
LARRY STESSEL JOINS EMI RECORDS AS SR. VP/GM



YOU'VE BEEN A CONSULTANT FOR HOW LONG?

Officially for 15 years, and before that I was a group PD for five years, so if you add it up, it's about 20.

HOW LONG HAVE YOU ACTUALLY BEEN IN RADIO?

It was 30 years last month.

YOUR ORGANIZATION IS PRETTY SMALL, BUT YET VERY EFFECTIVE, AND VERY EFFICIENT. WHO REALLY WORKS FOR YOU?

I don't know that any of us work, but Bob West is my right hand man, sort of my understudy and future consultant of the decade. Colleen Cassidy is the group music coordinator. She has a long lengthy history of being one of the industry greats, which includes being the national music director for the Heftel group when they were the hottest group in radio back in the '70s. She's been with me now for about 10 years. Paige Nienaber is the group promotions person, his title is Vice President of Fun and Games. He more or less brainstorms with the radio stations for ideas for promotion and marketing both for station promotions and for client-type participations, like what they call 'added value.' He's there to help try to make all the ideas that come from the advertising community fit into the scheme and work for both the advertising people and the radio station. He also spreads all of the ideas that everybody has around via fax that he sends out almost every day. Amy Tennyson is our organizational person. Kind of the director of the company and future first female President of the World (New World). Jay Stevens helps consult WIOQ and Dr. Dave Ferguson does promos and drop-ins.

IS IT TRUE THAT BOB WEST CONCENTRATES MORE ON THE HISPANIC STUFF AND YOU CONCENTRATE ON THE OTHER STATIONS?

Bob is our resident Latino market guru and more. He's currently developing a Spanish language format that's on in Tucson at KOHT, but also is involved in several of the other New World stations. Bob's the consultant at WBLX in Mobile and JAMZ in Dallas, plus all the Hispanic market stations. Bob's been with me almost since the beginning. He was a

jock in the latter parts of the first New World-consulted station (K104 in Fresno), moved from there to MD and then PD at KGGI, programmed 93Z in El Paso to a 16 share, programmed WQUE in New Orleans to a 14 and changed and helped at WPGC in Washington during much of the turnaround. Bob hasn't got as much industry credit as he deserves, probably because he's been content to be my sidekick all these years. But I'd put Bob up against any consultant or PD in the business.

YOU DID THE FRESNO STATION BACK WHEN IT WAS K104, BEFORE IT BECAME MAGIC 104?


Yes. The first wave of stations were Southwest markets, the approach that took me back to my PD roots having come up the California route as a beginner PD (KAFY - KDES etc.). The first stations were K104/Fresno, KGGI/Riverside (who is still a client), KSFM/Sacramento (who is also a current client), KITY and then KTFM in San Antonio. Then came the Urban

RECENTLY...WHAT DO YOU THINK OF THAT?

Alternative is a very popular form of music right now. Many programmers, including New World, are experimenting with it. Our version is more of a hit-based or "crossover" Alternative Top40. It's on in Seattle at KUBE and it appears to be doing great.

YOU HAVE THE REPUTATION OF BEING A 'STREET GUY.' WHY DID YOU DECIDE TO TAKE KXTZ IN LAS VEGAS ADULT INSTEAD OF MAKING IT A MORE OF A STRAIGHT AHEAD RHYTHM/CHURBAN STATION?

People get a reputation based on not necessarily what they know, but what they've done or what they've done recently, and I believe programming is programming. I've always felt that if someone gave me a station to do and a focus on what demographics they wanted, that I can make it number one in that demo. That's how I got started doing Urban



problems with it, but I don't think it's losing its dominance. I just think that there are a lot of radio companies out there that have a hard time understanding that Rap is really the Folk music of today. Those people's parents, by the way, were the same ones who couldn't understand Led Zeppelin 20 years ago.

OKAY, BUT WHAT ABOUT THE VIOLENCE AND THE DRUG TAKING THAT IS IMPLIED IN A LOT OF RAP SONGS?

Evolution has never been easy. Our stations have tried to soften the shock with our public service campaigns, 'Stop The Violence,' 'Peace On The Streets,' and so on, but the music is simply a reflection of reality like it always is.

