Tonic, "Open Up Your Eyes" Polydor USA/A&M

For a brand new band to pack up this many early adds at rock radio, it had better be pretty friggin' radio friendly — and that's how "...Eyes" locked up all those outta the box ears. It's #1 Most Added at Active rock, with a number of positive OTB comments from programmers in the ballot box already. WRIF's Doug Podell, "I think it's got a great sound. It's strong at night right now"... WHMH's Scott Klohn, "If this isn't Rockin' 101 music, I don't know what is! Great rock with an edge"... KIOZ's Greg Stevens, "They will work the way Collective Soul works. A very mainstream kind of rock song"... KRXQ's Curtiss Johnson, "I was before the box for this one. I really like this record. I have seen too many records that were similar in nature just become big time hits"... and from KTUX's Mojo Mason, "This sounds great, and we have good expectations. It's my pick of the week, a great hook."

Good potential scores... Seeing a slight improvement in the **Goo Goo Dolls**... Lots of calls on the new **Kenny Wayne Shepherd**. People love this guy. Just that different sounding roots stuff they like, especially a male intensive audience... Not sure if the **Porno For Pyros** is

us... The **Primitive Radio Gods** might be too pop... **Smashing Pumpkins**' "**Tonight Tonight**" has about reached its peak. I was expecting a bit more, but I'm not unhappy... Early test potential for "**Burden In My Hand**" is huge... Looking at the **Spacehog**... **Sponge** is getting calls.... A solid first week of testing on **The Badlees**, moving up... **The Hunger** is staring to research very well for us... We like the **Zakk Wylde**.

Pantera's "Suicide Note #1"... Porno For Pyros' "Tahitian Moon" is at the top of the heap... We're not considering Primitive Radio Gods' "Standing..."... Prong's "Rude Awakening" is not very active... Starting to see Scorpions' "Wild Child" improve. It moved up this week. In town next week... Screaming Trees is a band we've had on-and-off luck with within the past. We'll give "All I Know" a shot... Sepultura's "Ratamahatta" doesn't seem to be creating the kind of buzz I was hoping for... I like Solution A.D.'s "Fearless." We're keeping an eye on it... The burn is getting up there on Soundgarden's "Pretty Noose." Still fairly positive... The burn on STP's "Trippin'..." has increased quite a bit in the last couple of weeks... Based on everyone else's reports, we are expecting The Hunger's "Vanishing Cream" to do well... Tonic's "Open Up Your Eyes" will work the way Collective Soul works. A very mainstream kind of rock song.

Butthole Surfers' "Pepper" is huge. One of the biggest phone records we play... I think Green Day's "Walking Contradiction" is a big maybe... Hazies are doing well, and testing in the mid teens. "Skin & Bones" sounds like it's really happening based on its own merits... Kicking Harold's "I'll Kill You" is not bad for a developing band... Metallica's "Ain't My Bitch" is huge, but "2X4" is just as big for me... Ozzy Osbourne's "I Just

Want You" has kind of hit the wall... Slowly but surely with Pantera's "Suicide Note #1." Not a whole lot of reaction yet... Porno For Pyros' "Tahitian Moon" is too Alternative... Primitive Radio Gods' "Standing..." is a huge Alternative record, but not sure if it is an Active Rock record... Prong's "Rude Awakening" is a lot stronger than "Snap Your Fingers"... I don't think Spacehog's "Cruel To Be Kind" is that strong of a follow-up... Stabbing Westward's "Shame" sounded great live when they were here for our Rockfest... I like Super 8's "King Of The World." It just sounds fabulous... The Hunger's "Vanishing Cream" is Top 10 in call-out after 11 weeks.

PD Harry Guscott/WRUF Gainesville



Gin Blossoms' "Day Job" is very popular with the females, doing well enough with males... Goo Goo Dolls' "Long Way Down" is building. It actually is starting to head in a little bit... We do get requests for the Hazies' "Skin & Bones," but they are relatively local. Holding their own. No great success story... We're using Hootie & The Blowfish's "Tuckers Town" to cume some Top 40 audience, or for a little familiarity... Imperial Drag's "Boy Or A Girl" is over... There's almost too much airplay on Metallica's

