New Releases

The Hooters, Out Of Body, MCA

Last week, MCA, Cornerstone Management and The Hooters



induced an *Qut Of Body* experience in the form of a raging release party in Philadelphia. In addition to the industry usuals (and later, the public), The Chestnut Cabaret was filled with the sights and sound of new Hooters music. Cuts from the album were experienced on video, on cassette and on stage. What we heard

was energetic and wonderful, with Rob Hyman, Eric Bazilian, David Uosikkinen, John Lilley, Fran Smith, Jr., and the new blood of Mindy Jostyn on violin (et al). Out Of Body begins with a quick-paced first single, which grabbed a Hard Debut of 79* this week. The Hooters have been busy with this album, taking their time in the "City of Brotherly Love", putting it together with just the right stuff. The colorful LP has something for everyone, making the unusually lengthy wait worthwhile. An Irish twist with violin, mandolin, a hooter (and all the Hooter usuals) are present and perfected on this project. It is obvious the band is very proud of the work they have done and very eager to get on the road again. Check "Great Big American Car" for straight ahead frivolity, "Dancing On The Edge" for a slower, deeper, rock groove and "Private Emotion", just a few of the choice cuts to taste.

Aimee Mann, Whatever, Imago

Though highly exposed on MTV and best known for "Voices



Carry", a 1985 top 10 hit (and Everything's Different Now on Epic), former 'Til Tuesday lead, Aimee Mann has been quiet on the recent rock scene. Emerging with her Imago solo debut Whatever, Mann has created a lyrical masterpiece, and shines through as a brilliant and true 90's songwriter. Aimee's passionate

lyrics are her forte, though her voice rivals the best (Ann Wilson, Joan Baez, Pat Benatar, Shawn Colvin). "I Should've Known" has already been received with eager arms at AOR (75-59* this week) and moves toward the top with speed. Which reminds me...try "Put Me On Top", where Aimee pokes fun at Ric, a Crush Velvet friend who's arrogance is painfully obvious). The album is very introspective, bearing all and spilling over with honesty and an insightful, sometimes humorous outlook. Whatever is a stripped-down album of pure story-telling bliss, approached with a rock charm that only Aimee can add. "Stupid Thing", "Jacob Marley's Chain" and "Could've Been Anyone" are cuts you should be sure to try at first glance.

Brother Cane, "Got No Shame", Virgin.... Jeffrey Naumann sent me this advance a few weeks ago and I just can't shake it. More than



that I don't want to. It rocks my usually metal tinted world. This is your wake-up call people. You want unpretentious roots rock. You want strong principles, integrity, a grasp on reality and a fresh cutting edge (not to mention hooks and harmonicas). Virgin have been offering just that to you. Alabama's Brother Cane (Damon Johnson, Roman

Glick, Glenn Maxey and Scott Collier) are the real deal. They create homegrown rock, flavored with deep rooted influences, heightened by a youthful '90s energy. And "Got No Shame" is only the tip of the proverbial iceberg. F.Y.I. the album's blisteringly honest and sincere; loaded to the hilt with hit songs (due out May 18th). Not necessarily just for nighttime airplay, "Got No Shame" is an easy choice. Just ask WKDF's John Nagarya who's flipping over them. As he testified, "It's been a real long time since a baby band got me this jazzed. Hell, I haven't been this excited about a record in the seven years that I've worked here! You will be eating someone else's dust if you ignore this band!" Nuff said. Already on KAZY, KRXQ, WBTZ, WXZL and WRZK.

Monster Magnet, "Twin Earth", A&M.... From the minute you get a whiff of "Twin Earths" massive opening, groove-induced kick (which is



not unlike Led Zep's "Rock & Roll"), you know you're in for a helluva ride. Conjuring up a psychedelic windstorm of grungy wah-wah guitar, across a low riding blues bed, Monster Magnet are a cerebral kick in the shorts (the sitar in the middle's a unique touch as well). Already leaning heavily into the metal charts (4* on Hard Hitters/#6 Most Requested), the base couldn't be

better for crossover to COR. In fact, a half dozen of you have already latched on (WHMH, WKLL, KRXQ, KNAC, KRXQ, WBTZ, WRZX—who have top phones). The song represents a harder side of what bands like Raging Slab are also offering, so crank it why don't you....

Circus Of Power, "Mama Tequila", Columbia.... A-ha! We mentioned this band in this section a couple of weeks ago, and here at last the

official single for COR/AOR radio comes swaggering. It's via the blues-belting of L.A. based, by way New York City, Circus Of Power. Having established their street smart brand of gritty rock at metal radio, over the course of a few albums (the current one being their most successful—they topped out at 5*), the band now hope to break through to the mainstream side of the



fence. Deservedly so, since "Manna Tequila" sports all the right hooks, plenty of slippery slide guitar, a memorable chorus and bootloads of attitude. Your AWOL if you're not on it. Those already in the know include KAZY, KRXQ, WBTZ, WXZL and WRZK. In fact, KAZY's Loid Todd commented that, "We've been on "Manna Tequila" from Circus of Power for awhile and it really sounds cool. Great phone action from the core, too…". Hmmm.

UP AND COMERS

The Fluid, "7/14", Hollywood.... The label is still just in the process of



working this, the first single from this band of Colorado natives, to metal and alternative. In fact, the album release is a week or two away, but they had no problem with my making you aware of them. The Fluid find their roots in punk rock, but have a much more timely alternative tinged style ripe for multi-format airplay. The single, "7/14", is a chunky and catchy,

warm and fuzzy (as far as the bass lines) number, complete with a hummable (literally) chorus. It's a sound that's beginning to really work in a rock setting and I believe there are plans to work it to COR in a couple. So, if you want to get the jump on the rest of the gang, snag a copy and you're ready to rumble.

Dog Society, "Test Your Own Eyes", East West.... This record was

apparently released around the 21st of April, so I'm a bit slow out of the chute. Dot "Dotline" Roy at the label was cool enough to send me a copy though and I'm really glad that she did. Nah, it's not for metal, but COR... hmm. Now here's a record they should have few qualms about playing. A smooth, guitar driven, song oriented band, Dog Society employ a variety of



styles, but the end result is extremely radio friendly — fringed in heavier guitar chords and only a touch of Alternative flourishes. The multi-layered vocals are also quite appealing. I'd recommend you check out "Blind To The Fact" (kind of like heavier Spin Doctors), "Time To Go" or "Degeneration". "Society Dancer" is a personal fave too, just so you know.

Gruntruck, "Crazy Love", Roadrunner....It's good to see that another



Northwestern band is showing signs of crossover, despite the tendency for there to be a bit of a backlash by now. Gruntruck have been pounding away just as long as some of the big name "successes" we're all so comfortable with calling our own. Naturally, their success is equally deserved, and it's really just starting to happen. The band's second effort enjoyed a per-

fectly good run at metal radio, but now they are finally making some headway with COR. This week they debuted on the chart at 48* with a bit of help from WXZL, KISW, WVCR, KZRX, WBTZ, KNAC and KRXQ. Keep on 'Truckin.

Dream Theater, "Another Day", East West/Atlantic Ah, could there

be a sweeter success than this one. I really doubt it. It truly is heartwarming to see how radio has embraced this hi-tech yet beautiful, progressive outfit. How many singles down the road is this now 2, 3? It doesn't even matter, because you probably all feel confident in exploring the whole album by now. This week, Dream Theater debut at 32* with "Another Day" — a sweeping epic of



a tune, built majestically (they were once called Majesty you know?) around James LaBrie's stunning vocals. On over 16 COR stations already and almost 40 AOR. "Another Day", another success story in the making....

The Hooters, "Out of Body," MCA
The boys from the City of



Brotherly Love have officially thrown their hat into the Triple A ring, and were immediately rewarded with a 45* debut on the chart. Rob Hyman and Eric Bazilian have reinvented The Hooters signature sound, and the addition of vocalist/fiddler Mindy Jostyn is the perfect complement to the band. KSPN's Steve Cole commented, "This is a great record. I immediately added 'Twenty-five Hours A Day,' into It's the spirit of '93. You can't help but get up and dance the studie when you're playing the people It's an air man

around the studio when you're playing the record. It's an air mandolin song." KFOG's Rosalie Howarth added, "The Hooters sound as bright as ever. Mindy's vocals enhance the band as if she's always been with them. Well-crafted, uplifting tunes."

Tom Kell, "The Chapel," Vanguard "My songs paint pictures of what I see on a daily level and are heavily

influenced by the Eagles and other songwriters from California," explains Tom Kell in his bio. While there is definitely a Don Henley/Glen Frey feel to his music, it is a very contemporary sound that is uniquely his own. Kell's debut album for Vanguard, Angeltown, includes several songs for the Triple A format,

The Hard Interview

By Bill Hard

THE GOSPEL ACCORDING TO ST. JOHN

Pat got his start in radio at his high school's ten watt FM in Detroit's Southfield suburb. Two weeks after graduation, the kid with the big pipes went to work at W4, which at the time was McLendon Beautiful Music. Like anyone who ran automation, Pat spent a good part of his shift making tapes for Motown's major Top 40 station, CKLW. That wish came true, thanks to the legendary late Jim O'Brien, who put Pat on the board for three DJ shows a week, combined with two days of driving the CK Camaro around for news actualities, along with a one day a week news shift. After a stint at crosstown WKNR ("Keener"), Pat segged to seminal ABC-FM WRIF in early '72. Then, in April of '73, it was off to ABC's franchise AOR facility, WPLJ/NYC. In a town where many have tried and died, Pat now celebrates 20 years of surfing the big rock radio wave in the number one market. The kid who first stepped up to the counter with 89 cents for "Great Balls of Fire" has obviously done a fine job of staying close to that rock and roll flame...

Over the past week and a half, you've had Robert Plant by the radio station, Rod Stewart, Ronnie Wood, and Tina Turner, who sat in with you.
WNEW-FM was involved with the Tommy on Broadway premiere, did the Tull live broadcast, had Paul Rodgers live from Electric Ladyland....

PAT: It started about 10 days ago with Marc Cohn. He brought by some tracks from the upcoming album. Then, chronologically, it was Tull from the Lonestar Roadhouse—with the full

band, which
was fabulous. Everybody that was there
was just nuts about it. Then, Robert Plant
spent about an hour with Carol Miller and
played guitar. Then, Rod Stewart brought
Ronnie Wood by. That was a crazy hour.
And, yes, I had Tina Turner on my show.
We did also Paul Rodgers from Electric
Ladyland, and Scott has Bryan Ferry
coming by this afternoon.

Obviously, you're aware that these sorts of things don't happen everyday at most radio stations.

PAT: Right.

Must be a fairly heady experience.

PAT: It's pretty neat. It keeps ya hoppin', but it makes for good radio. And it's a lot of fun. I don't come to work everyday thinking, 'Wow, this is New York...' I just don't think about it in those terms. It all seems to balance out. Most of the people on the staff here have been doing this for a long time and they realize that

still just a radio station. In other words, we've seen so many of the Rod Stewarts, the Paul McCartneys, the Robert Plants that it's not a question of us not being impressed. It's just that they are human beings. When they come in, they still have to use the John.

WNEW-FM is

Putting those pants on one leg at a time, just like Charles Koppleman, eh?

PAT: And it still comes down to the fact that at this station, they might wind up stepping over racks of reel to reels, or maybe some piles of albums in the challway.

stark place. It looks and feels like a radio station, where there's equipment or whatever. It's got a funky feel to it. There's never a stopwatch on anybody when they come in, and if they feel like doing something off the wall, they can. If there's something they want to talk about, that's okay, too. It's comfortable, and we don't really worry about mistakes or anything like that. When an artist comes here, the first thing we want to do is try and make them feel at home. So, when possible, we try to keep the hallways as clear as we can! We still have people here who want to try to get the autographs and all of that. If we announce that somebody's coming by live, sometimes there'll be a whole big group of people downstairs waiting to catch a glimpse of them, or get their autograph. But we treat our guests as if we were any other radio station, even though it is 'NEW-FM. We don't put on airs or anything like that, because when it comes down to sitting down with Scott Muni,

it's like, 'Hey, how ya doin'? You want a cup of coffee? We're just gonna have fun here.' We don't say, 'This is what we want to talk about. This is what we want to do.' It's obvious that if they've got something going, we'll talk about that. We want to have a good experience, and we want them to have a good experience, so that maybe they'll come back again.

Why is it that L.A. radio stations don't merit that level of Rock and Roll royalty?

PAT: I don't know! Maybe it's the energy in New York. Of course, there are stations there that have been around as long.

Do you think it's a testimony to Scott's pulling power as a thirty-five year icon in the market?

PAT: That's certainly part of it. There's only one Scott Muni. As Paul McCartney remembered, Scott was there when they got off the plane in '64.

Obviously, when these labels trot their big dogs by, they're gonna expect a quicker level of attention when they trot their smaller dogs by. Does that ever cause problems?

PAT: Yes, it's something we work with. There's no formal understanding. It's got to be something that's right and that's comfortable. The labels screen things ahead of time, too. It's hard to bring somebody by who we're not playing. They're not going to ask us to play something that they don't think is right.

