet they can't help but fall in love with. Stupid, silly, weird, profound, pointed and so totally FNM it's brilliant. The full record has already picked up new adds at CFOX, KCLB, KIOZ, KMSA, KZOK, KZRX, WBAU, WDHA, WGIR, WJUL, WKNC, WSMU, WSOU, WXCI and WZMB, while the 3 song sampler continues to pick up a few more at WAPI, WEOS and WQNY. It also managed some nice more at WAPI, WEOS and WQNY. What a trip.

Trouble, "Manic Frustration", Der American.... An unfortunate set of circumstances led to this amazing album being held up and mailed much later than ex-



pected. The three song sampler was supposed to have a fairly good lead time, but as it is, it's gotten there just ahead or at the same time as the full album. Well, despite all that a record as strong as this just can't be denied. Trouble have been around for years and making great, heavy music all the while. The culmination of their efforts it seemed was 1990's self-titled debut for Def American. The record of the year

here at Hard, it seemed the ultimate offering from this much loved quintet (Eric Wagner-vocals, Rick Wartell-guitars, Bruce Franklin-guitars, Ron Holzner-bass and Barry Stern-drums). Excellent as that LP is, it seems it was just the tip of the iceberg, because "Manic Frustration" leaps miles beyond it. Picking up the pace a bit, the band has thrown themselves fully committed into a more straight forward rock style. Never fear though, the sound is still undeniably Trouble--heavy, loaded with guitars, laced with classic lines, and the very unique and identifiable vocals of Wagner. Incredible, is exactly how it sounds. Fast, aggressive,

"Barney" Greenway (growls/grumbles etc.), Shane Embury (bass), Jesse Pintado (guitars), Mitch Harris (guitars) and newcomer Danny Herrera (drums). With the trends currently in favor of many speed based bands slowing down a tad, and therefore opting for a maximum slice of listenership rather than a select, albeit very loyal following, Napalm chose rather to reiterate their extreme nature. Their latest, "Utopia Banished" is a blaring adjective in motion, a ripping extravaganza of speed riffs, jackhammer drumming and the always deep, guttural and unearthly growls. There's nothing subtle, soft or "catchy" about 'em. They pummel for the sake of harshness. The machine rips along, full of contempt and disdain, sonically tight and severe. The kind of sound that burns at your very being after extended exposure to it. A big one for the band and their long enduring fans without a doubt. Dive in if you dare.

Skrew, "Burning In Water, Drowning In Flame", Metal Blade.... And speaking of extremes, here's a band just as out there, but they operate on a different kind of plain. Former



members of Austin based hardcore outfit Angkor Wat (remember them: "When Obscenity Becomes The Norm... Awake" and "Corpus Christi") Adam Grossman and guitarist Danny Lohner were looking for a further means of expression. And the industrial influence was beginning to needle its way into their otherwise hardcore countenance. The result is what you now hold before you. Skrew, the mod-

ernization and marriage of two musicians with machines. And due in large part to their A. Wat background, the guys managed to sidestep the largely dance type ebb of much of today's industrial based offerings. They instead lent a more metallic bent to the proceedings and the resulting 11 songs are exemplary of grinding riffs seeped in programming to gnaw your teeth on. Abrasive, sterile, but almost unbelievably infused with some, well... catchy almost melodic moments. Bizarre and eccentric the record progresses from one angry rant to another. Some leaders in the industrial movement also had input into the project thus the full blown effect (Al Jourgensen of Ministry, Phil Owen of the Revolting Cocks produced and many others). Of note, is that when the band takes "Burning ... " out on the road, they want it to be a very real and human experience and thus a band has been put together. The live show should prove quite sonic as a result. Check out the title track, "Charlemagne", "Sympathy For The Devil" (yep, the very one), "Poisonous", "Indestructible" or "Prey Elect" Flesh".

Quick Picks

Firehouse, "Hold Your Fire", Epic The lead single is already at metal radio, and chalked up a bunch of adds at KUNV,



WCWP, KZRX, WAIF, WMMR, WSOU, WXCI, WQNY and WSOU. Now however, the full harder album is impacting and waiting to ignite. One of the biggest breakthrough stories of 1991, Firehouse's debut sold more than 1.5 million copies, bolstered most significantly by the two smash singles "Don't Treat Me Bad" and "Love Of A Lifetime". It firmly established them across formats at

AOR/CHR and metal, not to mention virtually making them video stars overnight. They've a reputation as being one of the nicest bunches of guys, (C.J. Snare-vox, Bill Leverty-guitar, Perry Richardson-bass and Michael Foster-drums) you'll ever meet (and I can definitely vouch for that), and a hard working one at that. They've obviously put a lot of effort into their new album and you'll find that despite their power pop/metal standing, there is some decidedly heavier material on "Hold Your Fire" that may just give a boost here on the metal end. Yeah, they're huge on the other side of the fence, but they sound great and that's what matters most (and call me a softee but I just love C.J.'s voice). Check out "Rock You Tonight", "You're Too Bad", "Get In Touch", "Hold Your Fire", "Life In The Real World" or "Mama Didn't Raise No Fool".



