



Programmer's Think Tank

This has been a mean, miserable winter just about everywhere. Here in New York it's snowed or sleeted every weekend, so it's virtually impossible to get out of town. I found that after a few weeks of this monotony I started to get into a rut. My world consisted of about 20 blocks of Manhattan, and my priorities reduced to getting from home to the office and back without falling on my ass. The longer this went on, the less interested I became in breaking my little routine. I had no particular desire to go anywhere.

Finally, last weekend, I had to go to my chiropractor upstate and I was forced to break my routine reluctantly. The parkways were flooded and I had to maneuver my way on alternate routes. I've gotta admit that it really threw me. I was totally flustered. You see, it's easy to form habits and get into a rut. Then the rut becomes all there is and we then become resistant to change.

We saw this happen with George Bush when he was awed by a supermarket scanner and couldn't even estimate prices of everyday grocery items. Many of Rush Limbaugh's followers are now complaining that he's losing touch with the street. Chartering a private plane to take him to New Orleans for dinner then right back home again isn't how his listeners live. Limo's back and forth to work and messengers doing all the chores create a very dangerous routine existence.

Behaviorist John Bradshaw observes that "First you create a routine. Then the routine controls the routine. Then the routine controls you." In other words, to build a less complex and unpredictable life, we set up preconceived methods of doing things — our day, our job, etc. After a while, this pattern starts to take on a life of its own and becomes its own standard or routine. Finally, this routine is taken so much for granted that it's forgotten and the only thing left is the set of "rules" and priorities. The routine controls the routine.

This evolving set of rules that we create and then must obey is one of the things that separates the young from the old. Systems and

"safe patterns" replace experimentation, and even creativity.

What I'm getting at is that we in this industry fall prey to routines as we do our jobs. In some cases they may not even be routines we ourselves made up, but instead be somebody else's neurosis. Do we have to spend half our work day with our noses buried in the computer tracking and painfully scheduling every tune? Do we have to talk with 57 different promotion people every week or can we rethink a new and more mutually efficient way to optimize record label interaction, yet give everybody their say? Is playing 10 minutes of commercials back to back really a good idea for radio's perception or does it maybe hurt its image and advertiser effectiveness? Is it really a horrible idea to play one spot after each song instead? Now, I'm not saying that you have to change a thing - but I do suggest you think about why you do what you do. If every bit of your routine has a rational base and you're confident that you are the best you can be the most alert, well thought out and successful you ever wished you could be, then fine. Do you read all the trades – especially the articles you disagree with? Good for you.

Radio has a lot of "rules" right now, and it feels awfully safe to just follow them — especially when there are bullets flying and duopolies and LMA's threatening us at every turn. The safe harbor, though, isn't in that rut you've been reduced to. When I was forced last weekend to get out of town, get off the predictable streets and safe parkways to travel alternate routes I snapped awake and saw new things that had always been nearby. I got in touch again with life and spontaneity.

Let's never get into a rut where, like an old vinyl record, we keep turning and turning in ever-decreasing concentric circles until we reach a lock-groove.







This band has an industry importance that will be felt for years to come. This record was partially recorded in the Sharon Tate mansion and you can feel it when you listen to it! KROQ, 91X, LIVEIC5, KEDJ. WEQX, WHTG and WLAVAM hit it. but I think Mike Halloran sums up this record best when he gingerly states "F*%k whatever revolution you're into...This is the real one! An absolutely unbelievable album."

ELVIS COSTELLO Thirteen Steps Lead Down (Warner Bros.) - The Most Added record this week. If you don't hear this song as an obvious record for this and Pop formats there's a Murine Earwax Removal Kit in this magazine! Use it!

APRIL S MOTEL ROOM (Immortal) -Produced by Matt Hyde (Porno for Pyros, Jane's Addiction) the band's debut self-titled album is a blend of percussion-driven alternative grooves The dichotomy of April's Motel Room is that the music is uplifting; the lyrics are dark. Their music has been described as "Tribal, spacious and angst-ridden." After listening to their record tell me if you don't hear influences from The Beatles, Grateful Dead, Kiss, Rolling Stones and certain punk sensibilities. Call Sean at Immortal for your copy, this is definitely worth the listen.



HOW LONG HAVE YOU BEEN AT HOT97.7?

I got here the first of August.

