

Elton John goes over 1200 bds detections at adult radio, sells another 60,000 pieces over the counter and pulls in WXKS, WWHT & WLAN, you may ask why? because the album is selling, Elton is a core artist and "True Love" has a great holiday message. oh, and Elton is the 8th most played artist on VH-1 and all the proceeds from the single benefit the Elton John aids foundation-what could be better? Tom Petty pulls in 27 more stations, giving him another "Most Added" week. We've sold more than a quarter million albums over the counter in the last 3 weeks, the video was added into heavy out of the box at mtv, the single is currently the 2nd most requested song at aor, and tom has had the most played song at album radio for most of the past six weeks. shai moves to 31* on the monitored rhythm chart, with new adds at q102/philly & hot 97/new york. we've got 35 stations playing "yours" with 30% of the airplay in the major markets. speaking of major, there is a major new remix on the bobby brown single, so major in fact, that jefferson, glen and maurice at "q," and jamie and dakota at wlum felt we were just the ticket for crossover radio-they both added the single this week! bobby is just outside the monitored top 10 chart, over 2100 bds detections, all over mtv, happily married, and working on a new album for next year as you read this. since we mentioned next year, we're going to start '94 with the follow up to one of the biggest singles of '93. meatloaf's "rock & roll dreams come through" will be on your desks in days, the album is approaching 4 million and trust us, this single is a fucking smash. up next will be jodeci's "cry for you." the single is top 15 on the national soundscan sales charts, rocketing up crossover and urban playlists now, and yes the video is on mtv. at the risk of being redundant, this single is a fucking smash too!!! did we mention live, sass jordan, boston, mary'j blige, heavy d, and more elton john? man we're excited just thinking about it! happy holidaya-we're outta here.

Some are actually very mixshow friendly, and I'm sure there's at least one cut in here that'll fit your format. **PET SHOP BOYS** <u>Go West</u> (EMI/ERG) - New mixes are deep in there, stripped down and ready for the late set. **RuPAUL** <u>Little Drummer Boy</u> (TOMMY BOY) - Yet another instant floor-filler from America's fave drag queen. **SOUND OF ONE** <u>As I Am</u> (ONE) - Great vocal with remixes from Roger S., Farley & Heller, Nick Nice & Stonebridge on this fierce double 12". Did I mention written and produced by Allan George and Fred McFarlane (the cats behind Robin S.)?

NASTY NES, KUBE, Seattle

ICE CUBE <u>Bop Gun (One Nation)</u> (PRIORITY) - It may be 11 minutes off the LP, but you gotta get off yo ass and do an edit cause this cut is da Bomb!

ALT <u>All Nite Long</u> (PAR) - Remember the Mary Jane girls? ALT is in da mutha fu##in house with this well produced and slammin' single. 104 phat BPM's¹ Peep it out.

TOO SHORT <u>Money In The Ghetto</u> (JIVE) - I told ya bout this three weeks ago. This has got the best of the old and new school flav to it, and I see dollar signs whenever I play this record.

DADDY-O <u>Flowin In File</u> (ISLAND/PLG) - This LP cut deserves to be the next single. Daddy-O at his best. This'll flow in da mix.

DOO WHOP AND THE BOUNCE SQUAD <u>Hit 'Em In</u> <u>The Head</u> (BOUNCE SQUAD) - Breakin in New York and in Los Angeles, (thanks Flexx and the Baka Boyz) looks like it's gonna break here in Seatown, too!

JOHN HOHMAN, METROMIX, Pittsburgh

HAPPYHEAD <u>Digital Love Thing</u> (EASTWEST/ATL. GRP.) - Nice crossover alternative sound. Check out the "MK Extended Mix."

STAXX \underline{Joy} (CHAOS) - Cool uhro hip house dance feel, great production and vocals.

I TO I <u>The Right Time</u> (NEXT PLATEAU) - If you are looking for an uptempo happy love record, this one is for you.

HUGH K. <u>Shine On</u> (ZYX) - Male version on Robin S. It's getting a good club reaction.

INXS f/Ray Charles <u>*Please*</u> (ATLANTIC) - E-Smoove mixes are slammin'... Go 'head Mr. Charles.

