Olympia Broadcasting's KXXR in Kansas City, one will broaden to a more Mainstream stance

of the pioneers of the Rock Top40 format, has switched to a Crossover Top40 format, dubbing themselves "X106 - Triple the Music." Music Director Steve Douglas has been named Operations Manager as well as morning show host, while Gary Franklin will remain as Program Director. The station will also be consulted by Garry Mitchell and Dan O'Toole of The Programming Works

According to X106 General Manager Bob Gould, the move was necessitated by the difficulty in selling the city's merchants on the viability of the 18- to 24-year-old male audience, which comprised KXXR's core.

"Another problem was the fact that we only had 15 of the nation's top 40 records on our playlist," Gould admitted. "That aliented a large percentage of people we couldn't afford to lose in a market the size of Kansas City."

Olympia Files For Bankruptcy

Olympia Broadcasting Corporation has filed for federal bankruptcy protection in order "to permit the company to restructure its obligations in an orderly fashion and to stay certain litigation brought against the company," according to a report released by the company thsi week

The filing follows several months of discussions with Olympia's creditors, and does not include Olympia Broadcasting Networks, its radio networks subsidiary, or any of its subsidiaries which own the company's radio broadcasting stations.

Olympia owns and operates eight radio station in Kansas City, Fresno, Spokane, Anchorage and Fairbanks. Through its Olympia Broadcasting Networks subsidiary, the company produces and distributes sports, entertainment and information radio network programming to over 1700 radio stations. Olympia previously announced it was seeking to sell its radio stations, and earlier this month reached an agreement to sell KRZR-FM in Fresno to real estate giant Fred Sands, owner of KNAC and KDAY in L.A.

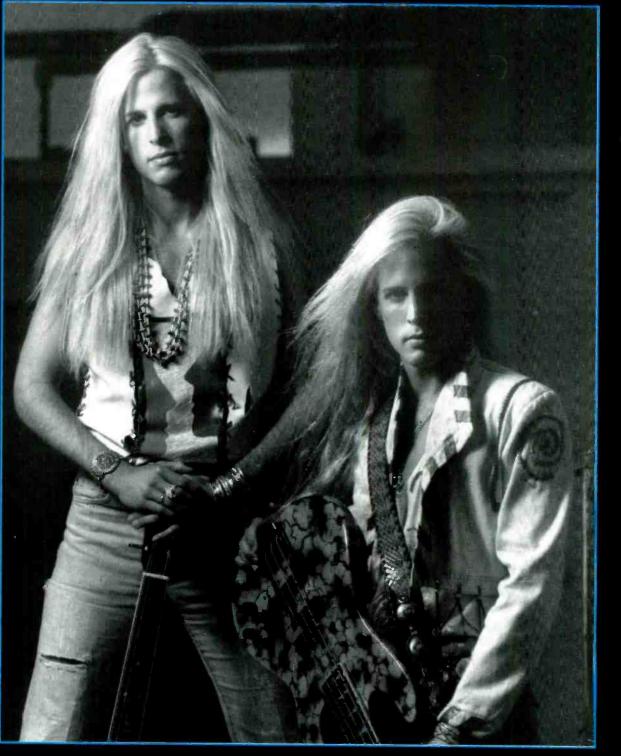

GLEICHER TO HEAD UP NEW SMASH RECORDS



Music industry veteran Starvin' Marvin Gleicher has been named President of POLY-GRAM's newly created Chicago-based label, SMASH Records, it was announced this week.

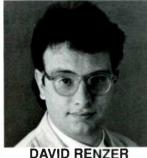
The formation of the new label reactivates the MARVIN GLEICHER SMASH name, which in

the early and mid sixties was a Chicago-based hitspawning label with acts ranging from Roger Miller to Left Bank to James Brown. The new SMASH will focus on urban, dance, pop and alternative artists.

Gleicher told HITMAKERS that a press party will be held June 28 in Chicago to announce specifics about the label, such as which of POLYGRAM's larger labels will lend their press and promotion staffs to SMASH.

Renzer Named VP/GM ot Zomba with Zomba for four years, most recently as Director

Renzer, who is based in New York, has been of Music Publishing. In his new position he will be responsible for both music publishing and overseeing producer management operations of the company. Since joining the company Renzer has been involved in signing k.d. lang, Levert, Britny Fox, Testament, Voivod and Metal Church to publishing deals.

"This will be a very exciting time for Zomba as we expand our L.A., N.Y., Nashville and foreign operations, and make new inroads as an aggressive independent publishing company," commented Renzer.

DAT COPYGUARD

A bill that would require all Digital Audio Tape (DAT) equipment sold in the U.S. to contain a system for preventing multiple first-generation copies of CDs, has been stopped before ever reaching the floor of the U.S. House of Representatives.

Following a June 13 hearing of the U.S. Senate Commerce Committee, Subcommittee on Communications, at which testimony in favor of and against the bill was heard, a hearing scheduled for later this month before the House was cancelled, due to the bill's lack of support in the Senate subcommittee.

The bill proposed that all DAT equipment contain the Serial Copy Management System (SCMS), which would allow copying from a CD to DAT, but not from one DAT to another, thus eliminating the danger of mass production of recordings from DAT copies.

While the bill appeased the recording industry, it failed to address the concerns of the National Music Publishers Association, which claims that songwriters would lose royalties as a result of DAT copies of CDs. NMPA President and CEO Ed Murphy, who testified against the bill June 13, told HITMAKERS that the bill would be satisfactory only if it included a clause providing for royalties paid to songwriters and publishers based on sales of DAT equipment and tapes.

"The meeting was characterized as being that the SCMS bill would not move forward unless a royalty renumeration were attached to it," said Murphy. He said that he didn't know whether the hearing results would affect the plans of Japanese manufacturers to

ship DAT equipment to the U.S. at the end of June. "The question (of whether DAT equipment will be shipped) was asked at the hearing, but I didn't hear an answer," said Murphy. If it does, said Murphy, the NMPA will consider filing a lawsuit seeking renumeration for its members.

In order to receive the channel, a custom digital tuner is provided to the home cable television system. Digital Planet offers a variety of stereo channels of CD-quality audio programming to subscribers equipped with the digital tuners.

"With the formation of the CAPITOL Records Channel, we are the initial recording company to become involved in this innovative music delivery system," said Milgrim. "I foresee our industry being involved in many new and varied technologies in the future to better serve our supporters and hopefully reach new audiences."

Bill DeLany, President of Digital Planet, said that the channel "adds a new dimension to our programming service. This programming effort by CAPITOL is the first step in pioneering a recording industry role in this exciting new business opportunity, which will benefit everyone."

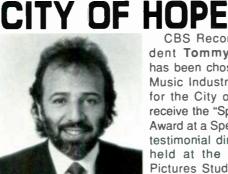

Crew movement spreading from Florida to other areas of the country, the man at the center of the controversy - 2 Live Crew leader Luther Campbell says that in order to stem the tide of obscenity rulings and record bannings, those who feel that the rights to freedom of artistic expression are being threatened must band together and make their voices heard

Campbell has become a national symbol in the censorship debate since a U.S. District Court judge in Fort Lauderdale ruled earlier this month that the album AS NASTY AS THEY WANNA BE is obscene, making it legal for law enforcement officials to enforce a ban on selling and distributing the record in Broward, Dade and Palm Beach Counties. Since then, officials in San Antonio, Texas

and Columbia, South Carolina have taken steps to ban the record, signaling a growing trend of right wing activism fueled by the Florida ruling.

In an interview from the Miami offices of LUKE Records (formerly SKYY-

WALKER Records), of which Campbell is President, the controversial rapper told HITMAKERS that he is hoping major labels come forward to lend their support in his label's fight to overturn the obscenity rulings and prevent the situation from spreading further. But, said Campbell, so far only rap-pers have taken the initiative.

"We want everybody to come together, but there hasn't been anybody calling from the music industry in general - the only ones who have been calling us are the rappers," said Campbell. "You've got to be living in a fucking can to not know what's going on. If anybody wants to help, they can call and show their support.

"We don't think we should be calling people up and saying, 'Hey, we need some help,' just for them to tell us (See CAMPBELL page 30)

bel record slingers would point first to their successes in Top40 radio as their crowning achievements. But that's not the case with Stu Cohen, WARNER BROS.' Brooklynbred, street-smart VP of Promotion what makes his temperment glow like a supernova is his company's success at breaking new artists. In this select category, the Eurbank-

based label is recognized as the best in the business at going that extra yard for their up-and-coming talent.

"People expect us to keep Madonna on top, so we don't get any pats on back for that." states Cohen, his East Coast mettle shining through. "What really makes me feel proud is the success we're having with our new acts, and we've broken four this year: Jane Child, Biz Markie, Tommy Page and Electronic."

Cohen credits the national and local staffs' esprit de corps and inbred pride as integral

factors in paving the way for the aforementioned acts' ascent. That elan has made them the envy of other labels and kept them on the cutting edge, but Stu feels the success of WARNER BROS, has as much to do with what happens off the airwaves as on.

"There is a lot more to breaking and maintaining bands than through the traditional channel of Top40," he says after a pause, unsure if he should reveal such 'scandalous' beliefs to our magazine. After taking stock of (See COHEN page 43)

HITMAKERS FACE-OFF IS RETAIL INFORMATION A VALID TOOL FOR PROGRAMMERS?

It has often been observed that radio stations and retail chains share a curious symbiotic relationship. Certainly radio acknowledges the fiscal reports provided them by dotina record merchants, but do the programmers keep the tallies top of mind when adding records at the end of the week? The general

consensus is that tastemakers who rely too heavily on sales charts risk sidestepping the pulse beats of their marketplace.

One programmer, Guy Zapoleon of ENERGY96.5 in Houston, concluded that sales can be a valuable tool, but only "if you can really trust the source of the information." Sadly, Zapoleon observed, the intimate link between programmer and retail manager - due to the escalating workload encumbering both parties - is becoming a

thing of the past.

