Sarah McLachlan plans a festival tour next July and August entirely devoted to female performers. The Lilith Fair, named after a mythical figure, is McLachlan's answer to Lollapalooza. She and her manager have made initial inquiries, approaching Joni Mitchell, Emmylou Harris, Suzanne Vega, Natalie Merchant and Neneh Cherry. They also hope that Tori Amos, Tracy Chapman, Annie Lennox and Veruca Salt can be convinced to participate, even if only for a week or two, or for selected dates. "I'm even going to ask Madonna," McLachlan says. "I want to have the whole range of music made by women—not just singer-songwriters, but rock and R&B as well." McLachlan is planning a Vancouver concert on September 14 using the Lilith Fair name and featuring Harris, Paula Cole and Lisa Loeb.

Producer **Kenny "Babyface" Edmonds** releases his third solo album in October, called "The Day." He's been finishing work on an album with **Eric Clapton** and a song with **Michael Jackson** for Spike Lee's upcoming "Get On The Bus" film about the Million Man March.

Joni Mitchell has two anthology albums coming out in October — one is called "Hits" and the other is "Misses." Her producer and ex-husband Larry Klein is also working on a Mitchell tribute album. The Canadian singer has signed a three-book deal to publish an art colleciton, a book of lyrics and poetry, and a set of memoirs.

Tori Amos, who had a successful dance remix of "Professional Widow," has released an EP that features an alternate version of "Hey Jupiter" and four live tracks, including her cover of "Over The Rainbow."

John Mellencamp releases his 14th album in September, called "Mr. Happy Go Lucky" (on Mercury Records). "When we started making this record, I thought I'd marry the rhythm of black music of the '90s, which is rap, and the sounds of black blues music of the '30s and '40s. We'd have Robert Johnson-type guitar licks playing with this rap rhythm underneath it. It didn't always work out that way but that's the place we started from," Mellencamp says. He's not planning to tour in support of the LP, though he will play at Farm Aid this fall. "I have been on tour so long. If you strive to be good at something and put a lot of pressure on yourself you can get burnout," he says. "I try to reinvent myself every so many years. In 1988, I made 'The Lonesome Jubilee,' which was pretty successful. It was a reinvention of myself. I used violin, accordion, hammered dulcimer, on a rock record. At the time nobody was making records like that. Two years later, to be taken seriously, you had to have Appalachian instruments on there. We had been following that sound pretty much since 1988."

Dance music veteran **Moby** has covered **Mission Of Burma**'s "That's When I Reach For My Gun" on his "Animal Rights" LP coming out in September. He plays all the instruments and sings on the album.

Andrew Innes of Primal Scream plays guitar on two tracks on the upcoming Secret Knowledge album "So Hard." Jah Wobble and Primal Scream's Martin Duffy also appear on the group's debut LP. "Primal Scream are my drinking mates and their attitude has been quite a big influence on the album anyway, so that's how come they ended up on it," says Kris Needs of Secret Knowledge." Plus I used to manage Jah Wobble in the early '80s. Actually, he saved my life once when he carried me to hospital after I fell down some stairs at a bar in Amsterdam. So I owe two big favors now."

Skunk Anansie releases a new album in October, preceded in Britain by a single called "All I Want," which comes out next month.

Noel Gallagher says **Oasis** will go back into the studio in October to continue work on a new album, before playing Hong Kong in December. The group plans to put out a new single in January, possibly "My Big Mouth" or "It's Getting Better, Man."

Nirvana's upcoming live album, "From The Muddy Banks Of The Wishkah," will include 16 songs put together by band member Krist Novoselic after he listened to over 100 hours of live recordings. Among the tracks on the LP is a version of "Smells Like Teen Spirit" recorded at the Del Mar Fairgrounds in California on December 28, 1991. The LP also includes "Breed" and "Polly," from a "Lame Fest" show the band played in London on December 5, 1989. In his liner notes to the LP, Novoselic writes: "In presenting the record I hope that the ultimate allure of Kurt and Nirvana's passion are brought to the forefront again, where it should be. Let all the perspectives and analysis fade away like yellow, aged newsprint. Crank this record up! Realise the bliss of the power and passion! TOTAL NIRVANA!" Novoselic says he wanted to show a more aggressive side to the band than was seen on the "Unplugged" album. Novoselic is about to start work in the studio on the debut album of his new band Sweet 75

Oasis have refused to let an English album by cartoon characters the **Smurfs** include a parody of "Wonderwall" called "Wondersmurf." The band's record label banned any release of the track, claiming it insulted the songwriting skills of Noel Gallagher, and demanding that all masters and recordings of the song be sent to them. **Blur**, the **Prodigy, Babylon Zoo** and **Mark Morrison** also objected to the Smurfs covering their British hits. The Smurfs, who have released an album called "Smurfs Go Pop," are now working on a Christmas album and another album of hit parodies for release in February.

