LES GARLAND Executive Vice President, THE BOX

Editors Note: The interview was conducted by Liz Kiley, Director, Radio Affiliations, THE BOX.

STORIES HAVE A **BEGINNING AS DOES THE LES** GARLAND SAGA. YOURS IS IN SPRINGFIELD, MISSOURI. TELL US HOW IT HAPPENED.

I was one of those teenagers enamored by radio and music. Both were very, very important to me, but in my mind they were one and the same. I would go to bed at night, crawl under the covers and DX through the dial. I would find KAAY in Little Rock, Arkansas, WLS in Chicago, and occasionally KXOK in St. Louis would bounce in. I remember one night I picked up WABC in New York. Just the thought of these radio signals coming in from places I never dreamed of going fueled my passion. At 14 my perception of radio was the disc jockey...You know, Mr. Cool sitting in a huge beautiful studio with the artists performing live. Theater of the mind, Huh? I hammed it up at school and church events. I remember I used to steal Red Skelton's greatest jokes. I'd get up and do shtick at functions. I always was sort of attracted to the stage. Being in front of people whether it was a speech class, school play, debate or radio reading. That developed into a craving to be on the radio or on television, of which both came within a few years.

YOU WENT TO SCHOOL AT **SMU IN TEXAS?**

Briefly...Sort of.

CAREFUL. AND WHY WAS THAT SO BRIEF, GARMAN?

Never made it to class, Kiley. For some reason I couldn't seem to concentrate on anything but getting into radio as soon as I could. I was driven by the desire to be a part of the

'60s Rock revolution. In 1965 I was off to school. I was about 100 miles outside Dallas. To this day, I remember the first time I heard Gordon McClendon's KLIF...What a great radio station in the history of Contemporary Top40! Shortly after my arrival, I enrolled at the Elkins Institute Of Radio in order to get my Third Class FCC license. Within two months, I found myself running the VTR machines at educational KERA-TV Channel 13 and doing weekend disc jockey work at an FM called KEIR. We're talking '65...Not a lot of FM penetration...I probably had three liseners! This was an eclectic station...Annette Funicello into the Beau Brummels! Funny, but I got into radio and television at the same time not knowing that that would benefit me 15 years later.

YOU WERE A GREAT JOCK,

I was me...There are rumors that I was pretty good at it.

THERE WAS ONE AIRSHIFT **DURING THE R&R CONVEN-**TION A FEW YEARS AGO IN DALLAS THAT REMAINS LEGENDARY AND AS A MATTER OF FACT I HAVE A TAPE TO PROVE IT.


to the fun factor? A lot of stations I hear become very boring with "ten in a row" when the morning guys finish up. I really miss the "personality" we used to insist on from our radio performers.

WHAT ARE THE ELEMENTS THAT MAKE IT ALL CLICK?

I think about this a lot. My philosophy regarding creating a positive and fun environment works here at THE BOX and anywhere I've ever been. In the mid '70s I was asked to monitor a major market station. It had all the ingredients...But, lacked "soul." You could tell from listening to the overall presentation. The station had everything except that intangible vibe...And ultimately that vibe comes out of the speakers or in television, on the screen.

WHAT ARE YOUR BEST **QUALITIES?**

I believe my most valuable asset is the unique ability to motivate people. My strongest leadership skill is to create an enjoyable environment for people to work within. Did I say work? I've never looked at what I do as work...Yes, things can be difficult. Some projects require a lot of time, a lot of strategy, a lot of dedication, and sometimes brains, too. But, if doing it



guys were programming geniuses. I dreamed of meeting Bill Drake some day...He was a legend because of what he'd done changing radio forever with his accomplishments in the RKO radio chain.

WHO IN RADIO WOULD BE ON YOUR MOST ADMIRED LIST?

I'd have to say my radio mentors were Bill Drake and Paul Drew. Still the best in my mind!

IF RADIO PEOPLE DON'T KNOW THOSE NAMES, THEY MIGHT WANT TO FIND OUT WHO THEY ARE.

Yeah, and to this day, misperceptions remain concerning the effect Drake had on contemporary radio. Some say he took the personality out of radio...when in fact, he refined radio and the personalities. Robert W. Morgan, The Real Don Steele, Dave Diamond, Charlie Tuna and others are still amongst the best to ever perform in a music format on radio. Drake cleaned up cluttered Top40 radio in America...Stations like KHJ, KFRC, CKLW, WRKO...Would stand up today if the music was current. Those stations had that magic...That soul.