Does the fact that your station is a three dollar cab ride away from for the heaviest hitters in the promotion side of the business add to the complexity of your job?

PAT: Well, first of all, there's no such thing as a three dollar cab ride anymore! And while it's true that the labels might have better access to us, we're also in a much better position to find out what's happening first hand. So, yeah, the labels are all a local call away, but we get to hear about all the hottest new bands first. It really works to our benefit.


You're a first time PD in the #1 market. I don't know that that's ever happened before. Is the job basically what you expected so far?

PAT: I've been a disc jockey for a little over 25 years now. To actually be the Program Director, even though I've

always worked with one, involves making so many more decisions than I expected. As far as time management, the fact that I'm also on the air in the middle of the day doesn't help. So, my hours have really lengthened, and of course, I expected that. A PD job is not a four hour job, like being a DJ is in a lot of cases.

What's the best part of the job to you? PAT: I'll let you know when it comes.

Well, this book had to be a pretty nice

PAT: Yes, it's encouraging. I would have liked it to have been higher. I always want to keep that upward direction going. I'm not going to let myself get too satisfied with this book because I know what can happen on the next one. We all know what can happen from month to month. So, the overall tone of this thing in my mind is that, 'Yeah, this was okay, but we're far from done.'

Do you feel somewhat vindicated, though, given the fact that you and the staff are more in control?

PAT: I am trying to have faith in the audience, that they will pick up on the entertainment value of the music and the presentation that's on 'NEW FM. I feel like we, as a staff, have kind of taken control of the radio station around from enough trol of the radio station away from consultants, and I'm hoping that the audience will catch on and will enjoy it; that they'll notice we're not playing the same old thing all the time anymore

And you feel like you definitely went through a period where that was the case?

PAT: Well, I think it was too tight, yes. Obviously, deep cuts was your solution to that problem.

PAT: I knew I had to freshen it up. I think I may have gone a little bit too far with it when I first started off because I did throw in some things that were way too unfamiliar.

I've heard that, yes. At what point did you have a specific point of awakening where you went, 'You know, I've got too much unfamiliar music on the radio.'

PAT: It was probably when I was putting songs in that some of the DJs didn't recognize. Now, we're getting a lot of feedback where people say, 'Oh, I love deep cuts.' Or they're requesting them by name, 'Will you play a deep cut from so and so?' It's starting to catch on. Some people say, 'What is this deep cut business?' Then you have to explain that a deep cut could be a lot of things, but essentially, its number one definition would be lesser known tracks by better known artists. From Fric Clapton it's the known artists. From Eric Clapton, it's the sixth or seventh cut from an album that you never seem to hear, but just sounds great. Sometimes, it's a one hit wonder that has disappeared, but people still remember the song.

'Driver's Seat' by Sniff 'n the Tears — _ what a great song!

PAT: Right. Sniff 'n the Tears, or The Records, something like that. Has deep cuts, in fact, cut into your current quotient?

PAT: No, it just takes the place of another library cut we'd play once that

Is it a jock option item, or does Selector specify the tune?

PAT: It comes up on the log, so it is programmed. But like everything else at the radio station, the jocks do have a screen and a mouse in there, so they are allowed to make changes. They can change the *deep cut*. They can change just about any category of any song. How do you come up with these tracks?

PAT: Actually, everybody has input. They give me their lists, and if I don't recognize something, I'll listen to it and we decide whether it's a good rockin' tune. Some of them don't make it, but I keep a constant log, too. When I hear something, I write it down and then add it into the rotation. I've gotten it to a point where there are so many in that category, that they don't come around category, that they don't come around that often.

The 'WNEW Twenty Year Club' has been much discussed. I know it's been a source of frustration to some people who've programmed there. For instance, Dave Logan. I know Dave felt at times that the staff was an immovable object which made it exceedingly difficult to get things done.

PAT: I think the problem there was that Dave wanted to be his own man, but he Dave wanted to be his own man, but he had Ted who was, at that point, the General Manager, but very much a Program Director. We, as jocks, would know what he'd want. If Logan was in the middle telling us something different, and trying to do it his way when he still had to answer to Ted, it made for an uncomfortable situation. Then, if Ted was answering to somebody else, it was

Even more convoluted.

PAT: Yes. So, now it's changed. Kevin Smith took over. He said, 'I'm not a musicologist. I'm going to find somebody who knows music and programming and who knows where the staff is coming from.' He zeroed in on me and offered from.' He zeroed in on me and offered me the gig when I wasn't really going for

Maybe Kevin decided he'd better pick one of the officers of the Club?

of the officers of the Club?

PAT: That's probably not a bad way to look at it. It does make some sense. But I also think his decision was music based, in that I'm a music guy. I'm also in there, and I've got the experience, and I'm doing this everyday, so I'm very familiar with what goes on in the studio and I'm doing it. I'm one of them. Kevin knew my philosophy wasn't the, 'Let me make my art, get off my back!' freeform thing. But as years go on, why should there be only 800 tunes in the library? Why is that? When songs are constantly coming out, why does something all of a sudden have to drop out? Why do we have to hear 'Roundabout' again and again? This radio station wasn't built on that. The Doobie Brothers did a lot more than Doobie Brothers did a lot more than 'China Grove.' They did 'Pursuit On 53rd Street.' People bought the albums and they remember them, so hit 'em with some depth once in awhile. The oldies

should be fresh, just like the new stuff should be fresh. It's just an approach of keeping the station interesting so that you don't know what is going to come up every time.

There are those who argue that using new —or old —unfamiliar tracks is flirting with disaster.

PAT: There's a lot of gut involved, which, in a lot of people's minds, is not the way to run a radio station. This is the flagship of the Group W radio stations. I do look at research. I do take everything into account, but to me, it still boils down to what I do as a living as a disc jockey. I just want to be a friendly guy on the radio who knows music and plays great music on the radio.

It doesn't have to be more complicated than that.

PAT: I am taking chances. And don't think I'm not aware of that when I play a track that a large part of the audience might not know. Particularly, when you punch over to K-Rock and every song that they're playing is a tested, familiar, winning hit. It's 'Ramblin' Man,' it's 'Comfortably Numb,' it's 'Light My 'Comfortably Numb,' it's 'Light My
Fire,' it's non-stop winning stuff. They
play great music over there, but it's just
not the only music. I'll play 'Maggie
McGill' from the Doors, because I really
believe that people want to hear that stuff.
If I give them a taste of that and I do it
consistently, they will get surprised. It's
the surprise element that people have
been missing from their radios that is
making WNEW-FM interesting. The
Two For Tuesday had gotten so predictable that if you heard 'Jessica' by the
Allman Brothers, you knew 'Ramblin'
Man' was next. And I'm not even talking
about a radio guy, I think that the people
were picking up on that. I try to give the
audience the benefit of the doubt that they
are into music and that they want to be are into music and that they want to be

Since you are a 'music guy,' do you find it tough to divorce yourself from your personal taste in terms of your programming decisions? For instance, you're playing 'Plush' from Stone Temple Pilots, but Atlantic could never get you into 'Sex Type Time.' Type Thing.

PAT: Yes, it's something that I have to deal with. But we are a classic rock based radio station, so I have to worry about tuneout. 'Plush' is more accessible to the classic rock audience. It's what I look for on any new music. Does it have classic rock potential? classic rock potential?

In other words, is this library material?

PAT: Right. Will it be accepted by the audience? For instance, I thought some of the Alice In Chains things were just too loud. They were over that line of too loud and too hard for this audience. But when the current record came out, it was like, 'Well, what about this one? 'Rooster' isn't too hard.' That, to me, went too far the other way, so I'm not playing that. To me, that's too dirgey.

What's Music Director Lorraine Caruso's role? Is she in a position there where if a record is important

PAT: Then she let's me know the partic-PAT: Then she let's me know the particulars. She's really good with dealing with all the record guys, and she's great when it comes to booking concerts and getting artist interviews and all of that. As far as keeping on top of the music with what's hot and what's not, she's terrific at sorting out the priorities. I'd also like to mention my program coordinator Amy Winslow, who also is invaluable to me. They're both great people.

How has your relationship with Scott changed since you've become Program Director?

PAT: My relationship with Scott has always been terrific. I'm not sure why we had such a good rapport because we were on opposite each other for 14 and 1/2

And a number of those years, I believe, you had better ratings. You spanked that

bad boy!

PAT: But we always had a rapport when we would meet at these record company functions or whatever. We were always cordial. And we seem to be on the same page with the direction of this radio sta-

He's happy with what you're doing?

PAT: Yes, I believe he is. And you know why? 'Cause he's a music guy. The relationship since I've become the Program Director has only gotten better, in my opinion, because if the music is right, then Scott doesn't have a lot to complain about.

(Laughs) That's good!

PAT: And he's not doing a lot of complaining now.

In terms of your personal preferences, what do you gravitate toward at home?

PAT: Donald Fagen, the Nightfly album—by the way, I've heard the new album and it's just a mother!!!!

I'm told it's great.

PAT: Unbelievable. I've been waiting for this one for 11 years and it'll be out at the end of the month. It's only 8 songs, but it's still worth it. It's fabulous. I can't wait to play it. I'm telling you, it's conna be mon-

gonna be mon-strous! I'm a big fan of NRBQ and, of course, a lot of that is catalogue stuff because their last couple of albums haven't been any great shakes. Let's see...what else? I never get tired of Johnnie Johnson's 'Johnny Be Bad' album. Ditto Georgie Fame's 'Cool Cat Blues' album. Fabulous!!! I could listen to it over and over

again. 'NEW is in a unique situation in the market; it's getting to be kind of unusual

in that you're not dealing with any kind of upper end or lower end stratifica-

PAT: It is a unique situation, and I'm rying to deal with that situation, and I'm trying to deal with that situation the way i is and to stay true to making WNEW FM comfortable to listen to in the current competitive climate. I want to be the music lover's radio station without trying to pigeonhole us so much into just one thing and only thing at all. That's why you can hear Jerry Lee Lewis and the Lewis Boogie at 9 o'clock at night here. That is possible. That is possible.

Aren't you concerned about blowing off your younger listeners with stuff like that at night?

PAT: At this point, I think it's really hard to please them, so I'm looking at a 25-44 base. It's not a different radio station at night anymore. We used to be that way. I've changed that.

When did you make that change?

PAT: Probably around the first of the

Hmmm. And do you think the book showed dividends?

PAT: Yes, I think so. Some of the philosophy has been that there's nobody over 25 listening after 7 o'clock at night, so you go toward the lower end.

And you ain't buyin' that?

PAT: You go toward an 18-24 base, and what happens is, the 30-year old or 35-year old gets into his car at night and turns

on the radio, and you blow him away. He changes the dial. The next morning, his radio is tuned into a different station. So, I'm trying to play from the same deck of cards on a 24 hour basis. It's like the same thing I found when I came in here and saw a lot of the dayparted records, such as 'Daniel' by Elton John, which couldn't be played at night. I went, 'Well, wait a minute, I want to be more of a full service 24 hour station, so that when you turn it on, you know what to expect as far as type of music or a certain sound and you get that.'

Meanwhile, WRXK has four hours of talk with the Greaseman at night opposite you. Your thoughts on that?

PAT: Boy, I don't know. I just kind of shake my head on that one.

Yeah, I'm kind of puzzled myself. What's your reaction to the show? Does the content offend you at all?

PAT: From time to time, yes, it does. It would seem to me that it would blow off women completely because it's really very juvenile. I think the kids can get a shock out of it, and I think some of them may not even know what he's talking about. He's got his codes for different words but was I'm shocked for the start of words, but, yes, I'm shocked from time to

time at what he's doing. To me, it's just kind of silly, 7th grade humor and I would think it would be very offensive to women. The Greaseman diminishes the specialty act that Howard is because even though they're twelve hours apart, it's like, 'Well, here's another talk show that gets controversial.'

Today was Pat 'Paraquat' Kelley's first day. How'd it go?

PAT: It went well. This is going to be a show that is going to develop over time. I was not looking for him to come out of the gate with both barrels drawn this morning and to be fully into it.

Well, he hasn't been on the air for a while now.

PAT: He has not been on the air for a few years, so he is really itchin'. He is so thrilled about being here. He had worked at KMET, of course, a sister station. There's a number of people that are still around here that remember taking the Fish reports and exchanging news stories with him, when he was out at KMET, so the name was familiar.

He's taken a little flack for the 'Paraquat' handle, hasn't he?

PAT: I have to admit, I've been a little uncomfortable with it myself. It's also a little bit confusing to have two Pat's around the station. When somebody around here said 'Pat,' it always meant

Not only that, but you guys are on back to

back.

PAT: That's a little bit strange. The way I'm looking at it is that once you hear the name 'Paraquat' you never forget it. That could perhaps conjure up a connotation of a wild and wacky morning show, which it's not. I'm very comfortable with the way he sounds. He sounds like he belongs at 'NEW. We thought about trying to come up with a totally different name, but to me, that didn't seem real. It's like when we talk about having the world's largest rock n' roll library, which is part of our handle. We've been using that for the last couple years, and I think the audience was saying, 'Yeah, but why don't you use it?' Now, I feel like we truly are using it. I want to give the people what we say we're delivering. I want to be honest. So, the guy's name is Pat Kelley, he's known as 'Paraquat' and that's what he'll be.

