



GIVE US A CAPSULE DESCRIPTION OF WHAT BROUGHT YOU TO YOUR CURRENT LOFTY POSITION.

My first radio job was in 1981 at WYRQ, a Country station in Little Falls, Minnesota, a town of 6,000 people. I was 16 years old, and part of a Boy Scout Career Explorer program. Basically, it was an automated station and we babysat the automation and did live news and weather every quarter hour.

Eventually after a year they moved me up to mornings on the weekends, which was live-assist, so I actually got to be a DJ and do production.

WERE YOU PETRIFIED JUST LIKE EVERYBODY ELSE YOUR FIRST TIME ON THE AIR?

Oh, my God. It was a nightmare. I still remember my very first time on the air. I thought I was going to throw up. That first farm report at 5:45 on a Saturday morning.

THERE'S NOTHING LIKE SMALL MARKET RADIO TO REALLY TEACH YOU THE BUSINESS.

You have to do everything, from farm reports to obituaries to high school basketball play-by-play to lost dog reports. Everything. You're the lifeblood for everybody, so that was a great learning experience. I worked there through high school. When I went to college the big radio station in the area was KCLD in St. Cloud, and my goal was to get a job there. I went to St. Cloud State University, and the summer before I started college I started pestering Jack Hicks, the PD there. Jack had worked in Minneapolis at KDWB and KQRS as APD, and I bugged him until he finally offered me a parttime job. I still have my first tape from being on the air there, and I don't know how he hired me because I really stunk.

WOULD YOU PLAY SOME OF THAT FOR US RIGHT NOW?

I don't have it with me at the moment...Occasionally when I get cocky, I'll pull it out to humble myself a little bit and remember where I came from, but it's really awful. I still keep in touch with Jack. He programs

an AOR station in Rochester, Minnesota now. I talked to him two years ago at the Conclave and said, "I went back and listened to one of my tapes and I don't know what you heard in me." He said it's one of those things where if you see a kid out there who's willing to do anything to make it, it just might be a good hire.

I THINK IT SHOULD BE REQUIRED THAT AT LEAST ONCE A YEAR YOU GO BACK AND LISTEN TO OLD AIR CHECKS OF YOURSELF.

I agree. I think that's great. I think that's real humbling. I worked parttime for KCLD through college. I did research for them and anything else they asked. I also worked at a record store and worked at the college radio station as the music director and learned as much as I possibly could, and eventually they asked me if I wanted to go full time. I was halfway through my junior year and I felt this is what I really want to be doing. I ended up quitting school and doing overnights and eventually worked my way up to nights and music director. I'd been at that station for about four and a half years when a new start-up

There are a lot of guys I found as I interviewed people for jobs that aren't willing to go to the really, really small markets where you can be bad and learn. You get people right out of college or broadcasting school who think they should be working in Philadelphia or New York or Chicago. They're just not willing to go and pay their dues. I always say, 'You need to go and make no money for a year, and work at the small market level and get good.

I DON'T THINK IT'S THE PEOPLE SO MUCH, ANYMORE, IT'S JUST GOTTEN SO MUCH MORE CORPORATE NOW.

It really has, but I tell you what Kevin. There are a ton of really, really small markets out there who are dying for young kids just out of school who



FM went on in St. Cloud, owned by Pat McKay who worked with Scott Shannon at WRBQ in Tampa in its heyday. Pat was the midday guy and music director there and eventually left to be PD at KBEO in Kansas City and worked at WZOU in Boston. A guy with a good pedigree, a guy from Minnesota who had already done everything he wanted to to at the major market level. He and a buddy bought a start-up and they hired me away to be the PD of the station while Pat was the Operations Manager and the morning guy. I did afternoons and nights and was the PD there for a year

are willing to do it, but if you go to college or broadcasting school you usually have student loans to pay and you've got to go get a job for \$8,000 a year. Nobody wants to do that and that's it too. When I got into radio it was because I wanted to be in it. The first guy who trained me in Little Falls, Minnesota - he was 32 years old and he also wrote sports for the local newspaper. He said, 'Kid, why the hell do you want to get into this business?' And I said, 'Because I really love radio and I really, really love music.' He said, 'Okay, that's the answer I was looking for. If you were to say the money or the glamour I'd tell you to get out of here.' You have to really have a passion for it. I talked with Scott Shannon and Scott was the



same way. He really, really loved it and still does...I don't know Steve Kingston, but I've heard stories where he says the first station he worked at was a gas station. I think that's really cool, and hopefully people still have that passion and desire to make it.