"Nowadays, with programmers spending more time surveying their call out research and request data, they have less time to foster close relationships with the people who supply them that key information," explained Zapoleon. "You have to have that relationship in order to trust that the information is valid.'

Conversely Russ Bach, President of CEMA Distributors in Los Angeles, said that modern retailers who

employ computerized registers can tip the discerning radio programmer off to hot records that they otherwise might not have detected.

"No one, no matter how brilliant they are, can be an omnipotent judge of what works ir their marketplace all the time," said Bach. He qualified his remarks by roting that "once cas-

singles become a factor again, and it 12-inch vinvl singles sales are considerec, the information will become more valuable to determine what's becoming popular.

The real shame," Bach said somberly, "is that we've never really been able to accurately track what sells albums, CDs and cassettes."

Programmers like Zapoleon and Sait Lake City's Lou Simon of HOT94.9, who also offered up a cynical view of retail as a programming tool, (See FACE-OFF page 54)

RETAIL REPORT FAITH BLAZING - WILSON LLIPS UNSTOPPAB

We harped about them like crazy over the last few weeks, and now the Faith No More epidemic has struck with withering intensity. Danny Shephard, retail roustabout at Tower Records in Tempe, says he can't keep track of all the band's discs flying through the doors of his store.

"The weather dets awfully warm around Arizona this time of year, but Faith No More is raising the thermometer a few notches higher all on its own," said Shephard. All of which should keep Rich Fitzgerald and his **REPRISE** cohorts cool, calm and collected during the hot summer months.

On the alternative ledger. DGC's The Sundays, MCA's The Lightning Seeds and CHRYSALIS' World Party are moving not only in Tempe, but in a myriad of other regions as well. "We think the time might be right for Concrete Blond

(IRS) to strike it rich here too," said Shephard. "Local radio airplay on their single Joey is translating into heavy sales."

Also blazing are Wilson Phillips, whose new SBK platter, Release Me, is mowing down the competition like Hale Irwin on the back nine of the U.S. Open. These three lovelies will not be denied their place in the sun. For a taste of a similar blend of harmonyladen California pop, albeit from a young male perspective, try another sweet DGC concoction for the nineties, Nelson. The group is spearheaded by the twin sons of the late, great Ricky Nelson, and display some crafty durable pop on their debut single Love and Affection. One programmer, Craig Roberts of KCHX in Odessa, TX, thinks nothing short of an epic flood will keep Nelson from striking (See RETAIL page 54)

INTERVIEW

When Paul "Boom Boom" Cannon was still just a pop gun, he made it a point every day to finish his homework at school so he could spend his evenings by the radio, soaking in the magic spun by the likes of Jackson Armstrong, Joe Thomas, and Andy Jackson. "I always thought 'Wow, what a great way to make a living without having to work," recalls Boom.

He broke into radio in Connecticut in 1976, eventually landing at Buffalo's WKSE in 1984 via Z104 in Frederick, Maryland. In the spring of 1989, the folks at Cap Cities/ABC came calling, and Cannon moved to Providence to program PRO-FM, a station with a storied history of Top40 success.

Now, after a full year at the helm, he gives us his views on the state of Top40 and how he plans to carry on the winning tradition in Providence. And while life in radio might be a little more work than young Boom ever envisioned, Cannon still brings that same boyish exuberance to the office every morning - and it shows.

WHERE DID YOU START TO DEVELOP YOUR PROGRAMMING PHILOSOPHY?

Before I went to 'KSE I worked at WZYQ in Frederick, Maryland, which at the time was a very highly regarded Top40. The program director was Kemosabi Joe, who is now down in Florida, and the GM was The Real Howard Johnson. I used to talk programming with Kemosabi quite a bit, and we used to sit down and talk about the station and different events that we could get involved in. I was doing nights at the time, but I used to come into the station around 2 p.m. just so I could get a handle on what was going on. A lot of times they would ask me to help out on things or give them some ideas about how a certain promotion would go, and we would talk music a little bit. I tried to get as involved as I could.

PRO-FM HAS BEEN A SUCCESS FROM THE START, SINCE THE FORMAT SWITCH SIXTEEN YEARS AGO. HOW DO YOU MAINTAIN THAT SUCCESS WITHOUT GETTING STALE OR OLD?

That's a good question, and I don't know if I can answer it because I haven't been here long enough to be judged with all the other great PDs that have been through here. This station has a heritage, and with many heritage Top40s, there are some things that you can fall into that put you in danger. I think you have to constantly challenge yourself and stay on top of what's going on in the industry to keep the station on top. That goes for any station, whether it be a heritage station like we are, or a station that's trying to battle against one that is in our position. It's also important to always analyze what you are doing and think about better ways to do it. The bottom line is, if you have a decent presentation and you have an exciting radio station, then you have a good chance of being successful.

IF A NEW TOP40 ENTERED PROVIDENCE WITH A NICHE FORMAT, WOULD THAT FORCE YOU TO MOVE IN ANY DIRECTION?

I really don't think so. You have to program your station to what you think is going to win and not be too influenced by the competition. One of the reasons some stations in the country have gotten hurt is because they were too reactionary. You have to do what you think is going to win in your market, and do everything in your power to make the station sound as tight and interesting as it possibly can. If you do all of those things right, you'll win.

IN THE MOST RECENT ARBITRON BOOK, PRO-FM IS #1 OVERALL 25-54 AND #2 18-34. HOW DO YOU APPEAL TO AN 18-34 MALE AND A 45-YEAR-OLD HOUSEWIFE AT THE SAME TIME?

There are different factors involved. We do a little bit of dayparting; in fact we do more dayparting here than I did when I was in Buffalo. We also direct some of the contesting at the adults and try to gear a lot of the things we do during the day to the adult audience. It's a tightrope, because in Top40 I don't think you want to program to a 25-54 audience - you still have to program to the 18-34s. But with the heritage of a PRO-FM, we can get away with being a pretty mainstream Top40 and still get adult demos.

GIVE US AN EXAMPLE OF AN ADULT-TARGETED PROMOTION.

This is a big tourist area with Newport, Naragansett and Mystic, Connecticut being close by. A couple of weeks ago was Rhode Island Tourism Week, so we did a promotion called Typical Tourist Trademarks. We did it in middays, and we asked people that were listening at their offices to fax us information when we asked for it. We asked for five typical things they thought tourists wore - things like knee socks with loafers, cameras, goofy hats - and we ended up taking 40 people down to Newport for a day of shopping, a cruise of Newport Harbor, and out to dinner. It was just kind of a fun little midday promotion, but that's what you have to do to attract

the adult audience.

PAUL CANNON PD, PRO-FM, Providence

IF YOU HAD YOUR CHOICE, WOULD YOU RATHER BE NUMBER ONE 18-34 AND NUMBER TWO 25-54, RATHER THAN THE WAY IT IS NOW?

Obviously, from a sales standpoint, you always want to be number one 25-54, and I think it's absolutely great that we can be. But I'm greedy, so I'd like to be number one 18-34, as well.

IS MUSIC STILL THE KEY TO SUCCESS FOR TOP40?

It absolutely is. Music is the single most important element there is at a radio station. It doesn't matter how good your talent is and it doesn't matter how good your promotions are - if your music is off target I don't think you can win.

WOULDN'T IT BE THE SAME IF YOUR TALENT OR YOUR PROMOTIONS WERE OFF TARGET? IS IT THREE-PARTS EQUAL?

No, I don't think it's three-parts equal. I think you can overcome some deficiencies in what you have as far as air talent goes, and I think you can be outpromoted in some respects by another station in the market, but if your product is off, that is a sure indication that you are going to lose. I would say that music is probably two-thirds of the picture, and your on-air and promotions make up the other third.

WHAT TYPES OF MUSIC WORK FOR PRO-FM?

This is a pretty aggressive market. People here like new music to a certain extent, and we play more new music here than I played in Buffalo. Along with the trend in the rest of the country, this market also happens to like like dance-flavored or Urban-type music. There is a high Italian influence here, and the people here like to dance. The situation here is pretty consistent with the trends happening in the rest of the country.

IS THE DANCE NICHE THE PLACE TO BE FOR A LONG TIME TO COME?

I don't know if dance is even a niche anymore. Dance is what Top40 radio is today. With all the changes that the AOR stations have gone through and with them being so gold-based, I think Top40 has to focus on who makes up our target demographic and who we are appealing to. With most of the 25-49 year-old men listening to AORs that are actually almost classic rock stations, Top40s have to lean to femaleappeal music, which is definitely rhythm-based.

IS IT THE RESEARCH METHODS USED TODAY THAT TELL YOU FEMALES AREN'T ATTRACTED TO ROCK MUSIC?

I think you can make research say anything you want it to say - it just depends on who you test. People are partial to a certain type of format, whether it be men or women. If you test women 18-34 who listen to AORs, then your test results are going to show that they prefer rock 'n' roll music, but you knew that when you started. It all depends on how you screen the test subjects. In research, you target the people

you want to attract.

SO WHY RESEARCH THEM IF YOU ALREADY KNOW THEY'RE GOING TO LIKE IT?

You don't really know. I can't pick 40 songs and tell you that all 40 of them are going to work with an 18-34 year-old woman, because I'm not an 18-34 yearold woman. Research is just a part of the puzzle. Sales and requests also have to be considered when your putting your music together. You have to remember something - program directors take a chance every week, whether they add one, three, five or ten records. The research isn't going to tell you what record to put on the radio. The research is only going to tell you if the records you chose to put on the radio are liked by the listeners.

IS THE APPROACH OF THE PROGRAMMER THESE DAYS JUST TO SIT BACK AND SAY, "ALL RIGHT, LET THEM HAVE THEIR SHARE OF THE PIE AND WE'LL TAKE OURS." ARE THERE ANY PROGRAMMERS OUT THERE THAT STILL WANT TO TAKE IT ALL?