Do you add extra risks to the mix, Pat, by PAT: That's a little bit strange. The

Do you add extra risks to the mix, Pat, by bringing a Californian into New York?

PAT: Yeah, it's something that I'm aware of. There is a small segment of the audience that is going to say, 'Hey, we don't need a Californian.' There's a certain amount of that, but again, it's like, 'Get used to it. Everybody's from somewhere else.' I'm from Detroit. It's a risk that I'm willing to take because I think he's the best

think he's the best guy for the job. Did you consider a number of people?

PAT: Yep.

Any overviews on the state of major market morning talent that crossed your desk?

PAT: Just that it's hard to find somebody for this format, and for this particular radio station because it's so specialized. I found some that were just too wacky. I heard some that were too laid back and not the right mix. I think Paraquat's

humor is perfect. It's more of a Letterman kind of thing. He's into the music. He knows how to edit himself and still be entertaining, and he's got a natural, pleasant voice. I don't think just music is going to get you to the level of Howard Stern type numbers. We've been battling Howard for a long time and in the scheme of things. I think time and in the scheme of things, I think we held our own for a number of years. The television show helped to really make him. That took him to another level. The show turned a lot of people onto the outrageousness of Howard Stern.

Do you hear any difference in WXRK since Tim Sabean got to town?

PAT: I don't know Tim Sabean, and I haven't perceived much of a difference since he's been here, other than they've got a new announcer on the radio station. Somebody today told me that they've got a new promo on the air that apparently is taking shots at our deep cuts. If that's the case, I haven't heard it yet. I haven't heard much different on that radio station other than Greaseman and the new announcer.

You've aired some fairly pointed promos yourself. Have you gotten any feedback?

PAT: It was varied. Some people didn't get it. When we said things like, 'Let's face it, New York radio sucks, we just suck less,' some people got offended. I just thought it was funny. We'd get 'em on and we'd get 'em off.

Well, I have heard it said that K-Rock specializes in recycling a lot of your station's basic ideas and promotions with a 'classic' topspin to them. Do you think that's true?

PAT: Yes, to a certain extent. When I hear things like 'If it's on 'XRK, it's a classic. Count on it.' I don't know what that means. I don't profess to say that every single thing we play is a classic. We're going deeper on some of these things, so everything isn't a classic. I think the word classic itself has been just overworked.

Milked to death.

PAT: To death! What does it mean anymore? Do people go out and ask for a Coca-Cola Classic. Just give me a Coke!!

Right now, goddammit!!

PAT: Coke is a classic. I ask for a Coke. What's it like having a brother, Michael Stevens of Atlantic, in the promotion side of the biz?

PAT: Oh, it's great! I love him. I wish I could see him more often.

Has he ever been in a situation where he was working you?

PAT: No, not really. Although, he's very aware of that part of the business, but we're past that. We are brothers first. I'm sure he has unknowingly gotten me excited about some music that was on his label, but only in the context of us sitting around and playing stuff we were into.

Did you ever work together when he did

PAT: When I left CKLW, I went over to WKNR, and when I was there Mike was carting records and working in produc-tion. He eventually made a tape and was hired at WKNR and was on the air after me. I was on 3 to 7, and he became the 7 to midnight jock on WKNR, which was his first full time gig. Then, Lee Abrams hired me at WRIF in '71. When WKNR became WNIC, Mike came over for nights on 'RIF. In fact, I think he had an nights on 'RIF.' In fact, I think he had an 11 share, coming on after Arthur Penhallow. He was there for 7 years. Mike also worked at 97 Rock in Houston, and KSFX in San Francisco. When that station went news, Gary Stevens offered Mike a job at WAPP here in New York. Mike called me up and said, 'Hey, they've offered me this job at the Apple. They want me to go in afternoons opposite you. What do you think?' I said, 'Hey, man, don't worry about me. You take of yourself. If it's a good gig, take it.' He took it and he was on 'APP.

New York is a tough enough town without

New York is a tough enough town without having to compete with your Bro!

PAT: When he got here, his car was broken into the first night. It was not a great experience. He had a terrible cold. He was only on afternoons for about two weeks and they moved him to middays. He kept asking, 'How am I doing?' The

all said, 'You're perfect. You're perfect. You're perfect!!' Well, there was a 90-day contractual thing or whatever, and on the 87th day, out of nowhere, they let him go. So, Mike did radio for a long time, and he still does some. He does voice work for Atlantic, some of their new releases. He'll do consettes and presente. releases. He'll do cassettes and presenta-

How did you wind up leaving Detroit for New York City?

PAT: I worked with Abrams for a while, until he left for Miami, and I was offered the job at WPLJ from 'RIF, and then came here.

Was it a weird experience to cross the street to WNEW after working 14 years at 'PLJ?

PAT: I had just returned from a week long vacation to WPLJ to do my Sunday shift, and there was a note on the studio door. It was from PD Larry Berger, and it said, 'I'm in my office. Stop by.' I walked in, and Larry said, 'We're buying out your contract, Pat. This is it. This is the end.' So, they essentially canned me that day after a week of vacation. that day after a week of vacation.

Hey, at least you got your vacation!

PAT: True. Although, I found out later that Howard Stern, was on the air saying, 'Yeah, I think St. John's gonna lose his gig,' the previous Friday. I don't how that happened, but I guess it was better that I was totally surprised when I walked into the station. I asked why they were getting rid of me, and Larry said, 'Because you remind people too much of the old 'PLJ, and we've got to get rid of the rock image. We've got to be something completely new.' I had just gotten a bonus and I had the highest ratings on the radio station. radio station.

PAT: I had four or five months left on my contract. I had been doing the Top 40 'PLJ for a number of years at that point. That was up to '87. After being an employee at 'PLJ for fourteen and a half years, I was surprised at my 'Well, okay' reaction. Rock and roll was where my

How did you relate to doing a straight Top 40 thing?

PAT: I related to Top 40 well, for a couple of reasons. I started off at Top 40 at CKLW and WKNR. I grew up listening to Top 40, so I enjoyed that. And when WPLJ was AOR, the rotations were so tight that I was sick of playing 'L.A. Woman,' 'Stairway To Heaven,' and 'Roundabout' over and over again. At least the switch to Top 40 allowed me to play something fresh. play something fresh

Dump the monitors, watch the meters.

PAT: Yeah. All of a sudden, I was talking up records, and I was playing jingles,

and I was running the board. And they were giving me a paycheck, so it was

But you went from being your basic laid back classic rock jock one day to being a Top 40 jock the next day?

PAT: Yeah, as we all did. Carol Miller was there, Tony Pigg, Jimmy Fink — the whole crew. When they changed format they said, 'Well, everybody's gonna stay the same.' I was one of the last ones to go. And the day after I left, Mark Chernoff called me up and said, 'I want you over here.'

Smart move.

PAT: The non compete situation was a problem at first. They said, 'You can go on in three months. You can go on at the end of November.' And they let me do that. In the meantime, during that three months, I did a lot of voice-overs and a lot of auditions, and it worked out fine. I missed being on the radio, but I still got a paycheck for that three months.

Given the rough n' tumble nature of our line of work, your on-air tenure in one of the toughest markets is remarkable.

PAT: I had hoped, when I first moved here, to be here for two years. In my wildest dreams, it was maybe ten years. Now, I've just had my 20th anniversary here on New York radio. It's been good. And I still love it.

What are the high points of the past two decades?

PAT: I would say that most of them have happened at this radio station. Obviously, the high point was actually getting to WNEW FM because even when I was over at 'PLJ, I worked for a Program Director that I really didn't get along with over there for those years.
WNEW was always the station that was wnew was always the station that was more into the music then they were just cold, hard numbers. Business wise, of course, that doesn't always make sense, but it did for Wnew. The station has always had such a spirit. Certainly, a high point was the first time I walked into this radio station knowing that I was being hired here. Obviously, the day that I was offered the Program Director job was another high point. Now, the high points another high point. Now, the high points just keep on comin'. You know, the fact that I'm in a decision-making position here where I can say, 'God, that's a great record. Let's play it!' and, by golly, it's

That's every disc jockey's fantasy.

PAT: It's a total dream. So, I can do it, keeping in mind the aim is to try to have other people share the enthusiasm that I feel with this radio station. But I still feel like the high points are happening. If everyone catches on to what's going on here and the radio station becomes more successful, then that will be my reward.

I've worked all through the Midwest, and Ron's methods were unparalleled. He taught me so much about working in a radio station. It's hard to believe that Quincy, Illinois has a rock radio station, and they owe it all to Ron. We plan on keeping up his standards." Jordan Seaman Resurrects Eugene Triple A It was a dark day for KAVE/Eugene listeners in February when economics forced Jordan Seaman and co-owners to switch the Triple A station to Z-Rock. Three months later, Jordan is bringing the Adult Alternative format back to the market, in the form of public radio station KRVM, which is licensed to the Eugene school district. ock and roll is a tough business. Steve Lukather and Toto have been at it since their high school days in California. Though the death of revered and loved drummer, Jeff Porcaro, could have been a devastating end for the band, Steve shared with me how "getting through the tragedy marks a new path. One where Toto is more in control of our own destiny". Rock radio has never seen Toto's true potential, but with guidance and support from new label, Relativity, they're ready to get down in front of audiences...."to just play!"

I know you have had your difficulties with "the business" in the past. Any thoughts?

Steve: We didn't see eye to eye with people in New York.

What is different about working with Relativity?

Steve: We're still signed to Sony International, but we have this brand new, wonderful relationship with Relativity We've got a great record and we're looking for it to get out of the box now. You know, we've been on rock radio for 10 years!

I've spoken to some radio people recently about your new album, King of Desire and the buzz is great. There seems to be some confusion about the players. Just to set the record straight - was Jeff (Porcaro) able to complete all the drum tracks?

Steve: Yes he was.

This album features him and is dedicated to him.

Steve: Right. He died after we finished this.

Now, you're about to embark on your first US tour in over seven years.

Steve: Yeah, since 1985.

Your official press release says that all performances are dedicated to Jeff. Can you explain what it really means to you?

Steve: He was my best friend and my mentor. He was like our spiritual leader. If there was ever a leader in our group I would have to say it was Jeff. He kept everybody honest. He was very meticulous about things. He wouldn't let shit fly. He was a lot more than....I don't know...it's really hard to say.

I guess that sort of says it all - the fact that you're dedicating the entire tour to his memory.

Steve: Well, we would dedicate anything for him. My life to him. I have a tattoo of one his cartoons on my arms.

What is it?

Steve: (hesitates) It's really way out there. He was a demented man (laughs).

(laughs) Send us a photo! We'll print it with the interview.

Steve: You'll have to see it. It's still healing.

There seems to a lot of excitement about the fact that Toto is planning this tour. Can you feel it?

Steve: It's really a trip for me to actually feel it - we don't know. I mean we know we're starting all over again here in the U.S. We sold millions of records and packed huge out-door arenas all over the world but we're playing clubs in the States. I mean, I really feel we might get a second chance with people this time around. I meet people who still think we're only a studio band. It just so happens that we could read music and we could play and people would hire us. It wasn't our fault that we got that reputation. It just turned into this whole big huge thing. We were just guys that started playing in garages like everybody else did. But nobody wanted to see that, nobody wanted to listen to that. We kept saying "No, we're not just a bunch of studio guys that put a band together.

It's like the band lost control and this thing called Toto began to take on a life of its own.

Steve: There's no doubt about it. At that point, there wasn't a record that didn't come out without one of us playing on it. That was like the early '80s. I've done maybe three sessions in the last two years. I really don't do that anymore nor do I have the desire to do it.

Do you attribute some of Toto's misdirection to factors beyond your control?

Steve: Well, let's face it. The press have been less than kind to us. And you know what? Some of it was right. Some of the work was worthy of being trashed. I'm not saying they're all wrong because a lot of times they nailed it on the head so well that we'd

start laughing and say "Oops, they got us".

Can you be specific?

Steve: You know, just the fact that we were spreading ourselves so thin....we were everywhere.

You weren't focused.

Steve: Honest to God, it did detract from our music. We kept saying it didn't, but it did. It was just you in your own entity....your own project....that's all we were doing. It meant that a 100% of your life was focused on that and consequently, the product would come up dead or less derivative of other things. I mean, our records were slick. Our problem was we knew how to do it all and we could go in there and do it, and at that point we liked making records like that. Now, I like the shit that's out of tune and loose and stuff.

Something that feels more real.

Steve: Yeah. It is real. I hate any music that's made with machine or sequenced. We used technology. Now when we go out live it's all us playing. We take a couple background singers and a progression player to make it sound.....full. I do sing everything on the record. There isn't anybody there that's ghosting me. But I'm sure there will be some critics that'll say "Oh, same ol' slick, total bullshit," for the rest of our lives.

Are you overly worried about that perception?

Steve: Well, there was a big stigma attached to the name. Like I said, we're starting over again. We expect to be met with a lot of brick walls but...

You're just going to work through it.

Steve: We're going to climb over it. If we can have a chance, we'll do it. The problem is that the reason why we haven't been doing the States is because we have gotten into sort of a catch-22. You get no support and you go up there and lose \$100,000 a week and nobody wants to do that. We

don't want to take a half-ass show on the road.