MATT '**The Bratt**' **Bradley**, **POWER PIG**, **Tampa FREDDIE JAMES** <u>*I*</u> <u>Can't Get Enough Of Your Love</u> (MONOGRAM) - You need to try a spin on the tables with this record. Hitting big, has lots of potential. Try it, you'll like it...

GEORGIE PORGIE <u>All Because Of Me</u> (VIBE) -Whew, this kut is a slamming, underground tune. There's a commercial sounding version that Tommy Musto put together for those who are afraid to go underground for such a cool record..

CYNDI LAUPER <u>That's What I Think</u> (EPIC) - She's back! This record hit me like a fukkin brick the first time I heard it! Hot, hot, hot production by two of the best in the world: Tommy Musto and Junior Vasquez!

GARY CANNAVO/NEIL PETRICONE, WJMN, Boston DEEP WALKER <u>4U</u> (NOISE) - I like this record very much. Great beat track for any mix show.

ROBIN S. <u>What I Do Best</u> (BIG BEAT/ATL. GRP.) - She does it again with another smoker song. Give a listen...5 stars.

VOLCANO <u>Let Your Body Be Free</u> (OLYMPIC) -Awsome record...love it, love it, love it. Watch out for this company, they're going to be hot! Six stars.

MARS PLASTIC *Find The Way* (RADIKAL/CRITIQUE) - We found out about this record through our conference call and they were right about this one...it smokes in our mix show.

LISA KEITH <u>I'm In Love</u> (PERSPECTIVE/A&M) - Great second single from her debut album. Should take her to new heights.

MG WHIZ, WPGC, Washington, DC

SNOOP DOGGY DOGG <u>Lodi Dodi</u> (DEATH ROW/ INTERSCOPE/ATL. GRP.) - Heya'll...itz time to <u>Lodi</u> <u>Dodi</u>... This iz definitely a cupcake rekkard...jus ask Kid Fresh!

THE FOG <u>Been A Long Time</u> (COLUMBIA) - Solid hook. House is definitely moving in the right direction.

NUBIAN CRAKERS <u>As We Talk</u> (BIG BEAT) - Don-'T' is the guest vocalist on this rough and rugged track. There's enuff mixes, even an a capella, so that we can get buzy!

SUDDEN CHANGE <u>Comin On Strong</u> (EASTWEST/ ATL. GRP.) - I love this record. I love this record. It's strictly flaava from uptown. Don't sleep.

PETE DYLAN, WWHT, Columbus

INNER CIRCLE <u>Rock With You</u> (BIG BEAT/ATL. GRP.) - Such an upbeat, fun, carefree jam... Still waiting on the vinyl, boys!

ROZALLA <u>*I Love Music*</u> (EPIC) - Actually added two weeks ago, but this is official. In a world of remixes, this is one of the better ones.

LISA LISA <u>Skip To My Lu</u> (PENDULUM/ERG) - It'll fit... I've got the 12" cover on my ceiling and the wife's a bit pissed. I'll watch anytime, Lisa! OW!



HITMAKERS

DR. DAVE FERGUSON/CHUCK FIELD PD/OM, KSFM102.5, Sacramento by RICKY LEIGH

TELL US A LITTLE ABOUT WHERE YOU'VE WORKED...

Dave: I've worked at every shithole station in the nation, pretty much.

Chuck: I've worked at some pretty shitty stations too.

Dave: I remember working out of a trailer. You couldn't see anything. You could smell the cows on the pasture...

WHERE WAS THAT?

Dave: New Mexico. The first thing I could see when the sun started coming out was cows. I started off doing a Sunday night Soul show, and then within six months I was Program Director and Morning Man.

YOU CAME TO 'PGC IN '86.

Dave: It was right when we changed format. Albie got there about two weeks before me. It was called Classy95 at the time.

YOU WERE AT CLASSY95, AND I WAS WORKING THE RECEPTION DESK...

Dave: After a couple of years at 'PGC I was doing afternoons. Bob Mitchell was PD, I was APD. Then when he left, I became Program Director. The first book we had, we went to #1, and then we had six #1's in a row. The best book we had was an 8.2.