Bass player **Nez** of **Heavy Stereo** was hospitalized with five broken ribs, a broken nose, severe concussion and loosened teeth after an unknown assailant attacked him with a heavy object as he walked home in London earlier this month. He crawled about 200 yards from the scene of the attack before losing consciousness. "The last thing I remember is waking up in the ambulance," he says. "I can't remember anything about the attack and haven't been able to give the police any descriptions because I was hit from behind." Nez needed six stitches for a head wound after the attack, the second against a member of Heavy Stereo to occur in London. Drummer **Nick Jones** was recently attacked by a one-legged vagrant who bit him on the arm.

Michael Nyman has declined to supply the music for the upcoming Jame Campion movie "Portrait Of A Lady" claiming that he wasn't given the flexibility to make a creative contribution.

The parents of a 15-year-old teenage girl repeatedly stabbed near her California home last year have filed a lawsuit against **Slayer**, claiming the band's lyrics inspired three teenagers to kill her in a Satanic ritual. Elyse Marie Pahler was killed last year in San Luis Obispo, but her body was not found until March of this year. Three teenage boys have been charged in the crime. Prosecutors say they had formed a band patterened after Slayer to "glorify Satan." David and Lisanne Pahler's lawsuit against Slayer and their record company contends the band's lyrics make listeners "take violent, destructive action towards teenage females." They cite lyrics such as "Slice her flesh to shreds, Watch the blood flow free" on the song "Kill Again." "This is filth," David Pahler says. "No wonder we have kids out there murdering. They can get hold of Slayer music talking about murder and sacrificing. I don't think minors should be allowed to be exposed to this sort of thing."

More than two years after they broke up, **Curve** are to release a new album early next year, tentatively entitled "Magic Music Festival." There will be a single out in Britain next month called "Pink Girl With The Blues." Singer **Toni Halliday** will be releasing the LP and single on her own (Fat Lip Records) label. Halliday says she and **Dean Garcia** broke up their band in January 1994 because they were "disgusted by the music business." "We weren't happy with the way anything was going. It had stopped being fun and we couldn't do what we wanted any more. We just wanted to jump off that treadmill," she says. Curve have no plans to tour. They are working on a song for the soundtrack to the upcoming film "Nowhere."

Three people were killed and 20 injured in the crush of the crowd about an hour before the start of a concert in Barranquilla, Colombia, headlined by a singer-songwriter named **Shakira**.

John Hiatt, Jerry Jeff Walker and **Sawyer Brown** were among the performers at a Nashville birthday party for President Bill Clinton and Tipper Gore, the wife of Vice President Al Gore.

Nick Lowe was paid \$1 million for the rights to use his song "Peace, Love & Understanding" on the soundtrack to "The Bodyguard," but the song didn't make it to the final cut of the film.

Natalie Merchant says her crusades for animal rights and against homelessness and domestic violence are part of her responsibility as a citizen. "I don't like to point fingers at other artists, because a lot of artists, all they're devoted to is making people feel good. That's an admirable aim in life to make people feel good," she says. "I always make the assumption that if people like my records there's a certain level of sensitivity and tolerance for some serious subject matter seeping into the music."

The **Blues Brothers** are on the road again — this time as a threesome of **Dan Aykroyd**, **James Belushi** and **John Goodman**. Their band includes **Steve Cropper** on rhythm guitar, **Donald "Duck" Dunn** on bass and **Matt "Guitar" Murphy** on lead guitar.