Was that the scenario in the past?

Steve: Bobby Kingly used to sing with us. He used to go around booking himself as Mr. Toto and the guys who play like shit. It was a bad look. So we're going up there (on stage) to redeem ourselves.

When are you leaving for South America?

Steve: May 19th and we'll be in the States June 1st. Yeah. We're going up to do this big club tour, like 1,000 to 2,000 feet clubs and go into the market and meet the radio people and let them know that we're actually real people and we are committed to doing this. They can come see us play and hopefully realize that we're really fucking good band players live. We're not just a bunch of guys that sit around in chairs with hemorrhoids reading music. And we're not a bunch of old men.

Okay, let's get personal. How old are

Steve: I'm 35 years old. I'm not fat. I have all my hair.

Even if you were all those things...Goddamn it... you can play! And you can sing.

Steve: Yeah. It's all real. Some of the fine musicians that you hear - it's not an ego thing. We don't just go out and play the same show every night. We have the ability to play all different kinds of stuff and really stretch

out. We've gone to places and people have said "I had no idea you guys play like that!" 'cause all they remember hearing is "I Bless The Rains Down in Africa."

Right. "Roseanna".

Steve: That was all fine and good. That was on record like 11 years ago. Give me a fuckin' break!

Simon Phillips, you met him in '86 when he was working with Jeff Beck.

Steve: Yeah. I did a show with Jeff Beck and Santana in Japan. We all played together. We became good buds and stayed in touch in the midst of the tragedy, losing my brother Jeff. We had this tour thing booked. A lot of people were depending on us for their livelihood and their families. But there was no way we could possibly go on without Jeff. It's almost like Jeffrey planned our meeting with Simon himself. The album was done and we know how proud - he was really proud of the record. We focused on a real band record. We wrote all but two songs, the four of us, the guys I went to school with. We worked on it really hard. We kind of re-bonded. No wives, no girlfriends. Nothing. Just the four of us. We ate, slept and lived this whole thing again and became like best friends all over.

Is Simon going to be staying with you

Steve: Yeah. He's an official member. We are going to make another

record. We decided it's not going to bring Jeffrey back if we don't work together. I'm just finished with my solo record now, it's coming out next

On Relativity?

Steve: Yeah, it looks that way.

Obviously you still play guitar, unbelievably I might add, but now you're the man on the Mic as well!


Any training, any kind of vocal training you had to do?

Straightjacket Fits, "Blow," Arista Since their first release in 1987, this guitar-slinging, New Zealand quartet has had praises and accolades coming out of the ying-yang! They've been hailed as the weirdest and best guitar band in

They've been hailed as the weirdest and best guitar band in the world (and quite possibly the universe) and received critical acclaim for their first and second albums, *Hail* and *Melt* and their two EP releases (their 1987 EP, *Life In One Chord* was appointed by some as the greatest debut single of all time). However, these guys were hardly impressed with themselves (talk about being overly hard on yourself — are these guys real human beings?), but this harsh self-criticism really pays off with *Blow*. This week, Straitjacket Fits reaps in the honor of #3 Most Added! *Blow* captures the very essence of Straitjacket Fits — a tumultuous storm of guitars that buzz, drone and crunch along with a driving drum beat and vocals that match the intensity of the guitars. Thanks to producer Paul Fox (10,000 Maniac, Sugarcubes), the production is lush, yet the searing live energy is not lost. Tracks that left us in a tizzy: "Joyride," "Sycamore," "Brother's Keeper," "Let It Blow," "If I Were You," and "Way."



"Swim" will have you so wide-eyed and pumped, you won't know what to do with yourself....it is, simply put, sensory-overload. Producer Terry Date's (Pantera, Soundgarden) work is every evident in "Swim." This head-banging/body-slamming tune has guitars beating head to head with the drums — your reflexes will automatically kick into the head-swinging mode (just try to resist the headbanging motion — it won't be possible). And Angelo Christopher Moore's vocal chords emit almost every sound possible by Homo sapiens: screams, moans, yelps, groans, squeals, growls, along with rapping, and at times, there's some semblance to singing. Fishbone will leave you wide-eyed and bushy tailed, so chuck the coffee machine and stimulate yourself nature's way with "Swim."

Judybats, "Incredible Bittersweet," Sire/Warner



Brothers In terms of intensity, "Incredible Bittersweet" is probably the most powerful track on *Pain Makes You Beautiful*. Lyrically and musically, it's the celebration of extremes and paradoxes. Jeff Heiskell's voice bounds back and forth between a deep, throaty speech to a hard-edged tune. While Heiskell belts it out, the guitars strum in the background, but as soon as the vocals tone





With an ample serving of rare/unreleased and live goodies, as well as impressive liner notes by Greil Marcus and Leslie Berman, Watching The Dark is a must for fans of music every-

where...LA's The Muffs, a band including Kim Shattuck and Melanie Vammen (two former members of the Pandoras) is on the scene and ready to roll. With a straight ahead approach and a tip of the hat to the New York punk scene of the 70's, their self-titled debut is full of aggression and humor. Shattuck's hard candy vocals are sweet yet tumultuous,



complementing the raunchy guitars very nicely. "Lucky Guy" is the lead track, and songs like "Saying Goodbye" and the playful "Another Day" should fit in well on stations actively supporting the punk ethic in their library. 



Heavy Hitters

Paw, "Dragline", A&M....

I believe the label sent this album out to metal, not really sure of



what kind of reaction to expect, but hopeful (they're on quite a roll). This band tends to traipse the alternative terrains a bit, but not so tenderly as some, as most of you have experienced with the first single, "Jessie" (which went out a couple weeks ago). Happily, due in large part to the band's raw, adrenalin pumped, distorted rock style, metal has in

fact, very warmly embraced the band. The aforementioned single (backed with "Gasoline") was #2 Most Added (with 41 stations) a couple of weeks back, and has continued to gain consistently more (5 this past week and 7 the week previous). Hopefully, now that the full CD has already started to hit our reporting roster, we will finally see them elevated from out of the rumblers and onto the chart. We have little doubt that that will happen very soon given the strong reaction to it. The metal folks dig it. Just as a refresher, Paw are a bright, rough-hewn four piece (Grant Fitch-guitar, Mark Hennessy-vocals, Peter Fitch-drums and Charles Bryanbass), from Lawrence, Kansas (by way of Chicago). Their music attempts to bridge the influential rivers of hardcore power metal (Rollins/Pantera) with melodic but edgy, tension filled emotional grinding (Bullet LaVolta) with a slightly more poppy song oriented musicality. And the band has succeeded in creating very real, unpretentious modern rock songs, that hit at the heart of America's insecurities. Boldness, aggression, anger, frustration and poetic irony (every song tells a story) all weave throughout "Dragline" and its emotional turmoil. For every measure of gritty, blasting guitar grind, there are equal parts melody and introspection. A touch of acoustics for good measure and a rough raspy voice makes the package airtight and ultimately enjoyable. There's just very little not to like about a record as real and unaffected as this is — it reminds me of a day long gone away. Try out the passion twist of "Lolita", "Dragline", the galloping "One More Bottle", the hardcore slap of "Hard Pig" or the full throttle sweep of "Sugarcane" and see if you don't agree.

fishbone, "Swim", Columbia.... Lots of Fishbone fans are already busy gearing up for the band's latest collection of mixed



bag musicality, brilliantly titled, "Give A Monkey A Brain And He'll Swear He's The Center Of The Universe". It is very appropriate then, that the first single would be the very un-single-ish purge called "Swim". A view from the mosh pit, "Swim" is a grungy, noisy, funky hypno-groove that,

without benefit of a real hook or catchy sing-a-longable chorus, still quickly embeds itself in the listener's brain stem. Undeniably heavy and bizarre, it inundates, along wave after wave of chunky riffs, multi-layered chaotic vocals and a bottom heavy groove. It very aptly captures the human sea, slosh and grind of being down in the pit. The inside line (from trusted friends and peers) is that the full album is excellent and destined to be quite huge. Throughout their ten year history, the band (John Norwood Fisher-bass, Philip Fisher-drums, Kendall Rey Jones-guitar, Christopher G. Dowd-trombone/keys, Angel C. Moore-lead vocals/sax, Walter A. Kibby II-trumpet and John Bigham-guitar/keys) has always maintained a dignified and colorful adherence to no particular genre in general. Naturally based in a funky ska-core style, the band has never been content to lounge about within one musical confine. Rather, they prefer to lunge about, seemingly recklessly (though not really so), in and out of metal, hip hop, rap, jazz and brass (the horns are naturally a very cool piece de resistance). All of this should help land this Fishbone album in the mainstream, in current, in the big pond (okay, I'll stop this now before I get to "caught" up in it). Dive in, have a nice "Swim". Later.


Fear Factory, "Fear Is The Mindkiller",

Roadrunner....Late in 1992, the metal masses were initiated



into the experimental and frightening realms of Fear Factory. Amidst the growing industrial rage, the aptly named Fear Factory came leaping at us with a fierce intensity and a sound so unlike anything heard before, people were forced to listen. Or at the very least, to pay attention to what

they were doing. The band (Burton C. Bell-vocals/hardware, Dino Cazares-guitars/bass, Andrew Shives-bass, Raymond Herrera-drums and Raynor Diego-samples/keyboards) openly defied categorization and tags with their extremely well received debut album, "Soul Of A New Machine". With its driving brutal intensity, distorted death metal vocals, industrial/techno dance bed and experimental grindcore riffing ("disco death"??!), the record, not too surprisingly, had the metal ranks all awhirl and the press trying to make heads or tails of it. To this day, some of our stations are still (nearly a year later) playing the album on their metal shows. Well, they've got some fresh reworked material to chomp down on now, thanks to this grinding EP that Roadrunner is issuing. "Fear Is The Mindkiller" offers up 6 new mixes (as rendered by Frontline Assembly's Bill Leeb and Rhys Fulber). Scary stuff? You better believe it. Heavy, mutated caterwauls torn from the heart of "Soul" have been recreated into flashes of heady cerebral pounding (even more so than they were before, I should say) — moody and dangerous. You're already familiar with them, and tons of you already like them, so need I say more really? Just remember, "Fear Is The Mindkiller" and everything will be just fine.

COLUMBIA

Schnitt Acht, "Slash And Burn", Magii Records/Cheetah Our first introduction to this industrial metal band, came by



way of the "Rage"/"Random Funk" single that was shipped to metal last fall. If you recall, Schnitt are the brainchild of one Morgan Lekcirt — a producer/keyboardist who has been working in various projects throughout Florida. We now are receiving a new album from his band (they had previously released a record called "Subhuman Minds: On The Firing Line"), comprised of Morgan, Jeff "E"-drums, Virgil L. Hibbs-guitar, and recent addition, ex-Massacre guitarist Rick Rozz. What you will hear upon listening to "Slash And Burn" has a more metallic leaning industrial style, than some of what you are probably already playing. It's an industrial brew that's extremely listenable, largely because the synthesizers tend to temper the noise quotient. The songs have definite form, despite the rampant distorted vocal tones, and the heavy emphasis on speed metal type guitar riffs (although sometimes they tend to plumb death metal depths as well). The aforementioned songs are both

included on the album, with "Rage" still remaining one of the standouts. Already a techno rave/dance hit with his alter/ego outfit Radioactive Goldfish, Morgan is hoping to break into the metal realms with his latest offering. For once, here is someone who wants to be considered part of the "metal" element. Unlike so many who owe their success to the genre only to dis it later when they make it big. Anyone who likes the aggressive guitar bolstered ferocity of metal and/or the modern extremity of industrial works, should enjoy this blending of the two. Try "The War Has Begun", "Rage", "Aftermath" or "Sweet Liberty".

Duick Picks

Infectious Grooves, "The Great Infectious Cover-<u>Up", Epic....</u> Ah, this'll put a smile on your face if nothing else

will. Yep, those funky infectiphibians are retracing their musical



roots (well some of 'em), with true to the originals (mostly), covers of David Bowie's "Change" and Zeppelin's "Immigrant Song". Already you know you're in for an adventure. The band has already been enjoying an enormously successful chart run with their second album, "Sarsippius' Ark", only recently experiencing some slippage. Chances are, though, many of you

have not yet fully realized the value of these two tracks, for your summertime airplay. Yeah, they're novelty. Yeah, you still hear both these songs on classic rockers from one coast to another. BUT! You won't ever hear 'em done like this again. I mean, come on, think about it - Mike Muir sings Robert Plant and David Bowie, bassed up to the max by Robert Trujillo's trademark slapping. Now do you get the picture? Besides, there's another special track or three (not to mention a bunch of colorful Sarsippius liners) not listed on the CD pro, which while groovin' steadily, also grind in a harder Suicidal Grooves kinda way.