WHO DO YOU THINK THE NEXT HOT SHOT PROGRAMMERS ARE?

The guys who work at our stations. We emphasize creativity and risk-taking as New World policy. The programmers at our stations are not 'yes' people, they are in training to be the champions of the world. My job is to develop potential. Anyone reading this article who has a burning desire to be one of the best should contact me. I'm always looking for the next potential superstar.

WHAT DO YOU THINK ABOUT THE INFLUENCE OF MIX SHOWS? DO YOU THINK THEY'RE STILL IMPORTANT TO BREAKING RECORDS ON THE RADIO? IF SO, HOW DOES THAT INFLUENCE YOU?

I think mix shows are slightly less important than they were a couple of years ago. I think the thrill of mix shows, the uniqueness of the mix show is more or less gone. I think that

group KMJQ/Houston, K104/Dallas, KMJM/St. Louis, WDRQ Detroit, etc.

AS YOU KNOW, THERE ARE MANY RUMORS FLOATING AROUND THE INDUSTRY CONCERNING YOU GETTING A STATION IN PHOENIX...ANY TRUTH TO THOSE RUMORS?

Phoenix is #1 on the target markets list. Since we've won twice there (with KZZP and KOY), it seems like a natural, and the market needs a Top40 station.

ANOTHER CURRENT RUMOR HAS YOU PICKING UP A CLIENT STATION IN LA...

That is a rumor.

WHYT IN DETROIT WENT TO THE CHANNEL X FORMAT

(WDRQ in 1973 and then KMJQ in Houston in 1979). That's how I got started doing Dance (Miami 1976), and now it's happening again with both Alternative-based Top40 (KUBE), and my version of Hot AC at KXTZ in Las Vegas.

YOUR OTHER NEW CLIENT STATION IS KOHT IN TUCSON, WHAT'S HAPPENING THERE?

That's Bob's station in the Hispanic language format.



the fad of mixing is on the wane, but there are still good shows and still are worthwhile on many of the stations. I just don't see them as being quite as powerful as they were a couple of years ago.

DO YOU SEE THE MIX SHOW OFFERING THE INDUSTRY AN OPPORTUNITY TO DISCOVER NEW PROGRAMMING TALENT?

Yes

WHERE DO YOU THINK PERSONALITY RADIO IS HEADING?

Personalities are an extremely positive weapon for stations who can find the, develop them, and afford YOU MADE YOUR REPUTATION BEING BOLD WHEN MOST CONSULTANTS ARE GENERALLY CONSERVATIVE. HOW HAVE YOU BECOME SO SUCCESSFUL DOING THAT?

I think I've become successful because I do this: I believe that someone in this industry has to be a leader. This is an industry of dogs chasing their tails, and you can't separate yourself from the rest of the crowd by doing the same things over and over and over again. Someone has to come up with a new, unique and better way of doing things, and today the only way to have ratings success is to be what rating success would suggest, and that is to be the leader in your market. You're doing

TITION AND CHANGES THE FORMAT, LEAVING ONLY ONE CONTEMPORARY STATION IN EACH MARKET. DO YOU FEEL THAT'S HEALTHY, OR DO YOU FEEL THAT'S HURTING THE FORMAT?

I don't think it has anything to do with either the Top40 format or any of the young contemporary formats at all. I think that just has something to do with business and I also think it has to do with people getting ready for this direct satellite broadcasting where they're taking out some of the competitive flavor in the market and then the direct satellite broadcast will put the competition back in. So I think it's very healthy for the financial situation of the stations that are in a position to become their own duopolies. I think that it gives them a real boost, and I also think it's a real positive for people for myself who have the ability to program several different formats to where we can get in and program using each one of our frequencies to help the other ones in the ratings battle.

AREN'T YOU NOW PROGRAM-MING TWO STATIONS IN THE SAN FRANCISCO MARKET?

