SWEDISH EAGLE/STEVE TSEPELIS, GROOVE RADIO INT.. Los Angeles

AIRSCAPE <u>Cruising</u> (ROUND AND ROUND) - Where trance and progressive house meet in a perfect combination. New re-mixes by Maurits Paardekooper. Look for this import...it will be worthwhile.

DEEE-LITE *Picnic In The Summertime* (ELEKTRA) - It's coming, it's gonna be big, it's here! Jungle music, basically breakbeat techno, with a reggae flavor. The Sampladelic Jumbo Jungle Remix is just that.

MANU DIBANGO f/Youssou N'Dour <u>Soul Makossa</u> (GIANT) - CC Smith, the editor of 'The Beat' magazine turned me on to this... This 12 inch comes complete with re-mix and additional production by Geoff Wilkinson and Mel Simpson of US3. From the Giant album, <u>WAKAFRIKA</u>.

JAZZY JIM, HOT97.7, San Jose

LADY KIMBERLY <u>Jump On It</u> (MAX'N) - It's a natural selection for my show. Lady Kimberly sounds like Salt N Pepa, but together, all by herself. Strong audience reaction out on the streets and much early interest at retail are some signs I'm seeing and reacting to.

FLEX & DA BARIQUA POSSE Shake That Hoochie Coochie (RCA) - Hmmm...let me see...I need an uptempo dance track...something that my Latin females, 18-34 really go crazy for in the clubs, but I need it to have a lot of energy and originality to stick out from all the others. Hmmm...let me think...

DA KNUTSAK <u>Deez Knutz</u> (AMERICAN) - The most fun someone can have on a turntable without taking their clothes off. I'm still laughin' so hard, I can barely think. All I can say is that when you play <u>Deez Knutz</u>, people go crazy, bottom line!

Just need to get some 'what's up's' out to Davey D, Joey Carvello, Craig Kallman, Eddie O., Bad Boy Bill, Arman, George Hess and the whole Hitmakers team for making that long flight and all the hassles worthwhile.

MARKUS SCHULZ, HOTMIX, Phoenix

THIRD WORLD <u>Talk To Me</u> (GREAT JONES) - The hypnotic bassline is what hooked me. Refreshing groove like Robin S. when it first came out.

On the progressive tip, **MC 900 FT JESUS** If I Only Had A Brain (AMERICAN). Cutting edge...mass appeal. Will have the same impact as Beck's Loser.

On the underground level, **APHROHEADS** <u>We Live</u> <u>In The Dark</u> (WHITE LABEL). 2 record set on the domestic release, plus import remixes on Bush Records with Dave Clark Remixes that are intense. With all the different versions, I play this record for 30 minutes at the club and the crowd goes wild.

J. SOUNDTOOLS <u>Whistling In Paradise</u> (LOGIC/RCA) - What can I say about this jam? I come to NY, hook up with Mr. Nevins, I buy him lunch, I let him convince me to go on the subway

during rush hour, I wind up sleeping on the floor and I still mention it in my Disc-overies. It must be a good song.

JEFF K., KDGE, Dallas

SAINT ETIENNE *Hug My Soul* (WARNER BROS) - One of my favorite bands of the moment. This single should bring them back into the mix show and club spotlight. With mixes from Sure Is Pure and Secret Knowledge, what more could you ask for?

CHANNEL 69 <u>Promise Is Breaking</u> (PURE) - Latest remixes from Channel 69's full length. Hard House Mix from Dallas' DJ Red-Eye and progressive mixes from K2 and some clown named Jeff K.

WATER LILLIES <u>Tempted</u> (WHITE LABEL) - This has gotta be the coolest combination of indie-rock and house. Very similar in style to Opus III, Saint Etienne, Sunscreem, etc. Don't miss this one!

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





BOTH OF YOU HAVE BEEN AT **Z90 FOR SOME TIME IN OTHER** CAPACITIES. IT JUST SHOWS YOU THAT THE SYSTEM WORKS OF PROMOTING FROM WITHIN. GIVE US A LITTLE BACKGROUND ON HOW YOU STARTED AT THE STATION.