HOW DID YOU HOOK UP WITH DON LONDON?

After St. Cloud I went to La Crosse, Wisconsin as a PD, and got to know Brian Philips, who was my consultant while he was at KDWB. I also did some weekend stuff at WLOL while I was in St. Cloud, so I became one of those nuts that worked seven days a week. After La Crosse, which wasn't a great opportunity, I was out of work after eight months. Brian Philips was kind enough to let me do weekends at KDWB. Don London had formerly programmed in La Crosse and had heard about me. He had been at WZPL about a year when I met him at a Conclave. He said he was going to have an overnight opening soon. I knew if I could get my foot in the door at a good situation I could work my way up. Don gave me that opportunity. Within three months I got moved up to late nights and then music director. We had a great run at 'ZPL. At one time it was the highestrated major market station in America. We were number one in our target demo of 18-34 women for ten straight books. We had a good time. I thought I had learned a lot from being a PD in a small market and I learned a lot being consulted by Brian Philips, but actually being in a winning situation at WZPL was wonderful. It was competitive as hell in that market and Don was a great teacher. Don is probably one of the most level-headed management guys I've ever had the

opportunity to work with.

I WAS GOING TO ASK YOU LATER ON ABOUT YOUR MENTORS. OBVIOUSLY DON IS ON THAT LIST

Way up there. Don did a lot for me and taught me a lot. When I was in La Crosse and St. Cloud I thought I was pretty hot stuff. I thought I knew everything. When you're young you're kind of a hot shot, and when I got fired in La Crosse, only my second PD job after eight months, I was kind of shocked and humbled and I felt like I needed to step back. I could have probably found another small market PD job, but I really didn't want to deal with giving away dog biscuits and hammers on the air. I felt like I needed to get into a situation with a guy I could learn from and could help me become a better PD next time around. Don London knows that to be a successful PD or OM, a manager, you have to surround yourself with the best people and give them the autonomy to follow through and do their job. Don hired the people and stood back and let them do their job. He would oversee it and make sure they did their jobs correctly. Don was a great teacher. I learned so much about how to handle people and be fair while I was at 'ZPL . I'll carry that experience with me for my entire life and career. Don was a terrific guy to work with, and maybe some day we'll be a team again in some capacity.

AFTER YOU LEFT 'ZPL YOU WERE ON THE BEACH FOR WHILE BEFORE LANDING AT WLAN IN LANCASTER.

That was weird, because for the first time in my life I wasn't scared of being out of work because I felt pretty confident in my abilities that I'd be able to land something.

ISN'T SCOTT SHANNON ABOUT DUE TO POP INTO THIS STORY?

Scott's home town is Indianapolis and he would come back quite often to visit his mom. As you know, Scott loves radio, so whenever he was in town he always stopped by the radio station. Scott and I hit it off the very first time we talked and shook hands. Maybe he saw something in me that was much like himself years ago. After Don went to Norfolk, Scott felt it was time for me to step out of the shadows and back into the PD arena again.

YOU COULD'VE EASILY GONE WITH DON TO NORFOLK.

I really wanted to work with Don again, and Norfolk would have been a great opportunity, but my instincts were telling me it was time to be a PD again. Scott also kept telling me it was time for me to step out and run my own radio station. He said, 'I know you've been a PD before, but you haven't been one for three years and you certainly could use some warmin' up.'

