




## STABBING WESTWARD, "WHAT DO I HAVE TO DO" COLUMBIA/CRG





## THE HARD REPORT

## Note from the Publisher

As as been widely rumored this week, yes, we are making some serious changes here at The Hard Report. Actually, we embarked on a substantially new direction starting last summer, and the revamped publication you now hold in your hands is the end result of that thinking.

We initiated our Report Card feature for several reasons. Our primary motivation was the fact that BDS has obviously rendered most trade charts obsolete. It had become totally apparent to us that though our AAA and Metal charts were still important within their specific formats and label departments, the Monitor's charts were really all that mattered to most of the industry.

So when faced with the challenge of how to most directly affect programmer perception of music for airplay, we came up with the Report Card concept. Want to dramatically expand a particular programmer's scope of awareness on a piece of product? Ask fifty or sixty other similarly positioned radio stations how that record is performing. Is it testing? Is it requesting? How's the retail? Staff regard? Personal confidence? Label commitment? We knew that if we could persuade our panel to deal with that sort of in-depth, direct questioning that the answers would be extremely valuable. And frankly, we knew that in many instances those responses could provide a lot more insight to both radio and records than any chart could.

As any regular HR reader knows, we've been at the task for six months now, and the Report Card has evolved into what I feel is one of the magazine's most compelling features. Read all of the phony, stroke-driven coverage out of Cherry Hill or L.A.. Then check out what our programmer panel has to say. Sure, there's the occasional bullshit comment. But, by and large, you won't find anything close to that level of honesty anywhere else in print.

I've been at this since 1977, and perhaps because I've had to write my fair share of "reviews," I find the Report Card's candor totally stimulating. I also think it adds immeasureably to any reader's understanding of what's really happening with music on the radio. I can also say without exaggeration that participating programmers universally share that feeling. After all, it's them the hype machine has been focused on for so long.

I won't say the section doesn't have its detractors. A number of label people - some old friends of mine - have a real problem with the fact that we're printing opinion, some of it occasionally negative. As a former PD myself, I know that any savvy programmer has a sense of what's really happening long before momentum is reflected in that station's report. We think sharing those thoughts is important. Besides, programmers put their asses and their paychecks on the line with every record they add. Who is better qualified to publicly offer their observations on how said inventory is performing?

Our new mission statement here at The Hard Report? Furthering the industry's most honest and open inter-station music programming dialogue sections — COR, AAA, Alternative and Hard Rock. Continue to expect the Hard interview, all that music news you know and love, and dramatically expanded music programming dialogue in the weeks to come. Ideas or suggestions? Don't hesitate to call. As we say in the biz...

Simple Minds lead singer Jim Kerr and his wife of four years, British actress Patsy Kensit are splitting up. "Regrettably Jim Kerr and Patsy Kensit have decided to separate," said a statement issued on behalf of Kerr. "They have no plans whatsoever to divorce and will remain friends and devoted parents to their son James." Kensit was photographed putting her hand down Michael Hutchence's pants at the MTV awards in Paris in November. Kensit's next film role is in "Angels & Insects," based on a novella by A.S. Byatt. She previously starred in "Absolute Beginners" with David Bowie and "Lethal Weapon II." Kerr was previously married to Pretenders lead singer Chrissie Hynde, and they had a daughter, Yasmin, who's now 10 years old. Kensit married Dan Donovan of Big Audio Dynamite when she was 20, after being introduced to him by Mick Jones of the Clash, but they broke up two years later blaming work pressures. At age 15, she was already going out with Gary Kemp of Spandau Ballet. Kensit recently told a British men's magazine that Kerr is "big." "But I don't know if he's the biggest in rock," she told the magazine FHM.