FROM RADIO YOU TRAN-SITIONED TO THE RECORD **BUSINESS AT ATLANTIC. YOU** STILL HOLD A VERY SPECIAL LANDMARK THERE, GARMAN. WHAT IS THAT?

Oh, God. I had such a lucky illustrious career in radio that took me through seven of the Top 10 markets. Kiley, as you probably remember, at the pinnacle of my radio career at KFRC, the station had been named the best by our peers year after year and I'd received the accolades that come with that recognition because I was the guy in the PD office with the best team ever assembled in radio.

IT'S BLACKMAIL MATERIAL.



As I listen to radio today that does seem to be missing...What happened isn't fun...What's the point? I got into the industry because it's the entertainment industry...Radio, music, television, the artis...Interesting people I enjoy associating myself

MANY YOUNGER PROGRAM-MERS WEREN'T AWARE OF "THE RKO YEARS"-A VERY SPECIAL TIME IN RADIO. WHAT WERE YOU DOING, AND WHAT WERE THE MAGICAL THINGS THAT HAPPENED AT THAT TIME?

In the late '60s I'd moved on to a programming gig in Tulsa up against what was called a "Drake station." At the time. I didn't even know what that meant. Radio offers came from NBC, ABC, CBS and others. None of it made any sense to me. I felt myself experiencing that inner drive. Seeking new challenges...I wanted to do something I'd never done before which, over the years, has lead me into some interesting situations both on a professional and personal level. One night in 1979 having dinner with Doug Morris, who had just become president of ATLANTIC Records the subject of my future came up. Doug asked me what I thought I would be doing when I left radio. By the time dinner had ended, Doug offered me an executive position on the West Coast with ATLANTIC. I moved to L.A. and began my education in records, from A&R, promotion, sales, marketing and so on. I traveled a lot on company money. At the end of my first year with ATLANTIC I received a memo from Corporate Finance informing me that I'd set a company record with my T&E expenditures! Maybe that record still holds...Hey, it costs money to go to "Harvard!"

WHEN YOU WERE GOING WITH BOB PITTMAN TO START A MUSIC VIDEO CHANNEL, WHICH OF COURSE BECAME MTV, YOUR REACTION WAS OH NO, GARMAN'S GONE OFF THE DEEP END AGAIN. YOU DIDN'T HAVE A LOT OF BELIEVERS AT THAT TIME.

I can't think of any other than Doug Morris. None of my close friends or business associates who I told the idea to thought it made sense. "Garland, you've lost your mind. Why would anybody leave ATLANTIC Records? Why would anyone leave the position you're in? Why would you leave the West Coast to move to New York and jump on some cockamamie idea of putting music videos on cable television...Cable doesn't mean anything." In 1981 cable television wasn't such a big deal. We weren't talking about super highways in those days. The world watched as HBO, ESPN, CNN, these specialized channels entered the cable line-up...It was only natural that someone attempt music. Again, I was one of the lucky ones to become involved. We launched MTV in August of '81...I knew I was in for a ride...but, I had no idea it would be as rewarding as it turned out to be.

MANY RADIO PEOPLE WERE AFRAID OF A MUSIC VIDEO CHANNEL THAT WAS GOING TO BE "THE ENEMY." BUT OF COURSE THAT WASN'T THE CASE. HOW DID MTV COME

How did it actually come to be born? Who was behind it? It was Warner Communications and American Express. Bob Pittman had left NBC and had joined the company, which was called Warner-

AMEX. Bob championed the concept and gained board approval to launch MTV costing tens of millions of dollars. Interestingly, Doug Morris cast the deciding vote which resulted in MTV being given the green light to

IT WAS A RADIO STATION ON TELEVISION.

It was never described that way by the people involved in the beginning. MTV was described by others as a radio station with pictures. I believed it was television with music. Even then, I underestimated the power and impact television could have on the youth culture. It amazed me! Look what happened...The force of MTV changed music, movies, television, commercials...It had such an incredible effect in so many different ways. Now 13 years later, I'm still involved with television and music...with a hook...it's interactive. THE BOX is programmed by our viewers...20 million of 'em! Looking back, MTV was "actively passive"... THE BOX is "actively active"...Our viewers are music fanatics like the original MTV core audience.