Lisa: Rick Thomas hired me away from Y95 in Phoenix about three years ago and brought me in as Promotions Director at Z90. I then became Promotions Director for Califormula Radio Group, and then made the jump to Operations Manager. It's been quite a transition

Jeff: I started as a promotions assistant. I was the guy who carried the helium tank and set up the promotions. I was also a mobile DJ and club DJ for ten years. I was given the opportunity to do an overnight shift and the mix show, and the rest is history.

HOW HAS THE TRANSITION

Lisa: In the beginning, when the job was offered, I was very worried. I knew nothing about RCS Selector. The only thing I was confident about was that I felt I could pick the right records to play, and play them at the right time. I had no real definition of what exactly a program director did with regards to record companies, directing an airstaff and such. The transition was fairly smooth, thanks to Jeff, he kept his eyes on the computer when Steve Wall was PD, and soaked in a lot of information. Jeff was the angel that God sent me to get through all of this. He taught me how to use Selector, imagine that! The MD teaching the OM how to use Selector. A Lot of lessons have been learned, some mistakes have been made, but we've made it.

Jeff: The transition has been exciting, challenging and rewarding. Victor Diaz, our owner, has been a great source of knowledge and wisdom for me. Lisa has been the best partner, manager, and most of all, friend through this transitional period, Without her managerial skills and our Promotions Director, Monchai's talent. it never would have worked. Victor saw something in us that wee didn't.

WHO WOULD YOU SAY THAT YOU'VE LEARNED THE MOST FROM?

Lisa: It's going to sound crazy but I've learned the most probably from Jeff Nelson. No doubt about it. I've also learned a lot from Jay Stevens, Rick Thomas, Steve Wall, and Billy Burke, because I saw how they managed people, their good and bad points. To program a radio station you're also managing a radio station, so you've got to learn management skills. If you don't have those, you can be the best programmer in the world but you're going to have a messed up air staff and you're not going to take your station to the top. So I've learned a little from everybody, but probably most from Jeff.

Jeff: I've got to admit I'm not much of a manager. I'm a party animal. I went from the street to mobile to club DJ to radio mix show, air personality, and now music director. I was raw. and the one person who took me under his wing was Billy Burke, who taught me radio. My morning jock, Mark In La Manana taught me about theatre of the mind and the dynamics of radio. I learned the most by listening to others' experiences and avoiding their mistakes.

THERE HAVE BEEN QUITE A FEW CHANGES AT Z90 WITHIN THE LAST TWO YEARS. HOW HAVE YOU MANAGED TO KEEP **EVERYTHING ON COURSE?**

Lisa: Since we've taken over, it's real simple. We all stuck together. We all had a true passion for what we were doing, and most of all, all of us on the programming and promotions staff are like family. We love each other. Instead of jealousy and hate for two inexperienced staff members sitting in the hot seats, our co-workers supported us and wished us luck...They would rather see us in charge rather than another outsider come in and take chances with the station.

Jeff: I only concern myself with the three things I knew most: the music, my city and my dream.

YOU ALSO HAVE A UNIQUE SITUATION IN THAT THE

not like a robot, but rather, like a wellinformed programmer.

LET'S TALK ABOUT HOW Z90 HAS CHANGED MUSICALLY IN THE LAST SIX MONTHS.

Lisa: We took out the Club house music and went with Pop/Dance, Pop/R&B, Dancehall/Reggae, Hip-Hop and Rap. Understanding the moos swings of the San Diego people, we dayparted accordingly. The promotions team took to the streets. and asked a lot of questions. We listened, and we are winning.

Jeff: We met with the top club DJ's throughout the city, as well as our record pool director, Javier Lugo of International Record Source, and asked a lot of questions and got a lot of answers. Then, Lisa and I sat in front of the computer and reconfigured categories, deleted

song and know that it's a remake and can tell you exactly what year it was from. That's helpful for us.

JEFF NELSON

I UNDERSTAND THE STATION IS CURRENTLY UNCONSULTED.