Single Matters

Quicksand, "Dine Alone", Polydor They're still climbing! That's right folks, the band that has been taking the metal



ranks by storm, and enjoying a very successful run on the charts is now Top 10 (8*). Quicksand combine the strength and power of Rollins with the angular grooves of Helmet, and incorporate a very song oriented style of their own. Needless to say, their debut has been creating quite a stir through the buzzbinners, with a great live

show to back it up. Now, with the band approaching Top 5, what better than a new single. And one that was very much a favorite of many of our reporters from the beginning. The hard slam of "Dine Alone" jolts along a rocky guitar line and bold bass groove, with the high edgy vocals wailing along on top. As catchy as it is heavy, it's like the release of a ton of pent up energy. An edit is provided, but we naturally prefer the album version, complete with melodic break et al. Also included on the CD pro is a great previously unreleased bonus track, "How Soon Is Now?" — a Smith's cover. Talk about different. Somehow I doubt Morrissey ever envisioned a band like Quicksand ripping through his song. Tee hee. It's pretty amazing friends, so be sure and check it out.

Rudeswirl, "Buttalo", Mlegaforce Nudeswirl ... you haven't forgotten about them already have you? Didn't think so.



Who could forget the frenzied wall of guitar sound of 'Swirl, or the lost in the center of it all vocals. New Jersey's own topped out at 11* on the Hard Hitters chart, led in most part by the powerful snap of "F Sharp". The band now are carousing around the mid-twenties on the chart, but there's still a chance of re-igniting all the earlier excite-

ment. "Buffalo" perhaps could be the track to do it. If you're jamming to Monster Mag or Tool, there's no excuse for you not to check out the huge distortion rush of this song. It rolls along like the giant it's named for, amidst pitching guitar lines, and Johnny Lydon-like vocal warbling. The sliding chorus features some nice deeper harmonies as well. Nudeswirl have certainly proven with this debut, that they have all the goods necessary to keep pace with their many grungy peers. It would be a shame for the record to get lost before its time, so do your listeners a favor and slam on "Buffalo" and see if they react. Here's hoping so, 'cause it's a very cool song, from a great little band.

St. Thomas, "Electric City", TPT Now that you've gotten to sample the many varied styles of this eclectic new band,




via the hard chugging "I Hate... Pt 1", and the full "Electric City" album, the label offers up another somewhat harder slice for you to chew on. The title cut from the band's debut, offers up the more rock/metal inclined edge of St. Thomas. Less dark and driving than the first single, "Electric City" gallops along a drum and

bass rhythm, while the melody zooms along equally as fast, until tumbling into the catchy chorus. The guitars blast along, highlighted by some wild phasing and distortion, laying sorta low, so

the vocals and drums move to the front. Okay, so all the spacy affectations that echoed throughout a portion of the CD are not necessarily missing, as you'll notice as soon as the band hits the outerzone tones in the middle break. Of course, they soon plunge right back into the wild romp of the chorus. The band's been stalling just a bit on the charts recently, so perhaps this one can put a charge back into St. Thomas' chart life.



Well, you've got to know the folks over in the Capitol building must be feeling pretty good about the streak they're on lately. Megadeth was #1, Exodus was #1 and now here come bouncing the Butthole Surfers looking to make it a triple shot. Slotting



into #2 this week, "Independent Worm Saloon" (14 increases/6 moves into rotation), is perfectly aligned to assume the position at #1, if you will, in Sacred's wake (the record is now into its 10th week at #1 already — they beat Megadave's 9 week record). They're #4 Most Requested as well. While we know the label and indie folks are gunning for the top spot, we also

know they'll have to jam on it, 'cause the competition's fiercer than ever.... Coming up fast from behind (absolutely no pun intended), are A&M's Monster Magnet (up 4 from 8-4* with 11 increases and 9 moves into rotation), Zoo's Tool (up 2 from 7-5* with 12 increases) and Polydor's Quicksand (10-8* with 7 increases and 7 moves into rotation). And squashed there in the middle at 3* are Atlantic's Overkill, who finally regain their pace and have started the trek back upwards.... Also making definite headway through the Top Twenty are Interscope's unstoppable and heavily requested (#5) Primus (14-11* with 9 increases and 9 moves). Folks just can't get enough of them. Right on their funky tails are Living Colour (12*), who at this point are just trying to keep the momentum building with the new "Auslander" single (which picked up 18 new adds this past week). And then there was Anthrax. Folks are still in the indecisive mood about this one. Fans of Armored Saint are having no

trouble accepting this teaming, but hard-core Anthrax fans just haven't made up their minds yet. Needless to say, when the rest of the album (the majority of which is heavier than the very radio friendly "Only") hits, the thump heard round the world (as jaws hit the ground in unison) will be decidedly in the band's favor.



We're sure of it. This week the band grabbed 5 more adds, while pummeling their way to a 31-13* move (with 21 huge moves into rotation) on Hard Hitters (#2 Most Requested). FYI, metal WILL be getting the Anthrax album before the rest of the radio world, so make the most of it! Could #1 be far away? Not.... Glancing down a bit further, it looks like Mercury's Mind Bomb has finally kicked in (up 12 from 32-20*).... Virgin's mighty Asphalt Ballet are beginning to really see some strong results over here on the harder side of the fence. This past week, they knocked past 9 more for a move from 32-20* (with 5 increases/7 moves into rotation). The band are going to be touring until they drop from exhaustion, so don't miss them when they come to town. They're young, aggressive and put on an excellent show. Besides, you'll want to check out the new vocalist Tommy Dean.... Roadrunner's Disincarnate (James Murphy's band), hit the chart at 39* last week, and have, in no time at all, managed to brush past 11 long time chart dwellers, to 28* (with 10 increases). By all indications, they're in for an extended stay in Hard



Hitterdom.... Mr. Vince Neil has been getting the thumbs up from a lot of our reporters, who express a touch of surprise at just how cool some of the songs on his album are. Their support has helped launch Vince and crew (again no pun intended), up 12 spots from 43-31*.... Finally, finally, finally. People are FINALLY starting to

"get" The God Machine. They continue their slow, but steady, climb this week with a move from 36-33* (5 moves into rotation/5 increases). If you haven't listened to it yet... please do. You won't be sorry.... Megaforce's newest prize contenders,



MindFunk hit the chart with a push from a hard swinging "Goddess", and now expect nothing but the best from "Dropped".

Metal radio's already oohing and aahing over the record, so let's make sure the numbers reflect that, folks. This week they slide past 8 more from 47-39* with 10 more adds clocking in. Great album.... The debuts this week were a heavy lot, that ranged from

Nuclear Blast's Benediction (42*), Restless' Dumpster Juice (44*) and Futurist/Noise's Mordred (46*). The chart is certainly looking freshly loaded for all those summertime parties (all reporters checking out for the duration, please let us know your plans, ok?). Still to come: Damn the Machine, Mind Over Four, Power Trio From Hell, Bosstones full, Raging Slab, Vader, Genitorturers, Paw, Fishbone (yeehaw!) and literally tons more!!

Metal Filings

You see, it's like this... Ozzy Osbourne (Epic) has huge amounts of stuff going on in his camp. For your eyes only, is the full length Ozzy and Co. live home video, "Loud & Live", that is chock full of the Oz man's biggest hits. This home vid is exclusively available on video three weeks before the June 15th release of the album of the same name. Then, headed the metal radio way (and going for adds May 17th and 18th) will be the live CD single, "Changes". Also featured on the disc as b-sides are live versions of "No More Tears" and "Desire". Any questions?... Since you've been waiting so long to get the techno remixes from Fear Factory (Roadrunner) I know it's gonna be hard to let go of 'em long enough to drop them into the nearest CD player, but you know, what better time to do it than May 10th/11th. Just go for it on these four Bill Leeb and Rhys Fulber re-mixes known as "Fear Is The Mindkiller"... You might want to let your listeners in on the fact that the Living Colour (Epic) "Auslander" CD-5 is available commercially. It is in stores now... Even if you aren't a tequila drinker, you should take note that "Mama Tequila" from Circus Of Power (Columbia) goes for adds now - May 10th/11th... If you listen real hard to the Infectious Grooves (Epic) "The Great Infectious Cover Up" CD-pro, you will find some Sarsippius drop-ins and productions that are not listed on the CD. It seems that Sarsippius also snuck his version of "Sprek" onto the CD. Imagine that... "Trial", the sophomore release from Skin Chamber (Roadrunner), has found its way into your hands ready to take up space on the radio waves... Let your listeners know they can pick up the MindFunk (Megaforce) LP, "Dropped", at their local record outlet this week!... May 11th marks the street date for the Cry Of Love (Columbia) album, "Brother". The first track from the album (which is in the same hard rock vein as Bad Company and Free) to hit metal radio will be "Peace Pipe" sometime in June. You might want to know that John Custer produced the album and that C.O.C. (Relativity) guitarist Pepper Keenan played a little guitar on the record... The full LP "pur plemetalflakemusic" from The Fluid (Hollywood) goes for adds May 17th. Tracks to check out are "Pill", "One Eye Out" and "On My Feet" (which you might remember was previously released as a 7" on white vinyl)... Do you want to preview the new Anacrusis (Metal Blade) record? If so, you can do it right over the phone by calling (212) 695-8863 selection 212. You will then get an earful of the "Scream and Whispers" album, actually you will hear 30 seconds of 6 trax. The first single from the upcoming release will be "Sound The Alarm", which goes for adds the 17th... The Judas Priest digitally remastered 32 track 2 disc "Metal Works" will be serviced to radio and will be in stores May 18th. This is all courtesy of Columbia Records... Remember last issue when you were informed of the upcoming muscle man Arnold movie <u>Last Action Hero</u> and the incredible

soundtrack that comes along with it? You also should remember that the first single taken from the album is the AC/DC (Atco/Atlantic) tune "Big Gun" (written especially for the movie). The single ships to metal radio on May 24th, while the entire star packed album will arrive in stores June 6th... Look for a June release on the Onyx (Columbia) CD-5. I know this is a hip hop rap group but Billy Graziadei of Biohazard (Roadrunner) did a remix or two of their song "Slam" for the upcoming release... The first single from the upcoming Mercyful Fate (Metal Blade) release is "Egypt" and it will arrive on your desk the first week of June... Rage Against The Machine (Epic) will deliver "Bombtrack" to the metal masses on June 8th. The b-side is a live version of the non-LP track "Settle For Nothing" ... Suicidal Tendencies (Epic) have their "Still Cyco After All These Years" LP in stores June 15th. The first single to metal radio will be "I Saw Your Mommy", which goes for adds June 8th... Black Train Jack (Roadrunner) will release "No Reward" on July 13th... Also arriving on July 13th is the "Warrant" EP from Dog Eat Dog (Roadrunner)... The next record from Barkmarket (Def American) is called "Gimmick" and has been given a July 27th release date. ◆◆◆◆ Biohazard (Roadrunner) will cross the Atlantic to embark on a 2 month stint playing gigs in Europe beginning mid-May... Suicidal Tendencies (Epic) are on a massive European festival kick. They are taking the stage in stadiums opening up for acts like Guns N'Roses (Geffen) and Metallica (Elektra)... Sacred Reich (Hollywood), who have been in the number one chart position across the boards for nine consecutive weeks, have been added to the last three dates on the first leg of the Danzig (Def American) tour. They join Glenn and crew, Nudeswirl (Megaforce) and Proper Grounds (Maverick) for the May 21st NYC show, May 22nd in Boston and May 23rd in Baltimore. Then, they will be heading back to Europe to finish up their headlining tour. Then, they come back stateside around June 10th for the second leg of the Danzig (Def American) tour. Got that?... 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

MAY DAY FOR BRIAN

HIS PAST. to do, you know. My dad was the typical Englishman of the period. Very rigid and upstanding and never showed any emotion. Not tactile, not huggy in any way. And incredibly demanding in terms of moral behavior and everything. So I spent a lot of time over this difficult period — the last 5 to 6 years — wrestling with the guilt that I hadn't lived up to his expectations.

What were your dad's expectations of you? How could he want you to have more success than you've already had? He saw Queen, right?

MAY: The public side is okay but it was my MAY: The public side is okay but it was my private life that never made him happy. His religion was the family. And that was how he saw life. That was paramount to him. You look after your loved ones first and foremost. And I got married and had kids, who I adore, but I couldn't keep it together. That hurt him. He felt that I was going off the rails.

You ended up getting divorced?

MAY: Not quite divorced but I've been separated for about six years.

So, to your dad, your marriage falling apart was a big failure?

MAY: It was terrible for him. And, also to me, it represented a total major failure. I had a terrible time with it. I mean, I had a terribly hard time getting through all that. Of course, I lost my dad just at about the time that was starting to happen. And also the group stopped touring at that time. And then it became apparent that Freddie was dying of AIDS. It was a hell of a few years.

When you're at the top and suddenly the car-pet's pulled from beneath your legs and you're at the bottom, how do you adjust? Success can control you and ruin your whole life. We've lost some of our most treasured performers because of that.

MAY: Absolutely. I certainly went to the bottom totally.

What did you end up doing and how did you climb out?

MAY: I was totally depressed for a while and dysfunctional.

Your dad was very special to you, wasn't he?

MAY: Yeah. He made me my very first guitar, he was an inventor. He used to make all these different things. Sadly, I lost him about six years ago. But that's another story — the effect he had on me. He was great. He was, sort of, unfathomable. I still don't understand my dad. He could turn his hand to anything and make a great job of it — he was amazing — we were always making stuff.

Were you best friends?

