2 IN A ROOM <u>El Trago</u> (CUTTING) - Very energetic, limited edition remix. The original was good, but the remix is the shit. Props to Kevin Jones at Cutting for a fierce remix and being a great guy!

ARIA <u>My World Is Empty</u> (SPEED) - Played this jam in the mix and received quick response! A nice groovy beat with a smooth bass line is what this cut is all about. The Tribal Funkatorium is the one to play for all of you that have this vinyl...check it out!

CHRIS PHILLIPS <u>Close Your Eyes</u> (METROPOLITAN) - Another slammin freestyle release from the guys in East Newark, NJ. This cut reminds me of all of the jams that made Miami freestyle what it is today. Has great crossover potential if it receives its due in recognition.

MARIAH CAREY <u>Anytime You Need A Friend</u> (COLUMBIA) - Check da Boriqua Tribe mix...es buy caliente. It funkin' kicked ass at this party ova here!

WHAT PART OF THE COUNTRY DID YOU GROW UP IN?

Most of my high school life was spent in Michigan and then I moved to Los Angele and went to school at the University of Southern California.

WAS RADIO SOMETHING YOU ALWAYS THOUGHT ABOUT DOING?

I really never thought about being in radio until after I got out of school. I got into radio at an AM AC radio station in Merced, California. I found a job at a station. Actually I interviewed with Baltazar who is at HOT97 in New York now. We interviewed together for the same position. He got it and I was the second choice and I begged my way in doing anything. The overnight guy happened to have appendicitis one night on the air, Baltazar got moved up from weekends and I moved into a weekend position.

HOW LONG WERE YOU AT THAT STATION?

A total of about five years. I did weekends for awhile. A new program director came in and I got the overnight position. The station switched from an AC to Churban back in '87. Vince Garcia hired me to do overnights. I did that for about a year and then moved to middays. When Vince left I became the program director in '88.

WHEN DID PROGRAMMING INTEREST YOU?

Always, I've never been real excited about being on the air. I had always wanted to be behind the scenes, putting it all together. I have a passion for music. Growing up in Michigan I did listen to WLS and CKLW on my little transistor radio. I used to listen to radio a lot and was real excited about John Landecker. Once I got my foot in the door I realized a lot of things that I enjoyed about radio and I think, more than anything, the programming aspect came from just a real passion for music. I never have gotten a real woody out of being on the air.

HOW LONG WERE YOU PROGRAM DIRECTOR AT THAT STATION?

About three years and I saw that station through a change from Churban to an Alternative-leaning Top40 and then the station and its sister station, which was an FM easylistening station – were sold and the AM station became a news-talk. I actually programmed news-talk for two years and I thought that was tremendous because I also was the morning show host and producer, which was a great experience for me.

IT SEEMS LIKE EVERYBODY HAS A LITTLE BIT OF THE TALK BUG IN THEM.

Down the road that might be something I'd be interested in doing again. I don't want to go back into a situation where it's heavily satellite delivered. If I was going to get back into news-talk it would have to be something that was locally generated programming because there's only so much that you can do in terms of being a program director when nine tenths of your programming is coming from Mutual and ABC.

AND FROM THERE?

Jim Wilkinson, who is majority owner and general manager of HOT105, bought the station in April of '91 and brought me in to program. I interviewed with him and Steve Smith, who's been the consultant. Jim and Steve put together the concept of HOT105 as a rhythmic Top40 in '91 and brought me in to program the station.

HAVE YOU HAD DEALINGS WITH STEVE SMITH IN THE PAST?

I had never met Steve. It was

learned a lot about competitive programming from Steve and Eddie, then Eddie moved on to B95 and I was named program director again. I know it surprised Eddie. He didn't think that we'd be able to work together because I was, in a sense, being demoted, but three days into it he was so happy that they didn't let me go. I didn't let my ego get in the way of learning because I knew I could learn a lot from Eddie and from Steve and I didn't want to pass up that opportunity. I came into the position knowing that there was a lot for me to learn and I looked at it as an opportunity, not a demotion.