The Lancaster opportunity came up last summer. I spoke to the owner and the new GM and and it looked like a pretty decent deal. Definitely a turnaround situation. In its glory days WLAN had been #1 in the market and had fallen on hard times. I took the job with Scott Shannon and Mike Preston consulting me. The idea was to go to Lancaster, help rebuild the radio station, get it back on track and hopefully move on to the next big thing, which turned out to be Philadelphia. The folks here were ready to make a change from their Hot A/C direction and realized that Y100 needed to be a full-blown, current-based hit music station. At the time Philly already had three adult contemporaries here: STAR, B101, and MAGIC. We really didn't want to go the Urban-leaning route, because slice of the format pie, so to speak. This is a Mainstream hit music station for the '90s that doesn't lean Urban and doesn't lean A/C. It's very Rock/Pop/Alternative-based. We're just as reliant on bands like Aerosmith and Def Leppard as we are on R.E.M., U2, Stone Temple Pilots and Pearl Jam.

BEING THAT KIND OF GUITAR-BASED STATION, DO YOU SHARE A LOT OF AUDIENCE WITH WMMR?

Sure. Actually according the analysis I did of our last book, we share the most audience with WMMR, which doesn't surprise us. We're an 18-34 radio station. That's another thing that separates us from your textbook Top40 station. Y100 is not reliant on teens. We are focused on 18-34 persons, with females as our primary target, but because of the Rock-intensive nature of the station, men also enjoy it. I think it's a misnomer that people think women don't like Rock. They just like Rock that's familiar and tuneful and that really works for us. The two stations in Philadelphia that we are most competitive with when it comes to sharing new music are WMMR, and of course we have the simulcast of WDRE here, which Alternative. I don't really consider U2 and R.E.M. and bands of that ilk real Alternative. I've always been a fan of the basic Rock and Rock premise of guys playing guitars, bass, drums and singing, so you can label that Alternative or Rock & Roll. The reason I like Alternative music is because some of the best Rock in the last 10 years came from that side of the musical arena. The way I look at it is. 'Is this a hit record for my radio station?' That's really it. I've always tried to be very conservative where I work, and it drives folks at the record labels nuts because they know I love stuff. Yes, I guess I do love it personally. It could be in heavy rotation in my living room, but it's not going to be in heavy rotation on my radio station until I know it's a hit. Brian Philips told me something a long time ago, 'It's not really our job to break the hits, we're supposed to play the hits.' If that's Aerosmith, R.E.M., Stone Temple Pilots, Green Day or All-4-One, we're going to play the right popular hit music for our station.

LET'S BRIEFLY GO OVER THE FINE STAFF YOU'VE ASSEMBLED AT Y100.

One of the things I was really fortunate about coming here was inheriting a really good staff. Scott Shannon had been working with Dan Lerner, the owner of this radio station. He also worked with our station manager, Lynn Bruder to assemble a really great staff of people here, and we were fortunate enough to pick up some free agents from EAGLE106 when they changed format. One of the first hires for the station was Chuck Tisa, who was the music director at EAGLE and a guy that I admired from afar when I was in Indianapolis. I figured any guy who is working as a music director for Brian Philips must be damn good because I knew what Brian demanded, Mr. Ed. who I think is one of the best in the business also worked for a long time with Brian at KDWB, so it was really great to be able to come here and suddenly figure out, wow, my music director and APD is Chuck Tisa, a guy that I respected for a long time. Turns out he's a really great guy too, and we've become a great team and I'm thrilled to be able to work with him on a daily basis. One of the things Chuck really gets and I think all great music directors get this is the biggest part of your job is what's coming out of the speakers. When I was a young MD I used to think the most important thing was to disc-over songs and turn

you have Q102, WUSL, and WDAS. The market was missing a Mainstream hit music station, but one that didn't lean Urban or A/C. I truly believe that if EAGLE106 was still here today they'd be doing what we're doing right now.

CAN YOU DESCRIBE YOUR VISION OF WHAT Y100 IS RIGHT NOW?