The **Beach Boys** have joined veteran British band **Status Quo** for a new version of their 1960s hit "Fun Fun Fun." The band flew to London's Brixton Academy for a live performance to promote the track, the first single from Status Quo's 30th anniversary album "Don't Stop," made up of covers of other group's songs. "The band first met the Beach Boys in Berlin in 1994 when they were both performing at a huge farewell party to mark the departure of British, American and French troops from the city," says a spokesman for the British band. Status Quo recorded instrumental parts for the track in Britain and sent them to the U.S. so the Beach Boys could add their vocals. There are plans for a home video of the London concert to aid a British music charity.

First lady Hillary Rodham Clinton says "really loud" music helps her cope with controvesries surrounding her. In an interview in the Chicago Sun-Times newspaper, she says President Bill Clinton gave her **Carly Simon**'s "Clouds In Your Coffee" CD for Christmas. "I turn that one to the highest decibel you can imagine and go around singing and beating the table in time to the music," she says.

The attorney for **Jerry Garcia**'s widow says there isn't enough money to pay off the \$35 million in claims that have been filed against his estate. Max Gutierrez Jr., representing Deborah Koons Garcia, told a Marin County probate court hearing that entertainment attorney Robert Gordon has been hired as a consultant to increase the value of Garcia's estate by selling music rights and artwork. "If all of the claims were paid as filed, then it would bankrupt the estate," Gutierrez said. He said Gordon had "added significant value" to the estate of **Janis Joplin**, whose "Mercedes Benz" song was used to promote sales of the car of the same name despite some people's objections. Claims against Garcia's estate include \$15.6 million and \$12 million from two art agents, one of them who claimed to be Garcia's manager, and a \$21,000 claim by Garcia's high school sweetheart who says he broke a 1992 promise to marry her.

Attorneys for two teenagers charged with a triple murder in Washington state are blaming **Silverchair**'s song "Israel's Son," from the "Frogstomp" album. They say Nicholaus McDonald and Brian Bassett had been listening to the song before and after killing Bassett's parents and five-year-old brother. It's not the first time the Australian band's lyrics have drawn controversy. Singer and guitarist **Daniel Johns** had earlier been criticized for a song called "Suicidal Dreams." The band's U.S. record label issued a statement saying that "to assign another purpose to 'Israel's Son' is to abuse its meaning and the intent of its author." Silverchair are to play a concert in Hollywood on February 4 and then go on the road with the **Red Hot Chili Peppers** for ten dates.

**Paul McCartney** has licensed the use of one of his songs for television for the first time. "Put It There," from his 1989 album "Flowers In The Dirty," will be used on the series "Party Of Five."

**Lou Reed** mentions talk show host Rush Limbaugh and Republican presidential candidate Bob Dole on the track "Sex With Your Parents (Motherfucker)" on his album "Set The Twilight Reeling" set for release next month. The 11-song LP was recorded in a studio Reed built at his New York City apartment.

Bono and Adam Clayton of U2 narrowly escaped injury in Negril when Jamaican police fired upon a seaplane owned by Jimmy Buffett moments after the band members and Bono's wife had disembarked. Jamaican police said they thought the plane was being used by a drug smuggler. Bono, his wife Ali, and Clayton were in a small boat being taken ashore when police fired at the plane because they wrongly believed it had no clearance to land. The U2 members and their families were about 250 yards from the plane when the shooting began. Buffett, who was not on the plane at the time, was given a severe warning from police. But Buffett says the pilot had received clearance from the nearest airport to land in the bay. Jonathan Morrison, assistant superintendent at the Jamaica Police Information Center said the incident was "not quite regular." "We're not clear why it would have been necessary to shoot," he says. "We're still gathering information." The Jamaican Minister for Internal Security has apologized and launched a full investigation.

**Sting** says the drug Ecstasy should be legalized. "Then we can make sure what we take is safe and that it is Ecstasy," he was quoted as saying in a Swedish newspaper. "If we leave it to the criminals, they can put anything they want into the pill." Sting said he wasn't recommending the drug, but said he had tried it a couple of times "in a nice environment." He said it was an "interesting" drug. "In England, millions of Ecstasy pills are consumed every week. Three or four have died in God knows how many years. Teenagers notice the statistics. They are prepared to take the risks." In a subsequent interview with British radio, he said the whole Ecstasy problem shouldn't be "left in the hands of criminals." "Our government needs to tackle it and not be afraid of it," he told Independent Radio News. "There's a hysteria and a panic about it which is very frightening and it's not serving our young people." Sting, who has six children, says he isn't backing down from

his legalization plea, even though it has been widely criticized in the U.K.