Movie soundtracks are having less and less to do with their film counterparts. Other than **Larry Mullen** and **Adam Clayton**'s reworking of the "Mission Impossible" theme, only one of the songs on the soundtrack album is actually heard during the movie. A **David Bowie** track called "The Heart's Filthy Lesson" is played during the closing credits of the thriller "Seven," but doesn't appear on the soundtrack album due to "licensing problems." THE HARD REPORT A man who claims to be a former manager for **Hootie & The Blowfish** is suing the band's record label and its parent company for \$100 million, claiming they interfered with his agreement with the band when they signed the group in 1993.

Magnapop are being left without a record company as their label (Priority Records) ends a two-year foray into rock music. Other alternative groups on the label include **Congo Norvell**, **Rugburns** and **Foreskin 500**.

Don Henley, Bryan Adams, Sheryl Crow, Melissa Etheridge, John Mellencamp and **Steve Winwood** are among the artists who will participate in an all-star jam in Los Angeles on October 16. The 1996 City of Hope "All-Star Garage Band" is expected to raise \$3 million to \$4 million.

After the **Hoodoo Gurus**' last tour, the band had composed enough new material for a double album. The band whittled the selection down to 14 songs for their seventh LP "Blue Cave" (on Zoo Entertainment). "I think this is the best thing we've done — no holds barred, no apologies," says singer-songwriter **Dave Fualkner**. "Speaking for myself, I really feel like I hit my straps on this one. Songwriting-wise, I didn't think of myself off the hook and I think it paid off." Faulkner says the band started off thinking it was making an "really layered, intricate" album like the **Beach Boys**' "Pet Sounds." "But we got a really full-throated rock & roll album. I think this record is pretty much the pure essence of what we are."

FBI documents say **Latoya Jackson**'s husband and manager paid the Genovese crime family \$1,500 per month for protection for at least a year beginning in 1994. The New York Daily News quotes law enforcement sources as saying the payments were made to protect Jackson from mentally disturbed fans and possible shakedowns by other crime families.

Release of **Mazzy Star**'s album "Among My Swan" is slated for the end of October.

British **Elvis Presley** fan Vince Everett is trying to sell his 3,00 piece memorabilia collection, which he says is the largest outside of Graceland. Everett, who changed his name to that of the character Presley played in "Jailhouse Rock," says he can't afford to continue to care for the items, which are scattered around bank vaults and storage sheds. Everett says he's had offers from the U.S. and Japan, but he's hoping to establish a museum, either permanent or traveling, to showcase the 4 year collection. Everett has the electronic gate opener from Graceland, Presley's 4 1/2-ounce solid gold bracelet and the white shell necklace Presley wore on his last vacation, Interest in Presley memorabilia remains high in Britain, where one of Elvis' bathrobes sold for more than \$6,000 last year.

Singles by **Eric Clapton** and **Bryan Ferry** are to be released in conjunction with the fall release of the film "Phenomenon."

Richard Thompson, having played a series of solo acoustic performances this summer with **Joan Armatrading**, goes on tour with a band beginning September 4 in Columbus, Ohio. Dates continue through early December in support of his double album "you?me?us?"

While one researcher found that young people who listen to heavy metal music are depressed more often, other studies presented at the annual meeting of the American Psychological Association didn't agree. University of Southern California psychologist Michael Newcomb studied 552 people and found no correlation between sexual behavior and drug use. He also found no link between drug use and rock music. At first, he thought he'd found a link between rock music and sensation-seeking, but it disappeared after he adjusted for societal influences. In another study, Appalachian State University researchers from Boone, North Carolina, found a link between risky behavior and music preferences among men, but not among women, when a total of 96 people were interviewed. "The clamor about the detrimental effects of music may be misdirected," say psychology researchers Mary Ballard and Linda McNamara.

The **Violent Femmes** will play a concert aboard a Russian icebreaker headed for the North Pole during the Labor Day weekend, as part of the second annual Molson Ice Polar Beach Party.

"The **Rolling Stones** Rock & Roll Circus," a concert film that features the Stones, as well as acrobats and wild animals, will get its first full public screening at the New York Film Festival October 12-13. The movie, originally intended as a television special, was filmed at Wembley Stadium in 1968 after the band had finished the "Beggars Banquet" album. The band performs six songs in the film, including "You Can't Always Get What You Want," "Sympathy For The Devil" and "Jumpin' Jack Flash." After seeing a rough cut of the movie, shot late at night because of technical problems, the band decided they didn't want to release it. One of the reasons is because they felt they'd been upstaged by the **Who**, who appear in the film along with **John Lennon, Eric Clapton** and **Marianne Faithfull**.