I'm sure every programmer at every station wants to take it all. I think a lot of programmers have sat back and said, "Well, they haven't made that animal yet that appeals to 18-34 women and men equally at the same time." There are a few records out there like that, but for the most part men and women have different likes and dislikes, tastes, attitudes and moods. If you try to be too broad-based or too mass appeal, you end of pleasing no one.

GIVE US A PEEK INTO YOUR WEEKLY MUSIC MEETING.

Usually on Friday or Monday - and sometimes as late as Tuesday, although we try not to wait that long - my MD Tony Bristol and I bring in whatever product we feel is right for the station, and that depends a lot on what's on the station currently. There are certain weeks where you may be looking for something that's got a little rhythm, or a ballad, or a rock ballad, or something to play at night. Once you decide what the tempo and texture and feel of your station is going to be, you always work from that end, and that's how you end up deciding what's going to make it into your meeting and what you're going to talk about for the next week. Certainly Tony has a lot of contact with the record community and talks with them on a consistent basis, as do I. We try trade-off every week so we can both get a good feel of what everybody's all about. In the meetings we analyze what music is out there and hopefully just put the hits on the radio.

IF YOU'RE NOT REALLY IN NEED OF A BALLAD, BUT YOU HEAR ONE THAT'S AN ABSOLUTE SMASH, WILL YOU STILL HOLD OFF?

In most cases, yes, unless you're so incredibly sure about the record and you want to take something off that's already working for you, and I can't see too many instances where that would happen. You can wait a week in most cases.

IS THE PROBLEM THAT THE THE STATION WOULD BE OFF BALANCE MUSICALLY?

Absolutely. If there happen to be five rock ballads out one week and I thought they were all great rock ballads, the chances of me adding all five of them would be slim to none. If there were five dance records out one week, the chances of adding all of them are slim to none as well. If you get too ballad heavy, too dance or urban, or too rock, that's when you have problems. You have to have a certain texture and tempo and feel to the station. That's why people listen.

WOULD YOU SAY THAT PROGRAMMING IS MORE OF A PEOPLE-MANAGEMENT ENDEAVOR THAN A CREATIVE ENDEAVOR?

It's both. People skills are very important, and if you can keep your air staff motivated and psyched and wanting to win, that's a big part of being successful. In addition to that, you want your promotions and presentation on the air to be as exciting as they can be, and that will only happen if you are creative. It's a two-edged sword.

DO YOU GIVE YOUR DJ'S LOTS OF FREEDOM AND CREATIVE LICENSE?

That depends on the situation you're in. Different people need different types of motivation. There are some people who are gung-ho and try to come up with all kinds of creative things on their own, and they'll experiment. I try to give these people some leeway as to what they can and can't do. Then there are people that you have to push a bit to be a little more creative. It all depends on the individual.

THE BASIC TALENT LINEUP AT PRO-FM HAS REMAINED THE SAME FOR YEARS. DOES THAT HELP?

That's one of the reasons why we are such a legendary station. When we research, all of the air personalities at PRO-FM do extremely well with topof-mind awareness and name recognition. There's kind of a unity in that, and it even sparks some playful in-house sparring. They kind of jab each other about who's more well known.

GIVE US A RUNDOWN OF THE FULLTIME AIRSTAFF.

Jimmy Gray does 5:30 a.m. to 10 a.m. He's been in the market about 20 years, originally starting at WPRO-AM and moving over to PRO-FM in 1974 when we switched formats. He's been doing mornings for us every since. Jimmy is the master of one-liners, and his name recognition is incredible. He's kind of a habit for listeners in Providence. Tony Bristol does 10 a.m. to 2 p.m., and he's our biggest female attraction. The daytime listeners love him. From 2 p.m. to 6 p.m. is David Simpson. He's been here about nine years, and he's one of the guys I mentioned before who likes to try different things on the air. He's a little bit off-center. He tries little experiments on the air and just has a lot of fun while he's on. Big John Bina has been doing nights here for about 13 years. In fact, John was one of the guys that put PRO-FM on the air back in 1974, then left the station for a little while and came back. He's gangbusters at night. Again, I think part of the magic is the fact that he's been here so long. It's really kind of crazy when you could potentially be a parent and tell your three- or four year-old that you used to listen to Big John. From 10 p.m. to 1 a.m. is Tony Mascaro, and he's been here a slew of years as well. He's made a lot of progress since I've been here. He does a great job of keeping those late nighters tuned to the station so their radio is on 92.3 when they wake up in the morning. Overnights is Jim Halfyard, and he's been at it 11 years. We call him Smiling Jim, because anybody who's done overnights for that long and isn't crazy should be called Smiling.

ALL THESE GUYS HAVE BEEN IN THE MARKET FOR SO LONG, AND A GUY NAMED BOOM CANNON FROM PUTNAM, CONNECTICUT, WALKS IN THE DOOR ONE DAY. HOW DO YOU AIRCHECK A STAFF LIKE THAT? I have an inside joke at the station. When somebody says, "I've been doing it this this way for 15 years," I'll say, "Oh. Well hopefully from now on we're going to do it the right way." Of course I say that tongue-incheek and with a smile on my face. Everybody has different ideas and opinions on how things should be done, and I think that if you can convey to your staff that some of your ideas - at least one in ten - are good ones, then they'll respect you. I was really excited about coming here because this is kind of like home to me, and I brought an energy and boyish excitement with me that's been contagious. I like to have fun, and the staff knows it. I'm certainly not going to do anything that's going to be detrimental to the station, and they know that too. Sure, they look at you with a little hesitancy at first, but when they realize that you have some idea of what you're talking about, they accept it, and they want to come along for the ride.

DO YOU FIND YOU'VE CHANGED MUCH COMING FROM THE COMPETITIVE SITUATION IN BUFFALO TO A HERITAGE STATION?

No, not really, except that this is a little bit more of an aggressive situation musically. I think that's influenced by the fact that there are a lot of colleges here. We've got Providence College, Brown, URI and Bryant, among others. There's some Boston influence here, and with the New England states being so small, things are a bit more diverse as far as music goes.

ALTHOUGH PROVIDENCE IS THE SMALLEST MARKET IN THE CHAIN, PRO-FM HAS BEEN REFERRED TO AS THE JEWEL OF THE CAP CITIES /ABC RADIO PROPERTIES. WHY SO?

Because it's a big profit center. The station has always done very well financially, and we've never really had any major fluctuations as far as the ratings are concerned. Unlike some of the other properties, this station has always been rock-steady.

DOES THAT MEAN THEY TAKE A HANDS-OFF ATTITUDE?

To be honest with you, in most cases as far as Cap Cities properties are concerned, they are fairly hands-off. There is real local autonomy in almost every Cap Cities situation, which is kind of nice. I certainly think they are one of the best broadcastproperties chains in the country, if not the best. They just know what they're doing. They're not investment bankers and they don't do real estate; they buy radio and television properties and overall media-type properties, and that's what they do best.

ANY GOALS OR ASPIRATIONS?

That's kind of a strange question for me. I think you do the best job you can possibly do, whether you're in Providence, Poughkeepsie or wherever, and if you do a good job where you are presently, then good things will happen. Good things may be that I'm in New York in five years or L.A. in five years, or good things might be that I'm still at PRO-FM. I think the future is really based on the individual and their particular goals, and to be honest with you, I don't want to set any. If I say I want to be in New York in five years, the only thing that does is make me depressed if I make it in six. I can't say that I want to be the president of the company some day. I'll just do the best job I can possibly do, and then if offers or opportunities happen to come my way, I'll decide at that time whether it's advantageous for me or not.