A federal court judge has suggested that bootleg **Ozzy Osbourne** t-shirts seized at his concerts be sent to a Third World country or to Bosnia. U.S. District Judge Zita Weinshienk in Denver said it would make more sense to send the shirts to "Bosnia or some other country abroad which could use some clothing" instead of simply destroying them.

**Tori Amos** says her new album, "Boys For Pele," is like a novel. "It's the story of the descent of a woman to gain her passion and gain her compassion and not hate the thing that taught her that," she says. Amos says she'd been "trying to find this energy current in anything I could, whether it be the men in my life or fame or attention or whatever." The new LP was recorded in a church in Ireland. The Pele of the album's title is the Hawaiian volcano goddess.

Nova Scotia band **Sloan** are recording tracks in Halifax for their next album.

**David Bowie**, his record label and his management firm are being sued by his former record company (Savage Records) for \$80 million. Bowie's former label says the defendants conspired to withhold money it was owed, forcing it into bankruptcy in 1993.

The **Rolling Stones** have cancelled plans to tour South America and Asia this year. Their "Voodoo Lounge" world tour was to have resumed in March in South America, but a concert promoter was reportedly unable to book enough dates to offset the costs of subsequent concerts in Asia.

**Tricky**'s next album, being recorded in Jamaica, should be out in late spring. The "Nearly God" record will feature **Damon Albam** of **Blur**, **Bjork**, **Terry Hall** and **Neneh Cherry**. Tricky is also planning to record a single with ragga musician **Capleton**.

**Dolores O'Riordan** of the **Cranberries** has teamed up with **Marianne Faithfull** for a cover of Faithfull's "Dreamin' My Dreams," produced by **Van Morrison** and **Gavin Friday**. The track is to benefit the Women Against Aids charity in Britain.

Oasis were the big winners in Britain's annual Brat music awards, given out by Britain's New Musical Express as a counterpoint to the Brit awards which will be given out next month. Oasis were named Best Band, Best LP ("(What's The Story) Morning Glory?"), Best Single ("Wonderwall") and Best Live Band. Pulp won the award for Best Live Act for their performance at the Glastonbury Festival. They also won for Best Video for their song "Common People." Paul Weller, formerly of the Jam and the Style Council, was named Best Solo Artist, while the Prodigy were named Best Dance Act. Robson & Jerome's "I Believe" got the Worst Record Of The Year award, while Tony Crean was given a Special Award For Services Beyond The Call Of Duty for putting together the Bosnian benefit "Help" album. Black Grape's "Reverend Black Grape" was named NME Single of the Year, while "Maxinquaye" by Tricky was NME's Album of the Year.

**Supergrass** won for best performance on BBC Radio 1's Evening Session and also won the Miller Genuine Draft Best New Band award.

The **Afghan Whigs** release a new album in March called "Black Love," said to be similar to the band's "Gentlemen" LP.

**Kermit** of **Black Grape** will join the band on their upcoming tour after spending time in a Manchester, England, hospital for blood poisoning he suffered in November.

**Bjork** is working on a "Red Hot & Rio" AIDS charity record centering on Latin American music. She's planning to sing a piece by the composer Schoenberg and is spending eight hours a day training her voice. She says her next LP will be "like flirting with a Latin jazz combo."

**Lenny Kravitz** begins a North American tour in San Francisco on January 26 as "Can't Get You Off My Mind" is released as the latest single from his "Circus" album. Kravitz recently returned from a tour of Japan which included seven consecutive sold-out shows in Tokyo.