"Until It Sleeps." Huge and getting bigger... Big phones on Nada Surf's "Popular." This record is going to be huge... Pomo For Pyros' "Tahitian Moon" is gone this week... Primitive Radio Gods is building in response. I think Columbia's gonna get that record. There's some really neat stuff on that album. I have a whole different feeling about that band after hearing the album... Spacehog's "Cruel To Be Kind" is building. I feel very good about this song. I think this is may be getting lost in the shuffle... Very positive reaction on **Sponge**'s "Wax Ecstatic." | think they've got a hit here... We just added Stabbing Westward's "Shame." I don't get it... Super 8's "King Of The World" is performing fairly well, nighttime only. I would like to see it develop a little further... Seeing some neat stuff on The Hunger's "Vanishing Cream," no negs whatsoever... **Ugly Americans** are the cross between The Spin Doctors and The Grateful Dead. I like "Vulcan Death Grip," it's refreshing and it's fun... Wallflowers' "6th Avenue Heartache" is building, but with upper demos. It's really about 30 and above.

APD Mark Thompson/WYSP Philadelphia

Cracker's "Nothing To Believe In" is hanging in there. Research is holding its own, but it could go either way... Giving the Goo Goo Dolls' "Long Way Down" a couple more weeks... The King's X is hooky. We're getting lots of requests, but I can't get it to test... Metallica's "Ain't My Bitch" is huge... Getting fairly good phones on Pantera's "Suicide Note #1." We're primarily running it at night as a public service announcement... We're giving the Scorpions as much exposure as possible. "Wild Child" is a C record... Not seeing the phones lighting on fire for the Sponge yet... My gut says "Shame" is a great track for Stabbing Westward... Massive testing on STP's "Trippin'...". No burn. One of the current tracks we're going to be hanging onto for a very long time... "Vanishing Cream" is huge — my number one testing record... "Wire" is a good follow-up track to "Sister," but it's too early to get a read... Zakk Wylde's "Between Heaven & Hell" is doing great, coming up very nicely in research.

PD Gregg Steele/WZTA Miami

The Butthole Surfers is really young, but I'd imagine it will do alright... Virtually nothing on "Day Job."... Getting a really positive start on "Tahitian Moon." Requests are actually slower than we'd hoped, but testing is coming along quite nicely... Just added the Primitive Radio Gods. This could be a big hit... Prong's "Rude Awakening" just won't happen, it's too aggressive... For me personally, I really hope the Screaming Trees' track is something that breaks through for them. They've been underrated for far too long... "Fearless" is kind of a cool song, but we don't hear it as a hit yet... "Burden In My Hand" had not reacted instantly as we've been told it has with other people. I really like the sound, and am anticipating increasing the spins... "Wax Ecstatic" doesn't strike us as important to the audience as it is to us personally. We really like Sponge, and we did some fabulous things with them, and we think it's cool... I think "Moon June Spoon" has the potential to be the biggest hit on the **Spot** album. We've seen some decent reaction... Stabbing Westward's "Shame" has been getting some phones, but not in volume... STP's "Trippin'..." looks pretty decent, but not great. Nice start, but a little unfamiliar... "Vanishing Cream" sounds very reminiscent of Saigon Kick, but when it gets rocking its rocks... We would really like to follow up The Nixons, and "Wire" is something we're looking at.

PD Pat Dawsey/ZROC Dallas

We're playing the 311 at night. We're starting to get some phones, and seeing some sales in various markets... Huge phones on "Pepper." If it's not #1 it's Top 3, and it just moved from light to heavy. It will probably have a quick burn, so take advantage... "Leave Me Alone" is a medium and I don't think the movie will have the legs to carry the soundtrack... We haven't really gotten anything on the Dada yet. Maybe we'll be looking at moving on. I still think it has a fantastic sound... When "Walking Contradiction" comes on, if people like Green Day they'll keep it on. If they're sick and tired, then they'll turn it off. It's mainly a band thing... The Imperial Drag hasn't really bowled us over... I think the Kicking Harold track, "I'll Kill You," is a potential smash. It's very catchy. The fact that it's mid-tempo makes it something that could work for everybody... Getting excellent response on the Nada Surf. "Popular" isn't as big of a request item as we expected, but on certain given days I would put it in the Top 5 range... There was an initial buzz and anticipation for the Porno

For Pyros, but right now it's kind of maintaining.... The **Sepultura** is somewhat of a departure for us... We just purely look at "**Gold Dust Woman**" as "Courtney's in the news," so we added it from that perspective... Gonna wait and see on "**Wire**." I have been on every track on the **Nixons**' album, and I know that on a sales basis "Sister" has done really well. We've never had a really over-the-top story of success.

