Michael Hutchence of **INXS** and his girlfriend Paula Yates have their first child, a six-pound baby girl named Heavenly Hiraani Tiger Lily. Hutchence chose the Polynesian name for Yates' fourth daughter, who was born at the former home of Yates exhusband **Bob Geldof**. Yates obtained the house through a recent divorce settlement. Yates already has three children, named Fifi Trixibelle, Peaches and Pixie.

Rob Collins of Manchester band the **Charlatans** was killed last week in a car accident on a country road near his studios in Monmouth, South Wales. Collins, who played keyboards with the band, died on the way to the hospital. His passenger, a 31year-old sound engineer, was unhurt. The remaining members have issued a statement saying they will continue because "that is what Rob would have wanted." The band will have a new single called "One To Another" out at the end of this month. Their new album is 75 percent complete.

Tracks on **REM**'s upcoming album "New Adventures In Hi-Fi" were partially recorded on tour and then added to in the studio. A track called "E-bow The Letter," recorded earlier this year in Seattle, features vocals from **Patti Smith**. The LP is described in Entertainment Weekly as "more melodic than 'Monster'" but "less mellow than 'Automatic for the People.'"

Albums by **Oasis, Pulp, Manic Street Preachers, Black Grape, Courtney Pine, Underworld** and **Mark Morrison** are among the nominees for this year's Mercury Music Prize in England. The Artists for War Child "Help" album has also been nominated for the award to be given out in London on September 10. The Mercury Music Prize has, in five years, become one of Britain's top music awards. Nominations are made by a panel of leading critics who focus on creativity instead of sales. Bookmakers have already made Oasis their favorite.

A bus carrying the British band **Terrorvision** struck and seriously injured a 15-year-old who was sleeping outside the Phoenix rock festival in Long Marston, England. Daniel Duffey was in satisfactory condition with multiple fractures and suspected internal injuries. The three members of Terrorvision were lying on their bunks in the bus when it backed up and struck Duffey.

Jimi Hendrix' father was on his way to meet Chas Chandler for the first time when the former Animals bass player died in his sleep at a British hospital. Chandler, who managed Hendrix and produced the first four Hendrix albums, died about 48 hours before he was scheduled to meet 77-year-old James Al Hendrix, who was travelling from Seattle to see him. The elder Hendrix attended Chandler's funeral, as did actor and singer Jimmy Nail, Roy Wood and members of Slade. Two Animals colleagues, guitarist Hilton Valentine and drummer John Steel were also present. "Jimi said he was a great guy and a great producer," Hendrix said after the funeral service. "I though the must be a terrific person from what Jimi told me. Chas had been wanting to meet me in person and we were only a day or two from that meeting when he died. It's a great shame we never met."

The manager of **Oasis**' British record company has taken out a full-page ad in Britain's New Musical Express music paper to rave about the **Sex Pistols**. Alan McGee, the head of Creation Records, went to see the Pistols in London with Oasis song-writer **Noel Gallagher**. "Noel turned 'round halfway through and said they are lot better than us," McGee says. "That is

some compliment." McGee's \$8,000 ad in NME says: "I went half expecting it to be part comedy, part irrelevancy. What I saw destroyed my preconceptions. (They) were simply stunning. Literally the best rock & roll band around. It was one of the best gigs I have ever seen. The Sex Pistols changed my life in 1977 and 1996. If you don't get it now, you would never have got it then. Britop? More like Shitpop. You're welcome to your mediocrity. This band are our alternative royal family." A spokeswoman for the Sex Pistols' British label says the band was shocked to see the ad. "Everybody said, 'Wow, what's this?'" the spokeswoman said. McGee, who refused to give interviews for six years because his reluctance to deal with the media, says he took out the ad to silence critics of the Sex Pistols reunion. "I probably have made too much money," McGee says. "But if you are going to be a multi-millionaire, you might as well enjoy it. If you are going to spunk five grand (the cost of the ad in English pounds) you might as well do it in style." Glen Matlock of the Sex Pistols released a solo album on McGee's label earlier this year, but McGee denies the ad is an indirect plug for the LP. "It would be a bizarre marketing plan to spend money saying that another record company's band is better than ours," he says. "I did the ad because the gig was genius, it was mega. It's as simple as that."

Donna Lewis' single "I Love You Always Forever" was originaly to be called "Lydia," inspired by the novel of the same name by H.E. Bates. "The promo people said it might create problems, because the word Lydia doesn't appear in the song," says the Welsh singer. "I suppose I'm glad I did change it now." Lewis' new album was co-produced with Kevin Killen, who has worked with **Kate Bush, U2** and **Elvis Costello**.