CHUCK, WHERE DID YOU GET YOUR START?

Chuck: I got started in Dawson, GA, It was this little hole in the wall station in this little peanut-growing town. I did the morning show on this Country/Bible station. My very first words on the air were, "Oh, Shit, Jesus Christ!"

HOW DID THAT HAPPEN?

Chuck: I had the mic open, and I said, "Sunshine 99, the time is 7:54." Then I hit the wrong cart machine button, because you had to do it manually. I kept hitting the off button, instead of the on button, and I said, "Oh, Shit! Jesus Christ!" It was right during the Bible hour. Nobody called, so I don't think anybody was listening. A lot of things haven't changed in my career.

'PGC WAS ONE OF THE FIRST STATIONS TO GET INTO PLAYING THE TWELVE-INCH VERSIONS OF SONGS. Dave: And doing remixes, and stuff like that. They had a lot of Urbans there, but nobody was doing hip stuff, they were all doing this Urban thing. We were doing remixes, and it made us different. I guess they were doing it in New York. Albie had a lot more experience with it than I did, because he was into the mixing stuff.

TAKE US UP TO DATE... CONGRATS ON THE NUMBERS.

Dave: Thank you.

Chuck: It's probably the highest numbers we've had since we were in Woodland, when there were only like three radio stations in Sacramento.

YOU USED TO HEAR "FM102 IS THE ONLY TOP40 IN THE MARKET." WHAT PEOPLE DON'T REMEMBER IS THAT THERE USED TO BE THREE TOP40s IN THE MARKET.

Chuck: Yeah, right. People always say, "God, you're in a formatexclusive market.

Dave: That's because we kicked their asses!

EXPLAIN YOUR STYLE OF MUSIC, CATEGORY BY CATEGORY. Dave: No, we're generating the sales by playing it.

A LOT OF PEOPLE DON'T REALIZE SACRAMENTO IS ONE OF THE TOP SALES MARKETS IN THE NATION.

Chuck: Top 15 retail market in country. FM102 is largely responsible for that. That's why we rely on sales so much, because we do have a very active record-buying audience that listens to our station.

TELL US ABOUT THE AIRSTAFF, SHIFT BY SHIFT. I KNOW YOU'VE GOT THE NUMBER ONE MORNING SHOW IN THE MARKET, TOO.

Dave: I do mornings with Tina Macuha, who is our News Director and sidekick. Roger Hudson does traffic. He brings a lot to the table. He sets up all of the interviews, and not just anything, something cool that people will talk about in elevators or on the way to work. We've got Steve Trejo doing middays. He's from Sacramento, he's been here all his life. Afternoons, of course, Jammin' Chuck is # 1.

At night, we've got the hottest night show, Davy-D and I-Bro. These

Dave: We play rap, hip-hop, slow jams, and old school. Most commonly referred to by people who need labels, as "Churban." They thought that in a market like this, you couldn't do a Churban, because they're wasn't a market for it...But they were wrong.

EXPLAIN THE PROCESS OF SELECTING THE MUSIC FOR SACRAMENTO?

Dave: Sales plays a big part. The record stores' Top 10 sales, I would guesstimate, probably 8 out of the Top 10 songs, we're playing.

YOU'RE NOT WAITING UNTIL SALES ARE GENERATED BEFORE YOU DECIDE TO PLAY A SONG... guys have a 20-share. I-Bro started in research. He just always hung around, always wanted to be on the air, bugged the hell out of us, until finally we gave him a job. Davy D is from New Orleans. They've taken the town by storm.

Chuck: I knew Davy five years ago, when he was just a club mixer. He was seventeen years old, lying about his age - He was the hottest mixer in New Orleans, and we always knew he was going to be a good jock. He was a lot like E-Bro. We gave him a shot on the air, and he proved himself, and he became kind of the night-time jock sidekick. When I knew that Mark Allen was going to be leaving us to go to HBO's Comedy Central, I called Davy and asked him for a tape, and he



had improved so much...I said to Dave, "How come none of our jocks are as cool as this? He'd sound great in Sacramento." Even though he has kind of a Cajun accent -

Dave: Clifton said, "He sounds too Cajun, too New Orleans. It won't work anywhere else." I said, "You're wrong. He sounds like hip-hop - a rapper." The show just sounds like a party at night. They live the core lifestyle, and the core-er the station has gotten, the higher the ratings go. We're giving the audience what they want, I hope. It sure looks like we are.