MAY: My relationship with my dad was very complicated. Looking back on it, yes, it was very tight and very close. When I was a little boy it was the closest thing I knew. I think we had a problem adapting the relationship as I grew, though. There was a point where we were, sort of, hardly talking to each other for quite a long time.

Why?

MAY: It was a while after I left home and was getting involved in things that my dad didn't approve of. And, as I say, we didn't manage to, sort of, change the relationship into the adult stage until much further on.

How did you manage to come together?

MAY: My dad... it was strange... This is very personal, really. Basically, the problems me and my dad were having drove my mom out of her mind. Almost literally. She got so stressed that she got ill. And that happened because my dad was pulling one way and I was pulling the other way. other way.

It really bothered her that much?

MAY: Yeah. Very seriously. She looked as though she was going to die if we kept it up. So one day my dad came over to me and we had a talk. He said to me that this wasn't worth making mom ill for and I said, 'Well, I'm glad you finally realize that.' So that was very difficult for me. I only felt that I was just about getting to know my dad on an adult level when he died. I didn't really have time to ask him all those questions that I really wanted to.

Did you tell him you loved him?

MAY: Yeah. I got that far. But that was hard

MAY: Bad enough not to get up in the morning. Sleeping all day and, sort of, palpitating. Completely freaking really. Nothing to do with drugs. I never took a drug in my life. Nothing to do with alcohol because I never drank to excess... well, maybe a little. There were some points I drank when I was going out of my mind. But solely to do with emotional incapability of handling my life. Like you say, there is this incredible contrast between your image of yourself which is built upon what other people see you as and the contrast between that and how you feel inside. What you really are as a person. There's the

> What you really are as a person. There's the media machine creating the Queen image, the Brian May image, and then there's the human being.

MAY: I always thought that I've been very down to earth.

You seem that way to me.

MAY: I mean, I thought I was. I prided myself that my fame and success hadn't changed me. Keeping with certain values and stuff. I always thought and I've always said that my first priority was the family and the kids. But I found that no matter what I did I could not stay in that family unit. It just crippled me pled me.

How old are your kids now and do they understand what happened?

MAY: They pretty much do. They're 14, 11 and 6. A boy and two girls.

So have you ever sat down and had a heart to heart with them?

MAY: I've talked a lot to them along the way. The important thing with kids is to always be honest with them. They'll usually know if you're lying.

It's important to make your kids understand so they don't end up hating you or your wife.

MAY: I think there's an element in all of them that would be angry with us both. And I don't really blame them for feeling that way. Of course, they are different ages. It's quite fascinating, actually. If it wasn't quite so tragic it would be very interesting because they all

took it completely differently.

Plus there's a difference emotionally. And then there's the differences between the gen-

MAY: They all took it totally differently and I can see how it's affected them. But the one thing my wife and I agreed on is that we would always talk to them and be honest with them about the situation. That, in a way, has been one of my biggest problems in life. The fact that my parents gave the appearance of having a perfect relationship. And perfect in dealing with life evenly.

The appearance was more important than the

MAY: Yeah, but that was the way that generation handled things when it came to the family. So I know now, and again, it's personal stuff and I don't find it easy to talk about, but I know they, like everybody else, had problems to deal with. But I never was allowed to see that as a kid. And so when I have problems and failures there's always a part of me that feels like a failure as a person. And that's very hard to take. hard to take.

I think you can't be too hard on yourself.

MAY: Well, logically, I can see my way out of it but, emotionally, it's still there. It's raw pain.

Do you have a good group of friends around you? People you know that like you for you not for your association with Queen?

MAY: On a certain level, ves.

They can tell you to your face, if needed, that your shit still stinks?

MAY: (Laughs.) Yeah. I know people in my life that can do that for me. At various times in my life, though, I sunk everything into the one relationship. And that prevented me not being as close to friends as I should've been

You didn't have the balance?

MAY: Yeah. I look at my kids and I wonder what mistakes I'm making because I know exactly what my parents did to me and I'm trying not to do that to them. But then you know that they're going to turn around at some point and go, But you did this to us and you did that. That's why we're so fucked up!' So I wonder what I might be doing wrong. I really hated myself for splitting up the family for a long time, you know. And that was because I was worried what it was doing to them. But they're actually handling it in their own way.

Are they proud of their father?

Are they proud of their father?

MAY: I think so. It also brings them immense problems. I mean, just being famous brings all these pressures and problems, immense problems. I never realized when I embarked on my musical career what fame can create. I always thought that you get famous and people would be proud of you. But it makes more problems than you can humanly handle at times. You think the struggle to get fame is tough. Fame itself opens up an entire can of worms. For everybody, in particular, that's close to you, it makes problems. And sometimes severe problems.

Are the kids able to make new friends? Do

Are the kids able to make new friends? Do they find that hard to do?

they find that hard to do?

MAY: They have all sorts of problems doing that. Jimmy, who's 14, has the problem that people will gravitate to him because they think there's something glamorous about his dad which is totally false. Or else, they'll move away because there's a jealousy thing going on or else they think it's something to make fun of. When I was going through the separation I was in the London papers every day. You know what that's like. We had six months of being trashed, more or less, every single day. So, of course, all the kids' friends see that and it becomes very hard. it becomes very hard.

Talking about tragedies, how did you adjust and deal with Freddie Mercury's death? Your whole life was based around this unit, Queen, and Freddie was the crucial part of this unit. Suddenly he's gone and what do you do? you do?

MAY: I was pretty close with Freddie in some ways. Incredibly close (creative-wise) when we were in the studio. There would be long periods where, when the group wasn't working, we would normally, sort of, fly apart. Maybe just speak to each other once a week or something. It's curious to me now because I was used to not seeing Fred for maybe a couple of months at a time. Sometimes that would happen and then there would be an intense period of being together. like, every hour of nappen and then there would be an intense period of being together, like, every hour of the day. So I still get that feeling, like, Freddie just might walk in through the door any minute. It's really odd because it was that kind of closeness. You know, we were close when we were in close proximity. And then

we got on with your own lives. And we had separate lives in many ways. How did I come to terms with it? It was a continuous process because we obviously knew for a long time that Freddie had AIDS and before we actually knew was appeared. knew, we suspected.

When did you first suspect that Freddie was

MAY: I had slight feelings when he said he didn't want to tour anymore at the end of 1986 when we had just finished that European tour. It was really the ultimate tour de force of Europe at that time. Nobody had ever done a tour like that. So then we were at the point saying, 'where do we go from here?' And Freddie suddenly took on a different attitude saying, 'I don't want to go anywhere from here.' He had no desire to tour in the foreseeable future. I think I knew at that point he was able future. I think I knew at that point he was sick because that just wasn't like Freddie. He was always looking for the next rung of the ladder. The next ground to conquer. That wasn't like him. But it was years before I knew for certain.

Did he talk to you about death? Was he prepared?

MAY: I would say he was more prepared than anybody I've ever known. I think we're all afraid of death to a point but Freddie never showed any signs of wanting any sympathy.

Do you remember the first time he told you that he had AIDS?

that he had AIDS?

MAY: There was a period when we didn't know and then there was a period when we more or less knew even though it was unspoken. But we didn't know if he knew that we knew he was sick. And then Jim Beech... I'll never forget it. We were in Montreux [Switzerland] and Freddie was back home for a couple of days and Jim said, 'Freddie wants to have a meeting tomorrow. He wants to have a chat and tell you something.' We all just looked at each other because we knew what it was. And that was a big moment because that was the time that you'd finally have to admit that your suspicions were true. what it was. And that was a big moment because that was the time that you'd finally have to admit that your suspicions were true. So then he came out and said, 'You know what I'm dealing with here. And this is how I would like to approach the next few months. I want to be private about it. I don't want to do all this in public. I want to work and still have the things that we share going on without anything getting in the way. He said that he wanted to work up until the last minute because that's what I'm here for and he said he didn't want all this shit getting in the way. He said, 'I also don't really want to talk about it too much. I'd rather talk about stuff that we can be creative about.' And it gradually crept into our work. It already had crept in, actually, because we were all... it was already in the songs before that. In the lyrics. I was aware of what was happening. Not so much in what Freddie was writing but because of how it affected us — it crept into what we were doing a whole lot more. It was, sort of, an unconscious awareness. I mean, we knew he was going to die and this is someone we spent the last 20 years with, you know. It was incredible because we had also arrived for the first time where we actually had all been writing together. That was around the time of last 20 years with, you know. It was incredible because we had also arrived for the first time where we actually had all been writing together. That was around the time of Innuendo. Having spent most of our career writing stuff separately and then just arranging and recording it. But we would always call it written by Queen. And that was a major thing, man. I mean, you know how it is. Your songs are your babies. Try and let your song go—it's really hard. So we actually did that. Every song we had we put into the pool and we all worked on it. And it was incredible and a great experience. A lot of times I sat down with Freddie, in particular, and we hacked out a lyric together. Which is quite something because you expose so much of yourself when you do that. Towards the end I wrote quite a lot of stuff, obviously, for Freddie to sing. At various times I would look at him and ask, 'Are you alright about doing this? Is this okay with you?' Because he would scan down it, you know, because a song is about three or four different things at the same time. Whether you want it to be or not. Amongst all this "tragedy" it was a wonderful time because there was so much creativity going on in that respect. Freddie would come in and write and sing and then he would have to literally be carried out of the studio and he wouldn't be able to move for three or four days at a time. Then he would conserve his energy and come in and sing or write again. Freddie Mercury was he would conserve his energy and come in and sing or write again. Freddie Mercury was more unique than I think people realize.

Was there a time when you actually knew this would be the last time you'd see him and you had to say goodbye?

MAY: There wasn't a specific moment but there was this gradual talking we did which prepared me. He had come to terms with it. It was incredible. I never saw anybody like that.

He was very strong. If it were me, I'd be a mess. He had this thing... he had this acceptance about it all. He had it. He definitely did. He had everything in order and he was in control of his family and his loved ones. He sat there, looked at it and dealt with it. There were a few times that I saw him and I thought it might be the last time. But he was able to hang in there and be very strong. The last few times I went to see him he would be there and sitting up in his bed at his home. It was the summertime. He'd be sitting by the window looking at his garden. He loved his garden. He would look out the window and see his trees and the fish in his pool and it would give him so much joy. He had a wonderful house in the middle of London that was like a country home. It was unique for London. We had some good conversations, too. There was a time when he had the TV on and I would start chatting about something. And he once stopped me mid-sentence and said, 'Brian, you don't have to feel like you need to make conversation. The fact that you're here in itself is great. I'm happy about that. You don't have to try so hard. I'm fine. I'm really happy that you're here and that's enough.'

Did he ever talk to you about death?

MAY: It's too hard to talk about. I mean, the last time we were there — me and my girl Anita — we talked with Freddie about all that stuff. But very gently. As far as his mental journey was concerned he was very much in control. There are some songs that were written the last few days of his life in the studio and they'll tell it all.

Jim Beech is supposedly putting together a record of stuff that was never released. True?

MAY: The solo stuff which he recorded out-MAY: The solo stuff which he recorded outside the band, which is not very much actually, it wasn't the major thrust of his work. His major work was with the band. The solo stuff is controlled by Freddie's estate and we don't have any control over that material. Which is a bit tough. Jim Beech has a hand in that but it's owned collectively by the estate. The Queen material we have control over so we can make our own decision about what goes can make our own decision about what goes out and what doesn't.

What's left? Is there an album's worth?

What's left? Is there an album's worth?

MAY: I don't think any of us are really sure. There's at least three or four full pieces which we can complete, I'm sure. They're lyrically complete, too, for the most part. What we don't want to do is dredge up all the out-takes and all the things that got thrown off the albums because they were thrown off for good reasons. And they should stay buried. I'd hate to do that. Like Jimi Hendrix's stuff got all dragged out. Luckily, for the time being, we do have that control. So my feeling is that we should tastefully finish up those things and put out the last stone and then move on.

So suddenly you're a solo artist. How did you regroup and start looking at your career?

MAY: Well, in the beginning, I wasn't looking at a career. I was trying to get myself together on a personal level.

Did you ever think about not playing any-

MAY: No. Not for a moment. Truthfully, it's the only thing that saved my life. It was, really. It was the only thing that gave me glimmers of hope. There was a moment when... I had a really bad time when it came to this rearrangement of my life. I went to L.A. for a month just to try and sort out everything. I needed to get away from the source of all my pressures. Strangely enough L.A. was the place to go for me. I have a little house there which is totally suburban. It's in a neighborhood where people still push around baby strollers. And you can be fairly normal. The sunshine there was really amazing and I find the sun does amazing things for me. It really helps me think. It's a healer. The sun would bring me just above the sanity line, but when it would go down I'd just lay on the floor and scream like a baby. And do all sorts of stuff which I'm not proud of.

At least you're a survivor. Not many people MAY: No. Not for a moment. Truthfully,

At least you're a survivor. Not many people could handle all the pressure you've been put through.

MAY: Yeah, maybe. I'll tell you what does do something to you.

It sounds like it's made you stronger.

MAY: Maybe it has. I don't know. I just try and live each day one at a time. That's all I can do.