SOMETIMES YOU HAVE TO TAKE A STEP BACK TO MOVE FORWARD.

Exactly. When I came back into the program director's position, I was much farther along. We ran with a very small staff and it was very difficult to accomplish what we wanted to accomplish with the load I was carrying. I was scheduling music, promotions director, program director and doing a midday show. Eddie had me focus on the music. That gave us both an opportunity to do a much better job of getting the station to where it is now.

YOU DON'T HAVE TO DO IT

interesting because when I found out that Jim Wilkinson was buying the station I had put together a proposal for him. It was very, very similar to what Steve was proposing in terms of programming the radio station. I think that was the key in getting the opportunity. We had the same vision for this big 50,000 watt station.

YOU WERE PROGRAMMING HOT105?

I got the station on the air. Eddie Monson, who had worked with Steve Smith in Phoenix was available. Eddie came in with a lot of experience into the program director position. I stepped down into the APD/MD position and we were great together for a year. Both of our strengths really matched up well. It was kind of a left brain/right brain kind of thing and I

ALL BY YOURSELF NOW.

Right. My right hand has been Alan Chase. He has been an amazing member of the staff in terms of his commitment to HOT105 and it goes far beyond commitment. He's a tremendously talented young man and I fully expect him to be programming a radio station soon.

WHAT OTHER POSITIONS DO YOU HANDLE YOURSELF?

I handle promotions. I do middays and kind of stick my face in everywhere, even places where I don't want it to be sometimes. I work closely with the sales staff in terms of getting them to understand what it is that we do here and why it is that this radio station is a strong entity for them to be selling.

DO YOU FIND YOURSELF IN SALES MEETINGS, GOING OUT ON SALES CALLS?

Not as often as I'd like. Time doesn't really allow it when I'm shuffling a zillion different things in the office. I'd like to go on more sales calls and I'd like to be in on more sales meetings. Our sales staff happens to be made up of former programmers. As a matter of fact, Eddie Monson is a member of the sales staff here. My former APD Bob Malone, is a member of the sales staff and they're doing very well because they understand what it is that they're selling and that's a tremendous blessing.

AND A VERY UNIQUE POSITION TO BE IN TO HAVE PEOPLE THAT ACTUALLY UNDERSTAND BECAUSE THEY DID IT ON THAT SIDE.

They understand what they're doing when they're selling value-added packages or working with clients in that respect. I don't have guys plopping down 25 percent off discount coupons for a transmission job that I'm supposed to give away with morning drive all day. I don't get that here as much as I think some other people do because of the programming background of our sales staff.

SPEAKING OF THE MORNING SHOW, TELL US ABOUT JEFF DAVIS.

Jeffrey Davis, former program director of POWER102 in Fresno has come in to our morning show and done a real solid job understanding what we're trying to do in the morning. His experience has been very valuable to the radio station. I'm hoping Jeff will be here a long time, but I know Jeff wants to get back into programming. That's understandable. It started out as an interim situation. Our morning show had dashed off to Bakersfield after a few months and we were scrambling and Jeff was available after POWER had made its change to a Spanish radio station. Jeff's wife was on the airstaff at POWER102 as well is teamed with Jeff in the morning. Initially they weren't a couple on the air and one day they were bickering about something off the air. I thought, that's cool and relatable. After that little episode I thought it would be good, compelling radio.

AND MIDDAYS?

Middays is me and it ain't the most stunning show. I think there's a certain level of comfort as far as our listeners are concerned with me being on the air middays for the last three years. That's quite a long time to be in one spot and one shift.

DO YOU DO ANY MIDDAY FEATURES?

It's not so much a feature but during the noon hour we do an Oldies thing. It started out as something that was in a sense, client driven and people have loved it so much that we're looking at building at least a half hour of classics together. It's great to be able to play something like Betty Wright's Tonight's The Night. Those are things that we also plan a very slow rotating rotation. Isley Brothers Between The Sheets, Marvin Gaye's *Distant Lover* - songs like that that we've been featuring at noon and basically the response was so great we've put them into lighter rotations throughout the day.