AND, HOW LONG WERE YOU AT KTFM IN SAN ANTONIO?

I was there a little over three years. Where I was the Operations Manager and programmed the station with Big Dog, Rick Hayes.

WHAT ARE THE HIGHLIGHTS OF YOUR PROGRAMMING CAREER?

I've programmed and consulted seven #1 Top40 stations since 1980. Prior to that, I spent six years as a DJ in Baton Rouge, Louisiana.

WHO ARE SOME OF YOUR EARLY RADIO MENTORS?

I've spent a lot of my career doing two things. Number one: there are people both in and outside of radio, and I stress outside of radio, who I think are brilliant thinkers and strategic planners, and I spend a lot of time studying them and applying their philosophies to radio. And number two: I spend as much of my time as possible talking to regular radio listeners who have nothing to do with the business.

IS THERE A CERTAIN TIME THAT YOU ALLOT EACH WEEK FOR STREET RESEARCH?

I spend a lot of time in the streets talking to radio listeners. We have a very well-defined idea of who our target audience is, where they live, where they party, go to school, what shopping malls they hang out at, what movie theaters they go to, what their favorite lifestyle events are, this is the same story with all seven #1 radio stations. Make the streets come out of the speakers.

THAT'S A TERM THAT I'M NOT SURE IF YOU INVENTED IT, BUT YOU CERTAINLY HAVE COINED IT OVER THE YEARS.

Actually Big Dog said it first, and I liked it so much I ripped it off.

WELL, AREN'T THE BEST IDEAS ALWAYS RIPPED OFF?

Yes, and what's so unfortunate is that most radio people will read a statement like that, and think bullshit, it's got to be harder than that. Come on, he's not telling us anything and frankly it's not harder than that. Just make the street come out of the speakers. We have a tendency in radio to allow our ego's our personal taste, our preconceived notions, what worked 10 years ago, and all that baggage to get in the way of our thinking; that's the biggest problem most people in programming have. The trick is to get out from under that baggage. Throw all that crap out the window and go talk to your target audience and find out exactly what are the records they want to hear on the radio. What kind of prizes do they want to win, what do they want the morning show to be talking about tomorrow morning. What do they want from their favorite station?

DO YOU DO YOUR OWN IN-HOUSE RESEARCH?

The research takes many different forms. There's callout research, finding out what's selling in the record stores, watching the requests, hitting the streets and talking to regular listeners about what their favorite songs are, all of that in my opinion is research.

WHEN YOU CAME INTO SAN JOSE, WHAT WAS THE FIRST

DIFFERENCES FROM PROGRAMMING IN THE SOUTH-WEST AND ON THE WEST COAST?

In San Antonio where we started with a three-way Top40 race, the pace in San Antonio was much more conservative. They basically wanted the hits over and over and over and over. Out here on the West Coast, the music tastes are much more aggressive. The appetite for new music, new and different things is greater. Once again it all goes back to getting on the streets and finding every excuse you can to go talk to your target audience about what they want on the radio, and the differences between the markets will manifest themselves. To give an example: When I was back in McAllen-Brownsville, I used to go hang out in the laundry mats and find Hispanic females. I'd pay for the dry cycle if they would sit down and tell me what their favorite songs were. That's how simple it gets. Physically get out of the building and go to places where your target audience hangs out, and talk to them. What do they want on their radio station? They'll tell you every time. Great radio programming, and making a station #1 is a balance between left brain and right brain. Yes, you've got the callout



months. The problem was, I was sitting inside the radio station doing what I thought the audience wanted, and it didn't work. So I hired Lee in San Antonio and he was the first person to teach me about going out and talking to listeners and reversed my thinking. Instead of doing what I want, let's go find out what they want. We used to sit in Mexican restaurants for three or four hours at a time and wait until every single waitress had come around to our table and filled our glasses full of water so that we made sure that we had a list of favorite songs of every waitress in the building. A lot of that sounds so simple, and people read that and think, man this is ridiculous, but it's really that simple. There is another person who was extremely instrumental in my thinking, and what's so ironic is I've never worked with this person before. That's Jerry Clifton. I have learned a great deal by studying him and his radio stations extensively, and learned what I can from them. I think he's a brilliant programmer. I know that a lot of people have a hard time figuring out Jerry, but I don't. When I study him and his radio stations it makes perfect sense to me. Don Kelly opened the consulting door for me. Don taught me a lot about the consulting business. George Jenne gave me my first programming job at age 20 in McAllen-Brownsville. George never let someone's chronological age get in the way of advancement. If he thought you had the juice, he'd give you the opportunity. That's extremely rare. Also, Joe Ernest and Dick Lewis are two GMs who have been very instrumental in my career.