The **Rentals** "Waiting" is the lead track to the new film "Joe's Apartment," though there are no plans to release a sound-track LP for the movie. The Rentals are in London preparing to begin work on a second album.

MOD are about to go on the road for their first tour in almost two years. The band recently released an album called "Dictated Aggression."

Cleveland Indians pitcher and singer-songwriter **Jack McDowell** has released an album with his group **Stick Figure**. The LP's called "Just A Thought" and features **Mike Mesaros** of the **Smithereens**, **Billy Talbot** of **Crazy Horse** and bass player **Charles Levi** of **My Life With The Thrill Kill Kult**. McDowell, who wrote all of the nine songs on the LP, says pitching and performing in a rock band are completely different. "When I'm out on the field, doing my job, I have to block out the crowd," he says. "Now when I'm on stage I have to include the crowd. I'm there for them."

Entertainment Weekly magazine has compiled a list of the 100 Greatest Summer Songs Of All Time, choosing from singles that peaked on the charts during the summer. The list includes: "Summer in the City" by the **Lovin' Spoonful**, "California Girls" by the **Beach Boys**, "School's Out" by **Alice Cooper**, "Heat Wave" by **Martha & The Vandellas**, "Under the Boardwalk," by the **Drifters**, "Light My Fire" by the **Doors**, "Dancing in the Streets" by Martha & The Vandellas, "Borderline" by **Madonna**, "Hot Fun in the Summertime" by **Sly & The Family Stone** and "(I Can't Get No) Satisfaction" by the **Rolling Stones**. Magic Dick & Jay Geils, formerly of the J. Geils Band, have a new album called "Little Car Blues" (on Rounder Records), which includes songs dating as far back as "Some Sweet Day," a Louis Armstrong track from 1933. Magic Dick and Jay Geils released an album two years ago called "Bluestime."

Smashing Pumpkins have received eight nominations for the 1996 MTV Video Music Awards. Alanis Morissette, Foo Fighters and Bjork received five nominations each. Most of the Smashing Pumpkins' nominations, including video of the year, were for the song "Tonight, Tonight." The band is also up for best hard rock video for "1979." The awards will be given out on September 4. Other nominees for best video include "Tha Crossroads" by Bone Thugs-N-Harmony, "Big Me" by Foo Fighters, and "Ironic" by Alanis Morissette. Bush, Everclear, Foo Fighters and Smashing Pumpkins are nominated for alternative video, while Tracy Bonham, Garbage, Jewel and Alanis Morissette are nominated in the new artist category.

Guitarist **Craig Chaquico** was recently stopped near his rural Mill Valley, California, home and cited by a local law enforcement agency for walking his dog without a leash. "I was laughing out loud, which didn't help any, thinking that all these other celebrities are getting arrested with smack, crack and handguns, and here I am with a ticket for letting my Golden Retriever run through the woods. It's hysterical," Chaquico says.

A judge in Pasadena, California, said at a court hearing that **Stone Temple Pilots** lead singer **Scott Weiland** "is doing quite well" in drug rehabilitation. Weiland agreed last year to spend four to six months at a residential drug treatment facility. He's scheduled to appear in court October 29 for another progress report.

Oasis will begin their seventh U.S. tour on August 27 in Chicago. The dates come on the heels of seven European festival dates where the band is to play before a total of almost a half-million people.

Tamara Danz, East Germany's most successful rock singer in the 1980s, has died in Berlin at age 43. Danz, who began her rock career in 1978 with a band called Silly, helped lead protests that led to the fall of the Berlin Wall. She was repeatedly voted East German female singer of the year. Danz, whose voice has been described as a cross between Marianne Faithfull and Janis Joplin, was disillusioned with the unification that followed the end of the German Democratic Republic. Her 1992 song "Halloween in East Berlin" criticized East German leaders for being timid in their acceptance of the new Germany. Danz became ill with breast cancer last year and refused further treatment after undergoing three unsuccessful operations. She died four months before she was scheduled to marry fellow musician Uwe Hassbecker.

Slayer go on a tour of small venues in August, after returning from three weeks of European festival dates.

Lucinda Williams and her band have been recording material in a Nashville studio with **Steve Earle** producing. The record should be out early next year.

Photographer Timothy White has shot a video for New York trio **Motorbaby**'s upcoming self-titled debut album.

Brian Eno says he's not producing **U2**'s next album because he "needed a break from the studio." "There's no bad feeling or anything. They've got quite competent people doing it, so I'm sure they're going to be just fine," Eno says. Flood, **The Edge** and **Nellee Hooper** are helping to produce the new U2 LP, which should be out before the end of the year.