WHAT ABOUT P.M. DRIVE?

That would be Allen Chase again, my esteemed APD/MD. He's done a great job of, in the time he moved into afternoons from nights. He does a 5 p.m. highway home feature that is incredibly well produced. I think he's added a tremendous amount to that. It is classic driven with old school, and a lot of fun and I'm always amazed by what he does considering all the other things he does here as well as being my de facto production director.

HE'S ALSO PRODUCTION DIRECTOR? WE DO WEAR A FEW HATS, DON'T WE?

We all do our share of spot production around here, but Allen also puts together our promos, sweepers, image sweepers that are voiced by Eric Edwards in Los Angeles and Alan puts them all together with a tremendous flair. When Alan's able to focus on that, he does a tremendous job.

HOW MANY HOURS A DAY DO YOU GUYS WORK?

I'm in at 5:30 a.m. It's a great time to get in and think clearly and I usually get out of here six at night. And Alan puts in about the same. He gets off the air at six and usually is here by eight.

SHOW BIZ HOURS. WHAT ABOUT NIGHTS?

Nights is Rene Roberts, also from POWER102 in Fresno where he was the APD/MD and did afternoons in Fresno. Not too long ago we lost our night guy to Bob Lewis at KWIN and I was really concerned about how we were going to fill that position because Mark Anthony - now Mark Medina, was a pretty recognized personality on the air here. I was also trying to find a morning show, so I had the opportunity to hire Rene. Rene has a great sense of humor that really comes across on the air. A little dry but a lot of fun. He has a good time on the air and has been a great addition to the staff. My staff is, from morning drive to 10 p.m. made up of either current program directors, former program directors, APD's and MD's

WELL YOU'VE GOT A REAL TALENT POOL THERE. EITHER THAT'S A PROGRAMMER'S NIGHTMARE OR A REAL PLUS.

Here it's a plus. It's great because we can sit around and talk about some things with valuable input from Jeffrey and from Rene, as well as Allen and myself. Our love jams are hosted by a woman by the name of Michelle Allison. She works a two hour airshift Monday-Thursday, but her fulltime job is with the County Continuing Education and Youth Services Program. So she's real qualified to give solid advice on the air too and that's what we've wanted out of our love jams. HOT105's Hot Love Jams is more than just dedications...I think there's a real sophisticated edge to our love songs which has given us some real strong adult numbers and in a daypart where that's not easy to do. I know we have listeners that turn the radio on at 10 o'clock. We're real proud of that show. My overnight position is kind of made up by several people: Steve Richards doing the majority of the overnight shifts. Also Ryan Cota and Izzy Real. They also make up my street posse. They do a tremendous job of not sleeping ever and keeping the van on the streets and I really have to tip my hat to these guys because they're really going after it. They're young and they're new in the business. All of them came to us with absolutely no radio experience and worked their way on to the air and really knocked themselves out driving the van. They've logged big miles on the van.

HOW HAS THE STATION TARGET CHANGED IN THE LAST SIX MONTHS?

Aside from staff changes in the morning and at night, very little. We've really turned up our visibility in the market and we've tightened our promotional focus. We've done a great job of trimming away the promotional clutter on the air. Musically, we've vacillated a bit on the issue of Rap. About four months ago, we pulled all Rap off the air. We had been taking a lot of heat in the sales department and because we have the market to ourselves formatically, we felt we could lose the rap and still maintain our strength. About a month later we reviewed our position and decided that we'd play Rap again, but be a little more selective and try and avoid any "gangsta" rap.

DO YOU HAVE ANY OTHER SPECIAL FEATURES OR THINGS THAT YOU DO – MIX SHOWS, ETC.?