**Pulp** lead singer **Jarvis Cocker** duets with **Miki Berenyi** of **Lush** on a track on Lush's album coming out in March. The track is called "Ciao!" and is described as an "anti-love song" between the two.

Joni Mitchell and French composer Pierre Boulez will be awarded this year's Polar music prize in Sweden in May. Each will be given \$147,500 as part of the award given out by the Royal Swedish Academy of Music. "In the course of a long career, Joni Mitchell has achieved world renown for a many-sided artistic achievement distinguished by personality of expression, ambitious lyrics and technical perfection," organizers say.

A rock group called Babylon Zoo has debuted on the British singles chart at number one with the fastest-selling debut single in the country's history. "Spaceman" sold over 500,000 copies in its first week of release, knocking George Michael's first single in four years out of first place, selling ten times as many copies as Michael's track. The track soared to instant popularity after it was featured in a Levi's jeans television commercial in Britain. Babylon Zoo are led by a 24-year-old singer named Jas Mann, who is half-Asian and half-Sioux (American Indian) and lives in Britain. Their single outsold the total number of copies sold of the number two through number ten singles in the U.K. Babylon Zoo are the second artist to enter the chart at number one with a debut single. The last act to do so was Whigfield, whose "Saturday Night" shot straight to number one in September 1994. Babylon Zoo are planning on releasing a follow-up single soon and a debut album.

**Moby** says he's shifting from dance music to guitar rock on his next album which will have "nothing electronic or dance about it. "If I had to make a more electronic record like the last one, I don't think it would be very good, because my heart wouldn't be in it," he says. "This is causing a lot of trouble at the record company, because the last record and all the singles sold pret-

ty well. There's a good chance that this next record will alienate everybody. Rock people won't like it because they'll think, 'Oh, he's coming from a dance background,' and dance people will feel betrayed."

Australian singer and soap opera star **Dannii Minogue**, the sister of **Kylie Minogue**, has reportedly undergone a \$5,000 breast enlargement operation in London, increasing her bust size from 34B to 34D. London's Sun tabloid newspaper said the operation follows her split from Australian husband Julian McMahon, as part of a makeover which also includes major weight loss and blonde hair. Minogue is now hosting a weekend children's television show in Britain called "It's Not Just Saturday." She's posed for the Australian edition of Playboy magazine and is now considering a showing off her new figure in the American edition.

Researchers in Berlin have invented a square CD that British record executives are already touting as a novelty that will appeal to collectors. But British science writer Barry Fox notes that a square CD will have less surface area available for recorded music. "We're very excited about it, they've got great potential," says Gennaro Castaldo, a spokesman for Britain's HMV record chain. "I think there will be a great demand for them." Interest in a square CD was prompted by two German students who said they cut a **Kylie Minogue** CD with a hand saw and were surprised to find that the disc still played normally. CDs play from the center, and the portions cut by the students at Berlin's Free University didn't affect the recorded music. "Now we ask ourselves everyday why did no one think of this before?" one of the students asks.

"Limbo" is the tentative title for **Throwing Muses**' upcoming album, recorded in New Orleans, set for release in April. Meanwhile, **Kristin Hersh** has written half the songs for a solo acoustic album she's releasing later this year.

**Pamelo Mounka**, one of the most famous singers from the Congo has died from diabetes at age 51, according to a hospital in Brazzaville. Mounka, whose real name was Nbemba Yvon, started his musical career in the 1960s with the **Africa Fiesta** orchestra of Zaire with **Tabu Ley**.

Scottish singer **Sheena Easton** has adopted a second child, a girl named Skylar, just days after she was born in Los Angeles. Easton adopted a baby boy named Jake two years ago. Easton moved to the U.S. about 15 years ago.

A new stage show called "Lost Highway — The Music and The Legend of **Hank Williams**" will open May 2 in Nashville and will run at Nashville's Ryman Auditorium through October 26.

Police in Aiken, South Carolina, dropped a domestic violence charge against **James Brown** the day after his wife was buried. Adrienne Brown had alleged that Brown beat her last October, but withdrew her claim the following week.