T-Ride, "I Hunger", Hollywood I realize you're probably all getting a wee bit tired of me constantly nudging you about this t-riffic threesome, but hey, what's one more write-up, when the band's this good? Right? Besides, "I Hunger" is my favorite track on the record and I always play it first (followed by "Ride"). It kicks off with massive drums (courtesy of Eric Valentine) and slaps into a pretty fiesty groove right away, etched with sharp six string lines a la Jeff Tyson, not to mention the high-ended wails of Dan Arlie. Fiery, rebellious and fast, it's the perfect summer tune (the promo voodoo dolls were rather cool too). I just love the fact that this band attacks every song with such obvious ferocity and yet maintains such a high standard as musicians (they're hyper talented). It's all encompassing and entertaininga feast for your senses if you will. If you loved "Zombies" you'll love this and if you didn't quite get it, you'll still love "*I Hunger*". It rocks quite boldly. Already on KZRX, while the LP continues picking up increases at CFOX, WVFS, WXDR and KISW. Still cruising on KZOK, WXCI, WCWP, WDHA, WGIR, WVVX, WZMB, KZAK, WNYE, WQNY, KDJK, KEYJ, KROK, KSAQ, WAPI, WCDB, WHJY, WHMH, WMMR, WTPA and WHVY (with Top 5 phones at WHMH and WVVX). Oh, and YEAH! look for them out on the road with Asphalt Ballet and Shotgun Messiah in a town near you real soon.

Iron Maiden, "The Fugitive", Epic.... So what do you do when your band's on top of the charts for the third week straight? You stack the odds even further in your corner by releasing another great emphasis track, backed with some fun stuff to keep the masses entertained. In this case it's "Roll Over Vic Vella" (y'know "Roll Over Beethoven" kinda done differently) a tribute to Maiden's first soundman and roadie (really fun song), and there's also a grand little interview to cruise through too (18 minutes worth). And so it goes, Epic is unleashing "The Fugitive". One of the more fierce numbers on the album, it's chomps along classic Maiden lines and Nicko's big bold drums. All this while the first single "Be Quick Or Be Dead" single is still jammin' away at WRLC, WVFS, KIOZ, WBAU, WSOU, WXCI, KUNV, KBPI, KDJK, KISW, KNGX, KSAQ, KUSF, KVHS, KZAK, KBPI, KDJK, KISW, KNGX, KSAQ, KUSF, KVHS, KZAK, KZOK, KZRX, WAPI, WBCN, WBIM, WBNY, WCDB, WHJY, WKPX, WLFR, WNHU, WTPA, WVVX, WWSP, WXDR, WXTB and WZRC (with top requests at KDJK, KNGX, KVHS, KZOK, KZRX, WAPI, WBNY, WLFR, WRLC, WTPA and WVVX). Danzig, "Danzig III, How The Gods Kill" Sampler, Def American.... The brooding form of Glenn Danzig has become more and more of a familiar and welcome sight in the



world of music (metal in particular, obviously), and no doubt the range and extent of his reach will be greatly exhanced with his latest greatest offering. The band's third album, "How The Gods Kill" - a resounding expose on the false nature of some religious factions, the plight of the forced faithful, and the crushing of innate belief systems, (he's not a subtle guy that's for sure) is set for release in mid-July. For Ain't No

starters however, the label has pulled five tracks from it, for metal radio in order that you will all know the power of what lies ahead. Included for your listening pleasure are "Left Hand Path", "How The Gods Kill", "Godless", "Do You Wear The Mark" and "Dirty Black Summer". At the core of what makes Danzig--the band, such a serious force in the metal world... is consistency. The very talented line-up has again remain 🖉 unchanged (Glenn-vocals, John Christ-guitar, Chuck Biscuits-drummer and Eerie Von-bass) and despite always stretching further with each project, Danzig always stays true to their aggressive and heavy nature. Glenn has grown immensely as a vocalist over the years, most noticeably on "Lucifuge", where he explored more fully his softer ranges and greater melody (he practically **purced on some songs**). A side of him we'd never been exposed

to before, yet how beautifully it all worked. This record furthers his vocal explorations. Notice the Morrison like quality on the intro to the title track--pretty amazing and stunningly performed and produced (handled by Glenn this time around). For now, enjoy these five tracks and prepare, for the powerful third installment of the world according to Glenn Danzig. In a word... intense.

Steve Morse Band, "Coast To Coast", MCA... In January of last year, I rushed to put this brilliant band's album



"Southern Steel" (I still have the artwork on my wall) on the cover of the magazine. I wish I had the space and opportunity to do so again (having grown up around airplanes all my life I really dig the art on this one too) for his latest, but as you can see the summer flood of releases has come rushing in and I'm just trying to keep my head above water. For those among you crazy enough not to be familiar with

Steve Morse, what you need to know is that he was formerly with the Dixie Dregs (he toured with them recently and there's a new record coming out soon on another label), and Kansas and that this is his fourth album under The Steve Morse Band (he also had one pure solo LP -- "High Tension Wires"). Also, he's one of the finest guitar players in the world. That said, on we go. Joining Steve once again are the equally versatile and talented Dave

LaRue on bass and Van Romaine on drums. If ever you have the opportunity to see this trio perform, do so. It will blow your mind. Dave and Van are as mesmerizing to watch and hear, as Steve's dancing fingers and the magic he coaxes out of six strings. And their natural stage banter is funny and genuine. As for the record, it's beautiful. Once again a pleasant and tantalizing package of songs running a wide range of texture, speed and precision. The interaction of the instruments is fascinating enough, but encapsulated in a very catchy and flowing structure, the songs are highly expressive. From the funky southern twang of "Runaway Train", to the frenzied "Morning Rush Hour", or the chiming delicacy of "Long Lost", the record serves notice (again) that high performance/precision musicianship need not lack emotional artistry, and that it in fact favors it. In those realms, these three men are some of the absolute best. Classic and modern lines intertwine beautifully under such skillful hands as these. Also check out "Collateral Damage", "Cabin Fever" (we know it well), "Flat Baroque" or "User Friendly". They're all great. Enjoy. Al-ready added at KEYJ, KMSA, KNGX, KUNV, KZAK, WBAU, WCWP, WFCS, WFIT, WKDU, WKNH, WPSC, WQNY, WRFL, WVVX, WWSP, WXCI and WXDR.

"Blues For The Red Sun, Kyuss. Chameleon/Dali This band's debut album "Wretch" should

still be fairly fresh in your memories, since it was only just released in November of last year. The record managed to chart, but never quite managed to get the boost it needed to bolt up into the higher echelons. And a great little record it was, full of raw new talent brimming over the



be noticed. Well, they may just get the chance yet. The band, (Brant Bjorkdrums, Josh Homme-guitar, Nick Oliveri-bass and John Garcia-vocals) practically threw together another record and it now awaits your attention. It was recorded virtually live and mixed in two weeks with producer Chris Goss (Masters Of Reality) and it retains therefore a very raw edge, much like you would expect. But theirs is a sound alive with distortion, rooted in grunge, desolate and stripped down like the desert terrain the band arose from in Southern California. For an album so quickly put together it sports a mean collection of tunes of ethereal and heavy nature. Somber walls of drone often explode into grinding riffs akin to Bullet

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LaVolta meets Soundgarden, and yet always rippling through are the desperately raspy vocals of Garcia. Sometimes catchy, sometimes rambling, sometimes lost esoterically in a musical tangent that finds them soaring about for close to 8 minutes. And yet at other moments they need but seconds to express themselves ("Yeah" is about 3). Wild, and very nice. Check out "50 Million Year Trip (Downside Up)", "Caterpillar March", "Green Machine", "Thong Song", "Freedom Run", "Writhe" or "Mondo Generator" for a taste of Kyuss' raw potential realized even further.

"Utopia Death, Banished", Napalm Relativity/Earache.... Undoubtedly one of the most extreme

bands around, Napalm Death has been grinding out a ferocious profusion of speedcore since their formation in the '80s. And throughout the band's turbulent yet still highly successful rise, its personnel roster has seemed to almost be in a constant state of flux -- having evolved over the years through collaborations that once included Godflesh's Justin Broadrick, Carcass' Bill Steer and



Cathedral's Lee Dorian. And the documentation of this whirlwind history remain still at the fore of the hardcore/metal camps... in the recordings "Scum", "From Enslavement To Obliteration", the "Mentally Murdered" EP, and 1990's "Harmony Corruption" (which featured the more stable lineup that exists today plus one), as well as the tours (including a slot on the New Titans On The Bloc tour). This year's model features Mark



Encino Man, Soundtrack (Various), Hollywood.... Soundtracks have been making quite the splash across the board at radio lately. A trend started just a couple years ago really, but look at the huge successes of Wayne's World, Bill & Ted and now Encino Man (plus the Singles Soundtrack is yet to come and destined to be huge). As for Encino, however... itsa rockin' in a big way. Led on the metal side by the Vince Neil track "You're Invited..." which at press time was still gaining ground at KNAC, WHVY, Z-ROCK, KISW, KLBJ, WAPI, KSAQ, KZRX and WVVX. Of course now the Scatterbrain cover of L.L. Cool J's "Mama Said Knock You Out" is driving the album even further up the charts with new adds at KLBJ, KNGX and WPSC, plus strong airplay action at CFOX, WMMR, WSOU, KIOZ, WHMH and WKPX (with previous adds still to turn around at KZAK, WEOS, WFCS, WLRA, WQNY, WGIR, WXDR and WZMB). The full CD is spinning as well at KDJK, WAPI, KCLB, WGIR, KEYJ, WLFR and WXDR. All this resulting in a whopping 31-18* on Hard Hitters.

Thought Industry, "Songs For Insects", Metal Blade,... I've got a feeling the folks over at Metal Blade are getting pretty stoked about this band even more than ever now. #1 Most Added their first week out, over some serious competition, on the road with Skinny Puppy (Godflesh had to drop off the tour) and the subject of immense quantities of raves from metal heads far and wide. Bizarre sonic expressionists, the members of Thought Industry offer a progressive grind the kind of which we've grown to miss here on the hard side. Yeah, the grunge bands are great, yeah melody is awesome and heavy Sabbathy riffs rule, but here's something so completely off the wall, it challenges the trends rather than follows them. And how awesome is that? No wonder that it continued to pick up adds this week at WBNY and WHJY, increases at KWUR, WPSC and WRFL, and super strong support from the likes of KIOZ, CFOX, WFIT, WKNC, WKNH, WSMU, WSOU, WVCR, KMSA, WCWP, WHMH, WJUL, WPSU and WQNY (the previous adds yet to turn around include KNGX, KSJS, KUCI, KUNV, KZAK, WAIF, WFCS, WKDU, WLFR, WNYE, WRIU, WRLC, WVBR, WVVX, WWSP, WXCI, WXDR and WZMB). 41-34* on Hard Hitters. 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Music Now!