We don't have a mix show. We've been having problems finding people locally that can produce this show on a regular basis and it hasn't been all their fault. One guy had all his equipment and music stolen at a break-in and he was the guy that we were really counting on and as he puts his stuff back together I think we'll have him on. Other than that, in terms of features, our love songs is really about it. The station is pretty true to itself 24 hours a day with a little bit of added punch at night.

WHAT ABOUT YOUR PROMOTIONAL ACTIVITY?

Having a van out is something that we try to do constantly in conjunction with other larger promotions that we have going on. We're into the Hot 105 Days of Summer and the van is staving out on the road. Everything we do we loop it back into a theme of this summer which is the Hot 105 Hot Days of Summer. We've done some direct mail things during this summer period. We've also done some of our first outdoor marketing and cable television marketing as well. We're expecting it to pay off for us and we wouldn't do it if we didn't think it was going to work well for us. Where we are, we don't have a lot of shows coming to our porch - concerts and things like that, but with San Francisco being two hours away and Los Angeles four and a half - we like to get people to those shows. We make sure that our listeners are getting to see them and it's a real treat to hop on a plane and see a show in Phoenix or Los Angeles and head down for the weekend and do a lot of weekend getaways and stuff like that

WHO DO YOU SEE AS SOME OF THE MAJOR PROGRAMMERS THAT YOU LIKE TO KEEP TABS ON?

The guys around me in San Francisco, I like to keep an eye on what they're doing particularly WILD107. WILD107's programming is very Hispanic-based which is what we do. Of course, Steve Smith at HOT97, whose music is quite different from ours. He's got a unique station, but he's also very in touch with everything that's going on at Emmis and POWER106 in Los Angeles, so I try and tap into that as much as possible as well as Bob Perry and Trevor in San Jose, Shakes and Marino at KMEL and talk to Michael Newman at KDON. He's a friend and a peer that I have a lot of respect for.

HOW ABOUT YOUR PERSONAL LIFE?

I'm getting married on the 9th of July and it's been a real settling influence meeting Robin. Over the past two years I think it's helped me. She's tremendously supportive of what I do. She understands my time, my dedication to what I do. I know of situations where the dedication it takes to do this well has gotten in the way of personal relationships and they've suffered because of it. In my situation, I'm blessed because she's a sweetheart. She's really been an angel and really my biggest supporter and I love her to death.

IT'S NICE TO HAVE SOMEBODY THAT UNDER-STANDS BECAUSE PEOPLE ON THE OUTSIDE JUST DON'T SEEM TO UNDERSTAND THE BUSINESS TOO OFTEN.

Absolutely! People always ask me, "How does she handle it?" A lot of people do know that I'm here at 5:30 a.m. and I get home at 6 p.m. or 7 or even 9 p.m. Sometimes on top of that we're out at clubs doing promotions and she understands that and she gives me my space for doing this.

WHAT DO YOU DO FOR FUN?

Sleep. Sleep is a priority.

SLEEP IS GOOD.

Sleep is a good thing that I don't tend to get enough of. I've become an astute sega-hockey player. It gives me a chance to get out frustrations, too. Being a family person. With my work hours being so long, the hours I get to spend with my family are not as long as I want, so we try and do as much as we can together, whether it's just going out and getting something to eat as a group because we have two great kids. It's tough that I'm not around that much so when I am home I want to try and focus on my family. It sounds kind of boring to me, especially when I think about what I was doing at 22 as opposed to now going on 32. It's a big change in my life and I couldn't be happier.

DO YOU WANT TO BE A CONSULTANT, GROUP PD, OWNER? WHERE DO YOU SEE YOURSELF?

Consulting would be very good. I certainly would like to, when the time comes and the situation is right. I will continue to program and seek new challenges. I love the idea of going into a situation where it is a format change similar to what happened when I came in here. If opportunities pop up, I'll look into them. Sometimes it's difficult to think beyond when you're in the day-to-day kind of in the trench. It's a little tough to get your bearings set on something beyond that. I love Los Angeles and Southern California, I still think of that as home.


Other News:


