KTCL IS LIKE THE BEST KEPT HERITAGE STATION SECRET IN AMERICA. HOW LONG HAS KTCL BEEN A MODERN ROCK FORMAT?

Actually it's been a Modern Rock format per say since about 1985 when we started focusing in on the artists that were in the format at that time, like Talking Heads, Bowie and R.E.M. This station had actually been here since 1974 and signed on as a progressive station, sort of an outgrowth of what was going on in the late '60s and it worked through the '70s. Around '82 or '83 that sort of sound started getting too homogenized. The Eagles and Fleetwood Mac and The Stones and all of those guys just became superstars, and it didn't seem appropriate for us to be banging them as a progressive station. Folks as outrageous as Tom Petty and Talking Heads came along, and we slowly shifted over into that vein because it was a time that enough golds were available to turn it into a viable format. You can't deny that over the last year or two the core artists we focused on were those who can be termed cutting-edge or Alternative -Artists that sell up the butthole, like Nine Inch Nails, U2, Nirvana and Pearl Jam and all those other folks who we have fine plaques on the wall from. That's what has really made the difference. It's also the idea of the music coming of age too, as far as retail sales, popularity, trends around the nation and around the world. So it's sort of been a combination of a lot

Absolutely, and within the format I think that there is a lot of diversity from a lot of blends of music, and that's what progressive radio has always been about - a diversity of music. Everything from MC 900 Ft. Jesus to Counting Crows to, of course, Nine Inch Nails, but there is a lot of diversity within the format, too. There is a lot of diversity and it's neat to see that that kind of diversity is now welcomed by a broader audience, both in the listening audience and as evidenced by retail sales, too.

HOW LONG HAVE YOU BEEN WITH KTCL? GIVE US A LITTLE BIT OF YOUR BACKGROUND AS WELL.

I've been at KTCL for 15 years, and we have definitely grown and evolved together. I think anybody who has been in radio or even in the retail side knows 15 years ago the business was totally different. We all certainly had more of an emphasis on partying and

having a good time. The music at that time sort of mirrored society from the '60s on up to today. So 15 years ago it's party time, and we're all having a great time, and this was all sort of a hobby. Over the last 15 years it has become more scientific...I mean, I don't think that the fun has ever left for me, I wouldn't have been here for 15 years...It's a situation of realizing how society has changed, how the music mirrors that, and the radio station has to change along with the times. Hopefully, we're keeping up or ahead of the times, taking a glimpse into the future and predicting what's going to be hot over the next year, whether it's a particular form of music, style of clothing, or whatever. It's just been a situation of keeping on top of that and that's what is so much fun about it, staying dynamic with the music and with the industry and with the technology too, because technology has changed considerably.


On a personal note, I guess I've sort of changed that way too, and never really stayed in a rut, or never expected the listener or the radio station to be a certain way, and that's the way I am too. I don't expect that what happened before equals what's going to happen in the future, and I think that's one of the reasons I've been here so long and I still enjoy it. That's the trick: if you don't enjoy it, screw it. I mean everybody's gonna know, including your listeners. Everybody's going to know that somebody there at the station isn't

necessarily understand the audience until I was shown how to relate to any audience that you're trying to get, whether it's Country or Top40 or Alternative, but he showed me how to relate and understand that audience and program to them and not for myself. I was lucky enough to come over to KTCL in '79 as a part-timer when we were a progressive station and I could play anything I wanted, anything!

WHAT WERE SOME OF THE GROUPS YOU WERE PLAYING?

We were playing everything from Klaatu and certainly lots of Genesis, Jerry Jeff Walker was on the radio station, played a lot of Yes and Santana and that early Bonnie Raitt and Little Feat and John Prine. At that time we were one of those stations that was a forerunner of the Triple A format. Pretty much an 'anything goes' format. In the late '70s and early '80s we started veering off into groups like The Clash, but we also kept playing a wide variety of groups like The Bongos, Guadalcanal Diary, Hoodoo Gurus, all those sorts of bands too, so even after we went from that sort of progressive Triple A thing into sort of a forerunner of Modern Rock, we always played a wide variety of

are yet where we are going to be within six months, but I'm real happy with where we are.

TELL US ABOUT DENVER. IT SEEMS TO BE ONE OF THE MARKETS THAT THE PEOPLE ARE REALLY IN TOUCH WITH THE MUSIC THERE.