Guitarist, keyboardist and backing vocalist **Regina Chellew** has joined **Ruby**, replacing **Sharon Doherty** who "left amicably to pursue new products," the band says.

A **Catherine Wheel** album called "Like Cats & Dogs" comes out later this month, featuring previously unreleased tracks, single b-sides and alternate versions of other tracks. The LP includes a version of **Pink Floyd**'s "Wish You Were Here."

The hastily-assembled production of the **Who**'s "Quadrophenia" which made its debut at a star-studded charity concert at London's Hyde Park, will now travel to nine U.S. cities. The show, which just finished a week's run at Madison Square Garden in New York, has been so successful that the three members of the Who have decided to play some more concerts.

The **Pet Shop Boys** are about to release a new single in Britain, "Se A Vide E." The band has had 27 consecutive singles hit the top 30 in the U.K.

Childrens' characters the **Smurfs** have a "The Smurfs Go Pop" album out in Britain. It includes a cover version of Technohead's British techno hit "I Want To Be Hippy" called "I've Got A Little Puppy." Plans for a Smurfs version of "Wonderwall" called "Wondersmurf" fell afoul of **Oasis** who wouldn't permit it. **Shaggy** did OK a version of "Boombastic" called "Smurftastic" and Supergrass agreed to a Smurfs cover of "Alright" renamed "We're The Smurfs." The Smurfs have outsold the entire catalog of the **Beatles, Queen** and **Pink Floyd** in Germany and Holland last year.

Peter Gabriel is putting out a CD-ROM called "Eve" which gives uses the chance to create new versions of four Gabriel songs.

London band **Morcheeba** is co-producing three tracks on **David Byrne**'s upcoming solo album. Byrne is slated to work with the four-piece group at their South London studio. "It's great because we all grew up listening to **Talking Heads**," says **Paul Godfrey** of Morcheeba. "When we were about 12 and first started playing instruments their records were some of the things we tried to play."

Swedish band the **Cardigans** releases its third album "First Band On The Moon" next month. The overseas success of the band has come as a surprise to **Peter Svensson**. "We really didn't expect anything, although I thought that people would like our music," he says. "We didn't even think of getting abroad as lots of Swedish bands don't make it outside the country. The Charlatans UK keyboard player Rob Collins was killed after a car accident in the early hours of Tuesday, July 23rd. 33 year old Collins was driving his BMW near Monmouth in Wales when the vehicle veered out of control and hit parked cars. Keyboard technician Johnny Clarke, a passenger in the car, was uninjured. Collins died on his way to the hospital. Members of the British musical community have been paying tribute to Collins. Noel Gallagher of Oasis said, "Although I didn't know him that well, I still considered him a friend. To die in a car crash is tragic. It's a waste of young life and a great talent. My thoughts are with the Charlatan lads and his family." Stone Roses bassist Mani commented, "The Hammond King has gone. I've lost a true friend and my only fishing partner. It was a pleasure to have known him." The Chemical Brothers and Dub War were amongst other bands who paid tribute to the keyboard player. Collins was born in Sedgeley on February 23, 1963. He began playing the piano in school and played in various bands before meeting Martin Blunt and Jon Brookes in 1988. With singer/quitarist, Baz Kettley, the four formed an early version of The Charlatans UK. Kettley was replaced by the band's current frontman, Tim Burgess, in early 1989; later in the same year, the band released their debut single, "Indian Rope," via the independent Dead Dead Good Records. The '60s-influenced single featured Collins' Hammond organ high in the mix, a distinctive trait of all Charlatans' releases. Caught up in the "Madchester" wave with such bands as Happy Mondays, Stone Roses and Inspiral Carpets, The Charlatans signed with Beggars Banquet and released a second single, "The Only One I Know." The track made the UK top ten in 1990 and the band's debut album, Some Friendly, entered the charts at number one. This was followed by a low point in the band's career. Guitarist Martin Blunt was hospitalized with manic depression and their second album, Between 10th and 11th, received poor reviews. In 1993, Collins was jailed for his part in the attempted robbery of a liquor store. He was released from jail in 1994, after serving an eight-month prison sentence. The band supported him throughout and did not release their third album, Up To Our Hips, until he was free. In August 1995, The Charlatans released an eponymous fourth album which received strong reviews and fully re-established the band's reputation and commercial status. At the time of Collins' death, The Charlatans were working on a fifth album and were about to release a new single, "One To Another." This release looks likely to go ahead, particularly as the band have issued a statement saying they will fulfill August support slots to Oasis and Paul Weller. Rob Collins is survived by his wife, Joanne, and his daughter, Emily... Oasis, Black Grape, and Pulp are amongst bands nominated for the 1996 Mercury Music Prize. The award is to honor the best British or Irish album of the year regardless of genre. From 150 nominations, the judging panel of ten drew up the following shortlist: Oasis, (What's The Story) Morning Glory?; Pulp, Different Class; Black Grape, It's Great When You're Straight ... Yeah!; Manic Street Preachers, Everything Must Go; British folk singer