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A High Court in London has banned an anti-nuclear protest rally that was due to feature a performance by U2. British Nuclear Fuels Ltd., successfully sought the injunction because of fear that thousands of people would join in the protest. The company, which owns a new nuclear reprocessing plant scheduled to open in 1993, had approved a small protest, but when they learned that U2 would be there they withdrew their permission. The High Court injunction bans Greenpeace from organizing the event and orders them to publicize that the rally has been canceled. U2 plans to donate proceeds of a June 19 "Stop Sellafield" concert to the cause. **Public Enemy, Kraftwerk and Big Audio Dynamite II** were also on the bill for that show in Manchester, England.

Black Sabbath begin a reunion tour of the U.S. in Miami on July 24, with Love/Hate opening. The tour comes following the release of the band's "Dehumanizer" album, which reunits Terry "Geezer" Butler, Ronnie James Dio, Tony Iommi and Vinny Appice.

Paul McCartney spent his 50th birthday working on a new album at his country farm in southern England. "He is not quietly at home, he is loudly in the studio with his band playing rock music," said a spokesman. "He will go into his studio today and plug in his guitar just like he has been doing every day recently. If he is going to tour after the record is finished, as planned, he will be playing those songs for the next year, so they have to be good." McCartney's new album will be the 23rd since the Beatles broke up.

Politicians may not have been able to agree on much at the Earth Summit in Brazil recently, but a number of musical acts have gotten together to raise money and awareness of environmental issues. "Earthwise" is the official album of the United Nations Conference, and it includes contributions from Paul McCartney, Seal, Paul Simon, R.E.M., Queen and many others. All profits from the album go to the Earth Love Fund, for distribution to environmental charities.

A compilation benefit album coming out soon in Britain will celebrate the 40th anniversary of weekly music newspaper New Musical Express. A variety of acts are recording exclusive songs for the album, including David Bowie, Sinead O'Connor, Carter The USM, Boy George and Tori Amos. Previous NME compilation albums have raised over \$1.3 million for charity.

June 28 is National Music Day in Britain, which will feature 1,500 performances by amateur and professional bands. Mick Jagger helped organize the event after hearing of a similar event in France. Prince is playing in Scotland, while Elton John and Eric Clapton play in London.

Kenny Loggins is taking an environmental tack on his current tour. At each of Loggins' concert, an environmental group called Global Action Plan is offering a "Household Ecoteam Workbook" as well as other merchandise. Loggins is also lending his music to the National Park Service, which is using "Conviction Of The Heart" from Loggins' most recent album, "Leap Of Faith," as the theme for a motivational film for National Parks visitors and employees.

The Cure, the Levellers, the Farm, Tori Amos and Alison Moyet will play a benefit concert for Oxfam at Eastnor Castle in Britain on September 5.

Lemon Grass, a new group formed by former Waterboys and World Party keyboardist Guy Chambers, has finished recording its debut album for a new British record label formed by Mike Ede of the Mock Turtles.

Def Leppard's "Adrenalize" album has sold three million copies in the first two months of its release, according to the Recording Industry Association of America.

Stephen Stills has received a plaque from the U.S. Information Agency for organizing a free concert in Sofia, Bulgaria in November 1991. The award recognizes Stills for advancing "ideals of democracy and universal concert for the earth." The concert was in association with an exhibit, "Environmental Action in America," sponsored by the USIA. As threatened, the British band Nirvana has filed a lawsuit in Los Angeles Superior Court against the Seattle group of the same name. The lawsuit notes the British group has been around since 1968, while **Kurt Cobain**'s group has only existed since 1987. The complaint asks for a court order blocking Cobain's group from using the name, and seeking compensatory and punitive or treble damages for loss of profits and damage to professional reputation.

Gram Parsons' daughter has filed a lawsuit In Los Angeles Superior Court against former collaborators of the musician, record companies and managers, claiming that they have failed to pay royalties to his estate. The legal action names **Roger McGuinn and Lee Hazlewood**, among others. It also seeks to dissolve the **Byrds** partnership. The lawsuit says that Parsons' estate has received no money from the 1990 "The Byrds Box Set" that includes outtakes from a Byrds album recorded when Parsons was in the band.

Queen Elizabeth has contributed an undisclosed amount to the Liverpool Institute for the Performing Arts that Paul McCartney hopes to establish in Liverpool. McCartney wants to raise \$20 million for a planned opening of the school in September 1995.

The Atlanta-based company that owns the Turtles, Record Bar and Tracks retail stores has decided not to sell the **Body** Count album that includes "Cop Killer." Super Club Music Inc., has 300 stores in 19 states. A spokeswoman for the company cited objections that police, local officials and religious groups have about the record.

A lawsuit has been filed in Providence, Rhode Island, by a woman who says **Billy Idol** tried to rape her and burned her with a cigarette during five separate incidents in New York and Los Angeles in 1985. Cheryl Thompson had been dating a member of Idol's band at the time of the attacks. Idol's publicist says the woman is "obviously a very troubled young lady. It's one of those cases where she pulled facts from a number of printed articles and conjured up her own story for money." Thompson says she didn't take any action sooner because she had been threatened by Idol and his associates.