Right. Denver is incredibly hip as far as listeners music tastes go, and it's incredibly competitive radio-wise. Right now there are many stations vying for the 25+ crowd, you've got 'Alice' that just came in which calls themselves a warped A/C, and that's what they are. They'll play a wide variety of upper-end A/C music from Gin Blossoms to Ace Of Base every single hour. There's certainly KBCO who is the stalwart of the 25+ eclectic crowd. From what I can gather, KBPI is now going after a 20 to 30 year-old crowd, because they're playing a lot of Pumpkins and Blind Melon and that sort of thing. There's a new station called 'The Peak' that's going after a 25+ crowd, and I would call them a an '80s-based Classic Modern Rock station. When I'm thinking about the listener and we're talking about exactly who we're going after, I don't always sav I'm after the 18 to 24s or the 18 to 34s, although those are two cells who are extremely important to us. I call it a particular audience. In other words, it's a particular audience who likes to stay on the cutting edge, who wants to hear some of the familiar music that they grew up with, which may even go back to 1980. It's a lifestyles thing, it's a sociological thing, and it just so happens my degree from college is in sociology and heavily influences the way I look at programming. Yes, I want the 18-24s, and I would love to be #1 there, and for sure we want the 25+ crowd, we love 25-34s. As a matter of fact, we've got great numbers there, but I never hinder myself by saying, 'It's gotta be these 18-34 people.' I look at it more as a lifestyle thing. It's a group of people that fall into this category as far as the sorts of movies they might go see, the sorts of

having fun, so hopefully as a program director you should be a role model in that way for your jocks, in terms of he or she should be the person that's staying on top of things, both professionally and personally and being a good example and a morale booster for everyone.

TELL US ABOUT YOUR FIRST RADIO GIG.

I had started in radio back in Utah at a tiny station, we were like a Top40 station, and I was the guy that had a great big album collection. I took it to this radio station in Utah and they hired me to do a Progressive show. The station sort of evolved into a Top40 album rock station, and the individual who owned that station, KJKJ is what they were called, gave me a lot of pointers on formatics and understanding the audience because God knows I didn't. I didn't

TIGHTENED UP YOUR LIST CONSIDERABLY?

I feel like we're broad-based, as far as the sorts of records that we look for when we're looking for balance on the air. Everything from the heavier guitar stuff which I would hesitate to call grunge, to the lighter pop stuff. I feel we still have a real broad base, but we tempered that with higher rotations and our rotational patterns are evolving all the time. I feel we can play a wider variety of music or a broader base, but we have to pick the right songs, rotate them higher, give them the impressions they need, give the songs the impressions that are needed for the listener to become familiar and comfortable with them. You know you can play a broader base, but what I'm finding out is you have to rotate them higher, and we continually evolve as far as our rotation patterns, and I don't think we

I'm not necessarily tied to numbers unless somebody pushes me on it, unless I have to go to the sales people and say here are the numbers, the age group that you have to talk about, these are the demographics that you need throw around. I literally look at it as lifestyles and try not to put numbers on it.

WHAT ABOUT THE RUMORS OF NEW COMPETITION COMING INTO THE MARKET.

You know the beauty is the old cliche the listeners are going to win, but it enables us to get better, it gives us an opportunity to prove to ourselves and to everyone that we have been here for a reason. We've been building, we've been growing, and with the increased competition in town it gives us the opportunity to come out on top over some very talented programmers and some very talented radio people in this market. We look at it as our chance to shine because we know that we are going to prevail with some of the ideas and with certainly the enthusiasm that we have for the format, for the music, for the future that it gives us an opportunity to say, 'Hey, it's probably the most highly competitive market in the country and we won.' We're delivering to our clients and we're sold out all the time now, and that's what we want. We also want to make art, and so we're able to make art and be sold out at the same time, so that only makes us better. I know this station is real excited about the competition.

One of the major keys to KTCL's success is that we get out on the streets and rub shoulders with the sort of listener that appreciates this format. We don't put up any sort of image, we're not marketing ourselves as something we're not. We're the real thing, and we push that all the time. We push it on purpose, we don't get out there and do cliches on the air, we don't try to convince the listener that we're anything other than what we are, we just beat our own drum as what we are and we know that we will prevail because we are the real thing. We're the real people, we know this music inside and out and we all live it and are excited by it.

TAKE US THROUGH THE PROCESS OF HOW A RECORD GETS FROM THE MUSIC MEETING ALL THE WAY THROUGH ITS ROTATION. WHAT TOOLS YOU USE TO DECIDE WHAT HAPPENS?

It all comes down to gut for us. Mary or I listen to everything that comes through, and if we don't we'll pass it off to everybody else. We'll obviously look for the hook. We are also looking for a particular balance for the radio station. In other words, if we've got a lot of bright jangly guitar stuff in there, whether it's the most killer record in the world, we're not going to deal with it right now unless of course it's a core artist. But we're looking for balance on the radio station, the various styles that we

want to present, and then if it fits in with that particular realm we'll go ahead and start spinning it, hear how it sounds in the mix, see if we get any sort of response to it all. I'm talking about record that is not like a given. This would be sort of a work record that we're not sure about. We'll give it some spins to see what sort of response we get to it, and then obviously check national airplay and see if anybody else has caught on to this, although that is not as crucial. The next step is what are the touring plans? Promotional support? Is the record company going to get behind this band or this song? Is it going to be a career act for the record company? Is MTV going to be getting on this record? Is it in Buzz Bin?

All those things would come into play, but I think everything is secondary to gut programming. How does it sound on the air and where does it fit into the particular mix here. If the record's responding, if we're getting listener response to it, and if a lot of those other variables that I've just mentioned fall into place, we'll increase the airplay. Another factor are the records that your competitors might play. If it's something that we think is going to be big for the format, and if another station in the market is too conservative to get on it first, we'll bang it really hard. We'll own the record, so that hopefully when that other station was to play it, the dial punchers think of KTCL. That's basically the process that goes on.