Right. So that's a case there where the stations are at least designed to help each other not to compete with each other. I think that the problem with there not being several Top40 stations in every market is that the business side of radio has allowed the **CABLE TELEVISION OFFERED** AN OPPORTUNITY FOR **SMALLER COMPANIES TO NOT** COMPETE FOR VIEWERS WITH THE BIG NETWORKS BUT TO OFFER LOCAL ACCESS, WHERE THE AVERAGE CITIZEN HAS AN OPPORTUNITY TO ACTUALLY HAVE THEIR OWN TELE-VISION SHOW. DO YOU THINK THAT WE'RE COMING INTO A TIME WHEN TECHNOLOGY WILL ALLOW PROGRAM-MERS TARGETING THE YOUNGER DEMOS TO HAVE THEIR OWN RADIO STATIONS OR SHARE FREQUENCIES ON THE SATELLITE AND BE ABLE TO HAVE A CHEAPER ACCESS TO BROADCAST THAN WE'VE SEEN IN THE PAST BEFORE?

That's a possibility. I think the answer to that would be probably. Obviously these direct satellite frequencies are going to have to have something to put on those frequencies. So as it happened when FM first started, I mean FM radio opened the door for people like myself to get in and experiment and develop some things that now have become the norm. And I think now this is kind of the same thing there is going to be a whole slew of needs for new creativity on radio, and so naturally there will become a whole bunch of new, young geniuses, and that's great.

WITH THE TREMEDOUS

them. It's a weapon that your competition can't copy. The future of personalities on radio is limited because there are no 'minor league' training stations anymore, and few stations are willing to take the risk necessary to develop the unproven talent. It's a tough road for a young talent to fight his way through the maze of control freaks and dictator broadcasters to gain a reputation, however the financial benefit is there for those who make it.

WITH THE 500 TV CHANNELS REPORTEDLY ON THE WAY, AND THE 1000 RADIO CHANNELS AVAILABLE VIA THE INFORMATION SUPERHIGHWAY, WHERE DO YOU SEE THE STATE OF LOCAL RADIO IN THE YEAR 2000?

It provides a great opportunity for artists and innovators and a serious challenge to owners. I think stations will either become meaningful in their local markets or they'll be eliminated. The focus must totally be on quality product, as the mediocre low-rated station that survives on selling commercials cheap today will no longer be an advertising consideration in the future.

WHAT ABOUT DUOPOLIES?

It's a chance to take out some of the competition and improve profit. If it accomplishes both of these goals it will be great.

things that are unique and special and entertaining, and really focusing on your listeners

FOREGROUND AS OPPOSED TO BACKGROUND.

I believe that the execution of the radio station is more foreground than most people would want to believe. I believe the job of leaders is to help people develop, become great and accentuate the positives and to help them reach their potential. I don't believe that the programmer's job is to simply make them shut up and play the hits.

AND YOU OBVIOUSLY LIVE BY THAT BECAUSE PEOPLE STAY WITH YOU WHETHER IT'S AT ONE STATION, OR A DIFFERENT MARKET. PEOPLE HAVE A TENDENCY TO STAY WITHIN YOUR ORGANIZATION.

Yeah, I think it's that, plus we have a lot of fun and we're not doing what everybody else is doing. We're doing what everybody else is going to be doing soon.

BACK TO DUOPOLIES: 20 YEARS AGO THERE USED TO BE TWO OR THREE TOP40 STATIONS IN EACH MARKET. TODAY IF THERE ARE TWO TOP40s IN A MARKET, THE GUY WITH THE BIGGER MONEY BUYS HIS COMPE- "There are a lot of radio companies that have a hard time understanding that Rap music is really the Folk music of today."

demo to become 25 to 54, and yet all of the excitement and all of the radio listening is done between the ages of 15 and 34. So as you see the age demographics go up, you see the amount of time they spend listening to the radio go down radically, and because everybody wants to own the money demos 25 to 54, everybody's fighting for a very small piece of the real listening audience. I think there is something to be said for trying to develop young advertisers that are focused on the youth market 15 to 29 and as soon as there is enough advertising dollars in that demo there will be more radio stations in the SUCCESS THAT YOU HAVE ENJOYED IN RADIO AND AS A CONSULTANT, WOULD YOU CONSIDER GETTING INVOLVED ANOTHER MEDIUM, LIKE MUSIC TELEVISION, FOR EXAMPLE?

I think it would be great. I've had conversations about different television shows with people who produce them, but I've never really thought of consulting in any other medium but radio. It's what I love. But, if somebody asked me to do it, I'd certainly think about it.