A lot of people are saying we're a Top40 station, but I don't know if Top40 really exists at the major market level any more. Top40 to me is a station that plays a variety of different kinds of music that are currently popular and selling. That's the original definition of the format, and I don't know if that exists anymore, especially in a market this big where you have this many people and this many signals competing for a

does very well 18-34, as does WMMR. We're not an Urban centercity type of radio station. We're more of a suburban station.

I KNOW YOUR PERSONAL MUSIC TASTES DO LEAN TOWARD THE ALTERNATIVE WORLD. HOW DO YOU TEMPER THOSE TASTES AND STILL OBJECTIVELY PROGRAM THE RADIO STATION?

This is weird because I think since Indianapolis people think I'm an Alternative guy. Reality is I'm really a Rock & Roll guy. One of my all-time favorite bands is KISS, and I love Van Halen, but I also there was a time in my life where I realized that Rock & Roll was making a shift and I wasn't into the hair band scene at that time. I realized that a lot of the great Rock & Roll was suddenly being labeled



people on to new music. Yes, that is important, you need to have good ears, but the most important job of any music director and all the great ones will tell you this, is the day-to-day sequencing of the music on the radio station, and Chuck spends an amazing amount of time in front of that computer tweaking it beautifully. The guy is a flowmaster. He's had a chance to learn from some great guys. He worked with Brian, who was very meticulous about going over the music logs. Since he came over here he's had the chance to work with both Scott Shannon and Mike Preston. Mike helps consult the station with Scott, and they are two of the smartest radio guys in the country.

MIKE IS A TRUE FLOWMASTER AS WELL. I THINK YOU'LL AGREE THAT IT TAKES AN INCREDIBLY ANAL PERSONALITY TO BE A GOOD MUSIC DIRECTOR BECAUSE YOU HAVE TO SIT THERE AND MENTALLY SING THOSE SONGS IN YOUR HEAD WHILE YOU'RE SEQUENCING THEM.

Certainly. Scott said this to me and I laughed, but to be a great music director when it comes to sequencing music, you've got to be kind of a granny. Willing to be slow and spend the time and look at every song, every hour, every minute of the day and make that thing come out like a work of art. We also picked up Sean Caldwell, who is our production director and afternoon guy from EAGLE106 as well. The guy is phenomenal. His production skills are probably some of the best in the country. He's a great voice guy too. He has his own sweeper and promo business on the side (see ad on page 46) and one of his first clients was Mr. Ed at Z104 in Madison. He's also doing stuff for KISS in Dallas, KS104 in Denver, and several other fine radio stations near you. It's a thrill to have him here because he's young, smart and very gifted, three qualities I demand of my staff...Our midday guy, Bret Hamilton was the late night guy at EAGLE, and also worked at O102 during the Mark Driscoll regime. He's also an incredibly young and talented guy. He's a great midday jock and has the numbers to prove it, but on top of that he shines at station appearances. He's a good-looking guy and he goes nuts in the clubs about five nights a week. He's also an actor. He's had bit parts in a couple of moves. In fact, if you rent 'Philadelphia,' you'll see him in the courtroom scene, and he's done TV commercials.

Mornings I have Paul Barsky, 'The

Barsky Show.' Barsk is a guy who is probably one of the most naturally funny morning guys I've ever met. Barsk worked at WCAU 'Hot Hits,' here back in the early '80s. Did pretty well. Left there to go work for WLS-FM in Chicago, which later became Z95, and was there until '88 or '89. Ended up going to KRBE in Houston for awhile and wanted to get back here. He considers Philly his hometown, and Scott and Dan Lerner were responsible for bringing him back. Barsk is really starting to take off. He really fits the mindset of your 18-34 year old audience, and he's not your typical shticky, Top40 morning DJ. There's no bells and whistles, rimshots, or any of that kind of stuff. It's just straightahead personality radio. He doesn't have a real big voice. He just sounds like a regular guy on the radio. Our morning news anchor and one of his sidekicks, Sherri Lee Stevens, worked at WSTW in Wilmington and she's fantastic, Great voice, Real news hound too. Some day I could see her doing network news. She's that good, and a terrific foil for Barsk because she represents the feminist viewpoint on the air, and we need that to balance out the amount of testosterone in the studio. His producer and other sidekick is Tony Angelo. Tony worked at Y95 in Phoenix, KRBE in Houston and one of

has made him the stunt coordinator for their live broadcasts. During Cinco de Mayo we rented one of those inflatable sumo wrestling outfits and we made Shemp the human pinata. Listeners would come down and beat Shemp with a whiffle ball bat for prizes. It was great.