Lisa: That is correct, and our intention for it to remain unconsulted. Victor feels that the program director should be able to research, relate and execute according to the demands of the community, not dictated by a label-controlled consultant. Jeff and I agree. It makes no sense for Z90 to be programmed from 350 miles away and we've seen it happen and not work...We have past programmers' Selector database gridlock to prove it.

ONE OF YOUR AREAS OF EXPERTISE LISA: YOU GUYS ARE VERY PROMOTIONALLY ACTIVE IN THE STREETS OF SAN DIEGO.

Lisa: You can say that again. Our Promotions Director, Monchai Pungaew is the best! Between him and our promotional team, we are omnipresent. They work 366 days a year, 25 hours a day. The only thing that works more is our air conditioning system. We have two giant Z90 street blimps and five promo vehicles. We are at every major event in the city, Tijuana and sometimes, even in L.A.

DO YOU DO OUTSIDE MARKETING WITH BILL-OUTSIDE BOARDS OR ANYTHING LIKE

Lisa: We have about 130 busboards up in San Diego year round. We spend a lot of our money paying the gasoline bill for all our station vehicles a a lot on our large promotions staff. They do a good job of taking our logo all over San Diego County. Listeners are constantly remarking on how they see the bus everywhere...That's a great reflection on our promotions team.

YOU **GUYS** OCCASIONALLY CROSS THE **BORDER?**

Lisa: We don't do it as much any more. We definitely enjoy Tijuana. We try to take care of them as much as we can. We send jocks and prizes

OWNER AND HIS WIFE ARE ACTIVELY INVOLVED IN THE OPERATION OF Z90 AND A SPANISH FM?

Lisa: There are three FM stations under their leadership, and they are the most popular stations with the Hispanic market in San Diego, the first being Z90, then X99, which plays banda music, and then Radio Latina, which is an adult Top40 station. All our stations have great staff members and are very successful. Having the owner in the building is also an asset for us. When we need approval for an expense or an idea, we don't have to wait long for a response, it's usually a matter of minutes. They make themselves available 24/7. They are actively involved in everything, and do not spare any expense when it comes to the Califormula Radio Group.

Jeff: Between Victor and Martha Diaz, there is close to 70 years of combined experience of life and radio. They obviously know something I may not see, so I listen and execute daypart restrictions, and analyzed song for song three hundred times a

WHERE DID YOU GROW UP?

Lisa: I grew up in Houston, Texas listening to KKBQ and KMJQ.

Jeff: I was born in Hawaii and

raised in San Diego, so I've spent the past 30 years right here.

SO YOU DEFINITELY HAVE YOUR FINGER ON WHAT'S HAPPENED IN THE IN THE MARKETPLACE.

Jeff: Yes. I'm a typical San Diegan. I know what the city wants and I know how they are socially and politically. This knowledge is a great asset when it comes to the application of music on the edge.

Lisa: If I ever have a doubt about a song, Jeff knows the history of music in this city and as a mix jock he's more clued in to what's happened and what will happen than your average Jane Doe off the street. Jeff will hear a

We have a tremendous amount of listeners in T.J.that truly love what we play, but to do a sticker stop there is like doing a promotion in New York City. Where on earth do you park your van? It's impossible.

JEFF, LET'S TALK ABOUT THE MIX SHOW PROGRAMMING AT THE RADIO STATION.

Jeff: We break our mix show down into three different parts. It starts at 8 pm Fridays and Saturdays and will go until midnight. The jocks are in the streets, at the promotions and the busses are out, and we're all doing phone-ins. It's just one big huge party. It's very college-oriented, so the music covers everything from Alternative to dance, freestyle, disco and rap. From midnight to 2 am we take in to another level and it's strictly underground hip-hop. It's true to the game hip-hop; it's raw. We feature DJ's throughout the city, we fake no funk on this. We bring in everything that anybody who is on the edge wishes they had. From 2 to 4 am we do the 'House of Z,' and it's strictly house music, and we also feature special DJ's from across the country. We've had Little Louie Vega, Joey Jiminez, Richard 'Humpty' Vission.

YOU USED TO HAVE MORE DIRECT COMPETITION, AND NOW THAT COMPETITION HAS GOTTEN MUCH MORE ADULT.