PD Curtiss Johnson/KRXO Sacramento



I've got great long-term testing on **7 Mary 3**'s "**My My**"... **Dada** is pretty unfamiliar, but fair results... The **Goo Goo Dolls** just won't burn. Still one of my Top 5 as far as call-out goes... "**Skin & Bones**" is actually doing pretty well. The call-out shows it is a decent performer for males, but a great female record. I hear I'm not the only one getting those results... Great phone response to **Kenny Wayne Shepherd's** "**Aberdeen**"... I'm just not hearing the

Primitive Radio Gods for a rock station... Prong sounds great, but "Rude Awakening" seems to be overshadowed by all those majors that are out there... I doubt that we'll play the Sepultura... We expect the Smashing Pumpkins will be a little polar. That blue collar harder-rocking male probably won't like this... I'm looking at Solution A.D. Probably drifting away at this point in time... "Burden In My Hand" is starting to generate some phone calls. Just from what I hear, this is going to be a smash... B confidence in the Stabbing Westward. Still a little early... No way to Hole... I really like the Tonic record. I have seen too many records that were similar in nature just become big time hits. It was out of the pre-box for that one.

APD/MD Mojo Mason/KTUX Shreveport



It's the first time on the **311**. We were getting calls at night... No test results on the **Butthole Surfers**, but doing great — our #1 requested song. Kicking ass and taking names... I have high expectations on **Deep Purple**'s "**Vavoom: Ted The Mechanic**." The first week requests are doing well in all dayparts... **Fu Manchu** is a great night record... Haven't seen anything yet on the **Goldfinger**, but testing well with women 18-34... It's our second time around

with Goo Goo Dolls' "Long Way Down." It's familiar, and testing well. I think it will be around a while up into heavy... Kenny Wayne Shepherd is doing well for us. We always expected it to do great things, so we have high expectations... We had a lot of success with the first Kicking Harold track, and we are getting phones at night for "Kill You"... Metallica is smokin' on the phones. Testing Top 3, already familiar... Instant phones on "Suicide Note #1." Pantera is always big in the area. with high expectations. "Drag The Waters" is still getting phones... "Outside/Broken Phone Booth" is getting some phones during the day. This is one of those records that mixes well with the harder stuff we're playing. Primitive Radio Gods gives us balance... Prong is doing well at night, Top 5 phones. It's doing what I expected... "All I Know" will be a big song. The phones lit up the first time I played the Screaming Trees. It will do really well... Sepultura core fans are eating "Ratamahatta" up. It got requests before we started playing it from the show with Ozzy... My first inclination is that Solution A.D. would do

well, but no response yet... Still early on the **Sponge**, no phones yet. "Wax Ecstatic" is unfamiliar, but we think it will do well... I think the **Stabbing Westward** track, "**Shame**," will do well once it gets familiar, but the audience hasn't clicked in yet... I think **Hole**'s "**Gold Dust Woman**" will be a smash... Seeing even more phones on **The Hunger**. I think "Vanishing Cream" will be a Top 10 record. It's in heavy, and it will be around a while... "Wire" will do well. It's starting to get some phones. **The Nixons** are from the region, and have done quite a few show here... **Tonic** sounds great — we have big expectations. My pick of the week, a great hook... **Zakk Wylde**'s "**Between Heaven & Hell**" is another great balance record. It's starting to get some phones and is testing well.

PD Doug Podell/WRIF Detroit



311 is too young for WRIF... We are feeling better about "Nothing To Believe In." Hanging in there with it, and it's starting to move up a bit for us. There is still life in Cracker... We like The Hazies, and we will hang in as well. Starting to get some response, and the phones are picking up... We have no interest in Imperial Drag's "Boy Or Girl"... Metallica is probably the top album on the air. No burn on "Until It Sleeps" yet... Pantera's "Suicide"

Note #1" has #1 phones already... I don't know if we're ready for the Primitive Radio Gods yet... With Pantera, Metallica, Slayer, the new Prong isn't "Snap Your Fingers"... "Bulls On Parade" is still holding up on the phones. Rage Against Machine has a very young audience, though... I look at Slayer as the alternative to Metallica. We still feel there is room for metal in Detroit... "Pretty Noose" is starting to slip a little bit. People know the song, and research has actually been better than "Burden On My Hand" from the beginning... I don't see Spacehog's "Cruel To Be Kind" as a great follow-up to "In The Meantime"... Sponge is the best sounding track on the air, and the response has been phenomenal... We just put the **Stabbing** Westward in and we like it. Sounds just great right now... The Hunger is the best new thing I've had on in six weeks. "Vanishing Cream" moved from light to medium with lots of potential... The Nixons are crossing into a situation where they need to be careful that they do not become the Goo Goo Dolls, The Rembrandts, or any of those types of ballad driven kind of groups... I think Tonic's "Open Up Your Eyes" has a great sound. It's strong at night right now.