The Louisiana Senate has approved and sent to Governor Edwin Edwards a bill that would make it a crime to sell "dirty" records to minors. Edwards has said he would vote against the bill, which could subject retailers to a six-month jail term of a \$500 fine or both.

There are covers of the Rolling Stones' "Sweet Black Angel" and Kate & Anna McGarrigle's "Heartbeats Accelerating" on the new album from Jamaican reggae duo the Wailing Souls (on Chaos/Columbia Records).

The Northern Pikes will record a new album this summer in studios in Los Angeles, Toronto and Boston. The group hopes to have the album out before the end of the year.

The Pursuit Of Happiness have just about completed a new album with producer Ed Stasium. Todd Rundgren appears on the album.

The Rebel Pebbles have an EP, recorded live at Hollywood High, coming out soon. It's the first recording from the band to feature the group's new bass guitarist and vocalist, Margaret Ford, a former member of west coast bands Passion and Aural Canvas.

Even though he's currently without a record label, Randy Bachman, formerly of Bachman-Turner Overdrive, has finished a solo album recorded in Vancouver with producer Chris Wardman.

The album that Canadian singer Mae Moore recorded in Australia with Steve Kilbey of the Church will be called "Bohemia" and will be out in the fall.

Ozzy Osbourne has recorded some fresh material in Los Angeles for inclusion on the live album planned from Osbourne's current "No More Tours Tour." Osbourne decided to go into the studio with bandmates Zakk Wylde, Randy Castillo and Michael Inez to lay down some songs he'd written while touring earlier this year.

"Native Tongue" is the working title for Poison's next album, which the band begins recording in July in Los Angeles with producer Richie Zito. The LP should be out in January.

John Hampton has finished mixing a new album for Robert Cray at Ardent Studios in Memphis.

Dwight Yoakam was joined by Little Village member Ry Cooder when he played a benefit concert for the Gene Autry Museum in Los Angeles saluting singing cowboys like Autry, Roy Rogers, Dale Evans and Rex Allen. About 4,000 people attended the show on the lawn near the museum in Griffith Park. Emmylou Harris and Clint Black were also on the bill.

Renegade Soundwave are working on their third album for release in the fall.

Non-Fiction will have a new album out in late August (on Grand Slamm/IRS Records) called "In The Know." It's the follow-up to their "Preface" LP.

The Catherine Wheel are splitting up citing "musical differences," after releasing their debut EP.

A double-CD of "Emerson Lake & Palmer -- The Atlantic Years" is being released in mid-July. The two and a half hours of music has been remastered and includes Greg Lake's original solo version of "I Believe In Father Christmas," which had previously only been available as a 7-inch single and as an ELP track on the "Works" collection.

Ryuichi Sakamoto has a new album called "Heartbeat" coming out in July, featuring Super DJ Dmitry and Jungle DJ Towa Towa from Deee-Lite, African musician Youssou N'Dour, Ingrid Chavez, David Sylvian, John Cage and Arto Lindsay of Ambitious Lovers. Sakamoto will perform at the World Expo in Seville, Spain in mid-July, and he's writing a song for the World Paralympics in Barcelona, Spain in September.

Jellyfish are still looking for a new guitarist, as they begin working on their next album for release this fall.

Right Said Fred are shooting a six-page fashion spread for "Mademoiselle" magazine with model Stephanie Seymour.

Guitarist Dave Hole recently toured with Gary Moore in Europe. Hole's latest album (on Alligator Records) is "Short Fuse Blues."

Widespread Panic, Col. Bruce Hampton & The Aquarium Rescue Unit, Spin Doctors and Blues Traveler are going on the road together this summer for a H.O.R.D.E. Tour --Horizons Of Rock Developing Everywhere. Bela Fleck & The Flecktones and Phish are also playing on some of the dates.

The Leslie Spit Treeo has recorded a new album in Memphis with producer Joe Hardy. The album, "Book Of Rejection" is described by Hardy as being "edgy folk-based rock." Lead singer Laura Hubert says the LP is about "the idea of rejection and how you've got to take your bruises and keep going."

Marc Scully has been named the new bass player for Ratcat. He was formerly with MX Warheads, a Sydney punk band, and was also in Deadly Hume and Nick Barker & The Reptiles. The band is working on a new album.

Bernie Bremond, former sax player for Johnny Diesel & The Injectors, is putting a new band together. Bremond has recorded three songs described as "more soul inspired than the old Injectors."

Three songs recorded by Crowded House with Roger McGuinn appear on the Australian CD single of Crowded House's "I Feel Possessed." The tracks were recorded when the musicians performed in California under the name Byrdhouse.

Rick Springfield is to star in a new hour-long television series (on ABC-TV) beginning in late July. In the program "Human Target," Springfield will play Christopher Chance, a man who impersonates people who are in danger. Animal Bag are recording their debut album (for Stardog/Mercury Records) with producer Guy Charbonneay, who has worked with the Grateful Dead and Rush.

Bernard Besman and his music publishing company has filed a \$5 million lawsuit against ZZ Top, claiming that the guitar riff in the 1973 hit "LaGrange" was taken from one used in "Boogie Chillun," a hit for John Lee Hooker, which he co-wrote.

Bobby McFerrin will perform the main theme for the new "The Son of the Pink Panther" film.