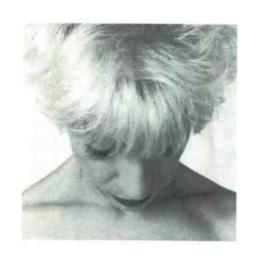

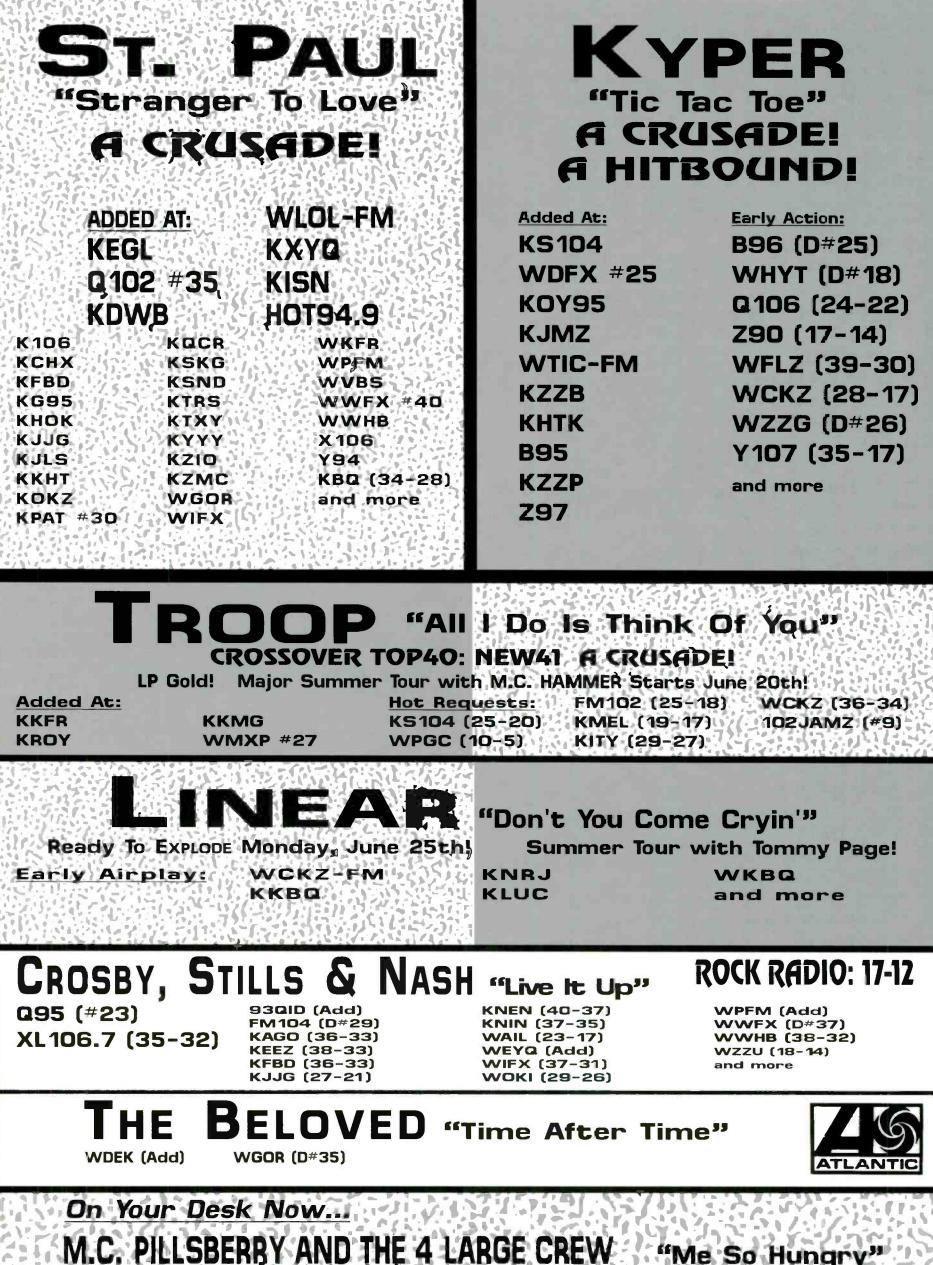

Also, **THE TIME** <u>Jerk Out</u> (REPRISE) has the sound that's their own! And a solid, upbeat record is **ST. PAUL** <u>Stranger To Love</u> (ATLANTIC)!"

JIMMY STEAL, Asst. PD/MD at KEGL, Dallas sez, "NEW KIDS ON THE BLOCK <u>Tonight</u> (COLUMBIA) is a SMASH! Also, check out **TIMES TWO** <u>Sweet</u> <u>Jane's Revenge</u> (EMI)! It's more neo-Beatles music, but it sounds GREAT! And you have to listen to **THE RAILWAY CHILDREN** <u>Every Beat Of The Heart</u> (VIRGIN). It's reminiscent of The Cure's <u>Just Like Heaven</u> - slightly post-modern but still very straight-ahead!"

MICHAEL POWERS, MD at WZPL, Indianapolis sez, "WILSON PHILLIPS <u>Release Me</u> (SBK), their second release, is very good! Also, THE TIME <u>Jerk Out</u> (REPRISE) sounds just like it should - GREAT! Anytime you hear Morris Day laugh, you know it'll be GREAT! For a record that'll KICK this summer, play ST. PAUL <u>Stranger To Love</u> (ATLANTIC)! And if you wanna have some fun, listen to <u>Me And Elvis</u> by HUMAN RADIO (COLUMBIA)!"

JEFF KAPUGI, MD at POWER PIG, Tampa sez, "**THE TIME** returns with a very cool record - <u>Jerk Out</u> (REPRISE)! **TIMMY T** delivers another HIT to Tampa with <u>What Will I Do</u> (QUALITY)! It's already working really well! Check out the import version of <u>Don't Let Me Fall Alone</u> by **FAN CLUB** (EPIC) - it's excellent! Lastly, there's a HOT buzz on ICEY JAYE <u>It's Just A Girl Thing</u> (ARISTA)! What a GREAT novelty tune!"

FRANK MINIACCI, MD at THE BEAT, Los Angeles sez, "Check out GEOFF McBRIDE <u>Got A Good Thing</u> (ARISTA), written and produced by Levert with an obvious Levert sound. A HOT novelty tune is <u>What You Deserve</u> by UNANSWERED QUESTIONS (EMI)! And yes, it is at the right speed! FATHER MC <u>Treat Them Like They Want To Be Treated</u> (UPTOWN/MCA) sounds similar to Guy! Check out <u>Your Love</u> by KEITH SWEAT (ELEKTRA)! It's an uptempo JAM! And BANG <u>Holding My Heart In Your Hand</u> (A&M) is an excellent summer record that's perfect for Pop radio!"

DANA LUNDON, MD at HOT102, Milwaukee sez, "Check out **INDECENT OBSESSION** *Tell Me Something* (MCA)! The guitar riffs might be a problem for some stations, but it's a very cool jam, especially the 12-inch version. Also, **TAFURI** *What Am I Gonna Do About Your Love* (SLEEPING BAG) is a GREAT single! **PAJAMA PARTY** *Living Inside Your Love* (ATLANTIC) is a beautiful ballad that I believe is even stronger than Seduction. *Holding My Heart In Your Hand* by **BANG** (A&M) is a super record, and the mixes are GREAT! Lastly, check out THE BRAT PACK LP (VENDETTA/A&M), especially the original mix of the ballad *Every Time It Rains*, and *Unconditional Love* which is reminiscent of Wham!'s *I'm Your Man*!"

This remix has additional vocals and production and is the absolute GROOVE for nighttime rotation!"

MICHAEL MARTIN, MD at KIIS-FM, Los Angeles sez, "MAXI PRIEST <u>Close To You</u> (CHARISMA) is the Soul II Soul hit that you've been waiting for! Be on time with THE TIME <u>Jerk Out</u> (REPRISE)! This is a HIT! And one to look out for is **ST. PAUL** <u>Stranger To Love</u> (ATLANTIC)!"

MIKE SNOW, MD at KKBQ, Houston sez, "Check out **THE RAILWAY CHILDREN** *Every Beat Of The Heart* (VIRGIN)! This is another crossover Alternative HIT! **THE TIME** *Jerk Out* (REPRISE) is a very cool comeback! Look out for *Watching You* by **THE BLACK FLAMES** (COLUMBIA), and also *Pleasure* by **PLEASE** (ANXIOUS)! What a beautiful record! Lastly, a GREAT Mainstream Pop record is **ST. PAUL** *Stranger To Love* (ATLANTIC)!"

DON O'NEAL, Asst. PD at WCKZ-FM, Charlotte sez, "Top five phones for <u>Jerk Out</u> by THE TIME (REPRISE)! What a GREAT record! ANITA BAKER is back with an all daypart SMASH, <u>Talk To Me</u> (ELEKTRA)! She's definitely a core artist! For chartable LP cuts check out <u>One More Chance</u> by PERFECT GENTLEMEN (COLUMBIA) and <u>Your Love</u> by KEITH SWEAT (ELEKTRA)! And if you're curious about <u>Welcome To The Real World</u> by JANE CHILD (WARNER BROS.), check out the Jimmy Jam remix. It did it for us!"

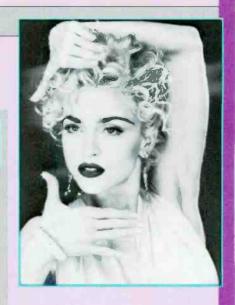

President **Jay Berman** was one of those who testified in favor of the bill, telling the Subcommittee on Communications that the bill "represents substantial progress for the music industry." Berman testified that the bill would reflect a recognition of the home taping problem, and that the Copyright Coalition, which includes the NMPA, ASCAP and the Songwriters Guild of America, "has less at stake with respect to home taping than do the record companies.

"Regardless of whether we sell a recording, we still have recording and manufacturing costs and salaries for production, promotion, marketing and distribution," said Berman. "We cannot afford to be so cavalier about the home taping issue as to ignore the opportunity to limit some home taping and recoup some of the otherwise lost income until we can secure compensation through royalties."

"It's a case where the ultra-right wing minority in Florida have intimidated the passive majority," says Goldberg, who is President of Gold Mountain artist management firm in Los Angeles. Read the newspapers, watch the news, pay attention to what's going on around you, and look for local opportunities. A great example was when Gorbachev was here. Here is one of the most powerful people in the world, one of the most influential people in the last century, and he's coming to our town for a day. As soon as you hear something like that, the bells go off and you think there are a million ways for my station to reflect the Twin Cities' excitement. We had special songs for Gorbachev, we ran a lot of bits, we had a birthmark contest, we sent people to Moscow, Minnesota - we did so much to seize the moment that we ended up on *Good Morning America* and the *ABC Nightly News*. We ran Russian ID's and we gave Russian lessons in the morning. When you start doing something like that, it really changes the whole face of the radio station - but I think people expect it. People expect a living, breathing radio station to be talking about the same things that they're talking about.

IS SPONTANEITY ONE OF THE MOST IMPORTANT INGREDIENTS IN CONSTRUCTING AND NURTURING A HEALTHY FORMAT?

Absolutely. You can't just wish for spontaneity; you have to have a natural inclination to seize the moment. I don't think you can wake up one day and take a flat, boring radio station and say, "Wow - maybe we should be spontaneous!" Spontaneity is a product of having people who are observant and in touch with the pulse of the marketplace, and who have enough of a sense of humor to know how to treat it on the air.

DO YOU TEACH THIS IN YOUR AIRCHECK SEMINARS WITH EACH OF THE JOCKS?

We want it to be so that listeners never know what our jocks are going to say. Other formats can be consistant, make sure the weather forecast falls at the right time, and have everything chiseled in stone, but that's not us - you can't teach people to be spontaneous, but you can nurture it in people who already have the inclination. My afternoon guy, Hollywood Henderson, is great with the phones, and with him you hear a tremendous amount of very topical, quick bits with listeners about things that are going on in the market. He came to us with that talent, and we just encourage him to use it.