Jeff: It's funny, because we have no direct competition. The black market wants their own and they don't hesitate to let us know that. We really do our best to satisfy different races and play the music for them. When we first started out, we asked our general sales manager what demo he wanted. He told us 18-34, and that's what we targeted.

Lisa: That's what we're winning in.

Jeff: And now we have a 9.8.

YOU'VE BROADENED A BIT SINCE YOU LOST A DIRECT URBAN AND A DIRECT TOP40 COMPETITOR.

Jeff: When Steve Wall, our last program director was here, we had direct competition from an Urban station and it was an inner city battle! During the radio war the Urban station quit and went Adult Alternative. Z90 instantly jumped to a 6.1! Steve Wall quoted, "They have no where to go, so we can do what we want!" In one book we fell to a 4.9, the same basic level as before the Urban station signed off. It was a lesson well-learned, that even if there isn't direct competition for our format, the listeners still have the choice not to listen. They hated us! With that kind of motivation, programming, Promotions, ownership and sales went to work. The people spoke, we listened, and in one book, we went from a 4.9 to a 5.8 12+. We later focused on the 18-34 demo and exploded to a 9.8. Later we learned that a large percentage of our 12+_ audience was switching between us and the heritage Country station, which is currently #1. (For now!)

IS THERE ANY ROOM TO PLAY WITH ALTERNATIVE CROSS-

OVER PRODUCT, LIKE THE CHANNEL X STATIONS DO?

Jeff: There really isn't much of a reason for us to even tamper with the Alternative vibe here. To do that we'd cut our own throat because it's so well saturated right now.

Lisa: And they do a good job at what they do. Props to both 92.5 and 91X, they do very well.

TELL US ABOUT THE AIRSTAFF, STARTING WITH MORNING DRIVE.

Lisa: Our morning guy is Mark In La Manana.

Jeff: That was a unique situation there. Mark and Steve Wall had a difference of philosophies and Steve moved him to overnights, and when the changes were made we moved him to nights. Nights went from a 10 share to a 14 share inside of the first trend. After that we decided to put him in the morning, utilizing a nighttime delivery, give our morning show a lot of pep, vibe and thrust, and he just skyrocketed. According to our weekly AccuRatings, he's matched, if not beat Jeff & Jer, the #1 morning show in the city.

Lisa: Now the only thing we have to do is finish that morning team. Find a morning show producer and a teammate to maybe help him through those rating periods. Next on middays we have Nick Monroe, who is Australian.

Jeff: Lisa and I were thinking it might be kind of fun to have an Alternative voice on in the middays and it worked out great. The females loved him and he can relate really well.

Lisa: He's a great jock who shows

and as high as 30 share in the AccuRatings 12+. It's exciting for us because it's all specialty programming from 6 to midnight. It's a lot of fun. You've got to hear it.

Lisa: From 2 to 5:30 am we have a gentleman by the name of Jerry Z. He was one of my promotion assistants who I put on the air out of necessity because we were so short-staffed. I taught him some skills and he stuck with Jeff and learned how to be a good DJ, and now he's incredible and we're very pleased with him. I would also like to mention our Production Director Edward. He's been with us from the very beginning. He's been a great asset and is very creative. He represents!

ANY OTHER SPECIALTY PROGRAMMING?

Lisa: From 6 to 10 on Sunday evenings we have our Old School show, which has been very traditional. That was one of Rick's ideas. It's got a huge core of dedicated listeners, and Cha Cha specializes in putting that show together. She works with Jeff, but a lot of times the magic comes from Cha Cha. We've got to give her credit there. She knows a lot of old school records that we had totally forgotten about.

Jeff: She teaches me.

Lisa: People actually show up here on Sunday nights. They bang on the door because they couldn't get through the request line and they want to drop off their old school requests. That's how big that show is.

DO YOU HAVE WEEKLY PROGRAMMING MEETINGS?

up to work every day at 7 am to do production. He gets off the air at 2 pm and hits the streets in a van until 5 pm. Then we have Cha Cha, who is our female voice in the afternoon and she's wonderful. She's one of the best jocks out there. I always pray that nobody ever takes her away from me because she's so good. She's got a great attitude and has wonderful numbers in the afternoon.