PD Greg Bergen/KRZZ Wichita

Deep Purple's "Vavoom: Ted The Mechanic" is really not a bad comeback song. We had heard they were playing the market... "Day Job" is a decent Gin Blossoms cut. They've turned into a non-reaction band, but it sounds fine on the air... I'll give Goo Goo Dolls' "Long Way Down" a B+ due to great air sound. If Wal-Mart won't carry it, we know it's a hit... Hazies' "Skin & Bones" is starting to happen for us. This is a band that went from a play a day to a couple of spins. In the pocket for us... They say some stations are giving Kicking Harold's "I'll Kill You" pretty heavy spins. I'll listen to it again... We're finding that some of the library cuts off Ozzy Osbourne's record are coming through stronger than "I Just Want You"... Pete Droge's "Mr. Jade" is okay, but it has potential to get lost. There are just so many midtempo records out there... I don't know how someone can play Primitive Radio Gods' "Standing Outside/Broken Phone"

Booth" on a station like ours... I wouldn't mind playing Prong's "Rude Awakening" 4 times a week... Son Volt's "Route" Really hasn't happened yet for us... Sponge's "Wax Ecstatic" is too early for us, but a fine record. Great performance by these guys, too... We'll wait for more to jump on with Stabbing Westward's "Shame"... Getting some nighttime responses for Super 8's "King Of The World"... I don't like Hole's "Gold Dust Woman"... Still a pretty healthy vibe on The Why Store's "Lack Of Water."... I like Tonic live a lot. "Open Up Your Eyes" is a decent song... Lots of curiosity calls on Zakk Wylde's "Between Heaven & Hell." I don't know if it can drive retail, but people seem interested. Easy all daypart item for us.

PD John Stevens/WSFM Wilmington

Butthole Surfers' "Pepper" is huge. Giant. Lots of curiosity calls, but not just from core listeners... I think the Cranberries' "Free To Decide" is actually more mass-appeal than "Salvation"... The Cure's "Mint Car" is one that works well for me, though a lot of active rockers won't play it. A hugely credible group and a good accessible track that can be played around the clock... Dada's "I Get High" is still getting mixed results. Moved down slightly in rotation... Foo Fighters' "Alone Easy Target" is a goner next week if I don't see something... I'm starting to see Gin Blossoms' "Day Job" work some with upper demos. A programming record for getting some 25-34's... Not getting anything on the Green Day. We're wondering about artist burn... Getting some nighttime response on the Imperial Drag. Need to see something happen with it soon... Porno For Pyros' "Tahitian Moon" is a song that I believe in. Working for me... Primitive Radio Gods' "Standing..." is a smash. #2 phones behind Butthole Surfers, and not just low-end... I absolutely think Screaming Trees' "All I Know" is fucking wonderful... Solution A.D.'s "Fearless" is in the developmental stages. It could be something... I think Spacehog's "Cruel To Be Kind" sounds great on the air. Nothing like the other one in terms of response, but how many records perform like that... I do think Super 8's "King Of The World" is turning around, but it will take a while... We're on the fence with The Hunger's "Vanishing Cream" right now. I know it's performing for Active Rock. This could be the week... I think Wallflowers' "6th Avenue Heartache" is real. I like this. Don't see any sales, but we have had calls.

IVID Tom Skinner/KIBZ Lincoln

The Butthole Surfers' "Pepper" was a five-time crank or yank champ, so we added it... "Leave Me Alone" definitely rocks. It's still doing well, but a bit unfamiliar... We tested **Deep** Purple's "Vavoom: Ted The Mechanic," and it did okay so we may get on it... "Alone + Easy Target" is still a little new. Our listeners are okay with the Foo Fighters, but they are not huge. It's a good tune... We had tested a couple of Kicking Harold's songs, and decided on "Kill You." It's still early, but response has been okay... Not sure why King's X's "Sometime" hasn't gone bigger - the album is great - but we are getting minimal response. May take some time... Pantera's "Suicide Note #1" is the "Planet Caravan" of the new record — accessible in all dayparts. If you listen closely you can actually hear Phil sing... Prong's "Rude Awakening" has always been solid for us. This is definitely a step forward. Response has been good since we started it on the Metal show... We are going to test Screaming Trees' "All I Know" this week. They are a cool band, but we'll see what the listeners think... Hell, yeah, I like Sepultura's "Ratamahatta." This is huge with our nighttime audience. Generating some phones, and a lot of people are surprised we are on this but their time has come. Can't understand what they are saying but who cares, it rocks... **Slayer** is another band that has broken out of the metal show. Some people may misunderstand the album in the punk direction, but they are just trying to show what it's really about. Getting good phones at night on "I Hate You"... **Stabbing Westward**'s "Shame" sounds very cool. It may take some time to build up to "What Do I Have To Do," but it's a strong enough track to hold its own... **The Hunger**'s "Vanishing Cream" is still doing well. They have a show in town and are getting more spins this week because of that. Getting some phones.