I REMEMBER YOU SAYING THAT AS YOU WERE ADJUSTING THE PROG-RAMMING OF THE STATION, IT STARTED CUME-ING BIGGER AND BIGGER...

Dave: You can always get better. Keep selling what's coming up. This radio station is not just a jukebox. We're like the social planner, the information source, all the parties that we throw, and the information that we give for their everyday lives. The better we get at serving the listeners outside of just the music, the better we get at serving their social plans, and with news and information, the more we are endeared to them. You should do nice things for the community to better the community. That's part of our reason for being here is to serve the community and to make their lives better.

TELL US ABOUT THE BEGINNING OF THE STOP THE VIOLENCE CAMPAIGN...

Dave: It was me and Clifton and Cliff Berkowitz sitting in a bar. We were COMPILED FROM KEY RECORD POOLS ACROSS THE U.S.A.



trying to think of something that betters the community. Something that people really care about, that wasn't a promotion. We asked, "What's the biggest problem in the community right now? Well, we've got over 500 shootings this year," which told us right away what we should do, which was try to get people to stop shooting each other. Luckily Ben Hill was behind us, and helped us pull it off. And you learn, every time you try to do something like that, how to do it better next time. It's just like having these concerts, everv time you make a mistake, you learn what not to do to make it better the next time. So the first 'Stop The Violence' campaign probably was the best because it was the first one, the first time. But just like my first concert I ever gave, back at 'PGC, compared to the ones we do now, they get better every time, because hopefully, you learn from your mistakes.

NOW IT SEEMS LIKE EVERYBODY'S DOING IT. DO YOU FEEL IT'S GOTTEN WATERED DOWN AS A RESULT OF THAT?

Dave: Stop The Violence doesn't mean much anymore. Now it's like a commercial. We were doing it from the heart because we were out in those streets worrying for our own lives as much as anything else.

HOW DO YOU GO ABOUT CONVINCING YOUR AUDI-ENCE THAT IT IS FROM THE HEART NOW, INSTEAD OF JUST SOUNDING LIKE JUST ANOTHER RADIO STATION...

Dave: You don't want to sound like you're preaching, especially when you're playing records that have to do with violence. You've got to really be there, not just by paying it lip service - you've got to prove that you really care, by going out and doing something about it. I always used to stress to the jocks not to come down on the gang-bangers on the air, not to sound 'holier-than-thou,' calling names and acting like they're the problem. The problem is society as a whole. They aren't learning it just from anybody, they're learning it from society, from TV...from music...from real life.

I WAS THINKING ABOUT DYLAN'S 'EVERYBODY MUST GET STONED,' 'HEY JOE,' BY JIMI HENDRIX, 'DOWN BY THE RIVER,' BY NEIL YOUNG: SONGS ABOUT DRUG USE AND VIOLENCE. THE CONTENT OF THIS MUSIC IS NO DIFFERENT THAN THE STUFF IN THE 'GANGSTA RAP' OF TODAY. Dave: I think because we see what that kind of stuff can do...

Chuck: It's a different time now ...

Dave: It doesn't mean I won't play 'em, if they're hits. You've got to have a social conscience about what's going on around you, take a stand sometimes.

SO THE RECORD GOES TOP 5 IN SALES, THE MARKET IS DEMANDING IT, BUT IF YOU DON'T THINK IT'S APPROPRIATE, THEN YOU'RE GONNA STAY OFF OF IT.

Dave: It's done on a song-by-song basis. I'm not going to say in a general term that any song like that, that has that kind of content...I think it's just on a song-by-song basis. I think a station like ours has to be very socially conscious, because we're making an impact. I mean everything we're doing, people believe, or they should, if we're doing it right. We have an opportunity to better our community.