THING YOU DID?

I talked to Hispanic female listeners, and asked what do you want from this radio station?

ONCE AGAIN IT SOUNDS VERY SIMPLE, BUT THERE'S A LOT MORE TO IT THAN THAT.

Yes, there are tricks of the trade, but when it really gets down to it, that's basically it. The constant fight within my mind is making sure that what I'm doing is not influenced by the opinions of people inside the building. That an ongoing goal to make sure everything we're doing on the radio is what the target audience wants.

THERE ARE QUITE A FEW

research, and you've got the charts, and graphs and all the scientific stuff, but you have to balance that with an intuitive feel. Your programming intuition is built by going out to the streets and talking to listeners as much as possible and listening very closely to what they say.

IS THERE ANY ONE PARTICULAR PROGRAMMER OR CONSULTANT THAT'S HAD THE GREATEST INFLUENCE ON YOU?

Actually a couple. The first consultant I ever worked with was a guy named Lee Randall. Sometimes you learn the most in programming from your failures. The first station that I ever programmed back in 1980 lost half the station's audience in six





while programming at the same time. The attitude at HOT97.7 is that this station benefits from my outside consulting because every time I go on a consulting trip, I come back with a great idea for HOT97.7. My last consulting project was the Fall Arbitron for POWER102 in El Paso, which went 10.6 to a 12.5. Props to PD John Candalaria and the POWER crew,

BEING ABLE TO WEAR ALL THOSE HATS ALSO MEANS YOU HAVE TO EMPOWER THE PEOPLE THAT WORK FOR YOU?

I do.

YES, I KNOW. ABSOLUTELY.

At this radio station we have a good staff. Trevor Carey, the APD, works hard. The time clock doesn't mean anything. The guy works all the time and he's very instrumental in a lot of aspects of the radio station. Pete Manriquez is the MD. Pete was the one that had been working at the station for a long time and I don't think his potential has ever been realized. What makes Pete so special is he is from the street. He has become very good at this science of going out and working listeners and finding out what they want and don't want on the radio. As a matter of fact, Pete was the one that brought me All-4-One So Much In Love, and this was based strictly on talking to listeners on the street. We were the first station in America to play this record.

LET'S TALK A LITTLE BIT ABOUT WHAT YOU'VE DONE WITH THE STATION. YOU'VE REFOCUSED, AND THERE IS A DIFFERENT DIRECTION AT HOT97.7 TODAY.

No question. We feel extremely fortunate that our first book has gone 4.1 to a 5.5 against some of the toughest competition in America. This is a three-way Top40 fight, and I only know of two other markets with three Top40s - New York and L.A., beside this one. What's interesting is in those markets the Top40s have very big competitive differences. One leans adult, one leans Alternative, one Dance. However in this market the three Top40s are fighting over the same audience. The other two Top40s I'm talking about are WILD107 and KMEL in San Francisco and someone would ask, why in the hell are the two San Francisco radio stations competing in San Jose? Which leads me to one of the most unique things about this market. San Jose and San Francisco are only 30 minutes apart and San Jose is its own market. We're market 31. We have our own Arbitron, but for whatever reason the

San Francisco Arbitron combines both San Jose and San Francisco and Oakland all together, which is why San Francisco is the #4 market in the country. San Jose has a bigger population than San Francisco. Over one third of the diaries used to make the San Francisco Arbitron actually come out of San Jose and Santa Clara county, and that is why WILD107 and KMEL spend so much time competing directly with HOT97.7 here in San Jose, WILD107 spends more time on the streets of San Jose than they do on the streets of San Francisco. Having such incredible competition from two very wellprogrammed radio stations with two of the best program directors in America - Dave Shakes and Rick Thomas...And in our first book we go to #2 18-34 and from #5 to #2 25-34, behind an AOR...To have those kind of increases against such formidable competition, you can bet we feel fortunate.

YOU HAVE ALSO CHANGED THE SOUND OF HOT97.7 WITH THE DANCE PRODUCT AND THE FREESTYLE.