MD Sherry McKinnon/KICT Wichita

We just added 311's "Down," and we'll see how it does. There is a great level of support in the area... I liked Beck's "Where It's At" right away. It's Top 5 phones... Especially with a show last night, Butthole Surfers' "Pepper" is doing well. They are going right into heavy this week. Still Top 5 phones... Cracker's "Nothing To Believe In" has been moderate on the phones, because Metallica and the Surfers are dominating requests. But we have a great history with Cracker. I wish we had more sales and phones, but I feel confident that they are a band we should still be playing... Getting nice phones on Garbage's "Stupid Girl," and a spike in the album sales. The hook is short but obvious... Nada Surf's "Popular" will do really well at night. A young record, youth appeal... Porno For Pyros' "Tahitian Moon" is doing pretty well. It hasn't requested like crazy, but we have been playing the hell out of it. Perry fans are liking it... Nice early phones on Primitive Radio Gods' "Standing..." It's a fabulous track... Solution A.D.'s "Fearless" is maintaining. I like it, but not sure how far it will go... I like Sponge's "Wax Ecstatic," yet it was not what I was expecting but it's still early.

PD Rick West/WXKE Ft Wayne

Think the Gin Blossoms' "Day Job" is a very Midwest kind of song. It's a song about working, and god, how Midwest can you get... We're hoping for fabulous things on the Hazies... Sponge's "Wax Ecstatic" is like a rocket. This thing is really taking off for us, very active record... "Vanishing Cream" has that freakin' little keyboard, but the record is very strong. People want to know who it is... I'm interested in the new Nixons track, but "Sister" just went recurrent... The Wallflowers' "6th Avenue **Heartache**" is picking up quickly. It's a track that I rejected at first, but feel there's definitely a daytime market for this at AOR... Just started on Zakk Wylde's "Between Heaven & Hell" and it looks great so far.

Nothing new on the **311**, but "**Down**" continues to be strong... "**Pepper**" is already in an A rotation. Good phones as you might expect... Seeing nothing phone-wise on **Dave Matthews**' "**So Much To Say**" yet... **Dada**'s "**I Get High**" has trailed off in calls, but hopefully it will hang in there. The research has been healthy... Nothing yet on "**Day Job**." Confidence is always questionable when you get this deep... **Green Day**'s "**Walking Contradiction**" is actually getting healthy phones and sur-

prisingly great testing early on, probably due to the familiar sound of the band... Letters To Cleo's "Dangerous Type" is testing extremely well for us. Very easy to listen to... Metallica is the most active artist in terms of response that we've had this season... Call-out is great on the Porno For Pyros, and the phones are nominal... We feel we need to be playing "Gold Dust Woman" because it's Hole. We're getting some phones. Not a very good testing record... We like the new one from The Nixons — we're trying to find the right timing for "Wire".

"Walking Contradiction" is just another typical Green Day record the kids dig. Not a long term thing... Calls are still minimal at this point on Metallica's "Hero Of The Day," but it's still just a depth track for us. The band never tests at first, but so far we're seeing great stuff on "Until It Sleeps." No burn yet... Ozzy Osbourne's "I Just Want You" is burning, but it sounds great and the audience loves it... "Rude Awakening" is gonna be a smash. So melodic. Everybody loves **Prong**... I love **Sepultura**'s "Ratamahatta." It's such a great album, but I kinda doubt we'll use it... We're getting some requests on Cure's "Mint Car." I don't know if it's core fans, or really who they are, but they are requesting it... Dada's "I Get High" has an interesting vibe. I hear they are already servicing a new track... I want Everclear's "Heartspark Dollarsign" to do really well. It's getting some MTV play, but we haven't seen much on it yet... "Alone Easy Target" is the Foo Fighters, people want it... I love the Green Day record. "Walking Contradiction" won't be as big as everything else... Slowly but surely with Hazies' "Skin & Bones." A month ago they played the market and drew maybe 50. A week ago they packed the same club... Nada Surf's "Popular" will be huge... top testers, and still performing.