Then we have this guy here, our MD, Crazy J. Nelson, who has the #1-rated show in the evening. He's been as high as a 27 or 30 share at night, so it's phenomenal. We own 12+, 18-34, and 25-54 at night. He's got a lot of programs that he does within his show like Relationships 911 and others that are just incredible and people love. Eddie Love does 'Late Nights With Love.' It's strictly music for lovers.

Jeff: He's got the voice from God and the women go goo goo over him.

Lisa: Very sexy. Makes you want to make love to the radio.

Jeff: People are mailing so many love letters to him that we had to get another P.O. box. He's also part of the rated time during the night show, and between he and I together the night show has gone to an 18 share 18-34

Jeff: Oh yeah, absolutely. Our music coordinator, James Dee is also our mix DJ. He brings the music to me that's on the edge, that's on the progressive scene. Lisa and I listen to the label priorities and we look at each other and make funny faces and come up with a hit. Then we put it in a test rotation and let the record speak for itself from there.

HOW DOES A RECORD GET ON THE AIR AT Z90?

Lisa: We do look at SoundScan, but we don't live and die by it. We do listen to the record reps, but by no means do we let them make our decisions for us. If the three of us hear it, it automatically goes into a test rotation. If one of us disagrees, we'll debate over it, or we'll walk it over to the secretaries and they'll make the decision for us.

As far as record people go, we know they're just doing their jobs, but it sometimes gets on our nerves when they throw call letters from other markets in our faces, 'Well such and such is playing it,' well you know what, kudos, but such and such is in Los Angeles or Cleveland and their

market is totally different from San Diego. It's a chance we're taking. We could make some wrong calls but who's to say.

IT'S MORE IMPORTANT NOW THAN EVER TO BE FOCUSED ON YOUR MARKET.

Lisa: We totally agree. And I think that's been some of our magic.

Jeff: I'm kind of weird. I have blinders on in reference to my market. There's nothing like San Diego and I don't care to hear about anybody else's city. I have blinders on and I'm dogmatic about that view. Sometimes I dislike a song, but she softens me up and then I'll see something that I just couldn't see before and it helps.

LET'S CHANGE FROM THE BUSINESS SIDE TO THE PERSONAL SIDE. WHAT DO YOU GUYS LIKE TO DO IN YOUR SPARE TIME?

Lisa: I go to the movies or go walk on the beach

Jeff: I read a trade magazine.

YOU'RE A SICK INDIVIDUAL.

Lisa: It's hard to believe but in the eight months since we've taken over, the first time we've ever gotten away was for the HITMAKERS New York trip, and outside of that I would guess we've each had maybe two days off, and that's just because we've been short of staff, and rather than bringing just any person in here, we'd rather wait until we get the right person.

Jeff: I've got to say if it wasn't for HITMAKERS conventions I probably would have no entertainment in my life

ANY ADVICE FOR FELLOW PROGRAMMERS?

Jeff: Yes, I'd like to tell other programmers, with all their experience, do themselves a favor, take the dayparting off their songs and follow their gut. It's been my best friend and now we've got a 9.8 18-34.

Lisa: Remember where you came from, because you can always end up there, and not by choice.

LET'S TALK ABOUT THE FUTURE. WHERE DO YOU SEE EACH OF YOURSELVES HEADING?

Jeff: I'm just excited about being here and helping this station make history. I hope some day to be considered the right kind of material for program director and just stick with this team because I don't have a lot of experience in the other markets. Our air personalities tell me this is the place. They've been everywhere and they've never been happier than here. I want to stay here with my family at Z90 and make history.

Lisa: I don't even want to think about the future. We all know that you never know what tomorrow may bring, but in the meantime I put my trust in God, work hard here and try to finish our mission, which is to educate the people of San Diego, to give them a positive message, and to entertain them at the same time. My future is making Z90 #1 and keeping it there, and spreading the gospel of peace and happiness.