CHECKING THE NUMBERS, IT LOOKS LIKE YOU GUYS ARE OWNING THE ADULT FEMALES.

Dave: We're the #1 music station for the fifth or sixth book in a row with a 10.6, 12+...Our female numbers are strong in every demo.

Chuck: #1 18 to 49. #1 12-49...all the way up.

Dave: Top 5 25-54. Top 3 25-34. That's not as much because of the music, as it is that when we turn on the microphone, I have pictures up there of our listeners, and they're supposed to look at those pictures cuz, it's directed to them...

Why would a 25-34 female want to hear dick jokes?

I DON'T EXPECT YOU TO GIVE AWAY ANY SECRETS, AS SUCCESSFUL AS YOU ARE...

Dave: You know what, there are none. There are no great secrets. It's gut, it's instinct.

TELL US ABOUT YOUR VOICE WORK. YOUR VOICE DROPS, YOUR PROMOS...

Dave: Our stuff is usually pretty tongue-in-cheek in most cases. It's got an attitude, but it's not screaming at you. We don't have to scream at people to get them to listen to us. With the drops and all that stuff... back when I grew up most of the stations sounded like screamers, so that's kind of what I grew up hearing until I started hanging out with Jerry Clifton, and he kind of changed my thoughts on that. When you realize there's a better way to do it, that's what you should do. Luckily, through Jerry, I've got a lot of clients now.

HAVE YOU FOUND A DIFFERENT DELIVERY FROM MARKET TO MARKET...?

Dave: Every station has a different sound. What I would do for WILD107 in San Francisco, I wouldn't do for 102JAMZ in Orlando, because the vibe is different. I don't have any stations that want screaming voice-overs. They want a big, ballsy, sexy voice like mine.

I GOTTA ASK YOU GUYS THE QUESTION THAT MUCH OF THE RECORD INDUSTRY WANTED ME TO ASK YOU TWO: WHAT ARE YOUR LIKES AND DISLIKES ON HOW YOU'RE PROMOTED ON RECORDS?

Dave: I just want to hear the record and see if it fits. There's so much politics in between the record guys and the music director before it gets to me. I try to stay out of the politics of it. Chuck's very good at handling that part.

Chuck: I don't really enjoy the politics of it, but the way Top40's are today, with promotion budgets being cut, politics is a necessary evil in this business. In essence, if a record is a hit, we're going to play it...

You'll never find a record being played on FM102 because of a record company's promotion. It's if the record is performing. That's why we have various forms of research: callout, sales, top-of-mind requests. They all balance out each other, and we can find out what the hits really are. And as far as being worked on a record, the best information you can give me is sales. If you don't give it to me, I'll get it somewhere else.

WHAT CAN THEY GIVE YOU THAT YOU DON'T HAVE ACCESS TO THAT WOULD MAKE THEM MORE IMPORTANT TO YOU.

Chuck: In all honesty, nothing. There's nothing you can tell me or Dave or anybody that is going to qualify your record. The thing that's interesting is that most of the people that work records that tell you that their record's a hit for your market have never, worked in a radio station in their careers. What qualifies them to tell you that a record's going to be a hit at your radio station? Their job is to give us the information that's right for FM102. The best labels are the ones that are service oriented, and the ones that will be patient, and when we ask for support on a project, to maybe bring in an act for a concert. That's the best way you can work FM102 on a record, because that will benefit the station, and it will benefit the record company.

DO YOU LOOK AT OTHER STATIONS AROUND THE COUNTRY?

Dave: Every market's different. I don't really key into any particular market. If it's a winning station, that's what I look at.

CAN YOU TALK ABOUT THE ROLE OF JERRY CLIFTON?

Dave: He comes about twice a year...

Chuck: And I particularly enjoy the experience...

WHEN HE COMES IN AND PUTS HIS FEET UP ON YOUR DESK, AND SPENDS ABOUT HALF THE DAY ON YOUR PHONE...

Dave: Yeah. Steals my office, basically, and uses my phone to call his other stations.

UNLIKE A LOT OF PD'S YOU'RE ALSO DOING FULL-OUT PRODUCTION.