**Young MC**'s father, Cleveland Young, has been sentenced to 15 years probation for the murder of his wife. Lee Circuit Judge William Nelson, in Ft. Myers, Florida, gave a light sentence because Young had been suffering from depression. He could have been sentenced to 7 1/2 years in prison for manslaughter for stabbing his wife in the couple's home in November 1994. The judge did order Young to continue to receive counseling for his mental health.

**Bonnie Pointer** has asked prosecutors in Los Angeles not to press charges that her husband struck her and her sister in an incident on Christmas Eve. Pointer says she wants the matter dropped so she and husband Jeffrey Bownes can finish work on a new solo album. Prosecutors say they'll probably bring him to trial on charges despite Pointer's request.

Composer Andew Lloyd Webber says the musical score to the film version of "Evita" is being changed because Madonna doesn't have the vocal range for the original score. "She has shifted down a key," he says. Madonna's driver and secretary were briefly detained by police in Buenos Aires, Argentina, after their car struck a young man outside the hotel where Madonna was staying for the filming Alan Parker's movie version of "Evita." The victim did not appear to have been seriously injured and police said no charges would be filed, according to a spokesperson for one of Madonna's production firms. A recent public opinion poll carried out by Argentine television channel ATC revealed that only 237 of those asked supported Parker's choice of Madonna for the role, while twice as many disagreed. Even Argentinian president Carlos Menem has expressed reservations about Madonna playing Eva Peron. It was in the late 1940s that the wife of then-president Peron worked passionately for the working class of Argentina. She died in 1952 and has become a legend in the country. Madonna has met with Peron historians and former party officials to prepare for the role. Both the singer and director Parker have promised to make a film that will not cause offense to the memory of Eva Person.

**Whitney Houston** has signed a two-year, multi-million-dollar film deal with Disney, which will allow her to produce and star in movies for theaters and television.

A Los Angeles judge has ordered **2Pac Shakur** jailed for violating his probation for an assault and battery conviction in 1994. Municipal Court Judge Gregory Alarcon ordered Shakur into custody after a hearing that concluded he missed a deadline for putting in 15 days of work with a California Department of Transportation road work crew. Bond was set at \$52,000. The same judge set a February 14 hearing to determine if Shakur committed other probation violations when he was arrested in April 1994 in Hollywood and charged with marijuana possession and suspicion of carrying a concealed pistol. The assault and battery conviction stemmed from attacking a music video director on the set. He was given a 15-day jail term for that conviction and ordered to serve 45 days of community service.

Lush have been recording with Pulp's Jarvis Cocker. The track, "Ciao!," will be featured on the new Lush album which will be released via 4AD in March. Lush singer Miki Berenvi says the song was originally supposed to be a duet between her and drummer Chris Acland. According to Berenyi: "The reason that song came about was because Chris wanted to sing on the album. He said, 'Justin (Welch) gets to sing on Elastica Records, I want to sing.' I remember listening to 'Jackson' by Nancy Sinatra which is a couple slagging each other off and then I wrote the song, but Chris said he was only joking. So we had this song that was a duet and no one to sing it and someone mentioned Jarvis." Lush's new single "Single Girl" has made the Top 30 of the UK Charts... Nick Cave and The Bad Seeds' new album Murder Ballads will be released via Mute on February 5. The full track listing: "Song Of Joy" (a reinterpretation of the standard "Stagger Lee"), "Henry Lee" (a duet with Polly Harvey), "Lovely Creature," "Where The Wild Roses Grow," "The Curse of Millhaven," "The Kindness Of Strangers," "Crow Jane," "O'Malley's Bar" and "Death Is Not The End" (a Bob Dylan cover). In addition to Polly Harvey, Kylie Minogue, Anita Lane and Shane MacCowan are also featured on the album... Oasis' Noel Gallagher says he expects the band to win all the five Brit Awards they have been nominated for (Best Album, Best British Group, Best Video, Best Single, and Best Producer). Gallagher says the awards will not see the renewal of the hostile rivalry between Blur (nominated for four awards) and Oasis: "That's just the media. It's finished now anyway, all over. They had their year last year and we'll have our year now." (Nevertheless, the bands will both release singles on February 12. Oasis' single is "Don't Look Back In Anger," while Blur's single is "Stereotypes.") The Brits ceremony takes place on February 19 at London's Earls Court. Elsewhere, Edwyn Collins, who received a nomination for "A Girl Like You" as Best Single, says he is delighted: "The album has sold 800,000 and the single about two million. At 36 you can't really imagine yourself as some kind of rebel but, as our advert says, `Every Pariah Has His Day." David Bowie will receive an Outstanding Contribution Award... Rage Against The Machine guitarist Tom Morello has been speaking to Kerrang! magazine about the three year gap between the band's forthcoming album Evil Empire and their self-titled debut: "Different band members have their different interests that they've been pursuing. But principally, the main reason for the delay between records was trying to find the right combination of our very diverse influences that would make a record that we were all happy with and that was great. That was a long process." Morello also says he has written a book featuring short biographies of revolutionary figures. The new album was recorded between November and December in Hollywood... **Kraftwerk** will not be playing at the spring dance festival, The Tribal Gathering. The band was approached but turned down the chance. Organisers, The Mean Fiddler and