Natalie Cole has filed for divorce from her husband, Andrew Fisher, citing "irreconcilable differences." The couple separated earlier this month. Fisher produced half of the songs on Cole's most recent "Unforgettable" album.

Paula Abdul has been released from a Houston hospital where she received what was described as "routine" treatment for influenza. Abdul had to cancel concerts in Houston and Oklahoma City after suffering from intestinal flu and dehydration.

A U.S. District Court Judge in Washington has heard oral arguments in James Brown's \$3 million copyright lawsuit against the producers of the film "The Commitments." Brown objected to usage of his performance on the 1965 "TAMI Show" in the movie, but attorneys representing the film company say Brown doesn't own rights to the footage. Brown also says he should have the right to publicize his own name and persona and the filmmakers never sought his consent.

k.d. lang has canceled a performance in Owen Sound, Ontario, because beef farmers planned to use trucks and farm equipment to block access to the venue where she was going to play. The ranchers are still upset that lang appeared in anti-meat television advertisements for People for the Ethical Treatment of Animals.

The **Red Hot** Chili **Peppers** have narrowed the search for a new guitarist down to three candidates.

John Mellencamp is giving a free concert July 4 for people who attend one of his other concerts that same week. "The people of Indiana have supported me from the beginning, and if I wasn't playing there July 4th, I'd be in Indiana just the same, at home in Bloomington with my family," Mellencamp says. Mellencamp's concert will be broadcast live (on ABC-TV).

Trial dates have been set for July for four music stores in Omaha, Nebraska charged with selling copies of 2 Live Crew's "Sports Weekend" album to minors.

Forty people were arrested, mostly on drug charges, as the Grateful Dead played two sold-out concerts in Albany, New York.

Andrew Lloyd-Webber, composer of the musicals "Jesus Christ Superstar" and "Cats," has been awarded a knight bachelor for service to the arts by Queen Elizabeth in London. Fashion designer Vivienne Westwood, who was one of those behind the punk music fashions of the 1970s, was awarded an Order of the British Empire.

INXS release their next album in early August, called "Welcome To Wherever You Are." The first single, "Heaven Sent," is just out.

Former Ratt member Stephen Pearcy will take his new group, Taboo, into the studio this summer, to record an album for fall release. Former Cinderella drummer Fred Coury and lead guitarist Johnny Angel are part of the band, though the rest of the line-up has not yet been announced. The band has already written about 20 songs for possible inclusion on the debut LP.

Alice Cooper begins recording a new album in September, working with Zodiac Mindwarp, who wrote Cooper's "Feed My Frankenstein" on the "Wayne's World" soundtrack. "I really like the way Zodiac write," Cooper says. "And I'm gonna be writing with loads of people for the album. I believe you should write 50 songs before you even think about recording. I'd say I've got about four songs finished so far." The Washington Music Industry Coalition says it will join with the American Civil Liberties Union and the Recording Industry Association of America in filing a lawsuit to overturn a new Washington state law which makes it illegal to sell "erotic" material to minors. "This law sends the wrong message to the rest of the country," says Hillary Rosen, RIAA executive vice president. "I just think it generally sets a very bad precedent," adds **R.E.M.** lead singer Michael Stipe. "I don't think the government is a very good baby-sitter. They obviously have bad taste in music." Stipe says the last two R.E.M. albums could be considered erotic "by a judge with a good ear." Under the law, a judge can rule certain recordings should be labeled "adults only," and retailers who decline to label them could be sentenced to six months in prison and fined up to \$500 for a first offense.

A stage collapsed in heavy rain in Milan, Italy, just after Sting and Elton John had performed a duet. The marquee at the Castle of the Sforzas broke down just as an AIDS benefit concert was ending.

Bill Clinton's appearance on Arsenio Hall's program didn't get good reviews from some jazz musicians who saw it. "He played like a politician because everything was confusing," jazz saxophonist Stanley Turrentine told Entertainment Weekly magazine. "You couldn't tell one note from the other. 'Heartbreak Hotel' was better because the band drowned him out." In the same article, Jimmy Heath said "at least he has a concept of the way music should sound. I admire his courage for exposing himself."

Body Count's "Cop Killer" is drawing heat from police and politicians in Alabama and Texas. Alabama Governor Guy Hunt has called on record stores to stop selling the Body Count album because of the song "Cop Killer." Among the lyrics are "die, pig die," and, "I'm 'bout to kill me something. A pig stopped me for nothing. Cop killer -- it's better you than me." Hunt was joined by over 20 Alabama law enforcement officers as he criticized the record at a news conference. "It's the lowest level of people who would put this on the store shelves of the state," Hunt says, saying the song "advocates genocide, the obliteration of a group of people just because they are police officers." Meanwhile, Texas police groups are urging a boycott of all Time-Warner products, since the record was released by one of their labels. "We must separate the almighty dollar from things that advocate murder," says Glenn White of the Dallas Police Association.

Chuck Berry is asking for a federal court to consider civil lawsuits filed against him for allegedly videotaping women in the restroom of his restaurant near St. Louis. Attorney Richard Schwartz says state courts have been biased against Berry. "The question is whether an economic lynching is being carried out against him in state court that qualifies for removal to federal court," Schwartz says. "Chuck Berry has been maligned and mistreated and subjected to totally bogus felony charges. We've uncovered a far-reaching ring of lawyers, investigators and judges who are related to people who claim their privacy was invaded." Ten million dollars worth of civil lawsuit have been filed over the videotaping, which restaurant managers say took place because they believed workers were smoking marijuana in the bathroom.