Mick Ronson, former guitarist for David Bowie as well as a solo artist, has died in London of cancer of the liver at age 46. Ronson was the co-arranger and guitarist on Bowie's "Ziggy Stardust" album of 1972. He played on the albums "Hunky Dory" and "The Man Who Sold The World," as well as playing guitar on a track on Bowie's latest solo album. Ronson was also a member of Mott The Hoople and formed a duo with Mott lead singer Ian Hunter. He'd also produced Roger McGuinn's "Cardiff Rose" album in 1976. Ronson's solo albums included "Play Don't Worry" and "Slaughter On Tenth Avenue." Ronson had been suffering from cancer for the past year. He's survived by his wife, Suzy Fussey, from whom he was separated, and one daughter.

Chuck Mosely, former singer for Faith No More and the Bad Brains, has formed a new band called Cement, which is releasing its debut album later this month. Other band members are guitarist Sean Maytum, bass player Senon Williams and drummer Doug Duffy. Mosely was the vocalist on Faith No More's first big hit, "We Care A Lot."

Producer Steve Albini says his involvement may be part of the reason why Nirvana's record company isn't happy with the band's new album, now slated for release in September. "From the beginning, Nirvana's record label and management company didn't want me to produce the album," Albini told the Village Voice newspaper. "To date, I haven't spoken a word to either of them, but the band got the impression that the record company doesn't like the album we recorded and that their manegement company doesn't like it either....At every point while we were recording, there were moves we could have made to make it softer and more commercial or harsher or more aggressive, and at every point we decided to go with harsher and more aggressive." But Albini says that, because of a clause in his contract, Nirvana's record label won't be able to make changes to the album. "I feel like I did the job that I was asked to do," Albini says. "I worked my ass off for those guys. If everyone feels like taking the band's time and money and wasting it, my conscience is clear."

The Wedding Present have officially split from their British record label, even though the band had 12 different singles in the U.K. top 30 last year. The band is taking time off after a two-month tour of Japan and France. David Gedge is taking a vacation in Cyprus. The Wedding Present's "Hit Parade 2," which included the a- and b-sides of each of the band's hit singles from the last half of last year, was never released in the U.S.

Kat Bjelland of Babes In Toyland is finishing work in Seattle on the debut album by her new group Crunt. The band also includes her husband Stuart Grey of Lubricated Goat on bass, and drummer Russell Simins of the Jon Spencer Blues Explosion. "The music is more of a rock & roll variety but I still manage to get in a few bloodcurdling screans," Bjelland says. She's planning to work with Courtney Love of Hole later this year.

The stage version of the Who's "Tommy" has received seven Darama Desk nominations. "Tommy" was among the musicals nominated as the best of the 1992-93 New York theater season. Winners are to be announced on May 17.

Metallica found themselves at the center of a full-scale riot during a stadium concert in Jakarta, Indonesia, recently. The trouble started when an estimated 75,000 people tried to gain admission to the show at the 45,000-capacity stadium. Some of the fans locked out of the show set the wooden gates on fire, almost causing a major disaster when the fire spread to electrical cables. Local press reports tried to blame the riots on the band's music, prompting Metallica to issue a statement expressing sadness over the destruction and pointing that nothing had previously happened in their 21 months of world tour.

The Mission U.K. are set to return after two years off the road. Lead singer Wayne Hussey has recruited three new members for the group. The line-up will be unveiled in a series of European dates in July. The shows will be followed by an album, tentatively entitled "Dog Lover," in August.

World Party has included a hidden track on CD copies of its new album, "Bang." The satirical Beach Boys cover, titled "Kuwait City," was written by Karl Wallinger and drummer Chris Sharrock at the beginning of the Gulf War. The song is described by the band as a "controversial black comedy."

Wallinger says he'd been watching television coverage of the war two years ago and wrote the song from the point of view of U.S. soldiers who would have preferred to have been back home surfing. Wallinger also says he liked the way Nirvana hid the track "Endless Nameless" at the end of the "Nevermind" album, and he thought World Party should do the same thing. The track is hidden about 20 minutes past the last track on "Bang."

A Toronto man has been charged with extortion and uttering death threats for letters he sent to Pink Floyd's manager in London. Jerrold William Jackman allegedly threatened to kill the band unless he was paid \$2 million. Police say letters were sent and a threatening phone call was made to Stephen O'Rourke, the band's manager, during the past month.

AC/DC's "Big Gun" will be the first single from the sound-track of "Last Action Hero." The soundtrack album comes out the first week of June, two weeks before the movie. The video accompanying the AC/DC track was filmed in concert in Los Angeles. Megadeth, Tesla, Queensryche, Cypress Hill also have songs on the soundtrack. No final line-up of tracks has been announced, but the album will reportedly include a version of Aerosmith's "Dream On" with strings, as well as material from Anthrax and Def Leppard and Megadeth.

Maria McKee is reunited with three members of Lone Justice on her new solo album, "You Gotta Sin To Be Saved," which comes out in June. McKee, who now lives in Dublin, Ireland, says the record is "a return to grassroots American rock & roll."

Nina Hagen is recording two songs for her next album with Dave Stewart, formerly of Eurythmics.

Brent Leonard, director of "Lawnmower Man," is doing two videos for Billy Idol's "Cyperpunk" album coming out in late June. The clips for "Heroin" and "Shock To The System" are said to include special effects never before used in promotional videos. Idol plans a high-tech tour beginning in Europe in August and continuing in the U.S. in September.

The first authorized biography of the Ramones comes out in early June. It's Jim Bessman's "The Ramones: An American Band."

Rumors out of Britain that Alice In Chains are on the verge of breaking up seem to be overstated. Singer Layne Staley's is said to have been in poor health because of the rigors of the band's most recent North American tour. The band cut short the last leg of that tour, in an apparent effort to give Staley time to recover before this year's Lollapalooza tour. Alice In Chains has finished work on two tracks for Arnold Schwarzenegger's upcoming movie, "Last Action Hero." The band's management says that despite the break-up rumors, the band is just taking a break and will make the Lollapalooza dates in June. While the band was touring, Staley was quit to admit the band had been working hard, most recently during an eight-month world tour. "We've spent the past three years playing pretty much six or seven shows a week and no matter how tough or resilient you are, that takes a toll," Staley said. Mike Starr left the band in January citing the rigors of all those live dates.

Midnight Oil, the Hothouse Flowers, the Tragically Hip and Daniel Lanois will play a series of day-long concerts across Canada this summer.

Adam Clayton of U2 is engaged to model Naomi Campbell, after having been introduced to her by Bono only three months ago. On an Irish television program, Campbell said she got her engagement ring Friday night. "Adam popped the question on the phone when I was in New York. He was very straightforward about it," Campbell said on the "Kenny Live" show. She says they won't be able to marry until after U2 completes a four-month tour that begins in June. Both Clayton and Campbell were born in England. Clayton's family moved to Dublin in 1965. "We want a family but not right now," Campbell said. "There is a lot of trust between us and that is what I always wanted."

Arrested Development and Stevie Wonder are to perform at a Black Farm Aid concert in Little Rock, Arkansas, on June 5. An organization called Black Farm Aid of America has been established.

Clarke had a plate implanted in the wrist and was being held overnight for observation. It's not known if Clarke's injury will delay the start an overseas tour scheduled to begin May 22 in Tel Aviv, Israel. The four dates will not be made up, because they had already been rescheduled because of winter storms.

Joni Mitchell, Roger McGuinn, Syd Straw, Richard Thompson, Arlo Guthrie, Judy Collins, Beausoleil, Jimmie Dale Gilmore, John Hammond, Richie Havens, the Jefferson Starship, Taj Mahal, John Prince, Leon Redbone and Odetta are among the artists who will perform at a "Troubadours Of Folk Festival" taking place at the University of California, Los Angeles, on June 5 to 6. The event will benefit UCLA's performing arts program.

Rockmelons lead singer Deni Hines has been signed (to Interscope Records). She'll begin recording a her solo album next month. Hines, who's engaged to Kirk Pengilly of INXS, joined the band two years ago after having sung backing vocals for Jimmy Barnes and Kylie Minogue.

Gang Of Four drummer Hugo Burnham is recording a solo album. He's asked Michael Hutchence of INXS to sing on a cover of a Donovan song.

David Byrne has designed the cover art for Book Of Love's new album "Love Bubble."

Film Threat magazine asked "media psychologist" Stuart Fischoff for his opinion of Madonna. "Madonna hasn't got a clue about what's sexual," Fischoff concludes. "She's becoming more of a freak show. She's like the current-day equivalent of Tiny Tim.

Blur have covered Elvis Costello's "Oliver's Army" for a "Peace Together" album being put out in June in the United Kingdom. Pop Will Eat Itself have recorded Peter Gabriel's "Games Without Frontiers" and Therapy? have covered the Police's "Invisible Sun." 808 State, Billy Bragg, Fatima Mansions, Carter USM and EMF also appear on the benefit album.

That Petrol Emotion have launched their own record label in England, to release their latest album, "Fireproof." They're calling the label "Koogat," taking the name from Woody Allen's "Sleeper" movie. "There's a scene in the film where Diane Keaton and her friends are having this very pretentious conversation about art," says drummer Claren McLoughlin. "They're all talking about this piece of art and one of them say, 'It's so wonderful, it's keen. It's better than keen, it's koogat." McLoughlin says the band liked the name because "it's obviously something complimentary in a pretentious way."

Pantera are playing dates in South America and Japan before returning to the U.S. to begin pre-production for a new album. "If anything, we'll make an even better attempt to stay away from anything that seems to be commercial," says drummer Vinnie Paul. "We'll never lose the cutting edge. That's why people like Pantera. It's going against the grain, it is different, it's not the same old hat you can flick on the radio or TV and see every day. We're never gonna make any music that alienates us from our core fans."

The title to Daniel Lanois' new album, "For The Beauty Of Wynona," comes from the name of a small town in Ontario, in Canada. But Lanois adds it "can be whatever you want it to be. It could be a figure or quest that you might be obsessive about, the kind of thing you're going to fight for."

The Waterboys release a new album, "Dream Harder," late this month.

Ultravox are releasing a new album, "Revelation," this month in Europe. Founding member Billy Currie has recruited British singer Tony Fenelle for the band.

The next album from Army Of Lovers will be called "The Gods Of Earth And Heaven." The band says the first single, "Israelism," "incorporates elements from five traditional Jewish folk hymns in an updated arrangement...The song should be seen as a powerful statement against racism and bigotry in Europe today."

Dutch guitarist Arjen Lucassen, formerly of the group Vengeance, is playing with the German rock band Accept on its current European tour.

Vader, the first Eastern Bloc death metal band to be signed to a Western label (Relativity Records), is touring the U.S. for the first time. The Polish band just completed a European tour and is now touring the U.S. with Dismember and Deicide. The band's touring in support of the album "The Ultimate Incantation." "A lot of people think Poland isn't the country for death metal, that there couldn't be a good band from eastern Europe, but we'd like to change that opinion," says vocalist Peter.

Alligator Records is releasing the first four records in its Trumpet Series this month, issuing hard-to-find recordings from the Trumpet Records label, which released material from 1950 to 1956. "Trumpet was unlike any other label of its era and in many ways served as a model for Alligator," says Alligator president Bruce Iglauer. "We are not in the business of reissues, but this is wonderful, timeless music that needs to be heard." "Clowining With The World" features Sonny Boy Williamson and piano player Willie Love, with Elmore James and Little Milton Campbell playing guitar on some of the tracks. Big Joe Williams is accompanied by Elmore James and Little Milton on some of the tracks on "Delta Blues — 1951." Also coming out are "Deep South Gospel" featuring the Southern Sons and "Strange Kind Of Feeling" with Jerry "Boogie" McCain, Clayton Love and Tiny Kennedy. More releases are planned later this year including an "Anthology" album and the album "Goin' In Your Direction," featuring Williamson as well as Arthur "Big Boy" Crudup and Bobo "Slim" Thomas.

Scottish band the **Trash Can Sinatras** releases a new album this month, called "I've Seen Everything."

Despite the fact that their 1980s hit "Young At Heart" recently spent some time at the top of the British singles charts, the Bluebells have no plans to get back together. Bobby Bluebell is now a graphic designer, Lawrence Donegan works for the Guardian newspaper in Britain, Russell Irvine is a chef in London, and the McCluskey brothers now have their own group, called the McCluskey Brothers.

Former Motley Crue lead singer Vince Neil says he wasn't fired from the band because of his interest in car racing. "Some people really thought I had given up rock 'n' roll for racing, which I would never do," Neil says. Instead, Neil says he objected to the band's shift to a more blues-oriented sound. "It just wasn't sounding good to me. I'm not a blues singer and Motley is a rock band — not a blues band. I think it's a stupid idea that will alienate the fans."

Cher's daughter, Chastity, will have an album out this summer

Boston band the Swinging Steaks will have a new album out in August (on Capricorn Records). Gary Katz is producing the band's LP in Minneapolis. It will be the follow-up to "Suicide At The Wishing Well," the debut CD the band released on its own label last year.

An Fender guitar autographed by U2 went for \$3,000, at a benefit Los Angeles auction recently. A silver lame concert suit worn by Rod Stewart went for \$2,000 and Michael Jackson's signed "Dangerous" artwork brought \$1,500.