Universe have denied reports that they approached the Beastie Boys to headline the event, which will feature at least 25 artists,... Howie B, the influential Scottish hiphop artist who has worked with U2, Bjork and Brian Eno, will release his debut solo album Music For Babies via Polydor on February 26. Talking to the New Musical Express, **Howie B**, who is currently working on "grooves and ideas" for U2's forthcoming album says he did not ask anyone to guest on the album: "When you're working with other people, even though you're having great conversations with people that you can feed off later, you're giving all the time. And that can be frustrating. But it's great working with people and it's great working on your own too." The album was recorded in Spain and Howie B says he could see the African Coast from the studio... Northern Uproar singer Leon Meya has been called up by the Spanish Army for national service. However, it seems unlikely that the 17 year old singer, who lives in the UK, will have to go. Speaking to the New Musical Express, he says, "I went home for Christmas and I got this thing from the Spanish Ministry of Defense. It was sent on December 21st and they wanted me to join up on the 22nd. I lived in Spain for the first five years of my life, but that was it and I thought there's no way I'm going into this at all. I told me mam and got her to phone them. Me mam phoned up and she had a bit of a do with the fella." Meya will have to go to the Spanish Consulate on his 18th birthday to formerly exclude himself from national service. Elsewhere, the band, who have been receiving strong reviews from the UK weekly music press release a new single "From A Window" via the Independent Heavenly on January 22. They are currently on their first headlining tour of the UK... Credit To The Nation, a UK rap act, will release their second album Daddy Always Wanted Me To Grow A Pair Of Wings via One Little Indian on February 12th. The single "Mad Dog" will follow on February 26... Frank Black has been talking to the New Musical Express about his admiration for science fiction writer Ray Bradbury, "To grow up reading someone's books and then getting to see them speak at another time is somehow resonant, there's a catharsis, or whatever. I had to write a song. I don't know it there's one thing running through everything he's written that's echoed in my own feelings. I just like some of the things he's said. Stuff about war being a masculine trait of the human race specifically perpetuated by men, that maybe space or people going into space could replace war. And he's a real L.A. guy, and maybe in my own kind of pseudo-library way I'm making Los Angeles and California and the Pacific my muse. That's what I like to sing about." Black's new album is called The Cult Of Ray... Dub War's new single is "Enemy Maker," available via Earache. The band will tour the UK through January and February... New Order, Ultramarine and The Cocteau Twins are amongst artists who have contributed exclusive tracks to the latest in the Volume series of CDs. Each edition features a magazine con-