The **Dave Matthews Band** has plenty of material written for their next album, and **Dave Matthews** hopes the LP will be even more improvisational. "I think the next album we can experiment a lot," Matthews says. "I certainly feel the next album we can pull things out of it that we haven't seen before, see how far we can stretch the fact that people will buy our albums again." The band recorded most of its "Crash" album will seated in a circle. "The combination of us sort of picked us up and took us, as opposed to any one of us being the choreographer who designed everything. It wasn't like that," Matthews says.

Former **Slade** singer **Noddy Holder** is to star in a British television comedy special called "The Grimleys," set in the 1970s. It's expected to air early next year. Nigel Planer, formerly of the Young Ones, will also star in the hour-long program, which might lead to a series. Holder works as a DJ at a Manchester radio station.

Mark Morrison, who had a number one single in Britain earlier this year with "Return Of The Mack," has admitted in a London court that he didn't perform a sentence of 150 hours of community service he was given last year for his involvement in a 1992 disturbance. He faces another court hearing to determine what will happen to his case.

Tina Turner is to give three concerts in Moscow November 5 through 7, as part of a European tour that began in London on July 6.

David Bowie plays Andy Warhol in the film "Basquiat," which got its premiere in New York on July 31. The movie is about the late New York painter Jean Michael Basquiat. Longtime Warhol associate Bob Colacello told the USA Today newspaper that Bowie's Warhol was "so much like Andy it was scary." Bowie calls his role an "impersonation" of Warhol. "I'd met him enough times so I kind of knew what (Warhol's) body language was and little idiosyncrasies of how he talked."

Early 1980s punk band the **Descendents** releases a 15-track album late next month (on Epitaph Records) called "Everything Sucks." While frontman **Milo Aukerman** went to college to get a doctorate, the rest of the band made eight LPs under the name of **All**. Aukerman, who says he doesn't usually listen to his own albums, says "This one doesn't make me cringe." "It's like drinking a fine Italian espresso with Twinkies...the culmination of two decades of playing combined with the rediscovery of spontaneous interaction," he says.

Former **Take That** singer **Robbie Williams** is being sued in a London High Court for \$125,000 by former band manager Nigel Martin-Smith, London's Daily Mirror newspaper reports. Among other sums, Martin-Smith claims Williams owes him \$50,000 from a \$200,000 royalty check, and another \$75,000 from Williams' \$300,000 advance for the band's "Greatest Hits" album. Williams recently signed a solo recording contract and is in the British charts with a remake of **George Michael**'s "Freedom." He's currently in the U.S. recording material for his debut solo album.

London band **Star 69** will release a new album next month (on Radioactive Records) called "Eating February." The group is touring Britain in September and will go on the road in the U.S. beginning in October. They'll play dates with the **Counting Crows** in November.

A survey in Britain found, not surprisingly, that people aged 18 to 30 years old would rather have the Gallagher brothers of **Oasis** as drinking companions than Tony Blair, leader of the country's Labour party.

A punk-pop band called **Kenickie** has been signed to a \$300,000, six-album contract (with EMI Records) in Britain. The band is fronted by 18-year-old **Lauren Le Laverne**, who has just graduated from the British equivalent of high school. Kenickie opened for **David Bowie** at the Phoenix Festival and are to play at the upcoming Reading (pron: redding) Festival. The band has already been getting radio play with a record called "Punka."

A support group for victims of domestic violence is refusing to accept money from a charity concert because performer **James Brown** has beaten his wife. The organization called Retreat said it wanted to disassociate itself from a Back At The Ranch concert in Montauk, New York. "His reputation as a batterer is well known in the domestic violence community," says Retreat executive director Jeri Woodhouse. "It's an awkward position — we would have received about \$10,000 — but we feel his performing would be totally inappropriate given our goals." Brown's late wife, Adrienne, accused him of assault three times during their 12-year marriage, but the charges were dismissed or withdrawn each time.