BILL TANNER

PD, POWER 96, Miami

The name of the game is to seize the moment. Train everybody to look at life with a larger pair of eyes, to take what is already there in the community and put it in the context of your radio station. The ultimate objective is to make your radio station sound, feel, taste, and smell like the moment. Capture the moment and make it bigger than life. An example is the controversy that's raging in South Florida over 2 Live Crew, which we have made the subject of our morning shows. It has been so hot that we were featured in a report on the CBS Evening News about a week ago. CBS is also planning a 48 Hours episode on censorship, which we're to be a part of. This is a matter of taking something that was already going on in the public mind, and putting the radio station squarely in the center of the controversy. When it comes to that type of controversial situation, we don't shy from it - we look for it. That's one way to make your radio station known, to make it more than just a jukebox that people can replace with a CD player in the trunk of their car. You have to have the mortar between the bricks; the music is the bricks, but without the proper consistancy of mortar, the bricks will fall down. The key is to take the spontaneity of the moment and put it in the context of your music-oriented radio station.

DOES A JOCK HAVE TO HAVE IT IN HIM TO BE SPONTANEOUS?

You have to have it in the whole radio station as a living, breathing, operating philosophy.

HAVE YOU BEEN PRACTICING THIS?

All my career. We talk about doing this at 80% of the jock meetings, and if you use it as a philosophy you'll find that it's not something your competitors are doing at all. I believe that POWER96 does it very well, and it's one of the things I'm most proud of about this radio station. From the top down - from the manager, to the sales staff, to the programming staff, to the promotions staff - we all think and live that way. It really is the heart and soul of the format.

JOEL FOLGER PD, KEGL, Dallas

Things that we experience in everyday life - like going to the grocery store, seeing a concert, being stuck in traffic - those are the things that can help spark spontaneity and creativity of thought. As far as spontaneity in our programming mix goes, I believe it's part of our daily mix. One of the most critical elements in the mix is to let everybody know that it's O.K. to be spontaneous. Let everybody in the building know that if they have an idea about something for on the air, talk about it - and that goes for the janitor and the receptionist as well. Small germs sometimes create big, entertaining radio. Just talking about a bad pizza that the jock had the night before can turn into a major promotion, like a pizza challenge, in which different pizza shops are challenged to bring the radio station a pizza in 30 minutes so we can judge the pizza on the air. Spontaneity is a part of everyday life here at the Eagle.

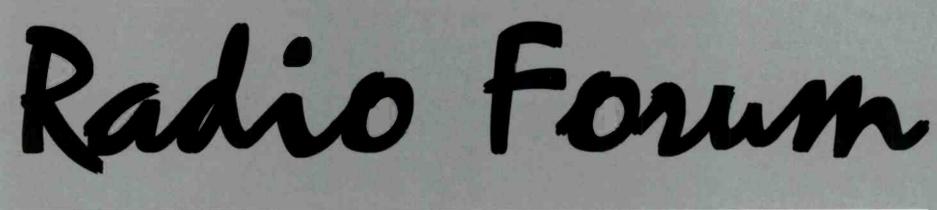
JEFF McCARTNEY

PD, KROY, Sacramento

In the control room your clocks are set up so that there's a liner here and a liner there, but you don't nail the jocks down by saying, "I want you to say this just this way; this is the only way you can say it; this is the only thing you can do in this particular break." I try to preach to my jocks that even though I may write verbatim a liner or a promo, the only time I ever want them to read it verbatim is if they're having a real bad day and can't do anything right. Otherwise they should be adlibing everything. I encourage the disc jockies to work the phones, because some of the best spontaneous things on the air come from the telephones. For instance, I had the Iceman ask a girl if she knew the phrase that pays backwards. She played along with him and said the phrase that plays, and then he spliced the tape and reversed it, and it came out all warbled. Then he asked her if she'd repeat it, and it was awesome. My night jock, The Jack Rabbit, works his phones incredibly well. He answers and records every phone call, and that's how a jocky gets a lot of stuff from the phones. I watched Gary McKee from Atlanta for years, and he would do absolutely no show prep whatsoever, but could wind up having a pretty good show just by working the phones. So I instill in the jocks to dare to be dangerous, and I'll tell them if they cross the line. I won't fire them for it, but I may tell them it was in bad taste. For Fathers Day, J.R. wanted to give away free vasectomies, and he had women calling up volunteering their husbands. It's National Accordian Week this week, and this morning J.R. called the oldest accordian school in Sacramento and got this 70-year-old accordian teacher to play along with him on the air. This guy was a real asshole to J.R. at first because he thought J.R. was making fun of him, but finally the guy warmed up to him and played a couple of accordian songs. Now J.R. is going to take accordian lessons, and he's going for his first lesson today. Tomorrow morning he's going to come in and play really bad, but sound really confident and ask people to call in with their requests. He's going to have an accordian virtuoso in the studio who will play all the songs, and it will be like, "Damn, didn't he learn quick!" He did the same thing with the electric guitar. It's amazing how well stuff like that works.



You have to be sensitive to where the radio station is at any particular time. For example, when I was at KIIS-FM in Los Angeles there was a point when we felt that the station had become a little too formatted, a little too sterile, and so I went to all the jocks and told them, "Throw the format out the window; I'll tell you when you've gone too far." We operated on that basis for a period of time, and when I thought they'd gone too far, I swung it back the other way. Doing that makes the station sound spontaneous. I think if you can keep surprises coming for the jocks, it keeps them interested in the radio station - and that comes across on the air.



RICK UPTON

PD, KITY, (POWER93), San Antonio

You've got to jump on the fads as they are peaking. For instance, the Spurs had a great basketball team this year, so we had POWER95 Kick Some Butt T-shirts, which we brought to the basketball games. At one game we had the Spurs' mascot holding up one of our T-shirts, and the fans were chanting "Kick Some Butt." Things like that are very important.

HOW DO YOU ENCOURAGE JOCKS TO BE SPONTANEOUS ON THE AIR?

I try to explain it like the movie *Tron*, which is about a guy who gets trapped inside a computer and becomes a part of this computerized pinball game. I try to get the jocks to be part of the formal, so I just let them know that when then step into the control room, they're stepping into an entire format, and they're a piece of that format. They have to make things flow within that format, they have to project their personalities in everything they do inside of that format. The key for them is to be a part of the format, to know that everything revolves around them. They're the nucleus in there.

HANK NEVINS

PD, MAJIC102, Buffalo

I don't have a problem with that at MAJIC102, because rry jocks are just a bunch of overgrown kids anyway. That's why the radio station sounds like we're having fun, and spontaneity isn't a problem. They've all got a real strong idea about the direction the station is headed in, and about the attitude of the station. They do a good job of projecting that. We take a very fun approach, and I really don't have a problem with those guys understanding how important it is to sound spontaneous on the air.

DO YOU EVER HAVE TO WATCH FOR THEM GETTING A CASE OF THE DOLDRUMS?

Absoultely. Every once in a while you get into a funk, and one of the things we do in our airchecks is try to point out when people are using crutches and getting into patterns. We try to motivate them to do things to get out of that mode. The fact that they're on the street a lot helps keep them fresh, too.

CHRIS BAILEY

PD, WNVZ, Norfolk

I try to encourage that we have airchecks and jock meetings on a frequent basis. We get the guys to sit and relax, and we try to bring things out that they d dn't know they had. We try to see what their limits are and then work from there. If someone's trying something on the air, sometimes it will work and sometimes it won't but - the key is to not be afraid to at least try to be spontaneous. When something doesn't work and they fall flat on their face, or they think it's good and it really stinks, you don't go in there and browbeat them; you explain why it d dn't work and give them a way to try to make it work better. The problem is that sometimes, a PC will hear some guy really trying to reach out and be a personality and come across as a genuine human being, and if ne's struggling they'll tell him to shut up and read the card. You can't do that. You've got to explain to them why it didn't work, and suggest a way for him to present it so that it will work in his own style. That's what I try to do, and I give them several open breaks throughout their snifts. You could call it the "dazzle me" break, because I tell them "It's all yours, do what you want. You fill it in and entertain me." It takes a while, but in the long run the results are pretty good.

DON LONDON OM/PD, WZPL, Indianapolis

The air staff has to be preparing constantly - from the time they start their day until the time they get off the air - looking for topical bits to jump on, such as Gorbachev coming to Minneapolis, or Madonna's top falling off during the shooting ot the *Dick Tracy* movie. Spontaneity can occur at any time, and we have to be on the ball constantly. Announcements come up, rumors begin, and you really have to be thinking about what people are going to be talking about next, what they re talking about now, and what will strike a chord with them. It s not all that tough, but sometimes we make it much tougher than it really is. Sometimes it's as simple as picking up a *USA Today* or answering the request lines and saying, "Hey, what's happening out there?" It goes way beyond reading liner cards and promo cards, and it puts you in touch with what the listener is really concerned about, which ultimately is the most important thing.

WHAT DO YOU DO TO CREATE SPONTANEITY?

I bring things to their attention in critique sessions, and even in the hallways. I'll say, "Hey, you know a lot of people are talking about *The Humpty Dance* from Digital Underground." Or, "I was he mall last night and there was this kind of a show." I'll pick up a paper and ask, "What do you think would be good things to talk about?" There might be a press conference with Warren Beatty and Madonna in Disneyworld this week, and they may not know about it. No one can know about everything, so we constantly exchange information back and forth. Every morning our news director goes through the wire and the newspapers and cuts out clippings. That really helps because she's closest to current events, news, human interest stories, etc.

ADAM COOK PD, KFBE, Houston

You try to involve your creative people in the radio station, and it doesn't necessarily have to be your air staff. In brainstorming meetings you have to always look at the station internally and figure out ways to make it better and fresh. Think of ways to sell your statement in a more creative way, without making it impossible to remember or getting too cute with things. We try to bond together and use the sources of many people, as opposed to one or two people. That seems to help us sound pretty fresh, because a lot of our ideas and the crazy stuff we do comes from a group effort. If you're re ying on one or two people to get it done all the time, they may tend to come up with the same thought processes. After a while things may start to seem boring.

HOW ABOUT THE INDIV'DUAL AIR SHIFTS?