Crowded House announced they were breaking up at a 2 1/2 hour concert for fan club members in London, three weeks before release of the compilation album "Recurring Dream," which includes three new songs as well as tracks form the band's four studio albums. In Britain, the LP is being packaged with a limited-edition 15-track live album. Lead singer **Neil Finn** says "creative frustrations" are the cause of the split.

The **Cranberries**' third album, "To The Faithful Departed," is the fastest-selling album of their career in Britain, having sold over three million copies in its first month of release. The album has also hit number one in France and Germany, where it has sold more than 230,000 copies.

Counting Crows have finished work on their second album "Recovering The Satellites" with producer Gil Norton, which is scheduled for release in September.

One of London's most famous rock concert venues is back in business for a few shows, including two concerts July 6 and 7 by **Elvis Costello & The Attractions.** The Roundhouse, located in north London, will be shut down after gigs by other bands this summer. In its heyday in the 1960s and 1970s, the club saw the first European performance by the **Doors**.

Soundgarden played to a crowd of 500 people in Vancouver as part of a beer company promotion. The show was the first of a series of 13 "blind date" concerts sponsored by Molson. "Imagine what we thought when we got a call asking us to play some scummy little bar in Vancouver," says **Chris Cornell**. Molson is the same company that send hundreds of fans to the arctic village of Tuktoyaktuk last year to hear **Hole**, **Metallica**, **Moist** and **Veruca Salt**.

Bryan Ferry is to collaborate with **The Millionaire**, leader of lounge-style band **Combustible Edison** for a track on an upcoming Ferry album. The two met when Combustible Edison opened for Ferry on his last U.S. tour.

Manic Street Preachers singer James Dean Bradfield is featured on a track called "Lopez" on the new 808 State album "Don Solaris." It's 808 State's first album since the 1992 LP "Gorgeous," though the band's three members have been writing, recording and remixing artists such as REM, Bomb The Bass, Soundgarden, David Bowie, Bjork, the Shamen, Primal Scream and Future Sound Of London.

Paul Westerberg, the former **Replacements** leader, is pictured lying on the floor of the Ambassador Hotel in Los Angeles in a recent issue of the on-line magazine Addicted To Noise. The hotel is where presidential candidate Robert F. Kennedy was assassinated in 1968. The picture, which Westerberg calls "sick and funny," recreates a famous Life magazine cover.

Mick Jagger and his wife, Jerry Hall, are considering sending their

11-year-old son James to Britain's exclusive Eton academy. The couple joined parents on a tour of the school, but reports say Jagger would rather send his son to Manor House beginning in September 1997. Eton officials wouldn't comment on the possibility of Jagger's son attending. "One of the things which actually makes the school so special is that it contains boys from all sorts of social and ethnic backgrounds," one official said.

Speed-metal guitarist the **Great Kat** has announced her own World Wide Web site (www.greatkat.com), complete with music samples, photos, video files and "a macabre look at various Kat body parts." The Kat Slave Club of the Web site promises "Actual slave videos, Slave Newsletter, and a sneak peak into 'Kat's Kloset.'"

Hole covers Fleetwood Mac's "Gold Dust Woman" on the soundtrack to "The Crow: City of Angels," coming out next month. The soundtrack will include new and previously unreleased songs by 15 artists, including Bush covering New Order's "In A Lonely Place." Iggy Pop, one of the film's stars, performs a live version of the Stooges' "I Wanna Be Your Dog" in the film.

Sting has again called for the legalization of Ecstasy, saying it is the only way to stop drug dealers from profiting from the drug. "The only people who benefit from the criminalization of drugs are the people who sell them," he said on a British television program. "They are the last people on earth who want the issue looked at because they are making too much money. So we are basically leaving our children in the hands of criminals and that is wrong." Sting says making drugs illegal "actually makes the problem worse."

Chicago rock band **Tripl3fastaction** is opening for **Magnapop** in concerts in the eastern U.S. this month and next. The band has been touring with Candlebox.

Joni Mitchell says she's leaving her record label (Geffen Records) because she hasn't received a royalty check in 20 years. Mitchell says, in an interview in Details magazine, that David Geffen "dammed up" her songwriting royalties and wouldn't let her out of her contract. "I said slavery with tenure is not attractive to me," she says. Geffen responds by saying that "not one of her records since 1978 has been profitable." "Joni, who I really do have ultimate respect for as an artist, is very comfortable playing the victim, but I'm certainly no victimizer," Geffen says.

Sports Time of Carson, California, plans to release two Special Edition **Beatles** Trading card sets in October. There will be a mass market version and a hobby edition of the 10 card sets, which will describe the band's history from its early days in Hamburg, West Germany.

Kelley Deal, touring with her new band, the **Kelley Deal 6000**, says she's discovered she plays better when she's off heroin. Deal went to a halfway house in St. Paul, Minnesota, after being arrested in 1994 on heroin charges. "I'm glad that my creativity really came out when I was sober," she says. "It's obvious

The **Young Fresh Fellows** will probably record a new album next month, says **Scott McCaughey** of the band, which has been touring with the **Presidents Of The United States Of America**. McCaughey jokes the band's backstage rider asks for "Taco Bell, beer, red wine." "For beer, I put 'preferred local.' For wine, I put 'red,'" he says.

For Squirrels have written seven new songs for their second album, which Travis Tooke says will be move diverse than the band's debut, "Example." One of the songs, "Critic's Razor," was inspired by a review of "Example" in Rolling Stone magazine. "Eighty percent of the article was about the accident" that killed two of the band's members last September, Tooke says. "It said the album wouldn't carry any weight if it wasn't for that. It was particularly nasty. If he didn't like the music, he should say why. He could say the band was REM derivative, the band needs to find itself, something insightful. He would have been right in some sense because we still needed to go places." Tooke admits that REM has been a big influence. "I listened to 'Reckoning' so many times doing chores. That was freedom to me, escaping my upbringing," Tooke says.

Bon Jovi's last album is bring re-issued in Britain this month with a bonus live CD recorded last year.

Paul McCartney has been criticized in England for a breach of protocol for having kept his left hand in his pocket when he greeted Queen Elizabeth II at the Liverpool Institute for Performing Arts, which he founded in his hometown. Etiquette expert Fleur Toukham told the Daily Star newspaper that McCartney had been "very rude." The Queen heard students sing a medley of **Beatles** songs in the Paul McCartney Auditorium.

British pop-dance band MN8 has finished work on its new album.

The company that holds the publishing rights to "Oh, Pretty Woman" has settled a copyright infringement lawsuit it had filed against **2 Live Crew** over the rappers' parody of **Roy Orbison**'s classic. Under the settlement, Acuff-Rose Music dismissed its lawsuit against the group while 2 Live Crew agreed to pay royalties for its version of the song. "The cost of further litigation outweighed the potential benefits of victory," says Jerry Flowers, vice-president of Acuff-Rose's parent company, the Opryland Music Group.

Shunkworks, led by former **Iron Maiden** singer **Bruce Dickinson**, has just released its self-titled debut album. "I'm trying to bury Bruce Dickinson in the mists of the past, basically, because that's over as far as I'm concerned," Dickinson says. "I'm more excited about music and what I'm doing now than I have been since (Iron Maiden's album) 'Number of the Beast'." Even though Dickinson is 37, the average age of band members in Skunkworks is 23.

When former MC5 guitarist Wayne Kramer played Detroit, it was "the cultural event of the season," he says, because his opening act was poet John Sinclair, a White Panther leader who was the MC5's manager in the late 1960s. Sinclair, who now lives in New Orleans, was busted for marijuana possession and John Lennon performed at his benefit concert. The show was in support of Kramer's "Dangerous Madness" album, but it won't be their last collaboration. The duo is planning to begin recording in Los Angeles in August. "As we were all discovering freedom music, the free jazz thing, and applying it to high-energy rock 'n' roll, we all bought saxophones and trumpets and bells and whistles. John would get in there and blow a tenor, too....He played pretty well," Kramer says. "We're well into it now. It's going to be Wayne Kramer experimental guitar playing and John Sinclair verse. The stuff sounds good; a lot of it is steeped in the blues and the history of the blues, which is John's thing."

Sponge played a benefit concert in Detroit for an 11-year-old friend who needs a bone marrow transplant. The band featured songs from its upcoming album "Wax Ecstatic."

Chaka Khan will be releasing a greatest hits album this summer with four or five additional songs, including one written with **Rufus**.

David Bowie's drummer **Zachary Alford** tipped off authorities who raided Camden Market in London and seized bootleg videos and cassette recordings. Over a thousand bootlegged items, including pirated Bowie videos made during his "Outsiders" tour last fall.