taining interviews with the artists featured and Volume 15 has just been released... Ride, who recently announced they have split, will release a new single "Black Nite Crash" b/w "Nothing Lasts For Ever," "Slave" and "A Trip Down Ronnie Lane" via Creation on February 12th. The lead track is taken from the band's final album Taranula. Ride has no plans for any live dates, and it is unclear whether they will promote the releases... Therapy?'s drummer Fyfe Ewing has left the band. The band's Andy Cairns and Michael McKeegan are currently auditioning replacements. It is unclear whether the band's February tour of the USA will go ahead. Therapy?'s record company A&M say the split was due to the "rigors of touring" and that it was "amicable." However, there were rumors of a rift in the group as long ago as last spring... James singer Tim Booth has been working with former Suede guitarist Bernard Butler. The duo will release an album under the name of The Bad Angels in March or April this year. Angelo Badalamenti, most famous for his work on Blue Velvet and Twin Peaks produced the project which features Brian Eno guesting on backing vocals on some tracks. James are currently working on songs with producer Stephen Hague. An album will be released late this year or early in 1997... Rough Trade, the London record store, will celebrate its 20th anniversary this year. The store is putting on a series of shows at the London Suberanea venue from March 17-22, including a Creation Records acoustic evening, a Go! Discs evening and a Heavenly Records night. Money from the shows will go to charity. The Rough Trade store opened in 1976, and was important because it stocked US and British punk, reggae and avant garde music at a time when most stores were ignoring such material. The operation grew to include a record distribution company and a label, most famous for releasing The Smiths... Coil, the avant garde band, have hit out at the producers of the hit movie Seven. Coil remixed Nine Inch Nails' "Closer" for the opening credits of the movie, which is currently number one at the UK box office. However, the screen credit is to Howard Shore, who wrote the film's incidental music. Coil do not feature on the end credits either and the track is not featured on the soundtrack album. In a statement, Coil say: "It's one thing to be underground and unknown, but the situation between New Line Cinema (the film's producers) and Seven is ridiculous and needs redressing." Coil are currently working on the score to a new movie Frisk... The Wedding Present release a six-track minialbum Mini this week via Cooking Vinyl Records... Billie Ray Martin releases her debut solo album Deadline For My Memories (east/west) this week... Rocket From The Crypt have been picking up rave reviews in the UK for their Scream Dracula Scream album. The band have been on their first tour of the UK and the group's guitarist ND told UK Music News he thought the press attention was increasing pressure on the band to produce a strong live show... Moose return this week with a new album Live A Little And Love A Lot (Play It Again Sam Records)... Dr. Robert, former frontman with the Blow Monkeys, releases his debut solo album Realms Of Gold via Permanent Records this week. He will play a London show at the Garage on January 31. A new single "The Coming Of Grace" will be in stores on February 12th... Police have called for the closure of a south London nightclub, Club UK. On January 13th, 18 year old Andreas Bouzis collapsed at the club after taking Ecstasy. Paramedics were called, but Bouzis later died in the hospital. It is the second raver that died after attending Club UK in two years. Police say they want the venue's license revoked, although a spokesman admitted this might just move the problem elsewhere. A statement from the club, who employ 'undercover' security staff, says: "The club, and indeed the industry generally, has gone on record on more than one occasion stating its anti-drugs policy. It is increasingly difficult for individuals to attempt to deal and/or misuse illegal substances in this venue and indeed in may other venues nationally. Responsibility or blame can therefore in no way be attached to any club where the individual misuses illegal substances away from the premises."... Oasis are disputing former drummer Tony McCarroll's version of his sacking. McCarroll, who is suing the band for loss of earnings, says he was sacked by the band's guitarist Bonehead. However, Oasis say the band's manager Marcus Russell formerly told him he was no longer part of the band on April 28, and that the conversation with Bonehead took place later on the same day... Banco De Gaia, influential UK dance act, have a new single "Kincajou" available via Planet Dog... Duffy's latest single is "Needle Mythology" (Indolent)... Knownothing are a band worth checking for in the import bins. The south London guitar group's debut album The Room Where Everything Happens At Once has just been released via World Domination.