MTV CHANGED THE WORLD OF TELEVISION AS WE WATCH IT TODAY, IT WAS TRULY AN **AMAZING** EXPERIENCE. WHEN YOU LEFT MTV I DON'T THINK YOUR DESIRE WAS TO JOIN ANOTHER CHANNEL, IT WAS TO BE INVOLVED IN THE

made sense and we began the national roll-out of what is now known as THE BOX. In 1990 THE BOX was in front of 400,000 homes...Today we reach 20 million! I certainly never thought I'd be anywhere other than New York or Los Angeles. Fortunately, the R&D for THE BOX had been done in South Florida. I've never been happier in my life! I'm excited to say we're doing well...Chris Blackwell is now involved...And this fall we'll be moving our headquarters to two of the most beautiful art deco buildings on South Beach here in Miami.

WITH CHRIS BLACKWELL IN THE MIX - THERE'S A DESIRE FULFILLED.

I've wanted to work with Chris for a long, long time. It's another dream come true for me.

THE BOX IS POISED TO GO TO THE NEXT LEVEL NOW.

A lot of things are happening in '94 at THE BOX. Increased revenues, U.S. distribution, international distribution, promotions, technology and, of course, the reason you joined our company, Kiley. You and I first talked of developing a relationship between THE BOX and local radio almost two years ago. You've done an amazing job in your first couple of months with us.

first 24-hour video music channel on cable in stereo." Well, THE BOX is the world's first 24-hour interactive video music channel in stereo. THE BOX is programmed by the viewers who access one of our systems in 33 states and 65 DMA markets. Typically, each BOX computer unit is connected to a cable system head-end servicing approximately 40,000

IF THERE ARE A FEW HUNDRED BOXES IN THE UNITED STATES, CHANCES ARE YOU WON'T SEE THE SAME VIDEO ON THOSE BOXES AT THE SAME TIME.

Each system is self-contained, housing BOX programming materials, commercials, promos and digitally stored music. I'd bet each system is playing a different video right now.

BECAUSE THEY ARE RESPON-SIVE TO THE VIEWERS IN THAT AREA.

Exactly. But as Paul Drew used to say..."A hit is a hit is a hit." The Top 10 requested videos are fairly consistent from BOX to BOX to BOX. There are variables, though. We see different request patterns from, say, Detroit to Phoenix.

THAT'S VERY TRUE. DOES IT FOLLOW THROUGH WITH SALES AND HOW MUCH DO THE RECORD LABELS REALLY SUPPORT WHAT WE DO?

The labels have been incredibly supportive for a lot of reasons. THE BOX is adventurous...We're unafraid of new music. In fact, 35% of our requests are dialed in for videos that have been featured for less than one month on the channel. We constantly promote new music with our promos. Our niche is new music. Labels have taken advantage of promotional, marketing and sales opportunities that aren't available anywhere in radio or television. The Great Payola Scheme, for example. Labels can buy guaranteed exposure once a clip is accepted and programmed into the mix. The people at THE BOX all take a great deal of pride in saying that we work with the labels. The effort on all fronts is to develop the talent of tomorrow. That's the labels future and

THE BOX IS KNOWN FOR EXPOSING NEW ARTISTS TO A VERY WIDE AUDIENCE. HOW DID THE BOX GAIN THIS REPUTATION AND WHO ARE SOME OF THE ARTISTS THAT YOU CAN THINK OF THAT GOT THEIR START ON THE BOX?

Personally, I've always positioned my radio stations, MTV, and now THE BOX on the ...pardon the

OWNERSHIP OF A RADIO STATION OR TO JOIN PROFESSIONAL GOLF IN SOME MANNER. WHAT HAPPENED?

I was looking to come out of "mini" retirement to re-enter into something I'd never done. I looked to my past and seriously considered radio ownership if I could put together the financing. At the same time I was looking at managing professional golfers. In fact, I had a deal in place to move back to the West Coast hooking up with a wellknown sports management group launching the golf division. We had talked abbut handling players and creating golf events for television. Readers Digest version: I was tracked down by a head hunter and told that my name had surfaced to become involved in a music video channel then called the Video Jukebox Network. I checked it out...saw its potential...got a deal together that

Garland: That must be why we love it so much. We have an opportunity to create a national situation on a localized level.