In our weekly aircheck meetings we are able to find the ways the jocks would like to go and coach them in the ways they want to exhibit their personalities. In this size market we allow for a lot of spontaneity, and consequently several of my people stand out on the air We try to find personalities who can be spontaneous because that can set you apart. One thing people can't copy is their personalities. If somebody is very creative and different, it's harder for the other radio stations to copy a personality, as opposed to copying the music you play. What program directors do sometimes s attempt to make something work real fast, which is wrong. They tell the morning show to be crazy and outrageous right off the bat, and I don't think that gives the audience time to grow into them, and learn when they're kidding and when they're ærious. I feel if you are able to nurture a show, it tends to have long term success.

BRAD HOLCOMB

PD, WJLK-FM, MONMOLTH/OCEAN, NJ

First of all, there are formatics that have to be followed within your air shift. But as far as spontineaty goes, that also comes from a one-to-one delivery - where you want the jock to know what is going on in the person's life right now. The key is TOMA - top of mind awareness - and I think that can come across as spontineaty as long as the jock knows where to start and where to end. This does not necessarily take away from show prep, but it does encourage each jock to be creative, spontaneous and take advantage of situations as they occur on the air.

HOW DO YOU WATCH FOR THOSE SLUMP PERIODS AND HOW DO YOU DEAL WITH THEM?

Rule number one is professionalism. All of us in this business experience slumps to some degree. Personally, "ght now my father is dying, but how do I go on the air in the afternoon drive and not share that with my listeners? I certainly don't want to, because I don't want to bring them down. Smiling is one thing I am forced to do every time the microphore goes on because if you smile you're going to sound brighter, and if you're down it will be hidden by the smile that you project over the microphone. I stress real hard here that when that microphone goes on, be sure you've got one of those ear-to-ear grins on your face and make sure you're having a good time. Everybody here knows that if they have a personal problem, they can come talk to me about it. If they feel they can go on the air with it, maybe I'll give them some suggestions as to how to deliver on the air without letting people know of their personal tragedy. Just a good talk with the person and letting them know that you're behind them will give them that encouragement to go in there and do what they do best.

Steve Hoffman HOT AND HEAVY OVER HOTS AND HEAVIES

Gee, for some reason, one of the hot topics in Rock Radio today is the question of what defines a rotation. Here we are at HITMAKERS, having taken 45 or so rock radio stations that play lots of current product and break new artists and deciding that they constitute something different from album-rockers playing two or three currents an hour. It stands to reason that what might pass for a hot rotation at a library-intensive rocker is quite different from what these stations would call a heavy, or even a medium.

We decided to chat with some nice people about what particular market conditions, if any, have changed the way they handle their music. That leaves us thinking a couple curious thoughts. First, how does the competition shape your music? Second, if you crunch those rotations down some, how do your listeners react? Will they mob your radio station, screaming for your private parts? Or will they flock to you in droves, appreciating that fresh approach of yours?

Baltimore: Taking On Top40

In Baltimore, 98ROCK (WIYY) has been extremely successful by aggressively attacking mainstream Top40 B104 (WBSB). PD **Russ Mottla** has some

observations on how the relationship between cume and TSL shape a potential Rock Radio attack on Top40. "Obviously, Rock Radio stations have longer time spent listening than Top40," says Russ. "Therefore, AORs have to lengthen their rotations."

However, there's a big drawback to that kind of textbook thinking. "That makes it tough to bring in new cume, because you aren't playing the hits fast enough," explains Mottla. "A lot of AORs end up costing themselves cume because they're spreading out their hits so far. They're not becoming the big cume monster in the market. Let's face it - to attract new cume, you've gotta play the hits."

How did 98ROCK decide to take this approach? And how did they implement it without blowing off their heritage listeners? Russ answers candidly, "At 98ROCK, we have a pretty average Top40 competitor that was showing some perceptual weaknesses that we could take advantage of, so we looked at the availability of this whole new cume. We had to keep the station comfortable to our core, while making the station an environment acceptable to Top40 listeners. We didn't just add some crossover records; we played them in a real rotation."

Indeed, that approach has worked well for 98ROCK. Classic Rocker WGRX has made no real gains on 98ROCK's upper end, and using some real neat and complicated stuff from the Arbitron programmer's package, something interesting has happened. Russ concludes, "As it turned out in the last few books, B104 partisans ended up spending more quarter hours listening to 98Rock than B104." Taking On Classic Rockers

In Miami, WSHE faced a very library-intensive album rocker (the recently-deceased WGTR) and still competes with a classic rocker (WZTA). In Dayton, WAZU has been hacking off pieces of library-leaning

WTUE. How does competing with that kind of radio station affect their rotations and how has listener feedback helped shape their game plans over the long haul? It may vary by market, but there's gotta be a fine line everywhere that you can't cross. Aren't Rock Radio listeners so anti-repeat conditioned that you've gotta be careful not to spin those powers too fast?

Miami: Room To Bang

"That's bullshit," says WSHE-Miami PD **Brian Krysz**. "People listen to the radio to hear their favorite songs. If people really like hearing a song, they don't mind hearing it a lot. As a matter of fact, they look for the station that will deliver that song to them every time they're in need of it."

Mightn't that kind of attitude make you vulnerable to no-repeat counter-programming? Says Brian, "My favorite stations to compete with are the ones that do no-repeat days or no-repeat workdays. Of course, our situation is kind of unique. We're the only station where you can hear <u>Doubleback</u> or <u>Cradle Of Love</u> in this town, so people have to come here to hear them."

He sums up 'SHE's lack of limitations this way: "The bigger the song, the more I crank it. As a matter of fact, we double up our rotation in morning drive. We'll play a power at an hour forty-five. And we have never had very many complaints about our current rotations."

Dayton: Easing Up A Bit

The lay of the land is a bit different in Dayton, where the big WAZU has found it necessary to strike a

compromise between bangin' the hits and irritating the repetition-conscious element out there. PD **Michael Luczak** led with three-hour powers, saying, "At first, I thought this was a good cume builder. We're the new breed of Rock Radio. We play a lot of new artists and rock a little harder. A lot of it has to do with how you're positioning yourself against your competitors."

FROM LUCZAK TO MUZAK... THE WEEK IN ROCK RADIO

There's plenty to talk about in the wonderful world of rock music this week. First, our weekly update on our favorite subject of the hour--LOVE/HATE. Airplay continues strongest in the South and West, with a 37-32 regional move n the South. Among the major league calls affiliated with <u>Blackout In The Red Room</u> are WSHE, KBPI, WXTB, KRSP, WLRS and KNAC. The depth and quality of this album has made this lad a believer. Listen more than once--you'll discover some sophisticated song structures and plenty of hooks that are quite reminiscent of--I can't bring myself to say it--but you know. COLUMBIA has a great new artist on its hands, and they know it. Okay, enough preaching.

The big add for the week is **COLIN JAMES** <u>Just</u> <u>Came Back</u>, which is no tremendous surprise. The buzz has been building on it for weeks, and Virgin did a great job of prepromotion. Everyone's calling it a mass-appeal monster. When so many PDs and MDs all call a record a one-listen smash, you've gotta figure this is a record with a chance to go all the way.

Buzz is also building on another of our favorites here at the radio ranch--**BURNING TREE**'s <u>Fly On</u>. Sure it's retro, but frankly, who cares? Given the success to date of the Crowes and Quireboys, and considering the way all those Cream records in your library research, is there a much safer bet than this one? Kudos have to go to Harvey and everyone at Epic for the great promo package they sent out on the Tree. Y'know, the one with the firehose and the lovely picture of Smokey the Bear informing us all that, "Only you car prevent Burning Tree!" <u>That</u> is creative promotion in action.

While we're on the subject, let's talk followups. <u>Twice</u> <u>As Hard</u> is kicking in for the **BLACK CROWES** now, as evidenced by the Crowes second straight week in the top three Most Added. Their chart debut doesn't hurt either. You have to get the impression that (See ROCK MUSIC NEWS page 40)

New breed or not, three hours eventually became too tight for WAZU's core to tolerate. Michael continues, "After a while, people started getting burned out by that. It was the number one complaint about our station. Now, we've lengthened them to four and a half hours. As listener loyalty grew, and we became a primary station, it really helped us."

That has been borne out by WAZU's increased ratings and time spent listening, as evidenced by a 5.7-6.2 12+ move in the Winter ARB. TSL also jumped from a low of 7:30 to 9:30 this last winter, tying WAZU with 'TUE. Those numbers look especially good when you consider that the rotation changes weren't made until late February. Word out of the market has the latest trends being even better for WAZU.

As evidenced here, a power in Baltimore is not a power in Miami, which is not a power in Dayton. Shaping their rotations to match their markets has paid great dividends for all three Rock Radio stations. How much repetition is too much for you market? How important is it for you to bang home those powers in morning drive? Stay open-minded, use some research and some gut, and the answers you get might even surprise you.

Def American and Geffen are developing a new core artist for Rock Radio.

The buzz is also starting on the LONDON QUIREBOYS second single *I Don't Love You Anymore.* It's certainly as reminiscent of mid-70's rock ballads as the first one was of its counterparts from days past. That leaves CAPITOL with a solid new artist for their stable to complement their continued success with HEART. Of course, you can't forget the new POISON project, kicked off by *Unskinny Bop.*

On the chart, *Holy Water* looks poised to keep **BAD COMPANY** and ATCO at the top for a while. Currently, it's #1 in three regions and pulling away from the pack on the National chart. *Fearless* and *If You Needed Somebody* are the depth tracks of choice right now.

Making for an interesting challenge to replace Bad Co. are five strong movers. **BRUCE HORNSBY** *Across The River* is giving RCA a potent combo, at 5 and 6 with **LITA FORD** *Hungry*. For WARNER'S **DAMN YANKEES**, *Come Again* may well become their second #1 airplay track. It's already jumped to #9 in no time. That **AEROSMITH** album hasn't really been out forever, it just seems that way as *The Other Side* makes its anticipated rush upthe chart for GEFFEN, moving 38-10 in two weeks. Also exploding over the last two weeks is one more CAPITOL act, **SMITHEREENS**. *Yesterday Girl* has gone from nowhere to 13 over the last two weeks. in chart order, **BATON ROUGE**, **CSN**, **ROBERT PLANT** and **SONS OF ANGELS**. Okay, so Robert Plant and Crosby, Stills and Nash are what they are, with success about assured. The performance of the other two has been impressive, to say the least. *Walks Like A Woman* is pulling phones <u>and</u> calling out where it's getting serious airplay. Here in the land of current-intensive, the question isn't who's playing it, but who isn't, hence the #4 chart spot for Baton Rouge. *Cowgirl* is reacting very quickly where it's getting played, resulting in a quick jump from 40-26 in two weeks.