Guitarist **Duane Eddy** has been invited to perform with **Chet Atkins** at the Grand Ole Opry in Nashville, 34 years after he refused to perform with Atkins because the Opry wouldn't let his sax player join him. Horn players weren't permitted at the Grand Ole Opry until the 1970s. "To be at the Opry once again with Chet after all those years, to use a sax in my performance, and to finally realize a boyhood dream...l am honored," Eddy says.

A monument to the late **Del Shannon** has been erected in his hometown of Coopersville, Michigan, six years after his death from suicide at age 55. His son, Craig Westover, and over a hundred members of an association of Friends of Del Shannon attended a ceremony in the town, not far from Grand Rapids. Shannon's real name was Charles Westover. His biggest hit was 1961's "Runaway."

Bruce Springsteen was quick to jump on stage to join a band performing at the wedding party for his sound engineer Toby Scott in Whitefish, Montana. Springsteen picked up a guitar to join the **Fanatics** for versions of "Shake, Rattle & Roll" and "Mustang Sally."

After a separation of two years from his wife Kelly, **Van Halen** drummer **Alex Van Halen** has filed for a divorce in Los Angeles. The couple married in 1984 and have a six-year-old son.

Old and new music from **Devo** is featured on the CD of "DEVO Presents Adventures Of The Smart Patrol," the audio soundtrack companion to a CD-ROM game written and directed by the band's **Gerald Casale**. The LP includes two new songs called "Theme From The Smart Patrol" and "That's What He Said," and a previously unreleased version of "U Got Me Bugged."

East 17 played a a festival called The Beat Machine in Beirut, making them the first British band to perform there since fighting ended in the Lebanese capital. The band is writing new material and releases a new single out in October.

Aerosmith have hired a new New York-based manager, Wendy Laister, who has been working with the band for the past three years. "We already know that we work extremely well together and have the utmost respect for her," says the band's **Joe Perry**. "We're really excited and ready to get on with the music."

Smashing Pumpkins drummer **Jimmy Chamberlin** has pleaded not guilty in New York City to a charge of criminal possession of a controlled substance. The misdemeanor charge was filed in connection with the death of session keyboardist **Jonathan Melvoin** on July 12. If convicted, Chamberlin could be sentenced to a one-year prison term. He's free without bail until his next court appearance, which has been scheduled for September 26.

The aggravated battery trial of **Bobby Brown** in connection with a fight at Walt Disney World's Pleasure Island has been delayed because of minor injuries the singer suffered in a traffic accident. Brown is now slated to go on trial November 7. He and two other men are charged with beating a Chicago man at a Disney World nightclub in April 1995. Brown smashed a Porsche belonging to his wife, **Whitney Houston**, in Hollywood, Florida, a few days before he was scheduled to appear in an Orlando courtroom. The car skidded and came to a halt against a street sign. A witness t the incident said he was surprised Brown was not seriously hurt. Brown was treated for neck and leg injuries. **Melissa Etheridge** and her lesbian lover, Julie Cypher, are expecting a baby in January. A statement issued by Etheridge didn't offer particulars about Cypher's pregnancy. "Both Julie and I have been planning this for a long time and we couldn't be happier," Etheridge says.

Elton John says he's written and recorded 19 tunes for the upcoming musical "Aida" in 19 days. In an interview with the New Yorker magazine, John says he's also written new songs for the stage musical version of the film "The Lion King." One of the songs is tentatively entitled "The Hyena Slobber Song." "What I do best is write melodies to other people's lyrics," he says. "I wish I could write my own lyrics, but I can't."

A High Court in London has refused a request to dismiss a lawsuit filed by **Bruce Springsteen** against a company that wants to release a CD called "Unearthed" of early Springsteen recordings. The album features 23 songs ranging back to the 1970s. Springsteen wants release of the album blocked. There will be another court hearing after more documents are filed.

Los Del Rio, who have had a worldwide hit with "La Macarena," are to record a single with opera star **Montserrat Caballe**. The Spanish flamenco duo say "it's an honor that a singer of this category has thought of us to work with." The record should be out in September. It's not the first time Caballe has worked with contemporary musicians. He recorded "Barcelona" with the late **Freddie Mercury** of **Queen**.

Pulp played a concert before a small audience of 1,500 on Britain's Shetland Islands largely because Shetland is the home of the mother of the band's keyboardist, **Candida Doyle**.