LET'S GO BACK FOR A MINUTE. I THINK THERE ARE STILL A FEW PEOPLE OUT THERE THAT DON'T KNOW WHAT THE BOX IS AND THEY DON'T KNOW HOW IT WORKS.

You made me think of an amusing story. In the early '80s I was on a press run for MTV. I was on a talk station, KGO in San Francisco, in fact. The interviewer asked me, "what is MTV?" It's the first time in my life I remember being stumped for an answer! I went totally blank. Later, the answer came to me. I should have responded with, "MTV is the world's

expression...Cutting Edge. New music works if you play the right new music. In the case of THE BOX, the viewers do it for us. The programming department simply makes the right new music available. Acts that come to mind...Beginning with Vanilla Ice...Remember when I did a cover photo and interview in this same magazine in December of 1990? Well, since then, it's been Ace Of Base, Toni Braxton, DRS, Dr. Dre, Snoop Dogg, 4 Non Blondes...Let's see...Prong, Primus, I could ramble on with this one. Oh, and Meat Loaf. That's a story of its own...Meat Loaf...MCA Records wanted to use THE BOX to relaunch his career. We treated his I'd Do Anything For Love video like the coming of a hot new film. There was a pre-promo campaign...It worked out for everyone. The last time I'd seen Loaf...He was golfing, not making

WHO HAD A BETTER HANDICAP?

He's a pretty good player. I think I beat him, though. You usually win if you're in charge of the score card and you have a pencil with an eraser...

NOW, IF YOU'RE A 12-29 PROGRAMMER AND YOU'RE NOT PAYING ATTENTION TO WHAT'S GOING ON THE BOX, ARE YOU PAYING ATTENTION TO WHAT'S HAPPENING IN YOUR MARKET?

I'd be all over THE BOX if I were a programmer in a market where THE BOX has distribution. THE BOX attracts the actives...Clicked into how it works...And they make calls to see videos for \$1.99. If I were a prorammer, I'd want that active viewer listening to my station. Part of our radio affiliation program includes sharing request information on a local market basis ever week.

I'M GOING TO TURN THE TABLES ON YOU. I'M GOING TO PUT YOU IN MY POSITION. I'M A PROGRAMMER NOW FOR A RADIO STATION. WHAT DOES THE BOX HAVE TO OFFER ME?

Once a programmer always a programmer. Get it in your blood and the passion never dies. When you and I first talked about the concept of THE BOX and local radio, I remember sharing my ideas with you. Specifically, if I were programming radio today I'd be searching for ways to differentiate my station from my 65 competitors. If Liz Kiley came to me with an opportunity for me to get promotional exposure on a "localized" national music video interactive TV channel, I'd ask you where you want me to sign up! There's a bit more to it than that...But that's the basic concept...Use THE BOX to promo radio locally...And local radio to promote THE BOX, which is a

nationally known reputable music channel. I'd really be afraid that if I didn't...my competition might... and, of course, it can work if we choose the right radio stations. The smart guys get it.

THE WHOLE IDEA IS HAVING A TELEVISION CHANNEL CUSTOMIZED FOR YOUR MARKET, YOUR RADIO STATION. IT'S JUST GETTING TO THAT NEXT LEVEL, BREAKING OUT OF THE PACK. I THINK THAT'S ONE THING THAT WE DEFINITELY HAVE TO OFFER.

If done right...The marriage of radio and THE BOX will build awareness and brand loyalty for both of us. Can't hurt when one takes into account the real objective...Success in those Arbitrons! TV exposure can only juice listener and viewer recall.

WE HAVE STATIONS SIGNED IN MANY PARTS OF THE COUNTRY WITH A TOTAL OF 25 TO BE SIGNED BY THE END OF THE SUMMER.

I'm getting very excited!

WE WANT RADIO TO BE INVOLVED. WE WANT RADIO TO BE A PART OF THE BOX. IF YOU COULD SAY SOMETHING TO PROGRAMMERS WHO DON'T UTILIZE THE BOX,

WE DO WHAT WE DO 24/7.

THE BOX is a music channel. We sell only six minutes of commercials an hour. We average 12 videos every hour, 168 hours a week. But, we're more than that with BOXTALKS, BOXTOPS, "breakin' out of THE BOX." Contests and other programming features designed to attract and keep viewers. You can watch for free or you can call for a small fee...See what you want when you want. Cool concept!