Danzig's new EP, "Thrall-demonsweatlive," will be out at the end of this month (on Def American Recordings).

Booker T & The MG's, who reunited in New York in 1988 to play at the 40th anniversary celebration for Atlantic Records, will have a new album out this fall (on Columbia Records). The MG's were the house band for the Bob Dylan tribute concert at Madison Square Garden last October.

A track from Roxette is the first single from the soundtrack to the "Super Mario Bros." film, which will premiere Memorial Day weekend. The Divinyls, George Clinton, Charles & Eddie, Marky Mark, Extreme, Joe Satriani and Megadeth have songs on the soundtrack, which will also include Queen's "Tie Your Mother Down." Marie Fredriksson of Roxette is only seen from her shoulders up in the accompanying video, because she was very pregnant when the clip was shot in Stockholm, Sweden. Fredriksson gave birth to a baby daughter, Inez Josefin Boylos, on April 29.

Atlanta band Seersucker will have an album out this summer (on Sky Records). The four-member group has been playing together for about a year and includes three members of a band called Dirt. Dave Barbe is producing Seersucker's album in Athens, Georgia. The LP will be called "Pushin' Rope."

San Francisco-area band Green Day is about to begin recording its first album for a major label (Warner Brothers Records). The LP should be out early next year. The band has released two albums and a number of seven-inch singles on a smaller label (Lookout Records). Green Day is currently on tour in Europe.

Tina Turner has her "What's Love Got To Do With It" sound-track album out in mid-June. The LP is to include three new songs, including the first single "I Don't Wanna Fight," which was written by Lulu with Steve DuBerry. Turner begins her first North American tour in six years in Reno, Nevada, on June 6. Lindsey Buckingham and Chris Isaak will be opening for her on some concert dates.

Sting will perform the 2,500-year-old Theater of Ephesus in Istanbul, Turkey, this summer, as part of the 21st Istanbul International Music Festival. Bob Dylan, Joan Baez and Manhattan Transfer will also perform as part of the six-week series. Festival organizers say Sting will be paid \$300,000 for his appearance.

Joe Ely is working on a play with Jimmie Dale Gilmore and artist Terry Allen. Allen's wife, writer and actress Jo Harvey, was asked by a Philadelphia theater group to stage an original work for an annual festival. Harvey based her play on the diary of a prostitute who worked in oil boom towns in the 1940s. "It's a portrait of this incredible underworld that existed at the time," Ely says. "It's when the actual birthplace of honkytonks was happening. It was right after Prohibition, and she writes about going to clubs where Bob Wills and all these other swing bands were playing." Ely is currently touring in support of his tenth album, "Love And Danger," the first LP he's made in Nashville since the late 1970s.

Mandy Smith has auctioned off for charity the engagement ring her ex-husband, Bill Wyman, gave her. She raised about \$23,000 for a London charity, emphasizing that she wants nothing more to do with Wyman. "I have suffered a lot," she says. "I know what it's like and I wanted to give something back."

In an interview with a French magazine, David Bowie denies the allegation of his former wife, Angie, that he had an affair with Mick Jagger. "Mick and I have never had any liaison," Bowie says. "I have nothing really good to say about my exwife or any of the storytellers she hangs around with."

Even though he's a guitar player, Warren Haynes says he kept the guitar solos to a minimum on his solo album, "Tales Of Ordinary Madness." "The guitar has always struck me as powerful and special," Haynes says. "But I am probably more influenced by horn players, particularly saxophone players, than I am by guitarists. I spend a lot of time listening to Cannonball Adderly, John Coltrane and Sonny Rollins." Haynes says that he listened to records by Ray Charles, Otis Redding, Wilson Pickett and the Four Tops when he was a kid, and he was determined to be the first soul singer from Asheville, North Carolina. "I had to sing," Haynes says. "I spent years singing in my room, trying to be a black soul singer."

Paul Rodgers says he never met Muddy Waters when he was alive, though he did see him play at the Marquee Club in London 25 years ago. "I was with Free — a blues band — when I heard Mr. Waters, and I've always done blues-based things," Rodgers says. "But I've never done a blues album before, so it's a first in thats ense." Rodgers says the Rolling Stones' version of "I Just Want To Make Love To You" was his first introduction to the blues. "It was such a strange, exotic feel and I ahd to find out where that music was coming from," he says.

Melbourne, Australia band, Sea Stories, is breaking up.

Michael Hepworth is starting a new band with another former member of the group, drummer Jonathan Williamson.

Don Henley and a Los Angeles neighbor have been named in a lawsuit by another neighbor. The lawsuit claims that Henley and Harry Fox interfered with construction of a house on a public site and that Henley bribed public officials to block its construction.

Broadcast Music Inc., says Paul McCartney's "Yesterday" is the most-played song in the United States. BMI, which monitors radio airplay, says the song has been played over six million times since it was written in 1965. "I'm amazed and delighted," McCartney says. "I never imagined it would become so popular for so long." McCartney says "Yesterday" came to him in a dream. "I woke up with this melody in my head. I had a piano in the room and I quickly laid it down."

When the Stone Temple Pilots were offered the chance to open for Aerosmith, the band turned down the offer. "We didn't feel it would be the right thing for us," says singer Weiland. "We've gotten some flak for it, mostly from people who don't understand what direction we want to go in. I'd rather we define ourselves as individuals rather than ride cottails." Weiland says some people might have thought it "hypocritical to tour with a band who is the sort of epitome of that sex-rock thing. I've got nothing against sex, but there's a big difference between sex and sexism." Weiland says that because of "Sex Type Thing," a song against date rape, people always ask him why he feels so strongly about women's rights. "I feel strongly about everyone's rights," he says. Instead of touring with Aerosmith, Weiland says he's trying to get together a tour with some other bands. "We're putting together a three- or four-band bill. Nothing is etched in stone, but it looks like it will be us and the Butthole Surfers, playing at drive-in theaters across America. The movie screen will have cheesy B-movies playing, and we'll have weenies and burgers and Elvis impersonators."

Alice Donut has canceled a months worth of concert dates because of throat problems being suffered by lead singer Thomas Antona.

Black 47 lead singer and guitarist Larry Kirwan is also a playright. He says he's about to write his third play, "Blood," about the life of Irish union organizer James Connolly, who was executed by the British in 1916. Kirwan's most recent play was "Livepool Fantasy," a fictional story about what might have happened to the Beatles if they hadn't ever hit the big time. In the play, George Harrison ends up being a Jesuit preist, Paul McCartney becomes a Las Vegas lounge act and John Lennon is unemployed. Kirwan married the choreographer of one his plays six years ago and has two sons, aged 5 and 3.

Members of Living Colour appear on Jack DeJohnette's new album, "Music For The Fifth World" (on Manhattan Records).

Johnny Clegg, Lisa Germano, Freedy Johnston and David Baerwald are touring together beginning the middle of this month.

Former Snap lead singer Penny Ford has a self-titled solo album just out. It includes a cover version of Aretha Franklin's "Daydreaming," and a song recorded with Ford's late sister Sharon Redd. Ford was formerly the lead singer for Klymaxx and was a member of the S.O.S. Band for six months before working as a backing vocalist for Chaka Khan.

INXS are unveiling material from their next album on their short North American theater and club tour. There's only one straight-ahead love song on the album, says Michael Hutchence. "There's a lot I wanted to say," he adds. "Life, death, and all of that." Hutchence says one song, "Cut The Roses," is about "all those fascists running around out there." INXS played three sold-out concerts in Perth, Australia, in advance of the tour. They also unveiled a song called "The Gift," from the new album, which was recorded on the Italian island of Capri.

Masters Of Reality have written a song called "Stop The Ameron Express" in an attempt to stop a planned quarry in the countryside of the island of Oahu in Hawaii. The song, recorded in Los Angeles, got airplay on radio stations on the island, and helped stop construction of the quarry. The band visits the island twice a year as special guest performers at the Polo Club. "We're so glad it worked," says guitarist and vocalist Chris Goss. "Now let's put together a celebration gig in Hawaii."

James Brown will receive a medal of honor from the President of Senegal, a former French colony, later this year.

Disco artist Georgio has formed a new record label (G-String Records) which will release a record by rap group Projek X.

A federal bankruptcy judge has cleared the way for release of material from Bob Dylan, Johnny Cash, Charlie Rich, Roy Orbison and Tammy Wynette that was found by a record producer who paid \$50 for the contents of a storage room in Nashville. A judge has rejected a lawsuit filed by Sony Music Entertainment Inc., claiming ownership of the material. Record producer Clark Enslin got 2,800 tapes when he bought what was believed to be a roomful of junk.

A total of 612 people have set a new record for the largest country dance line. In Macon, Georgia, people danced to country music in a store parking lot to best the old world record of 512 participants.

Even though Siobhan Fahey had said the split-up of Shakespear's Sister wasn't permanent, she says she still has no plans to record again with American singer Marci Detroit, who was her partner in the group. Fahey recently had a number one hit in England with a song she co-wrote ten years ago—the Bluebells' "Young At Heart." The single became popular after it was featured in recent television advertisements for Volkswagen.

Phil Collins says his role in the film "And The Band Played On," made him think even more about the risks of AIDS. "I grew up when no one had to fear sex," Collins says. "If I was a kid now, I'd be terrified." Collins has a four-year-old daughter with his present wife, Jill, and has two grown children living with their mother in Vancouver. "My son is 16 and has just started to go out with girls. I've never talked to him about AIDS," Collins says. "It made me stop and think about my 20-year-old daughter. Thank God she's sensible. She's a Guardian Angel and works cleaning up kids' playgrounds. Now she wears huge rubber gloves because she's in there scooping up hypodermic needles."

North Korean leader Kim Jong II, in a meeting with creative artists, urged them not to adopt "the wild and mad electronic music now prevalent in different countries," according to a report by the North Korean news agency. It reports that Kim urged "creation of many more soft and plain songs easy to sing, national in melody and revolutionary and socialistic in content."

In an interview in Spin magazine, Janet Jackson says her sister LaToya has made up the stories about sexual and physical abuse by their father. "I think LaToya is being brainwashed," Janet Jackson says in the interview. "That is my opinion. I think that's an attention-getter for her." In the interview she says that Michael Jackson's interview with Oprah Winfrey showed he's "human, he's not weird, and that he's a goodhearted person." And she blasted Madonna's "Sex" as "a horrible book." "She didn't even sell that many albums. Her last album sold 2 million. They shipped it, but it got shipped back," Jackson says.

A federal judge in New York has declined to order Mariah Carey to give part of her earnings to her stepfather. Joseph Vian of lake Hiawatha, New Jersey, had filed a lawsuit seeking a portion of the money Carey has made since her first album was released in 1990. Vian contended that Carey entered into an oral agreement with him on three separate occasions. But the judge ruled that wasn't enough.

Cher met the president of Armenia during a two-day private aid mission. Cher's late father was Armenian. She brought \$2.75 million in provately donated humanitarian aid to Yerevan.

Australian Trade Minister Peter Cook says the government of Thailand has agreed to act against bootleg cassettes. He says pirate recordings are costing the Australian music industry up to \$7 million a year. "(It's) five or ten million dollars that would be better off in the pockets of the Australian industry and, in the case of Australian performers, in their pockets," Cook says. INXS was one of the bands most subject to bootlegging.

Chantay Savage, the author of CeCe Peniston's "We Got A Love Thang," has her own album coming out at the end of this month (on RCA Records). She wrote eight of the ten songs on the LP.

The mother of disco singer RuPaul has died of cancer at her home in San Diego. Ernestine Charles died just as RuPaul releases the single "Back To My Roots," which opens with him singing, "This is a special shot going out to Mama."

"Roll Wit Tha Flava" is the name of a new album just out (on Flavor Units/Epic Records) featuring a number of different rap acts. Naughty By Nature's "Bring It On" is included as well as tracks by Apache, Freddie Foxxx and a song called "Sounds Of Fattness" by Bigga Sistas. The single from the album, also titled "Roll Wit Tha Flava," features Treach of Naughty By Nature, Chip-Fu of the Fu-Schnickens, Dres of Black Sheep, Queen Latifah and D-Nice.

Gloria Estefan and her husband, Emilio, have received the Alexis de Tocqueville Award from the United Way of Dade County, Florida. The award, named after a French historian who wrote about American democracy, recognized the couple's Hurricane Relief Concert which raised \$2 million, as well as other work they have done for charity. "The one thing I learned most from my mother and grandmother was the most beautiful thing in the world is the feeling one gets from helping others," Gloria Estefan said. "It's tough to get an award for something that feels so good. But I'll take it."

Michael Jackson is being sued for \$60 million by a New York entertainment company which claims Jackson is reneging on a promise to let them make a Beatles rap album. 57 Entertainment Inc., has filed a lawsuit in New York claiming that the ATV Music publishing company had agreed to let Beatles songs be used on a "Beatle Rap Project." "Notwithstanding his contractual obligations, Jackson unilaterally, and without any justification whatsoever, repudiated the contract," the lawsuit says. "The project has taken a difficult turn since Jackson and ATV have denied any association," says entertainment attorney Eric Kolper, one of two partners in 57 Entertainment.