Ventures drummer **Mel Taylor** has died from lung cancer at age 62 in Los Angeles, according to his wife Fiona. The band saw a resurgence of popularity when "Surf Rider" was featured in the film "Pulp Fiction." Two weeks before his death, Taylor had returned from Japan, where the band was always popular, because he felt ill.

San Diego band the **Paladins** releases a live album next month called "Million Mile Club," recorded earlier this year at shows in the northwestern U.S. The band, which has played more than 200 shows a year for more than 15 years, was initially discovered by **Fabulous Thunderbirds** singer **Kim Wilson**, who brought them to Texas and recorded their self-titled LP. The Paladins plan to tour the U.S. this fall and then play dates in Europe.

Former **4 Non Blondes** lead singer **Linda Perry** releases a solo album next month called "In Flight," which she describes as "one big mood swing." The LP, featuring members of the **Tuesday Night Music Club** made famous by **Sheryl Crow**, includes a duet with **Grace Slick** called "Knock Me Out" that also appears on the soundtrack to "The Crow: City of Angels." "I made a record I'm really proud of. To me this record is where music left off a while ago, when they would go in the studio and make albums. That hasn't been done in a really long time," Perry says.

Marshall Chapman releases an 11-song album called "Love Slave" next month (on Margaritaville/Island Records). Emmylou Harris and Beth Neilsen Chapman also appear on the LP.

The Neurotic Outsiders are playing a few live dates next month in support of their self-titled debut LP, produced by Jerry Harrison of Talking Heads. The Neurotic Outsiders is made up of the Sex Pistols' Steve Jones, Duran Duran's John Taylor, and Duff McKagan and Matt Sorum of Guns N' Roses.

Phil Collins' first studio album in three years, "Dancing To The Light," comes out in October. The LP was co-produced by Hugh Padgham, who has been working with the balding superstar throughout his solo career. The first single, "Into The Light," comes out next month.



Squeeze "Ridiculous" (IRS)



"This guartet made 'Ridiculous,' a new album that once again illustrates how the undeniable cleverness of Tilbrook and Difford can be both a weakness and a strength. Cleverness is a liability when the melodies become so convoluted and arbitrary and the lyrics so esoteric and pun-filled that the songs lose the illusion of conversation. On

the other hand, cleverness can be an invaluable asset when an unexpected chord change lifts a catchy melody into a higher emotional plane or when a surprising verbal detour reveals more about the singer than it obscures. It happens more often than not on 'Ridiculous.'...Best of all is 'Electric Trains,' a sharply sketched memoir of discovering puberty, 'The Sound of Music' and the Grateful Dead all at the same time."

Like any other geek flaunting specialized knowledge, Beck is a bore. Still, the care-

fully constructed chaos of 'Odelay' can be intriguing....He doesn't infuse anything meaningful into his lyrics, which are often twisted cultural references delivered in a stream of consciousness, and that's consistent with the meaningless instrumental melange....Along the way are numerous kitschy studio gimmicks and so many nods to various styles, a chiropractor might be in order. Funny how something so desperately unique can sound so dull.