THE BOX HAS GONE FROM 450,000 TO 20 MILLION IN A MATTER OF A COUPLE OF YEARS. WHERE DO YOU SEE IT ONE YEAR FROM NOW?

One year from today I see us looking back recognizing huge growth internationally. Ad revenues will continue to grow, distribution will increase, the look of the channel will continue to improve as technology catches up. Hopefully, we will have had a tremendous impact on launching musical careers. And, it goes without saying, our radio affiliations will have become meaningful. I should also mention merchandising. It's been written about a lot...We hope to put that BOX "twist" on it.

office before dark. Every day is a new day. It would be very difficult to say exactly what I do. I do a little bit of everything. Fortunately because of my position in this company and my years in the business, I can get involved in a lot of different areas of our company. It never gets boring to me. If I ever got bored...I'd leave.

WHERE DO YOU THINK YOU WOULD LIKE TO BE FIVE YEARS FROM NOW, BESIDES ON THE GOLF COURSE?

Interesting question, Kiley. I've never plotted that far in front. Only recently, and for the first time in my life, I've actually looked five years out. I believe I'd find gratification in putting to use the knowledge I've gained from a wonderful career. Over the course of my life many people have told me I should teach. I believe a responsibility that comes with knowledge is to make it available to others. I think I'd like to tour college campuses with a multimedia presentation of my career past with a glimpse into the future. I've been approached and believe when the time becomes available I'd enjoy writing a book. The Les Garland story is the American dream. I've been very fortunate. Teaching and writing would afford me the time to improve my golf game, too. It's a game in which a person is not restricted by age. I'm a 7.0 handicap today and wish I had the time to work it down to a three!

WITH ALL YOUR YEARS IN THIS INDUSTRY AND WILD DAYS WITHIN THOSE, YOU HAVE TO HAVE ONE MEMOR-ABLE MOMENT. I'M ALMOST AFRAID TO ASK WHAT IT IS.

I have thousands of memorable moments! In 1973, I was programming the test station for the RKO radio chain... KYNO in Fresno...at the peak of Bill Drake's programming career at RKO, when he decided to leave to buy a radio station. It was an FM in Los Angeles. That station later became PIRATE Radio. Drake phoned me in Fresno and invited me to get to L.A. as soon as possible. I arrived that night...was picked up and chauffeured to his home in Beverly Hills. Drake was somewhere upstairs from where I heard him call out my name. I went upstairs only to find him in the bathroom wrapped in a towel shaving in front of the mirror. I entered the rather large bathroom. Drake says "have a seat." I look around and grabbed the only available seat - the toilet. On the spot, Drake hired me to program K100. I'll never forget that moment. It was a big break for me.

ESPECIALLY ON A TOILET.

WHAT WOULD IT BE?

12-25 year olds watch almost 50 hours of television every week...They listen to the radio every day, too. A lot of that TV viewing is spent on THE BOX. In the past seven Nielsen coincidentals, THE BOX has scored some impressive ratings. The channel is on the come, big time...

WHAT ABOUT THE OTHER CHANNELS? THE NEW CHANNELS?

We just left the national cable show in New Orleans. There were more than 40 new channels being presented...from the singles channel, classic sports, the auto channel, golf channel, jazz, classic music, ecology, crime, games, talk, health, all on the ramp to hit the super highway. There won't be 500 channels anytime soon...But there will be 100. Much like radio experienced 20 years ago...TV is fragmenting more and more as more channels become available.

REMAIN ON THAT KIND OF EDGE?

Well, I'm flattered that you would say that Kiley. As you know, I'm an excitable boy. I get off when I hear a great record, hear a great promo, see a great promo, a video, a contest... whatever. I love this medium. In reality, I'm normal. When I leave the office and get into my car I listen to the radio like a consumer would. Same with watching TV. I really trust my gut...It's right more often than wrong.

WHAT'S YOUR TYPICAL DAY LIKE?

As long as I've got ears I wanna dance!

I've never had a typical day. I've never had two days that resembled each other. Every day is a new day for me even though I have a blueprint of what I'm going to do tomorrow, I know it's going to change the minute it starts. I'm an early riser these days and I have been now for well over 10 years. I'm up before the sun. I rarely get out of the