WHY DON'T YOU TOUCH ON YOUR STAFF A LITTLE (NOT LITERALLY) THIS A FAMILY

a music director. She does middays and is real popular. She also has the added benefit of knowing the retro or the older music very, very well because she's lived the format, too. She's been here for about five years.

Our morning guy Brett Saunders came out of talk radio. He knows our music inside and out, and has the most extraordinary dry wit that is perfect for this format. He doesn't take himself too seriously, he's pretty self-effacing, yet the listeners love it. He's very much the anti-jock; he tends to act dumb about the music, and it's incredibly endearing and very postmodern. With his talk radio background he has the radio skills to pull off a morning show.

Chris Adams has been here eight years doing late afternoons, and is going to go to middays. He's a well known voice, another very witty guy, a real in-your-face quietly sort of individual, so he's going to be great in middays.

Our night guy/Production Director Dave Granger used to be the Production Director at WFNX. He does incredible things on the air, is highly listener participation-oriented, very promotionally-oriented. He's great for the younger crowd because of course, we've got a different demographic at night, a more active, younger life-styled listener and he really plays on that. Our overnight guy Reverend Pete sounds like a Reverend but certainly with this sort of music, it's sort of irreverent. It's a real well-rounded staff, really good people on the weekends too. Everybody has such a great attitude and very very competitive attitude

Mary: We have a lot of club nights and just about all the jocks have at least one, I've got two myself and that helps a lot because in all the situations people come right up to the booth, they know why you're there, they know who you are and you talk a lot about music with the listeners plus all the promotions we do I mean we do at least one or two things every week where somebody's out somewhere, go down and see them. We're always out there, always. In our case it takes a lot of effort because a lot of times we're 65 miles away to where we need to be and to go to Denver it's 120 miles round trip so our jocks are really into it and they're all here because they love the music and they love what they do and it shows and you have to have people on your staff like that because in our situation it's gruelling. It's quite a hard schedule to keep and sure it's ugly in every situation but we're pretty far removed from the major cities that we go into and so it takes that much more effort to get down there and spend some time talking to people and that's what we do, we do a lot of talking.

WHERE DO YOU SEE YOURSELF GOING IN THIS INDUSTRY?

Mary: As long as I stay working with the music for me it doesn't really matter and maybe I should have more direction than that but my love is promotion and my love is music and as long as I can do either one of those than I'm happy. I can do anything so it won't matter.

FINAL THOUGHTS.

John: I think KTCL and any radio station has to be certain to tap into the lifestyles of the market and the listeners and be very very aware of what works in your market and what the mood of the potential listener is, because certainly it's easy to put your finger on the sort of listener that you have but I don't see why in any market in an alternative or modern rock can't understand the mood of the community in general and whether everybody in the community listens to you or not which is a pretty big order they all know about you and can appreciate you and I think that's really important for any programmer or radio station to be aware of is their environment and to have a goal of everyone knowing who you are.

MARY, ANY FINAL THOUGHTS FROM YOU?

I've been here five years, and I've seen this station go from one point to another and we've lived through all the changes that have happened and they've all been very positive. I really think that (I'm not just kissing ass here) but I really do think that John Hayes is responsible for the station's success. He's taken the station to a point where we never even expected. It's been a very an exciting trip, and I hope that we're all still here doing it 10 years from now.

"I never hinder myself by saying, 'It's gotta be these 18-34 people...' I look at it more as a lifestyle thing."

SHOW. I UNDERSTAND DOM CASUAL IS A RECENT HIRE.

Absolutely, we're real excited about having Dom come in. I've known Dom in Salt Lake for quite some time, and had a lot of respect for his air work and his music director abilities. I knew we should use someone in afternoon drive that would be an upbeat, real listener participation, promotions-oriented sort of individual, and as I asked around the industry, his name came up again and again. He's extremely excited to come here for afternoons, so that's going to be such a great addition to the staff. He's also going to be working on on-air promotions. He's an excellent addition to the staff.

Mary Moses is an incredible Music Director because she loves the music and she lives the music. She tends to be months ahead of people on it, if not, in some cases, a year ahead. There are some records that she'll really dig, they'll sit around then they'll come back. She's way ahead of the crowd on music. She's real open to new music and she's also evolving as a jock and as

here right now.

MARY MOSES - GIVE US A RUN DOWN OF YOUR DAY TO DAY EVENTS. WHAT DO YOU DO AT THE STATION?

I come in and I whip each person about 10 times and then usually there is some chatting that goes on between John and I about what's going to go on....If it's Thursday or Friday I take the music calls one right after the other everybody knows what that's like and do my show from noon to 4, do production and then usually John and I will sit down and talk about music. Most of the time it's just like kind of a conversation between you and anybody else, it's like well what do you think you know. We just kind of talk about it that way, we talk over promotion deciding what we want to do what we need and do the work from there.