"Locked in a by-the-numbers bow to American noise rock, France's Les Thugs serve as yet another painful reminder of our country's dubious superiority in the realm of trash culture. Imagine Gerard Depardieu as 'The Nutty Professor.'...Oldschool champions of boring, ambient ruckus, these guys wallow in more feedback and narcissism than Thurston Moore at a Hendrix memorial. And while one must assume guitarist Eric is singing in either English or French, just which may prove hard to pin down. As a result, better cuts such as "Poison Head" sound like just another 'Come on Pilgrim'era Pixies rip-off, every instrument milking a basic bass progression right into les ground. The Lemonheads have been forced to cancel the release of the single, "Purple Parallelogram," after Sony Music, the publishers for Noel Gallagher, refused to allow the track to be released. The song was co-written by Evan Dando and Gallagher when The Lemonheads frontman was going to Oasis shows last year. Speaking to the New Musical Express, Dando described how the track came about. "We were partying and stuff. Their record, '...Morning Glory,' had just come out the day before or something and we were really excited about the whole thing, and I'd been saying this phrase which actually denotes a certain substance. It was prescribed to me, a legal drug 'cause I had trouble sleeping and we'd been out in Amsterdam trying to score some drugs all night and couldn't find any. Noel got up the next morning singing this song, 'Purple Parallelogram,' 'cause that's what I called them, and we finished the song that night at some hotel, the (London) Hyde Park Hotel or something... it was fun." It is unclear why Sony have objected to the track's release. However, there are reports that there was no consultation between Gallagher and Dando prior to The Lemonheads recording the song. There are also rumors that the two have agreed not to release the song. It is the second time Noel Gallagher has stopped one of his tracks from going out. Recently, he refused to let "Wonderwall" be included on a Smurfs' album. The next Lemonheads' single will be "Car Button Cloth," available via East/West on September 30... Morrissey has signed with Mercury Records. The deal is for all territories. The former Smiths' singer will return with a new album and a world tour next year. A spokesperson for Morrissey's former label, RCA, said he (Morrissey) was unhappy with what he perceived as a lack of support in North America around the release of "Southpaw Grammar."... Super Furry Animals have withdrawn a track from their forthcoming EP because Steely Dan's Donald Fagen refused to clear the use of a sample from "Showbiz Kids." The track, "The Man Don't Give A Fuck," featured the line, 'You know they don't give a fuck about anybody else,' 50 times. Fagen had agreed to the sample's use, but withdrew permission at the last moment. Welsh guitar band, Super Furry Animals have recorded a new song, "Guacamole," to replace it. The 'If You Don't Want Me To Destroy You' EP will be released via Creation on September 30. Super Furry Animals will tour the UK in support of the EP... Oasis recorded an MTV Unplugged performance at a secret location in London on August 23. It will be broadcast later this year. There are no plans for an album of the show to be released. Around 400 people attended the show... Elsewhere, Oasis' two shows at Knebworth were remarkably trouble free. Over 250,000 people saw the band, but there were only 13 arrests (most for drunkenness or theft). More

than 3 million people applied for Knebworth tickets... PJ Harvey and John Parish will play two UK shows this year to showcase material from the forthcoming album, 'Dance Hall At Louse Point' (available September 23). The shows, in Bristol, southwest England on October 8 and 9, will be the duo's only dates this year... Technohead have been criticized by parents after Scottish schoolchildren holding fake joints sang along to the band's hit, "I Wanna Be A Hippy," at a village hall. The track has the line 'I wanna get stoned — mara, marijuana.' The children, aged between six and 12, dressed up as hippies. The story was picked up by the tabloid newspaper The Daily Record. Organizer of the village hall event Maria Stewart said the act was not meant to promote drugs. Technohead's next single, "Banana-na-na (Dumb Diddy Dumb)," will be in stores on September 9... Dodgy will play a benefit show at Newquay in south-west England on August 26. The show is for Surfers Against Sewage. In recent years, there have been a number of cases in the UK where surfers have fallen seriously ill, including some surfers who have been paralyzed. Surfers Against Sewage blames this on pollution... R.E.M.'s Peter Buck says his home in Hawaii has helped him to relax. Speaking to the New Musical Express, the guitarist commented, "I went in January just to get away from everything and I just started to get this really weird feeling. After a couple of weeks I realized, I'm relaxing! Literally, in my life I don't think I'd ever relaxed. I'm a worrier, and I'm really tense and I've got a lot of energy, so it was a totally foreign feeling to me, and I liked it. So, I bought this great house and, God, I don't shave for a week at a time, read a book a day, play guitar two or three hours a day and sit on the beach with the kids."... Bjork, Cast, Ocean Colour Scene, Terrorvision, Kula Shaker and **Sleeper** will all play at a benefit for the charity Childline at London Wembley Arena on September... Frank And Walters return this week with a new single, "Colours," available via Setanta/Go! Discs. An album, 'The Grand Parade,' will follow in the near future... Steve Harley releases a new album, 'Poetic Justice,' via Transatlantic this week. It is the first new set from the former Cockney Rebel frontman in five years... Kula Shaker's new single, "Hey Dude," will be in stores this week. The guitar band, heavily influenced by '60s and '70s psychedelia, have received critical praise in the UK and have already scored a UK Top Ten hit with "Tattva." Kula Shaker's debut album, 'K,' will be released on September 16. The band will tour the UK in support of the album... The Shamen will release a new album, 'Hempton Manor,' on September 30. The album is completely instrumental and dedicated to the "hemp plant."