Guns N' Roses canceled a sold-out show in Manchester, England, just after their concert in Paris, because lead singer W. Axl Rose was suffering from exhaustion. At the Paris show, Rose called Warren Beatty a "cheap punk" and "an old man who likes to live vicariously through young people and suck up all their life because he has none of his own."

A prosecutor is threatening to arrest W. Axl Rose at a Guns N' Roses concert scheduled for August 2 in Columbia, South Carolina. Circuit Court Solicitor Dick Harpootlian says he'll serve Rose with a warrant as a fugitive from justice "the minute he sets foot in South Carolina." Rose is wanted in St. Louis on charges stemming from a disturbance at a GN'R show in July 1991. Rose's record label says he plans to surrender on the charges.

Michael Jackson has chartered a Russian An-124 jet to carry his equipment and stage to London for the European portion of his "Dangerous" tour. It'll take two days to load the plane, which is one of the largest cargo carriers in the world and has a wing span of 240 feet.

The Isley Brothers have filed a lawsuit against Michael Bolton claiming his "Love Is A Wonderful Thing" is actually their 1964 song of the same name. "The song he claims is his has the same title, the same hook, the same chorus, the same everything," says lead singer Ronald Isley. Isley wants Bolton to return two recent songwriting awards he received for the song.

A judge in Los Angeles has dismissed a \$25 million lawsuit against Rod Stewart filed by model Kelly Emberg. Emberg says Stewart promised continued financial support for her now 4-year- old boy by Stewart.

The McNutt family of Tulsa, Oklahoma, has filed a \$2.068 million lawsuit against Van Halen, claiming they received obscene and threatening phone calls and were subject to vandalism after their phone number appeared in a photograph in the artwork to the band's "For Unlawful Carnal Knowledge" album.

The Tattooed Love Boys have reportedly broken up, following a shortened European tour with Love/Hate. Matti Appleby had been recruited for that tour after vocalist Gary Mielle departed suddenly on the eve of the tour. "There were some not really very good relations within the band, and we had no money," explains drummer Mick Ransome. "We decided to call it a day after numerous line-up changes and lack of interest from all parties, including band members, record companies and managers." Ransome and guitarists Nick Singleton and Chris Danby will continue to work together and have already written about a dozen songs, while looking for a vocalist, bass player and piano player.

Dream Theater have a new album coming out called "Images And Words." The LP is described as "a cross between **Metallica** and Yes," and features the band's new vocalist, **James LaBrie**. "We go way beyond progressive rock," says drummer **Mike Portnoy**. "We have Yes and **Genesis** influences but we also have Metallica and other thrash bands as influences."

James Taylor is playing concerts this summer to increase awareness and membership for the Natural Resources Defense Council, an environmental organization Taylor has supported in the past. "I have always found the work of the NRDC to be inspiring and I hope others will too," Taylor says. "It is important that we all do what we can in our own lives and communities to work toward a safer and healthier environment."

Another Bad Creation, Big Daddy Kane, Naughty By Nature, Cypress Hill and Biz Markie all appear in "The Meteor Man," a comedy being directed by Robert Townsend.

Freddie Jackson has a new album coming out in July (on Capitol Records) called "Time For Love." It includes a cover of "Me And Mrs. Jones" and a cover with D'Atra Hicks that was produced by Richard Marx.

KWS' cover of KC & The Sunshine Band's "Please Don't Go" has been released in the U.S. (on Next Plateau Records) after topping the charts in Britain for five weeks in a row.

Michael Jackson is shipping two tons of clothes to Europe for his "Dangerous" tour dates, which begin later this month in Germany. Two of his outfits are lined with optical fibers and are nine feet tall, another carries 3,000 volts to 36 strobe lights.

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U2 could risk imprisonment on June 20 by demonstrating outside the gates of the Sellafield nuclear reprocessing plant in Cumbria, North England. British Nuclear Fuels, who run the plant are seeking an official ban on a protest rally organised by CORE (Cumbrians Opposed to a Radioactive Environment) and Greenpeace. Last February, British Nuclear Fuels approved plans for a demonstration against the proposed opening of a second nuclear reprocessing plant at the Sellafield site. Subsequently, they have withdrawn this permission, alleging that Greenpeace are planning a massive free pop concert. British Nuclear Fuels are attempting to get a court order banning any gathering. U2, though, remain adamant they will be at Sellafield on June 20. Last week Bono com-mented: "Sellafield 1 would be enough reason to get involved. Everybody should be aware of what Sellafield 2 is about to do to them. It's a kind of experiment British Nuclear Fuels are putting on us." Commenting on British Nuclear Fuels' attempts to stop any public gathering, Bono said: "It would be very irresponsible of them (British Nuclear Fuels), because people are going to turn up. It just means that it won't be as organised. I have to turn up because I've invited people right across Britain, Ireland and Europe. I don't know the numbers. The people that and Europe. I don't know the numbers. The people that make it to Sellafield are going to be very serious and very conscientious protesters. I feel it would be very wrong for U2 not to turn up." A press release from British Nuclear Fuels explaining their action reads: "The company agreed to the request (for the demonstration) on the basis that only a few people would attend, as at CORE's previous demonstration in 1987. It soon became apparent, how-ever, that the event had been taken over by Greenpeace ever, that the event had been taken over by Greenpeace who were promoting it as a free pop concert which would be supported by Irish rock group U2. In addition, Greenpeace asked BNFL to provide an adjoining field for a camp site, wanted a helicopter pad made available and requested standpipes. Then they applied to Copeland Borough Council for an entertainment license, saying that 10,000 people were expected for the event." Greenpeace have denied they attempted to turn the protest into a free pop concert. Speaking to *Melody Maker*, a spokesperson commented: "U2 never said they would play and we never intended putting on a concert. We were asked to apply for an entertainment license by the authorities, although we didn't know why and objected to the fact." On Greenpeace's request for a helicopter pad and a field for camping, the same spokesperson said: "We didn't know how many people to expect, but we thought it was sensible to plan on the basis that there would be a huge number of people worried about the nuclear issue. Those people happen to include U2. They are Irish. Sellafield's pollution reaches well beyond the shores of this country. The Irish coast is contaminated with radioactivity from Sellafield. U2 have been making it clear for a number of years that they are as concerned as all the other people in Ireland who have been making their objections known. They wanted to join us and help us with this campaign against reprocessing." Talking about the Irish objections to the plant, U2's **The Edge** told the *New Musical Express*: "One of the other reasons why U2 are so interested in Sellafield is because it is in our back garden. There's a particular school in Dundalk where a lot of the girls have left and had Down's Syndrome babies. Over the years, time and time again, the finger gets pointed across the water. And the idea that this new plant would open up and increase emissions by 1000 per cent is completely outrageous." U2 will play a concert at Manchester G-Mex on June 19 with Kraftwerk, Public Enemy, and BAD II to raise funds for the comparison against a second nuclear reprocessing plant the campaign against a second nuclear reprocessing plant at Sellafield. On a lighter note, U2 were joined on stage by ABBA's Bjorn Ulvaeus and Benny Anderson in Stock-holm last week. The duo helped U2 on a version of ABBA'S "Dancing Queen".

London's alternative music station XFM will return to the airwaves in September. In April, the station was granted a 28 day temporary license and its return will be on a similar basis. Last week, station manager Sammy Jacob revealed that to date the station has received over 2000 cards and letters of support. A spokesperson from RSGB also gave the results of research the company carried out for XFM to determine the level of awareness about the station. A poll of 226 15-24 year-olds in the North London area (although XFM's signal carries slightly further, this is its target area) revealed that 20 percent of those questioned were aware of XFM, a result that compares well with far longer established stations. The research also showed that many of those questioned would be regular listeners if the station was to be on-air permanently. Perhaps the most remarkable figure in the research revealed was the number of people who had actually listened to the station within the week they were questioned. Summarized below, XFM's reach within a very small amount of time again compares very favourably to much longer established stations.

Stations listened to in the last seven days:

Capital FM (London top 20/mainstream pop station):49%

Kiss 100 (London soul/dance station):29%

BBC Radio 1 (Nationwide pop station):18%

XFM: 10%

LBC Talkback (London current affairs/talk show)7%

In the long term, XFM is planning to apply for a permanent license when a number of London franchises come up for renewal or replacement next year. Finally, just prior to going off-air last month, the station's listeners voted for their all-time top 20. The results were as follows:

The Cure's show at Eastnor Castle has been cancelled, with organisers left searching for an alternative site. The September 5 fundraiser for Oxfam, which will also feature **The Mission, The Levellers, The Farm** and **Tori Amos**, failed to gain an entertainment license from the local government of Malvern Hill Council. Many local people objected to the event after the recent free festival at nearby Castlemorton Common. Organizers are currently looking at the possibility of holding the concert at an alternative venue and tickets already purchased will be valid for any new location. However, the shift in venue may mean some bands pulling out of the concert. **The Levellers** have already hinted they would be unhappy with a shift to a more conventional venue. Other festival news is that a live album of performances from the *Glastonbury Festival* will be made available two weeks after the event. The album will feature bands from the stage sponsored by the *New Musical Express* and is likely to feature the following: Lush, Ned's Atomic Dustbin, Thousand Yard Stare, The Frank And Walters, The Shamen and Spiritualized. The album will be available on mail order via the *New Musical*

Express and all profits will go to Greenpeace. Finally, one of the support acts for the Madness reunion concert at London's Finsbury Park on August 8 has been confirmed. The Ska Heroes will be joined by Fabulous (who are currently in the studio with producer Pete Waterman). There are also strong rumours that The Farm, The Brand New Heavies and Kevin Rowland has put together a new band for the show and will preview material from a forthcoming album.

The Farm have signed a deal which takes them from the independent Produce to Sony. Reports suggest that Sony may have given the band as much as one million pounds for a five-album deal covering all of the world with the exception of the USA where the band will continue their current deal with Sire. The first fruit of the new alliance comes in the form of a single released on June 22: "Rising Sun" b/w "Creepers".

A report in *Melody Maker* says that **Captain America** may change their name in advance of a major deal. The band, who are fronted by former **Vaselines** singer Eugene Kelly, are said to be considering changing their name to Eugenius on the advice of various major labels. Elsewhere, Kelly has been invited to write songs with Kurt Cobain when Captain America go to the USA for the New Music Seminar.