Dave: I'm also a musician. That helps a lot in the production aspect. It also helps in imaging a station, because to me, the station is like a song...I look at it like a painting. Radio is art. It's a business, but it's art, too. GMs and sales people look at it a different way, but they have to; it's their job.

LET'S GO BACK TO THE MUSIC. YOUR OWN OPINION: WHY ALL OF A SUDDEN THIS 'OLD SCHOOL' PHENOMENON?


Dave: The Old School concept came about at a Clifton/New World brainstorming session in San Diego last year. It works because it's conducive to the format. It's the only really old product we can play that really conforms to the format.

Chuck: These were almost forgotten records...

Dave: Yeah, they were House Party records. They weren't records that were usually played on the radio at all. Those were the songs that everybody liked. The old Cameo records, and the Zapps, and stuff you would hear at House Parties. You would hear it booming in everybody's cassette deck in their car, but you'd never hear the radio stations play it.

We see a lot of 30 year-olds at Old School nights at local clubs.

Chuck: We throw an Old School party about once a month at some cool location around Sacramento, and it's always packed, lines waiting to get in.

Dave: A lot of clubs have these parties. One reason is too keep out the hoodlums. It kind of betters the quality of your audience.

YOU'RE GOING TO GET THE ADULT FEMALES. YOU'RE PLAYING RECORDS THAT THEY GREW UP WITH.

Dave: Yeah, you go back to when they first got musically active, when they were around 16 or 17.

Chuck: We have research that goes back ten years.

A LOT OF MAJOR RECORD COMPANIES HAVE THEIR POP DEPARTMENTS, AND YOU HAVE SOME RECORDS THAT GET WORKED URBAN, AND THEY DON'T SERVICE THEM TO YOU UNTIL THE RECORD COMPANY DECIDES...

Dave: And we have to call and say, "Hey, man, this record has really gone pop. Why haven't you serviced it yet?" Because they're still working it Urban.

Chuck: But at the same time, most of the successful Urban stations are in a sense Churbans. A lot of the real successful Urban stations, like JAMZ in Dallas, and 'GCI in Chicago, those are just like any Clifton-based Churban stations. They're playing hits. No matter what the trades or the record companies define as the format, it doesn't sound a whole lot different than FM102.

Dave: I don't like the way you have to categorize, especially when we first came on with the format. All the Urbans went on the air saying "don't listen to 'PGC, because it a bunch of white folks trying to take the black dollar... blah, blah, blah..." That wasn't really the case. It's just the politics you've got to play sometimes. When you step on somebody's turf, they're gonna try to bite ya.

DO YOU FIND IT DIFFICULT TO GET THE SAME ACTS FOR SHOWS WHEN THEY PLAY YOUR BAY AREA COMPETITORS JUST 90 MILES AWAY?

Chuck: I know myself that when someone pulls that kind of shit, I know I don't forget it. We've worked very hard to where that doesn't happen nearly as much, if at all. We've had a sold-out Fall Jam with Tony Toni Tone, Shai, Zapp N Roger, George Clinton, DRS, Duice... We always sell out, and we always get a huge ratings spike in the months that we do these concerts. Dave: If they can sell units here, and they can sell tickets here, they'll bring them here. Concerts not promoted by us tend to go to the Bay Area, but that's why ours are so successful, because we don't get a lot of the concerts that come down the pike and go to San Francisco and L.A. We do our own.

I'M AT THE DR. DAVE SCHOOL OF PROGRAMMING. WHAT ARE YOU GOING TO TEACH THIS FUTURE PD?

Dave: Well, by industry standards, they probably don't consider me a successful PD. I don't get off on seeing my picture or name in magazines, unlike other PD's who have half the ratings I do. I want my station to win big and make money. So in that sense, that's success to me. I'm a real private person; I don't like to do these kinds of things very often. You either see it or you don't; it's a vision.

YOU'VE TAKEN TWO LOSING MAJOR MARKET STATIONS TO #1 - HOW DID YOU DO IT?