The street told us they wanted to dance more, when a Rap record is a hit like 2PAC <u>Keep Your Head Up</u>, we'll play that record around the clock, no problem there. However the street in San Jose was telling us they wanted more Dance music, and by

Some programmers who think freestyle dance music is over may want to reconsider it because the audience in your market may want it. You need to go out and talk to your listeners and find out. If they want it and it will work in your market, not only will your ratings go up, but your adult numbers will skyrocket and that will make you a bigger star with the owner, management and the sales department.

DEFINITELY THE OWNERS.

In this situation going back to more freestyle hit dance music has done two things: A) The ratings went up, and we beat back some pretty tough competition; and B) We were able to put some good adult numbers on the radio station which definitely will help the financial end. This radio station is going to have a much improved financial picture this coming year. A lot of Top40 radio stations have gotten in big trouble trying to be too 25-54 and trying to be what the format was not designed to be, Top40 is 18-34. And fortunately I'm working for a company that is smart enough to know that if you will focus your guns on giving 18-34 year olds what they want on the radio, by virtue of having a big gain in the demo it will have favorable impact on other demos. You kill 25-34, and that's how you make 25-54 numbers go up for Top40. We kill 18-34 and

while doing all the information elements. In middays, it's Trevor, the hardest working APD in radio. Afternoon drive is Elvis Medina, this guy is a pro. Formerly Q106, Z90-San Diego, KSFM-Sacramento, was most recently with Y95-Phoenix, Production Director, incredible on-air sound and the numbers show it. At night we have Dr. Dave who made the switch from WILD107. Dr. Dave has been in the market in the Bay Area for quite a while and knows what to put on the radio. The late night show is open.

IS THERE ANYONE ELSE THAT YOU WOULD LIKE TO MENTION?

Dayton Phillips, the GM. One of the few GMs that allows the programming department to do the programming and gives us constant support. Tim Sullivan, who owns the company and spent many years at KHJ in Los Angeles, obviously he believes in the Top40 format. And, my fiancee, Cassandra Castellanos, who has spent a number of years doing both TV and radio, and is a constant source of brilliant ideas.

SO I WOULD IMAGINE THAT IF I WAS TO ASK YOU WHAT YOUR PERSONAL LIFE MIGHT BE LIKE...

Are you talking about living, and breathing, radio? It's ongoing, you never stop thinking. You can't turn it off at 5 p.m. and on the weekends. And it's not a chore to think and do it all the time. It's just you really have to love it and constantly have your eyes and ears open for the next great idea that's going to come rolling down the pike.

DO YOU HAVE ANY CLOSING COMMENTS?

The same: Make the streets come out of the speakers, find out who your target is. Find out what they want on the radio and just give it to them.

AND ABOUT DANCE MUSIC NOW?

If you're looking for a way to make the ratings go up and put some adult demos on the radio station, I would suggest that you look at some of the high energy dance music. And once again this goes back to something we talked about earlier. Everybody's preconceived notion is that freestyle dance is dead. Take your preconceived notions and throw them out the window and go talk to the audience. They may tell you differently, and you better be listening when they talk to you because they're the real boss.

working the streets like we do, we came across a number of dance records that they liked that were not yet on the radio and we simply put them on the radio. (Some people call it high energy). The street has told us this is what they want and that is what they're going to get. So HOT97.7, because of what our listeners were telling us, we took the station on a more dance mode, whereas KMEL and WILD107 definitely played a lot more rap product than we played.

AND THAT'S WHY YOUR FEMALE NUMBERS AND YOUR 18-34'S HAVE GONE UP?

Through the roof, a lot of people screamed that freestyle is dead. I really don't care what other radio and record people say or don't say. It's what the listeners say, and in this market there are dance records that are working and because of what the listeners say they're on the radio.

all of a sudden we're #4 18-49.

LET'S GO THROUGH THE AIRSTAFF.

Morning drive we have Mike Martinez. Some people know him as Eli Milano.

FROM KPRR IN EL PASO.

He's programmed and done mornings in several Hispanic markets including San Antonio, El Paso, Riverside, McAllen-Brownsville. We teamed him up with an incredible talent, Jeff Stein who just got here from KSFM (FM102) in Sacramento. Jeff and his cast of characters. 