Life is going to get busier for EMI as **ALIAS** begin their chart climb with *Haunted Heart*, debuting at 40. All the while, Norm has that Vixen LP in his pocket too...

Love/Hate is not the only COLUMBIA project that is building right now. **BRUCE DICKINSON** is at #35 and climbing this week with *Tattooed Millionaire*. It's melodic, not too hard, and your listeners know who he is. With summer basically upon us, this is a great all day record. Ditto *Me And Elvis* from **HUMAN RADIO**. At some point in the day, you'll hear it on every CD player in our office. It's addicting. It's also hanging just outside chart position.

Also nearing a chart debut are **CONCRETE BLONDE** and *Joey*. The band is hip. The song has adult appeal. I.R.S. has them at #7 on our commercial-only Alternative chart. If this record doesn't finally cross them to Rock Radio, it's a crime. Wild Blue Yonder (A&M), FAITH NO MORE Epic, (REPRISE), SLAUGHTER Deperately (CHRYSALIS) and DON HENLEY How Bad Do You Want It (GEFFEN). The two guitar heroes on RELATIVITY, STEVE VAI and JOE SATRIANI are lurking just outside the chart and are both retailing quite well, especially the Vai album. Look for Relativity to rework Satriani's Flying In A Blue Dream soon, especially given the tremendous success KLOS has had with it.

Deb Flanagan, our Retail Director extrordinaire, informs us all that the **GARY MOORE** LP on Charisma is starting to move fast at retail, as are the LPs by **WORLD PARTY** (CHRYSALIS), **JOE COCKER** (CAPITOL), **L.A. GUNS** (POLYDOR), the **SUNDAYS** (DGC), and interestingly, the RYKODISC release of **BOWIE**'s <u>Ziggy Stardust</u>.

We could probably spend months diving into issues raised in that interview with the KUKQ gang that we wrapped up last week. One of the most interesting ones, in my opinion anyway, is the topic of competition. Sure, Alternative Radio occupies a niche unto itself. On the other hand, most of that cume of yours isn't exclusive.

You're battling someone for the affections and diary mentions of your listeners. The intrepid **HITMAKERS** eye took a tour around the country to find out what formats and format variations Alternative stations are competing against.

Multiple Answers For Similar Reasons

The key denominator is (surprise, surprise) music—both yours and your competition's. KJQN/Salt Lake City PD **Mike Summers** is in a different situation than many. "If we have a natural competitor, it's Top40. Both the album-rockers in this

market rock very hard," Mike relates, "Anytime we cross anything here, it usually goes to Top40. I can't remember the last time we crossed a record to Rock Radio." In terms of audience sharing, he's not sharing a lot of folks with any one format, saying only that, "We share a lot of females and teens with Top40 and males with Rock Radio."

That sentiment was, of course, also reflected in our talk last week with the gang at KUKQ/Phoenix. Said KQ's **Ernesto Gladden** last week, "When we took a look at other markets and other situations, we realized that Alternative Radio was an extension of Top40, as much as, if not more so than it was from an album rock orientation. If we take a look at the cume relationship of KUKQ, we're cuming 30 percent with KKFR, Y95 and KZZP, while about eight percent

of the KUPD listenership will gravitate towards $\ensuremath{\mathsf{KUKQ}}\xspace.$

KJJO/Minneapolis OM **Tony Powers** faces a very unusual challenge with another Alternative-leaning outlet in the market, KTCZ (Cities 97). His market is also notable for its lack of a current-leaning album rocker. "I think I'm competing with Cities 97 and

KDWB more than anybody else," he says, "I doubt many people listen to us and KQRS, because they're more of an oldies station. From the letters I get from my listeners, it seems most of them don't listen to AORs."

Tony Powers and Mike Summers share the view that Top40 is the most natural competitor for Alternative Radio. Says Tony, "I think what Alternative Radio appeals to is the Top40 audience that wants albumoriented current material." Mike takes it a step further, believing that his programming future lies in Top40 radio. His viewpoint: "It's a natural evolution. Most of the bands I've been working with are going to go in that direction. That's what Alternative radio stations are—they're alternative Top40s."

The Obligatory Semi-Counterpoint

When we talked to KDGE/Dallas PD Larry Nielson, he offered a slightly different perspective. Says Larry, "We're competing with both Top40 and Rock Radio. When it comes down to programming music, there really is no competition, because we're traditionally so far ahead on music. Where I see our audience coming from is the people who never had a radio station to listen to before. The Top40 listener, who appreciates the new music they play, but doesn't care for Paula Abdul, will come here."

Even so, he continues, "The radio station we share

the most audience with is KTXQ, possibly because the Top40s are real dancey these days." He also cites two other causes for KDGE's sharing with a library-leaning album rocker. First, the Edge is about 60% male in audience composition. Secondly, and quite interesting to these ears, Larry feels, "The guys who were in college ten years ago aren't hearing their music on AOR anymore, so they come here."

WMDK/Peterborough PD Janice Bailey echoes those rather intriguing thoughts, saying, "We'; e finding that people who are, say, 30, are not being serviced by heritage AOR. Heritage AOR leans to the late 1960s and early 1970s and ignores the whole punk/new wave revolution of the late '70s. That's what 30-year-olds were listening to ten years ago when they were in college."

In terms of competition, she believes WMDK faces its biggest competition from Rock Radio. "We're up against WBCN and WFNX out of Boston. Boston radio penetrates our market real well. Our main

competition is a heritage AOR that isn't really classic, but their rotations are such that their listeners are looking elsewhere," Janice reports, adding, "We're pretty guitar-based, so we don't share a lot of music with Top40."

KROQ/L.A. PD Andy Schuon gets the final word on the issue with a simple thought, "It's a pretty even split for us, because of the nature of KROQ, which is in between AOR and Top40." A quick look at the **HITMAKERS** Rock Radio and Mainstream Top40 charts also shows a pretty even split in terms of music. However, it's interesting to note that almost every Alternative programmer is cognizant of some level of Top40 competition, but the same does not hold true with regard to Rock Radio.

OTHER NEWS AND SCHMOOZE...

Well, there certainly aren't any huge surprises at the top of the Alternative chart. <u>GOODBYE JUMBO</u> could keep **WORLD PARTY** there for plenty more weeks to come. Is there anyone left out there who doesn't think this album is the second coming? CHRYSALIS is moving plenty copies of it at retail too.

Also beginning to kick up a fuss at retail, especially here on the left coast, is **JESUS JONES**. They're making the jump from British sensation to American success quite nicely. <u>LIQUIDIZER</u> moves 44-32 on the chart this week for SBK, with track emphasis leaning strongly to <u>Never Enough</u>, but <u>Move</u> <u>Mountains</u>, <u>Real World</u> and <u>Song 13</u>. Among those joining the party are KJQN, WHFS and 15X.

That move, however, is not the biggest of the week. That distinction belongs (surprise, surprise) to **GENE LOVES JEZEBEL**. As GEFFEN ships the <u>KISS OF</u> <u>LIFE</u> LP, it moves 39-18 on the strength of the single. *Jealous* should be the single that finally breaks them at Rock Radio, if you care.

After a week in which they tied for Most Added with their kinda-sorta stablemates, **SONIC YOUTH** get their well-deserved chart premier at #40 for the <u>GOO</u> LP. Between the **SUNDAYS**, **JOHN DOE**, and these young lads, DGC has already developed an enormous presence in Alternative land. <u>Kool Thing</u> is definitely that.

At the top of Most added for this week are two of our personal favorites. #1 this week are the **RAILWAY** CHILDREN. <u>NATIVE PLACE</u> bows at #48, with action coming from Live105, KJQN, WDRE, KUKQ and more. While <u>Every Beat Of The Heart</u> is a great single, everybody has their own favorites. Two of ours are <u>It's Heaven</u> (Gee, what does it remind us of?) and <u>Music Stop</u>.

The other big add for the week comes from veterans **AZTEC CAMERA** for SIRE/REPRISE. Among those

on board at this early stage are KROQ, KJQN, WOFM and KRCK. Chart position should be forthcoming soon for the <u>STRAY</u> album.

While on the subject of REPRISE, there's that one little record of theirs that's become a hot topic of debate for lots of formats. That, naturally, would have to be the **FAITH NO MORE** single <u>Epic (What Is It?)</u>. Whatever it is, it's rapidly turning into a record that transcends formatic boundaries. Out here, it sounds as good on KROQ as it does on Pirate. Also agreeing with KROQ's judgement are WBRU, KJQN, KRCK and 15X. With the hot rotations it's in at those outlets, a couple more adds could push it into chart status.

Two last mentions for REPRISE: the **KATYDIDS** have developed an extremely strong base for their self-titled debut LP. As those rotation increases start piling up on <u>Heavy Weather Traffic</u>, expect some quick chart moves. A quick word about Morrissey: (See NEWS AND SCHMOOZE page 43)

the comment, Stu admits that he's "overjoyed when we have a hit on radio, as it's obviously the easiest and most effective way to reach the public. But," he confesses, "there are other areas that we can utilize to build up a solid core audience, and one of my jobs is to find out what those areas are. After all, there are an awful lot of people who buy records today who don't find Top40 a suitable area to discover new music, and we need to search out these people."

Cohen cited one WARNER BROS. act, The Jesus And Mary Chain, as an example of what creative marketing outside the parameters of commercial radio can yield. "Their first album for us sold in the neighborhood of 50,000 records, and this new one has passed 250,000 units and is still selling," he says triumphantly, before moving on to a subject that has of late become a hot topic, both at WARNERBROS. and in the music industry as a whole:Rap music. move on the chart. While <u>Onion Skin</u> continues to kick, check out <u>Talk About It</u>. Obviously, the folks at GIANT are glad WARNER BROTHERS decided to share with them on this one.