Norma Waterson's collection of cover songs by such artists as The Grateful Dead and Elvis Costello; modern classical composer Peter Maxwell Davies' 'The Beltane Fire'; Courtney Pine, 'Modern Day Jazz Stories'; Mark Morrison, 'Return Of The Mack,; Underworld, 'Second Toughest In The Infants; and the 'Help' compilation. Writing in The Times, one of the judges David Sinclair said the inclusion of 'Help' had been a difficult decision for the judges to come to because it was a compilation album and they could not agree on which were the strongest tracks. He also says there was debate over whether to include The Beatles 'Anthology II' album. According to Sinclair, the unluckiest person to miss the shortlist was Richard Thompson, whose You? Me? Us? album was an unofficial eleventh... R.E.M.'s Michael Stipe has been explaining the influence of Patti Smith on his career. Writing in Mojo, Stipe says: "No-one's ever really tied in how much I've liked from her as a performer. She was just really guttural. It was like all the body noises you make, Billy Bragg says that when men wake up in the morning, they have to make every possible body noise they can to assure themselves that they're really still alive. Patti Smith's voice was like that. It wasn't a trained, perfect crescendo of notes. It was this howling, mad beast; every noise you can make. I've blindly stolen from her for the last 15 years." Stipe also says he used to dedicate a song to her when R.E.M. played Detroit just in case she was in the audience. Patti Smith is interviewed in the same issue of Mojo and describes making her latest album Gone Again in the wake of the death of her husband, Fred 'Sonic' Smith: "This album was both joyous and heartbreaking to do. We were 80 per cent done with the record and I had to stop. I couldn't take it any more, because... I just really missed Fred. It was so difficult and I was so emotionally depleted. So we stopped for a while. When we did that little mini-tour Bob Dylan, I was supposed to be finishing the record, but I still couldn't face it. But I got a lot of energy and positive feelings from the Dylan experience and then we went back in and completed the album. Those dates gave me my confidence back"... The Sex Pistols' live album, Filthy Lucre Live, is released this week via Virgin. The LP was recorded at the band's recent London Finsbury Park outdoor show. The negative reaction to the Pistols' show from some critics provoked Creation Records (home of Oasis, The Boo Radleys, and Teenage Fanclub) boss Alan McGee to take out a full-page advertisement in the New Musical Express. It reads (sic throughout): "I never saw The Sex Pistols in 1977. They never came to Scotland. I saw everybody else. Everybody. The Clash three times in '77, Buzzcocks, Ramones. Everybody. I got a ticket on Wednesday night (for the Pistols' show at the London Shepherds Bush Empire) in a way out of embarrassment that I never stayed around to see them at Finsbury Park which I had heard they were like 'cabaret.' I went half expecting to be partly comedy part irrelevancy. What I saw destroyed my preconceptions. Granted they are no longer a social phenomenon, that they had to wait almost 20 years to be able to play their music and to be judged on that shows you what a social

phenomenon they actually were. The Sex Pistols at the Shepherd's Bush Empire were simply stunning. Simply the best rock 'n' roll band around. The singer/songwriter says he is happy with the switch in label after a period when his career was in the doldrums: "I spent two years in the wilderness, feeling as though I'd been discarded. Go! Discs seem to have the same attitude that Island had when I was starting out, the youth and enthusiasm is a trip and I actually like all their artists, especially Gabrielle!".... 'Voyeurz?', the London West End show starring Fem 2 Fem, has been receiving cool reviews in the UK. The show has attracted notoriety because of its nudity. However, the Times newspaper critic commented, "If it's nudes you are after, there are nine of them eventually, and some of the girls rub against each other, if you fancy the sight of that. The cancellation has added to fears of a clampdown on dance events because of public fears about drug and the use of Ecstasy in particular... Sparklehorse frontman mark Linokus hopes to be out of his wheelchair when the band play in the UK in August. Linokus was taken to hospital in January after he collapsed at a London hotel. Suffering from a heart attack, his legs were pinned under him for 14 hours causing a loss of circulation to one leg. Recently, he has begun to walk again. Sparklehorse's forthcoming UK single is 'Rainmaker'... Marc Almond has split with Stevo, his manager for 16 years. The parting is described as "amicable." Almond has recently been co-producing (with Pet Shop Boys' Neil Tennant) an album for 60s icon P.J. Proby.