Black Grape, the **Chemical Brothers**, **Leftfield**, **Sasha** and **Sven Vath** are on the bill for a "Tribal Gathering" music festival taking place in Britain on June 29. The event was refused a license for June 1 at Otmoor Park in Oxfordshire last month. It will now take place at an estate near Luton. The new site will have eight tents with different themes, such as Starship Universe, Astral Nuts, Erotica, Cyperpunk, Nexus and Shangri La.

An album of traditional Qawwali devotional music from Pakistani singer **Nusrat Fateh Ali Khan** is coming out in September (on American Records), produced by **Rick Rubin**. Khan's vocals were featured in the music to the film "Dead Man Walking," including two duets with **Eddie Vedder**. Rubin is also slated to produce a second traditional album and an LP pairing Khan with Western singers. There are also plans for boxed sets of Khan's many Pakistani recordings.

White Zombie are releasing an album of remixed versions of songs on "Astro Creep: 2000." The Dust Brothers, PM Dawn and Nine Inch Nails associate Charlie Clouser are among those mixing tracks for "Supersexy Swingin' Sounds," which comes out in mid-August.

Beatles producer **George Martin** has been knighted in England, and **Van Morrison** has been given the Order of the British Empire. "I am absolutely astonished, but of course I am delighted and flattered to be awarded a knighthood," Martin says. "I've had the

good fortune to work with many marvellous people over the years and I feel that this honour is theirs to share." The Beatles were appointed Members of the British Empire in 1965, but **John Lennon** returned his award to the Queen wrapped in brown paper in protest of Britain's involvement in Biafra and support of America during the Vietnam War. "It is great for George and very well deserved," **Paul McCartney** said. "Ringo and George are over the moon about it as well, they all think it's fantastic." Morrison may have been honored because his "Days Like This" was used to back a peace campaign in Northern Island. Morrison sang the tune before 80,000 people when President Bill Clinton visited Belfast's city hall last year.

The **Goo Goo Dolls** will appear in an advertisement called "What A Game," which is intended to promote the sport of baseball. The band appears with members of the Atlanta Braves in the commercial, which will premiere nationally in July. The Goo Goo Dolls do a version of "Take Me Out To The Ballgame" while various ball players appear on camera. Major League Baseball is also filming rap, country and pop versions of the "What A Game" commercial.

The four surviving members of the **Grateful Dead** appeared with the San Francisco Symphony in their first public performance since the death of Jerry Garcia last year. **Mickey Hart, Phil Lesh, Bob Weir** and **Vince Welnick** participated in the symphony's American Festival, performing **John Cage**'s avant-garde pieces "Renga" and "Apartment House 1776," which are intended to be played simultaneously.

Patti Smith says the last thing **Fred "Sonic" Smith** taught her before his death was how to play the guitar. "Fred taught me seven or eight chords, and I stayed up nights writing a song for each one of them," Smith says. "Those guitar chords got me through a lot of difficult nights."

The **Black Crowes** plan a number of free or low-cost shows next month in advance of the release of their "Three Snakes And One Charm" album.

Cincinnati officials won't let **Smashing Pumpkins** perform there because of fear of moshing. "We investigated the band and received information that there was a potential for injury there," says acting city safety director Joseph Charlton.

The **Beach Boys** are releasing a single of "I Just Wasn't Made For These Times" from their "Pet Sounds" album. after Cocker complained of exhaustion at a Los Angeles concert. It's only the second time in three years that Pulp has canceled a show

David Crosby says Crosby, Stills & Nash are letting computer feedback on the Internet dictate what shows are being played live. "There's a huge CSN website from the Netherlands, as well as a very active billboard on America Online. I frequent those places and I got a lot of feedback from fans about what we should be playing, so I asked the fans to make a list," Crosby says. "The guy running the website tabulated hundreds and hundreds of requests and when I took the list of favorite songs to Nash and Stills, we decided to throw the set list out and start over again. We still have hit songs in the show but through the web we realized people wanted to hear songs like 'Delta' more than some of the other hits. So, the concert breakdown is really driven by the fans, and it so much more fun to do." Crosby underwent a transplant after hepatitis C destroyed his liver. "I was on the transplant list for a long time and they told me I had to enter hospital because they couldn't keep me alive outside. After 40 days of that, I was so scared — terrified I was going die horribly," he says. "When I was recovering my wife gave birth to a baby boy, Django. Being with him as I recuperated was as good as it gets. And then to be able to go back to work with my music turned out to be so much fun, man. It's just great."

Boyz II Men have been given honorary doctorate degrees by Drexel University in west Philadelphia for their "committment to expressing positive values" and the recognition they have brought to their hometown.