One last new name is still making a solid chart impact--CHARISMA. **SOMETHING HAPPENS** are definitely happening, with a top 15 chart move for <u>STUCK TOGETHER WITH GOD'S GLUE</u>.

An old stand-by is having an impressive double as TVT has scored with **MODERN ENGLISH** and the **JACK RUBIES**. At 38 & 46 on the chart respectively, both are climbing quite nicely.

I.R.S. has a strong one-two punch on board, with **PATO BANTON**'s new offering <u>WIZE UP! (NO COMPROMIZE)</u> debuting at #45. <u>Spirits</u> is making the action, but with Mandela touring the U.S., you

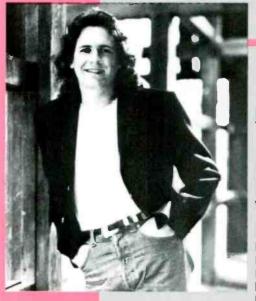

might take solace in innovations that Bach says are presently being employed in a growing number of chains. Bach mentioned that a new data-tracking modem used by Musicland, one of the nation's largest retail chains, will now provide accurate information that the programmers can swallow with a greater degree of confidence.

"They can monitor precisely what product crosses their counters in a 24-hour cycle," said Bach, trying to put to rest the fears of Zapoleon and Simon and their misanthropic peers. "For the last four years we have put bar codes on our records, so that the figures can be accurately tabulated at the end of the day."

Bach said that two other valuable gauges of what's hot are video rotation and - surprisingly - in-store play. Both have been salient factors in the establishment of two hot new CEMA-distributed acts, Sinead O'Connor and Slaughter.

"There is a buzz that starts to build from in-store play if an artist, especially a new one, begins to elicit a lot of inquiries and spur-of-the-moment sales at the counter from customers," Bach noted. He said that shrewd broadcasters should be on the alert to find out what artists are creating that in-store buzz. One band he cited as having recieved only sporadic national airplay, but which is enjoying a sales bonanza of sorts, is the Red Hot Chili Peppers, who Bach claims have logged sales "in excess of half a million units." Bach said the uproarious EMI quartet germinated and took root through in-store play.

"Radio still has not reconciled with a number of acts who are blowing out on a retail level," Bach said. "They might discover a pearl in the oyster by taking a listen to some of these records that are moving without radio play, and maybe they'll launch a few hits on their own. These bands are obviously saying something that the public wants to hear." **RETAIL** (from page 7)

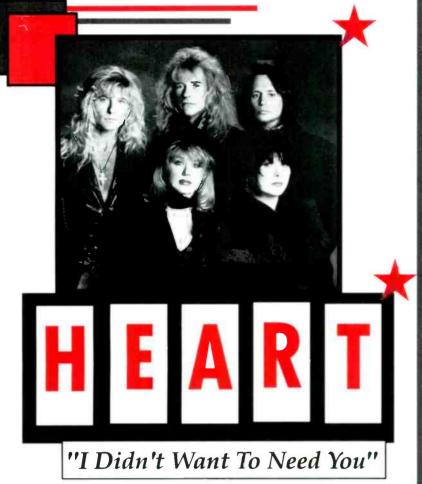
"The song is perfect for the radio with its great chorus and harmonies," said Roberts, before shifting emphasis to the group's trump card: their dazzling physical attributes. "You know a zillion girls are going to buy their album because of their blond hair and cheek bones," he said.

According to **Kevo Thompson** at General Record in Seattle, some other groups who are revving up his registers are **Tony! Ton! Tone!** and **En Vogue**. Kevo said he's still amazed by the response of his customers to the latter, a San Fran quartet whose debut single <u>Hold On</u> is a major smash. His customers, he says, are eagerly delving headfirst into the LP to discover more nuggets from the Bay Area sirens.

"We are flabbergasted by how swiftly they've generated a following," said Thompson. "ATLANTIC's really got a hot one on their hands."

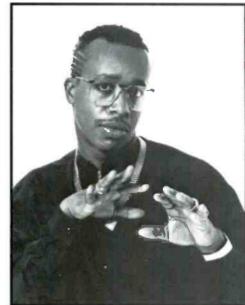

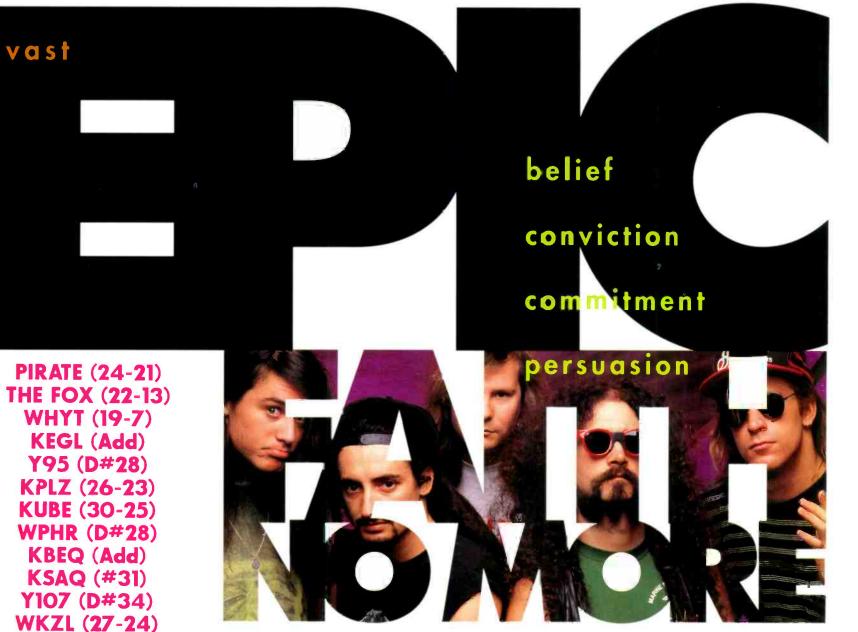

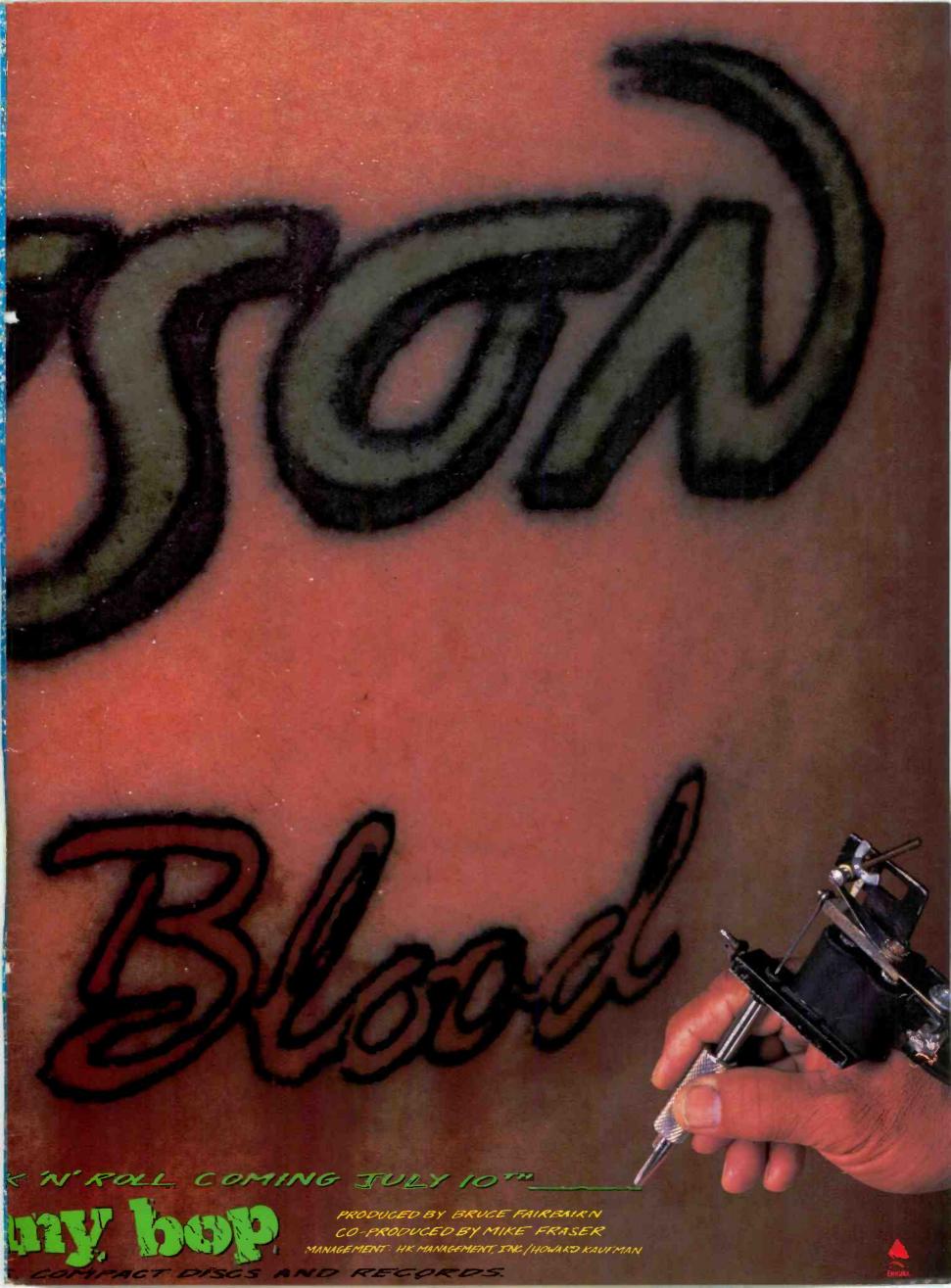