Dave: It was easier at 'PGC because it was already in the works, the vibe was already there, so it didn't take us long to take it to the top. It was already on the way up and I was already a part of it instead of starting all over. FM102 was a great experience, in that it was the opposite of WPGC. It Dave: We drive around, listen to the station, and talk about what we're going to do that day. I try to be there for as many hours a day as possible, but I'm not getting anything done if I'm there. I'd rather be out observing people and listening to the station. You can't be a PD if you ain't listening to your station. I eat, sleep, and drink this radio station. I have a real high car phone bill because I'm always listening in my car and calling in. I'm out there like the listeners are, listening to the radio.

SO THE LARGEST NUMBER OF CALLS ON YOUR CAR-PHONE BILL WOULD BE THE HOTLINE NUMBER?

Dave: Very few bad hotline calls ... most of the time, I'm calling to say, "Hey, that was good. The traffic here at such-andsuch corner is stalled, so mention that I'm sitting here behind this fool whose tire is flat." It's the sense of immediacy. The closer to your listeners you get, the more the station is like their lives.

CHUCK, WHAT CAN YOU TEACH ME ABOUT PROGRAMMING?

Chuck: I think that, if you're going to be a successful programmer, you need to have a philosophy behind what you do. You've got to have a philosophy on what it means and takes to be successful.

needed a "vibe" desperately, and in creating that "vibe," we had to replace the people who were holding us back from success. Looking back, I think that the "clean sweep" theory may have been smarter than the "slow-fix," but you live and learn. I'm glad we finally did get that "vibe," and things seem to be on the right track. All in all, both stations have been great learning experiences, and I'm looking forward to many more challenges.

I SPEAK TO GUYS WHO PROGRAM FROM THEIR OFFICE ...

Dave: It's the opposite of what we do. I force myself to get out of the station because I can't get any work done there. You're always putting out fires and it's boring.

Chuck: The first thing Dave and I do every single morning is have a meeting outside of the radio station. Dave: You have to have a philosophy, but you can't be so rigid that you won't change if you find something that works better.

Chuck: Top40 is an ever-changing, ever-evolving format. Your philosophy can stay the same, but you've got to be able to adapt to the changing times. The kind of station I'd like to program is music-oriented, hip, service-oriented Top40 that appeals in certain times of the day to the needs of the listener. That's the basic philosophy of my programming.

We found that becoming more core is what the audience wants. The Old School thing is a perfect example. There is a demand for that and we filled that demand. We served the listener with what they wanted to hear. We found the jocks that would serve our audience best. We changed with the times. But that's all within the framework of the same philosophy. The philosophy never changed, it's just the way we approached it did. If you're truly serving your audience, you can't lose.

Dave: We try to beat ourselves. There's no one else to beat at this point. We had a meeting at my house last week. We called all the jocks over, ordered a pizza, and we sat there and put down what we thought were our weak points and tried to create a station that could beat us. We're not as good as we think we are; we have a lot of growth areas.

CHUCK, WHAT'S IN THE FUTURE FOR YOU?

Chuck: Definitely programming. The Churban format is my format of choice, and I plan to be at my own station soon. I've been here 3 1/2 years and this has been the greatest job that I have ever held. Not only have I become a decent programmer and a good air talent, but in my personal and professional life I think I've grown up a lot and really learned the ropes of the business. I can really say, "If I don't ever go on to do anything else in this business, I really have lived the business at this station."

TALK A LITTLE BIT ABOUT THE RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN THE TWO OF YOU.

Chuck: It's cool because we live two blocks from each other. We watch each other's back. We confer with each other constantly. There's a lot of communication between us ...

Dave: ...and we're friends. That helps... you can't really communicate that closely 24 hours a day and read each other's minds if you're not friends.

CHUCK'S CLOSING REMARKS:

If people want to know me, come to Sacramento, and I'll buy...I'm into meeting new people face-to-face.

And Ricky, it's nice to do this interview with someone we know and trust; so thanks!

DAVE'S CLOSING REMARKS:

1. Thanks to record companies who are so supportive of their product, and of our station... Warner Bros., Mercury, Atlantic, Capitol, Gasoline Alley/ MCA, Interscope, A&M, and all the others. Sorry if I didn't name you.