Our current overnight guy is Mark Sommers, who was my morning guy in Lancaster, a kid with a ton of potential who could possibly be moving up in the ranks of the radio station very soon. A 23-year-old guy with a great attitude, a great delivery on the air, very funny. Right now he's filling in for our open night jock position, and Mark is a very strong contender for that job.

YOU ALSO TAPPED THE OLD 'ZPL STAFF FOR YOUR PROMOTIONS DIRECTOR.

We needed to make a change in promotions after Eric Johnson decided to join All-Sports WIP in town. Eric did a great job, but he wanted to try a different type of radio, so he went over there with our blessing. This gave us a chance to bring in another upcoming superstar in the business. Lynne Jeanrenaud was our Research Director and Assistant Promotion Director under Kay Feeney at 'ZPL. Kay is probably one of the three best promotion

kicking my ass for hiring her away. Lynne has already made a big difference here at the radio station. We are probably the most visible radio station street-wise in the city right now. We are everywhere because Lynne has created a well-oiled promotional machine. We just hired a new assistant promotion director, Dave Burgess. I think those two are going to be the dynamic duo of promotions here in Philadelphia.

ANYBODY ELSE WE NEED TO MENTION?

I wanted to mention Lucy St. James, our assistant production director who also does a two-hour late night shift from 11 pm to 1 am. She also worked at EAGLE106 and was brought over here with the help of Sean Caldwell. She's a major part of the radio station. Excellent on the air, lived in Philly most of her life, knows the area, and is a fantastic production person who ties up a lot of loose ends and allows us not to miss anything when it comes to the production end of the building.

I also want to mention our Station Manager, Lynn Bruder. She's young, she's top-notch and she gets it. She has a sales background, but she also respects and understands the programming department of the radio station, and that makes my job a lot easier. Of course our station owner and head of our company, Dan Lerner, who has given me the opportunity to come here and help rebuild this radio station. Dan is very easy to work with, very understanding, and he's given us the tools necessary for Y100 to become a force in the marketplace. Dan lets me do my job and is wide open to new ideas. He loves originality.

He has a tendency to push Barsk into the frat boy club occasionally, but Barsk tries as much as possible to stay politically correct, of course. We also have Kim Douglas, our traffic reporter and parttime air personality, who adds a nice touch to our morning show. She's another strong female presence to help balance the show. Even though both she and Sherri represent the female perspective, Kim is a lot different than Sherri. She's certainly less conservative than Sherri, shall we say. She even rides a motorcycle...Last but not least is Shemp, our assistant morning show producer and his main on-air function is the temperature, which has now now become the 'Shemp-erature.' Barsky



We talked to a lot of folks in town here and couldn't find the right person with the drive, passion and energy, and I remembered Lynne. She was working as a promotion assistant at Sony Music in Cleveland at the time and doing a great job there, She'd only been working for them for about four months, and I thank Dave Watson, the local Columbia guy there for not

It really makes for a very electrifying radio station when you've got Dan Lerner and Lynn Bruder here in the building, then we've got Scott Shannon and Mike Preston in New York City helping Chuck and I out with the vision and direction of the radio station. Scott and Mike really help keep us on the straight and narrow and make sure we're on the path to success. I think with all these people working together and staying focused this is going to be a legacy radio station in Philadelphia Scott Shannon once told me, 'We don't build radio stations, we build institutions,' and we're hoping to build the latest radio institution in Philadelphia.


